NCAA Infractions Report

Southeast Missouri State University accepts the sanctions announced today by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I Committee on Infractions panel in its investigation into the Southeast men's basketball program during the 2015-2016 academic year.

Summary of the violations:

The case involved academic misconduct by a former assistant men's basketball coach at Southeast and centered on 1) knowingly arranging for the receipt of fraudulent academic credit for a prospective student-athlete; 2) providing false or misleading information during his interviews; and 3) failure to cooperate with the institution and enforcement staff's investigation.

Penalties prescribed by the panel include the following:

- Public reprimand and censure of the University
- A two-year extension of probation from the University's 2016 infractions case involving the women's basketball program, which will conclude on Feb. 11, 2019.
- A six-year show-cause period for the former coach from March 10, 2017, through March 9, 2023. Any NCAA school employing him in an athletically related role during that time can appear with him before a Committee on Infractions panel to determine if the former coach's athletically related duties should be limited.

A \$5,000 fine (self-imposed by the University).

ABE STUBER

be Stuber Track Complex is the home location for meets held at Southeast Missouri during the outdoor season. Considered one of the finest track facilities in the Midwest, it has been the host of the Ohio Valley Conference Outdoor Track & Field Championships six times and three NCAA Division II Championships. The facility is also home to the Joey Haines Invitational which is held during the first weekend of April every year.

Dedicated in the spring of 1980 and named after the late Abe Stuber - who coached the Southeast track squads from 1932-46 - the facility includes a press box and spectator seating for up to 2,000.

Recently, an \$800,000 update took place as all track and field runways were resurfaced, jumping areas were renovated and new fencing was added to the complex. Previous updates included a brand new hammer cage added in March, 2012 and an office/weight room adjacent to the track in 2002.

The 2,000-square foot building houses a weight room, coaches offices, restrooms and storage. The weight room is equipped with seven multipower racks and lifting platforms, containing nearly 5,000 pounds of free weights, 3,000 pounds of dumbbells and numerous weight training machines.

The Abe Stuber Track

Complex is located on the north
edge of campus off Sprigg Street
and within walking distance to
the University.

outheast Missouri's
North Student Rec
Center is the home
for the Redhawks indoor track
meets. All events are held in the
east gym of the facility.

The Student Recreation
Center is the headquarters of the
Recreation Services Department
and is the primary facility for
recreation activity.

The indoor track is a four lane, 170 meter running/walking track (9 laps per mile). A work out "pit" is the main attraction of the buliding, containing 4252 square feet of free weight, plate loaded and cable system equipment.

The facility also contains multiple levels of cardio machines, with one overlooking the track and basketball courts in the east gymnasium. The east gym also features a rock climbing wall, racquetball courts and secluded dumbell room.

The facility contains five basketball courts in total and plays host to both men's and women's basketball practices throughout the year.

he Holcomb Success
Center offers Southeast
Missouri student-athletes
a place to study and develop as
students and campus leaders.

It is located in the Student
Recreation Center, just south
of Houck Field. The Holcomb
Success Center offers a
computer lab with 18 work
terminals, study areas and rooms
for group meetings. The facility
houses the Southeast Academic
Services staff and main weight
room for Redhawk studentathletes.

The beautiful facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by Southeast student-athletes.

Last year, the Redhawks recorded a 3.21 cumulative grade point average in the fall and spring semesters. Women's tennis paved the way with a 3.76 cumulative GPA, while gymnastics, women's cross country and women's soccer followed close behind with 3.70, 3.69 and 3.68 marks, respectively.

In all, 211 student-athletes finished with a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA, including 12 with a 4.0 and 115 at 3.5 or better. That total accounted for over 64 percent of the entire student-athlete population.

During the spring semester alone, the Redhawks had nine programs post a 3.10 or better GPA, including women's tennis (3.87), women's cross country (3.66), women's soccer (3.65), gymnastics (3.60), softball (3.59), women's basketball (3.39), women's track & field (3.36), volleyball (3.29) and baseball (3.17).

Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress is monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study skills and life skills topics, and thus, enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes can also receive individualized academic programs which include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The Holcomb Success
Center staff works to get
athletes involved in campus and
community projects, as well. This
is done to provide a support
structure and greater opportunity
for academic success. Through
the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills
Program, the Holcomb Success
Center gives student-athletes
personal and professional skills in
order to facilitate successful and
productive futures.

outheast Missouri's Strength and Conditioning program is committed to developing the total student-athlete through their experiences within a competitive training environment.

Southeast's weight room renovations at the Holcomb Success Center were completed in January, 2016.

Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation, which cost \$500,000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle Southeast's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Branding and new lighting were also included in the overall project.

The newly-renovated weight room enhances training with the best equipment available and is able to accomodate larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time.

TRAINING PRINCIPLES FOR SOUTHEAST ATHLETES

- 1. Reduce the risk of injuries
 - If a student-athlete is injured, he/she will not be able to compete at practice or games.
- Ensure the athletes are optimally prepared to compete
 - It is our responsibility to best manage all stressors that are placed on the student-athletes body in order to achieve the best results on the playing field.

- 3. Maximize athletic ability
 - We challenge each athlete, both physically and mentally, in order to achieve optimal results.

EXERCISES FOR SOUTHEAST ATHLETES ARE BASED ON THE FOLLOWING PRINCIPLES:

- 1. Ground Based Movements
- Athletes compete with their feet on the ground, and therefore, should train that way. The ability to produce force against the ground determines how fast athletes can run and how high they can jump.
- 2. Three-Dimensional Movements
 - Athletes must be able to stabalize themselves in

all planes of movement. A fancy way of saying we use free weights (barbells/dumbbells vs. machines).

- 3. Multi-Joint Movements
 - Very rarely in sport do athletes isolate one single joint at a time. Athletes can train more muscle mass at the same time.

Southeast student-athletes are offered the best care possible by the athletic training staff. The Sports Medicine department includes five full-time athletic trainers, six graduate assistants and several student assistants. The staff serves student-athletes around-the-clock at numerous facilities on campus.

The athletic trainers begin treatments and rehabilitation starting as early as 6 a.m., and are available until the last studentathlete is through.

There are currently four

athletic training facilities on campus. The staff treats out of the Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary training room is located. There are two other satellite athletic training rooms, including one at Houck Field House and one at the Show Me Center.

The Southeast athletic training rooms are equipped with stationary bikes, hand weights, therapeutic modalities and the latest physical therapy equipment. Each component is strategically designed to not only give the student-athlete the best care, but also to aid in returning to competition as quickly as possible.

Southeast Athletic Training has strong working relationships with local physicians and two hospitals in Cape Girardeau. It is from these hospitals that the Athletic Training department is assisted by four orthopedic physicians.

r. Carlos Vargas became the 18th president of Southeast Missouri State University July 1, 2015, after having served as acting president at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania.

Since becoming president, Dr. Vargas has launched initiatives to marshal the resources, leverage opportunities and address a variety of challenges and needs of Southeast Missouri State University. He has set as primary goals for the institution the support for student persistence and retention.

He has encouraged and supported the identification and development of innovative academic programs, including bachelor's degrees in Unmanned Aircraft Systems, Geographic Information Science, and industrial

and systems engineering. He has continued to support the globalization of the campus through expansion of studyabroad experiences, extensive engagement of international students, and encouragement of students on campus and abroad to explore cultural interaction. He has championed the work of the President's Task Force on Diversity Education and continued emphasizing the expectations for enhancement of the teacherscholar model. Under President Vargas' leadership, regional partnerships and collaborations have been solidified, including several joint initiatives with Three Rivers. Mineral Area and other community colleges.

Prior to his tenure at Kutztown, Dr. Vargas was at Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio, where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs. He was also Kent's associate dean for research. interim assistant dean for research and interim assistant dean for the School of Technology. He started his tenure at Kent State in 1985 as a professor, and continued to teach until his departure from the university in 2003.

Dr. Vargas began his career in

higher education at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), from which he received a Bachelor of Science in physics.

He earned his Ph.D. in physics and aerospace science from the University of Michigan and he has Master of Science degrees from Michigan in both physics and aerospace science. He is married to Pam Vargas, who currently serves as director of Research and Grant Development at Southeast, and they have a son, a daughter, and two granddaughters.

rady Barke is in his third year as Southeast Missouri's Director of Athletics.

Barke served as the Interim Director of Athletics since July, 2015, before being named to the permanent position of Director of Athletics on June 7, 2016.

Most recently, Barke reached a multi-year agreement with Under Armour. The Baltimore-based global leader in performance footwear, apparel and equipment became the official outfitter of Southeast Missouri Athletics on July 1, 2018.

As part of the multi-year agreement, Under Armour will provide on-field and training gear for 15 sports. Additionally, Under Armour will outfit members of the athletic department including coaches and staff.

Academically, Southeast's athletic teams recorded a 3.21 cumulative grade point average

in 2017-18. Women's tennis paved the way with a 3.76 cumulative GPA, while gymnastics, women's cross country and women's soccer followed close behind with 3.70, 3.69 and 3.68 marks, respectively.

In all, 211 student-athletes finished with a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA, including 12 with a 4.0 and 115 at 3.5 or better. That total accounted for over 64 percent of the entire student-athlete population.

During his first year in 2016-17, Barke introduced Andy Sawyers as the Redhawks head baseball coach and worked tirelessly on two major renovation projects.

Nearly a month after Sawyers was hired, Southeast Missouri State and the City of Cape Girardeau officially broke ground on Capaha Field. New synthetic turf, new fencing and a digital scoreboard in the outfield were added as part of the \$1.8 million

project that was completed before Southeast's season-opener. More improvements are in the works at Capaha Field.

On Feb. 3, 2017, Southeast formally dedicated Holcomb Success Center. To honor the long-time service and philanthropy of Dr. John and Judy Holcomb, the University named the facility the Holcomb Success Center located in the Student Recreation Center-South.

Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation at a cost of \$500,000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle Southeast's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Barke helped secure the Holcombs gift, the largest single cash gift in Southeast Athletics history.

Major improvements were also

made to the second floor of the building where athletic academic services are housed. This space provides student-athletes with places to study and features a computer lab with 30 work terminals and rooms for group meetings. Staff members assist student-athletes with life skills development, academic advising and academic progress toward degree requirements and NCAA eligibility.

More than \$240,000 in pledges for the Redhawks Club unrestricted booster fund has been raised under Barke's leadership. It is the largest total since the 2003-04 school year. More than \$266,000 was raised in Sponsorship & Marketing contracts for FY18 marking the fourth-consecutive year of Sponsorship and Marketing revenues.

Football and volleyball ticket sales revenue were the second-

highest total in the last 12 years.

Barke has also worked hard to enhance Redhawks branding around the community. Redhawk banners, S-E! M-O! billboards, Welcome to Redhawk country and Your Redhawks yard signs are prominently displayed all over Cape Girardeau.

Barke created the Redhawks
Trivia Night & Auction, a sold
out event that generated over
\$40,000 in net revenue its first
year. In addition, he launched
the Redhawks BRIDGE program
which provides student-athletes
with both leadership and life skills
experiences through interactive
programming that will prepare
them to be successful in life after
athletics.

Barke, senior associate to the president and secretary to the Board of Regents at Southeast, officially began as Director of Athletics on July 1, 2016.

Barke served as Interim
Associate Director of Athletics for
Compliance & Student Support
Services before being named the
Senior Associate to the President
and Secretary to the Southeast
Missouri State University Board of
Regents in 2013.

He began his tenure at
Southeast in 2008 as Assistant
Director of Athletics for
Compliance & Eligibility. Barke
previously served as a governance
intern with the NCAA national
headquarters in Indianapolis, and
as a law clerk with the Southern
Illinois University-Carbondale
Department of Athletics
Compliance Office.

Barke has served as a member of the National Association of Athletics Compliance (NAAC), chaired the NAAC Education Committee, and was a member of the NAAC Board of Directors. He has facilitated the NCAA

Regional Leadership Academy, and served on both the NCAA Sports Wagering Task Force and the Olympic Sports Liaison Committee.

Barke has a juris doctorate degree from Southern Illinois University School of Law, an MBA from Southeast Missouri State University, and a bachelor of science degree in biology from Webster University. While a student at Webster, Barke was a member of both the basketball and golf teams and was inducted into the Webster Athletic Hall of Fame.

He and his wife, Halley, are parents of three children, Mabrie, Jackson, and Kolbe.

The Southeast women had a successful 2018 season and matched a program-best finish of second at the 2018 OVC Cross Country Championship held in Cape Girardeau, Missouri. It marked the 10th time that the Redhawks women had finished runners-up at the conference meet.

Kaitlyn Shea, Sydney O'Brien and Carli Knott registered All-OVC performances as SEMO totaled 80 points in the 5K for second. Southeast last had three All-OVC women runners in 2008 when Juli Koenegstein, Monica Noble and Linnea Woldtvedt recorded the feat.

Shea was the top women's finisher with a time of 17:36.7 for seventh to garner All-OVC First Team laurels. She has now earned a spot on the All-OVC Cross Country Team each of the past three seasons (2016 and 2017 All-OVC Second Team) after being named OVC Freshman of the Year in 2015.

O'Brien who won two races in 2018 placed eighth with a personal-best time of 17:36.9 for All-OVC Second Team honors. Knott was also an All-OVC Second Team performer with

a career-best mark of 17:56.3 for 10th.

Rachel Hutchcraft (18:24.6, 20th) and Natalie Kopplin (18:59.9, 36th) rounded out the Redhawks top five.

The Redhawk women won both the Saluki Invite and the SIUE John Flamer Invitational to start the year with O'Brien and Shea crossing the finish line first and second in both races

SEMO was sixth out of 100 women's teams at the Louisville Sports Commission Cross Country Classic in Louisville, Kentucky, on Sept. 29 with a team average of 18:07.44 and beat SEC schools like Mississippi State and Auburn along with meet host, Louisville.

O'Brien posted the fastest Redhawk time with a personal best of 17:37.8 for 27th. Shea was the second SEMO finisher with 17:43.5 for 37th.

Knott was 50th in the race, clocking in at 18:02.0. Hutchcraft (PR, 18:14.5, 58th) and Thomas (18:59.4, 117th) rounded out the women's top five.

Prior to the OVC Championship, Southeast competed at the

Wisconsin Pre-Nationals. Shea was the first finisher on the women's side with a personal-best mark of 21:26.7 for 66th as the team averaged a time of 22:15 and finished ahead of Nebraska of the Big Ten, UT Martin and Southern California of the Pac-12.

O'Brien also finished in the top 100 in 21:38.0 (83rd). Knott (22:13.1, 142nd), Hutchcraft (22:27.0, 165th) and Thomas (PR, 23:26.2, 215th) rounded out SEMO's top five.

O'Brien matched SEMO women's best individual finish of 43rd as the team placed tied for 18th in the 6K at the 2018 NCAA Division I Midwest Regional in Peoria, Illinois.

O'Brien tied Rebekah Lawson's (21:29) mark of 43rd set at the 2013 NCAA Midwest Regional in Ames, Iowa, to lead SEMO, clocking in at 21:28.7.


O'Brien was one of three members of the SEMO team to finish in the top 100 as Shea and Hutchcraft placed 71st and 100th, respectively. Shea registered her best finish at the regional with a time of 21.48.4 and Hutchcraft posted a personal-best 6K mark of 22:04.6.

The Southeast men improved in 2018 with an eighth place finish at the OVC Cross Country Championship held in Cape Girardeau, Missouri after placing 10th the season prior.

Dan Plunkett led the team with a time of 25:47.2 in the 10K for 33rd overall as the men earned 217 points.

Curtis Reed was second on the Redhawks, clocking in at 26:16.0 (42nd). Chris Durr (26:28.9, 50th), James Kosbar (26:29.5, 51st) and Griffin Bailey (65th, 27:19.7) also scored for Southeast.

Plunkett led the men in 2018 and helped the Redhawks take second out of five teams at the Saluki Invite and second at the SIUE John Flamer Invitational dual meet to start the season.

He then registered a personal-best time of 25:19.8 for 77th at the Louisville Sports Commission Cross Country Classic.

Kosbar (25:46.3, 132nd) and Durr (26:05.8, 167th) also registered career-best marks at the second and third spots for SEMO. Reed (26:07.7, 169th) and Bailey (26:15.6, 177th) were the fourth and fifth Redhawk finishers.

Southeast's men were 31st out of 109 men's teams, recording their fastest team average in three years of 25:55.04.

In a tune up before the OVC Cross Country Championship, the Redhawks competed at the Wisconsin Pre-Nationals. Bailey paced the men with a time of 26:29.5 (220th) as Southeast averaged a mark of 26:50.

Plunkett (26:47.8, 225th), Kosbar (26:51.0, 227th), Durr (26:58.0. 230th), Reed (231st, 27:02.0) and Trevor Falco (242nd, 28:27.9) were the next fastest Redhawk finishers.

SEMO concluded the campaign at the 2018 NCAA Division I Midwest Regional in Peoria, Illinois.

The Redhawks finished 27th in the 10K behind Plunkett who crossed the finish line 97th (32:56.1) for his first top-100 finish at a NCAA Midwest Regional.

Bailey (33:42.0, 140th), Durr (PR, 34:57.5, 183rd), Reed (35:15.1, 185th) and Kosbar (36:13.0, 200th) also represented Southeast in the 10K.

ric Crumpecker is in his 10th season as head coach of the Southeast Missouri men's and women's track and field teams. Crumpecker is in his 26th year at Southeast, having served 17 years as an assistant under legendary head coach Joey Haines.

Last year, SEMO's men placed third in the conference at both the indoor and outdoor championships. The women finished fifth at the outdoor league championship and sixth at the OVC indoor meet. Crumpecker coached 2018 OVC Champions in Anya Tonga (indoor weight throw), Logan Blomquist (indoor shot put, outdoor discus) as well as OVC Field Athlete of the Year, OVC javelin champion and Second-Team All-American Jonno Engelking.

In 2017, Crumpecker won his third OVC Outdoor Coach of the Year honor as Southeast captured their eighth outdoor championship, marking back-to-back years Crumpecker has taken home both awards. It marked the eighth time the men have won conference in program history. Zach Gordon was named OVC Men's Championship MVP and Logan Blomquist earned OVC Freshman of the Year Honors.

Earlier in 2016, Crumpecker won his second OVC Outdoor Coach of the Year laurel as the Redhawks earned their seventh outdoor championship. He helped coach Kevin Farley towards his second championship MVP performance as Farley took gold in the shot put, discus and hammer throw. Farley's success continued at the NCAA Outdoor Championships, earning first-team All-America honors in discus in eighth place and second-team All-America in shot put in 10th.

In 2015, Crumpecker led the Southeast men's program to its second consecutive OVC indoor title and earned his second OVC Men's Indoor Coach of the Year award. During the conference meet, 10 Redhawk athletes brought home gold medals. Following the victory, Reggie Miller



and Blake Smith qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships in the triple jump and 60-meter dash, respectively. Smith finished 10th in the nation at 6.66 seconds during the preliminary race at nationals, falling short of the NCAA's final group of eight by just 0.05 seconds.

In 2014, Southeast Missouri won the men's indoor title followed by sweeping the outdoor championships for the first time since 2006. It was the first men's indoor championship since 1996. Crumpecker was awarded OVC Men's Coach of the Year following both the indoor and outdoor seasons. The 2014 indoor season featured Farley as Indoor Field Athlete of the Year, Indoor Freshman of the Year Chris Martin and Smith earning OVC Athlete of the Championship. The outdoor season featured Female Field Athlete of the Year Kayla Gutierrez. His student-athletes combined to win 10 individual OVC titles during the season. Gutierrez brought home gold in the indoor weight throw and outdoor discus events. Farley won the indoor shot put and outdoor hammer throw. In his first season with the Redhawks, Shon Kyle won the shot put and discus events at the outdoor championship. Courtney Gapelu took gold in both the indoor and outdoor shot put.

In 2013, the Redhawks won their first team OVC title under Crumpecker. The women snagged the team crown at the OVC Indoor Championships, using a balanced effort that featured only one individual conference champion, but three runner-up finishes and several strong supporting performances. Crumpecker was voted the OVC Women's Coach of the Year following the team title, marking the first time he has been voted the league's top coach. The Southeast men continued to knock on the door for a team title, finishing second at both the indoor and outdoor meets.

Southeast has also experienced tremendous postseason success individually under Crumpecker's guidance. The Redhawks sent three competitors to the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in 2013, the most individuals from the program since 2006. Farley took seventh in the shot put, breaking the school record with a throw of 61' 113" to become the first Redhawk to earn first-team All-American honors since Miles Smith in 2008. Craig Robinson and Gapelu also qualified for the NCAA West Region prelims. Southeast also got second-team All-American performances from Blake Carter in both the indoor and outdoor long jump while Miller earned honorable mention All-American in the outdoor high jump for the second consecutive year.

The Redhawks totaled three second-place team finishes at the OVC Indoor and Outdoor Championships during the 2011-12 season. Both the men and women finished as runner-up during the outdoor meet while the men posted another second-place



point total indoors. Crumpecker works closely with the throwers group that combined for three conference titles. Josh Uchtman, the 2012 Male Field Athlete of the Year during the indoor season, claimed the shot put indoors. Brian Grote and Robinson won gold in the javelin and shot put, respectively, at the outdoor meet. In total, the Redhawks won nine individual OVC titles in 2011-12.

In addition to the three individual conference champion throwers, Farley was named the OVC Male Freshman of the Year during the outdoor season.

During Crumpecker's tenure as head coach, the Redhawks have finished in the top three in all but one OVC indoor or outdoor meet (23 of 24). The men have finished second eight times while the women have been runner-up seven times.

Individually, he has mentored 88 individual OVC champions, 46 regional qualifiers and nine NCAA National Championships qualifiers. Redhawks student-athletes have won OVC Field Athlete of the Year 13 times, Track Athlete of the Year once, Athlete of the Year twice and Freshman of the Year eight times.

The Redhawks have also been stellar in the classroom under Crumpecker. Both the men's and women's track and field programs have earned All-Academic Team recognition from the US Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) in five of his six years as head coach. Jill Schnurbusch and Farley were both placed on the USTFCCCA's All-Academic team in 2012-13. Additionally, Alex Zisser earned third-team Academic All-America honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) while Farley and Joel Krause joined Zisser on the Academic All-District team.

During his time as an assistant coach he worked primarily with the field events, Crumpecker was a part of 20 OVC team titles, coached 81 OVC individual champions, 131 All-OVC performers, six OVC Track Athletes of the Year, four NCAA national finalists, 12 NCAA provisional qualifiers, 26 NCAA regional qualifiers and five regional finalists. He guided Southeast student-athletes to 11 school records and three OVC marks.

A native of Union, Missouri, Crumpecker is a USATF Level 1 certified coach. He earned a bachelor's degree in History from Missouri S&T and a master's in Higher Education Administration from Southeast. As a collegiate athlete, Crumpecker was a starting lineman for the Miners football team and earned All-MIAA honors in the shot put and discus for the track team.

Crumpecker and his wife, Amy, reside in nearby Jackson, Mo. They are parents of a daughter, Ella, and son, Jake.

yan Lane is in his ninth season at Southeast Missouri as the head cross country coach, while also serving as the assistant track coach specializing in distance running.

The Redhawk women's cross country team has finished in the top four each of the past six seasons.

Kaitlyn Shea, Sydney O'Brien and Carli Knott registered three All-Ohio Valley Conference performances for the first time since 2008 as SEMO's women finished runners-up at the 2018 OVC Cross Country Championship in Cape Girardeau at the Osage Centre.

O'Brien then matched Southeast's best individual finish at a Regional with 43rd (21:28.7) at the 2018 NCAA Division I Midwest Regional in Peoria, Illinois.

The 2017 season was highlighted by a fourth place finish from the women at the OVC Championships. Kaitlyn Shea led the Redhawks on the season with two first-place finishes and a second team All-OVC selection.

During the 2016 season, the women placed second in conference and 16th at regionals. Megan Parks and Sydney O'Brien became the first Southeast duo to finish in the top 50 at Regionals since 1998. The programs have combined for 18 All-OVC performers, including six first-



team runners while under Lane.

In 2015, the women's team placed third in the Ohio Valley Conference. Megan Parks earned Second Team All-Conference honors with a 12th place finish at the OVC Championships. Newcomer Kaitlyn Shea was named Female Freshman of the Year and was the first female in program history to win the award.

The 2014 season saw the end of Rebekah Lawson's cross country career. Lane saw Lawson through her career for four seasons. Lawson is the only Redhawk in Division I history to earn First Team All-OVC honors all four years of their career. The women's team capped a great 2014 season with a fourth-place finish at the OVC Championships. The men finished sixth at the event.

In 2011, both the men and women had one first-team and one second-team All-OVC finisher. Nate Shipley's third-place finish garnered him a spot on the all-conference first team while Brent Collins earned second team all-conference on the men's side. Rebekah Lawson took sixth as a freshman to earn the first team nod while fellow freshman Jenny Govero made second team All-OVC.

The Redhawks have also excelled in the classroom under Lane. In 2013, both the men's and women's programs earned All Academic honors from the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches' Association (USTFCCCA). Southeast's women posted a 3.72 team GPA, the fifth-highest mark in the nation, while the men's 3.48 GPA was good for 11th. The achievement marks the fourth-straight year at least one of the cross country programs earned academic recognition under Lane.



Lane's success with the distance runners has carried over to the track as well. Lawson notched a runner-up finish in the 5000m indoors to earn second-team All-OVC honors in 2013. During the outdoor season, Charles Johnson garnered second-team All-OVC recognition for his runner-up finish in the steeplechase.

The 2012 season saw Jessica Bollinger win an OVC title outdoors in the 10,000m while Lawson finished runner-up in both the 5000m and 10,000m. On the men's side, Mohammed Souleiman won an OVC title in the 800m while Chris Loseman earned second-team All-OVC honors after finishing runner-up in the 10,000m.

Lane's athletes have combined for 10 All-OVC selections and three OVC titles in his first three seasons. Lane returned to the Southeast program in which he interned as coach in 2008-09. That season, the Redhawk cross country teams recorded top-three finishes at the Ohio Valley Conference Championships. During that time, he received his Master's in Higher Education, finishing with a 4.0 GPA.

Prior to his coaching internship at Southeast, Lane worked as an assistant coach for the Cape Central High School cross country and track programs. He also served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Francis Howell North High School (2006-07). In all, Lane coached 41 All-State performers at the prep level.

Lane competed as a member Southeast cross country and track teams from 2002-2003, before an injury cut his career short.

He received his undergraduate degree from Southeast in 2006, graduating with a magna cum laude distinction in Education.

DANIELLE BURBAGE

anielle Burbage enters her fourth season with the Southeast Missouri track and field team as an assistant coach. Burbage serves as the Redhawks sprints, hurdles and relays coach.

In her time at Southeast, she has coached decathletes to 15 personal-best marks (six indoors, nine outdoors) and her heptathletes have earned six career-high scores (two indoor, four outdoor).

In 2017, Burbage coached Nick South who was the OVC Men's Indoor Heptathlon Champion and the OVC Outdoor Men's Decathlon silver medalist as the Redhawks men were named 2017 OVC Outdoor Track & Field Champions. She also coached NCAA West Preliminary Qualifiers Zach Gordon and Brannon Wright who finished first and second at the OVC Outdoor Championship.

Burbage helped coach Taylor Coffelt to an outstanding senior year where Coffelt set six personal records. Coffelt won gold in the heptathlon with a career-high score of 4877 at the 2016 OVC Outdoor Championships where she reached personal bests in both high jump (1.60m) and the 200m dash (26.13).

During the 2014-15 season, Burbage served as the director of operations at the University of Louisville. She managed the team budget, was in charge of alumni relations and fundraising, organized team travel and logistics along with home meet operations and oversaw equipment orders among other duties.


Burbage was also a volunteer coach at Louisville and assisted with jumps and multi-events for the Cardinals. She worked closely with NCAA long jump qualifier Brittany Owens and 100m hurdler Briana Brown in that role.

Prior to returning to her alma mater, Louisville, Burbage was an assistant coach at Wilmington College (Ohio). There, she coached one NCAA Division III qualifier in the 400m hurdles and was a part of the 2013 Ohio Atlantic Conference Coaching Staff of the Year. In addition, Burbage monitored classroom activities and efforts of student-athletes, while helping with the program's day-to-day operations.

Burbage, a Paducah, Kentucky, native, was a member of the 2008, 2009 and 2010 Big East Championship teams at Louisville. She competed in the 100m, 200m and both 4x100m and 4x400m relays as a member of the Cardinals track & field team. Burbage received a Bachelor of Science in Sport Administration from Louisville in 2010.

hris Navarro is in his third season as a member of the Southeast Missouri track and field coaching staff. Navarro serves as an assistant coach with an emphasis on multis, pole vault, hurdles and jumps.

Navarro had a successful career as a student-athlete at Southeast, capturing six gold medals at OVC Championships. He was victorious during both heptathlon and decathlon events in the men's dominant 2014 season, helping win both the indoor and outdoor conference titles. The following season, Navarro took first in the 60m hurdles and heptathlon at the 2015 indoor championship only to follow with gold in the 110m hurdles and decathlon at the outdoor championships.



HALL OF FAME

INAUGURAL CLASS OF 2002

LAURA BYRNE: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1986-89)

Byrne, a track and cross country athlete from 1986-1989, won four NCAA II individual titles during the 1988-89 school year when she won the cross country national championship and the indoor 1,500 and 3,000-meters and the outdoor 5,000-meters.

MARVIN ROSENGARTEN: TRACK COACH, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Rosengarten was a football player at Southeast who later served as an assistant football coach, track coach, athletics director and director of athletic development. The Marvin Rosengarten Athletic Complex on the Southeast campus is named in his honor.

ABE STUBER: TRACK COACH (1932-46)

Stuber was football and track coach at Southeast from 1932-1946 and also served as basketball coach from 1932-1935 and from 1943- 1946. His track teams won seven MIAA championships and his football teams claimed three league titles including the 1937 team that was unbeaten and untied

MIKE VANATTA: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1981-84)

Vanatta, track and cross country from 1981-1984, won four NCAA II individual national championships. He won the steeplechase title in 1982, 1983 and 1984 and claimed the cross country championship in 1984 while leading Southeast to the team title.

1984 MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY TEAM

The team won the NCAA Division II National Championship.

1985 MEN'S INDOOR TRACK TEAM

The team won the NCAA Division II National Championship.

CLASS OF 2003

RICK ATTIG: TRACK (1970-73)

Attig, a football and track standout, was honorable mention All-American and team captain for the football team, and an All-American in the javelin for the track team. He is the Southeast and MIAA record holder in the javelin. He is currently an assistant track coach at Nebraska after having served as an assistant at Kansas.

HERB MULKEY: TRACK (1939-42)

Herb Mulkey was a star in both basketball and track. He was a two-time all-MIAA selection and team captain in basketball and held school records in the low hurdles, high hurdles and high jump. At one time, Mulkey held 11 high jump records at tracks throughout the Midwest.

WALTER SMALLWOOD: TRACK (1965-68)

Walter Smallwood was a two-time all-MIAA football selection who still holds Southeast records for touchdowns in a game (5), season (16) and career (38) and held the career rushing record until 1994. Smallwood was the MIAA 60-meter champion.

CLARK WILLE: TRACK (1967-71)

Clark Wille was a five-time MIAA champion in the high hurdles. He claimed All-American honors in the hurdles in 1971. After graduation he coached Herculaneum High School to ten state championships in cross country and track. Wille coached over 160 collegiate All- Americans at Lindenwood and Missouri Baptist. He guided the Lindenwood women to the NAIA cross country championship and the Lindenwood men to the NAIA men's indoor track title.

CURTIS WILLIAMS: TRACK (1964-67)

Curtis Williams was the first African-American student-athlete at Southeast. He lettered four years in track and three years in basketball. He was the basketball MVP in 1967 and was MIAA champion in the high jump, triple jump and long jump.





CLASS OF 2004

LIZZ BARRINGER: TRACK (1986-89)

Lizz Barringer was a four-time Division II All-American in the heptathlon. She was the 1989 NCAA Division II heptathlon national champion and was an Olympic trials qualifier in the heptathlon.

BILL MCLANE: TRACK (1934-37)

Bill McLane ranks as one of the all-time great track athletes at Southeast. When he graduated in 1937 he held 24 track and field records at Southeast.

RYLAND "DUTCH" MEYR: TRACK (1958-61)

Ryland "Dutch" Meyr was a four-year starter at tackle and was honored as a Little All-American in 1961. Three of the four teams he played on won MIAA championships. He served as an assistant coach from 1969-1977. He had a record of 25-7 as head coach at Cape Central High School.

REX MILLER: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1955-58)

Rex Miller was Southeast Missouri State's first cross country All-American. He was 24th in the 1957 NCAA championships for all divisions held at Michigan State. He was undefeated for three years in the two-mile and was the MIAA mile and two-mile champion. Miller was also the high school coach of Southeast Hall of Famer Mike Vanatta.

ROB THOMAS: TRACK (1981-84)

Rob Thomas ranks as Southeast Missouri State's only NCAA Division I national champion. He won the 1984 indoor 600-meters at the NCAA Division I championships. He was also a Division I All-American in 1982 and was a Division II All-American in 1984, 1983 and 1984. He was a U.S. Olympic trials qualifier in 1984 and a U.S. National Team member in 1985.

CLASS OF 2006

JOHN SCHWEPKER, TRACK (1984-88)

Schwepker won two individual national championships at Southeast while earning seven All-America awards. He won the NCAA Division II indoor pole vault championship in 1985 and was the decathlon national champion in 1988. The Southeast record holder in the decathlon with 7,881 points, Schwepker participated in the 1988 Olympic Trials.

ROYAL TIBE: TRACK (1919-23)

Tibi is believed to be the only athlete at Southeast to earn varsity letters in five sports. He lettered in football, basketball, baseball, track and tennis. An outstanding punter on the football team, he also served as captain of the track team and was described as an outstanding defensive player on the basketball team.

CLASS OF 2007

ED WHITE: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1973-77)

White is the only Southeast cross country runner to earn All-America honors for three straight years. He was honored in 1974, 1975 and 1976 with his highest national finish ninth in 1975. White is retired after coaching track and cross country at Fox High School in Arnold for over 30 years. His wife, the former Laura Byrne, is a member of the Southeast Athletic Hall of Fame inaugural class of 2002.



HALL OF FAME

CLASS OF 2008

JOEY HAINES: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY COACH (1982-2008)

Ohio Valley Conference "Coach of the Year" 20 times during a career that saw his teams win one NCAA II National Indoor Title, one NCAA II National Cross Country Title and earn 18 NCAA II National Top Four Finishes. He was the NCAA II National Coach of the Year in 1985, the NCAA Division I Regional Coach of the Year in 1998, MIAA Coach of the Year six times and Missouri Track & Field Coaches Association Coach of the Year six times. He coached one NCAA Division I national champion, 23 NCAA II national champions, 10 NCAA I All-Americans and 145 NCAA II All-Americans.

RICK WADLINGTON: TRACK (1968-71)

An All-American in 1971 after placing second in the shot put at the NCAA II national finals, he established a Southeast outdoor shot put record with a throw of 59-0 1/2 while winning the MIAA championship. Helped lead the Southeast team to the MIAA title in 1971 by winning both the shot put and discus.

CLASS OF 2009

ANDREW PRESBERRY: TRACK AND FIELD (1978-82)

Presberry was a four-time All-American at Southeast, winning honors in the hurdles and on the mile relay team. He still holds the Southeast record in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 13.84. The record, established in 1981, has stood for 28 years. Presberry also recorded the second fastest 400-meter hurdle time of 51.35.

CLASS OF 2010

TERRANCE BRANCH: TRACK AND FIELD (1982-2008)

Terrance Branch, of McCluer High School in St. Louis, Mo., tore through the record books during his career as a Southeast Missouri Student-Athlete. As a freshman, Branch ran the 400 meters in 47.74 at the indoor National Championships, earning All-American honors. In 1992, Southeast Missouri moved up to Division I, and Branch ran a 45.8 at nationals, but was disqualified for running out of the lane. He was given a medical redshirt in 1993, and came back to run a school record 45.52 400 meter dash, placing fourth at the NCAA National Championships. Branch earned a degree in Mass Communications, while placing himself in the record books in the 200 meters, 400 meters, 4x400 meter relay, and earning an OVC Outdoor Championship in the 400. Branch hung up his cleats as a four-time All-American.

CLASS OF 2011

BOB FERGUSON: TRACK AND FIELD (1983-86)

Ferguson was part of the 1985 National Championship track & field team which is in the Southeast Hall of Fame. He was a five-time NCAA Division II All-American and eight-time MIAA indoor and outdoor conference champion in the pole vault. Ferguson was the 1987 NCAA Division Il Outdoor Pole Vault Champion. He was a world championship team member for the 1987 Pan Am Games. In addition, Ferguson won a silver medal at the 1986 Commonwealth Games.





CLASS OF 2012

CHRISTINE (RIDENOUR) VANATTA: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1982-84)

Highlighted her athletic career at Southeast by winning the 1984 NCAA Division II Women's Cross Country Championship, leading her team to a third-place finish. She was a three-time NCAA Division II All-American in cross country and a two-time NCAA Division II national qualifier in track & field. By the time she left Southeast, Ridenour had set school records in the 1500m, mile run, 3000m, 2-mile run and 5000m events. She is married to Southeast Hall of Famer Michael Vanatta.

BEVERLY SLAUGHTER: TRACK AND FIELD (1981)

She was one of the first great female athletes at Southeast. She held the long jump record at 20-5 for a period of 17 years. Slaughter was an All-American in 1981 and won numerous MIAA titles. She currently ranks third on the school's all-time long jump list. Two-time national high jump champion who won both the NCAA II indoor and outdoor championships in 1985. He won the indoor title with a jump of 6-11 in Fargo, North Dakota to lead Southeast to the national team title. He won the outdoor title with a jump of 7-1 in Los Angeles, California. A three-time All-American, he still holds the Southeast high jump record at 7-1 1/2.

CLASS OF 2013

KATHLEEN HUDSON: TRACK AND FIELD (1979-1981, 1983)

Hudson began her career at Southeast in 1978-79 and helped lay the foundation for the women's track and field program that has remained strong and extremely competitive for the past 35 years. During her time at Southeast, Hudson became an Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women two-time All-American in 1981. In the national championships that year, she finished sixth in the finals after going into the meet with the second-best time in the nation at 55.8, a time that remains outstanding even today. She followed that performance by anchoring the 1600m relay that achieved All-American status by also finishing sixth. While Hudson was an outstanding individual competitor in the 400m dash and long jump, she was versatile and indispensable as a member of all the relay teams. She ran on, and almost always anchored teams that broke 13 school records (nine in the mile relay, three in the 880 yard/800m medley relay, and one in the 400m dash).

MILES SMITH: TRACK AND FIELD (2004-2008)

Smith might very well be the greatest Division I athlete Southeast Missouri State University has produced in any sport. A native of St. Louis, Smith was a five-time All-American in the 400m, earning the prestigious honors in 2005, 2006 and 2008. He was named the Ohio Valley Conference Male Track Athlete of the Year four times (2005 indoors, 2006 indoors & outdoors and 2008 indoors) and still owns Southeast school records in the 200m (indoors), 400m (indoors and outdoors) and 4x400m relay (indoors and outdoors). Southeast enjoyed tremendous team success with Smith, winning OVC Outdoor Championships in 2005, 2006 and 2008. He won seven individual OVC Championships in his collegiate career and was named the 2006 OVC Athlete of the Championship at the OVC Indoor Track & Field Championships. Smith was also an elite competitor on the international stage. He ran for the US National Team in the 2005 IAAF World Championships in Helsinki, Finland, where he won a gold medal with the 4x400m relay team. He also qualified for the USA Olympic Trials in both 2008 and 2012. Smith returned to his alma mater as a sprinters coach in 2013-14. Prior to that, he spent the 2012-13 season as a volunteer assistant coach at Tennessee State.



HALL OF FAME

CLASS OF 2016

HEATHER JENKINS: TRACK AND FIELD (2002-2006)

A Cape Girardeau native, Jenkins had a decorated career as a thrower for the Southeast women's track & field program. As a freshman in 2002, Jenkins won the OVC shot put and discus titles, and established a school discus record of 173-11. She went on to finish 15th at the NCAA Championships in the discus that year. A year later, Jenkins set an OVC record in the shot put with a throw of 50' 5.5" and won the discus crown at the OVC Outdoor Championships. She was an NCAA Regional qualifier in the shot put and discus, and also set a conference record in the 20lb weight throw (59' 11"), and won the shot put at the OVC Indoor Championships that season. A year later, Jenkins won the weight throw at the OVC Indoor Championships and again broke the school and conference record in the process. During outdoor competition, she won the OVC shot put and discus crowns, while qualifying for the NCAAs in the shot, discus and hammer. Jenkins was named both the OVC Indoor and Outdoor Track Athlete of the Year, and claimed First-Team All-OVC accolades. In all, Jenkins was a two-time OVC Indoor shot put champion, three-time OVC Indoor weight throw champion, four-time OVC Outdoor discus champion and four-time OVC Outdoor shot put champion during her illustrious career. She still holds the school's all-time discus record today.

CLASS OF 2018 - ANNOUNCED

TOM BRENNECKE FOOTBALL AND TRACK AND FIELD (1954-1957)

Brennecke, who is deceased, played running back at SEMO for two Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) championship teams (1955, 1957) during his career. He was part of two unbeaten teams with the 1955 squad going 9-0 under the direction of head coach Kenneth Knox. Brennecke played every game during the last two seasons of his career and started 12 contests. He scored 12 total touchdowns twice during the 1957 campaign. His 12 touchdowns tied for eighth among the school's all-time single-season leaders. Brennecke earned All-MIAA honors in 1957 and Second-Team All-MIAA accolades in 1956. He was a unanimous pick by the conference coaches as the Captain of the MIAA Conference All-Star squad and voted Most Valuable Back. Brennecke led the 1957 SEMO team in scoring with 72 points and was named SEMO's Most Improved Player as a freshman. He was also a member of the school's track & field team and becomes the 19th multiple sport athlete to be inducted into the Southeast Missouri Athletics Hall of Fame.

LUTRICIA PURHAM: TRACK AND FIELD (1997-2000)

Purham was a six-time OVC Champion at SEMO. She was a three-time OVC individual champion in the outdoor shot put (1998, 1999, 2000), two-time individual champion in the indoor shot put (1999, 2000) and discus champion (2000). Purham was named the 2000 OVC Track Athlete of the Year. She was an NCAA Qualifier in the shot put during both the 1999 and 2000 seasons. Purham finished 15that the national meet each of those years and was part of four OVC Championship teams.

DR. TIM RADEMAKER: ASSISTANT TRACK & FIELD COACH (1975-1982, 1980s-2017)

Dr. Rademaker has been a mainstay in the SEMO Track and Field family for decades and once represented the program as a top athlete in the pole vault and as its team captain. He is an outstanding events coach, particularly and certainly not limited to the pole vault. Rademaker has produced numerous MIAA and OVC champion athletes as well as NCAA national champions throughout the years either as a paid or volunteer assistant coach. In all, he coached 18 OVC pole vault champions and one OVC high jump champion. All of SEMO's pole vault records have come with Rademaker as coach of that event. He has been a great recruiter for the track and field and cross country programs during his coaching tenure. In addition to coaching, Rademaker has been a clinician presenter and has published articles in journals regarding the pole vault and methods in the teaching and coaching profession. As an educator, he taught in the physical education and recreation department for many years and continues to be a positive influence, role mode and mentor to countless teachers, coaches and students at SEMO.





THIS IS THE OVC

Now in its 71st year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

In May 2011 the Conference expanded for the second time in four years, adding Belmont University which began competition in the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont gave the OVC 12 members, the most the league has had at one time in its illustrious history. The move added a second team in the city of Nashville and was the first addition to the league since Southern Illinois University Edwardsville joined in 2008. Subsequently, the league has shown its stability over the past decade, seeing only one member institution depart over the past 18 years.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart,

football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

After Title IX legislation passed in 1972, women's athletics began a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC began formulating plans for women's athletics in 1975 and established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977. with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982. The conference added women's golf and softball in 1994 and women's soccer in 1998. Over its 70 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in

football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track

State) to present-day standouts like basketball player Kenneth Faried (Morehead State) and Robert Covington (Tennessee State), football player Jimmy Garoppolo (Eastern Illinois) and baseball players A.J. Ellis (Austin Peay) and Shawn Kelley (Austin Peay). Hamilton is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and an NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles

The OVC's first volleyball tournament was held in 1981, the same year Eastern Kentucky began a string of six-straight tournament crowns. Former EKU skipper Dr. Geri Polvino compiled a 627-439 record in 32 seasons as head coach of the Colonels, earning OVC Coach of the Year honors eight times. More recently, former Austin Peay coach Cheryl Holt and former Southeast Missouri skipper Cindy Gannon also earned their peers' recognition multiple times with four awards each.

Throughout the last 35 years, 11 different teams have won an OVC regular-season or tournament volleyball crown. Since joining the league in 1991, Southeast Missouri has dominated the scene, winning seven of its

the athletics director at Murray State, Charles "Turkey" Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged February 27-28. 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first nontraditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958 Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961 Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in

and golf.

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States Olympic Rifle Team and Morehead State's Brian Shimer who competed in five Winter Olympics in bobsled (winning a bronze medal in 2002) and coached the 2010 United States bobsled team to its first gold medal since 1948. Former Morehead State football and Eastern Kentucky track and field athlete Dallas Robinson competed with the U.S. bobsled team during the 2014 Sochi Winter Olympics. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State) and Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peay) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead

eight regular-season titles during the 1990's, including five straight from 1993-97. The Redhawks have also won five tournament crowns (1994, 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2000). Jacksonville State won back-to-back OVC Tournament Championships (2005, 2006) including going through the OVC undefeated (16-0) in 2006 and winning a NCAA Tournament match in 2010, the league's first NCAA victory since 2000.

Following the 2007 season, Jacksonville State's Abbey Breit was named the OVC Offensive Player of the Year for the thirdstraight season, becoming the first player in OVC history to accomplish that feat. She was later joined by Murray State's Scottie Ingram who won three-straight awards from 2014-16. Four other individuals - Eastern Kentucky's Angela Boykins (1985-86), Morehead State's Dayle Hammontree (1988-89), Southeast Missouri's Tuba Meto (1996-97) and Morehead



State's Amy Almond (2001-02) – were back-to-back winners of the award.

Morehead State won its fourth-straight OVC volleyball regular season championship in 2013. Over that four-year period (2010-13) the Eagles compiled an impressive 67-3 league record.

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 275 student-athletes honored with the award, including 81 over the last eight years (2010-18).

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior

has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown

significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Belmont University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

due to the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

Additionally, the OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference

2019 OVC INDOOR TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2019 OVC Men's and Women's Indoor Track & Field Championship will be held Feb. 20-21 at the Birmingham CrossPlex in Birmingham, Alabama. The CrossPlex, which will host the 2019 and 2022 NCAA Indoor Championships, houses one of the fastest indoor hydraulic tracks in the world. It marks the first time the OVC Indoor Championship has been held at a neutral site. The 2020 and 2021 OVC Championships will also be held at the venue. Last year the Eastern Kentucky men won its first Indoor crown since 2008 while the Tennessee Tech claimed its first-ever women's crown.



2019 OVC OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2019 OVC Men's and Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championship will be held May 9-11 at the Abe Stuber Track Complex on the campus of Southeast Missouri State University.

Last year the Eastern Kentucky men's team won its first championship since 1957 while the Tennessee Tech women captured its first-ever outdoor crown (after winning its first indoor crown back in February).






