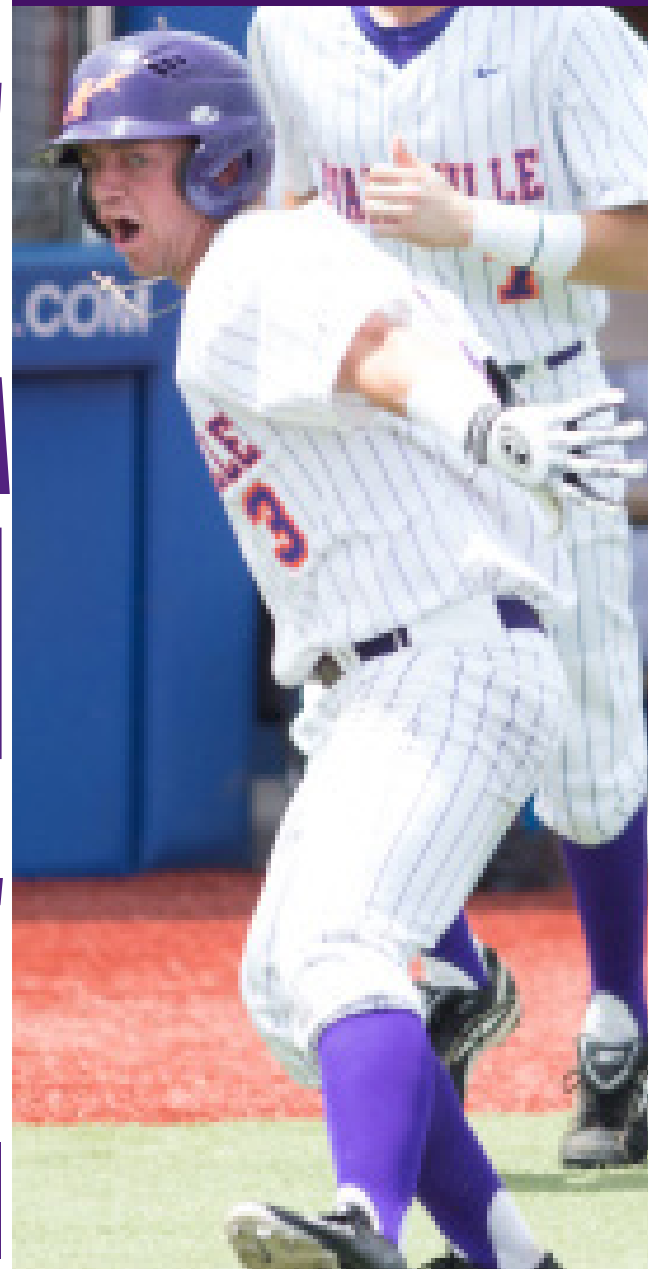

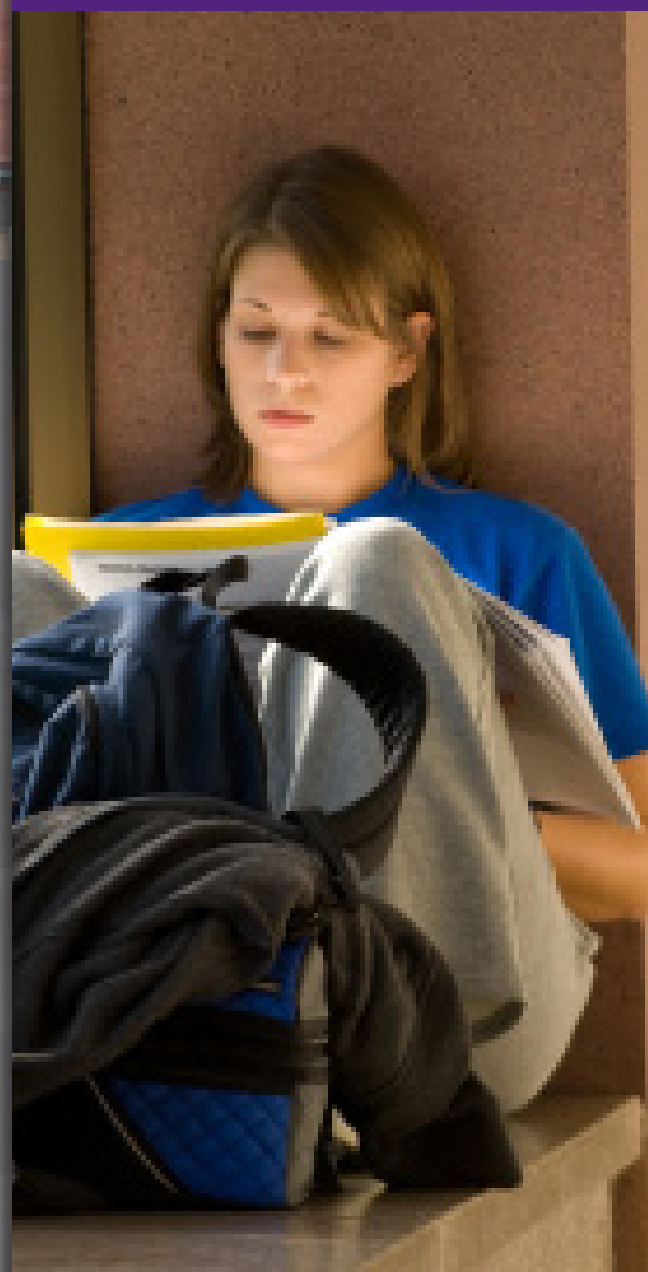

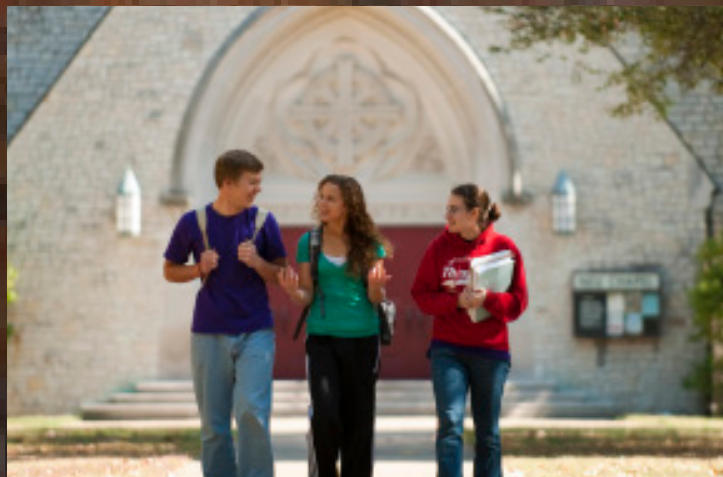
A MISSION OF LEARNING

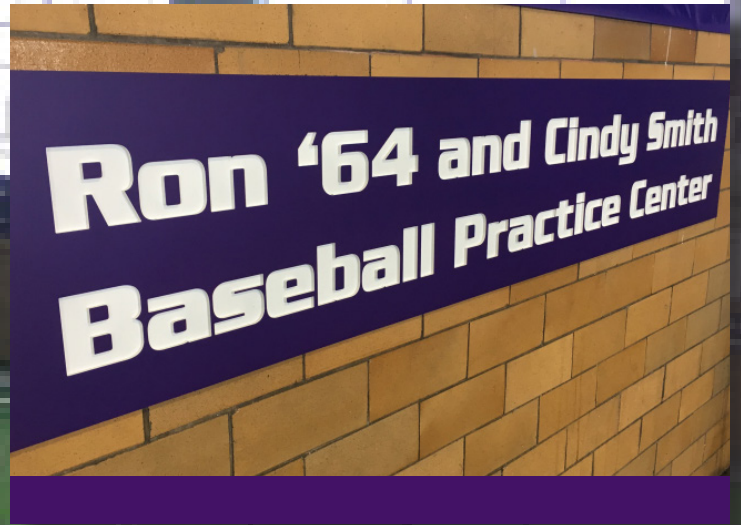
In the fall of 2016, the University of Evansville began extensive renovations in the old National Guard Armory adjacent to Charles H. Braun Stadium. The end result is the Maikranz Family Indoor Facility, which was completed in January 2017.

The all-weather home for the Aces offers 12,000 square feet of turf and a state-of-the-art golf simulator as well as a putting green and pitching mounds.

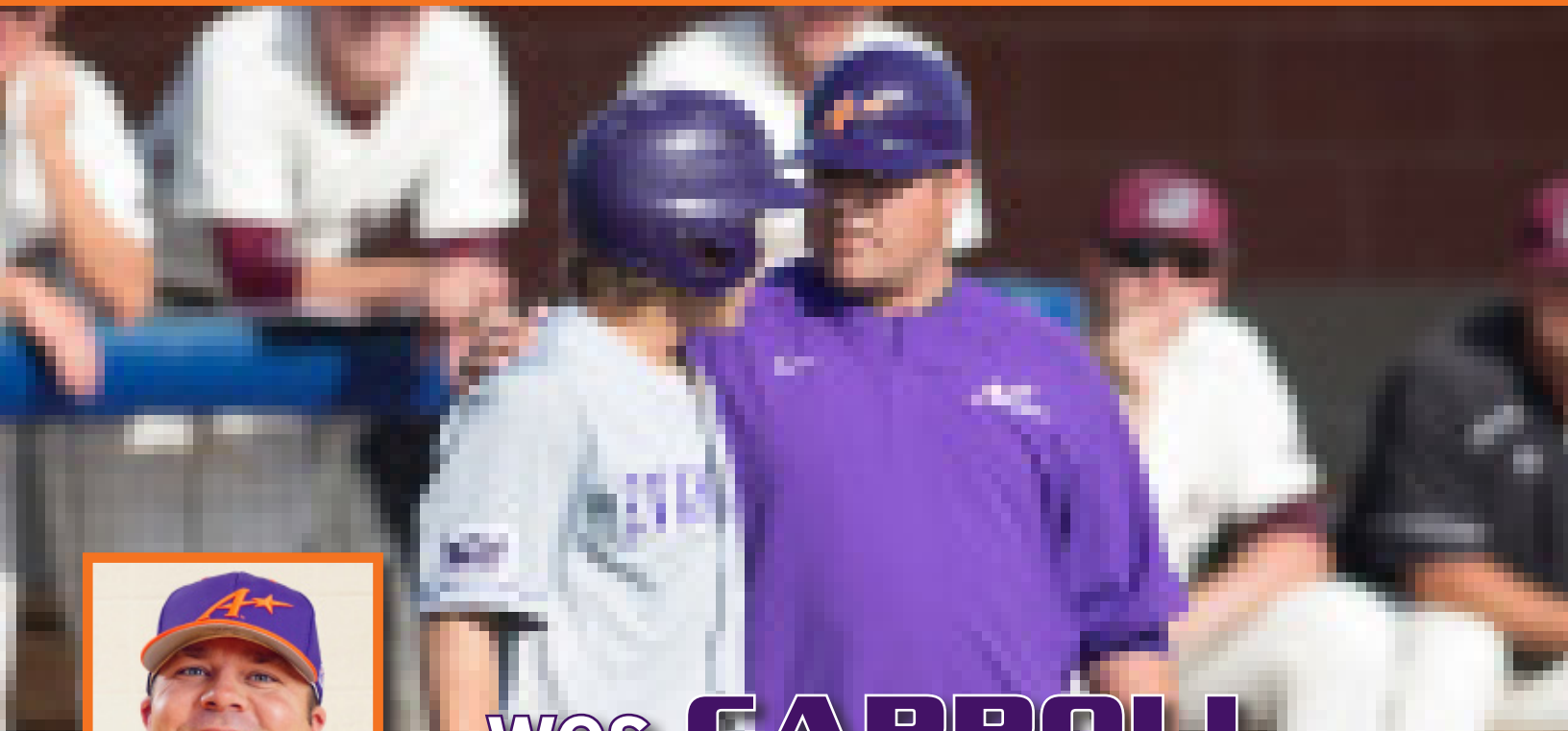

Carroll is in his tenth year as head baseball coach at the University of Evansville.

Inheriting a team that won only 14 games in 2008, Carroll posted the second-highest victory total by a first-year baseball coach at Evansville with 25 wins in 2009 and increased UE's victory total by at least seven wins in each of his first two seasons. He has led Evansville to winning seasons in each of the last three years.

Last season, he led the Aces to a 29-27 campaign that featured a trio of all-conference players in Boomer Synek, Josh Jyawook and Trey Hair. The team went on to finish fifth in the Missouri Valley Conference before picking up a pair of postseason wins for the first time since 2013.

In 2015, Carroll led UE to another winning season. He also coached outfielder Kevin Kaczmarek to the nation's highest batting average at .465, the first player in school history to be named MVC Joe Carter Player of the Year and an All-American by seven different outlets.

The 2014 season was a banner year for Carroll and the Purple Aces, as Evansville claimed the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title, placed a record number of players on the All-MVC First Team and saw three players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. UE finished the season 34-21 overall and finished 15-6 in Valley play to claim their first MVC crown since 2006 and only its second in program history, as Carroll was named the MVC's Dan Callahan Coach of the Year, become just the third Evansville coach to earn the honor.

Under Carroll's direction, a total of seven Aces were named to All-MVC squads, including four first team selections and MVC Pitcher of the Year Kyle Freeland, who finished the season 10-2 with a 1.90 ERA, 128 strikeouts and only 13 walks. Freeland earned a trio of All-America honors (Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA), becoming the first UE player to be recognized as an All-American by three publications since Andy Benes in 1988. In addition, Freeland was selected by the Colorado Rockies with the eighth overall pick in the MLB Draft, becoming the second-highest draftee in program history, behind only Benes, who was taken with the No. 1 overall pick in the 1988 draft.

Kyle Pollock and Sam Johns joined Freeland as draftees, as Pollock was picked in the 20th round by the Kansas City Royals and Johns was taken in the 31st round by the Washington Nationals. Statistically, the Aces led the Valley in batting average (.283) and on-base percentage (.380) and finished second in the

league in runs scored (330), runs batted in (297) and doubles (103). In conference play, UE hit a remarkable .291 as a team to lead the conference by 12 points and struck out just 105 times, 24 times less than any other MVC squad.

In 2013, Carroll led the Aces to 24-34 overall record and a 10-10 mark in Missouri Valley Conference play, as five Evansville players landed on All-MVC squads. Kevin Kaczmarek earned a spot on the All-MVC First Team, while Chris Pearson, Kyle Lloyd and Jake Naumann were all selected to the All-MVC Second Team. Jason Hockemeyer rounded out the list of UE selections by earning All-MVC Honorable Mention status. Following the conclusion of the 2013 season, Kyle Lloyd became Evansville's seventh player to sign a professional contract under Carroll, as he was drafted by the San Diego Padres in the 29th round of the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

During the 2012 campaign, Evansville finished 32-27 under Carroll's direction and led the nation with a .981 fielding percentage. Four Purple Aces earned All-Valley honors, including Eric Stamets, who was an All-MVC First Team honoree and was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year. Outfielder Kevin Kaczmarek was named to the All-MVC Second Team and pitchers Kyle Freeland and Kyle Lloyd earned All-Valley Honorable Mention status. Stamets added to his honors by earning a spot on the Louisville Slugger All-American Third Team as selected by Collegiate Baseball. Kaczmarek also earned All-American status under Carroll, as he was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball.

In 2011, the Aces boasted a .977 fielding percentage, representing a then-program record and the 10th best in NCAA Division I that season, as Evansville finished the year with a 28-25 mark. With four UE players earning all-MVC honors, Cody Fick, a first team pick, headlined the cast. Fick became one of only two players in Evansville baseball history to earn multiple All-America honors in the same season, being named an ABCA/Rawlings first team All-America selection by the American Baseball Coaches Association, and was a second team Louisville Slugger All-American as selected by Collegiate Baseball. Under the direction of Carroll, Fick was also named Region V Player of the Year by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers of America and was a finalist for the College Baseball Hall of Fame's John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award.

In 2010, Evansville broke or tied 19 different single-game, single-season and career records, including one MVC mark as the Aces finished the year 32-27 overall and third in the State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament. Seven Aces earned all-conference honors, including three first team picks and the Freshman of the Year in Eric Stamets.

In his first year as head coach, Carroll quickly pointed the program in the right direction, helping the Purple Aces to 11 more victories than a season prior as UE went 25-30 in 2009 with four players garnering all-MVC awards.

In Carroll's tenure, six players have gone on to sign with professional baseball teams, including Eric Stamets, a sixth round pick by the Los Angeles Angels in the 2012 Major League Baseball Draft.

As a coach, Carroll has led his team with the same enthusiasm and hard-nosed approach which made him one of the top players to wear a Purple Aces' uniform and play in the Missouri Valley Conference.

Carroll learned the game "the Purple Aces' way" growing up just minutes from the UE campus in nearby Newburgh, Indiana. He watched his older brother and current Major League infielder, Jamey Carroll, excel at

shortstop for UE, and later got to experience the success the program is capable of first-hand as a four-year starter for the Purple Aces and a member of UE's 2000 NCAA Tournament team.

Wes Carroll became UE's first Freshman All-America selection in 1998, thanks to a rookie campaign in which he hit .355 with 18 doubles, two home runs, and 39 runs batted in. Carroll went on to hit .299 or better in each of his four years at UE, and finished his career by setting the school's all-time career record for doubles (74), while also ranking in the school's career top 10 in six different categories. He still holds the record for career doubles, has the second-most base hits in school history with 308, and ranks 10th all-time in UE history with a .339 career batting average. Carroll earned all-conference and all-region honors on the UE infield during his four-year career, before being named to the Missouri Valley Conference's All-Centennial Team in 2007 as one of the top players in league history.

Following his college career at Evansville, Carroll was drafted in the 37th round of the Major League Baseball first-year player draft by the Philadelphia Phillies. Carroll spent the next five years playing Minor League Baseball for the Phillies, and later, for the Montreal Expos/Washington Nationals organization. As a part of the now-Nationals organization, Carroll played parts of two seasons at the AAA level. He retired from the professional ranks in the spring of 2006, but not before he was able to play alongside his older brother, Jamey, in two spring training games for the Washington Nationals.

Carroll then returned to his alma mater in the summer of 2006 as an assistant coach with the Purple Aces' program. Carroll's main responsibilities as an assistant coach included serving as the team's hitting coach and infield coach. Carroll helped the 2007 Purple Aces attain their third-highest team batting average (.292) since the NCAA implemented reforms on bats in 2000.

Carroll was named the 12th head coach in UE baseball history on July 2, 2008.

"Wes has a strong history in our community, has been successful as a player, and knows the University of Evansville as both a graduate and as a coach," said UE Director of Athletics John Stanley. "Wes' passion for the baseball program, the game of baseball, the University, and the community make him an ideal choice to lead our program."

Carroll graduated from UE in 2001 with a degree in Human Kinetics and Sport Studies. Wes and his wife, Ashley, a former soccer standout at the University of Evansville, reside in Evansville and have one son and one daughter.

Fick is in his sixth season as pitching coach of the Purple Aces baseball team.

In 2015, Fick guided the UE pitching staff to a Missouri Valley Conference low 193 walks. He mentored closer Brent Jurceka to nine saves, tied for eighth most in single season program history. Fick worked closely with reliever Conor Gilligan who lowered his career ERA from 6.14 to 3.31 with a 1.39 ERA in 2015. Gilligan and Jurceka each held opponents to a team-low .188 batting average that season.

Fick led the pitching staff in 2014 to the MVC regular season title. The staff recorded 393 strikeouts and only 180 walks, both of which are top 10 all-time for UE pitching staffs. Fick helped guide Kyle Freeland to the MVC Pitcher of the Year honor as well as the 8th overall selection (Colorado Rockies) in the MLB Amateur Draft and several All-American honors - Baseball America (first team), Perfect Game (first team), ABCA/Rawlings (second team), Collegiate Baseball (third team), NCBWA (third team). He also oversaw closer Sam Johns, whose 11 saves are 4th best single season in program history and then get drafted by the Washington Nationals in the 31st round.

University of Evansville head coach Wes Carroll announced the hiring of Cody Fick as the pitching coach for the UE baseball program in the summer of 2013.

Fick was a volunteer assistant coach for the Purple Aces in 2012 and was a three-year standout for Evansville from 2009-11. Prior to returning to Evansville as a coach, Fick played a season of professional ball in the Philadelphia Phillies organization in 2011.

"I'm very excited to announce Cody Fick as the new pitching coach for the Purple Aces," Carroll said. "He has a tremendous competitive drive combined with great knowledge of the game. Cody was one of the greatest players to ever wear an Aces uniform and I look forward to his leadership of the pitching staff."

During his playing career at UE, Fick posted a .353 career average with 37 home runs, 182 RBI and a .612 slugging percentage. On the mound, Fick was 7-5 with a 2.81 ERA and 61 strikeouts in 83.1 innings. He was a two-time All-American (2010, 2011), an ABCA All-Region selection (2011), two-time All-MVC First Team honoree (2010, 2011), a two-time selection to the MVC All-Tournament Team (2010, 2011) and was the 2011 recipient of the William V. Slyker Award, which is given to UE's top male student-athlete.

Fick's name litters the Evansville record book, as he ranks second in career RBI, is tied for second on the career home run list and ranks third in career batting average. His 2011 season was one of the best ever by UE player, as he finished his senior campaign with a .406 batting average, 21 doubles and 71 RBI. His .406 average ranks third on the UE single-season batting average list, while his 71 RBI are second on the single-season list. In 2010, Fick belted 19 homers, a mark that stands as the second most by a Purple Ace in a single season.

A native of Rich Fountain, Mo., Fick graduated from the University of Evansville in 2011 with a degree in Exercise Science, and he resides in Evansville with his wife, Shana.

Mahon is in his fourth year as an assistant baseball coach at UE Athletics.

He was named an assistant coach on June 22, 2015. Mahon was a four-year starter for the Purple Aces from 2011-14 and served as the team's volunteer assistant coach for the 2015 campaign.

In his time with the Aces, he's helped guide the program to new heights offensively, highlighted in 2016 by an offense that slugged 51 home runs, which was the most for a UE team since the NCAA introduced new bat standards in 2011. Every UE player with an official at-bat homered in 2016, and the total of 13 players with a four-bagger was the most for a UE squad since 2001. Three players (Trey Hair, Korbin Williams and Jonathan Ramon) logged 10 homers apiece, tying for the most home runs for an individual UE hitter since Cody Fick hit 19 in 2010.

Hair, Boomer Synek and Josh Jyawook were all named to an all-conference team at the end of the season.

In 2015, he helped coach Kevin Kaczmarek to the highest batting average in the NCAA (.465). He'd earn All-America honors as well as the Joe Carter MVC Player of the Year award.

During his playing days at UE, Mahon saw time at catcher, first base, third base and designated hitter. He posted a .274 career batting average with 29 doubles, 105 runs batted in and a .389 on-base percentage. Mahon hit a career-best .322 during his junior year in 2013. He ended his career in 2014 with a .295 senior season with 35 runs driven in. Mahon was also an All-Missouri Valley Conference First Team selection in 2014.

A native of Plain City, Ohio, Mahon graduated from the University of Evansville in 2014.

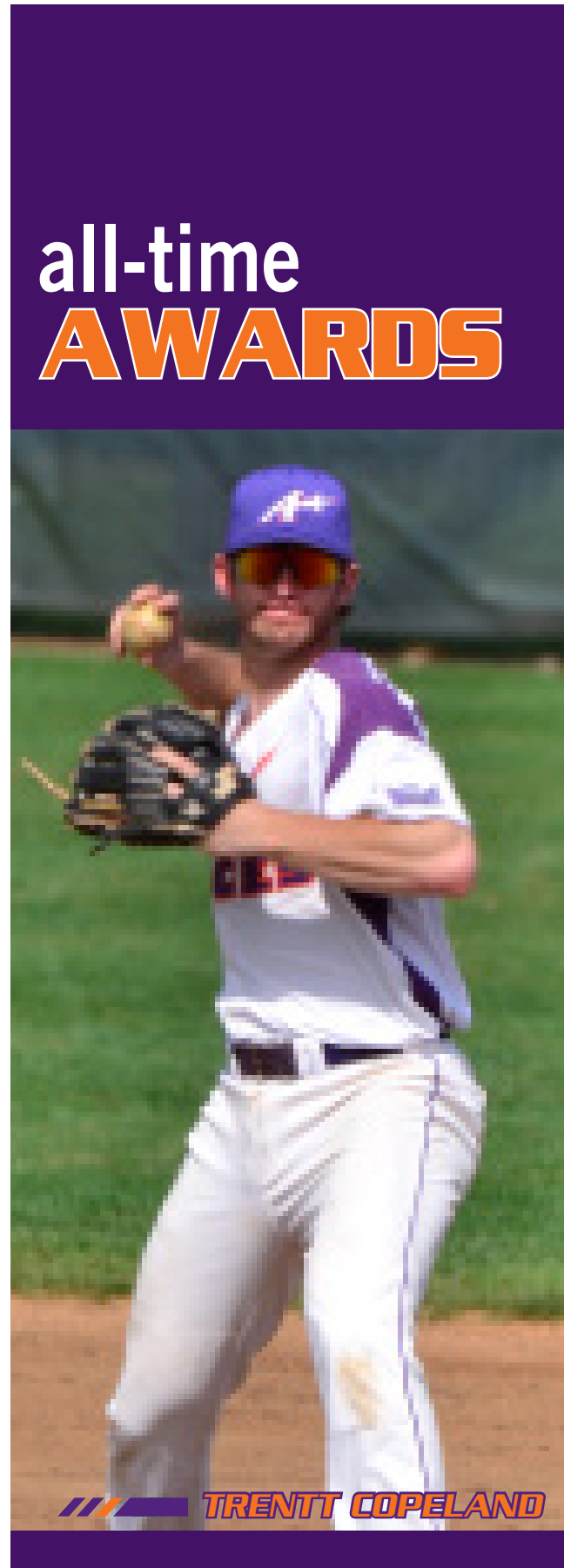

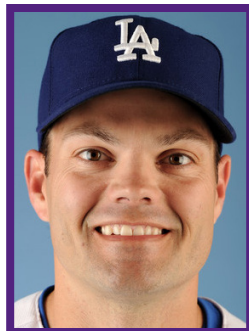

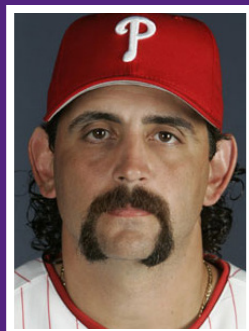
ANDY BENES

A 14-year MLB veteran, Andy Benes ranks as one of the most successful UE athletes of all-time. The 1988 No. 1 overall pick in the MLB draft, Benes was 1993 all-star while pitching for the San Diego Padres. An Evansville native, Benes ended his career with 155 victories on the mound with a 3.97 earned run average and 2,000 strikeouts.



JAMEY CARROLL

A 12-year MLB veteran and the brother of current UE head coach Wes Carroll, Jamey Carroll left UE after being drafted by the Montreal Expos in 1996. He would eventually debut with the Expos in 2002 before becoming a valuable infield cog to a number of MLB teams. Carroll finished his career as a .272 batter with 1,000 career hits and 560 runs scored.



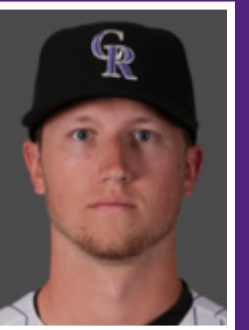
SAL FASANO

After being selected in the 37th round of the 1993 draft, Sal Fasano would make his first appearance in the big leagues in 1996 with the Kansas City Royals. He would go on to be an 11-year pro with nine different clubs, primarily in the American League. He logged 245 hits in his career, scoring 136 times and knocking in another 140.



ROB MAURER

Another star of the 1988 Aces squad, Rob Maurer was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Texas Rangers. He'd ultimately make his debut with the big club during the 1991 season, appearing in 13 games with a double and a pair of RBI. His major league career would end a year later with a pair of hits and a score.



KYLE FREELAND

One just three UE players to be selected in the first round of the MLB Draft, 2014 consensus All-American Kyle Freeland was selected eighth overall by his hometown Colorado Rockies. Ranked as high as the No. 6 prospect in the Colorado system, the southpaw broke through to the Majors after a meteoric rise through the minors, making his big league debut in April of 2017. Freeland went 11-11, with a 4.14 ERA, racking up 107 strikeouts, while making 28 starts.





ERIC STAMETS

One of the best defensive shortstops to ever step foot at Braun Stadium, Eric Stamets heard his name called in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft. The Dublin, Ohio, native is a former UE All-American and took home the Missouri Valley's Defensive Player of the Year award in 2012. Originally a member of the Angels organization, Stamets spent last season with Cleveland's Triple-A Columbus Clippers and was an invitee to the Indians spring training camp.



KYLE LLOYD

After earning an all-conference nod for the second consecutive season, Kyle Lloyd was selected by the San Diego Padres in the 29th round of the 2013 MLB Draft. The Sacramento, Calif., native posted a 2.59 ERA over a team-best 94 innings in his final season with the Aces. Last year, Lloyd made his Major League debut in a spot start for the Padres, going four innings while striking out a pair.



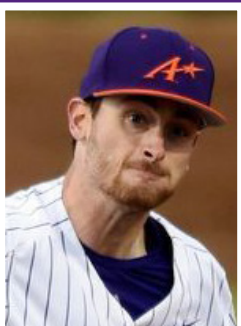
TREY HAIR

After two seasons in the Aces program, the sweet-swinging infielder was taken in the 34th round of the Major League Baseball Draft as Trey Hair by the Tampa Bay Rays. A native of Firth, Neb., Hair was a 2-time All-Missouri Valley Conference Second Team selection in his two seasons with the Aces. As a senior in 2017, Hair batted .297 while leading the team in runs (37), RBI (43), walks (37) and doubles (21). His 21 doubles ranked third in the MVC.



KEVIN KACZMARSKI

After a 2015 season that saw him log an NCAA-best .465 batting average, the New York Mets selected Kevin Kaczmariski in the ninth round of the 2015 draft. A four-time all-conference honoree, Kaczmariski finished the 2016 season with the Advanced-A St. Lucie Mets. A native of Cary, Ill., he made the jump up to Double-A, playing for Binghamton, where he batted .274, with 18 doubles, 5 home runs and 52 RBIs.



CONNOR STRAIN

The senior right-hand pitcher was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 9th round of the 2017 Major League Baseball Draft. Strain was the 280th overall pick in the draft. The fifth-year senior recorded a 2-5 record in 2017, but put up stellar numbers. He posted an impressive 2.62 ERA in 14 starts. Strain fanned 68 batters in just over 68 innings of work.

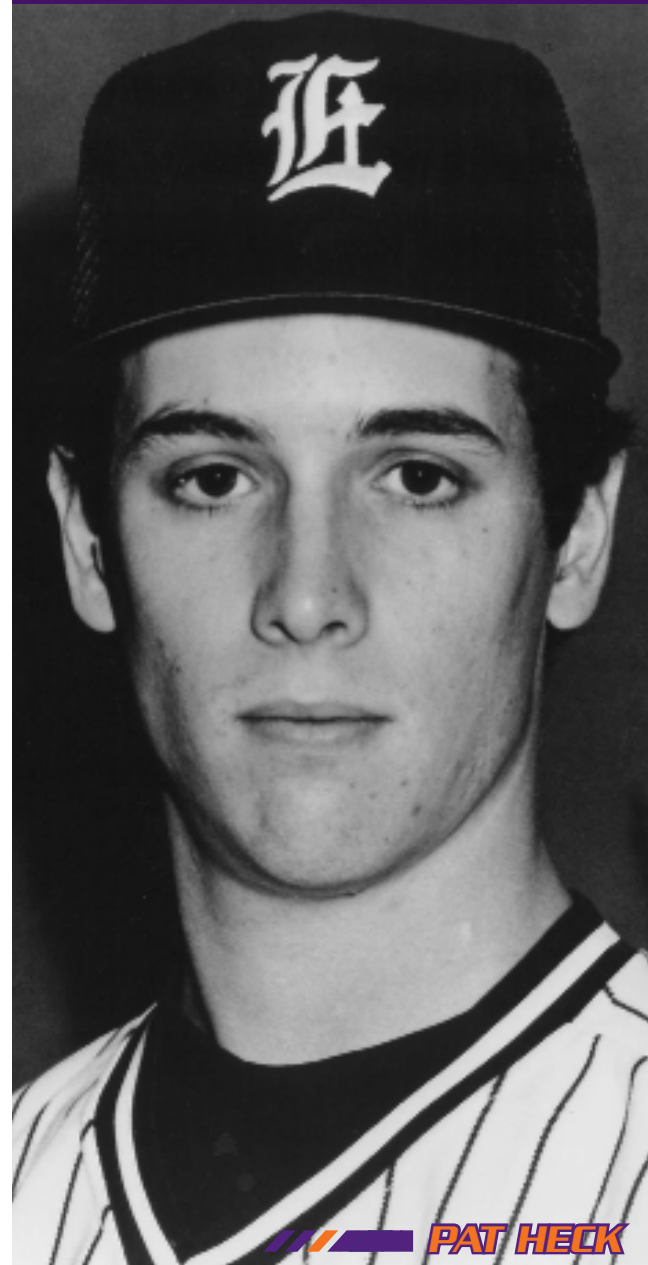

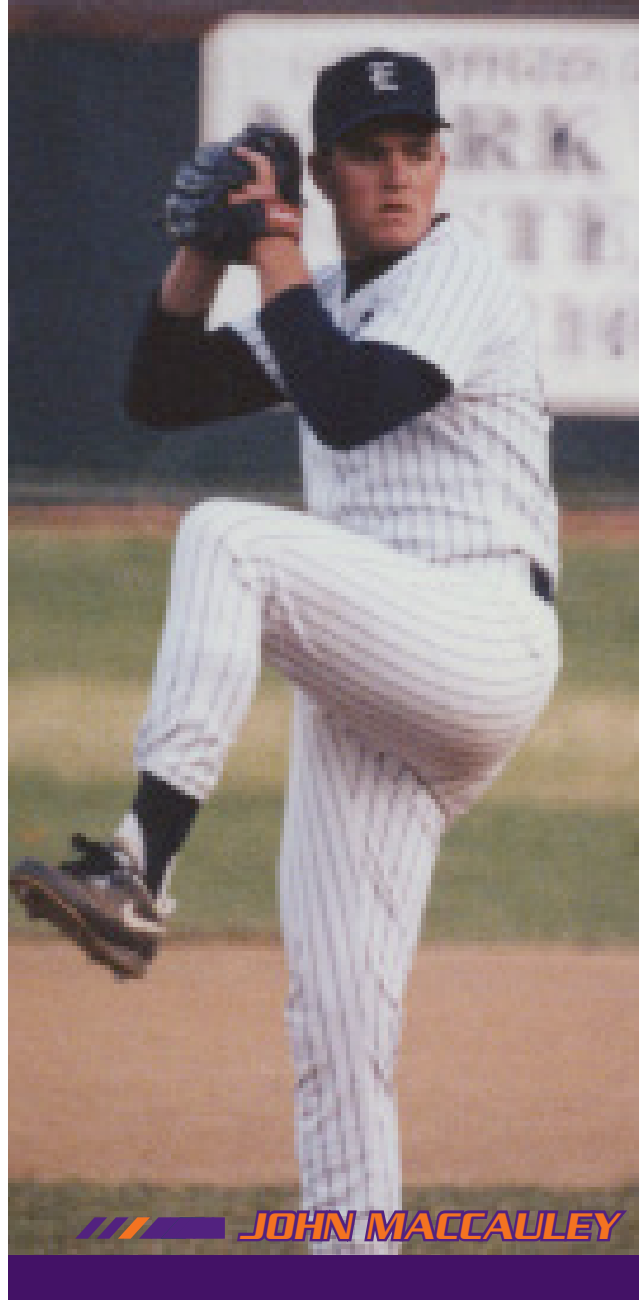
