## FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

**1** RV/RV Minnesota (8-4, 5-4 B1G) makes its 23rd all-time bowl appearance on Thursday, Dec. 29, when it faces Syracuse (7-5, 4-4 ACC) in the 2022 Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl. The game will be held at Yankee Stadium at 1 p.m. with ESPN televising and radio coverage provided by ESPN Radio and KFAN.

**2** Minnesota has a pair of All-Americans in center **John Michael Schmitz** and running back **Mohamed Ibrahim**. Schmitz was named a first-teamer by the AP and FWAA and a second-teamer by the AFCA and Walter Camp. He's the first Gopher to be a First-Team All-American since **Antoine Winfield Jr.** in 2019 and the first such offensive lineman since **Greg Eslinger** in 2005. A finalist for the Rimington Trophy, Schmitz anchored an offensive line that featured four new starters and helped pave the way for the nation's No. 11 rushing offense, as the Gophers ran for 218.2 yards per game. Minnesota also ranks 17th in sacks allowed at 1.08 per game and tied for 23rd in the nation in tackles for loss per game allowed at 4.33. Ibrahim, meanwhile, has been tabbed to the second-team for the AFCA, AP, FWAA and Walter Camp teams. This is the second time in his career that Ibrahim has been named an All-American by the AP, as he was a Third Team selection in 2020. Eslinger (2004-05) was the last Gopher to be an All-American in multiple seasons for Minnesota. Ibrahim, who played in 11 games, finished fourth in the nation in rushing yards at 1,594 and second in the country in rushing yards per game at 144.9. He tied for second in the nation with 19 rushing touchdowns and tied for third in scoring with 10.4 points per game.

**3** Minnesota boasts one of the best and most well-rounded defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi**. The Golden Gophers rank fifth in the country by allowing 279.5 total yards per contest. They also have the No. 4 defense in terms of scoring (13.3 ppg), No. 8 in passing yards allowed (173.7) and the No. 15 rush defense (105.8). Minnesota, Air Force, Illinois, and Iowa are the only teams in the FBS that rank in the top 20 in each of those categories.

**4** The Golden Gophers are 10-12 in their history in bowl games, but they have won five straight bowl contests, including all three appearances under head coach **P.J. Fleck** (2021 Guaranteed Rate Bowl, 2020 Outback, 2018 Quick Lane). The five-game bowl winning streak is the second longest active streak in the country. Only Alabama (excluding national championship game appearances) has a longer streak with seven straight wins.

**5** The 2022 campaign is the sixth for head coach **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota, where he holds a record of 43-27. He is already fifth in program history for wins and sixth in Big Ten wins (26) and games coached (70). Fleck's .614 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only **Henry L. Williams** (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 10th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 73-49 (.598).

## A WIN WOULD...

- Improve Minnesota to 9-4 overall this season, Minnesota's 11th nine-win season in program history and the third in six years under **P.J. Fleck** (he is already one of two coaches in program history with multiple nine-win seasons)
- Give the Gophers nine wins for the third time in a four-year span, something that hasn't happened since 1905
- See Minnesota's bowl record improve to 11-12 all-time and 4-0 under Fleck
- Extend the Gophers' winning streak in bowl games to six
- Make the Golden Gophers 4-2 all-time against Syracuse, including 1-1 in bowl games
- Have Minnesota 16-7 all-time against ACC opponents
- Get the Gophers to 20-10 in Thursday games, including 1-4 in bowl games on Thursdays
- Push Fleck's record against non-conference opponents to 18-1 since becoming Minnesota's head coach
- Enhance Fleck's record to 44-27 at Minnesota and 74-49 overall

## FACING SYRACUSE

► Minnesota and Syracuse meet for the sixth time at the Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl. The Golden Gophers lead the all-time series 3-2, though the Orange won the only previous matchup in a bowl game, a 21-17 win in the 2013 Texas Bowl.

► All five previous games in the series have been decided by 10 points or less. In fact, the scoring margin stands at just two points as the Orange hold a slight lead at 111-109.

► The only ACC team Minnesota has faced more than Syracuse is Pittsburgh, whom the Golden Gophers have squared off with 12 times with from 1933-92 and gone 9-3 against.

► Minnesota is facing an ACC opponent for the first time since defeating Georgia Tech in the 2018 Quick Lane Bowl. All-time, the Golden Gophers 15-7 all-time against teams currently in the league.

► Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** has not faced Syracuse before, nor has Orange head coach Dino Babers taken on the Golden Gophers. However, the coaches are 1-1 against each other from their time in the MAC when Fleck was at Western Michigan and Babers helmed Bowling Green from 2014-15.

► Minnesota has one New York native on its roster in redshirt junior long snapper **Austin Sullivan**. He's from Slate Hill and attended Minisink Valley High School. Slate Hill is about 70 miles northwest of The Bronx and roughly 200 miles southeast of Syracuse.

► Syracuse has one Minnesotan on its roster in redshirt sophomore OL Jakob Bradford from Brooklyn Park and Park Center High School.

► Fleck worked with Syracuse special teams coordinator Bob Ligashesky at the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 when Fleck was wide receivers coach and Ligashesky was special teams coordinator/safeties coach.

► Gophers co-defensive coordinator/cornerbacks coach **Paul Haynes** was a graduate assistant at Bowling Green in 1994 when Ligashesky worked there as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator.

► Minnesota offensive line coach **Brian Callahan** was the OL coach at Eastern Illinois from 2010-12. Babers' first year as the Panthers' head coach was 2012, while Orange running backs coach Mike Lynch coached EIU wide receivers in the 2010-11 seasons and running backs in 2012.

► Syracuse defensive passing game coordinator/safeties coach Nick Monroe is from Mahtohmedi, Minn., and played at St. Cloud State from 1997-01.

► Minnesota Athletic Director **Mark Coyle** was the Syracuse AD from 2015-16 and hired Babers as the Orange's head coach following the 2015 season.

► Syracuse finished the regular season with a 7-5 record overall and a 4-4 mark in the ACC. The Orange finished tied for third in the ACC Atlantic division.

► The Orange started the season 6-0, just their third time doing so since 1935. They got as high as No. 14 in the AP rankings, but a 27-21 loss to Clemson on Oct. 22 started a stretch of five straight losses. Syracuse ended the season with a win over Boston College.

► Minnesota and Syracuse played one common opponent this year in Purdue. The Gophers lost at home to the Boilermakers, 20-10, on Oct. 1, while the Orange won their matchup in Syracuse, 32-29, on Sept. 17.

► Garrett Shrader has completed 173-of-266 passes for 2,310 yards, 17 touchdowns and six interceptions for a QB rating of 154.56 in 11 games for Syracuse. He also rushed 136 times for 415 yards and seven scores, making him the team's leading rusher heading into the game with Sean Tucker opting out and declaring for the NFL Draft.

► The receiving corps is led by Oronde Gadsden II, who has team highs in receptions (54), receiving yards (891) and touchdown catches (6).

► Defensively, Marlowe Wax leads the team with 89 tackles and 10.5 tackles for loss, and he's added 4.5 sacks, one pass breakup, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and a blocked kick.

► Caleb Okechukwu is not far behind Wax with his team-leading 7.0 sacks to go with 10.0 TFLs, while Mikel Jones has 84 tackles, 7.0 TFLs and 4.0 sacks.

► In the secondary, Garrett Williams leads active Syracuse players with two interceptions, while Jason Simmons, Jr., has seven pass breakups to lead the squad.

## LAST TIME VS. THE ORANGE

► *With assistance from the AP:* Minnesota rallied from an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit to take a three-point lead in the 2013 Texas Bowl, but Syracuse came back late for a 21-17 win.

► Syracuse led 14-3 entering the fourth quarter before **Mitch Leidner** threw two touchdown passes and a 2-point conversion to put the Golden Gophers up 17-14.

► Minnesota cut it to 14-9 when **Maxx Williams** got in front of two defenders for a 20-yard touchdown reception from Leidner on the first play of the fourth quarter. Minnesota attempted a 2-point try, but Leidner was sacked.

► The Gophers took their first lead of the game when Syracuse bit on a play-action fake that left **Drew Wolitarsky** wide open for a 55-yard touchdown that made it 15-14 early in the fourth quarter. Leidner then hit **Mike Henry** for the 2-point conversion to push the lead to 17-14.

► Syracuse attempted a 45-yard field goal with about 3 1/2 minutes left, but it sailed wide right. Robert Welsh sacked Leidner on third down on the next drive to force a punt and set up the winning drive.

► Terrel Hunt scrambled 12 yards for a touchdown with 1:14 remaining to lift Syracuse to the victory and win the Most Valuable Player award. He finished with 188 yards passing and 74 rushing with two scores.

► After the Orange regained the lead, Minnesota attempted two long passes to the end zone on the final plays. The first slipped through Wolitarsky's arms and the second, as time expired, was knocked down near the end zone.

► Leidner finished with 205 yards passing, Williams had five receptions for 76 yards and a touchdown and Wolitarsky had 94 yards receiving and a score.

► Syracuse took a 7-0 lead when Jerome Smith scored on a 1-yard run early in the second quarter. The Orange used a 5-yard touchdown run by Hunt to push the lead to 14-3 with about three minutes left in the third quarter.

► Minnesota cut it to 7-3 on **Chris Hawthorne's** 41-yard field goal as time expired in the first half.

## MEMORABLE WINS VS. SU

► Sept. 22, 2012: **Donnell Kirkwood** rushed for 99 yards and two touchdowns and the Minnesota defense forced four turnovers in a 17-10 victory over Syracuse in front of a sell-out crowd at Huntington Bank Stadium. **Max Shortell** threw for 231 yards in place of injured starter **MarQueis Gray** as the Gophers improved to 4-0 for the first time since 2008.

► Sept. 5, 2009: **Eric Ellestad** kicked a 35-yard field goal in overtime to give Minnesota a 23-20 road victory over the Orange in the season opener. Trailing 20-14 at halftime, Ellestad kicked two field goals in the second half to force overtime, and a **Nate Triplett** interception in overtime helped lead to the game-winning kick. The victory spoiled the debut of Syracuse QB Greg Paulus, who made his collegiate debut after four seasons of playing basketball at Duke.

► Sept. 21, 1996: Two **Adam Bailey** field goals in the final 5:23, including the winner with 42 seconds left, lifted Minnesota to a 35-33 victory over No. 23 Syracuse and star QB Donovan McNabb. Minnesota was aided by **Tyrone Carter**, who scored on fumble returns of 63 and 20 yards on consecutive possessions in the third quarter.

## THURSDAY FOOTBALL

- The 2022 Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl is being played on a Thursday. The Gophers are 19-10 all-time in program history on Thursdays, though they're 0-4 in bowl games on Thursdays.
- Minnesota has won five of its last six games on the day and is 4-1 under **P.J. Fleck** on Thursdays.
- The Golden Gophers opened this season with a 38-0 win over New Mexico State on Thursday, Sept. 1. Coupled with the Pinstripe Bowl, it'll be the third time in program history that they'll play two Thursday games in one season. The other instances came in 2014 with a season opener against Eastern Illinois and Citrus Bowl vs. Missouri, as well as in 2002 when Minnesota played on consecutive Thursdays in October due to conflicts with Minnesota Twins playoff games.
- The Gophers have a .661 winning percentage in their history when playing on days other than Saturday, going 56-28-3. Under Fleck, it is 9-3 on non-Saturdays.

LAST BOWL: 2021  
GUARANTEED RATE BOWL

- With assistance from the AP: **Ky Thomas** ran for 144 yards and a touchdown, **Mar'Kiese Irving** added 129 yards rushing and Minnesota shut down West Virginia on defense to win the 2021 Guaranteed Rate Bowl, 18-6.
- Thomas and Irving carried most of the load offensively against West Virginia, accounting for 273 of Minnesota's 358 total yards.
- The Gophers overwhelmed the Mountaineers defensively, holding them to 206 total yards to win their fifth straight bowl game, third under coach **P.J. Fleck**.
- The Mountaineers finally clicked a little in the second quarter, moving 75 yards in 12 plays. Jarret Doege capped the drive by diving for the pylon on 4th-and-goal from the 1. They were moving the ball again later in the second quarter before Doege threw an interception at Minnesota's 14-yard line by **Michael Dixon**.
- West Virginia couldn't get anything going against Minnesota's defense in the second half, crossing midfield only once while being held to 79 yards.
- **Daniel Faalele**, the 6-foot-9, 380-pound offensive lineman, lined up at fullback, took the handoff and bulled his way into the end zone for a 2-yard touchdown. Minnesota threw in a fake extra point for good measure, going up 8-0 after converting the 2-point conversion.
- Thomas put the Gophers up 15-6 at halftime, scoring on a 5-yard run two plays after bursting up the middle for a 50-yard gain.

## RECAPING WISCONSIN

- With assistance from the AP: **Athan Kaliakmanis** connected with **Le'Meke Brockington** on a tiebreaking 45-yard touchdown with 3:40 remaining and Minnesota hung on in the final minute to beat Wisconsin 23-16 in the regular season finale.
- Minnesota, which defeated Wisconsin 23-13 last year, retained possession of Paul Bunyan's Axe, which goes to the winner of this annual matchup, for the first time since 1993-94. The Gophers also tied the most-played Football Bowl Subdivision rivalry — these two Big Ten foes have been facing each other since 1890 — at 62-62-8.
- Minnesota was facing second-and-11 when Brockington ran a slant route, caught Kaliakmanis' pass in stride inside the 35 and outran Wisconsin's defense to the end zone for his first career touchdown.
- Kalikamanis ended up 19 of 29 for 319 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions in his third game filling in for **Tanner Morgan**, who was out with an upper-body injury. **Brevyn Spann-Ford**, **Dylan Wright** and **Daniel Jackson** combined to catch 17 passes for 267 yards.
- Wisconsin, which had come back from a 13-6 deficit to lead 16-13 late in the third quarter, couldn't rally again.
- Minnesota's **Justin Walley** picked off a Graham Mertz pass and had a 28-yard interception return to put the Gophers in position for a game-clinching score, but **Matthew Trickett**, who had already made three field goals in the contest, had a 48-yard field-goal attempt bounce off the right upright with 1:48 left.
- After an injury knocked Mertz out of the game on the Badgers' final series, backup Chase Wolf drove the Badgers into position for a tying touchdown. A pass interference penalty in the end zone gave Wisconsin first-and-goal from the 5 with 26 seconds left. But a holding penalty and a false start pushed Wisconsin back to the 20. After Wolf threw an incompleteness, two more false starts created second-and-goal from the 30. The game ended with Wolf throwing an incompleteness into a crowd of players in the end zone on fourth-and-goal from the 25.

## 18 HONORED BY BIG TEN

- When All-Big Ten honors were announced at the end of the regular season, 18 Gophers were recognized.
- Running back **Mohamed Ibrahim** and center **John Michael Schmitz** were both named First Team All-Big Ten by the coaches and the media. This is the third time in the last four years that Minnesota has had multiple players named to the First Team.
- Defensive back **Tyler Nubin** was named Second Team All-Big Ten by coaches and the media, while line-backer **Mariano Sori-Marin** was tabbed Third Team by the coaches and Honorable Mention selection by the media.
- Guard **Axel Ruschmeyer** was named Third Team All-Big Ten by the coaches and media, while fellow guard **Chuck Filiaga** was placed on the Third Team by the coaches. All five offensive linemen earned recognition.

- Five Minnesota seniors are scheduled to play in all-star games following the bowl game.
- Running back **Mohamed Ibrahim** and defensive back **Terrell Smith** have both accepted invitations to play in the East-West Shrine Bowl, Feb. 2, at Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas.
- Center **John Michael Schmitz** has accepted an invitation to play in the 2023 Senior Bowl, Feb. 4, in Mobile, Ala. It's the fourth straight year a Gopher will be at the event.
- Defensive back **Jordan Howden** is set to play in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl, which will take place Jan. 28, 2023, at the Rose Bowl Stadium in Pasadena, Calif.

## IN THE POLLS

► Minnesota ended the regular season receiving votes in both the AP Poll and Coaches Poll. The Golden Gophers rank 11th among those receiving votes in the AP Poll and 10th for the Coaches.-

► The bowl game will mark the 10th time in 13 games this year that Minnesota was ranked or receiving votes. The Gophers have gone 5-4 in those previous nine games.

► Three of Minnesota's four losses this year have come against teams currently ranked in the two major polls. Penn State checks in at No. 9 in the AP Poll and No. 7 in the Coaches, while Illinois and Purdue are receiving votes in both polls.

► Minnesota was receiving votes in the AP Preseason Poll. 2022 is the 11th season that Minnesota can make that claim, including three of the past four years, according to CollegePollArchive.com. The Gophers are looking to start and finish the year in the AP Poll for the second time in program history, also doing so in 2019.

## SUCCESS ON 3RD DOWNS

► Minnesota is one of the top teams in the country this year on both sides of the ball on 3rd downs. The offense is second in the FBS in conversion percentage, while the defense is second in opponent conversion rate.

► Minnesota's offense has converted 82 of 156 3rd downs for a 52.56 percent success rate. For context, Washington (57.06%) is the only other team higher than 52 percent and there are only eight teams total above 50 percent in the FBS this year.

► The Gophers have converted on better than 63 percent of third downs in five of their 12 games this year, including a season-best 86.7 percent (13-15) versus Colorado.

► On the other side of the ball, Minnesota has allowed opponents to convert just 39-of-149 third downs, 26.17 percent. Marshall (23.43 percent) is the only team with a better rate than the Gophers, and only 10 FBS teams total are under 30 percent on the season.

► The 39 conversions allowed are tied for the fewest in the nation with Air Force, while the 149 3rd downs faced are the ninth fewest.

► Penn State has had the most "success" against Minnesota this year by converting 5-of-11 3rd downs (45.5%). Otherwise, Illinois was 6-of-17 (35.3%), Wisconsin was 5-of-16 (31.3%), Purdue was 4-of-14 (28.6%), Iowa and Nebraska were 3-of-11 (27.3%), Michigan State was 2-of-8 (25.0%), Northwestern was 3-of-12 (25.0%), New Mexico State was 2-of-9 (22.2%), Rutgers was 2-of-10 (20.0%), Colorado was 1-of-12 (8.3%) and Western Illinois was 1-of-13 (7.7%).

## EXTRA EFFICIENT

► According to BCFTOys.com, Minnesota is one of the most efficient teams this year in regards to points per drive, net available yards and net yards per play.

► Ratings and supporting data on BCFTOys is calculated from the results of non-garbage possessions in FBS vs. FBS games.

► Minnesota's offense averages 2.44 points per drive, 52nd in the FBS, while the defense is seventh at 1.35. That net rating of 1.09 points per drive ranks 15th.

► Available yards percentage is calculated by dividing drive yards earned by available yards measured from starting field position to end zone.

► The Gophers rank 39th offensively in available yards percentage at .518, while the defense is No. 13 at .360. That gives them a net percentage of .158 that sits 13th among FBS schools.

► Minnesota also ranks 71st in offensive yards per play at 5.65, while the defense is 11th in the FBS at 4.78. The net difference of 0.87 puts the team 23rd in the FBS and 14th in the Power 5.

## EXPLOSIVE RUNS PUSH OFFENSE

► Minnesota has 174 plays from scrimmage this year that have gained at least 10 yards. Of those plays, 83 have been rushes of 10+ yards, tied for 16th most in the country, and nearly 48 percent of the team's big plays.

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** is responsible for 46 of those 83 runs to rank third in the country for runs of 10+ yards. His 10 runs of 20+ yards ties for 29th in the FBS and his five runs of 30+ is tied for 25th nationally.

## MILESTONE WATCH

- **Mohamed Ibrahim** is 57 rushing yards away from tying **Darrell Thompson's** school record of 4,654 career rushing yards and 79 yards from cracking the Big Ten's all-time top 10.
- In terms of single-season records, Ibrahim is 32 yards back of **David Cobb's** school record of 1,626 rushing yards set in 2014.
- Ibrahim is also 10 rushing attempts behind Cobb's record 314, also set in 2014.
- Ibrahim has tied Gary Russell's overall touchdown mark of 19 (set in 2005) and Russell's single-season record of 114 points, also set in 2005.
- Ibrahim also sits 10th in all-purpose yards (1,644) and could jump several spots in the bowl game.
- With eight career interceptions, **Tyler Nubin** needs one more to crack Minnesota's top-10 and two more to become the eighth player to reach 10 for a Gopher career.
- **Matthew Trickett** needs to make one extra point to move into a four-way tie for fourth in Gopher history, three to reach third and five to tie for second.

## MORE ON MO

- **Mohamed Ibrahim** has rushed 304 times in 11 games this season for 1,594 yards (5.2 average) and 19 touchdowns. He's posted those numbers despite missing the Purdue contest and not playing beyond the opening drive of the second half in any of the first three contests this season.
- A semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award, Ibrahim is third nationally with his 19 touchdowns, all of which have been on the ground, which is second most in the FBS. For context, there are 55 FBS teams that have not yet reached 19 rushing TDs this year.
- In addition, his 144.9 rushing yards per game is second in the nation (first among Power 5 players) and is a higher average than that of 60 teams.
- Ibrahim leads the country with his 27.64 rushing attempts per game and is third nationally in scoring (10.4) and rushing attempts, fourth in rushing yards, seventh in points scored (114) and eighth in all-purpose yards per game (149.45).
- Ibrahim has six games this year with at least two rushing touchdowns, tied with Ole Miss' Quinshon Judkins and Marshall's Khalan Laborn for the most in the country. Ibrahim is also one of seven FBS players this year to have three games with three or more rushing touchdowns.
- Ibrahim has been asked to carry the load as of late, rushing at least 27 times in each of the last six games. His five games of 30+ rushing attempts this season is tied for most in the FBS with Laborn and Illinois' Chase Brown.
- Within the Big Ten, Ibrahim leads the conference in total touchdowns (19), rushing touchdowns (19) and rushing yards per game (144.9), is second in rushing yards (1,594), all-purpose yards per game (149.45), total points (114) and points per game (10.4), ninth in yards per carry (5.24) and points responsible for per game (10.4) and 11th in total offense per game (144.9) and points responsible for (114).
- With 1,594 rushing yards on the season, Ibrahim has reached 1,000 yards for the third time in his career (also doing so in 2018 and 2020). Ibrahim joins **Laurence Maroney** (2003-05) and **Darrell Thompson** (1986-87, '89) as the only Gophers to accomplish the feat.
- Ibrahim's 144.9 rushing yards per game currently ranks second best in Minnesota single-season history behind his school record of 153.7 per game set in 2020.
- He's got 16 games in his career with multiple touchdowns (six this year), including seven games with at least three scores (three this season) and two games with a school-record four touchdowns.

- The 2020 Big Ten Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, Ibrahim holds the program record with 52 career rushing touchdowns, 52 total touchdowns, 24 games of 100 yards rushing and five career games of 200 yards rushing. His 312 points are second overall and the most by a non-kicker at Minnesota. He's also currently the program leader in rushing yards per game (114.9).
- Ibrahim is also second at Minnesota in rushing yards (4,597), third in all-purpose yards (4,808), fourth in rushing attempts (851) and tied for ninth in yards per carry (5.40).
- With 1,594 yards of total offense, Ibrahim is on pace to be the first non-quarterback to lead Minnesota in total offense since fellow running back **Garry White** in 1980.
- Within the Big Ten, Ibrahim is sixth in career rushing touchdowns with 52, while his 52 overall touchdowns is 10th in conference annals. He needs 79 rushing yards to crack the conference's all-time top-10 list.

## 100-YARD GAME STREAK ENDS AT 19

- Mohamed Ibrahim saw his streak of consecutive games with at least 100 yards rushing end with 70 rushing yards in the season finale at Wisconsin. The streak, which started at the 2020 Outback Bowl, was the longest in the FBS since at least 2000.
- During his 19-game streak, Ibrahim rushed 528 times for 2,903 yards and 37 touchdowns. He averaged 5.50 yards per rush and 152.8 yards per game over that span and added 15 catches for 106 yards.
- He had four games of more than 200 yards during his streak, including a career-high 263 against Iowa, 12 games with at least two rushing touchdowns, six games with three or more scores and a pair of four-TD games that tied Minnesota's single-game record.

## IBRAHIM BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- **Mohamed Ibrahim** was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after rushing for a career-high 263 yards and one touchdown on 39 carries against Iowa. This is the second time that Ibrahim has received the honor in his career as he was also honored once in 2020.
- His 263 yards are fifth most in the nation this year (most in Big Ten by 20 yards), fourth highest in program history and the most since **Chris Darkins'** program record of 294 against Purdue in 1995. It was also the most rushing yards against Iowa, who entered the game ranked eighth nationally by 88.6 rush yards per game, since Northern Illinois' Leshon Johnson's 306 yards in 1993.
- Ibrahim also set a Huntington Bank Stadium record for rushing attempts (39), and his 263-yard effort was the most in stadium history for a Gophers player, topping **David Cobb's** 220-yard performance versus Middle Tennessee State on Sept. 6, 2014.

## WINNINGEST QB AT MINNESOTA

► Sixth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is the winningest QB to wear the Maroon and Gold.  
 ► Morgan was injured at Illinois and did not play at Penn State on Oct. 22, snapping a streak of 45 straight starts. With **Athan Kaliakmanis** under center against the Nittany Lions, it marked the first time a quarterback other than Morgan started for Minnesota since **Zack Annexstad** at Nebraska on Oct. 20, 2018.  
 ► Morgan missed only one game and returned the next week against Rutgers, completing 14-of-21 passes for 122 yards and running three times for 17 yards. Morgan missed the second half at Nebraska due to injury and has missed the past three games.  
 ► This season, he has completed 103-of-153 passes for 1,324 yards and seven touchdowns with five interceptions. He's also added 63 rushing yards and a career-high four touchdowns on 32 carries.  
 ► His completion percentage this season of .673 is on pace to break his own school record of .632 set in 2019, while his pass efficiency rating of 148.57 is currently ranked third in Minnesota single-season history.  
 ► His career completion percentage of .622 is first in school history (50 points ahead of second place), as is his 150.58 efficiency rating, .702 win percentage and 33 wins.  
 ► Morgan ranks second in school history in completion and attempts (657-of-1056), passing yards (9,396), passing touchdowns (63), total offense (9,409), quarterback starts (47) and games with 250+ yards passing (12). He's also third in TD:INT ratio (1.97) and fourth in passing yards per game (188.2) and 300-yard passing games (4).  
 ► He has led the Gophers in passing each year since 2018, joining him with **Adam Weber** (2007-10) and **Rickey Foggie** (1984-87) as the only QBs in Gopher history to lead the team in passing yards four times. He is on track to become the first to do it in five years.  
 ► Morgan has at least 12 season and game team records and was All-B1G Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-B1G Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

## MORGAN B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK

► After helping Minnesota to a 34-7 win at Michigan State on Sept. 24, **Tanner Morgan** was named the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week along with Michigan's Blake Corum.  
 ► Morgan completed 23-of-26 passes for 268 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. It was his fourth career game completing at least 83 percent of his passes. He owns the top three marks in program history after completing 88.5 percent against the Spartans.  
 ► It was his eighth career game with at least three touchdowns passes and the third of his career with at least that many scoring strikes and no interceptions.  
 ► Morgan was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Nov. 9, 2020, when **Mohamed Ibrahim** received the honor.  
 ► It was the third time in his career that Morgan was tabbed as the conference's Offensive Player of the Week, as he was also bestowed the honor on Nov. 11, 2019 and Sept. 30, 2019. Morgan and **Adam Weber** are the only Minnesota quarterbacks to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week three times in their careers.

## KALIAKMANIS STEPS UP AT QB

► Redshirt freshman **Athan Kaliakmanis** has played in 10 games with four starts and gone 53-of-102 (52.0%) for 866 yards with three touchdowns and four interceptions for a rating of 125.14.

► Looking just at his four starts this year, Kaliakmanis is 42-of-79 (53.2%) for 645 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions for a rating of 129.22.  
 ► When **Tanner Morgan** was injured at Illinois, it was Kaliakmanis who came on in relief. He completed two of his six passes for 17 yards and threw the first two interceptions of his career.  
 ► Kaliakmanis then made his first career start at Penn State's White Out in place of the injured Morgan, completing 9-of-22 passes for 175 yards with one touchdown and one interception, and rushing seven times for 45 yards. Over the last 45 seasons, 31 QBs have started for the Gophers. Kaliakmanis' 19.4 yards per completion ranked third best among those signal-callers in their debut.  
 ► The last Gopher quarterback to make his first career start on the road before Kaliakmanis was **Conor Rhoda** at Maryland on Oct. 15, 2016, while the last Gopher QB to make his first career start against a ranked team was **MarQueis Gray** at then-No. 25 USC on Sept. 3, 2011. With Penn State ranked 16th, Kaliakmanis' start was against the highest ranked opponent for a first career start since **Andy Persby** started against then-No. 13 Penn State on Oct. 10, 1998.  
 ► Kaliakmanis also replaced an injured Morgan in the second half at Nebraska, completing 6-of-12 passes for 137 yards and rushing three times for 27 yards. Minnesota was down 10-0 when Kaliakmanis entered the game and he helped led the Gophers to a 20-13 victory.  
 ► He has since started the last three games against Northwestern, Iowa and Wisconsin.  
 ► Kaliakmanis was a four-star recruit according to 247Sports and ESPN and ranked as the No. 16 quarterback in the nation according to Rivals. He was listed as the No. 2 prospect in Illinois according to 247Sports and 267th overall by ESPN.

## KALIAKMANIS B1G FRESHMAN

► A native of Antioch, Ill., **Athan Kaliakmanis** is coming off the best game of his career, a 23-16 comeback win at Wisconsin that netted the signal-caller Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.  
 ► He set career highs in completions (19), attempts (29), passing yards (319) and touchdowns (2). He completed nine passes of 15 yards or more and averaged 16.8 yards per completion, as Minnesota rallied from a 16-13 fourth-quarter deficit to retain Paul Bunyan's Axe.  
 ► The Kaliakmanis-led offense finished with 416 yards of total offense (319 passing and 97 rushing), which was the most yards for the Gophers against the Badgers since racking up 501 yards in 2007.  
 ► Kaliakmanis is the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week since **Justin Walley** received the honor on Nov. 29, 2021. He is the first Minnesota quarterback to be feted since **Tanner Morgan** earned the weekly honor on Oct. 29, 2018.

## RELIABLE TIGHT END TARGET

► Gopher tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** is making the most of his redshirt senior campaign as he leads the team in targets (58), receptions (40), yards after catch (240) and YAC per game (20.0) and he's second in receiving yards (481) and touchdown receptions (2).  
 ► Trailing teammate **Daniel Jackson** by just three receiving yards, Spann-Ford is looking to become the first Gophers tight end to lead the team in receiving yards since **Maxx Williams** did it in 2013 and 2014. Before that, **Patt Evans** last did it in 1991.  
 ► Spann-Ford has been targeted at least two times in every game this year, the only Gopher to make that claim. He's also the only Minnesota player to have a catch in every game this season.  
 ► At Wisconsin, he set career highs in both receptions and receiving yards as he caught seven balls for 95 yards.

► Spann-Ford saw his production grow over the final weeks of last season. Of his 30 targets last year, 17 came in the final four weeks of the regular season, including a season-high six targets versus Illinois and four against Iowa and Wisconsin. He caught 23 passes for 296 yards and a touchdown last year, tying for third on the team in receptions and ranking fourth in receiving yards.

## JACKSON STEPS UP

► With **Chris Autman-Bell** out for the season, fellow wide receiver **Daniel Jackson** has helped pick up some of the production.

► Jackson missed the first two games of the season due to injury, but he made up for lost time. He leads the team with 5.6 targets per game, 484 receiving yards and three touchdown receptions. He's also second in targets (56), receptions (33), receiving yards per game (48.4) and yards after catch (163), and third in YAC per game (16.3).

► He recorded three catches for 42 yards and two touchdowns at Michigan State for the first multi-TD game of his career. The next week against Purdue, he posted a career-high 110 receiving yards on six receptions, including a career-long 66 yard gain.

► His nine targets against the Boilermakers and Wisconsin are the most by a Gopher this year, while his 54 targets over the last nine games (since Autman-Bell's injury) are most on the team.

► Jackson has been the team's leading receiver five times this season, most on the squad.

► Despite missing two games last year, Jackson was second on the team in receptions (25), targets (53) and targets per game (4.8). He had a career-high 58 receiving yards versus Ohio State in the 2021 season opener.

## BROCKINGTON, WRIGHT BREAK THROUGH AT UW

► The regular season finale at Wisconsin was a breakout game for redshirt junior wide receiver **Dylan Wright** and redshirt freshman wideout **Le'Meke Brockington**.

► Wright set a career high with 86 receiving yards, including a career-long 42-yard grab, and matched his career best with five catches. He entered the contest with 10 catches for 180 yards and a touchdown on the year and had three catches for 68 yards in his prior seven games.

► Brockington, meanwhile, had his second consecutive multi-reception game as he caught two passes for a career-high 52 yards. His 45-yard touchdown reception with 3:40 to play was the first of his career and turned out to be the game-winner as it broke a 16-16 tie.

► Brockington, who's made four starts this year, has been targeted just 16 times this season, but seven of those came in the last two games. In addition, four of his nine receptions on the year have come in the last two contests.

## GEARY MAKING MOST OF 7TH YEAR

► Wide receiver **Clay Geary** is in his seventh season of eligibility for the Golden Gophers and making the most of his last go-around in Maroon and Gold.

► After redshirting as a freshman walk-on in 2016, he played in nine games over the next two seasons with one catch. He was put on scholarship prior to 2019 and was surprised with the news after throwing out the first pitch at a Minnesota Twins game. He then went on to play in 10 games that year, mostly on special teams, before appearing five times in 2020 with five receptions for 50 yards. Geary then missed all of 2021 after a torn ACL in camp.

► He's gotten back into the fold this year with six catches for 85 yards and a touchdown. The touchdown, an acrobatic eight-yard reception against Colorado, was the first of his career.

► Geary has caught six of the seven passes thrown his way, the second highest catch rate (85.7%) among Gophers with at least three targets this season.

## POTTS, WILLIAMS BOUNCE BACK FROM INJURIES

► Running backs **Trey Potts** and **Bryce Williams** have both returned in 2022 are suffering season-ending injuries in 2021.

► Potts has 92 carries for 444 yards (4.8 average) and three touchdowns in 11 games (did not play at Illinois), while Williams has played in all 12 games and has carried 49 times for 243 yards (5.0 average) and three scores and caught 10 passes for 83 yards.

► Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's 2021 game at Purdue. He was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.

► The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back after the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.

► In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, 2021, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries tied for 14th in the FBS.

► He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then had 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before adding 78 yards and a TD on 15 carries at Purdue.

► Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.

► From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.

► Through games on Oct. 2 of last year, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).

► Three games after Potts' injury, Williams suffered a season-ending injury at Northwestern.

► In eight games in 2021, Williams ran for 186 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries. Most of his production came in a three-game span, running for 184 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries from Oct. 16 to Oct. 30. Williams was also second on the team in kick returns (5) and kick return yards (60).

► In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was Williams who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher last year.

## AUTMAN-BELL OUT FOR YEAR

► Sixth-year wide receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** suffered a season-ending lower leg injury against Colorado and had surgery on Sept. 21. Head coach **P.J. Fleck** said after the injury that the team would apply for a seventh-year of eligibility but would leave the decision up to Autman-Bell to use it or not if it was granted.

► Through three games this year, Autman-Bell was leading the team in targets (15), targets per game (5.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (214), receiving yards per game (71.3) and yards per catch (19.5), and he was tied for the lead in touchdown receptions (1).

► Against Western Illinois on Sept. 10, Autman-Bell caught five passes for 118 yards. It was his fifth career game with 100+ receiving yards and the second highest total of his career behind 129 against Purdue in 2020.

► Autman-Bell has played in 47 career games with 125 catches (12th in program history) for 1,970 yards (9th) and 13 TDs (T-13th).

► He had caught at least one pass in 45 games and has made at least one catch in his past 41 games, which remains the third longest active FBS streak and the second longest streak in school history behind **Ron Johnson's** Big Ten record streak of 46 games.

► Despite missing the first two games of the 2021 season, and the majority of two others due to varying injuries, Autman-Bell still led the team last year in receptions (36), receiving yards (506), receiving yards per game (46.0), receiving touchdowns (6), targets (59) and targets per game (5.4).

## O-LINE RELOADS

► Minnesota was one of 22 units named to the Midseason Honor Roll for the Joe Moore Award, which is given to the nation's most outstanding offensive line.

► The Golden Gophers have used the same starting five on the offensive line in every game this season with **Aireontae Ersery** at left tackle, **Axel Ruschmeyer** at left guard, **John Michael Schmitz** at center, **Chuck Filiaga** at right guard and **Quinn Carroll** at right tackle.

► Should that same unit start the bowl game, it would be the first time since at least 1995 that Minnesota used the same starting offensive line for an entire season.

► The unit has given up just 13 sacks in 12 games, tied for 16th in the country in fewest sacks allowed. The rate of 1.08 sacks allowed per game is tied for 19th. Minnesota has had six games this year with zero sacks allowed and has only had two games where they've allowed more than two sacks (3.0 at Nebraska and Wisconsin).

► The Gophers are also tied for 20th with 52 tackles for loss given up this year. The rate of 4.33 TFLs allowed per game is tied for 23rd in the FBS. The 42 TFLs have resulted in a loss of 172 yards, the 15th fewest this year.

► Minnesota is coming off a 2021 season where it boasted one of the deepest and most experienced offensive lines in the entire country.

► The Golden Gophers' line had more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 235. In addition, 12 members of the unit had appeared in at least one game and nine had started at least one contest.

► Four of the five starters have moved on, but Schmitz, a preseason All-American and nominee for the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Rimington Award, returned to anchor this year's unit. The sixth-year senior has started a unit-high 35 games in his career and was a first-team All-American.

► In the season opener against New Mexico State, Ersery made his first career start at left tackle, while Ruschmeyer lined up next to him at left guard. Schmitz manned the center position, while Filiaga made his Gopher debut by starting at right guard, and Carroll, a Notre Dame transfer, made his first career start when he lined up at right tackle. The unit did not allow a sack, while racking up 297 yards on the ground.

► While the unit may lack the number of starts as a year ago, it is certainly not a young group, but rather a group that has considerable experience in the program. Of the 19 offensive linemen on the Minnesota roster, nearly half are entering at least their fourth year of college, with 15 having at least two years of eligibility remaining.

## GOPHERS 'D' AMONG THE BEST

► As noted on Page 1, Minnesota boasts one of the best defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi**.

► One reason Minnesota has been successful this year is that the defense gets off the field. The unit has limited opponents to just 57.1 plays per game this year, the second fewest in the country.

► Minnesota has outscored opponents 251-100 over the first three quarters of games this year, including a 106-29 edge in the second quarter and 82-38 advantage in the third. Backups played significant fourth-quarter minutes in each of the team's first four games and yielded 21 points.

► Since the start of 2021 Minnesota has held 17 teams below 300 yards of offense in a game tied with Wisconsin for the most in the FBS in that span. This season, the Gophers have held eight of 12 opponents under 300 yards, tied for second most in the country behind Michigan (9).

► In addition, Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing seven times since the start of 2021, tied for the most in the country in that span. The Gophers have done it three times this year against New Mexico State (53), Colorado (90) and Rutgers (86).

► Minnesota has held 18 of its last 24 opponents below their rushing average entering the game, including 10 by more than 50 yards.

► Since the start of 2021, the Gophers have held 18 opponents to 16 points or fewer, second most in the nation behind only Georgia (20).

## SHUT-DOWN DEFENSE

Minnesota has held 17 of its last 20 opponents, and 19 of its last 23, below their total offense average entering the game, including 11 by more than 100 yards and three by more than 200.

► This year, Minnesota has held five teams to seven points or fewer. That's tied for the most such games in the FBS with Alabama, Georgia and Illinois.

► Minnesota gave up just 16 points in a three-game span against Rutgers, Nebraska and Northwestern. That tied for the fewest for the program in any three-game span since 1999 (16 points allowed in 2021 Guaranteed Rate Bowl and first two games of 2022), and were the fewest allowed in Big Ten play since allowing 15 points in a three-game span in 1967.

## STOPPING THE EXPLOSIVE PLAY

► One key for success this year for the Minnesota defense has been the ability to prevent explosive plays.

► The longest pass play from scrimmage for a Gopher foe is 58 yards, while only six runs have gone for longer than 20 yards (tied for fourth fewest in the nation).

► The Maroon and Gold has yielded just 115 plays of 10 yards or more from scrimmage, fifth best in the FBS, while only 34 plays from scrimmage have gone for more than 20 yards, tied for fourth best in the country.

► The 18 plays allowed of 30+ yards is tied for 21st, but Minnesota is fourth in the nation by giving up only four plays from scrimmage of at least 40 yards.

► The Golden Gophers' 74 pass plays allowed of 10 yards or more is tied fourth in the nation, while the 28 passes of more than 20 yards are tied for 12th. The Gophers are tied for fifth by allowing only three pass plays of 40+ yards, and they are one of 18 programs that has not given up more than one pass play longer than 50 yards.

## MORE ON THE SHUTOUTS

► Minnesota has two shutouts on the season, a 38-0 win over New Mexico State in the season opener and a 31-0 victory against Rutgers on Oct. 29. It's the first time Minnesota has recorded two shutouts in a season since 2006 and the second time doing so since 1977.

► Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State are the only other programs with two shutouts this season, but each has one against FCS foe, making Minnesota the only team to shut out two FBS teams this year.

► The shutout of Rutgers was the Gophers' first Big Ten shutout victory since a 45-0 win versus Illinois on Oct. 23, 2004.

► The Gophers dominated on defense, limiting Rutgers to just 134 total yards (86 passing, 48 rushing), seven first downs, and 2-of-10 conversions on third down. RU averaged just 3.0 yards per play and 2.3 yards per rush.

► Minnesota's shutout of New Mexico State on Sept. 1 saw a smothering performance by the defense, holding the Aggies to just 91 yards of total offense with 53 yards passing and 38 rushing yards. It was the first time since at least 2000 the Gophers held an opponent to 55 or fewer yards in both passing and rushing in one game.

► The Aggies were held to only 33 plays on the night, the fewest ever by a Minnesota opponent and tied for the lowest total in the FBS since 2017. The previous school mark was 40, set by Nebraska in 1960 and matched by Middle Tennessee State in 2010.

► NMSU gained 91 yards (53 passing, 38 rushing), the third fewest by an FBS team this season. The Golden Gophers also held the Aggies to just six first downs, equaling the fewest allowed in the P.J. Fleck era (two off the modern school record) and tied for the fourth lowest total this year by an FBS program.

► The 91 yards of total offense allowed was the sixth best performance in program history since 1960 and the second fewest since 1967 after last year's performance at Colorado where the Buffaloes were limited to 63 yards.

► The 38 rushing yards allowed marked the 11th time since 2000 the Gophers held their opponent to at least that number. Four of those 11 have come under Fleck.

► Rutgers and New Mexico State both had 21 rushing attempts, tied for the fewest by a Minnesota opponent since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011. Colorado also had 21 last year.

► Coupled with a 30-0 shutout at Colorado last year, Minnesota joins Georgia (5), Fresno State (3), Penn State (3) and UAB (3) as the only programs with at least three shutouts in the past two seasons.

## SORI-MARIN LEADS DEFENSE

► Fifth-year linebacker **Mariano Sori-Marin** was the top returning tackler from last season and he's carried that into 2022, leading the team with 78 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss. He also has a sack and three pass breakups.

► On the preseason watch list for the 2022 Butkus Award, he has at least three tackles in every game this year, including a season-high 15 at Penn State on Oct. 17, and at least five tackles in nine contests. No other Gopher has at least two tackles in every game.

► The game at Penn State was Sori-Marin's fifth career game of at least 10 tackles and his second of at least 15. He had a career-high 18 stops at Nebraska in 2020.

► Sori-Marin, who started all 13 games last year but was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue because of injury, finished with 85 tackles, including 23 in a two-game span. After 11 at Northwestern, he had 12 against Illinois, which was the most by a Gopher last year.

► Sori-Marin also had 4.5 tackles for loss in 2021 to go with three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and an interception.

## LINDENBERG LEADING OF LATE

► Redshirt sophomore linebacker **Cody Lindenberg** is second on the team this season with 60 tackles and fourth with 4.0 tackles for loss. He's also got 1.0 sacks, two pass breakups and a QB hurry.

► Lindenberg has played in all 12 games but has started each of the past five contests. In that time, he's posted a team-high 34 tackles.

► He's led or tied for the team lead in tackles six times this season, including a career-high eight stops at Nebraska and against Iowa

## SENIOR SECONDARY

► With sophomore **Justin Walley** manning one of the cornerback spots, the rest of the secondary is filled out by fifth year corner **Terrell Smith**, fifth year safety **Jordan Howden** and fourth-year senior safety **Tyler Nubin**.

► Those four account for 11 of the team's 13 interceptions this year as Nubin leads the team with four interceptions, while Walley has three and Howden is tied with Smith for third with two picks. The other picks belong to defensive lineman **Danny Striggow** at Michigan State and fellow defensive back **Ryan Stapp** against Northwestern.

► Nubin's first pick this year came against Purdue, and then he had two against Rutgers. He had the first multi-interception game by a Gopher since **Antoine Winfield Jr.** had two versus Penn State on Nov. 9, 2019. Nubin's most recent pick came versus Northwestern.

► Also against Purdue, Nubin recorded his first forced fumble of the season (second career). He became the first Minnesota player to have both a forced fumble and an interception in the same game since **Eric Murray** versus TCU on Sept. 3, 2015.

► Nubin, who missed the Wisconsin game due to injury but has announced he is returning to Minnesota for a fifth season, is third on the team with 55 tackles, and he has 2.0 tackles for loss, three pass breakups and a forced fumble. He had a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.0 for loss, at Illinois.

► After tying for the team lead in interceptions in 2020 (1) and 2021 (3), Nubin is looking to join **Keith Edwards** (1977-79) as the only Gophers since 1961 to lead the team in interceptions three years in row.

► Howden is not far behind Nubin with 51 stops, 2.5 tackles for loss and four pass breakups. Howden had 10 tackles against the Illini, his second career game with double-digit stops. His interceptions came against Western Illinois and Purdue.

► Smith has 38 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble, two interceptions and a team-high five pass breakups. He's one of six players in the country to record that stat line this season.

► Smith made his pick to preserve a shutout in the season opener against New Mexico State and had one on the road at Nebraska.

## WALLEY'S WORLD

► Sophomore defensive back **Justin Walley** earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team last season and was PFF's highest graded true freshman cornerback.

► This year, he's started all 12 games at cornerback and has 33 tackles with two pass breakups. He's second on the team with three interceptions and one fumble recovery.

► At Michigan State, Walley had three tackles, plus an interception and a fumble recovery. Since at least 2000, he's just the third Gopher to have an interception and fumble recovery in the same game (**Jalen Myrick** at Purdue in 2015, **Mario Reese** vs. Iowa in 2006).

► He picked up his second interception of the season at Penn State and returned it 37 yards to set up a Minnesota field goal. It was the longest interception return for a Gophers player since **Coney Durr's** 72-yard pick six versus Maryland on Oct. 26, 2019.

Walley recorded his third interception of the year at Wisconsin in the fourth quarter, returning it 28 yards.

► His 65 interception yards this year are tied for ninth most at Minnesota since 2000.

► Twice this season (against Purdue and Iowa) he's had six tackles in a game, a career high.

► Walley played in all 13 games last season and started the final six of the season. He made 29 tackles, broke up seven passes, recovered two fumbles, forced one fumble and made one interception.

► During the season, he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after a standout performance in Minnesota's 23-13 win against Wisconsin as he recorded his first career interception and finished the game with a career high five tackles, helping Minnesota win Paul Bunyan's Axe for the second time in four years.

► Walley was the first Gopher defensive player to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

## TRANSFERS REINFORCE DEFENSE

► The Gophers' defense in 2022 has relied on five transfers to provide depth and production at key spots along the defensive line and in the secondary.

► Defensive lineman **Kyler Baugh** is one of three defensive linemen to transfer in to Minnesota. Baugh played the prior three years at Houston Baptist where he played in 26 games with 18 starts. He made 104 career tackles, which included 11.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks, broke up four passes, forced a fumble and recovered another. He was a three-time Southland Conference Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll honoree.

► **Darnell Jefferies** is a defensive lineman coming off a four-year career at Clemson where he was a part of the 2018 national championship team and the 2019 squad that reached the national title game. He played in 29 games for the Tigers and made 22 tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.

► The third defensive lineman is **Lorenza Surgers** who is playing at Minnesota after four seasons at Vanderbilt. He played in 18 games and made 19 career tackles, which included 1.5 tackles for loss and one sack. He also broke up two passes.

► Defensive back **Beanie Bishop** spent the past four seasons at Western Kentucky where he played in 36 games and made 76 tackles, totaled 8.5 tackles for loss, defended 12 passes, made three interceptions and forced one fumble.

► Last season, Bishop was named All-Conference USA First Team as a defensive back as he made 43 tackles and 6.5 tackle for loss, broke up four passes, made three interceptions (returned one for a touchdown) and forced one fumble. He also returned 28 kickoffs for 676 yards to earn all-conference honorable mention as a kickoff returner.

► Fellow defensive back **Ryan Stapp** came to Minnesota following three years at Abilene Christian where he made 91 tackles in 27 games. He added 6.5 tackles for loss, 13 pass breakups and four interceptions. While with the Wildcats, where he was teammates with former Gopher linebacker **Jack Gibbens**, Stapp was on the Southland Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.

► Three of the five transfers have played in all 12 games for the Gophers this year. Baugh has started every game and has 33 tackles, 1.0 tackles for loss, 0.5 sacks and a pass breakup. Bishop has 28 stops with a sack and a pass breakup, while Jefferies has made five tackles.

► Stapp has played in 11 games with 11 tackles, 1.0 sacks and an interception, while Surgers has four tackles, with a sack, in six games.

## REDDING READY ON RETURNS

► Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Quentin Redding** has emerged as a potent weapon in the return game this year for Minnesota.

► He's returned 17 kickoffs for 390 yards, which is more yards than any Gopher has had in a season since **Demetrius Douglas** had 594 in 2018. Redding's average of 22.9 yards per return is third in the Big Ten and ranks 28th nationally.

► At Illinois, Redding set career highs in returns (5) and return yards (151), highlighted by a career-long 92-yard return to start the second half.

► Redding's return was Minnesota's longest since Smith returned the opening kick 100 yards for a TD versus Nebraska on Nov. 11, 2017. Redding's 151 kick return yards were the most for a Gopher since **KiAnte Hardin** had 165 versus Illinois on Nov. 21, 2015.

► Redding is also averaging 6.0 yards on punt returns, gaining 78 yards on 13 returns. His returns are the most since by a Gopher since **Craig James** (16) in 2014 and his yardage is the best since Douglas in 2018 (113).

## TRICKETT CAN KICK IT

► On the season, **Matthew Trickett** is 15-of-18 on field goal tries with a long of 50 yards, and he's made all 42 extra point tries. His 42 extra points made without a miss is third best in program history.

► He's currently third in the Big Ten and 36th nationally with his 83.3 percent success rate on field goals, is sixth in the conference with his 1.25 field goals made per game and ranks seventh with 7.2 points per game and 87 points on the season.

► A transfer last season from Kent State, Trickett is already ninth in program history with 32 career field goals made, while his field goal percentage of .744 ranks fifth.

► Last year Trickett made the most of his first season with Minnesota. He made 36 of 38 extra points and 17 of 25 field goals for 87 points, 41 more than any other Gopher. He ranked ninth in the Big Ten in scoring and 11th nationally with 6.7 points per game. His 87 points were 11th overall in Minnesota single-season history and seventh all-time among Gopher kickers.

► Trickett's 17 made field goals tied for fifth most in program history and the most since **Emmit Carpenter** made 17 in 2018. He made 1.31 field goals per game, good for sixth in the Big Ten.

## BIG SPECIALIST OF THE WEEK

► **Matthew Trickett** was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after his performance in Minnesota's 20-13 road win at Nebraska.

► The fifth-year senior made his two longest field goals of the season, first from 47 yards on the opening drive of the third quarter to cut Nebraska's lead to 10-3 and later from 49 yards in the fourth quarter to give Minnesota its first lead in the game at 13-10. He also went 2-of-2 on point-after attempts, scoring eight of Minnesota's 20 points in the game.

► The 49-yard field goal was tied for the second longest of his career and one yard shy of tying his career mark of 50 yards.

► Trickett was the first Gopher to earn Special Teams honors from the Big Ten since **Mark Crawford** did it last year and the first kicker to do so since **Emmit Carpenter** in 2018.

## KESICH: KICKOFF SPECIALIST

► Junior kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich** has posted touchbacks on 58 of 66 kickoffs this year, including a career-high eight against Western Illinois.

► Kesich leads the country with his kickoff average of 64.79 yards and touchback percentage of 87.88 percent, while his 58 touchbacks are tied for fifth most in the FBS.

► As a result of Kesich's prowess, Minnesota opponents have only had six kickoff returns this year, which ties for fewest in the country, and the 123 kickoff return yards allowed is second.

## CRAWFORD THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

► **Mark Crawford** is in his third season as the Gophers' punter. He's punted 40 times this year with 37 of those punts coming in the team's last eight games. With 41 punts this year (including a block at Penn State), the Gophers rank tied for 22nd in fewest punts. The 3.4 punts per game is tied for 23rd.

► Crawford, who is also the team's holder on kicks, is averaging 40.3 yards on his boots this year. Eighteen of his 40 punts have been fair caught, 12 have landed inside the 20-yard line and only three have gone for a touchback.

► He has four punts this year of 50+ yards, including a long of 53 yards, three of which came at Penn State.

► Opponents have only returned nine punts this year, tied for 23rd fewest in the country. They also rank sixth with only 26 punt return yards allowed and the 2.89 yards per return ranks ninth.

► Last year, Crawford punted 47 times for 1961 yards, an average of 41.7 yards per punt that ranked eighth in the Big Ten. He had six kicks cover at least 50 yards and 24 punts land inside the 20-yard line.

► A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.

► He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win six Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.

## CONTEXT FOR THE NEBRASKA COMEBACK

► Trailing 10-0 at halftime at Nebraska on Nov. 5, Minnesota came back for a 20-13 victory. In fact, the Gophers were down 10-0 until a field goal with 10:30 left in the third quarter got them on the board.

► The Golden Gophers outscored the Huskers 10-0 in the third quarter and 10-3 in the fourth to outscore them 20-3 in the second half.

► It was Minnesota's biggest comeback win since overcoming a 14-point deficit at Nebraska on Nov. 22, 2014. In that game, the Gophers trailed 21-7 with 5:18 remaining in the first half, but rallied for a 28-24 victory.

► The comeback win was Minnesota's 11th since 1973 when trailing by at least 10 points at halftime. The most recent of which was the aforementioned 2014 win at Nebraska where it trailed 21-7 at intermission.

► Down 10-0 after the opening quarter, Minnesota overcame a 10-point deficit at the end of the first quarter for the fifth time since 1973. Prior to Saturday, the most recent such comeback took place versus Purdue on Oct. 10, 2009 when the Gophers trailed 10-0 after the first quarter and won 35-20.

## CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Minnesota has dominated time of possession this year, averaging 35:15 minutes with the ball. That figure ranks second nationally behind only Air Force (36:16).

► The Golden Gophers opened the year with their highest time of possession in six years under **P.J. Fleck** when they had the ball for a staggering 44:30 against New Mexico State. Minnesota held it for at least 8:58 in every quarter, including 13:29 in the third quarter alone.

► Eight times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. In addition to New Mexico State, Minnesota also had it for 42:29 this year at Michigan State, 41:02 against Rutgers and 40:22 versus Northwestern.

► It happened three times last year, holding the ball for 40:02 at Iowa, 40:09 at Northwestern and 40:13 at Colorado. In 2019, Minnesota recorded 42:53 against Maryland.

► In 70 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 55 times and gone 38-17 in those contests.

## AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

► Minnesota is among the least penalized teams in the country, committing 44 penalties for 393 yards.

► The Gophers rank second nationally and lead the Big Ten with their 3.67 penalties per game, and they are fifth in the FBS and second in the conference with 32.75 penalty yards per contest.

► Minnesota has committed four or fewer penalties in a game nine times this year, including a program record zero against Iowa.

## ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** leads all active FBS players in rushing touchdowns (52), total touchdowns scored (52) and rushing yards (4,527), is second in rushing attempts (851), rushing attempts per game (21.28) and all-purpose plays per game (21.90), third in rushing yards per game (114.9) and all-purpose plays (876), sixth in all-purpose yards (4,808) and all-purpose yards per game (120.20), 11th in points per game (7.8), 20th in points (312) and 25th in yards per rush (5.4).

► **Tanner Morgan** is second among all active FBS players in passing yards per attempt (8.90) and ranks 13th in total offense per play (7.39), 18th in passing yards (9,396), 21st in pass efficiency (150.58), 24th in total offense (9,409), 29th in total plays (1,274), pass attempts (1,056) and pass completions (657), 31st in passing touchdowns (63), 32nd in TDs responsible for (71) and 39th in completion percentage (.622).

► Defensive back **Tyler Nubin** ranks 29th in interceptions (8) and 39th in interceptions per game (0.19) among FBS players.

► Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** ranks third among active FBS players in field goals made (79), fifth in field goal attempts (100), eighth in points (409) and field goals made per game (1.49), ninth in field goals attempted per game (1.89), 14th in points per game (7.7), 16th in extra points made and attempted (172-175), 21st in extra point percentage (.983) and 42nd in field goal percentage (.790).

## FIVE, SIX YEARS OF FLECK

► As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their sixth season under **P.J. Fleck**. The first five years of the Fleck Era, in which they went 35-23 overall, stack up among the best of any five-year span in program history.

► The .603 win percentage is tied for the best mark since 1960-64 (.649) and is tied for the second best percentage since 1944-48.

- ▶ The team's 21 Big Ten wins are the most since the program won 23 from 1965-69.
- ▶ The three bowl wins in a five-year span are tied for second most in program history behind only four from 2015-19 (of which two belong to Fleck).
- ▶ With one game still to play this year, Fleck already has the second most wins of any coach at Minnesota in his first six seasons. His 43 victories are topped only by **Henry L. Williams'** 65 wins from 1900-05.
- ▶ Fleck's win percentage of .614 trails only Williams (.912) and Bernie Bierman (.833) through six seasons at Minnesota, while Fleck's 26 Big Ten wins are the most.

## BURNS NAMED HEAD COACH AT KENT STATE

- ▶ University of Minnesota Assistant Head Coach and Running Backs Coach **Kenni Burns** has been named the head football coach at Kent State University. Burns has been at Minnesota since 2017 and this is his first head coaching opportunity.
- ▶ Burns will depart Minnesota after coaching some of the best running backs to ever wear the Maroon and Gold. He mentored three of Minnesota's top 13 rushers ever in **Mohamed Ibrahim** (second in school history), **Rodney Smith** (third in school history) and **Shannon Brooks** (13th in school history).
- ▶ "Kenni is an elite coach and person, and I am thrilled for him and for Kent State," said Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck**. "This is a tremendous hire and the Golden Flashes are getting an amazing man who excels at connecting with his players and getting the most out of them on the field, in the classroom and in the community. Kenni will do a fantastic job, and he will do it his way. I am excited to follow his journey."
- ▶ Burns is in his 15th year of coaching, as he also spent time at Western Michigan, Wyoming, North Dakota State, Southern Illinois and Millersville (Pa.). The Springfield, Ill., native played college football at Indiana where he was a running back from 2003-06. He graduated in 2006 with a degree in general studies.

## CIARROCCA BACK AS OC

- ▶ **Kirk Ciarrocca** has returned as Minnesota's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, a role he previously held from 2017-19.
- ▶ Ciarrocca returned after being away for two years. He spent 2020 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Penn State and served in a non-coaching role as an offensive analyst at West Virginia in 2021.
- ▶ For further evidence of Ciarrocca's success at Minnesota, quarterback **Tanner Morgan** has had eight of his 10 best games in regards to pass efficiency with Ciarrocca as his OC.
- ▶ In addition to previously working with Fleck at Minnesota, Ciarrocca was also his offensive coordinator at Western Michigan for four seasons. Ciarrocca has spent seven total seasons as an offensive coordinator under Fleck and helped both programs produce record-setting numbers on offense.
- ▶ Ciarrocca was one of 15 semifinalists for the Broyles Award in 2019 after the Gophers averaged 432 yards per game (fourth most in school history in the modern era) and 34.1 points per game (third most in school history in the modern era). That same year, Minnesota rushed for 25 touchdowns and threw for 31 touchdowns, which was the first time in school history that the Gophers reached both of those numbers in the same season.
- ▶ With Ciarrocca as the OC and **Joe Rossi** as the DC, Minnesota has gone 22-7. That span covers the final four games of 2018 (3-1), the 2019 regular season (10-2) and this season (8-4).

## THREE ADDED TO STAFF IN 2022

- ▶ In addition to the hiring of Ciarrocca, Minnesota added three assistant coaches to its staff in the offseason.
- ▶ **Danny Collins** is coaching the Gopher safeties. He has been on the Minnesota staff since 2017 and has served in multiple roles with the Gophers, most recently as a Senior Defensive Analyst.
- ▶ Collins was in quality control in his first season in Minnesota in 2017, then transitioned to a graduate assistant position for the 2018 season and was named interim defensive backs coach for Minnesota's win against Georgia Tech in the Quick Lane Bowl.
- ▶ Collins moved back to quality control in 2019 and again worked on the defensive side of the ball. He was thrust into on-field coaching duties again at the Outback Bowl and was the interim defensive line coach. Collins came to Minnesota from Western Michigan where he was a defensive GA from 2015-17 under **P.J. Fleck**.
- ▶ **Greg Harbaugh** (pronounced HAR-bo) is coaching the Gopher tight ends. He returns to Minnesota for a third stint with the Gophers, as he previously served in a quality control role twice on the Minnesota staff (2017, '19). Harbaugh most recently was the receivers coach at Western Michigan for the 2020 and 2021 seasons. Prior to his first stint at Minnesota in 2017, Harbaugh was also at Western Michigan in 2015 and 2016 as a graduate assistant under Fleck.
- ▶ Veteran coach and proven recruiter **Brick Haley** is leading Minnesota's defensive line. Haley brings more than 30 years of experience – both in college and in the NFL – to the Gophers. He has primarily coached the defensive line in his career, but has also been a defensive coordinator and coached linebackers.
- ▶ Haley most recently was at Missouri where he coached the defensive line for four seasons and also held the title of Senior Associate Head Coach. Prior to Missouri, Haley spent two seasons at Texas, and before that he was at LSU for from 2009-14, where he directed one of the nation's most disruptive defensive fronts.
- ▶ In addition to those three, one other offseason change saw cornerbacks coach **Paul Haynes** get promoted to co-defensive coordinator. Haynes joined the University of Minnesota coaching staff in February 2020 and has been instrumental in the Gophers cornerbacks' contributions to a stout defense.

## GOPHER GRADUATES

- ▶ Minnesota's 2022 roster features 16 student-athletes who have already graduated: **Chris Autman-Bell**, **Nathan Boe**, **Chuck Filiaga**, **Clay Geary**, **Mohamed Ibrahim**, **Jordan Howden**, **Darnell Jefferies**, **Preston Jelen**, **Tanner Morgan**, **Samuel Pickerign**, **Axel Ruschmeyer**, **Thomas Rush**, **John Michael Schmitz**, **Terrell Smith**, **Mariano Sori-Marin** and **Lorenza Surgers**.

## FOUR GOPHERS DRAFTED IN '22

- ▶ Minnesota had four players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft. That ups its total since 2020 to 11, which is fifth in the Big Ten and tied for 13th nationally.
- ▶ Seattle took **Boye Mafe** in the second round with the 40th overall pick, making him the first Minnesota d-lineman drafted since **Ra'Shede Hageman** went 37th overall in 2014.
- ▶ **Daniel Faalele** was next off the board as Baltimore took him in the fourth round with the No. 110 pick. Faalele was the first Gopher offensive lineman to be drafted since 2006 when both **Greg Eslinger** and **Mark Setterstrom** were selected.

- ▶ The Minnesota Vikings selected defensive lineman **Ezezi Otomewo** in the fifth round with the No. 165 pick. He was the first Gopher to be selected by the Vikings since 2010, when the purple and gold took linebacker **Nate Triplett** in the fifth round.
- ▶ **Ko Kieft** was the final Gopher off the board as the tight end was taken by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the sixth round with the No. 218 overall pick. He became the first Gopher tight end picked since **Maxx Williams** in 2015.
- ▶ With the picks of Mafe and Otomewo, it was the first time two Gopher d-linemen were taken in the same draft since 1958.
- ▶ Minnesota has now had 12 players taken in a four-year span (2019-22). That is the most selections in that time frame in school history since the draft was reduced to seven rounds in 1994. Minnesota's previous best in a four-year span was from 1988-91 when it had 14 players taken in drafts that were 12 rounds.

## SCORIGAMI

- ▶ Scorigami is a concept thought up by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks final scores that have never happened before in NFL history. Inspired by Bois, what follows are the Scorigami results this season for Minnesota football.
- ▶ *Minnesota 38, New Mexico State 0.* No scorigami. It's the fourth such score in program history. The Gophers have won by this score three times, most recently in 1975 against Western Michigan.
- ▶ *Minnesota 62, Western Illinois 10.* Scorigami achieved! In 1,296 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.
- ▶ *Minnesota 49, Colorado 7.* No Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end in this score, all Minnesota victories. The last was in 1998 against Iowa.
- ▶ *Minnesota 34, Michigan State 7.* No Scorigami. This was the seventh game in program history to end in this score, with Minnesota winning five of them. The most recent was a victory over Nebraska in 2019.
- ▶ *Purdue 20, Minnesota 10.* Scorigami achieved! In 1,299 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.
- ▶ *Illinois 26, Minnesota 14.* Partial Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end by this score, most recently a win at Nebraska in 1960. It's the first time Minnesota has lost by the score.
- ▶ *Penn State 45, Minnesota 17.* No Scorigami. This was the second game to end by this score with the other being a loss at Purdue in 2011.
- ▶ *Minnesota 31, Rutgers 0.* Partial Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end by this score, but the first in which Minnesota won.
- ▶ *Minnesota 20, Nebraska 13.* No Scorigami. This was the seventh game in program history to end by this score, most recently a win at Purdue in 2021. The Gophers have won by the score four times in their history.
- ▶ *Minnesota 31, Northwestern 3.* Partial Scorigami. This was the second game in history to end by this score, but the first in which Minnesota won.
- ▶ *Iowa 13, Minnesota 10.* Scorigami achieved! In 1,305 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.
- ▶ *Minnesota 23, Wisconsin 16.* Scorigami achieved! In 1,306 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.

## HEAD COACH // SIXTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 42, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 73-49 and is 43-27 at Minnesota.

In five years, Fleck established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program. Fleck was already sixth in program history in overall wins (35) and Big Ten wins (21), and eighth in games coached (58). Fleck's .603 win percentage was third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season twice, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 3-0 in bowl games and those three wins are tied with Glen Mason (3-4 bowl record during his time coaching the Gophers from 1997-2006) for the most in school history.

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), eight Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 268 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also led Minnesota to a 3-0 record in bowl games and has had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Mohamed Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied

school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single-season history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the

Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annestad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted

a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

## OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.
