FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1 Minnesota (5-3, 2-3 B1G) starts play in the month of November by traveling to Nebraska (3-5, 2-3) Saturday. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m. on ESPN2 with radio coverage on KFAN.

2 Mohamed Ibrahim has rushed 170 times in seven games for 955 yards (5.6 average) and 13 touchdowns. He's posted those numbers despite missing the Purdue contest and not playing beyond the opening drive of the second half in any of the first three contests this season. In the process, he's extended his streak of 100-yard rushing games to 16 straight dating back to the 2020 Outback Bowl. According to BTN, Ibrahim's streak is tied for the longest by any FBS player since 2000 with Arizona's Ka'Deem Carey, who also got to 16 games from 2012-13. During the current stretch, Ibrahim has rushed 421 times for 2,334 yards and 31 touchdowns. He's averaging 5.54 yards per rush and 145.9 yards per game over that span and has added 14 catches for 99 yards. More info on Ibrahim can be found on Page 5.

Minnesota boasts one of the best and most well-rounded defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi**.

The Golden Gophers rank seventh in the country by allowing

the top 25 of each of those categories.

274.4 total yards per contest. They also have the No. 4 defense in terms of scoring (14.4 ppg), the sixth-ranked unit for passing yards allowed (168.1) and the No. 16 rush defense (106.2). Minnesota joins Boise State, Georgia, Illinois, Iowa, Michigan and Ohio State as the only teams in the nation that rank in

4 Rutgers entered last Saturday's game with one of the top defenses in the country, but the Golden Gophers executed well against the Scarlet Knights. Rutgers came in with the No. 7 total defense (283.9 ypg), but Minnesota recorded 375 yards of offense. The Scarlet Knights' rushing defense was sixth in the FBS (87.4 ypg), but Minnesota ran for 253 yards. Rutgers also had the No. 32 scoring defense (21.3 ppg), but Minnesota scored 31 points. Ohio State is the only Rutgers opponent this year to have more total yards or points, while the Gophers' rushing performance was the best against the Scarlet Knights this season.



Tyler Nubin had his first career multi-interception game Saturday with two picks in the 31-0 shutout win over Rutgers. Dating back to last season, Minnesota is the only program in the country with three shutouts against FBS programs.

SHUTTING 'EM DOWN

Minnesota held Rutgers to just 134 yards of total offense Saturday. Three of the top five total defense performances at Minnesota since 2000 have now come in the past two seasons.

The 2022 campaign is the sixth for head coach **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota, where he holds a record of 40-26. He is already fifth in program history for wins, sixth in Big Ten wins (23), and is seventh in games coached (66). Fleck's .606 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only **Henry L. Williams** (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 10th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 70-48 (.593).

- Make the Gophers 36-25-2 all-time against Nebraska, including 12-12 in Lincoln, 7-5 overall since the Huskers joined the big Ten and 5-1 under P.J. Fleck
- Mark the first time Fleck has beaten a team five teams as Minnesota's head coach and in his career
- Grow Minnesota's win streak in the series to four, its longest since a 10-game win streak against Nebraska from 1940-49

FACING NEBRASKA

- ▶ Minnesota and Nebraska meet for the 63rd time on Saturday. The Golden Gophers own a 35-25-2 edge in the all-time series, including a 6-5 advantage since the Huskers joined the Big Ten in 2011.
- ► The Gophers have won four of the last five matchups in the series, including each of the last three. Over those three contests, they've outscored the Huskers 88-47.
- ► Minnesota's three-game streak is its longest in the series since winning three in a row from 1951-54. The Gophers are looking to win four straight over the Cornhuskers for the first time since a 10-game win streak from 1940-49
- ► The three-game win streak is Minnesota's second longest currently against a Big Ten team behind a four-game win streak over Indiana. Overall, it's tied for their fifth longest active streak against one team. The only longer ones are against Miami (OH) (5 games), Colorado State (4), Indiana (4) and Western Michigan (4).
- ► The Golden Gophers are 11-12 all-time in the series in Lincoln. They won the most recent matchup there in 2020, 24-17, and have split the last four contests at Memorial Stadium.

- ▶ P.J. Fleck is 4-1 all-time against Nebraska. A win Saturday would mark the first time he's beaten a team five teams as Minnesota's head coach and the first time he's done so in his career.
- Minnesota has no Nebraskans on its roster, while Nebraska has four Minnesotans. Freshman TE Chase Androff (Lakeville South HS) and sophomore OL Bryce Benhart (Lakeville North HS) are from Lakeville, while junior nickel Omar Brown (Minneapolis North HS) and freshman RB Emmett Johnson (Holy Angels) are from Minneapolis.
- ▶ Minnesota offensive line coach and run game coordinator **Brian Callahan** held the same title at Akron from 2005-09, while Nebraska defensive line/edge coach Mike Dawson was the Zips linebackers coach from 2006-08.
- ▶ Nebraska enters the game with a 3-5 record overall and is tied for third in the Big Ten West with Minnesota and Wisconsin at 2-3 in league play. The Cornhuskers started the season 1-3 before winning two in a row in league play over Indiana and Rutgers. However, Nebraska has lost its last two to Purdue and Illinois.
- ► The Cornhuskers are playing under interim head coach Mickey Joseph after Scott Frost was fired on Sept. 11 during his fifth season at his alma mater.
- ▶ Minnesota and Nebraska have played two common opponents so far this year in Purdue and Rutgers. Both teams lost to the Boilermakers: 20-10 for the Gophers (Oct. 1) and 43-37 for the Huskers (Oct. 15). Each has also defeated Rutgers: 14-13 for Nebraska (Oct. 7), while Minnesota shut out the Scarlet Knights, 31-0 on Saturday.
- ▶ Casey Thompson has started all eight games this year for Nebraska, throwing for 2,023 yards with 12 touchdowns and 10 interceptions on 141-of-224 passing. However, he was injured in the team's last game against Illinois and did not play the final 2.5 quarters. His status for Saturday is to be determined. Nebraska's other two quarterbacks to play this year are Chubba Purdy, who's completed 10-of-20 passes with no touchdowns and two interceptions, and Logan Smothers, who only has a one-yard touchdown pass.

- Anthony Grant has 743 rushing yards with six touchdowns on 156 carries to lead the Huskers rushing attack. The receiving corps is led by Trey Palmer, who has team highs in receptions (48), receiving yards (782) and touchdown receptions (5). He's 12th in the nation with 97.8 receiving yards per game.
- ▶ Defensively, Luke Reimer leads the team with 58 tackles and has added 3.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks, one interception and five pass breakups. Garrett Nelson has a team-best 6.0 TFLs and 4.5 sacks, while Marques Buford Jr. and Malcolm Hertzog have two interceptions each to pace the secondary. Quinton Newsome has a team-high seven pass breakups.

LAST TIME VS. THE CORNHUSKERS

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Tanner Morgan threw for 209 yards and two touchdowns and Bryce Williams rushed for 127 yards and another score as Minnesota defeated Nebraska 30-23 last season in Minneapolis.
- ▶ The Gophers dominated the first half, taking a 21-9 lead behind near-perfect passing from Morgan. But Nebraska flipped the script in the second half, forcing two interceptions to get back into the game. However, a number of missed opportunities prevented the Huskers from taking the lead and allowed Minnesota to hang on.
- ▶ Given short fields twice in the third quarter after Minnesota punts, the Huskers drove deep into Gophers territory but came up empty both times. First, the Gophers defense made three consecutive stops at the goal line to force a turnover on downs. Then Nebraska kicker Connor Culp missed a 27-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter.
- ► The Huskers faced another decision midway through the fourth quarter when it was fourth-and-10 from the Minnesota 34. Trailing 21-16, Nebraska head coach Scott Frost elected to go for it, but a heavy pass rush forced an incompletion and another turnover on downs.
- ▶ On the next drive, the Gophers punted instead of electing to go for it on fourth-and-1 near midfield. On first down from his own 11, Nebraska quarterback Adrian Martinez was wrapped up in the end zone by **Esezi Otomewo**. Martinez threw the ball away but was called for intentional grounding, resulting in a safety that made it 23-16.
- ▶ Minnesota got the ball back after the safety and pushed its lead to 30-16 on a 56-yard touchdown run by Williams with 2:12 to play.
- ▶ Offensively, the Gophers were practically flawless in the first half. They scored touchdowns on three of their first four drives. Brevyn Spann-Ford caught a 5-yard pass for a TD from Cole Kramer out of the wildcat formation, while Michael Brown-Stephens and Chris Autman-Bell both caught touchdown passes from Morgan to put Minnesota up 21-9 at halftime.
- ▶ Morgan was 14-for-15 for 171 yards and two touchdowns in the first half. He went on to set a school record with his 16th consecutive completion early in the third quarter, though his streak was snapped when Taylor-Britt picked off his next pass in the end zone.
- ▶ Morgan's next pass was intercepted, too, and this time the Huskers took advantage. Safety Deontai Williams' pick set up Nebraska at the Gophers 45, and three plays later Rahmir Johnson scored his second touchdown of the game on a 1-yard run to cut Minnesota's lead to 21-16.

PREVIOUSLY IN LINCOLN

▶ With assistance from the AP: Mohamed Ibrahim ran for two touchdowns following Nebraska turnovers, and a Minnesota team that was idle for three weeks and missing nearly three dozen players to COVID-19 protocols or injuries left Lincoln with a 24-17 win on Dec. 12, 2020.

- ▶ Ibrahim scored on fourth-and-goal from the 1 to give Minnesota a 10-point lead early in the fourth quarter after Adrian Martinez fumbled at the Nebraska 39.
- ► Connor Culp's 30-yard field goal cut it to 24-17 with 4:42 left, but Ibrahim finished off the game with six straight carries for 59 yards before Minnesota went into victory formation at the Nebraska 6. Ibrahim recorded 108 yards on 20 carries. **Tanner Morgan** was 17 of 30 for 181 yards.
- ► The Gophers opened the scoring after **Tyler Nubin** intercepted a tipped pass at the Huskers' 35 in the middle of the first quarter. On fourth-and-1, a direct snap went to Ibrahim, who broke through the middle for a 26-yard score.
- Nebraska managed only 1.9 yards per play on its first three possessions before breaking through early in the second quarter, as Martinez passed 8 yards to Austin Allen for their first touchdown. Martinez later led the Huskers on a 13-play, 73-yard drive, finishing it off with a run from the 7 for a 14-10 lead.
- ▶ The Gophers took a 17-14 lead into the final quarter. They had gone ahead late in the first half after a targeting penalty on cornerback Cam Taylor-Britt kept alive a 75-yard scoring drive that started with **Cam Wiley** sprinting 61 yards down the sideline. That set up Minnesota inside the 10, and Morgan threw to tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard touchdown.
- ▶ Leading the Minnesota defense was **Mariano Sori- Marin**, who finished with 18 tackles and a forced fumble, and ended up winning Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance.

MEMORABLE GAMES VS. NEBRASKA

- ▶ Sept. 11, 2017: The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in P.J. Fleck's first season as head coach. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers had scored in a Big Ten game since 2006. Rodney Smith finished with 279 all-purpose yards, including 134 rushing yards and a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, and the Gophers racked up 409 rushing yards, the eighth best total in program history.
- Nov. 22, 2014: **Mitch Leidner** led a pair of 10-play touchdown drives in the second half as Minnesota rallied for a 28-24 win at No. 21 Nebraska. Leidner scored on a three-yard run with 3:25 to play to give the Gophers their first lead.
- ▶ Oct. 26, 2013: Minnesota snapped a 16-game losing streak against Nebraska with a 34-23 win at Huntington Bank Stadium. **David Cobb** led the Gophers on the ground with 138 rushing yards.
- ▶ Oct. 6, 1945: Behind a school-record seven interceptions, Minnesota beat Nebraska in Lincoln, 61-7. The 61 points are the most Minnesota has ever scored in a road game, while the 54-point win is the Gophers' second largest on the road behind a 58-0 victory at Shattuck in 1890.

RECAPPING RUTGERS

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Mohamed Ibrahim rushed for 159 yards and three touchdowns on 36 carries to lead Minnesota past Rutgers 31-0 on Saturday to stop a three-game losing streak.
- ▶ Quarterback **Tanner Morgan** crisply returned from a concussion that kept him out of the previous game for the Gophers, who enjoyed a 19-play, 99-yard drive on their first possession that drained 10:24 off the clock.
- ► They converted 13 of 19 third downs and were in full control, giving coach **P.J. Fleck** a victory over his mentor and former boss Greg Schiano. The Gophers had the ball for 41:02
- Minnesota's revived defense produced a punishing and unrelenting performance against a Scarlet Knights team missing leading rusher Samuel Brown V and still dealing with quarterback instability.

- ► Gavin Wimsatt made his second career start, going 6 for 17 for 68 yards. He threw the first of two interceptions by **Tyler Nubin** at the Rutgers 33 early in the fourth quarter that set up Ibrahim's third score and put the game out of
- ► That was Ibrahim's 46th career touchdown, breaking the all-time program record held by Darrell Thompson, who cheered the feat from his perch in the radio booth.
- ▶ Wimsatt was replaced by Noah Vedral, the sixth-year player who started the previous three games, when he took a shoulder-to-shoulder hit at the end of a run and had his head snap back hard against the turf midway through the fourth quarter. The Scarlet Knights had just 134 total yards of offense
- ▶ Ibrahim extended his streak of 100-yard games to 16 straight with some of his finest work to date. Behind a rejuvenated line, the sixth-year star continually found space and broke tackles in the middle of the field against a rugged Rutgers team that entered the game ranked sixth in the FBS and third in the conference in rushing defense.
- ► He hurt his left ankle late in the third quarter, too, but after treatment in the tent he rejoined the offense with a taped-up foot after logging 31 carries over the first three quarters.

IN THE POLLS

- Neither Minnesota or Nebraska are ranked in either major poll this week.
- ► Two of Minnesota's 2022 opponents are currently ranked. Illinois checks in at No. 14 in the AP Poll and No. 13 in the Coaches, while Penn State is No. 16 in each.
- ► Those two opponents, along with Purdue, are responsible for Minnesota's losses this season.
- ▶ Minnesota was receiving votes in the AP Preseason Poll. 2022 is the 11th season that Minnesota can make that claim, including three of the past four years, according to CollegePollArchive.com. The Gophers are looking to start and finish the year in the AP Poll for the second time in program history, also doing so in 2019.

SUCCESS ON 3RD DOWNS

- Minnesota has been one of the top teams in the country this year, on both sides of the ball, on 3rd downs. The offense leads the country in conversion percentage, while the defense is second best in opponent conversion rate.
- ▶ Minnesota's offense has converted 61 of 102 3rd downs for a nation's best 59.8 percent. For context, USC is second at 54.7 percent, and there are only 12 teams other than Minnesota above 50 percent in the FBS this year.
- ► The Gophers have converted on better than 63 percent of third downs in five of their eight games this year, including a season-best 86.7 percent (13-15) versus Colorado.
- ▶ On the other side of the ball, Minnesota has allowed opponents to convert just 23-of-94 third downs, 24.5 percent. Marshall (21.4 percent) is the only team with a better rate than the Gophers.
- ► The 23 conversions allowed are the fewest in the nation, while the 94 3rd downs faced are tied for fifth.
- ▶ Penn State has had the most "success" against Minnesota this year by converting 5-of-11 3rd downs (36.4%). Otherwise, Illinois was 6-of-17 (35.3%), Purdue was 4-of-14 (28.6%), Michigan State was 2-of-8 (25.0%), New Mexico State was 2-of-9 (22.2%), Rutgers was 2-of-10 (20.0%), Colorado was 1-of-12 (8.3%) and Western Illinois was 1-of-13 (7.7%).

EXTRA EFFICIENT

According to BCFToys.com, Minnesota has been one of the most efficient teams this year in regards to points per drive, net available yards and net yards per play.

- ▶ Ratings and supporting data on BCFToys is calculated from the results of non-garbage possessions in FBS vs. FBS games.
- ► The Minnesota offense is averaging 2.66 points per drive, 44th in the FBS, while the defense is 12th at 1.52. The net rating of 1.14 points per drive is 14th in the nation.
- Available yards percentage is calculated by dividing drive yards earned by available yards measured from starting field position to end zone.
- ► The Gophers rank 38th offensively in available yards percentage at .527, while the defense is No. 12 at .358. That gives them a net percentage of .168 that sits 11th among FBS schools and ninth among Power 5 programs.
- ► Minnesota also ranks 80th in offensive yards per play at 5.60, while the defense is ninth in the FBS at 4.70. The net difference of 0.91 puts the team 27th in the FBS and 17th in the Power 5.

EXPLOSIVE RUNS PUSH OFFENSE

- ► Minnesota's offense is averaging 6.17 yards per play this season, 42nd in the country, and that's been aided by 123 plays from scrimmage of at least 10+ yards. That figure is 46th in the nation.
- Of those 123 plays, 57 have been rushes of at least 10 yards, tied for the 10th most in the country. Two of the teams ranked above Minnesota have played nine games to the Gophers' eight.
- ► A list of the Gophers' longest plays this year can be found on Page 21.

MORE ON MO

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim is back in 2022 after missing nearly all of last season following a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's 2021 season opener. As noted on Page 1, he's been one of the top running backs in the country this year.
- ▶ Ibrahim is third in the nation in rushing touchdowns (13, 2nd in B1G) and points per game (11.1, 2nd), fourth in rushing yards per game (136.4, 2nd, fifth in total TDs (13, 2nd), ninth in all-purpose yards per game (142.6, 3rd), total rush yards (955, 3rd) and points scored (78, 4th), and 38th in yards per carry (5.62, 7th).
- Ibrahim also leads all Power 5 players this year with 12 redzone rushing touchdowns, according to Pro Football Focus. The one rushing score that didn't come in the redzone was a 28-yarder Saturday against Rutgers, the longest TD run of his career.
- ▶ With 955 rushing yards on the season, he is just 45 yards away from reaching 1,000 yards for the third time in his career (also doing so in 2018 and 2020). Should he reach the number, Ibrahim would join Laurence Maroney (2003-05) and Darrell Thompson (1986-87, '89) as the only Gophers to accomplish the feat.
- ► The 2020 Big Ten Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, Ibrahim holds the program record with 46 career rushing touchdowns, 46 total touchdowns and four career games of 200 yards rushing. His 276 points are second overall and the most by a non-kicker at Minnesota. He's also currently the program leader in rushing yards per game (109.9).
- ▶ Ibrahim is also second at Minnesota in 100-yard games (21), third in rushing yards (3,958), fourth in rushing attempts (717), and seventh in yards per carry (5.52) and all-purpose yards (4,162).
- ► He's got 14 games in his career with multiple touchdowns (four this year), including six games with at least three scores (two this season) and two games with a school-record four touchdowns.
- ▶ Within the Big Ten, Ibrahim is tied with Ohio State's Keith Byars (1982-85) for ninth in career rushing touchdowns with 46. Ibrahim is four scores away from cracking the conference's top-10 list for career overall touchdowns.

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

- ► Sixth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his fourth full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's the winningest QB to wear the Maroon and Gold.
- ▶ Morgan was injured at Illinois and did not play at Penn State on Oct. 22, snapping a streak of 45 straight starts. The last time a quarterback other than Morgan started for Minnesota was **Zack Annexstad** at Nebraska on Oct. 20, 2018.
- ► He returned Saturday against Rutgers, completing 14-of-21 passes for 122 yards and running three times for 17 yards.
- ► His career completion percentage of .621 is first in school history (49 points ahead of second place), as is his 150.86 efficiency rating, .696 win percentage and 32 wins.
- Morgan ranks second in school history in completion and attempts (651-of-1048), passing yards (9,358), passing touchdowns (63), total offense (9,399), quarterback starts (46) and games with 250+ yards passing (12). He's also third in TD:INT ratio (1.97) and fourth in passing yards per game (191.0) and 300-yard passing games (4).
- ► He has led the Gophers in passing each year since 2018, joining him with Adam Weber (2007-10) and Rickey Foggie (1984-87) as the only QBs in Gopher history to lead the team in passing yards four times. He is on track to become the first to do it in five years.
- ► Morgan has at least 12 season and game team records and was All-B1G Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-B1G Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.
- ► This season, he has completed 97-of-145 passes for 1,286 yards and seven touchdowns with five interceptions. He's also added 91 rushing yards and a career-high four touchdowns on 27 carries.
- ▶ Morgan is 16th in the FBS and third in the Big Ten in yards per pass attempt (8.87). Also within the conference, he's fourth in yards per completion (13.26) and fifth in completion percentage (.669) and pass efficiency (150.4).

MORGAN B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- ► After helping Minnesota to a 34-7 win at Michigan State on Sept. 24, **Tanner Morgan** was named the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week along with Michigan's Blake Corum.
- Morgan completed 23-of-26 passes for 268 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. It was his fourth career game completing at least 83 percent of his passes, and he now owns the top three marks in program history after completing 88.5 percent against the Spartans.
- ▶ It was his eighth career game with at least three touchdowns passes and the third of his career with at least that many scoring strikes and no interceptions.
- ► Morgan was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Nov. 9, 2020, when **Mohamed Ibrahim** received the honor.
- ▶ It was the third time in his career that Morgan was tabbed as the conference's Offensive Player of the Week, as he was also bestowed the honor on Nov. 11, 2019 and Sept. 30, 2019. Morgan and **Adam Weber** are the only Minnesota quarterbacks to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week three times in their careers.

BACKING UP MORGAN

- ► Thanks to the first three contests of the season being well in hand by halftime, Minnesota's backup quarterbacks have both both able to see extensive action this year.
- ► Redshirt freshman **Athan Kaliakmanis** has played in six games with one start and gone 14-of-33 for 259 yards with one touchdowns and three interceptions

- ▶ When Morgan was injured at Illinois, it was Kaliakmanis who came on in relief. He completed two of his six passes for 17 yards and threw the first two interceptions of his career.
- ▶ Kaliakmanis then made his first career start at Penn State's White Out in place of the injured Morgan, completing 9-of-22 passes for 175 yards with one touchdown and one interception, and rushing seven times for 45 yards Over the last 45 seasons, 31 different QBs have started for the Gophers. Kaliakmanis' 19.4 yards per completion ranked third best among those signal-callers in their debut.
- ▶ The last Gopher quarterback to make his first career start on the road before Kaliakmanis was Conor Rhoda at Maryland on Oct. 15, 2016, while the last Gopher QB to make his first career start against a ranked team was MarQueis Gray at then-No. 25 USC on Sept. 3, 2011. With Penn State ranked 16th, Kaliakmanis' start was against the highest ranked opponent for a first career start since Andy Persby started against then-No. 13 Penn State on Oct. 10, 1998.
- ► Kaliakmanis was a four-star recruit according to 247Sports and ESPN and ranked as the No. 16 quarter-back in the nation according to Rivals. He was listed as the No. 2 prospect in Illinois according to 247Sports and 267th overall by ESPN.
- ► Redshirt junior **Cole Kramer** has also played in six games and completed 5-of-8 passes for 41 yards and added 26 yards on five carries.
- ► Kramer established himself last year as the team's Wildcat QB as he rushed 36 times for 165 yards and two TDs, averaging 4.6 yards per carry.
- ▶ Of his 36 carries, 15 came on third down and he turned 10 of them into first downs. Of the five he didn't convert, three were on plays of 3rd-and-5 or longer. A 3rd-and-3 rush against Nebraska went for 2 yards, but he followed with a 5-yard TD pass on 4th down.
- ► Kramer also completed all three of his pass attempts for 62 yards and two touchdowns. Kramer was one of two players in the country last year, along with UCF's Ryan O'Keefe, with two touchdown passes on three or fewer attempts. Over the five prior seasons, Kramer was one of only 10 to accomplish the feat.

RELIABLE TIGHT END TARGET

- ► Gopher tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** is making the most of his redshirt senior campaign as he leads the team in targets (42), targets per game (5.3), receptions (27), receiving yards (349), touchdown receptions (2), yards after catch (167) and YAC per game (20.9).
- ▶ With his totals, Spann-Ford is on pace to the be the first Gophers tight end to lead the team in receiving yards since Maxx Williams did it in 2013 and 2014. Before that, Patt Evans did it in 1991.
- ► Spann-Ford has been targeted at least three times in every game, the only Gopher to make that claim this year. He's been targeted at least six times in each of the last four games
- ► He's also the only Minnesota player to have a catch in every game this season; he's actually got two in each.
- ► At Penn State, he set career highs in both receptions and receiving yards as he caught five balls for 68 yards and a score.
- ▶ Spann-Ford saw his production grow over the final weeks of last season. Of his 30 targets last year, 17 came in the final four weeks of the regular season, including a season-high six targets versus Illinois and four against lowa and Wisconsin. He caught 23 passes for 296 yards and a touchdown last year, tying for third on the team in receptions and ranking fourth in receiving yards.
- Spann-Ford's 76.7 percent catch rate was the best on the team for anyone with at least 10 targets last year.

BROWN-STEPHENS: PLAYMAKER

- ► Redshirt junior wide receiver **Michael Brown- Stephens** is second on the team in receptions (19), receiving yards (311), targets (32) and yards after catch (104).
- ► At Michigan State, he had a career-high six receptions on six targets and led the team with 73 yards.
- Last year he had 23 catches in 2021 and turned them into 392 receiving yards, the second-highest yardage total on the team. His 17.0 yards per catch average was third on the team and ranked fifth in the Big Ten among players with at least 20 catches.
- ▶ At Purdue last year, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 54 and 51 yards, the second and third longest receptions by a Gopher last year, respectively. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane Bennett**, with 121 yards on two catches vs. Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.
- ► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of both 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.

JACKSON STEPPING UP

- ▶ With Chris Autman-Bell out for the season, fellow wide receiver Daniel Jackson has helped pick up some of the production.
- ▶ Jackson missed the first two games of the season due to injury, but he's quickly made up for lost time. He's tied for team lead in touchdown receptions (2) and is second in yards after catch (109), YAC per game (18.2) and targets per game (5.2), and third in targets (31) and catches (18).
- ► He recorded three catches for 42 yards and two touchdowns at Michigan State for the first multi-TD game of his career. The next week against Purdue, he posted a career-high 110 receiving yards on six receptions, including a career-long 66 yard gain.
- ▶ His nine targets against the Boilermakers are the most by a Gopher this year, while his 29 targets over the last five games (since Autman-Bell's injury) are second on the squad behind **Brevyn Spann-Ford** (31).
- ▶ Despite missing two games last year, Jackson was second on the team in receptions (25), targets (53) and targets per game (4.8). He had a career-high 58 receiving yards versus Ohio State in the 2021 season opener.

GEARY MAKING MOST OF 7TH YEAR

- Wide receiver Clay Geary is in his seventh season of eligibility for the Golden Gophers and making the most of his last go-around in Maroon and Gold.
- After redshirting as a freshman walk-on in 2016, he played in nine games over the next two seasons with one catch. He was put on scholarship prior to 2019 and was surprised with the news after throwing out the first pitch at a Minnesota Twins game. He then went on to play in 10 games that year, mostly on special teams, before appearing five times in 2020 with five receptions for 50 yards. Geary then missed all of 2021 after a torn ACL in camp.
- ► He's gotten back into the fold this year with six catches for 85 yards and a touchdown. The touchdown, an acrobatic eight-yard reception against Colorado, was the first of his career.
- ► Geary has caught six of the seven passes thrown his way, tied for the highest catch rate (85.7%) among Gophers with at least three targets this season.

POTTS, WILLIAMS BOUNCING BACK FROM INJURIES

- ▶ Running backs **Trey Potts** and **Bryce Williams** are both bouncing back from season-ending injuries suffered in 2021.
- ▶ So far, so good for the RB pair as Potts has 73 carries for 365 yards (5.0 average) and three touchdowns to go with three receptions for 23 yards in seven games (did not play at Illinois). Williams has played in all eight games and has carried 44 times for 223 yards (5.1 average) and three scores and caught 10 passes for 83 yards.
- ▶ Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's 2021 game at Purdue. He was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.
- ► The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back after the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.
- ▶ In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries were the most by an FBS player last season until Sept. 25, and tied for 14th.
- ▶ He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then tallied 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before adding 78 yards and a TD on 15 carries at Purdue.
- ▶ Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.
- From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.
- ▶ Through games on Oct. 2 of last year, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).
- Three games after Potts' injury, Williams suffered a season-ending injury at Northwestern.
- ▶ In eight games in 2021, Williams ran for 186 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries. Most of his production came in a three-game span, running for 184 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries from Oct. 16 to Oct. 30. Williams was also second on the team in kick returns (5) and kick return yards (60).
- In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was Williams who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher last year.

AUTMAN-BELL OUT FOR YEAR

▶ Sixth-year wide receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** suffered a season-ending lower leg injury against Colorado and had surgery on Sept. 21. Head coach **P.J. Fleck** said after the injury that the team would apply for a seventh-year of eligibility but would leave the decision up to Autman-Bell to use it or not if it was granted.

- ► Through three games this year, Autman-Bell was leading the team in targets (15), targets per game (5.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (214), receiving yards per game (71.3) and yards per catch (19.5), and he was tied for the lead in touchdown receptions (1).
- Against Western Illinois on Sept. 10, Autman-Bell caught five passes for 118 yards. It was his fifth career game with 100+ receiving yards and the second highest total of his career behind 129 against Purdue in 2020.
- Autman-Bell has played in 47 career games with 125 catches (12th in program history) for 1,970 yards (9th) and 13 TDs (T-13th).
- ► He had caught at least one pass in 45 games and has made at least one catch in his past 41 games, which remains the longest active FBS streak and the second longest streak in school history behind **Ron Johnson's** Big Ten record streak of 46 games.
- ▶ Despite missing the first two games of the 2021 season, and the majority of two others due to varying injuries, Autman-Bell still led the team last year in receptions (36), receiving yards (506), receiving yards per game (46.0), receiving touchdowns (6), targets (59) and targets per game (5.4).

O-LINE RELOADS

- ▶ Minnesota's offensive line is one of 22 units named to the Midseason Honor Roll for the Joe Moore Award, which is given to the nation's most outstanding offensive line.
- The Golden Gophers have used the same starting five on the offensive line in every game this season with Aireontae Ersery at left tackle, Axel Ruschmeyer at left guard, John Michael Schmitz at center, Chuck Filiaga at right guard and Quinn Carroll at right tackle.
- ▶ The unit has given up just seven sacks in eight games, tied for sixth in the country in fewest sacks allowed. The rate of 0.88 sacks allowed per game is tied for seventh. Minnesota has had four games this year with zero sacks allowed and has not given up more than two sacks in any contest.
- ► The Gophers are also tied for 19th with 32 tackles for loss given up this year. Those 31 TFLs have resulted in a loss of 93 yards, the fifth fewest yielded this year.
- ▶ Minnesota is coming off a 2021 season where it boasted one of the deepest and most experienced offensive lines in the entire country.
- ▶ The Golden Gophers' line had more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 235. In addition, 12 members of the unit had appeared in at least one game and nine had started at least one contest.

► Four of the five starters have moved on, but Schmitz, a preseason All-American and nominee for the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Rimington Award, returned to anchor this year's unit. The sixth-year senior has started a unit-high 31 games in his career and was Pro Football Focus' highest-graded returning center in the country this year.

- ▶ In the season opener against New Mexico State, Ersery made his first career start at left tackle, while Ruschmeyer lined up next to him at left guard. Schmitz manned the center position, while Filiaga made his Gopher debut by starting at right guard, and Carroll, a Notre Dame transfer, made his first career start when he lined up at right tackle. The unit did not allow a sack, while racking up 297 yards on the ground.
- While the unit may lack the number of starts as a year ago, it is certainly not a young group, but rather a group that has considerable experience in the program. Of the 19 offensive linemen on the Minnesota roster, nearly half are entering at least their fourth year of college, with 15 having at least two years of eligibility remaining.

GOPHERS 'D' AMONG THE BEST

- ► As noted on Page 1, Minnesota boasts one of the best defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi**.
- ▶ One reason Minnesota has been successful this year is that the defense gets off the field. The unit has limited opponents to just 56.5 plays per game this year, the third fewest in the country.

SHUT-DOWN DEFENSE

Minnesota has held 14 of its last 16 opponents, and 16 of its last 19, below their total offense average entering the game, including 10 by more than 100 yards and three by more than 200.

- ▶ Prior to Penn State's 17-point second quarter on Oct. 22, the Gophers had gone 69 straight quarters, each of the prior 17 games plus the first quarter against PSU, without allowing an opponent to score more than 10 points in any quarter. The last team to do so before the Nittany Lions was Miami (OH), which scored 13 points in the fourth quarter on Sept. 11, 2021. Minnesota's steak was far and away the longest active in the nation as the next closest entering play on Oct. 22 belonged to Cincinnati at 36 quarters.
- After shutting out New Mexico State in the 2022 season opener, Minnesota kept its next opponent, Western Illinois, off the scoreboard until a field goal with 1:10 remaining in the first quarter. It ended a scoreless streak by the Gophers defense of 112 minutes and 38 seconds dating back to the second quarter of the Guaranteed Rate Bowl versus West Virginia.
- ▶ The Leathernecks' late touchdown with less than five minutes to play was the first allowed by the Minnesota defense since the second quarter of the Guaranteed Rate Bowl versus West Virginia, a streak of nine straight quarters without allowing a TD.

- ▶ Minnesota has outscored opponents 204-71 over the first three quarters of games this year, including a 89-23 edge in the second quarter. Backups played significant fourth-quarter minutes in each of the team's first four games and yielded 21 points.
- ▶ Since the start of 2021 Minnesota has held 14 teams below 300 yards of offense in a game, including five opponents this year, tied with Wisconsin for the most in the FBS in that span. Prior to their loss to Purdue, the Golden Gophers had held each of their last 11 opponents under 300 yards of total offense.
- ▶ In addition, Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing seven times since the start of 2021, tied for the most in the country in that span. The Gophers have done it three this year against New Mexico State (53), Colorado (90) and Rutgers (86).
- ▶ Minnesota has held 15 of its last 20 opponents below their rushing average entering the game, including nine by more than 50 yards.
- ▶ Since the start of 2021, the Gophers have held 14 opponents to 16 points or fewer, second most in the nation behind only Georgia (17). Minnesota has done it five times this season.

STOPPING THE EXPLOSIVE PLAY

- ► One key for success this year for the Minnesota defense has been the ability to prevent explosive plays.
- ► The longest pass play from scrimmage for a Gopher foe is 40 yards, while only three runs have gone for longer than 20 yards (tied for fourth fewest in the nation).
- ► The Maroon and Gold has yielded just 77 plays of 10 yards or more from scrimmage, tied for ninth best in the FBS, while only 18 plays from scrimmage have gone for more than 20 yards, third best in the country.
- ► The 10 plays allowed of 30+ yards is tied for 12th, but Minnesota is one of five teams in the country that has given up two or fewer plays from scrimmage longer than 40 yards.
- ▶ The Golden Gophers' 49 pass plays allowed of 10 yards or more is tied for fifth best in the country, while the 15 passes of more than 20 yards is tied for third. The Gophers are one of four teams that has allowed no more than one pass play of 40+ yards and one of 12 that has not given up a pass play longer than 50 yards.

MORE ON THE SHUTOUTS

- ▶ Minnesota has two shutouts on the season, a 38-0 win over New Mexico State in the season opener and a 31-0 victory against Rutgers last Saturday. Minnesota has recorded two shutouts in a season for the first time since 2006 and second since 1977.
- ► Georgia and Kansas State are the only other programs with two shutouts this season, but each had one against FCS foe, making Minnesota the only team to shut out two FBS teams this year.
- ► The shutout of Rutgers was the Gophers' first Big Ten shutout victory since a 45-0 win versus Illinois on Oct. 23, 2004.
- ► The Gophers dominated on defense, limiting Rutgers to just 134 total yards (86 passing, 48 rushing), seven first downs, and 2-of-10 conversions on third down. RU averaged just 3.0 yards per play and 2.3 yards per rush.
- ▶ Minnesota's shutout of New Mexico State on Sept. 1 saw a smothering performance by the defense, holding the Aggies to just 91 yards of total offense with 53 yards passing and 38 rushing yards. It's the first time since at least 2000 the Gophers held an opponent to 55 or fewer yards in both passing and rushing offense in one game.

- ► The Aggies were held to only 33 plays on the night, the fewest ever by a Minnesota opponent and tied for the lowest total in the FBS since 2017. The previous school mark was 40, set by Nebraska in 1960 and matched by Middle Tennessee State in 2010.
- ▶ NMSU gained 91 yards (53 passing, 38 rushing), the second fewest by an FBS team so far this season (New Mexico had 88 vs. LSU on Sept. 24). The Golden Gophers also held the Aggies to just six first downs, equaling the fewest allowed in the **P.J. Fleck** era (two off the modern school record) and the second lowest total this year by an FBS program (2 for New Mexico against LSU).
- ► The 91 yards of total offense allowed was the sixth best performance in program history since 1960 and the second fewest since 1967 after last year's performance at Colorado where the Buffaloes were limited to 63 yards.
- ▶ The 38 rushing yards allowed marked the 11th time since 2000 the Gophers held their opponent to at least that number. Four of those 11 games have come under Fleck.
- ▶ Rutgers and New Mexico State both had 21 rushing attempts, tied for the fewest by a Minnesota opponent since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011. Colorado also had 21 last year.
- ► Coupled with a 30-0 shutout at Colorado last year, Minnesota joins Georgia (5) and UAB (3) as the only programs with at least three shutouts in the past two seasons.

SORI-MARIN LEADS DEFENSE

- ▶ Fifth-year linebacker Mariano Sori-Marin is the top returning tackler from last season. He has carried that into 2022, leading the team with 59 tackles so far and ranking tied for second with 3.0 tackles for loss. He also has two pass breakups.
- ▶ On the watch list for the 2022 Butkus Award, he has at least five tackles in every game this year, including a season-high 15 at Penn State on Oct. 17. No other Gopher has at least two tackles in every game.
- ► The game at Penn State was Sori-Marin's fifth career game of at least 10 tackles and his second of at least 15. He had a career-high 18 stops at Nebraska in 2020.
- ► Sori-Marin, who started all 13 games last year but was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue because of injury, finished with 85 tackles, including 23 in a two-game span. After 11 at Northwestern, he had 12 against Illinois, which was the most by a Gopher last year.
- ► Sori-Marin also had 4.5 tackles for loss in 2021 to go with three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and an interception.

WALLEY: FRESHMAN AA

- ▶ Sophomore defensive back **Justin Walley** earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team last season and was PFF's highest graded true freshman cornerback.
- ► This year, he's started all eight games at cornerback and has 18 tackles. He's tied for second on the team with two interceptions, two pass breakups and one fumble recovery.
- ▶ At Michigan State, Walley had three tackles, plus an interception and a fumble recovery. Since at least 2000, he's just the third Gopher to have an interception and fumble recovery in the same game (Jalen Myrick at Purdue in 2015, Mario Reese vs. lowa in 2006).
- ► He picked up his second interception of the season Saturday at Penn State and returned it 37 yards to set up a Minnesota field goal. It was the longest interception return for a Gophers player since **Coney Durr's** 72-yard pick six versus Maryland on Oct. 26, 2019.

BEST NON-CON RECORDS

Since P.J. Fleck arrived in Minnesota in 2017, the Golden Gophers have gone 17-1 against non-conference opponents, including bowl games, which gives them the fourth best winning percentage in the FBS.

- ▶ Walley played in all 13 games last season and started the final six of the season. He made 29 tackles, broke up seven passes, recovered two fumbles, forced one fumble and made one interception.
- ▶ During the season, he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after a standout performance in Minnesota's 23-13 win against Wisconsin.
- ► He recorded his first career interception and finished the game with a career high five tackles, helping Minnesota win Paul Bunyan's Axe for the second time in four years.
- ► Walley was the first Gopher freshman defensive player to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

SENIOR SECONDARY

- ▶ With sophomore Justin Walley manning one of the cornerback spots, the rest of the secondary is filled out by fifth year corner Terrell Smith, fifth year safety Jordan Howden and fourth-year senior safety Tyler Nubin.
- Nubin leads the team with three interceptions, while Howden is tied with Walley for second with two picks and Smith has one. Howden's have come against Western Illinois and Purdue. Smith made his pick to preserve a shutout in the opener against New Mexico State.
- Nubin's first pick this year came against Purdue, and then he had two against Rutgers. He had the first multi-interception game by a Gopher since Antoine Winfield Jr. had two versus Penn State on Nov. 9, 2019.

- ▶ Also against Purdue, Nubin recorded his first forced fumble of the season (second career). He became the first Minnesota player to have both a forced fumble and an interception in the same game since **Eric Murray** versus TCU on Sept. 3, 2015.
- Nubin is second on the team with 35 tackles, and he has 2.0 tackles for loss, one pass breakup and a forced fumble. He had a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.0 for loss at Illinois
- ► Howden is not far behind Nubin with 32 stops, 2.0 tackles for loss and two pass breakups. Howden had 10 tackles against the Illini, his second career game with double-digit stops.
- ► Smith has 27 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks, a forced fumble, one interception and four pass breakups. He's one of 14 players in the country, and one of 10 in the Power 5, to record that stat line in 2022.

Transfers reinforce defense

- ► The Gophers' defense in 2022 has relied on five transfers to provide depth and production at key spots along the defensive line and in the secondary.
- ▶ Defensie Back **Beanie Bishop** spent the past four seasons at Western Kentucky where he played in 36 career games and made 76 tackles, totaled 8.5 tackles for loss, defended 12 passes, made three interceptions and forced one fumble.
- ▶ Last season, he was named All-Conference USA First Team as a defensive back as he made 43 tackles and 6.5 tackle for loss, broke up four passes, made three interceptions (returned one for a touchdown) and forced one fumble. He also returned 28 kickoffs for 676 yards to earn all-conference honorable mention as a kickoff returner.
- ▶ Fellow defensive back **Ryan Stapp** comes to Minnesota following three years at Abilene Christian where he made 91 tackles in 27 games. He added 6.5 tackles for loss, 13 pass breakups and four interceptions. While with the Wildcats, where he was teammates with former Gopher linebacker **Jack Gibbens**, Stapp was on the Southland Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.
- ▶ Defensive lineman **Kyler Baugh** is one of three defensive linemen to transfer in to Minnesota. Baugh played the previous three years at Houston Baptist where he played in 26 career games with 18 starts. He made 104 career tackles, which included 11.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks, broke up four passes, forced a fumble and recovered another. He was a three-time Southland Conference Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll honoree
- ▶ Darnell Jefferies is a defensive lineman coming off a four-year career at Clemson where he was a part of the 2018 national championship team and the 2019 squad that reached the national title game. He played in 29 career games for the Tigers and made 22 tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.
- ▶ The third defensive lineman is Lorenza Surgers who is playing in Minnesota after four seasons at Vanderbilt. He played in 18 career games and made 19 career tackles, which included 1.5 tackles for loss and one sack. He also broke up two passes.
- ▶ Four of the five transfers have played in all eight games for the Gophers this year. Baugh has started all eight contests and has 22 tackles, 0.5 for loss and a pass breakup. Bishop also has 22 stops and a pass breakup, while Stapp has made nine tackles with 1.0 sack, and Jefferies has made four stops.
- Surgers has four tackles, with a sack, in five games.

REDDING READY ON RETURNS

- ▶ Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Quentin Redding** has emerged as a potent weapon in the return game this year for Minnesota.
- ▶ He's returned 10 kickoffs for 260 yards, which is already more yards than any Gopher has had in a season since **Demetrius Douglas** had 594 in 2018. Redding's average of 26.0 yards per return is second in the Big Ten and ranks 15th nationally. That is on pace to be the best kick return average for a Gopher since **Jalen Myrick** averaged 28.2 yards per return in 2014.
- ► At Illinois, Redding set career highs in returns (5) and return yards (151), highlighted by a career-long 92-yard return to start the second half.
- Redding's return was Minnesota's longest since Rodney Smith returned the opening kick 100 yards for a TD versus Nebraska on Nov. 11, 2017. Redding's 151 kick return yards were the most for a Gopher since KiAnte Hardin had 165 versus Illinois on Nov. 21, 2015.
- ► Redding is also averaging 5.9 yards on punt returns, gaining 41 yards on seven returns.

TRICKETT CAN KICK IT

- ► Fifth-year kicker **Matthew Trickett** is eight-of-nine on field goal tries with a long of 46 yards, and he's made all 33 extra point tries.
- ► He's currently second in the Big Ten and 25th nationally with his 88.9 percent success rate on field goals, is ninth in the conference with his 1.0 field goals made per game and ranks ninth with 7.1 points per game.
- Trickett is already 11th in program history with 25 career field goals made.
- Last year Trickett made the most of his first season with Minnesota after transferring from Kent State. He made 36 of 38 extra points and 17 of 25 field goals for 87 points, 41 more than any other Gopher. He ranked ninth in the Big Ten in scoring and 11th nationally with 6.7 points per game. His 87 points were 11th overall in Minnesota single-season history and seventh all-time among Gopher kickers.
- ► Trickett's 17 made field goals tied for fifth most in program history and the most since **Emmit Carpenter** made 17 in 2018. He made 1.31 field goals per game, good for sixth in the Big Ten.
- ► Trickett did miss eight field goal tries last year, though five of those attempts were from 45 yards or longer and three were 50-plus yards.

KESICH: KICKOFF SPECIALIST

- ▶ Junior kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich** has posted touchbacks on 41 of 47 kickoffs this year, including a career-high eight against Western Illinois.
- ► His touchback percentage of 87.23 percent leads the nation, and he's fourth with his 41 touchbacks this year. In addition, he's fourth in kickoff yard average (64.70).
- ► As a result of Kesich's prowess, Minnesota opponents have only had six kickoff returns this year, which ties for sixth fewest in the country, and the 123 kickoff return yards allowed is 10th.

CRAWFORD THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

▶ Mark Crawford is in his third season as the Gophers' punter. He's only punted 22 times this year with 19 of those punts coming in the team's last four games. With 23 punts this year (including a block at Penn State), the Gophers rank tied for 13th in fewest punts this season.

- ► Crawford, who is also the team's holder on kicks, is averaging 41.1 yards on his boots this year. Nine of his 22 punts have been fair caught, seven have landed inside the 20-yard line and only three have been a touchback.
- ► He has four punts this year of 50+ yards, including a long of 53 yards, three of which came at Penn State.
- ▶ Opponents have only returned four punts this year, tied for eighth fewest in the country. They also rank tied for seventh with only seven punt return yards and the 1.75 yards per return ranks tied for ninth.
- ► Last year, Crawford punted 47 times for 1961 yards, an average of 41.7 yards per punt that ranked eighth in the Big Ten. He had six kicks cover at least 50 yards and 24 punts land inside the 20-yard line.
- ► A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.
- ► He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win six Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

- ▶ Minnesota has dominated time of possession this year, averaging 35:17 minutes with the ball. That figure ranks third nationally behind only Air Force (35:44) and Illinois (35:22).
- ► The Golden Gophers opened the year with their highest time of possession in six years under **P.J. Fleck** when they had the ball for a staggering 44:30 against New Mexico State. Minnesota held it for at least 8:58 in every quarter, including 13:29 in the third quarter alone.
- ▶ Seven times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. In addition to New Mexico State, Minnesota also had it for 42:29 this year at Michigan State and 41:02 against Rutgers. It happened three times last year, holding the ball for 40:02 at lowa, 40:09 at Northwestern and 40:13 at Colorado. In 2019, Minnesota recorded 42:53 against Maryland.
- ▶ In 66 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 51 times and gone 35-16 in those contests.

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

- ▶ Minnesota is among the least penalized teams in the country this season, committing 35 penalties for 300 yards.
- ► The Gophers rank 10th nationally and lead the Big Ten with their 4.38 penalties per game, and they are 10th in the FBS and second in the conference with 37.5 penalty vards per contest.
- Minnesota has committed four or fewer penalties in a game five times this year, including a low of two at Illinois.

MILESTONE WATCH

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim needs one rushing touchdown to move into a tie for eighth in Big Ten history (47) and two to tie for seventh (48).
- ▶ Ibrahim is 42 rushing yards away from becoming the third Gopher in program history to reach 4,000 career rushing yards. He's 164 yards away from matching **Rodney Smith** (4,122) for second in program annals.
- ▶ Ibrahim is also 185 all-purpose yards away from matching **Chris Darkins** (4,347) for sixth in program history and 201 behind **Thomas Hamner** (4,363) for fifth.
- ▶ Matthew Trickett is one made field goal away from tying Rhys Lloyd (26) for 10th in program history and four back of Ryan Santoso (29) for ninth.
- More milestone information can be found on page 12.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

- ▶ Tanner Morgan leads all active FBS players in passing yards per attempt (8.93) and ranks 11th in total offense per play (7.45), 14th in passing yards (9,358), 19th in pass efficiency (150.86) and total offense (9,399), 24th in passing touchdowns (63), 25th in pass completions (651), 26th in pass attempts (1,048), 28th in TDs responsible for (71), 30th in total plays (1,261) and 35th in completion percentage (.621).
- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim ranks second among all active FBS players in rushing yards (3,958), rushing attempts per game (19.92), rushing touchdowns (46) and total touchdowns (46), third in rushing yards per game (109.9), rushing attempts (717) and all-purpose plays per game (20.58), fourth in all-purpose plays (741), seventh in all-purpose yards (4,162), eighth in all-purpose yards per game (115.61), 13th in points per game (7.7) and 17th in yards per rush (5.5)
- ▶ Defensive back Ryan Stapp has scored two touchdowns in his career (one interception and one fumble recovery, both at Abilene Christian) to rank 13th among active FBS players in defensive touchdowns.
- ► Fellow defensive back **Beanie Bishop** averaged 25.2 yards per kick return at Western Kentucky, a figure that still ranks 21st in the FBS. He has no returns this year at Minnesota, however.
- ▶ Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** ranks sixth among active FBS players in field goals made and attempted (72-91), eighth in field goals made per game (1.47), ninth in field goal attempts per game (1.86), 11th in points per game (7.7), 17th in extra point percentage (.982) and extra points made and attempted (163-166), and 34th in field goal percentage (.791).

FIVE YEARS OF FLECK

- As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their sixth season under P.J. Fleck. The first five years of the Fleck Era, in which they went 35-23 overall, stack up among the best of any five-year span in program history.
- ► The .603 win percentage is tied for the best mark since 1960-64 (.649) and is tied for the second best percentage since 1944-48.
- ► The team's 21 Big Ten wins are the most since the program won 23 from 1965-69.
- The three bowl wins in a five-year span are tied for second most in program history behind only four from 2015-19 (of which two belong to Fleck).

CIARROCCA BACK AS OC

- ► Kirk Ciarrocca has returned as Minnesota's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, a role he previously held from 2017-19.
- ► Ciarrocca returned after being away for two years. He spent 2020 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Penn State and served in a non-coaching role as an offensive analyst at West Virginia in 2021.
- ► For further evidence of Ciarrocca's success at Minnesota, quarterback **Tanner Morgan** has had eight of his 10 best games in regards to pass efficiency with Ciarrocca as his OC.
- ▶ In addition to previously working with Fleck at Minnesota, Ciarrocca was also his offensive coordinator at Western Michigan for four seasons. Ciarroccaa has spent seven total seasons as an offensive coordinator under Fleck and helped both programs produce record-setting numbers on offense.

Minnesota at Nebraska // Nov. 5, 2022

- ► Ciarrocca was named one of 15 semifinalists for the Broyles Award in 2019 after the Gophers averaged 432 yards per game (fourth most in school history in the modern era) and 34.1 points per game (third most in school history in the modern era). That same year, Minnesota rushed for 25 touchdowns and threw for 31 touchdowns, which was the first time in school history that the Gophers reached both of those numbers in the same season.
- With Ciarrocca as the OC and Joe Rossi as the DC, Minnesota has gone 19-6. That span covers the final four games of 2018 (3-1), the 2019 regular season (10-2) and this season (5-3).

THREE ADDED TO STAFF IN 2022

- ▶ In addition to the hiring of Ciarrocca, Minnesota added three assistant coaches to its staff in the offseason.
- **Danny Collins** is coaching the Gopher safeties. He has been on the Minnesota staff since 2017 and has served in multiple roles with the Gophers, most recently as a Senior Defensive Analyst.
- Collins was in quality control in his first season in Minnesota in 2017, then transitioned to a graduate assistant position for the 2018 season and was named interim defensive backs coach for Minnesota's win against Georgia Tech in the Quick Lane Bowl.
- Collins moved back to quality control in 2019 and again worked on the defensive side of the ball. He was thrust into on-field coaching duties again at the Outback Bowl and was the interim defensive line coach. Collins came to Minnesota from Western Michigan where he was a defensive GA from 2015-17 under **P.J. Fleck**.
- ► Greg Harbaugh (pronounced HAR-bo) is coaching the Gopher tight ends. He returns to Minnesota for a third stint with the Gophers, as he previously served in a quality control role twice on the Minnesota staff (2017, '19). Harbaugh most recently was the receivers coach at Western Michigan for the 2020 and 2021 seasons. Prior to his first stint at Minnesota in 2017, Harbaugh was also at Western Michigan in 2015 and 2016 as a graduate assistant under Fleck.
- ▶ Veteran coach and proven recruiter **Brick Haley** is leading Minnesota's defensive line. Haley brings more than 30 years of experience both in college and in the NFL to the Gophers. He has primarily coached the defensive line in his career, but has also been a defensive coordinator and coached linebackers.
- ► Haley most recently was at Missouri where he coached the defensive line for four seasons and also held the title of Senior Associate Head Coach. Prior to Missouri, Haley spent two seasons at Texas, and before that he was at LSU for from 2009-14, where he perennially directed one of the nation's most disruptive defensive fronts.
- ▶ In addition to those three, one other offseason change saw cornerbacks coach **Paul Haynes** get promoted to co-defensive coordinator. Haynes joined the University of Minnesota coaching staff in February 2020 and has been instrumental in the Gophers cornerbacks' contributions to a stout defense.

GOPHER GRADUATES

Minnesota's 2022 roster features 17 student-athletes who have already graduated: Chris Autman-Bell, Nathan Boe, Chuck Filiaga, Clay Geary, Mohamed Ibrahim, Jordan Howden, Darnell Jefferies, Preston Jelen, Tanner Morgan, Braelen Oliver, Samuel Pickerign, Axel Ruschmeyer, Thomas Rush, John Michael Schmitz, Terell Smith, Mariano Sori-Marin and Lorenza Surgers.

FOUR GOPHERS DRAFTED

- Minnesota had four players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft. That ups its total since 2020 to 11, which is fifth in the Big Ten and tied for 13th nationally.
- ► Seattle took **Boye Mafe** in the second round with the 40th overall pick, making him the first Minnesota defensive lineman drafted since **Ra'Shede Hageman** went 37th overall in 2014.
- ▶ Daniel Faalele was next off the board as Baltimore took him in the fourth round with the No. 110 pick. Faalele was the first Gopher offensive lineman to be drafted since 2006 when both Greg Eslinger and Mark Setterstrom were selected.
- ► The Minnesota Vikings selected defensive lineman Esezi Otomewo in the fifth round with the No. 165 pick. He was the first Gopher to be selected by the Vikings since 2010, when the purple and gold took linebacker Nate Triplett in the fifth round.
- ► Ko Kieft was the final Gopher off the board as the tight end was taken by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the sixth round with the No. 218 overall pick. He became the first Gopher tight end picked since Maxx Williams in 2015.
- With the picks of Mafe and Otomewo, it was the first time two Gopher d-linemen were taken in the same draft since 1958.
- Minnesota has now had 12 players taken in a four-year span (2019-22). That is the most selections in that time frame in school history since the draft was reduced to seven rounds in 1994. Minnesota's previous best in a four-year span was from 1988-91 when it had 14 players taken in drafts that were 12 rounds.

SCORIGAMI

- Scorigami is a concept thought up by Jon Bois at SB Nation and tracks final scores that have never happened before in NFL history. Inspired by Bois, what follows are the Scorigami results this season for Minnesota football.
- Minnesota 38, New Mexico State 0. No scorigami. It's the fourth such score in program history. The Gophers have won by this score three times in their program history, with the most recent occurrence taking place in 1975 against Western Michigan.
- Minnesota 62, Western Illinois 10. Scorigami achieved. In 1,296 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.
- Minnesota 49, Colorado 7. No Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end in this score, all Minnesota victories. The last was in 1998 against Iowa.
- Minnesota 34, Michigan State 7. No Scorigami. This was the seventh game in program history to end in this score, with Minnesota winning five of them. The most recent was a victory over Nebraska in 2019.
- ▶ Purdue 20, Minnesota 10. Scorigami achieved. In 1,299 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.
- ▶ Illinois 26, Minnesota 14. Partial Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end by this score, most recently a win at Nebraska in 1960. It's the first time Minnesota has lost by the score.
- ▶ Penn State 45, Minnesota 17. No Scorigami. This was the second game to end by this score with the other being a loss at Purdue in 2011.
- Minnesota 31, Rutgers 0. Partial Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end by this score, but the first in which Minnesota won.

HEAD COACH // SIXTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 41, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 70-48 and is 40-26 at Minnesota.

In five years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program. Fleck is already sixth in program history in overall wins (35) and Big Ten wins (21), and eighth in games coached (58). Fleck's .603 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season twice, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 3-0 in bowl games and those three wins are tied with Glen Mason (3-4 bowl record during his time coaching the Gophers from 1997-2006) for the most in school history.

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), eight Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 268 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Aubum) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Aubum) since 1962. He has also led Minnesota to a 3-0 record in bowl games and has had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Mohamed Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (15.7.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied

school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the

Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats om the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also host-

ed a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head cond at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rugers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and lowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.


