#### **Against Ranked Teams**

Arkansas is ranked No. 2 in this week's D1Baseball Poll. The Razorbacks are also ranked fifth in the Collegiate Baseball and sixth in the Baseball America polls. Arkansas is the first top-five opponent Southeast Missouri faces since playing at #1 Vanderbilt on Feb. 26, 2019. The Redhawks are 3-8 in their last 11 meetings with ranked opponents. That record includes a 0-2 mark against teams ranked in the top five. SEMO last beat a ranked team on Apr. 29, 2018 (10-6, vs. #20

Tennessee Tech). The Redhawks last knocked off a ranked Southeastern Conference team was Mar. 28, 2017 (6-5, at #23 Missouri). Here are SEMO's results in its last 11 meetings with ranked teams:

#### Series History

Southeast Missouri and Arkansas meet for the 12th time when they open their series Thursday. The Razorbacks hold a slight 6-5 lead in the series which dates back to 1995. All 11 games of the series were played in Fayetteville. SEMO last faced Arkansas on Mar. 17-18, 2015. The Redhawks split two games with the Razorbacks winning, 4-3, on Mar. 17 that year.

#### Sawyers vs. Ranked Opponents

Andy Sawyers is 2-2 all-time against ranked opponents as Southeast Missouri's head coach, SEMO upended #23 Missouri, 6-5, on Mar. 28, 2017 (Columbia, Mo.) and took down #20 Tennessee Tech, 10-6, on Apr. 29, 2018 (Cape Girardeau). The Redhawks ended TTU's 28-game winning streak, the longest in the nation at the time. SEMO's other two meetings with ranked teams under Sawyers were at #1 Vanderbilt (L, 11-3, Feb. 26, 2019) and at #24 Missouri (L, 21-6, May 1, 2019).

#### **Ezell Revisits Razorback Country**

First-year Southeast Missouri Director of Offensive Player Development and former Arkansas Razorback Trevor Ezell returns to his old stomping grounds in Fayetteville this week. A native of Bryant, Arkansas, Ezell is back in Cape Girardeau following a two-year stint in Minor League Baseball. He was signed by the Tampa Bay Rays during the summer of 2019 after making a trip to the College World Series at Arkansas. In his final college season at Arkansas, Ezell hit .329 with a team-high 25 doubles and 72 runs scored en route to Second-Team All-SEC and SEC All-Defensive Team accolades that year. His 72 runs also ranked fourth in the SEC and 11th in the nation. Additionally, Ezell was the Razorbacks top hitter in the 2019 NCAA Tournament hitting .459 with 17 hits, six doubles, two home runs and eight RBI in eight contests. Prior to that, Ezell spent four years at SEMO. He earned both First-Team and Second-Team All-Ohio Valley Conference honors. Ezell started 181 games and accumulated 251 hits, 194 runs, 128 RBI, 48 stolen bases and 45 doubles in his career. He also hit .336, boasted a .495 slugging percentage and held a .967 fielding percentage during his time as a Redhawk.

#### Season-Opening Series Win

The Redhawks opened their 2021 campaign with a 2-1 series win on the road at Sun Belt Conference member South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). Southeast Missouri beat the Jaguars, 4-2, on Feb. 19 and, 8-6, in 10 innings on Feb. 21 to claim its second season-opening series win under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. With its win on Feb. 19, SEMO also improved to 12-18 all-time in season-opening games during its NCAA Division I era (since 1992) and 3-2 in such games under Sawyers.

#### On the Road in February

A schedule adjustment early on put Southeast Missouri on the road for its first month of the baseball season. The Redhawks wound up beginning their 2021 campaign with a three-game series at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). SEMO was originally supposed to host Milwaukee in a four-game series on opening weekend, but large amounts of snow and ice covered the Cape Girardeau area forcing unplayable conditions. Southeast Missouri State University's main campus was closed due to the heavy winter weather on Feb. 15 and Feb. 16.

#### Against the SEC

Southeast Missouri has faced eight of the 14 teams out of the Southeastern Conference in its baseball history. The Redhawks are 24-63 all-time against SEC foes. SEMO played Alabama (4-7), Arkansas (5-6), Auburn (1-2), Kentucky (0-1), Ole Miss (2-16), Mississippi State (0-6), Missouri (11-23) and Vanderbilt (1-2). Georgia, Florida, Tennessee, South Carolina, LSU and Texas A&M are the SEC teams the Redhawks have never faced.

#### Basler Now Fifth in Career Stolen Bases

Connor Basler stole at least one base in each of the first three games of the 2021 campaign. As a result, Basler moved into a three-way tie for fifth among Southeast Missouri's all-time career stolen base leaders. He, Kerry Robinson (1993-95) and Kenton Parmley (2009-12) share the fifth-place spot with 46 stolen bases. Denver Stuckey (2000-03) currently holds the record with 52. Basler stole a base in each of his first three games of a season for the first time in his Redhawk career.

#### Andrews Off to Good Start

Freshman Lincoln Andrews was one of three Redhawks to hit over .330 during Southeast Missouri's series at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). Andrews hit .385 with a run scored, five hits and three RBI. He led the Redhawks in hits and RBI during opening weekend. Andrews hit safely in all three games and had the first runs batted in of his career against the Jaguars.

#### **Division I Debuts**

Seven players made their NCAA Division I baseball debuts at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21) last weekend. Freshmen Noah Jacobsen made his first career starts in right field, freshman Ty Stauss made his first start in left field and right-hander Ryan Vogt recorded his first start on the mound. Four others, including freshmen Kyle Miller and sophomores Connery O'Donnell, Austin Williams and Hunter Ralls made their first relief appearances with the Redhawks.

#### Miller Shines

Freshman right-hander Kyle Miller recorded a six-out save in his first Southeast Missouri appearance at South Alabama (Feb. 19). Miller entered the game in the eighth inning and struck out four, walked none and gave up two hits in 2.1 innings of work.

#### **Double-Digit Hits**

Southeast Missouri registered 10 or more hits in nine of its last 10 games dating back to 2020. SEMO outhit South Alabama, 28-19, in three games a week ago. The Redhawks finished the series with 10 hits in game two and 11 in game three. SEMO leads the Ohio Valley Conference in hits, total bases (39) and stolen bases (7) through its first three games of 2021.

#### **Stauss Brothers**

Brothers Wade and Tyler Stauss were in Southeast Missouri's lineup together for the first time in the series finale at South Alabama (Feb. 21). Wade started at catcher and his younger brother, Ty, was in left field for that contest.

#### First Home Runs

Wade Stauss and Andrew Keck became the first to hit a home run for Southeast Missouri this young season. Stauss homered to right center in the first inning and Keck homered to left center in the third inning of the series finale at South Alabama (Feb. 21). SEMO hit a home run in eight of its last 10 games dating back to last season.

#### Redhawks Sweep OVC Honors

Southeast Missouri seniors Austin Blazevic and Dylan Dodd swept the Ohio Valley Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week honors on Feb. 22. A first baseman from Plainfield, Illinois, Blazevic won this year's first OVC Player of the Week accolade, while Dodd, a left-hander from Danville, Illinois, claimed the first OVC Pitcher of the Week award in 2021. Blazevic and Dodd gave SEMO its first sweep of the league's accolades during the opening week of a season in eight years. Jason Blum (Player) and Zack Smith (Pitcher) was the last duo to complete that sweep on Feb. 18, 2013. Blazevic hit .455 with five runs scored, a double, walk and one RBI to lead SEMO to a series victory at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). He finished the series with multiple hits in back-to-back games. In Sunday's finale, Blazevic rallied the Redhawks in the ninth inning where they scored three runs to get a 6-5 lead. He started the inning with a single and SEMO sent eight hitters to the plate during its big inning. Then, after USA tied things up in the bottom of the ninth. Blazevic ripped a double down the right field line to score Danny Wright for the go-ahead run all the way from first base. Meanwhile, Dodd struck out eight and allowed only one walk in six innings to lead SEMO to a season-opening 4-2 win over USA on Feb. 19. He moved to 2-1 in his career on opening day. Dodd got stronger as the game went along en route to nailing down his first win of 2021. He retired 12 of the last 13 hitters he faced before giving way to Bryce Grossius in the seventh. Dodd pitched back-to-back 1-2-3 innings in the fifth and sixth frames. The OVC Pitcher of the Week honor marks the third of Dodd's career and the OVC Player of the Week laurel is the second of Blazevic's time in a SEMO uniform.

#### Season 63

The 2021 campaign is Southeast Missouri's 63rd year of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 30th season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,366-1,118-10 all-time and 832-731-1 at the NCAA Division I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 409-283-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won four OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016), three OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016) and made three NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016) in program history.

## Redhawks Tabbed Fifth in OVC Preseason Poll

The Redhawks accumulated 131 points and one first-place nod in this year's Ohio Valley Conference Predicted Order of Finish voted on by the OVC Head Baseball Coaches and Communication Directors. Belmont is this year's preseason favorite with 188 points and 14 first-place votes, while Jacksonville State (176 pts.), Murray State (136 pts.) and Austin Peay (132 pts.) also rated above the Redhawks. Eastern Kentucky (117 pts.), SIU Edwardsville (78 pts.), Eastern Illinois (73 pts.), Morehead State (57 pts.), Tennessee Tech (66 pts.) and UT Martin (45 pts.) round out the preseason poll.

#### Wilber and Dodd Earn Preseason All-OVC Honors

Junior shortstop Tyler Wilber and senior left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd was named to this year's Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Statistics were based on the 2019 campaign when determining the 16 players selected to the 2021 Preseason All-OVC squad. A native of Danville, Illinois, Dodd led SEMO with 77 strikeouts in 76 innings through 14 starts that year. He finished with four wins on the mound, second-most on the team. Dodd tied for eighth in the OVC in strikeouts. Wilber, who hails from Los Alamitos, California, led the league in batting average (.383) and on-base percentage (.480), while ranking third in doubles (19) and fifth in hits (80) in 55 starts during the 2019 season. He also scored 43 runs, had a team-high three triples and led the Redhawks with 40 RBI. For his efforts, Wilber garnered First-Team All-OVC accolades.



## Wilber Ranked 17th Among D1Baseball's Top 100 Shortstops

D1Baseball rated Southeast Missouri junior Tyler Wilber 17th among its Top 100 shortstops in the nation. A native of Los Alamitos, California, Wilber was rated among D1Baseball's Top 40 junior hitters in 2020. He ranked second on the team with a .406 batting average in 17 starts during a shortened season due to COVID-19. Wilber led the Redhawks in runs (26), doubles (9), walks (11) and on-base percentage (.494). Wilber was atop the Ohio Valley Conference in runs scored and ranked second in doubles, total bases (48) and total plate appearances (85) when play was suspended. Nationally, he ranked second in runs scored, fourth in runs per game (1.53) and ninth in total bases. UCLA's Matt McLain was tabbed as the No. 1 shortstop on this year's list.

#### 2021 Roster

After all the uncertainties and challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA Division I Council decided to allow schools to provide spring sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility. Since everyone from 2020 redshirted, Southeast Missouri brings back over 60 percent of its roster. That said, the Redhawks 2021 squad consists of 38 players, including 19 returnees, six position starters and three starting pitchers.

#### 2020 Recap

Southeast Missouri was 9-8 overall and 2-1 in the Ohio Valley Conference at the time play was cancelled due to a global COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. SEMO heated up to win seven of its final nine contests during its shortened campaign. The Redhawks were establishing their identity in the early going of 2020. SEMO was making significant strides with their starting pitching, playing excellent defense and reaping the benefits from an offense built around power and speed. Statistically, the Redhawks concluded competition ranked first in the OVC in batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), stolen bases (36) and fielding percentage (.976). SEMO was also second in slugging percentage (.513), on-base percentage (.404), runs scored (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21). Nationally, the Redhawks were sixth in hits, eighth in triples and 11th in both batting average and slugging percentage.

#### Sawyers in Fifth Year

Andy Sawyers is in his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach. Sawyers, who has been coaching college baseball for more than two decades, is 177-124 in his career as a head coach. That includes a 90-97 record and 48-45 Ohio Valley Conference mark as SEMO's skipper. He has led the Redhawks to two OVC Tournaments (2017, 2018). SEMO's 29 victories in 2017 are currently the most in a season with Sawyers at the helm.

#### Over 150 Starts

Two Redhawks have made over 150 starts in their careers. Second baseman Connor Basler tallied a team-high 181 career starts and mainstay center fielder Danny Wright has accumulated 167. Both Basler and Wright are fifth-year seniors after joining Southeast Missouri's baseball program in 2017.

#### Pro Prospects Return

Shortstop Tyler Wilber, a First-Team All-Ohio Valley Conference selection in 2019, chose to remain at Southeast Missouri after turning down free agent offers from a couple of different professional teams last summer. Left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd also decided to return after getting offers to play professionally.

#### Career .300 Hitters

Southeast Missouri has three players hitting .300 or better for their careers entering this weekend's season-opening series. Tyler Wilber leads the way with a .386 career batting average followed by Andrew Keck (.304) and Danny Wright (.302). Wilber, Keck and Wright have combined for a total of 301 hits, 175 runs scored, 61 doubles, 10 triples, 14 home runs and 155 RBI in their careers.

#### Career Rankings

Tyler Wilber presently ranks third all-time among Southeast Missouri's career leaders with a .388 batting average. Danny Wright is third in hit by pitch (30) and Connor Basler rates seventh in hit by pitch (25) and eighth in stolen bases (42). Dylan Dodd ranks eighth all-time in strikeouts/9 innings (9.95) and seventh in walks allowed/9 innings (2.55).

#### **Coaching Additions**

Southeast Missouri baseball great Trevor Ezell and former Rend Lake College assistant Drew Millwood join the Redhawks coaching staff this season. Ezell is the team's Director of Offensive Player Development and Millwood is Director of Analytics. Both will handle various administrative duties and assist with stat compilation, analytical breakdown, video analysis and scouting. A native of Bryant, Arkansas, Ezell returns to Cape Girardeau following a two-year stint in Minor League Baseball. He was signed by the Tampa Bay Rays during the summer of 2019 after making a trip to the College World Series at the University of Arkansas. Ezell wrapped up his college career with the Razorbacks after spending four years at SEMO. He earned both First-Team and Second-Team All-Ohio Valley Conference honors. Ezell started 181 games and accumulated 251 hits, 194 runs, 128 RBI, 48 stolen bases and 45 doubles in his career. He also hit .336, boasted a .495 slugging percentage and held a .967 fielding percentage during his time as a Redhawk. Millwood worked as an assistant coach at Rend Lake College. He was responsible for the hitters and was the Warriors recruiting coordinator. His only season at Rend Lake was cut short due to COVID-19. Before Rend Lake College, Millwood was both Head Coach and Athletic Director at Wayne City High School and was Head Baseball Coach at Webber Township High School. He helped grow and develop the baseball team and enhanced the overall athletic programming for both schools in those roles. Millwood first started coaching when he was the owner and operator of one of the largest sports training facilities in Southern Illinois. While in that position, he worked with a diverse population of athletes ranging from kids and weekend warriors to Division I collegiate athletes and Cross-Fit and OCR competitors.

## 2021 Ohio Valley Conference Schedule

The Redhawks will play a 30-game Ohio Valley Conference slate in 2021. Each three-game series will be played over two days with a single game on Friday and a doubleheader on Saturday with the exception of the Redhawks home series with UT Martin (May 20-21) which will be contested on Thursday and Friday. In addition to UT Martin, Austin Peay (Mar. 19-20), Jacksonville State (Apr. 2-3), Tennessee



Tech (Apr. 16-17) and Eastern Kentucky (May 7-8) come to Cape Girardeau this year.

Meanwhile, the Redhawks road series in conference play are at SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12-13), Eastern Illinois (Mar. 26-27), Murray State (Apr. 9-10), Belmont (Apr. 30-May 1) and Morehead State (May 14-15). The Redhawks will open OVC play on the road at SIUE.

#### Redhawks in the Major Leagues

A total of 10 Southeast Missouri players have gone on to play Major League Baseball. Presently, left-handed pitcher Joey Lucchesi, is the only former Redhawk on an active roster. Lucchesi, after spending three seasons with the San Diego Padres is in spring training with the New York Mets. He was traded to the Mets on Jan. 19. SEMO has had a total of 30 players drafted since 1966. Lucchesi is the highest draft pick out of the Redhawks baseball program when he went in the fourth round in 2018. Left-handed pitcher Galen McSpadden and first baseman Matt Tellor are SEMO's other two Top-10 draft picks. McSpadden was a sixth-round selection by the Padres and Tellor was a 10th-round pick by the Atlanta Braves in 2014.

#### On Deck

Southeast Missouri plays host to Illinois State in its home-opening series on Mar. 5-7. SEMO and ISU will play four games with a nine-inning matchup on Mar. 5 and Mar. 7, and a doubleheader on Mar. 6.



ndy Sawyers enters his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach in 2021.

SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in Ohio Valley Conference play when its 2020 season was abrubtly cut short due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits

(6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros.

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a league-high with 29 hits when play was suspended.

Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Nineteen returnees are back for Sawyers to mentor again this spring as the Redhawks return over 60 percent of last year's roster.

None of those players lost any

eligibility after the COVID-19 pandemic influenced the NCAA Division I Council's decision to allow schools to provide spring-sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility.

Before they took the field last spring, the Redhawks ushered in a state-of-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-tiem stats and performance metrics.

In Sawyers' last full season of competition, SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480).

Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers,

including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and eight NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 39 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and eight top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs

and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman
Josh Rolette who garnered
Louisville Slugger Freshman
All-American honors in 2016.
He also helped mentor Jake
Scudder who was named Big
12 Newcomer of the Year. The
Wildcats had three studentathletes on the All-Big 12 Teams
that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to stolen bases as the 149 steals were second-most in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399).

Before K-State, Sawyers spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American.

Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008, Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips

to the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance at the 2005 College World Series. Sawyers, who lettered two years at Nebraska, worked with 12 Huskers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Alex Gordon, a two-time Big 12 Player of the Year. In 2005, Gordon won five National Player of the Year

awards before being taken as

the second overall pick by the

Kansas City Royals.

Sawyers took on all hitting coach responsibilities at Nebraska beginning with the 2006 season when the team hit .310 - its best mark in four years - and ranked in the top three of the Big 12 in home runs, stolen bases, on-base percentage and slugging percentage.

Sawyers served as the academic coordinator and worked with the catchers during his time at Nebraska, as well. He also had a hand in the Huskers recruiting their then-highest-rated class in school history, as the 2004 recruiting class was ranked 16th nationally by





Collegiate Baseball.

After working as the volunteer assistant at Nebraska in 2000, Sawyers worked the 2001 and 2002 seasons as head coach at Hutchinson Community College, compiling an 87-30 record and two postseason berths. In 2001, the Dragons went 40-16 and won the Jayhawk West Sub-Regional, while the 2002 squad set a school record with 47 wins and was ranked as high

as seventh by the NJCAA.

Sawyers' coaching career began at Northwestern (La.) State in 1999 as a volunteer assistant coach, helping the Demons finish second in the Southland Conference.

He first played collegiately at Point Loma (Calif.) Nazarene College in 1994. Following a year off, he played at Mendocino (Calif.) Junior College in 1996 before finishing up his playing career at Nebraska.
