Redhawks Travel to Tennessee Tech

Southeast Missouri (23-8, 7-2) travels to Tennessee Tech (18-12, 2-4) for a three-game series prior to the Easter holiday. SEMO and TTU will open their series at 6 p.m., CT Thursday.

Series History

Thursday's series-opener marks the 97th meeting between Southeast Missouri and Tennessee Tech. SEMO leads the all-time series, 55-41. The Redhawks won the series a year ago, taking two of three games in Cape Girardeau. SEMO's last series win in Cookeville came in 2014.

23 Wins

Southeast Missouri leads the Ohio Valley Conference with 23 wins this season. SEMO is one of three teams in the league with over 20 victories. Eastern Illinois (22-8) and Belmont (21-12) are the others. The Redhawks eight losses are tied for fewest in the OVC with EIU.

SEMO is 18th in the nation with a .742 winning percentage.

First Home Loss

The Redhawks saw a program record 17-game home winning streak end with its first loss at Capaha Field Tuesday. Southeast Missouri dropped a tight 3-2 contest to longtime rival Southern Illinois in the 91st meeting between the teams. It was the first time SEMO fell at home since May 21, 2021 (9-2, vs. UT Martin). The 17-game stretch was the second-longest home winning streak in the nation.

That Was Fast

With its win over Arkansas State on Apr. 5, Southeast Missouri reached 20 wins in a season quicker than it has ever done under

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Head Coach Andy Sawyers. The Redhawks 20th win came 25 days sooner than it did a year ago (Apr. 30, 2021). SEMO is one of 31 NCAA Division I teams with 23 or more victories this year.

Second in the OVC

The Redhawks are tied for second in the Ohio Valley Conference standings with Belmont. Both teams are 7-2 in conference play thus far. The seven league victories lead the OVC.

Great at Home

Southeast Missouri is 17-1 at home this season. The Redhawks won 19 of their last 21 matchups at Capaha Field dating back to the 2021 campaign. SEMO is 88-42 at home under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. One more win will match the most home victories in a season by a Sawyers coached team (18 in both 2017 and 2018).

Record Home Winning Streak

The Redhawks 17-game home winning streak marked the longest in program history. Southeast Missouri went undefeated through its first 17 home games of a season for the first time ever. Prior to this year, SEMO began the 2000 campaign at 13-0 at home. The Redhawks have the most home victories in the Ohio Valley Conference. That winning streak was second only to #1 Tennessee (29 games). Tennessee Tech upended the Volunteers in midweek action Tuesday, but that game was played at a neutral site in Tennessee.

Get Out the Brooms!

Southeast Missouri swept seven opponents this season. SEMO swept five of its first seven weekend series and two home-and-home series (vs. Saint Louis; vs. Arkansas State). The Redhawks completed three-game sweeps vs. Bellarmine (Feb. 26-27), Bradley (Mar. 4-5), Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13), SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27) and Murray State (Apr. 8-10). The seven series sweeps are the most in a season with Andy Sawyers at the helm. In all, the Redhawks have 15 series sweeps under Sawyers. Interestingly enough, SEMO did not sweep any opponent during its entire 2021 campaign.

Hitting Streaks Intact

Andrew Keck and Tyler Wilber head into the weekend on hitting streaks of eight and six games, respectively. Wilber posted multiple-hits five times during his six-game hitting streak which began on Apr. 3. Meanwhile, Keck's hitting streak started at Austin Peay (Apr. 1) during the beginning of the month.

Happy Easter!

Southeast Missouri and Tennessee Tech will contest this week's series on Thursday, Friday and Saturday due to the Easter holiday. SEMO is an even 6-6 with a pair of series wins (both vs. Jacksonville State) in games prior to Easter with Andy Sawyers at the helm. The Redhawks and Golden Eagles face each other before Easter for the second time in Sawyers' tenure.

Weekend Rewind

Southeast Missouri swept Murray State (Apr. 8-10) with 11-2, 8-5 and 11-10 victories. SEMO fell behind early in all three games before pulling off comeback wins. The Redhawks broke a 5-5 tie by scoring three runs in the bottom of the eighth inning during game two. A leadoff solo home run by Tyler Wilber sparked the rally in the eighth. In the series finale, SEMO trailed, 10-9, before scoring twice in the bottom of the ninth by way of a game-tying home run from Wilber and walk-off single by Brett Graber.

Comeback Kids

The Redhawks have 17 come-from-behind victories this season, including nine after they trailed in the first inning. Southeast Missouri came back to win six of its first nine Ohio Valley Conference games this year.

Wilber Wins First OVC Player of the Week Honor

Preseason Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year Tyler Wilber won his first OVC Player of the Week honor on Apr. 11. Wilbertook over as Southeast Missouri's top hitter following four-straight multiple-hit performances last week. For the week, he hit .722 (13-for-18) with eight runs scored, a pair of doubles, two home runs, six RBI, a 1.167 slugging percentage and .722 on-base percentage. Wilber hit the go-ahead home run during game two vs. Murray State (Apr. 9) and the tying home run against the Racers on Apr. 10. For the Murray State

series alone, Wilber had back-to-back four-hit games and one three-hit contest. He hit .786 with 11 hits in 14 at-bats and boasted a 1.286 slugging percentage in that series. Wilber raised his batting average 63 points from .304 to .367 during that four-game stretch.

Mr. Clutch

Center fielder Brett Graber hit a two-out bases clearing triple to lift Southeast Missouri to its 8-5 midweek win over Arkansas State (Apr. 5). SEMO held a 5-0 lead, but ASU scored four times in the sixth and added another run to tie the game in the top of the seventh. The Redhawks, however, kept their poise and quickly responded during their turn in the seventh. Jevon Mason reached on a one-out error and moved into scoring position on a two-out single by Tyler Wilber. After Mason and Wilber advanced on a wild pitch, Andrew Keck walked to load the bases. Graber, behind 1-2 in the count, then tripled to right to clear the bases and put SEMO ahead. It was the second triple of Graber's career. Five days later, Graber delivered the RBI-single in the bottom of the ninth to send SEMO to an 11-10 walk-off victory over Murray State (Apr. 10).

Redhawks at Capaha

Just how good is Southeast Missouri at home? SEMO is hitting .314 and outscoring opponents by a staggering +83 margin (169-86). The Redhawks hit 37 home runs at Capaha Field for a little over two (2.05) per home contest. Additionally, SEMO has scored 10 or more runs 10 times and collected 10 or more hits a total of 11 times on its home field. Individually, Tyler Wilber boasts a .486 batting average with 26 runs, five doubles, nine home runs and 30 RBI, while Brett Graber and Andrew Keck follow hitting .429 and .403 at home, respectively.

Single-Season Home Run Marks

With its 52 home runs this season, Southeast Missouri passed its total of 37 homers in 52 games a year ago by a +15 margin. The single-season school record during the Redhawks NCAA Division I era is 92 home runs set by the 2000 club. The most home runs hit in a season under Head Coach Andy Sawyers stand at 54 by his first SEMO team in 2017. Here are the Redhawks top-five single-season

Nine of Twelve

Southeast Missouri has won nine of its last 12 games. SEMO won four in a row during that stretch with a series sweep of SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27) and midweek wins over Saint Louis (Mar. 30) and Arkansas State (Apr. 5). The Redhawks also dropped two of three at Austin Peay (Apr. 1-3) before winning five in a row from Apr. 3-10. SEMO's longest winning streak of the season stands at 11 (Feb. 26-Mar. 13).

Five-Game Homestand

The Redhawks wrapped up their second-longest homestand of the season with a 4-1 record. Southeast Missouri beat Arkansas State (Apr. 5) and swept Murray State (Apr. 8-10) before falling to Southern Illinois (Apr. 12).

Up Next

After this week's series at Tennessee Tech, the Redhawks travel to SEC member and #25 Ole Miss on Apr. 19. Southeast Missouri then returns home to host Morehead State in a three-game series on Apr. 22-24.

Midweek Games

The Redhawks scored in every inning en route to blowing out Saint Louis, 16-5, in their first midweek game of the season on Mar. 1. SEMO established season-highs in runs (16) and hits (16) against the Billikens. SEMO also beat Arkansas State twice (Mar. 8, Apr. 5) and Saint Louis (Mar. 29) again. The Redhawks are 4-3 in midweek action this year.

Marching On

Southeast Missouri finished with a 13-4 record in March, its best in that month under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. In its 17 March contests, SEMO outscored its opponents by a +42 margin (136-94) and hit 28 home runs.

Andrews Notches Career-High in Home Runs

First baseman Lincoln Andrews went 3-for-4 with a career-high three home runs at Austin Peay (Apr. 2). Andrews homered in each of his first three at-bats of the game with a solo bomb in each of the second and sixth innings, and a two-run shot in the fourth. He became the first Redhawk to hit three home runs in a game since fellow first baseman Matt Teller accomplished the feat at UT Martin (Mar. 30, 2014).

Wilber Hits 20th Career Home Run

Tyler Wilber hit his 20th career home run to clinch Southeast Missouri's 6-5 win over Austin Peay (Apr. 3). Wilber's solo shot in the top of the ninth inning loomed large in the end of the close contest. He hit his 20th career home run on the day he made his 150th career start as a Redhawk. Wilber was also ranked as the #22 shortstop in the country by D1Baseball during week six (Mar. 28-Apr. 3).

OVC Openers

With its 2-1 win over SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25), Southeast Missouri moved to 19-12 all-time in Ohio Valley Conference openers. That mark includes a 4-2 record under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO has opened conference play with a win in four of its last five seasons.

Strong OVC Start

Southeast Missouri won each of the first two games of its Ohio Valley Conference opening series against SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27) on a two-out double in the middle innings. In game one, Ben Palmer doubled off the left field wall to score Joel Vaske and Ty Stauss in the bottom of the fifth inning. Tyler Wilber then doubled home Jevon Mason and Stauss with two outs in the bottom of the sixth during game two. Andrew Keck and Palmer each homered to lift the Redhawks to a 5-2 win in the series finale. SEMO began OVC play with a series sweep for the first time under Head Coach Andy Sawyers and first time since 2016. The Redhawks and Eastern Illinois were the only two teams that swept during the league's opening weekend. SEMO enters the week third in the OVC standings with a 4-2 mark.



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Best Start in Division I Era

The Redhawks began the 2022 season at 13-1, their best start in their NCAA Division I era. Southeast Missouri moved to the D-I ranks in 1992. SEMO's 13-1 start tied with the 1973 team which also won 13 of its first 14 contests.

RPI Update

Southeast Missouri has a RPI rating of 45 this week. SEMO currently holds the highest RPI of any team in the Ohio Valley Conference. This year is the highest SEMO has ranked in RPI under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. The Redhawks other RPI rankings with Sawyers at the helm include 87th (2021), 136th (2017), 200th (2018, 2020) and 259th (2019).

Miller Gets Pair of Saves

Right-hander Kyle Miller pitched five scoreless innings out of the bullpen en route to picking up two saves in Southeast Missouri's sweep of SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27). Miller struck out four and allowed only one hit in three innings during game one. In the series finale, he struck out three and gave up just one hit in two more scoreless innings. For the weekend, Miller struck out seven, walked two and scattered two hits in five innings. He has allowed only four earned runs in 27.2 innings through 14 relief appearances this season. Miller ranks tied for third in the Ohio Valley Conference with six saves. He also leads the team with five wins (5-2).

Keck Triples and Scores

After Tyler Wilber's game-tying home run in the bottom of the ninth inning vs. Murray State (Apr. 10), Andrew Keck tripled and later scored the winning run in Southeast Missouri's 11-10 victory. The triple was Keck's first of the season. For the year, he ranks second on the team with a .345 batting average. Keck is also second in hits (40) and RBI (33), and leads the Redhawks with 10 doubles. Additionally, he has six home runs and seven stolen bases, both of which rank third.

OVC Slate

The 24-game Ohio Valley Conference slate for the reigning OVC Champion and preseason favorite Southeast Missouri baseball team started with a series sweep of SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27). The rest of the league schedule includes home series with Murray State (Apr. 8-10), Morehead State (Apr. 22-24) and UT Martin (May 13-15). SEMO's OVC road schedule

consists of Austin Peay (Apr. 1-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 14-16), Belmont (Apr. 29-May 1) and Eastern Illinois (May 19-21).

Yard Work

Southeast Missouri has homered in 23 of its 31 games and hit a series-best 10 round-trippers vs. Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). SEMO finished with a season-high five home runs in two games -- vs. Bradley (Mar. 4); vs. Valparaiso (Mar. 13). Twenty-four of the Redhawks home runs have come against Missouri Valley Conference teams. SEMO has 52 home runs and ranks second in the Ohio Valley Conference behind Tennessee Tech (53) in that category.

Series Wins

The Redhawks claimed wins in 21 of their last 25 series dating back to their COVID-shortened 2020 campaign. At one time, Southeast Missouri posted 11-consecutive series wins during that stretch.

Atop the OVC

As a team, Southeast Missouri leads the Ohio Valley Conference in wins (23), runs (240) and RBI (228). Individually, Tyler Wilber leads the league in RBI (45) and Jevon Mason is first among league leaders in runs (40). Jason Rackers is tied for first in strikeouts looking (15) and Kyle Miller is tied for first in wins (5).

Quality Start

Right-hander Jason Rackers matched his longest start of the season when he allowed only one run and struck out six in six innings of a no-decision vs. SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25). Rackers leads the Redhawks in strikeouts (41) and innings pitched (39.2) this season.

Bullpen Gets it Done

Southeast Missouri's bullpen did not allow a run in four-straight games from Mar. 25-29. SEMO's relievers combined to pitch 19.1 scoreless innings and allowed only four hits in that span. The bullpen also accounted for 16 strikeouts, three wins and two saves during that time.

Klein Time

Right-hander Anthony Klein earned his first career win in relief when he beat Saint Louis (Mar. 29). A freshman from St. Louis, Klein tossed 3.2 scoreless innings of no-hit baseball. He also struck out five and did not give up a walk against the Billikens. Klein was the

Prospect League's top reliever last summer for the Cape Girardeau-based Cape Catfish.

Spencer For Hire

Junior Spencer Parker got his first NCAA Division I RBI-hit with a single in the top of the ninth inning at Saint Louis (Mar. 29). Parker, a transfer from Iowa Western Community College, finished with a career-high two hits in that contest.

Winning Streak Ends at 11

Southeast Missouri saw its 11-game winning streak end when it fell to Indiana State, 10-1, on Mar. 15. The winning streak was SEMO's longest since it won 11 in a row (Mar. 18-Apr. 5) during the 2016 campaign. At the time, it was the third-longest winning streak in NCAA Division I baseball this year.

Great Work Williams

Right-hander Austin Williams picked up his first two wins of the season out of the bullpen for Southeast Missouri last week. Williams struck out four, walked none and allowed just one hit in 3.1 scoreless innings to get his first win at Arkansas State (Mar. 8). He then struck out a career-high seven in the longest outing of his career (five innings) to beat Valparaiso (Mar. 13). Williams retired seven-straight Valpo hitters exiting the game in the ninth. For the week, he went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA, allowed just one run, scattered four hits, struck out 11 and walked one in two relief appearances.

They Did That Twice?

In each of the final two games of its series against Valparaiso (Mar. 13), Southeast Missouri homered three times and scored six runs in an inning. SEMO trailed, 6-3, in game one before Peyton Leeper, Tyler Wilber and Lincoln Andrews homered in the bottom of the fourth. That six-run inning lifted the Redhawks to a 16-6 win as SEMO scored the final 13 runs of the game. In game two, the Redhawks were down, 3-0, when Jevon Mason, Wilber and Brett Graber homered as part of a six-run third inning. SEMO later won that contest by a score of 10-8. The Redhawks fell behind in the first inning during every game against Valparaiso before sweeping the series with three come-from-behind victories.



Seeing Double

The Redhawks scored double-digit runs 11 times this season. Southeast Missouri scored 10 or more runs in seven consecutive games for the first time in program history from Feb. 27-Mar. 8. The Redhawks lead the Ohio Valley Conference with 240 runs.

Power Outage

Ten different players have homered for Southeast Missouri this season. Tyler Wilber leads the Redhawks with 11 home runs, while Jevon Mason follows with seven. Peyton Leeper, Lincoln Andrews and Andrew Keck each have six, and Ty Stauss has five. Brett Graber, Joel Vaske and Ben Palmer all have three, and Spencer Parker has two.

Leeper Tabbed OVC Player of the Week

Southeast Missouri utility player Peyton Leeper won Southeast Missouri's first Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Week honor of the 2022 season on Mar. 14. A native of Mokane, Missouri, Leeper homered in all four of his starts last week helping the Redhawks extend their winning streak to 11 games. He broke SEMO's series-opener against Valparaiso (Mar. 12) open with a grand slam, the first of his career. Leeper then homered in both games of the series-ending doubleheader against the Beacons the following day. His second round-tripper that day was a game-winning two-run homer in the bottom of the eighth inning during the night-cap. Leeper's other home run for the week came in a midweek matchup at Arkansas State (Mar. 8). In the Valparaiso series alone, Leeper finished with three home runs, six runs scored and nine RBI. For the week, he hit .353 with four of his six hits coming via the long ball. He scored nine times, had 10 RBI, boasted a 1.059 slugging percentage, recorded a .500 on-base percentage and was a perfect 3-of-3 in stolen bases. Leeper carries a six-game hitting streak into this week's action. Leeper won the award for the first time in his career. UT Martin right-hander Rhett Fetner (Pitcher of the Week) rounded out the week's honorees.

Wilber Clears 200 Hits

Tyler Wilber went over 200 career hits in the Redhawks series sweep of Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). Wilber hit a team-high .500 in the series. He had four runs, six hits, three home runs, seven RBI and a 1.250 slugging percentage

against the Beacons. Wilber got his 200th career hit on a two-out single in the bottom of the eighth inning during game two of the series. He now has 229 hits in his career.

Over 150

Andrew Keck (169) surpassed 150 hits in his career against Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). Keck hit .357 with a run scored, home run and two RBI against the Beacons. He is the second player on this year's team to reach 150 or more hits joining Tyler Wilber (229).

NCAA Division I Rankings (Top-25)

As of games through Apr. 10, the Redhawks rank among the top 25 NCAA Division I teams home runs per game (17th, 1.7), home runs (17th, 51) and win-loss percentage (13th, .767). Individually, Noah Niznik is 19th in games started (8), Jevon Mason is 23rd in runs (40) and 14th in runs per game (1.3), Kyle Miller is 23rd in saves (6) and Tyler Wilber is eighth in RBI (45) and ninth in RBI per game (1.5).

Stealing the Show

Andrew Keck is 7-of-10 on the basepaths this season. Keck has 41 stolen bases and is now ninth on Southeast Missouri's all-time career stolen base list. Jevon Mason leads SEMO in stolen bases with 12 in 14 attempts.

Graber Goes Off

Outfielder Brett Graber hit a series best .455 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs and eight RBI in Southeast Missouri's three-game set vs. Bradley (Mar. 4-5). Graber went 5-for-11 at the plate. He also walked twice, boasted a 1.182 slugging percentage and finished with a .538 on-base percentage against the Braves.

Double-Digit Hits

Southeast Missouri registered double-digit hits in 16 games. SEMO is 14-2 in games when it gets 10 or more hits. It finished with a season-high 16 hits vs. Saint Louis (Mar. 1) and Valparaiso (Mar. 13).

RBI Guys

Tyler Wilber and Andrew Keck are first and fourth in the Ohio Valley Conference with 45 and 33 RBI, respectively. Wilber (14) and Keck (10) have combined for 24 multiple-RBI games this season.

Huge Week for Keck

Andrew Keck hit safely in three of Southeast Missouri's four wins last week. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, Keck opened the week by going 4-for-5 with a double, grand slam, career-high four runs and career-best seven RBI vs. Saint Louis (Mar. 1). The grand slam was Keck's second of the season that came in a three-day span. He also went 3-for-4 with two runs and one RBI vs. Bradley (Mar. 5) after finishing with two hits and two RBI the day before against the Braves. SEMO swept BU for its second series sweep of the season. For the week, Keck hit .563 (9-for-16) with nine runs, a double, grand slam, 11 RBI, three stolen bases and three walks. He boasted a .813 slugging percentage and .600 on-base percentage, as well.

Career Day for Keck

Catcher Andrew Keck went 4-for-5 with a grand slam, double, two singles, four runs scored, two stolen bases and seven RBI to lead Southeast Missouri to its win over Saint Louis (Mar. 1). Keck hit safely in each of his first three at-bats. His four runs and seven RBI are new career-highs, while his four hits match a career-best. Keck leads the team with a .412 batting average.

Grand Slamming

Andrew Keck hit his second grand slam in three days against Saint Louis (Mar. 1). Keck launched his team-high third home run of the season over the left field wall in the bottom of the sixth inning. He smashed his first career grand slam to help send Southeast Missouri to a 10-2 win over Bellarmine (Feb. 27). That round-tripper came in the bottom of the first inning against the Knights.

Mason Plays Strong

Leadoff man Jevon Mason is Southeast Missouri's fourth-leading hitter with a .313 batting average. Mason ranks first on the team in runs (40), third in doubles (8) and second in home runs (7). He is also third on the team in slugging percentage (.586) and on-base percentage (.412) through 31 starts.

Walk-Off Wins

First baseman Lincoln Andrews snapped a 7-7 tie with a leadoff walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th inning to give Southeast Missouri an 8-7 come-from-behind win in its



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series-opener vs. Bellarmine (Feb. 26). The walk-off hit marked the first of Andrews' career. Brett Graber then delivered a RBI-single with no outs in the bottom of the ninth inning to give SEMO an 11-10 win over Murray State (Apr. 10).

Over .300

Southeast Missouri has four players hitting over .300 through 31 games this season. Tyler Wilber leads the team with a .363 clip, while Andrew Keck (.342), Brett Graber (.333) and Jevon Mason (.313) follow. Those four players have accounted for 122 RBI, as well.

Extra Innings

Three of Southeast Missouri's games this season have gone to extra innings. The Redhawks are 3-0 in such games after beating #22 Dallas Baptist, 7-6, in 12 innings (Feb. 18) and, 6-5, in 10 innings (Feb. 19), and Bellarmine, 8-7, in 11 innings (Feb. 26). SEMO played seven extra inning games in 2021 (4-3).

Walk This Way

Southeast Missouri players hold three of the first eight spots among Ohio Valley Conference leaders in walks. Peyton Leeper (t3rd, 22), Jevon Mason (t3rd, 22) and Brett Graber (t8th, 20) occupy those places. Those three are responsible for 64 of SEMO's 149 bases on balls, second-most in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Early and Often

Southeast Missouri has jumped on opponents early through its first 31 games this season. In the first four innings alone, SEMO has scored a combined 115 runs, including 29 in the first, 20 in the second, 46 in the third and 20 in the fourth. Forty-eight percent of the Redhawks runs have come in the first four innings of play. SEMO is outscoring opponents 115-97 in that span.

Six-Inning Starts

Left-hander Noah Niznik and right-hander Jason Rackers have combined for five six-inning starts this season. Niznik went six innings to beat Bellarmine for his first win on Feb. 27 allowing just one run on five hits. He also struck out two and walked one in his longest start since pitching seven innings in a no-decision vs. Austin Peay (Mar. 20, 2021). Rackers picked up his second victory of the year after

scattering four hits, giving up three runs and striking out four in six innings at Missouri State (Mar. 19). He then collected six strikeouts when he worked six innings in a no-decision vs. SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25). Niznik worked six innings with seven strikeouts in a no-decision at Austin Peay (Apr. 2). Most recently, Rackers had a season-high seven strikeouts in a win over Murray State (Apr. 8).

What a Weekend!

The Redhawks used a pair of extra inning victories to win their season-opening series on the road at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 18-20). Southeast Missouri stunned the Patriots with 7-6 win in 12 innings on Feb. 18, a game that lasted four-and-a-half-hours. In less than 24 hours, the Redhawks turned around to come-from-behind and beat DBU, 6-5, in 10 innings during another one-run affair. SEMO claimed a series win against a ranked opponent for only the second time in program history. The Redhawks also took two of three at then-#16 Alabama to open the 2009 campaign.

Home-Openers

Southeast Missouri improved to 21-10 all-time in home-openers in its NCAA Division I era (since 1992). The Redhawks are now 4-2 in such games under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. Sawyers' home-opening wins came in 2022 (8-7, vs. Bellarmine), 2017 (22-2, vs. Western Illinois), 2019 (5-1, vs. Western Michigan) and 2021 (4-3, vs. Illinois State).

Miller Named OVC Pitcher of the Week

Southeast Missouri sophomore right-hander Kyle Miller won the first Ohio Valley Conference Pitcher of the Week award of the 2022 season on Feb. 21. Miller picked up his first win of the season at #22 Dallas Baptist on Feb. 18. He came out of the bullpen to toss six scoreless innings to help lead the Redhawks to a 12-inning one-run upset of the nationally-ranked Patriots. Miller struck out four, walked two and allowed only three hits in his first appearance of the year as SEMO posted a series win against a ranked opponent for only the second time in program history.

Ranked Teams Fall on Opening Day

#22 Dallas Baptist was one of six ranked teams to lose on opening day. Southeast Missouri edged the Patriots, 7-6, in 12 innings on Feb. 18. The win snapped an eight-game losing streak against ranked opponents for the Redhawks and marked their first victory over a ranked foe since Apr. 29, 2018 (10-6, vs. #20 Tennessee Tech). After getting two wins against the Patriots, Andy Sawyers now has a total of three victories over ranked teams as SEMO's head coach.

Vote-Getters

Southeast Missouri was one of two Ohio Valley Conference teams receiving votes in this week's National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Poll on Feb. 21. Dallas Baptist, which was ranked #22 entering the 2022 season, dropped out of the poll after losing two of three in its season-opening series against the Redhawks.

Redhawk Debuts

Nine players, including Spencer Parker, Joel Vaske, Ryan Malzahn, Ben Palmer, Wyatt Grant, Jason Rackers, Tommy Windt, Ethan Osborne and Anthony Klein made their Southeast Missouri debuts during opening weekend at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 18-20). Palmer started three games at second base and Vaske saw action in all three contests and logged two starts. Rackers also struck out six in 5.2 innings during SEMO's game two win on Feb. 19.

Big Hits

Down, 3-1, with one out in the top of the ninth inning of game two at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 19), pinch-hitter Joel Vaske hit a three-run home run to put the Redhawks ahead. SEMO scored four runs in the inning to grab a 5-3 advantage. After DBU hit a two-run home run to send the game to extra innings in the bottom of the ninth, Brett Graber hit a two-out single to score Andrew Keck for the game-winner. Keck doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored the winning run on Graber's hit. Vaske hit .333 with two extra base hits, two runs, four RBI, a .788 slugging percentage and .455 on-base percentage in his first three games as a Redhawk.



Season-Openers

Southeast Missouri improved to 13-18 all-time in season-openers during its NCAA Division I era (since 1992). SEMO is now 4-2 in such games under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO beat Western Michigan at home in 2019, UT Arlington in Nacogdoches, Texas in 2017, South Alabama in Mobile, Alabama in 2021 and #22 Dallas Baptist in Dallas, Texas for Sawyers' season-opening victories.

Season 64

The 2022 campaign marks Southeast Missouri's 64th year of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 31st season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,417-1,147 all-time and 882-758-1 at the NCAA Division I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 440-296-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won five OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2021), four OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016, 2021) and made four NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016, 2021) in program history.

OVC Preseason Favorite

Southeast Missouri was tabbed the preseason favorite in the 2022 Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Preseason Poll on Feb. 10. The reigning OVC regular-season and tournament champion, SEMO received eight of the possible 18 first-place nods in the overall voting by league Head Coaches and Communication Directors. SEMO accumulated a total of 114 points, while Murray State – which the Redhawks beat to win the OVC Tournament crown in 2021 – was picked second with four first-place votes and 104 points. Morehead State (93 pts.), Austin Peay (87 pts.) and Belmont (86 pts.) round out the top five, while SIU Edwardsville (55 pts.), Eastern Illinois (50 pts.), Tennessee Tech (43 pts.) and UT Martin (16 pts.) complete the nine-team predicted order of finish.

2022 Redhawks

The Redhawks 2022 roster consists of 38 players, including four seniors, 16 juniors, nine sophomores and nine freshmen. Southeast Missouri returns five position starters and two starting pitchers. SEMO also has each of its top five hitters back from last season.

Wilber Named OVC Preseason Player of the Year

Senior shortstop Tyler Wilber was voted the 2022 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Player of the Year. A native of Los Alamitos, California, Wilber started all 52 games last season. A Second-Team All-OVC pick, he was Southeast Missouri's leading hitter with a .378 batting average. Wilber also led the Redhawks in RBI (49), total bases (109), slugging percentage (.542), and hits (76). He finished the regular-season with a league-best .400 batting average. Additionally, Wilber was a semifinalist for the Brooks Wallace Award.

Batting Titles

Tyler Wilber won the Ohio Valley Conference regular-season batting title twice in his career to date. Wilber was hitting .400 at the end of regular-season play in 2021 and hit .383 during the 2019 campaign.

What a Career!

Tyler Wilber is in his fourth-year as Southeast Missouri's starting shortstop. Wilber has a career batting average of .381. His batting average is the second-highest in a career among players in SEMO's NCAA Division I era behind Todd Shylanski (.387, 1991-92). Wilber ranks fourth all-time among the Redhawks career leaders in batting average and sixth in on-base percentage (.467). He has 229 hits, 133 runs, 48 doubles, six triples, 22 home runs and 146 RBI in 155 starts.

Mason Secures Preseason All-OVC Honors

Left fielder Jevon Mason joined Tyler Wilber on this year's Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Mason, who hails from West Des Moines, Iowa, made the league's All-Tournament Team in his first year as a Redhawk in 2021. He ranked second on the team with a .350 batting average behind Wilber. Mason led Southeast Missouri with 14 doubles and boasted a team-best .447 on-base percentage.

155 and Counting

Tyler Wilber has never missed a start in his Southeast Missouri career. The shortstop has started 155 consecutive games as the most experienced player on the roster. Wilber committed only nine errors in 52 starts at short in 2021.

From Walk-On to Scholarship

What a rookie season right-hander Kyle Miller had for Southeast Missouri in 2021. Miller, who joined the team as a walk-on, compiled a 4-2 record in 20 appearances and five starts. He rated third on the team with 52 strikeouts in 51.1 innings. Miller picked up his first career save on six outs in the Redhawks season-opening win at South Alabama a year ago and then finished his freshman year by throwing a complete game two-hitter with 10 strikeouts in the Redhawks Ohio Valley Conference Tournament Championship win over Murray State. Miller begins his 2022 campaign as a scholarship player.

SEMO Spring Fact

Southeast Missouri's baseball (17-1), softball (9-0) and women's tennis (4-0) teams are a combined 30-1 at home this season. All three are reigning Ohio Valley Conference Champions, as well.

ANDY SAWYERS

HEAD COACH

Andy Sawyers is the reigning Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year after leading Southeast Missouri to the league's regular-season and tournament titles, and the program's fourth NCAA Tournament berth in 2021.

Sawyers looks to carry the momentum into the 2022 campaign, his sixth year as SEMO's head coach.

The Redhawks finished their championship season with an overall 30-22 record and 17-10 in the OVC. SEMO recorded 30 wins in a season for the first time with Sawyers at the helm and posted series wins in eight of its nine series against league foes in 2021.

Sawyers coached his first OVC Specialty Award-Winner when left-hander Dylan Dodd was tabbed the league's Pitcher of the Year.

Dodd later became the

highest draft pick in program history when he was selected in the third round by the Atlanta Braves in the 2021 Major League Draft. Additionally, Dodd wrapped up his final college season as a Second-Team Collegiate Baseball All-American.

Statistically, SEMO led the OVC with 14 saves and a .967 fielding percentage after committing just 49 errors in 52 contests. The Redhawks were also second in the conference in wins as their 30 victories marked the most in a season in five years.

In 2020, SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in OVC play when its season abruptly ended due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in

batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits (6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros.

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a league-high with 29 hits when play was suspended.

Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Before they took the field in 2019, the Redhawks ushered in a state-of-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-time stats and performance metrics.

SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber



and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480).

Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers, including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head

Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and nine NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 40 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and nine top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman Josh Rolette who garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American honors in 2016. He also helped mentor Jake Scudder who was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. The Wildcats had three student-athletes on the All-Big 12 Teams that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to

stolen bases as the 149 steals were second-most in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399).

Before K-State, Sawyers spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas

A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American.

Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008, Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips to the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance at the 2005 College World Series. Sawyers, who lettered two years at Nebraska, worked with 12 Huskers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Alex

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Collegiate Baseball.

After working as the volunteer assistant at Nebraska in 2000, Sawyers worked the 2001 and 2002 seasons as head coach at Hutchinson Community College, compiling an 87-30 record and two postseason berths. In 2001, the Dragons went 40-16 and won the Jayhawk West Sub-Regional, while the 2002 squad set a school record with 47 wins and was ranked as high as seventh by the NJCAA.

Sawyers' coaching career began at Northwestern (La.)

State in 1999 as a volunteer assistant coach, helping the Demons finish second in the Southland Conference.

He first played collegiately at Point Loma (Calif.) Nazarene College in 1994. Following a year off, he played at Mendocino (Calif.) Junior College in 1996 before finishing up his playing career at Nebraska.

A native of Willits, California, Sawyers received his bachelor (1998) and master's (2000) degrees from Nebraska. He is married to the former Dena

Lindeblad and the couple have two sons, Andrew James (A.J.) and Alex.
