Redhawks Resume OVC Play

Ohio Valley Conference co-leader Southeast Missouri (10-9, 4-2) resumes Ohio Valley Conference play with a three-game series at Eastern Illinois (11-9, 2-4) this weekend. The Redhawks and Panthers play a 11:30 a.m. doubleheader Friday and a single game at 1 p.m., CT Saturday.

Follow the Redhawks

Series History

Friday's series opener marks the 79th meeting between Southeast Missouri and Eastern Illinois. SEMO holds a 42-36 lead in the all-time series. The Redhawks went 11-5 in their previous 16 matcups against the Panthers. SEMO claimed series victories over EIU in five of the last six years. Two of those series wins were in Charleston (2015, 2017). SEMO has swept the Panthers a total of four times in 1997 (4-0), 2005 (3-0), 2011 (3-0) and 2016

(3-0). All of those series sweeps were in Cape Girardeau.

Last Meeting

Southeast Missouri and Eastern Illinois didn't get the opportunity to face each other in 2020 after COVID-19 shortened the baseball season. SEMO and EIU last met on Mar. 31-Apr. 1, 2019 in Charleston. The Panthers won the series, 2-1, after winning the final two games by scores of 1-0 and 9-6.

First in the OVC

The Redhawks enter the weekend in a three-way tie for first in the Ohio Valley Conference. Southeast Missouri, Tennessee Tech and Murray State top the standings with identical 4-2 OVC records. SEMO had a

season-long five-game winning streak end in a close 12-11 loss to Austin Peay in 12 innings.

Heating Up

The Redhawks have won eight of their last 12 games and are 8-4 in March. Southeast Missouri went 3-1 last week with a comefrom-behind 8-6 win at Saint Louis (Mar. 16) and a 2-1 home Ohio Valley Conference series victory over Austin Peay (Mar. 19-20). The 6-5 extra inning win over the Governors on Mar. 20 marked SEMO's 10th victory of the season. SEMO then dropped its midweek matchup with #22 Southern Illinois Wednesday.

Sawyers in March

Southeast Missouri is presently 8-4 this month, its best record in March with Andy Sawyers. Two more victories will give Andy Sawyers his most wins in March during his tenure as SEMO's head coach. Sawyers' 2018 and 2019 clubs each won nine games during the month of March.

Closing in on 100

Andy Sawyers is just two wins away from reaching 100 victories as Southeast Missouri's head coach. Sawyers, in his fifth year at the helm, is 98-105 overall at SEMO.

Extra, Extra

The Redhawks concluded their series against Austin Peay by splitting a pair of extra inning games at Capaha Field on Mar. 20. Southeast Missouri trailed, 5-1, in the bottom of the ninth inning when it scored four runs on four hits to send game one to extra innings. Connor Basler delivered a two-RBI single with two outs to tie the game. With runners on first and second and one out in the bottom of the 11th, Jevon Mason delivered a walk off single to left and Peyton Leeper scored the winning run. In game two, the Redhawks battled back from an 11-5 deficit by scoring three runs in the eighth and ninth innings. Basler again came up big, this time with a two-out three-RBI double to tie the game. APSU, however, scored one run in the top of the 12th to edge the Redhawks. SEMO has played six extra-inning games and is 4-2 in those contests this year.

Series Wins

Southeast Missouri recorded four series wins so far this season. The Redhawks beat South Alabama (2-1), Illinois State (3-1), SIU Edwardsville (2-1) and Austin Peay (2-1) for those victories. If SEMO comes away with a series win at Eastern Illinois this weekend, it would mark the first time the Redhawks won three-straight conference series since 2018. SEMO claimed a total of seven series wins against league foes that year.

Midweek Games

The Redhawks dropped to 1-1 in midweek games this season when they fell to #22 Southern Illinois, 21-4, Wednesday. Southeast Missouri is 14-24 all-time in midweek action under Head Coach Andy Sawyers.

Walk Off Wins

Southeast Missouri earned its second walk off win of the season when it rallied to beat Austin Peay, 6-5, in 11 innings on Mar. 20. Jevon Mason became the second Redhawk to walk off with a game-winning hit when he drove in Peyton Leeper on a one-out single to left. Leeper, a freshman, hit a sinking line drive base hit in the bottom of the 10th inning to give SEMO its other walk off win, a 4-3 victory over Illinois State on Mar. 5. The walk off hits are career firsts for Mason and Leeper.

Mason Steps Up

Jevon Mason hit safely in each of his last three games. Mason delivered the game-winning walk off single in the bottom of the 11th inning in Southeast Missouri's 6-5 win over Austin Peay (Mar. 20). He then followed that up with a season-high three hits against the Governors and another single vs. Southern Illinois (Mar. 24). Mason is hitting .304 with seven hits in his 23 at-bats this year.

Basler is Clutch

Nine-hole hitter Connor Basler sent both games of Southeast Missouri's doubleheader against Austin Peay (Mar. 20) to extra innings. Basler had a two-out, two-RBI single to cap a four-run ninth inning during game one and then ripped a two-out, three-RBI double in the bottom of the ninth inning of game two. He had at least one RBI in each of his last five starts.

Back-to-Back Saves for Williams

Austin Williams picked up back-to-back saves in three of his relief appearances last week. Williams entered the game at Saint Louis (Mar. 16) in the eighth inning and recorded the final six outs to secure his first career save. Three days later, he finished with a career-high four strikeouts in two scoreless innings to preserve a 6-3 series-opening win over Austin Peay (Mar. 19).

Career Stolen Base Record in Reach

Connor Basler is second on the team with six stolen bases this season. Basler ranks tied for third all-time among Southeast Missouri's all-time career stolen base leaders with 48. He needs five more to break the school's all-time career record. Denver Stuckey (2000-03) currently holds the record with 52 stolen bases.

Hitting Streak at Eight Games for Keck

Andrew Keck, who leads the Ohio Valley Conference with nine stolen bases, is on an eight-game hitting streak. Keck is second among Southeast Missouri's everyday starters with a .289 batting average. He posted multiple hits three times during his current hitting streak. Keck also opened the 2021 campaign on an eight-game hitting streak from Feb. 19-Mar. 5. He holds the longest hitting streak of any Redhawk through 19 games.

Atop the OVC

Southeast Missouri leads the Ohio Valley Conference in stolen bases (31) and sacrifice bunts (12). SEMO is one of four OVC schools with 10 or more wins this season. Eastern Illinois (11), Murray State (10) and Morehead State (10) are the others.

About Eastern Illinois

At 11-9 overall and 2-4 in Ohio Valley Conference play, Eastern Illinois has the most overall wins of any league team. The Panthers, who dropped their first two conference series to Murray State (2-1) and Tennessee Tech (2-1), are coming off a 9-7 midweek victory at Illinois State (Mar. 24). Two Panthers are hitting over .400 this season. Presently, Logan Eickhoff is hitting .432 and Trey Sweeney follows with a .413 batting average as the top

two hitters in the OVC. Eickhoff also leads the league in hits (38), while Sweeney is first in slugging percentage (.516), RBI (32) and runs scored (25).

OVC Home-Openers

With its 6-3 win over Austin Peay on Mar. 19, Southeast Missouri improved to 4-0 in Ohio Valley Conference home-openers under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO beat UT Martin in both 2017 and 2019, and Morehead State in 2018 in such contests prior to this year. The Redhawks ended up winning their OVC home-opening series in 2017, 2018 and 2021. SEMO did not have a home series in conference play during its 2020 campaign that was shortened due to COVID-19.

March 12

When Southeast Missouri dropped its series-opener to SIU Edwardsville on Mar. 12, that game marked exactly one year from the time a global COVID-19 pandemic brought college athletics to an abrupt halt. On Mar. 12, 2020, the NCAA canceled its men's and women's basketball tournaments and conferences across the country changed plans for games in the months ahead. That decision affected championships in all winter and spring sports, including baseball. Southeast Missouri dropped a 6-4 midweek contest at longtime rival Southern Illinois in its final game of the shortened 2020 campaign a day before the decision to cancel play was made.

OVC Schedule

Each of Southeast Missouri's three-game series in Ohio Valley Conference play will be contested over two days with a single game on Friday and a doubleheader Saturday with the exception of the Redhawks home series vs. UT Martin (May 20-21) That series will be played on Thursday and Friday. SEMO hosts UT Martin, Austin Peay (Mar. 19-20), Jacksonville State (Apr. 2-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 16-17) and Eastern Kentucky (May 7-8), and visits SIUE (Mar. 12-13), Eastern Illinois (Mar. 26-27), Murray State (Apr. 9-10), Belmont (Apr. 30-May 1) and Morehead State (May 14-15) in league action this year.

50th OVC Win

Andy Sawyers picked up his 50th Ohio Valley Conference win when Southeast Missouri beat SIU Edwardsville 6-4 on Mar. 13. Sawyers is now 52-47 in OVC games as the Redhawks head coach.

Wilber Sixth in the OVC in Batting Average

Shortstop Tyler Wilber ranks sixth in the Ohio Valley Conference with a .347 batting average. Wilber also ranks fourth among league leaders in hits (25). He hit safely in six of his last seven games.

Dodd Clears 150 Strikeouts

Dylan Dodd surpassed 150 strikeouts in his career against Austin Peay (Mar. 19). Dodd did not allow an earned run and struck out eight in seven innings en route to getting his second win of the season. He struck out a least eight for the fifth time in 2021 and the seven innings matched his longest start of the year. He lowered his ERA by 68 points from 3.00 to a team-best 2.32 among Southeast Missouri starting pitchers. Dodd now has 157 strikeouts in 133.2 innings to date. He leads the Ohio Valley Conference with 44 strikeouts and 31 innings pitched through five starts. Dodd also ranks eighth in the nation in strikeouts.

Nice Work Keck

Andrew Keck hit .417 with four runs scored, five hits, a double, one RBI and a perfect 4-of-4 stolen bases in the Redhawks series win over SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12-13). Keck hit safely in all three games against the Cougars and recorded to hits and two stolen bases in each of the final two matchups of the series. He walked and scored as part of a three-run 10th inning that sent SEMO to a 6-3 victory in game two. Keck then singled and came around to score during a four-run first inning that keyed the Redhawks 6-4 victory in the series finale.

Redhawks Beat Illinois State

The Redhawks posted their second series win of the season and first at home when they won three of four games against Illinois State (Mar. 5-7) in Cape Girardeau last weekend. Southeast Missouri, which also claimed its first series victory against Missouri Valley Conference member ISU in program history,



snapped a 12-game losing streak in its series against the Redbirds.

Big Weekend for Wilber

Shortstop Tyler Wilber hit a team-best .615 to lead Southeast Missouri in its series victory over Illinois State (Mar. 5-7). Wilber went 8-for-13 at the plate with two runs scored, a double and four RBI. He hit safely and had a RBI in all four games of the series. Wilber also collected multiple hits in three of his four starts against the Redbirds.

Complete Game for Niznik

Left-hander Noah Niznik tossed a complete game victory to give Southeast Missouri a 5-1 victory over Illinois State (Mar. 6). Niznik recorded his first win of the season after striking out four and walking nin in seven innings. He allowed only one earned run, as well. It marked the third complete game and matched the longest outing of Niznik's career.

First Win for Miller

Freshman right-hander Kyle Miller picked up the win in his first career start when he defeated Illinois State (Mar. 7). Miller worked six innings, striking out three and walking one. He also gave up six hits and allowed just one run. Miller improved to 1-1 with a save in four appearances and one start this year.

Yard Work

Catcher Wade Stauss launched a three-run home run in back-to-back days during Southeast Missouri's series vs. Illinois State (Mar. 5-7). Stauss hit the first of those two bombs in the bottom of the third inning of game two. He then homered again in that same inning to grab SEMO the lead during the series finale. Stauss leads the Redhawks with four home runs. The Redhawks have 11 home runs as a team.

Triple Time

Peyton Leeper is tied second in the nation and leads the Ohio Valley Conference with three triples this season. Leeper also leads the OVC with 20 walks.

Ralls Nails Down First Save

Sophomore right-hander Hunter Ralls pitched effectively for three innings to claim his first career save against Illinois State (Mar. 7). Ralls recorded five strikeouts and allowed two hits

in three scoreless innings. He did not allow a walk, as well. It was the fourth relief appearance of Ralls' career.

Two 10-Strikeout Performances

Dylan Dodd was magnificent on the mound during his second start of the season. Dodd wound up getting a no-decision against #2 Arkansas (Feb. 25). He finished with 10 strikeouts, walked two and allowed just two runs on three hits. Dodd struck out two in each of the first three innings and sat the Razorbacks down in order in the second. He also no-hit Arkansas through 2.2 innings. In a no-decision against SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12), Dodd recorded 10 strikeouts in five innings of work. He finished with 10 strikeouts in two of his last three starts. Dodd has struck out 10 or more in a game a total of four times in his career.

Career Hit 200

Danny Wright registered the 200th hit of his career with a two-RBI single that gave Southeast Missouri a 5-2 lead in the eighth inning of game one at #2 Arkansas (Feb. 25). Wright finished with three RBI in that contest.

Division I Debuts

Twelve players have made their NCAA Division I baseball debuts at Southeast Missouri so far this season. At South Alabama (Feb. 19-21), freshmen Noah Jacobsen made his first career starts in right field, freshman Ty Stauss made his first start in left field and right-hander Ryan Vogt recorded his first start on the mound. Four others, including freshmen Kyle Miller and sophomores Connery O'Donnell, Austin Williams and Hunter Ralls made their first relief appearances as Redhawks. At #2 Arkansas, Jevon Mason and Braxton Zivic each logged their first starts in the outfield, while Joey Kossina, Joseph Karall and Matt Perego pitched for the first time out of SEMO's bullpen.

Season-Opening Series Win

The Redhawks opened their 2021 campaign with a 2-1 series win on the road at Sun Belt Conference member South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). Southeast Missouri beat the Jaguars, 4-2, on Feb. 19 and, 8-6, in 10 innings on Feb. 21 to claim its second season-opening series win under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. With its win on Feb. 19, SEMO also improved to 12-18 all-

time in season-opening games during its NCAA Division I era (since 1992) and 3-2 in such games under Sawyers.

Miller Shines

Freshman right-hander Kyle Miller recorded a six-out save in his first Southeast Missouri appearance at South Alabama (Feb. 19). Miller entered the game in the eighth inning and struck out four, walked none and gave up two hits in 2.1 innings of work.

Double-Digit Hits

Southeast Missouri registered 10 or more a total of six times this season. SEMO most recently collected a season-best 12 hits against Austin Peay (Mar. 20). The Redhawks are 4-2 in games where they put up double-digit hits.

Stauss Brothers

Brothers Wade and Tyler Stauss were in Southeast Missouri's lineup together for the first time in the series finale at South Alabama (Feb. 21). Wade started at catcher and his younger brother, Ty, was in left field for that contest. They have been in the starting lineup together a total of 11 times this year.

First Home Runs

Wade Stauss and Andrew Keck became the first to hit a home run for Southeast Missouri in 2021. Stauss homered to right center in the first inning and Keck homered to left center in the third inning of the series finale at South Alabama (Feb. 21).

Redhawks Sweep OVC Honors

Southeast Missouri seniors Austin Blazevic and Dylan Dodd swept the Ohio Valley Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week honors on Feb. 22. A first baseman from Plainfield, Illinois, Blazevic won this year's first OVC Player of the Week accolade, while Dodd, a left-hander from Danville, Illinois, claimed the first OVC Pitcher of the Week award in 2021. Blazevic and Dodd gave SEMO its first sweep of the league's accolades during the opening week of a season in eight years. Jason Blum (Player) and Zack Smith (Pitcher) was the last duo to complete that sweep on Feb. 18, 2013. Blazevic hit .455 with five runs scored, a double, walk and one RBI to lead SEMO to a series victory at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). He finished the series with multiple hits



in back-to-back games. In Sunday's finale, Blazevic rallied the Redhawks in the ninth inning where they scored three runs to get a 6-5 lead. He started the inning with a single and SEMO sent eight hitters to the plate during its big inning. Then, after USA tied things up in the bottom of the ninth, Blazevic ripped a double down the right field line to score Danny Wright for the go-ahead run all the way from first base. Meanwhile, Dodd struck out eight and allowed only one walk in six innings to lead SEMO to a season-opening 4-2 win over USA on Feb. 19. He moved to 2-1 in his career on opening day. Dodd got stronger as the game went along en route to nailing down his first win of 2021. He retired 12 of the last 13 hitters he faced before giving way to Bryce Grossius in the seventh. Dodd pitched back-to-back 1-2-3 innings in the fifth and sixth frames. The OVC Pitcher of the Week honor marks the third of Dodd's career and the OVC Player of the Week laurel is the second of Blazevic's time in a SEMO uniform.

Season 63

The 2021 campaign is Southeast Missouri's 63rd year of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 30th season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,374-1,126-10 all-time and 840-739-1 at the NCAA Dvision I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 414-285-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won four OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016), three OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016) and made three NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016) in program history.

Redhawks Tabbed Fifth in OVC Preseason Poll

The Redhawks accumulated 131 points and one first-place nod in this year's Ohio Valley Conference Predicted Order of Finish voted on by the OVC Head Baseball Coaches and Communication Directors. Belmont is this year's preseason favorite with 188 points and 14 first-place votes, while Jacksonville State (176 pts.), Murray State (136 pts.) and Austin Peay (132 pts.) also rated above the Redhawks. Eastern Kentucky (117 pts.), SIU Edwardsville (78 pts.), Eastern Illinois (73 pts.), Morehead State (57 pts.), Tennessee Tech (66 pts.) and UT Martin (45 pts.) round out the preseason poll.

Wilber and Dodd Earn Preseason All-OVC Honors

Junior shortstop Tyler Wilber and senior left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd was named to this year's Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Statistics were based on the 2019 campaign when determining the 16 players selected to the 2021 Preseason All-OVC squad. A native of Danville, Illinois, Dodd led SEMO with 77 strikeouts in 76 innings through 14 starts that year. He finished with four wins on the mound, second-most on the team. Dodd tied for eighth in the OVC in strikeouts. Wilber, who hails from Los Alamitos, California, led the league in batting average (.383) and on-base percentage (.480), while ranking third in doubles (19) and fifth in hits (80) in 55 starts during the 2019 season. He also scored 43 runs, had a team-high three triples and led the Redhawks with 40 RBI. For his efforts, Wilber garnered First-Team All-OVC accolades.

Wilber Ranked 17th Among D1Baseball's Top 100 Shortstops

D1Baseball rated Southeast Missouri junior Tyler Wilber 17th among its Top 100 shortstops in the nation. A native of Los Alamitos, California, Wilber was rated among D1Baseball's Top 40 junior hitters in 2020. He ranked second on the team with a .406 batting average in 17 starts during a shortened season due to COVID-19. Wilber led the Redhawks in runs (26), doubles (9), walks (11) and on-base percentage (.494). Wilber was atop the Ohio Valley Conference in runs scored and ranked second in doubles, total bases (48) and total plate appearances (85) when play was suspended. Nationally, he ranked second in runs scored, fourth in runs per game (1.53) and ninth in total bases. UCLA's Matt McLain was tabbed as the No. 1 shortstop on this year's list.

2021 Roster

After all the uncertainties and challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA Division I Council decided to allow schools to provide spring sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility. Since everyone from 2020 redshirted, Southeast Missouri brings back over 60 percent of its roster. That said, the Redhawks 2021 squad consists of 38 players,

including 19 returnees, six position starters and three starting pitchers.

Sawyers in Fifth Year

Andy Sawyers is in his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach. Sawyers, who has been coaching college baseball for more than two decades, is 185-132 in his career as a head coach. That includes a 98-105 record and 52-47 Ohio Valley Conference mark as SEMO's skipper. He has led the Redhawks to two OVC Tournaments (2017, 2018). SEMO's 29 victories in 2017 are currently the most in a season with Sawyers at the helm.

Over 150 Starts

Two Redhawks have made over 150 starts in their careers. Second baseman Connor Basler tallied a team-high 192 career starts and mainstay center fielder Danny Wright has accumulated 180. Both Basler and Wright are fifth-year seniors after joining Southeast Missouri's baseball program in 2017.

Pro Prospects Return

Shortstop Tyler Wilber, a First-Team All-Ohio Valley Conference selection in 2019, chose to remain at Southeast Missouri after turning down free agent offers from a couple of different professional teams last summer. Left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd also decided to return after getting offers to play professionally.

Career Hitters

Southeast Missouri has three players hitting .295 or better for their careers entering the week. Tyler Wilber leads the way with a .383 career batting average followed by Andrew Keck (.299) and Danny Wright (.295). Wilber, Keck and Wright have combined for a total of 428 hits, 264 runs, 75 doubles, 11 triples, 24 home runs and 229 RBI in their careers.

Career Rankings

Tyler Wilber presently ranks sixth all-time among Southeast Missouri's career leaders with a .380 batting average. Danny Wright is third in hit by pitch (32) and Connor Basler rates seventh in hit by pitch (25) and tied for third in stolen bases (48). Dylan Dodd ranks fourth all-time in strikeouts/9 innings (10.6) and sixth in walks allowed/9 innings (2.4).



ndy Sawyers enters his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach in 2021.

SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in Ohio Valley Conference play when its 2020 season was abrubtly cut short due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits

(6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros.

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a league-high with 29 hits when play was suspended.

Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Nineteen returnees are back for Sawyers to mentor again this spring as the Redhawks return over 60 percent of last year's roster.

None of those players lost any

eligibility after the COVID-19 pandemic influenced the NCAA Division I Council's decision to allow schools to provide spring-sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility.

Before they took the field last spring, the Redhawks ushered in a state-of-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-tiem stats and performance metrics.

In Sawyers' last full season of competition, SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480).

Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers,

including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and eight NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 39 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and eight top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs

and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman
Josh Rolette who garnered
Louisville Slugger Freshman
All-American honors in 2016.
He also helped mentor Jake
Scudder who was named Big
12 Newcomer of the Year. The
Wildcats had three studentathletes on the All-Big 12 Teams
that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to stolen bases as the 149 steals were second-most in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399).

Before K-State, Sawyers spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American.

Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008, Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips



to the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance at the 2005 College World Series. Sawyers, who lettered two years at Nebraska, worked with 12 Huskers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Alex Gordon, a two-time Big 12 Player of the Year. In 2005, Gordon won five National Player of the Year awards before being taken as the second overall pick by the Kansas City Royals.

Sawyers took on all hitting coach responsibilities at Nebraska beginning with the 2006 season when the team hit .310 - its best mark in four years - and ranked in the top three of the Big 12 in home runs, stolen bases, on-base percentage and slugging percentage.

Sawyers served as the academic coordinator and worked with the catchers during his time at Nebraska, as well. He also had a hand in the Huskers recruiting their then-highest-rated class in school history, as the 2004 recruiting class was ranked 16th nationally by





Collegiate Baseball.

After working as the volunteer assistant at Nebraska in 2000, Sawyers worked the 2001 and 2002 seasons as head coach at Hutchinson Community College, compiling an 87-30 record and two postseason berths. In 2001, the Dragons went 40-16 and won the Jayhawk West Sub-Regional, while the 2002 squad set a school record with 47 wins and was ranked as high

as seventh by the NJCAA.

Sawyers' coaching career began at Northwestern (La.) State in 1999 as a volunteer assistant coach, helping the Demons finish second in the Southland Conference.

He first played collegiately at Point Loma (Calif.) Nazarene College in 1994. Following a year off, he played at Mendocino (Calif.) Junior College in 1996 before finishing up his playing career at Nebraska.
