

Press Box credentials will be issued to accredited sports writers of daily and weekly newspapers. Photo credentials will be issued to accredited members of the photo media working for newspapers and television stations.

All credential requests should come from sports editors, directors or anchors. Spouses, dates and minors will not be permitted in the Press Box or the sidelines of Houck Field. Any unauthorized use of credentials will result in revocation of credentials issued by Southeast Missouri State University and credential requests will not be honored for future SEMO athletic events.

Postgame Interviews

The Southeast Missouri Strategic Communications staff will make student-athletes available to the media at the conclusion of each game. Postgame interviews will be held on the field at Houck Field. Please contact Eric Mueller with any interview requests.

The Redhawks compete at the NCAA Division I level and are part of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA). Southeast first became a member of the Ohio Valley Conference when it moved to NCAA Division I in 1991-92. The Redhawks have won 57 OVC regular-season championships and 20 OVC tournament titles during their first 29 years in the league. Southeast also won seven Women's

All-Sports trophies in that span.

Southeast Missouri joined the growing Under Armour roster of NCAA partners that includes the University of California, Los Angeles, University of California, Berkeley, University of Wisconsin, University of Notre Dame, Naval Academy Athletic Association, University of Maryland, Texas Tech University, Northwestern University, University of Cincinnati, Boston College, University of Utah, University of South Carolina and Auburn University.

Impossible is Nothing.

In September of 2012, Meg Herndon passed away from injuries suffered in a tragic scooter-truck collision near campus.

Meg was a soccer player under coach Heather Nelson at the time of her accident. Not only did she earn an athletic scholarship due to her hard work on the field, Meg also excelled in the classroom as well.

Herndon was a nursing major just like her mother. She was named to the Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll and a Southeast Scholar-Athlete each of her threeyears.

The Herndon family endowed a scholarship in Meg's named following her tragic accident. The scholarship is for SEMO Women's Soccer Athletes. Each year they hold a fundraiser at a St. Louis Cardinals game.

This motto is still displayed on team gear and in the team's locker room.





ouck Field has served as the home of Southeast Missouri soccer since 1999. Houck Field turned 90 years old in 2020...

A Formetco Sports digital video scoreboard with a massive screen size of 33' 6.75" x 52' 6" is the newest addition to Houck Field. The state-of-the-art video board was installed in April, 2020.

Before that, renovations were made to the press box prior to the 2015 season. Renovations included a new sound system, filming station and carpet among other things to enhance the overall interior and exterior look.

Prior to the 2011 season, Houck Field received a huge makeover when a FieldTurf playing surface, Daktronics video scoreboard and new lighting (which meets television standards) were installed. The facility was also repainted, giving the longtime home to Redhawk soccer a flashy look.

Houck Field was built at a cost of \$150,000 and remains a beautiful and picturesque stadium today.

The dedication game pitted SEMO football and Southern Illinois from nearby Carbondale, Illinois, on Oct. 3, 1930. That game attracted a crowd of over 6,000, with SIU claiming a 12-6 victory. The referee of the inaugural game was James T. Blair, who served as the Governor of Missouri from 1957-61.

Houck Field was constructed on the site of an old rock quarry and was purchased in 1925 for \$11,000 at the recommendation of then-college President Joseph A. Serena.

Ten thousand bags of Portland Cement, 23,000 feet of Oregon Fir seat lumber and 150,000 feet of Yellow Pine Form lumber were used in the construction, according to an ad in the Houck Field dedication program. The original stadium included 5,240 seats on the south side of the field.

The field and stadium were named in honor of Louis Houck, who served 39 years as a Regent for the University and President of the Board for all but three of those years.

Seating on the north side of the stadium was added prior to the 1963 season. The press box was later constructed on the south side in 1979. Approximately 400 chairback seats were added to a center section on the south side of the stadium in 1992.

In 2000, the very first FieldTurf playing field was installed and the exterior of the facility was resurfaced. Improvements were also made to the press box at that time.

More upgrades took place in the fall of 2005. Those included a paved parking area adjacent to the east end zone and new parking and landscaping areas surrounding the outside of the stadium.

A state-of-the-art dormitory was built on the west end of the facility in recent years. The ground floor of that building houses a locker room and athletic training facility which the football team uses on gamedays.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE



he Holcomb Success
Center offers Southeast
Missouri student-athletes
a place to study and develop as
students and campus leaders.

It is located in the Student
Recreation Center, just south
of Houck Field. The Holcomb
Success Center offers a computer
lab with 18 work terminals, study
areas and rooms for group
meetings. The facility houses the
Southeast Academic Services
staff and main weight room for
Redhawk student-athletes.

The beautiful facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by SEMO student-athletes.

Athletics achieved a 3.23 departmental GPA for the 2020-21 academic year. A total of 67 student-athletes graduated and 14 of SEMO's 15 sports finished with a team GPA of 3.0 or higher. There were 146 student-athletes on the President's List, including

78 in the fall and 68 in the spring. Additionally, 122 student-athletes made the Dean's List in the fall and 105 student-athletes earned that distinction during the spring.

Women's soccer (3.80) had the Department of Athletics' highest GPA in the fall and women's tennis (3.82) boasted the department's highest GPA in the spring. Women's soccer led the Department of Athletics with a 3.79 cumulative GPA during the 2020-21 academic year.

Maja Lundell (women's tennis) was one of five undergraduate students to receive the 2020-21 President's Spirit of Southeast Award. Lundell (4.0 GPA) was also the recipient of the Trombetta Award which is given to a graduating female student-athlete with the highest GPA for her career.

Morgan McCourt (women's soccer) received the Department of Economics' Outstanding

Overall Student Award from the Southeast Missouri State University Harrison College of Business.

Kate Daus (women's soccer) was awarded the Southeast Missouri State University Department of Communication Studies Public Advocacy Award and Trevor Falco (cross country/track & field, 3.80 GPA) received the Jewel Award. The Jewel Award is given each year to a male senior athlete with the highest GPA for his career.

Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress is monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at SEMO. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study skills and life skills topics, and thus, enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes can also receive individualized academic programs which include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The Holcomb Success
Center staff works to get
athletes involved in campus and
community projects, as well. This
is done to provide a support
structure and greater opportunity
for academic success. Through
the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills
Program, the Holcomb Success
Center gives student-athletes
personal and professional skills in
order to facilitate successful and
productive futures.









tudent-athletes and coaches at Southeast Missouri are dedicated to giving back to the community that so generously supports them.

Redhawk soccer studentathletes have opportunities to participate in a variety of community service activities each year. Community involvement helps provide a support structure and greater opportunity for academic success.

We are proud of the level of commitment shown by our student-athletes and always encourage them to participate in community service projects here at SEMO.

SEMO student-athletes also have the opportunity to participate in the Redhawks BRIDGE Program. The mission of the Redhawks BRIDGE Program is to develop a comprehensive student-athlete development program by Building Responsible Individuals and Delivering Gainful Experiences. This program provides student-athletes with both leadership and life skills experiences through interactive programming that will prepare them to be successful in life after athletics. The leadership programming will teach studentathletes about SEMO's culture and allow them to learn, develop. and apply leadership skills. The life skills programming provides educational programs designed to assist studentathletes in identifying and applying transferable skills and experiences to prepare them to succeed outside of the athletic arena.

SEMO's main weight room is located in the Holcomb Success Center.

In 2019, a nutrition center was added to the facility which provides adequate space for teams to have meals. Student-athletes can visit the nutrition center for breakfast and other snacks daily to enhance their nutritional needs. The nutrition center is always equipped with

plenty of water, gatorade and milk (provided by Prairie Farms) so student-athletes can stay properly hydrated.

Prior to that, the Holcomb Success Center Weight Room received a major overhaul in January, 2016.

Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation, which cost \$500,000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle SEMO's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Branding and new lighting were also included in the overall project.











PROVIDING THE BEST CARE POSSIBLE

outheast MIssouri's sports medicine staff strives to provide the best care possible for its student-athletes.

On Aug. 14, 2019, SEMO and SoutheastHEALTH entered a collaborative partnership in which SoutheastHEALTH will serve as comprehensive providers of orthopedic and sports medicine services for the University's NCAA Division I athletics program, its intramural and club sport participants and for the University's performing arts students.

Under the agreement,
SoutheastHEALTH orthopedic
and sports medicine physicians
provide orthopedic, primary
medical care, athletic training
and physical therapy services,
and invest in the University by
providing diagnostic equipment
and athletic training supplies, as
well as scholarships for students.

SoutheastHEALTH orthopedists Dr. Anthony McPherron, Dr. Matthew Baker and Dr. Charity Jacobs, and SoutheastHEALTH sports medicine physician Andrew Lawrence serve as the official team physicians of SEMO.

The sports medicine staff begins treatments and rehabilitation starting as early as 6 a.m., and is available until the last student-athlete is through.

There are currently four sports medicine facilities on campus. The staff treats out of the Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary training room is located. There are two other satellite athletic training rooms, including one at Houck Field House and one at the Show Me Center.

outheast Missouri's vision of winning the Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner's Cup became a reality when the Redhawks claimed the league's ultimate symbol of overall athletic excellence in Conference-sponsored championships for the first time in school history.

In 2018, SEMO developed a comprehensive strategic plan designed to guide the athletics department into the future which included the following objective as it relates to competition.

"Win the OVC Commissioner's Cup within the next five years and compete annually thereafter."

Mission accomplished.

In 2020-21, SEMO accumulated a total of 119 points, 7.5 points ahead of second-place Belmont (111.5). While competing in the middle of a COVID-19 pandemic, the Redhawks celebrated a dominating spring season bolstered by first-place finishes in

women's tennis, women's track & field, softball and baseball, and a second-place finish in men's track & field. The Redhawks also posted third-place finishes in women's basketball, soccer and volleyball.

"This is truly a team effort. Winning the Commissioner's Cup takes everyone. From the University administration, to the coaches and staff, to the student-athletes, to our supporters. We couldn't have achieved this level of success without all of these groups buying into our vision," said SEMO Director of Athletics Brady Barke.

The Redhawks storybook season came a year after they were on track to win the OVC Commissioner's Cup. In 2019-20, SEMO was in first place following the winter championships before the remainder of the year was canceled and the honor was not awarded due to COVID.

"Not having the opportunity to finish what we started in 2019-20,

makes this year's achievement extra special," added Barke. "We felt we were poised to win the Commissioner's Cup a year ago, so it was great to be able to carry that momentum into the 2020-21 academic year and achieve our goal."

Prior to 2020-21, SEMO finished no higher than third in the OVC Commissioner's Cup standings. Jacksonville State (110.5), Murray State (109.5), Austin Peay (95.0), Morehead State (92.5), UT Martin (88.5), Eastern Kentucky (86.5), Tennessee Tech (80.0), Eastern Illinois (79.5), SIU Edwardsville (75.0) and Tennessee State (33.0) completed this year's scoring.

Since the start of the 2019 calendar year, the Redhawks have won 11 conference championships, most in the OVC. Five of those titles came during this spring alone. SEMO completed its unprecedented 2020-21 campaign with a 93-42-1 (.688) record in conference regular-season play

for its highest OVC regularseason winning percentage in school history. The Redhawks were the only OVC school that qualified for every conference championship event this season. Additionally, SEMO became the first school in OVC history to win a regular-season championship in baseball, softball and women's tennis in the same year.





PRESIDENT DR. CARLOS VARGAS



r. Carlos Vargas became the 18th president of Southeast Missouri State University July 1, 2015, after having served as acting president at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania.

Since becoming president, Dr. Vargas has launched initiatives to marshal the resources, leverage opportunities and address a variety of challenges and needs of Southeast Missouri State University. He has set as primary goals for the institution the support for student persistence and retention.

He has encouraged and supported the identification and development of innovative academic programs, including bachelor's degrees in Unmanned Aircraft Systems, Geographic Information Science, and industrial and systems engineering. He has continued to support the globalization of

the campus through expansion of study-abroad experiences, extensive engagement of international students, and encouragement of students on campus and abroad to explore cultural interaction. He has championed the work of the President's Task Force on Diversity Education and continued emphasizing the expectations for enhancement of the teacherscholar model. Under President Vargas' leadership, regional partnerships and collaborations have been solidified, including several joint initiatives with Three Rivers, Mineral Area and other community colleges.

Prior to assuming the presidency at Southeast, Dr. Vargas served one year as acting president of Kutztown University, where he also served as the provost and vice president for academic and student affairs.

Prior to his tenure at Kutztown,

Dr. Vargas was at Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio, where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs. He previously served in several roles at Kent State University (Ohio) for a total of 18 years, including founding director of the program on electron beam technology. He was also Kent's associate dean for research, interim assistant dean for research and interim assistant dean for the School of Technology. He started his tenure at Kent State in 1985 as a professor, and continued to teach until his departure from the

university in 2003.

Dr. Vargas began his career in higher education at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), from which he received a Bachelor of Science in physics.

He earned his Ph.D. in physics and aerospace science from the University of Michigan and he has Master of Science degrees from Michigan in both physics and aerospace science. He is married to Pam Vargas, who currently serves as director of Research and Grant Development at Southeast, and they have a son, a daughter, and two granddaughters.

under the leadership of
Brady Barke.

In 2020-21, SEMO claimed its first-ever Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner's Cup, the league's ultimate symbol of overall athletic excellence in Conferencesponsored championships.

While competing in the middle of a COVID-19 pandemic, the Redhawks won five OVC titles and one national championship. Women's tennis (regular-season), softball (regular-season), women's outdoor track & field and baseball (regular-season and tournament) all celebrated OVC championships, and gymnastics won the 2021 USA Gymnastics Women's Collegiate National Championship.

All that success came after the Redhawks were on track to win the OVC Commissioner's Cup the previous year. In 2019-20, SEMO was in first place following the winter championships before the remainder of the year was canceled and the honor was not awarded due to COVID.

Since the start of the 2019 calendar year, the Redhawks have won a total of 11 conference championships, most in the OVC. SEMO completed its remarkable 2020-21 campaign with a 93-42-1 (.688) record in conference regular-season play for its highest OVC regular-season winning percentage in school history. The Redhawks were also the only OVC school that qualified for every conference championship event in 2020-21, the best season in SEMO's NCAA Division I history.

Barke looks forward to keeping the momentum going as he begins his sixth year as SEMO's Director of Athletics.

Barke served as the Interim Director of Athletics since July, 2015, before being named to the permanent position of Director of Athletics on June 7, 2016.

He has built a culture that thrives on academics just as much as it does on competitive success. Academically, SEMO's athletic teams are strong year-in and year-out.

Athletics achieved a 3.23 departmental GPA for the 2020-21 academic year. Fourteen of SEMO's 15 sports finished with a team GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Before that, student-athletes overcame an enormous amount of adversity and disruption brought on by a global COVID-19 pandemic to close out the 2019-20 academic year with a Department of Athletics record 3.53 spring grade point average.

That mark was the highest GPA of any semester for the Redhawks who had a total of 12 teams achieve a 3.21 or higher GPA in the spring term alone.

Also, five different programs, including gymnastics (3.82), women's soccer (3.78), women's basketball (3.42), men's basketball (3.26) and football (2.94) registered their highest semester GPAs ever.

The upcoming 2021-22 campaign marks SEMO's fourth

year with Under Armour. Barke reached a multi-year agreement with the Baltimore-based global leader in performance footwear, apparel and equipment that made Under Armour the official outfitter of SEMO Athletics on July 1, 2018.

As part of the multi-year agreement, Under Armour provides on-field and training gear for 15 sports. Additionally, Under Armour outfits members of the athletic department including coaches and staff.

Barke also secured bids to host SEMO's first home football playoff games. Additionally, he helped the University reach a collaborative partnership with SoutheastHEALTH. Under the agreement, SoutheastHEALTH orthopedic and sports medicine physicians provide orthopedic, primary medical care, athletic training and physical therapy services, and invest in the University by providing diagnostic equipment and athletic training supplies, as well as scholarships for students.

More recently, new state-ofthe-art Formetco digital video scoreboards were installed at both Houck Field and the Southeast Softball Complex under Barke's leadership.

A 4,000-square foot baseball training facility was completed prior to the 2020 season. The \$400,000 indoor facility can fit up to four batting cages.

Barke hired Brad Korn as the Redhawks head men's basketball coach on Mar. 24, 2020, while navigating through the challenging times during the COVID-19 pandemic. Korn was the fourth head coach Barke hired during his tenure as Director of Athletics.

During his first year in 2016-17, Barke introduced Andy Sawyers as the Redhawks head baseball coach and worked tirelessly on two major renovation projects.

Nearly a month after Sawyers was hired, Southeast Missouri State and the City of Cape Girardeau officially broke ground on Capaha Field. New synthetic turf, new fencing and a digital scoreboard in the outfield were added as part of the \$1.8 million project that was completed before SEMO's season-opener.

Gymnastics Coach Ashley Lawson orchestrated a big turnaround in SEMO women's gymnastics during her first three years as head coach.

Women's Tennis Coach Mary Beth Gunn was Barke's other hire.

Sawyers, Lawson and Gunn each claimed Coach of the Year honors in 2021. SEMO's baseball team won the OVC regularseason and tournament titles, and made the NCAA Tournament under Sawyers. The gymnastics team won the USA Gymnastics Women's Collegiate National Championship with Lawson at the helm. And, Gunn led the women's tennis team to its first OVC regular-season title in program history.

On Feb. 3, 2017, SEMO formally dedicated Holcomb Success

Center. To honor the long-time service and philanthropy of Dr. John and Judy Holcomb, the University named the facility the Holcomb Success Center located in the Student Recreation Center-South. Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation at a cost of \$500.000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle SEMO's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Barke helped secure the Holcombs gift, the largest single cash gift in SEMO Athletics history. Major improvements were also made to the second floor of the building where athletic academic services are housed. This space provides student-athletes with places to study and features a computer lab with 30 work terminals and rooms for group meetings. Staff members assist student-athletes with life skills development, academic advising and academic progress toward degree requirements and NCAA eligibility.

Additional renovations have been made to the nutrition area that serves as a fueling station for SEMO student-athletes at the Holcomb Success Center.

Fundraising continues to increase under Barke's direction.

The 2018-19 campaign marked the highest level of giving to the Redhawks Club general fund in 15 years.

Barke also worked with donors to establish two new endowed scholarships for student-athletes and raised over \$60,000 to support the SEMO football program and summer school scholarships.

More than \$250,000 in pledges for the Redhawks Club unrestricted booster fund has been raised with Barke as Director of Athletics.

Improved branding has been a priority. Redhawk banners, S-E! M-O! billboards, Welcome to Redhawk Country and Redhawks yard signs are prominently displayed all over Cape Girardeau.

On July 1, 2020, SEMO unveiled refreshed spirit marks, including a new primary logo, wordmark and variations for its 15 athletic programs. The new brand identity will allow SEMO's athletic teams to display consistent logos, lettering and numerals, and is independent of the existing University marks.

A year later on July 1, 2021, SEMO partnered with Affinity Licensing to manage its trademark licensing program. As part of the agreement, Affinity Licensing will act as the exclusive agency to manage the University's consumer products licensing relationships with manufacturers and retailers.

Barke helped develop the Redhawks Trivia Night & Auction, a sold out event that generated over \$200,000 in net revenue over five years. In addition, he launched the Redhawks BRIDGE program which provides studentathletes with both leadership and life skills experiences through interactive programming that will prepare them to be successful in life after athletics.

Barke served as Interim
Associate Director of Athletics for
Compliance & Student Support
Services before being named the
Senior Associate to the President
and Secretary to the Southeast
Missouri State University Board of
Regents in 2013.

He began his tenure at
Southeast in 2008 as Assistant
Director of Athletics for
Compliance & Eligibility. Barke
previously served as a governance
intern with the NCAA national
headquarters in Indianapolis, and
as a law clerk with the Southern
Illinois University-Carbondale
Department of Athletics
Compliance Office.

Barke has served as a member of the National Association of Athletics Compliance (NAAC), chaired the NAAC Education Committee, and was a member of the NAAC Board of Directors. He has facilitated the NCAA Regional Leadership Academy, and served on both the NCAA Sports Wagering Task Force and the Olympic Sports Liaison Committee.

Barke has a juris doctorate degree from Southern Illinois University School of Law, an MBA from Southeast Missouri State University, and a bachelor of science degree in biology from Webster University. While a student at Webster, Barke was a member of both the basketball and golf teams and was inducted into the Webster Athletic Hall of Fame.

He and his wife, Halley, are parents of three children, Mabrie, Jackson, and Kolbe.

eather Nelson is the only head coach that has guided the Southeast Missouri soccer program since its inception in 1999. She enters her 23rd season at the helm of SEMO soccer in 2021.

In 22 years under her guidance, the Redhawks have posted 17 winning seasons and compiled a 205-138-55 record. Nelson has coached six Ohio Valley Conference regular season champion teams (2001, 2002, 2007, 2011, 2014, and 2019) and back-to-back OVC Tournament championship squads (2006 and 2007) that earned berths in the NCAA Tournament.

Championship Culture

Since the inaugural 1999 season for Southeast Missouri

women's soccer, no Ohio Valley Conference school has captured more than the six regular season championships Nelson's program has earned.

SEMO has made the OVC Tournament 19 of the 22 seasons, most in league history.

After the inaugural season in 1999, Nelson guided SEMO to 10 wins the following year, a figure that was matched or surpassed in each of the next seven seasons and 10 times total in the following 19 years.

By year three, she helped guide Southeast Missouri to back-to-back OVC regular season championships (2001, 2002), which saw the Redhawks go undefeated in conference play during each of those years.

In 2001, Southeast Missouri stormed onto the scene with a 16-2 overall record and 5-0 mark in league play. The Redhawks posted an .889 winning percentage, which currently stands as the best in school history.

That team, which claimed the program's first-ever OVC title, boasted the nation's lowest goals against average (0.44) and the country's top shutout percentage (0.72). SEMO allowed only eight goals and posted 13 shutouts in 18 matches. Southeast Missouri also ranked 10th in the nation for points per game (2.67). SEMO set conference records for wins in a season and goals allowed, posting shutouts in all OVC contests.

Southeast Missouri repeated as the league's regular-season champion in 2002, posting an overall record of 14-4-2 and 6-0 mark in conference play while leading the league in shots, goals allowed, goals against, and shutouts. Following the 2002 season, nine players earned All-OVC honors, including Valerie Henderson and Jenny Hamilton, who were named OVC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, respectively. Despite the dominant records and accolades, an OVC Tournament title eluded the Redhawks in each of those seasons. Eastern Illinois pulled off upsets in the tournament championship match of both campaigns.

The Redhawks finally broke through in postseason play during the 2006 OVC Tournament. After a fourth-place regular season finish, Southeast Missouri knocked off top-seeded Samford and blanked Morehead State in the OVC Tournament finals

to secure its first-ever NCAA
Tournament berth in 2006.
The Redhawks drew nationallyranked Illinois in their program's
first NCAA Tournament game
and stifled the Illini offense for
much of the first period before
eventually falling by a score of
2-0.

SEMO turned that momentum from the 2006 run into a memorable 2007 season that saw the Redhawks finish 12-2-4 in the regular season with an unbeaten 8-0-1 record in OVC play. Southeast won a second-consecutive OVC Tournament, blanking UT Martin in the semifinals and outlasting Samford in penalty kicks in front of a home crowd at Houck Field to earn a return berth to the NCAA Tournament. Southeast Missouri drew instate rival Missouri and made history in the 43rd minute of that clash when Courtney Alexander scored the program's first NCAA Tournament goal. The contest went to penalty kicks, where Missouri prevailed despite a valiant effort from the Redhawks.

Nelson earned her third OVC Coach of the Year honor in 2007, marking the most of any women's soccer coach in league history. Southeast Missouri swept the OVC postseason awards with Alexander claiming OVC Player of the Year, Lindsay Pickering earning OVC Defensive Player of the Year and Ashley Runion collecting the program's first OVC Freshman of the Year honor. This is the only time in OVC history that a single

squad has swept the postseason awards.

Nelson's Redhawks won their fourth regular season title in 2011 with a 12-6-1 record and 8-1-0 finish in the OVC. The eight league wins tied the conference record, which was set by Southeast Missouri and Samford in 2007. Nelson was named OVC Coach of the Year for a record fourth time. Jessie Crabtree earned OVC Offensive Player of the Year honors in her lone season at Southeast Missouri while Erin Shulman claimed OVC Freshman of the Year honors.

The 2012 season was one of adversity for the SEMO soccer program as the team overcame numerous hardships and a tragedy that impacted the entire University and Cape Girardeau community. Nelson was injured in an accident over the summer and spent time away from the sidelines recovering during the first month of the season. In early September, senior defender Meg Herndon was involved in an accident that tragically cut her life short. Equal parts a captain, friend, sister and teammate, Herndon displayed tenacity as a driven defender on the field and was admired by the countless lives she touched in competition and her personal life. Herndon's No. 2 jersey was retired one year later during a celebration of her life prior to the annual alumnae match. During the event, Herndon's mother, Cindi Silvey, presented a check for the newly-formed Meghan Herndon

Memorial Scholarship.

"It's amazing knowing that Meg's legacy is going to live on through her scholarship," Nelson said. "Her family has been so wonderful as we've honored her. It reminds me of my relationship with Meg and how pleasant it was to work with her."

The 2012 Redhawks overcame many obstacles to finish 7-10-4 overall and 5-3-2 in OVC play to place fourth in the conference. SEMO closed the season by going 4-0-1 and qualified for the OVC Tournament for the third consecutive year. The momentum continued during the tournament as the Redhawks defeated Belmont for the program's first postseason victory since 2007. The memorable run ended in a 1-0 loss to UT Martin, the eventual OVC champions. Haley Abbott became the fifth player under Nelson to earn OVC Defensive Player of the Year.

2013 marked the 11th winning season in Nelson's career. Southeast went 8-7-3 overall and 6-2-2 in the OVC to finish third in the conference standings. The Redhawks earned a berth in the OVC Tournament for the fourth year in a row. Ashton Aubuchon was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year, marking the sixth time in Nelson's tenure that a SEMO player received the accolade and second time that Southeast Missouri has claimed the award in back-to-back seasons (Jenny Hamilton, 2001-02).

2014 saw the Redhawks claim their fifth OVC regular

season championship. The Redhawks finished the season 11-6 overall and 8-2 in league play. Southeast defeated SIUE in the regular season finale to win a share of the OVC title with the Cougars. With that win, Southeast earned the right to host the postseason tournament and earned a bye as the No. 1 seed. Freshman Kindra Lierz made history as the first player in the league history to be named OVC Defensive Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year. Lierz was also named First Team All-OVC and to the All-Newcomer Team. Aside from Lierz, the Redhawks had four others earn postseason honors following the 2014 campaign.

2015 was the Redhawks' third consecutive winning season, a feat that hadn't been done since SEMO had eight straight winning campaigns between 2000 and 2007. Southeast finished the 2015 season going 9-6-7 overall and 3-2-5 in league play. Southeast's seven draws were a program record. Following a pair of road losses to Austin Peay and Murray State, the Redhawks went on to finish the regular season undefeated, going 2-0-4 in the final six matches. Carrying the No. 6 seed into the OVC Tournament. the Redhawks drew No. 3 Jacksonville State in the opening round. The Redhawks played the Gamecocks to a 1-1 draw in a double overtime thriller and it was Southeast Missouri who advanced to the semifinals following penalty kicks.

SEMO took on No. 2 Tennessee Tech and the OVC Defensive Player of the Year in the semis in Murray, Kentucky. The Redhawks took down the Golden Eagles 2-0 to advance to the Championship round for the first time since 2007. The season came to an end following a 1-0 loss to top-seeded Murray State in the Championship match. The Redhawks and Racers played to a scoreless draw in regulation but Murray State scored the game-winning goal with 53 seconds left in the first overtime to capture the OVC title.

The 2016 season was highlighted by a season-opening victory over Southeastern Conference opponent by way of a 1-0 shutout. The win sparked a 6-0-1 start to the campaign. The win over Tennessee was the third over an SEC foe in the history of Nelson's program and the first since 2004. The Redhawks finished with a 9-6-4 record.

The 2017 season finished with

an 8-8-4 record and a run in the Ohio Valley Tournament. The Redhawks defeated Austin Peay 2-1 in the first round and tied Belmont in the Quarterfinals, only to advance on a shootout. SEMO then fell to the OVC Champions, Murray State, in the semifinals. The Redhawks notched a 4-3-3 record in OVC play.

In 2018, the Redhawks finished 5-8-5 on the season. SEMO made a historic trip out west as they faced Arizona State and Arizona in Tempe, Arizona, at the beginning of the season. SEMO went 0-0-2 in the OVC Tournament, resulting in a shootout in both games. The Redhawks outlasted Belmont in the first round, but fell to Eastern Illinois in the quarterfinals.

SEMO secured its sixth
OVC regular season champion
title in 2019 with 10-plus wins
for the first time since 2014
as they finished 11-5-1 on the
season. Nelson was named
OVC Coach of the Year for the

fifth time and Hailey Block earned OVC Freshman of the Year honors. SEMO fell to SIUE in the semifinals of the OVC Tournament.

SEMO qualified for its fourthstraight OVC Championship Tournament and 19th all-time appearance during the 2020-21 season. The Redhawks fashioned a 7-4-1 overall mark in 2020-21 including a 6-3-1 record during conference play, which tied for third in the Ohio Valley Conference. SEMO finished as the 2020-21 OVC Championship Tournament runners-up, downing topseeded Murray State, 1-0, in the Semifinals as the fourth seed before falling to SIUE, the 2020-21 Champions, 2-1, in overtime of the Championship Finals.

The Redhawks opened the campaign with five-straight victories and a tie for a six-game (5-0-1) unbeaten streak to start 2020-21. Midfielders Lauren Welker and Emma Brune were named to 2020-21 All-OVC Soccer Teams. Welker earned her first career All-OVC First Team nod while Brune was selected to both the All-OVC Second Team and All-Newcomer Team. Welker, Morgan McCourt and Brune were named to the 2020-21 All-OVC Tournament team.

Nelson captured her 200th career victory at SEMO with a 1-0 win at Belmont on March 9, 2021.

Developing Standout Student-Athletes

In her 22 seasons at Southeast Missouri, Nelson has coached four OVC Players of the Year, seven OVC Defensive Players of the Year and four OVC Freshman of the Year honorees. Additionally, Nelson has coached 98 players who have earned All-OVC accolades since

Nelson has coached 98 OVC Players of the Week, 38 OVC All-Tournament honorees, and two OVC Tournament MVPs.

Nelson has coached many remarkable athletes over the last 21 years. Of these, two are currently in the SEMO Hall of Fame. Lindsay Pickering was inducted in 2007 as a dual-sport athlete and Beth Guccione was inducted in 2019 as the first soccer-only athlete.

Pickering was a two-sport athlete at SEMO, excelling as a member of the women's soccer and softball teams. In soccer, Pickering was a two-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year, winning the coveted honor in 2005 and 2007. She earned First-Team All-OVC accolades each of those seasons and was a second-team pick in 2006. A three-year starting goalkeeper, Pickering rated as Southeast Missouri's career leader in shutouts (28), wins (34) and minutes played (5,233). Pickering was named Second-Team All-OVC in 2006 and landed a spot on the All-OVC Tournament Team in both 2004 and 2005. She is the first soccer player and 18th multiple sport athlete to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.

Guccione was the 2001 OVC Player of the Year and was a two-time First-Team All-OVC selection in her career. Guccione ranks among the school's top five career leaders in five categories and established three single-season records. She was SEMO's starting goalkeeper when the school first began its women's soccer program in 1999.

The Redhawks also earned regional recognition in 2012 as defender Hayley Abbott earned third-team all-region honors from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). For the second time in three seasons, a Southeast Missouri player received NSCAA recognition as defender Nikki Edwards earned honorable mention all-region honors in 2010.

Nelson mentored Esmie Gonzales who earned All-Newcomer, Second-Team and three First-Team All-OVC honors between 2016 and 2019. Gonzales was named to the OVC All-Tournament team in both 2017 and 2019. She ranks among SEMO's top five career leaders in goals (28, t-2nd), points (68, t-3rd) and field minutes played (5,612, 5th). The Fort Worth, Texas, native holds the record for shots (223) and is tied for first in game-winning goals (12) and shots on goal (109).

Nelson's teams have also performed extremely well in the classroom, posting a 3.3 grade point average or higher in each of her 20 years leading the program.

For the 2013-14 academic

year, the Redhawks posted a 3.72 cumulative grade point average as a team, ranking second nationally out of 323 NCAA Division I soccer programs. The Redhawks posted the third-highest Division I GPA the year prior.

Nelson's student-athletes have earned CoSIDA Academic All-District VII honors on seven occasions. She has also coached 68 OVC Medal of Honor recipients. The Redhawks have earned the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Team Academic Award in seven-consecutive seasons.

Morgan McCourt was awarded the Department of Economics' Outstanding Overall Student Award from the Southeast Missouri State University Harrison College of Business during the 2020-21 academic year. Kate Daus was also awarded the Southeast Missouri State University Department of Communication Studies Public Advocacy Award.

Before Southeast Missouri

Prior to building the Redhawks soccer program, Nelson coached at Florida State from 1995-98, helping lay the foundation for the Seminoles in an extremely competitive Atlantic Coast Conference. Nelson's 1996 and 1997 teams finished with the ACC's second-best GPA.

Nelson coached the 1986 age group Missouri Olympic Development Program (ODP) team to the 2003 Midwest Region II Championship and represented Region II at the 2004 ODP National Championship.

A former member of Canada's national team pool, Nelson was a four-year starter at the University of Saskatchewan.

After earning her Physical Education degree in 1992, Nelson went on to get her "B" license and coaching diploma at the National Coaching Institute at the University of Victoria in 1993. At the time, Nelson held the distinction of being one of only five Canadian female coaches qualified to coach at the national team level.

Heather Nelson and her husband, Paul Nelson, the Associate Head Coach at Southeast Missouri, have four children, Jordan, Taylor, Justi and Chase. Their daughter, Taylor, is a junior on the Redhawks soccer team, while their oldest daughter, Jordan, is a SEMO soccer alumna.

associate head coach. Paul
and his wife Heather Nelson,
head coach of the Southeast
women's soccer team, have built
the Redhawk women's soccer
program from the ground up
since its inception in 1999.

Nelson has drawn on his extensive playing and coaching experience from every level – juniors to professional – providing plenty of valuable guidance along the way.

Together with his wife, the Nelsons have built a program on the foundation of quality student-athletes. In 22 seasons, the Redhawks have compiled a .584 winning percentage going 205-138-55. SEMO's Ohio Valley Conference record is an even more impressive 100-53-34 (.626).

He helped lead the Redhawks to Ohio Valley Conference regular season championships in 2001, 2002, 2007, 2011, 2014 and 2019. Southeast also registered back-to-back OVC Tournament titles and NCAA Women's Soccer Cup appearances in 2006 and 2007.

Prior to Southeast, Nelson spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Florida State and two years at the Canadian western-based National Training Center. In addition, he was an assistant coach for Canada's Olympic team in 1994.

Nelson first entered the professional ranks in 1977 and enjoyed 13 competitive seasons at that level. He played in the once-heralded North American Soccer League (NASL) during both the indoor and outdoor seasons and competed in the Irish Premier Division.

Nelson signed with the NASL's Vancouver Whitecaps at the

age of 18, where he had the opportunity to play with and against some of the best players in the world, including Pelé, Franz Beckenbauer and Johan Cryuff.

In 2011, Nelson, his teammates and staff from the Whitecaps were inducted into the Soccer Hall of Fame and Museum as the 1979 Whitecaps earned the 2011 Team of Distinction Award. The Whitecaps went 20-10 that season and claimed the NASL's Soccer Bowl with a 2-1 win over the Tampa Bay Rowdies in front of 66,843 fans at Giants Stadium in East Rutherford, New Jersey.

As a staff coach for British
Columbia Soccer, Nelson
boasted one of the best amateur
soccer coaching records in
Canada. His coaching successes
include gold medals from
the 1991 Western Canadian
Championships and the 1993
Canada Matches.

In 1999, Nelson served as

coach of the American Soccer League's Vancouver 86ers reserve team.

He and his wife, Heather, have four children, Jordan, Taylor, Justi and Chase. Their daughter, Taylor, is a junior on the Redhawks soccer team, while their oldest daughter, Jordan, is a SEMO soccer alumna.

he 2021 season marks the first for Esmie Gonzales as the Graduate Assistant on the Redhawks soccer staff.

Gonzales spent four years at Southeast Missouri and set multiple records in a Redhawks uniform. She was a three-time All-OVC First Team selection during her four years and also garnered All-OVC Second Team and All-Newcomer Team honors.

Gonzales finished her career with the Redhawks with 28 goals and 12 assists. She tied the program record in game winning goals (12), and single-handedly holds the record for shots attempted (223) and shots on goal (109).

In her final season with the Redhawks, Gonzales helped lead the Redhawks to their first OVC title since 2014. She had four goals and four assists with 37 shots and a pair of game winning goals.

As a junior, Gonzales started in all 18 games and led the team

with 10 goals and 20 points. She recorded a career-high 10 shots at SIUE on October 14.

In 2017, Gonzales led the team with eight goals and 72 shots. She averaged 3.6 shots per game after starting in 20 matches.

As a freshman, Gonzales earned Second-Team All-OVC and All-Newcomer Team honors after scoring six goals and five assists. She played in all 15 matches, starting in 14 as a rookie.

Gonzales graduated from Southeast Missouri in 2020 with a Bachelor's of Science in Recreation and Park Administration.

Prior to SEMO, Gonzales competed four years at South Hills High School. She finished her career with 316 goals, which ranks as the nation's top goal scorer for both girl's and boy's soccer. Gonzales topped the previous national record of 286.

Gonzales captured the

national and Texas singleseason goals record with 109 as a senior. She averaged 3.1 goals per game and had a total of 66 assists.

Gonzales was named district MVP, First-Team All-District and Super Team all four of her high school seasons.

Lindsay PickeringClass of 2015

Lindsay Pickering (Soccer, 2005-07/ Softball, 2004-07) was a two-sport athlete at Southeast Missouri, excelling as a member of the women's soccer and softball teams.

In soccer, Pickering was a two-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year, winning the coveted honor in 2005 and 2007. She earned First-Team All-OVC accolades each of those seasons and was a second-team pick in 2006. A three-year starting goalkeeper, Pickering ranks as Southeast's career leader in shutouts (28), wins (34), and minutes played (5,233).

In softball, she was a four-year starting outfielder from 2004-07.

Pickering was named Second-Team All-OVC in 2006 and landed a spot on the All-OVC Tournament Team in both 2004 and 2005.

She was the first soccer player and 18th mulit-sport athlete to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.



Beth GuccioneClass of 2019

Beth Guccione (Soccer, 1999, 2001) was the first soccer only player inducted into the SEMO Athletics Hall of Fame.

She was the 2001 OVC Player of the Year and was a two-time First-Team All-OVC selection in her career.

Guccione ranks among the school's top five career leaders in five categories and established three single-season records. She was SEMO's starting goalkeeper when the school first began its women's soccer program in 1999.

She served an assistant coach for Women's Soccer from 2002-2005.

2021 SOUTHEAST MISSOURI SOCCER GUIDE OVC HISTORY

Now in its 74th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles "Turkey" Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged February 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958 Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961 Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

After Title IX legislation passed in 1972, women's athletics began a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC began formulating plans for women's athletics in 1975 and established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982. The conference added women's golf and softball in 1994 and women's soccer in 1998.

In 2007 the Conference had two teams in the NCAA Women's Soccer Tournament for the first time in league history, as former OVC member Samford earned an at-large selection while Southeast Missouri was the Conference's automatic bid.

Former Austin Peay standout and 2012 OVC Soccer Player of the Year Tatiana Ariza represented her native country of Colombia in both the 2012 Summer Olympics in London (earning a start against the United States) as well as the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup. In the 2015 event she assisted on the first World Cup goal in her country's history and in the following match helped her team to a 2-0 victory over France, giving Colombia its first-ever win at the event.

In 2016 SIUE turned in a major upset in the first round of the NCAA Division

I Soccer Championship, advancing on penalty kicks 5-4 over No. 11-ranked Notre Dame. The Cougars became just the second OVC team to advance to the second round (joining Samford who topped Vanderbilt on penalty kicks in 2005).

In March 2020 due to the COVID-19 public health emergency, spring sports were canceled across the OVC and the NCAA (including all winter and spring NCAA Championships). Conference play for Fall 2020 sports (football, soccer, volleyball, cross country) was pushed to the spring which saw every OVC Championship successfully completed in just a 112-day span (and all but one taking place in a 90-day span).

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 298 student-athletes honored with the award.

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national

issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

Additionally, the OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track, volleyball and beach volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Belmont University, Eastern Illinois University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin. The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is an affiliate member for the sport of beach volleyball.






