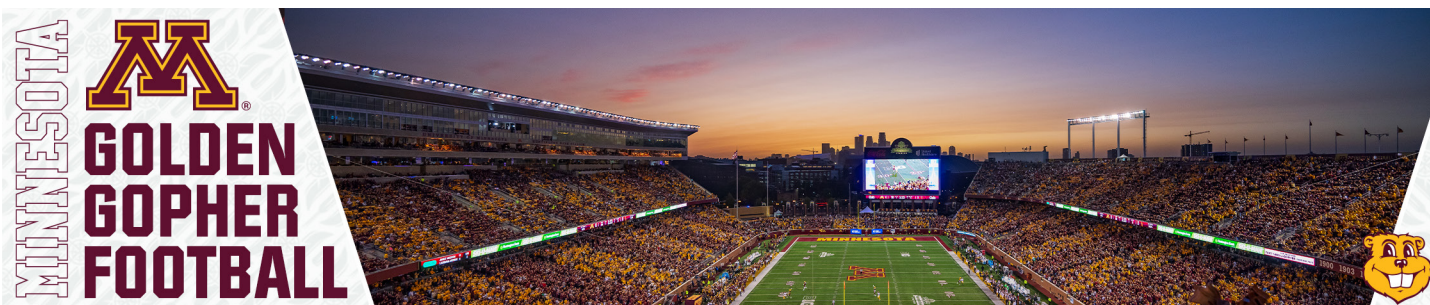

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1 Meeting for the 95th season in a row (every year since 1931), RV/NR Minnesota (5-2, 3-1 B1G) travels to NR/RV Iowa (6-1, 3-1) to face the Hawkeyes Saturday afternoon. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. on CBS and the Gopher Radio Network.

2 Saturday marks the 119th all-time matchup between Minnesota and Iowa, and it's also the 91st battle for Floyd of Rosedale, a 15.5-inch high, 21-inch long bronze statue of a prized hog (a full history of which can be found on Page 58). First played for in 1935, the all-time series record for Floyd could not be much closer as the Hawkeyes hold a slight lead at 45-43-2. After winning in Kinnick Stadium in 2023, Minnesota is looking for consecutive wins in Iowa City for the first time since 1979 and 1981.

3 Minnesota's defense was relentless in last Friday's 24-6 win over No. 25 Nebraska, recording nine sacks, the most in Gopher records dating to 1977. Five of those sacks came in the first half, their most in any half since at least 2019. **Karter Menz** and **Anthony Smith** each tallied 2.5 sacks, tying each other for the most by a Gopher player in the **P.J. Fleck** era and the most by a Gopher at Huntington Bank Stadium. With **Jaxon Howard** adding 2.0 sacks, Friday's game marked the first time since at least 1995 that Minnesota had three players record 2.0+ sacks in one game. Coupled with a 7-sack performance against Rutgers, Minnesota is the only team in the FBS this year with multiple games of at least 7.0 sacks. Additionally, that's the most such performances by any Big Ten team since the start of the 2024 season.

4 Redshirt freshman **Drake Lindsey** is having a standout debut season as the starter in the Maroon and Gold. He's 129-of-208 (62.0 percent) for 1,437 yards with 10 touchdowns and three interceptions, good for an efficiency rating of 133.0. Among FBS freshmen with at least 100 pass attempts this year, Lindsey is fourth in touchdown percentage (4.8), fifth in passing touchdowns (10) and interception percentage (1.4), sixth in pass attempts, seventh in completions, efficiency rating and passing yards per attempt (6.9), eighth in completion percentage, ninth in passing yards and yards per completion (11.1), and 10th in passing yards per game (205.3). Lindsey has already established himself as one of the top freshman QBs in Minnesota history as he's second all-time among Gopher freshmen for passing yards and is tied for second in passing touchdowns. Adam Weber holds both records with 2,895 passing yards and 24 touchdowns thrown. More on Lindsey can be found on Page 5 of the Notes.

5 The 2025 campaign is the ninth for **P.J. Fleck** at Minnesota. He is the fifth-longest tenured coach in program history and the second-longest active tenured coach in the Big Ten. Fleck's record stands at 63-41, putting him fifth in program history in overall wins and games coached (104), in addition to ranking fourth in Big Ten wins (37). One more victory will tie Fleck with Glen Mason (1997-06) for fourth in program history (see box right). Fleck's overall win percentage of .606 is third best among Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 13th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 93-63 (.596).

FACING IOWA

► Minnesota and Iowa meet for the 119th time on Saturday, and the Gophers lead the all-time series, 63-53-2.

► The Golden Gophers' 63 wins against the Hawkeyes are tied for their most against any one program (also 63 versus Wisconsin), while the 118 matchups with Iowa are second after 134 games against Wisconsin.

► In Iowa City, Minnesota trails in the series 24-32-1. The 24 road wins are third most against one program, but only one behind the 25 road wins over Wisconsin and Northwestern. The 57 games rank second behind 66 on the road versus Wisconsin.

► Saturday will mark the first time that **P.J. Fleck** faces another program nine teams as head coach of Minnesota and will be the first time he's played a team 10 teams overall as a college head coach.

► Along those lines, there is no coach that Fleck has faced off with more than Iowa's Kirk Ferentz as Saturday will be the 10th time they've coached a game against one another. The next closest is seven matchups with Pat Fitzgerald when he was at Northwestern, while the next among active head coaches is Louisville's Jeff Brohm, whom Fleck encountered six times while Brohm was at Purdue.

► Minnesota has two Iowa natives on its roster. Sixth-year TE **Frank Bierman** hails from Tipton (Tipton HS), which is about 30 miles northeast of Iowa City, and also played play two seasons at Iowa Western CC. Redshirt freshman TE **Jacob Simpson** is from Johnston (Johnston HS), roughly two hours west of Iowa's campus.

► Minnesota co-offensive coordinator **Greg Harbaugh Jr.** was the wide receivers coach at Western Michigan from 2020-21 when Iowa offensive coordinator Tim Lester was the Broncos' head coach. It was also Lester who took over at WMU when **P.J. Fleck** became Minnesota's head coach in 2017.

► Gopher tight ends coach **Eric Koehler** and Iowa offensive line coach George Barnett have worked together at three previous schools. Koehler was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Miami (OH) from 2014-22, while Barnett was the Redhawks' co-OC and o-line coach from 2014-20. Before that, Koehler was Illinois State's quarterbacks coach in 2013 when Barnett was the team's OC and offensive line coach. The pair was also at Grand Valley State with Koehler as offensive coordinator from 2008-12 and Barnett as GVSU's o-line coach from 2008-09.

► Koehler also coached in the state of Iowa at Wartburg College in Waverly, from 2002-07. He was the OC for the Knights from 2002-05 and then the head coach from 2006-07.

► Minnesota rush ends coach **C.J. Robbins** was also with Koehler and Barnett at Miami (OH) for the 2019 season as a graduate assistant.

► Gopher outside linebackers and nickels coach **Kevin Kane** was at Northern Illinois along with Iowa assistant defensive line coach Jay Niemann for the 2011-15 seasons. Kane coached tight ends, linebackers and special teams during his time with the Huskies, while Niemann was the defensive coordinator.

► Iowa running backs coach Omar Young spent one season coaching in the state of Minnesota at Minnesota State Moorhead as its special teams coordinator and secondary coach in 2010.

► Iowa enters the game with a 6-1 record overall and 3-1 mark in the Big Ten, tying with Minnesota and five other teams for third place in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes' two losses this season have come at then-No. 16 Iowa State on Sept. 6 and home versus then-No. 11 Indiana on Sept. 27.

► Minnesota and Iowa have one common opponent this year as both have beaten Rutgers. The Gophers defeated the Scarlet Knights, 31-28, in Minneapolis on Sept. 27, while the Hawkeyes prevailed in Piscataway, 38-28, on Sept. 19.

► Mark Gronowski is 95-of-146 passing this year for 811 yards and three touchdowns to four interceptions for an efficiency rating of 113.0. In addition, he's rushed 67 times for 289 yards. His 10 rushing touchdowns rank third in the FBS and second in the Big Ten.

► Kamari Moulton is tied with Gronowski for the team lead with 67 rush attempts but has a team-high 360 rushing yards and two scores.

► Gronowski spreads the ball around in the passing game as five players have between 10-13 catches. Kaden Wetjen leads the team with 13 receptions, while Sam Philips' 193 receiving yards are most on the squad, as are Seth Anderson's two receiving scores.

► Karson Sharar leads the Hawkeyes with 45 tackles to go with 6.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks and three QB hurries. Sam Llewellyn's 7.0 TFLs and 5.0 sacks are both best on the team.

► Six different Iowa players have an interception, and TJ Hall has a team-high eight pass breakups.

► Drew Stevens is 14-of-19 on field goals this year with a long of 55 yards. His 2.00 field goals made per game leads the Big Ten and ranks fifth in the FBS. Rhys Dakin is averaging 45.1 yards on 19 punts with a long of 65.

► Wetjen has touchdowns on both punt and kick returns this season. He's averaging 25.9 yards on 12 punt returns and 32.8 yards on eight kick returns. His 573 combined return yards leads the FBS.

LAST TIME VS. THE HAWKEYES

► *With assistance from the AP:* Kaleb Johnson rushed for 206 yards and three touchdowns, with two scores in the third quarter that propelled Iowa past Minnesota for a 31-14 victory that gave the bronze pig trophy back to the Hawkeyes last season in Minneapolis.

► The Gophers had the upper hand in the first half, taking a 14-7 lead on touchdown passes from Max Brosmer to **Jameson Geers** and Elijah Spencer. The only score by the Hawkeyes came after a 38-yard drive, thanks to a diving interception by linebacker Jay Higgins in the first quarter.

► Iowa punted four straight times after that and went into halftime with only 107 total yards. Cade McNamara, who finished 11 for 19 for 62 yards, had trouble finding any kind of a rhythm and had several throws glance off a receiver's hands while luckily avoiding any interceptions.

► The Hawkeyes took the second-half kickoff and scored the tying touchdown in five plays. Iowa's next drive went 73 yards in six plays, capped by a 40-yard run by Johnson for a 21-14 lead.

► Brosmer went 17 for 26 for 165 yards and the two scores before halftime, matching the most first-half completions since P.J. Fleck arrived in 2017. Brosmer finished 22-of-37 for 209 yards with two touchdowns and two picks.

PREVIOUSLY IN IOWA CITY

► *With assistance from the AP:* Dragan Kesich made four field goals and Minnesota won at Iowa for the first time since 1999 to snap an eight-game losing streak in the series, holding the No. 24 Hawkeyes to 12 yards in the second half in a 12-10 victory in Iowa City in 2023.

A WIN WOULD...

- Make the Golden Gophers bowl eligible at 6-2 overall
- See the Gophers win at least six of their first eight games for the third time under P.J. Fleck, last doing so in 2021
- Mark a 4-1 or better start in league play for the third time under P.J. Fleck; the team also started 6-0 against Big Ten competition in 2019 and 4-1 in 2021
- Push the Golden Gophers' lead in the all-time series to 64-53-2, giving them their most wins all-time versus one team
- Narrow the record for Floyd of Rosedale to 44-45-2
- Get the all-time series in Iowa City to 25-32-1, tying for Minnesota's most road wins over one team
- Give Minnesota consecutive wins in Iowa City for the first time since 1979 and 1981
- Be Minnesota's first road win of the season
- Enhance Fleck's record to 64-41 at Minnesota and 94-63 overall, tying Glen Mason for the fourth most overall wins in Gophers history

- Iowa appeared to take the lead with 1:21 left when Cooper DeJean fielded a punt that had bounced near the Minnesota sideline and returned it 54 yards for a touchdown. But after a replay review, DeJean was ruled to have made an invalid fair-catch signal before fielding the punt, disallowing the return.
- Iowa still had the ball, but Justin Walley intercepted Deacon Hill's pass with a minute to play.
- Kesich had a 43-yard field goal in the first quarter, then hit from 44 and 28 yards in the third quarter. His 31-yarder with 8:33 left gave the Gophers their first lead.
- Down 10-3 at the half, the Gophers held Iowa to minus-2 yards in the third quarter. The Hawkeyes had 127 yards overall while Hill fumbled twice in Iowa territory while completing just 10 of 28 passes for 116 yards. As a team, Iowa was held to 11 yards rushing.

NOTABLE WINS OVER IOWA

- Nov. 8, 2014: Maxx Williams caught three of Mitch Leidner's four touchdown passes, and Minnesota ran for 291 yards in a romp past Iowa 51-14 in their last home victory in the series. The Minnesota defense forced three turnovers, including an interception and a fumble, and had four sacks.
- Nov. 20, 1999: Trailing 21-10 at halftime, Minnesota outscored Iowa 15-0 in the second half for a 25-21 victory, its last in Iowa City. Billy Cockerham ran for 122 yards and threw for 175 more with one touchdown. Arland Bruce's 73-yard touchdown run with just over 9:00 remaining proved to be the winning score. Tyrone Carter had 16 tackles in the win and the defense forced an interception, a lost fumble and had four sacks.
- Oct. 21, 1972: John King ran for 173 yards and tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns in a 43-14 win in Minneapolis. Doug Beaudoin added 135 yards on the ground as the Gophers had their biggest win over the Hawkeyes since a 55-7 victory in 1949.

NEBRASKA RECAP

- *With assistance from the AP:* **Darius Taylor** ran for 148 yards and a touchdown, Drake Lindsey completed 16 of 20 passes for 153 yards and a score and Minnesota sacked quarterback Dylan Raiola a school-record nine times in a 24-6 victory over No. 25 Nebraska Friday.
- The Golden Gophers have won six straight against the Cornhuskers, and Minnesota coach **P.J. Fleck** improved to 7-1 against Nebraska, which hasn't won in Minneapolis since 2015.

- **Anthony Smith** and **Karter Menz** each had 2.5 sacks for Minnesota. The Gophers held Nebraska to a season-low 36 yards rushing. Raiola completed 17 of 25 passes for 177 yards for the Huskers.
- Lindsey found **Le'Meke Brockington** in the front corner of the end zone on a 20-yard touchdown pass to make it 14-6 with 2:36 left in the third quarter. A fourth-down defensive holding call kept the 98-yard, 14-play drive intact.
- A pass-interference penalty negated a Nebraska interception on Minnesota's next possession, capped by Taylor's 1-yard touchdown run.
- Minnesota led 7-6 at halftime thanks to a 1-yard, tush-push touchdown by Lindsey 1:40 into the second quarter. Taylor's 71-yard run down the sideline set it up.

IN THE POLLS

- Minnesota is among the teams receiving votes in the latest AP Poll, netting one vote, while Iowa shows up there in the Coaches Poll.
- Minnesota also received votes in the Preseason Coaches Poll, but was not in the Preseason AP Poll. The Gophers' 11 votes in the Coaches Poll put them 46th.
- Two other opponents are ranked in each poll with Ohio State continuing its run at No. 1 in each, while Oregon is sixth in both.
- In addition, Northwestern received one vote in the Coaches poll.
- Minnesota is 1-1 against ranked teams this year, defeating then-No. 25 Nebraska, 24-6, on Oct. 17 after losing at No. 1 Ohio State, 42-3, on Oct. 4.
- The win over Nebraska was the seventh AP Top-25 win under **P.J. Fleck**, a program record that broke a tie with Bernie Bierman and Murray Warmath for most in Gophers history.

► One more 100-yard rushing performance would tie Taylor with Marion Barber for ninth all-time at Minnesota with 12.

► Taylor's 81 career receptions leave him one behind Duane Bennett (82) for second all-time by a Gopher running back. The record belongs to Chuck Rios, who had 132 receptions from 1990-94.

► Taylor also has 576 career receiving yards to rank fifth in program history for Gopher running backs. He's 63 yards away from passing Barber (639) for fourth.

► Already with four career games of at least 200+ all-purpose yards, Taylor is one performance away from tying for second in team annals.

► Le'Meke Brockington has 843 career receiving yards, putting him 157 yards away from becoming the 30th player in Gopher history to reach 1,000.

► With 7.0 sacks on the season and 14.0 in his career, Anthony Smith is 0.5 sacks away from cracking both the single-season and career top-10 list at Minnesota.

► Sitting at 1,375 career receiving yards, 1,314 of which were recorded at UCLA, wide receiver **Logan Loya** is 125 yards away from 1,500 for his career.

► More record book information is located on Page 14.

HOME SWEET HOME

► Minnesota has won all five home games this season. That winning streak at Huntington Bank Stadium is the team's longest since winning the first six games there in 2019. The last time the Gophers won their first five home games in a season was also in 2019 when they started the year 6-0 in Minneapolis.

► This season marks the seventh time since Huntington Bank Stadium opened in 2009 that the Gophers have won at least five games there in a season. They've won six home games three times (2014, 2016, 2019) but are looking for their first undefeated season at home since going 6-0 at Memorial Stadium in 1967.

COMEBACK KIDS

► In wins over Rutgers and Purdue, Minnesota rallied from double-digit deficits. With records dating to 1973, the only other season featuring two such wins is 2014.

► The Golden Gophers trailed 14-0 in the second quarter on Sept. 27 against Rutgers before rallying for a 31-28 win. With records dating to 1973, the 14-point comeback tied for the third largest in program history, and it was the team's biggest comeback win since a 28-24 win at Nebraska in 2014 where Minnesota was down 21-7 in the second quarter. The only bigger comebacks came in 1979 against Indiana when the team was down 24-0 before a 32-31 win and a 1986 game versus Northwestern where a 17-0 deficit turned into a 44-23 win.

► The win over the Scarlet Knights was also the largest comeback win at home for Minnesota since an 18-17 win over Illinois in 1992, a game that saw Minnesota down 17-3 with 14:56 remaining in the contest.

► Against Purdue on Oct. 11, Minnesota was down 10-0 early in the second quarter to Purdue. Later in the game, the Gophers trailed 20-13 going into the fourth quarter before winning 27-20. It was the team's biggest comeback win entering the fourth quarter since last season versus USC when the Gophers were down 17-10 after three quarters and won 24-17.

LOOKING AT THE '25 SLATE

► Two of the Gophers' 2025 opponents reached the College Football Playoff last year, including national champion Ohio State. Five other opponents reached a bowl game. The seven combined postseason opponents tied for fifth fewest in the conference entering the year.

► The Golden Gophers had one new opponent on the '25 slate as they shut out Northwestern State in their first ever meeting on Sept. 6, 66-0.

► In addition, the non-conference saw Minnesota play Buffalo for the first time since 2017 on Aug. 28, winning 23-10, and face Cal for the first time since 2009 in a 27-14 loss on Sept. 13.

► Within the Big Ten, Minnesota will match up with Oregon as conference foes for the first time on Nov. 14. It will be the first meeting overall since 2003, first regular season contest since 1975 and first ever trip to Eugene for the Golden Gophers.

► Along with Iowa, another longstanding rivalry continues as the Gophers take on Wisconsin for the 118th straight season (every year since 1907).

► The Gophers will also play their first ever game at Wrigley Field when they visit Northwestern on Nov. 22. It'll be the third time in the last five seasons that Minnesota will have played in an MLB Stadium after playing in bowl games at Chase Field (Arizona) in 2021 and Yankee Stadium (New York) in 2022.

► Illinois is not on the Minnesota schedule this season, marking the first time since 2013 that the teams will not meet.

LINDSEY LEADING AS QB1

► As noted on Page 1, **Drake Lindsey** is having an elite redshirt freshman season.

► He was the first Gopher quarterback to win his first two career starts since Zack Annexstad in 2018, and Lindsey joined Tanner Morgan as the only Gopher QBs since 2016 to throw a touchdown pass in each of his first four starts.

► In fact, with records dating to 1977, only Adam Weber in 2007 had a longer streak when he had a touchdown pass in his first eight starts.

► Lindsey currently holds the third-best TD-to-INT ratio in Gopher history (min. 10 TD passes) at 3.33, while his completion percentage of .620 is sixth-best (min. 100 attempts) in Minnesota annals.

► According to Pro Football Focus, Lindsey's offensive grade of 80.1 is tied for fourth in the Big Ten and tied for 18th nationally among the QBs who have as many dropbacks (220) as he does. His passing grade of 78.8 also ranks third in the league and is 16th in the FBS among those passers.

► Against Nebraska on Oct. 17, Lindsey threw for 153 yards and a touchdown on 16-of-20 passing. He also tallied his second career rushing score. Completing 80 percent of his passes, Lindsey became just the eighth quarterback since 1995 to have that high of a completion percentage against the Huskers (min. 20 pass attempts).

► In a come from behind win over Purdue on Oct. 11, Lindsey completed 21-of-45 passes for 232 yards and two touchdowns, with one interception.

► He also had a career-high four rushes for a personal-best 49 plays of total offense. His 45 pass attempts were a career high and tied with Max Brosmer's 45 attempts at Rutgers last year as the most during the **P.J. Fleck** era.

► In Minnesota's comeback win over Rutgers on Sept. 27 Lindsey had one of the top performances turned in by a Gopher quarterback. He was 31-of-41 for 324 yards and three touchdowns, all career-highs, with no interceptions.

► For his efforts Lindsey was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week. He was the first Gopher to earn the honor on offense since 2023 and the fifth Minnesota QB to win the award since it was introduced in 2012.

► Lindsey's 31 completions tied for fifth-most in a single game and were the most since Adam Weber completed 31 versus Northern Illinois in 2010. In addition, Lindsey's 324 passing yards were the most since Tanner Morgan threw for 368 yards at Iowa in 2019.

► Lindsey's performance was the ninth game in Gopher history with 30+ completions, and his efficiency rating was more than 20 points better than any other Gopher QB.

► In the third quarter alone against Rutgers, Lindsey was 15-of-19 for 120 yards and a touchdown. The 15 completions were four more than any Gopher QB has in

any quarter since at least 2019, while the 19 attempts tied for the most in any quarter.

► Lindsey made his first career start in the season opener and completed 19-of-35 passes for 290 yards with two touchdowns and one interception, setting career highs in all categories. With records dating to 1977, the passing yardage total was the fourth highest by a Gopher in his first career start, while the attempts total ranked third and the completions tied for third. The passing total and touchdown pass total were also both fourth best in any season opener since 1979, while the completions and attempts both tied for fifth in such games.

► He followed that against Northwestern State by going 8-of-9 for 139 yards and a touchdown and added a rushing score before being removed midway through the second quarter with the game out of hand.

► A native of Fayetteville, Ark., Lindsey played in three games last year as a true freshman, completing 4-of-5 passes for 50 yards and a touchdown. His most extensive action came in a win over Rhode Island where he was 3-of-4 for 35 yards and an 8-yard TD strike, while in the 2025 Duke's Mayo Bowl he completed a 15-yard pass.

► A three-star prospect coming out of Fayetteville High School, Lindsey was named the state's Gatorade Player of the Year and the 7A Offensive Player of the Year.

► Lindsey helped lead his team to a 13-0 record and a state championship in which he was named MVP. On the year, Lindsey threw for 3,941 yards while completing 69 percent of his passes (264-for-383) as he tossed 54 touchdowns against just three interceptions for a TD:INT ratio of 18-to-1.

DYNAMIC DARIUS

► A two-time honorable mention All-Big Ten honoree, junior running back **Darius Taylor** has established himself as one of the top running backs in the Big Ten.

► Entering this year, he was placed on watch lists for the Doak Walker and Maxwell Awards, and he was a Fourth Team All-American by Athlon.

► After getting injured in the first quarter against Northwestern State on Sept. 6, he missed the next two contests but returned on Oct. 4 at Ohio State.

► Despite missing nearly three full games, Taylor leads the team in rushing attempts (79) and rushing yards (353) and his 70.6 rushing yards per game is the best for any player that's appeared in more than one game. He also leads the team in yards after catch per game (27.4), and is second in targets per game (4.6) and yards after catch (137), third in receptions (16) and YAC per catch (8.6), and fourth in receiving yards (134).

► In the season opener, Taylor rushed for 141 yards on 30 attempts and caught four passes for 36 yards. It was the highest rushing total in a season opener since 2021 for Minnesota, while his 30 carries were second most in such games since 1979.

► The following week against Northwestern State, Taylor left the game in the first quarter due to injury after rushing for 20 yards on three carries and catching a nine-yard pass.

► Upon returning from injury against Purdue, Taylor logged a career-high 67 receiving yards on six receptions, including a reception of 40 yards that was the longest for a Gopher running back since Shannon Brooks had a 40-yarder versus Illinois in 2015. In addition, the 67 receiving yards were the most by a Gopher running back since Duane Bennett had 71 yards against Penn State in 2010.

► Last week against Nebraska, Taylor rushed for 148 yards (most by a Gopher this year) on 24 carries and a one-yard touchdown, his first of the season. It was his 11th career 100-yard rushing game. He had a 71-yard run in the second quarter, the second-longest of his career and the longest for Minnesota since his own 80-yarder last year vs. Nevada. It was also the fourth longest of the Fleck era. He added a team-best four receptions for 16 yards.

► Taylor's 148 yards against Nebraska pushed his career rushing total to 2,138, making him the 18th player in Gophers history to reach the 2,000-yard mark. He got there in 23 games, tied with Mohamed Ibrahim for the third fewest since 1955.

► Pro Football Focus gives Taylor a receiving grade of 81.8, second best among all Big Ten running backs and 13th nationally at the position.

► In his career, Taylor ranks fourth in program history in career rushing yards per game (93.0) and 200-yard all-purpose games, 10th in 100-yard rushing games (11) and 17th in career rushing yards (2,138).

► With 81 career receptions for 576 yards, Taylor is third in program history for receptions by a running back, and fifth for receiving yards at the position. He has at least one reception in each of his last 22 games.

► Last season, Taylor played in 12 of 13 games, missing only the season opener. He rushed 205 times for 986 yards and a career-high 10 touchdowns, and he caught 54 passes for 350 yards and two scores. His 1,336 all-purpose yards led the Gophers and ranked 26th in Gopher single-season history.

► The Detroit native also emerged as threat in the receiving game as his 54 receptions set a school record for the position and nearly quintupled his reception total from 2023 (11), while his receiving yardage of 350 almost quadrupled his total (92) from 2023.

► Taylor was fifth in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game (82.2) and all-purpose yards per game (111.33), seventh in total touchdowns (12), ninth in rushing touchdowns and 10th in total rushing yards.

► Taylor finished the season third among Power 4 running backs and fourth nationally at the position with his 4.5 receptions per game this season. His 54 receptions led Big Ten running backs and were third nationally, while Taylor's 350 receiving yards were third among Big Ten running backs and 13th in the country.

► He led Minnesota with 330 yards after catch and 27.5 YAC per game. Taylor was also second on the Gophers in receptions, and third in receiving yards, receiving yards per game (30.3), targets (67) and targets per game (5.58).

► PFF ranked Taylor as the No. 17 receiving running back in the country last season and second best in the Big Ten with a 78.1 grade.

► Taylor added to his repertoire in the 2025 Duke's Mayo Bowl as he ran for 113 yards (ninth career 100-yard rushing game) and a touchdown on 20 carries and caught four passes for 17 yards. He also threw a 10-yard touchdown pass, the first non-QB touchdown pass for Minnesota since 2015. Taylor's 28-yard touchdown run was the second longest in Gopher bowl history.

► At Michigan last season, Taylor ran for 36 yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries and had a career-high 10 catches for 52 yards. The 10 catches tied a Minnesota running back record set by Chuck Rios vs. San Diego State in 1994.

► Against Iowa in 2024, Taylor pushed his career rushing total over the 1,000-yard mark. He got there in just nine career games, making him the second-fastest Gopher (by games) to get there since 1955. Only Darrell Thompson did it faster, getting there in seven games in 1986.

► Against Nevada last year, Taylor tallied 11 rushes for 124 yards and two TDs on the ground, plus five receptions for 37 yards and another TD for his first career 3-TD game. Taylor scored on an 80-yard TD run in the third quarter that tied for the sixth longest in program history and was the longest since Laurence Maroney's 93-yarder in 2005.

RB REINFORCEMENTS

► Taylor's injury earlier this season allowed other backs to step up, though another player in the room has been lost for the season.

► After not playing in the opener, redshirt freshman **Fame Ijeboi** is second on the team in both rushing attempts (56) and rushing yards (259). He's also got five receptions for 45 yards and another touchdown. His 12.0 yards after catch per reception leads Minnesota.

► Ijeboi's overall offensive grade of 81.8 from PFF ranks 30th in the country among running backs (seventh in the Big Ten), while his rushing grade of 81.7 is 11th in the Big Ten at the position.

► Ijeboi got a taste last year with two rushes for 13 yards in two games. He was a consensus three-star prospect out of high school and touted as the No. 8 recruit in Pennsylvania and the No. 31 running back in the nation by On3.

► **Cam Davis** is spending his final season at Minnesota after six years (2019-24) at Washington where he played in 41 career games and rushed 253 times for 1,093 yards and 15 touchdowns, while also catching 52 passes for 434 yards and returning 10 kicks for 183 yards. His top season came in 2022 as he played in 11 games with 107 rushes for 522 yards and 13 touchdowns.

► Davis is tied for the team lead with a pair of rushing touchdown and ranks third in rushing attempts (27) and fourth in yards (90). In the receiving game, he's fourth in yards after catch (100), YAC per game (14.3) and YAC per reception (8.3).

► Davis has also caught 12 passes on 13 targets for a team-best catch percentage of 92.3.

► **A.J. Turner** was injured at California and it was announced on Sept. 27 that he would miss the rest of the season. He had rushed 16 times for 64 yards and a touchdown in three games this season.

► Turner spent the previous three seasons (2022-24) at Marshall where he played in 22 games and rushed 127 times for 984 yards and six touchdowns and also caught 13 passes for 94 yards and three touchdowns. He has two years of eligibility remaining. In 2024, Turner rushed 104 times for 864 yards and six touchdowns, while also catching eight passes for 68 yards and two scores to earn All-SBC Second Team honors. His 8.3 rush yards per carry was the best for any FBS player with at least 70 carries on the year, thanks in part to two touchdown runs of more than 80 yards. In addition, he had four 100-yard rushing games.

► In his college debut, **Grant Washington** led Minnesota with 20 carries for 126 yards vs. Northwestern State. He was the first Gopher to run for over 100 yards in their first game since Mohamed Ibrahim ran for 101 yards on nine carries versus New Mexico State in 2018.

MOST 100/200-YARD RUSHERS

► Since 2021, Minnesota has seen eight different running backs combine for 35 100-yard rushing games:

Darius Taylor (11), Mohamed Ibrahim (10), Ky Thomas (5), Bucky Irving (3), Trey Potts (3), Jordan Nubin (1), **Grant Washington** (1) and Bryce Williams (1).

► Within the Big Ten, Minnesota's eight different players to rush for 100 yards trails only Oregon (9) for the most in the conference since 2021, while the 35 100-yard performances are second only to Michigan (39) in that span.

► Ibrahim (2), Taylor (1) and Nubin (1) have also combined for four 200-yard games since 2021.

► No other Big Ten school has had more than two 200-yard games since 2021 and Michigan (2) is the only other B1G school to have multiple players rush for 200+ yards.

WR SPOTS WIDE OPEN

► With the graduations of Daniel Jackson (75 catches for 863 yards, 4 TD) and Elijah Spencer (52 for 684, 6 TD), targets have been up for grabs among the Minnesota wide receiving corps in 2025.

► Redshirt senior **Le'Meke Brockington** has taken over as WR1 as he leads the team in receptions (25), receiving yards (285), receiving yards per game (40.7), touchdown catches (3), targets (37) and targets per game (5.29). He's also third in yards after catch (101) and YAC per game (14.4).

► He's got at least two receptions in each of the last five games and has already set career highs in receptions, receiving yards and TD catches in a season.

► He was fifth on the team a year ago in receiving yards (282) and sixth in receptions (18), adding one touchdown to enter 2025 as the team's top returning receiver.

► At California on Sept. 13, he set career highs with for targets (12), receptions (8), receiving yards (106) and all-purpose yards (106). It was the first 100-yard receiving game for a Gopher since Jackson had 117 last year versus Maryland and the highest reception total since **Jameson Geers** also had eight last year at Rutgers.

► Brockington was ranked No. 28 on this year's 'Freaks List' by The Athletic. As noted in the article, "the 6-0, 195-pounder, who has made a remarkable recovery from a broken leg in 2023, squatted a Gophers receiver record 664 pounds, breaking his own record from a year ago by 50 pounds. He vertical jumped 42 inches, broad jumped 11-4 1/4 (an improvement of five inches from last year), ran a 4.19 shuttle time and had a 10-yard split of 1.43."

► A pair of wideouts from the transfer portal -- **Javon Tracy** (Miami (OH)) and **Logan Loya** (UCLA) -- are also finding their place in the passing game.

► Tracy is second on the team with 18 receptions and ranks third with 260 receiving yards, 37.1 receiving yards per game, 31 targets and two touchdown grabs, and fourth in targets per game (4.43) and yards per target (8.4).

► Placed on the preseason watch list for the Biletnikoff Award, Tracy played three seasons for the Redhawks, appearing in 29 career games and making 79 catches for 1,166 yards and nine scores. In 2024, he played in 13 games and had 57 receptions for 818 yards and seven touchdowns to earn First Team All-MAC recognition. He has two years of eligibility left.

► Loya has nine catches for 61 yards this season. He stayed in the Big Ten for his final season after playing for UCLA the past five seasons. He played in 47 career games for the Bruins and made 109 catches for 1,314 yards and 12 touchdowns to go with 33 punt returns for 255 yards. A team captain last year, he started five of the 12 games he played in and made 29 catches for 348 yards and a team-best four touchdowns.

► Minnesota has also seen big-play ability from redshirt freshman **Jalen Smith**, who has 271 receiving yards on 13 catches for an average of 20.8 yards per reception. He leads the team in yards per catch (min. 5 receptions) and is second in targets (32), receiving yards and receiving yards per game (38.7) and third in touchdown receptions (2), yards per target (8.5) and targets per game (4.57).

► Of all players in the FBS with at least 13 catches like Smith, his average of 20.8 yards per catch leads the Big Ten and is 12th in the country. He's got two receptions of 60+ yards this year, tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for sixth in the country.

► Smith made his first career start and led the team with 76 yards on two receptions against Buffalo in the season opener, including a 60-yard scoring strike that was his first career touchdown.

► Against Rutgers on Sept. 27, Smith finished with four catches for a career-high 103 yards and a touchdown. His 78-yard reception in the second quarter was the longest since an 86-yard pass from Tanner Morgan to Rashod Bateman at Illinois in 2018. It was also Minnesota's longest pass play in Huntington Bank Stadium history and the second longest overall at the facility.

► With Smith going for 103 yards against Rutgers and Brockington tallying 106 yards in the prior game at California, it was the first time Minnesota had different receivers log 100+ yards in consecutive games since Michael Brown-Stephens (105) and Chris Autman-Bell (103) did it in 2021 at Purdue and against Nebraska, respectively.

HITTING ANOTHER GEER(S)

► Minnesota's tight end room is highlighted by redshirt senior **Jameson Geers**, a member of the Mackey Award Preseason Watch List.

► He's tied for the lead at Minnesota with three touchdown receptions. That figure is second among Big Ten tight ends and tied for 11th nationally at the position.

► Geers is also fourth on the Gophers in receptions (15) and targets (25) and fifth in receiving yards (129), receiving yards per game (18.4) and targets per game (3.57).

► Last year, he tied for second on the team with four TD receptions and was fourth in both catches (28) and receiving yards (282). Within the Big Ten, his four TD catches a year ago tied for the most of any returning tight end and ranked third overall in 2024. He also tied for 10th in receptions and 11th in receiving yards last season.

NEW LOOK O-LINE

► Minnesota's offensive line has a fresh look to it in 2025 as the Gophers have a new starter at each position. The unit isn't lacking experience though, as the entire room has combined for 116 starts and 209 games played.

► Through the first four games of the season the Gophers had used the same starting lineup along the o-line with Nathan Roy at left tackle, Greg Johnson at left tackle, Ashton Beers at center, Marcellus Marshall at right guard and Dylan Ray at right tackle.

► At Ohio State, however, the Gophers shook things up with Johnson moving to left tackle and Roy over to right tackle. Meanwhile, Marshall moved over to left guard and Ray slid inside to right guard. Beers remained at center.

► Versus Purdue, the line had its third starting configuration as the interior stayed the same but Roy went back to left tackle and Johnson moved to right tackle.

► Last week against Nebraska, they reverted back to the same starting unit that was used in the first four games.

► Beers boasts the best pass blocking grade on the unit at 77.4. That figure ranks 30th nationally among FBS centers, seventh among Big Ten centers and 21st within the Big Ten overall (min. 200 pass blocking snaps).

► Beers has been credited with six pressures allowed and no sacks given up this season in 221 opportunities. Only 12 linemen in the Big Ten have faced more opportunities without allowing a sack this year.

► Johnson, who has started games at left tackle, left guard and right tackle this season, has the highest overall offensive grade from PFF among the o-line starters at 71.0.

► Marshall has the most career starts of any player on the Minnesota roster with 43 over his time at both UCF (2023-24) and Kent State (2020-22), while his 49 career games played ranks second among Minnesota offensive players to w/out Logan Loya's 54.

► A starter at every position along the line in his career, Marshall started at right guard last season at UCF and played 782 snaps with only three sacks and 12 quarterback pressures allowed per Pro Football Focus. His pass blocking grade of 76.4 last season with the Knights was the best among any member of current o-line.

► Like Marshall, Minnesota is also the third school for Ray, who was at Kentucky (2023-24) and West Virginia (2021-22) previously. He was named to PFF's Week 8 Big Ten team after posting a season-high grade of 78.9 against Nebraska, and has the best run-blocking grade from PFF among the starters at 71.6.

► Roy appeared in two games a year ago but made his first career start in the 2025 opener against Buffalo.

► In addition to the starting five, many linemen saw action in the game against Northwestern State, highlighted by redshirt freshman center **Brett Carroll**, who posted a grade of 91.8 in 38 snaps to earn a spot on PFF's National Team of the Week.

COLLINS TAKES OVER AS DC

► Over the offseason, **Danny Collins** was promoted to defensive coordinator. Collins, who also coaches the safeties, has been at Minnesota since 2017 and most recently served as the safeties coach / pass game coordinator.

► The 2025 season is the ninth at Minnesota for Collins. It is his first as defensive coordinator, his fourth as coach of the safeties and his 13th year with **P.J. Fleck**.

► Collins came to Minnesota with Fleck in 2017 and served as the team's defensive quality control. He was a graduate assistant in 2018 before returning to quality control in 2019. In 2020, he was named senior defensive analyst before being promoted to safeties coach in 2022.

► At Minnesota, Collins has coached All-Americans **Koi Perich** and Tyler Nubin and has seen two of his safeties – Nubin (New York Giants) and Jordan Howden (New Orleans Saints) – drafted into the NFL. This past season, safeties Perich and **Kerry Brown** were both named semi-finalists for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award and Perich was one of five finalists.

► Since Collins has been at Minnesota, the Gophers have turned in some stellar defensive performances. In 2024, the team ranked fifth in the nation in total defense, seventh in team passing efficiency defense and ninth in scoring defense.

► In 2022, Minnesota ranked eighth in total defense, fourth in scoring defense and seventh in team passing efficiency defense. In 2021, the Gophers ranked third in the nation in total defense and tied for sixth in scoring defense.

SACK TOTALS SKYROCKET

► As noted on Page 1, Minnesota is coming off a school-record 9.0 sacks against Nebraska last Friday. That's tied for the most by an FBS program this season. But that wasn't the team's only standout game.

► Against Rutgers on Sept. 27, Minnesota's defense posted 7.0 sacks and 11.0 tackles for loss. The TFL number remains the most in the **P.J. Fleck** era.

► The performances have helped the Gophers climb up to No. 8 in the country and second in the Big Ten with 3.29 sacks per game, while the 6.7 tackles for loss rank 34th in the country and sixth in the conference.

TURNOVER TIME

► Minnesota's defense has forced 10 turnovers this season with six interceptions and four fumble recoveries. The Gophers had four takeaways each against Northwestern State and Purdue, tied for the most in the **P.J. Fleck** era.

► The 10 takeaways are tied for 38th in the FBS and tied for fourth in the Big Ten.

► The four fumbles recovered is tied for 35th in the country and tied for fifth in the Big Ten. Three of the four recoveries have been made by **Matt Kingsbury**, who leads the nation and has already tied for the most in a season by a Gopher since Kerry Glenn had four in 1983.

► The six interceptions are tied for 38th nationally and tied for sixth in the conference.

► Minnesota has capitalized on its 10 takeaways by turning them into 41 points, or an average of 4.1 points per turnover.

► **John Nestor**, who did not play against Nebraska, leads the team with three interceptions this season, a number that is eighth nationally and third in the Big Ten. He's also got a team-best five pass breakups, resulting in a team-high eight passes defended total this year. His 1.33 passes defended per game leads the Big Ten and is eighth in the FBS.

► In addition, Nestor is sixth on the team with 21 tackles with 2.0 for loss.

► Nestor had two interceptions against Northwestern State, including a pick-six. It was the first multi-pick game for a Gopher since **Koi Perich** last season at UCLA and the first pick-six for Minnesota since Justin Walley last year had a 32-yarder versus Maryland.

SMITH SET UP FOR SUCCESS

► Defensive lineman **Anthony Smith** was on preseason watch lists for the Lott Trophy, Shrine Bowl 1000 and Wuerffel Trophy. In addition, he was placed on preseason All-Big Ten teams by The Athletic (second team) Athlon (third team) and Phil Steele (fourth team).

► He's already made an enormous impact this season with team highs in tackles for loss (9.0) and sacks (7.0), plus 18 tackles and a pass breakup.

LONGEST BOWL WIN STREAKS*

Minnesota has won eight straight bowl games dating back to the 2015 Quick Lane Bowl. It is the longest active streak in the nation, the longest in Big Ten history and tied for the fourth longest in college football history. The only longer streaks belong to Florida State (11 straight wins from 1985-95), USC (9 from 1922-44) and Utah (9 from 1999-09).

► His 7.0 sacks and 1.00 sacks per game are tied for the Big Ten lead and tied for seventh nationally, while his 9.0 TFLs are tied for 16th in the country and rank third in the conference. Smith's 64 TFL yards lead the Big Ten and sit fifth nationally.

► Last year, Smith led Minnesota in tackles for loss (11.5) and quarterback hurries (10) last season and tied for the team lead in sacks (6.0).

► His TFL total was the highest for a Gopher since linebackers Blake Cashman and Carter Coughlin both had 15.0 in 2018 and the most by a Minnesota lineman since Ra'Shede Hageman tallied 13.0 in 2013.

► At UCLA last year, Smith set a career high with 2.5 tackles for loss, the most by a Gopher since Coughlin had 3.0 against Penn State in 2019. They were also the most by a defensive lineman, and tied for fourth most overall, under head coach **P.J. Fleck**. Smith matched that number against Penn State with 2.5 tackles for loss once again.

PERICH MAKES PLAYS

► Heralded recruit **Koi Perich** more than lived up to the hype in his true freshman season last year and the accolades rolled in for the sophomore safety and return specialist prior to 2025.

► The Esko, Minn., native was named to numerous watch lists, including the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy, Thorpe Award and Hornung Award, and he was named a preseason All-American by numerous outlets including Walter Camp, ESPN, The Athletic, PFF and Phil Steele.

► So far this season, he is third on the team with 38 tackles, including 2.0 for loss, 1.0 sacks, 1 interception and a pass breakup on defense, three catches for 55 yards on offense, plus 82 yards on 11 punt returns and eight kicks brought back for 177 yards on special teams.

► Perich's 259 combined kick and punt return yards rank fourth in the Big Ten and 33rd in the FBS.

► Showcasing his uniqueness, just past the halfway mark of the season, Perich joins USC's Adoree Jackson in 2015 as the only players in the FBS to have at least three receptions, 35 tackles, an interception, 80 punt return yards and 160 kick return yards in one season.

► Versus Purdue, Perich intercepted his first pass of the season (sixth career) and returned it 27 yards for the go-ahead touchdown with 7:40 left in the fourth quarter. It was the first pick-six of his career.

► Against Rutgers, Perich finished with double-digit tackles (11) for the second time in his career, including his first career sack and a TFL. In addition, he returned three kicks for a career-high 83 yards, including a career-long 54-yarder in the second quarter that was Minnesota's longest since **Quentin Redding** had a 72-yard return in the 2022 Pinstripe Bowl against Syracuse.

► In 2024, Perich was named a Sporting News Second Team All-American to become the first Minnesota freshman to be named an All-American since 1972 when the NCAA allowed freshmen to play to college football. Perich was also placed on the 2024 Freshman All-America Team by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), earned a spot on the All-Big Ten First Team on defense and was All-Big Ten Second Team as a return specialist. He was also one of five national finalists for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.

► Perich played in all 13 games for Minnesota last season and excelled on defense and special teams and even played a few snaps on offense. He finished fifth on the team with 46 tackles and had 2.5 tackles for loss. Perich led the Big Ten with five interceptions, setting a Minnesota freshman record in the process, and broke up three passes with one forced fumble.

► On special teams, he returned 16 kickoffs for 314 yards and 20 punts for 188 yards to become the only freshman in all of FBS since 1976 to have recorded more than 100 punt return yards, 100 kick return yards and five interceptions in a season.

► His five picks, including four in a three-game span against USC, UCLA and Maryland, were the most ever by a Gopher freshman. The Esko, Minn., native also became the first true freshman to lead Minnesota in interceptions since Kyle Theret in 2007.

► Two of his interceptions came at UCLA, joining Perich with teammate **Kerry Brown** as the only Gopher freshmen since at least 1990 to have multiple interceptions in a game. For his efforts versus the Bruins, Perich was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week, just the second Gopher freshman to ever win the award.

► Perich led Minnesota and all FBS freshmen with a grade of 88.9 from Pro Football Focus last season. That also put him 12th among all defensive backs in the country and seventh for FBS safeties. His grade led all Big Ten defensive backs and was seventh overall in the league.

► Perich also led Minnesota with a coverage grade of 88.9. The grade was tied for 31st overall in the country and tied for 14th among FBS safeties. He was third in the Big Ten overall and led all league defensive backs.

► On special teams, Perich returned 20 punts for a total of 188 yards last season, which was the most by a Gopher since Dominic Jones had 218 in 2006. Perich's average of 9.4 yards per punt return ranked fourth in the Big Ten and 24th nationally.

► Of his 20 punt returns last season, four went for at least 20 yards, tying for 12th in the country and third in the Big Ten.

► In addition, Perich had a team-high 16 kick returns for 314 yards, putting him fourth on the team in all-purpose yards at 565. In addition, that ranked fourth among all defensive players in the nation last year and was the highest all-purpose yardage total by a defensive player at Minnesota since Troy Stoudemire had 936 yards in 2010.

► Perich became just one of 12 players overall since 2000 to hit his total of punt return yards (188), kick return yards (314) and interceptions (5) in one season.

► Perich returned two punts for 82 yards at Michigan on Sept. 28, the most punt return yards by a player in eight years under **P.J. Fleck**.

► One of Perich's returns at Michigan was a 60-yarder that was Minnesota's longest since Demetrius Douglas had a 69-yard return for a TD at Wisconsin in 2018. Perich's return was the third longest of the Fleck era, and, in 13 career games, he's got two of the five longest punt returns in the Fleck era, including a 28-yarder vs. Rhode Island.

► Perich made his first career start against Penn State and posted a career-high 13 tackles. It was the highest tackle total by a Minnesota freshman since at least 2000.

► Perich had six tackles, forced his first career fumble and had a game-sealing interception against USC. The performance earned him weekly honors from both the Shaun Alexander Award and Paul Hornung Award.

► Perich was tabbed B1G Freshman of the Week after he posted his Big Ten-leading fifth interception of the season, which he returned 45 yards, to go with three tackles and 31 yards on three punt returns against Maryland.

► He was also the B1G Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 14. Perich became just the second player in league history to win the Big Ten's Freshman and Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same season, joining Northwestern's Godwin Igwebuike in 2014.

BROWN PLAYING BEYOND HIS YEARS

► Gopher defensive back **Kerry Brown** is building off of an elite redshirt freshman season.

► So far this year, Brown has 24 tackles with 3.0 TFLs, two interceptions and two pass breakups.

► Among Big Ten safeties, Brown ranks 11th this season in overall grade from PFF (79.5), eighth in rush defense grade (78.6) and 15th in coverage grade (73.8).

► Playing in 12 of 13 games last year, he was third on the team in tackles (63) and tied for third in interceptions (2). He also has 3.0 TFLs and four pass breakups.

► For his efforts, he was touted as a Second Team All-American by Sports Info Solutions and was a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.

► Brown's overall defensive grade of 76.7 from Pro Football Focus was second on the team and 10th among Big Ten safeties.

► In addition, Brown led the team with a rush defense grade of 83.9 that was fifth among Big Ten safeties and 12th amongst all of the league's defensive backs.

► Brown's tackling grade of 73.9 was also second on the Gopher roster and 20th among league safeties.

► Brown was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week following his standout performance against Nevada last season. The redshirt freshman recorded two interceptions – the first two of his career – and added four tackles as Minnesota shut out the Wolf Pack, 27-0.

► Brown joined current teammate **Koi Perich** and Justin Walley (2021) as the only Gopher defensive players to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

► Brown was one of four Power 4 freshmen, along with Perich, to have a multi-interception game last year.

TOP TACKLER: WILLIAMS

► Minnesota's top tackler this season is redshirt senior linebacker **Devon Williams**. He's got a team-high 56 stops to pace the Gopher defense, and he's third in tackles for loss (4.5) and tied for fourth in sacks (1.5), with two additional PBUs.

► The Dublin, Ohio, native is ninth in the Big Ten and 47th nationally with his 8.0 tackles per game. He's been Minnesota's top tackler in three games this year, all of which have taken place in the last five contests.

► Among Big Ten linebackers, Williams' PFF grades rank 13th in overall grade (74.2), 10th in coverage (70.6) and 18th in rush defense (76.6).

► Williams has already surpassed his totals from last year in tackles (52), TFL (2.5) and sacks (0.5), all of which took 12 games to record.

BARANOWSKI BACK

► Minnesota's top returning tackler from a year ago is redshirt junior linebacker **Maverick Baranowski**. He had 65 stops in 2024 to rank second on the team behind departed linebacker Cody Lindenberg (94), who was drafted by the Las Vegas Raiders.

► Baranowski added 5.0 tackles for loss to go with 1.0 sacks, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

► This season, Baranowski has 48 tackles to rank second on the team along with 4.0 stops for loss, 1.0 sacks and a forced fumble.

► Baranowski has the best PFF grades on Minnesota when it comes to overall defense (79.5), tackling (80.1) and pass coverage (81.0). Among Big Ten linebackers, those figures rank fourth, 11th and second, respectively.

► After posting a team-high 10 tackles with 1.5 TFLs in the season opener against Buffalo, he was named to PFF's Big Ten Team of the Week.

SPECIALIST SHAKE-UP

► With the graduation of kicker Dragan Kesich and punter Mark Crawford, Minnesota has had to replace two of its specialists in 2025. Kesich held both kickoff and placekicking duties each of the last two seasons, while Crawford was the punter since 2020.

► The first punter up has been redshirt sophomore **Tom Weston**, a native of Perth, Australia, who spent the past two years at Ouachita Baptist University in Arkadelphia, Ark.

► Weston is averaging 44.8 yards on 31 punts this year with nine 50-yarders, including a season-long of 59 yards. He's put 11 punts inside the 20-yard line, forced 10 fair catches and had only two punts go for a touchback.

► His average of 44.8 yards per punt ranks second in the Big Ten and 30th nationally. It's also currently the fourth best average in Gopher single-season history.

► At Ohio State, Weston punted seven times for an average of 50.9 yards per punt, with a long of 58, four punts of 50+ yards, and two downed inside the 20. His average of 50.9 ranked as the 10th best for a single game at Minnesota since at least 1977 (minimum of three punts). Prior to the game, the last Gopher to even have three 50-yard punts was Crawford at Penn State in 2022.

► After not seeing game action as a true freshman in 2023, Weston punted 51 times and averaged 44.2 yards per kick last year. He had 11 punts of 50 yards or more, including a career long of 76 yards, placed 23 punts inside the 20-yard line and had 21 punts fair caught.

► Senior Syracuse transfer **Brady Denaburg** has gotten the first crack as the new kicker and so far he's 9-of-12 on field goals with a long of 46 that tied a career best. All three misses have come from 40+ yards. In addition, he's 21-of-21 on extra points.

► He's also 31-of-35 on touchbacks, ranking 12 in the country with a touchback rate of 88.57 percent.

► He made his Minnesota debut by going 3-of-3 on field goals (38, 29, 25), tied for the most in a Gopher season opener since at least 1979 and tied for the third most in the Fleck era. Denaburg's 11 points tied for fifth most by a Gopher kicker in season openers.

► Denaburg was the Orange's primary kickoff specialist for three seasons and also did placekicking duties for two seasons. He made 13-of-22 career field goals (career long of 46 yards) and recorded 156 touchbacks on 198 kickoffs.

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

► Historically, Minnesota has been one of the least penalized teams in the country under **P.J. Fleck**.

► In Fleck's previous eight seasons as head coach, the Gophers led the country in fewest penalties per game three times, including two of the last three years, and the team has never finished lower than 18th.

► Under Fleck, Minnesota has ended the season averaging fewer than four penalties per game four times.

► In addition, the Gophers have placed 10th or better in penalty yards per game in six of Fleck's seasons, including four finishes in the top five and leading the country in 2017. They finished second in 2023 and third in 2022.

► Six times Minnesota has ended a Fleck season averaging fewer than 40 penalty yards per game.

► So far this season, Minnesota is continuing that strong tradition as it ranks fifth in the country by committing 3.57 penalties per game, while the yardage of 33.57 penalty yards per game ranks ninth in the FBS.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK

► Minnesota rewrote the school record books in its 66-0 win over Northwestern State on Sept. 6, which was ended with 6:15 to play due to inclement weather.

► The 66 points scored matched the modern era school record set against Murray State in 2001, and it tied for the most points in any Gopher game since a 69-7 victory over North Dakota State in the 1937 season opener.

► The 66-point margin of victory tied for the 10th best in school history and was the largest since an 81-0 win over Butler in 1926. Minnesota's 59 first-half points marked their most in any half since at least 1977, while the Gophers scored 35 points in the first quarter, their most in any quarter since at least 1973.

► Northwestern State's 42 yards of total offense and 37 plays run were the lowest by a Gopher opponent since at least 1960, while the Demons' 1.1 yards per play and two first downs recorded were the lowest by a Gopher foe since at least 1965.

► In addition, the 23 passing yards by NSU were the fewest by a Gopher opponent since Michigan State had 0 yards passing in 1979.

► Minnesota scored two defensive touchdowns in the contest on **John Nestor's** pick-six and **Matt Kingsbury's** scoop and score, which both came in the first quarter. It was the first time with two defensive touchdowns in a game since Tyrone Carter had two fumble return scores in the third quarter against Syracuse in 1996.

CLOSING OUT THE BULLS

► Leading 23-10 in the fourth quarter against Buffalo in the season opener, Minnesota showed its ability to put a game away as it took possession with 9:45 to play and used a 58-yard, 16-play drive to run out the clock.

► Minnesota was 4-of-5 on third downs and picked up the fourth down on the one third down it did not convert on the game's final play versus the Bulls. **Darius Taylor** led the way on the drive with 12 touches (11 runs) for 43 all-purpose yards (36 rush yards).

► Since head coach **P.J. Fleck** took over at Minnesota in 2017, it was the fifth longest drive by time (longest since a 10:27 drive vs. Rutgers in 2022) and tied for the sixth longest by plays (longest since a 16-play drive vs. Iowa in 2022). In addition, it was the longest drive to close out a game in the Fleck era, surpassing a 16-play, 68-yard drive over the final 8:38 to seal a win in the 2020 Outback Bowl over Auburn.

DEFENSE STOUT IN THE SEASON OPENER

► Before the Gopher defense shut down Northwestern State, Minnesota held Buffalo to 151 total yards (44 rushing, 107 passing) on 44 plays in the season opener, including -6 yards on 9 plays in the first quarter.

► The 44 plays run by Buffalo were the seventh fewest by an opponent since 1960. With records dating to 1979, the 151 yards were the third fewest yielded by Gophers in a season opener. The only better performances were 91 yards against New Mexico State in 2022 and 129 vs. Texas State in 2002. Meanwhile, the 44 rush yards allowed tied for fourth fewest in a Gopher season opener.

► Buffalo's eight first downs were the second fewest by a Gopher opponent in a season opener since 1979 and tied for the fifth fewest in the Fleck era.

► The Bulls converted just one of 11 third-down attempts. The .091 conversion rate was third worst by a Gopher foe in a season opener since 1979.

► The Gophers had 6.0 tackles for loss in the first half, tied at the time for their second most TFL in any half since 2019, and finished with 7.0 TFLs.

PROMOTIONS/ADDITIONS TO COACHING STAFF

► In addition to the promotion of **Danny Collins** to defensive coordinator, **P.J. Fleck** made other moves to his coaching staff in the offseason.

► **Mariano Sori-Marin** is coaching the linebackers and **Dennis Dottin-Carter** oversees the defensive line. Fleck also announced the hiring of **Kevin Kane** as nickels / outside linebackers coach and **C.J. Robbins** as rush ends coach. On the offensive side of the ball, Fleck announced **Jayden Everett** as the team's running backs coach.

► Sori-Marin knows the Minnesota linebacker position better than most, as he played the position for the Maroon and Gold from 2018-22. The Mokena, Ill., native played in 58 career games for the Gophers and ended his career with 274 tackles and 14.5 tackles for loss. He also broke up 10 passes, forced three fumbles and made one interception. Sori-Marin was honored as All-Big Ten Third Team in 2022 and was Honorable Mention in 2021. He was also named Academic All-Big Ten four times and was a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar.

► Sori-Marin joined the Minnesota staff prior to the 2023 season as a defensive analyst before being promoted to nickels / assistant linebackers coach in January 2024. Last year, with Sori-Marin coaching, three of the team's top six tacklers played either linebacker (Cody Lindenberg and **Maverick Baranowski**) or nickel (Jack Henderson) and the unit finished the year ranked fifth in the nation in total defense and 12th in rushing defense.

► Dottin-Carter joined the Gopher staff in January 2023 as a senior defensive analyst. In addition, he has worked closely with the team's defensive line and is one of the main reasons the team's sack and tackles for loss totals increased year-over-year.

► In 2022, the year prior to Dottin-Carter's arrival, Minnesota had 19 sacks and 47 tackles for loss. Last season, the Gophers totaled 28 sacks and 66 tackles for loss. In 2022, the Gopher defensive line broke up seven passes, and in 2024 it broke up 14.

► The 2025 season is the first in Maroon and Gold for Kane, who came to Minnesota after two seasons as Purdue's defensive coordinator. Kane has also worked at Illinois, SMU, Northern Illinois, Kansas and Wisconsin, and in addition to Purdue, he previously served as the defensive coordinator at SMU and Northern Illinois.

► Kane brings plenty of defensive coaching experience with him to Dinkytown, as he has worked exclusively on the defensive side of the ball since 2012 when he started coaching linebackers at Northern Illinois. He has also coached linebackers at Purdue, Illinois, SMU and Kansas.

► Robbins came to Minnesota from Central Michigan where he had a brief stint leading the defensive line. He spent the 2023-2024 seasons at Kent state. In 2023 he coached the rush ends and was also the co-special teams coordinator as well as the defensive recruiting coordinator.

► Prior to the 2024 season, Robbins was moved to linebackers coach and was promoted to special teams coordinator and the assistant head coach. In 2022, he coached the outside linebackers at the University of South Dakota.

► Robbins was a graduate assistant at Minnesota during the 2020 and 2021 seasons. In his first stint with the Gophers he helped mentor Boye Mafe (7.5 sacks) and Thomas Rush (5.5 sacks), who lead the Gophers in sacks in 2021. Both Mafe and Rush earned All-Big Ten honors in their careers.

► Everett has been coaching running backs his entire career, which includes on-field coaching experience at Michigan, Vanderbilt, Tulsa, Akron, Central Michigan, Indiana State and Hutchinson Community College. Everett spent the 2024 season at Michigan where he assisted the running backs. He then briefly accepted the running backs coach position at South Alabama before joining the Gophers.

► At Michigan, Everett helped mentor Kael Mullings and Donovan Edwards who combined for 1,537 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns in 2024. Prior to Michigan, Everett spent the 2023 season at Vanderbilt. There he helped Sedrick Alexander earn SEC All-Freshman honors, as he led all SEC freshmen in rushing yards and was the only freshman in the league with four or more rushing touchdowns. Everett spent the 2021-22 seasons at Tulsa and the 2019-20 seasons at Akron.

► **Keegan O'Hara** is in his third season at Minnesota in 2025 and was promoted to assistant quarterbacks coach this season after being hired as offensive analyst in January 2023. O'Hara has been with Gopher offensive coordinator Greg Harbaugh even longer, though, as the two worked together at Western Michigan during the 2020 and 2021 seasons. O'Hara was working with the tight ends and wide receivers as an undergraduate and a graduate assistant and Harbaugh was the receivers coach.

► Last season, with O'Hara on staff, Minnesota quarterback Max Brosmer led a potent Gopher offense and set a single-season school record with 268 completions for 2,828 yards (third most in single-season school history) and 18 touchdowns (tied for eighth most in school single-season history). Brosmer ranked second in single-season school history with a completion percentage of 66.5% and his 217.54 passing yards per game is eighth in single-season school history.

► Fleck also announced the hirings of **Nick Faus** (Assistant Wide Receivers Coach), **Jordan Hendy** (Offensive Analyst) and **Christian Pawola** (Assistant Defensive Backs Coach). Faus (2022 season) and Pawola (2022-23) both worked at Minnesota previously, while Hendy joins the Gophers from Pittsburg State.

BEST YEARLY SPANS

► As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their ninth season under **P.J. Fleck**. Entering the 2025 campaign, Fleck was 58-39 overall and 34-36 in the Big Ten. He had the most Big Ten wins, the second most overall wins and the third-best overall winning percentage (.598) of any Minnesota coach through his first eight seasons. Below is a look at how his yearly spans compare in Gopher history.

► **Last 8 Years (2017-24; 58-39 overall, 34-36 B1G, 6 bowl trips, 6 bowl wins):** The 58 wins are tied for fourth most in an eight-year span since 1910. The 34 B1G wins are tied for fifth most in an eight-year span in program history and tied for the most since winning 36 from 1961-68. **The six bowl wins are tied for the most in an eight-year span in team history**, while the six bowl trips are tied for fourth most.

► **Last 7 Years (2018-24; 53-32 overall, 32-29 B1G, 6 bowl trips, 6 bowl wins):** The 53 wins are tied for eighth most in a seven-year span in program history and tied for second most since winning 55 from 1902-08 (won 54 from 2013-19). The .624 win percentage is second best since 1949 (.631 from 2016-22). **The 32 B1G wins are tied for the most in a seven-year span in program history** (also doing so from 1934-40 and 1935-41). The .525 B1G win

percentage is the best in a 7-year span since 1967-73 (.507). **The six bowl wins in seven years are the most in program history** while the six bowl trips are tied for the most.

► **Last 6 Years (2019-24; 46-26 overall, 29-23 B1G, 5 bowl trips, 5 bowl wins):** **The 46 wins are tied for the most in a six-year span at Minnesota since 1908** (also 46 wins from 2014-19). The .639 win percentage is the best in a six-year span since 1949. **The 29 Big Ten wins are the most in any six-year span at Minnesota**. The .558 Big Ten win percentage is the team's best in a six-year span since 1970. **The five bowl wins and bowl trips in six years are tied for the most in program history**.

► **Last 5 Years (2020-24; 35-24 overall, 22-21 B1G, 4 bowl trips, 4 bowl wins):** The 22 Big Ten wins are tied for the 8th-most in a five-year span at Minnesota in program history and the third most since 1969 (won 24 from 2018-22 and 2019-23). The B1G win percentage of .512 is the third best since 1969-73 (.513). **The four bowl wins in five years are tied for the most in school history; it's been done four times**. The four bowl trips in five years is tied for third best in program history.

► **Last 4 Years (2021-24; 32-20 overall, 19-17 B1G, 4 bowl trips, 4 bowl wins):** **The 32 wins are tied for the most since winning 41 from 1903-06** and are tied for the sixth most in a four-year span in program history. The 19 B1G wins are tied for the second most in a 4-year span in program history (most is 21 from 2019-22). The .528 win percentage in conference games is the third best since 1970 (the other two also came under Fleck in 2018-21 and 2019-22). **It's the first time Minnesota has won four bowl games in four years**. The four bowl trips are tied for the most in a four-year span.

► **Last 3 Years (2022-24; 23-16 overall, 13-14 B1G, 3 bowl trips, 3 bowl wins):** The 23 wins in a three-year span is tied for 10th best in program history. The 13 conference wins are tied for fourth most in a three-year span since 1969. Minnesota has made a bowl game three straight years for just the eighth time in program history. It's the third time in program history Minnesota has won three bowl games in three years (also from 2021-23 and 2002-04).

► **Last 2 Years (2023-24; 14-12 overall, 8-10 B1G, 2 bowl trips, 2 bowl wins):** Minnesota has won back-to-back bowl games for the seventh time in program history.

THREE TAKEN IN '25 NFL DRAFT

► Minnesota had three Gophers selected in the 2025 NFL Draft as offensive tackle **Aireontae Ersery** went in the second round (48th overall) to Houston, cornerback **Justin Walley** was picked by Indianapolis in the next round (80th overall) and linebacker **Cody Lindenberg** was chosen by Las Vegas in the seventh round (222nd overall).

► Minnesota is one of nine programs in the country to have a selection in the first or second round in each of the last six drafts along with Alabama, Georgia, LSU, Michigan, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oregon and Penn State. The last time the Golden Gophers had first or second round picks in six consecutive drafts was 1940-45.

STRONG AWAY FROM HOME

Dating back to a 37-15 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2018, Minnesota has gone 24-14 (.632) away from home, including six bowl wins. Of the 14 losses, eight were against ranked teams and three more went to overtime. Since the date of Minnesota's win at Wisconsin, the Gophers rank third in the Big Ten in winning percentage away from home and are fourth in wins in such games. Only Ohio State (.829) and Oregon (.682) have better win percentages away from home, and the Buckeyes (34), Ducks (30) and Michigan Wolverines (25) are the only teams with more wins away from home over that time.

► Minnesota has now had at least one draft pick in the last seven drafts (2019-25). The last time that happened was 2002-08. It's also the third time in the last four years that the Gophers had at least three draft picks; 1988-91 was the last time that happened.

► With the selections of Ersery and Walley, it was the first first time since 2021 that Gophers had two top-80 picks (Rashod Bateman - 27th, Benjamin St. Juste - 74th). Before that, it hadn't happened since 1978 (Mark Merrill - 31st, Mike Hunt - 34th and Steve Stewart - 43rd).

► Ersery was the third Gopher offensive lineman to be drafted in the last four years, joining John Michael Schmitz (second round to the New York Giants in 2023) and Daniel Faalele (fourth round to the Baltimore Ravens in 2022). Prior to Faalele, Minnesota last had an offensive lineman drafted in 2006 when both Greg Eslinger and Mark Setterstrom were selected.

► The last time Minnesota had three offensive lineman drafted in a four-year span or less was in 2001-02 when Matt Anderle was drafted in the sixth round in 2002 and Ben Hamilton and Adam Haayer were drafted in the fourth and sixth rounds in 2001, respectively.

► As the 48th overall selection, Ersery was the highest drafted Gopher lineman since center Brian Williams was taken 18th overall by the New York Giants in 1989 and the highest drafted Gopher offensive tackle since John Williams was taken 23rd overall by the Baltimore Colts in 1968.

► Walley was the seventh Gopher defensive back taken since 2020. That's the most in a six-year span in program history since at least 1965.

SCORIGAMI

► Scorigami is a concept developed by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks unique scores in NFL history.

► In Minnesota's 1,340 all-time games, there have been 571 unique scores, including two this year.

► The most common overall score is 6-0, which has happened 25 times, though none have taken place since 1963. The next most common is 13-7, which has occurred 18 times, most recently in 1985.

► Minnesota's most common victory is 13-7, which it has done 13 times.

HEAD COACH // NINTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 44, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 93-63 and is 63-41 at Minnesota.

In eight years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most successful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program.

Entering 2025, Fleck was fifth in program history for overall wins (58) and games coached (97) and he was fourth in program history in Big Ten wins (34). Fleck's win percentage is third best among Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season three times, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 and 2022 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905). Minnesota has won eight games in a season four times under Fleck (2019, 2021, 2022 and 2024), which is tied for the most in program history under one coach.

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 6-0 in bowl games, and his six bowl wins are the most in school history by a coach. His six bowl wins represent 46% of Minnesota's overall 13 bowl wins as a program.

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2 mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more than once.

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached eight All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman, John Michael Schmitz, Tyler Nubin, Aireontae Erserly, Koi Perich and Mohamed Ibrahim twice), 10 Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, Ashton Beers, Schmitz, Jack Gibbins, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 438 Academic All-Big Ten performers.

He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, guided Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had 19 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota. Minnesota is one of only nine schools in the nation that can claim the distinction of having a first or second round draft pick in each of the last six years (2020-2025).

In 2024, Minnesota went 8-5 overall, 5-4 in the Big Ten and defeated Virginia Tech in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. The Gophers reclaimed Paul Bunyan's Axe with a road win at Wisconsin and posted ranked wins at home against No. 11 USC and on the road at No. 24 Illinois. Minnesota also won at UCLA to earn a victory at the historic Rose Bowl Stadium.

Quarterback Max Brosmer left his mark during his one season in the Maroon and Gold. The signal-caller threw for 2,828 yards and 18 touchdowns and also completed a school record 268 passes. With Brosmer at the helm, Minnesota had three players catch more than 40 passes in a season for the first since at least 1956 (far back as specific records exist) as Daniel Jackson (75), Darius Taylor (54) and a single-season program record for a running back and Elijah Sepcner (52) all eclipsed the 50-catch mark.

Offensive lineman Erserly was named an All-American and was the Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year. He helped anchor a line that allowed for Minnesota to average 26.15 points per game, 115.6 rushing yards per game

and 222.15 passing yards per game. The balanced Gopher offense rushed for 18 touchdowns and threw for 20.

Minnesota fielded a staunch defense, which was ended the season ranked in the top 15 in the nation in the following categories: Passes Defended/Game, Total Yards Allowed, Passes Defended, Interceptions/Game, Total Defense, Pass Breakups, Touchdowns Allowed, Opp. Pass Efficiency Rating, Interceptions Recorded, First Downs Allowed/Game, Scoring Defense, Passing TDs Allowed, Passing Yards Allowed, Pass Yards Allowed/Attempt and Yards Per Play Allowed.

Defensive back Perich was recognized as an All-American and was named All-Big Ten First Team (first Gopher freshman to be named All-Big Ten First Team since running back Darrell Thompson in 1986) after leading the Big Ten with five interceptions and making 46 tackles. Since 1976, Perich was the only freshman in all of FBS to have recorded more than 100 punt return yards, 100 kick return yards and five interceptions in a season. He was just one of 23 players overall since 1976 to hit his current total of punt return yards, kick return yards and interceptions in one season.

Perich was named a finalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award, while fellow defensive back Kerry Brown was named a semifinalist (Minnesota was the only school to have two players named a semifinalist).

The 2023 season saw Minnesota beat rival Iowa on the road to reclaim Floyd of Rosedale and win its fifth straight bowl game under Fleck (beat Bowling Green in the Quick Lane Bowl). Defensive back Nubin was named an All-American as he set a school record for most career interceptions with 13 and Dragan Kesich was recognized as the Big Ten Kicker of the Year.

Minnesota set a program record as nine Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (previous record of eight was set in 2018 and tied in 2019) and then-true freshman Taylor established himself as one of the best running backs in the nation. Taylor rushed 138 times for 799 yards and five touchdowns in six games of action. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week three times and set a school record for most yards by a true freshman when he ran for 208 yards in the Quick Lane Bowl victory.

The 2022 season saw Minnesota post nine wins as the Gophers went 9-4 overall, which included a bowl win against Syracuse and a road win at rival Wisconsin. Minnesota, which went 5-2 at home, 3-2 on the road and 1-0 in neutral site games, was paced by a stout, family-room defense and a bruising offense that featured two All-Americans.

Minnesota ended the season ranked No. 4 in the nation in scoring defense (13.85), No. 5 in third-down conversion defense (.279) and No. 9 in the nation in total defense (295.1 yards per game).

The 13.85 points allowed per game were the fewest that Minnesota has permitted since 1967 when it allowed 10.6 points per game during the 10-game season. Minnesota posted two shutouts during the season (38-0 against New Mexico State and 31-0 against Rutgers), which it had not done since 2006 and the Gophers were the only team in the nation to shutout two FBS teams in 2022 (Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State each had two shutouts, but one each game against an FCS foe).

First-Team All-American center Schmitz and Second-Team All-American running back Ibrahim led the Gopher offense, which ranked No. 17 in the nation with 207.3 rushing yards per game. With Schmitz anchoring an offensive line that featured four new starters, Ibrahim set single season records in

rushing attempts (320), rushing yards (1,665), rushing touchdowns (20), total touchdowns (20), total points (120) and 100-yard rushing games (10).

The 2022 season also saw three Gophers named either a semifinalist, finalist or winner of a national award. Ibrahim was named Comeback Player of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award. Schmitz was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy and was also a semifinalist for the Outland Trophy and the Rotary Lombardi Award. Quarterback Tanner Morgan was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a 6-3 Big Ten mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0 at Illinois).

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American Ibrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns and passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores.

In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times for 1,076 yards and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962.

The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best-ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history, while the defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-B1G First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletniok Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers were both freshmen and three of Minnesota's top-four receivers were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and were the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the M Health Fairview Masonic Children's Hospital and the program also hosts an annual diaper drive during training camp and an annual turkey drive during the week of Thanksgiving. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. You control whether you ROW fast or slow, confident or hesitant, efficient or rushed and whether you ROW for yourself or others! If you stop rowing, you will not go anywhere. OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), an international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), the MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.

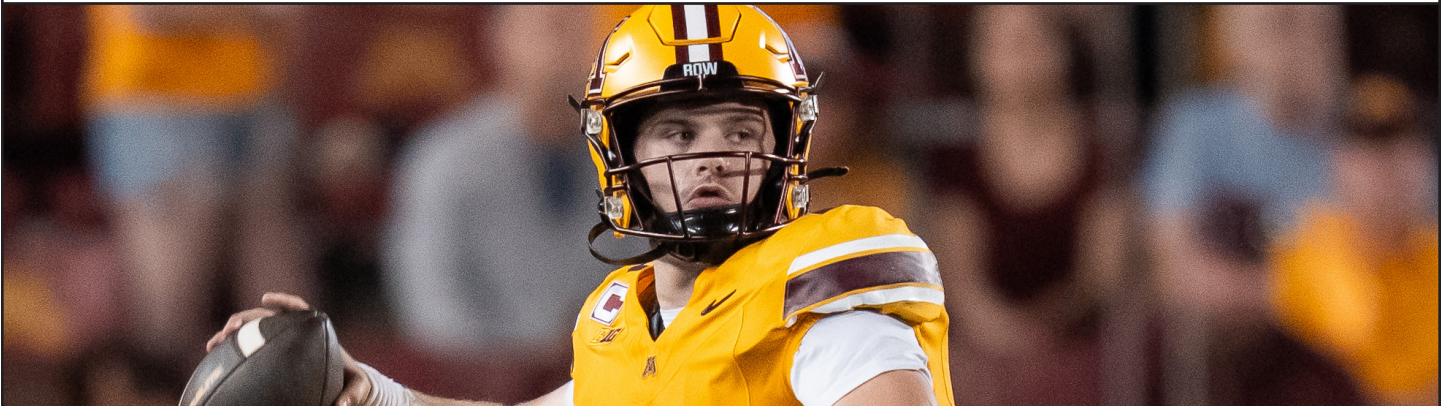

FLOYD OF ROSEDALE

Minnesota vs. Iowa

The states of Minnesota and Iowa battle it out every year in college football when their teams face each other in one of the most emotional rivalries in the country. The winner of the game earns the right to keep the bronze statue of a pig called "Floyd of Rosedale."

The year was 1935, and emotions were running hot heading into the Minnesota-Iowa game. Bernie Bierman's Gophers were 5-0, and Ossie Solem's Hawkeyes were 4-0-1. Iowa had recently been reinstated to eligibility following a suspension for slush-fund violations, a suspension that had been ardently supported by a Minnesota representative. To make matters worse, Iowa fans still remembered the contest from the year before, when Minnesota players had roughed up Hawkeye star Ozzie Simmons so badly that he had to leave the game because of injuries.

The game in 1935 was at Iowa, and the host-state had not forgotten either of the incidents. Iowa Governor Clyde Herring incited the fans and joined in the bitter feelings toward the state to the north and its football squad by saying, "If the officials stand for any rough tactics like Minnesota used last year, I'm sure the crowd won't."

Greatly alarmed, Minnesota's Governor Floyd Olson tried to cool the hot heads of fans on both sides of the border with his telegraphed answer to Herring. "Minnesota folks are excited over your statement about Iowa crowds lynching the Minnesota football team. I have assured them you are law abiding gentlemen and are only trying to get our goat...I will bet you a Minnesota prize hog against an Iowa prize hog that Minnesota wins."

The diplomatic tactic eased the tension, and the game was a hard-fought, but cleanly played, 13-6 Minnesota victory. More importantly, no mob of angry fans got involved in any postgame, extracurricular activity. The Golden Gophers brought home "Floyd of Rosedale," an award-winning prize pig which had been donated by Allen Loomis, the owner of Rosedale Farms near Fort Dodge, Iowa, and named after the Minnesota governor.

A few days later, Governor Herring collected Floyd and personally walked him into Governor Olson's carpeted office. About the same time, news surfaced that an Iowa fan had sworn out a warrant charging Herring with gambling.

Governor Olson later offered Floyd up as the grand prize in a state-wide essay-writing contest, which was won by 14-year old Robert Jones. Jones later sold the hog to the U of M. A year later, the University sold Floyd to J.B. Gjerdrum, a breeder who lived near Mabel, Minn., on the Iowa-Minnesota border, for "about \$50" according to Gjerdrum. Sadly, in a death most unbecoming a figure of such stature, Floyd passed on to that great pigpen in the sky. As Gjerdrum noted, "We had him about a year. There was hog cholera around...One day he just leaned up against a straw pile and died."

The spirit of good sportsmanship embodied by Floyd lives on in the form of a 15 1/2-inch high, 21-inch long bronze statue of the prize hog. The sculpture was commissioned by Governor Olson and created by Charles Brioschi, a St. Paul artist.

Every year since 1935, these two border-state rivals have fought for the right to pen the bronze pig in their own trophy case. Every college football season, Minnesota and Iowa fight for "Floyd of Rosedale," a symbol of how interstate tension can be averted through athletic competition.
