



Lipscomb (2-4) 80, Southeast Missouri (2-2) 74 ^{OT}

Wednesday, December 9, 2020 // 7 p.m., CT // Allen Arena // Nashville, Tenn.

- Southeast Missouri split its home-and-home series with Lipscomb that took place in a three-day span. The Redhawks are now 4-2 all-time against Atlantic Sun Conference opponents.
- The Redhawks played overtime in two of their first four games this season. Southeast Missouri was involved in only one overtime game in 31 matchups during the 2019-20 campaign. This year marks the first time since 1991-92 where SMO has gone to overtime in two non-conference matchups.
- Southeast Missouri put together a ferocious comeback to erase a 15-point deficit. The Redhawks trailed, 40-25, with 16:21 left to play. After Jake Wolfe made a free throw to give Lipscomb a 42-33 advantage with 12:12 remaining, SMO went on a 20-2 run to take a nine-point lead of its own. Nolan Taylor made a layup to give the Redhawks their first lead since the first half and DQ Nicholas capped the surge by making four free throws off a pair of Lipscomb technical fouls.
- The Redhawks led by four (61-57) with 50 seconds to go and held a one-point edge 36 seconds later. Jordan Love and Chris Harris each split a pair of free throws in the final 11 seconds leaving Southeast Missouri with a 63-60 lead. Jake Wolfe then made an off-balance 3-pointer at the buzzer to send the game to overtime.
- Chris Harris became Southeast Missouri's first 20-point scorer this season when he led his team with 21 points against the Bisons. Harris shot 7-of-17 from the field and made a game-high four 3-pointers. He has drained three or more 3-pointers in three of his first four starts this year. Harris boosted his scoring average to 18.3 points per game.
- The Redhawks committed 21 turnovers which led to 30 of Lipscomb's points. Southeast Missouri also missed 10 free throws marking the third time this season where it has missed 10 or more free throws in a game.
- Southeast Missouri has made 32 three-pointers through its first four games of 2020-21. The Redhawks are averaging eight threes per game. SMO made only 20 three-pointers in its first four games a year ago.
- DQ Nicholas scored 14 of his 17 points in the second half. Nicholas scored double figures for the 11th time in his career.
- The Redhawks outrebounded their opponent for the third-straight game. Southeast Missouri held a +16 advantage (41-25) on the boards against Lipscomb. The Redhawks also outrebounded the Bisons, 15-3, on the offensive glass. SMO leads the Ohio Valley Conference in rebounding defense (29.8 rpg) and ranks second in rebounding margin (+8.5).
- Tonight's loss marked Southeast Missouri's 19th-straight in true road games. The Redhawks did not win a road game (0-16) during the entire 2019-20 campaign. SMO's last true road win was at Eastern Illinois (88-79) on Feb. 16, 2019.
- Southeast Missouri is on an eight-game losing streak in true non-conference road games. The Redhawks last non-conference road win was at Mississippi Valley State (77-57) on Dec. 4, 2018.
