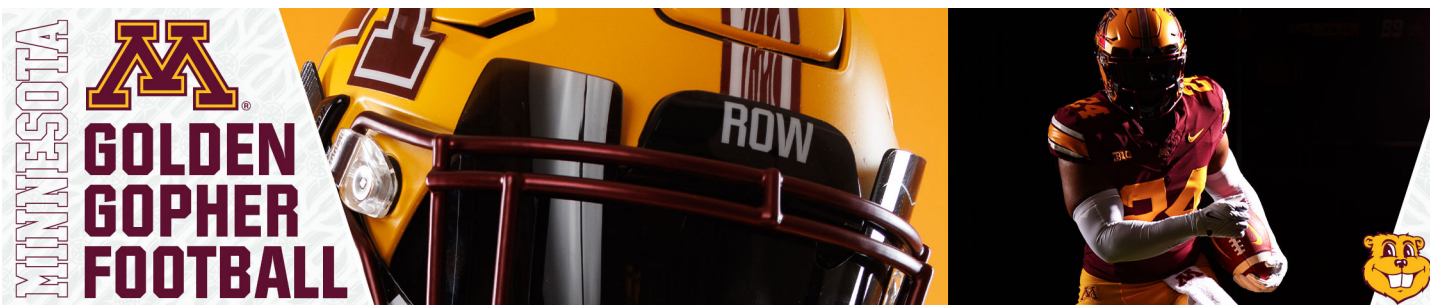

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

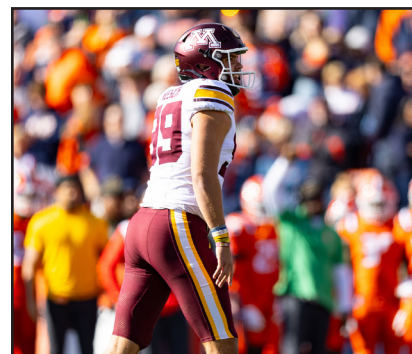
1 Winners of four in a row, NR/RV Minnesota (6-3, 4-2) goes on the road for the second straight week as it visits Rutgers (4-4, 1-4) Saturday. Kickoff is set for 11:00 a.m. CT on NBC and the Gopher Radio Network.

2 **Max Brosmer** has been excellent in 2024, completing 191-of-280 passes for 1,989 yards and 13 touchdowns with four interceptions for a rating of 140.3. He's also scored four rushing touchdowns. Pro Football Focus ranks Brosmer tied for eighth among FBS QBs with a passer grade of 86.5 this year, while his overall offensive grade of 86.1 ranks 15th at the position. He's second in the Big Ten in passing grade and third in overall grade. Brosmer's completion percentage of 68.2 percent is on pace to be the best in Minnesota single-season history (min. 100 attempts), ahead of Tanner Morgan's 66.9 percent performance in 2022. In addition, Brosmer's TD:INT ratio of 3.25 is third in Minnesota history. Brosmer has gone four straight games without an interception, the longest streak at Minnesota since Mitch Leidner went five games without a pick over the final three games of 2014 and first two of 2015. 3 A true freshman, **Koi Perich** has made an immediate impact for Minnesota. As a safety, he's made 16 tackles to go with a Big Ten-best five interceptions (second most nationally) and a forced fumble. His five picks, four of which have come in the last four games, are the most ever by a Gopher freshman. Two of his interceptions came at UCLA, joining Perich with at least 1990 to have multiple interceptions in a game. For his efforts versus the Bruins, Perich was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week, just the second Gopher freshman to ever win the award. On special teams, he's returned 12 punts for a total of 170 yards this season, which is the most by a Gopher since Marcus Sherels had 179 in 2008, while Perich's current average of 14.2 yards per punt return leads the Big Ten, sits seventh nationally and would rank third in Gopher single-season history. In addition, Perich has nine kick returns for 163 yards, putting him fourth on the team in all-purpose yards at 396. Since 2000, Perich is the only freshmen in all of FBS to have recorded over 100 punt return yards, 100 kick return yards and five interceptions in a season. 4 The Gophers, who became bowl eligible with last week's win at No. 24 Illinois, have won four games in a row. They're looking for their first five-game win streak overall since taking the final three contests of 2021 and first four of 2022, and their first five-game win streak in the Big Ten since winning the final conference game of 2018 and the first six in league play in 2019. Over the four games, Minnesota is winning the turnover battle 10-1, including zero turnovers in any of the last three games, which had not happened since 2003. Several players have stood out over the winning streak, as well (see box right).

5 The 2024 campaign is the eighth for Fleck at Minnesota, where his record stands at 56-37. He is fourth in program history in Big Ten wins (33) and is fifth in overall wins and games coached (93). Fleck's .602 win percentage is third best among Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 12th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 86-59 (.593).

FACING RUTGERS

► Minnesota and Rutgers meet for just the fourth time ever Saturday. The Golden Gophers have won all three previous matchups, prevailing at home in 2016, in Piscataway in 2019, and most recently back in Minneapolis in 2022.

► All-time, the Gophers have outscored the Scarlet Knights, 107-39, including a 73-7 edge in the last two games.

► This will be the Gophers' first trip to Piscataway since 2019, their longest current absence on the road against a league member. Excluding the four new teams to the Big Ten in 2024, Minnesota has played at every other conference school since 2020.

► Minnesota has played 143 opponents in its history. A win Saturday would make Rutgers the 11th program that the Golden Gophers are 4-0 or better against. The Scarlet Knights would be the fifth FBS team to join that group along with Miami (OH) (5-0), Colorado State (4-0), Louisiana (4-0) and Western Michigan (4-0).

► **P.J. Fleck** is currently 2-0 all-time against Rutgers after victories in 2019 and 2022. A win would give him his most wins without a loss against one team while head coach at Minnesota as he's also 2-0 versus Colorado, Fresno State, Indiana, Miami (OH) and New Mexico State.

► Fleck has faced 34 teams as Minnesota's head coach and is undefeated against 22. In his coaching career, he's taken on 49 teams and has not lost to 25.

► Minnesota does not have any New Jersey natives on its roster, though it does have six players from the surrounding area. Freshman DL **Jaylin Hicks** (Iona Prep) is from Harlem, N.Y., while freshman DB **Samuel Madu** (Archbishop Stepinac HS) hails from the Bronx, N.Y., both of which are about 50 miles northeast of Piscataway. Senior DB **Ethan Robinson** (Iona Prep) is from Montgomery, N.Y., which is about 100 miles north of Piscataway.

► In addition, redshirt senior DL **Jah Joyner** (Danbury HS) is from Danbury, Conn., roughly 125 miles northeast of Rutgers, freshman RB **Fame Ijeboi's** (William Penn Charter) hometown is Folcroft, Pa., about 80 miles southwest of Piscataway, and redshirt sophomore DL **Anthony Smith** (Shippensburg HS) calls Shippensburg, Pa., home, approximately 200 miles west of Rutgers.

► Rutgers does not have any Minnesotans on its roster, but it does have three former Gophers. Senior QB Athan Kaliakmanis and senior WR Dino Kaliakmanis each spent the past three seasons with the Gophers, while senior DB Flip Dixon played at Minnesota from 2020-22.

► Gophers head coach **P.J. Fleck**, served as wide receivers coach under Rutgers head coach Greg Schiano at two stops. First at Rutgers from 2010-11, then with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012.

► Minnesota special teams coordinator **Bob Ligashesky** was also on staff with the Bucs for the 2012 season, holding the same title.

► Minnesota defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Corey Hetherman** spent the past two seasons with the Scarlet Knights as the team's linebackers coach, while Gophers wide receivers coach **Matt Simon** was in Piscataway from 2012-13, first working in player development then as wide receivers coach.

► Scarlet Knights offensive coordinator Kirk Ciarrocca held the same position at Minnesota in two stints, first from 2017-19 and again in 2022. He was also Fleck's OC at Western Michigan from 2013-16. Also on that staff at WMU were Gophers offensive coordinator **Greg Harbaugh** (GA), offensive line coach **Brian Callahan** (OL coach), wide receivers coach **Matt Simon** (WRs) and safeties coach **Danny Collins** (GA).

► Additionally, Ciarrocca was at Rutgers in 2010 with Fleck and Schiano as the co-offensive coordinator/QBs coach.

► Scarlet Knights defensive coordinator Joe Harasymiak was on the Minnesota staff from 2018-21, spending his first two years as defensive backs/safeties coach before becoming co-defensive coordinator in his final two seasons.

► Hetherman coached under Harasymiak at Maine from 2016-18 as defensive coordinator when the latter was head coach. Before that, Harasymiak was the Black Bears' DC in 2015 when Hetherman was the defensive line coach. The pair also overlapped at Springfield College in 2009 when both were graduate assistants.

► Ligashesky coached special teams at Bowling Green in 2021 when Rutgers defensive ends coach Julian Campenni coached the same position with the Falcons.

► Rutgers DB Eric Rogers played at Northern Illinois from 2020-22 when Minnesota running backs coach **Nic McKissic-Luke** held the same title with the Huskies.

► The Scarlet Knights enter the game with a 4-4 record overall and 1-4 mark in league play. They started the year 4-0, including wins over Virginia Tech and Washington, but have since lost four in a row.

► Minnesota and Rutgers have two common opponents so far this year in USC and UCLA. The Gophers defeated both, topping the Trojans in Minneapolis and going on the road to beat the Bruins. The Scarlet Knights went 0-2 in those games, falling at home to UCLA and losing at USC.

► Quarterback Athan Kaliakmanis is 131-of-242 for 1,650 yards and nine touchdowns and five interceptions for an efficiency rating of 119.5 this season. He is fifth in the Big Ten in yards per completion (12.60).

► Kyle Monangain is the top Rutgers rusher with 931 yards and 10 touchdowns on 172 carries. He ranks second in the Big Ten in rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (10), rushing yards and rush yards per game (116.4), fourth in all-purpose yards per game (122.5) and scoring average (7.5), eighth in points scored (60) and 10th in yards per carry (5.41).

► Rutgers' passing attack is led by Dymere Miller, who has team highs in receptions (37), receiving yards (480) and receiving yards per game (60.0). Kenny Fletcher's two touchdown receptions lead the team, while Ian Strong's 16.69 yards per catch rank sixth in the conference.

► Defensively, Dariel Djabome has the team lead with 69 tackles, and his 8.6 tackles per game rank fourth in the Big Ten. Jordan Thompson's 4.0 tackles for loss lead the team, while Kyonte Hamilton's 2.5 sacks are most on Rutgers.

► Shaquan Loyol has two interceptions and five pass breakups to pace the Scarlet Knights in both categories.

► Jai Patel is 6-of-10 on field goals with a long of 49 yards. Jakob Anderson is averaging 42.6 yards per punt to rank seventh in the Big Ten.

► Christian Dremel is averaging 13.63 yards per punt return, while Ben Black has all two of the three kick returns on the season with a 19.0 average.

LAST TIME VS. THE SCARLET KNIGHTS

► *With assistance from the AP:* Mohamed Ibrahim rushed for 159 yards and three touchdowns on 36 carries to lead Minnesota past Rutgers 31-0 when the teams last met in 2022 in Minneapolis.

► Quarterback Tanner Morgan crisply returned from a concussion that kept him out of the previous game for the Gophers, who enjoyed a 19-play, 99-yard drive on their first possession that drained 10:24 off the clock.

► For the game, Minnesota converted 13 of 19 third downs and had the ball for 41:02.

► Minnesota's revived defense produced a punishing and unrelenting performance against a Scarlet Knights team missing leading rusher Samuel Brown V.

► Gavin Wimsatt made his second career start, going 6 for 17 for 68 yards. He threw the first of two interceptions by Tyler Nubin at the Rutgers 33 early in the fourth quarter to set up Ibrahim's third score.

► That was Ibrahim's 46th career touchdown, breaking the all-time program record held by Darrell Thompson, who cheered the feat from his perch in the radio booth.

► Wimsatt was replaced by Noah Vedral, the sixth-year player who started the previous three games, when he took a shoulder-to-shoulder hit at the end of a run and had his head snap back hard against the turf midway through the fourth quarter. The Scarlet Knights had just 134 total yards of offense.

► Ibrahim extended his streak of 100-yard games to 16 straight against a rugged Rutgers team that entered the game ranked sixth in the FBS and third in the conference in rushing defense.

PREVIOUSLY IN PISCATAWAY

► With assistance from the AP: Rodney Smith ran for 111 yards and two touchdowns and No. 20 Minnesota improved to 7-0 with a 42-7 victory against Rutgers when the teams last met in Piscataway in 2019.

► Smith scored on runs of 3 and 16 yards and Tanner Morgan threw two touchdowns as the Gophers won their ninth straight game spanning two seasons.

► Smith got Minnesota on the scoreboard late in the first quarter with his short run and Morgan had a 13-yard TD pass to Rashod Bateman with less than five minutes left in the half. Smith scored from 16 yards out on the opening series of the second half for a 21-0 lead.

► Rutgers, which was using its third quarterback of the season, was outgained 443-197. Johnny Langan was 9 of 19 for 48 yards and three interceptions, two by Winfield. Rutgers avoided the shutout when Kay/Ron Adams scored on a 5-yard run with 5:33 to play.

► The Gophers blew the game open in the fourth quarter, when Mohamed Ibrahim had a 6-yard TD run and defensive back Antoine Winfield Jr. scored on a 33-yard interception return on Rutgers' very next possession.

► Morgan, who went 15 of 28 for 245 yards, threw his second TD, a 56-yarder to Tyler Johnson in the fourth quarter.

► There was a tender moment after the Ibrahim touchdown. Redshirt sophomore Casey O'Brien, a four-time cancer survivor, was sent out to hold the ball for the extra point by kicker Michael Lantz. He was mobbed by teammates after the kick.

RECAPING ILLINOIS

► With assistance from the AP: Max Brosmer threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Jameson Geers and Dragan Kesich kicked his fourth field goal of the game in the final five minutes, rallying Minnesota to a 25-17 victory over No. 24 Illinois on Saturday.

► It was the fourth consecutive win for Minnesota, while Illinois dropped its second straight.

► Brosmer completed 22 of 37 passes for 213 yards and a TD. Darius Taylor ran for 131 yards and a TD on 22 carries and he was the Golden Gophers' leading receiver with nine catches for 58 yards. Elijah Spencer had six catches for 67 yards.

► Luke Altmeyer was 20 of 33 for 226 yards and a TD for Illinois, but lost two fumbles.

► Illinois' final drive ended deep in Minnesota territory when Altmeyer was sacked by Jah Joyner and his fumble was recovered by Danny Striggow on the Gophers 27.

► Pat Bryant (72 yards) and Zakhari Franklin (71 yards and a score) both caught five passes. Josh McCray rushed seven times for 71 yards and a TD.

► Illinois took a 17-16 lead with 9:03 to go when Altmeyer threw a 21-yard TD pass to Franklin after Minnesota's fake came up short, giving the Illini the ball on their own 46.

MILESTONE WATCH

► Fourth in program history for career receptions at 189, Daniel Jackson is nine catches from matching Ron Johnson for third in Gopher history and 11 away from hitting the 200-catch mark in a career.

► Fifth in program history for career receiving yards, Jackson is 176 receiving yards away from catching Tutu Atwell (2,640) for fourth. Jackson is also 36 yards away from becoming the fifth Gopher to hit 2,500 in a career.

► Two touchdown receptions would match Jackson Rashod Bateman (19) for sixth in program annals, while three more would make Jackson the fifth Gopher to hit 20 career TD receptions.

STAT COMPARISON

- Push Minnesota's record to 7-3 overall and 5-2 in the Big Ten
- Improve the Gophers to 4-0 all-time against Rutgers, including 2-0 in Piscataway
- Make Rutgers the 11th program, and fifth FBS team, that Minnesota is 4-0 against all-time
- Give P.J. Fleck a 3-0 record against Rutgers, his most wins without a loss against one team
- Mark the Gophers' first five-game win streak since winning the final three games of 2021 and first four of 2022
- Be the team's first five-game win streak in the Big Ten since winning seven in a row between 2018-19
- Go down as the fifth 7-win season under Fleck, tied for third most in program history
- Enhance Fleck's record to 57-37 at Minnesota and 87-59 overall

► A 100-yard receiving game would be the eighth of Jackson's career, tying him with Ron Johnson for sixth all-time at Minnesota.

► With 56 receptions on the season, Jackson sits 19th in single-season history at Minnesota and would need five catches to crack the top-10.

► Sitting at 642 receiving yards, Jackson is 158 yards back of recording the 19th 800-yard season in Gopher annals.

► **Max Brosmer** is 11 passing yards away from recording the 21st 2,000-yard season in Gopher history. In addition, he needs one more completion, two touchdown passes, one more 250-yard game and one 300-yard game to crack the single-season top-10 list in each category.

► With 1,443 career rush yards, **Darius Taylor** needs 14 yards to catch Jim Carter (1,457) for 33rd in school annals and 31 to tie Donnell Kirkwood (1,474) for 32nd.

► Taylor is nine receptions away from breaking Chuck Rios' single-season reception record by a Gopher running back. Rios holds the mark with 52 receptions in 1994, and Rios also ranks second with 48 catches in 1993.

► Taylor needs 41 all-purpose yards to achieve the 49th 1000-yard season in Gopher history.

► **Koi Perich** is one interception away from tying Walter Bowser (6) for third in Minnesota single-season history and two back of the school record of seven held by Antoine Winfield Jr. (2019) and Jeff Wright (1970).

► **Justin Walley** is four pass breakups away from tying Willie Middlebrooks (30) for fourth in program history and five back of the school record shared by three players.

► Walley is seventh in career interception return yards at Minnesota with 168 and is 115 away from the school record of 283 set by Lumpkin. In addition, with 102 interception yards this season, Walley ranks ninth but is 36 yards away from reaching second place and 101 back of Bowser's record of 203 set in 1970.

► Walley (9) also needs two pass breakups to reach Minnesota's single-season top-10.

► Sitting at 14.5 career sacks, **Jah Joyner** is already 10th in Gopher history and would need 1.5 more to get as high as sixth place.

► With 210 career punts, **Mark Crawford** is five away from tying Brent Berbel for third in Gopher history. Crawford (8,751) can also move into second on the punt yardage list with 177 more punt yards.

► **Dragan Kesich** (36) needs two made field goals to tie Adam Bailey for eighth all-time at Minnesota. Four more makes would give Kesich 17 made this season, entering him into Minnesota's single-season top-10.

► Kesich is also 11 points away from tying Brent Berglund (175) for 10th in kicker scoring in Gopher history.

► **Sieh Bangura** has 1,994 career rushing yards, including 1,982 recorded at Ohio, leaving him 6 yards away from 2,000 for his career.

► Sitting at 1,398 career rushing yards, **Jaren Mangham** needs 102 more to reach 1,500.

► More record book information is located on Pages 14-15.

► Minnesota does not appear in the AP Poll but it is receiving votes in Coaches Poll this week for the first time this season. Rutgers does not show up in either poll.

► The Gophers received 14 points in the Coaches Poll, putting them eighth among the teams receiving votes and 33rd overall.

► Among Minnesota opponents in 2024, Penn State is the only one ranked in both polls as the Nittany Lions are sixth in the AP Poll and seventh in the Coaches.

► Minnesota is 2-1 against AP Top 25 teams this year, losing at then-No. 12 Michigan on Sept. 28, 27-24, before returning home the following week to beat then-No. 11 USC on Oct. 5, 24-17 and winning on the road at No. 24 Illinois, 25-17, on Nov. 2.

► The Gophers' win over the Trojans was their first against a team ranked 11th or better since beating No. 9 Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl and the last such win at home since topping No. 5 Penn State in 2019.

► The win against the Illini was the first top-25 road win for Minnesota since taking down also-No. 24 Iowa in 2023.

► Minnesota has recorded two wins over AP top-25 teams in the regular season for the first time since 2000 when it beat No. 6 Ohio State and No. 22 Illinois.

► The win at Illinois was the sixth top-25 win for the Gophers under **P.J. Fleck**, tying him with Bernie Bierman and Murray Warmath for the most ranked wins in program history.

MIGHTY MAX

► As noted on Page 1, Minnesota has handed the keys to the offense to sixth-year quarterback **Max Brosmer**, a transfer from the University of New Hampshire who was a finalist for the 2023 Walter Payton Award and a Second Team All-American at UNH.

► Among his accolades this season, Brosmer has been named to the Davey O'Brien Class of 2024, earned Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors and has twice been named the PFF B1G Quarterback of the Week and selected for the O'Brien Award's weekly Great 8.

► Brosmer's efficiency rating of 140.35 and his passing yardage per game of 221.0 are both seventh best in one season at Minnesota.

► He's fifth in the Big Ten in completions per game (21.22) and sixth in passing touchdowns and passing yards. He's also seventh in completion percentage (.682; 19th nationally) and pass efficiency, eighth in points responsible for (102) and points responsible per game (11.3), ninth in passing yards per game (221.0), 10th in yards per attempt (7.10) and 12th in total offense (218.0).

► He's got three games this year of at least 250 passing yards, which ranks tied for ninth most in a Gopher career, while his one 300-yard game is also tied for ninth.

► PFF also ranks him 10th in the FBS and second in the Big Ten with an adjusted completion percentage of 79.5. Adjusted completion percentage factors in drops, throw aways, spikes, batted passes and being hit as thrown to try to report a completion percentage that's more indicative of a QB's accuracy.

► In just nine games at Minnesota, Brosmer already has four of the top-five performances for completions in a game in the eight seasons under **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota, and Brosmer has three of the top four for attempts. Brosmer completed 27 passes at Michigan, a Fleck era record, 26 at UCLA and against Maryland, and 24 against Rhode Island. His 40 pass attempts at Michigan and 37 attempts versus Illinois, UCLA and Iowa rank third and fourth, respectively, under Fleck.

► Brosmer has been particularly effective in the fourth quarter during the team's four-game winning streak. He's completed 23-of-30 passes (76.7%) for 255 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions for an efficiency rating of 170.1.

► Another example of the uptick in the passing game can be seen with **Daniel Jackson** (56 receptions), **Darius Taylor** (43) and **Elijah Spencer** (34). It's the first time since 2010 that Minnesota has had three receivers catch at least 34 passes in a season.

► Against Maryland, Brosmer completed 26-of-33 passes for season-highs of 320 yards and four touchdowns en route to being named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week. He was the first Gopher with four passing touchdowns since Tanner Morgan had four at Northwestern in 2019 and his 320 passing yards were the most since Morgan threw for 368 at Iowa in 2019.

► Brosmer scored three rushing touchdowns in the upset win over No. 11 USC. He was the first Gopher to accomplish the feat since Mohamed Ibrahim in 2022 and the first Minnesota QB to do since Mitch Leidner scored four in 2013.

► Against Rhode Island, Brosmer completed 24-of-30 passes for 271 yards and two touchdowns in the win over Rhode Island. He was the first Gopher to hit those numbers in a game since Mitch Leidner threw for 281 yards and two scores on 27 completions at Ohio State in 2015.

► In the season opener against North Carolina, Brosmer was 13-of-21 for 165 yards with no touchdowns and no interceptions. He also scored a rushing TD. Among the 33 Gopher QBs to start a game since 1977, Brosmer ranked 10th in completions and completion percentage (.619).

► Brosmer finished his Wildcat career by completing 760-of-1,225 passes for 8,713 yards, 70 touchdowns, 25 interceptions, 191 rushes, 263 rushing yards and 10 rushing touchdowns.

► Last year, Brosmer completed 294-of-459 passes (64.1%) for 3,464 yards and 29 touchdowns against five interceptions, while also rushing 57 times for 126 yards and three scores.

► He led the FCS in passing yards per game (313.55) and total offense per game (325.0), and was second in passing attempts and completions, passing yards, passing touchdowns and points responsible for per game (18.9), and finished fourth in completions per game (26.64) and total points responsible for (208).

► In addition to being a finalist for the Walter Payton Award and Brosmer was a Second Team All-American. He was also named CAA First Team Offense QB, was a finalist for the FedEx Ground Doris Robinson Scholar-Athlete Award and earned the CAA Football Chock Boone Leadership and Excellence Award.

► According to Pro Football Focus, Brosmer had the most attempts and passing yards, and was second in completions and touchdowns, on intermediate passing (10-19 yards) in the FCS last year. He was 63-of-127 for 1,160 yards and 12 touchdowns with four INTs.

► PFF also credited Brosmer as one of the most prolific QBs when it came to short passes (0-9 yards). Brosmer was 149-of-196 for 1,177 yards and seven touchdowns to one interception. He was third in the FCS in the category in attempts, completions and yards, and tied for eighth in TDs.

► Brosmer was also excellent against the blitz, earning a grade of 83.0 from PFF that ranked 14th in the FCS. In those spots, he was credited as going 123-of-198 for 1,473 yards and 16 TDs to 3 INTs. Against the blitz, he led the FCS in dropbacks (211), pass attempts, completions and pass yards, and was second in TD passes.

► Meanwhile, when kept clean, Brosmer boasted a rating of 88.8 from PFF as he had a 20:5 TD-to-INT ratio and completed 69.9 percent of his passes (242-346).

JACKSON GRABS WR1 SPOT

► The team's top receiver the last two seasons, **Daniel Jackson** is looking to become the third Gopher since 2001 to lead the team in receiving three straight years. He would join Tyler Johnson (2017-19) and Eric Decker (2007-09) should he do so.

► Jackson is on the right track, leading the team in receptions (56), receiving yards (642), receiving yards per game (71.3), targets (83) and targets per game (9.2).

► He's also second on the team in receiving TDs (3), yards after catch (198) and YAC per game (22.0).

► With 56 receptions on the season, Jackson has recorded the 26th 50-catch season in program history and his second straight. He's the eighth Gopher to have multiple seasons with 50+ catches, and he currently ranks tied for 19th in team annals.

► Jackson ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 24th nationally in receptions per game (6.2). He's also sixth in the Big Ten in receiving yards and eighth in receiving yards per contest.

► Jackson has been targeted at least five times in every game this season, including at least nine targets in six of the last seven contests, including 35 over the last three games, highlighted by a season high 13 targets at UCLA on Oct. 12.

► He has at least two catches in each of the past 19 games and has at least four receptions in all nine games this season.

► Currently with 189 career catches for 2,464 yards and 17 touchdowns, Jackson could become the 18th player in Big Ten history to attain 200 catches, 2,000 yards and 20 touchdowns in his career. Johnson and Decker are the only other Gophers to accomplish the feat.

► Jackson enters Saturday ranked fourth in team history in career receptions, fifth in receiving yards, sixth in receiving touchdowns and seventh in 100-yard games (7).

► Jackson finished with nine catches for 117 yards (most by a Gopher this year) and two touchdowns against Maryland. It was his fourth career multi-TD game and his seventh 100-yard game. Of his total, 102 yards came in the first half. It was the first time any Gopher had 100 receiving yards in a half since Jackson did it in the first half versus Purdue in 2022.

► At UCLA, Jackson finished with a career high 10 catches and 89 receiving yards. It was the 30th 10-reception game in Gopher history and the seventh under head coach **P.J. Fleck**.

► Against Iowa on Sept. 21, Jackson posted nine catches for 112 yards. With his performance versus the Hawkeyes, Jackson became the 10th player in Gopher history to go over the 2,000-yard receiving mark in a career. He got there in 46 games and needed 147 receptions.

► Last year, Jackson had team highs in targets (116), targets per game (8.9), catches (59), receiving yards (831), receiving yards per game (63.9), touchdown grabs (8), yards after catch (208) and YAC per game (16.0).

► Jackson ranked third in the Big Ten and 32nd nationally in touchdown receptions, and he was fourth in the conference in receiving yards, receiving yards per game and receptions per game (4.5), ninth in total touchdowns (8) and 11th in yards per reception (14.08).

► His totals last year ranked eighth for single-season 100-yard games at Minnesota (4), 12th for touchdown receptions, 14th for catches and 15th for receiving yards.

► Jackson was Minnesota's top receiver in nine of 13 games last season. He tied for the longest reception on the team and had seven of the 10 longest receptions. He was the only Gopher to see at least four targets in every contest last season, including five games with at least 10 targets and three with at least 15.

► Jackson became the 18th Gopher to reach 100 career receptions last year, reaching the mark in his 36th career game. That tied him for the ninth-fewest games needed to reach 100 career receptions in school history.

SPENCER SURGING

► **Elijah Spencer** has proven to be a reliable target in 2024, complementing Daniel Jackson in the WR corps.

► Spencer leads the team and is 10th in the Big Ten with four TD receptions. He also ranks second on Minnesota in receiving yards (421) and receiving yards per game (46.8), and is third in receptions (34), targets (48) and targets per game (5.3).

► He's been targeted at least two times every game so far and had at least four targets in eight of nine games. He's been targeted eight times twice this year, at Michigan and last week at Illinois.

► With the numbers he's posted, Spencer has nearly quadrupled his reception total from last year and has nearly seven times the yardage total as he produced nine receptions for 65 yards in 13 games in 2023. He also scored three times last season.

► Spencer had six catches for 99 yards (most as a Gopher) and two touchdowns against Maryland. It was his third career multi-touchdown game. With Jackson and Spencer each catching two touchdowns in the game, it was the first time Minnesota had multiple players with at least two TD grabs since Duane Bennett and Nick Tow-Arnett against Michigan State in 2009.

► Spencer spent his first two seasons at Charlotte where he made 85 catches for 1,324 yards and 15 touchdowns. In 2022, he hauled in 57 catches for 943 yards and nine touchdowns and was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. He was the fifth-ranked WR in Conference USA with a grade of 81.0 from PFF.

► In 2021, Spencer recorded 28 receptions for 381 yards and six touchdowns en route to being named Conference USA Freshman of the Year and a member of the Conference USA All-Freshman Team.

DYNAMIC DARIUS

► Named to the 2024 Maxwell Award watch list, sophomore running back **Darius Taylor** is proving his outstanding freshman campaign was no fluke.

► After missing the season opener against North Carolina, Taylor has played in eight games. He's rushed 126 times for 644 yards and a career-high eight touchdowns, and he's caught 43 passes for 315 yards and two scores. His 959 all-purpose yards lead the Gophers.

► Taylor is second in the Big Ten in total touchdowns (10), fourth in points per game (7.5), fifth in all-purpose yards per game (119.88), seventh in rushing yards per game (80.5), eighth in rushing touchdowns and points scored (60), ninth in rushing yards, 10th in receptions per game (5.4) and 11th in yards per carry (5.11).

► In his career, Taylor ranks fourth in program history in rushing yards per game (103.1), seventh in yards per carry (5.46) and 34th in rushing yards (1,443).

► The Detroit native has emerged as strong threat in the receiving game as he has nearly quadrupled last season's reception total (11) and tripled his receiving yardage total (92). He has one catch in 13 straight games and two receptions in each of his past 11 games. Taylor has five games this year with at least five receptions.

► Taylor leads Power 4 running backs and is second nationally at the position with his 43 receptions and 4.9 receptions per game this season. His 315 receiving yards lead all Big Ten running backs and are seventh most nationally.

► He leads Minnesota with 278 yards after catch and 34.8 YAC per game. He is also second on the Gophers in receptions (43), targets (52) and targets per game (6.5), and third in receiving yards and receiving yards per game (39.4).

► With his 43 receptions, already ranks third in a single-season for catches by a Minnesota running back, and he's just nine off the school record of 52 set at the position by Chuck Rios in 1994.

► In addition, with 54 career receptions for 407 yards, Taylor needs eight receptions and 146 yards to enter the school's all-time top-five in both categories.

► PFF ranks Taylor as the No. 6 receiving running back in the country and second best in the Big Ten with an 84.1 grade.

► In the upset win at No. 24 Illinois, Taylor ran for 131 yards and one touchdown on 22 attempts and caught nine passes for a career-high 58 yards. It was his seventh career 100-yard rushing game and ninth career game with 100+ all-purpose yards. His nine receptions were one off a career high and the Minnesota single-game record for a running back.

► At UCLA, Taylor scored once on the ground and once through the air, the latter of which was the game-winning score with 27 seconds left. It was his fourth career game with multiple touchdowns and second with both a rushing and receiving score.

► In the upset of then-No. 11 USC on Oct. 5, he ran for a season-high 144 yards on 25 carries. Taylor also led the Gophers with five catches for 56 yards. It was his fourth career game with 200 all-purpose yards, tying for fourth in program annals.

► At Michigan, Taylor ran for 36 yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries and had a career-high 10 catches for 52 yards. The 10 catches tied a Minnesota running back record set by Chuck Rios vs. San Diego State in 1994.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

Dating back to a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018, Minnesota has gone 22-11 (.667) away from home, including five bowl wins. Of the 11 losses, seven were against ranked teams and three more went to overtime. Since the date of Minnesota's win at Wisconsin, the Gophers rank second in the Big Ten in winning percentage away from home and tied for third in wins in such games. Only Ohio State (.794) has a better win percentage away from home, and Ohio State (27), and Oregon (25) are the only teams with more wins over that time.

► Against Iowa, Taylor pushed his career rushing total over the 1,000-yard mark. He got there in just nine career games, making him the second-fastest Gopher (by games) to get there since 1955. Only Darrell Thompson did it faster, getting there in seven games in 1986.

► Against Nevada, Taylor tallied 11 rushes for 124 yards and two TDs on the ground, plus five receptions for 37 yards and another TD for his first career 3-TD game. Taylor scored on an 80-yard TD run in the third quarter that tied for the sixth longest in program history and was the longest since Laurence Maroney's 93-yarder in 2005.

► Despite missing seven games and receiving just one carry for three yards in the season opener, Taylor rushed 138 times for 799 yards (5.8 per carry) and five touchdowns last year. He also caught 11 passes for 92 yards. His rushing yardage total was the fifth most ever by a freshman in school history.

► He averaged 133.2 rushing yards per game, which was the third most in school history and the best by an FBS freshman since 2021. Taylor did not play in enough games to be listed in the NCAA stat rankings last season, but if he were eligible he would have led the nation in rushing, surpassing Cody Schrader from Missouri who averaged 125.2 yards per game.

► In addition, Taylor's 148.5 all-purpose yards per game would have been the most of any Power 5 player and be third nationally had he played enough.

► After missing seven of the final eight games of the regular season due to injury, Taylor returned for the Quick Lane Bowl with a career-high 208 rushing yards, the most ever by a true freshman at Minnesota. He added 11 receiving yards for a career-high 219 all-purpose yards.

► It was his third game of the year with 200+ all-purpose yards, tied for the second most in program history. Only Tutu Atwell had more with six such games in 1997.

► Taylor was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week for a third straight week after a standout performance at Northwestern on Sept. 23. Taylor had 216 all-purpose yards at Northwestern as he rushed for 198 yards and had 18 yards receiving. His 216 all-purpose yards came in his fourth career game and ranked 44th in school history.

► Taylor was the first Gopher ever to receive Big Ten Freshman of the Week three straight weeks and only the second ever to be honored three times in a season, joining Shannon Brooks, who did it in 2015. Taylor was the first Big Ten player to receive the honor three straight weeks since Wisconsin's running back Jonathan Taylor in 2017.

► Taylor made his Gopher debut with one carry for three yards against Nebraska and followed that with a monster performance against Eastern Michigan, rushing for 193 yards and a touchdown on 33 carries. His numbers in a 25-6 win netted him Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. His 193 yards were second most in school history for a true freshman. He added 13 receiving yards to finish the game with 206 all-purpose yards.

► Taylor followed that Eastern Michigan performance by gaining 138 yards and scoring one touchdown on 22 carries at then-No. 20 North Carolina to earn his second straight Big Ten Freshman of the Week. He also caught one pass for 25 yards. He was the first Minnesota true freshman to rush for more than 100 yards in consecutive games since the 2021 season and just the second to do so since 2003.

► With his three straight 100-yard rushing games, Taylor became the first Minnesota true freshman to accomplish the feat since Laurence Maroney in 2003.

DEPTH IN THE RB ROOM

► Minnesota added to its running back room this offseason with three additions from the transfer portal.

► Now in his sixth season, **Marcus Major** spent the first five at Oklahoma. He played in 35 games for OU and rushed 194 times for 833 yards and eight touchdowns and caught 23 passes for 177 yards and two scores.

► Major is second on the team in rushes (64), rushing yards (263) and rushing yards per game (29.2), and third in rushing scores (2). In addition, he's set career highs in both receptions (16) and receiving yards (118).

► His 16 catches have come on 19 targets for a .832 catch percentage that's highest on the team among those with more than one catch. PFF ranks him as the No. 5 receiving running back in the Big Ten with a 74.4 grade.

► Minnesota is the fourth school for **Jaren Mangham**, who began his career at Colorado (2019-20) and spent two years at South Florida (2021-22) before playing at Michigan State in 2023. Prior to joining the Gophers, he competed in 38 career games with nine starts and rushed 344 times for 1,332 yards and 23 touchdowns in his collegiate career. He added 27 career catches for 162 yards.

► Mangham has played in four games this season, rushing 10 times for 66 yards. His 6.6 yards per carry is best on the squad.

► **Sieh Bangura** was at Ohio the last three seasons, playing in 28 career games with 24 starts for the Bobcats while rushing for 1,982 yards and 22 touchdowns on 412 carries (4.8 average) and catching 50 passes for 453 yards (9.1 average) and three touchdowns. He was the 2022 MAC Freshman of the Year and led the team in rushing each of the last two seasons.

► Bangura has played in three games, taking four carries for 12 yards.

► In addition to those three, Minnesota also has redshirt junior running back **Jordan Nubin**, who finished second on the team in rushing attempts (127), rushing yards (559), rush yards per game (43.0) and rushing TDs (3), and was tied for third in yards per rush (4.4).

► So far in 2024, Nubin has rushed 11 times for 19 yards and caught three passes for 32 yards.

► Nubin was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after his standout performance in Minnesota's 27-12 victory against Michigan State last season. Entering the game with 15 career rushing attempts for 51 yards, he rushed 40 times for 204 yards and two touchdowns against the Spartans. His 204 yards were the 28th most in program history. After rushing 18 times for 79 yards in the first half, Nubin followed with 22 carries for 125 yards and two touchdowns in the second half against the Spartans.

► Nubin's 40 carries set a Huntington Bank Stadium record and tied for seventh most in program history. For further context, no other player in the country last year had more than 36 carries in a game.

► Nubin was the first Gopher to be named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Mohamed Ibrahim on Nov. 21, 2022.

MOST 100/200-YARD RUSHERS

► Since 2021, Minnesota has seen seven different running backs combine for 30 100-yard rushing games: Mohamed Ibrahim (10), **Darius Taylor** (7), Ky Thomas (5), Mar'Keise Irving (3), Trey Potts (3), Jordan Nubin (1) and Bryce Williams (1).

► Within the Big Ten, Minnesota's 30 100-yard performances are tied with Michigan for the most in the conference since 2021, and only Oregon (8) has had more individuals run for 100+ yards in a game in that span.

O-LINE PAVING THE WAY

► Minnesota's offensive line has seen four different versions so far in 2024 as it looks to solidify its group. In the season opener against North Carolina, **Aireontae Erserly** lined up at left tackle, **Tyler Cooper** was at left guard, **Greg Johnson** at center, **Quinn Carroll** at right guard and **Martes Lewis** at right tackle. Lewis and Carroll then swapped spots against Rhode Island, while versus Nevada, Carroll stayed at right tackle while **Ashton Beers** made his first career start at right guard. That last iteration is what Minnesota used over the six games before Illinois.

► Against the Illini, Cooper missed the contest due to injury, resulting in Beers making his first career start at left guard, Carroll sliding back to right guard and redshirt freshman **Philip Daniels** making his first career start at right tackle.

► For their efforts, Carroll earned a grade of 84.5 from Pro Football Focus, best among all FBS right guards. Beers earned a 76.5 and was named to the PFF Big Ten Team of the Week, along with Carroll, and Daniels got a 70.9 in his first start.

► On the season, Erserly is rated by Pro Football Focus as the No. 3 offensive lineman overall in the Big Ten with a grade of 79.2. Nationally, he's 20th among FBS tackles and No. 32 overall. His pass blocking grade of 79.1 is ninth among tackles in the conference, while his run block grade of 75.3 ranks eighth at the position. Erserly has given up 11 pressures on 317 opportunities this year.

► Carroll sits 13th among Big Ten tackles with an overall grade of 73.1, but his run-blocking grade of 78.0 is fifth among tackles and tied for sixth compared to all conference linemen.

► Among those with at least 100 offensive snaps this year, Daniels leads all FBS offensive linemen with a run-blocking grade of 92.8 from PFF, and he ranks 10th in the country overall on the line with a PFF grade of 85.0.

► Among Big Ten guards, Cooper ranks 16th overall with a grade of 68.3 and eighth in run blocking (71.9).

► According to PFF, Johnson and Erserly have each given up just one sack so far this season in 317 opportunities. Carroll has yielded two in the same time period, which Cooper (267 snaps) and Beers (287 snaps) have given up three each.

► Minnesota returned 80 percent of its starts on the offensive line in 2024 with only center Nathan Boe needing to be replaced.

► Minnesota primarily used the same starting lineup on the offensive line last year with Erserly at left tackle, Cooper at left guard, Boe at center, Lewis at right guard and Carroll at right tackle. Cooper missed two games due to injury with Johnson moving into the lineup at left guard, but Cooper returned for the last four contests of the season. Erserly, Lewis and Carroll all started every game.

► According to PFF, Erserly was the Big Ten's top-graded lineman at 84.0 a year ago. That grade also ranked fifth among FBS tackles and seventh for all offensive linemen.

► Named to the 2024 Outland Trophy Preseason Watch List, Erserly also led the Big Ten, was third among FBS tackles and fourth overall along the o-line with a run block grade of 86.2. He allowed just two sacks and 15 total pressures in 841 snaps on offense.

► Cooper earned the top pass-blocking grade on the team in 2023 at 83.3, a figure that led all Big Ten guards, was fifth overall in the league and 21st for FBS guards.

► Johnson saw 397 snaps last year after making his collegiate debut at left guard at North Carolina. He was the first true freshman to play on and start on the offensive line for Minnesota since Erserly started against Nebraska in 2020.

FIRST ON 4TH DOWN

► By converting 14-of-17 fourth down attempts last season, Minnesota led the nation in fourth-down conversion rate at 82.4 percent.

► For context, Boise State (81.8) was the only other FBS team above 80 percent last year, while only two other Big Ten teams converted higher than 70 percent.

► Minnesota is back at the top spot again in 2024 at 87.5 percent, converting 7-of-8 fourth-down tries. The next closest teams are Boise State and Georgia at 84.6 percent (11-of-13), while Michigan (76.9) is the next closest Big Ten program.

► The Gophers had converted their previous eight fourth-down tries dating to last season's bowl game before getting stopped on a fake punt at Illinois.

GOPHERS 'D' LOOKING TO BE BACK AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota finished last season with the No. 56 total defense in the country, allowing 368.4 yards per game. It was a step back from 2022 when the Gophers were ninth (294.7) and 2021 when they finished third (278.8). After the departure of the previous defensive coordinator, Minnesota has brought in **Corey Hetherman** to take the reins in 2024.

► Hetherman spent the two previous seasons as the linebackers coach at Rutgers. Prior to that he was the defensive coordinator at James Madison from 2019-21 and was named the AFCA FCS Assistant Coach of the Year in 2021. His defense ranked in the top 10 in both total defense and scoring defense in all three years he was at JMU. Hetherman has also been the defensive coordinator at Maine (2016-18) and Pace College (2014).

► The Gophers are allowing 290.6 yards of total offense so far this season, a figure that ranks ninth nationally and ranks 10th best in program annals.

► The 16.8 points allowed per game this season is on pace to be the team's second best since 1999 with only 2022 (13.8) ranking better.

► The Gophers enter Saturday's game allowing just 169.6 passing yards per game, 14th-best in the FBS and on pace to be the best at Minnesota since yielding 162.9 yards per game through the air in 1996. The Gophers did not give up more than 200 yards passing in any of the first six games this season. It was the first time since at least 2000 that Minnesota had gone six straight games holding an opponent to 200 or fewer pass yards.

- ▶ The Gophers' INT:TD ratio of 15:6 (2.5 INT per TD) is second best in the country behind only Texas (12:3).
- ▶ Allowing just 9.72 yards per completion is on pace to break the school record of 9.97 set in 2017.
- ▶ Minnesota's 121.0 rushing yards allowed per game is currently eighth best in program history, while the 5.82 yards per pass attempt sits 10th.
- ▶ It's been a group effort defensively as 20 players have at least 10 tackles and 10 have at least 20. In addition, 16 have at least 0.5 tackles for loss, 15 have at least one pass breakup, and eight have at least one interception or half a sack.
- ▶ Minnesota had two interceptions against Maryland after recording three at UCLA and two versus USC. It was the first time since 2019 (Rutgers, Maryland and Penn State) that the Gophers had multiple interceptions in three straight games.
- ▶ The Gophers limited Iowa (62) and Michigan (86) to less than 100 yards passing in consecutive games last month. The last time Minnesota held consecutive opponents under 100 yards passing came in 2021, while the 148 passing yards allowed in the two-game span was the best for the team since at least 2000.
- ▶ Rhode Island was limited to 135 total yards, including just 18 on the ground, then only 172 yards were allowed to Nevada, including 58 rushing. UCLA became the third team to be held under 100 yards rushing when they tallied just 36 on Oct. 12.
- ▶ According to Big Ten Network, Minnesota logged four sacks and three interceptions against Nevada, the first time reaching those numbers in a game since doing so against Kent State in 2006.

TURNOVER TIME

- ▶ An opportunistic Minnesota defense has forced 19 turnovers this season with 15 interceptions and four fumble recoveries. The Gophers have forced at least one turnover in eight of nine games this year and have six games with at least two turnovers forced. The Gophers forced a season-high four against Rhode Island and had three each versus Nevada, USC and UCLA.
- ▶ The 15 interceptions are second nationally and first among Power 4 teams as only James Madison (16) has more picks this year.
- ▶ The 19 turnovers forced ranks tied for third nationally and are first in the Big Ten. With seven giveaways and 19 takeaways, the Minnesota turnover margin of +12 ranks fourth in the FBS and leads the Big Ten.
- ▶ If Minnesota commits no turnovers Saturday, it would mark the first time since at least 2000 that the Gophers have gone four straight games with zero giveaways.
- ▶ The Gophers forced two fumbles at Illinois for the first time since forcing three last season against the Illini. That was also the last time they recovered two fumbles in a game, tying for the second most in a game under head coach **P.J. Fleck**.
- ▶ Seven of Minnesota's 15 interceptions came in the first four games, its most in that span since 2014.
- ▶ The three interceptions against the Rams, Wolf Pack and UCLA all tied for the most in the Fleck era, as did the four turnovers forced against Rhode Island with an additional forced fumble.
- ▶ With three interceptions against both Nevada and Rhode Island, Minnesota logged six picks in a two-game span for the first time since seven total were recorded in 2008 against Montana State (3; 9/13/2008) and Florida Atlantic (4; 9/30/2008).
- ▶ Minnesota has capitalized on its 19 takeaways by turning them into 72 points, or an average of 3.79 points per turnover. Conversely, opponents have scored just 20 points off seven Gophers turnovers for a 2.86 average.
- ▶ **Koi Perich** leads the Big Ten and is tied for second in the country with five interceptions. In addition, **Kerry Brown**, **Ethan Robinson** and **Justin Walley** all have two interceptions this season. Four players with at least two picks ties the Gophers with Iowa State and SMU for most in the nation this year.
- ▶ Walley and **Jack Henderson** both have pick-sixes this season. Walley's was a 32-yard return against Maryland, while Henderson's was a 25-yarder against Rhode Island. Henderson's pick-six was the first by a Gopher since **Coleman Bryson's** 70-yard return in the 2022 Pinstripe Bowl, while the Gophers now have multiple pick-sixes in a season for the first time since 2017 when Jacob Huff and Jonathan Celestin did it.

LIMITING EXPLOSIVES

- ▶ A key for the Minnesota defense this year has been the lack of explosive plays allowed.
- ▶ Minnesota and James Madison are the only programs in the country to not give up a play of 50 yards or more this season from scrimmage.
- ▶ The Gophers have given up 25 plays of 20+ yards from scrimmage, tied for 12th in the FBS. Only seven plays have gone for 30+ yards, fifth best nationally, and only four have gone for more than 40 yards, tied for 13th.
- ▶ In the passing game, Minnesota has allowed just 15 plays of 20+ yards, tied for fourth in the FBS, while the four plays of 30+ yards are fourth and the two pass plays of 40+ yards are tied for sixth.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS

- ▶ Minnesota closed out the non-conference portion of its schedule with consecutive shutouts, defeating Rhode Island, 48-0, on Sept. 7 and Nevada, 27-0, on Sept. 14.
- ▶ It was the first time Minnesota accomplished the feat since October of 1962, and 1926 was the last time Minnesota had bigger back-to-back shutouts (122-0 over Iowa and Butler).
- ▶ The 2006 season marked the last time Minnesota had multiple shutouts in a season, and that was also the last time the Gophers posted two shutouts within the first three games of the year.
- ▶ All told, under new defensive coordinator **Corey Heatherman**, Minnesota went 128:41 of game time without allowing a point between the season opener and first quarter against Iowa.
- ▶ The 48-0 shutout victory over Rhode Island was the first for Minnesota since defeating Rutgers 31-0 on Oct. 29, 2022. Minnesota's 48-point margin of victory was its largest since a 62-10 win against Western Illinois in 2022, while the 48-point shutout was the team's biggest since a 62-0 win over Temple in 2006.
- ▶ Minnesota did not allow Rhode Island to cross midfield until the 6:22 mark of the fourth quarter. Even then, the Rams did not advance past Minnesota's 48 in the game. The Gophers held the Rams to had six first downs, tied for the third fewest allowed by Minnesota since 1965, and forced four turnovers, including three picks.
- ▶ Through Saturday, Minnesota, Alabama and Missouri are the only teams with two shutouts this season.

WALLEY'S WORLD

- ▶ Senior cornerback **Justin Walley** has been one of the top corners in the Big Ten ever since he earned a spot on the 247Sports True Freshman All-American team in 2021 and was PFF's highest graded true freshman CB.
- ▶ On the season, Walley has 31 tackles, 1.0 tackles for loss, two interceptions and a team-high nine pass breakups. He's averaging 1.6 passes defended per game to lead the Big Ten and rank second nationally.
- ▶ Walley has 168 career interception yards, which ranks seventh in school history, while his 102 interception return yards this season rank ninth in Gopher history. In addition, with 26 career pass breakups, Walley is fifth in program history.
- ▶ Walley recorded the first pick-six of his career with a 32-yard interception return against Maryland. It was his seventh career pick and second of the year. He added seven tackles and three pass breakups.
- ▶ He showed his talent against USC as he finished with a career high four pass breakups to go with three tackles. The four pass breakups tied for seventh most in a game at Minnesota since 1977 and were the most since Eric Murray also had four against UNLV in 2013.
- ▶ Prior to USC, Walley had missed the previous two games due to injury, marking the first two games he's missed in his career. He had played in all 42 Gopher games since the start of the 2021 season, including starts in the last 35 contests prior to his absence.
- ▶ Walley had a 70-yard interception return in the season opener against North Carolina to go along with six tackles. The return was the longest for Minnesota since **Coleman Bryson's** 70-yard pick-six in the 2022 Pinstripe Bowl and was the third longest interception return in Huntington Bank Stadium history.
- ▶ He had 45 tackles last year, eight pass breakups to lead the team and rank tied for fifth in the Big Ten, 2.0 tackles for loss, one forced fumble, a fumble recovery and one interception.
- ▶ Walley's run defense grade of 75.0 from Pro Football Focus led the team, while his tackling grade of 80.0 was best among Gopher returners.

LINDENBERG HEALTHY IN '24

► Redshirt junior **Cody Lindenberg** was hit by the injury bug last season and appeared in only four contests.

► He's healthy in 2024, though, leading the team with 62 tackles and ranking 12th in the Big Ten with 6.9 tackles per game. He's added 2.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks, six pass breakups, two QB hurries and an interception.

► Lindenberg made his mark in the season opener by tying his career high with 11 tackles, the fourth time he's reached that total. He's gone on to record at least five tackles in seven of nine games this season.

► Last year he did not make his season debut until Oct. 28 against Michigan State when he had three tackles, including one for loss. He broke out, though, against Illinois when he tied a career high with 11 tackles, including 1.5 for loss, and forced a fumble.

► However, he missed the next two weeks before returning in the regular season finale against Wisconsin with a team-high 11 tackles, including 1.0 for loss. In the bowl game, he tied for the team lead with six stops.

► He was second on the team in 2022 with 71 tackles and fourth with 4.0 tackles for loss. He also had 1.0 sacks and two pass breakups. He led or tied for the team lead in tackles seven times that year, including a career-high 11 tackles in the bowl win over Syracuse.

PERICH JUST MAKES PLAYS

► As noted on Page 1, true freshman **Koi Perich** has made an immediate impact in just eight games this year.

► A native of Esko, Minn., he's the team's top-ranked defensive player by Pro Football Focus with a grade of 89.7. That ties him as the top-rated defensive back in the country and ranks him ninth overall in the country at any position. He's fourth overall in the Big Ten.

► As seen in the chart at left, Perich also leads the team in coverage grade (89.4), and he's third in rush defense (76.4). The coverage grade is 13th best in the country and third among FBS safeties.

► Perich is looking to become the first true freshman to lead Minnesota in interceptions since Kyle Theret in 2007.

► Perich returned two punts for 82 yards at Michigan on Sept. 28, the most punt return yards by a player in eight years under **P.J. Fleck**. He also had 31 yards against Maryland, which ranks as fifth most under Fleck.

► One of Perich's returns at Michigan was a 60-yarder that was Minnesota's longest since Demetrius Douglas had a 69-yard return for a TD at Wisconsin in 2018. Perich's return was the third longest of the Fleck era, and, in nine career games, he's got two of the five longest punt returns in the Fleck era, including a 28-yarder vs. Rhode Island.

► Of his 12 punt returns this season, four have gone for at least 20 yards, tying for seventh in the country and ranking second in the Big Ten.

► Also the team's primary kick returner with nine returns for 163 yards, Perich had a career-high six tackles, forced a fumble for the first time in his career and had a game-sealing interception against USC. The performance earned him weekly honors from both the Shaun Alexander Award and Paul Hornung Award.

► Perich was tabbed the league's Freshman of the Week after he posted his Big Ten leading fifth interception of the season, which he returned 45 yards, to go with three tackles and 31 yards on three punt returns against Maryland.

► Perich was also the B1G Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 14. Perich is just the second player in league history to win the Big Ten's Freshman and Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same season, joining Northwestern's Godwin Igwebuike in 2014. Of note, Perich did it in separate weeks, while Igwebuike's honors came in the same week.

BROWN NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

► Gopher defensive back **Kerry Brown** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week following his standout performance against Nevada. The redshirt freshman recorded two interceptions – the first two of his career – and added four tackles as Minnesota shut out the Wolf Pack 27-0.

► It was the first multi-interception game for a Gopher since Tyler Nubin did so in the 2023 opener against Nebraska. Brown was also the first Minnesota freshman since **AT LEAST 1990** to have multiple picks in a game.

► Brown is one of 43 FBS players, and one of three Power 4 freshman including teammate **Koi Perich**, to have at least two interceptions in a game this year.

► Brown joins teammates **Justin Walley** (2021) and **Perich** (2024) as the only Gopher defensive players to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

► On the year, Brown, who did not play at UCLA, is second on the team in tackles (43) and is tied for second in interceptions (2). He also has 3.0 tackles for loss and two pass breakups.

► Brown's overall defensive grade of 84.6 from Pro Football Focus is second on the team and 11th overall in the Big Ten, including fourth among B1G safeties and 14th among all FBS safeties.

► In addition, Brown leads the team with a rush defense grade of 85.1 that is 19th among FBS safeties, 15th overall in the Big Ten and third among B1G safeties. His tackling grade of 82.9 is also first on the Gopher roster, and eighth among league safeties, while his 84.6 coverage grade is second on the team and third in the conference among safeties.

OTHER KEY PLAYERS ON 'D'

► Last year, **Jah Joyner** was third in the Big Ten and tied for 11th nationally with a PFF pass rush grade of 90.8 last season. This season, he's found success against the run as his PFF grade of 81.5 ranks fourth in the Big Ten among edge rushers. Overall, his defensive grade of 79.0 from PFF puts him fifth among Big Ten edge rushers.

► Joyner leads the Gophers in sacks (4.5), QB hurries (8) and forced fumbles (2), and he is second in tackles for loss (5.5) and pass breakups (6).

► **Jack Henderson** is the No. 9 safety in pass rushing in the country among those with at least 30 pass rush snaps, according to PFF, grading out at 69.7. The versatile defensive back leads the team in TFLs (6.0) and is second in sacks (3.5). He's also got 27 tackles, a pick-six, a pass breakup and a fumble recovery. **He's the only player in the FBS to post that stat line this season.**

► At UCLA, **Anthony Smith** set career highs in tackles (4) and tackles for loss (2.5). The 2.5 TFLs were the most by a Gopher since Carter Coughlin had 3.0 against Penn State in 2019. They were also the most by a defensive lineman, and tied for the fourth most overall, under head coach **P.J. Fleck**.

FOUR ADDED TO DEFENSE

► Four of Minnesota's 13 transfers this year came on defense, highlighted by defensive backs **Jai'Onte McMillan** and **Ethan Robinson**, and defensive lineman **Jaxon Howard**.

► Robinson is in his final year of eligibility, while McMillan has two years left and Howard has four years.

► An All-Patriot League First Team honoree in 2023, Robinson came to Minnesota after three years at Bucknell. He played in 31 career games and made 154 tackles (124 solo) with 6.5 tackles for loss, one sack, 25 pass breakups, five interceptions and two forced fumbles.

► Robinson has started all nine games at cornerback
and is tied for second on the team with two interceptions.
He's also posted 35 tackles, including 3.0 TFLs, and added
four pass breakups, a fumble recovery and forced fumble.

► McMillan spent four years at TCU, which included the
Covid season in 2020 and a redshirt season in 2021 where
he played in 33 career games. He recorded 15 tackles, two
tackles for loss and one sack, four pass breakups and one
interception for the Horned Frogs.

► Playing in eight games, McMillan has posted 17
tackles, including a career-high eight as he made his first
career start against USC on Oct. 5. He's also got 0.5 tack-
les for loss and a quarterback hurry.

► Howard was the top-ranked player in the state of
Minnesota in the 2023 recruiting class when he attended
Robbinsdale Cooper High School in New Hope. He spent
the 2023 season at LSU where he redshirted as a true
freshman. Howard played in five games and recorded two
tackles, seeing most of his action on special teams and as
a reserve edge rusher.

► Howard has played six games this season, recording
seven tackles and a quarterback hurry.

KESICH THE REIGNING BIG TEN KICKER OF THE YEAR

► **Dragan Kesich** is trying to get back to the form that
made him the 2023 Bakken-Andersen Big Ten Kicker of
the Year.

► Kesich is 13-of-19 on the season on field goals,
though five of his six misses have come from 43 yards or
longer, including three from more than 50 yards.

► He's been better as of late, however, going 7-for-8
over the last four games after starting the season 6-of-11.

► Last week at Illinois, Kesich went 4-of-4 on field goals,
converting from 20, 45, 38, and 46 yards, and adding an
extra point for a career-high 13 points. His four makes tied
a career high and tied for third most in Gopher history.

► Kesich is now the fifth kicker in Gopher history with
multiple games of 4+ made goals as he also made four last
season at Iowa. He joins Adam Bailey, Mike Chalberg, Jim
Gallery and Dan Nystrom in doing so.

► For his performance against the Illini, he was named
Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week for the third
time in his career, tying the program record held by Emmitt
Carpenter and Adam Bailey.

► Kesich has made two field goals this year from longer
than 50 yards, converting from 53 against Rhode Island
and 52 versus Nevada. That gives him five 50+ yard field
goals in his career, breaking a tie with Carpenter (2015-18)
and Chip Lohmiller (1984-87) for the most in program his-
tory. The 53-yarder tied for the second-longest in Huntington
Bank Stadium history (Kesich owns the record with a
54-yard make last season against Michigan).

► Kesich is also 42-of-50 on touchbacks this season,
including going 9-for-9 against Rhode Island to set a career
high for touchbacks in a game. He's 10th with his 42 touch-
backs, 11th with a touchback percentage of 84.00 and he's
14th in kickoff average at 64.22 yards.

► For context, Kesich is by far the best kickoff specialist
in recent Gopher history. His touchback percentages over
the last three years include 85.5 percent last year, 83.1
percent in 2022 and 62.7 percent in 2021. No other Gopher
kicker since 2003 has even reached 55 percent.

► In his career, Kesich is 36-of-47 on field goals for a
76.6 percent success rate that is second in program history
(min. 25 attempts). He is also eighth in program history with
his 36 career made field goals. He's never missed an extra
point, a perfect 56-of-56, which ranks as the fourth longest
extra point streak in program history.

► In his first season as the Gophers field goal kicker a
year ago, Kesich had one of the best years in program his-
tory, resulting in him being named the Big Ten Kicker of the
Year. He joined Carpenter in 2016 as the second Gopher
to take home the honor.

► A semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award and a First
Team All-Big Ten honoree last year, Kesich was 23-of-27
on field goals, good for an 85.2 percent conversion rate
that ranked second in the Big Ten and 21st nationally. He
did not miss more than one kick in any game a year ago.

► Kesich's 1.77 field goals per game led the Big Ten
and ranked ninth in the FBS, while his 7.4 points per game
were sixth in the Big Ten (fourth among kickers).

► His 23 makes last year were the second most in pro-
gram history, just two back of **Dan Nystrom's** record of 25
set in 2000. Kesich's field goal percentage was third best
by a Gopher kicker since 1977 (min. 10 attempts), and his
99 points ranked ninth in program history and fifth best by a
Minnesota kicker since 1965.

► Two times last year Kesich was named Big Ten
Special Teams Player of the Week, tying for the most in
one season in Gophers history.

► He converted the first two field goals of his career
against Nebraska, including a game-winning 47-yarder as
time expired. It was the first walk-off field goal in regulation
for the Gophers since 2003 when **Rhys Llyod** made a
35-yarder as time expired to defeat Wisconsin.

► Against Michigan, Kesich connected on a career-long
54-yard field goal, which tied for the fifth-longest in program
history and is a Huntington Bank Stadium record. It was
Minnesota's longest field goal since Joel Monroe made a
54-yarder at Iowa on Nov. 10, 2007.

► At Ohio State, Kesich tied his career-long by mak-
ing a 54-yard field goal. He also had a 50-yard make at
Northwestern.

CRAWFORD, THE PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

► **Mark Crawford** is in his fifth season as the Gophers'
punter. Also the team's holder, he's punted 35 times this
year for an average of 43.4 that ranks 37th nationally and
fifth in the Big Ten. The figure also ranks fifth best for one
season at Minnesota.

► He's got five 50-yard punts and 11 have landed inside
the opponent's 20-yard line, including three punts against
USC that all landed inside the 10.

► Crawford's career punt yardage total of 8,751 ranks
fourth in Gophers history and his punt total of 210 ranks
fourth. His average of 41.7 is sixth.

LONGEST BOWL WIN STREAKS

Minnesota has won seven straight bowl games dating back to the 2015 Quick Lane Bowl. It is the longest active streak in the nation (excluding national championship games), the longest in Big Ten history and tied for the seventh longest in college football history.

► Last year, he punted 65 times with a career best average of 42.5 yards per kick, which ranked ninth in program history. Eleven of Crawford's punts covered 50+ yards (long of 56), and 25 were downed inside the 20, while 32 were fair caught and four went for touchbacks.

► A native of Perth, Australia, Crawford played Australian Rule's Football in the winter until he was 17 and then played cricket in the summer until he was 22.

► He trained in Melbourne with Prokick Australia, which has seen its graduates win eight Ray Guy Awards (all since 2013) and 85 All-America honors.

► At 30 years old (will turn 31 on Dec. 28), he entered the season as the fifth oldest player in college football, according to a preseason survey of FBS SIDs.

ACTIVE CAREER FBS LEADERS

► **Darius Taylor** sits third among active FBS players in career all-purpose yards per game at 132.14.

► **Sieh Bangura** is 21st among active FBS players with an average of 13.42 rushes per game and 15.03 all-purpose plays per game, 43rd in rushing TDs (22), 45th in total TDs scored (25), 46th in rushes (416), 48th in all-purpose plays (466)

► **Daniel Jackson** ranks 18th among FBS players in career receptions (189), 19th in receiving yards (2,464), 29th in receiving yards per game (48.3), 32nd in TD receptions (17), and 34th in receptions per game (3.71).

► **Elijah Spencer** ranks 11th among active FBS players in career touchdown receptions (22) and is 40th in yards per catch (14.1).

► **Jaren Mangham** is 39th among active FBS players in career touchdown rushes with 23.

► **Justin Walley** sits 11th among active FBS players in career passes defended (33) and defensive touchdowns (2), 15th in interception yardage (168), 24th in non-offensive touchdowns (2), 29th in career interceptions (7) and 34th in passes defended per game (0.72).

► **Jah Joyner** checks in at No. 38 among active FBS players with 108 sack yards in his career and No. 43 in total sacks (14.5).

► **Mark Crawford** is 15th among active FBS players in career punts (210), 16th in punt yards (8,751), 42nd in punt average (41.7) and 47th in punts per game (3.96).

► **Dragan Kesich** is 32nd among active FBS kickers in field goals made (36), 37th in field goals attempted (47) and 49th in field goal percentage (.766).

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Minnesota ranks 36th in the country and fourth in the Big Ten in time of possession, sitting at 31:19. The top performance of the year saw Minnesota hold the ball for 40:32 against Rhode Island.

► Minnesota's time of possession figure last year of 31:52 ranked 20th in the FBS and third in the B1G. The Gophers won time of possession eight times in 2023, going 6-2 in those contests.

► Nine times in the Fleck era Minnesota has held the ball for more than 40 minutes in a game.

► In 93 games under Fleck, Minnesota has led in time of possession 67 times and gone 48-19 in those contests.

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

► Historically, Minnesota has been one of the least penalized teams in the country under **P.J. Fleck**.

► In Fleck's previous seven seasons as head coach, the Gophers led the country in fewest penalties per game three times, including each of the last two years, and the team has never finished lower than 15th.

► Minnesota has ended the season averaging fewer than four penalties per game four times.

► In addition, the Gophers have placed 10th or better in penalty yards per game in five of Fleck's seasons, including four finishes in the top five and leading the country in 2017. They finished second a year ago and third in 2022.

► Five times Minnesota has ended the season averaging fewer than 40 penalty yards per game.

► This season, the Gophers rank 14th in penalty yards per game at 39.11 and 30th in penalties per game at 5.22.

THREE SELLOUTS CONTINUE ATTENDANCE TREND

► Minnesota has announced sellout crowds in three of the six home games so far this season, bringing the total to 24 sellouts in the 16 years of Huntington Bank Stadium, including eight under **P.J. Fleck**.

► Attendance for the Gophers' season opener versus North Carolina was 50,805, while the Iowa game brought in 52,048, the 10th largest crowd in HBS history, and the USC game featured an attendance of 50,913.

► With back-to-back sellouts against Iowa and USC, it's the first time since the final two home games of 2019 that Minnesota had back-to-back sellouts..

► This marks the third season in the history of the facility that the Gophers have had three sellouts in one year, joining the opening season of 2009 and 2015.

► Minnesota's figures last year were among the best in the young history of Huntington Bank Stadium, which opened in 2009 and celebrated its 100th game against Illinois on Nov. 4, 2023.

► The average attendance of 48,453 was the fourth best in facility history. The only better marks came in 2015 (52,355) when the Minnesota Vikings shared the stadium while U.S. Bank Stadium was being built and capacity expanded, plus in 2009 (50,805) and 2010 (49,513), the first two years of the stadium.

TROPHY GAMES

► 2024 marks the 10th time in its history that Minnesota plays all four of its Trophy Games in one year.

► The 2013 season marked the last time they played Iowa for Floyd of Rosedale, Michigan for the Little Brown Jug, Penn State for the Governor's Victory Bell and Wisconsin for Paul Bunyan's Axe all in the same season.

► It also happened each year from 2003-06, as well as 1997-98 and 1993-94.

► Minnesota has won at least one of those games in eight of the nine prior seasons, including wins over both Penn State and Wisconsin in 2003.

► The Gophers have already played two of their trophy games this year, falling to Iowa, 31-14, on Sept. 21 and at Michigan on Sept. 28, 27-24.

► Still to come, Minnesota hosts Penn State on Nov. 23 and closes the season at Wisconsin on Nov. 29.

TWO NEW TO STAFF IN '24

► Two new faces joined the Gophers' coaching staff in 2024 with defensive coordinator / linebackers coach **Corey Hetherman** and special teams coordinator **Bob Ligashesky**.

► At Rutgers, Hetherman took over an inexperienced unit that had seven combined career starts prior to his arrival before the 2022 season. That year, the defense improved by allowing 46.7 fewer yards per game compared to 2021, 28.1 fewer passing yards and 18.6 fewer rushing yards. Rutgers posted its best mark in total defense (349.8) in 10 years.

► Ligashesky came to Minnesota with nearly 40 years of coaching experience, most recently serving as special teams coordinator at Syracuse where his units ranked second in kick return defense in the ACC in 2023 and third in the nation in kickoff return average in 2022.

► The veteran coach spent 12 years in the NFL, mostly coaching special teams, including with the 2008 Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh Steelers. He also has extensive experience at the college level. In addition to Syracuse, he has coached at Bowling Green, Illinois, Pittsburgh, Kent State, Arizona State (graduate assistant) and Wake Forest (graduate assistant).

► He also previously worked with Fleck, as they were on the same 2012 Tampa Bay Buccaneers staff. Ligashesky was coaching safeties and special teams, while Fleck was coaching receivers.

► Along with the new coaching additions, Fleck promoted defensive line coach **Winston DeLattiboudere III** to Assistant Head Coach and named **Eric Koehler** Tight Ends Coach.

NEW UNIFORMS FOR 2024

► Minnesota's new Nike uniforms feature the traditional colors of maroon and gold and include a white uniform for road games. Minnesota has also retained its current alternate black uniforms as an option for the 2024 season.

► The jersey relaunch was the first for Minnesota since it unveiled new uniforms in February 2018. Those uniforms were worn for six seasons from 2018-23.

► The most significant changes to the uniforms are the addition of shoulder stripes to the jerseys and stripes on the side of the pants.

► The state of Minnesota is featured on the outside collar of all three jerseys, while Minnesota's rallying call of 'Ski-U-Mah' is emblazoned on the inside of the jersey collar. The iconic 'Block M' remains on the front of the jersey, situated in the middle of the collar right above the numbers. The Big Ten logo is on the right chest, while the Nike swoosh is on the left chest and left hip.

► The maroon jerseys feature gold numbers, which is a change from the previous maroon jerseys when the numbering was white.

► The official colors for the uniforms unveiled are Night Maroon, University Gold and White. Minnesota's helmet colors for the 2024 season are maroon, gold and white.

► The uniforms are the Nike Vapor Field Utility Special Edition (F.U.S.E.) variety, which are stronger, lighter and more breathable than Minnesota's previous uniforms.

BEST YEARLY SPANS

► As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their eighth season under **P.J. Fleck**. Fleck entered the year 50-34 overall and 29-32 in the Big Ten.

► He had the most Big Ten wins, the second most overall wins and the third-best overall winning percentage (.595) of any Minnesota coach through his first seven seasons. Below is a look at how other yearly spans compare in Gopher history.

► **Last 7 Years (2017-23; 50-34 overall, 29-32 B1G):** The 50 wins are tied for 10th most in a seven-year span in program history. The .595 win percentage is tied for the third best since 1967 (.631 from 2016-22 and .600 from 2013-19). The 29 B1G wins are second most in a seven-year span since 1973 (31 wins from 2016-22).

► The five bowl trips in seven years is tied for seventh best (6 trips in 7 years done 6 times), while **the five bowl wins in seven years is tied for the most in school history** (also 5 from 2016-22 and 2015-21).

► **Last 6 Years (2018-23; 45-27 overall, 27-24 B1G):** The 45 wins are second best in a six-year span at Minnesota since 1908 (46 wins from 2014-19). The .625 win percentage is the best in a six-year span since 1965 and second best since 1949. The 27 Big Ten wins are tied for the second most in a six-year span at Minnesota (won 28 games from 1960-65). The .519 Big Ten win percentage is the team's best in a six-year span since 1973. **The five bowl wins in six years are the most in program history, while the five bowl trips in six years is tied for best in program history.**

► **Last 5 Years (2019-23; 38-21 overall, 24-19 B1G):** The 38 wins are second best in a five-year span in program history since 1907 (39 wins from 2018-22). The .644 win percentage is second best since 1964 (won .661 from 2018-22). **The 24 Big Ten wins are tied for the most in a five-year span at Minnesota, joining the 2018-22 span.** The B1G win percentage of .558 is tied for the best since 1967-71 (.569). **The four bowl wins in five years are tied for the most in school history; it's been done three times.** The four bowl trips in five years is tied for third best in program history.

► **Last 4 Years (2020-23; 27-19 overall, 17-17 B1G):** The .500 win percentage in conference games is just the third time since 1970 the team finished .500 or better in a four-year span (the other two also came under Fleck in 2018-21 and 2019-22). **The three bowl wins in four years are tied for the most in school history; it's happened seven times.**

► **Last 3 Years (2021-23; 24-15 overall, 14-13 B1G):** The 24 wins in a three-year span is the team's best since winning 25 from 2002-04. It's just the third time since 1906 that Minnesota won at least 24 games over three years. The 14 conference wins are tied for fourth most in a three-year span. Minnesota has made a bowl game three straight years for just the seventh time in program history; 2002-04 marks the only other time Minnesota won three bowl games in three years.

► **Last 2 Years (2021-22; 15-11 overall, 8-10 B1G):** Minnesota has won back-to-back bowl games for the sixth time in program history.

GOPHER GRADUATES

► Minnesota's 2024 roster features 19 student-athletes who have already graduated: **Max Brosmer, Quinn Carroll, Tyler Cooper, Mark Crawford, Aireontae Ersery, Lucas Finnessy, Sam Henson, Daniel Jackson, Darnell Jefferies, Jah Joyner, Nick Kallerup, Derek LeCaptain, Martes Lewis, Cody Lindenberg, Jalen Logan-Redding, Marcus Major, Jaren Mangham, Logan Richter and Danny Striggow.**

NUBIN DRAFTED IN 2024

► Minnesota defensive back Tyler Nubin heard his name called in the 2024 NFL Draft when the All-American safety was selected in the second round with the 47th overall pick by the New York Giants.

► Nubin is the 10th Gopher defensive back to be drafted since 2020, joining **Jordan Howden** (2021, fifth round to New Orleans) and All-Pro First Team **Antoine Winfield Jr.** (2020, second round to Tampa Bay).

► With Nubin going in the second round, Minnesota has now had a first or second round pick in five straight drafts (2020-24). The last time that happened was 1941-45.

► Minnesota is one of 13 programs in the country to have a pick in the first or second round in each of the last five drafts along with Alabama, Clemson, Florida, Georgia LSU, Michigan, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Penn state and USC.

► Minnesota has also now had at least one draft pick in the last six drafts (2019-24). The last time that happened was 2003-08.

► Nubin's selection marked the second straight year that the Giants drafted a Gopher after they picked center **John Michael Schmitz** last season with the 57th overall pick. New York also chose **Carter Coughlin** and **Chris Williamson** in the seventh round of the 2020 Draft. All-time, Nubin is the 26th Gopher drafted by the franchise. The only NFL team with more Minnesota draft picks is Green Bay with 41.

SCORIGAMI

► Scorigami is a concept developed by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks final scores that have never happened before in NFL history.

► In Minnesota's 1,329 all-time games, there have been 567 unique scores.

► The most common overall score is 6-0, which has happened 25 times, though none have taken place since 1963. The next most common is 13-7, which has occurred 18 times, most recently in 1985.

► Minnesota's most common result is a 13-7 victory, which it has done 13 times.

► Below are the Scorigami results for Minnesota football this season.

► **North Carolina 19, Minnesota 17.** No scorigami; sixth such score (MR: loss vs. USC in 2011) and second Gopher loss (USC in 2011).

► **Minnesota 48, Rhode Island 0.** No scorigami; fourth such score (MR: loss to Nebraska in 1989) and second Gopher win (MR: South Dakota State in 1930).

HEAD COACH // EIGHTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 43, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 86-59 and is 56-37 at Minnesota.

In seven years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program.

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season three times, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 and 2022 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905).

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 5-0 in bowl games, and his five bowl wins are the most in school history by a coach (Glen Mason was 3-4 in bowl games at Minnesota).

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached six All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman, John Michael Schmitz, Tyler Nubin and Mohamed Ibrahim twice), nine Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, John Michael Schmitz, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 379 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

The 2023 season saw Minnesota beat rival Iowa on the road to reclaim Floyd of Rosedale and win its fifth straight bowl game under Fleck (beat Bowling Green in the Quick Lane Bowl). Defensive back Tyler Nubin was named an All-American as he set a school record for most career interceptions with 13 and Dragan Kesich was recognized as the Big Ten Kicker of the Year.

Minnesota set a program record as nine Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (previous record of eight was set in 2018 and tied in 2019) and true freshman Darius Taylor established himself as one of the best running backs in the nation. Taylor rushed 138 times for 799 yards and five touchdowns in six games of action. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week three times and set a school record for most yards by a true freshman when he ran for 208 yards in the Quick Lane Bowl victory.

The 2022 season saw Minnesota post nine wins as the Gophers went 9-4 overall, which included a bowl win against Syracuse and a road win at rival Wisconsin. Minnesota, which went 5-2 at home, 3-2 on the road and 1-0 in neutral site games, was paced by a stout, family-room defense and a bruising offense that featured two All-Americans.

Minnesota ended the season ranked No. 4 in the nation in scoring defense (13.85), No. 5 in third-down conversion defense (.279) and No. 9

in the nation in total defense (295.1 yards per game).

The 13.85 points allowed per game were the fewest that Minnesota has permitted since 1967 when it allowed 10.6 points per game during the 10-game season. Minnesota posted two shutouts during the season (38-0 against New Mexico State and 31-0 against Rutgers), which is had not done since 2006 and the Gophers were the only team in the nation to shutout two FBS teams in 2022 (Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State each had two shutouts, but one each came against an FCS foe).

First-Team All-American center John Michael Schmitz and Second-Team All-American running back Mohamed Ibrahim paced the Gopher offense, which ranked No. 17 in the nation with 207.3 rushing yards per game. With Schmitz anchoring an offensive line that featured four new starters, Ibrahim set single season records in rushing attempts (320), rushing yards (1,665), rushing touchdowns (20), total touchdowns (20), total points (120) and 100-yard rushing games (10).

The 2022 season also saw three Gophers named either a semifinalist, finalist or winner of a national award. Ibrahim was named Comeback Player of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award. Schmitz was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy and was also a semifinalist for the Outland Trophy and the Rotary Lombardi Award. Quarterback Tanner Morgan was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a second place finish in the Big Ten West division with a 6-3 mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times for 1,076 yards and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history, while the defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annestad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota had eight Gophers named Big Ten Player of the Week and Tyler Johnson

became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gunkstun in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and host an annual diaper drive during training camp and an annual turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. You control whether you ROW fast or slow, confident or hesitant, efficient or rushed and whether you ROW for yourself or others! If you stop rowing, you will not go anywhere. OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.
