Preseason favorite Southeast MIssouri (14-5) begins Ohio Valley Conference play when it hosts SIU Edwardsville (10-8) in a three-game series this weekend. First pitch of the series is set for 6 p.m., CT Friday at Capaha Field.

"Fill The Hill" Fridays

A Southeast Missouri baseball tradition returns this 2022 season. The Redhawks have partnered with Kohlfeld Distributing to bring back tailgate days to Capaha Field as part of "Fill the Hill" Fridays. Dates for the special event include Mar. 26 (vs. SIUE), Apr. 8 (vs. Murray State), Apr. 22 (vs. Morehead State) and May 13 (vs. UT Martin). Kohlfeld Distributing will provide complimentary adult beverages to fans who provide proof of legal consuming age on those dates.

Series History

The Redhawks are 22-9 all-time against SIU Edwardsville. Southeast Missouri went 12-5 in the last 17 matchups between the clubs. SEMO and SIUE started Ohio Valley Conference play against each other a year ago. The Redhawks took two of three from the Cougars on Mar. 12-13 in Edwardsville, Illinois.

OVC Openers

Southeast Missouri is 18-12 all-time in Ohio Valley Conference openers. That mark includes a 3-2 record under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO has opened conference play with a win in three of its last four seasons.

Quite an OVC Start

As a league, the Ohio Valley Conference has won 56.8 percent of its baseball games this 2022 season. Combined, the conference is

99-75 through games of Mar. 22. Five teams have 13 or more wins, including Southeast Missouri (14), Tennessee Tech (14), Belmont (14), Eastern Illinois (13) and Murray State (13). SIU Edwardsville has 10 wins, as well.

Best Start in Division I Era

The Redhawks began the 2022 season at 13-1, their best start in their NCAA Division I era. Southeast Missouri moved to the D-I ranks in 1992. SEMO's 13-1 start tied with the 1973 team which also won 13 of its first 14 contests.

RPI Update

Southeast Missouri enters the weekend with a RPI rating of 52. SEMO currently holds the highest RPI of any team in the Ohio Valley Conference. The Redhawks ranked as high as 45th earlier this season. This year is the highest SEMO has ranked in RPI under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. The Redhawks other RPI rankings with Sawyers at the helm include 87th (2021), 136th (2017), 200th (2018, 2020) and 259th (2019).

Perfect at Home

Southeast Missouri is undefeated at home with a 10-0 record this season. SEMO won 12 of its last 13 matchups at Capaha Field dating back to the 2021 campaign. The Redhawks are 81-41 at home under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. The most home victories by a Sawyers coached team stands at 18 in both 2017 and 2018, his first two years as SEMO's skipper. The Redhawks last won their first 10 home games in a season during the 2000 campaign. That team went undefeated through its first 12 home matchups. This year marks SEMO's first 10-game home winning streak in six years. The 2016 club won 13 in a row at home. The Redhawks and Eastern Illinois are the only Ohio Valley Conference schools with no home losses this year.

Graber Rises

Outfielder Brett Graber took over as Southeast Missouri's leading hitter with a .375 batting average after a strong series against Missouri State (Mar. 19-20). Graber hit .454 (5-for-11) with two runs scored, one RBI, a double and two walks in three starts against the Bears. He had multiple hits in each of the first two games of the series. Graber has also reached base in all 19 games this season.

OVC Slate

The 24-game Ohio Valley Conference slate for the reigning OVC Champion and preseason favorite Southeast Missouri baseball team starts with SIU Edwardsville this weekend. The rest of the league schedule includes home series with Murray State (Apr. 8-10), Morehead State (Apr. 22-24) and UT Martin (May 13-15). SEMO's OVC road schedule consists of Austin Peay (Apr. 1-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 14-16), Belmont (Apr. 29-May 1) and Eastern Illinois (May 19-21).

Power Matchup

SIU Edwardsville and Southeast Missouri are ranked second and third in the Ohio Valley Conference in home runs, respectively. SIUE is second in the league with 38 round-trippers and SEMO follows close behind with 35.

Tennessee Tech leads the OVC with 39 homers.

Yard Work

Southeast Missouri has homered in 16 of its 19 games and hit a series-best 10 round-trippers vs. Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). SEMO finished with a season-high five home runs in two games --vs. Bradley (Mar. 4); vs. Valparaiso (Mar. 13). Twenty-four of the Redhawks home runs have come against Missouri Valley Conference teams.

Single-Season Home Run Marks

With its 35 home runs already this season, Southeast Missouri is only three away from surpassing its total of 37 in 52 games a year ago. The single-season school record during SEMO's NCAA Division I era is 92 home runs in 2000. The most home runs hit in a season under Head Coach Andy Sawyers stand at 54 by his first SEMO team in 2017. Here are the Redhawks top-five single-season home run marks since they turned Division I in 1991-92.

Winning Streak Ends at 11

Southeast Missouri saw its 11-game winning streak end when it fell to Indiana State, 10-1, on Mar. 15. The winning streak was SEMO's longest since it won 11 in a row (Mar. 18-Apr. 5) during the 2016 campaign. At the time, it was the third-longest winning streak in NCAA Division I baseball this year.

Against the Missouri Valley

Southeast Missouri has faced all eight Missouri Valley Conference baseball schools in its program history. The Redhawks are 56-86 all-time against MVC teams in their NCAA Division I era. Missouri State is the fifth of six MVC schools SEMO will face in 2022. The Redhawks are currently 9-5 against the MVC after winning two of three at then-#22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 18-20), sweeping both Bradley (Mar. 4-5) and Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13), losing two at Indiana State (Mar. 15-16) and dropping two of three at Missouri State (Mar. 19-20). SEMO also plays a home-and-home series against regional-rival Southern Illinois this year.

Series Wins

The Redhawks claimed wins in 17 of their last 20 series dating back to their COVID-shortened 2020 campaign. At one time, Southeast Missouri posted 11-consecutive series wins during that stretch.

Get Out the Brooms!

The Redhawks have swept in three of their first four series this season. Southeast Missouri posted three-straight series sweeps vs. Bellarmine (Feb. 26), Bradley (Mar. 4-5) and Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). All of those came at Capaha Field. The last time SEMO completed three-straight series sweeps was in 2016 (Morehead State, UT Martin, SIU Edwardsville). The three series sweeps are tied for most in a season under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO also had three sweeps in 2017 and 2018. In all, the Redhawks have 11 series sweeps with Sawyers at the helm. SEMO did not sweep one opponent during its 2021 season.

Great Work Williams

Right-hander Austin Williams picked up his first two wins of the season out of the bullpen for Southeast Missouri last week. Williams struck out four, walked none and allowed just one hit in 3.1 scoreless innings to get his first win at Arkansas State (Mar. 8). He then struck out a career-high seven in the longest outing of his career (five innings) to beat Valparaiso (Mar. 13). Williams retired seven-straight Valpo hitters exiting the game in the ninth. For the week, he went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA, allowed just one run, scattered four hits, struck out 11 and walked one in two relief appearances.

They Did That Twice?

In each of the final two games of its series against Valparaiso (Mar. 13), Southeast Missouri homered three times and scored six runs in an inning. SEMO trailed, 6-3, in game one before Peyton Leeper, Tyler Wilber and Lincoln Andrews homered in the bottom of the fourth. That six-run inning lifted the Redhawks to a 16-6 win as SEMO scored the final 13 runs of the game. In game two, the Redhawks were down, 3-0, when Jevon Mason, Wilber and Brett Graber homered as part of a six-run third inning. SEMO later won that contest by a score of 10-8. The Redhawks fell behind in the first inning during every game against Valparaiso before sweeping the series with three comefrom-behind victories.

Quick to 10 Wins

With its 14-6 road win at Sun Belt Conference member Arkansas State (Mar. 8), the Redhawks picked up their 10th victory of the season. Southeast Missouri became the third Ohio Valley Conference team to get to 10 wins this year joining Tennessee Tech and Belmont. SEMO's climb to 10 wins came 12 days sooner than it did a year ago. In 2021, the Redhawks earned their 10th victory on Mar. 20.

Atop the OVC

As a team, Southeast Missouri leads the Ohio Valley Conference RBI (159) and walks (122). Brett Graber is first among league leaders in on-base percentage (.529), Tyler Wilber is first in RBI (32) and Jevon Mason (20) tops the conference in walks.

Seeing Double

The Redhawks scored double-digit runs nine times this season. Southeast Missouri scored 10 or more runs in seven consecutive games for the first time in program history from Feb. 27-Mar. 8. The Redhawks rank second in the Ohio Valley Conference and 27th in the nation with 171 runs.

Power Outage

Nine different players have homered for Southeast Missouri this season. Tyler Wilber leads the Redhawks with eight home runs, while Jevon Mason and Peyton Leeper follow with six and five, respectively. Andrew Keck has four, Brett Graber, Lincoln Andrews and Joel Vaske all have three, Ty Stauss has two and Ben Palmer has one.

Streak Intact

Brett Graber is reached base in 19-consecutive games to start the 2022 campaign. It's the longest reached base streak since his fellow teammate reached base in 23-straight games during the 2021 season.

Leeper Tabbed OVC Player of the Week

Southeast Missouri utility player Peyton Leeper won Southeast Missouri's first Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Week honor of the 2022 season on Mar. 14. A native of Mokane, Missouri, Leeper homered in all four of his starts last week helping the Redhawks extend their winning streak to 11 games. He broke SEMO's series-opener against Valparaiso (Mar. 12) open with a grand slam, the first of his career. Leeper then homered in both games of the series-ending doubleheader against the Beacons the following day. His second round-tripper that day was a game-winning two-run homer in the bottom of the eighth inning during the nightcap. Leeper's other home run for the week came in a midweek matchup at Arkansas State (Mar. 8). In the Valparaiso series alone, Leeper finished with three home runs, six runs scored and nine RBI. For the week, he hit .353 with four of his six hits coming via the long ball. He scored nine times, had 10 RBI, boasted a 1.059 slugging percentage, recorded a .500 on-base percentage and was a perfect 3-of-3 in stolen bases. Leeper carries a six-game hitting streak into this week's action. Leeper won the award

for the first time in his career. UT Martin righthander Rhett Fetner (Pitcher of the Week) rounded out the week's honorees.

Wilber Clears 200 Hits

Tyler Wilber went over 200 career hits in the Redhawks series sweep of Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). Wilber hit a team-high .500 in the series. He had four runs, six hits, three home runs, seven RBI and a 1.250 slugging percentage against the Beacons. Wilber got his 200th career hit on a two-out single in the bottom of the eighth inning during game two of the series. He now has 208 hits in his career.

Over 150

Andrew Keck (155) surpassed 150 hits in his career against Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). Keck hit .357 with a run scored, home run and two RBI against the Beacons. He is SEMO's top hitter with a .375 batting average and is the second player on this year's team to reach 150 or more hits joining Tyler Wilber (208).

NCAA Division I Rankings (Top-20)

As of games through Mar. 22, the Redhawks rank among the top 20 NCAA Division I teams in home runs (11th, 35), home runs per game (11th, 1.84), walks (12th, 122) and scoring (16th, 9 rpg). Individually, Jevon Mason is eighth in runs (29) and runs per game (1.5), and 16th in both walks (20) and walks per game (1.0), Noah Niznik is 19th in games started (5), Tyler Wilber is seventh in RBI per game (1.7), ninth in RBI (32) and 19th in home runs (8).

Stealing the Show

Andrew Keck is a perfect 6-of-6 on the basepaths this season. Keck has 40 stolen bases and is now ninth on Southeast Missouri's all-time career stolen base list.

Midweek Games

Southeast Missouri scored in every inning en route to blowing out Saint Louis, 16-5, in its first midweek game of the season on Mar. 1. SEMO established season-highs in runs (16) and hits (16) against the Billikens. SEMO also beat Arkansas State (Mar. 8), 14-6, on the road. The Redhawks are 2-2 in midweek action this year.

Graber Goes Off

Outfielder Brett Graber hit a series best .455 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs and eight RBI in Southeast Missouri's threegame set vs. Bradley (Mar. 4-5). Graber went 5-for-11 at the plate. He also walked twice, boasted a 1.182 slugging percentage and finished with a .538 on-base percentage against the Braves.

Double-Digit Hits

Southeast Missouri registered double-digit hits in 10 games. SEMO is undefeated at 10-0 in games when it gets 10 or more hits. It finished with a season-high 16 hits vs. Saint Louis (Mar. 1) and Valparaiso (Mar. 13).

RBI Guys

Tyler Wilber and Andrew Keck are first and sixth in the Ohio Valley Conference with 32 and 23 RBI, respectively. Jevon Mason (19) is tied for 10th among league leaders in that category, as well.

Huge Week for Keck

Andrew Keck hit safely in three of Southeast Missouri's four wins last week. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, Keck opened the week by going 4-for-5 with a double, grand slam, career-high four runs and career-best seven RBI vs. Saint Louis (Mar. 1). The grand slam was Keck's second of the season that came in a three-day span. He also went 3-for-4 with two runs and one RBI vs. Bradley (Mar. 5) after finishing with two hits and two RBI the day before against the Braves. SEMO swept BU for its second series sweep of the season. For the week. Keck hit .563 (9-for-16) with nine runs, a double, grand slam, 11 RBI, three stolen bases and three walks. He boasted a .813 slugging percentage and .600 on-base percentage, as

Career Day for Keck

Catcher Andrew Keck went 4-for-5 with a grand slam, double, two singles, four runs scored, two stolen bases and seven RBI to lead Southeast Missouri to its win over Saint Louis (Mar. 1). Keck hit safely in each of his first three at-bats. His four runs and seven RBI are new career-highs, while his four hits match a career-best. Keck leads the team with a .412 batting average.

Grand Slamming

Andrew Keck hit his second grand slam in three days against Saint Louis (Mar. 1). Keck launched his team-high third home run of the season over the left field wall in the bottom of the sixth inning. He smashed his first career grand slam to help send Southeast Missouri to a 10-2 win over Bellarmine (Feb. 27). That round-tripper came in the bottom of the first inning against the Knights.

Mason Plays Strong

Leadoff man Jevon Mason is Southeast Missouri's third-leading hitter with a .338 batting average. Mason ranks second on the team in runs (26), doubles (6) and home runs (6), and is third in RBI (19). He boasts a teamhigh .701 slugging percentage and is second with a .469 on-base percentage through 19 starts.

Walk-Off Win

First baseman Lincoln Andrews snapped a 7-7 tie with a leadoff walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th inning to give Southeast Missouri an 8-7 come-from-behind win in its series-opener vs. Bellarmine (Feb. 26). The walk-off hit is the first of Andrews' career.

Over .300

Southeast Missouri has four players hitting over .300 through 19 games this season.

Brett Graber leads the team with a .375 clip, while Andrew Keck (.355), Jevon Mason (.338), and Tyler Wilber (.312) follow. Those four players have accounted for 47 percent of the Redhawks scoring output.

Extra Innings

Three of Southeast Missouri's games this season have gone to extra innings. The Redhawks are 3-0 in such games after beating #22 Dallas Baptist, 7-6, in 12 innings (Feb. 18) and, 6-5, in 10 innings (Feb. 19), and Bellarmine, 8-7, in 11 innings (Feb. 26). SEMO played seven extra inning games in 2021 (4-3).

Walk This Way

Southeast Missouri players hold four of the first six spots among Ohio Valley Conference leaders in walks. Jevon Mason (1st, 20), Peyton Leeper (2nd, 19), Brett Graber (5th, 17) and Tyler Wilber (6th, 16) occupy those places. Those four are responsible for 72 of SEMO's league-leading 122 bases on balls.

Early and Often

Southeast Missouri has jumped on oppoents early through its first 19 games this season. In the first four innings alone, SEMO has scored a combined 92 runs, including 22 in the first, 18 in the second, 37 in the third and 15 in the fourth. Fifty-three percent of the Redhawks runs have come in the first four innings of play. SEMO is outscoring opponents 92-75 in that span.

Six-Inning Starts

Left-hander Noah Niznik and right-hander Jason Rackers are the first starting pitchers to work six innings this season. Niznik went six innings to beat Bellarmine for his first win on Feb. 27 allowing just one run on five hits. He also struck out two and walked one in his longest start since pitching seven innings in a no-decision vs. Austin Peay (Mar. 20, 2021). Rackers picked up his second victory of the year after scattering four hits, giving up three runs and striking out four in six innings at Missouri State (Mar. 19).

What a Weekend!

The Redhawks used a pair of extra inning victories to win their season-opening series on the road at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 18-20). Southeast Missouri stunned the Patriots with 7-6 win in 12 innings on Feb. 18, a game that lasted four-and-a-half-hours. In less than 24 hours, the Redhawks turned around to come-from-behind and beat DBU, 6-5, in 10 innings during another one-run affair. SEMO claimed a series win against a ranked opponent for only the second time in program history. The Redhawks also took two of three at then-#16 Alabama to open the 2009 campaign.

Home-Openers

Southeast Missouri improved to 21-10 all-time in home-openers in its NCAA Division I era (since 1992). The Redhawks are now 4-2 in such games under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. Sawyers' home-opening wins came in 2022 (8-7, vs. Bellarmine), 2017 (22-2, vs. Western Illinois), 2019 (5-1, vs. Western Michigan) and 2021 (4-3, vs. Illinois State).

Miller Named OVC Pitcher of the Week

Southeast Missouri sophomore right-hander Kyle Miller won the first Ohio Valley Conference Pitcher of the Week award of the 2022 season on Feb. 21. Miller picked up his first win of the season at #22 Dallas Baptist on Feb. 18. He came out of the bullpen to toss six scoreless innings to help lead the Redhawks to a 12-inning one-run upset of the nationally-ranked Patriots. Miller struck out four, walked two and allowed only three hits in his first appearance of the year as SEMO posted a series win against a ranked opponent for only the second time in program history.

Ranked Teams Fall on Opening Day

#22 Dallas Baptist was one of six ranked teams to lose on opening day. Southeast Missouri edged the Patriots, 7-6, in 12 innings on Feb. 18. The win snapped an eight-game losing streak against ranked opponents for the Redhawks and marked their first victory over a ranked foe since Apr. 29, 2018 (10-6, vs. #20 Tennessee Tech). After getting two wins against the Patriots, Andy Sawyers now has a total of three victories over ranked teams as SEMO's head coach.

Vote-Getters

Southeast Missouri was one of two Ohio Valley Conference teams receiving votes in this week's National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Poll on Feb. 21. Dallas Baptist, which was ranked #22 entering the 2022 season, dropped out of the poll after losing two of three in its season-opening series against the Redhawks.

Redhawk Debuts

Nine players, including Spencer Parker, Joel Vaske, Ryan Malzahn, Ben Palmer, Wyatt Grant, Jason Rackers, Tommy Windt, Ethan Osborne and Anthony Klein made their Southeast Missouri debuts during opening weekend at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 18-20). Palmer started three games at second base and Vaske saw action in all three contests and logged two starts. Rackers also struck out six in 5.2 innings during SEMO's game two win on Feb. 19.

Clutch Hits

Down, 3-1, with one out in the top of the ninth inning of game two at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 19), pinch-hitter Joel Vaske hit a three-run home run to put the Redhawks ahead. SEMO scored four runs in the inning to grab a 5-3 advantage. After DBU hit a two-run home run to send the game to extra innings in the bottom

of the ninth, Brett Graber hit a two-out single to score Andrew Keck for the game-winner. Keck doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored the winning run on Graber's hit. Vaske hit .333 with two extra base hits, two runs, four RBI, a .788 slugging percentage and .455 on-base percentage in his first three games as a Redhawk.

Season-Openers

Southeast Missouri improved to 13-18 all-time in season-openers during its NCAA Division I era (since 1992). SEMO is now 4-2 in such games under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO beat Western Michigan at home in 2019, UT Arlington in Nacogdoches, Texas in 2017, South Alabama in Mobile, Alabama in 2021 and #22 Dallas Baptist in Dallas, Texas for Sawyers' season-opening victories.

Season 64

The 2022 campaign marks Southeast Missouri's 64th year of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 31st season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,408-1,144 all-time and 874-757-1 at the NCAA Division I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 432-294-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won five OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2021), four OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016, 2021) and made four NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016, 2021) in program history.

OVC Preseason Favorite

Southeast Missouri was tabbed the preseason favorite in the 2022 Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Preseason Poll on Feb. 10. The reigning OVC regular-season and tournament champion, SEMO received eight of the possible 18 first-place nods in the overall voting by league Head Coaches and Communication Directors. SEMO accumulated a total of 114 points, while Murray State - which the Redhawks beat to win the OVC Tournament crown in 2021 - was picked second with four first-place votes and 104 points. Morehead State (93 pts.), Austin Peay (87 pts.) and Belmont (86 pts.) round out the top five, while SIU Edwardsville (55 pts.), Eastern Illinois (50 pts.), Tennessee Tech (43 pts.) and UT Martin (16 pts.) complete the nine-team predicted order of finish.



2022 Redhawks

The Redhawks 2022 roster consists of 38 players, including four seniors, 16 juniors, nine sophomores and nine freshmen. Southeast Missouri returns five position starters and two starting pitchers. SEMO also has each of its top five hitters back from last season.

Wilber Named OVC Preseason Player of the Year

Senior shortstop Tyler Wilber was voted the 2022 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Player of the Year. A native of Los Alamitos, California, Wilber started all 52 games last season. A Second-Team All-OVC pick, he was Southeast Missouri's leading hitter witha .378 batting average. Wilber also led the Redhawks in RBI (49), total bases (109), slugging percentage (.542), and hits (76). He finished the regular-season with a league-best .400 batting average. Additionally, Wilber was a semifinalist for the Brooks Wallace Award.

Batting Titles

Tyler Wilber won the Ohio Valley Conference regular-season batting title twice in his career to date. Wilber was hitting .400 at the end of regular-season play in 2021 and hit .383 during the 2019 campaign.

What a Career!

Tyler Wilber is in his fourth-year as Southeast Missouri's starting shortstop. Wilber has a career batting average of .374. His batting average is the second-highest in a career among players in SEMO's NCAA Division I era behind Todd Shylanski (.387, 1991-92). Wilber ranks fourth all-time among the Redhawks career leaders in batting average and sixth in on-base percentage (.467). He has 208 hits, 123 runs, 44 doubles, six triples, 19 home runs and 133 RBI in 143 starts.

Mason Secures Preseason All-OVC Honors

Left fielder Jevon Mason joined Tyler Wilber on this year's Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Mason, who hails from West Des Moines, Iowa, made the league's All-Tournament Team in his first year as a Redhawk in 2021. He ranked second on the team with a .350 batting average behind Wilber. Mason led Southeast Missouri with 14 doubles and boasted a team-best .447 on-base percentage.

143 and Counting

Tyler Wilber has never missed a start in his Southeast Missouri career. The shortstop has started 143 consecutive games as the most experienced player on the roster. Wilber committed only nine errors in 52 starts at short in 2021.

From Walk-On to Scholarship

What a rookie season right-hander Kyle Miller had for Southeast Missouri in 2021. Miller, who joined the team as a walk-on, compiled a 4-2 record in 20 appearances and five starts. He rated third on the team with 52 strikeouts in 51.1 innings. Miller picked up his first career save on six outs in the Redhawks season-opening win at South Alabama a year ago and then finished his freshman year by throwing a complete game two-hitter with 10 strikeouts in the Redhawks Ohio Valley Conference Tournament Championship win over Murray State. Miller begins his 2022 campaign as a scholarship player.

Newcomer Talent

Outfielder Josh Cameron, infielder Ben Palmer. pitcher Jason Rackers, outfielder Joel Vaske and utility player Tommy Windt are some of the high-impact newcomers on Southeast Missouri's roster this season. Cameron was a First-Team National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) All-American at Butler Community College in 2021. He finished his career as one of the best junior college power hitters in the country. Cameron hit .412 and ranked second in the NJCAA with 25 home runs. Palmer was the 2021 NJCAA Division I ABCA/Rawlings Gold Glove winner at Iowa Western Community College. Vaske earned Third-Team NJCAA All-America accolades at Kirkwood CC and Rackers, who joins the Redhawks from SEC member Tennessee, is among the top 2022 Draft Prospects in the Ohio Valley Conference according to Baseball America. Windt secured Second-Team NJCAA Division I All-America laurels as a designated hitter at South Suburban College.

2022 Schedule

A 55-game schedule with 25 matchups at Capaha Field is in store for the Southeast Missouri baseball team this upcoming 2022 season. SEMO opens its season with a three-game series at reigning Missouri Valley Conference regular-season and tournament champion Dallas Baptist on Feb. 18-20. DBU is one of four NCAA Tournament teams from last season included on the Redhawks 2022 docket. Southeastern Conference member Ole Miss, which hosted the NCAA Regional SEMO played in during the 2021 campaign, will welcome the Redhawks for a midweek tilt on Apr. 19. Indiana State and Oklahoma State are the other 2021 NCAA Tournament participants. SEMO heads to ISU for a two-game set on Mar. 15-16 and travels to OSU (May 6-8) for its final non-conference series. OSU was runner-up in the Big 12 Conference Tournament last season. The Redhawks also face Kentucky (Feb. 22), Bellarmine, Saint Louis (Mar. 1, Mar. 29), Bradley (Mar. 4-6), Arkansas State (Mar. 8, Apr. 5), Valparaiso (Mar. 11-13), Missouri State (Mar. 18-20, May 10) and Southern Illinois (Apr. 12, Apr. 26) in non-conference action. SEMO hosts Bellarmine in its home-opening weekend on Feb. 25-27. The Redhawks 24-game Ohio Valley Conference schedule begins with a home series against SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27). Murray State (Apr. 8-10), Morehead State (Apr. 22-24) and UT Martin (May 13-15) round out SEMO's home OVC foes. SEMO will make trips to Austin Peay (Apr. 1-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 14-16), Belmont (Apr. 29-May 1) and Eastern Illinois (May 19-21) for its four conference road series.

OVC Tournament Moves to Lexington

For the first time in 2022, the OVC Baseball Championship will be held at the Lexington Legends Ballpark in Lexington, Kentucky on May 25-28. Since 2001, the Championship has been held at four other neutral locations, including Paducah, Kentucky (2001-09), Jackson, Tennessee (2010-16, 2021), Oxford, Alabama (2017-18) and Marion, Illinois (2019).



ndy Sawyers is the reigning Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year after leading Southeast Missouri to the league's regularseason and tournament titles, and the program's fourth NCAA Tournament berth in 2021.

Sawyers looks to carry the momentume into the 2022 campaign, his sixth year as SEMO's head coach.

The Redhawks finished their championship season with an overall 30-22 record and 17-10 in the OVC. SEMO recorded 30 wins in a season for the first time with Sawyers at the helm and posted series wins in eight of its nine series against league foes in 2021.

Sawyers coached his first OVC Specialty Award-Winner when left-hander Dylan Dodd was tabbed the league's Pitcher of the Year.

Dodd later became the

highest draft pick in program history when he was selected in the third round by the Atlanta Braves in the 2021 Major League Draft. Additionally, Dodd wrapped up his final college season as a Second-Team Collegiate Baseball All-American.

Statistically, SEMO led the OVC with 14 saves and a .967 fielding percentage after committing just 49 errors in 52 contests. The Redhawks were also second in the conference in wins as their 30 victories marked the most in a season in five years.

In 2020, SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in OVC play when its season abruptly ended due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in

batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits (6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a league-high with 29 hits when play was suspended. Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Before they took the field in 2019, the Redhawks ushered in a state-of-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-tiem stats and performance metrics.

SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber

and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480).

Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers, including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and nine NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 40 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and nine top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman Josh Rolette who garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American honors in 2016. He also helped mentor Jake Scudder who was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. The Wildcats had three studentathletes on the All-Big 12 Teams that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to

stolen bases as the 149 steals were second-most in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399).

Before K-State, Sawyers spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American.

Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008, Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips to the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance at the 2005 College World Series. Sawyers, who lettered two years at Nebraska, worked with 12 Huskers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Alex

Collegiate Baseball.

After working as the volunteer assistant at Nebraska in 2000, Sawyers worked the 2001 and 2002 seasons as head coach at Hutchinson Community College, compiling an 87-30 record and two postseason berths. In 2001, the Dragons went 40-16 and won the Jayhawk West Sub-Regional, while the 2002 squad set a school record with 47 wins and was ranked as high as seventh by the NJCAA.

Sawyers' coaching career began at Northwestern (La.)

State in 1999 as a volunteer assistant coach, helping the Demons finish second in the Southland Conference.

He first played collegiately at Point Loma (Calif.) Nazarene College in 1994. Following a year off, he played at Mendocino (Calif.) Junior College in 1996 before finishing up his playing career at Nebraska.

A native of Willits, California, Sawyers received his bachelor (1998) and master's (2000) degrees from Nebraska. He is married to the former Dena Lindeblad and the couple have two sons, Andrew James (A.J.) and Alex.
