

outheast Missouri and Under Armour, Inc. (NYSE: UA, UAA) announced a partnership agreement. The Baltimore-based global leader in performance footwear, apparel and equipment became the official outfitter of Southeast Missouri Athletics on July 1, 2018.

As part of the multi-year agreement, Under Armour provides on-field and training gear for 15 sports. Additionally, Under Armour outfits members of the athletic department including coaches and staff.

The Redhawks compete at the NCAA Division I level and are part of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA). The Redhawks have won 57 OVC regular-season championships and 20 OVC tournament titles during their first 29 years in the league. Southeast also won seven Women's

All-Sports trophies in that span.

SHOW ME CENTER



he 7,000-seat Show Me Center (SMC) is the home of the Southeast Missouri State University men's and women's basketball teams. Additionally, the Show Me Center is the entertainment and meeting hub for the 250,000 residents of the tristate region.

A number of renovations were made to the Show Me Center prior to the 2015-16 season, including new telescopic seating, a state of the art center-hung video board and improvements to sound and lighting systems.

On June 26, 2014, the
Southeast Missouri State
University Board of Regents
approved a list of high priority
major capital renovation projects
to be completed over the next two
to three years to upgrade the
Show Me Center to modern
arena standards.

The other phase of the project

includes high priority items such as renovating the front meeting room and parking lot areas.

The facility first opened its doors in the summer of 1987 and celebrated its 25th Anniversary during the 2012-13 season.

One of the best arenas in the Ohio Valley Conference, the Show Me Center has served Southeast Missouri State University, the City of Cape Girardeau, and the citizens of Southeast Missouri, Southern Illinois, and Western Kentucky by providing quality concerts, sporting events, topnotch family entertainment, and a first-rate banquet, convention, and meeting facility.

The facility is a joint-venture of Southeast Missouri State and the City of Cape Girardeau.

The combined SMC and Student Recreation Center, which received a complete renovation and expansion in 1999, were originally built at a cost of \$18 million.

The building houses the Redhawks men's and women's locker rooms, which have been completely remodeled. New basketball offices on the north side of the SMC were completed during the fall of 2003. More recently, a portable floor and goals were purchased before the 2011-12 season.

Southeast's Student Recreation Center is adjoined to the Show Me Center, and it houses the Redhawks' practice facilities. The center has five full basketball courts (including two hardwood courts), a large weight room, six racquetball courts, an indoor track, two cardiovascular equipment areas, a climbing wall, two multipurpose rooms, and full locker rooms. The new Student Acquatic Center, which opened in December 2007, features a four-lane lap pool, a recreational pool with a rock wall and zip line, hot tub and locker rooms.

In addition, the Redhawks had over 10,000 fans for the Western Kentucky (10,222) and Murray State (10,028) games in 2000, the Murray State (10,100) game in 2001 and the Southern Illinois matchups in 2005 (10,100) and 2011 (10,136).

The Redhawks went 12-1 at home during the historical 2019-20 season.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE



he Holcomb Success
Center offers Southeast
Missouri student-athletes
a place to study and develop as
students and campus leaders.

It is located in the Student
Recreation Center, just south
of Houck Field. The Holcomb
Success Center offers a computer
lab with 18 work terminals, study
areas and rooms for group
meetings. The facility houses the
Southeast Academic Services
staff and main weight room for
Redhawk student-athletes.

The beautiful facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by SEMO student-athletes.

Athletics achieved a 3.23 departmental GPA for the 2020-21 academic year. A total of 67 student-athletes graduated and 14 of SEMO's 15 sports finished with a team GPA of 3.0 or higher. There were 146 student-athletes on the President's List, including

78 in the fall and 68 in the spring. Additionally, 122 student-athletes made the Dean's List in the fall and 105 student-athletes earned that distinction during the spring.

Women's soccer (3.80) had the Department of Athletics' highest GPA in the fall and women's tennis (3.82) boasted the department's highest GPA in the spring. Women's soccer led the Department of Athletics with a 3.79 cumulative GPA during the 2020-21 academic year.

Maja Lundell (women's tennis) was one of five undergraduate students to receive the 2020-21 President's Spirit of Southeast Award. Lundell (4.0 GPA) was also the recipient of the Trombetta Award which is given to a graduating female student-athlete with the highest GPA for her career.

Morgan McCourt (women's soccer) received the Department of Economics' Outstanding

Overall Student Award from the Southeast Missouri State University Harrison College of Business.

Kate Daus (women's soccer) was awarded the Southeast Missouri State University Department of Communication Studies Public Advocacy Award and Trevor Falco (cross country/track & field, 3.80 GPA) received the Jewel Award. The Jewel Award is given each year to a male senior athlete with the highest GPA for his career.

Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress is monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at SEMO. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study skills and life skills topics, and thus, enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes can also receive individualized academic programs which include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The Holcomb Success
Center staff works to get
athletes involved in campus and
community projects, as well. This
is done to provide a support
structure and greater opportunity
for academic success. Through
the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills
Program, the Holcomb Success
Center gives student-athletes
personal and professional skills in
order to facilitate successful and
productive futures.

tudent-athletes and coaches at Southeast Missouri are dedicated to giving back to the community that so generously supports them.

Redhawk student-athletes have opportunities to participate in a variety of community service activities each year. Community involvement helps provide a support structure and greater opportunity for academic success.

We are proud of the level of commitment shown by our student-athletes and always encourage them to participate in community service projects here at SEMO.

SEMO student-athletes also have the opportunity to participate in the Redhawks BRIDGE Program. The mission of the Redhawks BRIDGE Program is to develop a comprehensive student-athlete development program by Building Responsible Individuals and Delivering Gainful Experiences. This program provides student-athletes with both leadership and life skills experiences through interactive programming that will prepare them to be successful in life after athletics. The leadership programming will teach studentathletes about SEMO's culture and allow them to learn, develop, and apply leadership skills. The life skills programming provides educational programs designed to assist studentathletes in identifying and applying transferable skills and experiences to prepare them to succeed outside of the athletic arena.

outheast Missouri's Sports Performance program is committed to developing the total studentathlete through their experiences within a competitive training environment.

SEMO's main weight room is located in the Holcomb Success Center.

In 2019, a nutrition center was added to the facility which provides adequate space for teams to have meals. Studentathletes can visit the nutrition center for breakfast and other snacks daily to enhance their nutritional needs. The nutrition center is always equipped with

plenty of water, gatorade and milk (provided by Prairie Farms) so student-athletes can stay properly hydrated.

Prior to that, the Holcomb Success Center Weight Room received a major overhaul in January, 2016.

Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation, which cost \$500,000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle SEMO's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Branding and new lighting were also included in the overall project.

outheast MIssouri's sports medicine staff strives to provide the best care possible for its student-athletes.


On Aug. 14, 2019, SEMO and SoutheastHEALTH entered a collaborative partnership in which SoutheastHEALTH will serve as comprehensive providers of orthopedic and sports medicine services for the University's NCAA Division I athletics program, its intramural and club sport participants and for the University's performing arts students.

Under the agreement,
SoutheastHEALTH orthopedic
and sports medicine physicians
provide orthopedic, primary
medical care, athletic training
and physical therapy services,
and invest in the University by
providing diagnostic equipment
and athletic training supplies, as
well as scholarships for students.

SoutheastHEALTH orthopedists Dr. Anthony McPherron, Dr. Matthew Baker and Dr. Charity Jacobs, and SoutheastHEALTH sports medicine physician Andrew Lawrence serve as the official team physicians of SEMO.

The sports medicine staff begins treatments and rehabilitation starting as early as 6 a.m., and is available until the last student-athlete is through.

There are currently four sports medicine facilities on campus. The staff treats out of the Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary training room is located. There are two other satellite athletic training rooms, including one at Houck Field House and one at the Show Me Center.

outheast Missouri's vision of winning the Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner's Cup became a reality when the Redhawks claimed the league's ultimate symbol of overall athletic excellence in Conference-sponsored championships for the first time in school history.

In 2018, SEMO developed a comprehensive strategic plan designed to guide the athletics department into the future which included the following objective as it relates to competition.

"Win the OVC Commissioner's Cup within the next five years and compete annually thereafter."

Mission accomplished.

In 2020-21, SEMO accumulated a total of 119 points, 7.5 points ahead of second-place Belmont (111.5). While competing in the middle of a COVID-19 pandemic, the Redhawks celebrated a dominating spring season bolstered by first-place finishes in

women's tennis, women's track & field, softball and baseball, and a second-place finish in men's track & field. The Redhawks also posted third-place finishes in women's basketball, soccer and volleyball.

"This is truly a team effort. Winning the Commissioner's Cup takes everyone. From the University administration, to the coaches and staff, to the student-athletes, to our supporters. We couldn't have achieved this level of success without all of these groups buying into our vision," said SEMO Director of Athletics Brady Barke.

The Redhawks storybook season came a year after they were on track to win the OVC Commissioner's Cup. In 2019-20, SEMO was in first place following the winter championships before the remainder of the year was canceled and the honor was not awarded due to COVID.

"Not having the opportunity to finish what we started in 2019-20,

makes this year's achievement extra special," added Barke. "We felt we were poised to win the Commissioner's Cup a year ago, so it was great to be able to carry that momentum into the 2020-21 academic year and achieve our goal."

Prior to 2020-21, SEMO finished no higher than third in the OVC Commissioner's Cup standings. Jacksonville State (110.5), Murray State (109.5), Austin Peay (95.0), Morehead State (92.5), UT Martin (88.5), Eastern Kentucky (86.5), Tennessee Tech (80.0), Eastern Illinois (79.5), SIU Edwardsville (75.0) and Tennessee State (33.0) completed this year's scoring.

Since the start of the 2019 calendar year, the Redhawks have won 11 conference championships, most in the OVC. Five of those titles came during this spring alone. SEMO completed its unprecedented 2020-21 campaign with a 93-42-1 (.688) record in conference regular-season play

for its highest OVC regularseason winning percentage in school history. The Redhawks were the only OVC school that qualified for every conference championship event this season. Additionally, SEMO became the first school in OVC history to win a regular-season championship in baseball, softball and women's tennis in the same year.





PRESIDENT DR. CARLOS VARGAS



r. Carlos Vargas became the 18th president of Southeast Missouri State University July 1, 2015, after having served as acting president at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania.

Since becoming president, Dr. Vargas has launched initiatives to marshal the resources, leverage opportunities and address a variety of challenges and needs of Southeast Missouri State University. He has set as primary goals for the institution the support for student persistence and retention.

He has encouraged and supported the identification and development of innovative academic programs, including bachelor's degrees in Unmanned Aircraft Systems, Geographic Information Science, and industrial and systems engineering. He has continued to support the globalization of

the campus through expansion of study-abroad experiences, extensive engagement of international students, and encouragement of students on campus and abroad to explore cultural interaction. He has championed the work of the President's Task Force on Diversity Education and continued emphasizing the expectations for enhancement of the teacherscholar model. Under President Vargas' leadership, regional partnerships and collaborations have been solidified, including several joint initiatives with Three Rivers, Mineral Area and other community colleges.

Prior to assuming the presidency at Southeast, Dr. Vargas served one year as acting president of Kutztown University, where he also served as the provost and vice president for academic and student affairs.

Prior to his tenure at Kutztown,

Dr. Vargas was at Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio, where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs. He previously served in several roles at Kent State University (Ohio) for a total of 18 years, including founding director of the program on electron beam technology. He was also Kent's associate dean for research, interim assistant dean for research and interim assistant dean for the School of Technology. He started his tenure at Kent State in 1985 as a professor, and continued to teach until his departure from the

university in 2003.

Dr. Vargas began his career in higher education at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), from which he received a Bachelor of Science in physics.

He earned his Ph.D. in physics and aerospace science from the University of Michigan and he has Master of Science degrees from Michigan in both physics and aerospace science. He is married to Pam Vargas, who currently serves as director of Research and Grant Development at Southeast, and they have a son, a daughter, and two granddaughters.

Athletics has reached unprecedented success under the leadership of Brady Barke.

In 2020-21, SEMO claimed its first-ever Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner's Cup, the league's ultimate symbol of overall athletic excellence in Conferencesponsored championships.

While competing in the middle of a COVID-19 pandemic, the Redhawks won five OVC titles and one national championship. Women's tennis (regular-season), softball (regular-season), women's outdoor track & field and baseball (regular-season and tournament) all celebrated OVC championships, and gymnastics won the 2021 USA Gymnastics Women's Collegiate National Championship.

All that success came after the Redhawks were on track to win the OVC Commissioner's Cup the previous year. In 2019-20, SEMO was in first place following the winter championships before the remainder of the year was canceled and the honor was not awarded due to COVID.

Since the start of the 2019 calendar year, the Redhawks have won a total of 11 conference championships, most in the OVC. SEMO completed its remarkable 2020-21 campaign with a 93-42-1 (.688) record in conference regular-season play for its highest OVC regular-season winning percentage in school history. The Redhawks were also the only OVC school that qualified for every conference championship event in 2020-21, the best season in SEMO's NCAA Division I history.

Barke looks forward to keeping the momentum going as he begins his sixth year as SEMO's Director of Athletics.

Barke served as the Interim Director of Athletics since July, 2015, before being named to the permanent position of Director of Athletics on June 7, 2016.

He has built a culture that thrives on academics just as much as it does on competitive success. Academically, SEMO's athletic teams are strong year-in and year-out.

Athletics achieved a 3.23 departmental GPA for the 2020-21 academic year. Fourteen of SEMO's 15 sports finished with a team GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Before that, student-athletes overcame an enormous amount of adversity and disruption brought on by a global COVID-19 pandemic to close out the 2019-20 academic year with a Department of Athletics record 3.53 spring grade point average.

That mark was the highest GPA of any semester for the Redhawks who had a total of 12 teams achieve a 3.21 or higher GPA in the spring term alone.

Also, five different programs, including gymnastics (3.82), women's soccer (3.78), women's basketball (3.42), men's basketball (3.26) and football (2.94) registered their highest semester GPAs ever.

The upcoming 2021-22 campaign marks SEMO's fourth

year with Under Armour. Barke reached a multi-year agreement with the Baltimore-based global leader in performance footwear, apparel and equipment that made Under Armour the official outfitter of SEMO Athletics on July 1, 2018.

As part of the multi-year agreement, Under Armour provides on-field and training gear for 15 sports. Additionally, Under Armour outfits members of the athletic department including coaches and staff.

Barke also secured bids to host SEMO's first home football playoff games. Additionally, he helped the University reach a collaborative partnership with SoutheastHEALTH. Under the agreement, SoutheastHEALTH orthopedic and sports medicine physicians provide orthopedic, primary medical care, athletic training and physical therapy services, and invest in the University by providing diagnostic equipment and athletic training supplies, as well as scholarships for students.

More recently, new state-ofthe-art Formetco digital video scoreboards were installed at both Houck Field and the Southeast Softball Complex under Barke's leadership.

A 4,000-square foot baseball training facility was completed prior to the 2020 season. The \$400,000 indoor facility can fit up to four batting cages.

Barke hired Brad Korn as the Redhawks head men's basketball coach on Mar. 24, 2020, while navigating through the challenging times during the COVID-19 pandemic. Korn was the fourth head coach Barke hired during his tenure as Director of Athletics.

During his first year in 2016-17, Barke introduced Andy Sawyers as the Redhawks head baseball coach and worked tirelessly on two major renovation projects.

Nearly a month after Sawyers was hired, Southeast Missouri State and the City of Cape Girardeau officially broke ground on Capaha Field. New synthetic turf, new fencing and a digital scoreboard in the outfield were added as part of the \$1.8 million project that was completed before SEMO's season-opener.

Gymnastics Coach Ashley Lawson orchestrated a big turnaround in SEMO women's gymnastics during her first three years as head coach.

Women's Tennis Coach Mary Beth Gunn was Barke's other hire.

Sawyers, Lawson and Gunn each claimed Coach of the Year honors in 2021. SEMO's baseball team won the OVC regularseason and tournament titles, and made the NCAA Tournament under Sawyers. The gymnastics team won the USA Gymnastics Women's Collegiate National Championship with Lawson at the helm. And, Gunn led the women's tennis team to its first OVC regular-season title in program history.

On Feb. 3, 2017, SEMO formally dedicated Holcomb Success

Center. To honor the long-time service and philanthropy of Dr. John and Judy Holcomb, the University named the facility the Holcomb Success Center located in the Student Recreation Center-South. Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation at a cost of \$500.000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle SEMO's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Barke helped secure the Holcombs gift, the largest single cash gift in SEMO Athletics history. Major improvements were also made to the second floor of the building where athletic academic services are housed. This space provides student-athletes with places to study and features a computer lab with 30 work terminals and rooms for group meetings. Staff members assist student-athletes with life skills development, academic advising and academic progress toward degree requirements and NCAA eligibility.

Additional renovations have been made to the nutrition area that serves as a fueling station for SEMO student-athletes at the Holcomb Success Center.

Fundraising continues to increase under Barke's direction.

The 2018-19 campaign marked the highest level of giving to the Redhawks Club general fund in 15 years.

Barke also worked with donors to establish two new endowed scholarships for student-athletes and raised over \$60,000 to support the SEMO football program and summer school scholarships.

More than \$250,000 in pledges for the Redhawks Club unrestricted booster fund has been raised with Barke as Director of Athletics.

Improved branding has been a priority. Redhawk banners, S-E! M-O! billboards, Welcome to Redhawk Country and Redhawks yard signs are prominently displayed all over Cape Girardeau.

On July 1, 2020, SEMO unveiled refreshed spirit marks, including a new primary logo, wordmark and variations for its 15 athletic programs. The new brand identity will allow SEMO's athletic teams to display consistent logos, lettering and numerals, and is independent of the existing University marks.

A year later on July 1, 2021, SEMO partnered with Affinity Licensing to manage its trademark licensing program. As part of the agreement, Affinity Licensing will act as the exclusive agency to manage the University's consumer products licensing relationships with manufacturers and retailers.

Barke helped develop the Redhawks Trivia Night & Auction, a sold out event that generated over \$200,000 in net revenue over five years. In addition, he launched the Redhawks BRIDGE program which provides studentathletes with both leadership and life skills experiences through interactive programming that will prepare them to be successful in life after athletics.

Barke served as Interim Associate Director of Athletics for Compliance & Student Support Services before being named the Senior Associate to the President and Secretary to the Southeast Missouri State University Board of Regents in 2013. He began his tenure at
Southeast in 2008 as Assistant
Director of Athletics for
Compliance & Eligibility. Barke
previously served as a governance
intern with the NCAA national
headquarters in Indianapolis, and
as a law clerk with the Southern
Illinois University-Carbondale
Department of Athletics
Compliance Office.

Barke has served as a member of the National Association of Athletics Compliance (NAAC), chaired the NAAC Education Committee, and was a member of the NAAC Board of Directors. He has facilitated the NCAA Regional Leadership Academy, and served on both the NCAA Sports Wagering Task Force and the Olympic Sports Liaison Committee.

Barke has a juris doctorate degree from Southern Illinois University School of Law, an MBA from Southeast Missouri State University, and a bachelor of science degree in biology from Webster University. While a student at Webster, Barke was a member of both the basketball and golf teams and was inducted into the Webster Athletic Hall of Fame.

He and his wife, Halley, are parents of three children, Mabrie, Jackson, and Kolbe.



n six seasons, Rekha
Patterson has elevated
the Southeast Missouri
women's basketball program
from a preseason last place
selection in 2015 to the 2020
OVC Conference Tournament
Champions. The Redhawks
earned the league's automatic
bid to the NCAA tournament, a
first in 13 years and were a team
that was projected to win their
First Round game before the
season was cancelled due to
COVID

Patterson has guided the Redhawks to six-consecutive Ohio Valley Conference Tournament appearances and led the Redhawks to just their second OVC Tournament title in program history and first since the 2006-07 season.

As Patterson enters her seventh season at the helm, she

and her staff have been able to recruit, retain and develop a plethora of talented student-athletes. They have tutored an OVC Tournament MVP, the first-ever Freshman of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and All-OVC performers in each season.

Southeast Missouri qualified for its sixth-straight Ohio Valley Conference Tournament as the #3 seed during the 2020-21 season. The Redhawks finished with a 15-11 overall record. SEMO posted a 13-7 record in OVC play for third in the league for the second-consecutive year. For Patterson, it was her second-straight winning season at SEMO after guiding the Redhawks to the 2020 OVC Tournament title.

SEMO recorded four series sweeps of OVC opponents

(Tennessee Tech, Tennessee State, Austin Peay and SIUE) in 2020-21. The Redhawks led the league with a field-goal percentage defense of 37.1. SEMO also topped the conference for rebound margin (3.8), rebounds (1,036) and rebounds per game (39.85). SEMO ranked second in the OVC for blocked shots (147) and blocked shots per game (5.7). The Redhawks were also third for 3-point field goal defense with 27.7.

LaTrese Saine was awarded 2020-21 OVC Defensive Player of the Year and was named to the 2020-21 All-OVC First Team with Tesia Thompson. Saine is the second Redhawk in school history to earn OVC Defensive Player of the Year after Adrianna Murphy nabbed the laurel in 2017-18.

Saine led the OVC and ranked second in the NCAA in 2020-21 for blocked shots (103) and blocked shots per game (3.96). She also was second for rebounds (222) and third for rebounds per game (8.5). She rewrote the SEMO record books for blocking in 2020-21. She set the single-season (103), singlegame (10) and career block records (212) in her redshirtsenior season as a Redhawk and helped SEMO set the all-time single-game blocks record with 13 against Murray State on January 14, 2021.

Thompson (430 points) and Saine (270 points) were SEMO's top scorers averaging 18.7 and 10.4 points per game, respectively in 2020-21. Roshala Scott was third on the team with 10.2 points per game (265 points) and Taelour Pruitt







averaged just under 10 points (9.9) per game (159 points). Sophie Bussard netted 8.8 points per contest (230 points).

Patterson mentored Thompson who finished her career with six All-OVC accolades including Freshman of the Year and Tournament MVP. She averaged 19.6 points and 7.8 rebounds per game in conference play, ranking third and ninth in the OVC in those categories, respectively in 2019-20. Thompson dished out 41 assists, five blocks and 25 steals, as well. For the year, she averaged 18.6 points per game as the Redhawks top scorer. Thompson concluded her SEMO career with 1,927 points, which ranks third in program history. She also is fourth all-time in school history for career rebounds (801) and fifth for steals (192).

Patterson was named the OVC Coach of the Year in 2019-20 as she led the Redhawks to a 25-7 overall record and a third-place finish with a 14-4 mark in OVC play. It was SEMO's highest OVC finish since the 2007-08. The 2019-20 team also had the highest winning percentage in the Division I era and were ranked 21st in the final CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll following the historic 2019-20 season.

The 2019-20 Redhawks achieved their success after being predicted to place sixth in the league's preseason poll. Statistically, SEMO led the OVC in scoring offense (74.5 ppg) and scoring margin

(+10.6), while ranking third with a .343 three-point field goal percentage. The team also achieved an 11-game winning streak during conference play.

The Redhawks finished their non-conference slate with an 8-3 record. SEMO recorded a dominating 70-53 win over SEC member Ole Miss for its first road win over an SEC school in program history. This was just the second all-time win against a SEC foe in program history and first since 1998.

SEMO went 3-0 in the 2020 OVC Tournament to earn the automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament before the season ended abruptly due to COVID-19. The Redhawks outscored their opponents 263-227 in the tournament, garnering double-digit victories against the tourney's top-two seeded teams.

Patterson garnered her first OVC Tournament win with an 82-81 overtime triumph over Tennessee Tech in the first round of the 2020 tournament. Taelour Pruitt's long-range step back 3-pointer at the buzzer against Tennessee Tech sent SEMO to the semifinals against No. 2 Belmont. The buzzer beater was the top play on ESPN SportsCenter's Top-10 on March 6, 2020.

SEMO shattered program and conference records with a 114-99 victory over No. 2 Belmont in the semifinals of the OVC Tournament. Tesia Thompson scored a career-high 39 points, Carrie Shephard poured in 29 and Taelour Pruitt added 21 in

in the record-setting game that ended Belmont's streak of four-straight OVC Tournament titles. The Redhawks broke OVC Tournament single-game records in points scored and 3-point field goal percentage (82.4 percent). SEMO missed only three times from beyond the arc going a staggering 14-of-17. Combined, SEMO and Belmont scored 213 points, also an OVC Tournament record for total points in a game.

A day after a staggering offensive showcase, #3 SEMO used a remarkable defensive effort to beat #1 UT Martin and win the 2020 OVC Tournament Title. Defensively, SEMO held UTM to only 33.3 percent (18-of-54) from the field and did not give up a 3-pointer to a Skyhawk team, which entered the game as the second-most accurate 3-point shooting team in OVC play. The Skyhawks had a 3-pointer in every game that season except this one, finishing 0-of-11 from beyond the arc.

The Redhawks 2019-20 All-OVC honorees included Tesia Thompson (First-Team, OVC All-Tournament Team MVP), Carrie Shephard (First-Team, OVC All-Tournament Team), and Taelour Pruitt (OVC All-Tournament Team).

Thompson became just the 10th Redhawk in the Division I era to surpass 1,000 points. She reached the milestone at Ole Miss (Dec. 14) in the first quarter.

Patterson also mentored Shephard, who broke her own SEMO single-season record in 3-pointers made with 88 in 2019-20. In her junior and senior seasons, Shephard made a combined 161 three-pointers, which place her fourth all-time at SEMO in career 3-pointers made. She was second on the team in scoring with 16.6 points per game and led the team with 67 steals and rates second with 101 assists.

In 2018-19, four Redhawks logged over 200 points, with Tesia Thompson leading the team and the conference with 529 points. Carrie Shephard (288), Murphy (258) and Jocelyn Taylor (234) also scored over 200 points. Carrie Shephard set the single-season record for three-pointers attempted (217) and three-pointers made (73).

In 2017-18, Patterson mentored Thompson, the first to gain All-OVC Newcomer, All-OVC Second Team and later named OVC Freshman of the Year honors in the same year. Murphy was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year, the first honor for a Redhawk. The Redhawks recorded the first ever pre-season WNIT victory over Saint Francis (82-50).

In 2016-17, Patterson mentored Bri Mitchell, the first, First Team All-OVC performer out of SEMO since Missy Whitney in 2007-08.

Mitchell and fellow 2016-17 senior Olivia Hackmann both topped the 1,000-point marks in their Redhawk careers. As a team, Southeast Missouri ranked second in the league in assists (479), fewest turnovers, scoring offense (73.9 points per game), and 3-point shooting percentage (34.9%). Individually, point guard Adrianna Murphy led the OVC in assists per game (5.8) and second in total assists (174).

In her first season as head coach, Patterson guided the Redhawks to their first winning season in seven years, posting an even 15-15 overall record and an 8-8 Ohio Valley Conference record. The Redhawks, who were picked to finish last in the 12-team league, finished tied for fifth in Patterson's first season. In addition, Southeast punched its ticket to the OVC Tournament for the first time since 2009 under Patterson's tutelage. Junior guard, Bri Mitchell was named a Second Team All-OVC performer.

Statistically, the Redhawks ranked 13th nationally in rebounds per game, averaging 43.4 board per game. That figure ranked second in the OVC. SEMO's 28 defensive rebounds per game ranked 24th nationally, third in the OVC.

Of the eight head coaches in the history of Southeast Missouri women's basketball, Patterson became the fourth to record a winning season in their first year at the helm of the program.

Academically, the Redhawks have averaged a 3.30 GPA over the last six years. SEMO has had 36 student-athletes on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Sophie Bussard and Sophia Hancock each earned OVC Academic Medals of Honor in 2020-21 after earning perfect 4.0 GPAs during the academic year. Carrie Shephard earned the award in 2019-20. In 2015-16 and 2017-18 Ashton Luttrull received the OVC Medal of Honor. The Redhawks recorded their highest semester team

GPA (3.42) after the Spring 2020 semester.

Patterson was named the eighth head coach in Southeast Missouri women's basketball history during a press conference at the Show Me Center on April 15, 2015. She is the first female head coach in the NCAA Division I era for Southeast Missouri and fourth female head coach in the 39-year history of the program.

Patterson is an active member of the community, serving on the Cape Girardeau Public Library Board of Directors since 2017, the Southeast Missouri FCA Board 2016-2019 and has been a member of the Chamber of Commerce since 2015. She has been a guest speaker for many local civic groups, sports organizations and Chamber of Commerce events and was the 2016 keynote speaker for the Women's Prayer Breakfast.

She currently serves as the OVC's WBCA Conference Captain.

Patterson previously was the associate head coach at Ball State from 2013-15. She also has worked on the staffs at Baylor (2002-04, 2010-12), Creighton (2007-08), Ball State (2006-07) and Eastern Illinois (2004-06).

During her coaching career,
Patterson has worked with
teams that have won a National
Championship, reached two
Final Fours, the Sweet 16 four
times and has been a part of
seven Big 12 championships.
She has coached a National
Player of the Year (Brittney
Griner), two National Freshmen
of the Year, four College







All-Americans, an Ohio Valley Conference Freshman of the Year (Rachel Galligan) and numerous all-conference performers.

Patterson helped guide Ball State to the WNIT. In 2014-15, the Cardinals were 13-5 in Mid-American Conference (MAC) play. In her first season back at Ball State, the Cardinals advanced to the 2014 MAC Tournament championship game. Ball State became the first team to ever play five games in a single MAC Tournament. It was her second stint with the Cardinals after previously serving as an assistant coach in 2006-07.

In 2014, Patterson was a participant in the Achieving Coaching Excellence (ACE) program that was run by the NCAA.

While at Baylor from 2009-13, Patterson was part of the first women's basketball team to ever win 40 games as the Lady Bears posted an unbeaten mark on the way to the national championship. She spent the 2012-13 season as the associate coach and recruiting coordinator after working the previous three years as the coordinator of basketball operations.

Patterson was an assistant coach at Creighton in 2007-08 when the Bluejays won 21 games, fell one win short of sharing the Missouri Valley Conference regular season title, and completed the 15th-best turnaround in the nation that season.

While she was an assistant coach at Eastern Illinois from 2004-06, Patterson was the post coach for Galligan as she earned the top freshman honor in the OVC.

From 2002-04, Patterson began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Baylor. Prior to that, she spent a year working at the NCAA national headquarters, where she was an education services intern.

A native of Red Springs, North Carolina, Patterson was a four-year letterwinner and two-time captain at North Carolina A&T, where she earned a bachelor's degree in public relations in 2001. She received a master's degree in education with an emphasis in sport management from Baylor in 2004.

Her mother, Eva Patterson-Heath, was the head coach of the Fayetteville State (N.C.) women's basketball program and took her team to the NCAA Division II national tournament. She previously won over 500 games as the head coach at Red Springs (N.C.) High School.

he 2021-22 season marks the first for Jasmine Newsome as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator on the Redhawks women's basketball staff.

Newsome previously served as an assistant coach on the UT Martin women's basketball staff for six seasons after ranking as one of the program's all-time greats during her playing career. During her tenure as a student-athlete with the Skyhawks, Newsome helped lead the squad to four Ohio Valley Conference Tournament titles and four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

In her coaching stint with the Skyhawk, Newsome has seen the program win three OVC regular season titles during the 2015-16, 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons along with four of the program's 20-win seasons. The Skyhawks also qualified for the postseason four times with berths in the Women's NIT in

2016, 2018, 2020 (canceled) and 2021.

Newsome has worked with eight All-OVC honorees in Ashton Feldhaus, Haley Howard, Chelsey Perry, Emanye Robertson, Kendall Spray, Myah Taylor, Maddie Waldrop and Dasia Young. Howard, Perry (twice), Robertson, Spray, Waldrop and Young each earned first team accolades while the others earned second team honors. Perry was named the 2020 and 2021 OVC Player of the Year while becoming the program's first WNBA Draft selection after being taken 26th overall by the Indiana Fever in 2021.

Newsome rejoined the Skyhawks after a stellar career, which saw the former guard rank as the program and OVC's second all-time scorer with 2,566 career points. She was twice named OVC Player of the Year while notching three Defensive Player of the Year awards. A four-time All-OVC first team selection, Newsome became the program's first Associated Press All-American following her junior campaign.

Additional accolades include being named Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Amateur Athlete of the Year along being tabbed College Sports Madness All Mid-Major Player of the Year and a first team All-American selection by the publication. She started every game of her 131-game career, while setting program single game records in points and assists. She tallied 44 points in a victory over Quinnipiac before setting a new assist record on senior night with 14 assists against Austin Peay.

Newsome holds UT Martin records for: single game points (44, 2013); single game three-point field goals made (nine, 2011); single game three-point field goals attempted (16, 2011); single game free throws made

(16, two occasions); single game free throws attempted (20, 2012); single game assists (14, 2014); single season points (770, 2013); single season free throws made (167, 2013); single season assists (193, 2012); career free throws made (611); career assists (681).

After playing at UT Martin she played professionally in Germany with Gisa Lions SV Halle.

Following her career, she was inducted into the UT Martin Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019 while having her jersey hung in the rafters of the Kathleen and Tom Elam Center on Feb. 8, 2020.

Newsome earned her bachelor's degree from UT Martin in 2014 with a degree in health and human performance. She also graduated from UTM with a Master's in Family and Consumer Science.

2021-22 SOUTHEAST MISSOURI WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GUIDE DAVID MIDLICK









ASSISTANT COACH

FIRST YEAR // MISSISSIPPI, 1991

he 2021-22 season marks the first for David Midlick as an assistant coach on the Redhawks women's basketball staff.

Midlick previously led the Austin Peay women's basketball team as the head coach. Midlick guided the Governors to six-consecutive Ohio Valley Conference Tournament appearances from 2015 to 2021.

In his six seasons at the helm in Clarksville, Tennessee, Midlick coached five All-OVC players, including 2016-17 Player of the Year, Tearra Banks. Midlick led the Governors to 18 regular season wins in 2019-20, which is the most regularseason wins in program history since the 2003-04 team won 20 regular-season games.

Midlick's Governors broke the Austin Peay single-season team three-point record twice. The 2019-20 squad buried a program record 267 three pointers, which led the OVC and ranked 14th

nationally.

Prior to leading the APSU women's basketball team, Midlick served as the associate head coach at Memphis and the head coach at Delta State. He also was an assistant coach at Tennessee State (2006-10) and had prior coaching stints with both the men's and women's programs at Austin Peay.

Midlick got his college coaching start as a volunteer assistant with the Austin Peay men's basketball team in 2003, holding that position through 2006 during an era that saw the Govs finish unbeaten in Ohio Valley Conference play in 2003-04 and advance to two conference tournament championship games (2004 and 2006) and one National Invitational Tournament appearance in 2004.

Midlick served two seasons as head coach at Delta State University, guiding the Lady Statesmen to consecutive Gulf South Conference regularseason championships and two NCAA Division II South Region appearances, including a Sweet 16 berth.

Midlick has also coached at the high school level and was a highly successful physical therapist before he pivoted to basketball.

Midlick began his career in the high school ranks, coaching boys and girls basketball at various points in his prep career in Mississippi. He entered the coaching ranks at Washington High School in 1994-95 and took a boys' program that won just six games in two seasons before his arrival and compiled a 90-77 record in his six seasons at the helm. He also guided the girls' team to its first winning season since 1991 during a three-year stint leading that program. Midlick was named the Mississippi Independent Association of Schools North AAA Coach of the Year in 1996

and MAIS District I-AAA Coach of the Year in 1999. In between stints at Washington High, he led Indianola Academy to a district 1-AA championship.

He graduated from the University of Mississippi with a Bachelor's degree in Biological Science in 1991 and earned his Bachelor's in Physical Therapy from the University of Mississippi Medical Center in

As a player, Midlick was a three-year letter winner at Ole Miss under head coach Ed Murphy from 1988-91. The Rebels played in the NIT in 1989 - with Midlick leading the team in free-throw percentage and three-point field goal percentage - and were Southeastern Conference tournament finalists in 1990.

he 2021-22 season marks the first for Carolyn Jenkins as an assistant coach on the Redhawks women's basketball staff.

Jenkins previously served as the associate head women's basketball coach at Kansas Wesleyan.

In her seven seasons at Kansas Wesleyan, Jenkins assisted with the varsity, worked exclusively with the post players and was the head coach of the junior varsity team. As the associate head coach, she helped the Coyotes compile a record of 120-81 with four 20-win seasons.

With head coach Ryan Showman, Jenkins coached KWU in 2019-20 to its first outright Kansas Conference title and a first-round win in the NAIA Division II National Championship before COVID-19 forced the cancellation of the rest of the event. The 2019-20 squad posted a program-best 21-3 record in conference play and had a 26-6 overall record.

In 2020-21, Jenkins helped guide the Coyotes to the KCAC Semifinals as Kentucky Wesleyan finished with a mark of 16-11.

She helped coach 22 All-KCAC players including 2019-20 KCAC Newcomer of the Year and third-team NAIA All-American Kelcey Hinz at KWU. Jenkins has also been a part of two NAIA Scholar-Teams and WBCA Academic Top 25 teams.

Prior to joining the Coyotes coaching staff, Jenkins played professionally overseas in Bulgaria and France and had a tryout with the former San Antonio Stars of the WNBA.

Jenkins graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Applied Behavioral Science and a minor in Sociology in 2013 from The University of Kansas.

She was a four-year player for KU, who scored more than 1,700

points and grabbed over 700 rebounds leading the Jayhawks to back-to-back NCAA Sweet 16 appearances. She was recognized as one of the top five centers in the country, as well as an All-American and her efforts landed her a spot on the KU Women's Basketball All-Decade Team

Jenkins earned her Master's of Business Administration from KWU in 2016.

She is married to Jeff Jenkins. The couple has two children: Aiden, 5, and Jiren, 1.









OVC HISTORY

Now in its 74th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles "Turkey" Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged February 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958 Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961 Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

After Title IX legislation passed in 1972, women's athletics began a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC began formulating plans for women's athletics in 1975 and established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982. The

conference added women's golf and softball in 1994 and women's soccer in 1998.

Several coaches have made their mark in the history of OVC women's basketball. Former Tennessee Tech coach Marynell Meadors posted an amazing 363-139 (72.3%) record at Tech, becoming the first woman in NCAA or AIAW history to win 300 games at the same institution, while former Tennessee State skipper Teresa Phillips earned National Coach of the Year honors from USA Today in 1990 for turning around the Lady Tigers' program before going on to lead TSU to the NCAA Tournament in 1994 and 1995. Phillips was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2021 after completing a career in administration that saw her serve as TSU's Director of Athletics from 2002 through 2019. Tennessee Tech coach Bill Worrell capped a stellar 20-year career in 2005-06 and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2007; he compiled a 408-190 record while leading the Golden Eagles to an unprecedented 16 OVC regular-season titles and eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including five straight from 1989-93. Larry Joe Inman, who retired at the conclusion of the 2007-08 season and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2009, won more than 100 games at both Middle Tennessee and Eastern Kentucky, and earned OVC Coach of the Year honors a record eight times - five times at EKU and three at MTSU. In 2012-13 Inman came out of retirement to take the Tennessee State job; in 2014-15 he led the Lady Tigers to its first OVC Tournament Championship since 1995. Inman once again retired following the 2016-17 season, with 545 career victories.

Many great players have graced the hardwood over the years, including former OVC Players of the Year Brooke Armistead and Gerlonda Hardin from Austin Peay, Pam Chambers, Jerilynn Harper, Cheryl Taylor, Angela Moorehead, Roschelle Vaughn, Diane Seng, Janet Holt and Emily Christian from Tennessee Tech; Morehead State's Donna Murphy, Priscilla Blackford and Chynna Bozeman; Eastern Kentucky's Kim Mays; Southeast Missouri's Gray C. Harris; Murray State's Ashley Hayes; UT Martin's Heather Butler, Jasmine Newsome and Chelsey Perry; and Belmont's Darby Maggard.

Morehead State center Brittany Pittman set new school, league and NCAA standards for blocked shots in 2008-09. Pittman swatted 164 shots during the season, setting a new NCAA single-season record (which has since been broken).

In 2012-13 the UT Martin duo of Jasmine Newsome and Heather Butler finished fifth and sixth nationally among NCAA scoring leaders. Newsome, the 2012 and 2013 OVC Player of the Year, averaged 22.6 points per game on the way to All-American honors while Butler averaged 22.4 points per contest. Butler set a NCAA record during the season by connecting on a 3-pointer in her 80th-straight game.

In 2013-14 Butler and Newsome capped their brilliant careers by ranking first and second in scoring in OVC history. Butler, the 2013-14 OVC Female Athlete of the Year, finished her career with 2,865 points, which ranked first in OVC and 16th in NCAA history. She also finished her career with 392 career 3-pointers (which was tied for the most in NCAA history following her career but now ranks second) and scored in double figures in all 129 career games, which ranks fifth in NCAA history. Following the season Butler was signed by the WNBA's San Antonio Stars where she became the first OVC player to make an active WNBA roster. Newsome capped her career with 2,566 points, second only to Butler in OVC history.

The league also had another historical moment in November 2008 when the NCAA awarded Nashville the 2014 NCAA Women's Division I Final Four. The OVC served as the host of the prestigious event, which is one of the biggest sporting events the city of Nashville can host. The event was held April 6 and 8 at Bridgestone Arena in downtown Nashville and was played in front of sold-out crowds for both the semifinals and championship as UConn topped Notre Dame in a battle of undefeated teams to win its ninth national title.

In 2017-18, Belmont completed its second-straight undefeated league season, increasing its winning streak in Conference games (both regular season and tournament) to 46 games. The Bruins were ranked in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and Associated Press Poll during the year, becoming the first OVC team to be nationally-ranked since 1992-93. The Bruins finished the year ranked No. 23 in the AP poll.

Belmont guard Darby Maggard capped her career in 2018-19 by earning her fourth-straight first-team All-OVC honor in addition to earning her fourth-straight OVC





All-Tournament honors. She became the first player in NCAA history to make at least 400 3-pointers and dish out at least 650 assists in a career while her 92.4 percent career free throw percentage ranks first in NCAA history, her 2.77 assist-to-turnover ratio is third and her 430 made 3-pointers is fourth. She was one of just 19 players in OVC history to reach 2,000 career points (2,031) and she finished her career third in OVC history for assists (683). After the season Maggard finished as the national runner-up at the College 3-Point Championship.

In 2020-21. Belmont would became the first OVC women's basketball team to win a NCAA Tournament game since 1990 (Tennessee Tech), topping Gonzaga 64-59 in the first round in San Marcos, Texas.

UT Martin's Chelsey Perry, a twotime OVC Player of the Year, was selected 26th overall by the Indiana Fever in the third round of the 2021 WNBA Draft. It marked the highest-ever selection for an OVC player and the first UTM player selected in the Draft. Perry would end up making the Fever's roster and appear in regular season games..

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 298 student-athletes honored with the award.

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995. the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation and has answered

the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

Additionally, the OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track, volleyball and beach volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Belmont University, Eastern Illinois University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin. The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is an affiliate member for the sport of beach volleyball.

2022 OVC Women's Basketball Championship Tournament

The 2022 OVC Women's Basketball Championship Tournament is set for March 2-5 at the Ford Center in Evansville, Indiana. It marks the fifth year in a row that the event will be held at that venue.

The Ford Center, which opened in 2011, is a 11,000-seat arena located in the core of Evansville's downtown district. The 290,000-square foot facility serves as home of the Evansville Thunderbolts of the Southern Professional Hockey League and the Indiana Freebirds of the National Gridiron League (NGL). The Ford Center has serves as host to numerous sporting events and concerts on an annual basis.

Last season Belmont won the 2021 OVC Championship with a 83-75 victory over top-seeded UT Martin.




