FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

Minnesota (7-4, 4-4 B1G) closes out the regular season Saturday as it visits Wisconsin (6-5, 4-4 B1G) at 2:30 p.m. on ESPN with radio coverage on KFAN. The most played FBS rivalry in college football history at 131 games, Saturday will be the ninth straight year that the Gophers and Badgers face off in the regular season finale.

Mohamed Ibrahim has rushed 277 times in 10 games this season for 1,524 yards (5.5 average) and 19 touchdowns. He's posted those numbers despite missing the Purdue contest and not playing beyond the opening drive of the second half in any of the first three contests this season. In the process, he's extended his streak of 100+ rushing yards to 19 games, the longest in the FBS since at least 2000. A semfinalist for the Doak Walker Award, Ibrahim leads the country this year with his 19 touchdowns, all of which have been on the ground. For context, there are 70 FBS teams that have not yet reached 19 rushing TDs this year. In addition, his 152.4 rushing yards per game leads the nation and is a higher average than 66 teams currently have. Ibrahim is second nationally in rushing yards, attempts, attempts per game (27.7) and scoring (11.4), and is third in points scored (114) and fourth in all-purpose yards per game (157.40). After winning Paul Bunyan's Axe last season, Minnesota is looking to claim it for a second straight year for the first time since the 1993-94 seasons.

Minnesota boasts one of the best and most well-rounded defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator Joe Rossi. The Golden Gophers rank seventh in the country by allowing 274.5 total yards per contest. They also have the No. 3 defense in terms of scoring (13.1 ppg), No. 8 in passing yards allowed (172.1) and the No. 10 rush defense (102.5). Minnesota, Illinois and Michigan are the only teams in the FBS that rank in the top 10 in each of those categories.

Though the all-time series has been played 131 times, Saturday marks the 74th battle for Paul Bunyan's Axe, a full history of which can be found on Page 50. First played for in 1948, the all-time series record for the Axe is tilted in Wisconsin's favor at 44-26-3. The teams have each won the Axe twice in the last four seasons, including

a college head coach, Fleck is 72-49 (.595).

FACING WISCONSIN

► In the most-played FBS rivalry in college football history, Minnesota and Wisconsin meet for the 132nd time on Saturday. Minnesota trails in the all-time series 61-62-8, though the Gophers' 61 wins against the Badgers are their second most wins against one team behind only lowa (62).

- ► Coming off last season's 23-13 win in Minneapolis, Minnesota is looking to win two in a row in the series for the first time since the 1993-94 seasons.
- The teams have split the last four contests with each team winning once at home and once on the road. In those four games, the Golden Gophers have a slight 94-86 edge in scoring over the Badgers.
- In Madison, Minnesota trails 35-23-6 in the series. That's the most games played for the Gophers against one opponent on the road, while the only team they've beaten more away from home is Northwestern (25).
- ▶ Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** is 2-3 versus Wisconsin while with the Gophers and 2-4 all-time in his coaching career.
- Only Minnesota (26) and Illinois (12) have more Gopher natives than the 11 that call Wisconsin home.
- Minnesota's 11 Wisconsin natives are: freshman OL Ashton Beers (Slinger), freshman RB Cole Berghorn (Walworth), redshirt junior OL Tyler Cooper (Saint Croix Falls), redshirt sophomore LB Lucas Finnessy (Sussex), freshman RB Max Grand (Ellsworth), redshirt freshman OL Jackson Hunter (Oconomowoc), junior K Dragan Kesich (Oak Creek), redshirt junior LB Derik LeCaptain (Gardner), freshman WR Evan Redding and redshirt freshman WR Quentin Redding (both Menemonee Falls), and freshman LB Jack Tinnen (Brookfield).

- ► Fleck and Wisconsin offensive line coach Bob Bostad were on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers staff in 2012 when Fleck coached wide receivers and Bostad the offensive line. Bostad was also a graduate assistant working with the offensive line at Minnesota from 1992-94.
- Minnesota co-defensive coordinator/CBs coach Paul Haynes was the head coach at Kent State from 2013-17. and UW cornerbacks coach Hank Poteat coached the same position with the Golden Flashes from 2015-16.
- Wisconsin enters the game with a 6-5 record overall and is one of three teams tied for third in the Big Ten West at 4-4 in league play along with Minnesota and Illinois.

- ► The Badgers started the season 2-3, and after a loss to Illinois on Oct. 1, they fired head coach Paul Chryst and named Jim Leonhard as interim head coach. Since taking over, Leonhard and Wisconsin have gone 4-2.
- Minnesota and Wisconsin have played seven common opponents this year in Big Ten foes Illinois, Northwestern, Michigan State, Purdue, Iowa and Nebraska, plus New Mexico State in the non-conference. Both teams are 4-3 in those games with the Gophers beating Northwestern, Michigan State, Nebraska and New Mexico State, while the Badgers have defeated the Wildcats, Boilermakers, Cornhuskers and Aggies.
- Graham Mertz has completed 147-of-258 passes for 1,960 yards, 19 touchdowns and nine interceptions for a QB rating of 138.1 in 11 games.
- Braelon Allen has 1,126 rushing yards with 10 touchdowns on 208 carries to lead the Badgers rushing attack. The receiving corps is led by Chimere Dike, who has team highs in receptions (39), receiving yards (601) and touchdown catches (6).
- Defensively, Jordan Turner leads the team with 56 tackles and has added 3.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, one interception, a forced fumble and a pass breakup.
- Linebacker Nick Herbig leads the nation with his 1.10 sacks per game (11.0 total), while his average of 1.6 tackles for loss per contest leads the Big Ten and is eighth in the FBS (15.5 TFL overall this year). Herbig was called for targeting in the second half of last Saturday's game at Nebraska and will miss Saturday's opening half.
- In the secondary, John Torchio leads the Big Ten and is fifth nationally with his five interceptions, while Jay Shaw's six pass breakups lead the team.

LAST TIME VS. THE BADGERS

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Tanner Morgan overcame an interception that was returned for a first-half touchdown, leading Minnesota on three scoring drives after halftime to surge past No. 18 Wisconsin 23-13 last season in Minneapolis to take back Paul Bunyan's Axe.
- Morgan, who went 11 for 16 for 199 yards and a third-quarter touchdown pass to Chris Autman-Bell, led the Gophers on the sprint into the end zone to hoist the 73-yearold trophy on their home field for the first time since 2003.
- The Gophers held Wisconsin freshman standout Braelon Allen to 47 yards on 17 rushes and forced Graham Mertz to throw throughout the second half. Mertz went 21 for 38 for 171 yards and an interception.
- ► Allen had topped the 100-yard mark in each of the last seven games, all wins for Wisconsin. The Badgers had 62 rushing yards, after averaging 229 yards on the ground entering the week.
- Collin Larsh made two field goals for Wisconsin but had a 48-yard try — four yards beyond his career long — bounce off the crossbar early in the fourth quarter. Minnesota went the other way for Matthew Trickett's third field goal of the game to put the stamp on it.
- Scott Nelson returned a tipped-ball interception 25 yards for a touchdown for the Badgers early in the second quarter to give them a 10-3 lead.
- The Gophers got their first big break early in the third quarter when Justin Walley, who had two pass interference penalties on the afternoon while covering Kendric Pryor, wrestled away a catch by Pryor for his first career interception at the Wisconsin 28.
- Morgan hit tight end Brevyn Spann-Ford for 26 yards to the 2 on the next play. Then Ky Thomas ran it in for a 13-10 lead with eight offensive linemen blocking on the play.
- Minnesota reached the end zone on its next possession, too, as Morgan connected with Autman-Bell.

PREVIOUSLY IN MADISON

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Collin Larsh kicked a 30-yard field goal in overtime to give Wisconsin a 20-17 victory over Minnesota in the battle for Paul Bunyan's Axe when the teams last met in Madison in 2020.
- ▶ Minnesota failed to score on its first possession in overtime when **Anders Gelecinskyj's** 36-yard field goal attempt sailed just outside the left upright.
- Minnesota tied it at 17 on **Tanner Morgan's** 9-yard touchdown pass to **Michael Brown-Stephens** with 4:40 remaining. Morgan kept the 12-play, 75-yard drive alive on fourth-and-4 with a 4-yard keeper to the Wisconsin 4.
- ▶ After Gelecinskyj's 38-yard field goal put Minnesota up 10-7 midway through the third quarter, backup QB Chase Wolf came on for UW and, under heavy pressure, rolled left and hit Jack Dunn for the score to put Wisconsin up 14-10.
- ► Collin Larsh added a 38-yard field goal on Wisconsin's next possession to make it 17-10 with 11:30 remaining in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ The Gophers capitalized on field position for their first score after Morgan's pooch punt pinned Wisconsin at the 1-yard line. The Badgers went three and out and Minnesota responded with a six-play, 53-yard touchdown drive as Morgan hit **Cam Wiley** on a wheel route for a 16-yard touchdown to put Minnesota up 7-0.
- ▶ Wisconsin countered on its next possession with a 39-yard touchdown run up the middle by Garrett Groshek. He entered with 105 total yards rushing on the season, but carried 24 times for 154 yards and a touchdown.

MEMORABLE AXE GAMES

- Nov. 24, 2018: **Demetrius Douglas** returned a punt 69 yards for a touchdown higlighting Minnesota's 37-15 win, snapping a 14-game losing streak in the rivalry. **Mohamed Ibrahim** ran for 121 yards, including a 10-yard touchdown run, on 26 carries, while **Bryce Williams** ran for two touchdowns in the fourth quarter as the Gophers won in Madison for the first time since 1994.
- ▶ Nov. 8, 2003: **Rhys Lloyd** kicked a game-winning 35-yard field goal as time expired to give Minnesota a 37-34 victory. **Marion Barber III** ran for 139 yards and a score, while **Laurence Maroney** added 135 yards and a touchdown of his own.
- Nov. 14, 1987: Rickey Foggie connected with Craig Otto on a 3-yard touchdown pass with just 36 seconds remaining to give Minnesota a 22-19 win in Minneapolis. The win was Minnesota's fourth straight in the series, something that hadn't been achieved since 1946-49.

RECAPPING IOWA

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Drew Stevens made a 21-yard field goal with 28 seconds left to lift lowa over Minnesota for a 13-10 victory on Saturday, after the Hawkeyes forced two late turnovers to take control of the Big Ten West with their eighth straight win over the Gophers for the Floyd of Rosedale trophy.
- ▶ Jack Campbell caused a fumble and came up with an interception off a tipped pass to thwart Minnesota drives in the closing minutes for lowa.
- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim trampled a dominant Hawkeyes defense by rushing for a career-high 263 yards and a touchdown on 39 carries, but the sixth-year star lost just his second fumble of the season with 5:07 remaining on a third-and-4 run that would've given the Gophers a first down at the 9. Campbell knocked the ball out, and Deontae Craig recovered it.
- Minnesota forced a three-and-out and took over at its 45 with 4:11 to go, when Ibrahim ripped a 19-yard run off the right side to put the Gophers right back in scoring range.

- ▶ But on third-and-7 from the 33, **Athan Kaliakmanis** making his third career start threw a slant to fellow redshirt freshman **La'Meke Brockington** that Riley Moss reached to deflect. Campbell snagged it in the air, returned it 30 yards and almost scored; but his right foot was ruled out at the 45
- ▶ Spencer Petras, who scored on a first-quarter quarterback sneak and went 15 for 24 for 221 yards, hit Luke Lachey for 33 yards on the next play. That put the Hawkeyes well within range for their freshman kicker, who made a 38-yarder in the first quarter.
- ▶ Matthew Trickett hit a 27-yard field goal in the third quarter for Minnesota, but he pulled a 34-yard try wide right with 38 seconds left before halftime. On the previous play, Kaliakmanis rolled left on third-and-1 and, under pressure by Campbell, missed a wide-open Brevyn Spann-Ford at the sideline. Moss almost intercepted the throw that went near the goal line.

IN THE POLLS

- ▶ With its three-game win streak snapped, Minnesota dropped out among teams receiving votes in both the AP Poll and USA Today Coaches Poll. Last week, the Golden Gophers are eighth among those receiving votes by the AP, and sixth for those in the Coaches Poll.
- ► Saturday will be the just the third time in 12 games this year that Minnesota enters the contest not appearing in either poll. The Gophers are 2-0 in those previous games.
- ▶ All four of Minnesota's losses this year have come against teams currently ranked in the two major polls. Penn State checks in at No. 11 in the AP Poll and No. 10 in the Coaches, while Illinois, lowa and Purdue are all receiving votes in both polls.
- ▶ Minnesota was receiving votes in the AP Preseason Poll. 2022 is the 11th season that Minnesota can make that claim, including three of the past four years, according to CollegePollArchive.com. The Gophers are looking to start and finish the year in the AP Poll for the second time in program history, also doing so in 2019.

SUCCESS ON 3RD DOWNS

- ▶ Minnesota has been one of the top teams in the country this year, on both sides of the ball, on 3rd downs. The offense is third in the FBS in conversion percentage, while the defense is second best in opponent conversion rate.
- ▶ Minnesota's offense has converted 77 of 142 3rd downs for a 54.23 percent success rate. For context, that's only .44 behind the top team, Washington, are there are only nine teams other than Minnesota above 50 percent in the FBS this year.
- ► The Gophers have converted on better than 63 percent of third downs in five of their 11 games this year, including a season-best 86.7 percent (13-15) versus Colorado.
- ▶ On the other side of the ball, Minnesota has allowed opponents to convert just 34-of-133 third downs, 25.56 percent. Marshall (21.38 percent) is the only team with a better rate than the Gophers, and only 10 other teams are under 30 percent on the season.
- ► The 34 conversions allowed are tied for the fewest in the nation with Marshall, while the 122 3rd downs faced are tied for 10th.
- ▶ Penn State has had the most "success" against Minnesota this year by converting 5-of-11 3rd downs (45.5%). Otherwise, Illinois was 6-of-17 (35.3%), Purdue was 4-of-14 (28.6%), Iowa and Nebraska were 3-of-11 (27.3%), Michigan State was 2-of-8 (25.0%), Northwestern was 3-of-12 (25.0%), New Mexico State was 2-of-9 (22.2%), Rutgers was 2-of-10 (20.0%), Colorado was 1-of-12 (8.3%) and Western Illinois was 1-of-13 (7.7%).

EXTRA EFFICIENT

- According to BCFToys.com, Minnesota has been one of the most efficient teams this year in regards to points per drive, net available yards and net yards per play.
- ► Ratings and supporting data on BCFToys is calculated from the results of non-garbage possessions in FBS vs. FBS games.
- ▶ Minnesota's offense averages 2.48 points per drive, 49th in the FBS, while the defense is seventh at 1.33. That net rating of 1.14 points per drive is 15th in the nation.
- Available yards percentage is calculated by dividing drive yards earned by available yards measured from starting field position to end zone.
- ► The Gophers rank 39th offensively in available yards percentage at .517, while the defense is No. 13 at .355. That gives them a net percentage of .163 that sits ninth among FBS schools.
- Minnesota also ranks 78th in offensive yards per play at 5.55, while the defense is 13th in the FBS at 4.77. The net difference of 0.79 puts the team 33rd in the FBS and 20th in the Power 5.

EXPLOSIVE RUNS PUSH OFFENSE

- ▶ Minnesota has 156 plays from scrimmage this year that have gained at least 10 yards. Of those plays, 77 have been rushes of 10+ yards, tied for 11th most in the country.
- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim is responsible for 43 of those 77 runs to rank third in the country for runs of 10+ yards. His 10 runs of 20+ yards ties for 20th in the FBS and his five runs of 30+ is tied for 18th nationally.

MILESTONE WATCH

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim is 127 rushing yards away from tying Darrell Thompson's school record of 4,654 career rushing yards.
- ► Ibrahim is 49 all-purpose yards away from matching **Laurence Maroney** (4,787) for third in program history.
- ▶ In terms of single-season records, Ibrahim is 102 yards back of **David Cobb's** school record of 1,626 rushing yards set in 2014.
- lbrahim is also 37 rushing attempts behind Cobb's record 314, also set in 2014.
- ▶ Ibrahim has tied Gary Russell's overall touchdown mark of 19 (set in 2005) and Russell's single-season record of 114 points, also set in 2005.
- ▶ Ibrahim also sits 13th in all-purpose yards (1,574) and could jump several spots Saturday.
- ▶ With eight career interceptions, **Tyler Nubin** needs one more to crack Minnesota's top-10 and two more to become the eighth player to reach 10 for a Gopher career.
- ▶ Matthew Trickett needs to make two extra points to match Dan Nystrom (42 in 2002) for seventh in team single-season annals.

MORE ON MO

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim is back in 2022 after missing nearly all of last season following a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's 2021 season opener. As noted on Page 1, he's been one of the top running backs in the country this year.
- ▶ During Ibrahim's 19-game streak of 100+ rushing yards, he's rushed 528 times for 2,903 yards and 37 touchdowns. He's averaging 5.50 yards per rush and 152.8 yards per game over that span and has added 15 catches for 106 yards.

- ▶ He's had four games of more than 200 yards during his streak, including a career-high 263 Saturday against lowa, 12 games with at least two rushing touchdowns, six games with three or more scores and a pair of four-TD games that tied Minnesota's single-game record.
- Ibrahim has six games this year with at least two rushing touchdowns, tied with Ole Miss' Quinshon Judkins for the most in the country. Ibrahim is also one of seven FBS players this year to have three games with three or more rushing touchdowns.
- ▶ Ibrahim has been asked to carry the load as of late, rushing at least 30 times in each of the last five games. His five games of 30+ rushing attempts this season is tied for most in the FBS.
- ▶ Within the Big Ten, Ibrahim leads the conference in total touchdowns (19), rushing touchdowns (19), rushing yards per game (152.4) and points per game (11.4), and is second in rushing yards (1,524) and points scored (114), all-purpose yards per game (157.40), sixth in yards per carry (5.50), seventh in points responsible for per game (11.4), eighth in points personsible for (114) and 11th in total offense per game (152.4).
- ▶ Ibrahim also leads all Power 5 players this year with 18 redzone rushing touchdowns, according to Pro Football Focus. The one rushing score that didn't come in the redzone was a 28-yarder against Rutgers, the longest TD run of his career.
- ▶ With 1,261 rushing yards on the season, he has reached 1,000 yards for the third time in his career (also doing so in 2018 and 2020). Ibrahim joins Laurence Maroney (2003-05) and Darrell Thompson (1986-87, '89) as the only Gophers to accomplish the feat.
- ▶ Ibrahim's 152.4 rushing yards per game currently ranks second best in Minnesota single-season history behind his school record of 153.7 per game set in 2020.
- ► He's got 16 games in his career with multiple touchdowns (six this year), including seven games with at least three scores (three this season) and two games with a school-record four touchdowns.
- ▶ The 2020 Big Ten Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, Ibrahim holds the program record with 52 career rushing touchdowns, 52 total touchdowns, 24 games of 100 yards rushing and five career games of 200 yards rushing. His 312 points are second overall and the most by a non-kicker at Minnesota. He's also currently the program leader in rushing yards per game (116.1).
- ▶ Ibrahim is also second at Minnesota in rushing yards (4,527), fourth in rushing attempts (824) and all-purpose yards (4,738) and seventh in yards per carry (5.49).
- ▶ Within the Big Ten, Ibrahim is sixth in career rushing touchdowns with 52, while his 52 overall touchdowns is 10th in conference annals. He needs 149 rushing yards to crack the conference's all-time top-10 list.

IBRAHIM B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after rushing for a career-high 263 yards and one touchdown on 39 carries against lowa. This is the second time that Ibrahim has received the honor in his career as he was also honored once in 2020.
- ▶ His 263 yards are fifth most in the nation this year (most in Big Ten by 20 yards), fourth highest in program history and the most since **Chris Darkins'** program record of 294 against Purdue in 1995. It was also the most rushing yards against lowa, who entered the game ranked eighth nationally by 88.6 rush yards per game, since Northern Illinois' Leshon Johnson's 306 yards in 1993.
- ▶ Ibrahim also set a Huntington Bank Stadium record for rushing attempts (39), and his 263-yard effort was the most in stadium history for a Gophers player, topping David Cobb's 220-yard performance versus Middle Tennessee State on Sept. 6, 2014.

WINNINGEST OB AT MINNESOTA

- ► Sixth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his fourth full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's the winningest QB to wear the Maroon and Gold.
- ▶ Morgan was injured at Illinois and did not play at Penn State on Oct. 22, snapping a streak of 45 straight starts. With **Athan Kaliakmanis** under center against the Nittany Lions, it marked the first time a quarterback other than Morgan started for Minnesota since **Zack Annexstad** at Nebraska on Oct. 20, 2018.
- Morgan missed only one game and returned the next week against Rutgers, completing 14-of-21 passes for 122 yards and running three times for 17 yards. Morgan missed the second half at Nebraska due to injury and has missed the past two games with Northwestern and lowa.
- ► This season, he has completed 103-of-153 passes for 1,324 yards and seven touchdowns with five interceptions. He's also added 63 rushing yards and a career-high four touchdowns on 32 carries.
- ► His completion percentage this season of .673 is on pace to break his own school record of .632 set in 2019, while his pass efficiency rating of 148.57 is currently ranked third in Minnesota single-season history.
- ► His career completion percentage of .622 is first in school history (50 points ahead of second place), as is his 150.58 efficiency rating, .702 win percentage and 33 wins.
- ▶ Morgan ranks second in school history in completion and attempts (657-of-1056), passing yards (9,396), passing touchdowns (63), total offense (9,409), quarterback starts (47) and games with 250+ yards passing (12). He's also third in TD:INT ratio (1.97) and fourth in passing yards per game (188.2) and 300-yard passing games (4).
- ► He has led the Gophers in passing each year since 2018, joining him with **Adam Weber** (2007-10) and **Rickey Foggie** (1984-87) as the only QBs in Gopher history to lead the team in passing yards four times. He is on track to become the first to do it in five years.
- ► Morgan has at least 12 season and game team records and was All-B1G Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-B1G Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

MORGAN B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- ► After helping Minnesota to a 34-7 win at Michigan State on Sept. 24, **Tanner Morgan** was named the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week along with Michigan's Blake Corum.
- Morgan completed 23-of-26 passes for 268 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. It was his fourth career game completing at least 83 percent of his passes, and he now owns the top three marks in program history after completing 88.5 percent against the Spartans.
- ▶ It was his eighth career game with at least three touchdowns passes and the third of his career with at least that many scoring strikes and no interceptions.
- ► Morgan was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Nov. 9, 2020, when **Mohamed Ibrahim** received the honor.
- ▶ It was the third time in his career that Morgan was tabbed as the conference's Offensive Player of the Week, as he was also bestowed the honor on Nov. 11, 2019 and Sept. 30, 2019. Morgan and **Adam Weber** are the only Minnesota quarterbacks to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week three times in their careers.

KALIAKMANIS STEPS UP AT OB

► Redshirt freshman **Athan Kaliakmanis** has played in nine games with three starts and gone 34-of-73 for 547 yards with one touchdown and four interceptions.

- ▶ When **Tanner Morgan** was injured at Illinois, it was Kaliakmanis who came on in relief. He completed two of his six passes for 17 yards and threw the first two interceptions of his career
- ► Kaliakmanis then made his first career start at Penn State's White Out in place of the injured Morgan, completing 9-of-22 passes for 175 yards with one touchdown and one interception, and rushing seven times for 45 yards Over the last 45 seasons, 31 QBs have started for the Gophers. Kaliakmanis' 19.4 yards per completion ranked third best among those signal-callers in their debut.
- ▶ The last Gopher quarterback to make his first career start on the road before Kaliakmanis was Conor Rhoda at Maryland on Oct. 15, 2016, while the last Gopher QB to make his first career start against a ranked team was MarQueis Gray at then-No. 25 USC on Sept. 3, 2011. With Penn State ranked 16th, Kaliakmanis' start was against the highest ranked opponent for a first career start since Andy Persby started against then-No. 13 Penn State on Oct. 10, 1998.

- ► Kaliakmanis also replaced an injured Morgan in the second half at Nebraska, completing 6-of-12 passes for 137 yards and rushing three times for 27 yards.

 Minnesota was down 10-0 when Kaliakmanis entered the game and he helped led the Gophers to a 20-13 victory.
- ► He has since started the last two games against started Saturday against Northwestern and Iowa.
- ▶ In his three starts this year, Kaliakmanis is 23-of-50 for 326 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions.
- ▶ Kaliakmanis was a four-star recruit according to 247Sports and ESPN and ranked as the No. 16 quarter-back in the nation according to Rivals. He was listed as the No. 2 prospect in Illinois according to 247Sports and 267th overall by ESPN.

RELIABLE TIGHT END TARGET

- ► Gopher tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** is making the most of his redshirt senior campaign as he leads the team in targets (50), receptions (33), touchdown receptions (2), yards after catch (189) and he's second in receiving yards (386) and YAC per game (17.2).
- ► Trailing teammate **Daniel Jackson** by just 12 receiving yards, Spann-Ford is looking to become the first Gophers tight end to lead the team in receiving yards since **Maxx Williams** did it in 2013 and 2014. Before that, **Patt Evans** last did it in 1991.
- ► Spann-Ford has been targeted at least two times in every game this year, the only Gopher to make that claim. He's also the only Minnesota player to have a catch in every game this season.
- ► At Penn State, he set career highs in both receptions and receiving yards as he caught five balls for 68 yards and a score.
- ▶ Spann-Ford saw his production grow over the final weeks of last season. Of his 30 targets last year, 17 came in the final four weeks of the regular season, including a season-high six targets versus Illinois and four against lowa and Wisconsin. He caught 23 passes for 296 yards and a touchdown last year, tying for third on the team in receptions and ranking fourth in receiving yards.
- Spann-Ford's 76.7 percent catch rate was the best on the team for anyone with at least 10 targets last year.

JACKSON STEPPING UP

- ▶ With Chris Autman-Bell out for the season, fellow wide receiver Daniel Jackson has helped pick up some of the production.
- ▶ Jackson missed the first two games of the season due to injury, but he's made up for lost time. He leads the team with 5.2 targets per game and 398 receiving yards and is tied for team lead in touchdown receptions (2). He's also second in targets (47), receptions (28), receiving yards per game (44.2) and yards after catch (149), and third in YAC per game (16.6).
- ► He recorded three catches for 42 yards and two touchdowns at Michigan State for the first multi-TD game of his career. The next week against Purdue, he posted a career-high 110 receiving yards on six receptions, including a career-long 66 yard gain.
- ▶ His nine targets against the Boilermakers remain the most by a Gopher this year, while his 45 targets over the last seven games (since Autman-Bell's injury) are most on the team.
- ▶ Jackson has been the team's leading receiver five times this season, most on the squad.
- ▶ Despite missing two games last year, Jackson was second on the team in receptions (25), targets (53) and targets per game (4.8). He had a career-high 58 receiving yards versus Ohio State in the 2021 season opener.

BROWN-STEPHENS ADDS DEPTH TO WR CORPS

- ► Redshirt junior wide receiver **Michael Brown-Stephens** is third on the team in targets (39), receiving yards (338), receptions (22) and yards after catch (109).
- At Michigan State, he had a career-high six receptions on six targets and led the team with 73 yards.
- Last year he had 23 catches in 2021 and turned them into 392 receiving yards, the second-highest yardage total on the team. His 17.0 yards per catch average was third on the team and ranked fifth in the Big Ten among players with at least 20 catches.
- ▶ At Purdue last year, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 54 and 51 yards, the second and third longest receptions by a Gopher last year, respectively. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane Bennett**, with 121 yards on two catches vs. Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.
- ► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.

GEARY MAKING MOST OF 7TH YEAR

- ▶ Wide receiver **Clay Geary** is in his seventh season of eligibility for the Golden Gophers and making the most of his last go-around in Maroon and Gold.
- After redshirting as a freshman walk-on in 2016, he played in nine games over the next two seasons with one catch. He was put on scholarship prior to 2019 and was surprised with the news after throwing out the first pitch at a Minnesota Twins game. He then went on to play in 10 games that year, mostly on special teams, before appearing five times in 2020 with five receptions for 50 yards. Geary then missed all of 2021 after a torn ACL in camp.
- ► He's gotten back into the fold this year with six catches for 85 yards and a touchdown. The touchdown, an acrobatic eight-yard reception against Colorado, was the first of his career.
- ► Geary has caught six of the seven passes thrown his way, the second highest catch rate (85.7%) among Gophers with at least three targets this season.

POTTS, WILLIAMS BOUNCE BACK FROM INJURIES

- ▶ Running backs **Trey Potts** and **Bryce Williams** are both coming off season-ending injuries suffered in 2021.
- ▶ Potts has 90 carries for 442 yards (4.9 average) and three touchdowns to go with three receptions for 23 yards in 10 games (did not play at Illinois). Williams has played in all 11 games and has carried 48 times for 232 yards (4.8 average) and three scores and caught 10 passes for 83 yards.
- ▶ Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's 2021 game at Purdue. He was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.
- ▶ The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back after the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.
- ▶ In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, 2021, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries tied for 14th in the FBS.

- ► He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then had 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before adding 78 yards and a TD on 15 carries at Purdue.
- ▶ Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.
- ► From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.
- ► Through games on Oct. 2 of last year, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).
- ► Three games after Potts' injury, Williams suffered a season-ending injury at Northwestern.
- ▶ In eight games in 2021, Williams ran for 186 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries. Most of his production came in a three-game span, running for 184 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries from Oct. 16 to Oct. 30. Williams was also second on the team in kick returns (5) and kick return yards (60).
- ▶ In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was Williams who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher last year.

AUTMAN-BELL OUT FOR YEAR

- ► Sixth-year wide receiver Chris Autman-Bell suffered a season-ending lower leg injury against Colorado and had surgery on Sept. 21. Head coach P.J. Fleck said after the injury that the team would apply for a seventh-year of eligibility but would leave the decision up to Autman-Bell to use it or not if it was granted.
- ► Through three games this year, Autman-Bell was leading the team in targets (15), targets per game (5.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (214), receiving yards per game (71.3) and yards per catch (19.5), and he was tied for the lead in touchdown receptions (1).
- ▶ Against Western Illinois on Sept. 10, Autman-Bell caught five passes for 118 yards. It was his fifth career game with 100+ receiving yards and the second highest total of his career behind 129 against Purdue in 2020.
- ► Autman-Bell has played in 47 career games with 125 catches (12th in program history) for 1,970 yards (9th) and 13 TDs (T-13th).
- ▶ He had caught at least one pass in 45 games and has made at least one catch in his past 41 games, which remains tied for the longest active FBS streak and the second longest streak in school history behind **Ron Johnson's** Big Ten record streak of 46 games.
- ▶ Despite missing the first two games of the 2021 season, and the majority of two others due to varying injuries, Autman-Bell still led the team last year in receptions (36), receiving yards (506), receiving yards per game (46.0), receiving touchdowns (6), targets (59) and targets per game (5.4).

O-LINE RELOADS

► Minnesota was one of 22 units named to the Midseason Honor Roll for the Joe Moore Award, which is given to the nation's most outstanding offensive line.

- ► The Golden Gophers have used the same starting five on the offensive line in every game this season with Aireontae Ersery at left tackle, Axel Ruschmeyer at left guard, John Michael Schmitz at center, Chuck Filiaga at right guard and Quinn Carroll at right tackle.
- ▶ Should that unit start the finale at Wisconsin and the bowl game, it would be the first time since at least 1995 that Minnesota used the same starting offensive line for an entire season.
- ▶ The unit has given up just 10 sacks in 11 games, tied for eighth in the country in fewest sacks allowed. The rate of 0.91 sacks allowed per game is also tied for eighth. Minnesota has had six games this year with zero sacks allowed and has only had one game where they've allowed more than two sacks (3.0 at Nebraska).
- ► The Gophers are also tied for 12th with 44 tackles for loss given up this year. The rate of 4.0 TFLs allowed per game is tied for 13th in the FBS. The 42 TFLs have resulted in a loss of 137 yards, the seventh fewest this year.
- ▶ Minnesota is coming off a 2021 season where it boasted one of the deepest and most experienced offensive lines in the entire country.
- ▶ The Golden Gophers' line had more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 235. In addition, 12 members of the unit had appeared in at least one game and nine had started at least one contest.
- ► Four of the five starters have moved on, but Schmitz, a preseason All-American and nominee for the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Rimington Award, returned to anchor this year's unit. The sixth-year senior has started a unit-high 34 games in his career and is Pro Football Focus' highest-graded offensive lineman in the country.

- ▶ In the season opener against New Mexico State, Ersery made his first career start at left tackle, while Ruschmeyer lined up next to him at left guard. Schmitz manned the center position, while Filiaga made his Gopher debut by starting at right guard, and Carroll, a Notre Dame transfer, made his first career start when he lined up at right tackle. The unit did not allow a sack, while racking up 297 yards on the ground.
- ▶ While the unit may lack the number of starts as a year ago, it is certainly not a young group, but rather a group that has considerable experience in the program. Of the 19 offensive linemen on the Minnesota roster, nearly half are entering at least their fourth year of college, with 15 having at least two years of eligibility remaining.

GOPHERS 'D' AMONG THE BEST

- As noted on Page 1, Minnesota boasts one of the best defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator log Rossi
- ▶ One reason Minnesota has been successful this year is that the defense gets off the field. The unit has limited opponents to just 56.3 plays per game this year, the second fewest in the country.
- ▶ Minnesota has outscored opponents 241-94 over the first three quarters of games this year, including a 103-26 edge in the second quarter and 79-28 advantage in the third. Backups played significant fourth-quarter minutes in each of the team's first four games and yielded 21 points.

- ► Since the start of 2021 Minnesota has held 17 teams below 300 yards of offense in a game, including eight opponents this year, tied with Wisconsin for the most in the FBS in that span. Prior to their loss to Purdue, the Golden Gophers had held each of their prior 11 opponents under 300 yards of total offense.
- ▶ In addition, Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing seven times since the start of 2021, tied for the most in the country in that span. The Gophers have done it three this year against New Mexico State (53), Colorado (90) and Rutgers (86).
- ▶ Minnesota has held 17 of its last 23 opponents below their rushing average entering the game, including 10 by more than 50 yards.
- ► Since the start of 2021, the Gophers have held 17 opponents to 16 points or fewer, second most in the nation behind only Georgia (19).
- ▶ This year, Minnesota has held five teams to seven points or fewer. That's tied for the most such games in the FBS with Alabama and Georgia.
- ▶ Minnesota gave up just 16 points in a three-game span against Rutgers, Nebraska and Northwestern. That tied for the fewest in any three-game span since 1999 (16 points allowed in 2021 Guaranteed Rate Bowl and first two games of 2022), and were the fewest allowed in Big Ten play since allowing 15 points in a three-game span in 1967.

STOPPING THE EXPLOSIVE PLAY

- ► One key for success this year for the Minnesota defense has been the ability to prevent explosive plays.
- ► The longest pass play from scrimmage for a Gopher foe is 58 yards, while only six runs have gone for longer than 20 yards (tied for eighth fewest in the nation).
- ► The Maroon and Gold has yielded just 103 plays of 10 yards or more from scrimmage, seventh best in the FBS, while only 31 plays from scrimmage have gone for more than 20 yards, tied for eighth best in the country.
- ► The 18 plays allowed of 30+ yards is tied for 38th, but Minnesota is tied for fourth in the nation by giving up only four plays from scrimmage of at least 40 yards.
- ▶ The Golden Gophers' 66 pass plays allowed of 10 yards or more is sixth in the nation, while the 25 passes of more than 20 yards are tied for 12th. The Gophers are tied for eighth by allowing only three pass plays of 40+ yards, and they are one of 23 programs that has not given up more than one pass play longer than 50 yards.

MORE ON THE SHUTOUTS

- ▶ Minnesota has two shutouts on the season, a 38-0 win over New Mexico State in the season opener and a 31-0 victory against Rutgers on Oct. 29. It's the first time Minnesota has recorded two shutouts in a season since 2006 and the second time doing so since 1977.
- ▶ Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State are the only other programs with two shutouts this season, but each has one against FCS foe, making Minnesota the only team to shut out two FBS teams this year.
- ► The shutout of Rutgers was the Gophers' first Big Ten shutout victory since a 45-0 win versus Illinois on Oct. 23 2004
- ► The Gophers dominated on defense, limiting Rutgers to just 134 total yards (86 passing, 48 rushing), seven first downs, and 2-of-10 conversions on third down. RU averaged just 3.0 yards per play and 2.3 yards per rush.
- ▶ Minnesota's shutout of New Mexico State on Sept. 1 saw a smothering performance by the defense, holding the Aggies to just 91 yards of total offense with 53 yards passing and 38 rushing yards. It was the first time since at least 2000 the Gophers held an opponent to 55 or fewer yards in both passing and rushing in one game.
- ► The Aggies were held to only 33 plays on the night, the fewest ever by a Minnesota opponent and tied for the lowest total in the FBS since 2017. The previous school mark was 40, set by Nebraska in 1960 and matched by Middle Tennessee State in 2010.
- ▶ NMSU gained 91 yards (53 passing, 38 rushing), the third fewest by an FBS team this season. The Golden Gophers also held the Aggies to just six first downs, equaling the fewest allowed in the **P.J. Fleck** era (two off the modern school record) and tied for the third lowest total this year by an FBS program.
- ► The 91 yards of total offense allowed was the sixth best performance in program history since 1960 and the second fewest since 1967 after last year's performance at Colorado where the Buffaloes were limited to 63 yards.
- ► The 38 rushing yards allowed marked the 11th time since 2000 the Gophers held their opponent to at least that number. Four of those 11 games have come under Fleck.
- ▶ Rutgers and New Mexico State both had 21 rushing attempts, tied for the fewest by a Minnesota opponent since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011. Colorado also had 21 last year.
- ► Coupled with a 30-0 shutout at Colorado last year, Minnesota joins Georgia (5), Penn State (3) and UAB (3) as the only programs with at least three shutouts in the past two seasons.

SORI-MARIN LEADS DEFENSE

- ▶ Fifth-year linebacker Mariano Sori-Marin was the top returning tackler from last season and he's carried that into 2022, leading the team with 72 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss. He also has a sack and three pass breakups.
- ▶ On the preseason watch list for the 2022 Butkus Award, he has at least three tackles in every game this year, including a season-high 15 at Penn State on Oct. 17, and at least five tackles in nine contests. No other Gopher has at least two tackles in every game.
- ► The game at Penn State was Sori-Marin's fifth career game of at least 10 tackles and his second of at least 15. He had a career-high 18 stops at Nebraska in 2020.
- Sori-Marin, who started all 13 games last year but was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue because of injury, finished with 85 tackles, including 23 in a two-game span. After 11 at Northwestern, he had 12 against Illinois, which was the most by a Gopher last year.
- Sori-Marin also had 4.5 tackles for loss in 2021 to go with three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and an interception.

LINDENBERG LEADING OF LATE

- ► Redshirt sophomore linebacker **Cody Lindenberg** is third on the team this season with 53 tackles and fourth with 4.0 tackles for loss. He's also got 1.0 sacks, two pass breakups and a QB hurry.
- ▶ Lindenberg has played in all 11 games but has started each of the past four contests. In that time, he's posted a team-high 27 tackles.
- ► He's led or tied for the team lead in tackles five times this season, including a career-high eight stops at Nebraska and against lowa

SENIOR SECONDARY

- ▶ With sophomore Justin Walley manning one of the cornerback spots, the rest of the secondary is filled out by fifth year corner Terrell Smith, fifth year safety Jordan Howden and fourth-year senior safety Tyler Nubin.
- ► Those four account for 10 of the team's 12 interceptions this year as Nubin leads the team with four interceptions, while Howden is tied with Walley and Smith for second with two picks. The other picks belong to defensive lineman **Danny Striggow** at Michigan State and fellow defensive back **Ryan Stapp** against Northwestern.
- Nubin's first pick this year came against Purdue, and then he had two against Rutgers. He had the first multi-interception game by a Gopher since **Antoine Winfield Jr.** had two versus Penn State on Nov. 9, 2019. Nubin's most recent pick came versus Northwestern.
- ▶ Also against Purdue, Nubin recorded his first forced fumble of the season (second career). He became the first Minnesota player to have both a forced fumble and an interception in the same game since Eric Murray versus TCU on Sept. 3, 2015.
- Nubin is second on the team with 55 tackles, and he has 2.0 tackles for loss, three pass breakups and a forced fumble. He had a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.0 for loss at Illinois
- ► Howden is not far behind Nubin with 47 stops, 2.5 tackles for loss and four pass breakups. Howden had 10 tackles against the Illini, his second career game with double-digit stops. His interceptions came against Western Illinois and Purdue.
- ► Smith has 36 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble, two interceptions and a team-high five pass breakups. He's one of four players in the country to record that stat line this season.
- ► Smith made his pick to preserve a shutout in the season opener against New Mexico State and had one on the road at Nebraska.

WALLEY'S WORLD

- ► Sophomore defensive back **Justin Walley** earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team last season and was PFF's highest graded true freshman cornerback.
- ▶ This year, he's started all 11 games at cornerback and has 29 tackles with two pass breakups. He's tied for second on the team with two interceptions and one fumble recovery.
- ▶ At Michigan State, Walley had three tackles, plus an interception and a fumble recovery. Since at least 2000, he's just the third Gopher to have an interception and fumble recovery in the same game (Jalen Myrick at Purdue in 2015, Mario Reese vs. lowa in 2006).
- ► He picked up his second interception of the season at Penn State and returned it 37 yards to set up a Minnesota field goal. It was the longest interception return for a Gophers player since **Coney Durr's** 72-yard pick six versus Maryland on Oct. 26, 2019.
- Twice this season (against Purdue and lowa) he's had six tackles in a game, a career high.
- ▶ Walley played in all 13 games last season and started the final six of the season. He made 29 tackles, broke up seven passes, recovered two fumbles, forced one fumble and made one interception.
- ▶ During the season, he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after a standout performance in Minnesota's 23-13 win against Wisconsin as he recorded his first career interception and finished the game with a career high five tackles, helping Minnesota win Paul Bunyan's Axe for the second time in four years.

► Walley was the first Gopher defensive player to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

TRANSFERS REINFORCE DEFENSE

- ► The Gophers' defense in 2022 has relied on five transfers to provide depth and production at key spots along the defensive line and in the secondary.
- ▶ Defensive lineman **Kyler Baugh** is one of three defensive linemen to transfer in to Minnesota. Baugh played the prior three years at Houston Baptist where he played in 26 games with 18 starts. He made 104 career tackles, which included 11.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks, broke up four passes, forced a fumble and recovered another. He was a three-time Southland Conference Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll honoree.
- ▶ Darnell Jefferies is a defensive lineman coming off a four-year career at Clemson where he was a part of the 2018 national championship team and the 2019 squad that reached the national title game. He played in 29 games for the Tigers and made 22 tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.
- ▶ The third defensive lineman is **Lorenza Surgers** who is playing at Minnesota after four seasons at Vanderbilt. He played in 18 games and made 19 career tackles, which included 1.5 tackles for loss and one sack. He also broke up two passes.
- ▶ Defensive back **Beanie Bishop** spent the past four seasons at Western Kentucky where he played in 36 games and made 76 tackles, totaled 8.5 tackles for loss, defended 12 passes, made three interceptions and forced one fumble.
- ▶ Last season, Bishop was named All-Conference USA First Team as a defensive back as he made 43 tackles and 6.5 tackle for loss, broke up four passes, made three interceptions (returned one for a touchdown) and forced one fumble. He also returned 28 kickoffs for 676 yards to earn all-conference honorable mention as a kickoff returner.
- ▶ Fellow defensive back **Ryan Stapp** came to Minnesota following three years at Abilene Christian where he made 91 tackles in 27 games. He added 6.5 tackles for loss, 13 pass breakups and four interceptions. While with the Wildcats, where he was teammates with former Gopher linebacker **Jack Gibbens**, Stapp was on the Southland Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.
- ▶ Three of the five transfers have played in all 11 games for the Gophers this year. Baugh has started every game and has 32 tackles, 1.0 tackles for loss, 0.5 sacks and a pass breakup. Bishop has 25 stops with a sack and a pass breakup, while Jefferies has made five tackles.
- ► Stapp has played in 10 games with 11 tackles, 1.0 sacks and an interception, while Surgers has four tackles, with a sack, in six games.

REDDING READY ON RETURNS

- ► Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Quentin Redding** has emerged as a potent weapon in the return game this year for Minnesota.
- He's returned 16 kickoffs for 375 yards, which is more yards than any Gopher has had in a season since **Demetrius Douglas** had 594 in 2018. Redding's average of 23.4 yards per return is third in the Big Ten and ranks 26th nationally.
- ► At Illinois, Redding set career highs in returns (5) and return yards (151), highlighted by a career-long 92-yard return to start the second half.
- ▶ Redding's return was Minnesota's longest since Smith returned the opening kick 100 yards for a TD versus Nebraska on Nov. 11, 2017. Redding's 151 kick return yards were the most for a Gopher since **KiAnte Hardin** had 165 versus Illinois on Nov. 21, 2015.

Redding is also averaging 6.3 yards on punt returns, gaining 75 yards on 12 returns.

TRICKETT CAN KICK IT

- On the season, Matthew Trickett is 12-of-14 on field goal tries with a long of 49 yards, and he's made all 40 extra point tries. His 40 extra points made without a miss is third best in program history.
- He's currently second in the Big Ten and 24th nationally with his 85.7 percent success rate on field goals, is sixth in the conference with his 1.09 field goals made per game and ranks seventh with 6.9 points per game and 76 points on the season.
- A transfer last season from Kent State, Trickett is already tied for ninth in program history with 29 career field goals made, while his field goal percentage of .757 ranks tied for fifth.
- ► Last year Trickett made the most of his first season with Minnesota. He made 36 of 38 extra points and 17 of 25 field goals for 87 points, 41 more than any other Gopher. He ranked ninth in the Big Ten in scoring and 11th nationally with 6.7 points per game. His 87 points were 11th overall in Minnesota single-season history and seventh all-time among Gopher kickers.
- ► Trickett's 17 made field goals tied for fifth most in program history and the most since Emmit Carpenter made 17 in 2018. He made 1.31 field goals per game, good for sixth in the Big Ten.

B1G SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK

- Matthew Trickett was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after his performance in Minnesota's 20-13 road win at Nebraska.
- The fifth-year senior made his two longest field goals of the season, first from 47 yards on the opening drive of the third guarter to cut Nebraska's lead to 10-3 and later from 49 yards in the fourth guarter to give Minnesota its first lead in the game at 13-10. He also went 2-of-2 on point-after attempts, scoring eight of Minnesota's 20 points
- The 49-yard field goal was tied for the second longest of his career and one yard shy of tying his career mark of 50 vards.
- Trickett was the first Gopher to earn Special Teams honors from the Big Ten since Mark Crawford did it last year and the first kicker to do so since Emmit Carpenter in 2018

KESICH: KICKOFF SPECIALIST

- Junior kickoff specialist Dragan Kesich has posted touchbacks on 53 of 61 kickoffs this year, including a career-high eight against Western Illinois.
- Kesich leads the country with his kickoff average of 64.77 yards, touchback percentage of 86.89 percent and his 53 touchbacks are tied for most in the FBS
- As a result of Kesich's prowess, Minnesota opponents have only had six kickoff returns this year, which ties for fewest in the country, and the 123 kickoff return yards allowed is second.

CRAWFORD THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

- Mark Crawford is in his third season as the Gophers' punter. He's punted 36 times this year with 33 of those punts coming in the team's last seven games. With 37 punts this year (including a block at Penn State), the Gophers rank tied for 23rd in fewest punts.
- Crawford, who is also the team's holder on kicks, is averaging 40.1 yards on his boots this year. Sixteen of his 36 punts have been fair caught, 12 have landed inside the 20-yard line and only three have gone for a touchback.

- ► He has four punts this year of 50+ yards, including a long of 53 yards, three of which came at Penn State.
- Opponents have only returned eight punts this year, tied for 18th fewest in the country. They also rank 10th with only 27 punt return yards allowed and the 3.38 yards per return ranks 13th.
- Last year, Crawford punted 47 times for 1961 yards, an average of 41.7 yards per punt that ranked eighth in the Big Ten. He had six kicks cover at least 50 yards and 24 punts land inside the 20-yard line.
- A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.
- ► He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win six Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.

CONTEXT FOR THE NEBRASKA COMEBACK

- ► Trailing 10-0 at halftime at Nebraska on Nov. 5. Minnesota came back for a 20-13 victory. In fact, the Gophers were down 10-0 until a field goal with 10:30 left in the third quarter got them on the board.
- The Golden Gophers outscored the Huskers 10-0 in the third quarter and 10-3 in the fourth to outscore them 20-3 in the second half.
- It was Minnesota's biggest comeback win since overcoming a 14-point deficit at Nebraska on Nov. 22, 2014. In that game, the Gophers trailed 21-7 with 5:18 remaining in the first half, but rallied for a 28-24 victory.
- The comeback win was Minnesota's 11th since 1973 when trailing by at least 10 points at halftime. The most recent of which was the aforementioned 2014 win at Nebraska where it trailed 21-7 at intermission.
- Down 10-0 after the opening quarter, Minnesota overcame a 10-point deficit at the end of the first quarter for the fifth time since 1973. Prior to Saturday, the most recent such comeback took place versus Purdue on Oct. 10, 2009 when the Gophers trailed 10-0 after the first quarter and won 35-20.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

- Minnesota has dominated time of possession this year, averaging 35:41 minutes with the ball. That figure ranks second nationally behind only Air Force (36:00).
- The Golden Gophers opened the year with their highest time of possession in six years under P.J. Fleck when they had the ball for a staggering 44:30 against New Mexico State. Minnesota held it for at least 8:58 in every quarter, including 13:29 in the third quarter alone.
- Eight times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. In addition to New Mexico State, Minnesota also had it for 42:29 this year at Michigan State, 41:02 against Rutgers and 40:22 versus Northwestern. It happened three times last year, holding the ball for 40:02 at lowa, 40:09 at Northwestern and 40:13 at Colorado. In 2019, Minnesota recorded 42:53 against Maryland
- In 69 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 54 times and gone 37-17 in those contests.

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

- Minnesota is among the least penalized teams in the country this season, committing 41 penalties for 361 yards.
- The Gophers rank third nationally and lead the Big Ten with their 3.73 penalties per game, and they are fifth in the FBS and second in the conference with 32.82 penalty yards per contest.
- Minnesota has committed four or fewer penalties in a game eight times this year, including a program record zero Saturday against Iowa.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

- ▶ Mohamed Ibrahim leads all active FBS players in rushing touchdowns (52), total touchdowns scored (52), rushing yards (4,527) and rushing yards per game (116.1), second in rushing attempts (824) and rushing attempts per game (21.13), third in all-purpose plays (849) and all-purpose plays per game (21.77), fifth in points per game (8.0) and all-purpose yards per game (121.49), sixth in all-purpose yards (4,738),20th in points (312) and 21st in yards per rush (5.5).
- ▶ Tanner Morgan is second among all active FBS players in passing yards per attempt (8.90) and ranks 12th in total offense per play (7.39), 17th in passing yards (9,396), 19th in pass efficiency (150.58), 24th in total offense (9,409), 26th in total plays (1,274), 27th in pass attempts (1,056), 28th in passing touchdowns (63) and pass completions (657), 30th in TDs responsible for (71) and 38th in completion percentage (.622).
- ▶ Defensive back **Tyler Nubin** ranks 22nd in interceptions (8) and 37th in interceptions per game (0.19) among FBS players.
- ▶ Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** ranks fifth among active FBS players in field goals made and attempted (76-96), eighth in points (398), ninth in field goals made and attempted per game (1.46-1.85), 14th in points per game (7.7), 16th in extra points made and attempted (170-173), 21st in extra point percentage (.983) and 42nd in field goal percentage (.792).

FIVE YEARS OF FLECK

- ▶ As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their sixth season under P.J. Fleck. The first five years of the Fleck Era, in which they went 35-23 overall, stack up among the best of any five-year span in program history.
- ► The .603 win percentage is tied for the best mark since 1960-64 (.649) and is tied for the second best percentage since 1944-48.
- ► The team's 21 Big Ten wins are the most since the program won 23 from 1965-69.
- ► The three bowl wins in a five-year span are tied for second most in program history behind only four from 2015-19 (of which two belong to Fleck).

CIARROCCA BACK AS OC

- ► Kirk Ciarrocca has returned as Minnesota's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, a role he previously held from 2017-19.
- ► Ciarrocca returned after being away for two years. He spent 2020 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Penn State and served in a non-coaching role as an offensive analyst at West Virginia in 2021.
- ► For further evidence of Ciarrocca's success at Minnesota, quarterback **Tanner Morgan** has had eight of his 10 best games in regards to pass efficiency with Ciarrocca as his OC.
- ▶ In addition to previously working with Fleck at Minnesota, Ciarrocca was also his offensive coordinator at Western Michigan for four seasons. Ciarroccaa has spent seven total seasons as an offensive coordinator under Fleck and helped both programs produce record-setting numbers on offense.
- ▶ Ciarrocca was one of 15 semifinalists for the Broyles Award in 2019 after the Gophers averaged 432 yards per game (fourth most in school history in the modern era) and 34.1 points per game (third most in school history in the modern era). That same year, Minnesota rushed for 25 touchdowns and threw for 31 touchdowns, which was the first time in school history that the Gophers reached both of those numbers in the same season.

▶ With Ciarrocca as the OC and **Joe Rossi** as the DC, Minnesota has gone 21-7. That span covers the final four games of 2018 (3-1), the 2019 regular season (10-2) and this season (7-4).

THREE ADDED TO STAFF IN 2022

- ▶ In addition to the hiring of Ciarrocca, Minnesota added three assistant coaches to its staff in the offseason.
- ▶ Danny Collins is coaching the Gopher safeties. He has been on the Minnesota staff since 2017 and has served in multiple roles with the Gophers, most recently as a Senior Defensive Analyst.
- ► Collins was in quality control in his first season in Minnesota in 2017, then transitioned to a graduate assistant position for the 2018 season and was named interim defensive backs coach for Minnesota's win against Georgia Tech in the Quick Lane Bowl.
- ▶ Collins moved back to quality control in 2019 and again worked on the defensive side of the ball. He was thrust into on-field coaching duties again at the Outback Bowl and was the interim defensive line coach. Collins came to Minnesota from Western Michigan where he was a defensive GA from 2015-17 under P.J. Fleck.
- ▶ Greg Harbaugh (pronounced HAR-bo) is coaching the Gopher tight ends. He returns to Minnesota for a third stint with the Gophers, as he previously served in a quality control role twice on the Minnesota staff (2017, '19). Harbaugh most recently was the receivers coach at Western Michigan for the 2020 and 2021 seasons. Prior to his first stint at Minnesota in 2017, Harbaugh was also at Western Michigan in 2015 and 2016 as a graduate assistant under Fleck.
- ▶ Veteran coach and proven recruiter **Brick Haley** is leading Minnesota's defensive line. Haley brings more than 30 years of experience both in college and in the NFL to the Gophers. He has primarily coached the defensive line in his career, but has also been a defensive coordinator and coached linebackers.
- ▶ Haley most recently was at Missouri where he coached the defensive line for four seasons and also held the title of Senior Associate Head Coach. Prior to Missouri, Haley spent two seasons at Texas, and before that he was at LSU for from 2009-14, where he directed one of the nation's most disruptive defensive fronts.
- ▶ In addition to those three, one other offseason change saw cornerbacks coach Paul Haynes get promoted to co-defensive coordinator. Haynes joined the University of Minnesota coaching staff in February 2020 and has been instrumental in the Gophers cornerbacks' contributions to a stout defense.

GOPHER GRADUATES

▶ Minnesota's 2022 roster features 17 student-athletes who have already graduated: Chris Autman-Bell, Nathan Boe, Chuck Filiaga, Clay Geary, Mohamed Ibrahim, Jordan Howden, Darnell Jefferies, Preston Jelen, Tanner Morgan, Braelen Oliver, Samuel Pickerign, Axel Ruschmeyer, Thomas Rush, John Michael Schmitz, Terell Smith, Mariano Sori-Marin and Lorenza Surgers.

FOUR GOPHERS DRAFTED

- ▶ Minnesota had four players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft. That ups its total since 2020 to 11, which is fifth in the Big Ten and tied for 13th nationally.
- ► Seattle took **Boye Mafe** in the second round with the 40th overall pick, making him the first Minnesota d-lineman drafted since **Ra'Shede Hageman** went 37th overall in 2014.

- ▶ Daniel Faalele was next off the board as Baltimore took him in the fourth round with the No. 110 pick. Faalele was the first Gopher offensive lineman to be drafted since 2006 when both Greg Eslinger and Mark Setterstrom were selected.
- ► The Minnesota Vikings selected defensive lineman Esezi Otomewo in the fifth round with the No. 165 pick. He was the first Gopher to be selected by the Vikings since 2010, when the purple and gold took linebacker Nate Triplett in the fifth round.
- ► Ko Kieft was the final Gopher off the board as the tight end was taken by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the sixth round with the No. 218 overall pick. He became the first Gopher tight end picked since Maxx Williams in 2015
- ▶ With the picks of Mafe and Otomewo, it was the first time two Gopher d-linemen were taken in the same draft since 1958.
- ▶ Minnesota has now had 12 players taken in a fouryear span (2019-22). That is the most selections in that time frame in school history since the draft was reduced to seven rounds in 1994. Minnesota's previous best in a four-year span was from 1988-91 when it had 14 players taken in drafts that were 12 rounds.

SCORIGAMI

- ► Scorigami is a concept thought up by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks final scores that have never happened before in NFL history. Inspired by Bois, what follows are the Scorigami results this season for Minnesota football.
- ▶ Minnesota 38, New Mexico State 0. No scorigami. It's the fourth such score in program history. The Gophers have won by this score three times in their program history, with the most recent occurrence taking place in 1975 against Western Michigan.
- Minnesota 62, Western Illinois 10. Scorigami achieved! In 1,296 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.
- ▶ Minnesota 49, Colorado 7. No Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end in this score, all Minnesota victories. The last was in 1998 against Iowa.
- ▶ Minnesota 34, Michigan State 7. No Scorigami. This was the seventh game in program history to end in this score, with Minnesota winning five of them. The most recent was a victory over Nebraska in 2019.
- ▶ Purdue 20, Minnesota 10. Scorigami achieved! In 1,299 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.
- Illinois 26, Minnesota 14. Partial Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end by this score, most recently a win at Nebraska in 1960. It's the first time Minnesota has lost by the score.
- ▶ Penn State 45, Minnesota 17. No Scorigami. This was the second game to end by this score with the other being a loss at Purdue in 2011.
- ▶ *Minnesota 31, Rutgers 0.* Partial Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end by this score, but the first in which Minnesota won.
- ▶ Minnesota 20, Nebraska 13. No Scorigami. This was the seventh game in program history to end by this score, most recently a win at Purdue in 2021. The Gophers have won by the score four times in their history.
- ▶ Minnesota 31, Northwestern 3. Partial Scorigami. This was the second game in history to end by this score, but the first in which Minnesota won.
- ▶ lowa 13, Minnesota 10. Scorigami achieved! In 1,305 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.

HEAD COACH // SIXTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 41, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 72-49 and is 42-27 at Minnesota

In five years, Fleck established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program. Fleck was already sixth in program history in overall wins (35) and Big Ten wins (21), and eighth in games coached (58). Fleck's .603 win percentage was third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season twice, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 3-0 in bowl games and those three wins are tied with Glen Mason (3-4 bowl record during his time coaching the Gophers from 1997-2006) for the most in school history

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), eight Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 268 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also led Minnesota to a 3-0 record in bowl games and has had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois)

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Mohamed Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl ne since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the

Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats om the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Ğopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also host-

ed a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head cond at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rugers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and lowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. 

PAUL BUNYAN'S AXE

Minnesota vs. Wisconsin

At 131 games and counting, the series between Minnesota and Wisconsin ranks as the longest in the Football Bowl Subdivision of NCAA Division I; and "Paul Bunyan's Axe" has the history of one of college football's fiercest rivalries emblazoned on its six-foot long handle. The first game in the series, a 63-0 Gopher victory in 1890, is printed on the handle near the axe's head. The results of every successive game line the handle in red ink. There have been so many games that the scores scroll up and down the width of both sides of the handle, and school officials have resorted to writing scores on the narrow edges of the six-foot shaft.

By 1930, "Paul Bunyan's Axe" wasn't even created, although the rivalry had already reached feverish levels. The 1906 game was canceled by President Theodore Roosevelt, who had decided to cool off heated college football rivalries, because of injuries and deaths on the field. In 1914, Minnesota faced the Badgers for the Gophers' first Homecoming game; likewise, Wisconsin hosted Minnesota for the Badgers' first in 1919. Between the years 1923 and 1925, the teams battled to three straight ties.

To symbolically capture the amazing atmosphere of the annual match-up, Dr. R.B. Fouch of Minneapolis fashioned a bacon slab out of black walnut to serve as the traveling trophy that he hoped would compare to the well-known "Little Brown Jug," which Minnesota and Michigan played for every year. The "Slab of Bacon," first played for in 1930, had a football carved on top inscribed with an "M" or "W", depending on how you held it. The idea was that the winning team would "bring home the bacon."

But in the early 1940s, the Slab of Bacon became the "Missing Slab of Bacon." Peg Watrous, who was the president of Wisconsin women students at the time, relates that she and her counterpart from Minnesota were to have a symbolic exchange after the game, whereby the trophy would be awarded to the winning team. Minnesota won, but in characteristic fashion, a postgame melee broke out on the field, with students and spectators running crazy over the field. Watrous couldn't find her counterpart, and was left "holding the bacon,"

as it were. "I have no memory of what happened after that...The whole thing was a dud, as I feared it would be," Watrous remembered good-humoredly, "and someone in charge probably hid the bacon."

But the two teams had to play for something, so in 1948 the Wisconsin W Club instituted "Paul Bunyan's Axe" as a trophy more befitting the grand rivalry between the two schools. The annual battles have survived so long that in the '60s the teams started to print the games' final scores smaller and smaller, scrunching the numbers and letters in order to avoid reaching the end of the axe's shaft. But the series continued to roll, and the last game to be painted on the broad face of the handle was in 1980. The subsequent games appear on the narrow side of the handle.

The Slab of Bacon was back in the news in the summer of 1994, when the long-lost trophy was found after a Camp Randall Stadium storage room was cleaned out. Wisconsin officials estimated that it had been missing since 1945; yet the scores of every Wisconsin-Minnesota game from 1930-70 were printed on the back of the slab. It is one of those Twilight Zone-esque mysteries that remains unexplained, and contributes to the legend of Minnesota's and Wisconsin's "Border Battle" rivalry.
