Redhawks Resume OVC Play

Southeast Missouri (8-7, 2-1) hosts Austin Peay (3-11, 1-2) in Ohio Valley Conference action this weekend. The Redhawks and Governors play a single game at 5 p.m. Friday and a doubleheader at 2 p.m., CT Saturday.

Follow the Redhawks

OVC Home-Openers

Friday marks Southeast Missouri's Ohio Valley Conference home-opener. The Redhawks are 3-0 in OVC home-openers under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO beat UT Martin in both 2017 and 2019, and Morehead State in 2018 during those contests. The Redhawks ended up winning their OVC home-opening series in both 2017 and 2018. SEMO did not have a home series in conference play during its

2020 campaign that was shortened due to COVID-19.

Series History

The Redhawks and Governors meet for the 98th time when they open their series Friday. Southeast Missouri holds a 56-41 lead in the all-time series which began in 1962. SEMO came away with series wins each of the last two times it faced APSU in 2018 and 2019. Twenty-four of the Redhawks wins in the series were at Capaha Field. Head Coach Andy Sawyers is 5-4 against the Governors.

Keep it Going

Southeast Missouri carries a three-game winning streak into this weekend's series with Austin Peay. SEMO won its final two games of its Ohio Valley Conference opening series at

SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 13) and beat Saint Louis (Mar. 16). All three of those wins were on the road. SEMO is 6-2 with a pair of series victories in March.

About Austin Peay

Austin Peay, picked a spot ahead of Southeast Missouri in this year's Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Poll, is 3-11 overall and 1-2 in conference play. The Governors have played two ranked teams so far in #24 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 20-22) and #17 Tennessee (Mar. 3). APSU went a combined 0-4 in those contests. The Governors dropped two of three in their first OVC series vs. Tennessee Tech (Mar. 13-14). APSU's other wins were a 12-7 victory vs. Army (Feb. 28) and a 3-2 victory at Northwestern State (Mar. 7). First baseman John McDonald and outfielder Garrett Spain garnered Preseason All-OVC honors. Spain is currently the Governors top hitter at .306 with seven runs scored, two home runs and seven RBI. APSU has the most losses of any OVC team and is ranked last in the conference in batting average (.196), slugging percentage (.291), on-base percentage (.306), runs (47), hits (78), RBI (40), total bases (116) and fielding percentage (.961).

March 12

When Southeast Missouri dropped its series-opener to SIU Edwardsville on Mar. 12, that game marked exactly one year from the time a global COVID-19 pandemic brought college athletics to an abrupt halt. On Mar. 12, 2020, the NCAA canceled its men's and women's basketball tournaments and c onferences across the country changed plans for games in the months ahead. That decision affected championships in all winter and spring sports, including baseball. Southeast Missouri dropped a 6-4 midweek contest at longtime rival Southern Illinois in its final game of the shortened 2020 campaign a day before the decision to cancel play was made.

OVC Schedule

Each of Southeast Missouri's three-game series in Ohio Valley Conference play will be contested over two days with a single game on Friday and a doubleheader Saturday with the exception of the Redhawks home series vs. UT Martin (May 20-21) That series will be played on Thursday and Friday. SEMO hosts

UT Martin, Austin Peay (Mar. 19-20), Jackson-ville State (Apr. 2-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 16-17) and Eastern Kentucky (May 7-8), and visits SIUE (Mar. 12-13), Eastern Illinois (Mar. 26-27), Murray State (Apr. 9-10), Belmont (Apr. 30-May 1) and Morehead State (May 14-15) in league action this year.

Midweek Win

The Redhawks posted a come-from-behind win in their first midweek game of the season when they rallied to beat Saint Louis, 8-6, Tuesday at the Billiken Sport Complex. SLU led the entire game until SEMO sent nine men to the plate to fuel a four-run eighth inning. Freshman Peyton Leeper singled home Ty Stauss to tie the game and Tyler Wilber drove in Leeper to put the Redhawks ahead.

50th OVC Win

Andy Sawyers picked up his 50th Ohio Valley Conference win when Southeast Missouri beat SIU Edwardsville 6-4 on Mar. 13. Sawyers is now 50-46 in OVC games as the Redhawks head coach.

Closing in on 100

Andy Sawyers is just four wins away from reaching 100 victories as Southeast Missouri's head coach. Sawyers, in his fifth year at the helm, is 96-103 overall at SEMO.

Wilber Second in the OVC in Batting Average

Shortstop Tyler Wilber ranks second in the Ohio Valley Conference with a .404 batting average behind Eastern Illinois' Logan Eickhoff (.420). Wilber also ranks third among league leaders in on-base percentage (.484) and hits (21). He recently went 3-for-4 with a run scored, home run and season-high four RBI to lead Southeast Missouri to its 8-6 midweek win at Saint Louis (Mar. 16). Wilber also drove in the go-ahead run in the eighth inning of that contest.

Going for Another

Southeast Missouri is going after its second-straight Ohio Valley Conference series win when it hosts Austin Peay this weekend. The Redhawks took two of three on the road at SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12-13) to start league play. The last time SEMO won its first two conference series of a season was 2018. That year,

the Redhawks won their first three OVC series and went on to claim a total of seven series victories against league foes.

Approaching 150 Strikeouts

Dylan Dodd is just one strikeout away from getting 150 in his Southeast Missouri career. Dodd recorded 149 strikeouts in 126.2 innings to date. He leads the Ohio Valley Conference with 36 strikeouts and 24 innings pitched through four starts. Dodd also ranks fifth in the nation in strikeouts.

Nice Work Keck

Andrew Keck hit .417 with four runs scored, five hits, a double, one RBI and a perfect 4-of-4 stolen bases in the Redhawks series win over SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12-13). Keck hit safely in all three games against the Cougars and recorded to hits and two stolen bases in each of the final two matchups of the series. He walked and scored as part of a three-run 10th inning that sent SEMO to a 6-3 victory in game two. Keck then singled and came around to score during a four-run first inning that keyed the Redhawks 6-4 victory in the series finale.

First Career Save for Williams

Austin Williams, who entered the game at Saint Louis (Mar. 16) in the eighth inning, got the final six outs to secure his first career save. Williams recorded three strikeouts and three groundball outs against the six hitters he faced.

Redhawks Beat Illinois State

The Redhawks posted their second series win of the season and first at home when they won three of four games against Illinois State (Mar. 5-7) in Cape Girardeau last weekend. Southeast Missouri, which also claimed its first series victory against Missouri Valley Conference member ISU in program history, snapped a 12-game losing streak in its series against the Redbirds.

Big Weekend for Wilber

Shortstop Tyler Wilber hit a team-best .615 to lead Southeast Missouri in its series victory over Illinois State (Mar. 5-7). Wilber went 8-for-13 at the plate with two runs scored, a double and four RBI. He hit safely and had a RBI in all four games of the series. Wilber also collected

multiple hits in three of his four starts against the Redbirds.

Complete Game for Niznik

Left-hander Noah Niznik tossed a complete game victory to give Southeast Missouri a 5-1 victory over Illinois State (Mar. 6). Niznik recorded his first win of the season after striking out four and walking nin in seven innings. He allowed only one earned run, as well. It marked the third complete game and matched the longest outing of Niznik's career.

First Win for Miller

Freshman right-hander Kyle Miller picked up the win in his first career start when he defeated Illinois State (Mar. 7). Miller worked six innings, striking out three and walking one. He also gave up six hits and allowed just one run. Miller improved to 1-1 with a save in four appearances and one start this year.

Yard Work

Catcher Wade Stauss launched a three-run home run in back-to-back days during Southeast Missouri's series vs. Illinois State (Mar. 5-7). Stauss hit the first of those two bombs in the bottom of the third inning of game two. He then homered again in that same inning to grab SEMO the lead during the series finale. Stauss leads the Redhawks with three home runs. The Redhawks have nine home runs as a team.

Leeper Walk Off

Freshman third baseman Peyton Leeper delivered a sinking line drive base hit in the bottom of the 10th inning to give Southeast Missouri a 4-3 walk off win over Illinois State (Mar. 5). Danny Wright led off the Redhawks final at-bat with a single up the middle and Jevon Mason was hit by a pitch. Ty Stauss advanced both runners on a sacrifice bunt. With two outs after Connor Basler flied out to right, Leeper singled home the winning run on his first career walk off hit.

Triple Time

Peyton Leeper is tied for first in the nation and leads the Ohio Valley Conference with three triples this season. Leeper is among 16 players with three triples thus far. Leeper also leads the OVC with 14 walks.

Ralls Nails Down First Save

Sophomore right-hander Hunter Ralls pitched effectively for three innings to claim his first career save against Illinois State (Mar. 7). Ralls recorded five strikeouts and allowed two hits in three scoreless innings. He did not allow a walk, as well. It was the fourth relief appearance of Ralls' career.

Two 10-Strikeout Performances

Dylan Dodd was magnificent on the mound during his second start of the season. Dodd wound up getting a no-decision against #2 Arkansas (Feb. 25). He finished with 10 strikeouts, walked two and allowed just two runs on three hits. Dodd struck out two in each of the first three innings and sat the Razorbacks down in order in the second. He also no-hit Arkansas through 2.2 innings. In a no-decision against SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12), Dodd recorded 10 strikeouts in five innings of work. He finished with 10 strikeouts in two of his last three starts. Dodd has struck out 10 or more in a game a total of four times in his career.

Career Hit 200

Danny Wright registered the 200th hit of his career with a two-RBI single that gave Southeast Missouri a 5-2 lead in the eighth inning of game one at #2 Arkansas (Feb. 25). Wright finished with three RBI in that contest.

Division I Debuts

Twelve players have made their NCAA Division I baseball debuts at Southeast Missouri so far this season. At South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). freshmen Noah Jacobsen made his first career starts in right field, freshman Ty Stauss made his first start in left field and right-hander Ryan Vogt recorded his first start on the mound. Four others, including freshmen Kyle Miller and sophomores Connery O'Donnell, Austin Williams and Hunter Ralls made their first relief appearances as Redhawks. At #2 Arkansas, Jevon Mason and Braxton Zivic each logged their first starts in the outfield, while Joey Kossina, Joseph Karall and Matt Perego pitched for the first time out of SEMO's bullpen.



Season-Opening Series Win

The Redhawks opened their 2021 campaign with a 2-1 series win on the road at Sun Belt Conference member South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). Southeast Missouri beat the Jaguars, 4-2, on Feb. 19 and, 8-6, in 10 innings on Feb. 21 to claim its second season-opening series win under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. With its win on Feb. 19, SEMO also improved to 12-18 all-time in season-opening games during its NCAA Division I era (since 1992) and 3-2 in such games under Sawyers.

On the Road in February

A schedule adjustment early on put Southeast Missouri on the road for its first month of the baseball season. The Redhawks wound up beginning their 2021 campaign with a three-game series at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). SEMO was originally supposed to host Milwaukee in a four-game series on opening weekend, but large amounts of snow and ice covered the Cape Girardeau area forcing unplayable conditions. Southeast Missouri State University's main campus was closed due to the heavy winter weather on Feb. 15 and Feb. 16. SEMO capped its first month of the season with a 2-5 record.

Basler Fifth in Career Stolen Bases

Connor Basler is second on the team with five stolen bases this season. Basler ranks fifth all-time among Southeast Missouri's all-time career stolen base leaders with 47. Denver Stuckey (2000-03) currently holds the record with 52.

Miller Shines

Freshman right-hander Kyle Miller recorded a six-out save in his first Southeast Missouri appearance at South Alabama (Feb. 19). Miller entered the game in the eighth inning and struck out four, walked none and gave up two hits in 2.1 innings of work.

Double-Digit Hits

Southeast Missouri registered 10 or more hits for the fourth time this season when it pounded out 11 vs. Illinois State (Mar. 7). The Redhawks posted a season-best 11 hits on three occasions. SEMO is 3-1 in games where it gets 10 or more hits.

Stauss Brothers

Brothers Wade and Tyler Stauss were in Southeast Missouri's lineup together for the first time in the series finale at South Alabama (Feb. 21). Wade started at catcher and his younger brother, Ty, was in left field for that contest. They have been in the starting lineup together a total of eight times this year.

First Home Runs

Wade Stauss and Andrew Keck became the first to hit a home run for Southeast Missouri in 2021. Stauss homered to right center in the first inning and Keck homered to left center in the third inning of the series finale at South Alabama (Feb. 21).

Redhawks Sweep OVC Honors

Southeast Missouri seniors Austin Blazevic and Dylan Dodd swept the Ohio Valley Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week honors on Feb. 22. A first baseman from Plainfield, Illinois, Blazevic won this year's first OVC Player of the Week accolade, while Dodd, a left-hander from Danville, Illinois, claimed the first OVC Pitcher of the Week award in 2021. Blazevic and Dodd gave SEMO its first sweep of the league's accolades during the opening week of a season in eight years. Jason Blum (Player) and Zack Smith (Pitcher) was the last duo to complete that sweep on Feb. 18, 2013. Blazevic hit .455 with five runs scored, a double, walk and one RBI to lead SEMO to a series victory at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). He finished the series with multiple hits in back-to-back games. In Sunday's finale, Blazevic rallied the Redhawks in the ninth inning where they scored three runs to get a 6-5 lead. He started the inning with a single and SEMO sent eight hitters to the plate during its big inning. Then, after USA tied things up in the bottom of the ninth, Blazevic ripped a double down the right field line to score Danny Wright for the go-ahead run all the way from first base. Meanwhile, Dodd struck out eight and allowed only one walk in six innings to lead SEMO to a season-opening 4-2 win over USA on Feb. 19. He moved to 2-1 in his career on opening day. Dodd got stronger as the game went along en route to nailing down his first win of 2021. He retired 12 of the last 13 hitters he faced before giving way to Bryce Grossius in the seventh. Dodd pitched back-to-back 1-2-3 innings in the fifth and sixth frames. The OVC Pitcher of the Week honor marks the third of Dodd's career and the OVC Player of the Week laurel is the second of Blazevic's time in a SEMO uniform.

Season 63

The 2021 campaign is Southeast Missouri's 63rd year of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 30th season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,372-1,124-10 all-time and 838-737-1 at the NCAA Division I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 412-284-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won four OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016), three OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016) and made three NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016) in program history.

Redhawks Tabbed Fifth in OVC Preseason Poll

The Redhawks accumulated 131 points and one first-place nod in this year's Ohio Valley Conference Predicted Order of Finish voted on by the OVC Head Baseball Coaches and Communication Directors. Belmont is this year's preseason favorite with 188 points and 14 first-place votes, while Jacksonville State (176 pts.), Murray State (136 pts.) and Austin Peay (132 pts.) also rated above the Redhawks. Eastern Kentucky (117 pts.), SIU Edwardsville (78 pts.), Eastern Illinois (73 pts.), Morehead State (57 pts.), Tennessee Tech (66 pts.) and UT Martin (45 pts.) round out the preseason poll.

Wilber and Dodd Earn Preseason All-OVC Honors

Junior shortstop Tyler Wilber and senior left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd was named to this year's Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Statistics were based on the 2019 campaign when determining the 16 players selected to the 2021 Preseason All-OVC squad. A native of Danville, Illinois, Dodd led SEMO with 77 strikeouts in 76 innings through 14 starts that year. He finished with four wins on the mound, second-most on the team. Dodd tied for eighth in the OVC in strikeouts. Wilber, who hails from Los Alamitos, California, led the league in batting average (.383) and on-base percentage (.480), while ranking third in doubles (19) and fifth in hits (80) in 55 starts during the 2019 season. He also scored 43 runs, had a team-high three



triples and led the Redhawks with 40 RBI. For his efforts, Wilber garnered First-Team All-OVC accolades.

Wilber Ranked 17th Among D1Baseball's Top 100 Shortstops

D1Baseball rated Southeast Missouri junior Tyler Wilber 17th among its Top 100 shortstops in the nation. A native of Los Alamitos, California, Wilber was rated among D1Baseball's Top 40 junior hitters in 2020. He ranked second on the team with a .406 batting average in 17 starts during a shortened season due to COVID-19. Wilber led the Redhawks in runs (26), doubles (9), walks (11) and on-base percentage (.494). Wilber was atop the Ohio Valley Conference in runs scored and ranked second in doubles, total bases (48) and total plate appearances (85) when play was suspended. Nationally, he ranked second in runs scored, fourth in runs per game (1.53) and ninth in total bases. UCLA's Matt McLain was tabbed as the No. 1 shortstop on this year's list.

2021 Roster

After all the uncertainties and challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA Division I Council decided to allow schools to provide spring sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility. Since everyone from 2020 redshirted, Southeast Missouri brings back over 60 percent of its roster. That said, the Redhawks 2021 squad consists of 38 players, including 19 returnees, six position starters and three starting pitchers.

2020 Recap

Southeast Missouri was 9-8 overall and 2-1 in the Ohio Valley Conference at the time play was cancelled due to a global COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. SEMO heated up to win seven of its final nine contests during its shortened campaign. The Redhawks were establishing their identity in the early going of 2020. SEMO was making significant strides with their starting pitching, playing excellent defense and reaping the benefits from an offense built around power and speed. Statistically, the Redhawks concluded competition ranked first in the OVC in batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), stolen bases (36) and fielding percentage (.976). SEMO was also second in slugging percentage (.513), on-base

percentage (.404), runs scored (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21). Nationally, the Redhawks were sixth in hits, eighth in triples and 11th in both batting average and slugging percentage.

Sawyers in Fifth Year

Andy Sawyers is in his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach. Sawyers, who has been coaching college baseball for more than two decades, is 183-130 in his career as a head coach. That includes a 96-103 record and 50-46 Ohio Valley Conference mark as SEMO's skipper. He has led the Redhawks to two OVC Tournaments (2017, 2018). SEMO's 29 victories in 2017 are currently the most in a season with Sawyers at the helm.

Over 150 Starts

Two Redhawks have made over 150 starts in their careers. Second baseman Connor Basler tallied a team-high 188 career starts and mainstay center fielder Danny Wright has accumulated 176. Both Basler and Wright are fifth-year seniors after joining Southeast Missouri's baseball program in 2017.

Pro Prospects Return

Shortstop Tyler Wilber, a First-Team All-Ohio Valley Conference selection in 2019, chose to remain at Southeast Missouri after turning down free agent offers from a couple of different professional teams last summer. Left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd also decided to return after getting offers to play professionally.

Career Hitters

Southeast Missouri has three players hitting .299 or better for their careers entering this weekend's series. Tyler Wilber leads the way with a .391 career batting average followed by Andrew Keck (.300) and Danny Wright (.299). Wilber, Keck and Wright have combined for a total of 419 hits, 256 runs, 74 doubles, 11 triples, 23 home runs and 226 RBI in their careers.

Career Rankings

Tyler Wilber presently ranks third all-time among Southeast Missouri's career leaders with a .391 batting average. Danny Wright is third in hit by pitch (31) and Connor Basler rates seventh in hit by pitch (25) and fifth in stolen bases (47). Dylan Dodd ranks fourth all-time in strikeouts/9 innings (10.6) and sixth in walks allowed/9 innings (2.4).

Redhawks in the Major Leagues

A total of 10 Southeast Missouri players have gone on to play Major League Baseball. Presently, left-handed pitcher Joey Lucchesi, is the only former Redhawk on an active roster. Lucchesi, after spending three seasons with the San Diego Padres is in spring training with the New York Mets. He was traded to the Mets on Jan. 19. SEMO has had a total of 30 players drafted since 1966. Lucchesi is the highest draft pick out of the Redhawks baseball program when he went in the fourth round in 2018. Left-handed pitcher Galen McSpadden and first baseman Matt Tellor are SEMO's other two Top-10 draft picks. McSpadden was a sixth-round selection by the Padres and Tellor was a 10th-round pick by the Atlanta Braves in 2014.





ndy Sawyers enters his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach in 2021.

SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in Ohio Valley Conference play when its 2020 season was abrubtly cut short due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits

(6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros.

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a league-high with 29 hits when play was suspended.

Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Nineteen returnees are back for Sawyers to mentor again this spring as the Redhawks return over 60 percent of last year's roster.

None of those players lost any

eligibility after the COVID-19 pandemic influenced the NCAA Division I Council's decision to allow schools to provide spring-sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility.

Before they took the field last spring, the Redhawks ushered in a state-of-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-tiem stats and performance metrics.

In Sawyers' last full season of competition, SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480).

Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers,

including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and eight NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 39 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and eight top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs

and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman
Josh Rolette who garnered
Louisville Slugger Freshman
All-American honors in 2016.
He also helped mentor Jake
Scudder who was named Big
12 Newcomer of the Year. The
Wildcats had three studentathletes on the All-Big 12 Teams
that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to stolen bases as the 149 steals were second-most in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399).

Before K-State, Sawyers spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American.

Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008, Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips



of the Year. In 2005, Gordon won

five National Player of the Year

awards before being taken as

the second overall pick by the

Kansas City Royals.

Sawyers took on all hitting coach responsibilities at Nebraska beginning with the 2006 season when the team hit .310 - its best mark in four years - and ranked in the top three of the Big 12 in home runs, stolen bases, on-base percentage and slugging percentage.

Sawyers served as the academic coordinator and worked with the catchers during his time at Nebraska, as well. He also had a hand in the Huskers recruiting their then-highest-rated class in school history, as the 2004 recruiting class was ranked 16th nationally by





Collegiate Baseball.
