SERIES VS. S.D. MINES:

FORT LEWIS LEADS THE ALL-TIME SERIES AT 13-9, INCLUDING A 9-2 RECORD INSIDE OF WHALEN GYMNASIUM. DESPITE THE MARK, THE SKYHAWKS HAVE DROPPED THREE IN A ROW TO THE MOUNTAIN LIONS. IN THE LONE MEETING LAST YEAR, FORT LEWIS FELL BY A 55-52 FINAL AT HOME. SORENSON HAD 17 POINTS AND FIVE REBOUNDS IN THE LOSS.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAIN LIONS:

THE MOUNTAIN LIONS SIT 4-9 OVERALL AND 3-4 IN LEAGUE PLAY AFTER EARNING A MID-WEEK WIN ON TUESDAY OVER CHADRON STATE COLLEGE (72-66). UCCS IS 4-3 AT HOME AND 0-4 ON THE ROAD THIS SEASON. THE TEAM AVERAGES 62.9 POINTS PER GAME AND 38.8 REBOUNDS PER GAME SO FAR. THEY RANK MIDDLE TO LOW IN THE STATISTICAL RANKINGS AMONGST RMAC TEAMS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF FIELD GOAL DEFENSE WHERE THE TEAM IS TOP THIRD.

AMYAH MOORE ALLEN LEADS ALL PLAYERS WITH 15.8 POINTS PER GAME IN HER SOPHOMORE SEASON. MAISON WHITE FOLLOWS AT 12.7 POINTS PER GAME ON A TEAM-BEST .553 FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE. WHITE IS THE LEADING REBOUNDER AT 8.5 PER GAME—SECOND IN THE RMAC. SOPHIE ABELA HAS DISHED OUT 40 ASSISTS THIS SEASON ON JUST 18 TURNOVERS FOR A 2.2 ASSIST/TURNOVER RATIO, A MARK THAT SITS FIFTH IN THE CONFERENCE.

SERIES VS. REGIS

FORT LEWIS LEADS THE ALL-TIME SERIES AT 14-10 WITH AN 8-4 RECORD AT HOME. LAST YEAR, THE SKYHAWKS LOST A 78-77 GAME ON THE ROAD AND A 68-58 HOME CONTEST TO THE RANGERS. ALYSSA ADAMS AND SORENSON COMBINED FOR 24 POINTS IN THE ONE-POINT ROAD LOSS.

SCOUTING THE RANGERS:

THE RANGERS ARE RIDING A THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK WHICH HAS PUT THEM AT 7-5 OVERALL AND 4-2 IN CONFERENCE PLAY. MOST RECENTLY, REGIS EARNED A 74-63 WIN OVER CHADRON STATE COLLEGE IN A RESCHEDULED GAME THIS PAST MONDAY. PRIOR TO THAT, THE TEAM PICKED UP WINS OVER COLORADO MESA (72-64) AND COLORADO CHRISTIAN (91-84).

REGIS IS AVERAGING 71.6 POINTS PER GAME WHILE HOLDING ITS OPPONENTS TO A 67.5 POINTS PER GAME CLIP. DEFENSIVELY, THE TEAM COMES AWAY WITH 42.2 REBOUNDS PER GAME WITH SIT SECOND IN THE RMAC. THEY LEAD ALL TEAMS WITH A REBOUND MARGIN OF 6.8. THE RANGERS SEE OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION FROM A VARIETY OF PLAYERS, INCLUDING FOUR WHO AVERAGE DOUBLE DIGITS. ERIN FRY LEADS THE WAY AT 14.2 POINTS PER GAME, FOLLOWED BY SAM DEEM (10.8 PPG), JOSEY RYAN (10.3 PPG), AND ERIN STROBERG (10.3 PPG). STROBERG AND DEEM ARE THE LEADING REBOUNDEES AT 7.4 AND 7.4 PER GAME, RESPECTIVELY.





SKYHAWKS DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS TRAVIS WHIPPLE

Whipple comes to Durango with over 15 years of senior-level experience, serving most recently as the Vice President of College Relations at Crown College (NCAA DIII) in St. Bonifacius, Minnesota. Whipple's role at Crown College had him providing oversight for fundraising, development, community, and alumni relations while leading the Department of Athletics. He also represented the department at institutional, conference, regional, and NCAA levels.

Whipple holds an M.S. in Educational Leadership from Winona State University, in addition to his undergraduate degree which was completed in 2008. Upon completion of his education at WSU, he served as the Assistant Athletic Director for External Operations at his alma mater. He quickly grew within the role, going on to amass a wealth of experience within the NCAA Division I and Division II ranks. Stops along the way have been at institutions such as the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, Texas A&M Corpus Christi, North Central, and Oral Roberts University. In addition to his prowess as an administrator,

Whipple carries a reputation for success that dates back to his time as a highly touted men's basketball student-athlete for the WSU Warriors. Whipple was an instrumental member of the two-time national champion Warriors' squad (2006, 2008) while also guiding his team to three Northern Sun Athletic Conference championships. He still ranks in the top 10 in career games played (144, 2nd), three-point shooting percentage (44.06%, 4th), and assists (335, 8th).

Whipple's time as a student-athlete, in conjunction with his years as an athletic administrator, blends seamlessly with his pursuit of greatness in all aspects of athletics. From winning on the field to performing well in the classroom and community, his vision presents a commitment to mentoring, supporting, and helping develop educated, caring, well-rounded, and productive citizens who are highly employable and equipped to succeed in all aspects of life.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE PRESIDENT TOM STRITIKUS

As president of Fort Lewis College, my focus is on helping students succeed in their educational and professional careers, as well as building FLC into a positive economic and social force in the Four Corners region. At FLC, students earn degrees relevant to current labor markets and study under faculty and staff dedicated to local partnerships and active learning.

President Stritikus arrived at FLC in August 2018 and began implementing strategies to advance higher education in Colorado, in addition to underpinning the college's mission of providing professional education and regional economic vitality.

HEAD WOMEN'S BASKETBALL COACH TAYLOR HARRIS

Taylor Harris will begin his second season at the helm of Fort Lewis College women's basketball in 2022-23.

Fort Lewis went 2-25 overall in the 2021-22 season while holding a 1-20 record in Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference play. The team won its home opener in 61-44 fashion over Northern New Mexico College in the Nike N7 Game which celebrates Native American Heritage. The overall record doesn't adequately reflect the grit that was displayed by the young Skyhawks squad as the team dropped eighth games by three points or less throughout the year.

Fort Lewis College was a desired destination for Harris, who has extensive Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference ties from his time as a women's basketball assistant coach at Regis University (2015-19) and a men's assistant coach at Metropolitan State University of Denver (2009-2015).

During his time at Miles Community College, Harris led the Pioneers to an overall record of 43-15 (.741) and a 30-5 mark (.857) in the Mon-Dak Athletic Conference.

His program has also ranked No. 2 among NJCAA teams in GPA for the 2019-20 academic year (3.771) while being active in the community, accumulating 365 total hours of community service since September of 2019.

A native of Denver, Colorado, Harris has demonstrated to be a proven winner in the RMAC as he helped lead the Regis women's basketball program to a record of 74-44 (.637) during his four seasons as an assistant under Molly Marrin.

Prior to his time with the Rangers, Harris was a men's assistant coach at MSU Denver under 2013 NABC National Coach of the Year, Derrick Clark. The Roadrunners put together a dominating stretch during Harris' six seasons, compiling an overall record of 161-33 (.830) while advancing to the NCAA Division II National Tournament Final Four in 2012-13 and 2013-14. In total, MSU Denver won four RMAC regular season championships, three RMAC Tournament championships and earned six NCAA Division II National Tournament appearances during Harris' tenure.

ASSISTANT WOMEN'S BASKETBALL COACH KYLIE LORENZEN

Kylie Lorenzen will begin her first season as women's basketball assistant coach in 2022-23.

Lorenzen was a standout athlete for Southern New Hampshire University (NCAA DII) from 2015-19, compiling 1798 points (15.9 PPG) and 932 rebounds (8.2 RPG)--both of which rank first all-time in program history. The forward was a three-time WBCA All-American Honorable Mention honoree to go along with a trio of All-Northeast 10 Conference accolades. In addition to her prowess on the hardwood, Lorenzen was an all-conference member of the women's track and field team where she competed in events such as the 100, 200, 400, long jump, and relays.

Following her prolific collegiate career, Lorenzen took her talents overseas to compete in the ATHLETICS British Universities and Colleges Sports basketball league. She shared an undefeated season with teammates from eight countries while obtaining her master's degree.

Lorenzen made the move to Colorado in May 2021

after obtaining a role as an ecological and vegetation monitoring crew member in Dolores. In her position, she is responsible for monitoring vegetation and soils using the Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Terrestrial Assessment, Inventory, and Monitoring (AIM) methodology. Among many other responsibilities, Lorenzen and a crew of three members identify variables of vegetation species, height, cover, and composition using line-point intercept and gap measurements, soil stability, land observations and characteristics, soil pit textures, colors, and structure within all allotted plots using GPS coordinates.

Lorenzen, a native of Holliston, Massachusetts, earned a B.S. in Environmental Science with minors in Biology and World Languages and Culture from Southern New Hampshire University in 2019. She went on to complete her M.S. in Environmental Monitoring, Modeling and Reconstruction from Northumbria University in 2020.

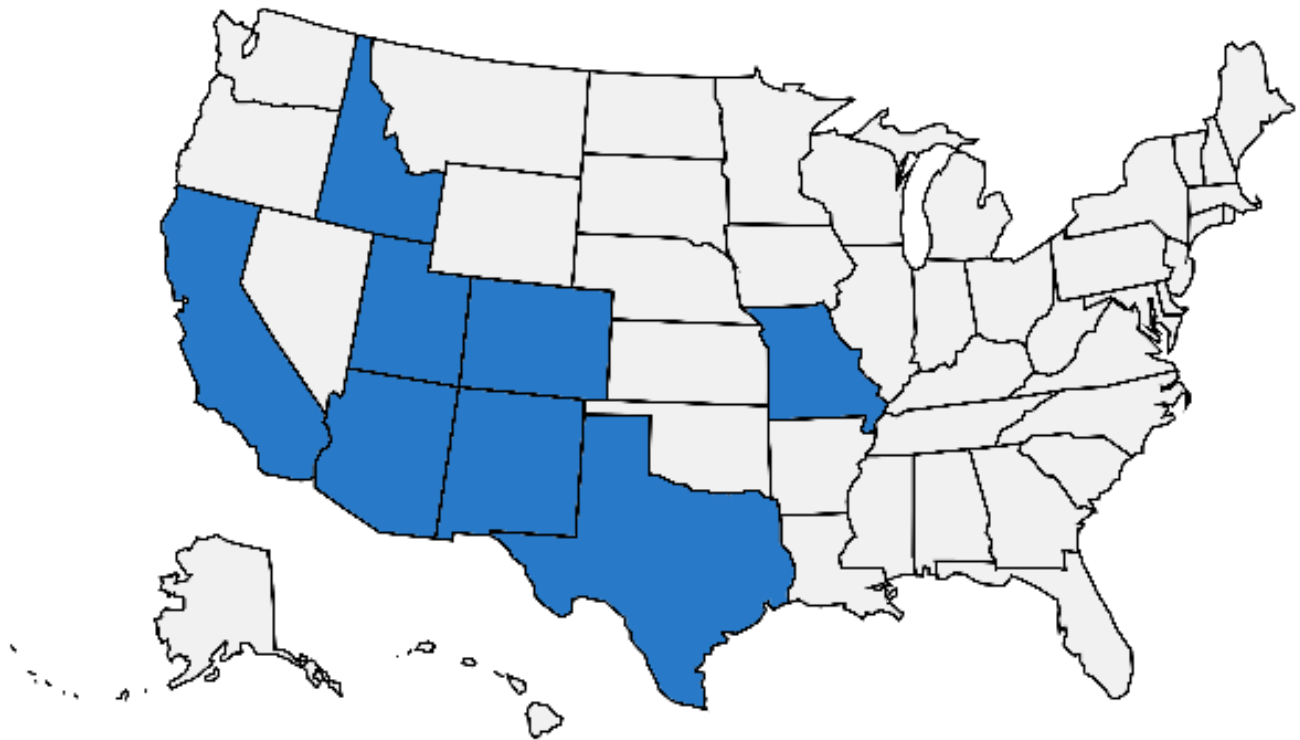
