She opened the season with three straight hits including a three-run homer against No. 17 Nebraska. She reached base in all four contests.

Tracking the Yellow Jackets

Georgia Tech comes into the weekend with a 3-3 record, dropping two contests to Alabama and one to Villanova. The Yellow Jackets saw wins over Villanova and Longwood last weekend at home in Atlanta. Last season, Georgia Tech went 26-27 and 7-17 in the ACC.

Milestone Watch

Now in her fourth season leading the Maroon and Gold, Piper Ritter is just one win away from 100. After a successful weekend at the SDSU Invitational, Ritter has accumulated a 99-60-1 record. Her success as Minnesota's head coach also includes four consecutive post season bids and a third place finish in the Big Ten last season.

Jess is the Best

Last weekend in San Diego, Jess Oakland had an impressive opening weekend outing. In game one, Oakland launched two out of the park for the second time in her career. The short stop also set a high of five RBI against UCSB, surpassing her career high of four, which she set against Michigan last season.

Checking in With the Circle

Minnesota pitchers Bri Enter and Sydney Schwartz made their 2024 debut last weekend. Enter pitched 6.0 innings against San Diego State, tossing three K's and leading Minnesota to a 5-3 win over the 24th-ranked Aztecs. Despite falling to No. 3 Stanford, Schwartz kept the battle in the circle between the two teams until the sixth inning. Through 5.2 innings of work, Schwartz set a career high six K's on Saturday.

First Timers

Four freshmen made their first appearance in Maroon and Gold over the weekend. Macy Richardson, Lucy Hooper, and Cameron Grayson scored a combined four runs as pinch runners. Richardson also saw time in the circle in game one against UC Santa Barbara.

Hometown Heroes

Three Gophers will head to their home state this weekend. Both Breezy Burnett and Bri Enter hail from Jacksonville, Fla., while Taylor Krapf is a native of Oviedo, Fla.

Postseason Push

The 2023 season marked a historic milestone for the Minnesota softball program. It was the 10th-straight season that the Maroon and Gold reached the NCAA Tournament, making it the longest current active postseason streak in the Big Ten.

Battling the Best

Minnesota's schedule features a loaded slate of opponents. 13 teams made an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, while eight finished in the NFCA Top 25 with four others receiving votes. Nine different states are featured including California, Florida, Texas, North Carolina, South Carolina, Maryland, Illinois, Indiana, and Iowa.

Added Experience

In the off-season, the Maroon and Gold added two transfers to the 2024 roster in Cassie Lindmark and Morgan DeBord. Lindmark, a transfer catcher, from Penn State looks to add depth from behind the plate with her wealth of Big Ten softball experience. DeBord joined the Gophers after a successful career at Loyola Marymount. With the

Lions, DeBord received All-WCC honors as a junior and senior.

In the Polls

Minnesota received votes in one of two major polls in the softball top 25. The ESPN.com/USA Today Week One Poll was released on Feb. 13, with the Golden Gophers receiving votes.

Nuthin' But a Sara 'G' Thang

Olympian and former Minnesota legend Sara Groenewegen was named an assistant coach for the Stanford softball program back in the fall. Groenewegen won a bronze medal with Team Canada at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics - the first Olympic medal in softball in Canada's history. 'G,' a Minnesota standout on both sides of the ball. competed with the Golden Gophers from 2014-17. She racked up multiple awards during her time donning the Maroon and Gold, The 2014 Big Ten Pitcher and Freshman of the Year, she became the first three-time NFCA All-American in program history, earning first team nods as a junior and senior. The Big Ten Player of the Year in 2015, Groenewegen was a four-time All-Big Ten first team pick and helped the Gophers win three Big Ten Tournament titles, nabbing Most Outstanding Player honors in 2016 and 2017. She was also a three-time USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year top-10 finalist.

B1G Returners

The Gophers closed out conference play in 2023 leading the Big Ten in All-Big Ten awardees. This season, Minnesota returns three of the six that were selected to All-Big Ten teams. Shortstop Jess Oakland returns for her sophomore campaign after being selected to the All-Freshman and First Team. Third baseman Kayla Chavez who also picked up First Team accolades comes back to the lineup while NFCA Third Team All-American Taylor Krapf will sit behind the plate, Krapf earned All-Big Ten First Team honors along with Big Ten Player of the Week nods on Feb. 27, 2023.

50 Years of Women's Sports

The University of Minnesota will celebrate 50 years of six women's sports during the 2023-24 athletic campaign: cross country, golf. gymnastics, softball, tennis and volleyball. The University of Minnesota officially recognized women's athletics through the physical education department in 1971 and was given a budget of \$5,000 from the Board of Regents' reserve fund. From there, swimming and diving was established as the first official women's varsity intercollegiate sport in 1971, followed by its first women's head coach, Jean Freeman in 1973. In 1974, several women's programs followed in crew, golf, field hockey, gymnastics, tennis, softball, volleyball and cross country. Linda Wells was hired as the softball and volleyball head coach while assisting with basketball, which began the year before. The University of Minnesota officially formed the Women's Intercollegiate Athletic department in July of 1975. Since 1971, the University of Minnesota added 12 varsity sports, the most recent reintroducing rowing in 2000.

Head Coach 4th Season Minnesota, 2004 Career Record: 96-58-1 Piper Ritter was named the eighth head coach in program history on May 3, 2020 after 13 seasons as the Gophers pitching coach. The 2023 season marks her third year as the Gopher head coach and 16th year with the program as a coach.

The Former Minnesota standout pitcher has developed five of the top hurlers in Minnesota softball history in Briana Hassett, Sara Moulton, Sara Groenewegen, Amber Fiser, and now Autumn Pease.

In 2023, Ritter led the Golden Gophers to a third place conference finish, appearance in the Big Ten Tournament semi final and NCAA Seattle Regional berth as the No. 2 seed. Along with six All-Big Ten selections, the Golden Gophers led the entire conference with five first team caliber players and Ritter's fourth Big Ten Pitcher of the Year in Autumn Pease. Minnesota also had an All-American battery in Pease and Taylor Krapf, the first All-American selections since Amber Fiser in 2019.

In the shortened 2020 season, Ritter coached Amber Fiser and Autumn Pease each to Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors. She has coached Gophers to 42 Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors in her tenure. She has coached pitchers to five All-American honors, three Big Ten Pitcher of the Year honors and has coached seventeen no-hitters.

Ritter helped take the Gophers to new heights in 2019 with the program's first ever Women's College World Series appearance in the NCAA era. A big reason for the Gophers success came from the circle. Ace Amber Fiser was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, First Team All-American, Honda Award Finalist, Academic All-District, broke school record and tied conference record with six Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors and was a two-time NFCA Pitcher of the Week honoree. Fiser finished second for most wins in a single season with 31 and third for strikeouts with 346 in 2019. She pitched every single inning of both the Minneapolis Regional and Super Regional. Ritter was part of her second NFCA Great Lakes Regional Coaching Staff of the Year honor to cap off a successful 2019 season.

In 2018, Ritter coached the Gophers to the 14th lowest ERA in the NCAA and second lowest in the Big Ten with a 1.90 mark as a staff. Ritter guided Amber Fiser to a 27-10 season with a 1.69 ERA as Fiser took on the role as the Gophers ace. Welcoming transfer Sydney Smith, who picked up the win in four of her last eight appearances, Ritter helped work Smith in to the Gophers rotation to form a strong starting staff along with Carlie Brandt who appeared in 16 games to go 7-2 with a 1.35 ERA. Ritter coached the Gophers to the third lowest ERA in the NCAA in the 2017 season with a 1.19 ERA as a staff. With the success in the circle the Maroon and Gold went a program best 56-5 overall. They broke a record for longest win streak to start a season with 19 and longest win streak ever with 26 straight. Prior to the 2017 season the Gophers were never ranked in the top-10 in either major polls. They reached No. 1 in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches poll and No. 3 in the ESPN.com/ USA Softball poll. They won their first regular season Big Te title since 1991 and their third Big Ten tournament championship in four years. Groenewegen went on to become the first Gopher to ever win All-American honors in three seasons after an impressive 2017 season. She went 31-4 with a 0.63 ERA and 307 strikeouts. The ERA was the second lowest in the NCAA and second lowest ever recorded in Gophers history. Besides Groenewegen, Ritter also mentored freshman Amber Fiser

to a strong freshman season. Fiser went 14-0 with a 1.68 ERA and 83 strikeouts. Along with head coach Jessica Allister and associate head coach Jessica Merchant, Ritter was part of the NFCA Great Lakes Regional Coaching Staff of the Year in 2017

As a staff in 2014 Moulton,
Groenewegen, and Nikki Anderson set single-season school
records for shutouts with 22 and
strikeouts with 487, both marks
put the Gophers in the top three
nationally during which led
Minnesota to post its winningest
season in 15 years. That season
the Gophers captured the Big

She left the university with career records for strikeouts (1,122), innings pitched (921.1), games (173), wins (88), shutouts (33), and complete games (85). Her career strikeout mark ranked third all-time in the Big Ten and 14th in NCAA history. Ritter threw a record-tying five career no-hitters for the Gophers, including two perfect games.

Ritter earned All-Big Ten honors all four years at Minnesota, including a first-team selection in 2003 when she posted 11 shutouts and what was then a single-season record 311 strikeouts. She also garnered NFCA All-Mideast Region accolades three times during her career and led the Gophers to the NCAA Regional Tournament two times (2002 and 2003).

Prior to joining the staff at Minnesota, Ritter served as pitching coach at the University of Northern Colorado for the 2006 season and was an assistant at North St. Paul High School during 2005. After graduating from Minnesota in 2004 with a degree in Kinesiology, she played and coached for one season in the Netherlands. Ritter also played one season in the National Pro Fastpitch League for the Texas Thunder, posting a 3-0 record with a 0.64 ERA.


JANE SAGE COWLES STADIUM
