DUAL NOTES

- Competing in its first home dual since Dec. 7, No. 7/12 Minnesota (7-2, 1-0 B1G) welcomes No. 6/7 Nebraska (8-3, 1-0 B1G) to Maturi Pavilion Friday for the Gophers' Big Ten home opener. The match is set to start at 8 p.m. on Big Ten Network.
- **Promotions:** Help Gopher Wrestling support those who battle cancer at its annual Takedown Cancer dual.
- Minnesota is 1-1 at home this season, tallying a win last time out over North Dakota State, 26-9, inside Maturi Pavilion on Dec. 7 after an 18-14 loss to then-No. 18 South Dakota State on Nov. 25 at Williams Arena.
- After a 27-9 win last Saturday at then-No. 11 Illinois, Minnesota is looking to start 2-0 in conference action for the first time since also winning its first two league duals in the 2019-20 season.

IN THE RANKINGS

- As noted above, the Golden Gophers enter the weekend ranked seventh in InterMat's dual team rankings and 12th in the InterMat tournament rankings. The team also moved up two spots to ninth in the NWCA Coaches Poll.
- Nine Gopher wrestlers are ranked in at least two of the major polls with five appearing in all four: InterMat, Flo, Win and OpenMat. All-American **Max McEnelly** is the No. 3-ranked wrestler at 184 pounds in all three polls, while **Jore Volk** (125) appears in the top-9 of each publication, including being ranked sixth by Flo.
- Redshirt freshman **Koy Hopke** (285) is a consensus top-10 wrestler, while redshirt senior **Vance VomBaur** (141) is 11th or higher. Hopke's best mark comes from OpenMat at No. 8, while WIN gives VomBaur his highest ranking at No. 5.
- Sixth-year senior **Andrew Sparks** (165) is ranked top-16 in all four polls, highlighted by a No. 11 ranking from InterMat.

► Redshirt freshman **Charlie Millard** (157) appears in three of the four polls. Millard doesn't show up in OpenMat's polls, but he's top-20 in the other three, including 19th by InterMat and WIN.

► Redshirt senior **Drew Roberts** (149) and redshirt sophomores **Ethan Riddle** (174) and **Gavin Nelson** (197) are all ranked by both InterMat and Flo, but don't appear in rankings from WIN or OpenMat. Riddle is ranked 22nd by InterMat and 23rd by Flo, while Nelson is 24th and 25th by the same publications, respectively. Roberts is 25th by InterMat and 27th by Flo.

NATIONAL STAT LEADERS

► Through last weekend's competition, **Vance VomBaur** (141), **Clayton Whiting** (174) and **Koy Hopke** (285) all had six major decision victories to tie for the second most in the country. Only Virginia's Gable Porter has more with seven.

► **Max McEnelly** (184) is tied for second in the nation with seven tech fall wins this season. Only Ohio State's Ben Davino and Franklin & Marshall's James Conway have more with 10.

► Heavyweight **Bennett Tabor** is tied for 11th in the country with six wins by fall this year.

FACING NEBRASKA

► Minnesota holds the all-time series lead over Nebraska with a record of 52-28 in a series that dates back to the 1921-22 season. The 80 all-time dual matches are the third-most in Minnesota history. The only other schools that the Golden Gophers have faced more are Iowa (111) and Wisconsin (107).

► This will mark the eighth straight season that Minnesota and Nebraska have faced each other, every year since 2019.

► The Huskers have won three straight in the series and eight of the past nine dating to 2016. The Gophers are looking for their first win in the series since a 19-13 home win in 2022.

► In Minneapolis, Minnesota owns a 30-9 lead in the all-time series. The 30 wins are the second-most against one school in home duals behind 40 wins in Minnesota over Wisconsin. The 39 home meetings are third most behind 53 against Wisconsin and 51 versus Iowa.

► The Cornhuskers enter Friday with an 8-3 record in duals this season, including a 1-0 mark in the Big Ten after last weekend's 36-3 home win over Purdue. Nebraska's three losses have come at the hands of Ohio State and Oklahoma State, twice. Those teams are ranked second and fifth, respectively, in the latest InterMat Team Dual Rankings.

► Minnesota and Nebraska have three common opponent this year in Missouri, Northern Iowa and Ohio State. Both the Gophers and Huskers defeated Mizzou and UNI and lost to the Buckeyes.

► Minnesota has no Nebraska natives on its roster, while the Cornhuskers have two Minnesotans in sophomore Alan Koehler (125, Prior Lake, Prior Lake HS) and redshirt freshman Marco Christiansen (184, Shorewood, Minnetonka HS).

LAST MEETING WITH THE HUSKERS

► Minnesota suffered a 21-13 setback to Nebraska when the teams met last season in Lincoln.

► In a dual that featured nine ranked matchups, the Golden Gophers swept the upperweight bouts from 184 pounds through heavyweight. Five of the Huskers' wins were by three points or less.

► The dual started at 157 pounds as No. 10 Tommy Askey faced No. 5 Antrell Taylor. Both recorded escapes, sending the match to overtime. There, Taylor got the sudden-victory takedown for a 4-1 victory.

TEAM NOTES

- The only non-ranked matchup came at 165 pounds as No. 9 **Andrew Sparks** met Christopher Minto. Sparks led 3-2 in the third but Minto got in on the ankle in the final seconds and secured the takedown off neutral danger to go ahead 5-3. The match appeared to be over but, after review, a locked hands call was made on Minto. Sparks had five seconds to escape and tie the match, but Minto prevailed 5-4.
- Nebraska made it 9-0 after a 9-3 victory for No. 16 Lenny Pinto over Minnesota's 24th-ranked **Clayton Whiting**. All three of Whiting's points came via escape.
- No. 4 **Max McEnelly** majored No. 6 Silas Allred at 184, 16-6. McEnelly scored a pair of takedowns in the opening frame and led 6-3 through two periods. He poured it on with three more in the final stanza.
- Isaiah Salazar made it two in a row with a major decision of his own at 197 pounds. Ranked ninth, Salazar topped No. 22 Camden McDanel, 8-0. Salazar had takedowns in each of the first two periods.
- Minnesota took the lead at 13-9 behind another dominant victory from top-ranked Gable Steveson at heavyweight. Facing No. 24 Harley Andrews, Steveson claimed a tech fall win with a 19-4 win (3:32). Seven of Steveson's 19 points came in the opening 20 seconds behind a takedown and four nearfall points. He added three more takedowns.
- Nebraska took the lead back at 125 pounds, 15-13, with No. 7 Caleb Smith topping No. 5 Cooper Flynn, 2-0. Smith rode out Flynn for the second period and added an escape in the third period to get the win.
- The 133-tilt between No. 11 Tyler Wells and No. 19 Jacob Van Dee came down to the wire. It looked as though they were headed to overtime tied at 1-1, but Van Dee scored a takedown in the closing seconds. Minnesota challenged but the call was confirmed and Van Dee prevailed, 4-1.
- The final top-10 showdown came at 141 between eighth-ranked **Vance VomBaur** and sixth-ranked Brock Hardy. It was a back-and-forth contest that saw VomBaur leading 4-3 after one period, but Hardy was on top 6-5 through two. Trailing 10-5, VomBaur got an escape in the third period and followed with a takedown to get within 10-9, but Hardy got a reversal and held on for a 12-10 decision to extend the Husker lead.
- The dual ended at 149 pounds with No. 5 Ridge Lovett shutting out No. 21 **Drew Roberts**, 5-0.

RANKED MATCHUPS

- Based on the probable starters and the latest rankings from InterMat, there are three ranked matchups scheduled for Friday with the possibility of eight total taking place.
- At 141 pounds, No. 11 **Vance VomBaur** is set to face third-ranked Brock Hardy for the fifth time in his career. Hardy has won all four previous matchups, including twice last year, first by decision in the regular season, and then by fall in the finals of the Big Ten Championships. They have four common opponents this year in Ohio State's Jesse Mendez, Missouri's Zeke Seltzer, Northern Iowa's Cory Land and North Carolina's Luke Simcox. VomBaur is 2-2 against those opponents with losses to Mendez and Land, while Hardy is 3-1 with his loss also coming to Mendez.
- The matchup at 149 could feature No. 25 **Drew Roberts** and No. 14 Chance Lamer. The pair have one prior meeting with Lamer, who was then at Cal Poly, beating Roberts by decision in the opening round of the 2024 NCAA Championships. They have one common opponent this year in Illinois' Michael Gioffre, and both beat Gioffre by decision. Roberts is 2-1 against ranked wrestlers this season.

- At 157, No. 21 **Charlie Millard**, 2-3 against ranked foes this year, is set to meet No. 5 Antrell Taylor for the first time. They have two common opponents this year in Northern Iowa's RJ Weston and Ohio State's Brandon Cannon. Both wrestlers beat Weston by tech fall and were majored by Cannon.
- No. 11 **Andrew Sparks**, 1-1 against ranked opponents this year, could face No. 8 LJ Araujo at 165 for the first time in their careers. They have one common opponents this year in Ohio State's Paddy Gallagher. Sparks won his matchup in overtime at the National Duals, while Araujo was majored.
- At 174, No. 22 **Ethan Riddle**, who has wrestled a team-high 10 ranked opponents this year and gone 6-4 in such matches, could meet No. 6 Christopher Minto for the first time. They have one common foe this year in Ohio State's Carson Kharchla. Riddle lost his match by tech fall, while Minto lost by decision.
- At 184, No. 3 **Max McEnelly** and No. 9 Silas Allred are scheduled to meet for the second time in their careers. Last year, McEnelly won by major decision in the regular season dual. They have two common opponents this year in Missouri's Aedon Sinclair and Ohio State's Dylan Fishback. McEnelly beat Fishback but lost to Sinclair, while Allred is 0-2 against the pair.
- The matchup at 197 could put No. 24 **Gavin Nelson** against No. 12 Camden McDanel for the first time. They have two common foes this year in Missouri's Evan Bates and Ohio State's Seth Shumate. Nelson, who is 1-4 against ranked opponents this year, lost to both, while McDanel beat Shumate and lost to Bates.
- The final ranked matchup could come at heavyweight between No. 10 **Koy Hopke** and fourth-ranked AJ Ferrari. The two have never met and have one common opponent this year in Ohio State's Nick Feldman, who beat the pair by decisions. Hopke is 6-2 against ranked opponents this year.

MAX ON A MISSION

- **Max McEnelly** is 10-1 so far this season with an 8-1 record in duals and 1-0 mark in the Big Ten. Eight of his 10 wins have been by bonus points, including seven tech falls.
- Against ranked competition, McEnelly is 6-1, including three wins by tech fall and one major decision. His highest-ranked win this year came over then-No. 7 Dylan Fishback of Ohio State at the National Duals, 4-1.
- McEnelly's lone loss this season came against Missouri's then-No. 8 Aedon Sinclair at the National Duals in November, 6-3.
- McEnelly and Sinclair battled each other over the summer with McEnelly winning in the closing seconds to win the U.S. Open at 86kg. At the U.S. Team Trials, the pair matched up again in the best-of-3 finals. Sinclair won the first match by a 10-2 decision, but McEnelly bounced back with a 6-5 victory to force a winner-take-all bout.
- Like at the U.S. Open, this one also came down to the wire as McEnelly used a takedown with 26 seconds to prevail 3-2 and claim his spot on the U.S. National team. He would go on to win gold at the U20 World Championships.
- McEnelly burst onto the scene last year in his redshirt freshman season and staked his claim as the top 184-pounder entering the 2025-26 season.
- En route to his first All-America honors, a third-place finish at the NCAA Championships, McEnelly was 25-2 with 13 tech fall wins and six majors. Those 13 tech fall wins led the team and ranked tied for third in the nation.

- The third-place finish was the best by a Gopher at 184 pounds since Roger Kish also took third in 2007.
- McEnelly was recognized as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year, the seventh Gopher to earn the honor and the first since Gable Steveson in 2019.
- In addition to tech falls, he led the team in bonus point victories (18) and dual wins (12), and tied for the team lead in dual win percentage (1.000, 12-0), Big Ten dual wins (8), Big Ten dual win percentage (1.000, 8-0).
- The Waconia, Minn., native also finished second on the roster in bonus point rate (.704), ranked wins (13), win percentage vs. ranked opponents (.867, 13-2), dual team points scored (51) and Big Ten dual team points scored (33), tied for second in major decisions (6), came in third in overall wins (25), overall win percentage (.926, 25-2) and team points per match (3.74), and tied for fifth in matches wrestled (27).
- McEnelly's only two losses on the season were to Penn State's Carter Starocci (who would go on to become a five-time NCAA champ) in the Big Ten Championship finals, and then to Northern Iowa's Parker Keckeisen (the reigning national champion at 184) in the NCAA semifinals.
- McEnelly faced 15 ranked opponents last year and went 13-2 against them, including a 6-2 record against top-10 competition and four top-five wins.
- As the No. 3 seed at NAAs, McEnelly posted a tech fall over No. 30 Colin Fegley of Lock Haven, a major decision against Oklahoma's No. 14 DJ Parker and a decision against Cornell's No. 6 Chris Foca.
- McEnelly lost in the semifinals to Keckeisen in overtime but responded with wins over No. 8 Jaxon Smith of Maryland in the consolation semifinals and No. 4 Dustin Plott of Oklahoma State in the third-place match.
- At the Big Ten Championships, McEnelly opened with a tech fall of Cartagena-Walsh and a major over No. 12 Edmond Ruth of Illinois in the semifinals. He then took the first loss of his career with an 8-5 overtime setback against Starocci, snapping a 35-match win streak.
- McEnelly was a three-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week last year.
- For his performance at the Mountaineer Invite, when he beat his opponents by a combined score of 61-14, McEnelly was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week, the first such honor in program history as last year was the first for the award.
- McEnelly's victory over No. 4. Bennett Berge of South Dakota State on Dec. 1 helped him sweep Big Ten Wrestler and Freshman of the Week honors.
- His third honor came after knocking off No. 8 Gabe Arnold of Iowa on Feb. 14.
- A Waconia, Minn., native, McEnelly went 15-0 in 2023-24 with 10 bonus-point victories, including eight tech falls, one pin and one major decision.
- Coming out of high school, McEnelly was a four-time Minnesota state champion at three different weight classes. He was the Minnesota Tribune's 2022-23 Metro Wrestler of the Year and winner of the 2023 MWCA Mr. Minnesota High School Wrestler Award.
- McEnelly posted a nearly perfect 181-1 record in has last four years of prep action. He was the pound-for-pound best wrestler in the state of Minnesota according to The Guillotine and ranked as the No. 8 recruit in MatScouts' Class of 2023 Big Board.

2X ALL-AMERICAN VOMBAUR

- Redshirt senior **Vance VomBaur** is a two-time All-American, finishing eighth in each of the last two years. He is the 59th multi-time All-American in Gophers history and the fourth to do so at 141 pounds.

TEAM NOTES

- He's on track for a chance at a third, sporting a 12-3 record overall, 5-3 mark in duals and 1-0 record in the Big Ten. He's got six major decisions to go with titles at the Southeast Open and Bison Open.
- A year ago, VomBaur went 26-7 overall, including seven wins by major decision, five by tech fall and one by pin. He recorded individual titles at the Mountaineer Invite and Cougar Clash.
- VomBaur led Minnesota in major decision victories (7) and tied for the team lead in overall wins (26) and total matches competed (33).
- He also placed third on the Gophers in dual wins (10) and ranked wins (12), tied for third in Big Ten dual wins (6), Big Ten dual win percentage (.750, 6-2) and Big Ten dual team points scored (24), ranked fourth in bonus point wins (13), win percentage vs. ranked opponents (.632, 12-7) and dual team points scored (39), tied for fourth in shutout wins (2), finished fifth in team points per match (2.19) and dual win percentage (.833, 10-2), and tied for fifth in overall win percentage (.788, 26-7) and tech falls (5).
- He opened the 2025 NCAA Championships with shutout wins over No. 27 Greyson Clark of Purdue and No. 11 Dylan Cedeno of Virginia before a loss in the quarterfinals to eventual national champion Jesse Mendez (Ohio State). VomBaur battled back to beat No. 15 Joseph Olivier of Rutgers in the Blood Round to clinch All-American status for the second straight year.
- At the Big Ten Championships, VomBaur upset No. 1 Beau Bartlett of Penn State, 5-3, to reach the finals.
- VomBaur also had an overtime win over then-No. 24 Dylan Chappell in a dual against Bucknell and a major decision against then-No. 30 Shannon Hanna in a dual versus Campbell. In addition, he topped No. 11 Sergio Lemley of Michigan, 4-2, on Jan. 19.
- Two years ago he finished the year with a record of 19-11 after going 3-3 at NAAs. He was the 11th All-American in Gophers history at 141 pounds and the eighth individual to do so at Minnesota.
- At No. 26, VomBaur became the lowest seeded Gopher to become an All-American since David Thorn finished seventh at 125 pounds in 2013 after being unseeded (full seeding started in 2019).

PROVIDING A SPARK(S)

- A four-time national qualifier at the NCAA Championships, **Andrew Sparks** is back for a sixth and final season with the Maroon and Gold.
- So far, he's 12-2 overall and 6-1 in duals. Sparks has two tech fall wins and two by major decision.
- Sparks's top win has been a 3-2 decision in sudden victory over Ohio State's then-No. 12 Paddy Gallagher at the National Duals Invitational.
- A year ago, Sparks was 24-9 on the year, including 9-3 in duals. He had 11 wins by tech fall, tied for 10th in the country, to go with three wins by major decision and one pin. Six of his nine losses on the year were by three points or fewer.
- He went 1-2 as the No. 10 seed at the NCAA Championships. Prior to that, he earned a career best fourth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships.
- Both losses at the Big Ten Championships were to No. 10 Beau Mantanona of Michigan, while he picked up wins over then-No. 9 Paddy Gallagher of Ohio State and No. 14 Braeden Scoles of Illinois.
- Other highlights of the season for Sparks included an 8-4 decision over then-No. 25 Drake Rhodes of South Dakota State on Dec. 1, a major of Northwestern's Maxx Mayfield, who was ranked 20th, on Jan. 26 and a tech fall of Rutgers' No. 25 Anthony White on Feb. 2.

TRANSFER DUO

- Minnesota has welcomed in a pair of transfers this year in senior **Jore Volk** and 7th-year senior **Chris Cannon**.
- Hailing from Lakeville, Minn., Volk spent the past three seasons at Wyoming where he was a Big 12 champion and two-time qualifier to the NCAA Championships at 125 pounds. He finished with a record of 53-19 for the Cowboys.
- This year, Volk has gone 14-2 overall, 7-2 in duals and 1-0 in the Big Ten. He's got titles at the Southeast Open and Bison Open. Four of his wins have come by tech fall and he's 6-1 against ranked foes, including a pair of decisions over then-No. 4 Eddie Ventresca of Virginia Tech at the National Duals.
- Volk was limited to just four matches last season, going 2-2. In January, he announced that he would be sitting out the remainder of the season due to injury and would seek a medical redshirt.
- The year prior in 2024, Volk broke through to earn All-America honors for the first time in his career as he compiled a record of 27-8, including a 15-8 mark against ranked opponents. He piled up a team-high 46 takedowns, six technical falls and was a team-best 8-3 in duals.
- Volk earned All-American status as he finished seventh at the 2024 NCAA Championships. After dropping his opening match as the No. 5 seed, Volk followed with four straight wins over the No. 21 seed (Oregon State's Brandon Kaylor), the No. 11 seed (Virginia Tech's Cooper Flynn), the No. 14 seed (Stanford's Nico Provo) and the No. 1 seed (Penn State's Braeden Davis). Volk then beat South Dakota State's No. 23 Tanner Jordan in the seventh-place match.
- Volk reached the NAAs after winning the 2024 Big 12 title. Seeded fifth, he beat the No. 4 seed Jordan, the No. 1 seed (Missouri's Noah Surtin) and the No. 2 seed (Oklahoma State's Troy Spratley).
- Volk had a breakout true freshman season in 2022-23, recording 21 wins and qualifying for the NCAA Championships as the No. 21 seed. He went 1-2 in his first appearance at the Championships. Volk also finished fifth at the Big 12 Tournament, earning automatic qualification to the NCAA Championships.
- Prior to Wyoming, Volk was a four-time state finalist and a three-time state champion while competing at Lakeville North High school. He was tabbed as the 48th ranked prospect in the country. On the national scene, he won the 2022 U20 Freestyle World Team Trials, earning a spot on the U20 Freestyle World Team. He was also a 2019 USAW Cadet National Champion in Freestyle and Greco-Roman. Volk finished fourth in a highly competitive field at the 2021 Super 32 Tournament.
- Cannon, who is 3-6 overall and 2-4 in duals this season at 133 pounds, spent five of the past six seasons at Northwestern, adding a stop at Michigan during the 2023-24 campaign. In total, he produced a 55-31 career record prior to joining the Gophers, including a 24-11 mark in duals and an 18-9 record in the Big Ten.
- A native of Oceanport, N.J., Cannon competed at 141 pounds for the first time in his career last season at Northwestern, finishing with a 5-9 record. This was a return to Evanston after he spent 2023-24 at Michigan, though he missed the majority of that season due to injury in his first and only match of the year.
- As a redshirt junior in 2022-23, Cannon reached the NCAA Championships for the third time in his career as he produced a 20-10 record overall and 7-2 mark in the Big Ten. He also equaled his career-best finish at the Big Ten Championships as he placed fourth with a 4-2 record, highlighted by an upset of second-seeded Jesse Mendez of Ohio State in the consolation semis.

- Cannon earned the second All-America honors of his career in 2022. Tallying a 20-7 overall record and 8-2 record in duals, he got there by securing a fifth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships while earning the No. 10 national seed for NAAs. Cannon went 4-2 at the championships to claim a seventh-place national finish for the second year in a row. He was also a finalist at the Cliff Keen Invite during the regular season.
- In his first season wrestling as a starter in the Wildcats' lineup in 2021, Cannon posted a 12-4 record at 133 pounds, earning bonus points in nine of his victories, placing fourth in the Big Ten Championship and ultimately securing All-American honors with a seventh-place finish at the 2021 NCAA Championships.

NEW TO THE LINEUP

- Three weight classes have new starters for Minnesota this season.
- At 157 pounds, redshirt freshman **Charlie Millard** has taken over for Tommy Askey. Millard has looked the part so far, sporting an 13-3 record with four tech fall wins and two coming by major decision.
- His biggest wins of the year so far came against then-No. 9 Gavin Drexler of North Dakota State in a 10-4 decision and then-No. 8 Kannon Webster of Illinois by injury default.
- All three of Millard's losses this season have been to ranked opponents.
- In his debut season, Millard was 13-2 overall including four wins by pin, and three each by tech fall and major decision.
- Among the highlights were being named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after going 3-0 with three major decision to win the Daktronics Open, including a 13-4 semifinal win over No. 14 Cobe Siebrecht of South Dakota State, plus another upset of Siebrecht at South Dakota State in Millard's dual debut.
- Millard added tournament wins at the Bison Open and Cyclone Open, the latter of which saw a 9-4 win over then-No. 8 Cody Chittum of Iowa State.
- The graduation of Isaiah Salazar at 197 pounds has opened the door for redshirt sophomore **Gavin Nelson**. Nelson was the only Gopher to go undefeated last year as he posted a 10-0 record, including tournament wins at the Cougar Clash, Daktronics Open and Bison Open. He placed second on the roster and 10th in the country in team points per match (4.50), and ranked third on the team in bonus point rate (.700) and wins by pin (3). Nagel, meanwhile, was 9-3 last year and made his collegiate dual debut. He placed second at the Mountaineer Invite, third at the Cougar Clash and was undefeated at the Daktronics Open.
- This year, Nelson is 6-7 overall, 1-6 in duals and 0-1 in the Big Ten. His best win came over then-No. 19 Sonny Sasso of Virginia Tech in the third-place match at the Southeast Open. Nelson has two tech fall wins and a pin.
- With Gable Steveson exhausting his eligibility, heavyweight has been taken over by redshirt freshman **Koy Hopke**.
- Hopke missed all of last season due to injury, but boasts a strong prep pedigree. He ranked ninth overall on MatScouts' final Big Board and was a four-time Division II State Champion at Amery High School in Wisconsin, winning three titles at 220 pounds before claiming the heavyweight crown as a senior. This summer, Hopke placed third at the U20 U.S. Open at 125 kg.
- Hopke has showcased his ability this year with a 16-3 record overall, 4-2 record in duals and 1-0 mark in the Big Ten.

TEAM NOTES

► He's won three matches by pin and six by major decision. Against ranked opponents he's 6-2, including a 3-0 mark at the Southeast Open that helped him sweep the Big Ten Weekly Awards for Wrestler and Freshman of the Week.

► At the Soldier Salute in early January, he captured the heavyweight title. He outscored his opponents 18-5 and was not taken down. In the semifinals, Hopke took care of No. 10 Christian Carroll of Wyoming, 6-1, while in the finals he avenged an earlier season loss to Nebraska's Cade Ziola by registering a 5-3 decision.

MOVING UP WEIGHTS

► Redshirt senior **Jager Eisch** has jumped two weight classes from 133 to 149 pounds. After beginning his career in 2021-22 at 125, Eisch has spent the last three years at 133. Last season, he competed in two events, finishing fourth at the Mountaineer Invite and posting a 2-1 record at the Daktronics Open. He's 25-14 in his career with a 3-0 mark in dual action.

► This year, he's 9-8 overall and 0-4 in duals with two wins by pin and three by major decision.

► Redshirt freshman **Silas Dailey** has also moved up two classes, going from 174 to 197 pounds. Last year as a true freshman, Dailey posted a 12-10 record at 174 pounds with four wins by tech fall and four by major decision. His best tournament finish came at the Jim Koch Open where he placed fourth. Dailey ranked second on the team in shutout wins (6) last year and tied for fifth in major decisions.

► Dailey is 9-6 this year, highlighted by a win over then-No. 30 Robert Platt of North Carolina at the Southeast Open.

► Joining Eisch at 149 is redshirt sophomore **Rhett Koenig**. He was 15-11 last year at 141 pounds, including a second-place finish at the Bison Open plus fifth-place results at the Jim Koch Open and Don Parker Open. Koenig tied for fourth on the team with two shutout wins.

► This year, Koenig is 13-7 overall and 0-1 in duals with three pins and two tech fall victories.

► Fellow redshirt sophomore **Brandon Morvari** primarily competed at 125 pounds last year but finished the year with a dual start at 133 and that's where he's competing this season. He went 4-6 last year overall, including an 0-2 mark in duals.

► He's 1-6 this year at 133, including an 0-3 mark in duals and 0-1 record in the Big Ten.

► **Jack Nelson** has moved up one weight from 149 pounds to 157. He competed in four tournaments a year ago with a 5-11 record, highlighted by a sixth-place finish at the Jim Koch Open. Nelson is 4-2 this season.

GOPHERS BLITZ THE ILLINI

► No. 7 Minnesota opened its Big Ten schedule with a dominant 27-9 victory at No. 11 Illinois on Jan. 10.

► The Golden Gophers took seven of the matches in total, including all five ranked contests. It marked their seventh straight win over the Illini and fourth in a row in Champaign. Overall, Minnesota has won 12 of the last 13 in the series. In addition, head coach Brandon Eggum improved to a perfect 7-0 against Illinois.

► The 18-point margin of victory was Minnesota's largest in the series since a 27-6 home win in 2002 and its biggest in Champaign since a 27-6 triumph in 1968

► The dual started at 184 between No. 3 **Max McEnelly** and No. 33 Chris Moore. McEnelly jumped out to a 6-2 lead after the first period thanks to a pair of take-downs. An escape in the second period plus two stall points in the third gave him the 9-3 decision.

► Illinois tied the match at 3-3 when Dylan Connell topped No. 20 **Gavin Nelson** in overtime, 4-1. Both wrestlers recorded escapes in regulation, and Connell got the winning takedown with 14 seconds left in OT.

► The first bonus-point victory of the dual came at heavyweight with No. 10 **Koy Hopke** majoring Ryan Boersma, 9-1. Hopke got a takedown in the first period and escaped in the second to lead 4-0 going to the third. In the final period, Hopke earned a point for stalling then cut Boersma loose late to go for the major. A short-time takedown plus riding time followed.

► No. 9 **Jore Volk** made it two bonus-point wins in a row for the Gophers thanks to a 22-6 (6:26) tech fall of CJ Campbell at 125 pounds in what ended up being the deciding matchup. Volk led 4-1 through two periods but blew things wide open with six takedowns in the third period.

► **Brandon Morvari** wrestled next for Minnesota at 133 and used a strong defensive gameplan against top-ranked Lucas Byrd, limiting the result to a 7-1 loss.

► The second ranked matchup of the day came at 141 as No. 11 **Vance VomBaur** took on No. 13 Danny Pucino. Tied at 1-1 lifetime in their meetings, VomBaur won the rubber match with a 6-3 decision. Pucino scored the first takedown but VomBaur escaped and got one of his own to lead 4-3 after one period. A quick escape in the second pushed the lead to 5-3 before VomBaur rode out Pucino for the entire third period, racking up over 3:00 of riding time.

► The momentum stayed on Minnesota's side at 149 with No. 26 **Drew Roberts** knocking off No. 20 Michael Gioffre, 7-6. After a scoreless first period, Gioffre led 4-1 going to the third. Roberts cut the lead to 4-3 off a reversal and pulled ahead 6-5 off a takedown with 1:20 remaining. Gioffre eventually escaped but not before Roberts earned the riding time point.

► The ranked matchup at 157 pounds came to an end early due to injury default. No. 21 **Charlie Millard** was leading 4-1 over No. 8 Kannon Webster in the second period when the two saw their heads collide. Webster was unable to continue and the match was called in Millard's favor at the 3:23 mark, sealing the dual win for Minnesota.

► Illinois claimed its final victory when No. 9 Braeden Scoles topped **Blaine Brenner** at 165, 9-3.

► In the final matchup of the dual, No. 22 **Ethan Riddle** provided the exclamation point with an 11-8, comeback win in overtime over No. 19 Colin Kelly. The match was scoreless through the first period, but Kelly turned Riddle for a reversal and four nearfall points to lead 6-0 going to the third. Riddle fought back, however, with two takedowns, an escape and the riding time point to send the match to overtime at 8-8. With 50 seconds left in sudden victory, Riddle cradled Kelly for the winning takedown.

HOPKE WINS SOLDIER SALUTE TITLE

► **Koy Hopke** won the heavyweight title at the Soldier Salute in early January.

► Hopke, ranked 11th at the time by InterMat, defeated Nebraska's Cade Ziola, 5-3, to cap a 4-0 weekend. Hopke outscored his opponents 18-5 and did not give up a take down. Hopke reached the championship match after a hard-fought, 6-1 win over No. 10 Christian Carroll of Wyoming in the semifinals.

► At 174 pounds, **Clayton Whiting** garnered a seventh-place finish with a 3-1, overtime win over Iowa State's Melton Powe. Whiting finished the weekend 4-2 with three wins coming by major decision.

► Bennett Tabor claimed eighth place at heavyweight, finishing 2-3 on the weekend.

► Seven other Gophers were in action over the weekend but did not place.

'U' BLASTS THE BISON

► Minnesota closed out its non-conference dual schedule on Dec. 7 with a 26-9 triumph over North Dakota State at Maturi Pavilion.

► The victory, which was the 90th dual win of head coach **Brandon Eggum's** career, marked the 21st straight for the Golden Gophers over the Bison. That's Minnesota's longest active streak against one other team.

► The dual started at 125 pounds in the first of four ranked matchups as No. 8 **Jore Volk** faced No. 30 Ezekiel Witt. Volk trailed 4-1 going to the final period and was down 4-2 in the closing seconds, but he hit Witt with a single-leg takedown and added four nearfall points for a dramatic 9-5 decision.

► At 133, **Chris Cannon** lost a 4-1 decision to No. 28 Tristan Daugherty. The match had to be stopped twice for injury time for Cannon and Daugherty was able to take the match on a takedown in the final seconds. A team point was then deducted from Minnesota after the match for unsportsmanlike conduct (thrown headgear).

► Trailing 3-2, the Gophers got their first bonus-point win of the dual as No. 11 **Vance VomBaur** majored No. 33 Michael Olson, 9-1, at 141. Scoreless through one, VomBaur used an escape, stall point and neutral danger takedown to build a 5-0 lead. He then added a late takedown and a point for riding time.

► The Bison evened the match at 6-6 when No. 29 Max Petersen rallied past **Drew Roberts** at 149. Roberts led 4-1 going to the third but Petersen scored a pair of takedowns, including the winner with 30 seconds to go, for a 7-5 decision.

► The turning point of the dual came at 157 with No. 21 **Charlie Millard** taking on No. 9 Gavin Drexler. Trailing 3-1 after the opening period, Millard escaped and then followed a takedown with multiple turns, earning two and four points, respectively, on his way to a 10-4 decision.

► Coming out of intermission, No. 9 **Andrew Sparks** kept the momentum going for the Gophers with an 18-3 tech fall (7:00) of Boeden Greenley at 165. Sparks had two takedowns in the first period, one in the second and two more in the third.

► A third-period comeback gave No. 25 **Ethan Riddle** a 9-5 decision over Max Magayna at 174. Magayna led 3-0 with over 2:00 of riding time after the first period before Riddle cut into the lead with a takedown of his own in the second. Down 4-3, Riddle recorded two take-downs in the third period en route to a 9-5 decision.

► Minnesota's second tech fall of the dual came at 184 with No. 3 **Max McEnelly** routing No. 14 Aidan Brenot, 22-6 (6:58). McEnelly had two takedowns in each of the first two periods and added three more in the third.

► North Dakota State got its final win of the dual at 197 with Devin Wasley recording a 6-3 decision over **Gabe Nagel**.

► At heavyweight, No. 15 **Koy Hopke** posted an 11-0 major decision of Drew Blackburn-Forst to close out the dual. Hopke led 3-0 after the first and added a reversal in the second to lead 5-0. Another takedown, plus two stalling points and nearly two minutes of riding time, pushed Hopke to the shutout.

TAKING DOWN THE TROJANS

► In the first ever dual matchup between Minnesota and Little Rock, the seventh-ranked Gophers downed the No. 25 Trojans, 23-9, on Dec. 4 at Homestead High School in Mequon, Wis., as part of FloWrestling Night in America.

TEAM NOTES

- ▶ Minnesota won the first four matches of the night, then closed out the evening with wins in three of the last four weights.
- ▶ The dual started at 125 where No. 8 **Jore Volk** rallied to beat Jeremiah Reno, 4-2. Tied 1-1 through two periods, Reno escaped but Volk got the winning takedown off a single-leg attack with 50 seconds to go.
- ▶ A back-and-forth contest at 133 saw **Chris Cannon** come from behind to defeat Dillon Cooper. Cannon struck first but a reversal from Cooper cut the lead to 3-2 after the first period. Cooper started the second period on top and cradled Cannon for two nearfall points to lead 4-3 going to the third. Cooper was called twice for stalling in the third period to tie the match at 4-4 before Cannon pulled in front with a reversal. He then rode out Cooper for the final 40 seconds to win 6-5.
- ▶ Redshirt freshman **Dawson Johnson** made his collegiate dual debut at 141 in a matchup with Brennan Van Hoecke. After a scoreless first period, Johnson escaped and added a takedown for a 4-1 lead. After an escape by Van Hoecke, Johnson showed good defense then circled behind for a takedown on the edge of the mat for an impressive 7-2 win.
- ▶ **Drew Roberts'** win at 149 turned out to be the match that decided the dual as he upset No. 17 Brock Herman, 5-1. An escape from Herman in the second period was the only point of the match headed to the third, but Roberts escaped and later got a takedown from the waterfall position with one minute remaining. He then rode out Herman the rest of the way.
- ▶ Little Rock captured the next two matches to cut the Gophers' lead in half at 12-6.
- ▶ No. 33 Jaivon Jones knocked off No. 21 **Charlie Millard** in overtime at 157 pounds, 4-1, as Millard competed in his high school gymnasium. At 165, **Blaine Brenner** competed in a dual for the first time since Feb. of 2024, but lost a 5-1 decision to No. 5 Matty Bianchi.
- ▶ No. 25 **Ethan Riddle** got the Gophers back on track with a 9-3 win over Gunner Holland at 174 pounds. Tied 1-1 through two periods, Riddle escaped quickly in the third and then added a pair of takedowns and the riding time bonus.
- ▶ The first bonus-point win of the night came at 184 pounds as No. 3 **Max McEnelly** majored No. 32 Brock DelSignore, 12-4. Takedowns in each of the first two periods, plus an escape, gave McEnelly a 7-2 lead going to the third. In the final period, McEnelly added two more takedowns and added points of stall calls and riding time.
- ▶ The Trojans got their final win of the night at 197 pounds as No. 3 Stephen Little posted a 7-2 decision over Minnesota's No. 19 Gavin Nelson.
- ▶ In the final match of the night, No. 15 **Koy Hopke** shut out Michael Gasper, 8-0. Hopke posted a takedown and got a point for stalling in the first period, while in the second he scored a reversal to lead 6-0. Another stall call and 3:28 of riding time resulted in the final score.

LAST SECOND LOSS TO SDSU

- ▶ Minnesota opened its home slate on Nov. 25 with an 18-14 setback against No. 17 South Dakota State.
- ▶ The teams alternated wins over the first eight matchups before the Jackrabbits closed out the night with wins at 197 and heavyweight to claim the victory. In a close-fought dual, seven of the 10 matchups were decided by three points or less.
- ▶ The dual started at 125 pounds in the first of six ranked matchups as No. 4 **Jore Volk** faced No. 21 Brady Roark. A first-period takedown helped give Volk a 4-2 lead late in the third period, but Roark caught him late for a takedown in the closing seconds and a 5-4 win.
- ▶ Minnesota got on the board at 133 thanks to **Chris Cannon**. A first-period takedown followed by four back points helped him to an 8-1 decision over Cale Seaton.

- ▶ South Dakota State pulled back in front after No. 12 Julian Tagg defeated No. 9 **Vance VomBaur** at 141 pounds, 5-1.
- ▶ Competing for the first time since the season-opening Southeast Open, **Drew Roberts** evened the match back up behind a 4-2 win over Avery Allen. Tied at 1-1 in the third period, Roberts circled behind Allen for the winning takedown with just under 90 seconds remaining.
- ▶ The Jackrabbits went into intermission on top 9-6 as No. 21 Cael Swensen topped No. 15 **Charlie Millard**. It was a 3-0 lead for Millard through one period but Swensen got a go-ahead takedown in the closing seconds of the second period and added three more points in the third to win 7-5.
- ▶ **Andrew Sparks** pulled the Gophers back even at 9-9 thanks to a 2-0 win over Marcus Espinoza-Owens at 165 pounds. Ranked ninth in the country, Sparks led 1-0 after two periods then rode Espinoza-Owens for the entire third period to grab the decision.
- ▶ South Dakota State reclaimed the lead 12-9 when No. 27 Moses Espinoza-Owens defeated No. 20 **Ethan Riddle**, 4-1, on a takedown with 30 seconds to go.
- ▶ The lone bonus-point victory of the night belonged to No. 3 **Max McEnelly** at 184 pounds as he posted a 20-5 (5:42) tech fall over Brock Fettig.
- ▶ At 197, No. 7 Bennett Berge squeaked past No. 19 **Gavin Nelson**. Both logged escapes in regulation, but the riding time point gave Berge the 2-1 decision.
- ▶ The dual came down to heavyweight as No. 13 **Koy Hopke** faced No. 20 Luke Rasmussen. Hopke jumped out to a 3-0 lead after the first period, but started on bottom in the second. Hopke was turned for three nearfall points for Rasmussen. A locked hands call on Rasmussen gave Hopke a 4-3 lead going to the final period. Hopke rode out Rasmussen for nearly the entire third period, but with 10 seconds to go, Rasmussen scored a reversal and back points to claim a 7-5 decision and give the dual to the Jackrabbits.

5TH PLACE = \$50K AT NATIONAL DUALS

- ▶ Minnesota won both of its matches on the final day of competition to finish in fifth place at the National Duals Invitational presented by Paycom in Tulsa, Okla.
- ▶ A 15-14 win over No. 17 Missouri in the consolation semifinals of the National Duals Invitational sent the Golden Gophers to the fifth-place match where they routed No. 11 Virginia Tech, 25-10.
- ▶ Minnesota opened the event with a 19-17 win over the Hokies before a 29-6 loss in the quarterfinals to eventual champion Ohio State. A 22-16 win over Northern Iowa kept the Gophers alive.
- ▶ **Jore Volk** (125), **Charlie Millard** (157), **Andrew Sparks** (165) and **Max McEnelly** (184) all went 4-1 at the event for the Gophers.

MINNESOTA DOMINATES BISON OPEN

- ▶ Minnesota dominated the competition at the Bison Open on Nov. 9, taking home 13 titles. The 13 titles across 10 weight classes were due in part to three weights that saw "no-contests" between Gophers teammates, resulting in co-champions, plus two separate pools at 149 pounds.
- ▶ **Jore Volk** (125), **Vance VomBaur** (141), **Andrew Sparks** (165), **Max McEnelly** (184) and **Bennett Tabor** (285) all won titles outright.
- ▶ Declared "no-contests" at 157, 174 and 197 resulted in shared title for **Charlie Millard** and **Jack Nelson**, **Clayton Whiting** and **Ethan Riddle**, and **Gabe Nagel** and **Gavin Nelson**, respectively.

- ▶ The 149-pound class was split into Gold and Green divisions, and both were won by Gophers as **Rhett Koenig** won Gold and **Jager Eisch** claimed Green.

GOPHERS CLAIM FOUR TITLES AT SOUTHEAST OPEN

- ▶ Minnesota wrestling opened the 2025-26 season on Nov. 2 with four individual titles at the Southeast Open in Salem, Va. In total, of the 20 wrestlers that competed for the Golden Gophers 14 placed in the top six at their weights.
- ▶ Arguably the most impressive performance belonged to **Koy Hopke**, who knocked off three ranked opponents to win the heavyweight title. After missing all of last season due to injury, Hopke made his collegiate debut by pinning Presbyterian's George Hopkins at the 1:39 mark, shut out No. 30 Stephan Monchery of Appalachian State, 8-0, then majored No. 14 Jimmy Mullen of Virginia Tech, 12-1. In the finals, Hopke had to go up against Gophers teammate and 25th-ranked **Bennett Tabor**. Both could only register escapes in regulation, but Hopke got the winning takedown in overtime for the 4-1 victory and tournament title.
- ▶ As a result of his efforts, Hopke swept the Big Ten Wrestler of the Week and Freshman of the Week honors.
- ▶ **Vance VomBaur** went 5-0 with three bonus-point wins to capture the 141-pound title. After opening with back-to-back major decisions, VomBaur's closest match came in the quarterfinals where he needed a reversal and riding time in the last 30 seconds to rally past North Carolina's Elias Navida, 10-7. After an 8-3 decision against Franklin and Marshall's Bryce Kresho, VomBaur took care of North Carolina's Luke Simcox in the finals with a 12-3 major..
- ▶ **Jore Volk** made a statement in his first competition with the Maroon and Gold as he won the 125-pound title. He recorded tech falls in his first two matches before being tested by Franklin and Marshall's James Garcia, but came away with a 5-1 win. In the finals, facing No. 6 Jett Strickenberger, Volk led 2-1 in the second period before the match was called at 4:52 in Volk's favor due to a medical forfeit.
- ▶ The new starter for Minnesota this year at 157 pounds, **Charlie Millard** looked right at home as he went 5-0 and outscored opponents 59-8 to claim the title. He began with two techs and a major. Millard faced his toughest test in Maryland's Kal Miller in the semifinals but prevailed with a 5-2 victory. In the finals, he jumped out to a 7-0 lead through two periods en route to an 8-1 decision over App State's Jeremiah Price.
- ▶ In addition to the four champions, Minnesota also had finalists at 165 in **Andrew Sparks**, 174 with **Ethan Riddle** and heavyweight with Tabor.
- ▶ Minnesota also saw a third-place finish from **Gavin Nelson** (197), fourth-place finishes from **Jager Eisch** (149) and **Clayton Whiting** (184), fifth-place finishes from **Blaine Brenner** (174) and **Jed Wester** (174), and **Silas Dailey** (197), and a sixth-place finish from **Rhett Koenig** (149).

MCENELLY WINS GOLD AT U20s

- ▶ **Max McEnelly** won gold at the U20 World Championships in August, posting his third shutout in four total matches to take the 86kg title Bulgaria.
- ▶ Facing UWW athlete Bozigit Islamgereev in the finals, McEnelly dominated from start to finish in an 8-0 win. The Waconia, Minn., native earned the first point for inactivity by Islamgereev then led 2-0 at the break thanks to forcing a stepout. The second period was all McEnelly, scoring three takedowns to cruise to the victory.

TEAM NOTES

- ▶ McEnelly reached the finals after a thrilling semifinal victory over Abolfazl Rahmani Firouzjaei of Iran on Tuesday. McEnelly scored first thanks to inactivity from Rahmani and led 3-2 after the opening period. An inactivity call on McEnelly evened the match at 3-3 with less than 90 seconds to go, and Rahmani pulled ahead 4-3 on a stepout. Battling until the end, McEnelly got the go-ahead takedown with less than 20 seconds to go. He was called for fleeing to tie the match at 5-5 but McEnelly won on criteria with the most two-point sequences.
- ▶ Prior to his semifinal match, McEnelly had not given up a point as he won each of his first two matches, 10-0, defeating Armenia's Razmik Yepremyan and then Georgia's Dachi Papinashvili.
- ▶ Outscoring his opponents 33-5 in four total matches, McEnelly adds gold to the bronze he won at the U17 Championships in 2022.

TWO HOME DUALS ON BTN

- ▶ Minnesota wrestling team is scheduled to appear on the Big Ten Network two times this upcoming season
- ▶ The Gophers' first appearance on the Big Ten Network comes on Friday, Jan. 16 when they host Nebraska at 8 p.m. in the home conference opener.
- ▶ The following week on Jan. 23, Minnesota makes its second and final appearance on BTN when it hosts Ohio State at 6 p.m.

RECAPING 2024-25

- ▶ Minnesota is coming off of a 2024-25 campaign that saw it finish tied for fifth place at the NCAA Championships with 51.5 points. It was the team's best placement under head coach **Brandon Eggum** and was the best since a runner-up finish in 2014. Overall, it was the 19th top-five finish in program history.
- ▶ Gable Steveson was a national finalist at heavyweight, **Max McEnelly** placed third at 184 pounds and **Vance VomBaur** finished eighth at 141 pounds for the second year in a row. It was the first time since 2022, but fifth time in the last seven years, that Minnesota had three All-Americans in a season
- ▶ At the Big Ten Championships, Minnesota saw eight Gophers to reach the podium as it finished in fourth place with 108.5 points, tying for the team's best finish under Eggum. Gable Steveson took home the heavyweight title, becoming the first heavyweight in Big Ten history to win four titles. McEnelly and VomBaur were also finalists at 184 and 141 pounds, respectively. Minnesota had multiple finalists for the third year in a row, while it was the first time since 2015 that the Gophers put three into the finals. Also reaching the podium were fourth-place finishers **Andrew Sparks** (165) and Isaiah Salazar (197), Tommy Askey, who was fifth at 157, as well as seventh-placers Cooper Flynn (125) and **Clayton Whiting** (174).
- ▶ In the dual season, the Maroon & Gold went 10-2 with the losses coming to Iowa and Nebraska, who were ranked second and fifth, respectively, in the final InterMat Dual Poll last year. Highlighting the dual season were wins over then-No. 17 South Dakota State (30-3), No. 21 Michigan (25-10), No. 12 Rutgers (28-9) and No. 4 Ohio State (20-17).

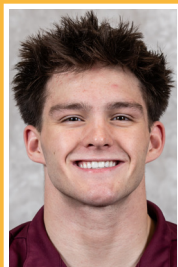
