Redhawks Face Austin Peay in Final Midweek Game

Southeast Missouri (18-15) will face Austin Peay (14-23) in its final midweek matchup of the season Wednesday. First pitch is set for 3 p.m., CT at Raymond C. Hand Park.

Series History

Wednesday marks the 101st meeting between Ohio Valley Conference members Southeast Missouri and Austin Peay, although that matchup will not count toward the conference standings. SEMO took two of three from the Governors earlier this year on Mar. 19-20 in Cape Girardeau. The Redhawks won game one, 6-3, before splitting a pair of extra inning games to clinch the series victory. SEMO came away with a series win each of the last three times it faced APSU.

Series Wins

Southeast Missouri recorded seven series wins this season, five of which came in Ohio Valley Conference play. The Redhawks beat South Alabama (2-1), Illinois State (3-1), SIU Edwardsville (2-1), Austin Peay (2-1), Jacksonville State (2-1), Murray State (2-1) and Tennessee Tech (2-1) for those victories. SIUE, JSU and MSU were ahead of SEMO in the OVC standings when the Redhawks faced them.

Eleven OVC Wins

Southeast Missouri (11-7) is tied for second with Murray State (11-7) in the Ohio Valley Conference standings. Morehead State (10-5) currently holds the top spot. SEMO (11-7),

Murray State, Belmont (11-10) and Austin Peay (11-10) are all tied for first in the OVC in conference wins. The Redhawks already played three teams in the top six spots of the conference standings, including SIUE (sixth), Murray State (tied for second) and Austin Peay (tied for third).

One More Series Win

One more series win will give Andy Sawyers his most series victories in a season as Southeast Missouri's head coach. The Redhawks claimed seven series wins three times during Sawyers' career (2017, 2018, 2021).

Career Stolen Bases Record in Sight

Connor Basler is second on the team with eight stolen bases this season. Basler ranks third all-time among Southeast Missouri's all-time career stolen base leaders with 50. He needs three more to break the school's all-time career record. Denver Stuckey (2000-03) currently holds the record with 52 stolen bases.

Missouri State Series Canceled

Southeast Missouri's final non-conference series at Missouri State (Apr. 23-25) was canceled due to positive COVID-19 test results within MSU's Tier 1 personnel, which consists of student-athletes, coaches, managers and staff. Subsequent testing confirmed the positive test results that canceled the Bears' Apr. 20 game with Missouri and contact tracing revealed that Missouri State did not have the minimum number of medically cleared student-athletes to play the four-game series with SEMO scheduled at Hammons Field.

Redhawks Take Care of Tennessee Tech

Southeast Missouri won games one and three to take a 2-1 series win over Tennessee Tech (Apr. 16-17) last weekend in Cape Girardeau. Dylan Dodd struck out eight in another strong outing and Tyler Wilber and Andrew Keck each added two hits to key SEMO's 7-3 game one win. Danny Wright had four hits and Collin Wilma keyed the Redhawks 7-2 series finale victory.

About Austin Peay

Austin Peay is tied for third with Belmont in the Ohio Valley Conference standings. The Governors are 14-23 overall and 11-10 in OVC play. APSU won two of three at home against SIU Edwardsville (Apr. 23-24) last weekend. The Governors lead the OVC with 48 stolen bases, just one ahead of Southeast Missouri's 47. Garrett Spain and Malcolm Tipler are hitting .328 and .300, respectively, for the Governors this year.

First to 10 OVC Wins

With its 7-3 victory over Tennessee Tech on Apr. 16, Southeast Missouri became the first to 10 Ohio Valley Conference wins this season. The Redhawks are 11-7 in league play. Austin Peay follows close behind with nine OVC wins, while Morehead State, SIU Edwardsville, Murray State, Jacksonville State and Eastern Illinois all have eight.

Wright Gets Career-High in Hits

Danny Wright notched a career-high four hits when he went 4-for-5 with two runs scored, a double and one RBI vs. Tennessee Tech (Apr. 17). Wright previously had three hits a total of 25 times in his career before establishing his new career mark.

Non-Conference Games

The Redhawks went 7-8 in non-conference games this season. Southeast Missouri played three teams out of the Missouri Valley Conference during non-league action, including Missouri State (0-1), Southern Illinois (0-1) and Illinois State (3-1).

Road Stretch

The Redhawks hit the road for four games this week. After heading to Austin Peay Wednesday, Southeast Missouri will visit Belmont for a three-game series on Apr. 30-May 1. SEMO is 9-9 on the road this season.

Countdown to 200

Andy Sawyers is seven wins away from reaching 200 in his career as a collegiate head coach. Sawyers is 193-138 between head coaching stints at Hutchinson Community College (87-27) and Southeast Missouri (106-111).

Double-Digit Game Hitting Streaks

Tyler Wilber is on an 11-game hitting streak and Andrew Keck has hit safely in 10-straight contests, marking the first time this season where two Redhawks have double-digit game hitting streaks intact. The 11-game stretch is the second-longest of Wilber's career, while the 10-game streak is the longest of Keck's career

OVC Active Hitting Streaks

Tyler Wilber (11 games) and Andrew Keck (10 game) are among six Ohio Valley Conference players with active 10 or more game hitting streaks. Daniel Harris (18 games, Eastern Illinois), Jackson Feltner (12 games, Morehead State), Logan Eickhoff (11 games, Eastern Illinois) and Brett Roberts (10 games, Tennessee Tech) are the others.

Getting on Base

Andrew Keck has also reached base in 22-consecutive games for the longest such streak of any Redhawk this season. Jevon Mason, Wade Stauss and Tyler Wilber reached base safely in their last 17, 12 and 11 games, respectively.

Second Half

The Redhawks began the second half of their Ohio Valley Conference season with a 2-1 series win over Tennessee Tech (Apr. 16-17). Southeast Missouri will play road series at Belmont (Apr. 30-May 1) and Morehead State (May 14-15), and host Eastern Kentucky (May 7-8) and UT Martin (May 20-21) in its final two home sets to close out its 30-game conference slate.

Midweek vs. OVC

Southeast Missouri played its first of two midweek games against Ohio Valley Conference foes when it beat UT Martin, 8-1, at Skyhawk Field on Apr. 13. SEMO sent 12 men to the plate in a 25-minute top of the second inning where it scored six runs. The Redhawks notched three singles, two doubles, a triple and one home run during that early surge. SEMO is also scheduled to face Austin Peay in Clarksville, Tennessee on Apr. 28. Neither of those matchups count as OVC games.

Andrews Sets New Career-High

In his third start at first base this season, Lincoln Andrews finished with a career-high three hits against UT Martin (Apr. 13). Andrews went 3-for-5 with a double, one run scored and one RBI in that game. It was his sixth multiple-hit game of the year.

Grossius Gets the Win

Bryce Grossius picked up his second win of the season when he beat UT Martin (Apr. 13). In his second start, Grossius struck out four and allowed only one run on four hits in 3.1 innings against the Skyhawks. He is 2-1 through 11 appearances and two starts this year.

Congratulations Coach Sawyers!

Andy Sawyers picked up his 100th career win as Southeast Missouri's head coach when the Redhawks beat Jacksonville State, 6-5, in comeback fashion on Apr. 2. Sawyers, who is in his fifth year at the helm, is 106-111 overall at SEMO.

Mason's Hitting Streak Ends at 11 Games

Jevon Mason's hitting streak ended at 11 games at Murray State (Apr. 9). Mason registered multiple hits a total of eight times during his hitting streak, the longest of any Redhawk this season. He is presently the only Redhawk that put together a double-digit game hitting streak in 2021.

New Season-Highs

Southeast Missouri established new season-highs in hits (13) and runs (12) during its doubleheader sweep of Murray State (Apr. 9). The Redhawks scored 20 runs on 25 hits in that twin bill. SEMO had a total of 34 hits against the Racers, its most in a any series this season.

Top Threats

Tyler Wilber and Jevon Mason lead Southeast Missouri in batting average hitting .392 and .365, respectively. Mason also tops the Redhawks with a .471 on-base percentage, while Wilber is also first on the team in hits (51), RBI (32) and slugging percentage (.577).

Wilber Logs 100th Career Start

Tyler Wilber made his 100th career start in game two of Southeast Missouri's doubleheader at Murray State (Apr. 9). Wilber, who has 105 starts as a Redhawk, is the third active player with over 100 starts joining Connor Basler (206) and Danny Wright (193).

Wilber Nabs First OVC Player of the Week Honor

Shortstop Tyler Wilber claimed his first Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Week honor on Mar. 5. Wilber hit .611 with two runs scored. a pair of doubles, nine RBI and a stolen base last week. He hit safely in 11 of his 18 at-bats, boasted a .722 slugging percentage and registered a .619 on-base percentage in four starts. Wilber had three or more hits in three games, including a season-best four against Jacksonville State (Apr. 3). He knocked in the go-ahead run on a two-RBI single in the sixth inning leading Southeast Missouri to its 6-5 come-from-behind series opening win vs. the Gamecocks (Apr. 2). UT Martin's Sam Folks (Pitcher of the Week) rounded out the week's honorees

200th Career Start

Second baseman Connor Basler made his 200th career start at Murray State (Apr. 9). Basler has played and started more games than any Redhawk on this year's roster. He currently leads the team with 211 games and 206 starts since joining the program in 2017.

Wilber Named to Brooks Wallace Award Watch List

Southeast Missouri shortstop Tyler Wilber was named to the 2021 Brooks Wallace Award watch list on Apr. 13. A group of 100 of the most talented athletes in Division I college baseball headline the 2021 Brooks Wallace Award watch list, announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The watch list features some of the most recognizable names in college baseball who either have paced perennial powers or led some relative newcomers to new heights. The award, sponsored by Mizuno, honors the nation's top shortstop and will be presented this summer by the College Baseball Foundation. It is named for former Texas Tech shortstop Brooks Wallace, who played for the Red Raiders from 1977 to 1980. Wallace died of leukemia at the age of 27. The award rewards



outstanding defensive play as much as it does production at the plate, which opens the watch list to all kinds of players at the position. Wilber is one of five Ohio Valley Conference players on the list joining Trey Sweeney (Eastern Illinois), Casey Harford (UT Martin), Ed Johnson (Tennessee Tech) and Cole Frederick (Jacksonville State).

Wilma Wins 2021 Starting Debut

Left-hander Collin Wilma, who started three of his four appearances in Southeast Missouri's shortened 2020 campaign (due to COVID-19), beat Jacksonville State (Apr. 3) in his first start this season. Wilma struck out three and allowed two runs on six hits in 5.1 innings during SEMO's series clinching 8-3 victory. He made three relief appearances prior to that start.

Miller Time

Freshman right-hander Kyle Miller was outstanding out of the bullpen in two relief appearances last week. Miller struck out seven of the nine hitters he faced for the week. He struck out the side and finished with five strikeouts en route to a six-out save against Jacksonville State (Apr. 2). Miller then came on in the ninth inning and recorded a big strikeout with two runners on base to polish off Southeast Missouri's series-clinching 8-3 win over the Gamecocks the next day. Miller tossed 2.2 scoreless innings against JSU. He is second on the team with two saves thus far.

OVC Tournament Site Selected

The Ohio Valley Conference announced on Apr. 6 that its 2021 Baseball Championship will be held at The Ballpark at Jackson from May 27-29. The OVC Baseball Championship was previously held at The Ballpark at Jackson form 2010-2016. This year's championship will feature the top four teams in the OVC standings competing in a double-elimination format with the winner getting the OVC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Jackson is located in the heart of West Tennessee halfway between Memphis and Nashville conveniently on Interstate 40.

Stauss Homers in Three-Straight Games

Catcher Wade Stauss hit a home run in each of his last three games. Stauss hit a home run in games two and three of Southeast Missouri's series at Murray State (Apr. 9-10). He followed that up with a solo home run at UT Martin (Apr. 13). Stauss leads the Redhawks and is tied for third in the Ohio Valley Conference with nine home runs this season. He has hit a home run in five of his last nine starts.

NCAA Top-25 Rankings

Peyton Leeper ranks 16th in the nation in sacrifice bunts (7) and 24th in sacrifice bunts per game (0.22).

Among OVC Leaders

Southeast Missouri leads the Ohio Valley Conference in sacrifice bunts (21) and ranks second in stolen bases (47). Individually, Peyton Leeper is tied for second in triples (3), Dylan Dodd is second in strikeouts (71) and earned run average (3.20), and fifth in innings pitched (56.1). Wade Stauss is tied for first in fielding percentage (1.000) and Andrew Keck is tied for third in stolen bases (14). Additionally, Tyler Wilber is tied for third among league foes in hits (51).

Wilber Third in the OVC in Batting Average

Shortstop Tyler Wilber ranks third in the Ohio Valley Conference with a .392 batting average. Wilber is also tied for third among league leaders in hits (51), seventh in slugging percentage (.577) and seventh in on-base percentage (.461).

15 and Counting

Tyler Wilber leads Southeast Missouri and ranks second in the Ohio Valley Conference with 15 multiple-hit games this season. Wilber collected multiple hits a total of 51 times during his SEMO career.

Over 150 Starts

Two Redhawks have made over 150 starts in their careers. Second baseman Connor Basler tallied a team-high 206 career starts and mainstay center fielder Danny Wright has accumulated 193. Both Basler and Wright are fifth-year seniors after joining Southeast Missouri's baseball program in 2017.

Extra, Extra

The Redhawks concluded their series against Austin Peay by splitting a pair of extra inning games at Capaha Field on Mar. 20. Southeast Missouri trailed, 5-1, in the bottom of the ninth inning when it scored four runs on four hits to send game one to extra innings. Connor Basler delivered a two-RBI single with two outs to tie the game. With runners on first and second and one out in the bottom of the 11th, Jevon Mason delivered a walk off single to left and Peyton Leeper scored the winning run. In game two, the Redhawks battled back from an 11-5 deficit by scoring three runs in the eighth and ninth innings. Basler again came up big, this time with a two-out three-RBI double to tie the game. APSU, however, scored one run in the top of the 12th to edge the Redhawks. SEMO has played seven extra-inning games and is 4-3 in those contests this year.

First Career Home Run for Basler

Fifth-year senior Connor Basler hit the first home run of his career against Missouri State (Mar. 30). Basler, who has played in a total of 201 games as a Redhawk, hit a two-run shot to left field to help lift Southeast Missouri to a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the second inning.

Walk Off Wins

Southeast Missouri earned its second walk off win of the season when it rallied to beat Austin Peay, 6-5, in 11 innings on Mar. 20. Jevon Mason became the second Redhawk to walk off with a game-winning hit when he drove in Peyton Leeper on a one-out single to left. Leeper, a freshman, hit a sinking line drive base hit in the bottom of the 10th inning to give SEMO its other walk off win, a 4-3 victory over Illinois State on Mar. 5. The walk off hits are career firsts for Mason and Leeper.

Basler is Clutch

Nine-hole hitter Connor Basler sent both games of Southeast Missouri's doubleheader against Austin Peay (Mar. 20) to extra innings. Basler had a two-out, two-RBI single to cap a four-run ninth inning during game one and then ripped a two-out, three-RBI double in the bottom of the ninth inning of game two.

Back-to-Back Saves for Williams

Austin Williams picked up back-to-back saves in three of his relief appearances last week. Williams entered the game at Saint Louis (Mar. 16) in the eighth inning and recorded the final six outs to secure his first career save. Three days later, he finished with a career-high four strikeouts in two scoreless innings to preserve

a 6-3 series-opening win over Austin Peay (Mar. 19).

OVC Home-Openers

With its 6-3 win over Austin Peay on Mar. 19, Southeast Missouri improved to 4-0 in Ohio Valley Conference home-openers under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO beat UT Martin in both 2017 and 2019, and Morehead State in 2018 in such contests prior to this year. The Redhawks ended up winning their OVC home-opening series in 2017, 2018 and 2021. SEMO did not have a home series in conference play during its 2020 campaign that was shortened due to COVID-19.

March 12

When Southeast Missouri dropped its series-opener to SIU Edwardsville on Mar. 12, that game marked exactly one year from the time a global COVID-19 pandemic brought college athletics to an abrupt halt. On Mar. 12, 2020, the NCAA canceled its men's and women's basketball tournaments and conferences across the country changed plans for games in the months ahead. That decision affected championships in all winter and spring sports, including baseball. Southeast Missouri dropped a 6-4 midweek contest at longtime rival Southern Illinois in its final game of the shortened 2020 campaign a day before the decision to cancel play was made.

OVC Schedule

Each of Southeast Missouri's three-game series in Ohio Valley Conference play will be contested over two days with a single game on Friday and a doubleheader Saturday with the exception of the Redhawks home series vs. UT Martin (May 20-21) That series will be played on Thursday and Friday. SEMO hosts UT Martin, Austin Peay (Mar. 19-20), Jacksonville State (Apr. 2-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 16-17) and Eastern Kentucky (May 7-8), and visits SIUE (Mar. 12-13), Eastern Illinois (Mar. 26-27), Murray State (Apr. 9-10), Belmont (Apr. 30-May 1) and Morehead State (May 14-15) in league action this year.

50th OVC Win

Andy Sawyers picked up his 50th Ohio Valley Conference win when Southeast Missouri beat SIU Edwardsville 6-4 on Mar. 13. Sawyers is now 59-52 in OVC games as the Redhawks head coach.

Dodd Clears 150 Strikeouts

Dylan Dodd surpassed 150 strikeouts in his career against Austin Peay (Mar. 19). Dodd did not allow an earned run and struck out eight in seven innings en route to getting his second win of the season. He has struck out at least eight in eight of his nine starts with a season-high 10 at Arkansas (Feb. 25) and SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12). Dodd now has 184 strikeouts in 159 innings to date. He ranks second in the Ohio Valley Conference with 71 strikeouts and fifth with 56.1 innings pitched through nine starts.

Nice Work Keck

Andrew Keck hit .417 with four runs scored, five hits, a double, one RBI and a perfect 4-of-4 stolen bases in the Redhawks series win over SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12-13). Keck hit safely in all three games against the Cougars and recorded to hits and two stolen bases in each of the final two matchups of the series. He walked and scored as part of a three-run 10th inning that sent SEMO to a 6-3 victory in game two. Keck then singled and came around to score during a four-run first inning that keyed the Redhawks 6-4 victory in the series finale.

Redhawks Beat Illinois State

The Redhawks posted their second series win of the season and first at home when they won three of four games against Illinois State (Mar. 5-7) in Cape Girardeau last weekend. Southeast Missouri, which also claimed its first series victory against Missouri Valley Conference member ISU in program history, snapped a 12-game losing streak in its series against the Redbirds.

Complete Game for Niznik

Left-hander Noah Niznik tossed a complete game victory to give Southeast Missouri a 5-1 victory over Illinois State (Mar. 6). Niznik recorded his first win of the season after striking out four and walking nin in seven innings. He allowed only one earned run, as well. It marked the third complete game and matched the longest outing of Niznik's career.

First Win for Miller

Freshman right-hander Kyle Miller picked up the win in his first career start when he defeated Illinois State (Mar. 7). Miller worked six innings, striking out three and walking one. He also gave up six hits and allowed just one run. Miller improved to 1-1 with a save in four appearances and one start this year.

Yard Work

Catcher Wade Stauss launched a three-run home run in back-to-back days during Southeast Missouri's series vs. Illinois State (Mar. 5-7). Stauss hit the first of those two bombs in the bottom of the third inning of game two. He then homered again in that same inning to grab SEMO the lead during the series finale. Stauss leads the Redhawks with nine home runs. The Redhawks have 21 home runs as a team.

Ralls Nails Down First Save

Sophomore right-hander Hunter Ralls pitched effectively for three innings to claim his first career save against Illinois State (Mar. 7). Ralls recorded five strikeouts and allowed two hits in three scoreless innings. He did not allow a walk, as well. It was the fourth relief appearance of Ralls' career.

Two 10-Strikeout Performances

Dylan Dodd was magnificent on the mound during his second start of the season. Dodd wound up getting a no-decision against #2 Arkansas (Feb. 25). He finished with 10 strikeouts, walked two and allowed just two runs on three hits. Dodd struck out two in each of the first three innings and sat the Razorbacks down in order in the second. He also no-hit Arkansas through 2.2 innings. In a no-decision against SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12), Dodd recorded 10 strikeouts in five innings of work. He finished with 10 strikeouts in two of his last three starts. Dodd has struck out 10 or more in a game a total of four times in his career.

Career Hit 200

Danny Wright registered the 200th hit of his career with a two-RBI single that gave Southeast Missouri a 5-2 lead in the eighth inning of game one at #2 Arkansas (Feb. 25). Wright finished with three RBI in that contest.



Season-Opening Series Win

The Redhawks opened their 2021 campaign with a 2-1 series win on the road at Sun Belt Conference member South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). Southeast Missouri beat the Jaguars, 4-2, on Feb. 19 and, 8-6, in 10 innings on Feb. 21 to claim its second season-opening series win under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. With its win on Feb. 19, SEMO also improved to 12-18 all-time in season-opening games during its NCAA Division I era (since 1992) and 3-2 in such games under Sawyers.

Double-Digit Hits

Southeast Missouri registered 10 or more hits a total of 14 times this season. SEMO collected a season-best 13 hits against Missouri State (Mar. 30) and Murray State (Apr. 9). The Redhawks are 8-6 in games where they put up double-digit hits. SEMO finished with over 10 hits in eight of its last 13 contests.

Stauss Brothers

Brothers Wade and Tyler Stauss were in Southeast Missouri's lineup together for the first time in the series finale at South Alabama (Feb. 21). Wade started at catcher and his younger brother, Ty, was in left field for that contest. They have been in the starting lineup together a total of 13 times this year.

Seven With Home Runs

Seven different Southeast Missouri players have homered this season. Wade Stauss leads the way with nine home runs, while Tyler Wilber and Andrew Keck follow with four and three, respectively. Austin Blazevic, Lincoln Andrews, Connor Basler and Danny Wright also homered.

Redhawks Sweep OVC Honors

Southeast Missouri seniors Austin Blazevic and Dylan Dodd swept the Ohio Valley Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week honors on Feb. 22. A first baseman from Plainfield, Illinois, Blazevic won this year's first OVC Player of the Week accolade, while Dodd, a left-hander from Danville, Illinois, claimed the first OVC Pitcher of the Week award in 2021. Blazevic and Dodd gave SEMO its first sweep of the league's accolades during the opening week of a season in eight years. Jason Blum (Player) and Zack Smith (Pitcher) was the last duo to complete that sweep on Feb. 18, 2013.

Blazevic hit .455 with five runs scored, a double, walk and one RBI to lead SEMO to a series victory at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). He finished the series with multiple hits in back-to-back games. In Sunday's finale, Blazevic rallied the Redhawks in the ninth inning where they scored three runs to get a 6-5 lead. He started the inning with a single and SEMO sent eight hitters to the plate during its big inning. Then, after USA tied things up in the bottom of the ninth, Blazevic ripped a double down the right field line to score Danny Wright for the go-ahead run all the way from first base. Meanwhile, Dodd struck out eight and allowed only one walk in six innings to lead SEMO to a season-opening 4-2 win over USA on Feb. 19. He moved to 2-1 in his career on opening day. Dodd got stronger as the game went along en route to nailing down his first win of 2021. He retired 12 of the last 13 hitters he faced before giving way to Bryce Grossius in the seventh. Dodd pitched back-to-back 1-2-3 innings in the fifth and sixth frames. The OVC Pitcher of the Week honor marks the third of Dodd's career and the OVC Player of the Week laurel is the second of Blazevic's time in a SEMO uniform.

Season 63

The 2021 campaign is Southeast Missouri's 63rd year of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 30th season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,382-1,132-10 all-time and 848-745-1 at the NCAA Dvision I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 422-291-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won four OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016), three OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016) and made three NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016) in program history.

Redhawks Tabbed Fifth in OVC Preseason Poll

The Redhawks accumulated 131 points and one first-place nod in this year's Ohio Valley Conference Predicted Order of Finish voted on by the OVC Head Baseball Coaches and Communication Directors. Belmont is this year's preseason favorite with 188 points and 14 first-place votes, while Jacksonville State (176 pts.), Murray State (136 pts.) and Austin Peay (132 pts.) also rated above the Redhawks. Eastern Kentucky (117 pts.), SIU Edwardsville

(78 pts.), Eastern Illinois (73 pts.), Morehead State (57 pts.), Tennessee Tech (66 pts.) and UT Martin (45 pts.) round out the preseason poll.

Wilber and Dodd Earn Preseason All-OVC Honors

Junior shortstop Tyler Wilber and senior left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd was named to this year's Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Statistics were based on the 2019 campaign when determining the 16 players selected to the 2021 Preseason All-OVC squad. A native of Danville, Illinois, Dodd led SEMO with 77 strikeouts in 76 innings through 14 starts that year. He finished with four wins on the mound, second-most on the team. Dodd tied for eighth in the OVC in strikeouts. Wilber, who hails from Los Alamitos, California, led the league in batting average (.383) and on-base percentage (.480), while ranking third in doubles (19) and fifth in hits (80) in 55 starts during the 2019 season. He also scored 43 runs, had a team-high three triples and led the Redhawks with 40 RBI. For his efforts, Wilber garnered First-Team All-OVC accolades.

Wilber Ranked 17th Among D1Baseball's Top 100 Shortstops

D1Baseball rated Southeast Missouri junior Tyler Wilber 17th among its Top 100 shortstops in the nation. A native of Los Alamitos, California, Wilber was rated among D1Baseball's Top 40 junior hitters in 2020. He ranked second on the team with a .406 batting average in 17 starts during a shortened season due to COVID-19. Wilber led the Redhawks in runs (26), doubles (9), walks (11) and on-base percentage (.494). Wilber was atop the Ohio Valley Conference in runs scored and ranked second in doubles, total bases (48) and total plate appearances (85) when play was suspended. Nationally, he ranked second in runs scored, fourth in runs per game (1.53) and ninth in total bases. UCLA's Matt McLain was tabbed as the No. 1 shortstop on this year's list.

2021 Roster

After all the uncertainties and challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA Division I Council decided to allow schools to provide spring sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their



period of eligibility. Since everyone from 2020 redshirted, Southeast Missouri brings back over 60 percent of its roster. That said, the Redhawks 2021 squad consists of 38 players, including 19 returnees, six position starters and three starting pitchers.

Sawyers in Fifth Year

Andy Sawyers is in his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach. Sawyers, who has been coaching college baseball for more than two decades, is 193-138 in his career as a head coach. That includes a 106-111 record and 59-52 Ohio Valley Conference mark as SEMO's skipper. He has led the Redhawks to two OVC Tournaments (2017, 2018). SEMO's 29 victories in 2017 are currently the most in a season with Sawyers at the helm.

Pro Prospects Return

Shortstop Tyler Wilber, a First-Team All-Ohio Valley Conference selection in 2019, chose to remain at Southeast Missouri after turning down free agent offers from a couple of different professional teams last summer. Left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd also decided to return after getting offers to play professionally.

Career Rankings

Tyler Wilber presently ranks third all-time among Southeast Missouri's career leaders with a .390 batting average. Wilber has the highest career batting average of any player during SEMO's NCAA Division I era (since 1992). Danny Wright is third in hit by pitch (35) and Connor Basler rates fourth in hit by pitch (29) and tied for second in stolen bases (50). Dylan Dodd ranks fifth all-time in strikeouts/9 innings (10.4) and sixth in walks allowed/9 innings (2.3).

Redhawks in the Major Leagues

A total of 10 Southeast Missouri players have gone on to play Major League Baseball. Presently, left-handed pitcher Joey Lucchesi, is the only former Redhawk on an active roster. Lucchesi, after spending three seasons with the San Diego Padres is in spring training with the New York Mets. He was traded to the Mets on Jan. 19. SEMO has had a total of 30 players drafted since 1966. Lucchesi is the highest draft pick out of the Redhawks baseball program when he went in the fourth round in 2018. Left-handed pitcher Galen McSpadden

and first baseman Matt Tellor are SEMO's other two Top-10 draft picks. McSpadden was a sixth-round selection by the Padres and Tellor was a 10th-round pick by the Atlanta Braves in 2014.

On Deck

Southeast Missouri closes out the week with a trip to Belmont. The Redhawks and Bruins play a three-game series on Apr. 30-May 1.



ndy Sawyers enters his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach in 2021.

SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in Ohio Valley Conference play when its 2020 season was abrubtly cut short due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits

(6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros.

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a league-high with 29 hits when play was suspended.

Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Nineteen returnees are back for Sawyers to mentor again this spring as the Redhawks return over 60 percent of last year's roster.

None of those players lost any

eligibility after the COVID-19 pandemic influenced the NCAA Division I Council's decision to allow schools to provide spring-sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility.

Before they took the field last spring, the Redhawks ushered in a state-of-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-tiem stats and performance metrics.

In Sawyers' last full season of competition, SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480).

Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers,

including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and eight NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 39 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and eight top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs

and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman
Josh Rolette who garnered
Louisville Slugger Freshman
All-American honors in 2016.
He also helped mentor Jake
Scudder who was named Big
12 Newcomer of the Year. The
Wildcats had three studentathletes on the All-Big 12 Teams
that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to stolen bases as the 149 steals were second-most in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399).

Before K-State, Sawyers spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American.

Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008, Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips

to the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance at the 2005 College World Series. Sawyers, who lettered two years at Nebraska, worked with 12 Huskers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Alex Gordon, a two-time Big 12 Player of the Year. In 2005, Gordon won five National Player of the Year awards before being taken as

Sawyers took on all hitting coach responsibilities at Nebraska beginning with the 2006 season when the team hit .310 - its best mark in four years - and ranked in the top three of the Big 12 in home runs, stolen bases, on-base percentage and slugging percentage.

the second overall pick by the

Kansas City Royals.

Sawyers served as the academic coordinator and worked with the catchers during his time at Nebraska, as well. He also had a hand in the Huskers recruiting their then-highest-rated class in school history, as the 2004 recruiting class was ranked 16th nationally by





Collegiate Baseball.

After working as the volunteer assistant at Nebraska in 2000, Sawyers worked the 2001 and 2002 seasons as head coach at Hutchinson Community College, compiling an 87-30 record and two postseason berths. In 2001, the Dragons went 40-16 and won the Jayhawk West Sub-Regional, while the 2002 squad set a school record with 47 wins and was ranked as high

as seventh by the NJCAA.

Sawyers' coaching career began at Northwestern (La.) State in 1999 as a volunteer assistant coach, helping the Demons finish second in the Southland Conference.

He first played collegiately at Point Loma (Calif.) Nazarene College in 1994. Following a year off, he played at Mendocino (Calif.) Junior College in 1996 before finishing up his playing career at Nebraska.
