THE GAME

After a long offseason of conditioning, lifting weights and mentally preparing for the upcoming season, the 2023 football season will officially get underway on Saturday, September 2, when Illinois State host Dayton at Hancock Stadium.

THE SERIES

Illinois State and Dayton will face off for the second time on the gridiron this weekend, with ISU leading the series 1-0. The Redbirds rolled to a 56-14 victory over the Flyers in the only other matchup between the two squads on September 1, 2012. In that contest, quarterback Matt Brown threw for three touchdowns, running backs Darrelynn Dunn and Cameron Hunt each amassed 100-plus rush yards and the Redbird defense allowed just 138 yards of total offense in the victory.

THE COACHES

Illinois State: Brock Spack (Purdue, 1983) is in his 15th season as the head coach at Illinois State (95-65). Spack guided the Redbirds to back-to-back shares of the MVFC title in 2014-15 and an appearance in the 2014 FCS Championship game. He has led the ISU to five playoff appearances overall and became the program's all-time wins leader in 2021.

Dayton: Trevor Andrews (Dayton, 1998) is in his first season as head coach at Dayton. Andrews was named Dayton's head football coach on Dec. 12, 2022, and brings 25 years of college coaching experience back to his alma mater. He returns to Dayton from Western Michigan, where he coached the Bronco linebackers for four seasons and prior to that, he was at William & Mary for 18 years.

REQUESTING CREDENTIALS

Credentials (game and parking) can be obtained by contacting the Athletics Communications Office, Campus Box 7130, Normal, IL, 61790-7130. Requests must be received by email at least two days prior to the game. Passes that are not mailed will be available at the Will Call table at Gate 5 approximately 60 minutes prior to kickoff.

PRACTICE PROCEDURES

Most practices are open to the media, but only the first hour is available to photographers/videographers. For all other media, it is recommended that an advance call be made to the athletics communications office to check on the status of practice for a particular day.

REGULAR-SEASON INTERVIEW POLICIES

- **Head Coach: Brock Spack** will do general interviews following practice Tuesday-Thursday on field or by phone or Zoom. All other requests for interviews must be submitted to the athletics communications office at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled interview.

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

- The University of Dayton is located in Dayton, Ohio, and has an enrollment of 11,770. The Flyers are members of the Pioneer Football League and play their home games at Welcome Stadium (11,000).
- UD was 8-3 overall in 2022, including 6-2 in the PFL, which tied for second place in the league.
- Dayton was picked to finish third in the Pioneer Football League for the fall 2023 season in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. Defending champion St. Thomas was picked as the favorite to win the 2023 PFL crown with 98 voting points and eight first-place votes. Davidson was next with 92 and two first-place votes. The Flyers were third (75), followed by San Diego (73, and the remaining first-place vote) and Butler (68).
- The 2023 season will be Dayton's first under new coach Trevor Andrews. Andrews, a Flyer alum who brings 25 years of college coaching experience back to the Hilltop, has a group of returnees that includes eight Flyers who earned All-Pioneer Football League honors last season – offensive tackle David Tkatch, defensive tackle Sam Schadek (who were named to the first team), linebacker Nathan Arthur (second team) and wideouts Luke Brenner, Sam Bubonics and Derek Williits, safety Cole Hildebrand and placekicker Sam Webster (all honorable mention).
- Four Flyers were named to the preseason all-conference team squad, including linebacker Nathan Arthur, safety Cole Hildebrand, defensive tackle Sam Schadek and offensive tackle David Tkatch.
- Placekicker Sam Webster has been named to the Watch List for the Fred Mitchell Award, which goes to the top kicking specialist at the FCS, NCAA Division II, Division III and NAIA levels.

LAST TIME VS. THE FLYERS (9/1/2012)

The No. 19 Illinois State Redbirds utilized a balanced offensive attack, and suffocating defensive effort, en route to a 56-14 season opening win over Dayton at Hancock Stadium. Senior quarterback Matt Brown threw for three touchdowns, running backs Darrelynn Dunn and Cameron Hunt each amassed 100-plus rush yards and the defense allowed just 138 yards of total offense in the victory. The 56-points scored by Illinois State was the most tallied in a Redbird home-opener since 2000, when ISU put up 75 points against West Virginia Tech on Aug. 21, 2000.

SUCCESS IN HOME OPENERS

The Redbirds have been very good at home under the leadership of head coach Brock Spack, especially in the home opener each season. ISU is 13-1 in the first game of the season at Hancock Stadium, which includes a home opening win over this year's opening opponent Dayton by a score of 56-14 in 2012.

SPACK NEARING THE CENTURY MARK

Heading into his 15th season at the helm of the Illinois State football program, Brock Spack is nearing a significant milestone in his coaching career. Already Illinois State's program wins record holder, Spack heads into the 2023 campaign five wins away from the century mark in his career. With an overall record of 95-65 (.593), Spack would become just the fourth head coach in Missouri Valley Conference history with 100 wins at a member school. With five more league victories, Spack would also move into a tie for third in MVFC history for most wins by a MVFC head coach.

FEELING THE PRESSURE

The Illinois State defense ranked No. 10 in the country in total defense (and second in the MVFC) in 2022 and much of that was due to the amount of success the Redbirds had had getting to the quarterback. ISU ranked No. 5 in the country in team sacks per game at 3.18 per contest. A total of 14 of those came from All-American and Buck Buchanan Award winner Zeke Vandenburg, who led the FCS in sacks and tackles for loss per game. The loss of Vandenburg to graduation will be a big hole to fill for the Redbird defense, however 10 players with significant playing time last year return from on the two-deep along with some talented transfers that will look to keep the Redbird defense one of the best in the country.

THE BROCK SPACK FILE

When **Brock Spack** was named the 20th head coach in Illinois State football history prior to the 2009 season, it also signaled the beginning of an entirely new belief system for Illinois State. Since that time, the Redbirds have posted 11 .500 or better campaigns, including a 13-2 record in 2014 on way to the FCS National Championship game. Spack guided the Redbirds to three-straight playoff appearances from 2014-16. With his win at Eastern Illinois in September of 2021, Spack became the program's all-time wins leader and he has the best winning percentage among coaches with more than one year at the helm.

TAKING OVER IN CONFERENCE PLAY

When quarterback Zack Annexstad took the reins of the Illinois State offense prior to the 2022 season beginning, he did so having been out of game action for quite a long time. With that came the expectation that he would have to knock off some rust in-game during the non-conference season to get ready for Valley Football play. That certainly seems to be what has happened for the Minnesota transfer, who threw just four touchdowns as compared to five interceptions in the first three games of the season. However, he rallied in conference play to complete 63 percent of his passes for nearly 1,100 yards with just two interceptions and seven touchdown passes. Even though his season was cut short due to injury, Annexstad's play at the end of the year gives the Redbird offensive momentum headed into 2023.

SENDING THE SENIORS OUT STRONG

It was certainly a string of ups and downs for the Redbirds in 2022, as a streak of five wins in six contests was followed by a three-game losing streak to even the team's record at 5-5 heading into the season finale against Western Illinois. However, the Redbirds rallied to send their seniors out on a high note with a victory over their in-state rival Leathernecks. With the win, the Redbirds finished with six wins and a winning record, marking the 11th time in the last 14 seasons under coach Brock Spack the Redbirds have finished with a .500 record or better.

DAN THE MAN

For a receiver who headed into the 2022 season as a walk on, Daniel Sobkowicz certainly opened some eyes with his performance during the 2022 campaign. Sobkowicz was consistent contributor in the Redbird passing game, leading the team with 377 yards receiving and three touchdowns while ranking second on the squad with 31 catches. Overall, he averaged 12.2 yards per catch on the year and heads into the 2023 season as the top returning target for quarterback Zack Annexstad.

LOCKDOWN SECONDARY

The Redbird defensive secondary was one of the question marks headed into the 2022 season, with losses from graduation, the transfer portal and young players coming back in key roles. With addition of three key transfers in the secondary and another year of experience for returning, the Redbird secondary became one of the best in the MVFC and country. The Redbirds finished the season ranked No. 5 in the country in passing yards allowed with 169.8 per game, which also ranked first in the MVFC. That group has also aided in ISU ranking No. 10 in the country in total defense, allowing just 318.5 yards per game, and No. 11 in scoring defense at 20.4 points per game to opponents on the season. With the loss of eight starters on defense headed into 2023, the secondary will once again be a strength for the Redbirds with safeties Dillon Gearhart and Keondre Jackson leading the charge.

THE STREAK CONTINUES

Redbird teams have been very successful in scoring on defense under the leadership of head coach Brock Spack. Thanks to a pair of pick six returns against Eastern Illinois, the Redbirds extended their streak to 14 seasons straight with at least one defensive score.

THE WRIGHT STUFF

When Redbird starting running back Cole Mueller was lost to injury early in the Wisconsin game, the rest of the ISU running back room knew it would need to step up to fill the void of the team's leading rusher from the year prior. Wenkers Wright got the message and took the lead against Valparaiso in the home opener, as he recorded the first of his three 100-plus yard rushing efforts on the season. He would go on to lead the team in rushing with 625 yards on 161 carries and was third on the team with a pair of rushing touchdowns as he earned MVFC All-Newcomer Team honors. When healthy he showed why he could be a true No. 1 back, as he ran for a career-high 180 yards in a win at Indiana State.

EIGHT REDBIRDS EARN PRESEASON HONORS

A total of eight Illinois State players were selected to the MVFC Preseason All-Conference team, as the Redbirds were picked seventh in the preseason poll voted on by league coaches, media, and sports information directors. Offensive tackle Hunter Zambrano, safety Dillon Gearhart and wide receiver/kick returner Jalen Carr were selected as MVFC preseason second-team picks, while running back Cole Mueller, safety Keondre Jackson, defensive tackle Josh Dinga, cornerback Jeff Bowens and Carr (as a return specialist) were named honorable mention selections.

SISKOWIC TO JOIN ILLINOIS STATE'S BEST ON HOMECOMING

One of Illinois State's football's best will take his place amongst the University's all-time greats in October, as former All-American linebacker Cameron Siskowic will be inducted as part of the 2023 ISU Athletics Percy Family Hall of Fame class during Homecoming festivities. Siskowic ended his career as a two-time All-American and was twice named a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award in 2005 and 2006, which is awarded to the top defensive player in FCS football. The 2006 MVFC Defensive Player of the Year, Siskowic was a three-year starter for the Redbirds and was a two-time All-MVFC selection. As a senior in 2006, he led the team with 140 tackles which ranked him No. 2 nationally and led the MVFC in total tackles for the second-straight season.

REDBIRD FOOTBALL TO AIR NATIONWIDE ON MARQUEE SPORTS NETWORK

Illinois State Football will continue to maintain its television footprint in the Chicago media market with a new four-game agreement between Redbird Sports Properties and Marquee Sports Network to broadcast ISU home games during the 2023 Redbird football season. All six contests will also be simulcast live on ESPN3/+ as part of the Missouri Valley Football Conference's broadcast agreement. Longtime television voice of Redbird football Kurt Pegler will once again serve as the play-by-play announcer, and he will be joined in the booth by former FCS All-American and NFL veteran Clay Harbor as analyst. Broadcasts will include the team's home opener against Dayton on September 2 (Noon), its annual Mid-America Classic contest against Dayton on September 2 (Noon), the October 7 matchup against defending FCS national champion South Dakota State (6:30 p.m.), the annual Homecoming contest against Indiana State (2 p.m.) on October 14 and home finale against Murray State on November 11 (11 a.m.). ISU's Family Weekend game against Lindenwood on September 23 (Noon) and the October 28 game against UNI (Noon) will be carried exclusively on ESPN3/+ as part of the Missouri Valley Football Conference's network package.

MEMORABLE MOMENTS IN HOME OPENERS

- **SEPT. 16, 1972 VS. NORTHERN IOWA**

The Redbirds sent the Lettermen's Day crowd home happy after scoring 10 points in the final 3:18 to defeat the Panthers by a score of 24-14.

- **SEPT. 5, 1981 VS. WESTERN ILLINOIS**

In his debut, freshman quarterback **John Coppens** threw for 138 yards with all 64 of Illinois State's offensive plays taped to his forearm, as the Redbirds defeated the Leathernecks by a score of 31-7.

- **SEPT. 12, 1987 VS. WESTERN MICHIGAN**

Illinois State freshman fullback **Vic Northern** made his Redbird debut with 129 yards on 20 carries, as the Redbirds defeated the Broncos by a final score of 20-6.

- **AUG. 31, 2000 VS. WEST VIRGINIA TECH**

Kevin Glenn completed 16-of-24 of his passes for 286 yards and four touchdowns to lead the No. 5 ranked Redbirds to a dominant 75-10 win. The 75 points scored set a Hancock Stadium record and the 65 point differential remains the widest margin of victory in school history.

- **SEPT. 2, 2010 VS. CENTRAL MISSOURI**

The Redbirds and the Mules combined to score 109 points, which set a school record for most combined points in a game. **Ashton Leggett** converted on a two-point conversion with 2:22 left in game to give the Redbirds the 55-54 victory in a game that was delayed an hour and 20 minutes due to lightning.
