be Stuber Track Complex is the home location for meets held at Southeast Missouri during the outdoor season. Considered one of the finest track facilities in the Midwest, it has been the host of the Ohio Valley Conference Outdoor Track & Field Championships seven times and three NCAA Division II Championships. The facility is also home to the Joey Haines Invitational which is held during the first weekend of April every year.


Dedicated in the spring of 1980 and named after the late Abe Stuber - who coached the Southeast track squads from 1932-46 - the facility includes a press box and spectator seating for up to 2,000.

Recently, an \$800,000 update took place as all track and field runways were resurfaced,

jumping areas were renovated and new fencing was added to the complex. Previous updates included a brand new hammer cage added in March, 2012 and an office/weight room adjacent to the track in 2002.

The 2,000-square foot building houses a weight room, coaches offices, restrooms and storage. The weight room is equipped with seven multipower racks and lifting platforms, containing nearly 5,000 pounds of free weights, 3,000 pounds of dumbbells and numerous weight training machines.

The Abe Stuber Track Complex is located on the north edge of campus off Sprigg Street and within walking distance to the University.



meets. All events are held in the
east gym of the facility.

The Student Recreation Center is the headquarters of the Recreation Services Department and is the primary facility for recreation activity.

The indoor track is a four lane, 170 meter running/ walking track (nine laps per mile). A work out "pit" is the main attraction of the building, containing 4,252 square feet of free weight, plate loaded and cable system equipment.

The facility also contains multiple levels of cardio machines, with one overlooking the track and basketball courts in the east gymnasium. The east gym also features a rock climbing wall, raquetball courts

and secluded dumbell room.

The facility contains five basketball courts in total and plays host to both men's and women's basketball practices throughout the year.

he Holcomb Success Center offers Southeast Missouri student-athletes a place to study and develop as students and campus leaders.

It is located in the Student Recreation Center, just south of Houck Field. The Holcomb Success Center offers a computer lab with 18 work terminals, study areas and rooms for group meetings. The facility houses the Southeast Academic Services staff and main weight room for Redhawk student-athletes.

The beautiful facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by SEMO studentathletes.

A total of 229 individuals achieved a 3.0 or higher grade point average during the 2018-19 academic year equating to 67.7 percent of the entire student-athlete population. Forty-five of those studentathletes recorded perfect 4.0 GPAs.

The SEMO women's tennis team led the department with a 3.87 cumulative GPA and registered a 4.0 during the spring semester alone. Women's cross country (3.75), gymnastics (3.70), women's soccer (3.69), softball (3.67), women's track & field (3.62), volleyball (3.61), baseball (3.27), women's basketball (3.19) and men's cross country (3.16) followed as the other programs to post 3.16 or better GPAs.

During the spring semester, SEMO's Department of Athletics accumulated a 3.23 GPA. Women's tennis (4.0), softball (3.74), women's track & field (3.71), volleyball (3.68) and women's soccer (3.67) filled the top five GPAs over the spring term. The 3.23 GPA was the Redhawks highest for any semester since 2014-15.

In all, 68 student-athletes received their degrees, including 18 in the fall and 50 in the spring.

Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress is monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study skills and life skills topics, and thus, enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories.

Student-athletes can also receive individualized academic programs which include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The Holcomb Success

The life skills programming provides educational programs designed to assist studentathletes in identifying and applying transferable skills and experiences to prepare them to succeed outside of the athletic arena.

SEMO's weight room renovations at the Holcomb Success Center were completed in January, 2016. Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation, which cost \$500,000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle SEMO's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Branding and new lighting were also included in the overall project.

The newly-renovated weight room enhances training with the best equipment available and is able to accomodate larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time.

Education. Those are the four primary phases of athletic training, and the Southeast Missouri athletic training staff strives to fulfill all of those areas when working with studentathletes on a daily basis.

SEMO student-athletes are offered the best care possible by the athletic training staff. The Sports Medicine department includes five full-time athletic trainers, six graduate assistants and several student assistants. The staff serves student-athletes around-the-clock at numerous facilities on campus.

The athletic trainers begin treatments and rehabilitation starting as early as 6 a.m., and are available until the last student-athlete is through.

There are currently four athletic training facilities on

campus. The staff treats out of the Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary training room is located. There are two other satellite athletic training rooms, including one at Houck Field House and one at the Show Me Center.

The SEMO athletic training rooms are equipped with stationary bikes, hand weights, therapeutic modalities and the latest physical therapy equipment. Each component is strategically designed to not only give the student-athlete the best care, but also to aid in returning to competition as quickly as possible.

The SEMO Athletic Training program prides and commits itself to providing the best comprehensive, personalized and efficient healthcare to its student-athletes.









r. Carlos Vargas became the 18th president of Southeast Missouri State University July 1, 2015, after having served as acting president at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania.

Since becoming president, Dr. Vargas has launched initiatives to marshal the resources, leverage opportunities and address a variety of challenges and needs of Southeast Missouri State University. He has set as primary goals for the institution the support for student persistence and retention.

He has encouraged and supported the identification and development of innovative academic programs, including bachelor's degrees in Unmanned Aircraft Systems, Geographic Information Science, and industrial and

systems engineering. He has continued to support the globalization of the campus through expansion of study-abroad experiences, extensive engagement of international students, and encouragement of students on campus and abroad to explore cultural interaction. He has championed the work of the President's Task Force on Diversity Education and continued emphasizing the expectations for enhancement of the teacher-scholar model. Under President Vargas' leadership, regional partnerships and collaborations have been solidified, including several joint initiatives with Three Rivers, Mineral Area and other community colleges.

Prior to assuming the presidency at Southeast, Dr. Vargas served one year as

acting president of Kutztown University, where he also served as the provost and vice president for academic and student affairs.

Prior to his tenure at Kutztown, Dr. Vargas was at Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio, where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs. He previously served in several roles at Kent State University (Ohio) for a total of 18 years, including founding director of the program on electron beam technology. He was also Kent's associate dean for research, interim assistant dean for research and interim assistant dean for the School of Technology. He started his tenure at Kent State in 1985 as a professor, and continued to teach until his departure from the university in 2003.

Dr. Vargas began his career in higher education at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), from which he received a Bachelor of Science in physics.

He earned his Ph.D. in physics and aerospace science from the University of Michigan and he has Master of Science degrees from Michigan in both physics and aerospace science. He is married to Pam Vargas, who currently serves as director of Research and Grant Development at Southeast, and they have a son, a daughter, and two granddaughters.

rady Barke is in his fourth year as Southeast Missouri's Director of Athletics.

Barke served as the Interim Director of Athletics since July, 2015, before being named to the permanent position of Director of Athletics on June 7, 2016

During the 2018-19 season, the Redhawks finished fifth in the Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner's Cup standings, improving three spots from where they ranked the previous year. SEMO accumulated a total of 98.75 points in the overall scoring and was awarded 12.5 points for winning the softball OVC regular season and tournament titles. The Redhawks tacked on a combined 43 points between second-place finishes in women's cross country, women's outdoor track & field, football and men's outdoor track & field.

Academically, SEMO's athletic teams were once again strong in the classroom.

A total of 229 individuals achieved a 3.0 or higher grade point average during the 2018-19 academic year equating to 67.7 percent of the entire student-athlete population.

Forty-five of those studentathletes recorded perfect 4.0 GPAs. The women's tennis team led the athletics department with a 3.87 cumulative GPA and registered a perfect 4.0 in the spring semester. SEMO's 3.23 spring GPA was the department's highest in any semester over the last 10 years.

In all, 68 student-athletes received degrees, including 18 in the fall and 50 in the spring. Additionally, the women's cross country and volleyball programs earned NCAA Public Recognition awards based on their multiyear Academic Progress Rates for the fourth year in a row.

The upcoming 2019-20 campaign marks SEMO's second year with Under Armour. Barke reached a multi-year agreement with the Baltimore-based global leader

in performance footwear, apparel and equipment that made Under Armour the official outfitter of Southeast Missouri Athletics on July 1, 2018.

As part of the multi-year agreement, Under Armour provides on-field and training gear for 15 sports. Additionally, Under Armour outfits members of the athletic department including coaches and staff.

Most recently, renovations have been made to the nutrition area that serves as a fueling station for SEMO student-athletes at the Holcomb Success Center. Construction for a new hitting facility at Capaha Field is underway and scheduled to be completed by the start of the upcoming 2020 baseball season.

During his first year in 2016-17, Barke introduced Andy Sawyers as the Redhawks head baseball coach and worked tirelessly on two major renovation projects.

Nearly a month after Sawyers was hired, Southeast Missouri

State and the City of Cape Girardeau officially broke ground on Capaha Field. New synthetic turf, new fencing and a digital scoreboard in the outfield were added as part of the \$1.8 million project that was completed before SEMO's season-opener.

On Feb. 3, 2017, SEMO formally dedicated Holcomb Success Center. To honor the long-time service and philanthropy of Dr. John and Judy Holcomb, the University named the facility the Holcomb Success Center located in the Student Recreation Center-South.

Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation at a cost of \$500,000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle Southeast's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Barke helped secure the Holcomb's gift, the largest single cash gift in SEMO Athletics history.

Major improvements were also made to the second floor of the building where athletic academic services are housed. This space provides student-athletes with places to study and features a computer lab with 30 work terminals and rooms for group meetings. Staff members assist student-athletes with life skills development, academic advising and academic progress toward degree requirements and NCAA eligibility.

Fundraising continues to increase under Barke's leadership.

The 2018-19 campaign marked the fifth consecutive year of growth for the Redhawks Club general fund. It is the highest level of giving to the Redhawks Club general fund since 2003-04.

Barke also worked with donors to establish two new endowed scholarships for student-athletes and raised over \$60,000 to support the

SEMO football program and summer school scholarships.

More than \$250,000 in pledges for the Redhawks Club unrestricted booster fund has been raised with Barke as Director of Athletics. Over \$200,000 was raised in Sponsorship & Marketing contracts each of the last two years. The 2018-19 season was the fifth-consecutive year of Sponsorship and Marketing revenues.

Barke has also worked hard to enhance Redhawks branding around the community. Redhawk banners, S-E! M-O! billboards, Welcome to Redhawk country and Your Redhawks yard signs are prominently displayed all over Cape Girardeau.

Barke created the Redhawks Trivia Night & Auction, a sold out event that generated over \$40,000 in net revenue its first year. In addition, he launched the Redhawks BRIDGE program which provides student-athletes with

both leadership and life skills experiences through interactive programming that will prepare them to be successful in life after athletics.

Barke, senior associate to the president and secretary to the Board of Regents at Southeast, officially began as Director of Athletics on July 1, 2016.

Barke served as Interim Associate Director of Athletics for Compliance & Student Support Services before being named the Senior Associate to the President and Secretary to the Southeast Missouri State University Board of Regents in

He began his tenure at Southeast in 2008 as Assistant Director of Athletics for Compliance & Eligibility. Barke previously served as a governance intern with the NCAA national headquarters in Indianapolis, and as a law clerk with the Southern Illinois University-Carbondale Department of Athletics Compliance Office.

Barke has served as a member of the National Association of Athletics Compliance (NAAC), chaired the NAAC Education Committee, and was a member of the NAAC Board of Directors. He has facilitated the NCAA Regional Leadership Academy, and served on both the NCAA Sports Wagering Task Force and the Olympic Sports Liaison Committee.

Barke has a juris doctorate degree from Southern Illinois University School of Law, an MBA from Southeast Missouri State University, and a bachelor of science degree in biology from Webster University. While a student at Webster, Barke was a member of both the basketball and golf teams and was inducted into the Webster Athletic Hall of Fame.

He and his wife, Halley, are parents of three children. Mabrie, Jackson, and Kolbe.



Maddie Keller and Carli Knott both finished in the top-10 to earn All-Ohio Valley Conference honors as the Southeast women grabbed fourth (109 points) as a team in the 5K at the 2019 OVC Cross Country Championship held at the SIUE Cross Country Course in Edwardsville, Illinois.

Keller placed fifth overall in the 5K, crossing the finish line in a personal-best 17:57.3 for First-Team All-OVC laurels. Keller's finish is the best Redhawk women's finish at the Championship since **Rebekah Lawson** was the runner-up at the 2013 Championship in Morehead, Kentucky. The award also marked the first career All-OVC honor for Keller.

Knott garnered her second career Second-Team All-OVC cross country laurel with a 10th place finish in 18:16.9. *Hannah Eastman, Katie Wegmann* and *Danielle Mohrmann* rounded out the Redhawk scorers for fourth overall in the women's team competition. Eastman was 29th in the race in a personal-best 19:02.2 and Wegmann followed in a career-best

19:03.6 for 30th. Mohrmann completed the race in 19:15.3 for 38th.

The SEMO women placed first at the Saluki Invite and second out of a field of 20 teams at the Bradley Intercollegiate to start the season.

Knott and Keller were the top-two finishers for the Redhawks at each of the four races prior to the OVC Championship. The one-two punch was third and fourth at the season-opening Saluki Invite before taking second and third at the Bradley Intercollegiate.

Knott and Keller also placed in the top-15 at Missouri's Gans Creek Classic and in the top-20 at the Bradley 'Pink' Classic. Knott posted the third-best 6K time (21:25.6, 11th, PR) in the OVC at the Bradley Pink Classic and was recognized as OVC Female Co-Runner of the Week after her Bradley Intercollegiate performance.

Eastman has been the third fastest finisher for the women in all four races. Wegmann (3), Mohrmann



(3), **Mackenzie Pugh** (1) and **Claire Morrill** (1) have also rounded out the top-five Redhawk scorers.

Keller concluded the season with a top-100 finish at the 2019 NCAA Division I Midwest Region Cross Country Championship held at the Oklahoma State University Cross Country Course. The Southeast women totaled 717 points for 27th in the team standings to finish ahead of DePaul, Southern Illinois, Drake, Illinois-Chicago, Oklahoma and Western Illinois.

Keller posted a time of 22:16.8 for 78th out of a field of 235 at her first career Regional. Knott completed the women's 6K in 22:46.9 for 114th.

Mohrmann (151st, 23:22.4), **Jane Boessen** (195th, 24:25.3) and Eastman (200th, 24:31.5) rounded out the Redhawk women's top-five after Keller and Knott. Pugh (202nd, 24:38.2) and Wegmann (212th, 24:48.0) also ran in the race for Southeast.



The Southeast men finished eighth (202 points) as a team at the 2019 OVC Cross Country Championship held at the SIUE Cross Country Course in Edwardsville, Illinois, which matched the team's finish at the 2018 Championship.

Chris Durr finished 33rd overall in the 8K in 26:01.7 to lead the Southeast men. Griffin Bailey placed 40th with a mark of 26:23.8. Freshmen Caleb Cornelius (27:10.9, 51st), Aaron Modrow (27:21.8, 54th) and Terrico Garrett (27:34.0, PR, 58th) rounded out the men's scorers.

Durr led the men in all four meets this season prior to the OVC Championship. He paced the team with a career-best 5K time (16:19.93) for third overall at the Saluki Invite and placed in the top-25 at the Bradley Intercollegiate.

Southeast has relied on its youth to complete their top-five scorers. Modrow, Cornelius, Garrett and *Kory Snyder* have all been scorers in their inaugural collegiate campaigns. Juniors *Austin Perkins* and *Trevor Falco* have also scored for the SEMO men in 2019.

The Redhawk men compiled a team score of 825 points for 27th at the 2019 NCAA Division I Midwest Region Cross Country Championship held at the Oklahoma State University Cross Country Course to conclude the season.

Cornelius, a Cape Girardeau, Missouri native, crossed the finish in 34:00.7 for 149th in the men's 10K. Durr posted a personal-best mark of 34:37.0 for 170th. Modrow (181st, 35:11.5), Bailey (35:45.3, 184th) and Garrett (193rd, 36:47.9) also scored for the SEMO men.

Snyder (36:59.0, 194th) and Perkins (37:25.7, 195th) both represented Southeast in the race as well.

ric Crumpecker is in his 11th season as head coach of the Southeast Missouri men's and women's track and field teams.

Crumpecker is in his 27th year at Southeast, having served 17 years as an assistant under legendary head coach Joey Haines.

Last season, the Redhawks men and women finished fourth at the indoor championship and were the runners-up at the outdoor championship held in Cape Girardeau, Missouri. Crumpecker coached 2019 OVC Indoor Field Athlete of the Year Anya Tonga (indoor weight throw champion), 2019 OVC Outdoor Championship MVP Logan Blomquist (outdoor discus and hammer champion) and Stephen Zagurski (indoor shot put champion). Blomquist captured the hammer throw title with a Southeast program record and OVC Championship record at the outdoor championship.

In 2018, SEMO's men placed third in the conference at both the indoor and outdoor championships. The women finished fifth at the outdoor league championship and sixth at the OVC indoor meet. Crumpecker coached 2018 OVC Champions in Anya Tonga (indoor weight throw), Logan Blomquist (indoor shot put, outdoor discus) as well as OVC Field Athlete of the Year, OVC javelin champion and Second-Team All-American Jonno Engelking.

In 2017, Crumpecker won his third OVC Outdoor Coach of the Year honor as Southeast captured their eighth outdoor championship, marking back-to-back years Crumpecker has taken home both awards. It marked the eighth time the men have won conference in program history. Zach Gordon was named OVC Men's Championship MVP and Logan Blomquist earned OVC Freshman of the Year Honors.

Earlier in 2016, Crumpecker won his second OVC Outdoor Coach of the Year laurel as the Redhawks earned their seventh outdoor championship. He helped coach Kevin Farley towards his second championship MVP performance as Farley took gold in the shot put, discus and hammer throw. Farley's success continued at the NCAA



Outdoor Championships, earning first-team All-America honors in discus in eighth place and second-team All-America in shot put in 10th.

In 2015, Crumpecker led the Southeast men's program to its second consecutive OVC indoor title and earned his second OVC Men's Indoor Coach of the Year award. During the conference meet, 10 Redhawk athletes brought home gold medals. Following the victory, Reggie Miller and Blake Smith qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships in the triple jump and 60-meter dash, respectively. Smith finished 10th in the nation at 6.66 seconds during the preliminary race at nationals, falling short of the NCAA's final group of eight by just 0.05 seconds.

In 2014, Southeast Missouri won the men's indoor title followed by sweeping the outdoor championships for the first time since 2006. It was the first men's indoor championship since 1996. Crumpecker was awarded OVC Men's Coach of the Year following both the indoor and outdoor seasons. The 2014 indoor season featured Farley as Indoor Field Athlete of the Year, Indoor Freshman of the Year Chris Martin and Smith earning OVC Athlete of the Championship. The outdoor season featured Female Field Athlete of the Year Kayla Gutierrez. His student-athletes combined to win 10 individual OVC titles during the season. Gutierrez brought home gold in the indoor weight throw and outdoor discus events. Farley won the indoor shot put and outdoor hammer throw. In his first season with the Redhawks, Shon Kyle won the shot put and discus events at the outdoor championship. Courtney Gapelu took gold in both the indoor and outdoor shot put.

In 2013, the Redhawks won their first team OVC title under Crumpecker. The women snagged the team crown at the OVC Indoor Championships, using a balanced effort that featured only one individual conference champion, but three runner-up finishes and several strong supporting performances. Crumpecker was voted the OVC Women's Coach of the Year following the team title, marking the first time he has been voted the league's top coach. The Southeast men continued to knock on the door for a team title, finishing second at both the indoor and outdoor meets.

Southeast has also experienced tremendous postseason success individually under Crumpecker's guidance. The Redhawks sent three competitors to the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in 2013, the most individuals from the program since 2006. Farley took seventh in the shot put, breaking the school record with a throw of 61' 11\%" to become the first Redhawk to earn first-team All-American honors since Miles Smith in 2008. Craig Robinson and Gapelu also qualified for the NCAA West Region



prelims. Southeast also got second-team All-American performances from Blake Carter in both the indoor and outdoor long jump while Miller earned honorable mention All-American in the outdoor high jump for the second consecutive year.

The Redhawks totaled three second-place team finishes at the OVC Indoor and Outdoor Championships during the 2011-12 season. Both the men and women finished as runner-up during the outdoor meet while the men posted another second-place point total indoors. Crumpecker works closely with the throwers group that combined for three conference titles. Josh Uchtman, the 2012 Male Field Athlete of the Year during the indoor season, claimed the shot put indoors. Brian Grote and Robinson won gold in the javelin and shot put, respectively, at the outdoor meet. In total, the Redhawks won nine individual OVC titles in 2011-12.

In addition to the three individual conference champion throwers, Farley was named the OVC Male Freshman of the Year during the outdoor season.

During Crumpecker's tenure as head coach, the Redhawks have finished in the top three in all but eight OVC indoor or outdoor meet (28 of 36). The men have finished second nine times while the women have been runner-up eight times.

Individually, he has mentored 97 individual OVC champions, 48 regional qualifiers and 10 NCAA National Championships qualifiers. Redhawks student-athletes have won OVC Field Athlete of the Year 14 times, Track Athlete of the Year once, Athlete of the Year twice and Freshman of the Year eight times.

The Redhawks have also been stellar in the classroom under Crumpecker. Both the men's and women's track and field programs have earned All-Academic Team recognition from the US Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) in five of his six years as head coach. Jill Schnurbusch and Farley were both placed on the USTFCCCA's All-Academic team in 2012-13. Additionally, Alex Zisser earned third-team Academic All-America honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) while Farley and Joel Krause joined Zisser on the Academic All-District team.

During his time as an assistant coach he worked primarily with the field events, Crumpecker was a part of 20 OVC team titles, coached 81 OVC individual champions, 131 All-OVC performers, six OVC Track Athletes of the Year, four NCAA national finalists, 12 NCAA provisional qualifiers, 26 NCAA regional qualifiers and five regional finalists. He guided Southeast student-athletes to 11 school records and three OVC marks.

A native of Union, Missouri, Crumpecker is a USATF Level 1 certified coach. He earned a bachelor's degree in History from Missouri S&T and a master's in Higher Education Administration from Southeast. As a collegiate athlete, Crumpecker was a starting lineman for the Miners football team and earned All-MIAA honors in the shot put and discus for the track team.

Cumpecker and his wife, Amy, reside in nearby Jackson, Missouri. They are parents of a daughter, Ella, and son, Jake.

yan Lane is in his 10th season at Southeast Missouri as the head cross country coach, while also serving as the assistant track coach specializing in distance running.

The Redhawk women's cross country team has finished in the top four each of the past seven seasons.

Maddie Keller and Carli Knott both placed in the top-10 to earn All-Ohio Valley Conference honors as the Southeast women grabbed fourth as a team in the 5K at the 2019 OVC Cross Country Championship. Keller placed fifth overall in the 5K for First-Team All-OVC laurels. Keller's finish is the best Redhawk women's finish at the Championship since Rebekah Lawson was the runner-up at the 2013 Championship in Morehead, Kentucky. Knott garnered her second career Second-Team All-OVC cross country laurel with a 10th place finish.

In 2019, Lane also coached OVC Outdoor Track Champions in Carli Knott (1,500 meters) and Kaitlyn Shea (3,000 meter steeplechase).

Kaitlyn Shea, Sydney O'Brien and Carli Knott registered three All-OVC performances for the first time since 2008 as SEMO's women finished runners-up at the 2018 OVC Cross Country Championship in Cape Girardeau at the Osage Centre.

The 2017 season was highlighted by a fourth place finish from the women at the OVC Championships. Kaitlyn Shea led the Redhawks on



the season with two first-place finishes and a second team All-OVC selection.

During the 2016 season, the women placed second in conference and 16th at regionals. Megan Parks and Sydney O'Brien became the first Southeast duo to finish in the top 50 at Regionals since 1998. The programs have combined for 18 All-OVC performers, including six first-team runners while under Lane.

In 2015, the women's team placed third in the Ohio Valley Conference. Megan Parks earned Second Team All-Conference honors with a 12th place finish at the OVC Championships. Kaitlyn Shea was named Female Freshman of the Year and was the first female in program history to win the award.

The 2014 season saw the end of Rebekah Lawson's cross country career. Lane saw Lawson through her career for four seasons. Lawson is the only Redhawk in Division I history to earn First Team All-OVC honors all four years of their career. The women's team capped a great 2014 season with a fourth-place finish at the OVC Championships. The men finished sixth at the event.

In 2011, both the men and women had one first-team and one second-team All-OVC finisher. Nate Shipley's third-place finish garnered him a spot on the all-conference first team while Brent Collins earned second team all-conference on the men's side. Rebekah Lawson took sixth as a freshman to earn the first team nod while fellow freshman Jenny Govero made second team All-OVC.

The cross country programs have combined for 23 All-OVC performers, including eight first-team runners while under Lane.

The Redhawks have also excelled in the classroom under Lane. In 2013, both the men's and women's programs earned All Academic honors from the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches' Association (USTFCCCA). Southeast's women posted a 3.72 team GPA, the fifth-highest mark in the nation, while the men's 3.48 GPA was good for 11th. The achievement marks



the fourth-straight year at least one of the cross country programs earned academic recognition under Lane.

Lane's success with the distance runners has carried over to the track as well. Lawson notched a runner-up finish in the 5000m indoors to earn second-team All-OVC honors in 2013. During the outdoor season, Charles Johnson garnered second-team All-OVC recognition for his runner-up finish in the steeplechase.

The 2012 season saw Jessica Bollinger win an OVC title outdoors in the 10,000m while Lawson finished runner-up in both the 5000m and 10,000m. On the men's side, Mohammed Souleiman won an OVC title in the 800m while Chris Loseman earned second-team All-OVC honors after finishing runner-up in the 10,000m.

Lane's athletes have combined for 10 All-OVC selections and three OVC titles in his first three seasons.

Lane returned to the Southeast program in which he interned as coach in 2008-09. That season, the Redhawk cross country teams recorded top-three finishes at the Ohio Valley Conference Championships. During that time, he received his Master's in Higher Education, finishing with a 4.0 GPA.

Prior to his coaching internship at Southeast, Lane worked as an assistant coach for the Cape Central High School cross country and track programs. He also served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Francis Howell North High School (2006-07). In all, Lane coached 41 All-State performers at the prep level.

Lane competed as a member Southeast cross country and track teams from 2002-2003, before an injury cut his career short.

He received his undergraduate degree from Southeast in 2006, graduating with a magna cum laude distinction in Education.







anielle Burbage enters her fifth season with the Southeast Missouri track and field team as an assistant coach. Burbage serves as the Redhawks sprints, hurdles and relays coach.

In her time at Southeast, she has coached decathletes to 18 personal-best marks (six indoors, 12 outdoors) and her heptathletes have earned eight careerhigh scores (three indoor, five outdoor).

In 2017, Burbage coached Nick South who was the OVC Men's Indoor Heptathlon Champion and the OVC Outdoor Men's Decathlon silver medalist as the Redhawks men were named 2017 OVC Outdoor Track & Field Champions. She also coached NCAA West Preliminary Qualifiers Zach Gordon and Brannon Wright who finished first and second at the OVC Outdoor Championship.

In 2016, Burbage helped coach Taylor Coffelt to an outstanding senior year where Coffelt set six personal records. Coffelt won gold in the heptathlon with a career-high score of 4,877 at the OVC Outdoor Championships where she reach personal bests in both high jump (1.60m) and the 200m dash (26.13).

During the 2014-15 season, Burbage served as director of operations at her alma mater, the University of Louisville. She managed the team budget, was in charge of alumni relations and fundraising, organized team travel and logistics along with home meet operations and oversaw equipment orders among other duties.

Prior to that, Burbage was a volunteer coach who assisted with jumps and multi-events for the Cardinals. She worked closely with NCAA long jump qualifier Brittany Owens and 100m hurdler Briana Brown in that role.

Burbage was an assistant coach at Wilmington College before returning to Louisville. There, she coached one NCAA Division III qualifier in the 400m hurdles. In addition, Burbage monitored classroom activities and efforts of student-athletes, while helping with the program's day-to-day operations.

Burbage previously served as a graduate assistant at the University of Louisiana-Monroe where she earned her Master's in Education Technology Leadership in 2012. She assisted with short sprints and relays, and helped the team's recruiting efforts.

Burbage, a Paducah, Kentucky native, was a member of the 2008, 2009 and 2010 Big East Championship teams at Louisville. She competed in the 100m, 200m and both 4x100m and 4x400m relays as a member of the Cardinals track & field team. Burbage received a Bachelor of Science in Sport Administration from Louisville in 2010.

CHRIS NAVARRO

hris Navarro is in his fourth season as a member of the Southeast Missouri track and field coaching staff. Navarro serves as an assistant coach with an emphasis on multis, pole vault, hurdles and jumps.

In 2019, Navarro coached OVC Indoor and Outdoor Pole Vault Champion Nick South and OVC Outdoor High Jump Champion Titouan Sajous.

Navarro had a successful career as a student-athlete at Southeast, capturing six gold medals at OVC Championships. He was victorious during both heptathlon and decathlon events in the men's dominant 2014 season, helping win both the indoor and outdoor conference titles. The following season, Navarro took first in the 60m hurdles and heptathlon at the 2015 indoor championship only to follow with gold in the 110m hurdles and decathlon at the outdoor championships.

Currently, Navarro holds the Redhawks' outdoor record for 60m hurdles (8.07), ranks ninth in 110m hurdles (14.31) and ranks eighth all-time in javelin (204'7").

Prior to competing at SEMO, Navarro earned Junior College All-American Honors in the decathlon, 110-meter hurdles and javelin while at Riverside Community College. He also helped win back-to-back California Junior College State Team Championships.

Navarro was a graduate of Vista Murrieta High School where he earned All-California Interscholastic Federation honors and was also a Team National Champion at Nike Track Nationals in 2010.

INAUGURAL CLASS OF 2002

LAURA BYRNE: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1986-89)

Byrne, a track and cross country athlete from 1986-1989, won four NCAA II individual titles during the 1988-89 school year when she won the cross country national championship and the indoor 1,500 and 3,000-meters and the outdoor 5,000-meters.

MARVIN ROSENGARTEN: TRACK COACH, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Rosengarten was a football player at Southeast who later served as an assistant football coach, track coach, athletics director and director of athletic development. The Marvin Rosengarten Athletic Complex on the Southeast campus is named in his honor.

ABE STUBER: TRACK COACH (1932-46)

Stuber was football and track coach at Southeast from 1932-1946 and also served as basketball coach from 1932-1935 and from 1943- 1946. His track teams won seven MIAA championships and his football teams claimed three league titles including the 1937 team that was unbeaten and untied.

MIKE VANATTA: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1981-84)

Vanatta, track and cross country from 1981-1984, won four NCAA II individual national championships. He won the steeplechase title in 1982, 1983 and 1984 and claimed the cross country championship in 1984 while leading Southeast to the team title.

1984 MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY TEAM

The team won the NCAA Division II National Championship.

1985 MEN'S INDOOR TRACK TEAM

The team won the NCAA Division II National Championship.

CLASS OF 2003

RICK ATTIG: TRACK (1970-73)

Attig, a football and track standout, was honorable mention All-American and team captain for the football team, and an All-American in the javelin for the track team. He is the Southeast and MIAA record holder in the javelin. He is currently an assistant track coach at Nebraska after having served as an assistant at Kansas.

HERB MULKEY: TRACK (1939-42)

Herb Mulkey was a star in both basketball and track. He was a two-time all-MIAA selection and team captain in basketball and held school records in the low hurdles, high hurdles and high jump. At one time, Mulkey held 11 high jump records at tracks throughout the Midwest.

WALTER SMALLWOOD: TRACK (1965-68)

Walter Smallwood was a two-time all-MIAA football selection who still holds Southeast records for touchdowns in a game (5), season (16) and career (38) and held the career rushing record until 1994. Smallwood was the MIAA 60-meter champion.

CLARK WILLE: TRACK (1967-71)

Clark Wille was a five-time MIAA champion in the high hurdles. He claimed All-American honors in the hurdles in 1971. After graduation he coached Herculaneum High School to ten state championships in cross country and track. Wille coached over 160 collegiate All- Americans at Lindenwood and Missouri Baptist. He guided the Lindenwood women to the NAIA cross country championship and the Lindenwood men to the NAIA men's indoor track title.

CURTIS WILLIAMS: TRACK (1964-67)

Curtis Williams was the first African-American student-athlete at Southeast. He lettered four years in track and three years in basketball. He was the basketball MVP in 1967 and was MIAA champion in the high jump, triple jump and long jump.



CLASS OF 2004

LIZZ BARRINGER: TRACK (1986-89)

Lizz Barringer was a four-time Division II All-American in the heptathlon. She was the 1989 NCAA Division II heptathlon national champion and was an Olympic trials qualifier in the heptathlon.

BILL MCLANE: TRACK (1934-37)

Bill McLane ranks as one of the all-time great track athletes at Southeast. When he graduated in 1937 he held 24 track and field records at Southeast.

RYLAND "DUTCH" MEYR: TRACK (1958-61)

Ryland "Dutch" Meyr was a four-year starter at tackle and was honored as a Little All-American in 1961. Three of the four teams he played on won MIAA championships. He served as an assistant coach from 1969-1977. He had a record of 25-7 as head coach at Cape Central High School.

REX MILLER: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1955-58)

Rex Miller was Southeast Missouri State's first cross country All-American. He was 24th in the 1957 NCAA championships for all divisions held at Michigan State. He was undefeated for three years in the two-mile and was the MIAA mile and two-mile champion. Miller was also the high school coach of Southeast Hall of Famer Mike Vanatta.

ROB THOMAS: TRACK (1981-84)

Rob Thomas ranks as Southeast Missouri State's only NCAA Division I national champion. He won the 1984 indoor 600-meters at the NCAA Division I championships. He was also a Division I All-American in 1982 and was a Division II All-American in 1982, 1983 and 1984. He was a U.S. Olympic trials qualifier in 1984 and a U.S. National Team member in 1985.

CLASS OF 2006

JOHN SCHWEPKER, TRACK (1984-88)

Schwepker won two individual national championships at Southeast while earning seven All-America awards. He won the NCAA Division II indoor pole vault championship in 1985 and was the decathlon national champion in 1988. The Southeast record holder in the decathlon with 7,881 points, Schwepker participated in the 1988 Olympic Trials.

ROYAL TIBE: TRACK (1919-23)

Tibi is believed to be the only athlete at Southeast to earn varsity letters in five sports. He lettered in football, basketball, baseball, track and tennis. An outstanding punter on the football team, he also served as captain of the track team and was described as an outstanding defensive player on the basketball team.

CLASS OF 2007

ED WHITE: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1973-77)

White is the only Southeast cross country runner to earn All-America honors for three straight years. He was honored in 1974, 1975 and 1976 with his highest national finish ninth in 1975. White is retired after coaching track and cross country at Fox High School in Arnold for over 30 years. His wife, the former Laura Byrne, is a member of the Southeast Athletic Hall of Fame inaugural class of 2002.



CLASS OF 2008

JOEY HAINES: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY COACH (1982-2008)

Ohio Valley Conference "Coach of the Year" 20 times during a career that saw his teams win one NCAA II National Indoor Title, one NCAA II National Cross Country Title and earn 18 NCAA II National Top Four Finishes. He was the NCAA II National Coach of the Year in 1985, the NCAA Division I Regional Coach of the Year in 1998, MIAA Coach of the Year six times and Missouri Track & Field Coaches Association Coach of the Year six times. He coached one NCAA Division I national champion, 23 NCAA II national champions, 10 NCAA I All-Americans and 145 NCAA II All-Americans.

RICK WADLINGTON: TRACK (1968-71)

An All-American in 1971 after placing second in the shot put at the NCAA II national finals, he established a Southeast outdoor shot put record with a throw of 59-0 1/2 while winning the MIAA championship. Helped lead the Southeast team to the MIAA title in 1971 by winning both the shot put and discus.

CLASS OF 2009

ANDREW PRESBERRY: TRACK AND FIELD (1978-82)

Presberry was a four-time All-American at Southeast, winning honors in the hurdles and on the mile relay team. He still holds the Southeast record in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 13.84. The record, established in 1981, has stood for 28 years. Presberry also recorded the second fastest 400-meter hurdle time of 51.35.

CLASS OF 2010

TERRANCE BRANCH: TRACK AND FIELD (1982-2008)

Terrance Branch, of McCluer High School in St. Louis, Mo., tore through the record books during his career as a Southeast Missouri Student-Athlete. As a freshman, Branch ran the 400 meters in 47.74 at the indoor National Championships, earning All-American honors. In 1992, Southeast Missouri moved up to Division I, and Branch ran a 45.8 at nationals, but was disqualified for running out of the lane. He was given a medical redshirt in 1993, and came back to run a school record 45.52 400 meter dash, placing fourth at the NCAA National Championships. Branch earned a degree in Mass Communications, while placing himself in the record books in the 200 meters, 400 meters, 4x400 meter relay, and earning an OVC Outdoor Championship in the 400. Branch hung up his cleats as a four-time All-American.

CLASS OF 2011

BOB FERGUSON: TRACK AND FIELD (1983-86)

Ferguson was part of the 1985 National Championship track & field team which is in the Southeast Hall of Fame. He was a five-time NCAA Division II All-American and eight-time MIAA indoor and outdoor conference champion in the pole vault. Ferguson was the 1987 NCAA Division II Outdoor Pole Vault Champion. He was a world championship team member for the 1987 Pan Am Games. In addition, Ferguson won a silver medal at the 1986 Commonwealth Games.



CLASS OF 2012

CHRISTINE (RIDENOUR) VANATTA: TRACK AND CROSS COUNTRY (1982-84)

Highlighted her athletic career at Southeast by winning the 1984 NCAA Division II Women's Cross Country Championship, leading her team to a third-place finish. She was a three-time NCAA Division II All-American in cross country and a two-time NCAA Division II national qualifier in track & field. By the time she left Southeast, Ridenour had set school records in the 1500m, mile run, 3000m, 2-mile run and 5000m events. She is married to Southeast Hall of Famer Michael Vanatta.

BEVERLY SLAUGHTER: TRACK AND FIELD (1981)

She was one of the first great female athletes at Southeast. She held the long jump record at 20-5 for a period of 17 years. Slaughter was an All-American in 1981 and won numerous MIAA titles. She currently ranks third on the school's all-time long jump list. Two-time national high jump champion who won both the NCAA II indoor and outdoor championships in 1985. He won the indoor title with a jump of 6-11 in Fargo, North Dakota to lead Southeast to the national team title. He won the outdoor title with a jump of 7-1 in Los Angeles, California. A three-time All-American, he still holds the Southeast high jump record at 7-11/2.

CLASS OF 2013

KATHLEEN HUDSON: TRACK AND FIELD (1979-1981, 1983)

Hudson began her career at Southeast in 1978-79 and helped lay the foundation for the women's track and field program that has remained strong and extremely competitive for the past 35 years. During her time at Southeast, Hudson became an Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women two-time All-American in 1981. In the national championships that year, she finished sixth in the finals after going into the meet with the second-best time in the nation at 55.8, a time that remains outstanding even today. She followed that performance by anchoring the 1600m relay that achieved All-American status by also finishing sixth. While Hudson was an outstanding individual competitor in the 400m dash and long jump, she was versatile and indispensable as a member of all the relay teams. She ran on, and almost always anchored teams that broke 13 school records (nine in the mile relay, three in the 880 yard/800m medley relay, and one in the 400m dash).

MILES SMITH: TRACK AND FIELD (2004-2008)

Smith might very well be the greatest Division I athlete Southeast Missouri State University has produced in any sport. A native of St. Louis, Smith was a five-time All-American in the 400m, earning the prestigious honors in 2005, 2006 and 2008. He was named the Ohio Valley Conference Male Track Athlete of the Year four times (2005 indoors, 2006 indoors & outdoors and 2008 indoors) and still owns Southeast school records in the 200m (indoors), 400m (indoors and outdoors) and 4x400m relay (indoors and outdoors). Southeast enjoyed tremendous team success with Smith, winning OVC Outdoor Championships in 2005, 2006 and 2008. He won seven individual OVC Championships in his collegiate career and was named the 2006 OVC Athlete of the Championship at the OVC Indoor Track & Field Championships. Smith was also an elite competitor on the international stage. He ran for the US National Team in the 2005 IAAF World Championships in Helsinki, Finland, where he won a gold medal with the 4x400m relay team. He also qualified for the USA Olympic Trials in both 2008 and 2012. Smith returned to his alma mater as a sprinters coach in 2013-14. Prior to that, he spent the 2012-13 season as a volunteer assistant coach at Tennessee State.



CLASS OF 2016

HEATHER JENKINS: TRACK AND FIELD (2002-2006)

A Cape Girardeau native, Jenkins had a decorated career as a thrower for the Southeast women's track & field program. As a freshman in 2002, Jenkins won the OVC shot put and discus titles, and established a school discus record of 173-11. She went on to finish 15th at the NCAA Championships in the discus that year. A year later, Jenkins set an OVC record in the shot put with a throw of 50' 5.5" and won the discus crown at the OVC Outdoor Championships. She was an NCAA Regional qualifier in the shot put and discus, and also set a conference record in the 20lb weight throw (59' 11"), and won the shot put at the OVC Indoor Championships that season. A year later, Jenkins won the weight throw at the OVC Indoor Championships and again broke the school and conference record in the process. During outdoor competition, she won the OVC shot put and discus crowns, while qualifying for the NCAAs in the shot, discus and hammer. Jenkins was named both the OVC Indoor and Outdoor Track Athlete of the Year, and claimed First-Team All-OVC accolades. In all, Jenkins was a two-time OVC Indoor shot put champion, three-time OVC Indoor weight throw champion, four-time OVC Outdoor discus champion and four-time OVC Outdoor shot put champion during her illustrious career. She still holds the school's all-time discus record today.

CLASS OF 2018

TOM BRENNECKE FOOTBALL AND TRACK AND FIELD (1954-1957)

Brennecke, who is deceased, played running back at SEMO for two Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) championship teams (1955, 1957) during his career. He was part of two unbeaten teams with the 1955 squad going 9-0 under the direction of head coach Kenneth Knox. Brennecke played every game during the last two seasons of his career and started 12 contests. He scored 12 total touchdowns twice during the 1957 campaign. His 12 touchdowns tied for eighth among the school's all-time single-season leaders. Brennecke earned All-MIAA honors in 1957 and Second-Team All-MIAA accolades in 1956. He was a unanimous pick by the conference coaches as the Captain of the MIAA Conference All-Star squad and voted Most Valuable Back. Brennecke led the 1957 SEMO team in scoring with 72 points and was named SEMO's Most Improved Player as a freshman. He was also a member of the school's track & field team and becomes the 19th multiple sport athlete to be inducted into the Southeast Missouri Athletics Hall of Fame.

LUTRICIA PURHAM: TRACK AND FIELD (1997-2000)

Purham was a six-time OVC Champion at SEMO. She was a three-time OVC individual champion in the outdoor shot put (1998, 1999, 2000), two-time individual champion in the indoor shot put (1999, 2000) and discus champion (2000). Purham was named the 2000 OVC Track Athlete of the Year. She was an NCAA Qualifier in the shot put during both the 1999 and 2000 seasons. Purham finished 15that the national meet each of those years and was part of four OVC Championship teams.

DR. TIM RADEMAKER: ASSISTANT TRACK & FIELD COACH (1975-1982, 1980s-2017)

Dr. Rademaker has been a mainstay in the SEMO Track and Field family for decades and once represented the program as a top athlete in the pole vault and as its team captain. He is an outstanding events coach, particularly and certainly not limited to the pole vault. Rademaker has produced numerous MIAA and OVC champion athletes as well as NCAA national champions throughout the years either as a paid or volunteer assistant coach. In all, he coached 18 OVC pole vault champions and one OVC high jump champion. All of SEMO's pole vault records have come with Rademaker as coach of that event. He has been a great recruiter for the track and field and cross country programs during his coaching tenure. In addition to coaching, Rademaker has been a clinician presenter and has published articles in journals regarding the pole vault and methods in the teaching and coaching profession. As an educator, he taught in the physical education and recreation department for many years and continues to be a positive influence, role mode and mentor to countless teachers, coaches and students at SEMO.



CLASS OF 2019 - ANNOUNCED

GERALD JONES: CROSS COUNTRY/TRACK & FIELD (1959-1962)

Jones was captain of the SEMO track & field team in 1961 and was a three-year letterman. He was honored as an outstanding track athlete and was the team's highest point scorer in 1961. Jones set the school record for the mile with a time of 4:20.3. He garnered four varsity letters in cross country and was captain each of his final two seasons. Jones broke a total of 28 records between track and cross country his senior year alone. That total included MIAA, school, course and stadium records. He was inducted into the Missouri Track & Field Hall of Fame in 2010 and has been a registered track referee and starter for the Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA) for many years.

1984 WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY TEAM

SEMO's 1984 Women's Cross Country team ended the season with a third-place finish at the NCAA Division II National Championships. The team won five of its six regular-season meets (mainly against Division I competition), a MIAA Conference title and Great Lakes Regional Championship (national qualifying meet). The team had three All-Americans, including Christine Ridenour, Margaret Hertenstein and Debbie Kilpatrick. Ridenour was the individual National Champion that year. Pam Palmer, Jenella Torrence and Laura Byrne were also members of the team. Palmer, Torrence and Byrne went on to be All-Americans later in their careers. THIS IS THE OVC



Now in its 72nd year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

In May 2011 the Conference expanded for the second time in four years, adding Belmont University which began competition in the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont gave the OVC 12 members, the most the league has had at one time in its illustrious history. The move added a second team in the city of Nashville and was the first addition to the league since Southern Illinois University Edwardsville joined in 2008. Subsequently, the league has shown its stability over the past decade, seeing only one member institution depart over the past 19 years.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart,

the athletics director at Murray State, Charles "Turkey" Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged February 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first nontraditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958 Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961 Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

After Title IX legislation passed in 1972, women's athletics began a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC began formulating plans for women's athletics in 1975 and established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977. with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982. The conference added women's golf and softball in 1994 and women's soccer in 1998.

Over its 71 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track

and golf.

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States Olympic Rifle Team and Morehead State's Brian Shimer who competed in five Winter Olympics in bobsled (winning a bronze medal in 2002) and coached the 2010 United States bobsled team to its first gold medal since 1948. Former Morehead State football and Eastern Kentucky track and field athlete Dallas Robinson competed with the U.S. bobsled team during the 2014 Sochi Winter Olympics. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State) and Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peav) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present-day standouts like basketball players Kenneth Faried (Morehead State) and Robert Covington (Tennessee State), football player Jimmy Garoppolo (Eastern Illinois) and baseball player Shawn Kelley (Austin Peay). Hamilton is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and an NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles Lakers).

In 2007, Eastern Kentucky's Jacob Korir won his fourth-straight Conference cross country title becoming just the third OVC student-athlete and 13th athlete nationally to accomplish that feat. Korir was a three-time All-American in cross country, earning two top-10 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country Championship. The Nairobi, Kenya, native was also named a track and field All-American twice during his career, was selected as the OVC Male Athlete of the Year in 2006-07 and received the NCAA post graduate scholarship in 2008

In 2011 the Eastern Kentucky men's cross country team earned a national ranking in the USTFCCCA poll, climbing to as high as No. 17; the ranking was the highest for an OVC

team since the polls began in the early 1980s. The EKU men would qualify for the NCAA Championship, becoming the first OVC team to reach the national championship meet since 1980. Eastern Kentucky finished 26th overall at the event as junior Soufiane Bouchikhi was 47th in a field of 252 runners. On the women's side Eastern Kentucky senior Lydia Kosgei became the first EKU woman to ever qualify for the NCAA Championship and went on to finish 37th at the national meet to earn All-American honors

A year later (2012) the EKU men's cross country team was ranked as high as No. 11 nationally and finished 24th at the NCAA Championship. Wade Meddles led the team with a 38th place finish at the event while Bouchikhi was 40th. In 2013 Eastern Kentucky placed 15th at the NCAA Championship, the highest national finish for an OVC team since 1980. Soufiane Bouchikhi capped his career by winning his fourth-straight OVC Championship and earning National Runner of the Week honors during the season. Bouchikhi finished 26th at the NCAA Championship in 2013, earning All-American honors for the secondstraight season. In 2014 EKU qualified for its fourth-straight NCAA Championship and finished 23rd overall and in 2015 earned its fifth-straight bid and finished 17th overall. EKU is only the second OVC team to ever qualify for five-straight NCAA Championships (ETSU being the other).

In 2016, Eastern Kentucky's Charlotte Imer finished 31st at the NCAA Championship, the second-highest finish ever by an OVC female (trailing only a 24th place finish by Samford's Lauren Blankenship in 2007).

In 2017, the Eastern Kentucky women's team earned its first national ranking as well as becoming the first OVC women's team to qualify for the NCAA Championship. The Colonels finished 23rd at the National Championship meet.

Following the 2017-18 season, long-time coaches Tom Akers (Eastern Illinois) and Rick Erdmann (Eastern Kentucky) retired. The duo combined for 118 OVC Championships and 115

OVC Coach of the Year Awards.

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 287 student-athletes honored with the award (including 53 over the past five years).

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

Additionally, the OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Belmont University, Eastern Illinois University. Jacksonville State University. Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

2020 OVC INDOOR TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2020 OVC Men's and Women's Indoor Track & Field Championship will be held February 26-27 at the Birmingham CrossPlex in Birmingham, Alabama, for the second-straight year.

The CrossPlex, which hosted the 2019 NCAA Indoor Championships (and will host the 2022 event as well), houses one of the fastest indoor hydraulic tracks in the world. The 2021 OVC Championships will also be held at the venue.



2020 OVC OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2020 OVC Men's and Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championship will be held May 14-16 at the Marshall Gage Track (located inside Stewart Stadium) on the campus of Murray State University in Murray, Kentucky.

Last year, Eastern Illinois claimed the men's championship, its 16th overall title, while Murray State won the women's crown, its first since 1992.






