FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1 Minnesota football, which is receiving votes in both the AP and Coaches Polls, opens up Big Ten play and goes on the road for the first time this year Saturday as it visits RV/#21 Michigan State. Kickoff is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. on Big Ten Network.

2 Minnesota enters Saturday's contest ranked second in the nation in both total offense and total defense. The Golden Gophers are averaging 554.7 yards of offense per game, while allowing just 170.3 yards per contest. They boast the No. 2 rushing offense (312.7 ypg) and No. 9 rush defense (69.7 ypg) along with the 19th-ranked passing efficiency offense (173.8 rating) and 10th-ranked passing efficiency defense (85.25 rating). Georgia is the only other program with its total offense (6th) and total defense (13th) both ranked in the top 15. For good measure, Minnesota also has the No. 7 scoring offense (49.7 ppg) and No. 4 scoring defense (5.7 ppg). With 149 points scored and just 17 allowed, the team's scoring differential of +132 ranks second nationally behind only Michigan (+149).

3 The 149 points through the first three games of the season is fourth most in Minnesota history. The only higher-scoring starts came in 1904 (259 points), 1905 (170) and 1916 (169). Along those lines, the Maroon and Gold's scoring differential of +132 through three games is also fourth best. Those same years, 1904 (+259), 1905 (+170) and 1916 (+155) are the only years with a better scoring margin through two games. The 17 points allowed through three games is the second best for Minnesota since 1961 with only 1999 (14 points) being better. The Gophers have won each game this year by at least 38 points, their first streak of three games or more since the 1916-17 seasons.

4 Now 3-0 on the season, the Gophers are looking to start 4-0 for the second time in six years under P.J. Fleck and the 36th time in program history. The other instance under Fleck came in 2019 when they started 9-0. Dating back to last year, Minnesota has won six games in a row. That's tied with UCLA and Coastal Carolina for the third longest active winning streak in the country. Only Clemson (9) and Kentucky (6) are currently on longer streaks.

5 The 2022 campaign is the sixth for head coach P.J. Fleck at Minnesota, where he holds a record of 38-23. He is already sixth in program history for wins and Big Ten wins (21), and is seventh in games coached (61). A win Saturday would tie him with Cal Stoll (39-39, 1972-78) for fifth in program history. Fleck's .623 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). Through his first five years at Minnesota, only Williams (55, 1900-04) had more wins than Fleck's 35. In his 10th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 68-45 (.602).



Mohamed Ibrahim ran for 202 yards and scored three rushing touchdowns Saturday vs. Colorado. He set a program record with his fourth career 200-yard game and tied Darrell Thompson's school mark of 40 career rushing scores.

A WIN WOULD...

- Push the Gophers' win streak to seven games, which would be their longest streak since winning the first nine games of 2019
- Improve Minnesota to 4-0 for the second time under **P.J. Fleck** (also did so in 2019) and 36th time in program history
- Make Minnesota is 64-55-8 all-time in Big Ten openers, including a 2-4 mark under Fleck
- Mark the Gophers' record at 61-65-9 all-time in road openers, including a 3-3 mark under Fleck
- Snap a five-game losing streak to Michigan State overall and end a three-game skid in East Lansing
- Put the Gophers at 18-30 all-time against the Spartans, including a 7-17 mark at Spartan Stadium
- Enhance Fleck's record to 39-23 at Minnesota and 69-45 overall
- Tie Fleck with Cal Stoll for the fifth-most wins in program history (39)

FACING MICHIGAN STATE

► Minnesota and Michigan State meet for the 48th time on Saturday, but due to scheduling quirks, it'll be the first time in nearly five years they will have met. The Gophers have played every other Big Ten team at least once since 2019, but they last faced the Spartans on Oct. 14, 2017.

► In fact, this will be the first matchup between the teams in East Lansing since Nov. 13, 2013. The next longest current gap between playing at a Big Ten school for Minnesota is at Penn State, where it last played on Oct. 1, 2016. The two teams meet in Happy Valley this year on Oct. 22.

► The Golden Gophers trail 17-30 in the series with the Spartans, including five straight losses. That's the team's third longest active losing streak against one opponent behind Ohio State (12) and Iowa (7). Minnesota is looking for its first win in the series since a 42-34 victory in Minneapolis on Oct. 31, 2009.

► In East Lansing, the Gophers trail 6-17 in the series. Minnesota is looking to snap a three-game losing streak at Spartan Stadium, which is tied for the third longest active skid at one school behind Iowa (10) and Ohio State (6). The Golden Gophers' last win at MSU came on Nov. 11, 2006.

► **P.J. Fleck** is 0-3 all-time in his career against Michigan State, including an 0-1 mark at Minnesota and 0-2 record from his time at Western Michigan. His very first game as a college head coach took place at Michigan State when he led WMU in 2013.

► Minnesota has one Michigan native on its roster in freshman linebacker **Tyler Stolsky**, who hails from Portage and Portage Central High School. Portage is about 1.5 hours southwest of East Lansing.

► Michigan State has three Minnesotans on its roster: freshman DE Chase Carter from Brooklyn Park (Minnehaha Academy), junior WR Terry Lockett Jr. from Minneapolis (Minnehaha Academy) and sixth-year TE Powers Warren from Minnetonka (Minnetonka HS).

► Minnesota cornerbacks coach and co-defensive coordinator **Paul Haynes** was Michigan State's defensive backs coach from 2003-04 and again from 2018-19.

► Gopher running backs coach **Kenny Burns** was the North Dakota State wide receivers coach from 2010-13, while Michigan State defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Scottie Hazelton** was the DC/LBs coach for the Bison from 2010-11.

► Michigan State offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Jay Johnson** was the OC/QBs coach at Minnesota for the 2016 season. He is an Austin, Minn., native and graduated from Lakeville High School.

► Spartan redshirt sophomore LB Itayvion Brown spent the 2020 season at Minnesota; he did not see game action.

► Michigan State enters the game with a 2-1 record. After convincing home wins over Western Michigan (35-13) and Akron (52-0), the Spartans went on the road last week and fell at Washington, 39-28.

► Payton Thorne has thrown for 768 yards on 60-of-94 passing with seven touchdowns and four interceptions, good for a QB rating of 148.5 that ranks sixth in the Big Ten.

► Jalen Berger leads Michigan State with 254 yards and four touchdowns on 46 rushing attempts, while Jarek Broussard is not far behind him with 138 yards and two scores on 29 carries.

► The receiving corps is led by Keon Coleman who has team highs in receptions (15) and receiving yards (236). His three receiving touchdowns are tied with Tre Mosley for the team lead. Mosley is second in catches (9) and yards (141).

► Defensively, Cal Haladay leads the team with 21 tackles and is one of three players with at least 20 tackles this year. Jacoby Windmon is tied for the FBS lead with 5.5 sacks, while 6.5 TFLs are tied for fifth. The Spartans are still looking for their first interception of the season, but Charles Brantley does have a team-high four pass breakups. MSU has forced eight fumbles, including four by Windmon alone, and recovered six of the team.

LAST TIME VS. THE SPARTANS

► *With assistance from the AP:* L.J. Scott rushed for a career-high 194 yards and two touchdowns on a soggy night, helping 21st-ranked Michigan State hang on for a 30-27 victory over Minnesota when the teams last met on Oct. 14, 2017, in Minneapolis.

► Madre London pitched in 74 yards rushing and a score, Matt Coghlin made three field goals.

► **Demry Croft** relieved a struggling **Conor Rhoda** at quarterback for the Gophers in the middle of the second quarter and connected with **Tyler Johnson** for three touchdown passes in the fourth. The late surge wasn't enough to overcome the bruising, pulling and trapping Spartans blockers who wore down an injury-depleted Gophers defense.

► A torrential rain fell sideways in the swirling wind right before the game and during much of the first half. The wet weather was a major factor early. Punter Jake Hartbarger dropped a high snap after a three-and-out by the Spartans on their first possession, and the Gophers jumped on the ball at the 3.

► But just as they did later in the first quarter after an interception of Brian Lewerke by Gophers safety **Duke McGhee** at the 34, the Spartans stiffened on defense and gave up only a field goal. The Gophers netted 1 yard on those two scoring drives.

► The Spartans had 199 yards rushing, excluding the 28-yard loss Hartbarger took on the fumble, through three quarters. They held the ball for 13:28 in the third quarter, with just 1:32 of possession time for the Gophers.

► Trailing 23-6 entering the fourth, Croft connected with Johnson on scoring plays of 28, 17 and 9 yards to make it a three-point game with 1:06 to play. However, the Spartans recovered an onside kick try and knelt down twice to end the game.

► **Thomas Barber** led the Minnesota defense with 16 tackles, including 2.0 for loss, and he recovered a fumble.

PREVIOUSLY IN EAST LANSING

► *With assistance from the AP:* **David Cobb** recorded his sixth 100-yard rushing game of the season, but Michigan State's Jeremy Langford ran for 134 yards and a touchdown as No. 11 Michigan State wrapped up an unbeaten regular season in Big Ten play with a 14-3 victory over Minnesota when the teams last met in East Lansing on Nov. 30, 2013.

► Cobb ran for 101 yards, not a bad day against a Michigan State team ranked No. 1 in the nation in total defense. But quarterback **Philip Nelson** went 6 of 18 for 77 yards, and **Mitch Leidner** was 3 of 7 for 48 yards.

► The Gopher defense held Michigan State well below its scoring average of 30.8 points per game, and stopped the Spartans on all eight of their third down attempts. But Minnesota was held without an offensive touchdown for the second straight game.

► The Spartans took the lead right away Saturday on Langford's 15-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, which capped a seven-play, 80-yard drive.

► The Spartans' top-ranked defense forced three turnovers and kept the Golden Gophers out of the end zone. Nelson attempted only seven passes in the first half, and two of them were picked off by Michigan State's Trae Waynes, but the Spartans struggled to extend the lead.

► **Chris Hawthorne's** 21-yard field goal made it 7-3, and the Spartans missed a chance to score at the end of the half when Connor Cook was intercepted at the Minnesota 24 by **Derrick Wells** in the final seconds. Cook finished 10 of 20 for 143 yards with an interception.

► Michigan State went 75 yards in eight plays to start the third quarter and led 14-3 after Cook's 12-yard scoring pass to Josiah Price.

► Minnesota had a chance to get back in the game in the fourth when backup quarterback Leidner directed a drive deep into Michigan State territory. But Leidner was sacked and fumbled, and the Spartans recovered at their own 14 with 4:45 to play.

NOTABLE WINS OVER MSU

► Oct. 31, 2009: **Adam Weber** passed for 416 yards (third best in school history) and five touchdowns (second best), helping Minnesota hang on to beat Michigan State 42-34 in what stands as the Gophers' last win in the series. Running back **Duane Bennett** caught two of the touchdowns for Minnesota, while tight end **Nick Tow-Arnett** had eight catches for 81 yards and two scores.

► Nov. 11, 2006: **Bryan Cupito** became Minnesota's all-time leading passer (now currently stands third all-time) and threw two second-half touchdowns to help the Golden Gophers pull away for a 31-18 victory over Michigan State. Cupito's 37-yard TD pass to **Ernie Wheelwright** put Minnesota ahead 24-12 midway through the third quarter. On the play, Cupito broke **Cory Sauter's** school-record 6,834 yards passing set from 1994-97. Also in the contest, **Willie VanDeSteege** tied a school record with four sacks.

► Oct. 24, 1998: Trailing by eight in the fourth quarter, **Billy Cockerham** threw a 24-yard TD pass to **Luke Levenson** with 1:47 to play, but the two-point conversion failed. The Golden Gophers recovered the onside kick, however, and **Adam Bailey** made a 37-yard field goal with 13 seconds left to complete a 19-18 comeback victory.

► Nov. 4, 1961: **William Munsey** scored both touchdowns as No. 5 Minnesota upset No. 1 Michigan State, 13-0. It's one of three victories in program history against the No. 1 team in the AP Poll.

BIG TEN/ROAD OPENERS

► Minnesota is 63-55-8 all-time in Big Ten openers and is looking to snap a two-game losing streak in such games. The Golden Gophers are 1-4 in conference openers under **P.J. Fleck**.

► Saturday will be just the third time ever that Minnesota opens its conference slate with Michigan State, also doing so in 1997 and 1953 with the Spartans winning both of those contests.

► Minnesota is 44-72-8 all-time in Big Ten road openers with a 2-3 mark under head coach P.J. Fleck. The two wins have come within the last three years, winning at Purdue in both 2019 and 2021.

► This year marks the fifth time that Michigan State has served as the Gophers' first league road game. The teams have split the prior four with Minnesota winning in 1968 (also the only other year where MSU has been the Gophers' first road game overall) and 1976 and the Spartans prevailing in 1995 and 1997.

► Saturday's trip also marks the first road game of the season for Minnesota. It is 60-65-9 all-time in road openers, including a 3-2 mark under head coach **P.J. Fleck**. Dating back to 2013, the Gophers have alternated wins and losses in its road openers with victories in odd number years and defeats in even numbered seasons.

RECAPING COLORADO

► *With assistance from the AP:* **Mohamed Ibrahim** ran for three touchdowns, **Tanner Morgan** threw for three more and the Minnesota Gophers' defense stifled the Colorado Buffaloes in a 49-7 win on Saturday.

► The Gophers' offense, ranked first in FBS in total yards and seventh in points scored entering the week, racked up 500 yards, including 349 yards in a 35-point first half. The starters scored touchdowns on six of their eight drives.

► Ibrahim scored the team's first three touchdowns, the last an 18-yard run in the second quarter that tied him with **Darrell Thompson** for Minnesota's career rushing touchdowns record. Ibrahim compiled 202 rushing yards, a school-record fourth time he's run for 200-plus yards.

► Morgan completed 11 of his 16 passes for 157 yards. After throwing an interception in the second quarter, Morgan threw two touchdown passes in the second quarter — a 39-yard strike to **Chris Autman-Bell** and a 16-yard throw to **Dylan Wright** — and added another in the third quarter.

► Meanwhile, Colorado's offense was nearly non-existent. J.T. Shrout started the game but was replaced by Brendon Lewis for the second series after Shrout was striped and sacked on the Buffaloes' first offensive snap. Shrout completed 4-of-11 passes for 24 yards and one touchdown. Lewis completed 2-of-6 passes for 14 yards. Colorado managed 227 yards, 136 of which came in the fourth quarter with most of the Gophers' starters out.

► The Buffaloes' fourth quarter touchdown was the second score the Gophers' defense has allowed all season.

IN THE POLLS

► Minnesota is receiving votes in both the latest Associated Press and Coaches polls, released Monday (Page 5). The Gophers are eighth among those receiving votes in both polls.

► One of Minnesota's opponents in 2022 is ranked in each poll while two more are ranked or receiving votes.

► Penn State is No. 14 in the AP Poll and No. 15 in the Coaches. Michigan State is the top team receiving votes in the AP Poll and is 21st in the Coaches Poll.

► Wisconsin is receiving votes in both polls.

► Minnesota was receiving votes in the AP Preseason Poll. 2022 is the 11th season that Minnesota can make that claim, including three of the past four years, according to CollegePollArchive.com. The Gophers are looking to start and finish the year in the AP Poll for the second time in program history.

OFFENSE CLICKS IN NON-CON

► As noted on Page 1, Minnesota's offense rolled through the non-conference season, is ranked among the best in the country in several categories and has produced one of the best starts through three games in team annals.

► In addition to the stats on Page 1, the Golden Gophers lead the country in 3rd-down offense (77.5 percent) and first downs per game (31.3), rank ninth in yards per pass completion (15.78) and 22nd in red zone offense (94.7 percent).

► Minnesota's 1,664 yards of total offense through three games is its second best since at least the year 2000, while its 7.3 yards per play is third best in that same time frame. Only 2004 (1,717 yards, 7.8 yards/play) and 2005 (7.5 yards per play) rank higher.

► The 726 yards passing through three games ranks third best at Minnesota since 2000 behind only 2007 (794) and 2008 (732), while the 938 rushing is also third best since 2000 after 2004 (1,078) and 2005 (1,005). The 16 rushing touchdowns for the Gophers is their most through three games since at least 2000.

► After putting up 679 yards of total offense in Week 2 against Western Illinois, the third most in school history, the Gophers finished Saturday with 500 yards (334 rushing, 166 passing) against Colorado. It marked the first time since 2005 that Minnesota has had back-to-back games with 500 or more yards.

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

► Sixth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his fourth full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's established himself as the winningest signal-caller to ever wear the Maroon and Gold.

► Morgan is 30-12 as a starter, six more wins than the previous school record of 24 held by **Mitch Leidner**. Morgan has completed 592 (second most in school history) of 956 passes (third most) for 8,690 yards (second most) and 60 touchdowns (second most) in his career.

► His career completion percentage of .619 is first in school history (47 points ahead of second place), as is his 153.13 efficiency rating and .714 win percentage.

► He has led the Gophers in passing each year since 2018, joining him with **Adam Weber** (2007-10) and **Rickey Foggie** (1984-87) as the only QBs in Gopher history to lead the team in passing yards four times. He is on track to become the first to do it in five years this season.

► Morgan has 12 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

► This season, he has completed 38-of-53 passes for 681 yards and four touchdowns with one interception. He's also added 25 rushing yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 10 carries.

► Morgan ranks second in the nation this year in yards per pass attempt (11.66), third in yards per completion (16.26), sixth in passing efficiency (190.8) and 14th in completion percentage (.717).

► Last season, Morgan completed 149-of-250 passes for 2,044 yards and 10 touchdowns against nine interceptions for an efficiency rating of 134.3, and he added two rushing touchdowns. He ranked fourth in the B1G in yards per completion (13.72) and fifth in yards per pass (8.18).

► Against Nebraska on Oct. 16 last year, Morgan finished 20-of-24 for 209 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. His completion percentage of 83.3 percent tied for fourth in school annals since 1979. He also owns the No. 1 (21-22 at Purdue in 2019) and No. 2 (18-20 vs. Penn State in 2019) spots on that list.

► Morgan was 14-of-15 (93.3 percent) for 171 yards and two touchdowns in the first half against the Huskers. He completed 16 straight passes between the first and third quarters, breaking the school record for consecutive completions of 14 done four times previously, including once by himself. The 16 straight completions tied for the third longest streak in a conference game in B1G history.

IBRAHIM BACK FROM INJURY

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** is back after missing nearly all of last season following a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's 2021 season opener.

► He has shown practically no rust in his return, rushing 67 times in three games for 464 yards (6.9 average) and seven touchdowns despite not playing beyond the opening drive of the second half in any of the contests. As noted on Page 1, this season Ibrahim leads the country in rushing touchdowns (7) and total touchdowns (7), is second in rushing yards (464), rushing yards per game (154.7), points scored (42) and points per game (14.0), is 11th in all-purpose yards per game (137.50) and sits 14th in rushing yards per carry (6.93).

► Ibrahim opened the year with 21 rushes for 132 yards and two touchdowns against New Mexico State, followed with 130 yards and two more scores on 23 carries versus Western Illinois and most recently had 202 yards and three touchdowns on 23 carries against Colorado.

► Ibrahim has 17 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of 12 in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl to the present. His 12-game streak is the longest active streak in the country and the longest in program history, four more than former Gopher **Laurence Maroney**.

► The 2020 Big Ten Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, Ibrahim holds the program record with four career games of 200 yards rushing is tied for most rushing touchdowns with 40. He's also second in total touchdowns (40) and rushing yards per game (108.3), third in 100-yard games (17), fifth in rushing yards (3,467), sixth in yards per carry (5.65) and seventh in rushing attempts (614).

► An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American in 2020, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

► He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

AUTMAN-BELL OUT FOR YEAR

► Sixth-year wide receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** suffered a lower leg injury against Colorado and is out for the season. He is scheduled to have surgery on Sept. 21. Head coach **P.J. Fleck** said the team would apply for a seventh-year of eligibility but would leave the decision up to Autman-Bell and his family whether to use it or not if it was granted.

► Through three games this year, Autman-Bell was leading the team in targets (15), targets per game (5.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (214), receiving yards per game (71.3) and yards per catch (19.5), and he was tied for the lead in touchdown receptions (1).

► Against Western Illinois on Sept. 10, Autman-Bell caught five passes for 118 yards. It was his fifth career game with at least 100 receiving yards and was the second highest total of his career behind 129 against Purdue in 2020.

► Autman-Bell has played in 47 career games with 125 catches (12th in program history) for 1,970 yards (9th) and 13 TDs (T-13th).

► He had caught at least one pass in 45 games and has made at least one catch in his past 41 games, which is the longest active FBS streak and the second longest streak in school history behind **Ron Johnson's** Big Ten record streak of 46 games.

► Despite missing the first two games of the 2021 season, and two others due to varying injuries, Autman-Bell still led the team last year in receptions (36), receiving yards (506), receiving yards per game (46.0), receiving touchdowns (6), targets (59) and targets per game (5.4).

► In addition, his catch percentage of 61.0 was second-highest on the team of anyone with at least 10 targets.

► At Iowa on Nov. 13, Autman-Bell caught a team-high five passes for 109 yards, including a 68-yard TD in the fourth quarter. The 109 yards were the most by a Gopher on the year, and his second 100-yard game of the season.

► The following week at Indiana, Autman-Bell had his first multi-TD reception game and the first by a Gopher since **Tyler Johnson** in the 2019 Outback Bowl.

► Autman-Bell posted a career-high 11 receptions for 103 yards against Nebraska on Oct. 16. His reception total was the highest by a Gopher since Johnson had 12 vs. Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl and tied for 10th in program single-game history. Autman-Bell, whose previous career high for receptions was five, caught nine passes for 100 yards and a score in the first half alone.

► With four catches against Maryland on Oct. 23, Autman-Bell became the 17th player in program history to record 100 career receptions. Reaching the mark in 38 games, he was the 11th quickest to get there.

RELIABLE TIGHT END TARGET

► Poised for a breakout 2022 season, Gopher tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** is making the most of his redshirt senior campaign so far. He's tied for the team lead in touchdown receptions (1), and is second on the squad in targets (11), targets per game (3.7), receptions (8), receiving yards (127) and yards per game (42.3).

► In the 2022 opener, Spann-Ford was third on the team in targets (3), receptions (2) and receiving yards (29). He followed that up last week with three catches for 64 yards, including a 45-yard touchdown reception, against Western Illinois. Saturday vs. Colorado he tied for the team lead in targets (4) and receptions (3) and finished with 34 receiving yards.

► Spann-Ford saw his production grow over the final weeks of 2021, serving as a reliable target in the Gopher passing attack. Of Spann-Ford's 30 targets last year, 17 came in the final four weeks of the regular season, including a season-high six targets versus Illinois and four against Iowa and Wisconsin. He caught 23 passes for 296 yards and a touchdown last year, tying for third on the team in receptions and ranking fourth in receiving yards.

► Spann-Ford's 76.7 percent catch rate was the best on the team for anyone with at least 10 targets last year.

► At Indiana, Spann-Ford had three catches for 67 yards, all in the first half, with the receiving yards being a career-high. He logged career-long 48-yard reception in the second quarter that was the longest for a Minnesota tight end since a 50-yard reception for **Nate Wozniak** versus Middle Tennessee on Sept. 16, 2017.

BROWN-STEPHENS: PLAYMAKER

► Redshirt junior wide receiver **Michael Brown-Stephens** is third on the team this year in targets (9), receptions (6), receiving yards (107), receiving yards per game (35.7) and yards per reception (17.8).

► He also has a team-best 59 yards after catch. Those 59 yards amount to 55.1 percent of his 107 total receiving yards this year. That's the highest percentage on the team among those with at least three receptions.

► Last year he had 23 catches in 2021 and turned them into 392 receiving yards, the second-highest yardage total on the team. His 17.0 yards per catch average was third on the team and ranked fifth in the Big Ten among players with at least 20 catches.

► At Purdue last year, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 54 and 51 yards, the second and third longest receptions by a Gopher last year, respectively. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane Bennett**, with 121 yards on two catches vs. Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.

► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of both 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.

JACKSON, WRIGHT LOOKING TO BUILD ON SOPHOMORE SEASONS

► With **Chris Autman-Bell** out for the season, fellow wide receivers **Daniel Jackson** and **Dylan Wright** will be looked upon to help fill the production lost.

► Jackson made his season debut Saturday against Colorado after missing the first two games due to his own injury. He caught two passes for 26 yards.

► Despite missing two games last year, Jackson was second on the team in receptions (25), targets (53) and targets per game (4.8). He had a career-high 58 receiving yards versus Ohio State in the 2021 season opener.

► Wright found the end zone for the first time this season against Colorado. He's up to 58 yards and a score on four receptions this year.

► Though he missed one game last season, Wright led the team in yards per catch (21.1), was second in TD receptions (2), and ranked third in receiving yards (365) and yards per game (30.4).

► In the 2021 opener against Ohio State, Wright caught five passes for 57 yards and a TD, then followed with three catches for 73 yards and another score vs. Miami (OH).

POTTS, WILLIAMS LOOKING TO BOUNCE BACK FROM INJURIES

► Running backs **Trey Potts** and **Bryce Williams** are both looking to bounce back from season-ending injuries.

► So far, so good for the RB pair as Potts has 40 carries for 219 yards (5.5 average) and three touchdowns, while Williams has carried 16 times for 134 yards (8.4 average) and a touchdown.

► Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's 2021 game at Purdue. He was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.

► The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back after the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.

► In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries were the most by an FBS player last season until Sept. 25, and tied for 14th.

► He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then tallied 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before adding 78 yards and a TD on 15 carries at Purdue.

► Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.

► From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.

► Through games on Oct. 2 of last year, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).

► Three games after Potts' injury, Williams suffered a season-ending injury at Northwestern.

► In eight games in 2021, Williams ran for 186 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries. Most of his production came in a three-game span, running for 184 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries from Oct. 16 to Oct. 30. Williams was also second on the team in kick returns (5) and kick return yards (60).

► In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was Williams who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher last year.

O-LINE LOOKING TO RELOAD

► Minnesota is coming off a 2021 season where it boasted one of the deepest and most experienced offensive lines in the entire country.

► The Golden Gophers' line had more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 235. In addition, 12 members of the unit had appeared in at least one game and nine had started at least one contest.

► Four of the five starters have moved on, but center **John Micheal Schmitz**, a preseason All-American and nominee for the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Rimington Award, returns to anchor the unit. The sixth-year senior has started a team-high 26 games in his career and is Pro Football Focus' highest-graded returning center.

► As a whole, the offensive line consists of 80 career starts covered by seven players. Second-year transfer **Karter Shaw** started 19 games at right guard while at Utah State, while newcomer **Chuck Filiaga** had 11 starts during his time at Michigan.

► In the season opener against New Mexico State, **Aireontae Ersery** made his first career start at left tackle, while **Axel Ruschmeyer** lined up next to him at left guard. Schmitz manned the center position, while Filiaga made his Gopher debut by starting at right guard, and Notre Dame transfer **Quinn Carroll** made his first career start when he lined up at right tackle. The unit did not allow a sack, while racking up 297 yards on the ground.

► The same starting five came out against Western Illinois and again did not yield a sack while paving the way for an offense that generated 679 yards of offense (307 rushing, 372 passing).

► The o-line finally yielded its first two sacks of the season against Colorado, but still paved the way for 334 yards rushing and 500 yards of total offense.

► While the unit may lack the number of starts as a year ago, it is certainly not a young group, but rather a group that has considerable experience in the program. Of the 19 offensive linemen on the Minnesota roster, nearly half are entering at least their fourth year of college, though 15 have at least two years of eligibility remaining.

BACKING UP MORGAN

► Thanks to both contests being well in hand by hal time, Minnesota's backup quarterbacks have both been able to see action in the first two games this season.

► Redshirt junior **Cole Kramer** has completed 5-of-8 passes for 41 yards, while redshirt freshman **Athan Kaliakmanis** has gone 3-of-5 for 67 yards. Neither has thrown a touchdown or an interception.

► Kramer established himself last year as the team's Wildcat QB. On the season, he rushed 36 times for 165 yards and two TDs, averaging 4.6 yards per carry.

► Of his 36 carries, 15 came on third down and he turned 10 of them into first downs. Of the five he didn't convert, three were on plays of 3rd-and-5 or longer. A 3rd-and-3 rush against Nebraska went for 2 yards, but he followed with a 5-yard TD pass on 4th down.

► Kramer also completed all three of his pass attempts for 62 yards and two touchdowns. Kramer was one of two players in the country last year, along with UCF's Ryan O'Keefe, with two touchdown passes on three or fewer attempts. Over the last five years, Kramer was one of only 10 to accomplish the feat.

► Kaliakmanis is seeing his first career action this season. He was a four-star recruit according to 247Sports and ESPN and ranked as the No. 16 quarterback in the nation according to Rivals. He was listed as the No. 2 prospect in Illinois according to 247Sports and 267th overall by ESPN.

GOPHERS 'D' AMONG THE BEST

► Through three weeks of the season, Minnesota boasts arguably the best defense in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi**. As noted on Page 1, the Golden Gophers second in the country allowing 170.3 total yards per contest. They also have the No. 4 scoring defense (5.7), the fourth-ranked defense in passing yards allowed (100.7) and the ninth-best rush defense (69.7). No other defense in the country ranks in the top 10 in each of those four categories and only two other schools (Iowa and James Madison) ranks in the top 15 in each.

► In addition to those stats, Minnesota leads the country in third-down defense (11.8 percent) and first downs allowed per game (9.3).

► Minnesota's defensive unit has limited opponents to just 47.3 plays per game this year. The next closest team is James Madison at 54.5.

► The Gophers have gone 56 straight quarters, each of the last 14 games, without allowing an opponent to score more than 10 points in any quarter. The last team to do so was Miami (OH), which scored 13 points in the fourth quarter on Sept. 11, 2021.

► Dating back to last season, Minnesota has held five straight opponents to 14 points or less for the first time since the final game of 1998 and first four games of 1999. Six straight was last done in the final game of 1966 and first five of 1967.

► After shutting out New Mexico State in the 2022 season opener, Minnesota kept its next opponent, Western Illinois, off the scoreboard until a field goal with 1:10 remaining in the first quarter. It ended a scoreless streak by the Gophers defense of 112 minutes and 38 seconds dating back to the second quarter of the Guaranteed Rate Bowl versus West Virginia.

► The Leathernecks' late touchdown with less than five minutes to play was the first allowed by the Minnesota defense since the second quarter of the Guaranteed Rate Bowl versus West Virginia, a streak of nine straight quarters without allowing a TD.

► The Golden Gophers have held each of their last 10 opponents under 300 yards of total offense, the longest active streak in the nation. Since the start of 2021, Minnesota has held 12 teams below that number, trailing only Wisconsin (14) for the most in the nation.

► Minnesota is coming off a season where it finished with the No. 3 total defense in the country, allowing just 278.8 yards per game. It was the program's lowest mark since 1974 when it allowed a school record 135.4 yards per game.

SHUT-DOWN DEFENSE

Minnesota held each of its last 11 opponents, and 13 of its last 14, below their total offense average entering the game, including eight by more than 100 yards and three by more than 200.

► The Gophers had one of the strongest rush defenses in the country last year, ranking eighth nationally and second in the Big Ten by allowing 97.5 rushing yards per game. That was the best opponent rush total for the Gophers since a program-record 52.2 yards allowed per game in 1962.

► Minnesota has held 12 of its last 15 opponents below their rushing average entering the game, including seven by more than 50 yards.

► In fact, Minnesota had a two-game stretch of just 3 rush yards allowed (-19 at Colorado, 22 vs. Bowling Green). The -19 rushing yards allowed at Colorado on Sept. 18 were the second fewest in any game in the country last year and the fewest involving two Power 5 teams. Minnesota led the country last year in fewest opponent rush attempts (376) and ranked seventh in opponent rush yards (1268), 12th in opponent rushing touchdowns (11) and 13th in opponent yards per carry (3.37).

► Teams didn't have much success passing either last year as Minnesota ranked eighth nationally and second in the Big Ten with 181.2 yards allowed per game. Since the start of 2021, Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing six times, the most such games in the country.

► The Gophers held opponents to 17.3 points per game last year, good for sixth in the country. It was the first time since 1999 (16.3) and the second time since 1977 (15.5) that Minnesota held its opponents below 20 points per game. Since the start of 2021, the Gophers have held 12 opponents to 16 points or fewer, second most in the nation behind only Georgia (15).

SORI-MARIN LEADS DEFENSE

► Fifth-year linebacker **Mariano Sori-Marin** is the top returning tackler from last season. He has carried that into 2022, leading the team with 16 tackles so far and tying for the team lead with 2.0 TFLs. He also has one PBU.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

► Sori-Marin, who started all 13 games but was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue because of injury, finished with 85 tackles, including 23 in a two-game span. After 11 at Northwestern, he had 12 against Illinois, which was the most by a Gopher last year.

► On the watch list for the 2022 Butkus Award, Sori-Marin also had 4.5 tackles for loss in 2021 to go with three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and an interception.

WALLEY: FRESHMAN AA

► Sophomore defensive back **Justin Walley** earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team last season and was PFF's highest graded true freshman cornerback.

► This year, he's started all three games and made six tackles. His two pass breakups are tied for the team lead.

► Walley played in all 13 games last season and started the final six of the season. He made 29 tackles, broke up seven passes, recovered two fumbles, forced one fumble and made one interception.

► During the season, he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after a standout performance in Minnesota's 23-13 win against Wisconsin.

► He recorded his first career interception and finished the game with a career high five tackles, helping Minnesota win Paul Bunyan's Axe for the second time in four years.

► Walley was the first Gopher freshman defensive player to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

SENIOR SECONDARY

► With sophomore **Justin Walley** manning one of the cornerback spots, the rest of the secondary is filled out by fifth year corner **Terrell Smith**, fifth year safety **Jordan Howden** and senior safety **Tyler Nubin**.

► Smith and Howden account for both interceptions for the Gophers defense this year, with Smith making his pick to preserve a shutout in the opener against New Mexico State. Nubin's came against Western Illinois.

► Howden is tied for second on the team with eight tackles to go with his interception, while Nubin has three stops and a pass breakup. Smith has three tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and a PBU to go with his pick.

TRANSFERS REINFORCE DEFENSE

► The Gophers' defense in 2022 is looking to its five transfers to provide depth and production at key spots along the defensive line and in the secondary.

► Defensive Back **Beanie Bishop** spent the past four seasons at Western Kentucky where he played in 36 career games and made 76 tackles, totaled 8.5 tackles for loss, defended 12 passes, made three interceptions and forced one fumble.

► Last season, he was named All-Conference USA First Team as a defensive back as he made 43 tackles and 6.5 tackle for loss, broke up four passes, made three interceptions (returned one for a touchdown) and forced one fumble. He also returned 28 kickoffs for 676 yards to earn all-conference honorable mention as a kickoff returner.

► Fellow defensive back **Ryan Stapp** comes to Minnesota following three years at Abilene Christian where he made 91 tackles in 27 games. He added 6.5 tackles for loss, 13 pass breakups and four interceptions. While with the Wildcats, where he was teammates with former Gopher linebacker **Jack Gibbens**, Stapp was on the Southland Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.

► Defensive lineman **Kyler Baugh** is one of three defensive linemen to transfer in to Minnesota. Baugh played the previous three years at Houston Baptist where he played in 26 career games with 18 starts. He made 104 career tackles, which included 11.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks, broke up four passes, forced a fumble and recovered another. He was a three-time Southland Conference Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll honoree.

► **Darnell Jefferies** is a defensive lineman coming off a four-year career at Clemson where he was a part of the 2018 national championship team and the 2019 squad that reached the national title game. He played in 29 career games for the Tigers and made 22 tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.

► The third defensive lineman is **Lorenza Surgers** who is playing in Minnesota after four seasons at Vanderbilt. He played in 18 career games and made 19 career tackles, which included 1.5 tackles for loss and one sack. He also broke up two passes.

► All five transfers have played in all three games for the Gophers this year. Baugh has started all three contests and has six tackles. Bishop leads all five transfers with seven stops, while Stapp has made four. Surgers also has four, including his first sack in the Maroon and Gold.

STOPPING THE EXPLOSIVE PLAY

► One key for success this year for the Minnesota defense has been the ability to prevent explosive plays.

► The longest play from scrimmage for a Gopher opponent is a 38-yard pass, while the longest run is just 18 yards.

► Minnesota is one of 13 teams in the country that has yet to give up a play from scrimmage longer than 40 yards. The Maroon and Gold has yielded just 20 plays of 10 yards or more from scrimmage, seventh best in the FBS.

► The team is also one of 15 that hasn't given up a run that's gained more than 20 yards.

► The Golden Gophers' 11 pass plays allowed of 10 yards or more is tied for third best in the country.

MORE ON THE NMSU SHUTOUT

► Minnesota's 38-0 shutout of New Mexico State saw a smothering performance by the Golden Gophers' defense, holding the Aggies to just 91 yards of total offense with 53 yards passing and 38 rushing yards. It's the first time since at least 2000 the Gophers held an opponent to 55 or fewer yards in both passing and rushing offense in one game.

► The Aggies were held to only 33 plays on the night, the fewest ever by a Minnesota opponent and the lowest total in the FBS since 2017. The previous school mark was 40, set by Nebraska in 1960 and matched by Middle Tennessee State in 2010.

► NMSU gained 91 yards (53 passing, 38 rushing), the fewest by an FBS team so far this season. The Golden Gophers also held the Aggies to just six first downs, equaling the fewest allowed in the **P.J. Fleck** era (two off the modern school record) and the lowest total this year by an FBS program.

► The 91 yards of total offense allowed was the sixth best performance in program history since 1960 and the second fewest since 1967 after last year's performance at Colorado where the Buffaloes were limited to 63 yards.

► Minnesota outgained the Aggies by more than 100 yards in each of the first three quarters, including a 156-3 advantage and possession for 13:29 in the third quarter. The Gophers ran 80 offensive plays to just 33 for NMSU.

► The 38 rushing yards allowed marked the 11th time since 2000 the Gophers held their opponent to at least that number. Four of those 11 games have come under Fleck.

- ▶ New Mexico State had 21 rushing attempts, tied for the fewest by a Minnesota opponent since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011. Colorado also had 21 last year.
- ▶ Since 1977, this is just the second time that Minnesota has recorded shutouts in consecutive seasons or multiple in one year. The Gophers held Kent State scoreless in the 2006 opener then did the same to Temple two games later.
- ▶ Coupled with a 30-0 shutout at Colorado last year, Minnesota joins Georgia (4), Penn State (2), Purdue (2), Texas A&M (2), Virginia (2) and Wisconsin (2) as the only Power 5 programs with multiple shutouts since the start of the 2021 season. Of those seven teams, however, Minnesota, Georgia and Penn State are the only ones with multiple shutouts of FBS programs.

TRICKETT COMES THROUGH

- ▶ Graduate transfer **Matthew Trickett** made the most of his first season with Minnesota. He made 36 of 38 extra points and 17 of 25 field goals for 87 points, 41 more than any other Gopher. He ranked ninth in the Big Ten in scoring and 11th with 6.7 points per game. His 87 points were 11th overall in Minnesota single-season history and seventh all-time among Gopher kickers.
- ▶ Trickett's 17 made field goals tied for fifth most in program history and the most since **Emmit Carpenter** made 17 in 2018. He made 1.31 field goals per game, good for sixth in the Big Ten.
- ▶ Trickett did miss eight field goal tries last year, though five of those attempts were from 45 yards or longer and three were 50-plus yards.
- ▶ This year, he's converted all three field goal tries with a long of 46 yards, and he's made all 20 extra point tries, which ties him for third in the FBS.
- ▶ Trickett is one of 22 kickers this year to make all of his field goals (min. 3 made) and his extra points.

KESICH: KICKOFF SPECIALIST

- ▶ Junior kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich** played in 12 of 13 games and had 42 touchbacks on 66 kickoffs last year. He finished 30th in the country with his 63.64 percent touchback rate and 24th with his 63.59 average yardage on kickoffs.
- ▶ Minnesota was 11th nationally by holding opponents to 16.67 yards per return and 21st with only 295 kickoff return yards allowed. The Gophers also tied for 31st in the country with only 18 opponent kick returns this year.
- ▶ This year, he's posted touchbacks on 22 of 25 kickoffs, including a career-high eight against Western Illinois.
- ▶ He's tied for the national lead with his 22 touchbacks this year, while his touchback percentage of 88.0 percent sits fourth. In addition, he's fourth in both kickoffs and kickoff yards (1618), and 12th in kickoff average (64.72).

CRAWFORD THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

- ▶ **Mark Crawford** is back for his third season as the Gophers' punter. He's only been called on to punt three this year, averaging 33.7 yards on his boots. However, two of the three have been fair caught inside the 20-yard line.
- ▶ Last year, he punted 47 times for 1961 yards, an average of 41.7 yards per punt that ranked eighth in the Big Ten. He had six kicks cover at least 50 yards and 24 punts land inside the 20-yard line.
- ▶ A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.
- ▶ He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win six Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.

- ▶ Crawford was named the co-Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 last year after a standout performance in Minnesota's 20-13 win at Purdue.
- ▶ He continually flipped the field in a rain-soaked game, as he averaged 51.3 yards on six punts. He recorded a career-long, 60-yard punt twice, which was Minnesota's longest punt since **Ryan Santoso** had a 61-yarder against Illinois on Oct. 21, 2017.
- ▶ Crawford's six punts traveled 60, 60, 58, 46, 45 and 39 yards with his three longest punts all ranking in the top 20 of longest punts in the Big Ten at the time. He placed four punts inside the 15-yard line, which led to Purdue starting drives on its own 2, 9, 15 and 15 yard lines.
- ▶ Crawford also executed four successful holds (two point-after attempts and two field goals) in a driving rain.
- ▶ He was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since holder **Casey O'Brien** was recognized on Oct. 21, 2019, and he was the first Minnesota punter to receive the honor since 2013 when **Peter Mortell** was recognized twice.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

- ▶ Minnesota finished the 2021 season 5-1 on the road, including a 4-1 mark in true road games.
- ▶ The Gophers shut out Colorado, 30-0, in Boulder, won at Purdue, 20-13, and beat Northwestern in Evanston, 41-14. The Gophers lost at Iowa, 27-22, but bounced back with a 35-14 victory at Indiana then capped off the season with an 18-6 win over West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl in Phoenix.
- ▶ The four road wins tied for the most in school single-season history, also notching four wins in 2019, 2003, 1999 and 1961.
- ▶ The Golden Gophers are 14-4 (.778) in their last 18 games away from home, including bowl games, beginning with a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018. During that span, only Ohio State (17-3; .850) has a better mark away from home among Big Ten teams.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

- ▶ Minnesota has dominated time of possession this year, averaging 39:55 minutes with the ball. The only other FBS team above 36 minutes is Rice at 37:36.
- ▶ The Golden Gophers opened the year with their highest time of possession in six years under **P.J. Fleck** when they had the ball for a staggering 44:30 against New Mexico State. Minnesota held it for at least 8:58 in every quarter, including 13:29 in the third quarter alone.
- ▶ Minnesota had an average time of possession of 35:25 last year, which led the Big Ten and ranked third nationally behind only Air Force (36:35) and Army (35:28).
- ▶ Five times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. In addition to this year, it happened three times last year, holding the ball for 40:02 at Iowa, 40:09 at Northwestern and 40:13 at Colorado. In 2019, Minnesota recorded 42:53 against Maryland.
- ▶ In 61 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 47 times and gone 32-15 in those contests.

MILESTONE WATCH

- ▶ **Mohamed Ibrahim** is currently tied with **Darrell Thompson**, the Gophers' radio analyst, for first in Minnesota history with 40 career rushing touchdowns. One more will give Ibrahim the record outright. Ibrahim is also three touchdowns shy of tying Thompson for most overall touchdowns scored as a Gopher at 43.
- ▶ Ibrahim needs 22 points to tie Thompson (262) for fourth most in program history overall and the most by a non-kicker.

- ▶ Ibrahim is 29 carries shy of matching **Chris Darkins** (643) for sixth in program history.
- ▶ **Tanner Morgan** is 117 yards of total offense behind **Mitch Leidner** (8,782) for second in team history.
- ▶ Morgan is also 310 passing yards away for 9,000 in his career. He'd be the second Gopher to reach that number and the fifth active player in the FBS to do so.
- ▶ In addition, Morgan is 44 pass attempts short of 1,000 for his career and 8 pass completions away from 600.
- ▶ More milestone information can be found on page 11.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

- ▶ **Tanner Morgan** leads all active FBS players in passing yards per attempt (9.09) and ranks eighth in passing yards (8,690), 15th in pass efficiency (153.13) and total offense (8,665), 17th in passing touchdowns (60), 21st in pass completions (592) and touchdowns responsible for (67), 22nd in total plays (1,152), 23rd in pass attempts (956), 27th in completion percentage (.619) and 40th in passing yards per game (193.1).
- ▶ Despite missing nearly all of 2021 because of injury, **Mohamed Ibrahim** leads all active FBS players in rushing yards per game (108.3), ranks second among active FBS players in rushing yards (3,467), rushing touchdowns (40) and total touchdowns scored (40), third in rushing attempts (614) and rushing attempts per game (19.19), fourth in all-purpose plays (634) and all-purpose plays per game (19.81), seventh in all-purpose yards per game (113.78), ninth in yards per rush (5.6) and all-purpose yards (3,641), 12th in points per game (7.5) and 23rd in total points (240).
- ▶ Out for the season, wide receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** still sits 10th among active FBS players in yards per catch (15.8) and 23rd in receiving yards (1,970).
- ▶ Defensive back **Ryan Stapp** has scored two touchdowns in his career (one INT and one FR, both at Abilene Christian) to rank 10th among active FBS players in defensive TDs and 26th in non-offensive TDs.
- ▶ Fellow defensive back **Beanie Bishop** averaged 25.2 yards per kick return at Western Kentucky, a figure that still ranks 22nd in the FBS.

► Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** ranks fifth among active FBS players in field goals made per game (1.52) and field goals made and attempted (67-85), sixth in field goal attempts per game (1.93), seventh in total points (351) and points per game (8.0), 13th in extra point percentage (.980) and extra points made and attempted (150-153), and 29th in field goal percentage (.788).

FIVE YEARS OF FLECK

► As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their sixth season under P.J. Fleck. The first five years of the Fleck Era, in which they went 35-23 overall, stack up among the best of any five-year span in program history.

► The .603 win percentage is tied for the best mark since 1960-64 (.649) and is tied for the second best percentage since 1944-48.

► The team's 21 Big Ten wins are the most since the program won 23 from 1965-69.

► The three bowl wins in a five-year span are tied for second most in program history behind only four from 2015-19 (of which two belong to Fleck).

CIARROCCA BACK AS OC

► **Kirk Ciarrocca** has returned as Minnesota's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, a role he previously held from 2017-19.

► Ciarrocca returned after being away for two years. He spent 2020 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Penn State and served in a non-coaching role as an offensive analyst at West Virginia in 2021.

► In addition to previously working with Fleck at Minnesota, Ciarrocca was also his offensive coordinator at Western Michigan for four seasons. Ciarrocca has spent seven total seasons as an offensive coordinator under Fleck and helped both programs produce record-setting numbers on offense.

► Ciarrocca was named one of 15 semifinalists for the Broyles Award in 2019 after the Gophers averaged 432 yards per game (fourth most in school history in the modern era) and 34.1 points per game (third most in school history in the modern era). That same year, Minnesota rushed for 25 touchdowns and threw for 31 touchdowns, which was the first time in school history that the Gophers reached both of those numbers in the same season.

THREE ADDED TO COACHING STAFF

► In addition to the hiring of Ciarrocca, Minnesota added three assistant coaches to its staff in the offseason.

► **Danny Collins** is coaching the Gopher safeties. He has been on the Minnesota staff since 2017 and has served in multiple roles with the Gophers, most recently as a Senior Defensive Analyst.

► Collins was in quality control in his first season in Minnesota in 2017, then transitioned to a graduate assistant position for the 2018 season and was named interim defensive backs coach for Minnesota's win against Georgia Tech in the Quick Lane Bowl.

► Collins moved back to quality control in 2019 and again worked on the defensive side of the ball. He was thrust into on-field coaching duties again at the Outback Bowl and was the interim defensive line coach. Collins came to Minnesota from Western Michigan where he was a defensive GA from 2015-17 under **P.J. Fleck**.

► **Greg Harbaugh** (pronounced HAR-bo) is coaching the Gopher tight ends. He returns to Minnesota for a third stint with the Gophers, as he previously served in a quality control role twice on the Minnesota staff (2017, '19). Harbaugh most recently was the receivers coach at Western Michigan for the 2020 and 2021 seasons. Prior to his first stint at Minnesota in 2017, Harbaugh was also at Western Michigan in 2015 and 2016 as a graduate assistant under Fleck.

► Veteran coach and proven recruiter **Brick Haley** is leading Minnesota's defensive line. Haley brings more than 30 years of experience – both in college and in the NFL – to the Gophers. He has primarily coached the defensive line in his career, but has also been a defensive coordinator and coached linebackers.

► Haley most recently was at Missouri where he coached the defensive line for four seasons and also held the title of Senior Associate Head Coach. Prior to Missouri, Haley spent two seasons at Texas, and before that he was at LSU for from 2009-14, where he perennially directed one of the nation's most disruptive defensive fronts.

► In addition to those three, one other offseason change saw cornerbacks coach **Paul Haynes** get promoted to co-defensive coordinator. Haynes joined the University of Minnesota coaching staff in February 2020 and has been instrumental in the Gophers cornerbacks' contributions to a stout defense.

GOPHER GRADUATES

► Minnesota's 2022 roster features 17 student-athletes who have already graduated: **Chris Autman-Bell, Nathan Boe, Chuck Filiaga, Clay Geary, Mohamed Ibrahim, Jordan Howden, Darnell Jefferies, Preston Jelen, Tanner Morgan, Braelen Oliver, Samuel Pickerign, Axel Ruschmeyer, Thomas Rush, John Michael Schmitz, Terrell Smith, Mariano Sori-Marin and Lorenza Surgers.**

FOUR GOPHERS DRAFTED

► Minnesota had four players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft. That ups its total since 2020 to 11, which is fifth in the Big Ten and tied for 13th nationally.

► Seattle took **Boye Mafe** in the second round with the 40th overall pick, making him the first Minnesota defensive lineman drafted since **Ra'Shede Hageman** went 37th overall in 2014.

► **Daniel Faalele** was next off the board as Baltimore took him in the fourth round with the No. 110 pick. Faalele was the first Gopher offensive lineman to be drafted since 2006 when both **Greg Eslinger** and **Mark Setterstrom** were selected.

► The Minnesota Vikings selected defensive lineman **Ezezi Otomewo** in the fifth round with the No. 165 pick. He was the first Gopher to be selected by the Vikings since 2010, when the purple and gold took linebacker **Nate Triplett** in the fifth round.

► **Ko Kieft** was the final Gopher off the board as the tight end was taken by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the sixth round with the No. 218 overall pick. He became the first Gopher tight end picked since **Maxx Williams** in 2015.

► With the picks of Mafe and Otomewo, it was the first time two Gopher d-linemen were taken in the same draft since 1958.

► Minnesota has now had 12 players taken in a four-year span (2019-22). That is the most selections in that time frame in school history since the draft was reduced to seven rounds in 1994. Minnesota's previous best in a four-year span was from 1988-91 when it had 14 players taken in drafts that were 12 rounds.

SCORIGAMI

► Scorigami is a concept thought up by Jon Bois at SB Nation. It is the art of building final scores that have never happened before in NFL history. Inspired by Bois, what follows are the Scorigami results so far this season for Minnesota football.

► **Minnesota 38, New Mexico State 0.** The Gophers have won by this score three times in their program history, with the most recent occurrence taking place in 1975 against Western Michigan. It's the fourth such score in program history.

► **Minnesota 62, Western Illinois 10.** Scorigami achieved. In nearly 1,300 games in program history, this is the first to end by this score.

► **Minnesota 49, Colorado 7.** This is the third game in program history to end in this score, all Minnesota victories. The last was in 1998 against Iowa.

HEAD COACH // SIXTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 41, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 68-45 and is 38-23 at Minnesota.

In five years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program. Fleck is already sixth in program history in overall wins (35) and Big Ten wins (21), and eighth in games coached (58). Fleck's .603 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season twice, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 3-0 in bowl games and those three wins are tied with Glen Mason (3-4 bowl record during his time coaching the Gophers from 1997-2006) for the most in school history.

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), eight Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 268 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also led Minnesota to a 3-0 record in bowl games and has had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Mohamed Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied

school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single-season history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the

Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annestad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted

a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.
