• Michigan State heads back on the road to face Minnesota on Saturday, Nov. 1 at 3:30 p.m. ET/2:30 p.m. CT in Minneapolis. The game will be televised on the Big Ten Network and streamed on the FOX Sports app with Guy Haberman (play-by-play), Yogi Roth (analyst) and Rhett Lewis (sidelines) on the call.

• The Spartans enter the contest at 3-5 (0-5 Big Ten) following a 31-20 loss to No. 25/24 Michigan last Saturday night in East Lansing. The Golden Gophers stand at 5-3 (3-2 Big Ten) after falling at Iowa, 41-3.

• Saturday's game marks the 50th meeting between Michigan State and Minnesota. The Spartans lead the all-time series, 30-19, including a 13-12 record in games played in Minneapolis.

• MSU fell to Minnesota, 27-12, in its last trip to Minneapolis in 2023 and is 2-2 in games at Huntington Bank Stadium, which opened in 2009. Overall, Michigan State has won 24 of the last 32 meetings, dating back to 1977, including five out of the last seven.

• Sophomore wide receiver **Nick Marsh** leads the Spartans with 42 receptions for 479 yards (59.9 ypg; 11.4 avg.), including a team-best five touchdown catches. The Detroit, Michigan, native ranks among the Big Ten leaders in TD catches (tied for seventh with five), receptions (tied for seventh with 42; 5.3 pg) and receiving yards (12th with 479 yards; 59.9 pg). During the Indiana game on Oct. 18, Marsh surpassed 1,000 receiving yards for his career; he has a total of 83 catches for 1,128 yards in 19 collegiate games.

• Sophomore running back **Makhi Frazier** rushed for a career-high 109 yards on 14 carries against Michigan, including a career-long 49-yard run in the second quarter that set up MSU's first touchdown of the game. It marked Frazier's second 100-yard rushing game of the season (103 vs. Western Michigan in season opener on Aug. 29). Frazier leads the team in rushing yards (493; 61.6 ypg) and carries (108) and is tied for fourth in the Big Ten with 18 runs of 10-plus yards.

• Redshirt junior and preseason All-American punter **Ryan Eckley** was named one of "Ray's 8" this past week by the Ray Guy Award for his performance against Michigan. Eckley averaged 47.4 yards on seven punts (332 yards), including a long of 55 yards and two placed inside the 20. Although he doesn't meet the NCAA stat minimums, Eckley would rank No. 1 in the FBS with his 50.4-yard punting average. He also ranks first in the Big Ten in 50-yard plus punts (16) and tied for third with 11 punts inside the 20.

PRESS BOX

• The Spartan Stadium press box, located on level eight, is the working press deck for reporters that features 193 seats and three radio broadcast booths. Level six is the television camera deck as well as the broadcast location for national telecasts. Admission to the press box is through Gate F on the west side of the stadium. All press personnel are subject to search prior to entering Spartan Stadium.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCES

• Post-game press conferences from both head coaches are conducted in the media center on the lower level of the north end zone facility at Spartan Stadium. Reporters can access the media center from the concourse. Selected Spartan players will also be available for interviews following the game. Quotes from both coaches and selected players will be posted online at msuspartans.com approximately one hour after the game.

MEDIA INTERVIEWS

• Outside the weekly press conference, interviews during the week with coaches or any Spartan players should be arranged through the MSU Athletic Communications Department. The best time for player interviews is following practice on Tuesday. All player interviews should be completed by Wednesday. Please contact the MSU Athletic Communications Department for all player interview requests at least 24 hours in advance.

SPARTAN MEDIA NETWORK

Michigan State Athletics and Playfly Sports announced in August 2020 a rebrand of the statewide Spartan Sports Network as the Spartan Media Network. In addition, long-term extensions were announced with the three flagship stations that anchor the network: Detroit's WJR 760-AM, Lansing's WVFN 730/WJIM 1240-AM and 94.9 WMMQ-FM. The Spartan Media Network extends its programming nationally and worldwide via partnerships with SiriusXM and TuneIn radio.

JONATHAN SMITH SHOW

The Spartan Media Network produces and distributes Jonathan Smith's weekly radio program Wednesdays from 7-8 p.m. ET (note: show is on Tuesdays from 7-8 p.m. when MSU plays on Friday nights). Spartan announcers George Blaha and Jehuu Caulcrick host the live show, featuring insight from coaches, players, special guests, features and phone calls. The radio show can be heard statewide as well as locally on flagship station WJIM Radio (AM 1240) and WMMQ (FM 94.9) and on msuspartans.com. The show is also available via a live webstream on Michigan State football's social media accounts (Facebook: Michigan State Football; X: @msu_football).

THIS IS STATE: A SEASON WITH MSU FOOTBALL

"This is State: A Season with MSU Football," presented by Farm Bureau Insurance, is a docuseries providing an exclusive look at Michigan State football. The series airs on MSU's football social media platforms throughout the season. The show is produced by the Emmy award-winning Spartan Vision team.



TEAM NOTES: OFFENSE

► RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

• Michigan State has scored on 27 of its 29 trips to the red zone this season, good for a .931 percentage, which ranks third in the Big Ten and 20th in the FBS. The Spartans have scored 21 touchdowns in the red zone, including 13 rushing TDs, along with six field goals. MSU's TD percentage in the red zone (.724) ranks third in the Big Ten and 26th in the FBS.

► 20 CONSECUTIVE STARTS UNDER CENTER FOR JUNIOR QUARTERBACK AIDAN CHILES

• Junior **Aidan Chiles** has started 20 consecutive games at quarterback for the Spartans. Now in his second season at MSU, Chiles is completing 63 percent of his passes (128-of-203) for 1,392 yards and 10 touchdowns against three interceptions.

• He currently ranks among the Big Ten leaders in points responsible for per game (eighth with 12.3 ppg), rushing TDs (ninth with six), passing touchdowns (10th with 10), passing efficiency (11th with 134.0 rating) and total offense (14th with 202.4 ypg). The Long Beach, California, native has accounted for 16 total touchdowns (10 passing, six rushing).

• Chiles was 27-of-33 passing for 243 yards and one touchdown in the loss at No. 3 Indiana on Oct. 18. He completed a career-best 82 percent of his passes while also leading the team in rushing with 48 yards on eight carries, including a career-long 64-yard rush in the fourth quarter. At one point, Chiles completed a school-record 20 consecutive passes, which tied the second-longest completion streak in any Big Ten Conference game (record: 22 by Chuck Long vs. Indiana in 1984).

► OMARI KELLY PROVING TO BE A PRODUCTIVE ALL-AROUND THREAT FOR MSU

• Senior wide receiver **Omari Kelly**, who is in his first season at MSU after transferring from Middle Tennessee State, leads the team in all-purpose yards (570; 71.3 ypg) and ranks second in receptions (30) and receiving yards (435; 54.4 ypg). Kelly ranks 17th in the Big Ten in receiving yards per game (54.4) and tied for 22nd in receptions per game (3.8), while also ranking second in the Big Ten in punt returns (18.6 avg.).

► MATT GULBIN ANCHORING THE OFFENSIVE LINE

• Graduate senior center **Matt Gulbin**, a Wake Forest transfer who joined the program in 2025, has taken every snap on offense this season for the Spartans (538). He is graded the second-best center in the FBS by Pro Football Focus (85.4). Gulbin is currently on the Rimington Trophy Watch List for the nation's best center.



TEAM NOTES: DEFENSE

► JORDAN HALL LEADS TEAM, RANKS AMONG BIG TEN LEADERS IN TACKLES

• Junior co-captain linebacker **Jordan Hall** leads the team and ranks 11th in the Big Ten with 60 tackles (7.5 pg). He recorded a career-high 15 tackles, including nine solo stops, in the win over Boston College on Sept. 6 to earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors. Hall had his first career interception to go along with eight tackles at Nebraska on Oct. 4.

► ALEX VANSUMEREN A VETERAN PRESENCE ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

• Redshirt junior defensive tackle **Alex VanSumeren** has started 20 straight games on the defensive line for the Spartans (all 12 games in 2024; all eight games in 2025).

• VanSumeren has already recorded a career-high 36 tackles, which ranks most among the Spartan defensive line and third most on the team.



TEAM NOTES: SPECIAL TEAMS

► PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN RYAN ECKLEY A WEAPON ON SPECIAL TEAMS

• Redshirt junior punter **Ryan Eckley**, a Ray Guy Award candidate and preseason All-American, led the Big Ten in punting in 2024 with his 47.9-yard average and was a second-team all-conference selection.

• Eckley has shown why he is one of the best punters in the nation in the first seven games of the season. Although he doesn't meet the NCAA stat minimums, Eckley would rank No. 1 in the FBS with his 50.4-yard punting average. He also ranks first in the Big Ten in 50-yard plus punts (16) and tied for third with 11 punts inside the 20. Eckley has dropped seven punts inside the opponents' 10-yard line, including three at the 1 and one at the 2.

• Eckley has a career punting average of 47.9 yards per punt (127 punts for 6,087 yards), which would rank No. 1 in school history (current record: Bryce Baringer, 46.0 avg.). That average also ranks No. 1 among current active players in the FBS.

- Minnesota's defense ranked among the top 10 in the FBS in total defense three times (No. 3 in 2021, No. 8 in 2022, No. 10 in 2019) and scoring defense twice (No. 4 in 2022, No. 6 in 2021) under Rossi's direction.
- Rossi coached 30 All-Big Ten honorees, two first-team All-Americans and 10 NFL Draft picks during his time in Minneapolis.
- Co-special teams coordinator/rush ends coach **Chad Wilt** spent two seasons at Minnesota (2020-21) as the defensive line coach under Joe Rossi.
- Assistant linebackers coach **Andrew Bindelglass** worked with current Spartan defensive coordinator/linebackers coach Joe Rossi for five seasons at Minnesota (defensive graduate assistant in 2019-21; defensive quality control in 2022-23).

► QUICK GLANCE AT MINNESOTA (5-3, 3-2 BIG TEN)

• Minnesota is 5-3 overall and 3-2 in B1G play coming off a 41-3 loss at Iowa in the rivalry battle for Floyd of Rosedale trophy with the Hawkeyes last Saturday in Iowa City.

• The Gophers were denied its season-long three-game win streak, as Minnesota has two in a row twice, opening the season with a pair of nonconference wins over Buffalo (23-10 on Aug. 28) and Northwestern State (66-0 on Sept. 6), before a loss at California (27-14 on Sept. 13). After a win over Rutgers (31-28 on Sept. 27), the Gophers lost at No. 1 Ohio State (42-3 on Oct. 4), before another two-game win streak with home wins over Purdue (27-20 on Oct. 11) and Nebraska (24-6 on Oct. 17), before Saturday's loss at Iowa.

• Offensively, the Gophers are 14th in the B1G and 96th in the FBS in scoring offense (23.9 ppg), while ranking 11th in the league and 47th in the nation in scoring defense (21.8 ppg).

• Minnesota's offense is 17th in the conference and 121st in the country in total offense (314.6 ypg), ranking 16th in the B1G and 118th in the FBS in rushing offense (110.5 ypg), along with 12th in passing offense (204.1 ypg).

• Defensively, the Gophers are sixth in the league and 15th in the nation in total defense (292.1 ypg), while ranking fifth in the conference and 19th in the country in rushing defense (102.1 ypg), in addition to ranking ninth in the B1G and 32nd in the FBS in passing yards allowed (190.0 ypg).

• Individually, redshirt freshman quarterback **Drake Lindsey** is 11th in the B1G and 86th in the FBS in passing yards/game (193.3 ypg), along with 10th in the league and 65th in the nation in passing TDs (10). Lindsey is 145-of-236 (.614) passing with 10 TDs and six INTs for 1,546 yards. Lindsey also has a team-high two rushing TDs, two of his 19 rushes, but has -63 net yards rushing, with a season-long rush of 3 yards.

• Redshirt senior wide receiver **Lemeke Brockington** is 18th in the B1G and 133rd in FBS in receptions/game (3.88), with 31 total catches on the season for 339 yards (42.4 ypg). Brockington and redshirt senior tight end **Jameson Geers** are tied for the team lead and tied for 20th in the league in receiving TDs (3).

• Junior running back **Darius Taylor**, who is a native of Detroit and the lone Michigander on the Gophers' roster, is 16th in the conference and 106th in the country in rushing yards/game (59.0), as well as 17th in the league and 113th in the nation in rushing yards/carry (4.43). Taylor has 354 yards on 80 carries with one rushing TD.

• The Gophers' defense is led by redshirt senior linebacker **Devon Williams** with 65 total tackles, ranking seventh in the B1G and 45th in the FBS in tackles/game (8.1), adding 6.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, two pass break-ups and one QB hurry.

• Redshirt junior defensive lineman **Anthony Smith** leads Minnesota and ranks third in the league and tied for 21st in the nation in tackles for loss (9.5), while tied for tops in the conference and tied for seventh in the country in sacks (7.0).

• Junior defensive back **John Nestor** is tied for fourth in the B1G and tied for 11th in the FBS with three interceptions, and is one of 15 players in the conference with an INT return for a TD. Nestor is also tied for third in the B1G and tied for 24th in the FBS in passes defended (8), adding five pass break-ups, which ranks tied for fifth.

• Redshirt sophomore linebacker **Matt Kingsbury** leads the league and ranks tied for first in the nation with three fumble recoveries.

• Senior placekicker **Brady Denaburg** is 10th in the conference and 57th in the country in field goals/game (1.25), along with 12th in the league and 67th in the nation in field goal percentage (.769), making 10-of-13, with a long of 46, making all nine attempts inside 40 yards, with his only misses coming from 41, 50 and 51-yards. Denaburg is also 21-of-21 on PATs.

• Minnesota head coach **P.J. Fleck** is in his ninth year guiding the Golden Gophers, posting a 63-42 overall record at Minnesota. Fleck is in his 13th year overall, amassing a 93-64 all-time collegiate head coach record, which includes three seasons as Western Michigan head coach.

► GAME RECAP

Michigan State scored 13 points in the fourth quarter but fell to No. 25 Michigan, 31-20, in front of a sellout crowd of 75,085 fans at Spartan Stadium last Saturday night.

Sophomore running back **Makhi Frazier** had 14 carries for a career-high 109 yards to lead MSU, while junior quarterback **Aidan Chiles** completed 14-of-28 passes for 130 yards and had a 1-yard rushing touchdown, his sixth rushing TD of the season.

Junior linebacker **Jordan Hall** led the defensive unit with nine tackles, while graduate linebacker Darius Snow and junior defensive lineman **Jalen Thompson** had six tackles apiece and redshirt junior defensive lineman **Alex VanSumeren** added five tackles.

► SCORING SUMMARY

The Spartans received the opening kickoff, but fumbled on their third play, giving Michigan good field position at the UM 37-yard line. MSU's defense held the Wolverines to a 21-yard field goal by Dominic Zvada.

The Wolverines (6-2, 4-1 Big Ten) took a 10-0 lead with 3:58 left in the first quarter on Bryce Underwood's 13-yard rushing touchdown.

Michigan State cut the lead to 10-7 thanks for **Aidan Chiles'** 1-yard rush midway through the second quarter. MSU's TD drive was aided by **Makhi Frazier's** season-long 49-yard rush to the Spartan 26-yard line; the total drive encompassed 73 yards on 10 plays and took 6:36 off the clock.

The Wolverines scored on their first possession of the second half, going 71 yards on seven plays, capped by a 5-yard touchdown run by Justice Haynes. On third-and-8 from the MSU 21-yard line, **Malcolm Bell** blitzed off the edge and forced an Underwood fumble, but Bell was called offsides, and the Wolverines scored two plays later.

Michigan increased its advantage to 24-7 on Haynes' second touchdown run, this time from 14 yards out, at the 3:08 mark in the third quarter.

The Spartans responded with a 12-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to make it 24-13 with 12:34 remaining, but didn't convert the 2-point conversion. Chiles' 24-yard pass to Marsh to the UM 1 set up **Brandon Tullis'** 1-yard rushing score.

The Wolverines pushed their lead to 31-13 on a 56-yard score from Jordan Marshall with 2:48 to play in the game.

Michigan State redshirt freshman quarterback **Alessio Milivojevic** engineered a nine-play, 75-yard drive in the final minutes, throwing a 21-yard touchdown pass to redshirt junior tight end **Michael Masunas** to make it 31-20.

► OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Junior quarterback **Aidan Chiles** was 14-of-28 passing for 130 yards . . . Chiles posted his third straight game and sixth game of the season without an interception.

- Chiles also scored a rushing TD for his sixth rushing TD of the season . . . it was the fourth game in the last five contests that Chiles has scored a rushing TD, and he has five rushing TDs in that four-game span highlighted by two TDs at Nebraska (10/4/25) . . . Chiles now has nine rushing TDs for his two-year MSU career and 12 total rushing TDs in his collegiate career.

- Sophomore running back **Makhi Frazier** rushed for a career-high 109 yards on 14 carries, including a career-long 49-yard scamper in the second quarter . . . Frazier posted his second 100-yard rushing outing after his previous career-best of 103 yards vs. Western Michigan in the season opener (8/29/25) . . . the 49-yard run also topped his previous longest rush of 28 yards from the same game vs. WMU.

- Sophomore running back **Brandon Tullis** scored his third rushing TD of the season but first Big Ten touchdown, with his 1-yard TD early in the fourth quarter . . . Tullis' previous TDs came in the season opener vs. Western Michigan (9/29/25) and vs. Youngstown State (9/13/25).



• Sophomore wide receiver **Nick Marsh** had game highs of six catches for 75 yards . . . Marsh now has 20 receptions for 216 yards in the last three games after seven catches in both the games vs. UCLA and Indiana and six Saturday vs. Michigan . . . Marsh has five or more catches in six of the eight games this season.

• Marsh has at least one catch in all 19 games he's played in as a Spartan, including multiple catches in the last 18 in a row, after one catch in his Spartan debut vs. Florida Atlantic, and then multiple catches in the last 18 straight.

• Redshirt freshman quarterback **Alessio Milivojevic** was 5-of-6 passing for 60 yards with one TD . . . Milivojevic tossed his third TD of the season, all coming in the last four games, with one each at Nebraska (10/4/25) and vs. UCLA (10/11/25).

• Redshirt junior tight end **Michael Masunas** caught his third TD pass of the season, but also his first in a Big Ten game . . . his previous TDs came in back-to-back games vs. Boston College (9/6/25) and Youngstown State (9/13/25) . . . Masunas now has at least one catch in seven of the eight games, with the Nebraska game the only contest without a catch.

• Senior wide receiver **Omari Kelly** had three catches for 29 yards, as he has at least one catch in all eight games played as a Spartan this season, as part of multiple receptions in seven of the eight contests . . . Kelly added one punt return for 12 yards.

► DEFENSIVE NOTES

• Junior linebacker **Jordan Hall** led MSU with nine tackles, marking this second-highest tackle total of the season behind his career-high 15 tackles vs. Boston College (9/6/25) . . . Hall has registered six or more tackles in each of the last four games as part of six of the eight games this season.

• Junior defensive lineman **Jalen Thompson** logged a career-high six tackles.

• Graduate linebacker **Darius Snow** logged six stops, his second-highest of the season, behind his season-best seven stops which came against vs. Boston College (9/6/25).

• Redshirt junior defensive lineman **Alex VanSumeren** posted five tackles, marking his fifth straight game with four or more stops and sixth time in eight games . . . Van Sumeren also posted the first pass break-up of his career.

• Senior defensive back **Nikai Martinez** returned to the starting lineup for the first time since Week 4 against USC and logged five tackles, for his second game with five or more stops.

• Redshirt senior linebacker **Wayne Matthews III** tallied five stops, marking the fourth consecutive game with five tackles as part of five or more tackles in seven of the eight games.

► SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

• Ray Guy Award Watch List member **Ryan Eckley** had seven punts of a 47.4 ypp average, with a long of 55 yards, one of three punts of 50+ yards . . . Eckley had 51 and 55-yarders in the first quarter, adding another 51-yarder in the second quarter.

• Eckley now has 16 punts of 50+ yards this season and 60 for his career.

2025 COACHING STAFF



• **Jonathan Smith**, who led Oregon State to new heights during his tenure over six seasons (2018-23), was named Michigan State University's 26th head football coach on Nov. 25, 2023. Smith is in his second season leading the Spartans in 2025 after laying a strong foundation for the program during his first year in 2024.

• Named the 2022 Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year, Smith built Oregon State into one of the top teams in the conference. He led the Beavers, who were ranked as high as 11th in the College Football Playoff rankings in 2023, to an 8-4 record in the regular season and their third straight bowl appearance, a first for the program since 2006-09. OSU went 25-13 in 2021-23 under Smith, including a No. 17 ranking in 2022 and a win over Florida in the Las Vegas Bowl. He also has experience coaching in the College Football Playoff as an offensive coordinator at Washington in 2016.

• Known for developing talent, the 46-year-old Smith has coached 10 All-Americans, 20 NFL Draft picks and more than 100 all-conference selections in his career, while also coaching in 10 bowl games, including the 2016 College Football Playoff as an offensive coordinator at Washington.

• Eleven Beavers were drafted under Smith's tutelage, and an additional 20 signed as undrafted free agents. Offensive tackle Taliese Fuaga became the highest-drafted OSU player in 10 years as he was picked in the first round (No. 14 overall) of the 2024 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints.

• Six of Smith's assistants at Oregon State joined him in East Lansing: secondary coach **Blue Adams**, assistant head coach/running backs coach/co-special teams coordinator **Keith Bhonapha**, offensive coordinator **Brian Lindgren**, offensive line coach/run game coordinator **Jim Michalczyk**, defensive line coach **Legi Suiaunoa** and tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator **Brian Wozniak**. **Jon Boyer**, who was a quality control coach at Oregon State under Smith from 2019-23, was named quarterbacks coach in January 2025.

• **Joe Rossi**, a 2024 Broyles Award nominee, begins his second year as the program's defensive coordinator/linebackers coach. Co-special teams coordinator/rush ends **Chad Wilt** also enters his second year on staff in 2025. Former Spartan great **Courtney Hawkins** is in his sixth season as the wide receivers coach at MSU.



• **Blue Adams**, who has 15 years of coaching experience and has coached both in college and the NFL, enters his second season as the program's secondary coach.

• Adams spent five seasons (2019-23) on Smith's staff as the secondary coach at Oregon State. Adams also coached four seasons as an assistant coach with the Miami Dolphins (2012-15) before returning to the college ranks at West Virginia (2016) and South Florida (2017-18).



• **James Adams** was named Michigan State's safeties coach in January 2025.

• Adams has coached defensive backs for the past 16 seasons since beginning his coaching career in 2009 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in Wake Forest.

• Spent the past three seasons as the safeties coach at Wake Forest (2022-24) and helped two Demon Deacons get selected in the 2024 NFL Draft (Malik Mustapha, fourth round, 49ers; Sanoussi Kane, seventh round, Ravens).



• **Jon Boyer** was named Michigan State's quarterbacks coach in January 2025 and enters his first season with the Spartans.

• Boyer is familiar with head coach Jonathan Smith and the Spartan offensive staff, spending six seasons (2019-24) at Oregon State, including five under Smith and Brian Lindgren as a quality control coach and senior advisor on the offensive side of the ball. He was OSU's tight ends coach during the 2024 season.

- **Keith Bhonapha** (BONE-uh-fuh) enters his second season as Michigan State's assistant head coach/running backs coach after joining the program in December 2023. He also serves as the program's co-special teams coordinator and holds play-calling responsibilities for that unit.
- Bhonapha has more than 20 years of collegiate coaching experience.
- Has helped develop six running backs into NFL Draft selections.



- **Courtney Hawkins** returns for his sixth season as Michigan State's wide receivers coach.
- A nine-year NFL veteran, Hawkins has helped develop NFL Draft picks Jayden Reed (Packers) and Jalen Nailor (Vikings) during his time in East Lansing.
- Hawkins came to MSU in 2020 after serving as the head football coach and athletic director at his alma mater, Beecher High School, in Flint, Michigan, for 15 years.



- **Brian Lindgren**, who has more than 15 years of experience as an offensive coordinator, enters his second season as Michigan State's offensive coordinator in 2025.
- Lindgren joined Jonathan Smith's MSU staff as the Spartans' offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in December 2023.
- Prior to arriving to MSU, Lindgren was with Smith at Oregon State for six seasons (2018-23) and helped build the Beavers into one of the most consistent offensive teams in the Pac-12.



- **Jim Michalczyk** (muh-hall-CHECK), who has more than 30 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and NFL levels, joined the Michigan State staff in December 2023 as the Spartans' offensive line coach/run game coordinator. Michalczyk was with Smith at Oregon State for six seasons (2018-23).
- Michalczyk was a nominee for the 2023 Broyles Award, which honors college football's top assistant coaches. His offensive lines at Oregon State were named semifinalists twice for the Joe Moore Award (2021, 2023).



- Secchia Family defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Joe Rossi**, a three-time Broyles Award nominee, is in his second season at MSU. He spent six seasons (2018-23) at Minnesota, where he helped build the Gophers into one of the best defenses in the Big Ten as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.
- Minnesota's defense ranked among the top 10 in the FBS in total defense three times (No. 3 in 2021, No. 8 in 2022, No. 10 in 2019) and scoring defense twice (No. 4 in 2022, No. 6 in 2021) under Rossi's direction.
- Rossi coached 30 All-Big Ten honorees, two first-team All-Americans and 10 NFL Draft picks during his time in Minneapolis.



- A collegiate coaching veteran of more than 20 years, **Lawrence "Legi" Suiaunoa** (Leng-ee SOO-ee-ow-noah) joined the Michigan State staff as the Spartans' defensive line coach in December 2023.
- Suiaunoa spent the past six seasons (2018-23) on Smith's staff at Oregon State, and he also coached with Smith at Montana in 2011.



- **Chad Wilt** is in his second season as Michigan State's co-special teams coordinator/rush ends coach.
- Wilt, who has more than 20 years of collegiate coaching experience, came to MSU after spending two seasons (2022-23) as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Indiana. He also spent two years (2020-21) as the defensive line coach at Minnesota under current Spartan defensive coordinator Joe Rossi.



- **Brian Wozniak** (Wahz-nee-ack), who was on Jonathan Smith's staff for six seasons at Oregon State, joined the MSU staff as the Spartans' tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator in December 2023.
- After helping Oregon State to an 8-4 record in 2023 to become bowl eligible, Wozniak has guided three teams to a bowl game as a coach and four as a player while at Wisconsin.

2025: 8 games/8 starts, 128-of-203 passing (.631), 1,392 yards (174.0 ypg), 10 TDs, 3 INTs

• Junior quarterback **Aidan Chiles**, who was named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award Watch List, has started 20 consecutive games for the Spartans. He was voted a captain by his teammates for the second year in a row.

• Chiles is completing 63 percent of his passes (128-of-203) for 1,392 yards (174.0 ypg) and 10 touchdowns against three interceptions. He has also proven to be a running threat and ranks second on the team in rushing with 227 yards on 81 carries with a team-high six scores (28.4 ypg); he has 13 carries of 10-plus yards (third among Big Ten QBs) and has run for 29 first downs (third among Big Ten QBs). **Chiles has rushed for a net of 421 yards and his six rushing TDs rank second among Big Ten quarterbacks.**

• Chiles currently ranks among the Big Ten leaders in points responsible for per game (eighth with 12.3 ppg), rushing TDs (ninth with six), passing touchdowns (10th with 10), passing efficiency (11th with 134.0 rating), and total offense (14th with 202.4 ypg).

• Chiles was 27-of-33 passing for 243 yards and one touchdown in the loss at No. 3 Indiana on Oct. 18. He completed a career-best 82 percent of his passes while also leading the team in rushing with 48 yards on eight carries, including a career-long 64-yard rush in the fourth quarter. **At one point, Chiles completed a school-record 20 consecutive passes, which tied the second-longest completion streak in any Big Ten Conference game (record: 22 by Chuck Long vs. Indiana in 1984).**

• Chiles rushed for a career-high two touchdowns at Nebraska (16 yards, 4 yards).

• Chiles accounted for four touchdowns in the loss at No. 25 USC with three passing TDs and one rushing score. He completed 12 of 21 passes for 212 yards, including a 75-yard TD pass to **Omari Kelly**.

• Against Youngstown State on Sept. 13, Chiles rushed for a career-high 76 yards on just eight carries, good for a 9.5-yard average, and compiled 346 yards of total offense as he completed 22-of-29 passes for 270 yards and one TD in the win.

• Chiles threw a career-high four touchdown passes against Boston College in Week 2 while completing 19 of his 29 pass attempts for 231 yards to earn Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors. He also connected with **Omari Kelly** on the game-winning pass on MSU's 2-point conversion in double overtime. Chiles compiled a total of 270 yards of offense against the Eagles, as he also had 12 carries for a net of 39 yards; he gained a total of 68 yards on the ground, including a 3-yard TD in double overtime that tied the game at 40, part of five rushes overall that earned MSU a first down or touchdown.

• Chiles started all 12 games for the Spartans as a true sophomore in 2024 and finished ninth in the Big Ten in total offense (220.0 ypg; 2,640 yards) to become the sixth Spartan sophomore QB in program history to throw for 2,000-plus yards in a season. The Long Beach, California, native is in his second season in East Lansing after playing in a back-up role as a true freshman at Oregon State in 2023. He was a consensus four-star prospect in the Class of 2023 and rated one of the top 10 quarterbacks in the nation coming out of high school by 247Sports.

► SPARTANS ANNOUNCE CAPTAINS FOR 2025 SEASON

• Michigan State head football coach **Jonathan Smith** announced the team captains for the 2025 season following the completion of preseason camp on Aug. 18. The five captains – junior quarterback **Aidan Chiles**, graduate senior defensive lineman **Quindarius Dunnigan**, graduate senior linebacker **Sam Edwards**, graduate senior offensive lineman **Matt Gulbin** and junior linebacker **Jordan Hall** – were voted by their teammates.

• Chiles is the first Spartan to be voted a captain in consecutive seasons since **Xavier Henderson** and **Payton Thorne** in 2021-22.

► MICHIGAN STATE ONE OF THE WINNINGEST FBS PROGRAMS IN HISTORY

• Michigan State is one of 36 programs in the FBS to win more than 700 games. The Spartans currently rank tied for No. 29 all-time with 738 victories (all-time record: 738-499-44, .593).

• Michigan State is in its 129th season of football in 2025 and has won six National Championships (1951, 1952, 1955, 1957, 1965, 1966) and nine Big Ten Championships (1953, 1965, 1966, 1978, 1987, 1990, 2010, 2013, 2015).

• Michigan State has finished in the final AP Top 25 rankings 28 times, including 17 finishes in the Top 10.

► MARK DANTONIO INDUCTED INTO MICHIGAN STATE ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

• **Mark Dantonio**, the winningest coach in Michigan State football history, was selected to the Michigan State Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2025. The induction ceremony was held on campus on Sept. 12.

• Dantonio was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame Class of 2024. He was also named to the Class of 2024 for the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame. His On-Campus Salute by the National Football Foundation was Sept. 28, 2024, for the Ohio State game, when he also had his name added to the Spartan Stadium Ring of Fame.

• After a storied 13 seasons as head coach of the Michigan State football program, Dantonio retired as the winningest coach in Spartan history on Feb. 4, 2020. Dantonio finished his career with a record of 114-57 (.667) in East Lansing and 132-74 (.641) in 16 seasons overall (2004-19). During his time at the helm of the Spartan program from 2007-19, Dantonio compiled an impressive list of accomplishments, including three Big Ten Championships (2010, 2013, 2015), two victories in the Big Ten Championship Game (2013, 2015), victories in the 2014 Rose Bowl and the 2015 Cotton Bowl, and an appearance in the 2015 College Football Playoff.

• Beyond his record for most victories at MSU, Dantonio won more Big Ten Championships (three) and bowl games (six) than any other coach in school history, while also ranking first with 12 bowl appearances. His .639 (69-39) winning percentage in Big Ten games is a school record, while he stands second in Big Ten wins (69), home wins (67), AP Top 25 finishes (seven) and AP Top 25 wins (21).

► SPARTANS WELL REPRESENTED IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

• **Nick Saban**, who posted a 34-24-1 record as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2025 Class.

• Saban is the sixth former Spartan head coach to enter the Hall of Fame, joining **Charlie Bachman**, **Mark Dantonio**, **Duffy Daugherty**, **Clarence "Biggie" Munn** and **Frank "Muddy" Waters**.

• Prior to being named the Michigan State head coach on Dec. 3, 1994, Saban previously coached at MSU, serving as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach from 1983-87, helping the Spartans to the 1987 Big Ten and 1988 Rose Bowl championships.

• In addition to the six former head coaches, 10 former Michigan State players are in the College Football Hall of Fame: halfback/punter **John Pingel** (inducted in 1968), tackle **Don Coleman** (1975), linebacker **George Webster** (1987), defensive end **Bubba Smith** (1988), safety **Brad Van Pelt** (2001), wide receiver **Gene Washington** (2011), linebacker **Percy Snow** (2013), running back **Clinton Jones** (2015), wide receiver **Kirk Gibson** (2017) and running back **Lorenzo White** (2019).

HEAD COACH JONATHAN SMITH



Jonathan Smith, who led Oregon State to new heights during his six-year coaching tenure from 2018-23, was named Michigan State University's 26th head football coach on Nov. 25, 2023.

Smith enters his second season leading the Spartans in 2025 after laying a strong foundation for the program during his first year in 2024.

Known for developing talent, the 46-year-old Smith has coached 10 All-Americans, 22 NFL Draft picks and more than 100 all-conference selections in his career, while also coaching in 10 bowl games, including the 2016 College Football Playoff as an offensive coordinator at Washington.

Named the 2022 Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year, Smith built Oregon State into one of the top teams in the conference. He led the Beavers, who were ranked as high as 11th in the College Football Playoff rankings during the 2023 season, to an 8-4

record in the regular season and their third straight bowl appearance, a first for the program since 2006-09. OSU went 25-13 in Smith's final three seasons (2021-23), including a No. 17 ranking in 2022 and a win over Florida in the Las Vegas Bowl.

Smith coached eight All-Americans during his OSU tenure (2018-23), including five his last two seasons (OL Taliese Fuaga, OL Tanner Miller and DB Kitan Oladapo in 2023; WR/PR Anthony Gould and LB Jack Colletto in 2022). In addition, Colletto was named the 2022 Paul Hornung Award winner for the nation's most versatile player, marking Oregon State's fourth major award winner in school history. Smith also coached two Pac-12 Freshman Offensive Players of the Year in Jermar Jefferson (2018) and Damien Martinez (2022) and four Freshman All-Americans overall. OSU tallied 74 All-Pac-12 selections during Smith's six seasons in Corvallis.

Eleven Beavers were drafted under Smith's tutelage, and an additional 20 signed as undrafted free agents. Offensive tackle Taliese Fuaga became the highest-drafted OSU player in 10 years as he was picked in the first round (No. 14 overall) of the 2024 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints.

Smith helped create one of the toughest home atmospheres in all of college football, as Oregon State compiled a 16-2 record at Reser Stadium over his last three years



(2021-23). Off the field, Smith led a culture of success in the classroom with a total of 168 Pac-12 Academic Honor Roll selections in his six seasons.

Smith held his introductory press conference in front of Spartan supporters, athletics staff and media from around the state of Michigan on Nov. 28, 2023, inside the Hall of History at the Breslin Center.

"My family and I are excited to join the Michigan State football family," said Smith upon his hiring. "There are no shortcuts, and we will be a program that's willing to do the work required to experience sustained success."

Smith became the fifth MSU head coach to start 3-0 overall in his first season as the Spartans' head coach, and the first since Hall of Fame Coach Mark Dantonio in 2007. The Spartans topped Florida Atlantic, 16-10, in Smith's Spartan debut on Aug. 30, 2024, and also opened the season with wins at Maryland and over Prairie View A&M. In addition, MSU had victories over Iowa and Purdue in closing the year narrowly missing a bowl bid with a 5-7 record. In the classroom, Michigan State set a program record with its highest-ever semester GPA and cumulative GPA, and had 32 Academic All-Big Ten honorees and a school-record seven Academic All-District selections.

Six Spartans ended the 2024 season with All-Big Ten recognition: sixth-year graduate defensive lineman

Khris Bogle (honorable mention, media), redshirt junior defensive back Charles Brantley (honorable mention, coaches and media), redshirt junior punter Ryan Eckley (second team, media; third team, coaches), sixth-year placekicker Jonathan Kim (second team, coaches and media), fifth-year graduate offensive lineman Luke Newman (honorable mention, coaches and media) and fifth-year senior linebacker Jordan Turner (honorable mention, coaches and media). Newman became the first NFL Draft pick in the Smith era at Michigan State, getting selected in the sixth round (No. 195 overall) by the Chicago Bears.

In Smith's final season at Oregon State in 2023, the Beavers were ranked in the AP Top 25 the first 12 weeks of the 2023 season, a first in program history, including two victories over ranked opponents (No. 10 Utah, No. 18 UCLA). The Beavers had one of the best defenses in the country, ranking seventh in the FBS in sacks (3.00 per game), 17th in rushing defense (104.1 ypg) and 18th in interceptions (12) during the regular season.

On the offensive side of the ball, Smith mentored quarterback D.J. Uiagalelei to a career high in passing yards (2,638; 219.8 ypg) in addition to his 21 touchdown passes. The Beavers averaged 33.8 points per game during the regular season, good for fourth in the Pac-12 and 26th in the FBS, and ranked 36th in the country in total offense (426.9 ypg). Sophomore Damien Martinez, a semifinalist for the Doak Walker

Award, led the Pac-12 in rushing yards (1,185; 98.8 ypg) in the regular season and was helped by an offensive line that was named one of 12 semifinalists for the Joe Moore Award. That group was anchored by junior first-team All-American offensive tackle Taliese Fuaga, who was one of seven semifinalists for the Outland Trophy and a first-round NFL Draft pick, and guard/center Tanner Miller, who earned second-team All-America honors from ESPN.com.

Smith was named the Pac-12 Co-Head Coach of the Year and the AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year in 2022 after leading Oregon State to 10 wins for just the third time in program history. The Beavers (10-3, 6-3 Pac-12) finished No. 17 in both the AP and Coaches Poll following a 30-3 win over Florida in the Las Vegas Bowl. OSU ranked No. 1 in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (20.0 ppg), rushing defense (108.2 ypg), total defense (332.8 ypg) and pass efficiency defense (114.1 rating).

Smith led the Beavers to their first winning campaign and bowl appearance in eight years during the 2021 season as Oregon State went 7-5 in the regular season and earned a berth to the Jimmy Kimmel LA Bowl. The offense was the key to OSU's resurgence, setting a program record with 6.4 yards per play while averaging 31.2 points per game and gaining 5,581 total yards. In addition, B.J. Baylor became the first Beaver to lead the Pac-12 in rushing (1,337 yards) since 2003.





2025 SPARTAN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES



During the shortened 2020 season, Jermer Jefferson earned All-America honors for the second time in his career and was tabbed the Co-Offensive Player of the Year by The Associated Press. A member of Smith's first recruiting class, Jefferson closed his OSU career ranked fifth in school history in rushing yards (2,923), rushing touchdowns (27) and 100-yard games (15). He was also selected as a Freshman All-American and the Pac-12's Freshman Offensive Player of the Year in 2018. Jefferson was one of three players to earn first-team All-Pac-12 accolades, becoming the first Beavers to earn first-team all-league honors since 2013.

In just his second season in Corvallis in 2019, Smith nearly led the Beavers to a bowl game, coming up just short at 5-7 while still tying for second place in the Pac-12 North (4-5). The beginning stages of his program development were on display with statistical improvements on both sides of the ball while also winning three road league games for the first time in six seasons. Redshirt junior linebacker Hamilcar Rashed Jr. led the nation with an OSU school-record 22.5 tackles for loss with 14 sacks to earn first-team All-America honors.

Smith returned to his alma mater as head coach on Nov. 29, 2017, following a highly successful four-year stint as offensive coordinator at Washington. He inherited a program that went from winless in the Pac-12 the year before his arrival as head coach to one of the top teams in the conference and consecutive Top 25 rankings six seasons later.

A four-year letterwinner at quarterback for the Beavers from 1998-2001, Smith helped lead OSU to its greatest

season in school history in 2000 with a school-record 11 wins, No. 4 ranking in the AP Poll, and a 41-9 victory over Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl. He was named the Fiesta Bowl Offensive MVP for his three-touchdown, 305-yard performance against the Fighting Irish. Smith finished his career as the all-time leader in school history in passing yards (9,680), touchdown passes (55), single-game passing yards (469 vs. Washington in 1998) and single-season passing yards (3,053). He also left OSU ranked No. 3 in conference history for passing yards and total offense, and his

9,680 passing yards are still third in school history. Smith was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week multiple times during his career and he earned honorable mention all-league honors twice.

Smith – who joined Oregon State as a walk-on – earned his first career start midway through his freshman season in 1998, and the two-time captain held that position the rest of his time in Corvallis, spanning a total of 38 games.

Following his prominent collegiate career, Smith entered the coaching ranks as a graduate assistant at OSU under National Championship-winning coach Dennis Erickson in 2002. He also was a GA under Mike Riley, the winningest coach in Oregon State history, in 2003. During his time as a graduate assistant, Smith helped the Beavers to the 2002 Insight Bowl and the 2003 Las Vegas Bowl and worked with longtime NFL quarterback Derek Anderson.

Smith landed his first full-time coaching position as the quarterbacks coach at Idaho in 2004, and in his final season with the Vandals in 2009, the team ranked ninth in the nation for total offense (451.4 yards per game), 12th for passing offense (286.7 yards per game) and 20th in scoring (32.7 points per game).

He then spent two seasons (2010-11) as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Montana. During the 2011 season, the Grizzlies posted one of the best offenses in the country and advanced to the FCS semifinals.

Smith made the jump to FBS in 2012 and joined Chris Petersen's staff at Boise State as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons (2012-13). The Broncos won a share of the Mountain West Conference title in his first season at BSU and also posted a win over Washington in the Las Vegas Bowl.





Smith then followed Petersen to Washington to be the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and the Huskies quickly turned into a national power.

Smith helped the Huskies to one of their best seasons in school history in 2016, when UW won 12 games, claimed the Pac-12 title, earned a berth in the College Football Playoff, and finished No. 4 in the national polls. He mentored quarterback Jake Browning, the Pac-12 Player of the Year, to a record-setting career in Washington. Browning set a school record with 43 touchdown passes as a sophomore in 2017 while throwing for 3,430 yards. The Huskies won 10 games in 2017 and advanced to their second straight New Year's Six bowl game with an appearance in the Fiesta Bowl.

Smith was a three-year starting quarterback at Glendora (Calif.) High School before his record-setting career at Oregon State, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in liberal studies in 2001.

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Michigan State scored three touchdowns in the first half and opened its 2025 season with a 23-6 win over Western Michigan under Friday night lights on Aug. 29 before a crowd of 71,657 at Spartan Stadium.

Sophomore running back Makhi Frazier carried the ball 14 times for 103 yards and one touchdown, while sophomore running back Brandon Tullis had seven carries for 52 yards and one touchdown as Michigan State finished the night with 181 yards on the ground.

Junior linebacker Jordan Hall led the defense with eight tackles, three solo, while adding one sack and 2.5 tackles for loss. Redshirt senior linebacker Wayne Matthews III added six tackles with a half for loss, including his first career interception, while redshirt junior defensive lineman Alex VanSumeren had five tackles and a half for loss and senior defensive back Malik Spencer had five tackles, including one for loss.

The Spartan defensive unit limited Western Michigan to just 29 rushing yards on 24 attempts, registered four quarterback sacks and 12 tackles for loss, and did not allow the Broncos offense to score. WMU's lone score came on an interception return late in the fourth quarter.

MSU is now 11-0 in home Friday night games to start the season and 13-0 overall in its Friday night season openers during that time span.

Michigan State opened the game's scoring on its first drive of the season, going 74 yards on 10 plays while taking 5:42 off the clock, capped by Tullis' first career touchdown from 12 yards out.

The Spartans went on another lengthy drive on their second series to take a 14-0 lead with 10:43 left in the second quarter. Nick Marsh caught his first touchdown of the season with a 7-yard grab in the end zone to complete a 10-play, 75-yard drive that lasted 5:59.

Michigan State went up 21-0 on Frazier's 9-yard touchdown run with 1:58 remaining in the first half. Frazier's first career score was set up by Chiles' 26-yard scamper down the sideline, equaling his longest rush as a Spartan.

MSU's defense turned Western Michigan over on downs on the first series of the game, then forced four-straight punts before Wayne Matthews III recorded his first career interception with 10 seconds left in the half. The Broncos had just 89 total yards of offense in the first half.

The Spartan defense scored the first points of the second half for MSU, as Alex VanSumeren and Jalen Thompson teamed up for a safety at the 8:01 mark; the safety was set up by Ryan Eckley's punt that was down at the 1-yard line.

Western Michigan got on the board late in the fourth quarter when Broncos safety Tate Hallock, a former Spartan, had a 32-yard interception return for a touchdown with 2:51 to play in the game.

POST-GAME NOTES:

- The game marked the 18th meeting between Michigan State and Western Michigan and Friday night's Victory for MSU was the Spartans' 14th-straight win over WMU that dates back to 1921 . . . MSU now leads the all-time series, 16-2, in the series that began in 1908 . . . the Spartans lead the series in games played in East Lansing, 15-2.



MSU's defense recorded a safety for the second-straight season-opener as red-shirt-junior defensive lineman Alex VanSumeren (91) and junior defensive lineman Jalen Thompson (9) combined for a tackle for loss for a safety, which was the MSU defense's first safety since D'Quan Douse in last year's season-opener vs. Florida Atlantic (Aug. 30). The Michigan State defense registered 12.0 tackles for loss to go with the 4.0 sacks. It was the MSU defense's fourth-straight season opener with 10.0 tackles for loss last year vs. Florida Atlantic, preceding 10.0 vs. Central Michigan (Sept. 1, 2023) and 11.0 vs. Western Michigan (Sept. 2, 2022).

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Junior quarterback Aidan Chiles scored from 3 yards out and completed a pass to Omari Kelly for a two-point conversion in the second overtime as Michigan State rallied to defeat Boston College, 42-40, at Spartan Stadium on Saturday night, Sept. 6.

Chiles completed 19-of-29 passes for 231 yards and four touchdowns, while running for 39 yards and one score. Sophomore running back Makhi Frazier had 17 carries for 81 yards, while sophomore wide receiver Nick Marsh caught five passes for 68 yards and two scores.

Junior linebacker Jordan Hall led the defense with a career-high 15 tackles, nine solo, while redshirt senior linebacker Wayne Matthews III, redshirt senior defensive back Armorian Smith and senior defensive back Ade Willie had eight tackles apiece.

Michigan State (2-0) forced BC three-and-out in its first possession, but a fumbled Spartan punt return gave the Eagles the ball right back at the MSU 39-yard line. Boston College fumbled it four plays later, however, as Armorian Smith dove on the ball and made a fumble recovery on the goal line just before Turbo Richard crossed into the end zone.

The Spartans responded with a touchdown drive on its first possession, going 80 yards on 11 plays, capped by a Nick Marsh 11-yard TD. On third-and-goal from the 11, Marsh caught a pass at the 7 and dragged several Eagle defenders into the end zone for his second touchdown of the season.

Boston College (1-1) tied the game at 7 on a 6-play, 88-yard drive as Turbo Richard scored on an 8-yard pass from Dylan Loneragan at the 12:50 mark in the second quarter.

The Spartans were stopped at midfield on fourth-and-1 on their next possession, and the Eagles took a 14-7 lead with the short field, going 49 yards on eight plays, ending with a 12-yard TD catch by Jaedn Skeete.

On the ensuing kickoff, Alante Brown initially fumbled the ball, but responded with a career-long 63-yard return to set up Michigan State's second TD of the game. Aidan Chiles connected on a 3-yard pass to Michael Masunas four plays after the kick return to even the game at 14 with 5:40 left in the first half.

BC went back ahead, 21-14, with its third touchdown of the game on a 14-yard Loneragan pass to Reed Harris with 31 seconds remaining in the half.

MSU opened the second half with a quick four-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped by a 41-yard touchdown strike from Chiles to Marsh to tie the game again at 21-21.

Luca Lombardo made a 37-yard field goal on BC's first drive of the second half as the Eagles regained the lead, 24-21, at the 7:00 mark in the third, but Martin Connington drilled a 50-yard field goal on his first career Spartan kick to make it 24-24 with 2:14 left in the third.

Midway through the fourth quarter, Connington connected again, hitting a 39-yard field goal to cap an 11-play, 46-yard drive that ate up more than six minutes on the clock as the Spartans took a 27-24 lead. The Eagles tied the game with 1:16 to play in the fourth quarter on a 38-yard field goal from Lombardo. The Spartans moved into BC territory on their first two plays on the next possession but could not convert and the game went to overtime.

BC won the toss in overtime and Michigan State took possession, using four plays to take a 34-27 lead on a 5-yard pass from Chiles to Jay Coyne. The Eagles tied the game at 34 on a 6-yard pass from Loneragan to Jeremiah Franklin, sending it to a second overtime period.

The Eagles had first possession in the second overtime and took a 40-34 lead on an 8-yard run from Richard, but BC's two-point conversion attempt failed. On MSU's drive, a 13-yard run from Frazier set up a 3-yard scoring rush from Chiles to tie the game at 40. Chiles then completed a pass to the back corner of the end zone to Omari Kelly, giving the Spartans a thrilling 42-40 win.



Omari Kelly hauled in the game-winning 2-point conversion pass from Aidan Chiles in double overtime for the Spartans for the 42-40 Victory for MSU. Kelly had four catches for 60 yards, while Chiles completed 19-of-29 passes for 231 yards and four touchdowns, while running for 39 yards and one score. MSU's 42 points was the Spartans' most points scored under Coach Smith and the most posting since scoring 45 points in 2023, also in game two, vs. Richmond in a 45-14 rout of Richmond on Sept. 9, 2023 at Spartan Stadium.

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Michigan State scored a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter to open a 21-point lead en route to a 41-24 win over Youngstown State at Spartan Stadium on the afternoon of Saturday Sept. 13.

The Spartans improved to 3-0 with the victory and will open Big Ten play next week at USC. Youngstown State, ranked No. 25 in the FCS Coaches Poll, fell to 2-1.

Junior quarterback Aidan Chiles completed 22-of-29 passes for 270 yards and one touchdown, while running eight times for 76 yards. Redshirt senior running back Elijah Tau-Tolliver had four carries for 37 yards, including a 22-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, and sophomore running back Brandon Tullis had four carries for 31 yards and a touchdown.

Sophomore Nick Marsh had a season-high six catches for 94 yards, all in the first half, and senior tight end Jack Velling also had a season-high six receptions for 70 yards.

The Spartans accumulated a season-high 444 yards of total offense in the win.

Redshirt senior linebacker Wayne Matthews III led the defensive unit with 10 tackles, while junior linebacker Jordan Hall had four tackles and a sack and senior defensive back Ade Willie and redshirt junior defensive lineman Alex VanSumeren had three tackles apiece.

Although Youngstown State (2-1) took an early 3-0 lead on a lengthy 15-play, 65-yard opening drive that took 7:39 off the clock, Michigan State responded with a 10-play, 82-yard touchdown march on its first series, capped by a Rodney Bullard Jr. 8-yard reverse that made it 7-3 MSU with 1:13 left in the first quarter.

Michigan State went up 14-3 with another touchdown on its second series of the game, going 87 yards on 12 plays over the course of 6:37, as Makhi Frazier rushed into the end zone for a 1-yard score at the 8:07 mark in the second quarter.

The Penguins scored their first touchdown of the game on their third series, sparked by a 66-yard rush by Jaden Gilbert to the MSU 1-yard line that led to a 1-yard touchdown run by Gilbert two plays later, cutting the Spartan lead to 14-10 with 5:59 left in the first half.

Armorian Smith recorded his first interception as Spartan right before halftime, and MSU took advantage of the turnover with a 24-yard Martin Connington field goal as time expired in the first half.

In the third quarter, Omari Kelly nearly returned a punt for a touchdown for 83 yards, the 10th-longest in MSU history, but was stopped at the YSU 4-yard line. MSU converted on the next play with a 4-yard rushing TD by Brandon Tullis to take a 24-10 lead.

The Spartans then went up 31-10 at the 6:55 mark in the third quarter on Michael Masunas' 28-yard touchdown grab in the end zone on their next possession.

Youngstown State trimmed its deficit to two touchdowns at 31-17 after Penguin QB Beau Brungard converted on fourth-and-goal for a 3-yard touchdown pass to RK Dandridge with 1:17 remaining in the third.

MSU went back up 17 points on Connington's second field goal of the game, this time from 27 yards out with 8:44 left in the fourth.

Youngstown State cut the lead down to 10 points, 34-24, when Brungard connected with Kylon Wilson on a 19-yard run-and-catch for a touchdown, capping an 11-play, 75-yard drive over 5:39.

The Spartans took over with 3:04 left in the game and closed out the scoring on a 22-yard touchdown run from Elijah Tau-Tolliver with 1:48 left in the game, making it 41-24.

POST-GAME NOTES:

- Jonathan Smith is the first MSU head coach to start 3-0 in his first two seasons.
- This marks the first time MSU has started 3-0 in consecutive years since doing it three seasons in a row from 2005-07 (John L. Smith in 2005-06; Mark Dantonio in 2007).



Junior quarterback Aidan Chiles rushed for a career-high 76 yards on just eight carries (9.5 ypc) . . . the 76 yards rushing topped his previous career long of 57 yards last season vs. Boston College on 9/21/24 . . . the 9.5 ypc was also a career-high when having more than four carries, topping the previous top mark of 6.3 ypc (57 yards on nine carries in aforementioned game vs. Boston College), and only trailing overall collegiate career bests of 14.5 (29 yards on two carries vs. Colorado) and 10.5 ypc (42 yards on four carries vs. UC Davis) during his freshman season of 2023 at Oregon State.

LOS ANGELES, Calif. -- The Michigan State football team suffered its first loss of the season at No. 25 USC, 45-31, on the night of Saturday, Sept. 20, at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.

Junior quarterback Aidan Chiles completed 12-of-21 passes for 212 yards and three touchdowns for the Spartans (3-1, 0-1 Big Ten), while also gaining 31 yards on the ground with a 4-yard touchdown run.

Senior wide receiver Omari Kelly had six catches for 133 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown from Chiles late in the fourth quarter. Sophomore Makhi Frazier carried the ball 14 times for 61 yards.

Senior safeties Nikai Martinez and Malik Spencer each had seven tackles for MSU.

USC (4-0, 2-0 Big Ten) received the opening kickoff and began the game's scoring with a 25-yard field goal by Ryon Sayeri, but Michigan State answered right back on its first series as Aidan Chiles found Chrishon McCray for a 42-yard touchdown pass at the 5:27 mark to make it 7-3 in favor of MSU.

The Trojans went on a quick six-play, 72-yard touchdown drive on their second series, capped by a Jayden Maiava 15-yard run to go back on top, 10-7, with 2:38 remaining in the first quarter.

Although Ryan Eckley pinned USC to its own 7-yard line with a 55-yard punt, the Trojans made quick work of their bad field position with a 93-yard touchdown drive, sparked by a 40-yard TD pass from Maiava to Makai Lemon as USC went up 17-7 at the 11:36 mark in the second quarter.

The Spartans made a fourth-down stop at midfield with 8:05 left in the second, and took advantage with an eight-play, 44-yard drive that Martin Connington finished with a 29-yard field goal, cutting MSU's deficit to 17-10.

USC upped its lead to 24-10 on Maiava's second TD pass of the game, this time on a 7-yard connection with Tanook Hines right before the half with 37 seconds left. Connington attempted his second field goal as time expired in the first half, but missed from 56 yards out.

The Trojans went up 31-10 after scoring on their first drive in the third quarter, but MSU trimmed the margin to one score after collecting back-to-back touchdowns on its next two series. The Green and White marched 87 yards on 11 plays, led by Frazier's six carries for 41 yards on the first scoring drive of the half. Chiles closed out the drive with a 4-yard rushing TD. On the ensuing series, Armorian Smith knocked the ball loose and Grady Kelly pounced on the Trojan fumble, giving MSU good field position at the USC 32. The Spartans scored eight plays later on a 1-yard Jack Velling TD on third-and-goal to make it 31-24 with 40 seconds on the clock in the third quarter.

USC answered with a 13-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that took 7:20 off the clock to go back up two scores, 38-24, midway through the fourth quarter. The Trojans scored their final touchdown on a 1-yard Maiava rush with 2:57 left to play that made it 45-24.

Chiles hit Kelly in stride down the field for a 75-yard touchdown at the 2:39 mark to put the final at 45-31.

POST-GAME NOTES:

• Saturday marked the ninth all-time meeting between Michigan State and USC and the first as Big Ten members . . . The Trojans now lead the overall series, 5-4, as Saturday's loss snapped the Spartans' three-game winning streak over the Trojans . . . Saturday also marked MSU's first regular-season game in the state of California since playing at Cal to start the 2008 season.



Senior wide receiver Omari Kelly had his first 100-yard outing of his Spartan career with six catches for 133 yards and one TD on a 75-yard catch-and-run to the end zone in the fourth quarter . . . it was Kelly's fifth 100-yard outing of his collegiate career after four last season at Middle Tennessee State . . . The TD catch was also Kelly's first as a Spartan and his second scoring catch, joining the game-winning walk-off two-point conversion in the 42-40 2OT Victory for MSU over Boston College (9/6/25) . . . it was Kelly's fifth career receiving TD and seventh overall TD after four receiving and one punt return for a score while at MTSU . . . The 75-yard TD catch was the longest of his collegiate career, topping a 71-yarder while at Middle Tennessee State vs. Western Kentucky (9/14/24).

LINCOLN, Neb. -- Michigan State rallied from a halftime deficit to take a 21-14 lead in the third quarter, but Nebraska came back to beat the Spartans, 38-27, on the afternoon of Saturday, Oct. 4, at Memorial Stadium.

MSU (3-2, 0-2 Big Ten) held Nebraska to a season-low 261 yards of total offense, including just 67 on the ground, but the Cornhuskers (4-1, 1-1 Big Ten) outscored the Spartans in the fourth quarter, 17-6, to earn the victory.

Michigan State collected a season-high five sacks on defense and had seven tackles for loss overall. The Spartans held a significant advantage in time of possession, 33:24-26:36, but turned the ball over three times and gave up a special teams touchdown on a blocked punt that was returned for a score in the first quarter.

Junior quarterback Aidan Chiles was 9-of-23 passing for 85 yards and two interceptions, but he did have a career-high two rushing touchdowns. Sophomore Makhli Frazier led MSU on the ground with 58 yards on 18 carries, while sophomore Nick Marsh had a team-high 41 receiving yards on four catches.

Junior linebacker Jordan Hall had a team-best eight tackles, including his first career interception, while junior defensive end Jalen Thompson had five tackles and two TFLs for 20 yards, including a 10-yard sack.

Nebraska opened the game's scoring with a nine-play, 48-yard touchdown drive on its first series, capped by a 2-yard run by Emmett Johnson.

The Huskers went up 14-0 after blocking a Spartan punt and returning it for a TD at the 7:37 mark in the first quarter.

Michigan State answered with a methodical 17-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that took 9:45 off the clock. Spartan quarterback Aidan Chiles was forced out of the game with an injury late in the drive on first-and-goal, and redshirt freshman Alessio Milivojevic came in to throw his first collegiate TD pass, a 2-yard strike to Jack Velling in the end zone. It marked MSU's longest drive in terms of plays (17) and time of possession (9:45) this season.

The game remained 14-7 at halftime, but Michigan State tied it up at 14 on its first series of the second half, going 48 yards on 11 plays as Chiles finished the drive with a 16-yard touchdown on fourth-and-4. Chiles had three rushing first downs on the drive, which came after the Spartans stopped a fake Nebraska punt on the first series of the third quarter.

Jordan Hall's first career interception on the Huskers' second drive of the half gave MSU good field position on the Nebraska 38-yard line. The Spartans took advantage with their second TD drive of the half, and also on Chiles' second rushing TD of the game, with a 4-yard score at the 2:37 mark to give MSU its first lead of the game at 21-14.

Nebraska quickly tied the game at 21 on a five-play, 75-yard touchdown drive in just 1:26 as Johnson raced 23 yards into the end zone with 1:11 left in the third.

MSU fumbled the ensuing kickoff, giving Nebraska the ball on the 35-yard line, but the Spartans held the Huskers to a 27-yard field goal by Kyle Cunanan.

After a Spartan three-and-out, Nebraska took a 31-21 lead on a 59-yard touchdown screen pass from Raiola to Nyziah Hunter. The Huskers stopped MSU again on the next possession, and capitalized with an 11-yard touchdown by Johnson, his third of the game, to go up, 38-21, at the 4:27 mark in the fourth quarter.

Milivojevic rushed for his first career touchdown, a 1-yard run, to finish a seven-play, 75-yard drive with 2:01 remaining. The Spartans didn't convert the 2-point conversion, however, and failed to recover the onside kick, and Nebraska ran out the clock for the victory.



Michigan State's defense held Nebraska to a season-low 261 yards of total offense, including just 67 on the ground, but the Cornhuskers outscored the Spartans in the fourth quarter, 17-6, to earn the victory . . . Junior linebacker Jordan Hall (5) finished with a team-leading eight tackles, as he has now registered eight or more stops in three of his four complete games played.

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Michigan State fell to UCLA on Homecoming, 38-13, before a crowd of 72,109 on the afternoon of Saturday, Oct. 11 at Spartan Stadium.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Alessio Milivojevic completed 8-of-18 passes for 100 yards and sophomore wide receiver Nick Marsh caught seven passes for 77 yards and one touchdown, while sophomore running back Makhi Frazier had 12 carries for 58 yards. Junior quarterback Aidan Chiles finished the day completing 8-of-17 passes for 66 yards and a 2-yard rushing touchdown.

Junior linebacker Jordan Hall led the defensive unit with seven tackles, while redshirt junior defensive lineman Alex VanSumeren had six tackles, including a half sack and a tackle-for-loss. Redshirt senior defensive back Armorion Smith added six tackles and redshirt sophomore edge David Santiago finished with five tackles.

Michigan State (3-3, 0-3 Big Ten) got off to a good start, forcing a UCLA three-and-out and then scoring on its first possession with a 10-play, 59-yard drive capped by a 2-yard rushing touchdown by Aidan Chiles, his fifth rushing TD of the season.

The Bruins (2-4, 2-1 Big Ten) got on the board on their second series with a 47-yard field goal by Mateen Bhaghani.

MSU came up short on fourth down on its second possession, giving UCLA good field position at the Spartan 34-yard line. The Bruins took advantage with a quick touchdown while taking just 1:39 off the clock as Jalen Berger fielded a direct snap and raced 16 yards into the end zone to make it 10-7 UCLA.

The Bruins went up 17-7 at the 10:17 mark in the second quarter on Berger's second TD of the game, this time on a 3-yard reception from Nico Iamaleava. UCLA extended its lead to 24-7 as Iamaleava connected with Titus Mokiao-Atimalala on a 12-yard touchdown with 4:09 left in the half.

UCLA scored two touchdowns in the third quarter to go up 38-7.

Nick Marsh caught his fourth TD pass of the season on a 5-yard reception from Alessio Milivojevic at the 13:09 mark in the fourth quarter.

POST-GAME NOTES:

- Michigan State scored on its opening possession for the fifth time in the six games . . . the Spartans had scored a TD on their first drive of the first four games of the season, before not scoring on their opening drive in game five of the season at Nebraska (10/4/25).
- Michigan State had five players on defense make their first starts of the season, including three of those five making their first starts of their collegiate careers . . . freshman defensive back Aydan West, redshirt-sophomore defensive back Chance Rucker, graduate defensive back Dontavius Nash, redshirt-freshman defensive lineman Kekai Burnett and graduate defensive lineman Ru'Quan Buckley all made their first starts of the 2025 season.



Sophomore wide receiver Nick Marsh snared a season-high seven passes for 77 yards, the second-most of the season behind his top mark of the season of 94 yards vs. Youngstown State (9/13/25) . . . Marsh caught his fourth TD catch of the season and first since tallying two in game two vs. Boston College (9/6/25) . . . With his first catch of the afternoon, Marsh now has a catch in all 17 of his games as a Spartan, including multiple receptions in the last 16 games, after one catch in his collegiate debut.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. -- Michigan State fell to third-ranked Indiana, 38-13, on the afternoon of Saturday, Oct. 18, before a crowd of 55,165 at Memorial Stadium.

Spartan junior quarterback Aidan Chiles was 27-of-33 passing for 243 yards and one touchdown; he completed a career-best 82 percent of his passes while also leading the team in rushing with 48 yards on eight carries, including a career-long 64-yard rush in the fourth quarter. At one point, Chiles completed a school-record 20 consecutive passes, which tied the second-longest completion streak in any Big Ten Conference game (record: 22 by Chuck Long vs. Indiana in 1984).

Nick Marsh had a team-high seven receptions for 64 yards, including a 15-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.

Graduate senior cornerback Malcolm Bell led the Spartan defense with a season-high seven tackles.

Michigan State (3-4, 0-4 Big Ten) scored on its opening possession, marching 55 yards on 13 plays while taking 6:53 off the clock, with a 38-yard field goal by Martin Connington.

Indiana (7-0, 4-0 Big Ten) answered right back on its first series to go up 7-3 as Fernando Mendoza found E.J. Williams Jr. for a yard touchdown reception with 2:40 left in the opening quarter.

The Spartans took even more time on their second possession, keeping the ball for eight minutes and 18 seconds en route to a 12-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. Chiles rushed 2 yards on a fourth-and-2 play from the IU 18-yard line, then found Nick Marsh on a 15-yard slant pass on third down for a touchdown to put the Spartans back on top, 10-7, at the 9:22 mark in the second quarter.

The Hoosiers took a 21-10 lead into halftime after scoring touchdowns on their second and third possessions.

Following a 30-minute delay at halftime due to severe weather in the Bloomington area, Indiana went up 28-10 with a five-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to open the second half, capped by a 48-yard TD pass from Mendoza to Omar Cooper Jr.

Mendoza threw his fourth touchdown of the day on a 27-yard pass to Elijah Sarratt with 3:55 remaining in the third quarter.

Both teams added field goals in the fourth quarter to make the final 38-13. Connington connected on his second field goal of the day, this time from 34 yards out, with 33 seconds remaining to close out the game's scoring.

POST-GAME NOTES:

- Saturday was the 72nd all-time meeting between Michigan State and Indiana . . . despite the loss, the Spartans still lead the all-time series, 50-20-2, including 24-11-1 in Bloomington . . . MSU has won 12 of the past 17 meetings, and IU now has a two-game win streak in the series, after IU beat MSU last season on Nov. 2 in East Lansing.
- Since 1950, the Spartans and Hoosiers have played for the Old Brass Spittoon, and since 1950, MSU leads the series, 50-17-1.

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Michigan State scored 13 points in the fourth quarter but fell to No. 25 Michigan, 31-20, in front of a sellout crowd of 75,085 fans at Spartan Stadium on the night of Saturday, Oct. 25.

Sophomore running back Makhi Frazier had 14 carries for a career-high 109 yards to lead MSU, while junior quarterback Aidan Chiles completed 14-of-28 passes for 130 yards and had a 1-yard rushing touchdown, his sixth rushing TD of the season.

Junior linebacker Jordan Hall led the defensive unit with nine tackles, while graduate line-backer Darius Snow and junior defensive lineman Jalen Thompson had six tackles apiece and redshirt junior defensive lineman Alex VanSumeren added five tackles.

The Spartans received the opening kickoff, but fumbled on their third play, giving Michigan good field position at the UM 37-yard line. MSU's defense held the Wolverines to a 21-yard field goal by Dominic Zvada.

The Wolverines (6-2, 4-1 Big Ten) took a 10-0 lead with 3:58 left in the first quarter on Bryce Underwood's 13-yard rushing touchdown.

Michigan State cut the lead to 10-7 thanks for Aidan Chiles' 1-yard rush midway through the second quarter. MSU's TD drive was aided by Makhi Frazier's season-long 49-yard rush to the Spartan 26-yard line; the total drive encompassed 73 yards on 10 plays and took 6:36 off the clock.

The Wolverines scored on their first possession of the second half, going 71 yards on seven plays, capped by a 5-yard touchdown run by Justice Haynes. On third-and-8 from the MSU 21-yard line, Malcolm Bell blitzed off the edge and forced an Underwood fumble, but Bell was called offsidess, and the Wolverines scored two plays later.

Michigan increased its advantage to 24-7 on Haynes' second touchdown run, this time from 14 yards out, at the 3:08 mark in the third quarter.

The Spartans (3-5, 0-5 Big Ten) responded with a 12-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to make it 24-13 with 12:34 remaining, but didn't convert the 2-point conversion. Chiles' 24-yard pass to Marsh to the UM 1 set up Brandon Tullis' 1-yard rushing score.

The Wolverines pushed their lead to 31-13 on a 56-yard score from Jordan Marshall with 2:48 to play in the game.

Michigan State redshirt freshman quarterback Alessio Milivojevic engineered a nine-play, 75-yard drive in the final minutes, throwing a 21-yard touchdown pass to redshirt junior tight end Michael Masunas to make it 31-20.

POST-GAME NOTES:

• Saturday's game marked the 118th meeting between Michigan State and Michigan . . . the Wolverines now lead the all-time series, 75-38-5 . . . Since 1950, Michigan owns a 42-32-2 advantage in the series, and since 1999, UM now holds a three-game edge, 15-12 . . . the Spartans are 10-8 in the last 18 meetings with the Wolverines.
