FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1 Minnesota (4-0, 1-0 B1G), ranked 21st in the AP Poll and 23rd in the Coaches Poll, welcomes Purdue (2-2, 0-1) to Huntington Bank Stadium for Homecoming and the Gophers' Big Ten home opener Saturday. Kickoff is scheduled for 11 a.m. on ESPN2.

2 Minnesota enters Saturday's contest leading the nation in total defense and ranked third in total offense. The Golden Gophers holding opponents to just 187.8 yards per game and are averaging 543.0 yards of offense per game. They boast the No. 3 rushing defense (61.8 ypg) and No. 2 rush offense (294.5 ypg) along with the ninth-ranked passing efficiency defense (98.22 rating) and seventh-ranked passing efficiency offense (184.68 rating). Alabama (2nd-D, 6th-O) and Georgia (11th, 4th) are the only other programs with their total defense and total offense both ranked in the top 15. For good measure, Minnesota also has the No. 2 scoring defense (6.0 ppg) and No. 11 scoring offense (45.8 ppg). With 183 points scored and just 24 allowed, the team's scoring differential of +159 ranks second nationally behind only Alabama (+164).

3 The 183 points through the first four games of the season is sixth most in Minnesota history. The only higher-scoring starts came in 1904 (324 points), 1916 (236), 1905 (215), 2003 (187) and 2005 (185). Along those lines, the Maroon and Gold's scoring differential of +159 through four games is fourth best. The years of 1904 (+324), 1916 (+222) and 1905 (+215) are the only seasons with a better scoring margin through four games. The 24 points allowed through four games is the best for Minnesota since 1961 (16 points).

4 Now 4-0 on the season and one of 21 undefeated teams remaining in the country, the Gophers are looking to start 5-0 for the second time in six years under P.J. Fleck and the 21st time in program history. The other instance under Fleck came in 2019 when they started 9-0. Dating back to last year, Minnesota has won seven games in a row. That's tied with UCLA and Coastal Carolina for the third longest active winning streak in the country. Only Clemson (10) and Kentucky (8) are currently on longer streaks.

5 The 2022 campaign is the sixth for head coach P.J. Fleck at Minnesota, where he holds a record of 39-23. He is already tied for fifth in program history for wins, sixth in Big Ten wins (22), and is seventh in games coached (62). Fleck's .629 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). A win Saturday would make Fleck the fifth coach at Minnesota to reach 40 wins and he is on track to do it in the third fewest games (63). In his 10th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 69-45 (.605).



Tanner Morgan has been named one of the Big Ten Offensive Players of the Week for the third time in his career after he completed 23-of-26 passes for 268 yards and 3 touchdowns with no interceptions at Michigan State Saturday.

A WIN WOULD...

- Push the Gophers' win streak to eight games, which would be their longest streak since winning the first nine games of 2019 and tied for the seventh longest in program history
- Improve Minnesota to 5-0 overall for the second time under P.J. Fleck (also did so in 2019) and 21st time in program history
- See Minnesota start 2-0 in Big Ten play for the second time under Fleck (also in 2019) and 37th time in program history (would be just third time since 2004)
- Make Minnesota 72-50-5 all-time in Big Ten home openers and 2-4 under Fleck in such games
- Be Minnesota's fifth straight win over Purdue, its first ever five-game win streak in the series
- Enhance Fleck's record to 40-23 at Minnesota and 70-45 overall, making him one of five coaches in program history to reach 40 wins
- Get Fleck his 40th win in 63 games as Gophers head coach, third fastest in team annals to get there
- Mark the first time Fleck has beaten a team five times in his career

FACING PURDUE

► Minnesota and Purdue meet for the 78th time on Saturday with the Golden Gophers owning a 41-33-3 edge in the all-time series. They have won the last four matchups and eight of the past nine. The four consecutive wins are tied with four straight wins over Indiana for Minnesota's longest active win streak against a Big Ten team.

► The four-game win streak is tied for the second longest active streak against one FBS team along with Indiana, Colorado State and Western Michigan. The only current streak longer for Minnesota is its five straight wins over Miami (OH).

► A win Saturday would give Minnesota its first ever five-game winning streak over Purdue and its first seven-game home win streak in the series.

► The Golden Gophers are 33-12-3 all-time against Purdue in Minneapolis. The 33 wins at home are their third most against a program behind Iowa (39) and Wisconsin (38). Minnesota has won six straight at home against the Boilermakers, tied with six straight home wins over Indiana for its longest active streak against an FBS team. Purdue's last win in Minneapolis came on Sept. 22, 2007.

► P.J. Fleck is 4-2 all-time against Purdue, including a 4-1 record while at Minnesota. A win Saturday would mark the first time he's beaten a team five times while head coach of the Gophers. In fact, it would be the first time he's beaten a team five times overall in his career (also currently owns four career wins over Illinois, Nebraska and Miami (OH)).

► Minnesota has two Indiana natives on its roster in redshirt freshman DL **Austin Booker**, who hails from Greenwood (Center Grove HS), and redshirt sophomore OL **Martes Lewis**, from Merrillville (Merrillville HS).

► Purdue has no Minnesotans on its roster.

► Minnesota cornerbacks coach and co-defensive coordinator **Paul Haynes** was a quality control assistant along with Purdue wide receivers coach Garrick McGee for the Jacksonville Jaguars during the 2001 season.

► Purdue cornerbacks coach Ashton Youboty played at Ohio State under Haynes in the 2005 season when Haynes was the Buckeyes' defensive backs coach. Youboty was named First Team All-Big Ten in 2005 and was a third round selection (No. 70) of the Buffalo Bills in the 2006 NFL Draft.

► Purdue enters the game with a 2-2 record overall and an 0-1 mark in league play. The Boilermakers have alternated wins and losses this season, losing to Penn State in the season opener, beating Indiana State, falling at Syracuse and most recently taking down Florida Atlantic.

► Aidan O'Connell has completed 86-of-134 passes for 1,000 yards with eight touchdown passes and one interception. However, he did not play in last week's game due to injury and his status for this week is undetermined. Austin Burton started in O'Connell's place and completed 21-of-29 passes for 166 yards and 3 touchdowns with a pick.

► Dylan Downing leads Purdue with 204 rushing yards and a pair of scores, while Devin Mockobee (137) is the only other player over 65 yards rushing. King Doerue leads the team with three rushing scores.

► The receiving corps is led by Charlie Jones who has team highs in receptions (41), receiving yards (533) and touchdowns (7). He leads the country in receiving touchdowns and receptions per game (10.2) and is third in receiving yards per game (133.2), fifth in all-purpose yards per game (166.25) and total touchdowns (7).

► Defensively, Sanoussi Kane leads the team with 19 tackles, and he's one of nine Boilermakers with at least 10 stops. Kydran Jenkins has a team-best 3.0 tackles for loss and he's one of six Purdue defenders with a sack. Chris Jefferson has two of the team's four interceptions, including a pick-six, and he's tied for the team lead with four pass breakups.

LAST TIME VS. THE BOILERMAKERS

► *With assistance from the AP:* **Trey Potts** ran 4 yards for the go-ahead touchdown 70 seconds into the second half, and Minnesota held on for a 20-13 victory at Purdue last season.

► After trailing most of the first half, Minnesota wasted no time turning the game in the second half. **Tanner Morgan** found **Mike Brown-Stephens** for 54 yards on the first play, Potts ran for 17 yards on the second play and scored on the third play to erase the 13-10 halftime deficit on a wet, cool afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium. Minnesota sealed it with a 38-yard field goal with 1:46 to go.

► Potts ran 15 times for 78 yards while Morgan was 9 of 18 with 169 yards passing. Brown-Stephens tallied 105 yards on just two receptions.

► **Chris Autman-Bell** hauled in a 32-yard TD pass to give Minnesota a 7-0 lead on its opening possession, the 50th touchdown pass of Morgan's career, but the Boilermakers answered with a short field goal and then a 7-yard TD pass from Aidan O'Connell to Milton Wright.

► And after Minnesota tied it at 10, Purdue closed out the half with a 42-yard field goal from Mitchell Fineran.

► O'Connell was 33 of 51 with 357 yards and one interception. He was sacked four times and lost a fumble.

► Purdue did not score in the second half. It was the first time Minnesota shut out a Big Ten team in a half since Oct. 19, 2019 when Rutgers did not score in the first half. It was also the first time Minnesota shut out a Big Ten team in the second half since Nov. 9, 2013 when Penn State did not score and the Gophers won 24-10 at home, and it was the first time the Gophers shut out a Big Ten team in the second half on the road since Nov. 3, 2012 at Illinois when Minnesota won 17-3.

PREVIOUSLY IN MINNEAPOLIS

► *With assistance from the AP:* **Josh Aune's** interception with 44 seconds left at the Minnesota 13-yard line gave the Gophers defense a big lift and preserved a 34-31 victory over the Boilermakers when the teams last met in Minneapolis during the 2020 season.

► The Boilermakers, boosted by a career-high 15 receptions for 116 yards from Rondale Moore, moved in position for what they believed was a 19-yard touchdown catch by tight end Payne Durham in the final minute. Durham was flagged for offensive pass interference, and Aune picked Plummer off on the next play.

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** scored his third touchdown of the game early in the fourth quarter to give Minnesota a 34-24 lead before a missed extra point. Payne Durham's scoring reception cut the lead to three points with 8:31 left.

► The Boilermakers got the ball back quickly, but Edward Dellinger, who had a 27-yard field goal blocked in the second quarter by **Micah Dew-Treadway**, pulled his 33-yarder wide right to keep Minnesota in the lead.

► **Tanner Morgan** produced a crisp and commanding performance marked by pinpoint throws on third downs and deep routes to **Chris Autman-Bell** (129 yards) and **Rashod Bateman** (59). **Cam Wiley** added a touchdown run, while Ibrahim notched his sixth straight 100-yard game.

► Purdue's Jack Plummer completed 35 of 42 passes for 367 yards and three TDs in his first start of the season. David Bell caught eight passes for 104 yards and two touchdowns for the Boilermakers, who had 492 total yards.

NOTABLE WINS OVER PURDUE

► Sept. 24, 2005: **Laurence Maroney** carried the ball 46 times (second in program history) for 217 yards and **Gary Russell** scored three rushing touchdowns in a 42-35, double overtime thriller against the 11th-ranked Boilermakers in Minneapolis. Maroney added 59 receiving yards and 57 kick return yards to finish with 333 all-purpose yards, the second-best total in team annals.

► Oct. 7, 1995: **Chris Darkins** ran for a program record 294 yards on 38 carries and scored three touchdowns in a 39-38, comeback win over Purdue in Minneapolis. **Cory Sauter** scored on a 1-yard run with 1:38 remaining and connected with **Ryan Thelwell** on the two-point conversion to seal the win.

► Oct. 9, 1993: **Scott Eckers** threw for 402 yards and set a school record with six touchdown passes, including a Big Ten-record five to **Omar Douglas**, in a wild 59-56 victory at the Metrodome. The two teams combined for 115 points and 1,184 yards of total offense. Purdue had leads of 21-7, 28-14, 35-21 and 42-28 before Minnesota scored 21 straight points to take its first lead. The lead then changed hands three more times before **Mike Chalberg** hit an 18-yard field goal with eight seconds to play.

BIG TEN HOME OPENERS

► Minnesota is 71-50-5 all-time in Big Ten home openers but is looking to snap a two-game losing streak in such games after losing to top-20 teams Ohio State and Michigan squads in 2021 and 2020, respectively.

► The Golden Gophers are 1-4 in B1G home openers under **P.J. Fleck** with the win coming over Illinois in 2019.

► Saturday will be 22nd time that Minnesota opens its home conference slate against Purdue, their most frequent home opening opponent in league play behind 23 games against Northwestern.

► In the previous 21 meetings with the Boilermakers, the Golden Gophers are 12-8-1, but Minnesota has lost three of the past four. The last such meeting came in 2007 when Purdue won, 45-31.

HOMECOMING WEEK

► Saturday against Purdue marks the annual Homecoming Game for the Golden Gophers. All-time, Minnesota is 60-39-3 in their Homecoming Games.

► Minnesota has won five of its past seven Homecoming Games dating back to 2014. With fans not allowed in games in 2020, there was no Homecoming contest.

► The Golden Gophers are 7-3 all-time against Purdue in Homecoming games, including three straight victories (2014, 2009 and 2005).

► Minnesota's most frequent Homecoming opponent is Northwestern, sporting a 9-8-2 record in 19 games with the Wildcats. The Gophers' 10 victories over Iowa are their most against one opponent. A full list of games can be found on Page 9.

RECAPPING MICHIGAN STATE

► With assistance from the AP: **Tanner Morgan** threw for 268 yards and three touchdowns and **Mohamed Ibrahim** rushed for 103 yards and a score to lead Minnesota to a 34-7 rout over Michigan State in the Big Ten opener for each school.

► Minnesota dominated Michigan State on both sides of the ball, outgaining the Spartans on offense 508-240 while also grabbing two interceptions and a fumble.

► Michigan State appeared ready to rally from a 17-point deficit at the start of the second half by driving to the Minnesota 5-yard line but **Thomas Rush** punched the ball free from quarterback Payton Thorne and **Justin Walley** made the recovery.

► The Gophers scored on their first three possessions to go up 17-0. Ibrahim, who extended his streak of 100-plus rushing yards to 13 games, broke Minnesota's all-time rushing touchdown record with a 2-yard run off the opening drive. It was his 41st rushing score, breaking a tie with former Gophers running back **Darrell Thompson**.

► Morgan, who completed 23 of 26 passes for 268 yards, capped off the next drive when he hit **Daniel Jackson** with a 23-yard touchdown pass. **Matthew Trickett** followed with a 26-yard field goal.

► Morgan added a 6-yard touchdown pass to tight end **Nick Kallerup** in the third quarter and a 4-yard scoring pass to Jackson early in the fourth quarter. Trickett closed the Gophers' scoring with a 22-yard field goal.

► The Spartans avoided the shutout when backup quarterback Noah Kim tossed a 27-yard touchdown pass to Germie Bernard with 17 seconds left.

IN THE POLLS

► Minnesota entered the polls this week, coming in at No. 21 in the AP Poll and No. 23 in the Coaches Poll (Page 5). The Golden Gophers are ranked by the AP for the first time since also coming in at No. 21 in the Oct. 18, 2020 poll prior to their game against 18th-ranked Michigan.

► Saturday will be just the third time Minnesota plays as the No. 21 team in the country. In addition to the loss to the Wolverines in 2020, the Gophers also secured a victory over Northwestern in 2003.

► All-time, Minnesota is 85-52-2 (.612) as a ranked team, including a 75-25-2 record (.745) when playing an unranked opponent.

► Penn State is the only opponent on Minnesota's schedule ranked in both of the latest polls, coming in at No. 11 in the AP Poll and No. 12 in the Coaches.

► Michigan State is receiving votes from the coaches.

► Minnesota was receiving votes in the AP Preseason Poll. 2022 is the 11th season that Minnesota can make that claim, including three of the past four years, according to CollegePollArchive.com. The Gophers are looking to start and finish the year in the AP Poll for the second time in program history.

SUCCESS ON 3RD DOWNS

► On 3rd downs this year, Minnesota leads the nation in both 3rd down conversion percentage and opponent conversion percentage.

► Minnesota's offense has converted 41 of 52 3rd downs for a nation's best 78.85 percent. For context, Kansas is in second place at 66.67 percent and only two other teams are above 60 percent.

► The Gophers' "worst" performance on 3rd downs came against Western Illinois when they "only" converted 7-of-11 attempts, 63.6 percent. They converted 11-of-14 (78.6%) against New Mexico State, 13-of-15 (86.7%) versus Colorado and 10-of-12 (83.3%) at Michigan State.

► On the other side of the ball, Minnesota has allowed opponents to convert just 6-of-42 third downs, a measly 14.29 percent. Alabama (18.64%), Temple (19.30%) and Virginia Tech (20.37%) are the only other teams in the FBS below 23 percent.

► The six conversions are by far the fewest in the nation as there is a four-way tie for second at 11.

► Michigan State has had the best "success" against Minnesota by converting 2-of-8 (25.0%) 3rd downs. Otherwise, New Mexico State was 2-of-9 (22.22%), Western Illinois was 1-of-13 (7.69%) and Colorado was 1-of-12 (8.33%).

RED ZONE A ONE-WAY STREET

► Minnesota has been one of the best teams on each side of the ball when it comes to red zone success.

► Defensively, Minnesota is tied for 12th by allowing opponents to score just 66.67 percent of the time. Digging deeper into the numbers shows some impressive context.

► The Golden Gophers have allowed opponents just three trips into the red zone and given up two scores, the fewest trips and scores given up in the nation. In addition, Minnesota, Illinois and Tulane are the only teams in the country to yield only one red zone touchdown this season.

► Offensively, the Gophers have been nearly perfect in the red zone, scoring on 23-of-24 trips. That 95.83 percent success rate ranks 16th in the country.

► The 24 trips to the red zone is tied for fourth in the FBS, while the 23 scores is tied for third. Of the 23 scores, 19 have been touchdowns and four have been field goals.

► Minnesota was 6-of-6 against New Mexico State, 7-of-7 versus Western Illinois and 5-of-5 at Michigan State. The only blemish was an interception against Colorado that made it 5-of-6.

THE EPITOME OF EFFICIENCY

► According to BCFTOys.com, Minnesota has been the most efficient team this year in regards to points per drive and net available yards.

► Ratings and supporting data on BCFTOys is calculated from the results of non-garbage possessions in FBS vs. FBS games.

► The Minnesota offense is averaging 5.11 points per drive, second in the FBS, while the defense has yet to give up any points against an FBS team not in garbage time. That rating of 5.11 stands out when realizing Georgia is second at 4.32 and third is Ohio State at 3.20.

► Available yards percentage is calculated by dividing drive yards earned by available yards measured from starting field position to end zone.

► The Golden Gophers rank second offensively in available yards percentage at .849, while the defense is No. 1 at .168. That gives them at net percentage of .680, far and away the best in the country. Georgia is second at .471, while Ohio State is third at .428 and Alabama (.420) and Michigan (.407) are the only other teams above .333.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS PUSH OFFENSE

► Minnesota's offense is averaging 7.2 yards per play this season and that's been aided by 86 plays from scrimmage of at least 10+ yards. That figure ranks third behind only North Texas (89) and Alabama (87).

► In those 86 plays, 41 have been rushes of at least 10 yards, the most in the country.

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

► Sixth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his fourth full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's become the winningest QB to wear the Maroon and Gold.

► Morgan is 31-12 as a starter, seven more wins than the previous school record of 24 held by **Mitch Leidner**. Morgan has completed 615 (second most in school history) of 982 passes (third most) for 8,958 yards (second most) and 63 touchdowns (second most) in his career.

► His career completion percentage of .626 is first in school history (54 points ahead of second place), as is his 154.72 efficiency rating, 2.25 TD:INT ratio and .721 win percentage.

► He has led the Gophers in passing each year since 2018, joining him with **Adam Weber** (2007-10) and **Rickey Foggie** (1984-87) as the only QBs in Gopher history to lead the team in passing yards four times. He is on track to become the first to do it in five years this season.

► Morgan has at least 12 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-B1G Honorable Mention in 2020.

In 2019, he was named All-B1G Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

► This season, he has completed 61-of-79 passes for 886 yards and seven touchdowns with one interception. He's also added 52 rushing yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 13 carries.

► Morgan ranks second in the nation in completion percentage at .772 with 19 more attempts than Michigan's J.J. McCarthy, who leads at .800. In addition, Morgan is third in yards per pass attempt (11.22), fourth in pass efficiency (198.1) and 16th in yards per completion (14.52).

► Last season, Morgan completed 149-of-250 passes for 2,044 yards and 10 touchdowns against nine interceptions for an efficiency rating of 134.3, and he added two rushing touchdowns. He ranked fourth in the B1G in yards per completion (13.72) and fifth in yards per pass (8.18).

MORGAN B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK

► After helping Minnesota to a 34-7 win at Michigan State Saturday, **Tanner Morgan** was named the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week along with Michigan's Blake Corum.

► Morgan completed 23-of-26 passes for 268 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. It was his fourth career game completing at least 83 percent of his passes, and he now owns the top three marks in program history after completing 88.5 percent against the Spartans.

► It was his eighth career game with at least three touchdowns passes and the third of his career with at least that many scoring strikes and no interceptions.

► Morgan is the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Nov. 9, 2020, when **Mohamed Ibrahim** received the honor.

► This is the third time in his career that Morgan has been feted as the conference's Offensive Player of the Week, as he was also bestowed the honor on Nov. 11, 2019 and Sept. 30, 2019. Morgan and **Adam Weber** are the only Minnesota quarterbacks to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week three times in their careers.

IBRAHIM BACK FROM INJURY

► **Mohamed Ibrahim** is back after missing nearly all of last season following a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's 2021 season opener.

► He has shown practically no rust in his return, rushing 89 times in four games for 567 yards (6.4 average) and eight touchdowns despite not playing beyond the opening drive of the second half in any of the first three contests.

► This season Ibrahim is second in the country in rushing yards per game (141.8), rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (8) and points per game (12.0), third in attempts and 10th in all-purpose yards per game (150.00)

► Ibrahim opened the year with 21 rushes for 132 yards and two touchdowns against New Mexico State, followed with 130 yards and two more scores on 23 carries versus Western Illinois, had 202 yards and three touchdowns on 23 carries against Colorado and most recently tallied 103 yards and a score on 22 rushes at Michigan State.

► Ibrahim has 18 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of 13 in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl to the present. His 13-game streak is the longest active streak in the country and the longest in program history, four more than former Gopher **Laurence Maroney**.

MO VS. HEISMAN RUNNING BACKS

During his current 13-game streak of at least 100 yards rushing, Mohamed Ibrahim has put up numbers that fall right in line with the most recent Heisman Trophy winning running backs.

► The 2020 Big Ten Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, Ibrahim holds the program record with 41 career rushing touchdowns and four career games of 200 yards. He's also second in total touchdowns (41) and rushing yards per game (108.2), third in 100-yard games (18), fifth in rushing yards (3,570) and points scored (246), sixth in yards per carry (5.61) and seventh in rush attempts (636).

► An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American in 2020, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

► He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

RELIABLE TIGHT END TARGET

► Poised for a breakout 2022 season, Gopher tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** is making the most of his redshirt senior campaign so far.

► He leads the team in targets (16) and is second in receptions (11) and receiving touchdowns, and third in receiving yards (167).

► Spann-Ford saw his production grow over the final weeks of 2021, serving as a reliable target in the Gopher passing attack. Of Spann-Ford's 30 targets last year, 17 came in the final four weeks of the regular season, including a season-high six targets versus Illinois and four against Iowa and Wisconsin. He caught 23 passes for 296 yards and a touchdown last year, tying for third on the team in receptions and ranking fourth in receiving yards.

► Spann-Ford's 76.7 percent catch rate was the best on the team for anyone with at least 10 targets last year.

► At Indiana last season, Spann-Ford had three catches for 67 yards, all in the first half, with the receiving yards being a career-high. He logged career-long 48-yard reception in the second quarter that was the longest for a Minnesota tight end since a 50-yard reception for **Nate Wozniak** versus Middle Tennessee on Sept. 16, 2017.

BROWN-STEPHENS: PLAYMAKER

► Redshirt junior wide receiver **Michael Brown-Stephens** leads the team in receptions (12) and is second in receiving yards (180) and targets (15).

► He also has a team-best 77 yards after catch. Those 77 yards amount to 42.8 percent of his 180 total receiving yards this year.

► Saturday at Michigan State, he had a career-high six receptions on six targets and led the team with 73 yards.

► Last year he had 23 catches in 2021 and turned them into 392 receiving yards, the second-highest yardage total on the team. His 17.0 yards per catch average was third on the team and ranked fifth in the Big Ten among players with at least 20 catches.

► At Purdue last year, Brown-Stephens caught two passes for 105 yards, tallying catches of 54 and 51 yards, the second and third longest receptions by a Gopher last year, respectively. Since 2000, the only Minnesota player with more receiving yards on two or fewer receptions was **Duane Bennett**, with 121 yards on two catches vs. Michigan State on Oct. 31, 2009.

► The last time a Gopher had multiple catches of 50+ yards in one game was **Rashod Bateman**, who had TD catches of both 86 and 61 yards at Illinois on Nov. 3, 2018.

JACKSON, WRIGHT LOOKING TO BUILD ON SOPHOMORE SEASONS

► With **Chris Autman-Bell** out for the season, fellow wide receivers **Daniel Jackson** and **Dylan Wright** will be looked upon to help fill the production loss.

► Jackson missed the first two games of the season due to injury, but he's quickly made up for lost time. After catching two passes for 26 yards against Colorado, he followed with three catches for 42 yards and two touchdowns. It was the first multi-TD game of his career.

► Jackson's two TD receptions lead the team and his YAC percentage of 45.6 percent is highest on the team among those with at least five catches. His six targets over the last two weeks rank third on the squad behind **Brevyn Spann-Ford** (11) and **Michael Brown-Stephens** (9).

► Despite missing two games last year, Jackson was second on the team in receptions (25), targets (53) and targets per game (4.8). He had a career-high 58 receiving yards versus Ohio State in the 2021 season opener.

► Wright found the end zone for the first time this season against Colorado. He's up to 112 yards (fourth on team) and a score on seven receptions and 11 targets (both fourth on the team) this year. Wright and Spann-Ford are the only Gophers to be targeted at least twice in every game this year.

► Though he missed one game last season, Wright led the team in yards per catch (21.1), was second in TD receptions (2), and ranked third in receiving yards (365) and yards per game (30.4).

GEARY MAKING MOST OF 7TH YEAR

► Wide receiver **Clay Geary** is in his seventh season of eligibility for the Golden Gophers and making the most of his last go-around in Maroon and Gold.

► After redshirting as a freshman walk-on in 2016, he played in nine games over the next two seasons with one catch. He was put on scholarship prior to 2019 and was surprised with the news after throwing out the first pitch at a Minnesota Twins game. He then went on to play in 10 games that year, mostly on special teams, before appearing five times in 2020 with five receptions for 50 yards. Geary then missed all of 2021 after a torn ACL in camp.

► He's gotten back into the fold this year with six catches for 85 yards and a touchdown. The touchdown, an acrobatic eight-yard reception against Colorado, was the first of his career.

► Geary has caught all six passes thrown his way, the most catches without a miss or drop on the team this season.

POTTS, WILLIAMS AIMING TO BOUNCE BACK FROM INJURIES

► Running backs **Trey Potts** and **Bryce Williams** are both looking to bounce back from season-ending injuries.

► So far, so good for the RB pair as Potts has 53 carries for 291 yards (5.5 average) and three touchdowns, while Williams has carried 22 times for 160 yards (7.3 average) and a touchdown.

► Potts left the field in the fourth quarter of the team's 2021 game at Purdue. He was immediately observed and treated by the team's medical staff and was then transported to a hospital for further observation. Potts was discharged from an Indiana hospital on Oct. 8 and returned to Minneapolis.

► The Gophers turned to Potts as their lead back after the season-ending injury to All-American **Mohamed Ibrahim**. In four games as a starter, Potts rushed for 518 yards and scored six touchdowns on 102 carries.

► In his first career start against Miami (OH) on Sept. 11, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries were the most by an FBS player last season until Sept. 25, and tied for 14th.

► He followed that by rushing for 121 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 26 carries at Colorado, then tallied 141 yards on 27 rushes against Bowling Green before adding 78 yards and a TD on 15 carries at Purdue.

► Overall on the season, Potts rushed 111 times for 552 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 110.4 yards per game and 5.0 yards per rush. He also caught three passes for 16 yards, returned six punts for 65 yards and brought back one kick for 17 yards.

► From Sept. 11 to Oct. 2 (his four games as a starter), Potts had the third-most rushing yards of any FBS player in the country and the second most carries.

► Through games on Oct. 2 of last year, Potts ranked ninth in the country in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game, 19th in punt return average (10.8), 21st in rushing TDs and 25th in all-purpose yards per game (130.0).

► Three games after Potts' injury, Williams suffered a season-ending injury at Northwestern.

► In eight games in 2021, Williams ran for 186 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries. Most of his production came in a three-game span, running for 184 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries from Oct. 16 to Oct. 30. Williams was also second on the team in kick returns (5) and kick return yards (60).

► In the first game without Ibrahim or Potts, it was Williams who got the start against Nebraska on Oct. 16. It was the third start of his career and his first since Oct. 26, 2018. Williams finished with 127 rushing yards on 17 carries, highlighted by a career-long touchdown run of 56 yards that gave Minnesota a 30-16 lead with just over two minutes to play. The 56-yard run tied Ibrahim for the longest rush by a Gopher last year.

O-LINE RELOADS

► Minnesota is coming off a 2021 season where it boasted one of the deepest and most experienced offensive lines in the entire country.

► The Golden Gophers' line had more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 235. In addition, 12 members of the unit had appeared in at least one game and nine had started at least one contest.

► Four of the five starters have moved on, but center **John Micheal Schmitz**, a preseason All-American and nominee for the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Rimington Award, returns to anchor the unit. The sixth-year senior has started a team-high 27 games in his career and was Pro Football Focus' highest-graded returning center in the country this year.

► As a whole, the offensive line consists of 85 career starts covered by seven players. Second-year transfer **Karter Shaw** started 19 games at right guard while at Utah State, while newcomer **Chuck Filiaga** had 11 starts during his time at Michigan.

► In the season opener against New Mexico State, **Aireontae Ersery** made his first career start at left tackle, while **Axel Ruschmeyer** lined up next to him at left guard. Schmitz manned the center position, while Filiaga made his Gopher debut by starting at right guard, and Notre Dame transfer **Quinn Carroll** made his first career start when he lined up at right tackle. The unit did not allow a sack, while racking up 297 yards on the ground.

► It's been the same starting lineup for the o-line all season and it's been a big reason why the Gophers rank in the top 15 nationally in total offense, rushing offense and scoring offense. In addition, the two sacks given up is tied for sixth nationally.

► While the unit may lack the number of starts as a year ago, it is certainly not a young group, but rather a group that has considerable experience in the program. Of the 19 offensive linemen on the Minnesota roster, nearly half are entering at least their fourth year of college, with 15 having at least two years of eligibility remaining.

BACKING UP MORGAN

► Thanks to the first three contests of the season being well in hand by halftime, Minnesota's backup quarterbacks have both been able to see extensive action this year.

► Redshirt junior **Cole Kramer** has completed 5-of-8 passes for 41 yards and added 26 yards on four carries, while redshirt freshman **Athan Kaliakmanis** has gone 3-of-5 for 67 yards. Neither has thrown a touchdown or interception.

► Kramer established himself last year as the team's Wildcat QB as he rushed 36 times for 165 yards and two TDs, averaging 4.6 yards per carry.

► Of his 36 carries, 15 came on third down and he turned 10 of them into first downs. Of the five he didn't convert, three were on plays of 3rd-and-5 or longer. A 3rd-and-3 rush against Nebraska went for 2 yards, but he followed with a 5-yard TD pass on 4th down.

► Kramer also completed all three of his pass attempts for 62 yards and two touchdowns. Kramer was one of two players in the country last year, along with UCF's Ryan O'Keefe, with two touchdown passes on three or fewer attempts. Over the last five years, Kramer was one of only 10 to accomplish the feat.

► Kaliakmanis is seeing his first career action this season. He was a four-star recruit according to 247Sports and ESPN and ranked as the No. 16 quarterback in the nation according to Rivals. He was listed as the No. 2 prospect in Illinois according to 247Sports and 267th overall by ESPN.

AUTMAN-BELL OUT FOR YEAR

► Sixth-year wide receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** suffered a season-ending lower leg injury against Colorado and had surgery on Sept. 21. Head coach **P.J. Fleck** said the team would apply for a seventh-year of eligibility but would leave the decision up to Autman-Bell and his family whether to use it or not if it was granted.

► Through three games this year, Autman-Bell was leading the team in targets (15), targets per game (5.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (214), receiving yards per game (71.3) and yards per catch (19.5), and he was tied for the lead in touchdown receptions (1).

► Against Western Illinois on Sept. 10, Autman-Bell caught five passes for 118 yards. It was his fifth career game with 100+ receiving yards and the second highest total of his career behind 129 against Purdue in 2020.

► Autman-Bell has played in 47 career games with 125 catches (12th in program history) for 1,970 yards (9th) and 13 TDs (T-13th).

► He had caught at least one pass in 45 games and has made at least one catch in his past 41 games, which is the longest active FBS streak and the second longest streak in school history behind **Ron Johnson's** Big Ten record streak of 46 games.

► Despite missing the first two games of the 2021 season, and two others due to varying injuries, Autman-Bell still led the team last year in receptions (36), receiving yards (506), receiving yards per game (46.0), receiving touchdowns (6), targets (59) and targets per game (5.4).

► In addition, his catch percentage of 61.0 was second-highest on the team of anyone with at least 10 targets.

GOPHERS 'D' AMONG THE BEST

► Through four weeks of the season, Minnesota boasts arguably the best defense in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi**. As noted on Page 1, the Golden Gophers lead the country by allowing 187.8 total yards per contest. They also have the No. 2 scoring defense (6.0) and second-ranked defense in passing yards allowed (126.0) and the No. 3 rush defense (61.8).

► Only six defenses in the country can say they rank in the top 25 in each of those four categories, and Alabama joins Minnesota as the only teams to rank in the top 10 of each stat.

► Minnesota's defensive unit has limited opponents to just 46.8 plays per game this year. The next closest team is Air Force at 51.3 plays per game.

► The Gophers have gone 60 straight quarters, each of the last 15 games, without allowing an opponent to score more than 10 points in any quarter. The last team to do so was Miami (OH), which scored 13 points in the fourth quarter on Sept. 11, 2021.

► Dating back to last season, Minnesota has held seven straight opponents to 14 points or less for the first time since the last six games of 1962 and the first two of 1963. Minnesota has also gone five straight games with holding opponents to 10 points or less, its best streak since 1962.

► After shutting out New Mexico State in the 2022 season opener, Minnesota kept its next opponent, Western Illinois, off the scoreboard until a field goal with 1:10 remaining in the first quarter. It ended a scoreless streak by the Gophers defense of 112 minutes and 38 seconds dating back to the second quarter of the Guaranteed Rate Bowl versus West Virginia.

► The Leathernecks' late touchdown with less than five minutes to play was the first allowed by the Minnesota defense since the second quarter of the Guaranteed Rate Bowl versus West Virginia, a streak of nine straight quarters without allowing a TD.

► Minnesota has outscored opponents 156-3 over the first three quarters of games this year, and the Gophers have not given up a single point in the second or third quarters this season. Of the 24 points the team has allowed, 21 have come in the fourth quarter with the Gopher starters no longer playing.

► The Golden Gophers have held each of their last 11 opponents under 300 yards of total offense, the longest active streak in the nation. Since the start of 2021, Minnesota has held 13 teams below that number, trailing only Wisconsin (14) for the most in the nation.

► Minnesota is coming off a season where it finished with the No. 3 total defense in the country, allowing just 278.8 yards per game. It was the program's lowest mark since 1974 when it allowed a school record 135.4 yards per game.

► The Gophers had one of the strongest rush defenses in the country last year, ranking eighth nationally and second in the Big Ten by allowing 97.5 rushing yards per game. That was the best opponent rush total for the Gophers since a program-record 52.2 yards allowed per game in 1962.

► Minnesota has held 13 of its last 16 opponents below their rushing average entering the game, including eight by more than 50 yards.

► Minnesota led the country last year in fewest opponent rush attempts (376) and ranked seventh in opponent rush yards (1268), 12th in opponent rushing touchdowns (11) and 13th in opponent yards per carry (3.37).

► Teams didn't have much success passing either last year as Minnesota ranked eighth nationally and second in the Big Ten with 181.2 yards allowed per game. Since the start of 2021, Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing six times, tied for the most in the country.

► The Gophers held opponents to 17.3 points per game last year, good for sixth in the country. It was the first time since 1999 (16.3) and the second time since 1977 (15.5) that Minnesota held its opponents below 20 points per game. Since the start of 2021, the Gophers have held 13 opponents to 16 points or fewer, second most in the nation behind only Georgia (15).

SORI-MARIN LEADS DEFENSE

► Fifth-year linebacker **Mariano Sori-Marin** is the top returning tackler from last season. He has carried that into 2022, leading the team with 25 tackles so far and tying for the team lead with 2.0 TFLs. He also has one PBU.

► On the watch list for the 2022 Butkus Award, he has at least five tackles in every game this year, including nine at Michigan State Saturday that was the most by a Gopher this season.

► Sori-Marin, who started all 13 games but was limited to less than one quarter of play at Purdue because of injury, finished with 85 tackles, including 23 in a two-game span. After 11 at Northwestern, he had 12 against Illinois, which was the most by a Gopher last year.

► Sori-Marin also had 4.5 tackles for loss in 2021 to go with three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and an interception.

WALLEY: FRESHMAN AA

► Sophomore defensive back **Justin Walley** earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team last season and was PFF's highest graded true freshman cornerback.

► This year, he's started all four games and made nine tackles. His two pass breakups are tied for the team lead.

► Saturday at Michigan State, Walley had three tackles, plus an interception and a fumble recovery. Since at least 2000, he's just the third Gopher to have an interception and fumble recovery in the same game (**Jalen Myrick** at Purdue in 2015, **Mario Reese** vs. Iowa in 2006).

► Walley played in all 13 games last season and started the final six of the season. He made 29 tackles, broke up seven passes, recovered two fumbles, forced one fumble and made one interception.

► During the season, he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after a standout performance in Minnesota's 23-13 win against Wisconsin.

► He recorded his first career interception and finished the game with a career high five tackles, helping Minnesota win Paul Bunyan's Axe for the second time in four years.

► Walley was the first Gopher freshman defensive player to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

SENIOR SECONDARY

► With sophomore **Justin Walley** manning one of the cornerback spots, the rest of the secondary is filled out by fifth year corner **Terrell Smith**, fifth year safety **Jordan Howden** and senior safety **Tyler Nubin**.

► Smith and Howden each have an interception, with Smith making his pick to preserve a shutout in the opener against New Mexico State. Nubin's came the next week against Western Illinois.

► Nubin is third on the team with 10 tackles and has one pass breakup, while Howden is right behind him with nine stops, 1.0 tackles for loss and his pick.

► Smith has seven tackles and is tied for the team lead with 2.0 tackles for loss. He's also got one sack, a forced fumble, one interception and a pass breakup. He's one of 13 players in the country to have least 2.0 TFLs, 1.0 sacks, one forced fumble and one interception this year.

TRANSFERS REINFORCE DEFENSE

► The Gophers' defense in 2022 is looking to its five transfers to provide depth and production at key spots along the defensive line and in the secondary.

► Defensive Back **Beanie Bishop** spent the past four seasons at Western Kentucky where he played in 36 career games and made 76 tackles, totaled 8.5 tackles for loss, defended 12 passes, made three interceptions and forced one fumble.

► Last season, he was named All-Conference USA First Team as a defensive back as he made 43 tackles and 6.5 tackle for loss, broke up four passes, made three interceptions (returned one for a touchdown) and forced one fumble. He also returned 28 kickoffs for 676 yards to earn all-conference honorable mention as a kickoff returner.

► Fellow defensive back **Ryan Stapp** comes to Minnesota following three years at Abilene Christian where he made 91 tackles in 27 games. He added 6.5 tackles for loss, 13 pass breakups and four interceptions. While with the Wildcats, where he was teammates with former Gopher linebacker **Jack Gibbens**, Stapp was on the Southland Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.

► Defensive lineman **Kyler Baugh** is one of three defensive linemen to transfer in to Minnesota. Baugh played the previous three years at Houston Baptist where he played in 26 career games with 18 starts. He made 104 career tackles, which included 11.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks, broke up four passes, forced a fumble and recovered another. He was a three-time Southland Conference Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll honoree.

► **Darnell Jefferies** is a defensive lineman coming off a four-year career at Clemson where he was a part of the 2018 national championship team and the 2019 squad that reached the national title game. He played in 29 career games for the Tigers and made 22 tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.

► The third defensive lineman is **Lorenza Surgers** who is playing in Minnesota after four seasons at Vanderbilt. He played in 18 career games and made 19 career tackles, which included 1.5 tackles for loss and one sack. He also broke up two passes.

► All five transfers have played in all four games for the Gophers this year. Baugh has started all four contests and has eight tackles and a pass breakup. Bishop has seven stops, while Stapp has made six with 1.0 sacks. Surgers has four tackles, including a sack, while Jefferies has made one tackle.

STOPPING THE EXPLOSIVE PLAY

► One key for success this year for the Minnesota defense has been the ability to prevent explosive plays. The longest play from scrimmage for a Gopher foe is a 38-yard pass, while the longest run is just 18 yards.

► Minnesota is one of six teams in the country that has yet to give up a play from scrimmage longer than 40 yards. The Maroon and Gold has yielded just 29 plays of 10 yards or more from scrimmage, fifth best in the FBS. Only six plays from scrimmage have gone for more than 20 yards, tied for second best in the country.

► The team is also one of three programs (Iowa and Washington State) that hasn't given up a run that's gained more than 20 yards.

► The Golden Gophers' 20 pass plays allowed of 10 yards or more is tied for fourth best in the country, while the six passes of more than 20 yards is tied for second. The Gophers are one of 15 teams yet to yield a pass play longer than 40 yards.

MORE ON THE NMSU SHUTOUT

► Minnesota's 38-0 shutout of New Mexico State on Sept. 1 saw a smothering performance by the Golden Gophers' defense, holding the Aggies to just 91 yards of total offense with 53 yards passing and 38 rushing yards. It's the first time since at least 2000 the Gophers held an opponent to 55 or fewer yards in both passing and rushing offense in one game.

► The Aggies were held to only 33 plays on the night, the fewest ever by a Minnesota opponent and the lowest total in the FBS since 2017. The previous school mark was 40, set by Nebraska in 1960 and matched by Middle Tennessee State in 2010.

► NMSU gained 91 yards (53 passing, 38 rushing), the sixth fewest by an FBS team so far this season. The Golden Gophers also held the Aggies to just six first downs, equaling the fewest allowed in the **P.J. Fleck** era (two off the modern school record) and tied for the second lowest total this year by an FBS program.

► The 91 yards of total offense allowed was the sixth best performance in program history since 1960 and the second fewest since 1967 after last year's performance at Colorado where the Buffaloes were limited to 63 yards.

► Minnesota outgained the Aggies by more than 100 yards in each of the first three quarters, including a 156-3 advantage and possession for 13:29 in the third quarter. The Gophers ran 80 offensive plays to just 33 for NMSU.

► The 38 rushing yards allowed marked the 11th time since 2000 the Gophers held their opponent to at least that number. Four of those 11 games have come under Fleck.

► New Mexico State had 21 rushing attempts, tied for the fewest by a Minnesota opponent since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011. Colorado also had 21 last year.

► Since 1977, this is just the second time that Minnesota has recorded shutouts in consecutive seasons or multiple in one year. The Gophers held Kent State scoreless in the 2006 opener then did the same to Temple two games later.

► Coupled with a 30-0 shutout at Colorado last year, Minnesota joins Georgia (4), Penn State (2), Purdue (2), Texas A&M (2), Virginia (2) and Wisconsin (2) as the only Power 5 programs with multiple shutouts since the start of the 2021 season. Of those seven teams, however, Minnesota, Georgia and Penn State are the only ones with multiple shutouts of FBS programs.

TRICKETT CAN KICK IT

► **Fifth-year kicker Matthew Trickett** has converted all five field goal tries with a long of 46 yards, and he's made all 24 extra point tries, which ties him for fifth in PATs made in the FBS.

► Trickett is one of 18 kickers this year to make all of his field goals (min. 3 FG made) and his extra points.

► Last year Trickett made the most of his first season with Minnesota after transferring from Kent State. he made 36 of 38 extra points and 17 of 25 field goals for 87 points, 41 more than any other Gopher. He ranked ninth in the Big Ten in scoring and 11th with 6.7 points per game. His 87 points were 11th overall in Minnesota single-season history and seventh all-time among Gopher kickers.

► Trickett's 17 made field goals tied for fifth most in program history and the most since **Emmit Carpenter** made 17 in 2018. He made 1.31 field goals per game, good for sixth in the Big Ten.

► Trickett did miss eight field goal tries last year, though five of those attempts were from 45 yards or longer and three were 50-plus yards.

KESICH: KICKOFF SPECIALIST

- Junior kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich** has posted touchbacks on 29 of 32 kickoffs, including a career-high eight against Western Illinois.
- He leads the nation with his 29 touchbacks this year, while his touchback percentage of 90.6 percent sits second. In addition, he's third in kickoffs and second in kickoff yards (2073), and eighth in kickoff average (64.78).
- As a result of Kesich's prowess, Minnesota opponents have already had three kickoff returns this year, which ties for sixth fewest in the country.
- Last year he played in 12 of 13 games and had 42 touchbacks on 66 kickoffs. He finished 30th in the country with his 63.64 percent touchback rate and 24th with his 63.59 average yardage on kickoffs.
- Minnesota was 11th nationally by holding opponents to 16.67 yards per return and 21st with only 295 kickoff return yards allowed. The Gophers also tied for 31st in the country with only 18 opponent kick returns this year.

CRAWFORD THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

- **Mark Crawford** is back for his third season as the Gophers' punter. He's only been called on to punt three times this year, which is the fewest amount for any team in the country this year. Georgia is next at 6 punts.
- Crawford is averaging 33.7 yards on his boots this year. However, two of the three have been fair caught inside the 20-yard line.

- Last year, he punted 47 times for 1961 yards, an average of 41.7 yards per punt that ranked eighth in the Big Ten. He had six kicks cover at least 50 yards and 24 punts land inside the 20-yard line.
- A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.
- He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win six Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.
- Crawford was named the co-Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 4 last year after a standout performance in Minnesota's 20-13 win at Purdue.
- He continually flipped the field in a rain-soaked game, as he averaged 51.3 yards on six punts. He recorded a career-long, 60-yard punt twice, which was Minnesota's longest punt since **Ryan Santoso** had a 61-yarder against Illinois on Oct. 21, 2017.
- He was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since holder **Casey O'Brien** was recognized on Oct. 21, 2019, and he was the first Minnesota punter to receive the honor since 2013 when **Peter Mortell** was recognized twice.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

- Minnesota has dominated time of possession this year, averaging a nation's best 40:33 minutes with the ball. The only other team above 36 minutes is Air Force at 36:38.
- The Golden Gophers opened the year with their highest time of possession in six years under **P.J. Fleck** when they had the ball for a staggering 44:30 against New Mexico State. Minnesota held it for at least 8:58 in every quarter, including 13:29 in the third quarter alone.
- Six times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. In addition to New Mexico State, Minnesota also had it for 42:29 this year at Michigan State. It happened three times last year for the Gophers, holding the ball for 40:02 at Iowa, 40:09 at Northwestern and 40:13 at Colorado. In 2019, Minnesota recorded 42:53 against Maryland.
- In 62 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 48 times and gone 33-15 in those contests.
- Minnesota had an average time of possession of 35:25 last year, which led the Big Ten and ranked third nationally behind only Air Force (36:35) and Army (35:28).

MILESTONE WATCH

- One week after breaking former Gopher great and current radio analyst **Darrell Thompson's** school record of 40 career rushing touchdowns, **Mohamed Ibrahim** is now two touchdowns shy of tying Thompson for most overall touchdowns scored as a Gopher at 43.
- Ibrahim needs 16 points to tie Thompson (262) for fourth most in program history overall and the most by a non-kicker.
- Ibrahim is 240 rushing yards away from tying Thomas Hamner (3,810) for fourth in program annals.
- Ibrahim is 7 carries shy of matching **Chris Darkins** (643) for sixth in program history and 24 back of **Laurence Maroney** and **Marion Barber** (660 each) for fourth.
- **Tanner Morgan** is 42 passing yards away for 9,000 in his career. He'd be the second Gopher to reach that number and the seventh active player in the FBS to do so.
- Morgan is also 40 yards of total offense away from 9,000 for his career. In addition, Morgan is 18 pass attempts short of 1,000 for his career.
- More milestone information can be found on page 12.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

- **Tanner Morgan** leads all active FBS players in passing yards per attempt (9.12) and ranks seventh in passing yards (8,958), 14th in pass efficiency (154.72), 15th in total offense (8,960), 17th in passing touchdowns (63), 19th in pass completions (615), 20th in touchdowns responsible for (70), 22nd in pass attempts (982), 23rd in total plays (1,181) and 24th in completion percentage (.626).
- Despite missing nearly all of 2021 because of injury, **Mohamed Ibrahim** ranks second among all active FBS players in rushing yards (3,570), rushing touchdowns (41) and total touchdowns scored (41), third in rushing yards per game (108.2), rushing attempts (636) and rushing attempts per game (19.27), fourth in all-purpose plays (658) and all-purpose plays per game (19.94), seventh in all-purpose yards per game (114.06), eighth in all-purpose yards (3,764), 10th in yards per rush (5.6), 15th in points per game (7.5) and 25th in total points (246).
- Defensive back **Ryan Stapp** has scored two touchdowns in his career (one INT and one FR, both at Abilene Christian) to rank 10th among active FBS players in defensive TDs and 27th in non-offensive TDs.
- Fellow defensive back **Beanie Bishop** averaged 25.2 yards per kick return at Western Kentucky, a figure that still ranks 22nd in the FBS.
- Including his career at Kent State, **Matthew Trickett** ranks fourth among active FBS players in field goals made (69) and field goals made per game (1.53), fifth in field goal attempts per game (1.93), sixth in field goal attempts (87) seventh in total points (361), eighth in points per game (8.0), 13th in extra points made and attempted (154-157), 14th in extra point percentage (.981) and 27th in field goal percentage (.793).

FIVE YEARS OF FLECK

- As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their sixth season under P.J. Fleck. The first five years of the Fleck Era, in which they went 35-23 overall, stack up among the best of any five-year span in program history.
- The .603 win percentage is tied for the best mark since 1960-64 (.649) and is tied for the second best percentage since 1944-48.
- The team's 21 Big Ten wins are the most since the program won 23 from 1965-69.
- The three bowl wins in a five-year span are tied for second most in program history behind only four from 2015-19 (of which two belong to Fleck).

CIARROCCA BACK AS OC

- **Kirk Ciarrocca** has returned as Minnesota's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, a role he previously held from 2017-19.

► Ciarrocca returned after being away for two years. He spent 2020 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Penn State and served in a non-coaching role as an offensive analyst at West Virginia in 2021.

► For further evidence of Ciarrocca's success at Minnesota, quarterback **Tanner Morgan** has had eight of his 10 best games in regards to pass efficiency with Ciarrocca as his OC.

► In addition to previously working with Fleck at Minnesota, Ciarrocca was also his offensive coordinator at Western Michigan for four seasons. Ciarrocca has spent seven total seasons as an offensive coordinator under Fleck and helped both programs produce record-setting numbers on offense.

► Ciarrocca was named one of 15 semifinalists for the Broyles Award in 2019 after the Gophers averaged 432 yards per game (fourth most in school history in the modern era) and 34.1 points per game (third most in school history in the modern era). That same year, Minnesota rushed for 25 touchdowns and threw for 31 touchdowns, which was the first time in school history that the Gophers reached both of those numbers in the same season.

► With Ciarrocca as the OC and **Joe Rossi** as the DC, Minnesota has gone 18-3. That span covers the final four games of 2018 (3-1), the 2019 regular season (10-2) and this season (4-0).

THREE ADDED TO COACHING STAFF

► In addition to the hiring of Ciarrocca, Minnesota added three assistant coaches to its staff in the offseason.

► **Danny Collins** is coaching the Gopher safeties. He has been on the Minnesota staff since 2017 and has served in multiple roles with the Gophers, most recently as a Senior Defensive Analyst.

► Collins was in quality control in his first season in Minnesota in 2017, then transitioned to a graduate assistant position for the 2018 season and was named interim defensive backs coach for Minnesota's win against Georgia Tech in the Quick Lane Bowl.

► Collins moved back to quality control in 2019 and again worked on the defensive side of the ball. He was thrust into on-field coaching duties again at the Outback Bowl and was the interim defensive line coach. Collins came to Minnesota from Western Michigan where he was a defensive GA from 2015-17 under **P.J. Fleck**.

► **Greg Harbaugh** (pronounced HAR-bo) is coaching the Gopher tight ends. He returns to Minnesota for a third stint with the Gophers, as he previously served in a quality control role twice on the Minnesota staff (2017, '19). Harbaugh most recently was the receivers coach at Western Michigan for the 2020 and 2021 seasons. Prior to his first stint at Minnesota in 2017, Harbaugh was also at Western Michigan in 2015 and 2016 as a graduate assistant under Fleck.

► Veteran coach and proven recruiter **Brick Haley** is leading Minnesota's defensive line. Haley brings more than 30 years of experience – both in college and in the NFL – to the Gophers. He has primarily coached the defensive line in his career, but has also been a defensive coordinator and coached linebackers.

► Haley most recently was at Missouri where he coached the defensive line for four seasons and also held the title of Senior Associate Head Coach. Prior to Missouri, Haley spent two seasons at Texas, and before that he was at LSU for from 2009-14, where he perennially directed one of the nation's most disruptive defensive fronts.

► In addition to those three, one other offseason change saw cornerbacks coach **Paul Haynes** get promoted to co-defensive coordinator. Haynes joined the University of Minnesota coaching staff in February 2020 and has been instrumental in the Gophers cornerbacks' contributions to a stout defense.

GOPHER GRADUATES

► Minnesota's 2022 roster features 17 student-athletes who have already graduated: **Chris Autman-Bell**, **Nathan Boe**, **Chuck Filiaga**, **Clay Geary**, **Mohamed Ibrahim**, **Jordan Howden**, **Darnell Jefferies**, **Preston Jelen**, **Tanner Morgan**, **Braelen Oliver**, **Samuel Pickerign**, **Axel Ruschmeyer**, **Thomas Rush**, **John Michael Schmitz**, **Terrell Smith**, **Mariano Sori-Marin** and **Lorenza Surgers**.

FOUR GOPHERS DRAFTED

► Minnesota had four players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft. That ups its total since 2020 to 11, which is fifth in the Big Ten and tied for 13th nationally.

► Seattle took **Boye Mafe** in the second round with the 40th overall pick, making him the first Minnesota defensive lineman drafted since **Ra'Shede Hageman** went 37th overall in 2014.

► **Daniel Faalele** was next off the board as Baltimore took him in the fourth round with the No. 110 pick. Faalele was the first Gopher offensive lineman to be drafted since 2006 when both **Greg Eslinger** and **Mark Setterstrom** were selected.

► The Minnesota Vikings selected defensive lineman **Ezezi Otomewo** in the fifth round with the No. 165 pick. He was the first Gopher to be selected by the Vikings since 2010, when the purple and gold took linebacker **Nate Triplett** in the fifth round.

► **Ko Kieft** was the final Gopher off the board as the tight end was taken by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the sixth round with the No. 218 overall pick. He became the first Gopher tight end picked since **Maxx Williams** in 2015.

► With the picks of Mafe and Otomewo, it was the first time two Gopher d-linemen were taken in the same draft since 1958.

► Minnesota has now had 12 players taken in a four-year span (2019-22). That is the most selections in that time frame in school history since the draft was reduced to seven rounds in 1994. Minnesota's previous best in a four-year span was from 1988-91 when it had 14 players taken in drafts that were 12 rounds.

SCORIGAMI

► Scorigami is a concept thought up by Jon Bois at SB Nation. It is the art of building final scores that have never happened before in NFL history. Inspired by Bois, what follows are the Scorigami results so far this season for Minnesota football.

► *Minnesota 38, New Mexico State 0.* The Gophers have won by this score three times in their program history, with the most recent occurrence taking place in 1975 against Western Michigan. It's the fourth such score in program history.

► *Minnesota 62, Western Illinois 10.* Scorigami achieved. In nearly 1,300 games in program history, this is the first to end by this score.

► *Minnesota 49, Colorado 7.* This is the third game in program history to end in this score, all Minnesota victories. The last was in 1998 against Iowa.

► *Minnesota 34, Michigan State 7.* This is the seventh game in program history to end in this score, with Minnesota winning five of them. The most recent was a victory over Nebraska in 2019.

HEAD COACH // SIXTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 41, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 69-45 and is 39-23 at Minnesota.

In five years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program. Fleck is already sixth in program history in overall wins (35) and Big Ten wins (21), and eighth in games coached (58). Fleck's .603 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season twice, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 3-0 in bowl games and those three wins are tied with Glen Mason (3-4 bowl record during his time coaching the Gophers from 1997-2006) for the most in school history.

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), eight Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 268 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also led Minnesota to a 3-0 record in bowl games and has had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Mohamed Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied

school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single-season history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the

Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annestad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted

a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.
