Founded in 1857, Illinois State University was the first public university in the state and is one of the Midwest's oldest institutions of higher education. It is a residential university that emphasizes undergraduate study. Abraham Lincoln drew up the legal documents to establish the university.

The original name of the school was Illinois State Normal University, reflective of its primary mission as a teacher training institution (at that time called a normal school). In 1964, as the institution began expanding and moving toward a full liberal arts curriculum, its name was changed, first to Illinois State University at Normal, and then by 1968 to Illinois State University.

Teaching is at the root of Illinois State's heritage and that tradition grows through the efforts of the outstanding faculty in all six of Illinois State's colleges. More than 92 percent of Illinois State's classes are taught by full-time faculty, most of whom have the highest degree in their academic area.

Illinois State is located in the twin-city community of Bloomington-Normal, and is centrally located 137 miles southwest of Chicago, 164 miles northeast of St. Louis and 178 miles west of Indianapolis. Interstate highways 74, 55, and 39, U.S. Route 150, and Illinois Route 9 intersect in Bloomington-Normal, creating a transportation hub. An Amtrak passenger station is just two blocks from the University, and the local airport is served by five scheduled airlines, one charter air service and three rental car agencies.

- The fall 2024 enrollment was 21,546, including 19,107 undergraduate students and 2,439 graduate students.
- 92.6 percent of students from the state of Illinois.
- 30.5 percent of students from underrepresented backgrounds.
- 93% of our students receive financial aid.

- Illinois State welcomed 4,285 First Time in College (FTIC) students for the 2024-2025 academic year, its largest incoming class in the University's history.
- Illinois State is ranked among the top universities for return on investment. U.S. News & World Report recognized the University as one of the Best Value Schools in the nation, and Washington Monthly included the University on the Best Bang for the Buck list in the Midwest.
- Illinois State students complete their degrees on time. ISU's retention rate remains among the highest in the nation at over 81.3 percent, and our high graduation rate (66.3 percent) is well above the national average.
- Washington Monthly ranked the University in the top 106 out of all public national universities for the institution's contribution to the public good through social mobility, research, and public services. Illinois State made U.S. News & World Report's 2024 rankings of America's top public schools, at No. 112.
- The University's hometown ranks as one of the top 3 best college towns in America based on its affordability and safety, while its entertainment scene, community, and quality of life are listed as reasons it also ranks as one of the Best Places to Live in the United States.

- ▶ Premium seating options, including 500+ chair back club seats, 5,500 sq. ft. indoor club accessible to club seat holders, and seven suites
- ▶ State-of-the-art press level, with three radio operations booths
- ▶ Expanded ticket office to improve fan experience on game days
- ▶ Daktronics video board and sound system added in April 2014
- ▶ Redbirds are 50-18 at Hancock Stadium since the 2013 renovation

KAUFMAN FOOTBALL BUILDING

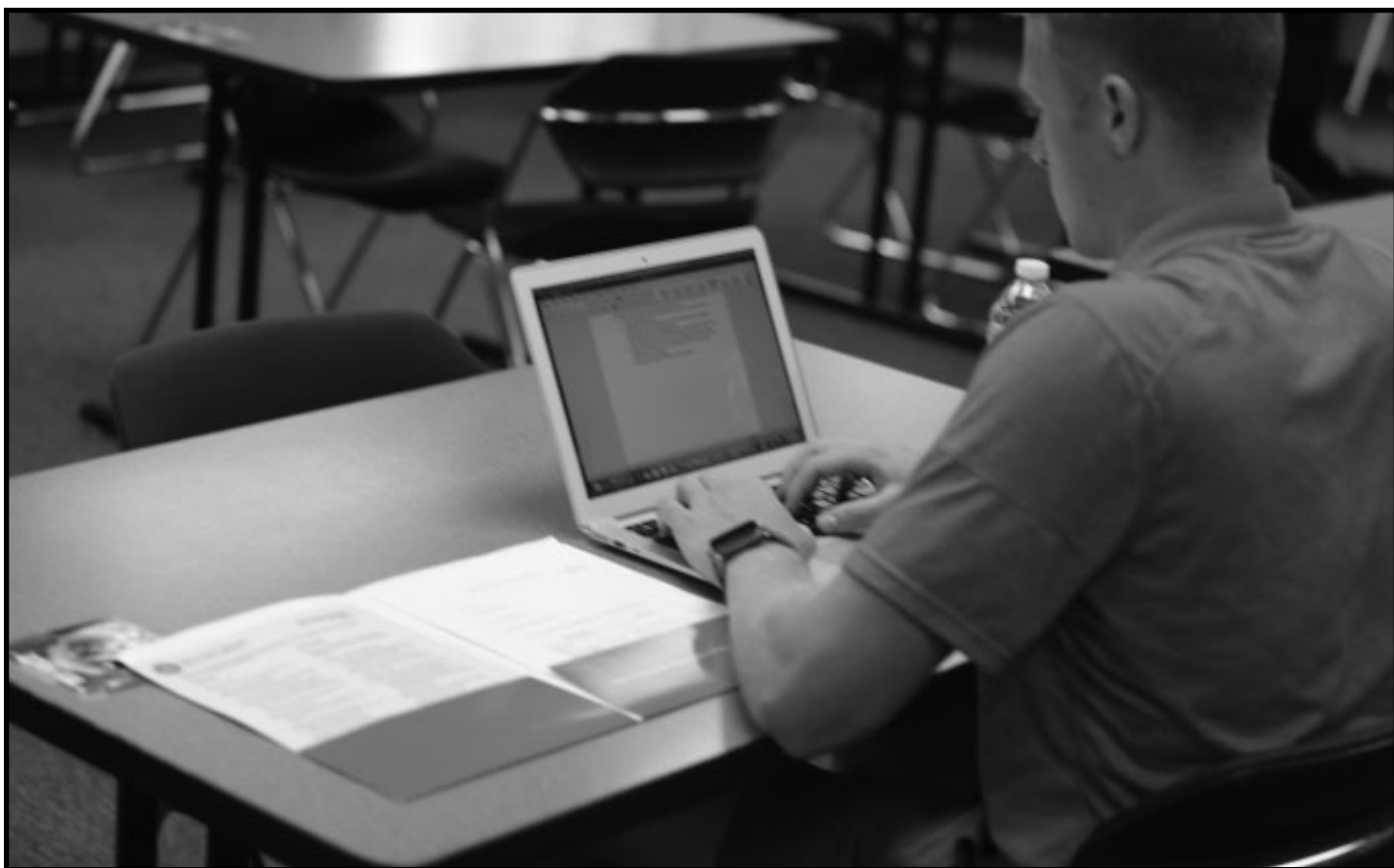
- ▶ Opened: August 2000
- ▶ Size: 16,000 square-feet
- ▶ Officially Dedicated: Nov. 11, 2000
- ▶ First Floor: Renovated locker room (2017), equipment room, training room, coaches' locker room and one of two main entrances from the west side
- ▶ Second Floor: Reception area, coaches offices, meeting rooms





OSF HEALTHCARE ATHLETICS TRAINING CENTER

- ▶ The facility is located on the site of the former football practice field directly north of Horton Field House
- ▶ The facility consists of a heated, dual-membrane fabric air dome with insulation pockets for planned year-round use
- ▶ The facility is 69 feet high, 393 feet long and 201 feet wide with LED lighting
- ▶ A 100-yard practice football field features a single end zone with run off areas and artificial turf to match the current surface at Hancock Stadium
- ▶ The facility is open to all Redbird teams as an indoor practice area and available to campus and community partners for rentals
- ▶ The \$11.5 million project was officially dedicated in September of 2023



KARIN L. BONE ATHLETICS STUDY CENTER

The Redbird academic support services staff understands the daily challenges student-athletes have to balance because many staff members are former college student-athletes and coaches themselves. With the unbridled support of Redbird coaches and athletics administrators, the academic support services staff helps student-athletes coordinate the demands they face athletically, academically, socially and personally.

Beyond their own care, concern and constant availability to help, the academic support staff's greatest asset is the comfortable, computerized Karin L. Bone Study Center. That's where programs like targeting, career development, community service projects, counseling and assistance for Redbird student-athletes from all 19 sports take place daily. People and programs not only contribute to an outstanding Redbird student-athlete graduation rate of more than 85 percent, but also prepares them to be leaders for a lifetime.

Illinois State's Karin Bone Athletics Study Center has been the model other universities have tried to copy. Redbird student-athletes continually rank above the national average for graduation rates, and generally graduate at a higher level than non-athletes at Illinois State. With very specific programs aimed at the unique needs of the student-athlete and an extremely dedicated staff, Illinois State provides one of the most comprehensive programs in the country.

ATHLETIC TRAINING

Injuries are inevitable in the game of football, but Illinois State football student-athletes know that if they suffer an unfortunate setback that they will be well taken care of by Associate Athletic Trainer Andrew Brubaker and his staff in the Kaufman Football Building training room.

Brubaker returned to Illinois State as the Associate Athletic Trainer for the football team in 2022, after serving as an assistant athletic trainer for one season at Lamar. His support staff includes Assistant Athletic Trainer Jackson Brunner, graduate assistant Maula Herring and eight student assistants.

The full-time staff members and graduate assistants not only serve the student-athletes at Illinois State, but also are an integral part of one of the best-known, fully-accredited athletics training education programs in the United States. Hundreds of current sports medicine professionals got their training at Illinois State.

Brubaker and his staff provide Illinois State football student-athletes with access to care and treatment second to none. The staff has access to consulting doctors and health care professionals on call in the community in virtually every area of sports medicine.

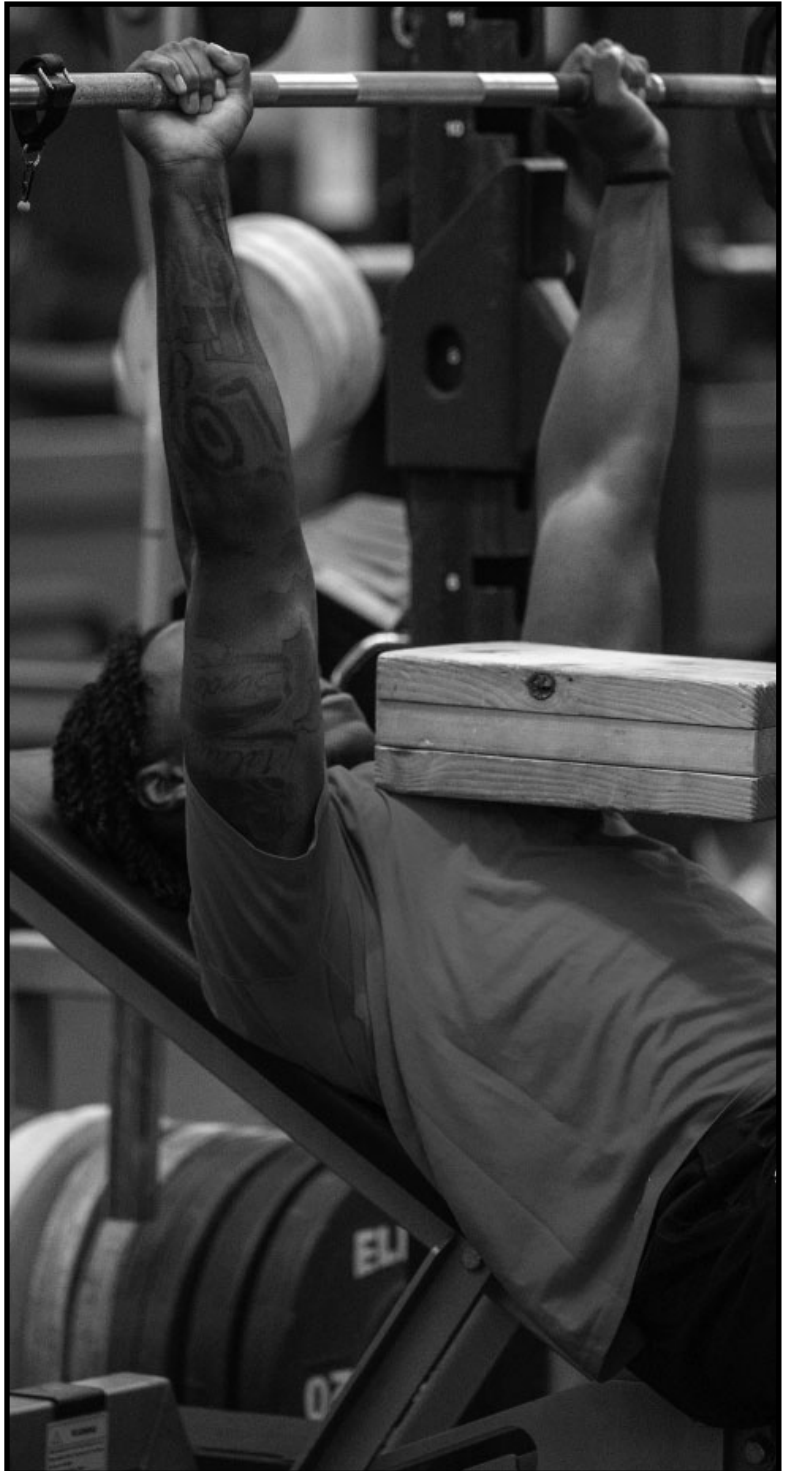




REDBIRD STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

- Founded in 1985, the Missouri Valley Football Conference has shaped itself into the nation's premier NCAA FCS conference. In May 2025, the MVFC President's Council approved a new governance structure that recognizes the strong partnership between key multi-sport conferences and positions the league for continued success as the dominant conference in the FCS.
- The agreement placed Jeff Jackson as the commissioner of the MVFC. Jackson has served as Commissioner of the Missouri Valley Conference (the all-sport league for five MVFC members) since July 1, 2021. The agreement further places Josh Fenton as the Executive Advisor for the MVFC. Fenton has served as Commissioner of The Summit League (the all-sport league for four MVFC members) since April of 2023. Notably, Kyle Grooms joined the football staff as Chief Operating Officer to further enhance MVFC leadership.
- There's not much that has eluded the Missouri Valley Football Conference in its first 40 seasons of competition. The league's first four decades have included national championships, national players of the year, national coaches of the year, No. 1 national rankings, and countless All-Americans. League member North Dakota State earned five-straight national championships from 2011-15, three-straight from 2017-19, and the league also has NCAA titles in 1997 (YSU), 2002 (WKU), 2021 (NDSU), 2022 (SDSU), 2023 (SDSU), and 2024 (NDSU). Indeed, all signs point to continued national prominence for the Missouri Valley Football Conference as it enters its 41st season in 2025.
- Since 2015, the MVFC has partnered with ESPN to distribute all league games on an ESPN platform (ESPN+ in 2024) and in August 2023, the Conference announced a multimedia rights extension with ESPN. The agreement features national linear and digital exposure for the Conference, beginning with the 2024 football season and extending through the 2029 season. In 2024, for the first time in the league's 40-year history, two regular-season Missouri Valley Football Conference home games were selected for national linear distribution.
- Last season, the MVFC extended its FCS-record to 14-straight title game appearances as NDSU defeated No. 1 seed Montana State in Frisco for the crown. Notably, the 2024 season marked the 20th title appearance for a league team. The league is 14-6 in title games, although Youngstown State (1991, 1992, 1993, 1994) and Southern Illinois (1983) both played in the championship prior to joining the league. All 20 of the league's title-game appearances have occurred since 1997.
- The MVFC is 107-48 (.690) since 2010 in the playoffs -- which includes 18 intra-conference games (meaning the league is 89-30 against teams from other leagues for a phenomenal .748 winning percentage).
- Counting last year, an MVFC member has reached the FCS semifinals 23 times in the past 14 seasons (and 37 times overall). The MVFC has had two semifinal teams eight times since 2014 (and three in 2024).
- The Missouri Valley Football Conference has an FCS-best 14 national championships and league members Youngstown State (3) and Southern Illinois (1) own additional titles prior to their league membership, meaning 18 FCS championship trophies (of 47 total previous championships) are housed on league campuses, in addition to six (Youngstown State on three separate occasions, UNI in 2005, Illinois State in 2014, South Dakota State in Spring 2021, and North Dakota State in 2022) runner-up finishes.

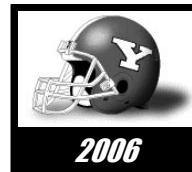

No. 15 Redbirds Advance, Beat No. 6 Appalachian State in OT

BOONE, N.C. - Shelby Harris' blocked extra-point attempt in overtime sealed No. 15 Illinois State's (9-3) thrilling 38-37 overtime victory over No. 6 Appalachian State (8-4) in second-round action of the FCS playoffs.

Tied 31-31 after regulation, ISU received the ball first and needed only one play to find the end zone in overtime. Quarterback Matt Brown connected with tight end James O'Shaughnessy on a 25-yard completion for the score. The Mountaineers also struck quickly, needing just four plays to answer the Redbird score. Jamal Jackson's four-yard toss to Andrew Peacock made it a one-point game, but Harris blocked Sam Martin's extra point, sealing the 38-37 overtime win.

Brown finished the game 20-for-32 for 322 yards and tied a career-high with five touchdowns passes. Senior wideout Tyrone Walker led the receivers with 10 catches for a season-best 176 yards and two touchdowns. O'Shaughnessy set career-highs with receptions (3), yards (47) and touchdown receptions (2).

Leading 14-10 at halftime, ISU went to the air to get on the board first in the second half. Brown connected with Donovan Harden on a 17-yard touchdown completion, making it 21-10 ISU with 7:33 to go in the third quarter.

The Mountaineers needed just five plays to respond. After missing on his first pass attempt, Jackson connected on his next four, including a 48-yard score to Malachi Jones. The Redbirds responded immediately, as Brown found Walker for a diving 32-yard touchdown catch in the end zone to give Illinois State a 28-17 lead.

After both teams exchanged punts, the Mountaineers had possession on the ISU 46-yard line. Jackson completed each of his pass attempts, including a 44-yard toss to Simms McElfresh that spotted the ball on the Redbirds one yard line. Two plays later, Rod Chisholm dove into the end zone for a one yard score, making it 28-24.

On the ensuing drive, Brown took to the ground and picked up 20 yards on the opening snap. Two plays later, Harden caught a 30-yard toss deep into Appalachian State territory, setting up a 41-yard field goal from Aussieker, making it 31-23.

Illinois State scored first on an eight-play, 83-yard drive that featured three third-and-long completions from Brown to Walker. Facing third-and-six Brown fired Walker, who dodged two defenders for a 41-yard touchdown play, making it 7-0.

The Mountaineers would tie the game on a 10-play, 69-yard drive that covered 3:46. Jackson threw for 31 yards over two plays, before diving into the end zone on a two-yard keeper to tie the game at 7-7 with 4:15 to go in the opening half.

After forcing a quick three-and-out, Appalachian State threatened and moved the ball into Illinois State territory. Facing fourth-and-one, Evan Frierson tallied the first sack of the game, giving ISU the ball back. Three plays later, Brown found O'Shaughnessy for a nine-yard score, making it 14-7 with 0:44 seconds to go. ASU netted a 37-yard field goal as time expired to make it 14-10 ISU at the break.

Redbirds End Season With Loss at Eastern Washington

CHENEY, Wash. - No. 15 Illinois State (9-4) tallied 520 yards of total offense, but could not erase a 21-point second half deficit, falling to second-seed Eastern Washington (11-2), 51-35, in the FCS quarterfinals in front of a sellout crowd at Roos Field in Cheney, Wash.

Trailing 38-17 with 11:01 to go in the third quarter, the Redbirds rallied for 18 points to cut the deficit to three at 38-35, but Kyle Padron's 76-yard touchdown pass to All-American receiver Brandon Kaufman stifled ISU's second-half rally and sealed the win for the Eagles.

Senior Matt Brown threw for 372 yards on 27-of-48 passing, with two touchdowns and two interceptions, while leading an Illinois State offense that tallied 520 yards of total offense. Tyrone Walker added nine catches for 148 yards with one touchdown and Lechein Neblett had six catches for 101 yards with one score.

Eastern Washington led 24-17 at halftime and added two quick third-quarter scores, as Padron connected with Kaufman on 47 and 17-yard touchdown passes to open the half.

With the Eagles leading 38-17, Clarke forced a Padron fumble, setting up a Nick Aussieker 26-yard field goal to make it 38-20 Eastern Washington. The Redbirds then rallied around a pair of three-and-outs, with Brown finding Neblett for a 22-yard touchdown and then rushing for a 13-yard score to make it 38-35 Eastern Washington with 13:55 to play. Padron then went to the air for the 76 yard touchdown pass to Kaufman to make it 44-35. The Eagles added a 10-yard touchdown pass to Ashton Clark to cap the scoring at 51-35.

Both teams exchanged scores in a fast-paced opening half, that saw points scored on the first six possessions of the game. Aussieker's 23-yard field goal gave ISU an early 3-0 lead, but Padron responded with a 44-yard touchdown pass to Daniel Johnson to give the Eagles a 7-3 advantage. Brown then completed a 40-yard strike to Walker for a 10-7 ISU advantage, before Jimmy Pavel's 20-yard field goal with 2:57 to play in the first quarter squared the game at 10-10.

Josh Burch's 72-yard kickoff return gave ISU field position deep in EWU territory. On third-and-goal from the three, Dunn carried the ball into the end zone for his 13th touchdown of the year, giving ISU at 17-10 lead with 14:29 to play in the opening half. Eastern Washington responded with a four-play, 21-yard drive capped by a Demitrus Bronson one-yard touchdown run to even the game at 17-17 in the second quarter.

The Eagles took advantage of a costly Illinois State turnover to score a touchdown in the closing seconds of the opening half. On third-and-long, Brown completed a pass to James O'Shaughnessy, who carried the ball into the Eastern Washington red zone, before fumbling the ball to the Eagles. Padron facilitated a 12-play, 79-yard drive, capped by a one yard pass to Zack Gehring to give the Eagles a 24-17 lead.

ISU Averages Lone Loss, Defeats UNI In Playoffs, 41-21

NORMAL, Ill. - In a dominating performance, Illinois State quarterback Tre Roberson threw for 382 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Redbirds to a second-round playoff victory against Northern Iowa, 41-21, Saturday afternoon at Hancock Stadium.

After losing to the Panthers on Nov. 1 at the UNI Dome, ISU got its revenge on the only team to defeat them this season. The Redbirds exploded out of the gate with a lightning-quick, 73-yard opening touchdown drive that ended with a 6-yard inside slant pass from Roberson to senior wide receiver Cameron Meredith.

On ISU's second drive, a 28-yard back shoulder throw to freshman wide receiver Jon-Marc Anderson set up a 1-yard plunge from junior running back Marshaun Coprich for his 22nd touchdown of the year to put the Redbirds ahead, 14-0.

Coprich, the Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Year, reached the 100-yard plateau for a school-record 12th-consecutive time. With his 148-yard game, he also earned the ISU single-season rushing yard record, passing Pierre Rembert's previous record of 1,743 yards (2006).

The Redbirds scored again on their third drive of the game, after a Roberson quarterback draw set the offense up at the 5-yard line. Roberson tossed another inside slant pass to Meredith from two yards out to complete a 15-play, 87-yard drive that took nearly eight minutes off the clock. Meredith's second touchdown of the game gave him eight receiving touchdowns on the season, and the senior also surpassed the 100-yard mark for the fourth-straight game.

Senior placekicker Nick Aussieker's would-be career long field goal attempt of 51 yards was partially blocked by Xavier Williams midway through the second quarter. The Redbirds drove the field in the last minute of the first half to set up another Aussieker attempt, which he converted from 45 yards out as time expired, and ISU took a 24-0 lead into halftime.

The Panthers started Sawyer Kollmorgen at quarterback in the second half, and he drove UNI down the field for a touchdown on its first drive of the third quarter. A 39-yard Aussieker field goal and a 26-yard touchdown pass from Roberson to senior tight end James O'Shaughnessy extended the Redbird lead, 34-7. However, the Panthers would not go down without a fight, as they wasted no time on an 84-yard drive that took less than three minutes off the clock and ended in a Johnson rushing touchdown. The Panthers recovered an ISU fumble on the ensuing kickoff, and punched in a touchdown three plays later to cut the lead, 34-21.

The Panthers were unable to capitalize on its final two drives stalled out on a failed fourth down conversion, and an interception by junior defensive end Teddy Corwin. O'Shaughnessy hauled in a 36-yard pass for his second receiving touchdown of the game to conclude the scoring and put him over 100 yards on the day.

Coprich, Redbirds Defeat EWU In FCS Quarterfinals

CHENEY, Wash. — Marshaun Coprich rushed for a career-high 258 yards and Illinois State piled up 542 yards of total offense en route to a 59-46 victory over Eastern Washington in the FCS quarterfinals.

Following a stop on Eastern Washington's first drive of the game, the Redbirds answered with a 12-play, 66-yard scoring drive that was capped off by a 31-yard field goal off the foot of Nick Aussieker. On the ensuing drive, David Perkins forced a fumble on a reception by Kendrick Bourne and Mike Banks recovered at the ISU 45-yard line. Coprich took over on the next drive, rushing for 36 of the team's 55 yards during the five-play scoring drive, which he ended with a seven-yard touchdown.

The Eagles answered the Redbird touchdown with one of their own, as Quincy Forte scored on a nine-yard touchdown run to cut the ISU lead to 10-7. The Redbirds battled right back, and put together an eight-play, 55-yard drive to extend the lead back to 10 points. Fullback Brady Tibbitts took his first career carry and pounced it across the goal line from three yards out to give the Redbirds a 17-7 advantage.

A 37-yard field goal from Tyler McNannay on the next drive cut the ISU lead to a touchdown at 17-10, but once again the Redbirds answered with an eight-play, 66-yard scoring drive as Tre Roberson capped off the drive with a seven-yard touchdown pass to Cameron Meredith. Meredith made a fantastic, one-handed grab that put the Redbirds up 24-10 with 6:35 left to play in the half. EWU would fight back again and cut the lead back to seven points at 24-17, after a Jabari Wilson one-yard touchdown run capped off an 11-play scoring drive at the end of the second quarter.

The Redbirds wasted little time putting points on the scoreboard in the third quarter, as they drove 15 yards down the field in just under four minutes to extend the lead to 31-17. Big grabs from James O'Shaughnessy set up a 21-yard touchdown run for Coprich, who moved over 100 yards rushing for the 13th-straight time. Eastern came back and settled for a 36-yard field goal from McNannay and cut the lead to 31-20 with 9:01 left in the third quarter, after Pat Meehan sacked Adams on third down.

ISU answered again, as Coprich scored his third touchdown of the game on a 2-yard run to extend the lead to 38-20. On the ensuing drive, Alex Donnelly picked off a Vernon Adams pass attempt and returned it to the EWU 23-yard line and six plays later, Roberson ran it in from five yards out to widen the lead to 45-20. A two-yard touchdown run by Adams early in the fourth quarter narrowed the ISU lead to 45-27, but a failed onside kick attempt by the Eagles was recovered by Colin Keoshian to give the Redbirds great field position. Four plays later, Roberson connected with Lechein Neblett on a 31-yard scoring strike to increase the lead to 52-27 with 10:30 left in the game.

EWU did not go away, as Adams connected with Cooper Kupp on a 30-yard touchdown pass and after a missed PAT try, the Redbirds lead was cut to 52-33 with 8:51 left in the game. After recovering an onside kick, Adams found Kupp again for a 35-yard touchdown to cut the ISU lead to 52-39 with 8:21 left in the game.

The Eagles kicked it long on the next kickoff and Tevin Allen fair caught the ball at the 25-yard line. Two plays later, Coprich broke loose for a 74-yard touchdown run, his fourth of the game, to extend the ISU lead to 59-39. On the next drive, Mike Banks intercepted Adams, but with 1:40 to play, Adams connected with Shaq Hill for a 47-yard touchdown. That would be the final score of the game.

Redbirds Punch Ticket To National Championship

Durham, N.H. — A 47-yard touchdown run by Illinois State quarterback Tre Roberson in the fourth quarter lifted the Redbirds (13-1) to a 21-18 win over top-seeded New Hampshire (12-2) in front of a rascous crowd at Cowell Stadium in the semifinals of the 2014 FCS Playoffs and secured ISU a spot in the national championship game.

Roberson led the comeback in the fourth quarter and finished the game 18-for-31 with 278 yards passing, including a career-long 77-yard connection to Lechein Neblett. He also added 95 yards on 12 carries, including the game winner. Running back Marshaun Coprich did not break the 100-yard barrier for the first time this season, but finished with 79 yards and the game's only other touchdown. Teddy Corwin led the way for the defense with a career-best 12 tackles and Collin Keoshian added six stops, a sack, a tackle-for-loss and an interception.

After each team punted on their first possession of the game, the Redbirds scored the first points of the day on a 33-yard field goal by Nick Aussieker mid-way through the first quarter. The Wildcats answered the score with a touchdown on their ensuing drive, as quarterback Sean Goldrich carried it in from four yards out to put UNH ahead 7-3 with 3:35 left in the first quarter.

The Redbirds attempted to answer on their last drive of the quarter and drove all the way inside the UNH 10 yard line. Roberson carried the ball eight yards to the one yard line and attempted to stretch over the goal line, but was hit and fumbled giving the ball back to the Wildcats and swinging the momentum. UNH took advantage of the turnover and put together a nine-play, 96-yard scoring drive that was capped off by a six-yard touchdown run by Nico Steriti and a two-point conversion on a run by Andy Vailas to extend the lead to 15-3 with 12:34 left in the second quarter.

ISU would add another field goal, this time a 23-yarder, with 1:45 left before halftime after a career-long 77-yard pass from Roberson to Neblett set the Redbirds up inside the UNH five yard line. However, three-straight runs by Coprich were stuffed and the Redbirds settled for the field goal to cut the UNH lead to 15-6.

UNH took the opening kickoff of the third quarter and put together a 13-play, 73-yard drive that took 4:12 off the clock to extend its lead to 18-6, after a 25-yard field goal from Brad Prasky. The rest of the third quarter was quiet for both teams, until the Redbirds took over on their final drive of the quarter. Roberson led a methodical, 10-play, 84-yard drive that was capped off on a two-yard touchdown run by Coprich that cut the UNH lead to 18-13 early in the fourth quarter.

After the defense forced another UNH punt, its third in a row, the Redbirds got the ball back on their own 11 yard line. The Redbirds marched down the field to the 47 yard line, when Roberson called his own number and took a quarterback draw 47 yards for the go-ahead touchdown. Following a quick time out, Roberson pitched the ball to Jon-Marc Anderson who dove into the end zone for the two-point conversion to put ISU in the lead at 21-18 with 7:51 left in the game.

UNH got the ball back and attempted to tie or gain the lead, but a stop of fourth down gave the Redbirds the ball back at their own 46 yard line. From there, the Redbirds picked up two first downs and took a knee to run the clock.

ISU Avenges Lone Loss, Defeats UNI In Playoffs, 41-21

FRISCO, Texas — Illinois State's bid for its first national championship came down to the final minute, but North Dakota State ran its streak of consecutive national championships to four with a 29-27 win at Toyota Stadium.

Tre Roberson's 58-yard touchdown run with 1:38 left in the game gave the Redbirds a late lead before NDSU (15-1) quarterback Carson Wentz scored from five yards out with 37 seconds left to reclaim the lead. Roberson's pass to Joe Farmer with eight seconds left in the game was intercepted, ending the ISU comeback hopes.

The Redbirds (13-2) were led Saturday by Roberson, who completed 11-of-23 passes for 157 yards and three touchdowns. He ran for a game-high 161 yards and another score. James O'Shaughnessy caught two of Roberson's touchdown passes, while Jon-Marc Anderson hauled in the other.

The Redbird defense stopped NDSU on its first offensive drive of the game as Alex Donnelly forced a Bison fumble as they entered the red zone. The Redbirds drove to midfield before ISU punter CJ Laros pimed the Bison inside their own 5-yard-line. North Dakota State was forced to punt four plays later and the Redbirds took advantage, capping a five-play, 38-yard drive with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Roberson to Anderson with 5:28 remaining in the first quarter.

NDSU answered with a 41-yard field goal from Adam Keller with just over a minute remaining in the quarter, cutting the Redbirds' lead to 7-3. The Bison took the lead on their next offensive possession, as Wentz found Luke Albers on a 6-yard touchdown pass with 8:43 left in the second quarter. Illinois State trailed 10-7 at halftime.

The Bison opened the second half with a key special teams play as they recovered the second-half kickoff at the Illinois State 19-yard-line. A third-down sack by Bradon Prate forced a field goal attempt and NDSU's Keller was good from 41 yards out, giving the Bison a 13-7 lead. After a Redbird three-and-out, the Bison put together an eight-play, 76-yard drive that was topped off by a 7-yard touchdown run by John Crockett with 7:28 left in the third quarter, boosting the Bison lead to 20-7.

The Redbirds got back into the game with a 41-yard pass from Roberson to O'Shaughnessy with 2:11 remaining in the third quarter, cutting the NDSU lead to 20-13 after a Nick Aussieker extra point. The Bison made it a two-possession game again with a 24-yard field goal by Keller with 11:20 left in the game. Roberson and O'Shaughnessy hooked up again just moments later, though, on a 3-yard touchdown pass with 8:05 left, cutting the NDSU lead to 23-21.

NDSU followed with a drive that chewed up nearly six minutes of clock, and included a key fourth-and-one conversion, but a third-down sack by Collin Keoshian forced a Bison punt and the Redbirds took over at their own 20-yard-line with 2:22 left.

Roberson's career-long 58-yard touchdown run with 1:38 remaining gave the Redbirds their first lead since early in the second quarter. The Redbirds had 37 seconds left after Wentz's go-ahead touchdown, but Roberson's pass from his own 44-yard-line was intercepted by NDSU's Easley Thorton.

Redbirds Advance With 36-19 Win Over Western Illinois

NORMAL, Ill. – After falling behind early in the third quarter, the Illinois State football team bounced back for a 36-19 win over Western Illinois in the second round of the FCS Playoffs on Saturday afternoon at Hancock Stadium.

The Redbirds (10-2) used 217 yards rushing from FCS Offensive Player of the Year finalist and Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Year Marshaun Coprich to edge out the Leathernecks (7-6). It was the senior's third straight 200-yard game and his sixth career 200-plus yard performance. Quarterback Tre Roberson also contributed a solid game on the ground with 111 yards and two scores. The pair helped the 'Birds outlast a solid performance from WIU quarterback Sean Maguire, who finished with 341 yards passing with two touchdowns.

ISU started off hot with a first quarter touchdown run by Coprich, but a pair of turnovers allowed WIU to keep pace as the Redbirds went into the locker room at halftime with a 7-6 lead following a pair of field goals by the Leathernecks' Luke Otto.

The Leathernecks came out firing in the second half with a 91-yard drive on their first possession of the half to take a 12-7 lead following the blocked extra point attempt. However, the 'Birds answered immediately with a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped off by a five-yard rushing score from Roberson. The signal-caller then found Anthony Warrum in the end zone on the ensuing two-point conversion to make the score 15-12 in favor of the Redbirds.

Warrum finished with 107 yards and a touchdown on six catches. The touchdown was the 14th on the year for Warrum, who now holds the ISU single season touchdown catches record after breaking a tie at 13 with Rickey Garrett (1998).

The touchdown drive ended up being a springboard for the Redbirds, as they marched the field on their next possession and Roberson outspurred several defenders up the right sideline for a 22-12 lead. The team was able to match a WIU touchdown to make it 22-19 on the next drive with a 21-yard strike from Roberson to Warrum. Coprich then sealed the game with a 72-yard rushing touchdown with under five minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

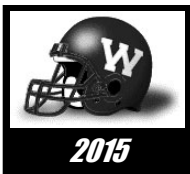

Redbirds Season Comes To An End With Loss To Richmond

NORMAL, Ill. – A frantic comeback in the final minutes fell short, as the Redbirds (10-3) fell by a score of 39-27 to Richmond (10-3) to see their season come to an end in the FCS Quarterfinals.

After going down 32-14 with 10 minutes left in the fourth quarter, the Redbirds converted back-to-back touchdown drives to pull within five points at 32-27. ISU quarterback Tre Roberson connected with running back Marshaun Coprich for a 12-yard score. Then, after Roberson went down after taking a wicked hit and had to sit out one play, backup quarterback Jake Kolbe scrambled for a 17-yard score on his first, and only, offensive snap of the game.

Richmond then sealed the win with a 28-yard rushing touchdown from running back Jacobi Green that clinched the game and sent the program to the FCS Semifinals against the winner of North Dakota State and Northern Iowa. Richmond quarterback Kyle Lauletta was tremendous, completing 18-of-30 attempts for 369 yards and touchdown.

ISU was led by the passing attack of Roberson, who was solid and accurate throughout most of the night on his way to a 25-of-42 finish for 370 yards and two touchdowns with one interception. His main target, Anthony Warrum, finished with nine catches for 152 yards and one score, while Christian Gibbs hauled in a career-best eight catches for a career-high 96 yards.

The Spiders got off to a hot start, taking the ball 73 yards down the field on their opening drive, but the Redbird defense held them to a field goal. After a quick three-and-out by ISU, the Spiders capped off another long drive with a Broadus rushing score from 13 yards out for a 10-0 lead heading into the second quarter.

Roberson led the ISU offense on a bounce-back touchdown drive, connecting with Warrum from 20 yards on a corner route toward the back of the end zone. The Spiders were then held to another Yoder field goal, this time from 24 yards out, for a 13-7 lead. It looked like that would be the score heading into the break, but a lightning-quick 87-yard drive in under two minutes capped off by a two-yard touchdown run from Jacobi Green gave the Spiders a 19-7 lead at halftime.

ISU struck first in the second half with a five-yard touchdown run by Coprich, set up by a 26-yard catch from Warrum and a 23-yard grab by Gibbs. The Spiders quickly answered, though, when Lauletta hit Green on a wide open screen pass in which the running back sprinted 35 yards for a score and a 25-14 lead. Green would later add an insurance touchdown with a 27-yard score in the fourth quarter for the 32-14 lead.

UCA's Fourth Quarter Comeback Eliminates ISU

CONWAY, Ark. – Despite Illinois State (6-6, 4-4 MVFC) tallying 17 first-half points and limiting Central Arkansas (10-2, 8-1 SLC) to just seven points, the Bears scored 24 fourth-quarter points to come back and defeat the Redbirds 31-24 at Estes Stadium Saturday afternoon in the first round of the 2016 FCS Playoffs.

Anthony Warrum's two touchdowns helped him become the only ISU receiver in school history to post 10 or more touchdowns in back-to-back seasons and the first player to record multiple seasons with 1,000 yards receiving.

The ISU defense dominated the first-half, limiting the Bears to just six rushing yards and not allowing a first down in the first quarter.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Bears began their comeback as they blocked a momentum-changing punt at the start of the fourth quarter that was picked up by Jakari Dillard on ISU's four-yard line, and he ran it in for the touchdown to bring the Bears within a field goal of the Redbirds, 17-14. The Bears followed that up with another score around the 10-minute mark to take the lead for the first time, 21-17. Following the score, the Bears shook things up opting for the onside kick that was recovered by UCA at ISU's 36-yard line. Despite a big stop by the Redbird defense inside the red zone, UCA was still able to kick a 28-yard field goal to widen its lead to a touchdown, 24-17.

In a mere one minute 38 seconds, the 'Birds fought back on a four-play, 81-yard scoring drive that was highlighted by a 55-yard touchdown reception from Jake Kolbe to Warrum to tie the game at 24-24. With a minute and a half remaining, the Bears answered back, returning Reece Attard's punt 33 yards to ISU's four-yard line, before Antwon Wells ran the ball into the end zone for a touchdown to break the tie and climb ahead 31-24.

American tailback James Robinson proved why he is one of the best in the country, as he ran for a school-record 297 yards and a touchdown as the No. 13 ranked Redbirds (9-4, 5-3 MVFC) ran away with a 24-6 win over No. 12 Southeast Missouri (9-4, 7-1 MVFC) at Houck Field Saturday in the first round of the 2019 FCS playoffs.

The 297 rushing yards by Robinson set a school record, besting the 272 yards gained by Pierre Rembert at Missouri State in 2005. The 297 yards also set a Redbird and Missouri Valley Football Conference record for most rushing yards in a playoff contest.

8 - ESTUS HOOD



A defensive back from Kankakee, Ill., Estus Hood went on to a seven-year NFL career (more than 100 games) with the Green Bay Packers. At one point, he logged 31-straight starting assignments.

As a pro, Hood finished his career with 11 interceptions.

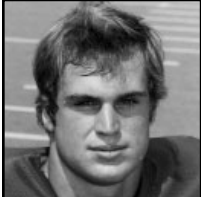
At Illinois State, he posted six career interceptions for 111 yards, an average of 18.5 yards per return. Hood also totaled 46 career punt returns for 582 yards, an average of 12.6

yards per return, and nine kickoff returns for 105 yards. He finished his Redbird career with four touchdowns.

Hood missed the 1975 ISU season due to injury and lettered with the Redbirds from 1973-74 and 1976-77, before being drafted by the Green Bay Packers in the third round of the 1978 NFL Draft.



15 - MIKE PRIOR



Mike Prior, a native of Chicago Heights, Ill., was a defensive back with the Green Bay Packers from 1993-98 and participated in two Super Bowls. In the Packers' Super Bowl XXXI victory over New England, in January 1997, Prior intercepted a Drew Bledsoe pass. Following Prior's interception, Brett Favre orchestrated a 74-yard, six-minute drive that concluded with a diving Favre touching the ball against the pylon to give Green Bay a 27-14

halftime lead.

Before joining the Packers, Prior spent six seasons in Indianapolis with the Colts and two with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Prior still ranks No. 1 on the school's career interceptions list with 24 and is also tops in career punt return yards with 906.

He also played baseball during his career at Illinois State and still holds the school marks for career batting average (.388) and slugging percentage (.715).



46 - BOOMER GRIGSBY



The all-time leading tackler in FCS history, Boomer Grigsby is the only three-time Missouri Valley Football Conference Defensive Player of the Year in league history. The Canton, Ill., native deservedly became the first Redbird player to enter the College Football Hall of Fame in 2022.

A three-time First Team All-American (2002-04), Grigsby remains the FCS leader in career tackles (550), career solo tackles

(325), single-season tackles per game (16.27 in 2002) and single-season solo tackles per game (9.82 in 2002). The standout linebacker is the only player in history to finish in the top three for the Buck Buchanan Award in three consecutive seasons.



72 - DENNIS NELSON



An offensive lineman from Kewanee, Ill., Dennis Nelson played five seasons with the NFL's Baltimore Colts and two more with the Philadelphia Eagles.

With the Colts, Nelson was part of the Super Bowl V champions in 1971. He played in 77 games during his NFL career, all as a reserve.

He was selected by the Colts in the third round, with the 77th pick overall, in the 1969 NFL Draft.

Nelson originally joined the Illinois State football team as a walk-on, before lettering four seasons (1965-68) with the Redbirds.
