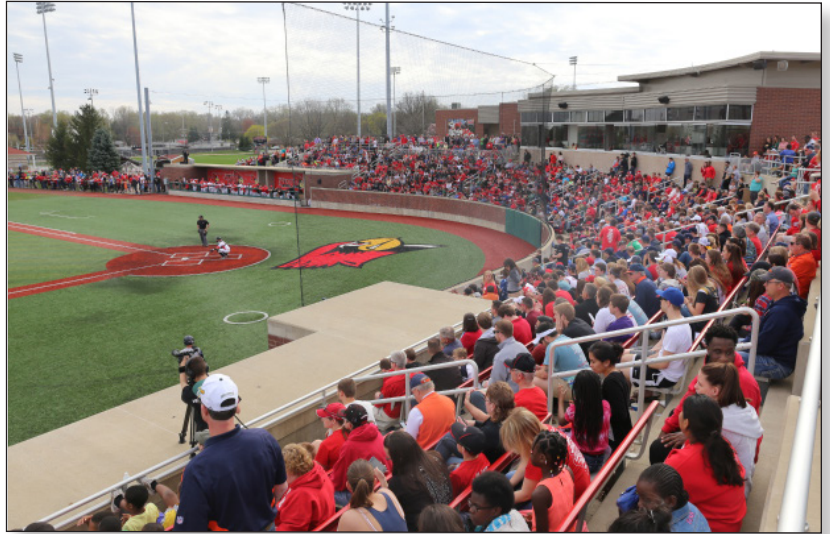

Duffy Bass Field – the home of Redbird baseball – features a gated complex with seating for over 1,500 spectators, concessions, restrooms, team dugouts and a state-of-the-art press box, making it one of the premier college baseball facilities in the Midwest. Prior to the 2009 season, the facility underwent a \$3.2 million renovation, and in 2010, a new energy efficient LED scoreboard was installed beyond the right-field wall.



Located in the northwest corner of Illinois State's athletics complex, Duffy Bass Field was dedicated on May 2, 2009, in honor of legendary ISU baseball coach Duffy Bass. The field is expertly designed and professionally maintained, and has been recognized as one of the top playing surfaces in college baseball. The Professional Grounds Management Society presented the "Honor Award" to ISU's baseball facility in 1992 and 2003 for recognition of grounds maintained with a high degree of excellence. The Redbird baseball team also enjoys a recently renovated locker room inside of Horton Field House.

Prior to the 2013 season, the Illinois State athletics department added a new playing surface to Duffy Bass Field. The infield was retrofitted with a FieldTurf surface and the outfield received improved drainage and was re-sodded. Illinois State hosted the 2013 Missouri Valley Conference Championship for the first time in school history.



## DUFFY BASS FIELD MEMORABLE MOMENTS

### MAY 18, 2019 • ILLINOIS STATE 11, EVANSVILLE 4

For the first time since the 2013 season, first-year head coach Steve Holm led the Redbirds to a share of the Missouri Valley Conference regular season title after a sweep of Evansville at Duffy Bass Field. ISU finished the 2019 campaign with a 14-7 overall conference record, eventually earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament.

### APRIL 14, 2015 • ILLINOIS 7, ILLINOIS STATE 3

In Illinois State's annual "Stuff the Duff" game, a Duffy Bass Field-record 1,977 fans came out to see the Redbirds against a nationally-ranked Illinois team. After holding a lead as late as the seventh inning, the Illini prevailed, by a 7-3 score.

### MAY 21, 2013 • ILLINOIS STATE 11, BRADLEY 1 (8 INNINGS)

Just days after winning the Missouri Valley Conference outright for the first time in school history, the Redbirds returned to Duffy Bass Field to host the Missouri Valley Conference Championship for the first time. As the top-seeded team, Illinois State trumped MVC-rival Bradley, 11-1, in an eight-inning, run-ruled game, before a near-capacity crowd at Duffy Bass Field. Illinois State would win twice more during the week to advance to the championship game versus Wichita State.

### MAY 2, 2009 • CREIGHTON 12, ILLINOIS STATE 2

After undergoing a \$3.2 million dollar renovation, featuring a gated complex with seating for over 1,500 spectators, concessions, restrooms, team dugouts and a state-of-the-art press box, the Illinois State Athletics Department officially dedicated the new stadium at Duffy Bass Field prior to ISU's game against MVC-foe Creighton. The facility was renamed from Redbird Field in honor of the late Duffy Bass, who coached Illinois State to more than 700 wins and the 1969 College Division National Championship.

### MARCH 20, 2009 • ILLINOIS STATE 3, EVANSVILLE 2

In the first-ever game played at the newly renovated Duffy Bass Field, **Corey Maines** (above) hit a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 10th inning and lifted Illinois State to a 3-2, Missouri Valley Conference-opening win over Evansville. Maines helped the Redbirds christen the ballpark with a leadoff home run to left field. Maines, whose primary role was as a starting pitcher, went on to become the winningest pitcher in Redbird history, with 24 career victories.

### MARCH 20, 2007 • ILLINOIS STATE 5, VALPARAISO 1

Former Illinois State head coach Jim Brownlee earned his 800th career-win after the Redbirds defeated Valparaiso, 5-1, in the home opener. Brownlee, who played for the 1969 College Division National Championship team, became the fourth coach in Valley history to surpass 800 wins.

### MAY 11, 1988 • NORTHWESTERN 15, ILLINOIS STATE 2

Legendary Illinois State head coach **Duffy Bass** (right) coached his final home game at Redbird Field, losing to Northwestern, 15-2. Bass, who coached from 1964-88, finished his career with a 713-457-18 record. Upon retirement, Bass was the winningest coach in Redbird history; however, he has since been surpassed by current softball coach Melinda Fischer.

### APRIL 9, 1988 • ILLINOIS STATE 5, SOUTHERN ILLINOIS 2

In the first game played at the new Redbird Field, Illinois State beat Southern Illinois, 5-2. Dan Freed earned the victory and Don King drove in the game-winning run. The home opener was the first game for the Redbirds in 26 days because of multiple rain-outs. Redbird Field, the program's first-ever field with lights, was constructed on the site of University High School's former field. The original Redbird Field was located on the present site of Redbird Arena.





The Missouri Valley Conference, the nation's second-oldest NCAA Division I conference, continues to be a leader in college athletics and is one of the nation's most progressive conferences, celebrating its 113th season in 2019-20. League members have worked together to focus on common goals and objectives, placing a high value on league harmony, while continuing to invest in athletic programs to compete at the highest level.

The Valley brand remains very strong, both regionally and nationally, and the great athletic tradition of The Valley remains a compelling force in recruiting student-athletes and in marketing all the MVC programs.

In baseball, for the 23rd time in league history, multiple MVC baseball teams earned NCAA bids as MVC tournament winner DBU was joined by regular season champion and at-large selection Missouri State. The Bears reached the Super Regional of the NCAA Championship, falling at TCU. A total of 24 MVC players were taken in the 2017 MLB Draft, the most for the league since 2007.

Meanwhile, the success of The Valley television package is one of the great stories in the league. The MVC Television Network has blossomed into a revenue-generating vehicle and The Valley's most visible marketing tool. Also, The Valley continues to be proactive in upgrading the production and marketing of both institutionally-produced and Conference-produced events.

The summer of 2015 yielded two major announcements on the TV front, as ESPN and the Missouri Valley Conference announced a 10-year extension to their current media rights agreement that will provide increased coverage of Conference events across ESPN

platforms through 2023-24. As part of the deal – which continues a business relationship that began in 1986 – ESPN, the Missouri Valley Conference and its 10 member institutions will work jointly to develop in-house production capabilities at each campus that will provide significant national coverage for multiple sports on ESPN3 and hands-on educational opportunities for students. As a result, ESPN3 will showcase a minimum of 820 events a year in the final six years of the agreement on the league's co-branded network.

Additionally, CBS Sports and the MVC are in a multi-year agreement to televise Valley basketball games on the CBS Television Network and CBS Sports Network. The deal, which begins this season and continues through 2019-20, is through a sublicense agreement with ESPN. CBS Sports has televised the men's basketball tournament final since 2006.

The seeds for the creation of the Conference were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions, who met at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on Jan. 12, 1907. The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association were Washington University of St. Louis, and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting, two more schools -- Drake University and Iowa State College -- were admitted.

Today, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track & field, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball. League members include Bradley, Drake, Evansville, Illinois State, Indiana State, Loyola Chicago, Missouri State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso. Central Arkansas is an affiliate member in men's soccer; Dallas Baptist is an affiliate member for baseball; Arkansas-Little Rock is an affiliate member in women's swimming and diving; and Stony Brook competes as an affiliate member in women's tennis.

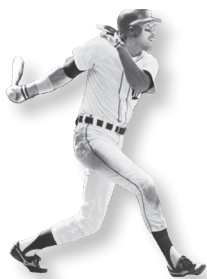

# STEVE HOLM

## Head Coach

### Second Season

### Oral Roberts '00



Head coach Steve Holm is entering his second season with the Redbird baseball program, after posting a 36-26 (14-7 MVC) record and earning a share of the Missouri Valley Conference regular season title in his debut 2019 season as head coach. The 36 wins was a 14-win improvement than the year prior and the most wins for an Illinois State team since winning 39 in 2013. It was also the most wins for a first-year Redbird baseball head coach in program history.

The 'Birds earned an at-large NCAA Tournament berth in 2019 and were placed in the Louisville regional, defeating both Big Ten regular season champions Indiana and No. 7 Louisville, before ultimately falling to Louisville in the first Illinois State appearance ever in a regional final. Louisville advanced to the Final Four of the College World Series where they were defeated by eventual champions No. 1 Vanderbilt, who ISU had also beaten earlier in the year in Nashville.

Holm was named MVC Coach of the Year for the 2019 season and the apparent turn-around of the Illinois State program. The Redbirds also collected the MVC Player of the Year (Joe Aeilts) and MVC Pitcher of the Year (Brent Headrick) awards as well.

At the conclusion of the 2019 season, five Redbirds heard their names called in the draft, including John Rave (Royals, 5th Round), Brent Headrick (Twins, 9th Round), Matt Walker (Tigers, 13th Round), Joe Aeilts (Rockies, 14th Round) and Jeff Lindgren (Marlins, 24th Round).



Prior to taking over the ISU program, Holm was a pitching coach at Purdue and an integral part of the staff that helped the Boilermakers improve by 28 wins over a two-year period and become a NCAA Regional participant in 2018.

Relief pitcher Ross Learnard was named a Third-Team All-American under Holm's tutelage in 2018, as the Boilermakers posted a 38-21 overall record (17-6 Big Ten) to finish second in the regular-season conference standings. Right-handed starter Tanner Andrews (Marlins, 10th Round) and catcher Nick Dalesandro (Diamondbacks, 10th Round) were both drafted following the season and six Boilermakers earned All-Big Ten honors.

In Holm's first season at Purdue in 2017, Learnard (NCBWA Second Team All-American) and Gareth Stroh (Third Team All-Big Ten) both garnered postseason honors while helping lead the Boilermakers to a 19-win improvement.

Learnard (0.58) eclipsed the team's minimum 30 innings ERA record that had stood since 1965 after having a consecutive

scoreless innings streak of 35 2/3. Stroh (90 1/3 IP, 1.30 WHIP) teamed with Andrews (8-4, .258 B/Avg.) to give Purdue its most consistent weekend rotation since 2012.

Dalton Parker's six saves eclipsed a team freshman record that had stood since 1993. Purdue's team totals for ERA (5.27 to 4.91), WHIP (1.61 to 1.43), batting average against (.295 to .265) and strikeouts per nine innings (5.8 to 6.7) all improved and its pitchers surrendered 57 fewer hits while throwing 22 more innings in 2017 vs. 2016.

Holm joined the Sacramento State coaching staff for the 2013 season and was promoted to associate head coach the following year. He helped the Hornets win 40 games and a pair of Western Athletic Conference titles

in 2014. Under Holm's guidance, the Hornets' team ERA dropped from 5.25 in 2012 to 3.63 during his first season and remained below 4.00 for three straight years. The 2015 pitching staff ranked third nationally in WHIP (1.09) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.07) while establishing school records for ERA (2.97) and batting average against (.235). Sacramento State won at least 30 games in

each of Holm's four seasons as an assistant coach, good for a combined mark of 137-103 (67-41 WAC). The 2014 team posted victories against Oregon State, Arizona State, Texas A&M and Fresno State on its way to a program-record 40 wins and its first NCAA Regional appearance.

Holm also worked with the catchers and infielders along with providing hitting instruction. The Hornets' 2016 MLB draft picks

included pitchers Tyler Beardsley and Sam Long as well as catcher Gunner Pollman. Numerous other Sacramento State players developed into MLB draftees after excelling under Holm's tutelage. That list was highlighted by three-time All-WAC honoree and all-time wins leader Brennan Leitao as well as all-time saves leader Sutter McLoughlin. Long and McLoughlin were both Freshman All-Americans to begin their collegiate careers. The Sacramento native was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 1997 MLB First-Year Player Draft after his senior season at McClatchy High School, but passed on that opportunity to start his collegiate career at American River Junior College. After two seasons, Holm made his way to Oral Roberts and became an All-American at shortstop, winning Mid-Continent

Conference Player and Newcomer of the Year honors in 2000 after batting a school-record .437. He was then drafted by the Giants in 2001 and made the transition to catcher in pro ball, where he played in over 700 games during his 12 pro seasons. He was part of the Giants' 2008 opening-day roster and also played in the big leagues in 2009 (Giants) and 2011 (Twins). Holm graduated in 2001 with a bachelor's degree

in recreation administration and was later inducted into the ORU Hall of Fame in 2014. In the fall of 2016, he was part of McClatchy High School's Hall of Fame class along with former teammate and longtime big leaguer Nick Johnson as well as their coach Brian Loforte. He and his wife, Lindsey, were married in the summer of 2013 and are the parents of two daughters, Annika and Hanna.





# WALLY CRANCER

Former Georgia Tech standout and Purdue assistant coach Wally Crancer begins his second season as the Redbirds' assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator.

At Purdue, Crancer served as the hitting coach and was tasked with the defensive instruction. The Boilermakers were the toughest team to strike out in the Big Ten during their 38-win season in 2018, and Crancer's work with the hitters and leading role in defensive alignments helped propel the Boilermakers to a 21-3 stretch during the second half of the season. It led to a No. 2 seed at the Chapel Hill Regional, just Purdue's third NCAA Tournament berth in program history.

Many of Crancer's recruits were also a big part of a 19-win improvement in 2017, which ranked as the greatest turnaround in program history. Sixteen newcomers saw action in 2017, as Purdue became just the second Big Ten team since 1988 to win 10 more games in league play than the previous year, returning to the conference tournament in the process.

Prior to heading to West Lafayette, Crancer spent two seasons at his alma mater on the Georgia Tech staff in 2012 and 2013. As an assistant, he worked primarily with the outfielders, assisted the hitting coach and served as the first base coach. Georgia Tech won the 2012 ACC Tournament and finished as a Regional runner-up to the site host in each of his two seasons on the coaching staff.

The Norco, California, native transferred to Georgia Tech, where he earned a bachelor's degree in 2007, after playing his first two college seasons at Riverside (Calif.) Community College. As a two-year starting outfielder at Georgia Tech, he batted .345 with 22 doubles, 14 home runs and 82 RBI in 90 career starts. In 2006, he helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a 50-win season. Following his collegiate career, Crancer was selected in the 12th round of the 2007 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft by the Baltimore Orioles.

Crancer and his wife Ashlee have two sons, Blake and Jaxson.





# TJ BENNETT

Illinois State baseball head coach Steve Holm announced the addition of TJ Bennett to the Redbird coaching staff in August 2019. Bennett brings six years of professional baseball experience as an infielder, most recently spending the 2019 season with the independent Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks where he was named an American Association All-Star.

An alum of the University of Utah, Bennett reached Triple-A in the San Francisco Giants organization in both 2016 and 2017, and was named the Giants' Organizational Defensive Player of the Year in 2016.

"I am extremely grateful for this opportunity to begin my coaching career at such a great university," said Bennett. "I have the utmost respect for Steve Holm and am looking forward to learning from and working with him and his staff. I have heard nothing but great things about the young men on this team and am excited to get started working with them. I hope to add to the already positive environment and winning mentality in place with the Redbird baseball program."

The Mesa, Arizona, native has played in several different levels of independent, affiliated, and foreign professional baseball throughout his career, including four seasons with the Brisbane Bandits of the Australian Baseball League. Bennett led the league in home runs during the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons and helped the Bandits to four ABL championships during his time abroad.

Bennett began his professional baseball career playing with the Frontier League's Gateway Grizzlies in 2014 and Schaumburg Boomers in 2015. He was signed by the San Francisco Giants in March of 2016 and spent the next two-and-a-half years playing on affiliated minor league teams within the Giants organization, including call-ups to the Triple-A Sacramento River Cats in both 2016 and 2017.

"We are pleased to welcome TJ to the Redbird baseball family," said Coach Holm. "I played for his father in the minor leagues when TJ was a little kid shagging flyballs in the outfield. I have watched him grow as a person and as a player ever since. He has gone on to have a quality career as a player, reaching as high as Triple-A. When he expressed to me that he felt it was time to hang up his spikes and start helping out the next generation of baseball players, I knew we had to add him to our team."

Bennett began his collegiate career at Oral Roberts where he was named All-Summit League second team and a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American during the 2011 campaign. He spent his sophomore season at Mesa Community College, earning all-region honors while posting a .331 batting average over 52 games. He finished his final two seasons at Utah, where he slashed .258 in a combined 94 games played.

Ross Learnard is in his first season as the volunteer assistant coach at Illinois State, after serving as the director of baseball operations for the 2018-19 academic year. Learnard brings experience as a player to the baseball staff, as he pitched two seasons at Purdue University.

As a senior, Learnard earned a spot on the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Stopper of the Year Watch List, NCBWA Second Team Preseason All-American, Collegiate Baseball Third Team Preseason All-American, and Big Ten Pitcher of the Week (April 23).

During his junior season, Learnard earned NCBWA Second Team All-American and Academic All-Big Ten. He pitched in a team-high 27 games, all in relief, and was recognized as the team's Pitcher of the Year, as he put together a streak of 35.2 consecutive scoreless innings from March 11 to May 12, making 21 appearances during the streak. His 0.58 ERA established a new Purdue single season record (minimum 30 innings), eclipsing a benchmark that had stood since 1965. His 0.42 ERA in Big Ten play was also a new record (minimum 15 innings), and his 0.863 WHIP ranked second on the Purdue all-time single-season list.

Learnard pitched his first two collegiate seasons at Parkland College in Champaign, Illinois. At Parkland, he compiled an 8-1 record, with 59 strikeouts and 1.96 ERA as a sophomore. He was named the 2016 Parkland Male Student-Athlete of the Year and was on the dean's list all four semesters.

Learnard earned his bachelor's degree from Purdue in Agribusiness in 2018.

All interviews should be arranged through the Illinois State Athletics Communications Office. Players and coaches will be available for interviews throughout the week and at the conclusion of all games.
