# **Redhawks Kick Off Season Saturday**

Southeast Missouri opens its 2018 season at Football Bowl Subdivision and Sun Belt Conference member Arkansas State Saturday. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m., CT, at Centennial Bank Stadium.

#### **Follow the Redhawks**

#### **Series History**

This year marks the 12th meeting between Southeast Missouri and Arkansas State. The Redhawks hold a 7-3-1 advantage in the all-time series. These teams last met on Sept. 13, 2003. ASU won that game, 21-3, in Jonesboro, Arkansas. Nine of the first 11 meetings between ASU and SEMO were shutouts. The Redhawks blanked the Red Wolves seven times in that span. This season marks the second time SEMO faces ASU since it joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1991.

## **Season-Openers**

The Redhawks are 9-18 all-time in season-openers since joining the Football Championship Subdivision in 1991. SEMO's last win in a season-opener on the road came at Austin Peay (38-13) on Sept. 2, 2006. The Redhawks kick off a season against a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent for the 11th time in 2018. SEMO is 0-10 in season-openers against FBS teams.

#### **Against the Sun Belt Conference**

Arkansas State marks the first Sun Belt Conference opponent Southeast Missouri faces in 15 years. SEMO has played three Sun Belt Conference foes in its football history. The Redhawks are 8-6-1 all-time against such teams -- 7-3-1 vs. Arkansas State, 1-1 vs. Troy, 0-2 vs. Louisiana-Monroe.

#### **Starting Debuts**

Ten players are expected to make their starting debuts at Southeast Missouri during week one. Elijah Swehla (LG), Jimmy Keutzer (RT), Austin Crump (TE), Jerrick Orr (WR) and Daniel Santacaterina (QB) are listed at the top of the Arkansas State game two-deep on offense, while Demarcus Rogers (ILB), Marcus Goree (OLB), Al Young (CB), DJ Freeman (FS) and Taj Jenkins (CB) will make their first Division I start on defense.

# **Santacaterina Earns Starting Quarterback Job**

At the conclusion of Southeast Missouri's preseason camp, Northern Illinois transfer Daniel Santacaterina was named the Redhawks starting quarterback. Santacaterina will make his first career start at SEMO Saturday against Arkansas State. A native

of Geneva. Illinois. Santacaterina played in six games and made four starts at NIU in 2017. He completed 62-of-97 passes for 712 yards and seven touchdowns. Santacaterina boasted a .639 completion percentage and averaged 118.7 passing yards per game. He threw for 128 vards on 15-of-22 passes to lead the Huskies to a 21-17 victory over Nebraska. Santacaterina joined the Redhawks in the spring, but was limited due to a shoulder injury. He was cleared before the start of camp and had a strong preseason. He succeeds Jesse Hosket who was SEMO's starting signal-caller the last two seasons. Hosket recently signed with upstart Alliance American Football League's Memphis.

# Terry and Forbes Garner Preseason All-America Honors

Senior tailback Marquis Terry and senior left tackle Drew Forbes earned Preseason All-America honors. Terry was a First-Team Phil Steele's Preseason All-America selection, while Terry made the Lindy's Sports (second-team) and STATS (third-team) Preseason All-America teams.

# Terry Named OVC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year

Senior tailback Marquis Terry became Southeast Missouri's first Preseason Ohio Vallev Conference Offensive Player of the Year. The OVC began selecting the Preseason Offensive Player of the Year on a regular basis since 2008. Terry rushed for 1,076 yards and seven touchdowns on 239 carries and averaged 4.5 vards per attempt in his first season at SEMO in 2017. He led the OVC with 97.8 rushing yards per game and was one of two running backs in the conference to rush for over 1,000 yards. Terry rated 13th in the Football Championship Subdivision in total rushing yards and 16th in rushing yards per game. He ran for over 100 yards four times with a season-high 184 vs. Eastern Kentucky. Terry went over 100 yards in two of his final three starts of the season as his 1,076 yards marked the fifth-most in a season at SEMO. Also an OVC All-Newcomer pick, Terry ranked fourth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,185) and caught 20 passes for 109 yards out of the backfield.

#### **More Preseason Accolades**

Senior offensive tackle Drew Forbes and junior inside linebacker Zach Hall joined teammate Marquis Terry on the 2018 Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference team. Forbes ranks at the top of the Athlon Sports Breakout Lineman Across FCS Football list. Hall led the Redhawks in tackles (79), tackles for loss (15) and sacks (9) in 2017. He forced a fumble and blocked a kick as well. Hall turned in 10 or more tackles in four of his final five starts of the season. He ranked eighth in the OVC in tackles, fourth in sacks and third in tackles for loss. Hall finished the year rated 18th in the nation in sacks and 27th in tackles for loss.

# Redhawks Picked Seventh in OVC Preseason Poll

Southeast Missouri was picked seventh in this year's Ohio Valley Conference Predicted Order of Finish with 62 points. Jacksonville State is the preseason favorite after earning 14 first-place votes and 126 points in the overall voting by the conference's Head Coaches and Communications Directors. Austin Peay (112 pts.), UT Martin (95 pts.), Eastern Illinois (73 pts.), Eastern Kentucky (69 pts.) and Tennessee State (64 pts.) were also picked ahead of the Redhawks. Murray State (24 pts.) and Tennessee Tech (23 pts.) complete the poll.

#### **Starting Streak**

Senior Drew Forbes enters Saturday's season-opener at Arkansas State with a streak of 22 consecutive starts at left tackle. Forbes anchors an offensive line that returns three starters.

#### **Interesting Trend**

Southeast Missouri has had three winning seasons in its NCAA Division I era (since 1991). All three of those winning seasons have come at eight-year intervals (1994, 2002, 2010). The 2018 campaign marks eight years from SEMO's last winning campaign. The Redhawks went 9-3, won their only Ohio Valley Conference title and made the NCAA Playoffs that 2010 season.

#### **OVC Action**

Eight of the nine Ohio Valley Conference teams will be in action during week one of the 2018 college football season. Southeast Missouri (at Arkansas State), Austin Peay (at Georgia), UT Martin (at Missouri) and Eastern Illinois (at Arkansas) open the season on the road against Football Bowl Subdivision opponents.

#### **Year Five**

Tom Matukewicz sets to begin his fifth season as head coach at Southeast Missouri.

Matukewicz has three wins over ranked opponents, most in program history. He received a two-year contract extension through the 2020 season.

#### **Roster Talk**

The Redhawks 2018 roster consists of 98 players, including 16 seniors, 24 juniors, 24 sophomores and 34 freshmen. Five of SEMO's seniors are fifth-year players. The Redhawks also return nine starters with five on offense and four on defense. Lucas Orchard (C), Junior Pierre (G), Drew Forbes (OT), Marquis Terry (RB) and Kristian Wilkerson (WR) return on offense, while Zach Hall (ILB), Bydarrius Knighten (FS), Reggie Miles (NT) and Clarence Thornton (DE) are back on defense.

#### **Where They Ranked**

Southeast Missouri led the Ohio Valley Conference and ranked sixth in the Football Championship Subdivision with 37 sacks in 2017. The Redhawks also ranked among the top four teams in the OVC in scoring defense (4th, 21.8 ppg allowed), rushing offense (4th, 137.7 ypg), kickoff returns (3rd, 22.8 ypr), punt return average (3rd, 10.1 ypr), sacks allowed (3rd, 14), fourth-down conversions (3rd, 50 percent), turnover margin (t2nd, +3) and red zone defense (4th, 75 percent).

#### **Close Games**

Winning close games is a big emphasis for the Southeast Missouri football team in 2018. The Redhawks lost five games by a combined 17 points last season. Four of those losses were by three points or less. Since 2014, SEMO has dropped 16 contests by seven points or less and took four one-point losses in that stretch. Also, SEMO was either up or down a score in the fourth quarter a total of 16 times before coming up short in those instances during the last three years alone.

#### **Eisenhart Awarded Scholarship**

Former walk-on Richie Eisenhart enters his senior year on a full scholarship. Eisenhart, a wide receiver, was awarded his scholarship during the final day of spring drills on Apr. 14. He played in 11 games and caught 10 passes for 134 yards and a touchdown last season. Eisenhart is the 11th player to earn a scholarship after joining Southeast Missouri's football program as a walk-on under head coach Tom Matukewicz.

#### Redhawks in the FCS

The Redhawks ranked among the top-30 teams in the Football Championship Subdivision in five categories last season. Southeast Missouri was sixth in sacks (37), 13th in kickoff returns (22.8 ypr), 21st in tackles for loss (7.4 per game), 26th in punt returns (10.1 ypr) and 28th in red zone defense (.750).

#### **Receiving Corps**

Southeast Missouri returns four of its top five receivers from 2017. Kristian Wilkerson led the team in receptions (52), receiving yards (553), receiving touchdowns (5) and receiving yards per game (55.3). Zack Smith ranked third on the team with 20 catches for 253 yards and three touchdowns. Marquis Terry and Eric Williams were fourth and fifth on the team in receptions with 20 and 15, respectively. Wilkerson ranked third in the Ohio Valley Conference in receptions per game (5.2) and seventh in receiving yards per contest.

#### **Racking Up Sacks**

The Redhawks led the Ohio Valley Conference and ranked sixth in the Football Championship Subdivision in sacks last season. Southeast Missouri tallied a total of 37 sacks, averaging 3.3 per contest. SEMO's 37 sacks were second-most in a season in the program's history. It marked the second time the Redhawks finished a season with over 30 sacks under head coach Tom Matukewicz.

#### **Sacks Allowed**

Southeast Missouri's offensive line allowed 14 sacks in 11 games last season, third-fewest in the Ohio Valley Conference. The Redhawks gave up a little over one sack (1.2) per game. SEMO did not allow a sack in three games a year ago.

# **Swift Emerges**

Outside linebacker Justin Swift notched seven sacks in his final four games of the 2017 season. Swift finished second on the team with seven sacks behind fellow returnee Zach Hall (9). He had a season-high three sacks at Jacksonville State (Oct. 28). Swift also had at least nine tackles in three-straight games to

end the year. He will start at outside linebacker this season.

#### On Watch

Jake Reynolds, Zach Hall and Justin Swift enter the season ranked among Southeast Missouri's all-time career leaders. Reynolds is seventh in punting average (39.56 ypp), Hall is tied for seventh in sacks (10.0) and 16th in tackles for loss (18.5), and Swift is tied for 20th in sacks (7.0).

#### Road to 100

Junior wide receiver Kristian Wilkerson is 13 receptions away from 100 in his career. Wilkerson has caught 87 passes for 1,296 yards and nine touchdowns as Southeast Missouri's top receiver. He averages just under 15 yards per catch (14.9) in his career.

#### **Deep Defensive Line**

Southeast Missouri's defensive line is relying heavily on its depth this season. The Redhawks want to be relentless affecting the quarterback and stopping the run, two areas the defensive line excelled in a year ago. In 2017, SEMO led the Ohio Valley Conference in sacks and tied for first with Jacksonville State in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed. Against the run, the Redhawks allowed only seven rushing touchdowns. SEMO did not allow a rushing TD in each of its first three games of the season. Nose tackle Reggie Miles is the only senior on this year's defensive line.

## Season 114

The 2018 campaign is Southeast Missouri's 114th season of football. The Redhawks enter their 28th season at the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision level. SEMO joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1991 and compiled an overall record of 104-200 with one Ohio Valley Conference title (2010) and one NCAA Playoff appearance as a D-I program.

**Redhawks Partner with Under Armour** 

Southeast Missouri and Under Armour, Inc. (NYSE: UA, UAA) announced a new partnership agreement through BSN SPORTS. The Baltimore-based global leader in performance footwear, apparel and equipment became the official outfitter of Southeast Missouri Athletics July 1, 2018. As part of the multi-year agreement, Under Armour will provide on-field and training gear for 15 sports. Additionally, Under Armour will outfit members of the athletic department including coaches and staff. The new official outfitter agreement includes marketing entitlement that will complement Under Armour's brand marketing campaigns through print and venue presence at the University. SEMO's athletic programs include football, men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball, men's cross country, women's cross country, softball, women's tennis, volleyball, women's soccer, men's outdoor track & field, men's indoor track & field, women's outdoor track & field, women's indoor track & field and women's gymnastics. The Redhawks compete at the NCAA Division I level and are part of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA) in football. SEMO first became a member of the Ohio Valley Conference when it moved to NCAA Division I in 1991-92. The Redhawks have won 53 OVC regular-season championships and 18 OVC tournament titles during their first 26 years in the league. SEMO also won seven Women's All-Sports trophies in that span. SEMO joins the growing Under Armour roster of NCAA partners that includes the University of California, Los Angeles, University of California, Berkeley, University of Wisconsin, University of Notre Dame, Naval Academy Athletic Association, University of Maryland, Texas Tech University, Northwestern University, University of Cincinnati, Boston College, University of Utah, University of South Carolina and Auburn University.

#### **Terry Goes Over 100 Again**

Marquis Terry ran for a game-high 116 yards at Tennessee State (Nov. 11), his fourth 100-yard performance of the season. Terry averaged 7.2 yards per carry on 16 attempts. He enters the week first in the Ohio Valley Conference and 15th in the Football Championship Subdivision with 98.4 rushing yards per game. Terry ran for over 100 yards in three of his last four starts.

#### **Redhawks Going Pro**

Five former Southeast Missouri players moved on to the professional football ranks following the 2017 season. Outside linebacker Kendall Donnerson was drafted by the Green Bay Packers in the seventh round of the 2018 NFL Draft. Donnerson is the first SEMO player to get drafted in 14 years. Outside linebacker Chad Meredith and cornerback Mike Ford joined the Detroit Lions as undrafted free agents and defensive back Rico McWilliams joined the Washington Redskins as an undrafted free agent. and quarterback Jesse Hosket the Redhawks starting quarterback the last two seasons, recently signed with upstart Alliance American Football League's Memphis.

#### **Scoring Streak**

The Redhawks presently have the second-longest scoring streak in the Ohio Valley Conference. Southeast Missouri has scored in 77-consecutive games and ranks behind Murray State (142) in that category. The last time the Redhawks were shutout in a game was at Purdue (59-0) on Sept. 17, 2011.

#### On the Road

Southeast Missouri is 3-20 all-time on the road under head coach Tom Matukewicz. The Redhawks beat UT Martin (2014), Austin Peay (2015) and Murray State (2016) for those victories away from home. SEMO's last win on the road was at Murray State (17-16) on Sept. 24, 2016. The Redhawks are looking to end a nine-game losing streak on the road.

# War for the Wheel

Starting this 2018 season, the longstanding football rivalry between Southeast Missouri and Southern Illinois will be deemed "War for the Wheel." Each year, the winner of the game will take an authentic ship wheel to its side of the Mississippi River and proudly display it until the next scheduled matchup. SEMO and SIU used to cross the Mississippi River by boat. One year, SIU's boat sunk and players

had to swim to shore. The SEMO and SIU football rivalry is the oldest in each school's history. The Redhawks hold a 40-37-8 lead in the all-time series which dates back to 1913. SEMO and SIU square off for the 86th time on Sept. 15. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m., CT, at Saluki Stadium.

#### **McDowell Named Offensive Coordinator**

Former Southeast Missouri starting quarterback Jeromy McDowell was hired as the Redhawks offensive coordinator, head football coach Tom Matukewicz announced on Dec. 12. McDowell returns to SEMO after working the last four years at NCAA Division II Colorado Mesa. He spent the 2016 and 2017 seasons as the Mavericks offensive coordinator, McDowell was on the Colorado Mesa staff with Russ Martin, Mike Chavez and Willie Ponder. Martin was the offensive coordinator, Chavez was offensive line coach and Ponder was a star wide receiver when McDowell played guarterback at SEMO. In 2017, McDowell led a Colorado Mesa offense that ranked second in the nation in scoring with 46.4 points per game. The Mavericks also finished seventh nationally in rushing offense (257.8 ypg) and eighth in total offense (489.3 ypg). Colorado Mesa compiled an overall record of 9-2 and 9-1 in conference play en route to its third-consecutive Rocky Mountain Conference title. The Mavericks went a combined 27-7 overall and 25-4 in the Rocky Mountain Conference over the last three seasons. Prior to beginning his college coaching career, McDowell served as a high school coach for 10 years, including his last five as head coach at North County High School in Bonne Terre, Missouri. He led the Raiders to back-to-back conference championships in 2012 and 2013 McDowell played quarterback at Southeast from 2001-03. He completed 219-of-389 passes for 2,651 yards and 17 touchdowns in his career. McDowell ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in pass efficiency (8th, 119.2). He also rates among Southeast's alltime single-season leaders in passing yards per game (7th, 186.5 ypg, 2001), touchdown passes (t9th, 13, 2001), pass attempts (t10th, 288, 2001), pass completion percentage

(2nd, 64.6, 2003) and passing yards (10th, 2,051, 2001). Additionally, McDowell threw for 391 yards in a 24-5 victory over Southern Illinois on Sept. 8, 2001, third-most in a single game at Southeast. McDowell graduated with a degree in business education from Central Methodist University.

# TOM MATUKEWICZ

ttitude, Effort, Passion and Discipline are the cornerstones of Tom Matukewicz's process-driven Southeast Missouri football program.

Matukewicz enters his fifth year as the Redhawks head coach in 2018. Matukewicz has guided his teams to three wins over nationally-ranked Football Championship Subdivision opponents, the most of any head coach in program history.

Following the 2017 campaign,

Matukewicz received a two-year contract extension through the 2020 season.

Southeast led the Ohio Valley Conference and ranked sixth in the Football Championship Subdivision with 37 sacks in 2017. The Redhawks also ranked among the top four teams in the league in scoring defense (21.8 ppg allowed), rushing offense (4th, 137.7 ypg), kickoff returns (3rd, 22.8 ypr), punt return average (3rd, 10.1 ypr), sacks allowed (3rd, 14), fourth-

down conversions (3rd, 50 pct.), turnover margin (t2nd, +3) and red zone defense (4th, 75 pct.).

Four Redhawks, including Kendall Donnerson (first-team), Marquis Terry (first-team), Zach Hall (second-team) and Drew Forbes (second-team) garnered All-OVC accolades. Donnerson was later drafted by the Green Bay Packers, becoming the first Southeast player to be drafted in 14 years.

In 2016, Southeast lost four games by a combined 12 points en route to finishing with an overall record of 3-8.

The Redhawks ranked third in the OVC in both scoring defense (24.4 ppg allowed) and rushing defense (138.5 ypg allowed), and boasted the league's second-best red zone defense. Five Redhawks, including Chad Meredith (First-Team), Alex Knight (First-Team), Cameron Sanders (First-Team), Will Young (Second-Team) and Jesse Hosket (All-Newcomer) earned All-OVC honors.

Another strong recruiting class will have a big hand in helping Southeast improve on its 3-8 record and sixth-place OVC finish a year ago.

Southeast completed its 2015 campaign ranked among the top three teams in the OVC in rushing offense (2nd, 182.9 ypg), kickoff returns (20.6 ypr), punt return average (3rd, 9.6 ypr), kickoff coverage (2nd, 40.6 net avg.), sacks (2nd, 31), fourth down conversions (2nd, 60 pct.) and turnover margin (1st, +10). The Redhawks 31 sacks were third-most in a season.

In addition, Southeast led the league in turnover margin after ranking last in that category the year before. The Redhawks faced four ranked teams and lost four games by a combined 14 points last season, as well.

Individually, Dante Vandeven, Tremane McCullough, Paul McRoberts, Garret Baker, Mike Ford, Knight and Roper Garrett earned All-OVC honors in 2015.

Vandeven was the league's Freshman of the Year, McCullough and McRoberts were first-team selections and Baker, Garrett, Knight and Ford were second-team picks. Vandeven, McCullough, Baker, Garrett, Knight and Ford are back this year.

McRoberts went on to sign as an undrafted free agent with the Los Angeles Rams and was then signed to the team's active roster on Dec. 23, 2016.

A native of Silver Lake, Kansas, Matukewicz hit the ground running during his head coaching debut in 2014, leading the Redhawks to their most wins in a season since 2010.

Along the way, Southeast celebrated two wins over ranked opponents, beating then-No. 3 Southeastern Louisiana and then-No. 20 Tennessee State. Southeastern Louisiana was the highest-ranked opponent Southeast had ever beaten and the 2014 campaign marked the first time the Redhawks knocked off two ranked opponents in a season.

After those wins, Southeast moved to No. 23 in the Oct. 6, 2014 Sports Network



Poll, claiming its first Top 25 ranking since the end of the 2010 season.

Statistically, the Redhawks led the OVC in third down conversion percentage (45.7), fourth down conversion percentage (66.7) and sacks allowed (9).

Southeast was also sixth in the Football Championship Subdivision in sacks allowed, 13th in fourth down conversion percentage and 14th in third down conversion percentage.

As a team, the Redhawks scored 384 points, their most in a season since 2002.

The excitement of
Matukewicz's brick-by-brick
approach generated an increase
in home attendance during two
of his first three seasons as
head coach.

Matukewicz coached a total of 14 All-OVC performers, including one OVC Freshman of the Year (Vandeven), six firstteam selections (McRoberts, McCullough, Ryan McCrum, Knight, Chad Meredith, Cameron Sanders) and seven secondteam picks (DeMichael Jackson, Tim Hamm-Bey, Baker, Garrett, Ford, Knight, Young) during his first three years as Southeast's head coach. McRoberts also became the first Redhawks player invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Off the field, Matukewicz's program is highly visible in the community and often engages in random acts of kindness. He simply uses goodwill to teach his players valuable life lessons.



As part of a Pink Up Jersey Auction, the football team raised \$55,000 for breast cancer awareness over the last three years. The Redhawks don special pink jerseys, each personalized with a name in honor or memory of a survivor or loved one during one of their games each season.

Before its 2016 seasonopener at Memphis, Southeast visited St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Redhawk players, coaches and support staff toured the amazing facility that leads the way the world understands, treats and defeats childhood cancer and other lifethreatening diseases. Southeast donated teddy bears and other items along with a check for over \$500 to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

On July 21, 2016, Matukewicz organized a Cops and Hawks flag football game which brought a whole community together in light of recent shootings in the United States. Redhawk players and local law enforcement officials were teammates in the event which raised \$4,500 for BackStoppers, a non-profit organization that provides needed financial assistance and support to the spouses and dependent children of fallen and injured service members in the line of duty.

During Southeast's 2014 season-opener against Missouri



Baptist, the Redhawk captains took a No. 14 jersey to midfield for the coin toss to honor the memory of Kaden Robert.

Robert was a Kelly High School football player who died in an accidental shooting in June, 2014.

A week later, Michael Douglas, a 16-year old from Kansas, accompanied the Redhawks on the sideline for their game against the Jayhawks on Sept. 6, 2014. Douglas was diagnosed with an interstitial lung disease when he was a year old and has to use an oxygen tank. The teenager initially contacted wide receiver Mike Cyliax for an autograph last summer. Once Matukewicz heard the story, he wrote Douglas a letter and invited him to the game.

Southeast's football program generously donated to the Nolan

Weber Believers 5K & Fun Run/ Walk in nearby Jackson. Weber was a soccer player at Jackson High School who fought brain cancer for almost three years (doubling the life expectancy of what his illness normally came with) before he passed away. The contribution went to the Believing Beyond Nolan Weber Foundation that provides financial and/or spiritual/ emotional support to children and their families battling cancer and other catastrophic illnesses.

Matukewicz also presented a check to the parents of Dominic Hooper -- a Scott City teen who tied in February, 2014 from injuries sustained in an ATV accident -- during the team's annual spring game.

A tireless worker, Matukewicz brings energy and passion

unlike any other. His commitment to excellence and brick-by-brick mantra have the Redhawks soaring to new heights.

Popularly known as "Coach Tuke," Matukewicz was introduced as Southeast's 13th head coach on Dec. 18, 2013. Matukewicz is used to transforming programs into winners and he did just that as an assistant coach at Northern Illinois and Southern Illinois.

While at NIU, Matukewicz helped lead the Huskies to the Mid-American Conference West title in 2010 and an outright MAC Championship in 2011. Matukewicz was the linebackers coach in 2011 after serving as defensive run-game coordinator for three seasons under thenhead coach Jerry Kill.

Matukewicz reached the pinnacle of his NIU stint when he was interim head coach for the Huskies' trip to the 2010 Humanitarian Bowl after Kill accepted the Minnesota job at the end of the season. He led NIU to a commanding 40-17 victory over Fresno State in that game.

Matukewicz was responsible for coordinating the Huskies' run defense during his first three seasons at NIU. In 2010, the Huskies ranked 24th nationally and third in the MAC in rushing defense, allowing 126.5 yards per game. NIU also had the MAC's No. 1 total defense in 2008 and 2009.

In his first year in DeKalb, Matukewicz was part of a staff that turned NIU into the No. 1 scoring and total defense in the MAC, and one of the top 20 units in the country. The Huskies boasted the secondmost improved scoring defense in the nation in 2008. That year, NIU allowed only 18 points per game, down from 30.8 the previous season. The Huskies ranked 17th nationally in total defense and was fifth in the country in pass defense.

Before that, Matukewicz spent seven seasons at SIU. As linebackers coach and run-game coordinator, he had a big hand in three Missouri Valley Football Conference championships (2003, 2004, 2005) and five NCAA Football Championship Subdivision playoff berths (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007).

Matukewicz was named the 2007 FCS Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association after helping turn the Salukis into one of the top rushing defenses in the nation. SIU held its opponents to a rushing average below 135 yards per game every year from 2002-07. The Salukis had three of the top-10 rushing defenses in program history during that time.

Matukewicz's 2004 linebacker corps formed the heart of a defense which gave up just 101.7 rushing yards per game, led the nation in scoring defense and allowed 13.2 points per contest. Matukewicz made one more stop at the University of Toledo prior to accepting his first head coaching job at Southeast.

At Toledo, Matukewicz was

defensive coordinator and linebackers coach for the 2012 and 2013 seasons.

In 2012, Matukewicz helped guide a defense that ranked among the top 25 in the nation in fourth-down conversion (9th), red-zone defense (10th), interceptions (18th) and turnovers forced (25th). The Rockets went 9-4 and earned a trip to the 2012 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Matukewicz's defense also featured the nation's leading tackler in linebacker Dan Molls. Molls had 166 tackles, earned First-Team All-MAC honors and became Toledo's first Academic All-American in eight years.

Matukewicz completed his undergraduate work at Fort Hays State. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1997 and then earned his master's degree in administration at Pittsburg State.

Fort Hays State (1996-97),
Pittsburg State (1997-99),
Coffeyville Community College
(1999-2000) and Emporia State
(2000-01) prior to his NCAA
Division I football tenure.

Matukewicz and his wife, Lenna, have two daughters, Georgia and Shelby.
