War For The Wheel

The game will be the 88th meeting all-time between the schools in a series that dates back to 1909 when the teams had to cross the Mississippi River by boat to play. The rivalry is branded the "War For The Wheel" in reference to the ship's wheel trophy that goes to the winner. SEMO is currently in possession of the wheel after last year's 44-26 win in Cape Girardeau. However, SIU has won 10 of the last 14 meetings.

Salukis ranked in preseason for first time since 2011

For the first time since 2011, the Salukis enter the season nationally ranked, coming in at No. 24. Last year, SIU spent one week in the polls when they were No. 25 on Nov. 23, 2019. That marked the first entry into the Top 25 since 2014. The 2020 season opener features a pair of ranked teams for the first time in school history.

Five Salukis active in the NFL

With the addition of 2019 All-American S Jeremy Chinn (Carolina Panthers) and CB Madre Harper (New York Giants), the Salukis have five active players in the NFL. They joined MyCole Pruitt (Tennessee Titans) Craig James (Philadelphia Eagles), and Ryan Neal (Seattle Seahawks). Chinn is leading the NFL in tackles by a rookie. Saluki Football has produced 42 players who have gone on to play in the NFL.

Touchdown leader Javon Williams Jr.

In 2019, **RB Javon Williams Jr. (6-2, 245, So.)** led the MVFC and all Division I freshmen with 19 touchdowns (17 rushing, 2 receiving). The total was a conference freshman record. He also threw two TD passes. In the game against Youngstown State, Williams Jr. became the first player in school history to rush for a TD, catch at TD and pass for a TD in the same game. Frequently operating out of the Wildcat formation, Williams totaled 1,038 rushing yards and average 6.4 yards per carry.

DE Anthony Knighton eyes sack record

DE Anthony Knighton (6-4, 251, Sr.) has started every game (34) of his Saluki career and is third all-time in sacks at SIU with 21.0. He had 6.0 sacks in 2019 season. Knighton is 3.0 sacks shy of breaking the school record held by James Phillips (1977-

80). He also has 34.5 tackles for loss in his career, which is sixth all-time at SIU.

QB Karé Lyles among national leaders in completion %, yards per attempt

After taking over at quarterback in game three last season, **Karé Lyles (6-0, 210, Sr.)** went on to rank among the nation's leaders in pass completion percentage (.629/23rd) and yards per attempt (7.7/32nd). A junior college transfer who began his career at Wisconsin, Lyles sparked the team to a five-game winning streak during conference play.

WR Landon Lenoir closing in on 100 career catches

WR Landon Lenoir (6-1, 192, Sr.) has 98 career catches for 1,149 receiving yards. An honorable mention All-MVFC performer the last two seasons, he needs two more catches to become only the 14th player in school history with 100 receptions. Lenoir has two relatives who played in the NFL. Brother Lance Lenoir, who holds the Western Illinois school record for career touchdown catches (28), played for the Dallas Cowboys last year. Cousin Laquon Treadwell is a WR for the Atlanta Falcons.

WR Avante Cox led team in receiving

WR Avante Cox (5-10, 170, Jr.) led last year's team with 47 catches for 617 yards and five TDs. The Wyoming transfer was named 2nd Team All-MVFC and All-Newcomer team. He also earned both the MVFC Player of the Week and Newcomer of the Week vs. South Dakota (113 receiving yards, 80 rushing yards, 3 TDs) and Newcomer of the Week against Arkansas State (142 receiving yards).

Saluki Sack Attack

SIU's defense ranked 6th in the nation, averaging 3.25 sacks per game in 2019. Twelve different recorded sacks. Southern tied a school record with nine sacks versus Youngstown State.

OLB Makel Calhoun with breakout year

OLB Makel Calhoun (6-2, 220, Jr.) had a breakout season in 2019, leading the team in sacks (7.0) and ranking 39th in the nation, despite missing the Missouri State game with a concussion. Calhoun recorded 2.0 sacks in both the Youngstown State and Indiana State games.

FB Jacob Garrett a key to SIU's running game

The Salukis had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in school history last year, and lead-blocking **FB Cody Crider (6-2, 245, Jr.)** was a big reason why the ground game was so successful. An MVFC All-Academic Team selection with 4.00 GPA, Garrett also caught five passes for 101 yards on the season and two TDs.

Salukis are Strong times two

Brothers Bryson and Justin Strong are now on opposite sides of the ball. **ILB Bryson Strong (5-10, 230, Jr.)** ranked fourth on the team in tackles (61) a year ago and averaged eight tackles per game in the second half of the season. RB **Justin Strong (6-0, 215, So.)** flips over to offense from his safety spot a year ago. He played in all 12 games last year and was a top special teams tackler. At Althoff High School, Justin played both sides of the ball. As a running back he averaged 12.9 yards per carry.

The Agnew family legacy

DT Keenan Agnew (6-0, 275, Jr.) is third Agnew brother to play at SIU. Fullback Ray Agnew (2010-13) played one season in the NFL for the Cleveland Browns. Running back Malcolm Agnew (2013-14) rushed for 1,708 yards and scored 19 touchdowns in two seasons. He is currently the running backs coach for North Dakota. The Agnews' father is Ray Agnew, who was the 10th overall pick in the 1990 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots and played six seasons in the NFL at defensive tackle. Ray Agnew is now the Director of Pro Personnel for the Los Angeles Rams. Keenan Agnew played in all 12 games and made 5 starts last season and was second on the team among defensive tackles with 23 tackles.

Defense much improved

In conference games, SIU's defense is improved across every statistical category vs. 2018.

The Leg from Down Under

A native of Melbourne, Australia, **P Jack Colquhoun (6-2, 190, Sr.)** is the first Australian to play for the Salukis since Wayne Cowley punted in 1973. Colquhoun had 12 kicks of 50+ yards last season, including an 80-yard boot at South Dakota State that was the third-longest in school history. Three of his 50+ yarders came against Youngstown State, as he was named the MVFC Special Teams Player of the Week. Colquhoun had never seen an American football game in person prior to his college debut at SEMO on Aug. 29. Colquhoun (pronounced KUH-hoon) was a decorated rugby player back home.

OLB Cody Crider — the Comeback Kid

After undergoing his fourth knee surgery last month, **OLB Cody Crider (6-0, 232, Sr.)** is fighting to make yet another comeback for SIU. Last year, the 2nd Team All-MVFC pick led the team with 12.0 TFLs. He started every game and was second on the team with 90 tackles.

Salukis versus ranked FCS opponents

On Oct. 19, 2019, the Salukis beat No. 18 Youngstown State to snap an eight-game losing streak versus ranked FCS opponents. They were 1-4 last year against ranked teams and are 3-14 under head coach Nick Hill.

Salukis one of three FCS teams with an FBS win in 2019

Southern Illinois was one of only three FCS teams to beat an FBS opponent in 2019. The Salukis beat UMass, 45-20, on Sept. 7. The other FCS wins were Central Arkansas over Western Kentucky, and The Citadel over Georgia Tech.

Defense makes great strides under Jason Petrino

The Salukis made tremendous strides on defense during Jason Petrino's first year in charge of the unit in 2019. In scoring defense, Southern improved from 10th (40.7) to 6th (23.0) — nearly cutting in half the amount of points allowed from the previous season. Similar gains were made in rushing defense (221.3 to 154.0) and passing defense (262.1 to 200.6).

Petrino is a cousin of former Louisville coach Bobby Petrino and Idaho coach Paul Petrino. He spent three seasons as head coach at NAIA Rocky Mountain College (2016-18) in Montana, where he led the program to a conference championship and playoff berth in 2018.

Jared Petrino special teams coach

The Saluki staff also features Jared Petrino, the brother of defensive coordinator Jason Petrino, as the program's special teams coach and assistant defensive line coach.

SIU's special teams flourished under Jared Petrino in his first season in charge of the units in 2019. The Salukis improved in the conference rankings in every category — kickoff coverage (+3), net punting (+4), punt returns (+4) and kickoff returns (+2).

Jared Petrino spent three seasons serving under his brother at Rocky Mountain College (2016-18) as defensive coordinator, special teams coordinator and a defensive line coach.

Dawg Bites

♦ SIU's five offensive line starters all have starting experience, with a combined 59 starts between them. All-Conference **LG ZeVeyon Furcron (6-2, 327, Sr.)** leads the group with 31 starts.

♦ The Salukis return 100.0 percent of their passing yardage leaders, 62.9 percent of rushing yardage and 73.0 percent of their receiving yardage.

♦ **K Nico Gualdoni (6-1, 218, Sr.)**, who also handles kickoffs is a combined 14-of-18 on field goals with a long of 45 yards, and 46-of-47 on PATs, in three seasons.

5-game win streak longest since 2009

The Salukis recorded a five-game winning streak during the 2019 season — their longest since 2009, when the team went 11-2 and won 11-straight games. During Southern's five-game winning streak, it out-scored opponents by an average margin of 20.2 points. The 24-point win at Western Illinois was the team's largest road margin in school history.

True Scholar-Athletes

Saluki Athletics leads the Missouri Valley Conference with 101 Academic All-Americans all-time. C Jacob Marnin was the most recent Academic All-American in 2018, 2019.

Personnel notes

♦ **LB Bryce Notree (6-3, 225, Sr.)** suffered a broken foot during pregame of the opener at SEMO last year and did not play again until the season finale versus North Dakota State. He led the team with 78 tackles and ranked 14th in the MVFC with 7.1 stops per game in 2018 to earn MVFC honorable mention status.

♦ **WR Avante Cox (5-10, 170, Jr.)** and **D'Ante Cox (5-11, 182, Jr.)** are brothers, as are **S Aaron Maddox (6-0, 213, Jr.)** and **CB Christian Maddox (6-3, 210, Jr.)**.

Quick Facts

Carbondale is located in the southern tip of the state — about a five-hour drive south of Chicago and two hours southeast of St. Louis...Many of SIU's alums are concentrated in those two cities...The Southern Illinois region is informally known as "Little Egypt," hence

the adoption of the Saluki (an Egyptian hunting dog) as the school mascot.

Jerry Kill legacy

Jerry Kill coached Nick Hill at SIU. Kill was the head football coach at SIU from 2001 to 2007, leading the Salukis to five-straight appearances in the Football Championship Subdivision and winning three straight Gateway Football Conference Championships. While at SIU he also received the prestigious Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award in 2004 and the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award in 2007.

He left SIU to serve as head coach at Northern Illinois from 2008 to 2010, delivering three bowl-eligible teams. Kill went on to become head coach at Minnesota from 2011 to 2015. While there, he was named 2014 Big Ten Coach of the Year, sent three teams to bowl games and produced six NFL draft picks.

Kill inherited a program at SIU that had two winning seasons in its previous 15 years. His 2007 team, quarterbacked by Nick Hill, advanced to the semifinals in the playoffs, where SIU lost to Joe Flacco and Delaware. Hill played for Kill from 2005-07.

Coach Kill connections

Five assistant coaches on Southern's staff have direct ties to Coach Kill.

♦ Safeties coach Marty

Rodgers played for Kill at SIU in his first two seasons, 2006 and 2007.

♦ Offensive line coach Trevor Olson played for Kill at Northern Illinois.

♦ Olson and running backs coach Nate Griffin were on the quality control staff under Kill at Minnesota before Hill hired them at SIU.

♦ Tight ends coach and co-special teams coordinator Pat Poore was an assistant coach under Kill at SIU, Northern Illinois and Minnesota.

Salukis' NFL Tradition

- ♦ Southern Illinois has had 42 alumni play in the NFL.

Why the Saluki?

Southern Illinois had been known as the Maroons since intercollegiate athletics began in 1913. The name "Salukis" became official on March 19, 1951, when the student body overwhelmingly approved the dog as the new symbol of SIU athletics, easily besting "Rebels," "Knights," "Flyers," "Marauders," and "Maroons."

The oldest purebred dogs in the world with records dating back to 3600 B.C., the Saluki is an ancient Egyptian hunting dog known for its speed and hunting prowess.

So why is the name Salukis relevant to Southern Illinois? Natives of southern Illinois know that the region is frequently referred to as "Egypt." Historian Baker Brownell, in his book "The Other Illinois," explained how the region came to be known as Egypt.

He wrote, "There was a drought in the northern counties (of Illinois) in the early 1800s...the wheat fields dried up, the streams died in their beds. But in Southern Illinois, rain fell and there were good crops, and from the north came people seeking corn and wheat as to Egypt of old. Thus, the name, Egypt."

The 19th century drought in Illinois parallels the Biblical account of the country of Egypt.

"There was famine in all lands; but in all the land of Egypt there was bread. All the earth came to Egypt to Joseph to buy grain, because the famine was so severe. And (Jacob) said, 'Behold, I have heard that there is grain in Egypt; go down and buy grain for us there, that we may live, and not die.' So 10 of Joseph's brothers went down to buy grain in Egypt." (Genesis 41:54b, 57, 42:2-3).

In Egypt at that time, Salukis were accepted as the finest animal a family could possess. Adopting such a well-respected dog as its mascot fit perfectly for a school in a region known as "Little Egypt."

King Tut's Tomb

King Tut was the school's first live Saluki mascot after the nickname change from Maroons to Salukis in 1951. King Tut died in 1954 after being struck by a car, and a concrete pyramid marked his burial at McAndrew Stadium. The marker was moved to its current spot outside Saluki Stadium in 2010. Before each home game, the Salukis walk from their locker room and pat Tut's Tomb for good luck.

Live pure-bred Saluki mascots continue to lead the team onto the field prior to each home game.

Walt Frazier — The Rest of the Story

Most people know that Southern's most famous basketball alum is Walt Frazier (1964-67). What they don't know is the story of how the Atlanta native ended up in Carbondale.

Basketball was Frazier's second-best sport in high school. He was offered a scholarship to play quarterback at Georgia Tech, but he didn't want to play football. Frazier went on a recruiting visit to SIU in 1963 and met with AD Donald Boydston, who was progressive about recruiting minorities during a time when southern schools rarely recruited

them. According to Boydston, Frazier didn't say one word the whole trip, but called shortly after he took the train back to Atlanta to say he was enrolling at SIU.

Frazier was dismissed from the team for academic issues after his sophomore year. He went back to Atlanta and got a job doing manual labor. Frazier called in August of 1965 and asked if he could come back. He was not eligible for a scholarship, so he paid his own way and sat out his junior year, making the Dean's List. He played on the practice team, and sometimes they would beat the varsity. The 1966-67 storybook season saw Frazier lead the team to the NIT National Championship, beating Marquette in the finals. He turned pro after the season.

Basketball powerhouse, 2002-07

SIU's most successful run in college basketball took place from 2002-07 when it made six-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16s in 2002 and 2007. Head coaches during that span were Bruce Weber, Matt Painter and Chris Lowery.

Heading into his fifth season at the helm of Saluki Football, and coming off a seven-win season and Top-25 ranking in 2019, 35-year-old Nick Hill has brought the perfect balance of energy, passion and creativity needed to re-energize the program.

A native son of southern Illinois, Hill's journey to the top job at SIU started 16 years ago and just 20 miles north of campus, where he was a football and basketball icon at DuQuoin High School.

During his senior year of high school in 2002-03, Hill was the area's Player of the Year in both sports and guided the Indians to the Illinois High School Association 3A state championship football game.

The legend continued on the hardwood where Hill averaged 23 points as a senior at DuQuoin and chose Western Kentucky from a host of Division I offers. A broken hand prematurely ended his freshman season at Western but ultimately led him home.

In the spring of 2004, Hill transferred to SIU to switch sports and play football under head coach Jerry Kill, just as the program was beginning its rapid rise to the top of the league standings.

Nick Hill was selected to attend the American Football Coaches Association's 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute in 2019.

"I took a leap of faith with Coach Kill," Hill recalled. "Everyone needs someone who believes in him and for me, that someone was Coach Kill."

Hill initially sat behind league Player of the Year Joel Sambursky, before taking over the starting job in 2006. In two seasons as the starter, he went 21-6 and set the school record for passing yards in 2007. He still holds the best completion percentage (68.3) in school history.

Highlights of Hill's playing career include guiding Southern to a win at Indiana in 2006, in which he passed for four touchdowns as SIU became the league's first team to defeat a Big Ten opponent. Hill capped off his career in 2007 by leading the team to the Final Four of the playoffs, where the Salukis ultimately lost a 20-17 heartbreaker to Joe Flacco and Delaware. He was also a finalist for the Peyton Award in '07.

Hill played six seasons of professional football, mostly in the Arena Football League, where he played for head coach Jay Gruden, now the head coach of the NFL's Washington Redskins. Hill also had brief free-agent stints with the Chicago Bears in 2008 and Green Bay Packers in 2012.

Playing for Gruden, one of the game's top offensive minds, helped shape Hill's offensive philosophy. First as

Southern's offensive coordinator and now as head coach, Hill has refined his own unique style of offense that combines elements of Air Raid, spread and up-tempo.

In his first season at SIU, Saluki quarterbacks broke a school record for single-season touchdown passes with 29. The following year in 2015, Southern's offense averaged 498 yards per game -- the second most in conference history. Quarterback Mark Iannotti led the nation in total offense per game.

In 2016, the Salukis set program records for passing completions, attempts and yards while only throwing seven interceptions. Southern Illinois ranked in the top-10 nationally for passing offense, total offense and scoring offense for nearly the entire year.

In 2018, the offense ranked third in the MVFC in total offense, first downs and time of possession, and ranked in the top half of the league in several more offensive categories. In 2019, the Saluki offense produced a pair of 1,000-yard rushers and ranked 12th in the nation in rushing.

Hill has assembled a talented mix of veteran assistant coaches and young, up-and-comers. First-year defensive coordinator Jason Petrino has both head coaching experience, plus spent four years in the MVFC as defensive coordinator at South Dakota. Tight ends and special teams coach Pat Poore is a former Kill assistant who was a key figure in Southern's initial rebuild.

"I know what the blueprint looks like for our program to be successful, going back to my playing days for Coach Kill, and I know we can get there," Hill said. "Coaching my alma mater is a dream come true. I love everything about this region and what it stands for, that blue-collar mentality. This is not my team. This is our team. Our program is going to invest in the community and make us proud on and off the field."

Hill and wife, Alicia, a former volleyball player at SIU, reside in Carbondale and have two daughters, Skylar and Charley. His brother, former Saluki quarterback A.J. Hill, coaches football at Rochester (Ill.) High School.
