FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1 RV/RV Minnesota (2-0) heads out on the road for the first time this season as it visits No. 20/18 North Carolina (2-0) in the first ever meeting between the schools. Saturday's kickoff is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. CT on ESPN.

2 Now 2-0 on the season, the Gophers are looking to start 3-0 for the fifth time in seven years under **P.J. Fleck**. The last instance came a year ago when they started 4-0. Dating back to last season, Minnesota has now won four games in a row. That's tied with Maryland for the second longest active winning streak in the Big Ten behind only Penn State (7).

3 **Darius Taylor** has been named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after a dominant performance against Eastern Michigan. A true freshman, Taylor rushed 33 times for 193 yards and one touchdown in Minnesota's 25-6 win. He had one carry in the season-opener against Nebraska and then carried the ball 33 times against the Eagles. His 193 yards were second most in school history for a true freshman, behind only **Darrell Thompson's** 205 yards against Bowling Green in 1986. Taylor rushed eight times for 44 yards in the first half before logging 25 carries for 149 yards in the second half. His touchdown was a two-yard burst in the second quarter. He had six runs of 10 yards or more, including scampers of 22 yards and 21 yards in the third quarter. He added 13 receiving yards to finish the game with 206 all-purpose yards. Taylor's 193 rushing yards were the second most in the nation in Week 2 (and the most in a non-overtime game) as only North Carolina's Omarion Hampton had more yards with 234 in a double overtime win against Appalachian State. Taylor is Minnesota's first Big Ten Freshman of the Week since quarterback **Athan Kaliakmanis** received the honor on Nov. 28, 2022.

4 Saturday's trip to North Carolina marks the first road game of the season for Minnesota. It is 61-65-9 all-time in road openers, including a 4-2 mark under head coach **P.J. Fleck**. Minnesota has won each of its last two road openers: at Colorado in 2021 and last year at Michigan State. It's the first time since 2012-13 that the Gophers have won consecutive road openers. The 2008-10 seasons mark the last time the Maroon and Gold won three straight road openers.

5 The 2023 campaign is the seventh for head coach **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota, where he holds a record of 46-27. He is already fifth in program history for overall wins and Big Ten wins (27) and sixth in games coached (73). Fleck's .630 win percentage is third best among the Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only **Henry L. Williams** (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 11th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 76-49 (.608).



Darius Taylor ran for 193 yards and a touchdown on 33 carries against Eastern Michigan. Recording the fourth highest rushing total in the FBS this year, Taylor was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

BEST FBS NON-CONFERENCE RECORDS

Since P.J. Fleck arrived in Minnesota in 2017, the Golden Gophers have gone 19-1 against non-conference opponents, including bowl games, which gives the Gophers the second-best win percentage in the FBS in that time.

A WIN WOULD...

- Improve Minnesota to 3-0 for the second straight season and fifth time in seven years under **P.J. Fleck**
- See the Gophers win a road opener for the third straight season for the first time since 2008-10
- Have the Gophers 1-0 all-time against North Carolina
- Mark a third straight win over the ACC and a 17-7 record overall (5-2 on the road) versus the league
- Get the Gophers to 65-21-2 when facing current FBS opponents for the first time
- Push the Gophers' win streak to five games dating to last season and have Minnesota victorious in eight of its last nine contests
- Make Minnesota 7-1 all-time when playing on Sept. 16
- Put the Gophers' non-conference road win streak at five games dating to 2014
- Enhance Fleck's record to 47-27 at Minnesota and 77-49 overall

FACING NORTH CAROLINA

- Minnesota and North Carolina meet for the first time ever Saturday. The Golden Gophers have played 87 different teams currently in the FBS, and they are 64-21-2 when playing those teams for the first time.
- Coupled with last week's game against Eastern Michigan, who Minnesota had also never faced, it's the first time since 2006 (Kent State and Temple) that the Golden Gophers face two brand new FBS opponents in the same regular season.
- All-time against schools in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Golden Gophers are 16-7, including a 4-2 mark in road games. Minnesota has won two straight against ACC teams and four of its past five dating to 2009.
- The last three matchups against ACC foes have all come in bowls, including last year's 28-20 win over Syracuse in the Pinstrip Bowl. The last time Minnesota faced a team from the conference in the regular season was a 17-10 home win over Syracuse in 2012. The Golden Gophers' last regular season road game against the ACC was a 23-20 overtime win at Syracuse in 2009.
- Minnesota has won four straight non-conference road games dating back to 2015, tied for the sixth longest active streak in the country. Only Oklahoma (9), TCU (9), Iowa (7), Oklahoma State (7) and Georgia (6) have longer streaks, while Kentucky is also at four.
- Those non-conference road wins for Minnesota include a 30-0 shutout at Colorado in 2021, a 38-35 double overtime win at Fresno State in 2019, a 48-14 victory at Oregon State in P.J. Fleck's first year at Minnesota in 2017 and a 23-20 overtime win at Colorado State in 2015. The Gophers' last non-conference road loss came at TCU in 2014.

- Sixth-year senior defensive lineman **Chris Collins** spent five years at North Carolina where he played in 46 games and had 68 tackles (33 solo), 12.0 TFLs, 6.5 sacks, one forced fumble and one pass breakup.
- Fellow sixth-year senior defensive lineman **Darnell Jefferies** is the only Gopher to have faced North Carolina. He did so in 2019 while at Clemson, though he did not record any stats.
- Minnesota has two North Carolina natives on its roster. Fifth-year DB **TreVon Jones** is from Warrenton (Trinity Christian HS), which is about an hour and 20 minutes north-east of Chapel Hill. He also played at Elon for four years (more on Page 8). Redshirt freshman DB **Coleman Bryson** hails from Waynesville (Rabun Gap-Nacoochee School), about four hours east of UNC's campus.
- North Carolina has one Minnesotan on its roster in graduate senior offensive lineman Spencer Rolland. He is from Burnsville, went to Apple Valley High School and spent the first four years of college at Harvard.
- Gopher co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Greg Harbaugh** was born in Raleigh, N.C., and attended Sanderson High School. In his coaching career, he spent the 2009-10 seasons as the wide receivers and running backs coach at North Carolina Wesleyan.
- Minnesota tight ends coach **Andrew Sowder** was a student assistant at Baylor from 2009-10, while North Carolina offensive line coach Randy Clements was the Bears' co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach those years.
- North Carolina defensive line coach Tim Cross was associate head coach/defensive line coach at Minnesota from 2007-10.

- North Carolina enters the game with a 2-0 record, defeating South Carolina in the season opener and taking a double-overtime bout with Appalachian State last weekend.
- The Tar Heels are led by dynamic quarterback Drake Maye. He's completed 45-of-62 passes for 477 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions this year. He's also run for 82 yards and a score on 15 carries.
- Omarion Hampton is the team's top rusher at 271 yards and five touchdowns on 42 carries. He's second in the nation in rushing scores and points per game (15.0), third in total touchdowns (5) and fourth with 135.50 yards per game.
- Kobe Paysour has been the top passing target with a team best 15 catches and 139 receiving yards. He has one of UNC's receiving scores along with John Copenhaver, who also has a team-best 17.33 yards per catch.

STRENGTH VS. STRENGTH

Saturday's contest will pit a top-notch Minnesota defense against a high-powered North Carolina offense. Since the beginning of last season, here's how the two units stack up against one another.

- Cedric Gray is the team's leading tackler with 20 so far, while Kaimon Rucker has a team's best 5.5 tackles for loss. Rucker also has 2.0 sacks, tying with Amari Gainer for the team lead. In the secondary, Don Chapman has North Carolina's lone interception this season, while Marcus Allen has a team-high three pass breakups.
- Ryan Coe has gone 3-of-4 on field goals and made all eight extra points, while Ben Kiernan is averaging 43.8 yards per punt.

LAST TIME VS. THE ACC

- With assistance from the AP: **Mohamed Ibrahim** rushed for 71 yards on 16 carries with a touchdown and became Minnesota's all-time rushing leader in the Golden Gophers' 28-20 win over Syracuse in the Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium on Dec. 29 last season.
- Ibrahim broke the school record held by **Darrell Thompson** (4,654 yards from 1986-89) on a 10-yard gain with about 2 1/2 minutes left in the first half. Before breaking the record, Ibrahim scored a gritty 4-yard run with 13:39 remaining in the half before sitting out the final periods. The TD gave him 20 and moved him past **Gary Russell** (19 in 2005) for the most single-season TDs in school history.
- **Daniel Jackson** hauled in a pair of TD passes — a 20-yard reception in the second and a 25-yard grab in the final minute of the third.
- **Athan Kaliakmanis** started at QB for Minnesota and completed 7 of 9 passes for 80 yards before being helped off the field with an injury. **Tanner Morgan** made his first appearance since Nov. 5 and completed 4 of 7 passes for 58 yards.
- Syracuse ended what was a promising season on a down note, playing without running back Sean Tucker, who declared for the NFL draft on Dec. 17. Syracuse's offense totaled 477 yards, but struggled at times as the Orange lost six of their final seven games after a 6-0 start elevated them to No. 14 in The Associated Press Top 25 Poll.
- LeQuint Allen replaced Tucker and finished with 103 yards on 16 carries. Garret Shrader faced constant pressure and completed 32 of 51 passes for 329 yards. He ran for both of Syracuse's TDs, but overthrew receivers at times.

- Ibrahim opened the scoring and nearly took a tackler with him up the middle with 13:39 left in the second quarter for a 7-0 lead. After Kaliakmanis was injured, Jackson made a leaping catch in the right corner of the end zone seven minutes later.
- Shrader's run moved Syracuse within 14-7 by halftime, and a 40-yard field goal by Andre Szymt made it 14-10 early in the third. The Golden Gophers took a 21-10 lead when Coleman Bryson stepped in front of a pass intended for Oronde Gadsden II and returned the interception 70 yards.
- Jackson's second TD put Minnesota up 28-13 with 38 seconds left in the third. Syracuse caught a break when Allen lost a fumble, but it was negated due to Minnesota having 12 men on the field. Shrader scrambled from eight yards out with 2 1/2 minutes remaining.

RECAPING EASTERN MICHIGAN

- With assistance from the AP: Darius Taylor ran for 193 of Minnesota's 296 yards and a touchdown, and the Gophers pulled away in the second half to beat Eastern Michigan 25-6 Saturday night.
- Sean Tyler added 93 yards on the ground for Minnesota, which had just 55 rushing yards in last week's season-opening 13-10 win against Nebraska.
- Early in the year, Minnesota is seeking how to best replace Mohamed Ibrahim, the school's all-time leading rusher. Sixth-year running back Bryce Williams did not play, leaving plenty of opportunities for Tyler and Taylor.
- A dynamic 1-2 punch against the Eagles, the duo combined for 48 yards during an 11-play, 93-yard second-quarter drive — aided by two pass interference penalties on Eastern Michigan — before Taylor scored from the 2.
- The pair added 67 yards during a 75-yard third-quarter drive that ended in a short field goal. Taylor had 28 yards on a later drive capped by a 1-yard sneak from Athan Kaliakmanis for a 19-6 lead.
- Eastern Michigan, a program with four wins over Power Five teams since 2017, got 73 rushing yards from Samson Evans. Austin Smith was 9-of-20 passing for 71 yards. Jesús Gómez had 20- and 37-yard field goals. In the second half alone, Eastern Michigan was held to just 4 yards on 14 plays (17 passing, -3 rushing).
- Eli Mau blocked a punt in the fourth quarter that went out of the back of the end zone for a safety. It was the first blocked punt for the Gophers since Preston Jelen against Michigan in 2020. - Chris Autman-Bell needs 30 receiving yards to get to 2,000 for his career, which would make him the ninth player at Minnesota to reach the milestone. He also needs five receptions to tie Drew Wolitarsky and Omar Douglas for 10th all-time.
- Brevyn Spann-Ford is six catches behind Ben Utech (83) for second all-time among Minnesota tight ends. Spann-Ford also needs 11 receiving yards to tie Jay Carroll (883), father of Minnesota fifth-year senior offensive lineman Quinn Carroll, for fifth among Gopher TEs and 128 to reach 1,000 for his career.

- Sitting at 1,874 career receiving yards, including 1,761 from his time at Western Michigan, Corey Crooms Jr. is 126 away from 2,000 for his career.
- Holding 1,333 career receiving yards, including 1,324 recorded at Charlotte, Elijah Spencer needs 167 to hit 1,500 for his career.
- With 10 career interceptions, one more would move Tyler Nubin into a four-way tie for third in Gopher annals.

IN THE POLLS

- Minnesota is receiving votes in both of the latest polls from the Associated Press and Coaches, ranking ninth among those receiving votes in the AP and 20th among those receiving votes by the coaches.
- Six opponents appear in the Sept. 10 polls, with four ranked. Michigan was No. 2 in both polls, while Ohio State was ranked 6th by the AP and 4th by the Coaches. Meanwhile, while North Carolina was 20th according to the AP and 18th via the Coaches and Iowa was ranked 25th by the AP and 24th by the coaches.
- In addition, Wisconsin was ahead of Minnesota in both polls among those teams receiving votes, while Michigan State rounded out the coaches' receiving votes section.
- With North Carolina ranked 20th in the AP Poll, Saturday is the first game this season for Minnesota against a team ranked in the AP Top 25. The Gophers are looking to snap a 12-game losing streak to ranked opponents on the road, last winning at then-No. 21 Nebraska in 2014. The team's last top-20 road win came at then-No. 6 Ohio State in 2000. Saturday is the 14th game all-time where Minnesota plays at a ranked non-conference opponent. The Gophers are looking for their first win in such games.
- 2023 year marks the 12th season that Minnesota was ranked or receiving votes in the preseason AP Poll, including four of the past five years, according to CollegePollArchive.com. The Gophers are looking to start and finish the year in the AP Poll for the third time in program history and first time in consecutive years.
- Four of Minnesota's 2023 opponents were ranked in both preseason polls, while two appeared in one each.
- The five opponents in the preseason AP Poll were tied for the most in the country along with 11 other teams.

OPPORTUNISTIC SCHEDULE

- Minnesota faces one of the most difficult, or opportunistic, schedules in the FBS this year. On3.com ranked it in the preseason as the second toughest slate, while Phil Steele had it seventh.
- Minnesota's 2023 opponents combined to go 89-67 in 2022. Seven teams won at least eight games last year, four won at least nine and Michigan (13) and Ohio State (11) each reached double digits.
- Gopher opponents in 2023 posted a .571 win percentage last year, that ranks third in the Big Ten behind Michigan State (.627) and Ohio State (.610). However, both of those teams do face one FCS opponent this year.
- Nine of the Gophers' 2023 opponents played in a bowl game last year, including Michigan, which reached the College Football Playoff. No Big Ten team faces more teams that made a bowl game last year than the Gophers.
- This will be the first time since 2015 that the Gophers face Michigan and Ohio State in the same season.

ATTENDANCE SOARING

- Asking fans in attendance to form a Gold Out, Minnesota played its season opener in front of a sellout crowd of 53,629. It was the fifth largest crowd in Huntington Bank Stadium history.
- The sellout was the first for Minnesota since the 2021 season opener, the fourth during P.J. Fleck's tenure, and the 20th since the stadium opened in 2009.

► Minnesota followed that up in Week 2 with a crowd of 48,101, the largest attendance for the second home game of a season since 2015.

► The total attendance of 101,730 through two games ranks 18th nationally and is the best consecutive-game total at Minnesota since the final game of 2019 and first game of 2021 saw a combined crowd of 104,561 (fans weren't allowed in 2020 due to COVID)

► It's the best start to a season attendance-wise since 2015 featured a total attendance of 106,970 fans for its first two home games.

KESICH, NUBIN TAKE B1G HONORS

► **Dragan Kesich** was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week, while **Tyler Nubin** was tabbed B1G Defensive Player of the Week for their performances against Nebraska. It was the first Big Ten player of the week recognition for each player.

► Kesich kicked the game-winning 47-yard field goal with zero time remaining on the clock to break a 10-10 tie and lift Minnesota to a three-point victory. It was his second field goal of the game, as he opened the scoring for the Gophers with a 34-yard field goal in the second quarter. Nubin recorded two interceptions, one in each half. His second interception came with less than a minute left in the game and was returned 14 yards. A few plays later, Kesich kicked the winning field goal. Nubin also added three tackles in the win.

► Kesich was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since **Matthew Trickett** received the honor in November 2022 after making two field goals in a 20-13 win at Nebraska.

► Nubin was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week since **Mariano Sori-Marin** was recognized in December 2020 after making 18 tackles in a 24-17 win at Nebraska. He was the first Minnesota defensive back to earn the honor since **Antoine Winfield Jr.**, did so in November 2019 after recording two interceptions and 11 tackles in a win against Penn State.

► With Kesich and Nubin being honored, this was the first time that Minnesota had two players recognized in the same week by the Big Ten since 2019 when Winfield (defensive player of the week) and **Tanner Morgan** (offensive player of the week) were feted after Minnesota beat Penn State.

► This was also the first time that Minnesota had players win Special Teams Player of the Week and Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same week since 2018 when Winfield (defensive) and kicker **Emmit Carpenter** (special teams) earned the awards after a 21-14 home win against Fresno State.

OFFENSIVE VERSATILITY

► Minnesota has shown the ability to take what the defense gives it, adjust its gameplan accordingly and come out with a victory.

► Against Nebraska in the season opener, the Golden Gophers threw the ball 44 times with 25 rushes. It was unusual in that one would have to go back to the Wisconsin game in 2015 to find the last time they threw the ball at least 19 more times than they ran it.

► Last week against Eastern Michigan, the Gophers returned to a style of play fans are more accustomed to with 56 rushes versus 15 passes. It was the 20th time under **P.J. Fleck** that Minnesota ran the ball at least 50 times in a game.

► Add it all up, and Minnesota is the only team in the country this year to win a game while throwing 40+ passes and also win a game with 50+ rushing attempts.

KALIAKMANIS' TURN AT QB

► With **Tanner Morgan** departing the program after six seasons, redshirt sophomore **Athan Kaliakmanis** is the starting quarterback for Minnesota in 2023.

► In two games in 2023, Kaliakmanis has completed 34-of-59 passes for 313 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions. Of his 25 incompletions, five have been deemed "drops" by Pro Football Focus.

► In the season opener, Kaliakmanis was 24-of-44 for 196 yards and a touchdown with one interception. His completion total was a career high and the most for a Gopher since Morgan completed 25 passes at Iowa in 2019. Kaliakmanis' 44 attempts were also a career best and the most at Minnesota since **Mitch Leidner** attempted the same number at Ohio State in 2015.

► Kaliakmanis played in 11 games with five starts last year as Morgan missed time due to injury. Kaliakmanis was 60-of-111 (54.1%) for 846 yards with three touchdowns and four interceptions for a rating of 127.4.

► Looking just at his five starts last year, Kaliakmanis' numbers improved to 49-of-88 (55.7%) for 725 yards with three touchdowns and two picks for a rating of 131.6.

► In the final game of the regular season against Wisconsin and bowl game against Syracuse (which he left in the second quarter due to injury), he was even better. He completed 26 of 38 passes (68.4%) for 399 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 173.99 rating.

► When Morgan was injured at Illinois last year, it was Kaliakmanis who came on in relief. He completed two of his six passes for 17 yards and threw the first two interceptions of his career.

► Kaliakmanis then made his first career start at Penn State's White Out in place of the injured Morgan, completing 9-of-22 passes for 175 yards with one touchdown and one interception, and rushing seven times for 45 yards. Over the last 45 seasons, 31 QBs have started for the Gophers. Kaliakmanis' 19.4 yards per completion ranked third best among those signal-callers in their debut.

► The last Gopher quarterback to make his first career start on the road before Kaliakmanis was **Conor Rhoda** at Maryland on Oct. 15, 2016, while the last Gopher QB to make his first career start against a ranked team was **MarQueis Gray** at then-No. 25 USC on Sept. 3, 2011. With Penn State ranked 16th, Kaliakmanis' start was against the highest ranked opponent for a first start since **Andy Persby** started against then-No. 13 Penn State on Oct. 10, 1998.

► Kaliakmanis also replaced an injured Morgan in the second half at Nebraska, completing 6-of-12 passes for 137 yards and rushing three times for 27 yards. Minnesota was down 10-0 when Kaliakmanis entered the game and he helped lead the Gophers to a 20-13 victory.

► Kaliakmanis then started the final four games of the season, including a masterful performance in the regular season finale against Wisconsin that saw him win Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.

► In a 23-16 comeback win in Madison, Kaliakmanis set career highs in completions (19 - since been passed), attempts (29 - since been passed), passing yards (319) and touchdowns (2). He completed nine passes of 15 yards or more and averaged 16.8 yards per completion, as Minnesota rallied from a 16-13 fourth-quarter deficit to retain Paul Bunyan's Axe.

► The Kaliakmanis-led offense finished with 416 yards of total offense (319 passing and 97 rushing), which was the most yards for the Gophers against the Badgers since racking up 501 yards in 2007.

JACKSON STEPS UP

► The team's top receiver last year, **Daniel Jackson** has picked up right where he left off with team highs in targets (20), targets per game (10.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (110), touchdown receptions (1), yards after catch (41) and YAC per game (20.5).

► In the season opener against Nebraska, Jackson posted career highs in targets (16) and receptions (9) and led the team in receiving yards (68) and touchdown receptions (1).

► Most of his production came in the second half against the Huskers where he turned 12 targets, including nine in the fourth quarter alone, into six catches for 41 yards and a highlight-reel 13-yard touchdown catch on fourth down to tie the game with 2:32 to play.

► Last year Jackson led the team with 5.5 targets per game, 557 receiving yards and five touchdown receptions. It was the most yards for a Gopher since 2019.

► He was also second in overall targets (60), receptions (37), receiving yards per game (50.6) and yards after catch (187), and third in YAC per game (17.0).

► He recorded three catches for 42 yards and two touchdowns at Michigan State for the first multi-TD game of his career. The next week against Purdue, he posted a career-high 110 receiving yards on six receptions, including a career-long 66 yard gain.

► Jackson recorded his second multi-TD game of his career in the bowl game with four catches for 73 yards and two score in the Pinstripe Bowl win over Syracuse.

► Jackson was the team's leading receiver six times last season, most on the squad.

TOP TIGHT END TARGET

► A preseason All-American by PFF and a member of the Mackey Award Watch List, **Brevyn Spann-Ford** is one of the top tight ends in the country.

► He currently ranks third on the team in receptions (7), receiving yards (50) and receiving yards per game (25.0).

► In the season opener, he tied a career high with eight targets and posted five catches for 45 yards.

► Last year he led the team in targets (61), receptions (42), yards after catch (245) and YAC per game (18.8), and he was second in receiving yards (497) and touchdown receptions (2).

► His 42 receptions were second most in Gophers history for a tight end, while his 497 receiving yards were fifth best. He became the first tight end to lead the team in receptions since **Maxx Williams** in 2014, while the reception total was the highest for a Gopher since 2019.

► Spann-Ford was targeted at least two times in every game last year, the only Gopher to make that claim. He was also the only Minnesota player to have a catch in every game in 2022.

► At Wisconsin, he set career highs in receptions and receiving yards as he had seven catches for 95 yards.

► According to PFF, Spann-Ford ranked as the No. 3 tight end in the country last year with an overall grade of 90.0, and he was the No. 5 run-blocking tight end at 82.5.

CROOMS JR. FITTING RIGHT IN

► Just two games into his Gophers career, **Corey Crooms Jr.** has already emerged as a top target of **Athan Kaliakmanis**, ranking second on the team in targets (16), targets per game (8.0), receptions (10), receiving yards (108), receiving yards per game (54.0), yards per catch (10.8), yards after catch (33) and YAC per game (16.5).

► Against Nebraska, Crooms Jr. was second on the team in targets (13), receptions (7), receiving yards (63) and yards after catch (13).

► According to PFF, his offensive grade and receiving grade are both 73.4. The former is best among wide receivers on the team, while the latter is tops on the team and 11th in the Big Ten.

► Crooms Jr., who has one year of eligibility left, spent the past four seasons at Western Michigan. He made 115 catches for 1,766 yards and 12 touchdowns in 42 career games with the Broncos.

► He had 57 catches for 814 yards and five touchdowns last season, including five 100-yard receiving games as he was named Second Team All-MAC. He ranked fifth in 2022 in the MAC with a receiving grade of 75.8 from PFF.

YEAR 7 FOR NO. 7

► Seventh-year wide receiver **Chris Autman-Bell** suffered a season-ending lower leg injury last year against Colorado, missing the final 10 games of 2022. However, he was back in the starting lineup for the season opener against Nebraska, though he missed the Eastern Michigan game.

► Autman-Bell played just one snap against the Huskers and saw his streak of games with at least one catch end at 41. It was the third longest active FBS streak and the second longest streak in school history behind **Ron Johnson's** Big Ten record streak of 46 games.

► Through three games last year (before his injury) Autman-Bell was leading the team in targets (15), targets per game (5.0), receptions (11), receiving yards (214), receiving yards per game (71.3) and yards per catch (19.5), and was tied for the lead in touchdown catches (1).

► Autman-Bell has played in 48 career games with 125 catches (12th in program history) for 1,970 yards (9th) and 13 TDs (T-13th).

BROCKINGTON LOOKING TO KEEP BREAKING THROUGH

► The regular season finale last year at Wisconsin was a breakout game for wideout **Le'Meke Brockington**, then a redshirt freshman.

► Brockington had his second consecutive multi-reception game as he caught two passes for a career-high 52 yards. His 45-yard touchdown reception with 3:40 to play was the first of his career and turned out to be the game-winner as it broke a 16-16 tie.

► Brockington, who made four starts last year, was targeted just 20 times, but 11 of those came in the last three games. In addition, six of his 11 receptions on the year came in the final three contests.

► He's been targeted four times this season and has one catch for 12 yards.

NEW FACES BOOST SKILL GROUPS

► Of the 11 transfers Minnesota brought in this off-season, three are on offense and they're aiming to boost the skill positions.

► Like the aforementioned Crooms Jr., running back **Sean Tyler** came in from Western Michigan with one year of eligibility left, while wideout **Elijah Spencer** joined the Gophers from Charlotte with two to play. All three were early enrollees in January.

► Tyler has started each of the first two games and is second on the team in rushing attempts (27), rushing yards (134), yards per rush (5.0) and rushing yards per game (67.0). His seven runs of 10+ yards this year lead the Big Ten.

► Against Eastern Michigan, Tyler rushed for a season-high 93 yards on 17 carries.

► He was Crooms Jr.'s teammate the last four years at WMU, rushing 495 times for 2,820 yards (5.7 avg.) and 23 touchdowns, catching 43 passes for 338 yards and three scores, and averaging 23.9 yards on 40 kickoff returns with three touchdowns in 42 career games with the Broncos. He also had 10 100-yard rushing games.

► In 2022, Tyler was named Second Team All-MAC as he led the conference and ranked ninth nationally with 146.83 all-purpose yards per game. He rushed 209 times for 1,097 yards and seven touchdowns and caught 12 passes for 111 yards and another score.

► Crooms Jr., and Tyler both have familiarity with Gophers co-OC and quarterbacks coach **Greg Harbaugh**, who was WMU's wide receivers coach from 2021-22.

► Spencer, who caught one pass for nine yards against Nebraska, played the last two seasons at Charlotte where he made 85 catches for 1,324 yards and 15 touchdowns. Last season he hauled in 57 catches for 943 yards and nine touchdowns and was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. He was the fifth-ranked WR in Conference USA with a grade of 81.0 from PFF.

► In 2021, Spencer recorded 28 receptions for 381 yards and six touchdowns en route to being named Conference USA Freshman of the Year and a member of the Conference USA All-Freshman Team.

TAYLOR, TYLER TAKE RB REINS

► Minnesota's all-time leading rusher and backfield mainstay **Mohamed Ibrahim** has graduated, leaving carries up to old and new faces in the running backs room.

► So far **Sean Tyler** (previous note) and **Darius Taylor** have grabbed the reins of the running back room.

► Taylor leads the team in rushes (34), rushing yards (196), rushing yards per game (98.0) and yards per carry (5.8) and is tied for the lead with one rushing score.

► Taylor made his Gopher debut with one carry for three yards against Nebraska and followed that with a monster performance against Eastern Michigan, rushing for 193 yards and a touchdown on 33 carries.

► As noted on Page 1, it's the fourth best rushing performance of the season in the FBS, the second best against an FBS team and the top effort by a freshman. So far, Taylor and Louisiana Tech's Keith Willis Jr. (188) are the only freshmen to rush for at least 127 yards this year.

► Taylor's offensive grade of 79.2 leads all Big Ten running backs this year and his rushing grade of 77.1 is third. His six runs of 10+ yards trail only Tyler among players in the Big Ten.

► Taylor, who was high school teammates with fellow freshman QB **Drew Viotto** at Lake Western High School in Walled Lake, Mich., was ranked by Rivals as a four-star prospect, the No. 6 player in Michigan and the No. 12 running back in the nation. A January enrollee at Minnesota, Taylor rushed 268 times for 2,450 yards and 36 touchdowns a senior.

O-LINE RELOADS

► Minnesota has used the same starting lineup on the offensive line through two games with **Aireontae Ersery** at left tackle, **Tyler Cooper** at left guard, **Nathan Boe** at center, **Martes Lewis** at right guard and **Quinn Carroll** at right tackle.

► Ersery is the top graded lineman for Minnesota so far this year at 71.0, while Carroll (69.9), Lewis (68.2) and Cooper (67.1) aren't far behind. Lewis is the top-graded run blocker at 67.6, while Carroll's pass blocking grade of 87.5 leads the team and is sixth in the Big Ten.

► As a unit, the Gophers are 35th with 4.5 tackles for loss allowed this year, and they are 72nd by allowing 2.0 sacks per game. The sack yardage lost is only 13 yards though, ranking 43rd.

► Minnesota, which boasts 59 career starts on the offensive line, is aiming to replace three of its five starters from a year ago. The Golden Gophers used the same starting five on the offensive line in the first 12 games of last season with Eersery at left tackle, **Axel Ruschmeyer** at left guard, **John Michael Schmitz** at center, **Chuck Filiaga** at right guard and Carroll at right tackle. Boe replaced Schmitz at center for the bowl game.

► Schmitz, an All-American and second round pick in the NFL Draft, as well as Ruschmeyer and Filiaga, both of whom earned All-Big Ten honors, have since moved on.

► The unit gave up just 15 sacks in 13 games, tied for 20th in the country in fewest sacks allowed. The rate of 1.15 sacks allowed per game tied for 18th. Minnesota had six games last year with zero sacks allowed and only had two games where it allowed more than two sacks (3.0 at Nebraska and Wisconsin).

► The Gophers were also tied for 22nd with 57 tackles for loss given up last year. The rate of 4.39 TFLs allowed per game tied for 20th in the FBS. The 57 TFLs resulted in a loss of 192 yards, tied for the 14th fewest last year.

► While the unit may lack the number of starts as in years past, it is certainly not a young group, but rather a group that has considerable experience in the program. Of the 20 offensive linemen on the Minnesota roster, half are entering their third year at least at Minnesota, while 18 having at least two years of eligibility remaining.

GOPHERS 'D' AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota has boasted one of the best defenses in the nation under defensive coordinator **Joe Rossi** over the last few seasons.

► The Gophers have already established themselves as a top unit in 2023, ranking eighth in total defense (223.5 ypg), third in pass yards allowed (92.5), fifth in opponent pass efficiency (79.08) and sixth in interceptions (4).

► Against Nebraska, the Gophers held the Huskers to 295 yards of total offense, including 114 through the air. In addition, the Golden Gophers forced four Nebraska turnovers (3 INTs, 1 fumble) in the opener. It was the most turnovers forced in a game by the Gophers since forcing Wisconsin into four giveaways in 2018. The three interceptions were the team's most since hitting that same number against Penn State in 2019.

► Minnesota followed that up in Week 2 against Eastern Michigan with just 81 rush yards and 71 pass yards. It was the third time since the start of last season that Minnesota held an opponent under both 100 yards rushing and passing, most in the FBS.

► Minnesota leads the Big Ten this year with five turnovers forced (four interceptions, one fumble recovery).

► Last year, the Golden Gophers ranked eighth in the country by allowing 295.1 total yards per contest. They also had the No. 4 defense in terms of scoring (13.8 ppg), and No. 15 in passing yards allowed (186.1) and rush defense (109.0). Minnesota, Air Force, Illinois, and Iowa were the only teams in the FBS that ranked in the top 20 in each of those categories.

► Since the start of the 2021 season, Minnesota has held 19 teams below 300 yards of offense in a game, tied with Georgia for the most in the FBS in that span.

► Minnesota has held a team below 100 yards passing eight times since the start of the 2021 season, tied for the most in the country in that span.

► Since the start of the 2021 season, the Gophers have held 20 opponents to 16 points or fewer, second most in the nation behind only Georgia (23).

► Saturday marked the eighth time since the start of 2022 that Minnesota has held an opponent to 10 points or less. That's tied for third in the country in that time frame.

SACK NUMBERS WAY UP

► Despite having one of the top defenses in the country last season, one area the unit struggled was sacking the quarterback. The Gophers ranked 117th nationally and last in the Big Ten in 2022 with 1.46 sacks per game.

► Through two games, the Gophers are at 3.5 per game after registering 3 against Nebraska and then 4 versus Eastern Michigan. That puts Minnesota tied for 16th nationally and tied for third in the conference.

► Minnesota hasn't had a stretch of 7.0 sacks over two games since early in 2021 when it had 4.0 in three straight contests against Colorado, Bowling Green and Purdue.

► Those 7.0 sacks this year are divided up among six players. **Kyler Baugh** leads the team with 2.0 sacks, both against EMU, while **Maverick Baranowski**, **Tre'Von Jones**, **Jah Joyner**, **Jalen Logan-Redding** and **Danny Striggow** each have 1.0.

NUBIN BACK FOR ONE MORE

► Coming off a year where he earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors, safety **Tyler Nubin** is back for a fifth season at Minnesota in 2023.

► All the preseason love that **Tyler Nubin** received, which included watch list appearances for the Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy and Thorpe Award, and preseason All-American honors by The Athletic, Sporting News and Phil Steele, was backed up by his performance in the season opener against Nebraska.

► In addition to his three tackles and two interceptions, Nubin was graded by Pro Football Focus at 91.5 overall on defense. That ranked 16th out of over 3,600 FBS players, second overall in the Big Ten, and No. 3 among all safeties. His coverage grade of 92.5 was the best among safeties in the country, tops of any player in the Big Ten, the second best for defensive backs and fourth overall in the nation.

► On the season, Nubin has five tackles and two interceptions. His defensive grade of 84.2 from PFF leads the Gophers, is 11th in the Big Ten overall, third among B1G safeties and 15th among all FBS safeties.

- ▶ Nubin's coverage grade of 90.3 is fourth in the Big Ten and tied for fifth nationally.
- ▶ He led the team last year with four interceptions, a career high. After tying for the team lead in interceptions in 2020 (1) and 2021 (3), Nubin joined **Keith Edwards** (1977-79) as the only Gophers since 1961 to lead the team in interceptions three years in row.
- ▶ Nubin, who played in and started 12 of 13 games a year ago, was fourth on the team with 55 tackles, and he had 2.0 tackles for loss, three pass breakups and a forced fumble. He had a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.0 for loss, at Illinois.
- ▶ He was ninth last year among Big Ten safeties, and is No. 3 among safeties returning, with an overall defensive grade of 76.4 from PFF. In addition, he ranked second with a rush defense grade of 83.4, ninth with a 76.5 tackling grade and 12th with a coverage grade of 72.6.
- ▶ Also according to PFF, he allowed only 7 receptions on 20 targets for a reception percentage of 35.0. That led all Big Ten safeties and was fourth in the FBS.

- ▶ Junior defensive back **Justin Walley** has been one of the top corners in the Big Ten ever since he earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team in 2021 and was PFF's highest graded true freshman cornerback.
- ▶ He's third on the team with nine tackles, while his two pass breakups and one forced fumble lead Minnesota.
- ▶ Walley's run defense grade from PFF of 92.7 leads all cornerbacks and is fourth nationally among all defenders.
- ▶ In the opener against Nebraska, he set a career high with eight tackles and forced a crucial fumble in the fourth quarter that led to a game-tying touchdown for Minnesota.
- ▶ Last year, he started all 13 games at cornerback and has 39 tackles with three pass breakups and a forced fumble. He was second on the team with three interceptions and one fumble recovery.
- ▶ He ranked 11th last year among Big Ten cornerbacks with an overall PFF grade of 77.6. Among returning CBs, he ranked fifth. His coverage grade of 80.1 was eighth-best last year and fourth among returners. He allowed only 9.5 yards per reception, tied for fifth best in 2022 in the Big Ten, while his NFL passer rating against mark of 48.6 was also fifth in the conference, according to PFF.
- ▶ At Michigan State, Walley had three tackles, plus an interception and a fumble recovery. Since at least 2000, he was just the third Gopher to have an interception and fumble recovery in the same game (**Jalen Myrick** at Purdue in 2015, **Mario Reese** vs. Iowa in 2006).
- ▶ He picked up his second interception of the season at Penn State and returned it 37 yards to set up a Minnesota field goal. At the time, it was the longest interception return for a Gopher since **Coney Durr's** 72-yard pick six versus Maryland on Oct. 26, 2019.
- ▶ His 65 interception yards last year tied for ninth most at Minnesota since 2000.

LINDENBERG'S TURN TO LEAD

- ▶ With the graduation of linebacker **Mariano Sori-Marin**, the team's leading tackler, eyes turn to redshirt junior **Cody Lindenberg** to lead the linebacking corps.
- ▶ Lindenberg, who missed the first two games of the year due to injury, was second on the team last season with 71 tackles and fourth with 4.0 tackles for loss. He also had 1.0 sacks, two pass breakups and a QB hurry.
- ▶ Lindenberg played in all 13 games with starts in the final six contests. In that stretch, he posted a team-high 45 tackles.

- ▶ He led or tied for the team lead in tackles seven times last season, including a career-high 11 tackles in the bowl win over Syracuse.

NEW NAMES AT LB

- ▶ As **Cody Lindenberg** sat out the first two game due to injury, some new names and faces have gotten significant snaps at linebacker.
- ▶ Redshirt sophomore **Devon Williams** and redshirt freshman **Maverick Baranowski** have started each game, while sixth-year transfer **Ryan Selig** (more on him in the note below) also started against Nebraska.
- ▶ Baranowski is tied for the team lead with 14 tackles and is third with 1.5 tackles for loss. He's also got 1.0 sacks on the year and a pass breakup.
- ▶ Baranowski is second on the team to only Nubin in PFF defensive grade at 77.7 and pass coverage at 74.1. Baranowski's pass rush grade of 77.2 is bested only by that of Williams' 80.1, which is third in the Big Ten among linebackers.
- ▶ Selig has six tackles on the season with one quarterback hurry.

SEVEN ADDED TO DEFENSE

- ▶ Seven of Minnesota's 11 transfers this year come on defense with defensive lineman **Chris Collins**, linebackers **Ryan Selig** and **Rowan Zolman** and defensive backs **Tyler Bride**, **Jack Henderson**, **TreVon Jones** and **Craig McDonald**.
- ▶ Collins (more on him on Page 2), Jones and Selig each have one year of eligibility left, Bride and Henderson have two, and McDonald and Zolman have three.
- ▶ Jones is tied for the team lead with 14 tackles and tied for second with 1.0 sacks, one interception and one pass breakup. Playing in both games, including a start against Eastern Michigan, Henderson has five tackles.
- ▶ Collins has played in both games, Bride has appeared in one without either recording any stats. Zolman and McDonald are waiting to make their debuts.
- ▶ Jones called Elon home the last four years. He played in 38 games with 27 starts and finished his Phoenix career with 185 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, nine pass break-ups, three interceptions, five fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 22 punt returns for 185 yards. He was named Third-Team All-CAA in 2021 and 2022 and was a 2019 Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American.
- ▶ Selig was teammates with fellow transfers **Corey Crooms Jr.**, and **Sean Tyler** at Western Michigan. In five years with the Broncos, Selig recorded 154 tackles (88 solo), 13.0 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and three pass breakups in 45 career games with the Broncos.
- ▶ Henderson competed at Southeastern Louisiana for the last three years and played in 33 career games. He recorded 163 career tackles (93 solo), 12 tackles for loss, two sacks, 13 pass breakups, six interceptions, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. According to PFF, his 12 pressures last year were three more than any other FCS cornerback, while his nine hurries also led all CBs.
- ▶ Bride was at Georgia Southern the last three years where he played in 30 games with 15 starts and saw nearly 1,200 snaps on defense and special teams. He had 82 tackles, 9.0 TFLs, 2.0 sacks, two interceptions, 16 pass breakups and a fumble recovery with the Eagles.
- ▶ Zolman played the 2022 season at Miami (OH) where he saw action in nine games, making one start. He finished the season with six tackles and an interception.

FEWEST POINTS ALLOWED

The 16 points allowed through two games are the second fewest for Minnesota over the last 21 years.

2022: 10 (0 vs. New Mexico St., 10 vs. Western Illinois)

2023: 16 (10 vs. Nebraska, 6 vs. Eastern Michigan)

2003: 17 (10 vs. Tulsa, 7 vs. Troy)

2017: 21 (7 vs. Buffalo, 14 vs. Oregon State)

2018: 24 (10 vs. New Mexico St., 14 vs. Fresno State)

► Minnesota is the third stop for McDonald after he spent 2022 at Auburn, where he played in two games, and the 2020-21 campaigns at Iowa State, where appearing in 17 games with three starts over two seasons.

STOPPING THE EXPLOSIVE PLAY

► One key for success last year for the Minnesota defense was the ability to prevent explosive plays. So far in 2023 the Gophers have continued that trend.

► Only 14 plays from scrimmage against Minnesota have gone for more than 10 yards this year, tied for sixth in the FBS. The Gophers have only given up one play from scrimmage of 30+ yards, tied for seventh nationally.

► Minnesota's pass defense has really done the job, holding teams to just six passes of more than 10 yards, tied with Air Force for best in the country.

► Last year, the Maroon and Gold yielded just 130 plays of 10 yards or more from scrimmage, ninth best in the FBS, while only 41 plays from scrimmage went for more than 20 yards, eighth best in the country.

► The 19 plays allowed of 30+ yards tied for 19th, but Minnesota was tied for third in the nation by giving up only four plays from scrimmage of at least 40 yards.

► The Golden Gophers' 86 pass plays allowed of 10 yards or more tied for ninth in the nation, while the 33 passes of more than 20 yards tied for 23rd. The Gophers tied for fourth by allowing only three pass plays of 40+ yards, and they were one of 15 programs that did not give up more than one pass play longer than 50 yards.

► The longest pass play for a Gopher foe was 58 yards, while only eight runs went for longer than 20 yards (tied for 10th fewest in the nation).

SHOUTOUT FOR THE SHOUTOUTS

► Minnesota had two shutouts last season, a 38-0 win over New Mexico State in the season opener and a 31-0 victory against Rutgers on Oct. 29. It was the first time Minnesota recorded two shutouts in a season since 2006 and the second time doing so since 1977.

► Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State were the only other programs with two shutouts in 2022, but each had one against an FCS foe, making Minnesota the only team to shut out two FBS teams last year.

► Coupled with a 30-0 shutout at Colorado in 2021, Minnesota joins Georgia (5), Fresno State (3), Kansas State (3), Penn State (3) and UAB (3) as the only programs with at least three shutouts in the past three years.

► The shutout of Rutgers was the Gophers' first Big Ten shutout victory since a 45-0 win versus Illinois on Oct. 23, 2004. The Gophers limited Rutgers to just 134 total yards (86 passing, 48 rushing), seven first downs, and 2-of-10 conversions on third down. RU averaged just 3.0 yards per play and 2.3 yards per rush.

KESICH ADDS FIELD GOALS TO KICKOFF PROWESS

► Dragan Kesich spent the last two seasons as the Gophers' kickoff specialist, but has added field goal duties this year with the graduation of Matthew Trickett.

► As noted on Page 4, he kicked the first two field goals of his career against Nebraska, including a game-winning 47-yarder as time expired.

► He followed that up against Eastern Michigan with a 3-3 performance on field goals, connecting from 19, 20 and 24 yards.

► Kesich is tied for fourth in the country with five made field goals. He's 5-of-6 on the year and his only miss was from 54 yards.

► A strong-legged lefty, Kesich is 5-7 on field goals in his career with his only misses being that 54-yard try against the Huskers and a 53-yard attempt at Iowa in 2021 that was blocked.

► Kesich excelled on kickoffs a year ago. He posted touchbacks on 59 of 71 kickoffs, including a career-high eight against Western Illinois.

► He led the country with his kickoff average of 64.59 yards in 2022, while his touchback percentage of 83.10 percent was fifth in the FBS and his 59 touchbacks ranked seventh.

► As a result of Kesich's prowess, Minnesota opponents only had 10 kickoff returns last year, which tied for fifth fewest in the country. The 194 kickoff return yards allowed were tied for sixth fewest.

► This year, he's 7-of-9 on touchbacks.

CRAWFORD THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

► Mark Crawford is in his fourth season as the Gophers' punter, and he got off to a strong start against Nebraska. He averaged 45.0 yards on four punts, including a 52-yarder that was downed at the 1-yard line. His leg was not needed against Eastern Michigan as the Gophers never had to punt.

► He punted 46 times last year, including just three times over the first four games of the season. The 47 punts on the year (including a block at Penn State), the Gophers ranked tied for 30th in fewest punts. The 3.6 punts per game tied for 29th.

► Crawford, who has also been the team's holder on kicks, averaged 40.6 yards on his boots this year. Of his 46 punts, 21 were fair caught, 15 landed inside the 20-yard line and only three went for a touchback.

► He had five punts of 50+ yards, including a long of 55 yards in the Pinstripe Bowl against Syracuse.

► Opponents only returned 11 punts last year, tied for 32nd fewest in the country. They also ranked 20th with only 52 punt return yards allowed and the 4.73 yards per return ranked 28th.

► A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.

► He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win six Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.

► At 29 years old (will turn 30 in December), he's the sixth oldest player in college football, according to a survey of FBS SIDs.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Thanks to Saturday's game against Eastern Michigan where Minnesota held the ball for 39:34, it has taken its place among the nation's leaders in time of possession. It's season average of 35:08 is ninth nationally.

► Minnesota dominated time of possession last year, averaging 34:32 minutes with the ball. That figure ranked third nationally behind only Air Force (36:33) and Navy (34:38). Michigan was next-closest at 33:48.

► The Golden Gophers opened 2022 with their highest time of possession in six years under P.J. Fleck when they had the ball for a staggering 44:30 against New Mexico State. Minnesota held it for at least 8:58 in every quarter, including 13:29 in the third quarter alone.

► Eight times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game. In addition to New Mexico State, Minnesota also had it for 42:29 last year at Michigan State, 41:02 against Rutgers and 40:22 versus Northwestern.

In 73 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 57 times and gone 40-17 in those contests.

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

► Another trait that has carried over from last year is the lack of penalties. Minnesota is averaging 2.5 penalties and 21 penalty yards per game. Those figures ranks third and fourth in the country, respectively.

► The Gophers committed three penalties for 25 yards in the opener but lowered those numbers to 2-21 in the second game.

► Minnesota was among the least penalized teams in the FBS last year, committing 46 penalties for 413 yards.

► The Gophers tied with Oklahoma State for the nation's lead with their 3.54 penalties per game, and Minnesota was third in the FBS and first among Power 5 schools with 31.77 penalty yards per contest.

► Minnesota committed four or fewer penalties in 10 of 13 games last year, including a program record zero against Iowa. The Hawkeyes didn't have any penalties either, making it the first FBS game to have no penalties since Oregon at Oregon State in 2018.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

► **Sean Tyler** leads all FBS players in career all-purpose yards (4,271) and rushing yards (2,954), fourth in all-purpose plays (606), sixth in yards per rush (5.7), seventh in rushing attempts (522), eighth in touchdowns scored (29), 16th in all-purpose yards per game (97.07), 17th in rushing touchdowns (23), 25th in rushes per game (11.86) and 30th in all-purpose plays per game (13.77).

► **Chris Autman-Bell** ranks fifth among FBS players in career yards per catch (15.8) and 17th in receiving yards (1,970).

► **Corey Crooms Jr.** sits 12th among players in the FBS in career yards per catch (15.0) and 23rd in receiving yards (1,874).

► With 15 career touchdown catches, **Elijah Spencer** ranks 25th among FBS players.

► **Tyler Nubin's** 10 career interceptions are fourth among active FBS players, while his 0.22 interceptions per game rank 17th.

FOUR ADDED TO COACHING STAFF

► Minnesota added four new assistant coaches to its staff in the offseason.

► Former Minnesota defensive lineman **Winston DeLattiboudere III** has returned to his alma mater to serve as the Golden Gophers' defensive line coach and newcomer coordinator. DeLattiboudere III spent the 2022 campaign as defensive line coach for Akron, while before that he worked one season as a graduate assistant at Oregon working with the defensive line. DeLattiboudere III started his coaching career in 2020 as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line at Charlotte.

► He spent five seasons with Minnesota as a player, including the final four with **P.J. Fleck** as head coach. DeLattiboudere III played in 51 career games with 36 starts, finishing with 83 tackles (43 solo) with 13.5 tackles for loss and five sacks. He earned academic All-Big Ten honors in 2019 as a senior, while also earning the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award and the program's Tony Dungy Award (character and community service) that same year.

► **Nick Monroe** will coach the cornerbacks and be the team's co-defensive coordinator. The Minnesota native returns to his home state after seven seasons at Syracuse. He joined the Orange staff in 2016 and served as Syracuse's secondary coach for two seasons before narrowing his focus to the team's safeties and nickelbacks in 2018 and safeties and rovers in 2020, before taking on his role last season of defensive passing game coordinator. His father, Marty, was a GA for the Gophers under head coach **Jim Wacker** in 1994-95.

► **Nic McKissic-Luke** is the running backs coach. He spent the past three seasons at Northern Illinois, first as running backs/fullbacks coach in 2020, adding run game coordinator and co-special teams coordinator titles in 2021 and then being run game coordinator, running backs coach and the sole special teams coordinator in 2022.

► **Andrew Sowder** will oversee the tight ends. He spent the past five seasons as Kent State's offensive coordinator. He also worked with quarterbacks and tight ends during his time with the Golden Flashes.

► Along with the new coaching additions, after spending last season as the Gophers' tight ends coach, **Greg Harbaugh Jr.** is now co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. He joins **Matt Simon** in the co-offensive coordinator role, which Simon has held, along with wide receivers coach, since the 2020 campaign.

BEST YEARLY SPANS

► As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their seventh season under **P.J. Fleck**. Fleck is 44-27 overall and 26-26 in the Big Ten. He has the most Big Ten wins, the second most overall wins and the third-best overall winning percentage (.620) and conference winning percentage (.500) of any Minnesota coach through his first six seasons. Below is a look at how other yearly spans compare in Gopher history.

► **Last 6 Years (2017-22):** The 44 wins are tied for the second most since 1903-08. The .620 win percentage is tied for the best mark since 1960-65 (.632) and it's tied for the second best since 1944-49. The 26 B1G wins are tied for the most since the program won 27 between 1964-69. The B1G win percentage of .500 is tied for the best since 1968-73 (.544). The four bowl wins in a 6-year span are tied for the most in school history along with 2014-19, 2015-20 and 2016-21.

► **Last 5 Years (2018-22):** The 39 wins are the most since 1903-07 (43). The .661 win percentage is the best mark since 1940-44 (.733). The 24 B1G wins are the most ever in a 5-year span in program history. The B1G win percentage of .558 is the best since 1967-71 (.569). The four bowl wins in a 5-year span are tied for the most in school history along with 2015-19.

► **Last 4 Years (2019-22):** The 32 wins are tied for the most since 1903-06 (41). The .696 win percentage is the best mark since 1940-43 (.727). The 21 B1G wins are the most in any four-year period in school history; no other 4-year span has 20 wins. The B1G win percentage of .618 is best since 1967-70 (.625). The three bowl wins are tied for the most in any 4-year span, along with 2001-04, 2002-05, 2015-18, 2016-19 and 2018-21.

► **Last 3 Years (2020-22):** The 14 B1G wins are tied for the second most since 1967-69. Only the span from 2019-21 when the team won 16 games is better. The B1G win percentage of .560 is second best since 1967-69 (.714). The only mark better since then was in 2019-21 when Minnesota had a .640 win percentage.

Last 2 Years (2021-22): The 18 wins are tied for the most since 1904-05 and it's just the eighth time ever Minnesota has won at least 18 games in consecutive years. Fleck is one of two coaches to do it more than once, also doing so in 2018-19. **Henry L. Williams** did it 5 times. The .692 win percentage is tied for the second best mark since 1967-68 (.700). The only mark better since then was in 2019-20 when the Gophers had a .700 win percentage. The 11 B1G wins are tied for the second most behind only 1960-61 (12). The last time Minnesota won at least 11 B1G games in consecutive years was 1967-68. The B1G win percentage of .611 is second best since 1972-73 (.625). The only mark better since then was a .625 win percentage in 2019-20.

9-4 IN BACK-TO-BACK YEARS

► Minnesota is coming off a 2022 campaign where it finished with a 9-4 record overall, capping it with a 28-20 win over Syracuse in the Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl.

► Minnesota reached nine wins in a season for the 11th time in school history and the third time in the past four years under head coach **P.J. Fleck**, something that hadn't happened since 1905. Fleck is just the second Minnesota coach to have at least three seasons with nine or more victories. **Henry L. Williams** had six such seasons from 1900-21, while all other coaches in program history have a combined two nine-win seasons.

► Combined with a 9-4 record in 2021, the 18 wins over two seasons are tied for the most in Gopher history since 1904-05 and it's just the eighth time ever the team has won at least 18 games in consecutive years.

► In addition, Minnesota went 5-4 in league play after a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021. It's the first time with back-to-back conference seasons over .500 since 1968-69.

GOPHER GRADUATES

► Minnesota's 2023 roster features 18 student-athletes who have already graduated: **Chris Autman-Bell**, **Nathan Boe**, **Tyler Bride**, **Quinn Carroll**, **Chris Collins**, **Tyler Cooper**, **Mark Crawford**, **JJ Guedet**, **Darnell Jefferies**, **Tre'Von Jones**, **Cole Kramer**, **Derek Lecaptain**, **Logan Richter**, **Ryan Selig**, **Karter Shaw**, **Brevyn Spann-Ford**, **Brady Weeks**, **Bryce Williams**

THREE DRAFTED IN 2023

► Minnesota had three players selected in the 2023 NFL Draft. That ups its total since 2020 to 14, which is the most draft picks in a four-year span for the Gophers since they also had 14 players picked from 1988-91.

► Center **John Michael Schmitz** was selected in the second round with the 57th overall pick by the New York Giants. **Jordan Howden**, who started his career as a walk-on at Minnesota, was taken in the fifth round with the 146th pick by the New Orleans Saints, while **Terrell Smith** went a few picks later when the Chicago Bears took him with the 165th pick.

► The 2023 draft was the fourth straight draft where Minnesota had an offensive and defensive player selected. The last time that happened was 1975-78.

► Schmitz was the highest Minnesota center to be drafted since 1989 when **Brian Williams** was taken 18th in the first round by the Giants.

► Schmitz became the third Minnesota center ever to be drafted in the first two rounds, joining Williams and **Clayton Tonnemaker**, who was drafted fourth overall by the Packers in 1950.

► Schmitz's selection was also notable in that Minnesota has now had offensive lineman taken in consecutive drafts, as **Daniel Faalele** was drafted in 2022 in the fourth round by Baltimore. The last time Minnesota had offensive lineman selected in consecutive drafts was 2001-02.

► With Schmitz going in the second round, Minnesota has also had a first or second round pick in four straight drafts. The last time that happened was 1942-45.

► Howden and Smith continued the good fortune of Minnesota defensive backs being drafted, as the Gophers have now had a program-record five defensive backs taken in the last four drafts. Washington took **Benjamin St-Juste** in 2021 and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers selected **Antoine Winfield Jr.**, in 2020, while the New York Giants took **Chris Williamson** the same year.

► This was the third time ever that the Gophers had two defensive backs selected in the same draft, also doing so in 2020 and 1985.

► Scorigami is a concept thought up by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks final scores that have never happened before in NFL history. Inspired by Bois, what follows are the Scorigami results this season for Minnesota football.

► *Minnesota 13, Nebraska 10.* Partial scorigami. It's the second such score in program history and the first Gopher victory.

► *Minnesota 25, Eastern Michigan 6.* No scorigami. It's the second such score in program history as the Gophers defeated North Dakota by that score to open the 1925 season.

HEAD COACH // SEVENTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 41, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 76-49 and is 46-27 at Minnesota.

In six years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program. Fleck is already fifth in program history in overall wins (44) and sixth in Big Ten wins (26) and games coached (71). Fleck's .619 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season three times, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 and 2022 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 4-0 in bowl games, and his four bowl wins are the most in school history by a coach (Glen Mason was 3-4 in bowl games at Minnesota).

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached five All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman, John Michael Schmitz and Mohamed Ibrahim twice), nine Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, John Michael Schmitz, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 327 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

The 2022 season saw Minnesota once against post nine wins as the Gophers went 9-4 overall, which included a bowl win against Syracuse and a road win at rival Wisconsin. Minnesota, which went 5-2 at home, 3-2 on the road and 1-0 in neutral site games, was paced by a stout, family-room defense and a bruising offense that featured two All-Americans.

Minnesota ended the season ranked No. 4 in the nation in scoring defense (13.85), No. 5 in third-down conversion defense (.279) and No. 9 in the nation in total defense (295.1 yards per game).

The 13.85 points allowed per game were the fewest that Minnesota has permitted since 1967 when it allowed 10.6 points per game during the 10-game season. Minnesota posted two shutouts during the season (38-0 against New Mexico State and 31-0 against Rutgers), which is had not done since 2006 and the Gophers were the only team in the nation to shutout two FBS teams in 2022 (Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State each had two shutouts, but one each came against an FCS foe).

First-Team All-American center John Michael Schmitz and Second-Team All-American running back Mohamed Ibrahim paced the Gopher offense, which ranked No. 17 in the nation with 207.3 rushing yards per game. With Schmitz anchoring an offensive line that featured four new starters, Ibrahim set single season records in rushing attempts (320), rushing yards (1,665), rushing touchdowns (20), total touchdowns (20), total points (120) and 100-yard rushing games (10).

The 2022 season also saw three Gophers named either a semifinalist, finalist or winner of a national award. Ibrahim was named Comeback Player of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award. Schmitz was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy and was also a semifinalist for the Outland Trophy and the Rotary Lombardi Award. Quarterback Tanner Morgan was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times for 1,076 yards and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history, while the defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season

school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or red-shirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and host an annual diaper drive during training camp and an annual turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.
