Medved vs. Missouri: First Meeting

STARTING FIVE

- The Golden Gopher men's basketball team hits the road for the first time in this new season when it travels to Missouri Wednesday night. Game time is set for 7 p.m., and on SECN+. It marks the fourth time these two teams are meeting and the second time in two years as it completes a home-and-home series.
- Minnesota opened the 2025-26 season with a pair of opening week wins against Gardner-Webb (Monday Nov. 3) and Alcorn State (Nov. 8). Cade Tyson scored 30 points in the season opener, becoming the first Gopher to score 30 points in a Minnesota debut. He followed with a 21-point performance against Alcorn State. Through two games, he averages 25.5 points and established his 1,000th career point.
- Minnesota's 45 point margin over Alcorn State marks the largest margin of victory for the Gophers since 2017 when it scored 95 points, while allowing just 50. In 2014, the Gophers held a 52-point win margin. Minnesota has outscored its two opponents, 182-110.
- Jaylen Crocker-Johnson has played in two games for his Golden Gopher career, adding double-doubles in both games. It marked his fourth and fifth of his career and first since his freshman year at Little Rock. Crocker-Johnson also added a new career high 16 rebounds in the Alcorn State win.
- Although it's early in the season, Minnesota ranks third in the Big Ten in scoring defense (allowing 55 points) and scoring margin (+36), eighth in free throw percentage (.776). Minnesota is also averaging 27.50 rebounds per game, which ranks second in the league in rebounding margin. The Gophers average 22.5 assists, which ranks second in the Big Ten and first in steals at 9.50 per game. Individually, Cade Tyson ranks second in Big Ten scoring with 25.5 points per game, while Jaylen Crocker-Johnson leads the rebounding category with 15 re-

bounds per game. Langston Reynolds also ranks eighth in field goal efficiency, making 11 of 16 attempts to start the year.

ALL-TIME SERIES

- The Nov. 12 game marks the fourth all-time meeting between the two schools, dating back to 1959 and the first time in Columbia since 1960. Minnesota leads the series, 2-1, however, Missouri won the last meeting at Williams Arena in 2023.
- In that last meeting, Dawson Garcia led the Golden Gophers with 16 points and nine rebounds, while shooting 7-of-8 on free throws (.875). While the Gophers led, 54-39, Missouri stormed back to go on a 14-2 run and close out the game with the 70-68 win on the road.

SIBLING RIVALRY

- The Minnesota/Missouri game will have two brothers competing against each other. Missouri head coach Dennis Gates is the older brother of Minnesota assistant coach Armon Gates.
- The two went against each other twice last year, each winning a game. It marks the fifth time these two brothers have faced each other either as a coach, player or assistants.

CAREER MILESTONES

- Minnesota's Cade Tyson earned his 1,000th career point on Mon., Nov. 3, vs. Gardner-Webb. It took him just 16:52 when he hit his first three of the game and eighth point of the game en route to 30 in the game.
- The senior from Monroe, N.C., scored 912 points at Belmont, 81 at North Carolina, and now 51 at Minnesota for 1,044 points.

NEW ERA BEGINS WITH COACH MEDVED

- Head coach Niko Medved was named the University of Minnesota men's basketball coach on March 24, 2025. He is in his 13th year as head coach. Medved most recently was at Colorado State University where helped the Rams advance to the NCAA Tournament three of the past four seasons. Medved, a Roseville, Minn., native, earned both a bachelor's and master's degree from Minnesota.
- Medved is joined on the coaching sidelines by Brian Cooley, Armon Gates, Aaron Katsuma, Dave Thorson and Chad Warner. Cooley, Katsuma and Thorson all worked with Medved in previous positions. Medved also brought along Joe De Ciman (chief of staff), Rachel Herndon (director of operations), Anthony Holland (player personnel), Lucas Stieber (player development) with him from Colorado State and added former Gopher manager Drew Evenson (scouting & analytics).

COACH MEDVED TIDBITS

- Medved was an assistant coach at Furman, Colorado State and Minnesota before being named the head coach at these three institutions. He is the only known coach to serve as an assistant to three places before becoming the head coach at the same institution.
- Medved's first career win against a Division

I opponent came against Gardner-Webb, the same opponent he recorded his first win as the Golden Gopher coach on Nov. 3.

RETURNING FOR THE GOPHERS

- Minnesota had two players remain with the team from the 2024-25 team in Isaac Asuma and Grayson Grove. Asuma saw significant time as a freshman last year when he averaged 24.7 minutes and averaged 5.6 points as a rookie. Grove redshirted the 2024-25 season.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- Minnesota welcomes 13 new additions to the roster: Jaylen Crocker-Johnson, Bobby Durkin, Maximus Gizzi, Max Lorenson, BJ Omot, Langston Reynolds, Kai Shinholster, RJ Spencer, Chance Stephens, Nehemiah Turner, Cade Tyson, Robert Vaihola and Chansey Willis Jr. Roster breakdown includes: six seniors (Reynolds, Vaihola, Tyson, Gizzi, Spencer and Willis Jr.), four juniors (Durkin, Crocker-Johnson, Stephens, Omot), two sophomores (Asuma, Turner) and three freshmen (Grove-redshirt, Lorenson, Shinholster).

GOPHER NEWCOMERS

- Following Asuma and Grove's commitment to staying with the program, Medved and staff immediately went to work and signed Minnesota native BJ Omot and Colorado State transfer Jaylen Crocker-Johnson. Omot played at North Dakota for two years before transferring to Cal last season. He played four games with the Bears, however, was sidelined for the remainder of the season due to injury. Crocker-Johnson followed head coach Niko Medved from Colorado State last season to Minnesota this year. Playing in all 36 games for the Rams, he helped CSU to the Round of 32 in the NCAA Tournament. Crocker-Johnson averaged nine points and 4.4 rebounds in 21.5 minutes played last season. Before his CSU tenure, Crocker-Johnson played at Arkansas Little Rock where he started in 33 of 34 games as a freshman.

IN THE BACKCOURT

- The Gophers added backcourt help with the addition of Chansey Willis Jr. and Langston Reynolds. Willis played at Western Michigan last season, where he led the Mid-American Conference in scoring when he averaged 16.8 points and 5.8 assists and ranked fifth in the league in steals per game (1.7) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.8). Despite playing in 24 games, Willis Jr. was named an All-MAC Second Team selection and a CSC Academic All-District honoree. Reynolds was a three-year player for Northern Colorado before transferring to Minnesota this season. Reynolds finished the 2024-25 campaign as one of the nation's most efficient scorers. He was named a First Team All-Big Sky and three-time Big Sky Player of the Week last year. He went from averaging 6.2 points in the 2023-24 campaign to 16 points, 5.6 rebounds the next season.

SHARP SHOOTERS

• Cade Tyson and Bobby Durkin add depth to the perimeter shooting. Tyson joins the Gopher men’s basketball program after playing the 2024-25 season at North Carolina and the previous two years at Belmont. Tyson enters his senior year scoring 993 collegiate points and 142 three-pointers in 91 career games. With Belmont, Tyson averaged 15 points, 5.3 rebounds in his two years there and was a second-team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection in 2024 and the 2023 MVC Freshman of the Year. Durkin transferred to Minnesota after playing two seasons at Davidson and was the team’s best three-point shooter the past two seasons. As a sophomore, Durkin averaged 13.5 points and 5.9 rebounds as well as 2.4 assists and 1.3 steals and started in 32 of 33 games.

FRONT COURT

• Nehemiah Turner and Robert Vaihola strengthens the front court. Turner transferred to Minnesota after spending a season at Central Arkansas. He saw action in all 33 games his freshman season, including the starting nod at the end of the year. Playing 18.1 minutes, Turner averaged 8.5 points and 4.2 rebounds, but averaged 17 points the final two months of the year. In the final 10 games of the season, Turner averaged 18.5 points and scored in double figures in all 10 contests. Vaihola played at San Jose State last season where, averaging 7.5 points, 7.5 rebounds, and 2.0 assists per game. He ranked fourth in the Mountain West in rebounds per game and third in offensive rebounds per game (2.48).

ABOUT THE TIGERS

- Missouri enters the Minnesota game with a 3-0 record. The Tigers opened the season at Howard, where they won, 88-67. Missouri then followed with a pair of home wins against Southeast Missouri State (SEMO) and VMI, 89-84 and 106-68. Missouri is coming off an NCAA Tournament appearance from a year ago where they went 22-12 and finished sixth in the SEC.
- Mark Mitchell leads the Tigers in points averaging 20.7 this season. Last year, Mitchell was an All-SEC selection when he led the Tigers with 13.9 ppg in the 2024-25 season. He is also on this year’s All-SEC Preseason Team and an XX watch list. Along with him are returners Trent Pierce and Anthony Robinson II. Pierce has yet to play however this year due to injury, while Anthony Robinson II is tied for second in team scoring averaging 14.3 points and leads the team with 10 steals. Transfer Jayden Stone redshirted at West Virginia last year and is also averaging 14.3 points. Shawn Phillips Jr. holds a team-best eight rebounds per game.
- Through three games, the Tigers are shooting 57.2 percent and averaging 94.3 points. They are also shooting 41.8 percent from three and average 42.3 rebounds per game.

ON THE DOCKET

• Following the Missouri game, the Gophers return home for two home games on Nov. 15 and Nov. 18. The Gophers host Green Bay at 8 p.m., and is televised on BTN. The Nov. 18 game features Chicago State at 7 p.m., on B1G+. Both games will also be featured on Gopher Radio Network and KFAN 100.3 FM.

Niko Medved was named the University of Minnesota men's basketball coach on March 24, 2025. He begins his Gopher head coaching career with 12 years of head coaching experience, most recently at Colorado State University. Medved is Minnesota's 19th head coach in program history.

Medved, who earned both a bachelor's and master's degree from Minnesota, returns to his alma mater after a seven-year head coaching stint at Colorado State. It marks the second time Medved has been a coach at Minnesota, as he was an assistant coach during the 2006-07 season. Medved started his collegiate basketball career at Williams Arena when he served as a student manager under former Gopher coach Clem Haskins.

Medved takes over the Minnesota program with an overall career record of 222-172 and was 143-85 at Colorado State. The Roseville, Minn., native completed a historic run at Colorado State, as the Rams competed in the NCAA Tournament three of the last four years. In the 2024-25 season, Medved led Colorado State to a Mountain West tournament championship and automatic NCAA Tournament berth, where they advanced to the Round of 32 with a First Round win over Memphis. Nique Clifford went on to be drafted 24th overall in the 2025 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings and became Medved's second player drafted in three years.

In 2023-24, Medved led Colorado State to its highest ranking in school history, as the Rams reached No. 13 in the Associated Press poll and No. 12 in the Coaches Poll. The Rams earned an NCAA Tournament at-large bid and defeated Virginia for the program's first NCAA Tournament win since 2012. Medved's first NCAA Tournament appearance came in 2022, which was the program's first in nine seasons. Medved was also the College Insider's recipient of the 2023-24 Skip Prosser Man of the Year award, which is presented annually to the Division I coach who wins with integrity, on and off the court.

In his time with the Rams, Medved recorded the second-most wins (143) in program history and was the fifth coach in school history to reach 100 wins. He was Colorado State's only coach to record 20 or more wins in a season five times. Medved was named the United States Basketball Writers Association's District Coach of the Year in 2022 and 2021.

During Medved's time, Colorado State had a first-team All-Mountain West selection for sev-

en consecutive years: Nico Carvacho (2019, 2020), David Roddy (2021, 2022), Isaiah Stevens (2023, 2024) and Nique Clifford (2025). In all, there were 18 all-conference selections, including Roddy as the 2022 Mountain West Player of the Year. In addition, the Rams also had five NABC and USBWA all-district honorees under Medved's watch. Roddy was named a 2021 All-America selection and went on to be the 23rd overall pick in the 2022 NBA draft and currently playing with the Toronto Raptors. Stevens became Colorado State's all-time leading scorer and assist leader at 2,350 points and 853 assists, respectively. He is currently on a two-way contract with the Sacramento Kings.

Before his time at Colorado State, Medved spent the 2017-18 season at Drake, where the Bulldogs went 17-17 overall and were 10-8 in the Missouri Valley Conference. That mark placed the Bulldogs third in the league that season, a five-game league win improvement from the previous year. Their 17-win season placed the Bulldogs in the ColleagueInsider.com Tournament, which was Drake's first postseason competition in six years.

Medved began his head coaching career at Furman, where he led the Paladins from 2013-17. His stint there was capped off by a 2017 Southern Conference regular season championship and Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors. It was Furman's first regular season championship in 26 years and first 20-win season since 2011. Medved twice coached the Southern Conference Player of the Year in Stephen Croone (2015-16) and Devin Sibley, Jr. (2016-17). After taking over a seven-win team, Furman improved each year under Medved with nine, 11, 19 and 23-win seasons, including two ColleagueInsider.com Tournament appearances in 2016 and 2017.

After serving as a Gopher student manager, Medved began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Macalester College from 1997-99. He then was an assistant coach at Furman from 1999-2006 before returning to Minnesota for the 2006-07 season. Medved was also an assistant coach at Colorado State from 2007-13 before beginning his head coaching career at Furman in 2013.

Medved earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology (1997) and his master's in sport management (1999) from the University of Minnesota.

He and his wife, Erica, have two daughters, Aly and Taylor.
