FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1 Playing its final home game of the regular season, Minnesota (6-4, 4-3) welcomes in No. 4/4 Penn State (9-1, 6-1) to Huntington Bank Stadium Saturday. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. on CBS and the Gopher Radio Network. The game will mark Minnesota's sixth all-time appearance on CBS and just the second home game (1982 vs. Illinois). It's the first time the team is appearing on the network since winning the 2003 Sun Bowl, while the last regular season game on CBS came on Nov. 15, 1986 with an upset at No. 2 Michigan.

2 Saturday marks the 17th battle for the Governor's Victory Bell, a full history of which can be found on Page 52. First played for in 1993 in recognition of Penn State's first Big Ten game, the all-time series record for the Bell is tilted in the Nittany Lions' favor at 10-6. The Bell is currently in Penn State's possession following a 45-17 victory in 2022. The Gophers are looking to avoid consecutive losses in the series for the first time since dropping four straight from 2005-10.

3 Minnesota is facing an AP Top-25 team for the fourth time this season as it takes on the fourth-ranked Nittany Lions. The Gophers fell at then-No. 12 Michigan in Ann Arbor on Sept. 28 but bounced back to upset then-No. 11 USC the following week and won at then-No. 24 Illinois on Nov. 2. This is the seventh time in program history that the Gophers have posted two wins over AP top-25 teams in the regular season. They've never had three top-25 wins in one year. A win would also be the seventh top-25 win for the Gophers under P.J. Fleck, which would break a tie with Bernie Bierman and Murray Warmath for the most in program history (see *chart bottom right*). The last top-4 win for Minnesota came at Penn State in 1999 as the Gophers won 24-23 when the Nittany Lions were ranked second, while the last such win at home for Minnesota was in 1977 over a No. 1 Michigan team.

4 Max Brosmer has been excellent in 2024, completing 218-of-325 passes for 2,251 yards and 14 touchdowns with four interceptions for a rating of 137.0. He's also scored four rushing touchdowns. Pro Football Focus ranks Brosmer 11th among FBS QBs with a passer grade of 86.5 this year, while his overall offensive grade of 86.8 ranks tied for 19th at the position. He's fifth in the Big Ten in both passing grade and overall grade. Brosmer's completion percentage of 67.1 percent is on pace to be the best in both Minnesota single-season history (min. 100 attempts) and career (300 att.). In addition, Brosmer's TD:INT ratio of 3.50 is second in Minnesota history. He has gone five straight games (and 199 passes) without an interception, the longest streak at Minnesota since Mitch Leidner went five games without a pick over the final three games of 2014 and first two of 2015. 5 The 2024 campaign is the eighth for P.J. Fleck at Minnesota, where his record stands at 56-38. He is fourth in program history in Big Ten wins (33) and is fifth in overall wins and games coached (94). Fleck's .596 win percentage is third best among Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 12th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 86-60 (.589).



With 45 receptions on the year, Darius Taylor is eight catches away from breaking Chuck Rios' single-season reception record by a Gopher running back (52 set in 1994). Taylor is averaging 5.0 receptions per game this year, tied for the most of any Power 4 running back.

FACING PENN STATE

► Minnesota and Penn State meet for the 17th time on Saturday with the Golden Gophers trailing in the all-time series 10-6.

► The teams have alternated wins over the last four meetings with the home team holding serve in each game. Minnesota won at home in 2013 and 2019 and Penn State prevailed at Beaver Stadium in 2016 and 2022.

► In Minneapolis, the all-time series is tied at 4-4. The Gophers have won their last two home contests in the series, while the Nittany Lions are seeking their first win at Huntington Bank Stadium since 2010. That's also the last time the road team won in the series.

► Due to scheduling quirks, it'll be the first time in five seasons that the teams will be playing in Minneapolis. Excluding the four recent Big Ten expansion teams, the only conference school that has not played more recently at Huntington Bank Stadium is Indiana, which last played there in 2018.

► Minnesota has two Pennsylvanians on its roster in redshirt sophomore DL **Anthony Smith** (Shippensburg, Shippensburg HS) and true freshman RB **Fame Ijeboi** (Folcroft, William Penn Charter).

► Penn State has no Minnesotans on its roster.

► Gophers redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Cristian Driver** spent his first two seasons at Penn State, playing in 10 games (mostly on special teams) and catching two passes for 16 yards.

► Minnesota special teams coordinator **Bob Ligashesky's** hometown is McKees Rocks, Pa., and he graduated from Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

► Penn State offensive coordinator Andy Kotelnicki is from Litchfield, Minn., about 1.5 hours west of Huntington Bank Stadium.

► Minnesota co-defensive coordinator/cornerbacks coach **Nick Monroe** overlapped on Syracuse's staff for four seasons with Penn State special teams coordinator/outside line-backers/nickels coach Justin Lustig. Monroe mostly coached safeties for the Orange during that time, while Lustig was the special teams coordinator and also oversaw running backs and outside receivers.

► The Nittany Lions enter the game with a 9-1 record overall and 6-1 mark in league play that ties them with Ohio State for third in the league. Their only loss on the year was a 20-13 setback against the Buckeyes on Nov. 2.

► Minnesota and Penn State have three common opponents so far this year in Illinois, UCLA and USC, and both the Gophers and Nittany Lions have gone 3-0 against those teams. Penn State outscored the trio, 81-48, while Minnesota's scoring edge was 70-51.

► Quarterback Drew Allar is 166-of-231 for 2,253 yards and 16 touchdowns and five interceptions for an efficiency rating of 172.3 this season. He is fifth in the country and third in the Big Ten in both completion percentage (71.9) and passer rating. Allar is also second in the conference in yards per completion (13.57) and yards per attempt (9.75).

► Penn State's passing attack is led by Tyler Warren, who leads the team in receptions (67), receiving yards (808), TD receptions (5) and receiving yards per game (80.8). Warren is third in the Big Ten in receiving yards, receiving yards per game and receptions per game (6.7).

► Penn State has one of the top running back duos in the league in Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton. Allen leads the team in rushes (139), rushing yards (654), rushing touchdowns (5) and rushing yards per game (65.4), while Singleton is right behind him with 95 carries for 583 yards, four touchdowns and 64.8 yards per game. Singleton's 6.14 yards per rush rank second in the Big Ten, and his 115.56 all-purpose yards per game rank fourth.

► Abdul Carter is one of the most disruptive players in the country with 17.5 tackles for loss and 8.0 sacks. His TFL total leads the Big Ten and is second in the nation, while his sack total is third in the B1G.

► Defensively, Jaylen Reed has the team lead with 60 tackles and three interceptions. Elliot Washington II has five pass breakups to lead the Nittany Lions.

► Ryan Barker is 8-of-9 on field goals with a long of 44 yards, ranking third in the conference in field goal percentage (.889). Riley Thompson is punting at a 42.7 yard clip.

► Zion Tracy is averaging 5.3 yards per punt return, while Singleton has returned 11 kicks for 219 yards, an average of 19.9 yards per return that ranks fourth in the league.

LAST TIME VS. THE NITTANY LIONS

► *With assistance from the AP:* Sean Clifford threw four touchdown passes, Penn State's defense forced seven punts and the No. 16 Nittany Lions beat Minnesota 45-17 when the teams last met at Beaver Stadium in 2022.

► Clifford threw darts over the middle to tight ends Tyler Warren and Theo Johnson on back-to-back possessions in the second quarter to put Penn State up for good. A 17-10 halftime lead for the Nittany Lions expanded when he lofted a deep ball to Parker Washington for a 35-yard score on Penn State's first possession of the second half.

► Nick Singleton added two touchdown runs and Mitchell Tinsley caught another Clifford TD pass.

► Starting quarterback Tanner Morgan was ruled out with a head injury and was replaced in the starting lineup by redshirt freshman Athan Kaliakmanis, who completed 9 of 22 passes for 175 yards.

► Kaliakmanis threw a short touchdown pass to Brevyn Spann-Ford in the fourth quarter, but an interception by Ji'Ayir Brown in the third spoiled a good looking drive.

► Clifford threw a deep ball into double coverage where it was picked off by **Justin Walley** and returned deep into Penn State's territory. The Gophers had to settle for a 35-yard field goal from Matthew Trickett for their only lead.

► Penn State responded with a 41-yard Jake Pinegar field goal, then its defense started pushing Minnesota back. The Gophers lost yardage on each of their next two possessions. The Nittany Lions turned both of theirs into touchdowns thanks to Clifford.

► Minnesota closed the deficit to 17-10 by halftime as Kaliakmanis scrambled to keep a nine-play, 90-yard drive going. It ended with Mohamed Ibrahim lunging in from 3 yards out.

PREVIOUSLY IN MINNEAPOLIS

► *With assistance from the AP:* Jordan Howden picked off Sean Clifford in the end zone with 1:01 left, the third interception thrown by Penn State's quarterback, and the 13th-ranked Gophers held on for a 31-26 victory over the fifth-ranked Nittany Lions for their first win over a top-five team in 20 years in 2019.

► Tanner Morgan passed for 339 yards and three touchdowns to direct a dismantling of Penn State's defense.

► Rashod Bateman got the Gophers going with a 66-yard score on their first possession and finished with seven catches for 203 yards, the second-most in program history. Tyler Johnson had seven receptions for 104 yards and a touchdown, too, as Minnesota made enough early gains to hold up during the late rally by Penn State.

► Journey Brown's second rushing touchdown of the game with 3:49 to go cut the lead to five points, and the Gophers promptly went three and out. K.J. Hamler muffed the punt when a teammate backed into him, and though the Nittany Lions recovered, they were pushed back to their 28-yard line.

► Clifford, who went 23 for 43 for 340 yards and one score, connected with Jahan Dotson for 49 yards to get Penn State to the 11. Two plays later, however, came the drive killer for Penn State. Daniel George was called for offensive pass interference during an over-the-middle catch by Brown that reached the 2. Clifford, who was off target for most of the day, overthrew George on the next play before the game-sealing pick by Howden.

► Antoine Winfield Jr. had the first two picks in the first half, setting the all-time Minnesota record with seven on the season. Both were inside the 10-yard line.

► The Gophers had 321 yards and a 24-13 lead at half-time, but a fumble near midfield at the end of a run on the first play after a punt sapped some momentum.

► Penn State went the other way for a touchdown pass from Clifford to backup tight end Nick Bowers, but Bateman broke open again for a 36-yard gain on the next drive to set up a scoring plunge by Seth Green.

► Chris Williamson batted down Clifford's fourth-down throw into the end zone on the next drive by Penn State, giving the Gophers another chance to drain the clock.

NOTABLE WINS OVER PENN STATE

► Nov. 9, 2013: **David Cobb** carried 27 times for 139 yards and a touchdown, and Minnesota held Penn State scoreless over the final 33 minutes in a 24-10 victory.

► **Philip Nelson** had 186 yards and a score on 15-for-24 passing, plus one touchdown and 40 yards rushing.

► Oct. 2, 2004: **Laurence Maroney** ran for 144 yards and a touchdown and Minnesota overcame Penn State's scrappy defense to beat the Nittany Lions 16-7.

► Nov. 6, 1999: **Arland Bruce** made a diving 27-yard catch on a tipped ball on fourth-and-16 with 1:22 left, setting up **Dan Nystrom's** 32-yard field goal as time ran out to beat the undefeated and second-ranked Nittany Lions, 24-23. **Billy Cockerham** was 14-of-24 for 277 yards and two TDs, and he ran for 44 yards and a score.

RECAPING RUTGERS

► *With assistance from the AP:* Rutgers linebacker Tyreem Powell hit the daily double Saturday with a textbook tackle that caused a game-changing late fumble that helped the Scarlet Knights turn their season around with a 26-19 victory over red-hot Minnesota on Nov. 9.

► The fumble that Shaquan Loyal recovered with 8:28 to play set up Athan Kaliakmanis' go-ahead 4-yard touchdown pass to Ian Strong and helped the Scarlet Knights snap a four-game losing streak.

► A Minnesota transfer, Kaliakmanis had hit Dymere Miller on first-half touchdown passes of 1 and 17 yards before finding a wide-open Strong for a TD and a 21-16 lead with 7:41 to play.

► Until that point, Minnesota appeared headed for a fifth straight win. **Max Brosmer**, who finished 27 of 45 for 262 yards, had hit **Marcus Major** on a 17-yard touchdown pass to start the second half to put the Gophers ahead 16-14.

► On the ensuing series after Powell's big play, defensive lineman Jordan Walker sacked Brosmer for a safety to push the lead to 23-16 and Jai Patel added a 22-yard field goal with 2:45 to make it a two-score game.

► **Dragan Kesich**, who kicked a 51-yard field goal in the first half, added a 30-yarder with 1:10 to play and Minnesota out of timeouts. Strong recovered the ensuing onside kick to ice the game.

► Kaliakmanis, who shook hands with many of his former teammates and coaches after the game, completed 17 of 33 passes for 240 yards.

► The Gophers were limited to 35 yards on 19 carries, including an 18-yard touchdown run by **Darius Taylor** to open the scoring.

MILESTONE WATCH

► Fourth in program history for career receptions at 195, **Daniel Jackson** is three catches from matching Ron Johnson for third in Gopher history and five away from hitting the 200-catch mark in a career.

► Fifth in program history for career receiving yards, Jackson is 106 receiving yards away from catching Tutu Atwell (2,640) for fourth.

► Two touchdown receptions would match Jackson with Rashod Bateman (19) for sixth in program annals, while three more would make Jackson the fifth Gopher to hit 20 career TD receptions.

► A 100-yard receiving game would be the eighth of Jackson's career, tying him with Ron Johnson for sixth all-time at Minnesota.

► With 63 receptions on the season, Jackson sits eighth in single-season history at Minnesota and would need seven receptions to tally the Gophers' fifth 70-catch season all-time.

► Sitting at 712 receiving yards, Jackson is 88 yards from tallying the 19th 800-yard season in Gopher annals.

► **Max Brosmer** is currently 15th in program history with 2,251 passing yards this season. He is 279 yards away from cracking the top 10. In addition, he is one touchdown pass away from tying for 10th at 15.

► With 218 completions this year, Brosmer is 40 away from the school record of 258 set by Adam Weber in 2007.

► With 1,471 career rush yards, **Darius Taylor** needs three yards to tie Donnell Kirkwood (1,474) for 32nd in school history.

► Taylor (45) is eight receptions away from breaking Chuck Rios' single-season reception record by a Gopher running back. Rios holds the mark with 52 receptions in 1994, and Rios also ranks second with 48 catches in 1993.

► A true sophomore, Taylor already has 56 career receptions, putting him six back of reaching the all-time top five at Minnesota. He's also 149 receiving yards away from reaching the top five in that category, as well.

► Taylor needs 16 all-purpose yards to achieve the 49th 1000-yard season in Gopher history.

► **Koi Perich** is one interception away from tying Walter Bowser (6) for third in Minnesota single-season history and two back of the school record of seven held by Antoine Winfield Jr. (2019) and Jeff Wright (1970).

► **Justin Walley** is four pass breakups away from tying Willie Middlebrooks (30) for fourth in program history and five back of the school record shared by three players.

► Walley is seventh in career interception return yards at Minnesota with 168 and is 115 away from the school record of 283 set by Lumpkin. In addition, with 102 interception yards this season, Walley ranks ninth but is 36 yards away from reaching second place and 101 back of Bowser's record of 203 set in 1970.

► Walley (9) also needs two pass breakups to reach Minnesota's single-season top-10.

► Sitting at 14.5 career sacks, **Jah Joyner** is already 10th all-time in Gopher history and would need 1.5 more to get as high as sixth place.

► **Mark Crawford** (9,011) is 450 punt yards away from Justin Kucek's program record of 9,461. With 216 career punts, Crawford is one away from tying Ryan Rindels for second in Gopher history.

► **Dragan Kesich** (38) needs two made field goals to tie Jim Gallery for sixth all-time at Minnesota. Two more makes would also give Kesich 17 made this season, entering him into Minnesota's single-season top-10.

► Kesich is also four points away from tying Brent Berglund (175) for 10th in kicker scoring in Gopher history.

► **Sieh Bangura** has 1,994 career rushing yards, including 1,982 recorded at Ohio, leaving him 6 yards away from 2,000 for his career.

► Sitting at 1,398 career rushing yards, **Jaren Mangham** needs 102 more to reach 1,500.

► More record book information is located on Pages 14-15.

► Minnesota does not appear in either the AP Poll or Coaches Poll, after popping up in the Coaches Poll prior to the Rutgers contest.

► The Gophers received 14 points in the Coaches Poll prior to the Rutgers contest, putting them eighth among the teams receiving votes and 33rd overall. It was the only time they've appeared in either poll so far this season.

- Improve the Gophers to 7-10 all-time against Penn State, including 5-4 in Minneapolis
- Avoid consecutive losses to PSU for the first time since dropping four straight from 2005-10
- Be the seventh AP Top 25 win under **P.J. Fleck**, which would be the most in school history
- Mark the first time in program history that Minnesota had three ranked wins in one season
- Register as the first win over an AP top-4 win since beating No. 2 Penn State in 1999 and the first such win at home since upsetting No. 1 Michigan in 1977

► Among Minnesota opponents in 2024, Penn State is the only one currently ranked in both polls as the Nittany Lions are fourth in each.

► Illinois is the only other opponent to show up in the polls, ranking 24th in the AP Poll and receiving votes from the coaches.

► Minnesota is 2-1 against AP Top 25 teams this year, losing at then-No. 12 Michigan on Sept. 28, 27-24, before returning home the following week to beat then-No. 11 USC on Oct. 5, 24-17 and winning on the road at No. 24 Illinois, 25-17, on Nov. 2.

► The Gophers' win over the Trojans was their first against a team ranked 11th or better since beating No. 9 Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl and the first such win at home since topping No. 5 Penn State in 2019.

► The win against the Illini was the first top-25 road win for Minnesota since taking down No. 24 Iowa in 2023.

► Minnesota has recorded two wins over AP top-25 teams in the regular season for the first time since 2000 when it beat No. 6 Ohio State and No. 22 Illinois.

TROPHY GAMES

► 2024 marks the 10th time in its history that Minnesota plays all four of its Trophy Games in one year.

► The 2013 season marked the last time they played Iowa for Floyd of Rosedale, Michigan for the Little Brown Jug, Penn State for the Governor's Victory Bell and Wisconsin for Paul Bunyan's Axe all in the same season.

► It also happened each year from 2003-06, as well as 1997-98 and 1993-94.

► Minnesota has won at least one of those games in eight of the nine prior seasons, including wins over both Penn State and Wisconsin in 2003.

► The Gophers have already played two of their trophy games this year, falling to Iowa, 31-14, on Sept. 21 and at Michigan on Sept. 28, 27-24.

► Up next, Minnesota hosts Penn State on Nov. 23 and closes the season at Wisconsin on Nov. 29.

MIGHTY MAX

► As noted on Page 1, Minnesota has handed the keys to the offense to sixth-year quarterback **Max Brosmer**, a transfer from the University of New Hampshire who was a finalist for the 2023 Walter Payton Award and a Second Team All-American at UNH.

► Among his accolades this season, Brosmer has been named to the Davey O'Brien Class of 2024, earned Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors and has twice been named the PFF B1G Quarterback of the Week and twice picked for the O'Brien Award's weekly Great 8.

► He's fourth in the Big Ten in completions per game (21.80; 20th nationally), sixth in completion percentage (21.80; 21st in the FBS), seventh in pass efficiency (137.01), eighth in passing touchdowns (14), passing yards (2,251) and passing yards per game (225.1), and ninth in points responsible for (108) and points responsible for per game (10.8).

► Brosmer's efficiency rating of 137.01 stands as fourth best in Gopher history for a career (min. 300 attempts). He's also got four games this year of at least 250 passing yards, which ranks ninth most, while his one 300-yard game is tied for ninth.

► Among Gopher single-season marks, he's first in completion percentage, second in TD:INT ratio (3.5), fourth in completions (218), sixth in passing yards per game and 250-yard games, eighth in passer rating, 11th in 300-yard games, 13th in passing touchdowns and 15th in passing yards.

► PFF also ranks him tied for 13th in the FBS and fourth in the Big Ten with an adjusted completion percentage of 78.0. Adjusted completion percentage factors in drops, throw aways, spikes, batted passes and being hit as thrown to try to report a completion percentage that's more indicative of a QB's accuracy.

► In just 10 games at Minnesota, Brosmer already has the top four performances for completions in a game in the eight seasons under **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota as Brosmer completed 27 passes at both Rutgers and Michigan, a Fleck era record. He also had 26 completions at UCLA and against Maryland.

► In addition, under Fleck there have been eight games where a Gopher quarterback attempted at least 37 passes, and Brosmer has five of those eight performances, including a Fleck-era record 45 at Rutgers.

► During the team's recent four-game winning streak, Brosmer was particularly effective in the fourth quarter. He completed 23-of-30 passes (76.7%) for 255 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions for an efficiency rating of 170.1.

► Another example of the uptick in the passing game can be seen with **Daniel Jackson** (63 receptions), **Darius Taylor** (45) and **Elijah Spencer** (39). It's the first time since 2010 that Minnesota has had three players catch at least 35 passes in a season. Minnesota has not had three players with at least 40 receptions in a season since at least 2000.

► Against Maryland, Brosmer completed 26-of-33 passes for season-highs of 320 yards and four touchdowns en route to being named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week. He was the first Gopher with four passing touchdowns since Tanner Morgan had four at Northwestern in 2019 and his 320 passing yards were the most since Morgan threw for 368 at Iowa in 2019.

► Brosmer scored three rushing touchdowns in the upset win over No. 11 USC to become the first Gopher to accomplish the feat since Mohamed Ibrahim in 2022 and the first Minnesota QB to do since Mitch Leidner scored four in 2013.

► Against Rhode Island, Brosmer completed 24-of-30 passes for 271 yards and two touchdowns in the win over Rhode Island. He was the first Gopher to hit those numbers in a game since Leidner threw for 281 yards and two scores on 27 completions at Ohio State in 2015.

► Brosmer finished his New Hampshire career by completing 760-of-1,225 passes for 8,713 yards, 70 touchdowns, 25 interceptions, 191 rushes, 263 rushing yards and 10 rushing touchdowns.

► Last year, Brosmer completed 294-of-459 passes (64.1%) for 3,464 yards and 29 touchdowns against five interceptions, while also rushing 57 times for 126 yards and three scores.

► He led the FCS in passing yards per game (313.55) and total offense per game (325.0), and was second in passing attempts and completions, passing yards, passing touchdowns and points responsible for per game (18.9), and finished fourth in completions per game (26.64) and total points responsible for (208).

► In addition to being a finalist for the Walter Payton Award and Brosmer was a Second Team All-American. He was also named CAA First Team Offense QB, was a finalist for the FedEx Ground Doris Robinson Scholar-Athlete Award and earned the CAA Football Chock Boone Leadership and Excellence Award.

JACKSON GRABS WR1 SPOT

► The team's top receiver the last two seasons, **Daniel Jackson** is looking to become the third Gopher since 2001 to lead the team in receiving three straight years. He would join Tyler Johnson (2017-19) and Eric Decker (2007-09) should he do so.

► Jackson is on the right track, leading the team in receptions (63), receiving yards (712), receiving yards per game (71.2), targets (99) and targets per game (9.9).

► He's also second on the team in receiving TDs (3), yards after catch (206) and YAC per game (20.6).

► With a career-high 63 receptions on the season, Jackson has recorded the 14th 60-catch season in program history. He's the eighth Gopher to have multiple seasons with 50+ catches, and he currently ranks tied eighth in team annals.

► Jackson ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 17th nationally in receptions per game (6.3). He's also sixth in the B1G in receiving yards and eighth in receiving yards per contest.

► Jackson has been targeted at least five times in every game this season, including at least nine targets in seven of the last eight contests, including 51 over the last four games, highlighted by 16 targets at Rutgers that tied a career high.

► He has at least two catches in each of the past 20 games and has at least four receptions in all 10 games this season.

► Currently with 195 career catches for 2,534 yards and 17 touchdowns, Jackson could become the 18th player in Big Ten history to attain 200 catches, 2,000 yards and 20 touchdowns in his career. Johnson and Decker are the only other Gophers to accomplish the feat.

► Jackson enters Saturday ranked fourth in team history in career receptions, fifth in receiving yards, sixth in receiving touchdowns and seventh in 100-yard games (7).

► Jackson finished with nine catches for 117 yards (most by a Gopher this year) and two touchdowns against Maryland. It was his fourth career multi-TD game and his seventh 100-yard game. Of his total, 102 yards came in the first half. It was the first time any Gopher had 100 receiving yards in a half since Jackson did it in the first half versus Purdue in 2022.

► At UCLA, Jackson finished with a career high 10 catches and 89 receiving yards. It was the 30th 10-reception game in Gopher history and the seventh under head coach **P.J. Fleck**.

► Against Iowa on Sept. 21, Jackson posted nine catches for 112 yards. With his performance versus the Hawkeyes, Jackson became the 10th player in Gopher history to go over the 2,000-yard receiving mark in a career. He got there in 46 games and needed 147 receptions.

► Last year, Jackson had team highs in targets (116), targets per game (8.9), catches (59), receiving yards (831), receiving yards per game (63.9), touchdown grabs (8), yards after catch (208) and YAC per game (16.0).

► Jackson ranked third in the Big Ten and 32nd nationally in touchdown receptions, and he was fourth in the conference in receiving yards, receiving yards per game and receptions per game (4.5), ninth in total touchdowns (8) and 11th in yards per reception (14.08).

► His totals last year ranked eighth for single-season 100-yard games at Minnesota (4), 12th for touchdown receptions, 14th for catches and 15th for receiving yards.

► Jackson was Minnesota's top receiver in nine of 13 games last season. He tied for the longest reception on the team and had seven of the 10 longest receptions. He was the only Gopher to see at least four targets in every contest last season, including five games with at least 10 targets and three with at least 15.

► Jackson became the 18th Gopher to reach 100 career receptions last year, reaching the mark in his 36th career game. That tied him for the ninth-fewest games needed to reach 100 career receptions in school history.

SPENCER SURGING

► **Elijah Spencer** has proven to be a reliable target in 2024, complementing Daniel Jackson in the WR corps.

► Spencer leads the team and is 14th in the Big Ten with four TD receptions. He also ranks second on Minnesota in receiving yards (482), receiving yards per game (48.2) and targets (55), and is third in receptions (39) and targets per game (5.5).

► He's been targeted at least two times every game so far and had at least four targets in nine of 10 games. He's been targeted eight times twice this year, at Michigan and last week at Illinois.

► With the numbers he's posted, Spencer has more than quadrupled his reception total from last year and has more than seven times the yardage total as he produced nine receptions for 65 yards in 13 games in 2023. He also scored three times last season.

► Spencer had six catches for 99 yards (most as a Gopher) and two touchdowns against Maryland. It was his third career multi-touchdown game. With Jackson and Spencer each catching two touchdowns in the game, it was the first time Minnesota had multiple players with at least two TD grabs since Duane Bennett and Nick Tow-Arnett against Michigan State in 2009.

► Spencer spent his first two seasons at Charlotte where he made 85 catches for 1,324 yards and 15 touchdowns. In 2022, he hauled in 57 catches for 943 yards and nine touchdowns and was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. He was the fifth-ranked WR in Conference USA with a grade of 81.0 from PFF.

► In 2021, Spencer recorded 28 receptions for 381 yards and six touchdowns en route to being named Conference USA Freshman of the Year and a member of the Conference USA All-Freshman Team.

DYNAMIC DARIUS

► Named to the 2024 Maxwell Award watch list, sophomore running back **Darius Taylor** is proving his outstanding freshman campaign was no fluke.

► After missing the season opener against North Carolina, Taylor has played in nine games. He's rushed 136 times for 672 yards and a career-high nine touchdowns, and he's caught 45 passes for 312 yards and two scores. His 984 all-purpose yards lead the Gophers.

► Taylor is third in the Big Ten in total touchdowns (11), fifth in rushing touchdowns, sixth in all-purpose yards per game (109.33) and points per game (7.3), seventh in rushing yards per game (74.7), ninth in receptions per game (5.0), 10th in rushing yards, 11th in yards per carry (4.94) and 12th in points scored (66).

► In his career, Taylor ranks fourth in program history in rushing yards per game (98.1), 10th in yards per carry (5.37) and 33rd in rushing yards (1,471).

► The Detroit native has emerged as strong threat in the receiving game as he has quadrupled last season's reception total (11) and more than tripled his receiving yardage total (92). He has one catch in 14 straight games and two receptions in each of his past 12 games. Taylor has five games this year with at least five receptions.

► Taylor is tied for the lead among Power 4 running backs and is second nationally at the position with his 5.0 receptions per game this season. His 45 receptions lead Big Ten running backs and are third nationally, while Taylor's 312 receiving yards are second among Big Ten running backs and ninth in the country.

► He leads Minnesota with 279 yards after catch and 31.0 YAC per game. He is also second on the Gophers in receptions (45) and targets per game (6.0), and third in receiving yards, receiving yards per game (39.4), touchdown receptions (2) and targets (5.5).

► With his 45 receptions, Taylor already ranks third in a single-season for catches by a Minnesota running back, and he's just seven off the school record of 52 set at the position by Chuck Rios in 1994.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

Dating back to a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018, Minnesota has gone 22-12 (.647) away from home, including five bowl wins. Of the 12 losses, seven were against ranked teams and three more went to overtime. Since the date of Minnesota's win at Wisconsin, the Gophers rank third in the Big Ten in winning percentage away from home and are tied for third in wins in such games. Only Ohio State (.800) and Oregon (.667) have better win percentages away from home, and the Buckeyes (28) and Ducks (26) are the only teams with more wins over that time.

► In addition, with 56 career receptions for 404 yards, Taylor is just six receptions and 149 yards away from entering the school's all-time top-five in both categories for running backs.

► PFF ranks Taylor as the No. 8 receiving running back in the country and second best in the Big Ten with an 83.8 grade.

► In the upset win at No. 24 Illinois, Taylor ran for 131 yards and one touchdown on 22 attempts and caught nine passes for a career-high 58 yards. It was his seventh career 100-yard rushing game and ninth career game with 100+ all-purpose yards. His nine receptions were one off a career high and the Minnesota single-game record for a running back.

► At UCLA, Taylor scored once on the ground and once through the air, the latter of which was the game-winning score with 27 seconds left. It was his fourth career game with multiple touchdowns and second with both a rushing and receiving score.

► In the upset of then-No. 11 USC on Oct. 5, he ran for a season-high 144 yards on 25 carries. Taylor also led the Gophers with five catches for 56 yards. It was his fourth career game with 200 all-purpose yards, tying for fourth in program annals.

► At Michigan, Taylor ran for 36 yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries and had a career-high 10 catches for 52 yards. The 10 catches tied a Minnesota running back record set by Chuck Rios vs. San Diego State in 1994.

► Against Iowa, Taylor pushed his career rushing total over the 1,000-yard mark. He got there in just nine career games, making him the second-fastest Gopher (by games) to get there since 1955. Only Darrell Thompson did it faster, getting there in seven games in 1986.

► Against Nevada, Taylor tallied 11 rushes for 124 yards and two TDs on the ground, plus five receptions for 37 yards and another TD for his first career 3-TD game. Taylor scored on an 80-yard TD run in the third quarter that tied for the sixth longest in program history and was the longest since Laurence Maroney's 93-yarder in 2005.

► Despite missing seven games and receiving just one carry for three yards in the season opener, Taylor rushed 138 times for 799 yards (5.8 per carry) and five touchdowns last year. He also caught 11 passes for 92 yards. His rushing yardage total was the fifth most ever by a freshman in school history.

► He averaged 133.2 rushing yards per game, which was the third most in school history and the best by an FBS freshman since 2021. Taylor did not play in enough games to be listed in the NCAA stat rankings last season, but if he were eligible he would have led the nation in rushing, surpassing Cody Schrader from Missouri who averaged 125.2 yards per game.

► In addition, Taylor's 148.5 all-purpose yards per game would have been the most of any Power 5 player and be third nationally had he played enough.

► After missing seven of the final eight games of the regular season due to injury, Taylor returned for the Quick Lane Bowl with a career-high 208 rushing yards, the most ever by a true freshman at Minnesota. He added 11 receiving yards for a career-high 219 all-purpose yards.

► It was his third game of the year with 200+ all-purpose yards, tied for the second most in program history. Only Tutu Atwell had more with six such games in 1997.

► Taylor was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week for a third straight week after a standout performance at Northwestern on Sept. 23. Taylor had 216 all-purpose yards at Northwestern as he rushed for 198 yards and had 18 yards receiving. His 216 all-purpose yards came in his fourth career game and ranked 44th in school history.

► He was the first Gopher ever to receive Big Ten Freshman of the Week three straight weeks and only the second ever to be honored three times in a season, joining Shannon Brooks, who did it in 2015. Taylor was the first Big Ten player to receive the honor three straight weeks since Wisconsin's running back Jonathan Taylor in 2017.

► Taylor made his Gopher debut with one carry for three yards against Nebraska and followed that with a monster performance against Eastern Michigan, rushing for 193 yards and a touchdown on 33 carries. His numbers in a 25-6 win netted him Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. His 193 yards were second most in school history for a true freshman. He added 13 receiving yards to finish the game with 206 all-purpose yards.

► Taylor followed that Eastern Michigan performance by gaining 138 yards and scoring one touchdown on 22 carries at then-No. 20 North Carolina to earn his second straight Big Ten Freshman of the Week. He also caught one pass for 25 yards. He was the first Minnesota true freshman to rush for more than 100 yards in consecutive games since the 2021 season and just the second to do so since 2003.

► With his three straight 100-yard rushing games, Taylor became the first Minnesota true freshman to accomplish the feat since Laurence Maroney in 2003.

DEPTH IN THE RB ROOM

► Minnesota added to its running back room this off-season with three additions from the transfer portal.

► Now in his sixth season, **Marcus Major** spent the first five at Oklahoma. He played in 35 games for OU and rushed 194 times for 833 yards and eight touchdowns and caught 23 passes for 177 yards and two scores.

► Major is second on the team in rushes (66), rushing yards (272) and rushing yards per game (27.2), and third in rushing scores (2). In addition, he's set career highs in both receptions (18) and receiving yards (138).

► His 18 catches have come on 21 targets for a .857 catch percentage that's highest on the team among those with more than one catch. PFF ranks him as the No. 5 receiving running back in the Big Ten with a 74.7 grade.

► Minnesota is the fourth school for **Jaren Mangham**, who began his career at Colorado (2019-20) and spent two years at South Florida (2021-22) before playing at Michigan State in 2023. Prior to joining the Gophers, he competed in 38 career games with nine starts and rushed 344 times for 1,332 yards and 23 touchdowns in his collegiate career. He added 27 career catches for 162 yards.

► Mangham has played in four games this season, rushing 10 times for 66 yards. His 6.6 yards per carry is best on the squad.

► **Sieh Bangura** was at Ohio the last three seasons, playing in 28 career games with 24 starts for the Bobcats while rushing for 1,982 yards and 22 touchdowns on 412 carries (4.8 average) and catching 50 passes for 453 yards (9.1 average) and three touchdowns. He was the 2022 MAC Freshman of the Year and led the team in rushing each of the last two seasons.

► Bangura has played in three games, taking four carries for 12 yards.

► In addition to those three, Minnesota also has redshirt junior running back **Jordan Nubin**, who finished second on the team in rushing attempts (127), rushing yards (559), rush yards per game (43.0) and rushing TDs (3), and was tied for third in yards per rush (4.4).

Since **P.J. Fleck** arrived in Minnesota in 2017, the Gophers have gone 23-3 against non-conference opponents, including bowl games, which is the fifth-best win percentage in the FBS in that span.

► So far in 2024, Nubin has rushed 11 times for 19 yards and caught three passes for 32 yards.

► Nubin was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after his standout performance in Minnesota's 27-12 victory against Michigan State last season. Entering the game with 15 career rushing attempts for 51 yards, he rushed 40 times for 204 yards and two touchdowns against the Spartans. His 204 yards were the 28th most in program history. After rushing 18 times for 79 yards in the first half, Nubin followed with 22 carries for 125 yards and two touchdowns in the second half against the Spartans.

► Nubin's 40 carries set a Huntington Bank Stadium record and tied for seventh most in program history. For further context, no other player in the country last year had more than 36 carries in a game.

► Nubin was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Mohamed Ibrahim on Nov. 21, 2022.

MOST 100/200-YARD RUSHERS

► Since 2021, Minnesota has seen seven different running backs combine for 30 100-yard rushing games: Mohamed Ibrahim (10), **Darius Taylor** (7), Ky Thomas (5), Mar'Keise Irving (3), Trey Potts (3), **Jordan Nubin** (1) and Bryce Williams (1).

► Within the Big Ten, Minnesota's 30 100-yard performances are tied with Michigan for the most in the conference since 2021, and only Oregon (8) has had more individuals run for 100+ yards in a game in that span.

► Ibrahim (2), Nubin (1) and Taylor (1) have also combined for four 200-yard games since 2021.

► No other Big Ten school has had more than two 200-yard games since 2021 and Michigan (2) is the only other B1G school to have multiple players rush for 200+ yards.

O-LINE PAVING THE WAY

► Minnesota's offensive line has seen four different versions so far in 2024 as it looks to solidify its group. In the season opener against North Carolina, **Aireontae Erserly** lined up at left tackle, **Tyler Cooper** was at left guard, **Greg Johnson** at center, **Quinn Carroll** at right guard and **Martes Lewis** at right tackle. Lewis and Carroll then swapped spots against Rhode Island, while versus Nevada, Carroll stayed at right tackle while **Ashton Beers** made his first career start at right guard. That last iteration is what Minnesota used over the six games before Illinois.

► Against the Illini, Cooper missed the contest due to injury, resulting in Beers making his first career start at left guard, Carroll sliding back to right guard and redshirt freshman **Philip Daniels** making his first career start at right tackle.

► On the season, Erserly is rated by Pro Football Focus as the No. 3 offensive lineman overall in the Big Ten with a grade of 79.6. Nationally, he's 20th among FBS tackles and No. 32 overall along the line. His pass blocking grade of 80.9 is fourth among tackles in the conference, while his run block grade of 74.4 ranks eighth at the position.

► Carroll sits 18th among Big Ten tackles with an overall grade of 70.3, but his run-blocking grade of 74.3 is ninth among tackles and 12th versus all B1G linemen.

► Daniels is third among Big Ten linemen with a run-blocking grade of 79.9 from PFF.

► Among Big Ten guards, Cooper ranks 15th overall with a grade of 68.3 and sixth in run blocking (71.9).

► According to PFF, Johnson and Erserly have each given up just one sack so far this season in 368 opportunities. Carroll has yielded two in the same time period, which Cooper (267 snaps) has given up three and Beers (338 snaps) has been credited with five allowed.

► Minnesota returned 80 percent of its starts on the offensive line in 2024 with only center Nathan Boe needing to be replaced.

► Minnesota primarily used the same starting lineup on the offensive line last year with Erserly at left tackle, Cooper at left guard, Boe at center, Lewis at right guard and Carroll at right tackle. Cooper missed two games due to injury with Johnson moving into the lineup at left guard, but Cooper returned for the last four contests of the season. Erserly, Lewis and Carroll all started every game.

► According to PFF, Erserly was the Big Ten's top-graded lineman at 84.0 a year ago. That grade also ranked fifth among FBS tackles and seventh for all offensive linemen.

► Named to the 2024 Outland Trophy Preseason Watch List, Erserly also led the Big Ten, was third among FBS tackles and fourth overall along the o-line with a run block grade of 86.2. He allowed just two sacks and 15 total pressures in 841 snaps on offense.

► Cooper earned the top pass-blocking grade on the team in 2023 at 83.3, a figure that led all Big Ten guards, was fifth overall in the league and 21st for FBS guards.

► Johnson saw 397 snaps last year after making his collegiate debut at left guard at North Carolina. He was the first true freshman to play on and start on the offensive line for Minnesota since Erserly started against Nebraska in 2020.

FIRST ON 4TH DOWN

► By converting 14-of-17 fourth down attempts last season, Minnesota led the nation in fourth-down conversion rate at 82.4 percent.

► For context, Boise State (81.8) was the only other FBS team above 80 percent last year, while only two other Big Ten teams converted higher than 70 percent.

► Minnesota is back at the top spot again in 2024 at 87.5 percent, converting 7-of-8 fourth-down tries. Only three other teams are even above 80 percent with Army ranking second at 84.2 percent, and Michigan (73.3) is the next closest Big Ten program.

► The Gophers had converted their previous eight fourth-down tries dating to last season's bowl game before getting stopped on a fake punt at Illinois.

GOPHERS 'D' LOOKING TO BE BACK AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota finished last season with the No. 56 total defense in the country, allowing 368.4 yards per game. It was a step back from 2022 when the Gophers were ninth (294.7) and 2021 when they finished third (278.8). After the departure of the previous defensive coordinator, Minnesota has brought in **Corey Hetherman** to take the reins in 2024.

► Hetherman spent the two previous seasons as the linebackers coach at Rutgers. Prior to that he was the defensive coordinator at James Madison from 2019-21 and was named the AFCA FCS Assistant Coach of the Year in 2021. His defense ranked in the top 10 in both total defense and scoring defense in all three years he was at JMU. Hetherman has also been the defensive coordinator at Maine (2016-18) and Pace College (2014).

► The Gophers are allowing 296.4 yards of total offense so far this year, which ranks 11th nationally and would be the third time in the last four seasons that Minnesota has kept teams under 300 yards per game. Before that, it had not happened in any year since 1967.

► The 17.7 points allowed per game this season is on pace to be the team's third best since 1999 with only 2022 (13.8) and 2021 (17.4) ranking better.

► The Gophers enter Saturday's game allowing just 176.6 passing yards per game, 17th-best in the FBS and on pace to be the best at Minnesota since yielding 174.5 yards per game through the air in 2017.

► The Gophers did not give up more than 200 yards passing in any of the first six games this season. It was the first time since at least 2000 that Minnesota had gone six straight games holding an opponent to 200 or fewer pass yards.

► The Gophers' INT:TD ratio of 16:9 (1.8 INT per TD) is third best in the country behind only Texas (5.0) and Notre Dame (2.5).

► Allowing just 10.15 yards per completion is on pace to be second best in school history behind the record of 9.97 set in 2017.

► Minnesota's 119.8 rushing yards allowed per game is currently eighth best in program history.

► It's been a group effort defensively as 20 players have at least 10 tackles and 13 have at least 20. In addition, 17 have at least 0.5 tackles for loss, 15 have at least one pass breakup, and eight have at least one interception or half a sack.

► The Gophers limited Iowa (62) and Michigan (86) to less than 100 yards passing in consecutive games at the end of September. The last time Minnesota held consecutive opponents under 100 yards passing came in 2021, while the 148 passing yards allowed in the two-game span was the best for the team since at least 2000.

► Rhode Island was limited to 135 total yards, including just 18 on the ground, then only 172 yards were allowed to Nevada, including 58 rushing. UCLA became the third team to be held under 100 yards rushing when they tallied just 36 on Oct. 12.

► According to Big Ten Network, Minnesota logged four sacks and three interceptions against Nevada, the first time reaching those numbers in a game since doing so against Kent State in 2006.

TURNOVER TIME

► An opportunistic Minnesota defense has forced 20 turnovers this season with 16 interceptions and four fumble recoveries. The Gophers have forced at least one turnover in nine of 10 games this year and have six games with at least two turnovers forced. The Gophers forced a season-high four against Rhode Island and had three each versus Nevada, USC and UCLA.

► The 16 interceptions are tied for fourth nationally and rank third among Power 4 teams as only BYU, Cal and James Madison have more picks this year with 17. The 16 picks are tied for 10th most in Gopher program history and are the most since recording 17 in 2006.

► The 20 turnovers forced ranks tied for 10th nationally and are tied for first in the Big Ten. With eight giveaways and 20 takeaways, the Minnesota turnover margin of +12 ranks eighth in the FBS and leads the Big Ten.

► Minnesota committed zero turnovers in a three-game stretch against UCLA, Maryland and Illinois, marking the first time since 2003 that the Gophers went three games in a row without turning the ball over.

► The Gophers forced two fumbles at Illinois for the first time since forcing three last season against the Illini. That was also the last time they recovered two fumbles in a game, tying for the second most in a game under head coach P.J. Fleck.

► Seven of Minnesota's 15 interceptions came in the first four games, its most in that span since 2014.

► Minnesota had two interceptions against Maryland after recording three at UCLA and two versus USC. It was the first time since 2019 (Rutgers, Maryland and Penn State) that the Gophers had multiple interceptions in three straight games.

► The three interceptions against Rhode Island, Nevada and UCLA all tied for the most in the Fleck era, as did the four turnovers forced against Rams with an additional forced fumble.

► With three interceptions against both Nevada and Rhode Island, Minnesota logged six picks in a two-game span for the first time since seven total were recorded in 2008 against Montana State (3; 9/13/2008) and Florida Atlantic (4; 9/30/2008).

► Minnesota has capitalized on its 20 takeaways by turning them into 72 points, or an average of 3.60 points per turnover.

► **Koi Perich** leads the Big Ten and is tied for second in the country with five interceptions. In addition, **Ethan Robinson** has three interceptions, and **Kerry Brown** and **Justin Walley** both have two. Four players with at least two picks ties the Gophers for fourth most in the country behind Alabama, Army and BYU, who all have five.

► Walley and **Jack Henderson** both have pick-sixes this season. Walley's was a 32-yard return against Maryland, while Henderson's was a 25-yarder against Rhode Island. Henderson's pick-six was the first by a Gopher since **Coleman Bryson's** 70-yard return in the 2022 Pinstripe Bowl, while the Gophers now have multiple pick-sixes in a season for the first time since 2017 when Jacob Huff and Jonathan Celestin did it.

LIMITING EXPLOSIVES

► A key for the Minnesota defense this year has been the lack of explosive plays allowed.

► Minnesota is one of 14 programs in the country to have given up just one play from scrimmage of 50 yards or more this season and one of 23 to not give up a rushing play of at least 50 yards.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS

► Minnesota closed out the non-conference portion of its schedule with consecutive shutouts, defeating Rhode Island, 48-0, on Sept. 7 and Nevada, 27-0, on Sept. 14.

► It was the first time Minnesota accomplished the feat since October of 1962, and 1926 was the last time Minnesota had bigger back-to-back shutouts (122-0 over Iowa and Butler).

► The 2006 season marked the last time Minnesota had multiple shutouts in a season, and that was also the last time the Gophers posted two shutouts within the first three games of the year.

► All told, under new defensive coordinator **Corey Heatherman**, Minnesota went 128:41 of game time without allowing a point between the season opener and first quarter against Iowa.

► The 48-0 shutout victory over Rhode Island was the first for Minnesota since defeating Rutgers 31-0 on Oct. 29, 2022. Minnesota's 48-point margin of victory was its largest since a 62-10 win against Western Illinois in 2022, while the 48-point shutout was the team's biggest since a 62-0 win over Temple in 2006.

► Minnesota did not allow Rhode Island to cross mid-field until the 6:22 mark of the fourth quarter. Even then, the Rams did not advance past Minnesota's 48 in the game. The Gophers held the Rams to had six first downs, tied for the third fewest allowed by Minnesota since 1965, and forced four turnovers, including three picks.

► Through Saturday, Minnesota joins Alabama, Missouri, Ohio State and Tulane as the only teams with two shutouts this season.

WALLEY'S WORLD

► Senior cornerback **Justin Walley** has been one of the top corners in the Big Ten ever since he earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team in 2021 and was PFF's highest graded true freshman CB.

► This season, Walley has 35 tackles, 1.0 tackles for loss, two interceptions and a team-high nine pass break-ups. He's averaging 1.4 passes defended per game to lead the Big Ten and rank sixth nationally.

► Walley has 168 career interception yards, which ranks seventh in school history, while his 102 interception return yards this season rank ninth in Gopher history. In addition, with 26 career pass breakups, Walley is fifth in program history, just five off the school record.

► Walley recorded the first pick-six of his career with a 32-yard interception return against Maryland. It was his seventh career pick and second of the year. He added seven tackles and three pass breakups.

► He showed his talent against USC as he finished with a career high four pass breakups to go with three tackles. The four pass breakups tied for seventh most in a game at Minnesota since 1977 and were the most since Eric Murray also had four against UNLV in 2013.

► Prior to USC, Walley had missed the previous two games due to injury, marking the first two games he's missed in his career. He had played in all 42 Gopher games since the start of the 2021 season, including starts in the last 35 contests prior to his absence.

► Walley had a 70-yard interception return in the season opener against North Carolina to go along with six tackles. The return was the longest for Minnesota since **Coleman Bryson's** 70-yard pick-six in the 2022 Pinstripe Bowl and was the third longest interception return in Huntington Bank Stadium history.

► He had 45 tackles last year, eight pass breakups to lead the team and rank tied for fifth in the Big Ten. 2.0 tackles for loss, one forced fumble, a fumble recovery and one interception.

► Walley's run defense grade of 75.0 from Pro Football Focus led the team, while his tackling grade of 80.0 was best among Gopher returners.

LINDENBERG HEALTHY IN '24

► Redshirt junior **Cody Lindenberg** was hit by the injury bug last season and appeared in only four contests.

► He's healthy in 2024, though, leading the team with 76 tackles and ranking eighth in the Big Ten with 7.6 tackles per game. He's added 3.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks, six pass breakups, two QB hurries and an interception.

► Pro Football Focus rates Lindenberg third on the team in overall defensive grade (79.7) and second in rush defense (84.3).

► At Rutgers, Lindenberg finished with a career-high 14 tackles, the most by a Gopher since Mariano Sori-Marin had 15 at Penn State in 2022. It was Lindenberg's fourth game this season with at least 10 stops.

► Last year Lindenberg did not make his season debut until Oct. 28 against Michigan State when he had three tackles, including one for loss. He broke out, though, against Illinois when he tied a career high with 11 tackles, including 1.5 for loss, and forced a fumble.

► However, he missed the next two weeks before returning in the regular season finale against Wisconsin with a team-high 11 tackles, including 1.0 for loss. In the bowl game, he tied for the team lead with six stops.

► He was second on the team in 2022 with 71 tackles and fourth with 4.0 tackles for loss. He also had 1.0 sacks and two pass breakups. He led or tied for the team lead in tackles seven times that year, including a career-high 11 tackles in the bowl win over Syracuse.

PERICH JUST MAKES PLAYS

► A true freshman, **Koi Perich** has made an immediate impact for Minnesota.

► As a safety, he's made 21 tackles to go with a Big Ten-best five interceptions (tied for second most nationally), 0.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

► His five picks, including four in a three-game span against USC, UCLA and Maryland, are the most ever by a Gopher freshman.

► Two of his interceptions came at UCLA, joining Perich with teammate **Kerry Brown** as the only Gopher freshmen since at least 1990 to have multiple interceptions in a game. For his efforts versus the Bruins, Perich was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week, just the second Gopher freshman to ever win the award.

► On special teams, the Esko, Minn., native has returned 13 punts for a total of 168 yards this season, which is the most by a Gopher since Marcus Sherels had 179 in 2008, while Perich's current average of 12.9 yards per punt return rank second in the Big Ten, sit 11th nationally and would rank fifth in Gopher single-season history.

► In addition, Perich has 12 kick returns for 225 yards, putting him fourth on the team in all-purpose yards at 456.

► Since 2000, Perich is the only freshmen in all of FBS to have recorded over 100 punt return yards, 100 kick return yards and five interceptions in a season.

► Perich is the team's top-ranked defensive player by Pro Football Focus with a grade of 84.9 that also puts him 20th among all defensive backs in the country and 11th for FBS safeties. He's 13th overall in the Big Ten, third among defensive backs and second for safeties.

► As seen in the chart at left, Perich also leads the team in coverage grade at 88.7. The grade is 19th best overall in the country and 10th among FBS safeties. He's second in the Big Ten overall and leads all league defensive backs.

► Perich is looking to become the first true freshman to lead Minnesota in interceptions since Kyle Theret in 2007.

► Perich returned two punts for 82 yards at Michigan on Sept. 28, the most punt return yards by a player in eight years under **P.J. Fleck**. He also had 31 yards against Maryland, which ranks as fifth most under Fleck.

► One of Perich's returns at Michigan was a 60-yarder that was Minnesota's longest since Demetrius Douglas had a 69-yard return for a TD at Wisconsin in 2018. Perich's return was the third longest of the Fleck era, and, in 10 career games, he's got two of the five longest punt returns in the Fleck era, including a 28-yarder vs. Rhode Island.

► Of his 13 punt returns this season, four have gone for at least 20 yards, tying for eighth in the country and tied for second in the Big Ten.

► Perich had a career-high six tackles, forced a fumble for the first time in his career and had a game-sealing interception against USC. The performance earned him weekly honors from both the Shaun Alexander Award and Paul Hornung Award.

► Perich was tabbed the league's Freshman of the Week after he posted his Big Ten leading fifth interception of the season, which he returned 45 yards, to go with three tackles and 31 yards on three punt returns against Maryland.

► Perich was also the B1G Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 14. Perich is just the second player in league history to win the Big Ten's Freshman and Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same season, joining Northwestern's Godwin Igwebuike in 2014. Of note, Perich did it in separate weeks, while Igwebuike's honors came in the same week.

BROWN NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

► Gopher defensive back **Kerry Brown** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week following his standout performance against Nevada. The redshirt freshman recorded two interceptions – the first two of his career – and added four tackles as Minnesota shut out the Wolf Pack 27-0.

► It was the first multi-interception game for a Gopher since Tyler Nubin did so in the 2023 opener against Nebraska. Brown was also the first Minnesota freshman since **AT LEAST 1990** to have multiple picks in a game.

► Brown is one of 49 FBS players, and one of three Power 4 freshman including teammate **Koi Perich**, to have at least two interceptions in a game this year.

► Brown joins teammates **Justin Walley** (2021) and Perich (2024) as the only Gopher defensive players to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

► On the year, Brown, who did not play at UCLA, is second on the team in tackles (49) and is tied for third in interceptions (2). He also has 3.0 tackles for loss and two pass breakups.

► Brown's overall defensive grade of 80.4 from Pro Football Focus is second on the team and 24th overall in the Big Ten, including fourth among league safeties.

► In addition, Brown leads the team with a rush defense grade of 85.8 that is tied for 14th among FBS safeties, 12th overall in the Big Ten and second among B1G safeties.

► Brown's tackling grade of 77.8 is also first on the Gopher roster, and 15th among league safeties, while his 77.6 coverage grade is second on the team and 10th in the conference among safeties.

OTHER KEY PLAYERS ON 'D'

► Last year, **Jah Joyner** was third in the Big Ten and tied for 11th nationally with a PFF pass rush grade of 90.8 last season. This season, he's found success against the run as his PFF grade of 82.0 ranks fifth in the Big Ten among edge rushers. Overall, his defensive grade of 77.1 from PFF puts him eighth among Big Ten edge rushers.

► Joyner leads the Gophers in sacks (4.5), QB hurries (9) and forced fumbles (2), and he is second in tackles for loss (5.5) and pass breakups (7). Joyner's seven pass breakups are the most by a Gopher defensive lineman since Ra'Shede Hageman had eight in 2013.

► Defensive back **Jack Henderson** has rushed the passer 55 times this year, according to Pro Football Focus, the fifth highest total by a safety in the country. Henderson's pass rushing grade of 71.5 ranks seventh nationally among those safeties with at least 30 pass rush snaps, according to PFF.

► Henderson is tied for the team lead in TFLs (6.0) and is third in sacks (3.5). He's also got 31 tackles, a pick-six, a pass breakup and a fumble recovery. He and Pitt's Rasheem Biles are the only players in the FBS to post that stat line this year.

► At UCLA, **Anthony Smith** set career highs in tackles (4) and tackles for loss (2.5). The 2.5 TFLs were the most by a Gopher since Carter Coughlin had 3.0 against Penn State in 2019. They were also the most by a defensive lineman, and tied for the fourth most overall, under head coach **P.J. Fleck**.

► Smith is tied for the team lead in TFLs (6.0) and is second in sacks (4.0), quarterback hurries (7) and forced fumbles (1).

FOUR ADDED TO DEFENSE

► Four of Minnesota's 13 transfers this year came on defense, highlighted by defensive backs **Jai'onte McMillan** and **Ethan Robinson**, and defensive lineman **Jaxon Howard**.

► Robinson is in his final year of eligibility, while McMillan has two years left and Howard has four years.

► An All-Patriot League First Team honoree in 2023, Robinson came to Minnesota after three years at Bucknell. He played in 31 career games and made 154 tackles (124 solo) with 6.5 tackles for loss, one sack, 25 pass breakups, five interceptions and two forced fumbles.

► Robinson has started all 10 games at cornerback and is second on the team with three interceptions. He's also posted 37 tackles, including 3.0 TFLs, and added six pass breakups, a fumble recovery and forced fumble.

► McMillan spent four years at TCU, which included the Covid season in 2020 and a redshirt season in 2021 where he played in 33 career games. He recorded 15 tackles, two tackles for loss and one sack, four pass breakups and one interception for the Horned Frogs.

► Playing in nine games, McMillan has posted 18 tackles, including a career-high eight as he made his first career start against USC on Oct. 5. He's also got 0.5 tackles for loss and a quarterback hurry.

► Howard was the top-ranked player in the state of Minnesota in the 2023 recruiting class when he attended Robbinsdale Cooper High School in New Hope. He spent the 2023 season at LSU where he redshirted as a true freshman. Howard played in five games and recorded two tackles, seeing most of his action on special teams and as a reserve edge rusher.

► Howard has played seven games this season, recording seven tackles and a quarterback hurry.

KESICH THE REIGNING BIG TEN KICKER OF THE YEAR

- ▶ **Dragan Kesich** is trying to get back to the form that made him the 2023 Bakken-Andersen Big Ten Kicker of the Year.
- ▶ Kesich is 15-of-21 on the season on field goals, though five of his six misses have come from 43 yards or longer, including three from more than 50 yards.
- ▶ He's been better as of late, however, making each of his last eight kicks over the last three games after starting the season 7-of-13.
- ▶ At Illinois, Kesich went 4-of-4 on field goals, converting from 20, 45, 38, and 46 yards, and adding an extra point for a career-high 13 points. His four makes tied a career high and tied for third most in Gopher history.
- ▶ Kesich is now the fifth kicker in Gopher history with multiple games of 4+ made goals as he also made four last season at Iowa. He joins Adam Bailey, Mike Chalberg, Jim Gallery and Dan Nystrom in doing so.
- ▶ For his performance against the Illini, he was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time in his career, tying the program record held by Emmitt Carpenter and Adam Bailey.
- ▶ Kesich has made three field goals this year from longer than 50 yards, converting from 53 against Rhode Island, 52 versus Nevada and 51 at Rutgers. That gives him a school record six 50+ yard field goals in his career, while no other player has more than four such makes. The 53-yarder tied for the second-longest in Huntington Bank Stadium history (Kesich owns the record with a 54-yard make last season against Michigan).
- ▶ Kesich is also 45-of-55 on touchbacks this season, including going 9-for-9 against Rhode Island to set a career high for touchbacks in a game. He's tied for 16th nationally with his 45 touchbacks, 12th with a touchback percentage of 81.82, and he's 23rd in kickoff average at 64.02 yards.
- ▶ For context, Kesich is by far the best kickoff specialist in recent Gopher history. His touchback percentages over the last three years include 85.5 percent last year, 83.1 percent in 2022 and 62.7 percent in 2021. No other Gopher kicker since 2003 has even reached 55 percent.
- ▶ In his career, Kesich is 38-of-49 on field goals for a 77.6 percent success rate that is second in program history (min. 25 attempts). He is also tied for seventh in program history with his 38 career made field goals.
- ▶ He missed an extra point at Rutgers, the first of his career, snapping a streak of 56 straight made extra points that was the fourth longest in Gopher history. His career percentage of .983 ranks fifth in program annals.
- ▶ In his first season as the Gophers field goal kicker a year ago, Kesich had one of the best years in program history, resulting in him being named the Big Ten Kicker of the Year. He joined Carpenter in 2016 as the second Gopher to take home the honor.
- ▶ A semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award and a First Team All-Big Ten honoree last year, Kesich was 23-of-27 on field goals, good for an 85.2 percent conversion rate that ranked second in the Big Ten and 21st nationally. He did not miss more than one kick in any game a year ago.
- ▶ Kesich's 1.77 field goals per game led the Big Ten and ranked ninth in the FBS, while his 7.4 points per game were sixth in the Big Ten (fourth among kickers).
- ▶ His 23 makes last year were the second most in program history, just two back of **Dan Nystrom's** record of 25 set in 2000. Kesich's field goal percentage was third best by a Gopher kicker since 1977 (min. 10 attempts), and his 99 points ranked ninth in program history and fifth best by a Minnesota kicker since 1965.

- ▶ Two times last year Kesich was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week, tying for the most in one season in Gophers history.
- ▶ He converted the first two field goals of his career against Nebraska, including a game-winning 47-yarder as time expired. It was the first walk-off field goal in regulation for the Gophers since 2003 when **Rhys Llyod** made a 35-yarder as time expired to defeat Wisconsin.
- ▶ Against Michigan, Kesich connected on a career-long 54-yard field goal, which tied for the fifth-longest in program history and is a Huntington Bank Stadium record. It was Minnesota's longest field goal since Joel Monroe made a 54-yarder at Iowa on Nov. 10, 2007.
- ▶ At Ohio State, Kesich tied his career-long by making a 54-yard field goal. He also had a 50-yard make at Northwestern.

CRAWFORD, THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

- ▶ **Mark Crawford** is in his fifth season as the Gophers' punter. Also the team's holder, he's punted 41 times this year for a career-best average of 43.4 that ranks 34th nationally and fifth in the Big Ten. The figure also ranks fifth best for one season at Minnesota.
- ▶ He's got six 50-yard punts and 14 have landed inside the opponent's 20-yard line, including three punts against USC that all landed inside the 10.
- ▶ Crawford's career punt yardage total of 9,011 ranks second in Gophers history and his punt total of 216 ranks third. His average of 41.7 is sixth.
- ▶ Last year, he punted 65 times with a career best average of 42.5 yards per kick, which ranked ninth in program history.
- ▶ A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.
- ▶ He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win eight Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.
- ▶ At 30 years old (will turn 31 on Dec. 28), he entered the season as the fifth oldest player in college football, according to a preseason survey of FBS SIDs.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

- ▶ **Darius Taylor** leads all active FBS players in career all-purpose plays per game at 22.00 and is fourth in all-purpose yards per game (125.00).
- ▶ **Sieh Bangura** is 22nd among active FBS players with an average of 13.42 rushes per game and 15.03 all-purpose plays per game and 46th in rushing TDs (22).
- ▶ **Daniel Jackson** ranks 17th among FBS players in career receptions (195), 20th in receiving yards (2,534), 31st in receiving yards per game (48.7), 34th in TD receptions (17) and 37th in receptions per game (3.77).
- ▶ **Elijah Spencer** ranks 16th among active FBS players in career touchdown receptions (22) and is 48th in yards per catch (14.1).
- ▶ **Jaren Mangham** is 43rd among active FBS players in career touchdown rushes with 23.
- ▶ **Justin Walley** sits 11th among active FBS players in career defensive touchdowns (2), 14th in passes defended (33), 15th in interception yardage (168), 24th in non-offensive touchdowns (2), 32nd in career interceptions (7) and 40th in passes defended per game (0.70).
- ▶ **Jah Joyner** checks in at No. 43 among active FBS players with 108 sack yards in his career and No. 49 in total sacks (14.5).
- ▶ **Mark Crawford** is 15th among active FBS players in career punts (216), 17th in punt yards (9,011), 45th in punts per game (4.00) and 47th in punt average (41.7).

- ▶ **Dragan Kesich** is 34th among active FBS kickers in field goals made (38) and 38th in field goals attempted (49).

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

- ▶ Historically, Minnesota has been one of the least penalized teams in the country under **P.J. Fleck**.
- ▶ In Fleck's previous seven seasons as head coach, the Gophers led the country in fewest penalties per game three times, including each of the last two years, and the team has never finished lower than 15th.
- ▶ Minnesota has ended the season averaging fewer than four penalties per game four times.
- ▶ In addition, the Gophers have placed 10th or better in penalty yards per game in five of Fleck's seasons, including four finishes in the top five and leading the country in 2017. They finished second a year ago and third in 2022.
- ▶ Five times Minnesota has ended the season averaging fewer than 40 penalty yards per game.
- ▶ This season, the Gophers rank 16th in penalty yards per game at 40.30 and 27th in penalties per game at 5.20.

THREE SELLOUTS CONTINUE ATTENDANCE TREND

- ▶ Minnesota has announced sellout crowds in three of the six home games so far this season, bringing the total to 24 sellouts in the 16 years of Huntington Bank Stadium, including eight under **P.J. Fleck**.
- ▶ Attendance for the Gophers' season opener versus North Carolina was 50,805, while the Iowa game brought in 52,048, the 10th largest crowd in HBS history, and the USC game featured an attendance of 50,913.
- ▶ With back-to-back sellouts against Iowa and USC, it's the first time since the final two home games of 2019 that Minnesota had back-to-back sellouts.
- ▶ This marks the third season in the history of the facility that the Gophers have had three sellouts in one year, joining the opening season of 2009 and 2015.
- ▶ Minnesota's figures last year were among the best in the young history of Huntington Bank Stadium, which opened in 2009 and celebrated its 100th game against Illinois on Nov. 4, 2023.
- ▶ The average attendance of 48,453 was the fourth best in facility history. The only better marks came in 2015 (52,355) when the Minnesota Vikings shared the stadium while U.S. Bank Stadium was being built and capacity expanded, plus in 2009 (50,805) and 2010 (49,513), the first two years of the stadium.

TWO NEW TO STAFF IN '24

- ▶ Two new faces joined the Gophers' coaching staff in 2024 with defensive coordinator / linebackers coach **Corey Hetherman** and special teams coordinator **Bob Ligashesky**.
- ▶ At Rutgers, Hetherman took over an inexperienced unit that had seven combined career starts prior to his arrival before the 2022 season. That year, the defense improved by allowing 46.7 fewer yards per game compared to 2021, 28.1 fewer passing yards and 18.6 fewer rushing yards. Rutgers posted its best mark in total defense (349.8) in 10 years.
- ▶ Ligashesky came to Minnesota with nearly 40 years of coaching experience, most recently serving as special teams coordinator at Syracuse where his units ranked second in kick return defense in the ACC in 2023 and third in the nation in kickoff return average in 2022.
- ▶ The veteran coach spent 12 years in the NFL, mostly coaching special teams, including with the 2008 Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh Steelers. He also has extensive experience at the college level. In addition to Syracuse, he has coached at Bowling Green, Illinois, Pittsburgh, Kent State, Arizona State (graduate assistant) and Wake Forest (graduate assistant).

► He also previously worked with Fleck, as they were on the same 2012 Tampa Bay Buccaneers staff. Ligashesky was coaching safeties and special teams, while Fleck was coaching receivers.

► Along with the new coaching additions, Fleck promoted defensive line coach **Winston DeLattiboudere III** to Assistant Head Coach and named **Eric Koehler** Tight Ends Coach.

NEW UNIFORMS FOR 2024

► Minnesota's new Nike uniforms feature the traditional colors of maroon and gold and include a white uniform for road games. Minnesota has also retained its current alternate black uniforms as an option for the 2024 season.

► The jersey relaunch was the first for Minnesota since it unveiled new uniforms in February 2018. Those uniforms were worn for six seasons from 2018-23.

► The most significant changes to the uniforms are the addition of shoulder stripes to the jerseys and stripes on the side of the pants.

► The state of Minnesota is featured on the outside collar of all three jerseys, while Minnesota's rallying call of 'Ski-U-Mah' is emblazoned on the inside of the jersey collar. The iconic 'Block M' remains on the front of the jersey, situated in the middle of the collar right above the numbers. The Big Ten logo is on the right chest, while the Nike swoosh is on the left chest and left hip.

► The maroon jerseys feature gold numbers, which is a change from the previous maroon jerseys when the numbering was white.

► The official colors for the uniforms unveiled are Night Maroon, University Gold and White. Minnesota's helmet colors for the 2024 season are maroon, gold and white.

► The uniforms are the Nike Vapor Field Utility Special Edition (F.U.S.E.) variety, which are stronger, lighter and more breathable than Minnesota's previous uniforms.

BEST YEARLY SPANS

► As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their eighth season under **P.J. Fleck**. Fleck entered the year 50-34 overall and 29-32 in the Big Ten.

► He had the most Big Ten wins, the second most overall wins and the third-best overall winning percentage (.595) of any Minnesota coach through his first seven seasons. Below is a look at how other yearly spans compare in Gopher history.

► **Last 7 Years (2017-23; 50-34 overall, 29-32 B1G):** The 50 wins are tied for 10th most in a seven-year span in program history. The .595 win percentage is tied for the third best since 1967 (.631 from 2016-22 and .600 from 2013-19). The 29 B1G wins are second most in a seven-year span since 1973 (31 wins from 2016-22).

► The five bowl trips in seven years is tied for seventh best (6 trips in 7 years done 6 times), while **the five bowl wins in seven years is tied for the most in school history** (also 5 from 2016-22 and 2015-21).

► **Last 6 Years (2018-23; 45-27 overall, 27-24 B1G):** The 45 wins are second best in a six-year span at Minnesota since 1908 (46 wins from 2014-19). The .625 win percentage is the best in a six-year span since 1965 and second best since 1949. The 27 Big Ten wins are tied for the second most in a six-year span at Minnesota (won 28 games from 1960-65). The .519 Big Ten win percentage is the team's best in a six-year span since 1973. **The five bowl wins in six years are the most in program history, while the five bowl trips in six years is tied for best in program history.**

► **Last 5 Years (2019-23; 38-21 overall, 24-19 B1G):** The 38 wins are second best in a five-year span in program history since 1907 (39 wins from 2018-22). The .644 win percentage is second best since 1964 (won .661 from 2018-22).

► **The 24 Big Ten wins are tied for the most in a five-year span at Minnesota, joining the 2018-22 span.** The B1G win percentage of .558 is tied for the best since 1967-71 (.569). **The four bowl wins in five years are tied for the most in school history; it's been done three times.** The four bowl trips in five years is tied for third best in program history.

► **Last 4 Years (2020-23; 27-19 overall, 17-17 B1G):** The .500 win percentage in conference games is just the third time since 1970 the team finished .500 or better in a four-year span (the other two also came under Fleck in 2018-21 and 2019-22). **The three bowl wins in four years are tied for the most in school history; it's happened seven times.**

► **Last 3 Years (2021-23; 24-15 overall, 14-13 B1G):** The 24 wins in a three-year span is the team's best since winning 25 from 2002-04. It's just the third time since 1906 that Minnesota won at least 24 games over three years. The 14 conference wins are tied for fourth most in a three-year span. Minnesota has made a bowl game three straight years for just the seventh time in program history; 2002-04 marks the only other time Minnesota won three bowl games in three years.

► **Last 2 Years (2021-22; 15-11 overall, 8-10 B1G):** Minnesota has won back-to-back bowl games for the sixth time in program history.

GOPHER GRADUATES

► Minnesota's 2024 roster features 19 student-athletes who have already graduated: **Max Brosmer, Quinn Carroll, Tyler Cooper, Mark Crawford, Aireontae Erserly, Lucas Finnessy, Sam Henson, Daniel Jackson, Darnell Jefferies, Jah Joyner, Nick Kallerup, Derek LeCaptain, Martes Lewis, Cody Lindenberg, Jalen Logan-Redding, Marcus Major, Jaren Mangham, Logan Richter and Danny Strigow.**

NUBIN DRAFTED IN 2024

► Minnesota defensive back Tyler Nubin heard his name called in the 2024 NFL Draft when the All-American safety was selected in the second round with the 47th overall pick by the New York Giants.

► Nubin is the 10th Gopher defensive back to be drafted since 2014 and he is the third safety to be drafted since 2020, joining **Jordan Howden** (2021, fifth round to New Orleans) and All-Pro First Team **Antoine Winfield Jr.** (2020, second round to Tampa Bay).

► With Nubin going in the second round, Minnesota has now had a first or second round pick in five straight drafts (2020-24). The last time that happened was 1941-45.

► Minnesota is one of 13 programs in the country to have a pick in the first or second round in each of the last five drafts along with Alabama, Clemson, Florida, Georgia LSU, Michigan, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Penn state and USC.

► Minnesota has also now had at least one draft pick in the last six drafts (2019-24). The last time that happened was 2003-08.

► Nubin's selection marked the second straight year that the Giants drafted a Gopher after they picked center **John Michael Schmitz** last season with the 57th overall pick. New York also chose **Carter Coughlin** and **Chris Williamson** in the seventh round of the 2020 Draft. All-time, Nubin is the 26th Gopher drafted by the franchise. The only NFL team with more Minnesota draft picks is Green Bay with 41.

► Scorigami is a concept developed by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks final scores that have never happened before in NFL history.

► In Minnesota's 1,330 all-time games, there have been 568 unique scores.

► The most common overall score is 6-0, which has happened 25 times, though none have taken place since 1963. The next most common is 13-7, which has occurred 18 times, most recently in 1985.

► Minnesota's most common result is a 13-7 victory, which it has done 13 times.

► Below are the Scorigami results for Minnesota football this season.

► **North Carolina 19, Minnesota 17.** No scorigami; sixth such score (MR: loss vs. USC in 2011) and second Gopher loss (USC in 2011).

► **Minnesota 48, Rhode Island 0.** No scorigami; fourth such score (MR: loss to Nebraska in 1989) and second Gopher win (MR: South Dakota State in 1930).

► **Minnesota 27, Nevada 0.** No scorigami; 11th such score (MR: loss to Northwestern in 2015) and sixth Gopher win (MR: Ohio State in 1949).

HEAD COACH // EIGHTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 43, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 86-60 and is 56-38 at Minnesota.

In seven years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program.

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season three times, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 and 2022 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 5-0 in bowl games, and his five bowl wins are the most in school history by a coach (Glen Mason was 3-4 in bowl games at Minnesota).

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached six All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman, John Michael Schmitz, Tyler Nubin and Mohamed Ibrahim twice), nine Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, John Michael Schmitz, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 379 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

The 2023 season saw Minnesota beat rival Iowa on the road to reclaim Floyd of Rosedale and win its fifth straight bowl game under Fleck (beat Bowling Green in the Quick Lane Bowl). Defensive back Tyler Nubin was named an All-American as he set a school record for most career interceptions with 13 and Dragan Kesich was recognized as the Big Ten Kicker of the Year.

Minnesota set a program record as nine Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (previous record of eight was set in 2018 and tied in 2019) and true freshman Darius Taylor established himself as one of the best running backs in the nation. Taylor rushed 138 times for 799 yards and five touchdowns in six games of action. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week three times and set a school record for most yards by a true freshman when he ran for 208 yards in the Quick Lane Bowl victory.

The 2022 season saw Minnesota post nine wins as the Gophers went 9-4 overall, which included a bowl win against Syracuse and a road win at rival Wisconsin. Minnesota, which went 5-2 at home, 3-2 on the road and 1-0 in neutral site games, was paced by a stout, family-room defense and a bruising offense that featured two All-Americans.

Minnesota ended the season ranked No. 4 in the nation in scoring defense (13.85), No. 5 in third-down conversion defense (.279) and No. 9

in the nation in total defense (295.1 yards per game).

The 13.85 points allowed per game were the fewest that Minnesota has permitted since 1967 when it allowed 10.6 points per game during the 10-game season. Minnesota posted two shutouts during the season (38-0 against New Mexico State and 31-0 against Rutgers), which is had not done since 2006 and the Gophers were the only team in the nation to shutout two FBS teams in 2022 (Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State each had two shutouts, but one each came against an FCS foe).

First-Team All-American center John Michael Schmitz and Second-Team All-American running back Mohamed Ibrahim paced the Gopher offense, which ranked No. 17 in the nation with 207.3 rushing yards per game. With Schmitz anchoring an offensive line that featured four new starters, Ibrahim set single season records in rushing attempts (320), rushing yards (1,665), rushing touchdowns (20), total touchdowns (20), total points (120) and 100-yard rushing games (10).

The 2022 season also saw three Gophers named either a semifinalist, finalist or winner of a national award. Ibrahim was named Comeback Player of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award. Schmitz was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy and was also a semifinalist for the Outland Trophy and the Rotary Lombardi Award. Quarterback Tanner Morgan was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times for 1,076 yards and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history, while the defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annestad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota had eight Gophers named Big Ten Player of the Week and Tyler Johnson

became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gustkunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and host an annual diaper drive during training camp and an annual turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.

GOVERNOR'S VICTORY BELL

Minnesota vs. Penn State

Like Floyd of Rosedale, Minnesota's fourth and most recent traditional game trophy was founded by a pair of state governors.

Then-acting Governor Mark Singel of Pennsylvania and former Governor Arne Carlson of Minnesota established the Governor's Victory Bell on Sept. 4, 1993, the date of the first Minnesota-Penn State game. The contest, which took place at Beaver Stadium on the Penn State campus, marked the first game between the two teams and also signified the inaugural Big Ten game for the Nittany Lions.

"As the Nittany Lions' initial conference opponent, Minnesota always will occupy a special place in Penn State football history, and we think it is appropriate to mark the occasion in this distinctive fashion," said Singel in 1993. "Governor Robert Casey was an early supporter of Penn State's move to the Big Ten Conference, and I know he looks forward to future conference games involving the Nittany Lions."

"Big Ten athletics has been a tremendously positive experience in the life of our state," said Carlson. "Minnesota's matchup against Penn State is a historic welcome to a school that will further enrich that experience for all of us. This trophy marks a very special occasion, and will allow us to remember it for years to come."

An artists' conception of the Governor's Victory Bell was presented by Singel and Carlson prior to the kickoff of that 1993 game, which Penn State won 38-20. The design of the trophy is a brass bell bearing a medallion of the Big Ten Conference, suspended from a wooden frame. At the top of the frame is a plaque which features the state seals of Minnesota and Pennsylvania, along with the following inscription:

Presented annually to the winner of the Penn State-Minnesota football game

Established September 4, 1993

At the bottom of the base, the Minnesota and Penn State athletics logos appear, along with individual brass plates for inscription of the scores of the games between the two teams.

After a two year hiatus between 1995-96, the battle for the Governor's Victory Bell returned in 1997 when Penn State earned a hard-fought 16-15 victory at Beaver Stadium. The 1998 game returned to the Metrodome for only the second time in the short history of the Bell, where the Nittany Lions earned a 27-17 win. Minnesota took the Victory Bell home for the first time in 1999 when the Golden Gophers scored a historic 24-23 upset against the second-ranked Nittany Lions at Beaver Stadium. In 2000, the Golden Gophers were again victorious, winning 25-16 at the Metrodome.

The Nittany Lions and Golden Gophers didn't meet in 2001 and 2002 and when the series renewed in 2003, the Gophers earned the right to keep the Bell with a 20-14 win in Happy Valley. Penn State claimed the bell for the first time in six years with their 44-14 win against Minnesota in 2005 and retained it with a 28-27 overtime win against the Gophers in the Metrodome in 2006. After a two-year hiatus, the series resumed in 2009 with a 20-0 Penn State victory in Happy Valley. A 33-21 win for Penn State at TCF Bank Stadium in 2010 gave the Nittany Lions four straight wins in the series. Minnesota reclaimed the Bell in 2013 with a 24-10 home win. The teams did not play in 2014 or 2015. In 2016, Penn State won 29-26 in Happy Valley overtime to secure the Bell. The No. 13 Gophers beat No. 5 Penn State 31-26 on Nov. 9, 2019 to earn back the Bell - the win was Minnesota's first home victory against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 - to win the Little Brown Jug - in 1977.

The addition of the Governor's Victory Bell to the Golden Gophers' list of traditional trophy games means that Minnesota has four active "trophy" rivalries on its schedule, more than any other college football program in the country.
