The Ballpark at Jackson

The 2021 OVC Baseball Championship will be held May 27-29 at The Ballpark at Jackson in Jackson, Tennessee. It marks the return to the venue that previously hosted the OVC Championship from 2010-16. The Ballpark at Jackson opened in 1998 and has a seating capacity of 6,000. The venue hosted the 1999 and 2011 Southern League All-Star Games. In 2017 and 2018, The Ballpark at Jackson won back-to-back Sports Field of the Year honors from the Tennessee Turfgrass Association. The back-to-back victories marked the first time that any facility in the Volunteer State won the award in consecutive seasons. Jackson is located in the heart of West Tennessee halfway between Memphis and Nashville conveniently on Interstate 40.

The event has been held at four neutral site locations after moving from the campus of the regular season champions in 2001. The event has been held in Paducah, Kentucky (2001-09), Jackson, Tennessee (2010-16), Oxford, Alabama (2017-18) and Marion, Illinois (2019) before returning to Jackson.

Ticket and Parking Information

Tickets will be \$10 per adult per day and \$5 per day for children (12 and under) and college students with valid ID and can be only purchased in-person at The Ballpark at Jackson. Parking is \$5 per vehicle.

Tournament Field

No. 1 Southeast Missouri (27-19), No. 2 Murray State (30-23), No. 3 Morehead State (24-21) and No. 4 Austin Peay (22-31) make up this year's four-team Ohio Valley Conference

Tournament field. This year marks SEMO's fifth appearance as the tournament's top seed.

Series History

Thursday marks the 102nd meeting between Southeast Missouri and Austin Peay. SEMO went 3-1 against APSU this year, although one of those matchups did not count toward the conference standings. The Redhawks last faced the Governors in postseason play during the 2016 Ohio Valley Conference Tournament (Jackson, Tenn.). SEMO eliminated APSU with a 10-4 victory that year.

OVC Champions

The Redhawks clinched the 2021 Ohio Valley Conference regular season title with their series win over UT Martin (May 20-21). Southeast Missouri claimed its fifth regular season championship in program history. The Redhawks won OVC regular season crowns in 2002, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2021.

OVC Tournament History

Southeast Missouri makes its 26th Ohio Valley Conference Tournament appearance in 2021. SEMO saw its streak of 24-straight OVC Tournament appearances come to an end in 2019, but bounced back to win this year's OVC regular season title after being picked to finish fifth in the league's preseason poll. The Redhawks are 42-46 all-time in OVC Tournament play and have won the league's postseason event three times (1998, 2002, 2016). SEMO last made the OVC Tournament in 2018.

Against the Field

The Redhawks are a combined 15-14 against the rest of this year's Ohio Valley Conference Tournament field. Southeast Missouri is 9-4 vs. Austin Peay, 2-5 vs. Murray State and 4-5 vs. Morehead State in postseason play. Morehead State is the only team headed to this year's conference tournament that the Redhawks didn't play during the regular season.

As the No. 1 Seed

Southeast Missouri won the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament twice as the No. 1 seed. Prior to this year, the Redhawks were the top seed in the 2002, 2014, 2015 and 2016 tournaments. Overall, SEMO has a record of 12-6 as the No. 1 seed in the OVC Tournament.

Wilber Wins OVC Regular Season Batting Title

Redhawk shortstop Tyler Wilber won the second Ohio Valley Conference regular season batting title of his career. Wilber finished the regular season hitting .400 ahead of Morehead State's Jackson Feltner (.397). He ranks 20th in the nation in batting average. Wilber also finished first in the OVC with a .383 batting average in 2019.

Sawyers Named OVC Coach of the Year, Dodd Tabbed Pitcher of the Year to Headline All-OVC Honors

Andy Sawyers was named Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year and left-hander Dylan Dodd was voted Pitcher of the Year to highlight Southeast Missouri's 2021 All-Conference baseball honors. Shortstop Tyler Wilber (Second-Team) and right-handed pitchers Kyle Miller (All-Freshman) and Collin Wilma (All-Freshman) also earned All-OVC laurels. Sawyers claimed his first OVC title as a head coach when the Redhawks won their final series of regular season over UT Martin (May 20-21). SEMO did not qualify for the OVC Tournament in 2019 and was ranked fifth in the league's preseason poll before Sawyers guided the Redhawks to their first OVC regular-season crown since 2016. The title also marked SEMO's fifth in program history. SEMO, the top seed in this week's four-team OVC Tournament, is in pursuit of its fourth OVC Tournament title. The Redhawks won eight of their nine series in conference play and posted 11 series victories in 2021, the most in a season with Sawyers at the helm. SEMO won 15 of its last 21 games and has not lost back-to-back contests since late March. Sawyers' club enters the postseason ranked tied for first in the OVC in fielding percentage (.973), first in saves (13), first in sacrifice bunts (29), second in wins (27), second in earned run average (5.06) and third in opposing batting average (.271). Sawyers becomes the third head coach to win the coveted OVC Coach of the Year award in SEMO baseball history joining Mark Hogan (2002) and Steve Bieser (2014, 2016). A native of Danville, Illinois, Dodd is the eighth SEMO player to secure OVC Pitcher of the Year honors. Joey Lucchesi, presently with the New York Mets, was the last Redhawk to win the award in 2016. Dodd, who also secured

shutout innings in three of his last four starts. He leads the league in ERA (2.36), innings pitched (84), strikeouts (102) and wins (8), and ranks second in opposing batting average (.208). Dodd has struck out eight or more in 12 of his 13 starts, including a season-high 10 at both Arkansas (Feb. 25) and SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12). Nationally, he ranks 18th in strikeout-to-walk ratio. 26th in wins and 28th in strikeouts. At 8-1. Dodd won in each of his last five starts. His only loss of the season came at SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12). Additionally, Dodd recently had a streak of 28-consecutive scoreless innings end against UT Martin (May 20). Wilber, who hails from Los Alamitos, California, earned All-OVC honors for the second time in his career. A semifinalist for the Brooks Wallace Award, Wilber won the league's regular-season batting title for the second time. He is hitting .400 through 46 starts at shortstop and leads the Redhawks in hits (72), doubles (11), RBI (45), slugging percentage (.583) and on-base percentage (.462). Wilber tops the OVC in hits and rates third in on-base percentage. He is among the nation's top 25 in batting average (20th) and hits per game (21st, 1.6). In addition, he rates tied for first in the OVC with 21 mutiple-hit games and held a 15-game hitting streak --second-longest in the OVC this season - from Mar. 30 to May 7. Miller is 3-2 with a 3.92 ERA in 17 appearances and four starts as a freshman. A native of Eureka. Missouri, he ranks second on the team and seventh in the OVC with five saves and has the most strikeouts (39) and innings (39) among SEMO relief pitchers. Miller recorded a season-best seven strikeouts in his longest outing of the season, which lasted 6.1 innings (start at SIU Edwardsville, Mar. 13). He also added a six-out save with four strikeouts in his first NCAA Division I appearance at South Alabama (Feb. 19). Despite being limited to seven appearances and four starts due to injury, Wilma still managed to land a spot on the league's All-Freshman Team. He went 2-0 with 21 strikeouts and eight walks in 27.2 innings of work. Wilma matched a career-high six strikeouts in 4.2 innings at Murray State (Apr. 10) and had four strikeouts over 2.1 innings in a combined shutout at Belmont (May 1). Eastern Illinois shortstop Trey Sweeney (Player of the Year) and Morehead State first baseman (Freshman of the Year) rounded out this year's OVC specialty award-winners.

Sawyers Wins First OVC Title

Southeast Missouri's Andy Sawyers won his first Ohio Valley Conference title as a head coach in 2021. Sawyers, who is in his fifth year at the helm, also picked up his 200th career win (8-4, at Lipscomb, May 15) as a collegiate head coach and 100th win (6-5, vs. Jacksonville State, Apr. 2) as SEMO's head coach this season. He is 115-115 all-time as the Redhawks skipper and 202-142 between head coaching stints at Hutchinson Community College (87-27) and SEMO (115-115). Sawyers is the the third head coach in program history to win a OVC regular season title joining Mark Hogan (2002) and Steve Bieser (2014, 2015, 2016).

Series Wins

Southeast Missouri recorded 11 series wins this season, eight of which came in Ohio Valley Conference play. The Redhawks beat South Alabama (2-1), Illinois State (3-1), Lipscomb (2-1), SIU Edwardsville (2-1), Austin Peay (2-1), Jacksonville State (2-1), Murray State (2-1), Tennessee Tech (2-1), Belmont (2-1), Eastern Kentucky (2-1) and UT Martin (2-1) for those victories. The 11 series wins are the most in a season under Head Coach Andy Sawyers.

Redhawk Momentum

The Redhawks are in pursuit of their fourth Ohio Valley Conference Tournament crown. Southeast Missouri won eight of its nine series in league play this year (its series with Morehead State was canceled due to COVID protocols). The Redhawks won 15 of their last 21 games and have not lost back-to-back contests since late March.

OVC Tournament Experience

Two Southeast Missouri players on this year's roster have been to the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament before. Danny Wright and Connor Basler each played in the 2017 and 2018 OVC Tournaments. Both the 2017 and 2018 OVC Tournaments were played in Oxford, Alabama.

Grossius Notches Career-High

Bryce Grossius registered a career-high seven strikeouts in 5.2 innings in his recent victory over UT Martin (May 21). Grossius (4-2) allowed just one run and no walks en route to picking up his fourth win of the season.

Dodd is Rolling

Dylan Dodd threw seven shutout innings in three of his last four starts. Dodd leads the Ohio Valley Conference in earned run average (2.36), innings pitched (84), strikeouts (102) and wins (8), and ranks second in opposing batting average (.208). He has struck out seven or more in 12 of his 13 starts, including a season-high 10 at Arkansas (Feb. 25) and SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12). Nationally, Dodd ranks 18th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.29), 26th in wins and 28th in strikeouts. He will make his first career OVC Tournament start against Austin Peay Thursday.

Over 100 Strikeouts

Dylan Dodd went over 100 strikeouts in a season for the first time in his career. Dodd has 102 strikeouts as the only pitcher in the Ohio Valley Conference with over 100 Ks this year. He is the first Southeast Missouri pitcher to get over 100 strikeouts in a season since Joey Lucchesi finished with a SEMO single-season record 149 in 2016.

Wilber Among Semifinalists for Brooks Wallace Award

Southeast Missouri's Tyler Wilber is among 30 semifinalists for the 2021 Brooks Wallace Award. The award, sponsored by Mizuno, honors the nation's top shortstop and will be presented this summer by the College Baseball Foundation. It is named for former Texas Tech shortstop Brooks Wallace, a slick-fielding shortstop who played for the Red Raiders to from 1977 to 1980. Wallace died of leukemia at the age of 27. Wilber is one of three OVC players among this year's Brook Wallace Award semifinalists. Tennessee Tech's Ed Johnson and Eastern Illinois' Trey Sweeney are the others. Baseball Gives SEMO Fourth OVC Title This Spring

The Redhawk baseball team gave Southeast Missouri Athletics its fourth Ohio Valley Conference title this spring. SEMO's softball, women's tennis and women's outdoor track and field programs also hoisted



championship trophies in 2020-21. Since the start of the 2019 calendar year, the Redhawks have won 10 conference championships, most in the OVC.

What a Year!

While competing in the middle of a COVID-19 pandemic Southeast Missouri's baseball team helped lead the Redhawks to their highest Ohio Valley Conference regular season winning percentage in school history.

Combined, SEMO's teams went 93-42-1 (.688) in conference regular season play. That mark included a 17-10 record from baseball. The winning percentage surpassed the previous record of .673 during the 1998-99 campaign. Additionally, SEMO is the only OVC school that has qualified for every conference championship event in 2020-21.

Morehead State Series Canceled

Southeast Missouri was originally supposed to play a three-game series at Morehead State on May 14-15, but those games were canceled due to COVID-19 protocols in the Eagles program. As a result, Morehead State did not have the requisite number of student-athletes available to compete in the series. The series will not be rescheduled and the games will be considered no contest in the Ohio Valley Conference standings.

Redhawks Down Lipscomb

After Southeast Missouri's series at Morehead State was canceled, the Redhawks scheduled a three-game set at Lipscomb (May 13-15). SEMO won two of three against the ASUN Conference member Bisons. The Redhawks won game one by a score of 3-2 and game three, 8-4, to clinch their series victory. SEMO

finished with a 10-9 record in non-conference action this season.

Mason Homers

Jevon Mason hit the first home run of his career at Lipscomb on May 15. Mason hit a two-run home run in the top of the ninth inning against the Bisons. He went 2-for-4 with two runs scored, two RBI, a walk, one home run and a double in that game. Mason became the eighth Redhawk to hit a home run this season.

Ralls Makes First Weekend Start

Right-hander Hunter Ralls made his first career weekend start on the mound against Lipscomb (May 15). Ralls allowed one run and two hits, while striking out three in four innings. He improved to 3-1 this season in his third start, the longest outing of his career.

Dodd Wins OVC Pitcher of the Week Honor for Second Time

Senior left-hander Dylan Dodd was named Ohio Valley Conference Pitcher of the Week on May 3. A native of Danville, Illinois, Dodd allowed just two hits and struck out eight in a combined 12-0 shutout of Belmont (Apr. 30). He gave up just one walk to the first hitter he faced of the game and improved to 5-1 this season. Dodd retired 20 of 22 hitters, allowing only a single in the fourth inning and a double in the seventh. He has recorded eight or more strikeouts in nine of his 10 starts this season. The OVC Pitcher of the Week honor marks Dodd's second of the season and fourth of his career. Morehead State catcher Jack Gardner (Player of the Week) rounded out the week's honorees.

Grossius Logs First Weekend Start

Bryce Grossius made his first career weekend start in game two of Southeast Missouri's series against Eastern Kentucky (May 7). Grossius threw six scoreless innings with six shutouts, allowed five hits and no walks in his strong outing. It was the longest outing of Grossius' career. Grossius made six starts this season, including three during the midweek.

Redhawks Beat Colonels

Southeast Missouri overcame a five-run deficit to pull off a 7-6 come from behind series clinching win over Eastern Kentucky (May 8). The Redhawks trailed, 5-0, before scoring the next seven runs of the game to take the lead. Andrew Keck's double in the seventh inning scored Connor Basler for what ended up being the decisive run of the game.

Wilber's Career Long Hitting Streak Ends at 15 Games

Tyler Wilber's career long hitting streak ended at 15 games against Eastern Kentucky (May 7). Wilber collected multiple hits 10 times during that stretch. It was the longest hitting streak of any Redhawk since Trevor Ezell hit safely in 18-straight games during the 2016 season.

First Shutout

Southeast Missouri recorded its first shutout of the season with a 12-0 win at Belmont (Apr. 30). Dylan Dodd allowed just two hits and struck out eight in seven innings to key the win. He retired 20 of the 22 hitters he faced and no-hit the Bruins for five innings. SEMO blanked an Ohio Valley Conference opponent on the road for the first time in six years. Interestingly enough, Belmont was also on the losing end of that contest by an identical score of 12-0 on May 14, 2015. The Redhawks ended up shutting out the Bruins twice in their series win

Dodd Reaches 200 Career Strikeouts

Dylan Dodd reached 200 career strikeouts against Eastern Kentucky (May 7). Dodd threw seven shutout innings with eight strikeouts on his way to that milestone. He has 215 strikeouts in 186.2 innings over 31 career starts on the mound. Dodd struck out eight or more in 11 of his 13 starts this year. He ranks tied for third among the school's all-time career strikeout leaders and is fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.4).

That Was Close

Tyler Wilber narrowly missed hitting for the cycle when he went 3-for-4 against Eastern Kentucky (May 8). Wilber fell a triple shy of the cycle. He hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the third inning, singled and doubled to complete his seventh three-hit game of the season.

Leeper Triples Again

Peyton Leeper hit his team-high fourth triple of the season against Eastern Kentucky (May 8). Leeper ranks second in the Ohio Valley Conference in that category.

Overpowering Performance

Following an 11-day layoff, Southeast Missouri erupted for a season-high 16 runs and 19 hits in its 16-3 victory over Austin Peay (Apr. 28). The win is currently SEMO's largest of the season. Five players finished with multiple runs and multiple hits in the Redhawks dominating effort. SEMO also scored seven of its runs with two outs against the Governors.



First Multi-Home Run Game

Andrew Keck posted the first multi-home run game of his career when he homered twice against Austin Peay (Apr. 28). Keck led off the third inning with a solo home run to left center and then homered again when he launched a two-run shot to left in the fifth. He finished at 3-for-5 with two runs scored and three RBI. Keck is tied for second on the team with five home runs this year.

Wilber and Andrews Lead the Way

Tyler Wilber and Lincoln Andrews each had a career-high four hits in Southeast Missouri's win over Austin Peay (Apr. 28). Wilber went 4-for-5 with two runs scored, a home run and a game-high five RBI. He hit safely in each of his first four at-bats of the contest. It was the sixth four-hit game of Wilber's career. Andrews was a perfect 4-for-4 with a double and two runs scored in the first four-hit game of his career.

NCAA Top-25 Rankings

Tyler Wilber ranks 20th in the nation in batting average (.400) and 21st in hits per game (1.6). Peyton Leeper rates 15th in sacrifice bunts (9) and 20th in sacrifice bunts per game (0.21). Dylan Dodd is also 18th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.29).

OVC Top-Three

Southeast Missouri is tied for first in the Ohio Valley Conference in fielding percentage (.973), ranks second in earned run average (5.06), first in sacrifice bunts (29), third in opposing batting average (.271), second in wins (27) and first in saves (13). Individually, Tyler Wilber leads the league in batting average (.400) and hits (72), and ranks third in on-base percentage (.462). Peyton Leeper is second in triples (4) and first in sacrifice bunts (9), Wade Stauss is second in hit by pitch (13) and Dylan Dodd ranks first in ERA (2.36), strikeouts (102), innings pitched (84) and wins (8), and second in opposing bating average (.208).

Career Stolen Bases Record in Sight

Connor Basler is third on the team with eight stolen bases this season. Basler ranks tied for second all-time among Southeast Missouri's all-time career stolen base leaders with 50. He needs three more to break the school's all-time career record. Denver Stuckey

(2000-03) currently holds the record with 52 stolen bases.

Missouri State Series Canceled

Southeast Missouri's final non-conference series at Missouri State (Apr. 23-25) was canceled due to positive COVID-19 test results within MSU's Tier 1 personnel, which consists of student-athletes, coaches, managers and staff. Subsequent testing confirmed the positive test results that canceled the Bears' Apr. 20 game with Missouri and contact tracing revealed that Missouri State did not have the minimum number of medically cleared student-athletes to play the four-game series with SEMO scheduled at Hammons Field.

First to 10 OVC Wins

With its 7-3 victory over Tennessee Tech on Apr. 16, Southeast Missouri became the first to 10 Ohio Valley Conference wins this season. The Redhawks are second in the OVC with a 15-9 record. SEMO's 15 conference wins are second-most in the league. The Redhawks nine OVC losses are also fewest among conference foes.

Wright Gets Career-High in Hits

Danny Wright notched a career-high four hits when he went 4-for-5 with two runs scored, a double and one RBI vs. Tennessee Tech (Apr. 17). Wright previously had three hits a total of 25 times in his career before establishing his new career mark.

Top Threats

Tyler Wilber and Jevon Mason lead Southeast Missouri in batting average hitting .400 and .356, respectively. Mason leads the team in doubles (11) and runs (31), and ranks second in slugging percentage (.459) and on-base percentage (.453), while Wilber tops the team in hits (72), doubles (11), RBI (45), slugging percentage (.583) and on-base percentage (.462).

Wilber Logs 100th Career Start

Tyler Wilber made his 100th career start in game two of Southeast Missouri's doubleheader at Murray State (Apr. 9). Wilber, who has 118 starts as a Redhawk, is the third active player with over 100 starts joining Connor Basler (219) and Danny Wright (206).

Wilber Nabs First OVC Player of the Week Honor

Shortstop Tyler Wilber claimed his first Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Week honor on Mar. 5. Wilber hit .611 with two runs scored, a pair of doubles, nine RBI and a stolen base last week. He hit safely in 11 of his 18 at-bats, boasted a .722 slugging percentage and registered a .619 on-base percentage in four starts. Wilber had three or more hits in three games, including a season-best four against Jacksonville State (Apr. 3). He knocked in the go-ahead run on a two-RBI single in the sixth inning leading Southeast Missouri to its 6-5 come-from-behind series opening win vs. the Gamecocks (Apr. 2). UT Martin's Sam Folks (Pitcher of the Week) rounded out the week's honorees.

200th Career Start

Second baseman Connor Basler made his 200th career start at Murray State (Apr. 9). Basler has played and started more games than any Redhawk on this year's roster. He currently leads the team with 224 games and 219 starts since joining the program in 2017.

Wilber Named to Brooks Wallace Award Watch List

Southeast Missouri shortstop Tyler Wilber was named to the 2021 Brooks Wallace Award watch list on Apr. 13. A group of 100 of the most talented athletes in Division I college baseball headline the 2021 Brooks Wallace Award watch list, announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The watch list features some of the most recognizable names in college baseball who either have paced perennial powers or led some relative newcomers to new heights. The award, sponsored by Mizuno, honors the nation's top shortstop and will be presented this summer by the College Baseball Foundation. It is named for former Texas Tech shortstop Brooks Wallace, who played for the Red Raiders from 1977 to 1980. Wallace died of leukemia at the age of 27. The award rewards outstanding defensive play as much as it does production at the plate, which opens the watch list to all kinds of players at the position. Wilber is one of five Ohio Valley Conference players on the list joining Trey Sweeney (Eastern Illinois), Casey Harford (UT Martin), Ed Johnson (Tennessee Tech) and Cole Frederick (Jacksonville State).



Wilma Wins 2021 Starting Debut

Left-hander Collin Wilma, who started three of his four appearances in Southeast Missouri's shortened 2020 campaign (due to COVID-19), beat Jacksonville State (Apr. 3) in his first start this season. Wilma struck out three and allowed two runs on six hits in 5.1 innings during SEMO's series clinching 8-3 victory. He made three relief appearances prior to that start.

OVC Tournament Site Selected

The Ohio Valley Conference announced on Apr. 6 that its 2021 Baseball Championship will be held at The Ballpark at Jackson from May 27-29. The OVC Baseball Championship was previously held at The Ballpark at Jackson form 2010-2016. This year's championship will feature the top four teams in the OVC standings competing in a double-elimination format with the winner getting the OVC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Jackson is located in the heart of West Tennessee halfway between Memphis and Nashville conveniently on Interstate 40.

Over .400

Tyler Wilber is the only Ohio Valley Conference player hitting .400 this season. Wilber boasts a league-best .400 batting average. Morehead State's Jackson Feltner (.397) and Eastern Illinois' Trey Sweeney (.382) round out the top three hitters in the league.

21 and Counting

Tyler Wilber leads Southeast Missouri and is second in the Ohio Valley Conference with 21 multiple-hit games this season. Wilber collected multiple hits a total of 57 times during his SEMO career.

Over 150 Starts

Two Redhawks have made over 150 starts in their careers. Second baseman Connor Basler tallied a team-high 219 career starts and mainstay center fielder Danny Wright has accumulated 206. Both Basler and Wright are fifth-year seniors after joining Southeast Missouri's baseball program in 2017.

Extra. Extra

The Redhawks concluded their series against Austin Peay by splitting a pair of extra inning games at Capaha Field on Mar. 20. Southeast Missouri trailed, 5-1, in the bottom of the ninth inning when it scored four runs on four hits to send game one to extra innings. Connor Basler delivered a two-RBI single with two outs to tie the game. With runners on first and second and one out in the bottom of the 11th, Jevon Mason delivered a walk off single to left and Peyton Leeper scored the winning run. In game two, the Redhawks battled back from an 11-5 deficit by scoring three runs in the eighth and ninth innings. Basler again came up big, this time with a two-out three-RBI double to tie the game. APSU, however, scored one run in the top of the 12th to edge the Redhawks. SEMO has played seven extra-inning games and is 4-3 in those contests this year.

First Career Home Run for Basler

Fifth-year senior Connor Basler hit the first home run of his career against Missouri State (Mar. 30). Basler, who has played in a total of 201 games as a Redhawk, hit a two-run shot to left field to help lift Southeast Missouri to a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the second inning. Basler has two home runs in his career, both of which came this season.

Walk Off Wins

Southeast Missouri earned its second walk off win of the season when it rallied to beat Austin Peay, 6-5, in 11 innings on Mar. 20. Jevon Mason became the second Redhawk to walk off with a game-winning hit when he drove in Peyton Leeper on a one-out single to left. Leeper, a freshman, hit a sinking line drive base hit in the bottom of the 10th inning to give SEMO its other walk off win, a 4-3 victory over Illinois State on Mar. 5. The walk off hits are career firsts for Mason and Leeper.

Basler is Clutch

Nine-hole hitter Connor Basler sent both games of Southeast Missouri's doubleheader against Austin Peay (Mar. 20) to extra innings. Basler had a two-out, two-RBI single to cap a four-run ninth inning during game one and then ripped a two-out, three-RBI double in the bottom of the ninth inning of game two.

Back-to-Back Saves for Williams

Austin Williams picked up back-to-back saves in three of his relief appearances last week. Williams entered the game at Saint Louis (Mar. 16) in the eighth inning and recorded the final six outs to secure his first career save. Three days later, he finished with a career-high four

strikeouts in two scoreless innings to preserve a 6-3 series-opening win over Austin Peay (Mar. 19).

OVC Home-Openers

With its 6-3 win over Austin Peay on Mar. 19, Southeast Missouri improved to 4-0 in Ohio Valley Conference home-openers under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO beat UT Martin in both 2017 and 2019, and Morehead State in 2018 in such contests prior to this year. The Redhawks ended up winning their OVC home-opening series in 2017, 2018 and 2021. SEMO did not have a home series in conference play during its 2020 campaign that was shortened due to COVID-19.

March 12

When Southeast Missouri dropped its series-opener to SIU Edwardsville on Mar. 12, that game marked exactly one year from the time a global COVID-19 pandemic brought college athletics to an abrupt halt. On Mar. 12, 2020, the NCAA canceled its men's and women's basketball tournaments and conferences across the country changed plans for games in the months ahead. That decision affected championships in all winter and spring sports, including baseball. Southeast Missouri dropped a 6-4 midweek contest at longtime rival Southern Illinois in its final game of the shortened 2020 campaign a day before the decision to cancel play was made.

OVC Schedule

Each of Southeast Missouri's three-game series in Ohio Valley Conference play will be contested over two days with a single game on Friday and a doubleheader Saturday with the exception of the Redhawks home series vs. UT Martin (May 20-21) That series will be played on Thursday and Friday. SEMO hosts UT Martin, Austin Peay (Mar. 19-20), Jackson-ville State (Apr. 2-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 16-17) and Eastern Kentucky (May 7-8), and visits SIUE (Mar. 12-13), Eastern Illinois (Mar. 26-27), Murray State (Apr. 9-10), Belmont (Apr. 30-May 1) and Morehead State (May 14-15) in league action this year.



50th OVC Win

Andy Sawyers picked up his 50th Ohio Valley Conference win when Southeast Missouri beat SIU Edwardsville, 6-4, on Mar. 13. Sawyers is now 65-55 in OVC games as the Redhawks head coach.

Nice Work Keck

Andrew Keck hit .417 with four runs scored, five hits, a double, one RBI and a perfect 4-of-4 stolen bases in the Redhawks series win over SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12-13). Keck hit safely in all three games against the Cougars and recorded to hits and two stolen bases in each of the final two matchups of the series. He walked and scored as part of a three-run 10th inning that sent SEMO to a 6-3 victory in game two. Keck then singled and came around to score during a four-run first inning that keyed the Redhawks 6-4 victory in the series finale.

Redhawks Beat Illinois State

The Redhawks posted their second series win of the season and first at home when they won three of four games against Illinois State (Mar. 5-7) in Cape Girardeau last weekend. Southeast Missouri, which also claimed its first series victory against Missouri Valley Conference member ISU in program history, snapped a 12-game losing streak in its series against the Redbirds.

Complete Game for Niznik

Left-hander Noah Niznik tossed a complete game victory to give Southeast Missouri a 5-1 victory over Illinois State (Mar. 6). Niznik recorded his first win of the season after striking out four and walking nin in seven innings. He allowed only one earned run, as well. It marked the third complete game and matched the longest outing of Niznik's career.

First Win for Miller

Freshman right-hander Kyle Miller picked up the win in his first career start when he defeated Illinois State (Mar. 7). Miller worked six innings, striking out three and walking one. He also gave up six hits and allowed just one run. Miller is 3-2 with five saves in 17 appearances and four starts this year.

Yard Work

Catcher Wade Stauss launched a three-run home run in back-to-back days during Southeast Missouri's series vs. Illinois State (Mar. 5-7). Stauss hit the first of those two bombs in the bottom of the third inning of game two. He then homered again in that same inning to grab SEMO the lead during the series finale. Stauss leads the Redhawks with 11 home runs. The Redhawks have 31 home runs as a team.

Ralls Nails Down First Save

Sophomore right-hander Hunter Ralls pitched effectively for three innings to claim his first career save against Illinois State (Mar. 7). Ralls recorded five strikeouts and allowed two hits in three scoreless innings. He did not allow a walk, as well. It was the fourth relief appearance of Ralls' career.

Two 10-Strikeout Performances

Dylan Dodd was magnificent on the mound during his second start of the season. Dodd wound up getting a no-decision against #2 Arkansas (Feb. 25). He finished with 10 strikeouts, walked two and allowed just two runs on three hits. Dodd struck out two in each of the first three innings and sat the Razorbacks down in order in the second. He also no-hit Arkansas through 2.2 innings. In a no-decision against SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 12), Dodd recorded 10 strikeouts in five innings of work. He finished with 10 strikeouts in two of his last three starts. Dodd has struck out 10 or more in a game a total of four times in his career.

Career Hit 200

Danny Wright registered the 200th hit of his career with a two-RBI single that gave Southeast Missouri a 5-2 lead in the eighth inning of game one at #2 Arkansas (Feb. 25). Wright finished with three RBI in that contest.

Season-Opening Series Win

The Redhawks opened their 2021 campaign with a 2-1 series win on the road at Sun Belt Conference member South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). Southeast Missouri beat the Jaguars, 4-2, on Feb. 19 and, 8-6, in 10 innings on Feb. 21 to claim its second season-opening series win under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. With its win on Feb. 19, SEMO also improved to 12-18 all-time in season-opening games during its NCAA Division I era (since 1992) and 3-2 in such games under Sawyers.

Double-Digit Hits

Southeast Missouri registered 10 or more hits a total of 20 times this season. SEMO collected a season-best 19 hits against Austin Peay (Apr. 28). The Redhawks are 14-6 in games where they put up double-digit hits.

Stauss Brothers

Brothers Wade and Tyler Stauss were in Southeast Missouri's lineup together for the first time in the series finale at South Alabama (Feb. 21). Wade started at catcher and his younger brother, Ty, was in left field for that contest. They have been in the starting lineup together a total of 15 times this year.

Eight With Home Runs

Eight different Southeast Missouri players have homered this season. Wade Stauss leads the way with 11 home runs, while Tyler Wilber and Andrew Keck follow with six and five, respectively. Danny Wright has three home runs, Lincoln Andrews and Connor Basler have two apiece and Austin Blazevic and Jevon Mason each have one.

Redhawks Sweep OVC Honors

Southeast Missouri seniors Austin Blazevic and Dylan Dodd swept the Ohio Valley Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week honors on Feb. 22. A first baseman from Plainfield, Illinois, Blazevic won this year's first OVC Player of the Week accolade, while Dodd, a left-hander from Danville. Illinois, claimed the first OVC Pitcher of the Week award in 2021. Blazevic and Dodd gave SEMO its first sweep of the league's accolades during the opening week of a season in eight years. Jason Blum (Player) and Zack Smith (Pitcher) was the last duo to complete that sweep on Feb. 18, 2013. Blazevic hit .455 with five runs scored, a double, walk and one RBI to lead SEMO to a series victory at South Alabama (Feb. 19-21). He finished the series with multiple hits in back-to-back games. In Sunday's finale, Blazevic rallied the Redhawks in the ninth inning where they scored three runs to get a 6-5 lead. He started the inning with a single and SEMO sent eight hitters to the plate during its big inning. Then, after USA tied things up in the bottom of the ninth. Blazevic ripped a double down the right field line to score Danny Wright for the go-ahead run all the way from first base. Meanwhile, Dodd struck out eight and allowed only one walk in six innings to lead SEMO to a season-open-



ing 4-2 win over USA on Feb. 19. He moved to 2-1 in his career on opening day. Dodd got stronger as the game went along en route to nailing down his first win of 2021. He retired 12 of the last 13 hitters he faced before giving way to Bryce Grossius in the seventh. Dodd pitched back-to-back 1-2-3 innings in the fifth and sixth frames. The OVC Pitcher of the Week honor marks the third of Dodd's career and the OVC Player of the Week laurel is the second of Blazevic's time in a SEMO uniform.

Season 63

The 2021 campaign is Southeast Missouri's 63rd year of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 30th season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,389-1,135-10 all-time and 855-748-1 at the NCAA Dvision I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 428-294-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won five OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2021), three OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016) and made three NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016) in program history.

Wilber and Dodd Earn Preseason All-OVC Honors

Junior shortstop Tyler Wilber and senior left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd was named to this year's Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Statistics were based on the 2019 campaign when determining the 16 players selected to the 2021 Preseason All-OVC squad. A native of Danville, Illinois, Dodd led SEMO with 77 strikeouts in 76 innings through 14 starts that year. He finished with four wins on the mound, second-most on the team. Dodd tied for eighth in the OVC in strikeouts. Wilber, who hails from Los Alamitos, California, led the league in batting average (.383) and on-base percentage (.480), while ranking third in doubles (19) and fifth in hits (80) in 55 starts during the 2019 season. He also scored 43 runs, had a team-high three triples and led the Redhawks with 40 RBI. For his efforts, Wilber garnered First-Team All-OVC accolades.

Wilber Ranked 17th Among D1Baseball's Top 100 Shortstops

D1Baseball rated Southeast Missouri junior Tyler Wilber 17th among its Top 100 shortstops in the nation. A native of Los Alamitos, California, Wilber was rated among D1Baseball's Top 40 junior hitters in 2020. He ranked second on the team with a .406 batting average in 17 starts during a shortened season due to COVID-19. Wilber led the Redhawks in runs (26), doubles (9), walks (11) and on-base percentage (.494). Wilber was atop the Ohio Valley Conference in runs scored and ranked second in doubles, total bases (48) and total plate appearances (85) when play was suspended. Nationally, he ranked second in runs scored, fourth in runs per game (1.53) and ninth in total bases. UCLA's Matt McLain was tabbed as the No. 1 shortstop on this year's list.

2021 Roster

After all the uncertainties and challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA Division I Council decided to allow schools to provide spring sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility. Since everyone from 2020 redshirted, Southeast Missouri brings back over 60 percent of its roster. That said, the Redhawks 2021 squad consists of 38 players, including 19 returnees, six position starters and three starting pitchers.

Sawyers in Fifth Year

Andy Sawyers is in his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach. Sawyers, who has been coaching college baseball for more than two decades, is 202-145 in his career as a head coach. That includes a 115-115 record and 65-55 Ohio Valley Conference mark as SEMO's skipper. He has led the Redhawks to one OVC regular-season title (2021) and three OVC Tournaments (2017, 2018, 2021). SEMO's 29 victories in 2017 are currently the most in a season with Sawyers at the helm.

Pro Prospects Return

Shortstop Tyler Wilber, a First-Team All-Ohio Valley Conference selection in 2019, chose to remain at Southeast Missouri after turning down free agent offers from a couple of different professional teams last summer. Left-handed pitcher Dylan Dodd also decided to return after getting offers to play professionally.

Career Rankings

Tyler Wilber presently ranks third all-time among Southeast Missouri's career leaders with a .393 batting average. Wilber has the highest career batting average of any player during SEMO's NCAA Division I era (since 1992). Danny Wright is third in hit by pitch (35) and Connor Basler rates fourth in hit by pitch (30) and tied for second in stolen bases (50). Dylan Dodd ranks third all-time in strikeouts (215) and strikeouts/9 innings (10.4).

Redhawks in the Major Leagues

A total of 10 Southeast Missouri players have gone on to play Major League Baseball. Presently, left-handed pitcher Joey Lucchesi, is the only former Redhawk on an active roster. Lucchesi, after spending three seasons with the San Diego Padres is in spring training with the New York Mets. He was traded to the Mets on Jan. 19. SEMO has had a total of 30 players drafted since 1966. Lucchesi is the highest draft pick out of the Redhawks baseball program when he went in the fourth round in 2018. Left-handed pitcher Galen McSpadden and first baseman Matt Tellor are SEMO's other two Top-10 draft picks. McSpadden was a sixth-round selection by the Padres and Tellor was a 10th-round pick by the Atlanta Braves in 2014.



ndy Sawyers enters his fifth year as Southeast Missouri's head coach in 2021.

SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in Ohio Valley Conference play when its 2020 season was abrubtly cut short due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits

(6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros.

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a league-high with 29 hits when play was suspended.

Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Nineteen returnees are back for Sawyers to mentor again this spring as the Redhawks return over 60 percent of last year's roster.

None of those players lost any

eligibility after the COVID-19 pandemic influenced the NCAA Division I Council's decision to allow schools to provide spring-sport student-athletes an additional season of competition and an extension on their period of eligibility.

Before they took the field last spring, the Redhawks ushered in a state-of-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-tiem stats and performance metrics.

In Sawyers' last full season of competition, SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480).

Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers,

including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and eight NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 39 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and eight top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs

and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman
Josh Rolette who garnered
Louisville Slugger Freshman
All-American honors in 2016.
He also helped mentor Jake
Scudder who was named Big
12 Newcomer of the Year. The
Wildcats had three studentathletes on the All-Big 12 Teams
that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to stolen bases as the 149 steals were second-most in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399).

Before K-State, Sawyers spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American.

Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008, Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips



to the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance at the 2005 College World Series. Sawyers, who lettered two years at Nebraska, worked with 12 Huskers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Alex Gordon, a two-time Big 12 Player of the Year. In 2005, Gordon won five National Player of the Year awards before being taken as the second overall pick by the Kansas City Royals.

Sawyers took on all hitting coach responsibilities at Nebraska beginning with the 2006 season when the team hit .310 - its best mark in four years - and ranked in the top three of the Big 12 in home runs, stolen bases, on-base percentage and slugging percentage.

Sawyers served as the academic coordinator and worked with the catchers during his time at Nebraska, as well. He also had a hand in the Huskers recruiting their then-highest-rated class in school history, as the 2004 recruiting class was ranked 16th nationally by





Collegiate Baseball.

After working as the volunteer assistant at Nebraska in 2000, Sawyers worked the 2001 and 2002 seasons as head coach at Hutchinson Community College, compiling an 87-30 record and two postseason berths. In 2001, the Dragons went 40-16 and won the Jayhawk West Sub-Regional, while the 2002 squad set a school record with 47 wins and was ranked as high

as seventh by the NJCAA.

Sawyers' coaching career began at Northwestern (La.) State in 1999 as a volunteer assistant coach, helping the Demons finish second in the Southland Conference.

He first played collegiately at Point Loma (Calif.) Nazarene College in 1994. Following a year off, he played at Mendocino (Calif.) Junior College in 1996 before finishing up his playing career at Nebraska.

A native of Willits,
