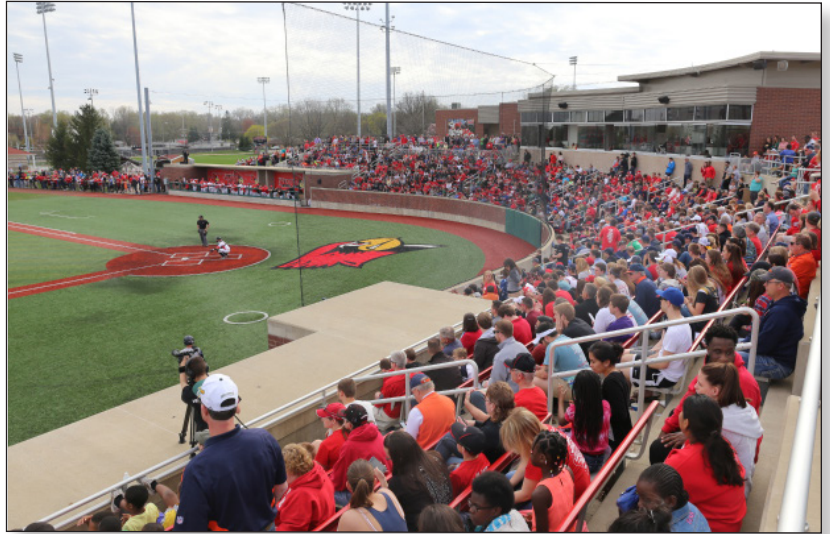

DUFFY BASS FIELD

Duffy Bass Field – the home of Redbird baseball – features a gated complex with seating for over 1,500 spectators, concessions, restrooms, team dugouts and a state-of-the-art press box, making it one of the premier college baseball facilities in the Midwest. Prior to the 2009 season, the facility underwent a \$3.2 million renovation, and in 2010, a new energy efficient LED scoreboard was installed beyond the right-field wall.



Located in the northwest corner of Illinois State's athletics complex, Duffy Bass Field was dedicated on May 2, 2009, in honor of legendary ISU baseball coach Duffy Bass. The field is expertly designed and professionally maintained, and has been recognized as one of the top playing surfaces in college baseball. The Professional Grounds Management Society presented the "Honor Award" to ISU's baseball facility in 1992 and 2003 for recognition of grounds maintained with a high degree of excellence. The Redbird baseball team also enjoys a recently renovated locker room inside of Horton Field House.

Prior to the 2013 season, the Illinois State athletics department added a new playing surface to Duffy Bass Field. The infield was retrofitted with a FieldTurf surface and the outfield received improved drainage and was re-sodded. Illinois State hosted the 2013 Missouri Valley Conference Championship for the first time in school history.



DUFFY BASS FIELD MEMORABLE MOMENTS

APRIL 14, 2015 • ILLINOIS 7, ILLINOIS STATE 3

In Illinois State's annual "Stuff the Duff" game, a Duffy Bass Field-record 1,977 fans came out to see the Redbirds against a nationally-ranked Illinois team. After holding a lead as late as the seventh inning, the Illini prevailed, by a 7-3 score.



MAY 21, 2013 • ILLINOIS STATE 11, BRADLEY 1 (8 INNINGS)

Just days after winning the Missouri Valley Conference outright for the first time in school history, the Redbirds returned to Duffy Bass Field to host the Missouri Valley Conference Championship for the first time. As the top-seeded team, Illinois State trumped MVC-rival Bradley, 11-1, in an eight-inning, run-ruled game, before a near-capacity crowd at Duffy Bass Field. Illinois State would win twice more during the week to advance to the championship game versus Wichita State.

MAY 2, 2009 • CREIGHTON 12, ILLINOIS STATE 2

After undergoing a \$3.2 million dollar renovation, featuring a gated complex with seating for over 1,500 spectators, concessions, restrooms, team dugouts and a state-of-the-art press box, the Illinois State Athletics Department officially dedicated the new stadium at Duffy Bass Field prior to ISU's game against MVC-foe Creighton. The facility was renamed from Redbird Field in honor of the late Duffy Bass, who coached Illinois State to more than 700 wins and the 1969 College Division National Championship.

MARCH 20, 2009 • ILLINOIS STATE 3, EVANSVILLE 2

In the first-ever game played at the newly renovated Duffy Bass Field, **Corey Maines** (above) hit a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 10th inning and lifted Illinois State to a 3-2, Missouri Valley Conference-opening win over Evansville. Maines helped the Redbirds christen the ballpark with a leadoff home run to left field. Maines, whose primary role was as a starting pitcher, went on to become the winningest pitcher in Redbird history, with 24 career victories.

MARCH 20, 2007 • ILLINOIS STATE 5, VALPARAISO 1

Former Illinois State head coach Jim Brownlee earned his 800th career-win after the Redbirds defeated Valparaiso, 5-1, in the home opener. Brownlee, who played for the 1969 College Division National Championship team, became the fourth coach in Valley history to surpass 800 wins.

MAY 11, 1988 • NORTHWESTERN 15, ILLINOIS STATE 2

Legendary Illinois State head coach **Duffy Bass** (right) coached his final home game at Redbird Field, losing to Northwestern, 15-2. Bass, who coached from 1964-88, finished his career with a 713-457-18 record. Upon retirement, Bass was the winningest coach in Redbird history; however, he has since been surpassed by current softball coach Melinda Fischer.

APRIL 9, 1988 • ILLINOIS STATE 5, SOUTHERN ILLINOIS 2

In the first game played at the new Redbird Field, Illinois State beat Southern Illinois, 5-2. Dan Freed earned the victory and Don King drove in the game-winning run. The home opener was the first game for the Redbirds in 26 days because of multiple rain-outs. Redbird Field, the program's first-ever field with lights, was constructed on the site of University High School's former field. The original Redbird Field was located on the present site of Redbird Arena.





The Missouri Valley Conference, the nation's second-oldest NCAA Division I conference, continues to be a leader in college athletics and is one of the nation's most progressive conferences, celebrating its 111th season in 2017-18. League members have worked together to focus on common goals and objectives, placing a high value on league harmony, while continuing to invest in athletic programs to compete at the highest level.

The Valley brand remains very strong, both regionally and nationally, and the great athletic tradition of The Valley remains a compelling force in recruiting student-athletes and in marketing all the MVC programs.

In baseball, for the 23rd time in league history, multiple MVC baseball teams earned NCAA bids as MVC tournament winner. DBU was joined by regular season champion and at-large selection Missouri State. The Bears reached the Super Regional of the NCAA Championship, falling at TCU. A total of 24 MVC players were taken in the 2017 MLB Draft, the most for the league since 2007.

Meanwhile, the success of The Valley television package is one of the great stories in the league. The MVC Television Network has blossomed into a revenue-generating vehicle and The Valley's most visible marketing tool. Also, The Valley continues to be proactive in upgrading the production and marketing of both institutionally-produced and Conference-produced events.

The summer of 2015 yielded two major announcements on the TV front, as ESPN and the Missouri Valley Conference announced a 10-year extension to their current media rights agreement that will provide increased coverage of Conference events across ESPN

platforms through 2023-24. As part of the deal – which continues a business relationship that began in 1986 – ESPN, the Missouri Valley Conference and its 10 member institutions will work jointly to develop in-house production capabilities at each campus that will provide significant national coverage for multiple sports on ESPN3 and hands-on educational opportunities for students. As a result, ESPN3 will showcase a minimum of 820 events a year in the final six years of the agreement on the league's co-branded network.

Additionally, CBS Sports and the MVC are in a multi-year agreement to televise Valley basketball games on the CBS Television Network and CBS Sports Network. The deal, which begins this season and continues through 2019-20, is through a sublicense agreement with ESPN. CBS Sports has televised the men's basketball tournament final since 2006.

The seeds for the creation of the Conference were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions, who met at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on Jan. 12, 1907. The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association were Washington University of St. Louis, and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting, two more schools -- Drake University and Iowa State College -- were admitted.

Today, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track & field, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball. League members include Bradley, Drake, Evansville, Illinois State, Indiana State, Loyola Chicago, Missouri State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso. Central Arkansas is an affiliate member in men's soccer; Dallas Baptist is an affiliate member for baseball; Arkansas-Little Rock is an affiliate member in women's swimming and diving; and Stony Brook competes as an affiliate member in women's tennis.

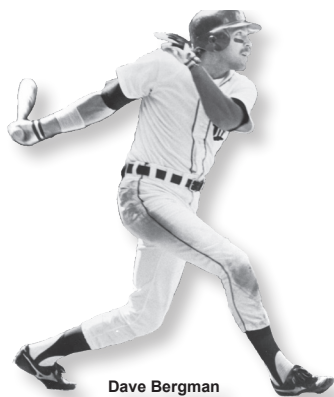

Bo DURKAC

Head Coach

Bo Durkac will begin his fourth season as Illinois State's head coach, and ninth season as a member of the Illinois State coaching staff, in 2018.

Illinois State has consistently ranked among the Missouri Valley Conference's top offensive teams during Durkac's tenure, and 16 student-athletes to play under Durkac have been selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Most recently, Durkac led Illinois State to the title game of the 2017 MVC Tournament. Though the Redbirds' final record stood at just 16-40, Illinois State was the only league team to defeat regular-season champion Missouri State and single-handedly eliminated the nationally-ranked Bears from the conference tournament with two victories over the NCAA Super Regional-bound foe. In the MVC Tournament's title game, Illinois State scored three runs in the bottom of the eighth inning to tie the game, but Dallas Baptist rallied in the ninth to secure the league's automatic NCAA Tournament berth.

The 2016 Redbirds posted a record of 17-37. The season was highlighted by three wins over Big Ten opponents, as well as Illinois State's first victory over a top-10 nationally-ranked opponent in nearly nine years. An Illinois State player was also selected in the MLB Draft for the seventh-consecutive season.

In 2015, the Redbirds ranked among the top three teams in the Valley in batting average (.277), on-base percentage (.378), slugging percentage (.406), home runs (45) and walks (267) as the Redbirds posted an even 27-27 record. The Redbirds earned their first win over a nationally-ranked opponent in over eight years and two players from the 2015 team were selected in the MLB Draft, while another signed a rookie free-agent contract.

In his final season as associate head coach in 2014, Durkac helped guide the Redbirds to their second-straight appearance in the Missouri Valley Conference Championship's title game, after ISU finished the regular season in fifth place in the league standings. After the season, a school-record six players were taken in the MLB Draft.

In 2013, Durkac helped the Redbirds to one of the most successful regular seasons in school history, as the team won 39 games and its first outright MVC title in school history. Additionally, five position players were named All-MVC First-Team selections and four players were drafted.

Under Durkac's guidance, the 2012 Illinois State offense was one of the most potent in NCAA Division I baseball. The offense averaged 6.9 runs per game, ranking 12th nationally, and led the MVC in batting average (.297) and on-base percentage (.386), while finishing second in slugging percentage (.426).

Durkac helped the 2011 Redbirds win 36 games, as the squad posted a .271 batting average and an MVC-leading .409 slugging percentage and .385 on-base percentage. ISU also hit 39 home runs, which ranked second in the league.

In his first season at Illinois State in 2010, Durkac oversaw a team that hit .293, as the Redbirds earned a share of the MVC regular-season title for the first time in school history, and won their first MVC Tournament title since 1994.

Prior to his time at Illinois State, Durkac spent seven years at Charlotte, where he was the hitting instructor, worked with infielders and assisted in recruiting. Durkac helped the 49ers steadily improve their offensive output each season during his time on staff, with the



2008 team setting a school record with a .333 batting average.

In all, Durkac coached or recruited 36 all-conference selections, three All-Americans and three freshman All-America selections at Charlotte, and helped the team to a 232-153-1 (.604) overall record from 2003-09.

The 2008 team's .333 batting average ranked 11th in the country, and the 2009 team's .322 mark ranked among the top 50 teams in the nation. In 2008, the 49ers recorded their second-highest hit total in a single season (720), giving the team over 700 hits in back-to-back seasons for the first time in school history. Charlotte registered over 100 doubles in 2009, tying the school record at six-straight seasons over the century mark, set from 1995-2000. In 2007, the 49ers set the team record for triples in a season (33) and saw an increase in hits, runs, RBIs and home runs. The 2007 squad played the best defense in school history, with a .966 fielding percentage, a mark that was repeated in 2008.

Before joining the coaching ranks, Durkac played seven years of professional baseball. He finished his professional career with the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2001, after playing for Sonoma County in the Western Baseball League that summer, and the Taichung Agan of the Taiwan Major Leagues during the spring. Before playing in Taiwan, he played three seasons in the Western Baseball League for the Chico Heat, and was named a Western League All-Star in 1999. That fall, he played for Team USA in the XIV International Cup in Sydney, Australia.



Durkac spent the 1996 and 1997 seasons in affiliated Minor League Baseball. In 1996, he hit .298/.393/.397 for the Visalia Oaks, a Detroit Tigers affiliate, in the Class A-Advanced California League. He spent the 1997 season with the High Desert Mavericks, an Arizona Diamondbacks affiliate, batting .282/.361/.398. In 1995, he split his first pro season between the independent Adirondack Lumberjacks of the Northeast League and the Will County Claws of the North Central League, before earning an affiliated contract.

Prior to his professional career, Durkac was a two-time All-Metro Conference third baseman at Virginia Tech. During his three seasons with the Hokies, he hit .360 with a school-record 60 doubles. A reliable infielder, Durkac played all but two innings in his final two collegiate seasons. In 1993, he was the Metro Conference Newcomer of the Year as he led the conference in hitting with a .423 batting average.

The Kittanning, Pennsylvania, native graduated with a liberal arts and sciences degree from Virginia Tech in 1995. He has authored two books on baseball: "2001: A Baseball Odyssey" and "How to Become a Professional Baseball Player." He also contributed a semimonthly column for Baseball America's website for two years.

Durkac and his wife, Heather, reside in Normal with their son, Gabe, and daughter, Dylan.

Mike Stalowy begins his fourth season as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at his alma mater in 2017-18.

A former member of the Illinois State baseball team, Stalowy served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Bellarmine University from 2012-13, where he helped the team to a conference title and a regional final appearance. In 2014, he served as the top assistant at Valparaiso.

Stalowy was a four-year member of the Redbird baseball team from 2006-09, and he served as a student assistant coach in 2010. A utility player throughout his playing career, Stalowy played six different defensive positions, encompassing all four infield spots and both corner outfield positions. He recorded a career batting average of .296 in 178 games as a Redbird. As a senior, he led the team in batting average (.328), hits (60), runs (41), doubles (15), triples (4) and stolen bases (12).

As a student assistant in 2010, Stalowy helped the Redbirds to Missouri Valley Conference regular-season and tournament titles.

Stalowy earned his bachelor's degree in parks and recreation administration from Illinois State in 2010.

Kellar came to Illinois State from Siena, where he had served as an assistant coach for three seasons, including the last two as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator.

Kellar starred at Niagara from 2008-09, and was a team captain and All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference selection as a senior, when he posted a 6-1 record against MAAC competition and a team-leading 3.56 ERA in league play. Kellar signed with the Evansville Otters of the Frontier League in 2010, but suffered a career-ending shoulder injury in spring training that year.
