FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

Minnesota (7-5, 5-4 B1G) will make its 26th all-time bowl appearance on Friday, Dec., 26, in the 2025 Rate Bowl when it faces New Mexico (9-3, 6-2 Mountin West) for the first time ever. The game is set to take place at Chase Field in Phoenix, Ariz., at 3:30 p.m. CT with ESPN televising and KFAN providing radio coverage.

The Golden Gophers are 13-12 in their history in bowl games and have won eight straight bowl contests, including all six appearances under head coach P.J. Fleck (2025 Duke's Mayo, 2023 Quick Lane, 2022 Pinstripe, 2021 Guaranteed Rate, 2020 Outback, 2018 Quick Lane). The eight-game bowl winning streak is the longest active streak in the country and tied for the fourth longest in FBS history (see chart bottom right). With six bowl wins, Fleck already has the most in Gophers history, while the other 34 coaches in program history have combined for seven bowl wins. Fleck's seven bowl game appearances will match Glen Mason for the most in team annals. This year will mark the fifth time Minnesota has played in the Rate Bowl, previously appearing in 2006, 2008 and 2009 when it was called the Insight Bowl,

as well as the 2021 Guaranteed Rate Bowl. The five appearances tie Kansas State for the most in the bowl's history and marks the bowl game Minnesota has played in the most times. The Golden Gophers are 1-3 all-time in the bowl. More bowl info and history can be found on Pages 3, and 65-80 of the notes.

The Golden Gophers finished the regular season with a record of 7-5, marking the fifth time in the last six seasons that they've finished the regular season with that record or better. Minnesota was also 7-5 last season after posting 8-4 marks in 2021 and 2022 and a 10-2 record in 2019. The team is looking to tally its fifth eight-win season under P.J. Fleck, which would join him with Henry L. Williams (6) as the only Gopher coaches to reach that number. The Gophers also finished with a 5-4 record in Big Ten play. Like its overall mark, the team has posted a winning record in the conference in five of the past six seasons.

In the regular season finale against Wisconsin, John Nestor had one of the best individual defensive performances the sport has seen in some time. He recorded a career-high nine tackles and 2.0 tackles for loss in a 17-7 win that helped Minnesota win Paul Bunyan's Axe for the fourth time in the last five years. He also had two interceptions (76 return yards) and recovered one fumble. According to Stathead, no FBS player since at least 2005 has had a game like Nestor's with at least nine tackles, two tackles for loss, two interceptions and a fumble recovery. Both of Nestor's interceptions came in the third quarter, making him the first Gopher with multiple picks in a quarter since Tyler Nubin versus Rutgers in 2022. Nestor also had two interceptions earlier this year against Northwestern State, joinging him with Antoine Winfield Jr. (2019) as the only Gopher since at least 2000 to have multiple games in a season with two interceptions. For his efforts against the Badgers, Nestor was named both the Big Ten Defenisve Player of the Week and the Bednarik Award Player of the Week.

LONGEST BOWL WIN STREAKS

Minnesota has won eight straight bowl games dating back to the 2015 Quick Lane Bowl. It is the longest active streak in the nation, the longest in Big Ten history and tied for the fourth longest in FBS history (full list

The 2025 campaign is the ninth for P.J. Fleck at Minnesota. He is the fifth-longest tenured coach in program history and the second-longest active tenured coach in the Big Ten. Fleck's record stands at 65-44, putting him fourth in program history in overall wins He's also fourth at Minnesota in Big Ten wins (39) and fifth in games coached (109). Fleck's overall win percentage of .596 is third best among Minnesota coaches with more than 40 games under their helm behind only Henry I. Williams (786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). In his 13th season overall as a college head coach, Fleck is 95-66 (.590).

FACING NEW MEXICO

- Minnesota and New Mexico meet for the first time ever in the Rate Bowl. The Golden Gophers have played 90 different teams currently in the FBS, and they are 65-23-2 when playing those teams for the first time.
- All-time against schools currently in the Mountain West Conference, the Golden Gophers are 15-3, including 12 straight wins since 2004. During that streak, Minnesota has won games by an average score of 33-19. Against Mountain West schools at the time of the game, the Gophers are 12-0.

- Minnesota has one native of New Mexico on its roster in true freshman OL Mark Handy. He is from Albuquerque and attended La Cueva High School, roughly 10 miles north of the Lobos' University Stadium.
- New Mexico has one Minnesotan on its roster in junior wide receiver Kader Diop, a Minneapolis native who attended Minneapolis South High School. He also spent the 2021 season at Concordia, St. Paul, where he redshirted and was teammates with Gopher kicker Sam Henson.
- The Gophers also have two Arizonans on the roster as long snapper Alan Soukup and offensive lineman Nick **Spence** are both from Phoenix. Soukup attended Pinnacle High School, about 20 miles north of Chase Field, while Spence went to Liberty High School, about 30 miles northwest of the stadium.
- New Mexico head coach Jason Eck coached in the state of Minnesota at both Minnesota State and Winona State. He was Minnesota State's offensive coordinator from 2013-14, while at Winona State he was the offensive line and tight ends coach in 2007 and added co-offensive coordinator duties in 2008.
- Lobos offensive coordinator Luke Schleusner also coached at Minnesota State. He first served as the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator from 2005-08 before adding the titles of wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator for the 2009-10 seasons.
- New Mexico defensive coordinator Spence Nowinsky has multiple ties to the state of Minnesota. He played at Minnesota State from 1991-94 as a defensive lineman, then coached for three years at Lake Crystal Wellcome Memorial High School (1995-97). He later returned to Minnesota State for the 2004-06 seasons, spending the 2004 and '06 seasons as the defensive line coach and the 2005 campaign as the offensive line coach.
- Nowinsky shared multiple stops with Minnesota tight end coach Eric Koehler. Both were on staff at Illinois State for the 2013 season when Nowinsky was the Redbirds' defensive line coach, while Koehler was the quarterbacks coach. They also overlapped at Miami (OH) from 2018-21 when Koehler was the Redhawks' OC/QBs coach and Nowinsky was the co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.
- ► Also on that Miami (OH) staff in 2019 was Minnesota rush ends coach C.J. Robbins, who was a graduate assistant.
- New Mexico receivers coach Colin Lockett was a high school defensive backs coach at St. John Bosco (CA) when Gophers wide receiver Logan Loya attended the school.
- The Lobos enter the game with a 9-3 record overall. Their 6-2 record in the Mountain West tied for first, though they missed the conference title game due to tiebreakers.

- Minnesota and New Mexico did not have any common opponents this year, though the Lobos did play two Big Ten teams. They lost in their season opener at Michigan, 34-17, but won at UCLA, 35-10, on Sept. 12.
- Jack Layne has been QB1 for New Mexico this season, completing 199-of-302 passes for 2,398 yards and 13 touchdowns against nine interceptions. Layne's efficiency rating stands at 140.8, while his completion percentage of .659 ranked third in the conference heading into bowl games. He has also run for 150 yards this year and scored four times on the ground.
- New Mexico's passing attack is led by the duo of Keagan Johnson and Dorian Thomas, both of whom have at least 53 receptions and 545 receiving yards. Johnson leads the way with 57 receptions for 730 yards. His 5.18 receptions per game ranked second in the Mountain West through conference championship games. Thomas has a team-high four receiving touchdowns.
- Like in the receiving corps, the running game is also spearheaded by two players. Damon Bankston has a teamhigh 578 yards on 104 attempts, and his 107.17 all-purpose yards per game were third most in the league heading into bowls. D.J. McKinney's 109 carries and seven rushing scores are most on the team.
- Jaxton Eck, son of head coach Jason Eck, is the Lobos' top tackler at 126 stops this season. His 10.5 tackles per game were second in the Mountain West and eighth nationally. He's also got 6.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, two pass breakups, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a safety.
- Keyshawn James-Newby leads New Mexico in both tackles for loss (13.0) and sacks (8.0). His 0.67 sacks per game led the MWC heading into bowl season.
- Austin Brawley has a team-high three interceptions, while Drew Speech leads the Lobos with seven pass breakups.
- Luke Drzewiecki is 15-of -16 on field goals with a long of 46 yards. Entering bowl season, he ranked second in the Mountain West and fourth nationally with a .938 field goal percentage, while his 1.25 field goals made per game ranked fifth in the league.
- Daniel Hughes is averaging 45.9 yards on 37 punts with 13 boots of 50-plus yards and 12 downed inside the 20.
- In addition to leading the backfield, McKinney and Bankston have been dangerous in the return game this year. McKinney has returned four punts for 71 yards (17.8 average), including a 49-yard return for a touchdown, while Bankston is averaging 30.4 yards on 11 returns with a touchdown as well

LAST TIME VS. THE MWC

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: The last time Minnesota played a team from the Mountain West, Darius Taylor ran for 124 yards and two scores and caught a touchdown pass as Minnesota beat Nevada 27-0 last year in Minneapolis.
- Taylor had an 80-yard touchdown early in the third quarter. The sixth-longest rushing score in school history included breaking through a couple missed tackles near the line of scrimmage and Taylor cutting back across the field over the final 20 yards.
- Max Brosmer finished 16 of 26 for 191 yards and a touchdown as the Gophers averaged 6.66 yards per play and finished with a 386-172 advantage in total yards.
- Dragan Kesich made a 52-yard field goal for Minnesota in the first quarter.
- Under pressure much of the game thanks to an overmatched offensive line, Nevada's dual-threat quarterback Brendon Lewis was 15 of 23 for 114 yards with three interceptions and ran 10 times for minus-1 yards. He was sacked four times.
- Kerry Brown had two interceptions and Ethan Robinson one for Minnesota.

WISCONSIN RECAP

- ▶ With assistance from the AP: Drake Lindsey threw a touchdown pass to Jameson Geers for the only second-half score in snow-globe conditions, and John Nestor had two interceptions and a fumble recovery for Minnesota in a 17-7 victory over Wisconsin on Nov. 29 to keep possession of Paul Bunyan's Axe and overtake the all-time series lead at 64-63-8.
- ▶ Darius Taylor had a 49-yard touchdown run late in the second quarter to get the Gophers going in the 135th edition of the most-played rivalry in FBS history.
- ▶ With snow whitening the field and wind whipping through the air all afternoon, Lindsey was 18 of 24 in a safe diet of screen plays and out routes for 90 yards.
- ► The redshirt freshman nailed his most important throw on third-and-7 from the 13 in the third quarter, floating a perfectly placed ball over the line so his trusty senior tight end, Geers, could secure a jumping catch in traffic as he tumbled to the turf for a 10-point lead.
- Nestor delivered interceptions on consecutive third quarter drives, just as the Badgers were starting to find success in the passing game. He darted in front of Trech Kekahuna for the pick and raced 68 yards before getting tackled by Simmons. Minnesota's season leader with five interceptions in 10 games, Nestor had two of his teamhigh-tying nine tackles in the game for loss.
- ► Carter Smith threw a fourth-and-goal touchdown pass to Jackson Acker with 21 seconds left in the first half, after Hunter Simmons set up the score with a 67-yard completion to Vinny Anthony.

MILESTONE WATCH

- ▶ Drake Lindsey's 361 pass attempts rank ninth in Gopher single-season history and are 24 away from cracking the top five of the single-season list, and his 16 touchdown passes are one back tying for 10th in one season.
- ► Le'Meke Brockington is four receptions away from recording the 29th 50-catch season in program history.
- ▶ Darius Taylor has 2,339 career rushing yards to rank 13th in Gopher history. He's 142 back of reaching Minnesota's all-time top-10.
- ➤ Taylor has 95 career receptions, putting him five away from becoming the 19th player in program history to get to 100. He also has 30 receptions on the year, meaning he needs three more to reach the top five for a Gopher running back in a season.

- ▶ In his career, Taylor has rushed 55 times for 321 yards in bowl games. He is 16 attempts and 115 yards away from owning the Minnesota records in each category.
- ▶ In addition, Taylor's 349 career all-purpose yards in bowl games are 86 off tying the school record, while his two touchdowns scored (both rushing) are two away from tying the school record for rushing touchdowns and overall.
- ▶ With 355 receiving yards on the season, **Jalen Smith** needs 51 more yards to break into Minnesota's top five by a freshman
- ▶ With 27.0 tackles for loss in his career and 13.5 this season, **Anthony Smith** is 1.5 TFLs away from cracking Minnesota's career and single-season top-10 list.
- ► Smith needs 1.5 sacks to tie Ben Mezera (12.0) for fourth in Minnesota single-season history.
- ▶ In bowl games, Smith's 3.0 career TFLs are 1.0 off tying the school record.
- ▶ One more punt return and 33 more punt return yards will push **Koi Perich** (37 for 302) into the top-10 for a career at Minnesota in both categories (since 1965).
- ▶ Perich (35 for 813) is also three kick returns and 36 kick return yards from reaching the top 10 in both for a career at Minnesota.
- ▶ In bowl games, Perich has returned three punts for 15 yards, putting him two returns and 20 yards from tying the school record in each category.
- ▶ Sitting at 1,375 career receiving yards, 1,314 of which were recorded at UCLA, wide receiver **Logan Loya** is 125 yards away from 1,500 for his career.
- More record book information is located on Pages 14-15.

IN THE POLLS

- ▶ Minnesota does not appear in either the latest AP Poll or Coaches Poll, while New Mexico is receiving votes from the AP.
- Two Gopher opponents from this season are ranked with Ohio State sitting at No. 3 in each, while Oregon is fifth in both polls.
- In addition, lowa is receiving votes in both polls.

- ► The win over Nebraska was the seventh AP Top-25 win under P.J. Fleck, a program record that broke a tie with Bernie Bierman and Murray Warmath for most in

HOME SWEET HOME

Minnesota finished the regular season 7-0 at Huntington Bank Stadium. It was the team's first undefeated season at home since going 6-0 in 1967, the fourth undefeated home season in the modern era (since 1946) and 26th undefeated season at home all-time.

- It was the first time Minnesota had gone 7-0 at home since 1931 (7-0), while the seven home wins tied for sixthmost in a single season.
- ► The only season in history that saw Minnesota go undefeated at home with more wins was in 1904 (11-0).
- The current seven-game win streak is the longest in the history of Huntington Bank Stadium, which opened in 2009. It's also the longest at home in any venue for Minnesota since the team won the final two games of the 2003 season and first five of 2004 at the Metrodome.
- ► Additionally, the Gophers have won five straight Big Ten games at home. That's tied for the eighth-longest conference home win streak in program history and is the best since winning five in a row over the 2003-04 seasons.

COMEBACK KIDS

- ▶ In wins over Rutgers and Purdue, Minnesota rallied from double-digit deficits. With records dating to 1973, the only other season featuring two such wins is 2014.
- ► The Golden Gophers trailed 14-0 in the second guarter on Sept. 27 against Rutgers before rallying for a 31-28 win. With records dating to 1973, the 14-point comeback tied for the third largest in program history, and it was the team's biggest comeback win since a 28-24 win at Nebraska in 2014 where Minnesota was down 21-7 in the second quarter. The only bigger comebacks came in 1979 against Indiana when the team was down 24-0 before a 32-31 win and a 1986 game versus Northwestern where a 17-0 deficit turned into a 44-23 win.
- ▶ The win over the Scarlet Knights was also the largest comeback win at home for Minnesota since an 18-17 win over Illinois in 1992, a game that saw Minnesota down 17-3 with 14:56 remaining in the contest.
- Against Purdue on Oct. 11, Minnesota was down 10-0 early in the second guarter to Purdue. Later in the game, the Gophers trailed 20-13 going into the fourth quarter before winning 27-20. It was the team's biggest comeback win entering the fourth quarter since last season versus USC when the Gophers were down 17-10 after three quarters and won 24-17.

▶ In addition, Minnesota trailed Michigan State 17-10 with 1:52 to go before prevailing in overtime, 23-20. It's the third fourth-quarter comeback for the team this year along with the wins over Purdue and Rutgers. That's tied for the most fourth-guarter comeback wins since 2009 when it had four such wins.

FRIDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

- ► The 2025 Rate Bowl against New Mexico marks the 21st contest in Minnesota history to be played on a Friday (full list on Page 10). The Gophers are 8-11-1 all-time in program history on Fridays, including a 2-5-0 mark in bowl games and a 5-3-0 record under P.J. Fleck.
- The Gophers have a .665 winning percentage in their history when playing on days other than Saturday, going 63-31-3.
- ► The bowl game will mark the fourth non-Saturday game of the year for Minnesota, its most since five such games in 1903.
- ▶ Under Fleck, the team is 16-5 on non-Saturdays, including a 2-1 record this season. Minnesota posted a win in the 2025 season opener against Buffalo, which was on a Thursday, beat Nebraska, 24-6, on Friday, Oct. 17, and lost at Oregon, 42-13, on Friday, Nov. 14.

LINDSEY LEADING AS OB 1

- ► Redshirt freshman Drake Lindsey is wrapping up a solid debut season as the starter for the Maroon and Gold. He's 228-of-361 (63.2 percent) for 2,235 yards with 16 touchdowns and six interceptions, good for an efficiency rating of 126.5. He's also got a team-high four rushing scores this season
- Lindsey has established himself as one of the top freshman QBs in Minnesota history as he's second all-time among Gopher freshmen for passing yards and passing touchdowns. Adam Weber holds both records with 2,895 passing yards and 24 touchdowns thrown.

- In addition, Lindsey's seven wins this season are the most by a freshman in Gopher history.
- ► He was the first Gopher quarterback to win his first two career starts since Zack Annexstad in 2018, and Lindsey joined Tanner Morgan as the only Gopher QBs since 2016 to throw a touchdown pass in each of his first
- In fact, with records dating to 1977, only Weber in 2007 had a longer streak when he had a touchdown pass in his first eight starts.
- In Gopher single-season history, Lindsey currently ranks fourth in TD-to-INT Ratio (2.67), fifth in completions and completion percentage, ninth in passing attempts and 16th in passing yards.
- He's also closing in on the single-season top-10 for passing touchdowns, 250-yard passing games and 300yard passing games.
- ► His career completion percentage of .634 ranks second in program history, while his career efficiency rating of 127.88 ranks fifth (min. 300 attempts for both). In addition, he's second in TD-to-INT ratio (2.83, min. 15 TD passes), ninth in 300-yard passing games (1), and 10th in passing yards per game (152.3) and 250-yard passing games (3).
- Among the 15 FBS freshmen with at least 200 pass attempts this year, Lindsey is tied for the best interception percentage (1.7), tied for second in fewest interceptions thrown (6), fourth in attempts, fifth in completions, seventh in passing touchdowns and touchdown percentage (4.4), eighth in passing yards, ninth in completion percentage and 10th in efficiency rating.
- ► At Northwestern, Lindsey was 20-of-30 for 264 yards and a career-high four touchdowns. It was the first four-TD passing game for a Gopher since Max Brosmer last season versus Maryland, and it tied for the most passing touchdowns under Fleck.
- Lindsey also joins Adam Weber as the only Gopher freshmen since 1995 to throw four or more touchdown passes in a single game.
- Against Nebraska on Oct. 17, Lindsey threw for 153 yards and a touchdown on 16-of-20 passing. He also tallied his second career rushing score. Completing 80 percent of his passes, Lindsey became just the eighth quarterback since 1995 to have that high of a completion percentage against the Huskers (min. 20 pass attempts).
- ▶ In a come from behind win over Purdue on Oct. 11, Lindsey completed 21-of-45 passes for 232 yards and two touchdowns, with one interception. He also had a careerhigh four rushes for a personal-best 49 plays of total offense. His 45 pass attempts were a career high and tied with Max Brosmer's 45 attempts at Rutgers last year as the most during the P.J. Fleck era.
- In Minnesota's comeback win over Rutgers on Sept. 27 Lindsey had one of the top performances turned in by a Gopher guarterback. He was 31-of-41 for 324 yards and three touchdowns, all career-highs, with no interceptions.
- ► For his efforts Lindsey was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week. He was the first Gopher to earn the honor on offense since 2023 and the fifth Minnesota QB to win the award since it was introduced in 2012.
- Lindsey's 31 completions tied for fifth-most in a single game and were the most since Adam Weber completed 31 versus Northern Illinois in 2010. In addition, Lindsey's 324 passing yards were the most since Tanner Morgan threw for 368 yards at lowa in 2019.
- In the third quarter alone against Rutgers, Lindsey was 15-of-19 for 120 yards and a touchdown. The 15 completions were four more than any Gopher QB has had in any quarter since at least 2019, while the 19 attempts tied for the most in any quarter.
- Lindsey's performance was the ninth game in Gopher history with 30+ completions, and his efficiency rating was more than 20 points better than any other Gopher QB.

- ► Lindsey made his first career start in the 2025 season opener and completed 19-of-35 passes for 290 yards with two touchdowns and one interception, setting career highs in all categories.
- With records dating to 1977, the passing yardage total was the fourth highest by a Gopher in his first career start, while the attempts total ranked third and the completions tied for third. The passing total and touchdown pass total were also both fourth best in any season opener since 1979, while the completions and attempts both tied for fifth in such games.
- He followed that against Northwestern State by going 8-of-9 for 139 yards and a touchdown and added a rushing score before being removed midway through the second quarter with the game out of hand.
- A native of Fayetteville, Ark., Lindsey played in three games last year as a true freshman, completing 4-of-5 passes for 50 yards and a touchdown. His most extensive action came in a win over Rhode Island where he was 3-of-4 for 35 yards and an 8-yard TD strike, while in the 2025 Duke's Mayo Bowl he completed a 15-yard pass.
- A three-star prospect coming out of Fayetteville High School, Lindsey was named the state's Gatorade Player of the Year and the 7A Offensive Player of the Year.
- ▶ Lindsey helped lead his team to a 13-0 record and a state championship in which he was named MVP. On the year, Lindsey threw for 3,941 yards while completing 69 percent of his passes (264-for-383) as he tossed 54 touchdowns against just three interceptions for a TD:INT ratio of 18-to-1.

DYNAMIC DARIUS

- ► A two-time honorable mention All-Big Ten honoree, junior running back Darius Taylor has established himself as one of the top running backs in the Big Ten.
- Entering this year, he was placed on watch lists for the Doak Walker and Maxwell Awards, and he was a Fourth Team All-American by Athlon.
- After getting injured in the first quarter against Northwestern State on Sept. 6. he missed the next two contests but returned on Oct. 4 at Ohio State. He started the next two games, as well, but only played the first series at Iowa and did not play at all versus Michigan State. He returned at Oregon and played the rest of the season.
- Despite missing nearly five full games, Taylor leads the team in rushing attempts (119) and rushing yards (554) and his 61.6 rushing yards per game is the best for any player that's appeared in more than two games. His three rushing scores are second on the team.
- In the passing game, Taylor has caught 30 passes for 222 yards to rank third on the team in receptions. In addition, he leads the team in yards after catch (234) and YAC per game (26.0), and is third in targets per game (4.78) and YAC per reception (7.8)
- Pro Football Focus gives Taylor a receiving grade of 81.8 this season, best among all Big Ten running backs and ninth nationally at the position.
- In his career, Taylor ranks fourth in program history in games of 200+ all-purpose yards (4) and rushing yards per game (86.6), ninth in 100-yard rushing games (12) and 13th in career rushing yards (2,339).

NEUTRAL SITE WIN STREAKS

The Gophers' eight-game bowl win streak coincides with

the team's eight straight wins at a neutral site. Entering

bowl season, no team had a longer win streak at neutral

- ▶ With 95 career receptions for 664 yards, Taylor is second in program history for receptions by a running back, and fourth for receiving yards at the position.
- ▶ In the 2025 season opener, Taylor rushed for 141 yards on 30 attempts and caught four passes for 36 yards. It was the highest rushing total in a season opener since 2021 for Minnesota, while his 30 carries were second most in such games since 1979.
- ► The following week against Northwestern State, Taylor left the game in the first quarter due to injury after rushing for 20 yards on three carries and catching a ninevard pass.
- ▶ Upon returning from injury against Purdue, Taylor logged a career-high 67 receiving yards on six receptions, including a reception of 40 yards that was the longest for a Gopher running back since Shannon Brooks had a 40-yarder versus Illinois in 2015. In addition, the 67 receiving yards were the most by a Gopher running back since Duane Bennett had 71 yards against Penn State in 2010.
- ▶ Against Nebraska, Taylor rushed for 148 yards (most by a Gopher this year) on 24 carries and a one-yard touchdown, his first of the season. He had a 71-yard run in the second quarter, the second-longest of his career and the longest for Minnesota since his own 80-yarder last year vs. Nevada. It was also the fourth longest of the Fleck era. He added a team-best four receptions for 16 yards.
- ➤ Taylor's 148 yards against Nebraska pushed his career rushing total to 2,138, making him the 18th player in Gophers history to reach the 2,000-yard mark. He got there in 23 games, tied with Mohamed Ibrahim for the third fewest since 1955

- Last season, Taylor played in 12 of 13 games, missing only the season opener. He rushed 205 times for 986 yards and a career-high 10 touchdowns, and he caught 54 passes for 350 yards and two scores. His 1,336 all-purpose yards led the Gophers and ranked 26th in Gopher single-season history.
- ► The Detroit native also emerged as threat in the receiving game as his 54 receptions set a school record for the position and nearly quintupled his reception total from 2023 (11), while his receiving yardage of 350 almost quadrupled his total (92) from 2023.
- ► Taylor was fifth in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game (82.2) and all-purpose yards per game (111.33), seventh in total touchdowns (12), ninth in rushing touchdowns and 10th in total rushing yards.
- ▶ Taylor finished the season third among Power 4 running backs and fourth nationally at the position with his 4.5 receptions per game this season. His 54 receptions led Big Ten running backs and were third nationally, while Taylor's 350 receiving yards were third among Big Ten running backs and 13th in the country.
- ► He led Minnesota with 330 yards after catch and 27.5 YAC per game. Taylor was also second on the Gophers in receptions, and third in receiving yards, receiving yards per game (30.3), targets (67) and targets per game (5.58).
- ▶ Taylor added to his repertoire in the 2025 Duke's Mayo Bowl as he ran for 113 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries and caught four passes for 17 yards. He also threw a 10-yard touchdown pass, the first non-QB touchdown pass for Minnesota since 2015. Taylor's 28-yard touchdown run was the second longest in Gopher bowl history.

- ▶ At Michigan last season, Taylor had a career-high 10 catches for 52 yards. The 10 catches tied a Minnesota running back record set by Chuck Rios vs. San Diego State in 1994.
- Against lowa in 2024, Taylor pushed his career rushing total over the 1,000-yard mark. He got there in just nine career games, making him the second-fastest Gopher (by games) to get there since 1955. Only Darrell Thomspon did it faster, getting there in seven games in 1986.

RB REINFORCEMENTS

- ► Taylor's injuries this season have allowed other backs to step up, though another player in the room was lost for the season.
- ▶ Cam Davis has spent his final season at Minnesota after six years (2019-24) at Washington where he played in 41 career games and rushed 253 times for 1,093 yards and 15 touchdowns, while also catching 52 passes for 434 yards and returning 10 kicks for 183 yards. His top season came in 2022 as he played in 11 games with 107 rushes for 522 yards and 13 touchdowns.
- ▶ Davis is tied for third on the team with a pair of rushing touchdown and ranks third in rushing attempts (34) and fourth in yards (109). In the receiving game, he's tallied 18 receptions for 119 yards. He's third on Minnesota in yards after catch per reception (8.0).
- Davis has also caught 18 passes on 22 targets for a team-best catch percentage of 81.8 (min. 5 targets).
- ▶ A.J. Turner was injured at California and it was announced on Sept. 27 that he would miss the rest of the season. He had rushed 16 times for 64 yards and a touchdown in three games this season.
- ▶ Turner spent the previous three seasons (2022-24) at Marshall where he played in 22 games and rushed 127 times for 984 yards and six touchdowns and also caught 13 passes for 94 yards and three touchdowns. He has two years of eligibility remaining. In 2024, Turner rushed 104 times for 864 yards and six touchdowns, while also catching eight passes for 68 yards and two scores to earn All-SBC Second Team honors. His 8.3 rush yards per carry was the best for any FBS player with at least 70 carries on the year, thanks in part to two touchdown runs of more than 80 yards. In addition, he had four 100-yard rushing games.
- In his college debut, **Grant Washington** led Minnesota with 20 carries for 126 yards vs. Northwestern State. He was the first Gopher to run for over 100 yards in their first game since Mohamed Ibrahim ran for 101 yards on nine carries versus New Mexico State in 2018.
- ▶ On the year, Washington is third on the team in rushing yards (132) and fourth in attempts (21).

MOST 100/200-YARD RUSHERS

- ► Since 2021, Minnesota has had nine different running backs combine for 37 100-yard rushing games: **Darius Taylor** (13), Mohamed Ibrahim (10), Ky Thomas (5), Bucky Irving (3), Trey Potts (3), Fame Ijeboi (1), Jordan Nubin (1), **Grant Washington** (1) and Bryce Williams (1).
- ▶ Within the Big Ten, Minnesota's nine different players to rush for 100 yards is tied with Oregon for the most in the conference since 2021, while the 37 100-yard performances are second only to Michigan (44) in that span.
- ▶ Ibrahim (2), Taylor (1) and Nubin (1) have also combined for four 200-yard games since 2021.
- ▶ No other Big Ten school has had more than two 200-yard games since 2021 and Michigan (2) and Rutgers (2) are the only other B1G school to have multiple players rush for 200+ yards.

WR SPOTS WIDE OPEN

- ▶ Redshirt senior **Le'Meke Brockington** has taken over as WR1 this season as he leads the team in receptions (46), receiving yards (484), receiving yards per game (40.3), targets (67) and targets per game (5.58). He's also second in touchdown receptions (4), yards after catch (185) and YAC per game (15.4).
- ▶ He's got at least two receptions in each of the last 10 games and has set career highs in receptions, receiving yards and TD catches in a season.
- ▶ Brockington was fifth on the team a year ago in receiving yards (282) and sixth in receptions (18), adding one TD to enter 2025 as the team's top returning receiver.
- ▶ With 46 catches on the year, he's six away from recording the 29th 50-catch season in program history.
- ▶ At Northwestern, Brockington caught four passes for 43 yards and a touchdown. His performance pushed him over the 1,000-yard mark for his career, becoming the 30th player in Gopher history to accomplish the feat. He currently ranks 29th with 1,042 career yards.
- ▶ At California on Sept. 13, he set career highs with for targets (12), receptions (8), receiving yards (106) and all-purpose yards (106). It was the first 100-yard receiving game for a Gopher since Jackson had 117 last year versus Maryland and the highest reception total since Jameson Geers also had eight last year at Rutgers.
- ▶ Brockington was ranked No. 28 on this year's 'Freaks List' by The Athletic. As noted in the article, "the 6-0, 195-pounder, who has made a remarkable recovery from a broken leg in 2023, squatted a Gophers receiver record 664 pounds, breaking his own record from a year ago by 50 pounds. He vertical jumped 42 inches, broad jumped 11-4 1/4 (an improvement of five inches from last year), ran a 4.19 shuttle time and had a 10-yard split of 1.43."
- ► Miami (OH) transfer **Javon Tracy** also found his place in the passing game.
- ► Tracy leads the team with six touchdown catches and is second on the roster with 35 receptions, 439 receiving yards, 36.6 receiving yards per game, 59 targets and 4.92 targets per game.
- ▶ At Northwestern, Tracy caught four passes for 87 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. He became the first Gopher with three touchdown receptions in a game since Rashod Bateman had three at Northwestern on Nov. 23, 2019.
- ▶ Placed on the preseason watch list for the Biletnikoff Award, Tracy played three seasons for the Redhawks, appearing in 29 career games and making 79 catches for 1,166 yards and nine scores. In 2024, he played in 13 games and had 57 receptions for 818 yards and seven touchdowns to earn First Team All-MAC recognition. He has two years of eligibility left.
- Minnesota has also seen big-play ability from redshirt freshman Jalen Smith, who has 355 receiving yards and two touchdowns on 22 catches for an average of 16.1 yards per reception. He leads the team in yards per reception (min. 10 receptions) and yards after catch per reception (8.8), and ranks third in receiving yards, receiving yards per game (29.6), targets (47), yards after catch (182) and YAC per game (15.2).
- ► He's got two receptions of 60+ yards this year, tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for 15th in the country.
- Smith made his first career start and led the team with 76 yards on two receptions against Buffalo in the season opener, including a 60-yard scoring strike that was his first career touchdown.
- ▶ Against Rutgers on Sept. 27, Smith finished with four catches for a career-high 103 yards and a touchdown. His 78-yard reception in the second quarter was the longest since an 86-yard pass from Tanner Morgan to Rashod Bateman at Illinois in 2018. It was also Minnesota's longest pass play in Huntington Bank Stadium history and the second longest overall at the facility.

▶ With Smith going for 103 yards against Rutgers and Brockington tallying 106 yards in the prior game at California, it was the first time Minnesota had different receivers log 100+ yards in consecutive games since Michael Brown-Stephens (105) and Chris Autman-Bell (103) did it in 2021 at Purdue and against Nebraska, respectively.

HITTING ANOTHER GEER(S)

- ▶ Minnesota's tight end room is highlighted by redshirt senior **Jameson Geers**, who has caught a pass in each of the last 20 games, the longest active streak on the team
- ▶ A consensus Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honoree, Geers is also tied for second on the Gophers in TD catches (4) and is fourth in receptions (22).
- ► Against Michigan State, Geers recorded a season-best 40 receiving yards on three receptions.
- ► His four touchdown receptions this year have tied a career high and are tied for fifth most by a Gopher tight end. Within the Big Ten, Geers is tied with two other for second most in the conference
- For his career, he's got nine touchdown catches, which ranks fifth in team history at the position.
- ▶ Last year, he tied for second on the team with four TD receptions and was fourth in both catches (28) and receiving yards (282). Within the Big Ten, his four TD catches a year ago tied for the most of any returning tight end and ranked third overall in 2024. He also tied for 10th in receptions and 11th in receiving yards last season.

NEW LOOK O-LINE IN 2025

- ▶ Minnesota's offensive line has had a fresh look to it in 2025 as the Gophers broke in a new starter at each position. The unit isn't lacking experience though, as the entire room has combined for 141 starts and 241 games played.
- ► Through the first four games of the season the Gophers had used the same starting lineup along the o-line with Nathan Roy at left tackle, Greg Johnson at left tackle, Ashton Beers at center, Marcellus Marshall at right guard and Dylan Ray at right tackle.
- ► At Ohio State, however, the Gophers shook things up with Johnson moving to left tackle and Roy over to right tackle. Meanwhile, Marshall moved over to left guard and Ray slid inside to right guard. Beers remained at center.
- ► Versus Purdue, the line had its third starting configuration as the interior stayed the same but Roy went back to left tackle and Johnson moved to right tackle.
- ▶ In the next five games, they reverted back to the same starting unit that was used in the first four games.
- ► For the regular season finale against Wisconsin, Tony Nelson made his second career start and first at right guard.
- Nelson boasts the best pass blocking grade on the the unit at 88.6 over 52 snaps. Of all players in the FBS with at least 50 pass block snaps this year, Nelson ranks 18th overall, 12th among guards and fifth among Big Ten offensive linemen.
- ▶ Beers is not far behind with a pass blocking grade of 82.3. That figure ranks 19th nationally among FBS centers, sixth among Big Ten centers and 12th within the Big Ten overall (min. 300 pass blocking snaps).
- ▶ Beers has been credited with eight pressures allowed and no sacks given up this season on 408 pass block snaps. Among Big Ten linemen, only Maryland's Michael Hershey has had more snaps (522) without allowing a sack this year than Beers.
- ▶ Johnson, who has started games at left tackle, left guard and right tackle this season, has the highest overall offensive grade from PFF among the o-line starters at 73.5. For his efforts, he was named Honorable Mention All-Big Ten by the conference media.

A WIN WOULD...

- Push Minnesota's record to 8-5 overall and mark the fifth 8-win season under P.J. Fleck, the second most in team history
- Give Minnesota four 8+-win seasons in a five-year span for the first time since 1902-05
- See Minnesota's bowl record improve to 14-12 all-time, including 7-0 under Fleck
- Extend the Gophers' winning streak in bowl games to nine, tied for the second longest streak in FBS history
- · Be a ninth straight win at neutral sites
- Make Minnesota 66-23-2 when playing an FBS program for the first time.
- Get the Gophers to 16-3 all-time against teams currently in the Mountain West Conference (13-0 versus the MWC at the time of the game).
- Mark a 13th straight win over a Mountain West team
- Improve Minnesota to 9-11-1 all-time, and 6-3-0 under Fleck, when playing on Fridays.
- Enhance Fleck's record to 66-45 at Minnesota and 96-66 overall as a college head coach

- ▶ Marshall has the most career starts of any player on the Minnesota roster with 46 over his time at both UCF (2023-24) and Kent State (2020-22), while his 53 career games played ranks second among Minnesota offensive players to wideout **Logan Loya's** 56.
- ▶ A starter at every position along the line in his career, Marshall started at right guard last season at UCF and played 782 snaps with only three sacks and 12 quarterback pressures allowed per Pro Football Focus.
- ▶ Like Marshall, Minnesota is also the third school for Ray, who was at Kentucky (2023-24) and West Virginia (2021-22) previously. He has the best run-blocking grade of the o-line starters at 71.6.
- ► Ray was named to PFF's Week 8 Big Ten team after posting a season-high grade of 78.9 against Nebraska.
- ▶ Roy appeared in two games a year ago but made his first career start in the 2025 opener against Buffalo. He was named a Freshman All-American by The Athletic as he's allowed only three sacks and 11 pressures on 407 pass-blocking snaps.
- ▶ In addition to the starting five, many linemen saw action in the game against Northwestern State, highlighted by redshirt freshman center **Brett Carroll**, who posted a grade of 91.8 in 38 snaps to earn a spot on PFF's National Team of the Week.

COLLINS IN FIRST YEAR AS DC

- ▶ Over the offseason, **Danny Collins** was promoted to defensive coordinator. Collins, who also coaches the safeties, has been at Minnesota since 2017 and most recently served as the safeties coach / pass game coordinator.
- ► The 2025 season is the ninth at Minnesota for Collins. It is his first as defensive coordinator, his fourth as coach of the safeties and his 13th year with **P.J. Fleck**.
- ▶ Collins came to Minnesota with Fleck in 2017 and served as the team's defensive quality control. He was a graduate assistant in 2018 before returning to quality control in 2019. In 2020, he was named senior defensive analyst before being promoted to safeties coach in 2022.
- ▶ At Minnesota, Collins has coached All-Americans

 Koi Perich and Tyler Nubin and has seen two of his safeties Nubin (New York Giants) and Jordan Howden (New
 Orleans Saints) drafted into the NFL. This past season,
 safeties Perich and Kerry Brown were both named semifinalists for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year
 Award and Perich was one of five finalists.
- ► Since Collins has been at Minnesota, the Gophers have turned in some stellar defensive performances. In 2024, the team ranked fifth in the nation in total defense, seventh in team passing efficiency defense and ninth in scoring defense.
- ▶ In 2022, Minnesota ranked eighth in total defense, fourth in scoring defense and seventh in team passing efficiency defense. In 2021, the Gophers ranked third in the nation in total defense and tied for sixth in scoring defense.

SACK TOTALS SKYROCKET

- ▶ Minnesota has been one of the best teams in the country at getting after the quarterback this season, posting 35 sacks in 12 regular season games. Through the conference championship games, the rate of 2.92 sacks per game was second in the Big Ten and tied for 11th in the country. The total of 35 sacks is the fifth most in the Minnesota record book (dating to 1984).
- ► The Golden Gophers have three games this year with 7+ sacks, tying six other teams for the most in a season in the FBS since 2005. No team has had four such games in a season.
- ► In addition, Minnesota is averaging 7.0 tackles for loss this season, ranking 11th nationally and second in the B1G.

- ▶ First Team All-Big Ten honoree **Anthony Smith** has been the top disruptor for the Gophers, leading the team in tackles for loss (13.5) and sacks (10.5). His 0.88 sacks per game are second in the Big Ten and eighth in the FBS. Smith's total is the best for a Gopher in a season since Willie VanDeSteeg also had 10.5 in 2008.
- ► The defense was relentless in the team's 24-6 win over No. 25 Nebraska on Oct. 17, recording nine sacks, the most in Gopher records dating to 1977. That's also tied for the most by an FBS program this season.
- ▶ Karter Menz and Smith each tallied 2.5 sacks, tying each other for the most by a Gopher player in the P.J. Fleck era and the most by a Gopher at Huntington Bank Stadium. With Jaxon Howard adding 2.0 sacks, it marked the first time since at least 1995 that Minnesota had three players record 2.0 sacks or more in one game.
- ▶ Against Michigan State on Nov. 1, Minnesota logged seven sacks, tied for fourth-most in school history and tied for second-most in the Fleck era. Six of those sacks came in the first half, the team's most in any half since at least 2019
- ► The team also finished with 12 TFLs against the Spartans, which stands as the most in the Fleck era and tied for sixth all-time (records date to 1977). Eight of the tackles for loss came in the first half, the team's most in any half since at least 2019.
- ▶ Against Rutgers on Sept. 27, Minnesota's defense posted 7.0 sacks and 11.0 tackles for loss. The TFL number was the most in the Fleck era at the time.

+7 TURNOVER MARGIN

- ▶ Minnesota's defense has forced 15 turnovers this season with eight interceptions and seven fumble recoveries.
- ▶ Minnesota has capitalized on its 15 takeaways by turning them into 58 points, or an average of 3.87 points scored per turnover
- ► The Gophers had four takeaways each against Northwestern State and Purdue, tied for the most in the P.J. Fleck era.
- ▶ John Nestor, who did not play against Nebraska or Northwestern, leads the team with five interceptions this season, a number that is tied for fourth nationally and ranks second in the Big Ten. He's also got a team-best six pass breakups, which is tied for 15th in the conference. It all adds up to a team-high 11 passes defended total this year. His 1.10 passes defended per game is tied for most in the Big Ten and tied for 14th in the FBS.
- ▶ In addition, Nestor is fifth on the team with 47 tackles and has 6.0 tackles for loss to go with his five interceptions and six PBUs.
- ▶ Three of the team's fumble recoveries have been made by **Matt Kingsbury**, who leads the Big Ten and is tied for second in the FBS, and has tied for the most in a season by a Gopher since Kerry Glenn had four in 1983.
- ▶ On the other side of the ball, the Gophers have only committed eight turnovers, tied for third fewest in the country and tied for the fewest in the Big Ten. Only one of those turnovers was a fumble, tying the Gophers with four other teams for fewest in the nation.
- ▶ Minnesota has had seven games this year with no turnovers, tied with BYU for the most such games among Power 4 schools and tied for third most overall.
- Since Nov. 1, the Gophers have not committed any turnovers, the only team in the country that can make that claim.

SMITH SET UP FOR SUCCESS

► As noted above, Anthony Smith has made an enormous impact this season with team highs in tackles for loss (13.5) and sacks (10.5), plus 32 tackles and a PBU.

- ▶ Smith's 13.5 TFLs this season are tied for the fourth most in the Big Ten this year and tied for 25th in the country. His 1.13 TFLs per game are tied for third in the Big Ten lead and are good for 24th nationally. Smith's 93 TFL yards are second in the conference and sixth in the FBS.
- ▶ In the Gopher record book, his 10.5 sacks this season rank tied for fifth in single-season history and are the most since Willie VanDeSteeg also had 10.5 in 2008. Smith's 17.5 career sacks are sixth most in program history.
- ▶ With 13.5 TFL on the year and 27.0 in his career, he's 1.5 away from cracking Minnesota's top-10 single-season and career list.
- Last year, Smith led Minnesota in tackles for loss (11.5) and quarterback hurries (10) last season and tied for the team lead in sacks (6.0).

PERICH MAKES PLAYS

- ► Heralded recruit **Koi Perich** more than lived up to the hype in his true freshman season last year and the accolades have rolled in for the sophomore safety and return specialist in 2025.
- ► The Esko, Minn., native was named Second Team All-Big Ten this year by the Big Ten media and Associated Press, while the league's coaches dubbed him Third Team All-Big Ten.
- ▶ This season he is third on the team with 77 tackles, including 3.0 for loss, 1.0 sacks, 1 interception and two pass breakups on defense, three catches for 55 yards and three carries for two yards on offense, plus 114 yards on 17 punt returns and 19 kick returns for 499 yards on special teams.
- ▶ Through the conference championship games, Perich's 613 combined kick and punt return yards rank second in the Big Ten and eighth in the FBS. His 26.3 yards per kick return ranks second in the conference and 10th nationally. In addition, Perich's 6.7 yards per punt return is good for sixth in the league and 38th in the FBS.
- ▶ Showcasing his uniqueness, Perich is the only FBS player since 2005 to have at least three receptions, 40 tackles, a pick-six, 80 punt return yards and 160 kick return yards in one season.
- ▶ At Northwestern, Perich had six kick returns for a career-high 230 yards and added 12 punt return yards for a career-high 242 all-purpose yards. The 230 kick return yards rank third highest for a Big Ten Conference game and second highest in Minnesota single-game history (records dating to 1977).
- Perich had a 93-yard kick return, which tied for the 11th longest in program history (records dating to 1977). It was the longest since Rodney Smith's 100-yarder against Nebraska in 2017.
- ▶ The 242 all-purpose yards are tied for 22nd highest in program history. Perich's performance marked the most AP yards for a Gopher since Smith had 279 against Nebraska in 2017. The 242 AP yards are also the most by a non-offensive player in the FBS since Western Michigan's Darius Phillips (who also played under **P.J. Fleck**) had 248 is 2017.
- ▶ Against Michigan State, Perich led the team with 10 tackles, one off his season-high and his third career game with double-digit stops.
- ► Versus Purdue, Perich intercepted his first pass of the season (sixth career) and returned it 27 yards for the go-ahead touchdown with 7:40 left in the fourth quarter. It was the first pick-six of his career.
- ▶ In 2024, Perich was named a Sporting News Second Team All-American to become the first Minnesota freshman to be named an All-American since 1972 when the NCAA allowed freshmen to play to college football. Perich was also placed on the 2024 Freshman All-America Team by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), earned a spot on the All-Big Ten First Team on defense and was All-Big Ten Second Team as a return specialist. He was also one of five national finalists for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award

- ▶ Perich played in all 13 games for Minnesota last season and excelled on defense and special teams and even played a few snaps on offense. He finished fifth on the team with 46 tackles and had 2.5 tackles for loss. Perich led the Big Ten with five interceptions, setting a Minnesota freshman record in the process, and broke up three passes with one forced fumble.
- ▶ On special teams, he returned 16 kickoffs for 314 yards and 20 punts for 188 yards to become the only freshman in all of FBS since 1976 to have recorded more than 100 punt return yards, 100 kick return yards and five interceptions in a season.
- ▶ Perich also became just one of 12 players overall since 2000 to hit his total of punt return yards (188), kick return yards (314) and interceptions (5) in one season.
- ► His five picks, including four in a three-game span against USC, UCLA and Maryland, were the most ever by a Gopher freshman. The Esko, Minn., native also became the first true freshman to lead Minnesota in interceptions since Kyle Theret in 2007.
- ➤ Two of his interceptions came at UCLA, joining Perich with teammate **Kerry Brown** as the only Gopher freshmen since at least 1990 to have multiple interceptions in a game. For his efforts versus the Bruins, Perich was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week, just the second Gopher freshman to ever win the award.
- ▶ Perich led Minnesota and all FBS freshmen with a grade of 88.9 from Pro Football Focus last season. That also put him 12th among all defensive backs in the country and seventh for FBS safeties. His grade led all Big Ten defensive backs and was seventh overall in the league.
- ▶ Perich also led Minnesota with a coverage grade of 88.9. The grade was tied for 31st overall in the country and tied for 14th among FBS safeties. He was third in the Big Ten overall and led all league defensive backs.
- ▶ On special teams, Perich returned 20 punts for a total of 188 yards last season, which was the most by a Gopher since Dominic Jones had 218 in 2006. Perich's average of 9.4 yards per punt return ranked fourth in the Big Ten and 24th nationally.
- ▶ In addition, Perich had a team-high 16 kick returns for 314 yards, putting him fourth on the team in all-purpose yards at 565. In addition, that ranked fourth among all defensive players in the nation last year and was the highest all-purpose yardage total by a defensive player at Minnesota since Troy Stoudermire had 936 yards in 2010.
- ▶ Perich made his first career start against Penn State and posted a career-high 13 tackles. It was the highest tackle total by a Minnesota freshman since at least 2000.
- ▶ Perich had six tackles, forced his first career fumble and had a game-sealing interception against USC. The performance earned him weekly honors from both the Shaun Alexander Award and Paul Hornung Award.
- ▶ Perich was tabbed B1G Freshman of the Week after he posted his Big Ten-leading fifth interception of the season, which he returned 45 yards, to go with three tackles and 31 yards on three punt returns against Maryland.
- ▶ He was also the B1G Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 14. Perich became just the second player in league history to win the Big Ten's Freshman and Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same season, joining Northwestern's Godwin Igwebuike in 2014.

BROWN PLAYING BEYOND HIS YEARS

▶ Gopher defensive back **Kerry Brown** is building off of an elite redshirt freshman season in 2024. This season, he has 55 tackles with 4.0 TFLs, and his two interceptions and four pass breakups both rank second on the team. For his efforts, he's been named a consensus Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honoree.

- ▶ On the Gophers, Brown has the best rush defense grade (80.9), a number which ranks eighth among B1G safeties.
- Playing in 12 of 13 games last year, he was third on the team in tackles (63) and tied for third in interceptions (2). He also has 3.0 TFLs and four pass breakups.
- ► For his efforts, he was touted as a Second Team All-American by Sports Info Solutions and was a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.
- ▶ Brown's overall defensive grade of 76.7 from Pro Football Focus was second on the team and 10th among Big Ten safeties.
- ▶ In addition, Brown led the team with a rush defense grade of 83.9 that was fifth among Big Ten safeties and 12th amongst all of the league's defensive backs.
- ▶ Brown's tackling grade of 73.9 was also second on the Gopher roster and 20th among league safeties.
- ▶ Brown was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week following his standout performance against Nevada last season. The redshirt freshman recorded two interceptions the first two of his career and added four tackles as Minnesota shut out the Wolf Pack, 27-0.

BARANOWSKI BACK

- Linebacker Maverick Baranowski has a team-high 86 tackles to lead Minnesota and go along with with 8.0 stops for loss (second on the roster), 2.0 sacks, a pass breakup and a forced fumble. He's earned consensus Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honors as a result.
- ▶ Baranowski has the second-best PFF grades on Minnesota when it comes to overall defense (76.2), tackling (75.6) and pass coverage (71.1), and he's third in rush defense (78.2).
- Among Big Ten linebackers, his grades rank sixth for overall defense, 11th in coverage and 12th in rush defense.
- ► At Northwestern, Baranowski set a career high with 2.5 tackles for loss, which ties for the most by a Gopher this year.
- He's recorded at least six tackles in each of the last 10 games and and seven or more stops in each of the last five.
- ► After posting a team-high 10 tackles with 1.5 TFLs in the season opener against Buffalo, he was named to PFF's Big Ten Team of the Week.
- Last year, he had 65 stops in 2024 to rank second on the team behind departed linebacker Cody Lindenberg (94), who was drafted by Las Vegas. Baranowski added 5.0 tackles for loss to go with 1.0 sacks, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

WILLIAMS WOWS

- ▶ Minnesota's No. 2 tackler this season is redshirt senior linebacker **Devon Williams**, who missed the contest at Northwestern but returned against Wisconsin.
- Not only is he second on the team in tackles (82), he's third in tackles for loss (7.5) and sacks (2.5), with two additional pass breakups.
- ► The Dublin, Ohio, native is 11th in the Big Ten with his 7.5 tackles per game. He's been Minnesota's top tackler in four games this year.
- ▶ Williams, who had a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss at lowa, has surpassed his totals from last year in tackles (52), TFL (2.5) and sacks (0.5), all of which took 12 games to record.

SPECIALIST SHAKE-UP

- ▶ With the graduation of kicker Dragan Kesich and punter Mark Crawford, Minnesota has had to replace two of its specialists in 2025. Kesich held both kickoff and placekicking duties each of the last two seasons, while Crawford was the punter and holder since 2020.
- ► Redshirt sophomore **Tom Weston**, a native of Perth, Australia, has taken over the punting duties after two years at Ouachita Baptist University in Arkadelphia, Ark.

- ▶ Weston is averaging 42.8 yards on 59 punts this year with 13 covering 50-yards, including a season-long of 59 yards. He's put 20 punts inside the 20-yard line, forced 16 fair catches and had only three punts go for a touchback.
- ► His average of 42.8 yards per punt ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 48th nationally. It's also currently the eighth best average in program history for one season.
- ▶ Weston's 13 50-yard punts are the most by a Gopher punter since Ryan Santoso had 16 in 2017.
- Among all Gophers with at least 50 career punts, Weston's average of 42.8 yards ranks third.
- ▶ At Ohio State, Weston punted seven times for an average of 50.9 yards per punt, with a long of 58, four punts of 50+ yards, and two downed inside the 20. His average of 50.9 ranked as the 10th best for a single game at Minnesota since at least 1977 (minimum of three punts). Prior to the game, the last Gopher to even have three 50-yard punts was Crawford at Penn State in 2022.
- ▶ After not seeing game action as a true freshman in 2023, Weston punted 51 times and averaged 44.2 yards per kick last year. He had 11 punts of 50 yards or more, including a career long of 76 yards, placed 23 punts inside the 20-yard line and had 21 punts fair caught.
- ▶ Senior **Brady Denaburg**, a Syracuse transfer, has handled kicking duties this season, going 14-of-21 on field goals with two makes from 46 yards, tying a career best. In addition, he's 31-of-31 on extra points.
- ▶ Denaburg is also 45-of-55 on touchbacks, ranking second in the Big Ten and 13th in the country with a touchback rate of 81.82 percent. With school records dating to 2003, Denaburg's touchback rate is third best.
- ▶ In part because of Denaburg, Minnesota boasts the No. 11 kick return defense in the country, allowing just 15.8 yards per return. Opponents have just 11 kick returns this year (tied for 20th in the FBS) and returned them for 174 yards (13th-fewest in the country).
- ▶ Denaburg made his Minnesota debut by going 3-of-3 on field goals (38, 29, 25), tied for the most in a Gopher season opener since at least 1979 and tied for the third most in the Fleck era. Denaburg's 11 points tied for fifth most by a Gopher kicker in season openers.
- ▶ Denaburg was the Orange's primary kickoff specialist for three seasons and also did placekicking duties for two seasons. He made 13-of-22 career field goals (career long of 46 yards) and recorded 156 touchbacks on 198 kickoffs.

AMONG LEAST PENALIZED

- ► Historically, Minnesota has been one of the least penalized teams in the country under **P.J. Fleck**.
- ▶ In Fleck's previous eight seasons as head coach, the Gophers led the country in fewest penalties per game three times, including two of the last three years, and the team has never finished lower than 18th.
- ▶ Under Fleck, Minnesota has ended the season averaging fewer than four penalties per game four times.
- ▶ In addition, the Gophers have placed 10th or better in penalty yards per game in six of Fleck's seasons, including four finishes in the top five and leading the country in 2017. They finished second in 2023 and third in 2022.
- Six times Minnesota has ended a Fleck season averaging fewer than 40 penalty yards per game.
- ▶ This season, Minnesota is continuing that strong tradition as it entered bowl season ranked third in the country by committing 3.33 penalties per game, while the yardage of 26.58 penalty yards per game led the Big Ten and ranked second in the FBS.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK

▶ Minnesota rewrote the school record books in its 66-0 win over Northwestern State on Sept. 6, which was ended with 6:15 to play due to inclement weather.

ON THIS DATE

Minnesota is 2-0 all-time when playing on Dec. 26. It is one of six dates in program history on which the Gophers are 2-0 or better.

2018 W 34-10 vs. Georgia Tech Quick Lane Bowl

- ▶ The 66 points scored matched the modern era school record set against Murray State in 2001, and it tied for the most points in any Gopher game since a 69-7 victory over North Dakota State in the 1937 season opener.
- ► The 66-point margin of victory tied for the 10th best in school history and was the largest since an 81-0 win over Butler in 1926. Minnesota's 59 first-half points marked their most in any half since at least 1977, while the Gophers scored 35 points in the first quarter, their most in any quarter since at least 1973.
- Northwestern State's 42 yards of total offense and 37 plays run were the lowest by a Gopher opponent since at least 1960, while the Demons' 1.1 yards per play and two first downs recorded were the lowest by a Gopher foe since at least 1965.
- ▶ In addition, the 23 passing yards by NSU were the fewest by a Gopher opponent since Michigan State had 0 yards passing in 1979.
- Minnesota scored two defensive touchdowns in the contest on John Nestor's pick-six and Matt Kingsbury's scoop and score, which both came in the first quarter. It was the first time with two defensive touchdowns in a game since Tyrone Carter had two fumble return scores in the third quarter against Syracuse in 1996.

PROMOTIONS/ADDITIONS TO COACHING STAFF

- In addition to the promotion of **Danny Collins** to defensive coordinator, **P.J. Fleck** made other moves to his coaching staff in the offseason.
- ▶ Mariano Sori-Marin is coaching the linebackers, while Kevin Kane was hired as nickels/outside linebackers coach and C.J. Robbins as rush ends coach.
- ► On the offensive side of the ball, Fleck announced **Jayden Everett** as the team's running backs coach.
- Sori-Marin knows the Minnesota linebacker position better than most, as he played the position for the Maroon and Gold from 2018-22. The Mokena, Ill., native played in 58 career games for the Gophers and ended his career with 274 tackles and 14.5 tackles for loss. He also broke up 10 passes, forced three fumbles and made one interception. Sori-Marin was honored as All-Big Ten Third Team in 2022 and was Honorable Mention in 2021. He was also named Academic All-Big Ten four times and was a Big Ten Distinquished Scholar.
- Sori-Marin joined the Minnesota staff prior to the 2023 season as a defensive analyst before being promoted to nickels / assistant linebackers coach in January 2024. Last year, with Sori-Marin coaching, three of the team's top six tacklers played either linebacker (Cody Lindenberg and Maverick Baranowski) or nickel (Jack Henderson) and the unit finished the year ranked fifth in the nation in total defense and 12th in rushing defense.
- ▶ The 2025 season is the first in Maroon and Gold for Kane, who came to Minnesota after two seasons as Purdue's defensive coordinator. Kane has also worked at Illinois, SMU, Northern Illinois, Kansas and Wisconsin, and in addition to Purdue, he previously served as the defensive coordinator at SMU and Northern Illinois.

- ► Kane brings plenty of defensive coaching experience with him to Dinkytown, as he has worked exclusively on the defensive side of the ball since 2012 when he started coaching linebackers at Northern Illinois. He has also coached linebackers at Purdue. Illinois. SMU and Kansas.
- ▶ Robbins came to Minnesota from Central Michigan where he had a brief stint leading the defensive line. He spent the 2023-2024 seasons at Kent state. In 2023 he coached the rush ends and was also the co-special teams coordinator as well as the defensive recruiting coordinator.
- ▶ Prior to the 2024 season, Robbins was moved to line-backers coach and was promoted to special teams coordinator and the assistant head coach. In 2022, he coached the outside linebackers at the University of South Dakota.
- ▶ Robbins was a graduate assistant at Minnesota during the 2020 and 2021 seasons. In his first stint with the Gophers he helped mentor Boye Mafe (7.5 sacks) and Thomas Rush (5.5 sacks), who lead the Gophers in sacks in 2021. Both Mafe and Rush earned All-Big Ten honors in their careers.
- ▶ Everett has been coaching running backs his entire career, which includes on-field coaching experience at Michigan, Vanderbilt, Tulsa, Akron, Central Michigan, Indiana State and Hutchinson Community College. Everett spent the 2024 season at Michigan where he assisted the running backs. He then briefly accepted the running backs coach position at South Alabama before joining the Gophers.
- ▶ At Michigan, Everett helped mentor Kalel Mullings and Donovan Edwards who combined for 1,537 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns in 2024. Prior to Michigan, Everett spent the 2023 season at Vanderbilt. There he helped Sedrick Alexander earn SEC All-Freshman honors, as he led all SEC freshmen in rushing yards and was the only freshman in the league with four or more rushing touchdowns. Everett spent the 2021-22 seasons at Tulsa and the 2019-20 seasons at Akron.
- ▶ Keegan O'Hara is in his third season at Minnesota in 2025 and was promoted to assistant quarterbacks coach this season after being hired as offensive analyst in January 2023. O'Hara has been with Gopher offensive coordinator Greg Harbaugh even longer, though, as the two worked together at Western Michigan during the 2020 and 2021 seasons. O'Hara was working with the tight ends and wide receivers as an undergraduate and a graduate assistant and Harbaugh was the receivers coach.
- Last season, with O'Hara on staff, Minnesota quarterback Max Brosmer led a potent Gopher offense and set a single-season school record with 268 completions for 2,828 yards (third most in single-season school history) and 18 touchdowns (tied for eighth most in school single-season history).
- ▶ Brosmer ranked second in single-season school history with a completion percentage of 66.5% and his 217.54 passing yards per game is eighth in single-season school history.
- ► Fleck also announced the hirings of Nick Faus (Assistant Wide Receivers Coach), Jordan Hendy (Offensive Analyst) and Christian Pawola (Assistant Defensive Backs Coach). Faus (2022 season) and Pawola (2022-23) both worked at Minnesota previously, while Hendy joins the Gophers from Pittsburg State.

BEST YEARLY SPANS

- ▶ As noted on Page 1, the Gophers are in their ninth season under **P.J. Fleck**. Entering the 2025 campaign, Fleck was 58-39 overall and 34-36 in the Big Ten. He had the most Big Ten wins, the second most overall wins and the third-best overall winning percentage (.598) of any Minnesota coach through his first eight seasons. Below is a look at how his yearly spans compare in Gopher history.
- Last 8 Years (2017-24; 58-39 overall, 34-36 B1G, 6 bowl trips, 6 bowl wins): The 58 wins are tied for fourth most in an eight-year span since 1910. The 34 B1G wins are tied for fifth most in an eight-year span in program history and tied for the most since winning 36 from 1961-68. The six bowl wins are tied for the most in an eight-year span in team history, while the six bowl trips are tied for fourth most.
- ▶ Last 7 Years (2018-24; 53-32 overall, 32-29 B1G, 6 bowl trips, 6 bowl wins): The 53 wins are tied for eighth most in a seven-year span in program history and tied for second most since winning 55 from 1902-08 (won 54 from 2013-19). The .624 win percentage is second best since 1949 (.631 from 2016-22). The 32 B1G wins are tied for the most in a seven-year span in program history (also doing so from 1934-40 and 1935-41). The .525 B1G win percentage is the best in a 7-year span since 1967-73 (.507). The six bowl wins in seven years are the most in program history while the six bowl trips are tied for the most.
- Last 6 Years (2019-24; 46-26 overall, 29-23 B1G, 5 bowl trips, 5 bowl wins): The 46 wins are tied for the most in a six-year span at Minnesota since 1908 (also 46 wins from 2014-19). The .639 win percentage is the best in a six-year span since 1949. The 29 Big Ten wins are the most in any six-year span at Minnesota. The .558 Big Ten win percentage is the team's best in a six-year span since 1970. The five bowl wins and bowl trips in six years are tied for the most in program history.
- ▶ Last 5 Years (2020-24; 35-24 overall, 22-21 B1G, 4 bowl trips, 4 bowl wins): The 22 Big Ten wins are tied for the 8th-most in a five-year span at Minnesota in program history and the third most since 1969 (won 24 from 2018-22 and 2019-23). The B1G win percentage of .512 is the third best since 1969-73 (.513). The four bowl wins in five years are tied for the most in school history; it's been done four times. The four bowl trips in five years is tied for third best in program history.
- Last 4 Years (2021-24; 32-20 overall, 19-17 B1G, 4 bowl trips, 4 bowl wins): The 32 wins are tied for the most since winning 41 from 1903-06 and are tied for the sixth most in a four-year span in program history. The 19 B1G wins are tied for the second most in a 4-year span in program history (most is 21 from 2019-22). The .528 win percentage in conference games is the third best since 1970 (the other two also came under Fleck in 2018-21 and 2019-22). It's the first time Minnesota has won four bowl games in four years. The four bowl trips are tied for the most in a four-year span.
- Last 3 Years (2022-24; 23-16 overall, 13-14 B1G, 3 bowl trips, 3 bowl wins): The 23 wins in a three-year span is tied for 10th best in program history. The 13 conference wins are tied for fourth most in a three-year span since 1969. Minnesota has made a bowl game three straight years for just the eighth time in program history. It's the third time in program history Minnesota has won three bowl games in three years (also from 2021-23 and 2002-04).
- Last 2 Years (2023-24; 14-12 overall, 8-10 B1G, 2 bowl trips, 2 bowl wins): Minnesota has won back-to-back bowl games for the seventh time in program history.

THREE TAKEN IN '25 NFL DRAFT

- ▶ Minnesota had three selected in the 2025 NFL Draft as offensive tackle **Aireontae Ersery** went in the second round (48th overall) to Houston, cornerback **Justin Walley** was picked by Indianapolis in the third round (80th overall) and linebacker **Cody Lindenberg** was chosen by Las Vegas in the seventh round (222nd overall).
- Minnesota is one of nine programs in the country to have a selection in the first or second round in each of the last six drafts along with Alabama, Georgia, LSU, Michigan, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oregon and Penn State. The last time the Golden Gophers had first or second round picks in six consecutive drafts was 1940-45.
- ▶ With the selections of Ersery and Walley, it was the first first time since 2021 that Gophers had two top-80 picks (Rashod Bateman 27th, Benjamin St. Juste 74th). Before that, it hadn't happened since 1978.
- ▶ Ersery was the third Gopher offensive lineman to be drafted in the last four years, joining John Michael Schmitz (second round to the New York Giants in 2023) and Daniel Faalele (fourth round to the Baltimore Ravens in 2022). Prior to Faalele, Minnesota last had an offensive lineman drafted in 2006.
- ▶ As the 48th overall selection, Ersery was the highest drafted Gopher lineman since center Brian Williams was taken 18th overall by the New York Giants in 1989 and the highest drafted Gopher offensive tackle since John Williams was taken 23rd overall by the Baltimore Colts in 1968.

SCORIGAMI

- ► Scorigami is a concept developed by Jon Bois at SB Nation that tracks unique scores in NFL history.
- ► In Minnesota's 1,345 all-time games, there have been 571 unique scores, including two this year.
- ► The most common overall score is 6-0, which has happened 25 times, though none have taken place since 1963. The next most common is 13-7, which has occurred 18 times, most recently in 1985.
- ► Minnesota's most common victory is 13-7, which it has done 13 times.
- ▶ Below are the Scorigami results for Minnesota football this season:
- Minnesota 23, Buffalo 10. Scorigami achieved! First such score in 1,334 games in program history.
- ▶ Minnesota 66, Northwestern State 0. No Scorigami; second such score and second Gopher win (Macalester in 1900).
- California 27, Minnesota 14. No Scorigami; third such score and second Gopher loss (Michigan in 1948).
- ► *Minnesota 31, Rutgers 28.* Partial Scorigami; fourth such score and first Gopher win.
- ▶ Ohio State 42, Minnesota 3. Scorigami achieved. First such score in 1,338 games in program history.
- ► Minnesota 27, Purdue 20. No Scorigami; third such score and third Gopher win (MR: Illinois in 2008).
- ► Minnesota 24, Nebraska 6. No Scorigami; fifth such score and fourth Gopher win (MR: lowa in 1980).
- ▶ *Iowa 41, Minnesota 3.* Partial Scorigami; second such score and first Gopher loss.
- ▶ Minnesota 23, Michigan State 20. No Scorigami; seventh such score and fifth Gopher win (MR: Colorado State in 2015).
- ► Oregon 42, Minnesota 13. No Scorigami; fifth such score and fifth Gopher loss.
- Northwestern 38, Minnesota 35. No Scorigami; third such score and second Gopher loss.
- ► Minnesota 17, Wisconsin 7. No Scorigami; ninth such score and fourth Gopher win (MR: Buffalo in 2017).

HEAD COACH // NINTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 44, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 95-66 and is 65-44 at Minnesota.

In eight years, Fleck has established himself as one of the most success-

in leight years, ricek has established inflies has one of the inflost success-ful coaches ever to lead the Minnesota program.

Entering 2025, Fleck was fifth in program history for overall wins (58) and games coached (97) and he was fourth in program history in Big Ten wins (34). Flecks win percentage is third best among Minnesota coaches with at

(34). Freicks will precentage is unit desic arriving minimisoral coaches with eleast 45 games under their helm behind only Henry L. Williams (.786, 1900-21) and Bernie Bierman (.716, 1932-41, '45-50).

Fleck and Williams are the only two Gopher coaches to record nine or more wins in a season three times, as Minnesota posted 11 wins in 2019 and nine in 2021 and 2022 under Fleck (Williams posted at least nine wins in six straight seasons from 1900-1905). Minnesota has won eight games in a season four times under Fleck (2019, 2021, 2022 and 2024), which is tied for

the most in program history under one coach.

The 11 wins in 2019 were the most for a Minnesota team since 1904 when that year's team went 13-0 under Williams. Fleck is 6-0 in bowl games, and his six bowl wins are the most in school history by a coach. His six bowl wins represent 46% of Minnesotat's overall 13 bowl wins as a program.

Fleck guided the Gophers to a 6-3 Big Ten record in 2021 and a 7-2

mark in 2019, making him the first Minnesota coach since Murray Warmath (1960, 1961 and 1967; six wins each) to win at least six conference games more

At Minnesota, Fleck has coached eight All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman, John Michael Schmitz, Tyler Nubin, Aireontae Ersery, Koi Perich and Mohamed Ibrahim twice), 10 Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries three times, Sam Renner twice, Ashton Beers, Schmitz, Jack Gibbens, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 438 Academic All-Big Ten

He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, guided Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had 19 players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota. Minnesota is one of only nine schools in the nation that can claim the distinction of having a first or second round draft pick in each of the last six years (2020-2025).

each of the last six years (2020-2025).
In 2024, Minnesota went 8-5 overall, 5-4 in the Big Ten and defeated Virginia Tech in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. The Gophers reclaimed Paul Bunyan's Axe with a road win at Wisconsin and posted ranked wins at home against No. 11 USC and on the road at No. 24 Illinois. Minnesota also won at UCLA to earn a victory at the historic Rose Bowl Stadium.

Quarterback Max Brosmer left his mark during his one season in the the Maroon and Gold. The signal-caller threw for 2,828 yards and 18 touchdowns and also completed a school record 268 passes. With Brosmer at the helm, Minnesota had three players catch more than 40 passes in a season for the first since at least 1956 (far back as specific records exist) as Daniel Jackson (75), Darius Taylor (54 and a single-season program record for a running back) and Elijah Sepncer (52) all eclipsed the 50-catch mark.

Offensive Lineman of the Year. He helped anchor a line that allowed for Minnesota to average 26.15 points per game, 115.6 rushing yards per game and 222.15 passing yards per game. The balanced Gopher offense rushed for 18 touchdowns and threw for 20

Minnesota fielded a staunch defense, which was ended the season ranked in the top 15 in the nation in the following categories: Passes Defended/Game, Total Yards Allowed, Passes Defended, Interceptions/Game, Total Defense, Pass Breakups, Touchdowns Allowed, Opp. Pass Efficiency Rating, Interceptions Recorded, First Downs Allowed/Game, Scoring Defense, Passing TDs Allowed, Passing Yards Allowed, Pass Yards

Allowed/Attempt and Yards Per Play Allowed. Passing 10s Allowed. Allowed/Attempt and Yards Per Play Allowed. Defensive back Perich was recognized as an All-American and was named All-Big Ten First Team (first Gopher freshman to be named All-Big Ten First Team since running back Darrell Thompson in 1986) after leading the Big Ten with five interceptions and making 46 tackles. Since 1976, Perich was the only freshman in all of FBS to have recorded more than 100 punt return yards, 100 kick return yards and five interceptions in a season. He was just one of 23 players overall since 1976 to hit his current total of punt return yards, kick return yards and interceptions in one season.

Perich was named a finalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award, while fellow defensive back Kerry Brown was named a semifinalist (Minnesota was the only school to have two players named a

The 2023 season saw Minnesota beat rival lows on the road to reclaim Floyd of Rosedale and win its fifth straight bowl game under Fleck (beat Bowling Green in the Quick Lane Bowl). Defensive back Nubin was named an All-American as he set a school record for most career interceptions with 13 and Dragan Kesich was recognized as the Big Ten Kicker of the Year.

Minnesota set a program record as nine Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (previous record of eight was set in 2018 and tied in 2019) and then-true freshman Taylor established himself as one of the best running backs in the nation. Taylor rushed 138 times for 799 yards and five touchdowns in six games of action. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week three times and set a school record for most yards by a true freshman when he ran for 208 yards in the Quick Lane Bowl victory.

The 2022 season saw Minnesota post nine wins as the Gophers went 9-4 overall, which included a bowl win against Syracuse and a road win at rival Wisconsin. Minnesota, which went 5-2 at home, 3-2 on the road and 1-0 in neutral site games, was paced by a stout, family-room defense and a bruising offense that featured two All-Americans.

Minnesota ended the season ranked No. 4 in the nation in scoring defense (13.85). No. 5 in third-down conversion defense (.279) and No. 9 in

tereinse (13.63), NU. 3 if illimid-outh Convention detense (27.9) and NU. 3 if the nation in total defense (295.1 yards per game). The 13.85 points allowed per game were the fewest that Minnesota has permitted since 1967 when it allowed 10.6 points per game during the 10-game season. Minnesota posted two shutouts during the season (38-0 against New Mexico State and 31-0 against Rutgers), which it had not done since 2006 and the Gophers were the only team in the nation to shutout two FBS teams in 2022 (Alabama, Georgia and Kansas State each had two shutouts, but one each came against an FCS foe).

First-Team All-American center Schmitz and Second-Team All-American running back Ibrahim led the Gopher offense, which ranked No. 17 in the nation with 207.3 rushing yards per game. With Schmitz anchoring an offen sive line that featured four new starters, Ibrahim set single season records in rushing attempts (320), rushing yards (1,665), rushing touchdowns (20), total touchdowns (20), total points (120) and 100-yard rushing games (10).

The 2022 season also saw three Gophers named either a semifinalist,

finalist or winner of a national award. Ibrahim was named Comeback Player initialist of winner of a hadronal award. Indimnin was named colleged of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award. Schmitz was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy and was also a semifinalist for the Outland Trophy and the Rotary Lombardi Award. Quarterback Tanner Morgan was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and was a semifinalist for the

Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award.

On the field in 2021, Fleck led Minnesota to a 9-4 record and a 6-3 Big
Ten mark. The Gophers beat Wisconsin for the first time at home since 2003 to reclaim Paul Bunyan's Axe and picked up a postseason win against West Virginia in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

Minnesota's dominant defense and offensive depth were the stories of the season, as the Gophers won their final three games of the year for the first time since 1973.

The Gophers ended the season with the nation's No. 3 total defense (278.8 yards per game) and the nation's No. 6 scoring defense (17.3 points per game). Minnesota also ended the year ranked fourth in first downs defense (202), eighth in rushing defense (97.5) and eighth in passing yards allowed (181.2). Minnesota held eight opponents to 14 points or less and recorded its first shutout (30-0 road win at Colorado) since 2006 (62-0 against Temple) and its first road shutout of a Power 5 opponent since 1977 (21-0

On offense, the Gophers boasted the most experienced offensive line in the nation and were a force rushing the ball, despite losing All-American lbrahim in the first game of the season and playing much of the season without five scholarship running backs. Still, the Gophers were the only team in the nation to have five different running backs all record at least one 100-yard rushing game. In total, Minnesota rushed for 2,575 yards and 27 touchdowns passed for 2,106 yards and 12 scores. In 2021, Fleck also became a Wall Street Journal best-selling author

when his Row The Boat book, which was co-authored with Jon Gordon, peaked at No. 2 on the list in June.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. Opinies yosted wat with a truchaska and millioid and bear include at more they suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing louchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touch-downs in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2). Ibrahim, who was named Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times for

lorahim, who was named Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times for 1,076 yards and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (188.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten

games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win

against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's bestranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962.

Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history, while the defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game. On offense, Minnesota was led by quar-

terback Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team), and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first eammates ever to both be named All-B1G First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving vards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Fech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history.

Minnesota also made history when it won

the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999.

The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns.

Minnesota's two leading rushers were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt fresh men and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954. Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo,

which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gonher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight 30-point wins.

The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and were the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found supporting the M Health Fairview Masonic Children's Hospital and the program also hosts an annual diaper drive during training camp and an annual turkey drive during teh week of Thanksgiving. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 reg-ular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.
Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year

from the American Football Coaches Association Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts.

Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record hold-er. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021

Off the field, Western Michigan had a pro am-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assis tant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins agains Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing profes-

sionally and started his coaching career.
Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

OTHER STADIUM NOTES

- When completed, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960 and the first in NCAA FBS since 2006 (additional NCAA FBS stadiums have since been built).
- The Gophers locker room is a state-of-the-art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The Gophers have a private recruiting room that can accommodate 150 people.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten Conference.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in America. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.
- In addition to Minnesota college football games, Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher hockey games, Monday Night Football (Minnesota vs. Chicago), NHL Stadium Series (Minnesota vs. Chicago), an international soccer match (Manchester City vs. Olympiacos), the MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings (2014-15) and Minnesota United (2017-18) also played seasons at Huntington Bank Stadium while their new stadiums were being built.





AP RECAP: In the first national color television broadcast of a college football game, Minnesota posted its first bowl victory as it defeated UCLA, 21-3, in the 1962 Rose Bowl. Game MVP Sandy Stephens scored the first and last TD's in Minnesota's almost methodical victory. UCLA took a 3-0 lead on Bobby Smith's 28-yard field goal in the first quarter, but Stephens went to work on the Bruin defenses with a skillful blend of power running and pinpoint passing. Stephens not only passes with clever timing — hitting on 7 of 11 tosses for 75 yards — and rushing 46 yards on 12 carries, he constantly kept UCLA off balance with his play selection. With the Bruins leading 3-0, Judge Dickson recovered a fumble and Stephens plunged in from a yard out three plays later. Stephens and company put the game away in the second period after Bill Munsey scored on a three yard run after a 16-play, 75-yard drive. As a team, the Gophers outrushed the Bruins 222-55.

Nine minutes later, he scored again, on a 2-yard run, to give Minnesota a 14-7 lead. KU tied it at 14 on a 4-yard pass from Reesing to Meier late in the first quarter. Reesing added two more touchdown passes to give Kansas a commanding 28-14 halftime lead.

Thomas put the Gophers up 15-6 at halftime, scoring on a 5-yard run two plays after bursting up the middle for a 50-yard gain.

Minnesota rattled off 21 consecutive points in the second quarter behind Spencer, who hauled in a 10-yard halfback option pass from Taylor and a 12-yard TD toss from Brosmer on back-to-back possessions. Taylor then made it 21-7 when he raced around left end on a 28-yard run. With Minnesota up 24-10, Dante Lovett intercepted Brosmer to give the Hokies the ball at the Minnesota 15 and a last chance at a comeback midway through the fourth quarter. But the Hokies couldn't convert as Za'Quan Bryan intercepted William Watson's pass in the end zone, essentially sealing the game with 4:24 remaining.
