FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1 University of Minnesota football begins its 140th season, and seventh under head coach **P.J. Fleck**, Thursday night as it hosts Nebraska at Huntington Bank Stadium. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. with a national TV audience on FOX.

2 Minnesota is 97-36-6 all-time in season openers, including wins in five of its last seven openers (4-2 under Fleck). The Golden Gophers are 101-31-7 all-time in home openers with an identical stretch of five wins in their past seven home openers (also 4-2 under Fleck). Minnesota, which is opening a season at home for the 11th straight year, is 9-5 in home openers since Huntington Bank Stadium opened in 2009.

3 For the third time in the last four seasons, Minnesota opens the year with a Big Ten opponent after facing Michigan in a 2020 schedule that featured only league action and Ohio State in 2021. Thursday's matchup with the Huskers will be the 11th time in program history that Minnesota faces a conference foe in the season opener. The Gophers are 2-8 in those previous games. Overall, Minnesota is 64-55-8 in Big Ten openers, including a 71-51-5 mark at home. Thursday marks the seventh time that Minnesota opens the season against Nebraska, going 3-3 in the previous games in a span from 1946-64.

4 Minnesota is coming off a 2022 campaign where it finished with a 9-4 record overall, capping it off with a 28-20 win over Syracuse in the Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl. Minnesota reached nine wins in a season for the 11th time in school history and the third time in the past four years under head coach **P.J. Fleck**, something that hadn't happened since 1905. Fleck is just the second Minnesota coach to have at least three seasons with nine or more victories. **Henry L. Williams** had six such seasons from 1900-21, while all other coaches in program history have a combined two nine-win seasons. Combined with a 9-4 record in 2021, the 18 wins over two seasons are tied for the most in Gopher history since 1904-05 and it's just the eighth time ever the team has won at least 18 games in consecutive years. In addition, Minnesota went 5-4 in league play after a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021. It's the first time with back-to-back conference seasons over .500 since 1968-69.

5 The 2023 campaign is the seventh for head coach **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota, where he holds a record of 44-27. He is already fifth in program history for wins and sixth in Big Ten wins (26) and games coached (71). Fleck's .620 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only **Henry L. Williams** (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 11th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 74-49 (.598).



Back for a fifth season, Tyler Nubin is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy and Thorpe Award. He's also been named a preseason All-American by Phil Steele and The Athletic.

FACING NEBRASKA

► Minnesota and Nebraska meet for the 64th time on Thursday. The Golden Gophers own a 36-25-2 edge in the all-time series, including a 7-5 advantage since the Huskers joined the Big Ten in 2011.

► The Gophers have won five of the last six matchups in the series, including each of the last four. Over those four contests, they've outscored the Huskers 108-60.

► Minnesota's four-game streak is its longest in the series since a 10-game win streak from 1940-49.

► The four-game win streak is tied for Minnesota's longest currently against a Big Ten team along with a four-game win streak over Indiana. Overall, it's tied for their second longest active streak against an FBS team. The only longer one is against Miami (OH) (5 games), while Colorado State and Western Michigan are also at four.

► The Golden Gophers are 24-13-2 all-time in the series in Minneapolis. They have won three straight at Huntington Bank Stadium by a combined score of 118-61 since 2017. It's the Gophers' longest home win streak in the series since taking 10 straight between 1932-48.

► The three-game home win streak is Minnesota's second longest currently against a Big Ten team behind six straight wins at home over Indiana. Overall, it's tied with Toledo for its fourth longest active home streak against an FBS team. The only longer ones are against Indiana (6), Miami (OH) (5) and Western Michigan (4).

► **P.J. Fleck** is 5-1 all-time against Nebraska. A win Thursday would mark the first time he's beaten a team six times as Minnesota's head coach and the first time he's done so in his career.

► Minnesota has no Nebraskans on its roster, while Nebraska has three Minnesotans. Senior DB Omar Brown (Minneapolis North) and redshirt freshman RB Emmett Johnson (Holy Angels) are from Minneapolis, while junior OL Bryce Benhart (Lakeville North HS) is a Lakeville native. ► Gophers defensive coordinator and linebackers coach **Joe Rossi** (then-defensive coordinator/safeties) and Nebraska running backs coach E.J. Barthel (then-football operations and recruiting) were on staff together at Rutgers for the 2014-15 seasons.

► Minnesota co-defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach **Nick Monroe** worked at Syracuse from 2016-22 coaching various units in the secondary, while Nebraska defensive coordinator Tony White held the same title with the Orange from 2020-22.

► Coming off of a 4-8 record in 2022 with a 3-6 mark in Big Ten play, Nebraska is under the direction of Matt Rhule, who is in his first season at the helm of the Huskers.

► Offensively, Nebraska has brought in Georgia Tech quarterback Jeff Sims to step in for departed Casey Thompson, who had a rating of 150.1. Sims started 23 games for the Yellow Jackets over the past three seasons, accounting for more than 5,500 yards of total offense.

► In the backfield, the Huskers bring back three of their top four rushers from a year ago, including Anthony Grant, who led the team in attempts (218), yards (915) and rushing touchdowns (6).

► Four of the team's top five leaders in receiving yards have moved on, with Marcus Washington the returning leader in receptions (31) and receiving yards (471).

► On the other side of the ball, the Huskers return two of their top three tacklers from last year with Luke Reimer leading the way with 86 stops. The team's top three leaders in TFL are no longer on the roster, making Isaac Gifford its top returning at 5.0 last year.

► Quinton Newsome and Ty Robinson, who tied for third on Nebraska last year with 2.0 sacks, are the team's top returners in the stat. Newsome also led in PBU with 10, while Malcolm Hartzog, who led the defense with three interceptions a year ago, is also back.

► Punter Brian Buschini (44.0 avg.) and kicker Timmy Bleekrode (9-12 FG) also return in 2023.

LAST TIME VS. THE HUSKERS

► *With assistance from the AP:* **Mohamed Ibrahim** rushed for 128 yards and two second-half touchdowns, and backup quarterback **Athan Kaliakmanis** brought Minnesota back from a 10-point halftime deficit in the Gophers' 20-13 victory at Nebraska on Saturday.

► Kaliakmanis, who took over at the start of the third quarter after **Tanner Morgan** was injured on the final play of the first half, led the Gophers to scores on four of his first five possessions.

► Both of Ibrahim's touchdowns were on 3-yard runs, the first tying the game at 10 and the second making it 20-10.

► The Huskers got a field goal to pull within a touchdown, but they turned over the ball on downs near midfield on their final possession and the Gophers ran out the clock.

► Ibrahim, held to 18 yards on eight carries in the first half, went over 100 yards for a FBS-best 17th straight game. He finished with 32 carries, his third straight game with at least 30, and had no runs longer than 11 yards.

► Chubba Purdy made his first start in place of Casey Thompson, who was held out after injuring a nerve in his right (throwing) elbow against Illinois the prior week.

► The Huskers scored on their first two possessions to lead 10-0. They punted on their next six series, five of which were three-and-outs. Purdy began alternating with Logan Smothers early in the third quarter.

CONTEXT FOR THE COMEBACK

► Trailing 10-0 at halftime at Nebraska last season, Minnesota came back for a 20-13 victory. In fact, the Gophers were down 10-0 until a field goal with 10:30 left in the third quarter got them on the board.

► The Golden Gophers outscored the Huskers 10-0 in the third quarter and 10-3 in the fourth to outscore them 20-3 in the second half.

► It was Minnesota's biggest comeback win since overcoming a 14-point deficit at Nebraska on Nov. 22, 2014. In that game, the Gophers trailed 21-7 with 5:18 remaining in the first half, but rallied for a 28-24 victory.

► The comeback win was Minnesota's 11th since 1973 when trailing by at least 10 points at halftime. The most recent of which was the aforementioned 2014 win at Nebraska where it trailed 21-7 at intermission.

► Down 10-0 after the opening quarter, Minnesota overcame a 10-point deficit at the end of the first quarter for the fifth time since 1973. Prior to Saturday, the most recent such comeback took place versus Purdue on Oct. 10, 2009 when the Gophers trailed 10-0 after the first quarter and won 35-20.

PREVIOUSLY IN MINNEAPOLIS

► *With assistance from the AP:* **Tanner Morgan** threw for 209 yards and two touchdowns and **Bryce Williams** rushed for 127 yards and another score as Minnesota defeated Nebraska 30-23 in Minneapolis in 2021.

► The Gophers dominated the first half, taking a 21-9 lead behind near-perfect passing from Morgan. But Nebraska flipped the script in the second half, forcing two interceptions to get back into the game. However, a number of missed opportunities prevented the Huskers from taking the lead and allowed Minnesota to hang on.

► Given short fields twice in the third quarter after Minnesota punts, the Huskers drove deep into Gophers territory but came up empty both times. First, the Gophers defense made three consecutive stops at the goal line to force a turnover on downs. Then Nebraska kicker Connor Culp missed a 27-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter.

► The Huskers faced another decision midway through the fourth quarter when it was fourth-and-10 from the Minnesota 34. Trailing 21-16, Nebraska head coach Scott Frost elected to go for it, but a heavy pass rush forced an incompleteness and another turnover on downs.

► On the next drive, the Gophers punted instead of electing to go for it on fourth-and-1 near midfield. On first down from his own 11, Nebraska quarterback Adrian Martinez was wrapped up in the end zone by **Ezezi Otomewo**. Martinez threw the ball away but was called for intentional grounding, resulting in a safety that made it 23-16.

► Minnesota got the ball back after the safety and pushed its lead to 30-16 on a 56-yard touchdown run by Williams with 2:12 to play.

► Offensively, the Gophers were practically flawless in the first half. They scored touchdowns on three of their first four drives. **Brevyn Spann-Ford** caught a 5-yard pass for a TD from **Cole Krame**, while **Michael Brown-Stephens** and **Chris Autman-Bell** both caught touchdown passes from Morgan to put Minnesota up 21-9 at halftime.

► Morgan was 14-for-15 for 171 yards and two touchdowns in the first half. He went on to set a school record with his 16th consecutive completion early in the third quarter, though his streak was snapped when Taylor-Britt picked off his next pass in the end zone.

► Morgan's next pass was intercepted, too, and this time the Huskers took advantage. Safety Deontai Williams' pick set up Nebraska at the Gophers 45, and three plays later Rahmir Johnson scored his second touchdown of the game on a 1-yard run to cut Minnesota's lead to 21-16.

MEMORABLE GAMES VS. NEBRASKA

► Sept. 11, 2017: The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in **P.J. Fleck's** first season as head coach. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers had scored in a Big Ten game since 2006. **Rodney Smith** finished with 279 all-purpose yards, including 134 rushing yards and a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, and the Gophers racked up 409 rushing yards, the eighth best total in program history.

► Nov. 22, 2014: **Mitch Leidner** led a pair of 10-play touchdown drives in the second half as Minnesota rallied for a 28-24 win at No. 21 Nebraska. Leidner scored on a three-yard run with 3:25 to play to give the Gophers their first lead.

► Oct. 26, 2013: Minnesota snapped a 16-game losing streak against Nebraska with a 34-23 win at Huntington Bank Stadium. **David Cobb** led the Gophers on the ground with 138 rushing yards.

► Oct. 6, 1945: Behind a school-record seven interceptions, Minnesota beat Nebraska in Lincoln, 61-7. The 61 points are the most Minnesota has ever scored in a road game, while the 54-point win is the Gophers' second largest on the road behind a 58-0 victory at Shattuck in 1890.

MILESTONE WATCH

► **Bryce Williams** is 26 rushing yards away from becoming the 48th Gopher to reach 1,000 yards in a career. ► After rushing for 2,820 yards in his Western Michigan career, running back **Sean Tyler** needs 180 more yards to hit 3,000 for his career.

► **Chris Autman-Bell** needs 30 receiving yards to get to 2,000 for his career, which would make him the ninth player at Minnesota to reach the milestone. He also needs five receptions to tie **Drew Wolitarsky** and **Omar Douglas** for 10th all-time.

► With 991 receiving yards, **Daniel Jackson** needs nine more to become the 28th Gopher to reach 1,000 career receiving yards.

► **Brevyn Spann-Ford** is three catches behind **Jack Simmons** (73) for third all-time among Minnesota tight ends. Spann-Ford also needs 61 receiving yards to tie **Jay Carroll** (883), father of Minnesota fifth-year senior offensive lineman **Quinn Carroll**, for fifth among Gopher TEs and 178 to reach 1,000 for his career.

► With eight career interceptions, one more would move **Tyler Nubin** into a six-way tie for eighth in Gopher annals.

► More information on Gopher record books can be found on Page 11 of the notes.

IN THE POLLS

► Minnesota is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and Coaches preseason polls, ranking 13th among those receiving votes in the AP and 15th among those listed by the coaches.

► This marks the 12th season that Minnesota has been ranked or receiving votes in the preseason AP Poll, including four of the past five years, according to CollegePollArchive.com. The Gophers are looking to start and finish the year in the AP Poll for the third time in pro-

gram history and first time in consecutive years.

► Four of Minnesota's 2023 opponents are ranked in both preseason polls, while two appeared in each poll.

► Michigan was No. 2 in both polls, while Ohio State was ranked 3rd by the AP and 4th by the Coaches. Meanwhile, Wisconsin was 19th and 21st by those same polls, respectively, while North Carolina was 21st according to the AP and 20th via the Coaches.

► In addition, Iowa was No. 25 in the AP Poll and the top team receiving votes by the Coaches. Illinois was among those receiving votes in both polls.

► The five opponents in the preseason AP Poll are tied for the most in the country along with 11 other teams.

OPPORTUNISTIC SCHEDULE

► Minnesota faces one of the most difficult, or opportunistic, schedules in the FBS this year. On3.com ranks it as the second toughest slate, while Phil Steele has it seventh.

► Minnesota's 2023 opponents combined to go 89-67 in 2022. Seven teams won at least eight games last year, four won at least nine and Michigan (13) and Ohio State (11) each reached double digits.

► Gopher opponents in 2023 posted a .571 win percentage last year, that ranks third in the Big Ten behind Michigan State (.627) and Ohio State (.610). However, both of those teams do face one FCS opponent this year.

► Nine of the Gophers' 2023 opponents played in a bowl game last year, including Michigan, which reached the College Football Playoff. No Big Ten team faces more teams that made a bowl game last year than the Gophers.

► This will be the first time since 2015 that the Gophers face Michigan and Ohio State in the same season.

THURSDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

► Minnesota is opening the season on a Thursday night, something it has done 14 times previously in its history, all since 2001. In fact, the Golden Gophers have opened on a Thursday for the last 10 full seasons since 2012 (excluding 2020 COVID season).

► The Gophers are 20-10 all-time in program history on Thursdays, including 19-6 in the regular season.

► Minnesota has won six of its last seven games on the day and is 5-1 under **P.J. Fleck** on Thursdays.

► The Gophers have a .657 winning percentage in their history when playing on days other than Saturday, going 57-29-3. Under Fleck, it is 10-3 on non-Saturdays.

► Last season, Minnesota won both of its Thursday games. After opening the season with a 38-0 win over New Mexico State on Thursday, Sept. 1, the Gophers ended the year with a 28-20 win over Syracuse in the Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl on Thursday, Dec. 29. It was just the third time in program history that they played two Thursday games in one season. The others came in 2014 with a season opener against Eastern Illinois and Citrus Bowl vs. Missouri, as well as in 2002 when Minnesota played on consecutive Thursdays in October due to conflicts with Minnesota Twins playoff games.

AUGUST ACTION

► Thursday marks the 13th game in program history to occur in the month of August. The Gophers have gone 10-2 in their previous August matchups, including 10 straight wins, the last three of which have come under **P.J. Fleck**.

► During the 10-game win streak, Minnesota has outscored its August opponents by an average of 31.8-12.1.

► Thursday will mark the first August game in program history to be against a Power 5 team and a Big Ten foe.

FOUR ADDED TO COACHING STAFF

► Minnesota added four new assistant coaches to its staff in the offseason.

► Former Minnesota defensive lineman **Winston DeLattiboudere III** has returned to his alma mater to serve as the Golden Gophers' defensive line coach and newcomer coordinator. DeLattiboudere III spent the 2022 campaign as defensive line coach for Akron, while before that he worked one season as a graduate assistant at Oregon working with the defensive line. DeLattiboudere III started his coaching career in 2020 as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line at Charlotte.

► He spent five seasons with Minnesota as a player, including the final four with **P.J. Fleck** as head coach. DeLattiboudere III played in 51 career games with 36 starts, finishing with 83 tackles (43 solo) with 13.5 tackles for loss and five sacks. He earned academic All-Big Ten honors in 2019 as a senior, while also earning the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award and the program's Tony Dungy Award (character and community service) that same year.

► **Nick Monroe** will coach the cornerbacks and be the team's co-defensive coordinator. The Minnesota native returns to his home state after seven seasons at Syracuse. He joined the Orange staff in 2016 and served as Syracuse's secondary coach for two seasons before narrowing his focus to the team's safeties and nickelbacks in 2018 and safeties and rovers in 2020, before taking on his role last season of defensive passing game coordinator. His father, Marty, was a GA for the Gophers under head coach **Jim Wacker** in 1994-95.

► **Nic McKissic-Luke** is the running backs coach. He spent the past three seasons at Northern Illinois, first as running backs/fullbacks coach in 2020, adding run game coordinator and co-special teams coordinator titles in 2021 and then being run game coordinator, running backs coach and the sole special teams coordinator in 2022.

► **Andrew Sowder** will oversee the tight ends. He spent the past five seasons as Kent State's offensive coordinator. He also worked with quarterbacks and tight ends during his time with the Golden Flashes.

► Along with the new coaching additions, after spending last season as the Gophers' tight ends coach, **Greg Harbaugh Jr.** is now co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. He joins **Matt Simon** in the co-offensive coordinator role, which Simon has held, along with wide receivers coach, since the 2020 campaign.

NEW FACES BOOST SKILL GROUPS

► Of the 11 transfers Minnesota brought in this off-season, three are on offense and they're aiming to boost the skill positions.

► Wide receiver **Corey Crooms, Jr.**, and running back **Sean Tyler** both came in from Western Michigan with one year of eligibility left, while wideout **Elijah Spencer** joined the Gophers from Charlotte with two to play. All three were early enrollees in January.

► Crooms, Jr., spent the past four seasons at Western Michigan. He made 115 catches for 1,766 yards and 12 touchdowns in 42 career games with the Broncos. He had 57 catches for 814 yards and five touchdowns last season, including five 100-yard receiving games as he was named Second Team All-MAC. He ranked fifth in 2022 in the MAC with a receiving grade of 75.8 from PFF.

► Tyler was Crooms, Jr.'s teammate the last four years at WMU, rushing 495 times for 2,820 yards (5.7 avg.) and 23 touchdowns, catching 43 passes for 338 yards and three scores, and averaging 23.9 yards on 40 kickoff returns with three touchdowns in 42 career games with the Broncos. He also had 10 100-yard rushing games.

► In 2022, Tyler was named Second Team All-MAC as he led the conference and ranked ninth nationally with 146.83 all-purpose yards per game. He rushed 209 times for 1,097 yards and seven touchdowns and caught 12 passes for 111 yards and another score.

► Crooms, Jr., and Tyler both have familiarity with Gophers co-OC and quarterbacks coach **Greg Harbaugh**, who was WMU's wide receivers coach from 2021-22.

► Spencer played the last two seasons at Charlotte where he made 85 catches for 1,324 yards and 15 touchdowns. Last season he hauled in 57 catches for 943 yards and nine touchdowns and was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. He was the fifth-ranked WR in Conference USA with a grade of 81.0 from PFF.

► In 2021, Spencer recorded 28 receptions for 381 yards and six touchdowns en route to being named Conference USA Freshman of the Year and a member of the Conference USA All-Freshman Team.

SEVEN ADDED TO DEFENSE

► Seven of Minnesota's 11 transfers this year come on defense with defensive lineman **Chris Collins**, linebackers **Ryan Selig** and **Rowan Zolman** and defensive backs **Tyler Bride**, **Jack Henderson**, **Tre'Von Jones** and **Craig McDonald**.

► Collins, Jones and Selig each have one year of eligibility left, while Bride and Henderson have two, and McDonald and Zolman have three.

► Collins spent five years at North Carolina where he played in 46 games and made 68 tackles (33 solo), 12 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, forced one fumble and broke up one pass.

► Selig was teammates with fellow transfers **Corey Crooms, Jr.**, and **Sean Tyler** at Western Michigan. In five years with the Broncos, Selig recorded 154 tackles (88 solo), 13.0 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and three pass breakups in 45 career games with the Broncos.

► Zolman played the 2022 season at Miami (OH) where he saw action in nine games, making one start. He finished the season with six tackles and an interception.

► Bride was at Georgia Southern the last three years where he played in 30 games with 15 starts and saw nearly 1,200 snaps on defense and special teams. He recorded 82 tackles, 9.0 TFLs, 2.0 sacks, two interceptions, 16 pass breakups and a fumble recovery with the Eagles.

► Henderson competed at Southeastern Louisiana for the last three years and played in 33 career games. He recorded 163 career tackles (93 solo), 12 tackles for loss, two sacks, 13 pass breakups, six interceptions, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. According to PFF, his 12 pressures last year were three more than any other FCS cornerback, while his nine hurries also led all CBs.

► Jones called Elon home the last four years. He played in 38 games with 27 starts and finished his Phoenix career with 185 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, nine pass break-ups, three interceptions, five fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 22 punt returns for 185 yards. He was named Third-Team All-CAA in 2021 and 2022 and was a 2019 Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American.

► Minnesota is the third stop for McDonald after he spent the 2022 season at Auburn, where he played in two games, and the 2020-21 campaigns at Iowa State, where appearing in 17 games with three starts over two seasons.

KALIAKMANIS' TURN AT QB

► With **Tanner Morgan** departing the program after six seasons, redshirt sophomore **Athan Kaliakmanis** takes over at quarterback for Minnesota in 2023.

► Kaliakmanis played in 11 games with five starts last year as Morgan missed time due to injury. Kaliakmanis was 60-of-111 (54.1%) for 846 yards with three touchdowns and four interceptions for a rating of 127.4.

► Looking just at his five starts last year, Kaliakmanis' numbers improved to 49-of-88 (55.7%) for 725 yards with three touchdowns and two picks for a rating of 131.6.

► In the final game of the regular season against Wisconsin and bowl game against Syracuse (which he left in the second quarter due to injury), he was even better. He completed 26 of 38 passes (68.4%) for 399 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 173.99 rating.

► He's poised to become the first QB to start a season opener other than Morgan since **Zack Annexstad** in 2018.

► When Morgan was injured at Illinois last year, it was Kaliakmanis who came on in relief. He completed two of his six passes for 17 yards and threw the first two interceptions of his career.

► Kaliakmanis then made his first career start at Penn State's White Out in place of the injured Morgan, completing 9-of-22 passes for 175 yards with one touchdown and one interception, and rushing seven times for 45 yards. Over the last 45 seasons, 31 QBs have started for the Gophers. Kaliakmanis' 19.4 yards per completion ranked third best among those signal-callers in their debut.

► The last Gopher quarterback to make his first career start on the road before Kaliakmanis was **Conor Rhoda** at Maryland on Oct. 15, 2016, while the last Gopher QB to make his first career start against a ranked team was **MarQueis Gray** at then-No. 25 USC on Sept. 3, 2011. With Penn State ranked 16th, Kaliakmanis' start was against the highest ranked opponent for a first career start since **Andy Persby** started against then-No. 13 Penn State on Oct. 10, 1998.

► Kaliakmanis also replaced an injured Morgan in the second half at Nebraska, completing 6-of-12 passes for 137 yards and rushing three times for 27 yards. Minnesota was down 10-0 when Kaliakmanis entered the game and he helped led the Gophers to a 20-13 victory.

► He then started the final four games of the season, including a masterful performance in the regular season finale against Wisconsin that saw him win Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.

► In a 23-16 comeback win in Madison, Kaliakmanis set career highs in completions (19), attempts (29), passing yards (319) and touchdowns (2). He completed nine passes of 15 yards or more and averaged 16.8 yards per completion, as Minnesota rallied from a 16-13 fourth-quarter deficit to retain Paul Bunyan's Axe.

► The Kaliakmanis-led offense finished with 416 yards of total offense (319 passing and 97 rushing), which was the most yards for the Gophers against the Badgers since racking up 501 yards in 2007.

► Kaliakmanis was a four-star recruit out of high school according to 247Sports and ESPN and ranked as the No. 16 quarterback in the nation according to Rivals. He was listed as the No. 2 prospect in Illinois according to 247Sports and 267th overall by ESPN.

TOP TIGHT END TARGET

► Gopher tight end **Brevyn Spann-Ford** is back for a sixth season in the Maroon and Gold. Last year he led the team in targets (61), receptions (42), yards after catch (245) and YAC per game (18.8), and he was second in receiving yards (497) and touchdown receptions (2).

► His 42 receptions were second most in Gophers history for a tight end, while his 497 receiving yards were fifth best. He became the first tight end to lead the team in receptions since **Maxx Williams** in 2014, while the reception total was the highest for a Gopher since 2019.

► Spann-Ford was targeted at least two times in every game last year, the only Gopher to make that claim. He was also the only Minnesota player to have a catch in every game in 2022.

► At Wisconsin, he set career highs in both receptions and receiving yards as he caught seven balls for 95 yards.

► According to PFF, Spann-Ford ranked as the No. 3 tight end in the country with an overall grade of 90.0, and he was the No. 5 run-blocking tight end at 82.5.

JACKSON STEPS UP

► With **Chris Autman-Bell** out for the season after three games last year, fellow wide receiver **Daniel Jackson** helped pick up some of the production.

► Jackson himself missed the first two games of the season due to injury, but made up for lost time. He led the team with 5.5 targets per game, 557 receiving yards and five touchdown receptions. It was the highest yardage total for a Minnesota player since 2019.

► He was also second in overall targets (60), receptions (37), receiving yards per game (50.6) and yards after catch (187), and third in YAC per game (17.0).

► He recorded three catches for 42 yards and two touchdowns at Michigan State for the first multi-TD game of his career. The next week against Purdue, he posted a career-high 110 receiving yards on six receptions, including a career-long 66 yard gain.

► He recorded his second multi-TD game of his career in the bowl game with four catches for 73 yards and two touchdowns in the Pinstripe Bowl win over Syracuse.

► His nine targets against the Boilermakers and Wisconsin were the most by a Gopher last year, while his 58 targets over the last 10 games (since Autman-Bell's injury) were most on the team.

► Jackson was the team's leading receiver six times last season, most on the squad.

YEAR 7 FOR NO. 7

► Seventh-year wide receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** suffered a season-ending lower leg injury against Colorado and had surgery on Sept. 21, missing the final 10 games of 2022.

► Through three games last year, Autman-Bell was leading the team in targets (15), targets per game (5.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (214), receiving yards per game (71.3) and yards per catch (19.5), and he was tied for the lead in touchdown receptions (1).

► Against Western Illinois on Sept. 10, Autman-Bell caught five passes for 118 yards. It was his fifth career game with 100+ receiving yards and the second highest total of his career behind 129 against Purdue in 2020.

► Autman-Bell has played in 47 career games with 125 catches (12th in program history) for 1,970 yards (9th) and 13 TDs (T-13th).

► He has made at least one catch in his past 41 games, which is the third longest active FBS streak and the second longest streak in school history behind **Ron Johnson's** Big Ten record streak of 46 games.

BROCKINGTON BREAKS THROUGH AT UW

► The regular season finale last year at Wisconsin was a breakout game for wideout **Le'Meke Brockington**, then a redshirt freshman.

► Brockington had his second consecutive multi-reception game as he caught two passes for a career-high 52 yards. His 45-yard touchdown reception with 3:40 to play was the first of his career and turned out to be the game-winner as it broke a 16-16 tie.

► Brockington, who made four starts last year, was targeted just 20 times, but 11 of those came in the last three games. In addition, six of his 11 receptions on the year came in the final three contests.

MAKING UP FOR MO

► Minnesota's all-time leading rusher and backfield mainstay **Mohamed Ibrahim** has graduated, leaving carries up to old and new faces in the running backs room.

► The most veteran returner is **Bryce Williams**, a sixth-year back who has played in 39 career games. He's rushed 227 times for 974 yards and 11 touchdowns. He's also caught 19 passes for 197 yards.

► A year ago, Williams was third on the team in rushes (51), rush yards (249) and rushing touchdowns (3). He added 11 receptions for 91 yards.

► Other returners include redshirt sophomore Jordan Nubin and redshirt freshmen Zach Evans and Max Grand. The trio combined for 21 carries for 67 yards last season with Evans adding a touchdown.

► The newcomers include a transfer in **Sean Tyler** (more on him on Page 4 of the notes) and a pair of true freshmen in **Darius Taylor** and **Marquese Williams**.

► Taylor, who was high school teammates with fellow freshman QB Drew Viotto at Lake Western High School in Walled Lake, Mich., was ranked by Rivals as a four-star prospect, the No. 6 player in Michigan and the No. 12 running back in the nation. A January enrollee at Minnesota, Taylor rushed 268 times for 2,450 yards and 36 touchdowns a senior.

► Williams was rated a consensus three-star prospect out of Bishop McDevitt High School in Harrisburg, Pa. He was ranked as the No. 29 running back in the country and the 12th-ranked player in the state of Pennsylvania by Rivals. Williams ran for 4,465 yards and 71 touchdowns on 545 carries (8.2) yards per carry, and caught 47 passes for 655 yards and 10 more touchdowns in his career.

O-LINE RELOADS

► Minnesota, which returns 49 career starts on the offensive line, will look to replace three of its five starters from a year ago.

► The Golden Gophers used the same starting five on the offensive line in the first 12 games of last season with **Aireontae Ersery** at left tackle, **Axel Ruschmeyer** at left guard, **John Michael Schmitz** at center, **Chuck Filiaga** at right guard and **Quinn Carroll** at right tackle. **Nathan Boe** replaced Schmitz at center for the bowl game.

► Schmitz, an All-American and second round pick in the NFL Draft, as well as Ruschmeyer and Filiaga, both of whom earned All-Big Ten honors, have since moved on.

► The unit gave up just 15 sacks in 13 games, tied for 20th in the country in fewest sacks allowed. The rate of 1.15 sacks allowed per game tied for 18th. Minnesota had six games last year with zero sacks allowed and only had two games where it allowed more than two sacks (3.0 at Nebraska and Wisconsin).

► The Gophers were also tied for 22nd with 57 tackles for loss given up last year. The rate of 4.39 TFLs allowed per game tied for 20th in the FBS. The 57 TFLs resulted in a loss of 192 yards, tied for the 14th fewest last year.

► While the unit may lack the number of starts as in years past, it is certainly not a young group, but rather a group that has considerable experience in the program. Of the 20 offensive linemen on the Minnesota roster, half are entering their third year at least at Minnesota, while 18 having at least two years of eligibility remaining.

GOPHERS 'D' AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota has boasted one of the best defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi** over the last few seasons.

► Last year, the Golden Gophers ranked eighth in the country by allowing 295.1 total yards per contest. They also had the No. 4 defense in terms of scoring (13.8 ppg), and No. 15 in passing yards allowed (186.1) and rush defense (109.0). Minnesota, Air Force, Illinois, and Iowa were the only teams in the FBS that ranked in the top 20 in each of those categories.

► In fact, over the last two seasons, Minnesota is the only team in the country to finish each season ranked in the top 15 of total, scoring, rush and passing defense.

► Since the start of the 2021 season, Minnesota has held 17 teams below 300 yards of offense in a game tied with Georgia for the second most in the FBS in that span behind only Wisconsin (18). Last season, the Gophers held eight of 13 opponents under 300 yards, tied for fifth most in the country and one of nine teams to reach that number.

► In addition, Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing seven times since the start of the 2021 season, tied for the most in the country in that span. The Gophers did it three times last year against New Mexico State (53), Colorado (90) and Rutgers (86).

► Since the start of the 2021 season, the Gophers have held 18 opponents to 16 points or fewer, second most in the nation behind only Georgia (21).

► Last year, Minnesota held opponents to 13 points or fewer on eight occasions, its highest total since 1961. Since 2000, no other Gopher team has had more than four such games.

► Minnesota's 10 rushing touchdowns allowed in 2022 were a school record (since 1955) and tied for the eighth fewest in the FBS.

STOPPING THE EXPLOSIVE PLAY

► One key for success last year for the Minnesota defense was the ability to prevent explosive plays.

► The longest pass play for a Gopher foe was 58 yards, while only eight runs went for longer than 20 yards (tied for 10th fewest in the nation).

► The Maroon and Gold yielded just 130 plays of 10 yards or more from scrimmage, ninth best in the FBS, while only 41 plays from scrimmage went for more than 20 yards, eighth best in the country.

► The 19 plays allowed of 30+ yards tied for 19th, but Minnesota was tied for third in the nation by giving up only four plays from scrimmage of at least 40 yards.

► The Golden Gophers' 86 pass plays allowed of 10 yards or more tied for ninth in the nation, while the 33 passes of more than 20 yards tied for 23rd. The Gophers tied for fourth by allowing only three pass plays of 40+ yards, and they were one of 15 programs that did not give up more than one pass play longer than 50 yards.

MORE ON THE SHUTOUTS

► Minnesota had two shutouts last season, a 38-0 win over New Mexico State in the season opener and a 31-0 victory against Rutgers on Oct. 29. It was the first time Minnesota recorded two shutouts in a season since 2006 and the second time doing so since 1977.

► Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State were the only other programs with two shutouts in 2022, but each had one against an FCS foe, making Minnesota the only team to shut out two FBS teams last year.

► The shutout of Rutgers was the Gophers' first Big Ten shutout victory since a 45-0 win versus Illinois on Oct. 23, 2004. The Gophers limited Rutgers to just 134 total yards (86 passing, 48 rushing), seven first downs, and 2-of-10 conversions on third down. RU averaged just 3.0 yards per play and 2.3 yards per rush.

► Minnesota's shutout of New Mexico State on Sept. 1 saw a smothering performance, holding the Aggies to just 91 yards of total offense with 53 yards passing and 38 rushing yards. It was the first time since at least 2000 the Gophers held an opponent to 55 or fewer yards in both passing and rushing in one game.

► The Aggies were held to only 33 plays on the night, the fewest ever by a Minnesota opponent and tied for the lowest total in the FBS since 2017. The previous school mark was 40, set by Nebraska in 1960 and matched by Middle Tennessee State in 2010.

► NMSU gained 91 yards (53 passing, 38 rushing), the third fewest by an FBS team last season. The Golden Gophers also held the Aggies to just six first downs, equaling the fewest allowed in the **P.J. Fleck** era (two off the modern school record) and tied for the fourth lowest total last year by an FBS program.

► The 91 yards of total offense allowed was the sixth best performance in program history since 1960 and the second fewest since 1967 after 2021's performance at Colorado where the Buffaloes were limited to 63 yards.

► The 38 rushing yards allowed marked the 11th time since 2000 the Gophers held their opponent to at least that number. Four of those 11 have come under Fleck.

► Rutgers and New Mexico State both had 21 rushing attempts, tied for the fewest by a Minnesota opponent since Miami (OH) also had 21 in 2011.

► Coupled with a 30-0 shutout at Colorado in 2021, Minnesota joins Georgia (5), Fresno State (3), Penn State (3) and UAB (3) as the only programs with at least three shutouts in the past two seasons.

NUBIN BACK FOR ONE MORE

► Coming off a year where he earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors, safety **Tyler Nubin** is back for a fifth season at Minnesota in 2023.

► He led the team last year with four interceptions, a career high. After tying for the team lead in interceptions in 2020 (1) and 2021 (3), Nubin joined **Keith Edwards** (1977-79) as the only Gophers since 1961 to lead the team in interceptions three years in row.

► Nubin's first pick of the year came against Purdue, and then he had two against Rutgers. He had the first multi-interception game by a Gopher since **Antoine Winfield Jr.** had two versus Penn State on Nov. 9, 2019. Nubin's last pick came at home against Northwestern.

► Also against Purdue, Nubin recorded his first forced fumble of the season (second career). He became the first Minnesota player to have both a forced fumble and an interception in the same game since **Eric Murray** versus TCU on Sept. 3, 2015.

► Nubin, who played in and started 12 of 13 games a year ago, was fourth on the team with 55 tackles, and he had 2.0 tackles for loss, three pass breakups and a forced fumble. He had a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.0 for loss, at Illinois.

► He was ninth last year among Big Ten safeties, and No. 3 among those safeties returning, with an overall defensive grade of 76.4 from PFF. In addition, he ranked second with a rush defense grade of 83.4, ninth with a 76.5 tackling grade and 12th with a coverage grade of 72.6.

► Also according to PFF, he allowed only 7 receptions on 20 targets for a reception percentage of 35.0. That led all Big Ten safeties and was fourth in the FBS.

WALLEY'S WORLD

► Junior defensive back **Justin Walley** has been one of the top corners in the Big Ten ever since he earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team in 2021 and was PFF's highest graded true freshman cornerback.

► Last year, he started all 13 games at cornerback and has 39 tackles with three pass breakups and a forced fumble. He was second on the team with three interceptions and one fumble recovery.

► He ranked 11th last year among Big Ten cornerbacks with an overall PFF grade of 77.6. Among returning CBs, he ranked fifth. His coverage grade of 80.1 was eighth-best last year and fourth among returners. He allowed only 9.5 yards per reception, tied for fifth best in 2022 in the Big Ten, while his NFL passer rating against mark of 48.6 was also fifth in the conference, according to PFF.

► At Michigan State, Walley had three tackles, plus an interception and a fumble recovery. Since at least 2000, he was just the third Gopher to have an interception and fumble recovery in the same game (**Jalen Myrick** at Purdue in 2015, **Mario Reese** vs. Iowa in 2006).

► He picked up his second interception of the season at Penn State and returned it 37 yards to set up a Minnesota field goal. At the time, it was the longest interception return for a Gopher since **Coney Durr's** 72-yard pick six versus Maryland on Oct. 26, 2019.

► Walley recorded his third interception of the year at Wisconsin in the fourth quarter, returning it 28 yards.

► His 65 interception yards last year tied for ninth most at Minnesota since 2000.

► Three times last season (against Purdue, Iowa and Syracuse) he had six tackles in a game, a career high.

LINDENBERG'S TURN TO LEAD

► With the graduation of linebacker **Mariano Sori-Marin**, the team's leading tackler, eyes turn to redshirt junior **Cody Lindenberg** to lead the linebacking corps.

► Lindenberg was second on the team last season with 71 tackles and fourth with 4.0 tackles for loss. He also had 1.0 sacks, two pass breakups and a QB hurry.

► Lindenberg played in all 13 games with starts in the final six contests. In that stretch, he posted a team-high 45 tackles.

► He led or tied for the team lead in tackles seven times last season, including a career-high 11 tackles in the bowl win over Syracuse.

REDDING READY ON RETURNS

► Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Quentin Redding** emerged as a potent weapon in the return game last year for Minnesota.

► He returned 20 kickoffs for 508 yards, which was more yards than any Gopher had in a season since **Demetrius Douglas** had 594 in 2018. Redding's average of 25.4 yards per return was second in the Big Ten and ranked 14th nationally.

► At Illinois, Redding set career highs in returns (5) and return yards (151), highlighted by a career-long 92-yard return to start the second half. The return was Minnesota's longest since **Rodney Smith** returned the opening kick 100 yards for a TD versus Nebraska on Nov. 11, 2017, while Redding's 151 kick return yards were the most for a Gopher since **KiAnte Hardin** had 165 versus Illinois on Nov. 21, 2015.

► Against Syracuse in the Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl, he returned three kickoffs for 118 yards, including a 72-yarder in the third quarter that was the longest in Minnesota bowl history. His 118 return yards were second most in Gopher bowl annals.

► Redding also averaged 6.0 yards on punt returns, gaining 78 yards on 13 returns. His returns were the most by a Gopher since **Craig James** (16) in 2014 and his yardage was the best since Douglas in 2018 (113).

KESICH ADDING FIELD GOALS TO KICKOFF PROWESS

► **Dragan Kesich** spent the last two seasons as the Gophers' kickoff specialist, but may add on field goal duties this year with the graduation of **Matthew Trickett**. A strong-legged left, Kesich has attempted one field in his career, a 53-yard try at Iowa in 2021 that was blocked.

► Kesich excelled on kickoffs a year ago. He posted touchbacks on 59 of 71 kickoffs, including a career-high eight against Western Illinois.

► He led the country with his kickoff average of 64.59 yards in 2022, while his touchback percentage of 83.10 percent was fifth in the FBS and his 59 touchbacks ranked seventh.

► As a result of Kesich's prowess, Minnesota opponents only had 10 kickoff returns last year, which tied for fifth fewest in the country. The 194 kickoff return yards allowed were tied for sixth fewest.

CRAWFORD THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

► **Mark Crawford** is in his fourth season as the Gophers' punter. He punted 46 times last year, including just three times over the first four games of the season. The 47 punts on the year (including a block at Penn State), the Gophers ranked tied for 30th in fewest punts. The 3.6 punts per game tied for 29th.

► Crawford, who has also been the team's holder on kicks, averaged 40.6 yards on his boots this year. Of his 46 punts, 21 were fair caught, 15 landed inside the 20-yard line and only three went for a touchback.

► He had five punts of 50+ yards, including a long of 55 yards in the Pinstripe Bowl against Syracuse.

► Opponents only returned 11 punts last year, tied for 32nd fewest in the country. They also ranked 20th with only 52 punt return yards allowed and the 4.73 yards per return ranked 28th.

► A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.

► He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win six Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.

► At 29 years old (will turn 30 in December), he's the fifth oldest player in college football, according to a survey of FBS SIDs.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Minnesota dominated time of possession last year, averaging 34:32 minutes with the ball. That figure ranked third nationally behind only Air Force (36:33) and Navy (34:38). Michigan was next-closest at 33:48.

► The Golden Gophers opened 2022 with their highest time of possession in six years under **P.J. Fleck** when they had the ball for a staggering 44:30 against New Mexico State. Minnesota held it for at least 8:58 in every quarter, including 13:29 in the third quarter alone.

► Eight times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. In addition to New Mexico State, Minnesota also had it for 42:29 last year at Michigan State, 41:02 against Rutgers and 40:22 versus Northwestern.

► In 71 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 55 times and gone 38-17 in those contests.

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

► Minnesota was among the least penalized teams in the FBS last year, committing 46 penalties for 413 yards.

► The Gophers tied with Oklahoma State for the nation's lead with their 3.54 penalties per game, and Minnesota was third in the FBS and first among Power 5 schools with 31.77 penalty yards per contest.

► Minnesota committed four or fewer penalties in 10 of 13 games last year, including a program record zero against Iowa. The Hawkeyes didn't have any penalties either, making it the first FBS game to have no penalties since Oregon at Oregon State in 2018.

BEST YEARLY SPANS

► As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their seventh season under **P.J. Fleck**. Fleck is 44-27 overall and 26-26 in the Big Ten. He has the most Big Ten wins, the second most overall wins and the third-best overall winning percentage (.620) and conference winning percentage (.500) of any Minnesota coach through his first six seasons. Below is a look at how other yearly spans compare in Gopher history.

► **Last 6 Years (2017-22):** The 44 wins are tied for the second most since 1903-08. The .620 win percentage is tied for the best mark since 1960-65 (.632) and it's tied for the second best since 1944-49. The 26 B1G wins are tied for the most since the program won 27 between 1964-69. The B1G win percentage of .500 is tied for the best since 1968-73 (.544). The four bowl wins in a 6-year span are tied for the most in school history along with 2014-19, 2015-20 and 2016-21.

► **Last 5 Years (2018-22):** The 39 wins are the most since 1903-07 (43). The .661 win percentage is the best mark since 1940-44 (.733). The 24 B1G wins are the most ever in a 5-year span in program history. The B1G win percentage of .558 is the best since 1967-71 (.569). The four bowl wins in a 5-year span are tied for the most in school history along with 2015-19.

► **Last 4 Years (2019-22):** The 32 wins are tied for the most since 1903-06 (41). The .696 win percentage is the best mark since 1940-43 (.727). The 21 B1G wins are the most in any four-year period in school history; no other 4-year span has 20 wins. The B1G win percentage of .618 is best since 1967-70 (.625). The three bowl wins are tied for the most in any 4-year span, along with 2001-04, 2002-05, 2015-18, 2016-19 and 2018-21.

► **Last 3 Years (2020-22):** The 14 B1G wins are tied for the second most since 1967-69. Only the span from 2019-21 when the team won 16 games is better. The B1G win percentage of .560 is second best since 1967-69 (.714). The only mark better since then was in 2019-21 when Minnesota had a .640 win percentage.

Last 2 Years (2021-22)

► **Last 2 Years (2021-22):** The 18 wins are tied for the most since 1904-05 and it's just the eighth time ever Minnesota has won at least 18 games in consecutive years. Fleck is one of two coaches to do it more than once, also doing so in 2018-19. **Henry L. Williams** did it 5 times. The .692 win percentage is tied for the second best mark since 1967-68 (.700). The only mark better since then was in 2019-20 when the Gophers had a .700 win percentage. The 11 B1G wins are tied for the second most behind only 1960-61 (12). The last time Minnesota won at least 11 B1G games in consecutive years was 1967-68. The B1G win percentage of .611 is second best since 1972-73 (.625). The only mark better since then was a .625 win percentage in 2019-20.

SUCCESS ON 3RD DOWNS

► Minnesota was one of the top teams in the country last year on both sides of the ball on 3rd downs. The offense finished third in the FBS in conversion percentage, while the defense was sixth in opponent conversions.

► Minnesota's offense converted 87 of 167 3rd downs for a 52.10 percent success rate. For context, Washington (56.83%) and USC (53.57%) were the only teams higher than 52 percent and there were only eight teams total above 50 percent in the FBS last year.

► The Gophers converted on better than 63 percent of third downs in five games last year, including a season-best 86.7 percent (13-15) versus Colorado.

► On the other side of the ball, Minnesota allowed opponents to convert just 46-of-165 third downs, 27.88 percent. Georgia (26.63%) and Oklahoma State (27.14%) were the only Power 5 teams ranked higher than Minnesota.

► Penn State and Syracuse had the most "success" against Minnesota last year by converting 5-of-11 (45.5%) and 7-of-16 (43.8%) on third downs, respectively. Otherwise, only Illinois (35.3%) and Wisconsin (31.3%) were above 30 percent in games last season.

EXTRA EFFICIENT

► According to BCFTOys.com, Minnesota was one of the most efficient teams last year in regards to points per drive, net available yards and net yards per play.

► Ratings and supporting data on BCFTOys are calculated from the results of "non-garbage possessions" in FBS vs. FBS games.

► Minnesota's offense averaged 2.43 points per drive, 50th in the FBS, while the defense was eighth at 1.39. That net rating of 1.03 points per drive ranked 14th.

► Available yards percentage is calculated by dividing drive yards earned by available yards measured from starting field position to end zone.

► The Gophers ranked 45th offensively in available yards percentage at .506, while the defense was No. 17 at .380. That gives them a net percentage of .126 that sat 18th among FBS schools.

► Minnesota also ranked 69th in offensive yards per play at 5.57, while the defense was 11th in the FBS at 4.88. The net difference of 0.69 put the team 30th in the FBS and 17th in the Power 5.

GOPHER GRADUATES

THREE DRAFTED IN 2023

► Minnesota had three players selected in the 2023 NFL Draft. That ups its total since 2020 to 14, which is the most draft picks in a four-year span for the Gophers since they also had 14 players picked from 1988-91.

► Center **John Michael Schmitz** was selected in the second round with the 57th overall pick by the New York Giants. **Jordan Howden**, who started his career as a walk-on at Minnesota, was taken in the fifth round with the 146th pick by the New Orleans Saints, while **Terrell Smith** went a few picks later when the Chicago Bears took him with the 165th pick.

► The 2023 draft was the fourth straight draft where Minnesota had an offensive and defensive player selected. The last time that happened was 1975-78.

► Schmitz was the highest Minnesota center to be drafted since 1989 when **Brian Williams** was taken 18th in the first round by the Giants.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

Dating back to a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018, Minnesota has gone 18-6 (.750) away from home, including three bowl wins. It's the best 24-game stretch away from home in team history. Since the date of Minnesota's win at Wisconsin, the only Big Ten team with more wins or a higher win percentage away from home is Ohio State at 21-4 (.840). Below is a list of the 24 Gopher games during the current span.

► Schmitz became the third Minnesota center ever to be drafted in the first two rounds, joining Williams and **Clayton Tonnemaker**, who was drafted fourth overall by the Packers in 1950.

► Schmitz's selection was also notable in that Minnesota has now had offensive lineman drafted in consecutive drafts, as **Daniel Faaalele** was drafted in 2022 in the fourth round by Baltimore. The last time Minnesota had offensive lineman selected in consecutive drafts was 2001-02.

► With Schmitz going in the second round, Minnesota has also had a first or second round pick in four straight drafts. The last time that happened was 1942-45.

► Howden and Smith continued the good fortune of Minnesota defensive backs being drafted, as the Gophers have now had a program-record five defensive backs taken in the last four drafts. Washington took **Benjamin St-Juste** in 2021 and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers selected **Antoine Winfield Jr.**, in 2020, while the New York Giants took **Chris Williamson** the same year.

► This was the third time ever that the Gophers had two defensive backs selected in the same draft, also doing so in 2020 and 1985.

SCORIGAMI

► Scorigami is a concept thought up by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks final scores that have never happened before in NFL history. Inspired by Bois, what follows are the Scorigami results last season for Minnesota football.

► *Minnesota 38, New Mexico State 0.* No scorigami. It's the fourth such score in program history. The Gophers have won by this score three times, most recently in 1975 against Western Michigan.

► *Minnesota 62, Western Illinois 10.* Scorigami achieved! In 1,296 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.

► *Minnesota 49, Colorado 7.* No Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end in this score, all Minnesota victories. The last was in 1998 against Iowa.

► *Minnesota 34, Michigan State 7.* No Scorigami. This was the seventh game in program history to end in this score, with Minnesota winning five of them. The most recent was a victory over Nebraska in 2019.

► *Purdue 20, Minnesota 10.* Scorigami achieved! In 1,299 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.

► *Illinois 26, Minnesota 14.* Partial Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end by this score, most recently a win at Nebraska in 1960. It's the first time Minnesota has lost by the score.

► *Penn State 45, Minnesota 17.* No Scorigami. This was the second game to end by this score with the other being a loss at Purdue in 2011.

► *Minnesota 31, Rutgers 0.* Partial Scorigami. This was the third game in program history to end by this score, but the first in which Minnesota won.

► *Minnesota 20, Nebraska 13.* No Scorigami. This was the seventh game in program history to end by this score, most recently a win at Purdue in 2021. The Gophers have won by the score four times in their history.

► *Minnesota 31, Northwestern 3.* Partial Scorigami. This was the second game in history to end by this score, but the first in which Minnesota won.

► *Iowa 13, Minnesota 10.* Scorigami achieved! In 1,305 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.

► *Minnesota 23, Wisconsin 16.* Scorigami achieved! In 1,306 games in program history, this was the first to end by this score.

► *Minnesota 28, Syracuse 20.* No Scorigami. This was the second game to end by this score with the other being a win over Indiana in 1953.

HEAD COACH // SEVENTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 41, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 74-49 and is 44-27 at Minnesota.

In six years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program. Fleck is already fifth in program history in overall wins (44) and sixth in Big Ten wins (26) and games coached (71). Fleck's .619 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season three times, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 and 2022 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 4-0 in bowl games, and his four bowl wins are the most in school history by a coach (Glen Mason was 3-4 in bowl games at Minnesota).

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached five All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman, John Michael Schmitz and Mohamed Ibrahim twice), nine Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, John Michael Schmitz, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 327 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

The 2022 season saw Minnesota once against post nine wins as the Gophers went 9-4 overall, which included a bowl win against Syracuse and a road win at rival Wisconsin. Minnesota, which went 5-2 at home, 3-2 on the road and 1-0 in neutral site games, was paced by a stout, family-room defense and a bruising offense that featured two All-Americans.

Minnesota ended the season ranked No. 4 in the nation in scoring defense (13.85), No. 5 in third-down conversion defense (.279) and No. 9 in the nation in total defense (295.1 yards per game).

The 13.85 points allowed per game were the fewest that Minnesota has permitted since 1967 when it allowed 10.6 points per game during the 10-game season. Minnesota posted two shutouts during the season (38-0 against New Mexico State and 31-0 against Rutgers), which is had not done since 2006 and the Gophers were the only team in the nation to shutout two FBS teams in 2022 (Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State each had two shutouts, but one each came against an FCS foe).

First-Team All-American center John Michael Schmitz and Second-Team All-American running back Mohamed Ibrahim paced the Gopher offense, which ranked No. 17 in the nation with 207.3 rushing yards per game. With Schmitz anchoring an offensive line that featured four new starters, Ibrahim set single season records in rushing attempts (320), rushing yards (1,665), rushing touchdowns (20), total touchdowns (20), total points (120) and 100-yard rushing games (10).

The 2022 season also saw three Gophers named either a semifinalist, finalist or winner of a national award. Ibrahim was named Comeback Player of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award. Schmitz was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy and was also a semifinalist for the Outland Trophy and the Rotary Lombardi Award. Quarterback Tanner Morgan was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times for 1,076 yards and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history, while the defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season

school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or red-shirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and host an annual diaper drive during training camp and an annual turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

The OAR = The ENERGY! The symbol of strength and purpose. The amount one brings to their life Academically, Athletically, Socially and Spiritually! The only tool that can move the boat forward!

The BOAT = The SACRIFICE! What are you willing to give up for something that you've never had? The more you serve and give, the bigger your boat gets. The bigger your boat gets, the more people you can actually influence. Influence is about the messengers, not just the message.

The COMPASS = The DIRECTION! This is set by the leader of the boat! Whomever you surround yourself with is who and what you will become. Where is the bow of your boat pointed? Your boat will go where you have directed your energy towards!

The **"NEVER GIVE UP"** mantra known as ROW THE BOAT came to life from tragedy, sorrow and heartbreak. This mantra can apply to all walks of life and can be used in every aspect of your life. Everyone, not just athletes and athletic teams can share, use and live the ROW THE BOAT lifestyle in their personal and professional lives. By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. You control whether you ROW fast or slow, confident or hesitant, efficient or rushed and whether you ROW for yourself or others! If you stop rowing, you will not go anywhere. As a team, you control whether all of you want to ROW together with purpose, or ROW because you have to. If you ROW on just one side of the boat, you will go in circles. ROW in unison with everyone else in the boat, no matter the circumstance (chaotic storms or calm seas), you will come out on the other end better and more experienced for never quitting. Getting everyone in the boat to ROW, no matter what circumstances life throws you, can be very difficult; however... keep ROWING!

PAST: When rowing the boat, the only thing you can actually learn from, but can't change, is the horizon you are looking at. With every passing stroke you learn, but can never go back! You aren't able to change the past, only learn from it and take with you the lessons to make you better today. You must embrace and learn from your past to create your future! Changing your best daily will take you places you thought were impossible!

OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.
