Redhawks Step Out of Conference Play This Weekend

Ohio Valley Conference leader Southeast Missouri (30-13) steps out of league play to visit #3 Oklahoma State (31-13) this weekend. First pitch of a three-game series is set for 6 p.m., CT at O'Brate Stadium.

Series History

Friday's series-opener marks the seventh meeting between Southeast Missouri and Oklahoma State. These teams hook up for the first time in 18 years. OSU leads the all-time series, 4-2, with each of the previous six games played in Stillwater. SEMO beat the Cowboys, 4-2, during the last meeting on May 31, 2004.

Against Ranked Teams

Big 12 Conference member #3 Oklahoma State is the second ranked opponent Southeast Missouri tangles with this season. The Redhawks opened the 2022 campaign with a stunning series win over then-#22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 18-20). SEMO is 5-15 in its last 20 meetings with ranked opponents. That includes a 0-6 mark against top-five teams. The Redhawks have never beaten a top-five ranked team. OSU is the highest ranked team SEMO plays since it dropped a four-game series at #2 Arkansas a year ago. Here are SEMO's last 20 matchups with ranked teams:

Sawyers vs. Ranked Teams

Of Southeast Missouri's previous five wins against ranked teams, four belong to Head Coach Andy Sawyers. Sawyers has faced ranked teams a total of 13 times in his SEMO career. #20 Tennessee Tech (10-6, Apr. 29, 2018) is the highest ranked team he has defeated. His other wins in that span came against #22 Dallas Baptist (7-6, Feb. 18, 2022; 6-5, Feb. 19, 2022) and #23 Missouri (6-5, Mar. 28, 2017).

Against the Big 12

Southeast Missouri is 9-18 all-time against schools from the Big 12 Conference. SEMO has faced Iowa State (8-1), Kansas (0-7), Kansas State (1-0), Oklahoma (0-6) and Oklahoma State (2-4) in its baseball history. The Redhawks last win over a Big 12 foe was at Oklahoma State (W, 4-2, May 31) in 2004. Andy Sawyers spent four years coaching at K-State. Sawyers was an assistant coach there in 2009 and 2010, and an associate head coach in 2015 and 2016. The Wildcats made the NCAA Regional in both 2009 and 2010. They won a combined 80 games those seasons.

Tuesday Recap

The Redhawks faced Southeastern Conference member and in-state Missouri Tuesday. Reigning Ohio Valley Conference Co-Player of the Week Andrew Keck went 2-for-4 with a home run and one run scored in the 9-3 road loss. SEMO got within a run twice against Mizzou before the Tigers scored the final five runs of the game to pull away.

Redhawks Get 30 Wins

Southeast Missouri became the first team in the Ohio Valley Conference to reach 30 wins this season. SEMO picked up its 30th victory with a series-clinching 11-4 win at Belmont (May 1). The 30-win season is the second-straight with Andy Sawyers at the helm and 15th in program history. SEMO also won 30 or more games for the fifth time in eight years. Entering the week, the Redhawks were among 29 NCAA Division I teams with 30 or more victories this year. One more victory will give Sawyers his most wins in a season in six years as SEMO's skipper.

Back in First

The Redhawks reclaimed the top spot in the Ohio Valley Conference standings after their big series win at Belmont (Apr. 29-May 1). Southeast Missouri entered last weekend second behind the Bruins, but took two of three to move into first. SEMO improved to 13-5 in OVC play. Belmont (10-5) and Eastern Illinois (9-6) round out the top three. SEMO has two series left in league play. The Redhawks host UT Martin (May 13-15) and close out the regular-season at Eastern Illinois (May 19-21) after they face Oklahoma State this weekend

150 On the Horizon

Andy Sawyers is two wins away from getting 150 as a head coach. Sawyers, who is in his sixth year at Southeast Missouri, is 148-131 all-time as an NCAA Division I head coach. He is 60-35 overall and 30-15 in the Ohio Valley Conference with one OVC regular-season and tournament title, and one NCAA Tournament berth since the start of the 2021 campaign.

Series Wins

The Redhawks claimed wins in 23 of their last 28 series dating back to their COVIDshortened 2020 campaign. At one time, Southeast Missouri posted 11-consecutive series wins during that stretch. This year. SEMO has claimed a total of 10 series victories. The Redhawks most series wins in a season under Head Coach Andy Sawyers stand at 11 during the 2021 campaign.

Redhawks Third in Single-Season Home Runs

With its 77 home runs this season, Southeast Missouri passed its total of 37 homers in 52 games a year ago by a +40 margin. The 2022 team is now third all-time in single-season home runs during SEMO's NCAA Division I era. The single-season Division I record is 92 home runs set by the 2000 club. This year's 77 bombs are the most by a Andy Sawyers coached team. Here are the Redhawks top-five single-season home run marks since they turned Division I in 1991-92.

92 home runs -- 2000 90 home runs -- 1998

77 home runs -- 2022

76 home runs -- 2010

71 home runs -- 2009

Home Run Streak

Andrew Keck has hit a home run in each of his last four games. Keck became the second Redhawk to accomplish the feat this season when he hit a solo home run in the top of the sixth inning at Missouri (May 3). Peyton Leeper also homered in four-straight games from Mar. 8-13.

Wilma is Back

Right-hander Collin Wilma returned from a stress fracture injury to make his first start on the mound in over a year at Missouri (May 3). Wilma worked 1.1 innings with one strikeout in a loss against the Tigers. He also gave up two runs on one hit. Wilma last pitched at Belmont on May 1, 2021 before making his first appearance and start of the season at Missouri.

Extra! Extra!

The Redhawks have gone to extra innings in four of their last eight games. Southeast Missouri won a pair of 10-inning contests vs. Morehead State before falling at Southern Illinois (Apr. 26). SEMO then beat Belmont, 5-4, in a series-opening win in 10 innings on Apr. 29. The Redhawks have been involved in seven extra-inning affairs this year and are 6-1 in those matchups.

Keck is Rolling

Andrew Keck is the fourth Redhawk to put together a double-digit game hitting streak in 2022. Keck carries a 11-game hitting streak into this weekend's series at Oklahoma State. He hit .533 with five runs, two doubles, three home runs, six RBI and a stolen base during his four starts last week. Keck had two hits in each of the first two games of the Belmont series (Apr. 29-30) and later finished his big week by going 3-for-4 with three runs, a double, home run and two RBI against the Bruins on May 1. He homered in all three games of the Belmont series en route to securing Co-Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Week honors on May 2.

10 or More Home Runs

Four Redhawks have 10 or more home runs this season. Tyler Wilber leads the team with 15 round-trippers, while Andrew Keck follows close behind with 14. Jevon Mason and Lincoln Andrew round out that group with 10 apiece. Wilber and Keck rank fourth and fifth among the Ohio Valley Conference's home run leaders, respectively.

Another Sweep

Southeast Missouri recorded its sixth series sweep of the season when it beat Morehead State (Apr. 22-23). SEMO won two of its three games against the Eagles by one run in extra innings. The Redhawks came from behind to win all three games.

Bombs Away

The Redhawks hit five home runs in a game for the fourth time this season in their series finale against Morehead State (Apr. 23). Lincoln Andrews accounted for three of those round-trippers in the doubleheader. Andrews hit a grand slam in SEMO's 16-9 victory and then homered twice in the Redhawks 9-8 win.

That's a Relief

Kyle Miller posted a pair of victories out of the bullpen against Morehead State (Apr. 22, Apr. 23). Miller recorded 10 strikeouts and did not allow a walk in those appearances. He struck out five in 2.1 innings during game one of the series and closed out the weekend strong by striking out five more in three scoreless innings during game three.

Another Power Five Matchup

Oklahoma State marks the third Power Five team Southeast Missouri faces during the final leg of its 2022 regular-season. Tyler Wilber narrowly missed hitting for the cycle to lead SEMO to a dominating 13-3 win over SEC member Ole Miss (Apr. 19). Wilber went 4-for-6 with three runs scored, a double, home run and three RBI. SEMO, which handed Ole Miss its largest non-conference loss of the season to date, knocked off a SEC opponent for the first time in five years. The win was also the Redhawks first over a Power Five conference foe since 2019 (3-2, at Purdue). SEMO recently fell to fellow SEC foe Missouri, 9-3, on May 3.

Wins Leader

Southeast Missouri leads the Ohio Valley Conference with 30 wins this season. SEMO is currently the only OVC team with 30 wins. The Redhawks 12 losses are fewest in the OVC. SEMO is 23rd in the nation with a .698 winning percentage.

Williams Strikes Out Nine

Austin Williams recorded a career-high nine strikeouts in his win over Tennessee Tech on Apr. 15. The nine strikeouts are the most in a game by any Southeast Missouri pitcher this season.

Two-Home Run Games

Andrew Keck became the fourth player to get two or more home runs in a game for the Redhawks this season when he homered twice at Tennessee Tech (Apr. 15). Lincoln Andrews (3, at Austin Peay, Apr. 2; 2, vs. Morehead State, Apr. 23), Ty Stauss (2, at Austin Peay, Apr. 3) and Tyler Wilber (2, vs. Valparaiso, Mar. 13) also reached the feat.

One Home Loss

The Redhawks saw a program record 17-game home winning streak end with its only loss at Capaha Field on Apr. 12. Southeast Missouri dropped a tight 3-2 contest to longtime rival Southern Illinois in the 91st meeting between the teams. It was the first time SEMO fell at home since May 21, 2021 (9-2, vs. UT Martin). The 17-game stretch was the second-longest home winning streak in the nation at the time.

Midweek Games

The Redhawks scored in every inning en route to blowing out Saint Louis, 16-5, in their first midweek game of the season on Mar. 1. SEMO established season-highs in runs (16) and hits (16) against the Billikens. SEMO also beat Arkansas State twice (Mar. 8, Apr. 5) and Saint Louis (Mar. 29) again, and toppled Ole Miss (Apr. 19). Additionally, the Redhawks dropped a 9-3 contest at Missouri (May 3). The Redhawks are 5-5 in midweek action this year.

Great at Home

Southeast Missouri is 20-1 at home this season. The Redhawks won 22 of their last 24 matchups at Capaha Field dating back to the 2021 campaign. SEMO is 91-42 at home under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. The 20 home wins are most in the Ohio Valley Conference and most in a season under Sawyers. The Redhawks last had 20 home wins in a season during the 2010 campaign (21-6).

Second-Best Home Record in the Country

The Redhawks (20-1) presently have the second-best home record in the nation behind Central Michigan (13-0). A total of 28 NCAA Division I programs have 20 or more home victories this season (through games of May 1). They include SEMO, Tennessee (29-2), Arkansas (27-4), Virginia (25-4), Louisville (25-5), College of Charleston (23-5), Wake Forest (23-6), LSU (23-6), Mercer (22-4), Davidson (22-5), Miami (Fla.) (22-6), Florida State (22-7), Texas State (22-6), Florida Atlantic (22-9), North Carolina (21-5), Georgia Tech (21-9), Wofford (20-3), Virginia Tech (20-4) Texas Tech (20-3), North Carolina State (20-5), Southern Illinois (20-6), USC Upstate (20-7), Houston (20-7), Charlotte (20-8), Clemson (20-8), Oregon (20-8), UNC Wilmington (20-9), McNeese State (20-12)

That Was Fast

With its win over Arkansas State on Apr. 5, Southeast Missouri reached 20 wins in a season quicker than it has ever done under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. The Redhawks 20th win came 25 days sooner than it did a year ago (Apr. 30, 2021).

A Look Ahead

Southeast Missouri wraps up its eight-game road trip at Oklahoma State (May 6-8) this weekend. SEMO, which plays 11 of its final 15 regular-season games on the road, returns home to host Missouri State (May 10) and UT Martin (May 13-15) before heading to Eastern Illinois (May 19-21) in its final seven contests before postseason play.

Record Home Winning Streak

The Redhawks 17-game home winning streak marked the longest in program history. Southeast Missouri went undefeated through its first 17 home games of a season for the first time ever. Prior to this year, SEMO began the 2000 campaign at 13-0 at home. The Redhawks have the most home victories and best home record in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Get Out the Brooms!

Southeast Missouri swept eight opponents this season. The Redhawks completed three-game sweeps vs. Bellarmine (Feb. 26-27), Bradley (Mar. 4-5), Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13), SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27), Murray State (Apr. 8-10) and Morehead State (Apr. 22-23). SEMO also swept its home-and-home series vs. Saint Louis and Arkansas State. The eight series sweeps are the most in a season with Andy Sawyers at the helm. In all, the Redhawks have 16 series sweeps under Sawyers. Interestingly enough, SEMO did not sweep any opponent during its entire 2021 campaign.

Getting On Base

Jevon Mason has reached base in 21 consecutive games and Andrew Keck has done the same in 20-straight contests. Mason's 21-game reached base streak is the longest on the team this season. Keck's 20-game stretch is now alone in second.

Comeback Kids

The Redhawks have 21 come-from-behind victories this season, including 11 after they trailed in the first inning. Southeast Missouri came back to win 10 of its 18 Ohio Valley Conference games this year.

Wilber Wins First OVC Player of the Week Honor

Preseason Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year Tyler Wilber won his first OVC Player of the Week honor on Apr. 11. Wilbertook over as Southeast Missouri's top hitter following four-straight multiple-hit performances last week. For the week, he hit .722 (13-for-18) with eight runs scored, a pair of doubles, two home runs, six RBI, a 1.167 slugging percentage and .722 on-base percentage. Wilber hit the goahead home run during game two vs. Murray State (Apr. 9) and the tying home run against the Racers on Apr. 10. For the Murray State series alone, Wilber had back-to-back four-hit games and one three-hit contest. He hit .786 with 11 hits in 14 at-bats and boasted a 1.286 slugging percentage in that series. Wilber raised his batting average 63 points from .304 to .367 during that four-game stretch.

Walk-Off Wins

First baseman Lincoln Andrews snapped a 7-7 tie with a leadoff walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th inning to give Southeast Missouri an 8-7 come-from-behind win in its series-opener vs. Bellarmine (Feb. 26). The walk-off hit marked the first of Andrews' career. Brett Graber then delivered a RBI-single with no outs in the bottom of the ninth inning to give SEMO an 11-10 win over Murray State (Apr. 10). Graber also hit a walk-off home run to give the Redhawks a 9-8 win in the 10th inning vs. Morehead State (Apr. 23).

Mr. Clutch

Center fielder Brett Graber hit a two-out bases clearing triple to lift Southeast Missouri to its 8-5 midweek win over Arkansas State (Apr. 5). SEMO held a 5-0 lead, but ASU scored four times in the sixth and added another run to tie the game in the top of the seventh. The Redhawks, however, kept their poise and quickly responded during their turn in the seventh. Jevon Mason reached on a one-out error and moved into scoring position on a two-out single by Tyler Wilber. After Mason and Wilber advanced on a wild pitch, Andrew Keck walked to load the bases. Graber, behind 1-2 in the count, then tripled to right to clear the bases and put SEMO ahead. It was the second triple of Graber's career. Five days later, Graber delivered the RBI-single in the bottom of the ninth to send SEMO to an 11-10 walk-off victory over Murray State (Apr. 10).

Redhawks at Capaha

Just how good is Southeast Missouri at home? SEMO is hitting .309 and outscoring opponents by a staggering +92 margin (202-110). The Redhawks hit 44 home runs at Capaha Field for a little over two (2.09) per home contest. Additionally, SEMO has scored 10 or more runs 11 times and collected 10 or more hits a total of 13 times on its home field. Individually, Tyler Wilber boasts a .442 batting average with 29 runs, seven doubles, nine home runs and 32 RBI, while Brett Graber and Andrew Keck follow hitting .434 and .393 at home, respectively.

16 of 24

Southeast Missouri has won 16 of its last 24 games. SEMO won four in a row from Mar. 25-29 and five in a row from Apr. 3-10 during that stretch. SEMO's longest winning streak of the season stands at 11 (Feb. 26-Mar. 13).

Marching On

Southeast Missouri finished with a 13-4 record in March, its best in that month under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. In its 17 March contests, SEMO outscored its opponents by a +42 margin (136-94) and hit 28 home runs.

Andrews Notches Career-High in Home Runs

First baseman Lincoln Andrews went 3-for-4 with a career-high three home runs at Austin Peay (Apr. 2). Andrews homered in each of his first three at-bats of the game with a solo bomb in each of the second and sixth innings, and a two-run shot in the fourth. He became the first Redhawk to hit three home runs in a game since fellow first baseman Matt Tellor accomplished the feat at UT Martin (Mar. 30. 2014).

Wilber Hits 20th Career Home Run

Tyler Wilber hit his 20th career home run to clinch Southeast Missouri's 6-5 win over Austin Peay (Apr. 3). Wilber's solo shot in the top of the ninth inning loomed large in the end of the close contest. He hit his 20th career home run on the day he made his 150th career start as a Redhawk. Wilber was also ranked as the #22 shortstop in the country by D1Baseball during week six (Mar. 28-Apr. 3).

OVC Openers

With its 2-1 win over SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25), Southeast Missouri moved to 19-12 all-time in Ohio Valley Conference openers. That mark includes a 4-2 record under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO has opened conference play with a win in four of its last five seasons.

Strong OVC Start

Southeast Missouri won each of the first two games of its Ohio Valley Conference opening series against SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27) on a two-out double in the middle innings. In game one, Ben Palmer doubled off the left field wall to score Joel Vaske and Ty Stauss in teh bottom of the fifth inning. Tyler Wilber then doubled home Jevon Mason and Stauss with two outs in the bottom fo the sixth during game two. Andrew Keck and Palmer each homered to lift the Redhawks to a 5-2 win in the series finale. SEMO began OVC play with a series sweep for the first time under Head Coach Andy Sawvers and first time since 2016. The Redhawks and Eastern Illinois were the only two teams that swept during the league's opening weekend. SEMO is first in the OVC standings with a 13-5 mark.

Best Start in Division I Era

The Redhawks began the 2022 season at 13-1, their best start in their NCAA Division I era. Southeast Missouri moved to the D-I ranks in 1992. SEMO's 13-1 start tied with the 1973 team which also won 13 of its first 14 contests.

RPI Update

Southeast Missouri has a RPI rating of 47 (through games of May 3). SEMO currently holds the highest RPI of any team in the Ohio Valley Conference. This year is the highest SEMO has ranked in RPI under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. The Redhawks other RPI rankings with Sawyers at the helm include 87th (2021), 136th (2017), 200th (2018, 2020) and 259th (2019). SEMO has faced four teams ranked among the top 63 in RPI, including Dallas Baptist (5th, 2-1), Missouri (40th, 0-1), Ole Miss (59th, 1-0) and Belmont (63rd, 2-1). The Redhawks are 5-3 in those contests.

Miller Gets Pair of Saves

Right-hander Kyle Miller pitched five scoreless innings out of the bullpen en route to picking up two saves in Southeast Missouri's sweep of SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27). Miller struck out four and allowed only one hit in three innings during game one. In the series finale, he struck out three and gave up just one hit in two more scoreless innings. For the weekend, Miller struck out seven, walked two and scattered two hits in five innings. He has allowed only four earned runs in 27.2 innings through 14 relief appearances this season. Miller ranks tied for third in the Ohio Valley Conference with six saves. He also leads the team and ranks second in the league with five wins (5-2).

Keck Triples and Scores

After Tyler Wilber's game-tying home run in the bottom of the ninth inning vs. Murray State (Apr. 10), Andrew Keck tripled and later scored the winning run in Southeast Missouri's 11-10 victory. The triple was Keck's first of the season. For the year, he ranks second on the team with a .345 batting average. Keck is also second in hits (40) and RBI (33), and leads the Redhawks with 10 doubles. Additionally, he has six home runs and seven stolen bases, both of which rank third.

OVC Slate

The 24-game Ohio Valley Conference slate for the reigning OVC Champion and preseason favorite Southeast Missouri baseball team started with a series sweep of SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27). The rest of the league schedule includes home series with Murray State (Apr. 8-10), Morehead State (Apr. 22-24) and UT Martin (May 13-15). SEMO's OVC road schedule consists of Austin Peay (Apr. 1-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 14-16), Belmont (Apr. 29-May 1) and Eastern Illinois (May 19-21).

Yard Work

Southeast Missouri has homered in 34 of its 43 games and hit a series-best 10 round-trippers vs. Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). SEMO finished with a season-high five home runs in two games --vs. Bradley (Mar. 4); vs. Valparaiso (Mar. 13). Twenty-four of the Redhawks home runs have come against Missouri Valley Conference teams. SEMO is second in the Ohio Valley Conference behind Tennessee Tech (84) with 75 home runs. The Redhawks have hit a home run in 11-straight games. The last time SEMO

did not homer in a game was at Tennessee Tech (Apr. 14).

Atop the OVC

As a team, Southeast Missouri leads the Ohio Valley Conference in wins (30), RBI (315) and strikeouts (pitching) (391). Individually, Tyler Wilber leads the league in RBI (57) and Jevon Mason is first among league leaders in runs (54). Jason Rackers is first in strikeouts looking (19).

Bullpen Gets it Done

Southeast Missouri's bullpen did not allow a run in four-straight games from Mar. 25-29.. SEMO's relievers combined to pitch 19.1 scoreless innings and allowed only four hits in that span. The bullpen also accounted for 16 strikeouts, three wins and two saves during that time.

Klein Time

Right-hander Anthony Klein earned his first career win in relief when he beat Saint Louis (Mar. 29). A freshman from St. Louis, Klein tossed 3.2 scorless innings of no-hit baseball. He also struck out five and did not give up a walk against the Billikens. Klein was the Prospect League's top reliever last summer for the Cape Girardeau-based Cape Catfish.

Spencer For Hire

Junior Spencer Parker got his first NCAA Division I RBI-hit with a single in the top of the ninth inning at Saint Louis (Mar. 29). Parker, a transfer from Iowa Western Community College, finished with a career-high two hits in that contest. He matched his career-best with two hits at Ole Miss (Apr. 19).

Winning Streak Ends at 11

Southeast Missouri saw its 11-game winning streak end when it fell to Indiana State, 10-1, on Mar. 15. The winning streak was SEMO's longest since it won 11 in a row (Mar. 18-Apr. 5) during the 2016 campaign. At the time, it was the third-longest winning streak in NCAA Division I baseball this year.

Great Work Williams

Right-hander Austin Williams picked up his first two wins of the season out of the bullpen for Southeast Missouri last week. Williams struck out four, walked none and allowed just one hit in 3.1 scoreless innings to get his first win at Arkansas State (Mar. 8). He then struck

out a career-high seven in the longest outing of his career (five innings) to beat Valparaiso (Mar. 13). Williams retired seven-straight Valpo hitters exiting the game in the ninth. For the week, he went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA, allowed just one run, scattered four hits, struck out 11 and walked one in two relief appearances.

They Did That Twice?

In each of the final two games of its series against Valparaiso (Mar. 13), Southeast Missouri homered three times and scored six runs in an inning. SEMO trailed, 6-3, in game one before Peyton Leeper, Tyler Wilber and Lincoln Andrews homered in the bottom of the fourth. That six-run inning lifted the Redhawks to a 16-6 win as SEMO scored the final 13 runs of the game. In game two, the Redhawks were down, 3-0, when Jevon Mason, Wilber and Brett Graber homered as part of a six-run third inning. SEMO later won that contest by a score of 10-8. The Redhawks fell behind in the first inning during every game against Valparaiso before sweeping the series with three comefrom-behind victories.

Seeing Double

The Redhawks scored double-digit runs 15 times this season. Southeast Missouri scored 10 or more runs in seven consecutive games for the first time in program history from Feb. 27-Mar. 8. The Redhawks rank tied for second in the Ohio Valley Conference with 327 runs.

Power Outage

Ten different players have homered for Southeast Missouri this season. Tyler Wilber leads the Redhawks with 15 home runs, while Andrew Keck (14), Jevon Mason (10) and Lincoln Andrews (10) join Wilber with 10 or more homers. Peyton Leeper and Brett Graber have six and Ty Stauss and Ben Palmer each have five. Joel Vaske and Spencer Parker have four apiece.

Leeper Tabbed OVC Player of the Week

Southeast Missouri utility player Peyton Leeper won Southeast Missouri's first Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Week honor of the 2022 season on Mar. 14. A native of Mokane, Missouri, Leeper homered in all four of his starts last week helping the Redhawks extend their winning streak to 11 games. He broke SEMO's series-opener against Valparaiso (Mar. 12) open with a grand slam, the first of his career. Leeper then homered in both games of the series-ending doubleheader against the Beacons the following day. His second round-tripper that day was a game-winning two-run homer in the bottom of the eighth inning during the nightcap. Leeper's other home run for the week came in a midweek matchup at Arkansas State (Mar. 8). In the Valparaiso series alone, Leeper finished with three home runs, six runs scored and nine RBI. For the week, he hit .353 with four of his six hits coming via the long ball. He scored nine times, had 10 RBI, boasted a 1.059 slugging percentage, recorded a .500 on-base percentage and was a perfect 3-of-3 in stolen bases. Leeper carries a six-game hitting streak into this week's action. Leeper won the award for the first time in his career. UT Martin right-hander Rhett Fetner (Pitcher of the Week) rounded out the week's honorees.

Wilber Clears 200 Hits

Tyler Wilber went over 200 career hits in the Redhawks series sweep of Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). Wilber hit a team-high .500 in the series. He had four runs, six hits, three home runs, seven RBI and a 1.250 slugging percentage against the Beacons. Wilber got his 200th career hit on a two-out single in the bottom of the eighth inning during game two of the series. He now has 246 hits in his career.

Over 150

Andrew Keck (190) surpassed 150 hits in his career against Valparaiso (Mar. 12-13). Keck hit .357 with a run scored, home run and two RBI against the Beacons. He is the second player on this year's team to reach 150 or more hits joining Tyler Wilber (246). Jevon Mason became the third player on this year's roster to get over 100 career hits (109).

NCAA Division I Rankings (Top-25)

As of games through May 1 the Redhawks rank among the top 25 NCAA Division I teams home runs per game (12th, 1.7), home runs (15th, 75) and winning percentage (19th, .714). Individually, Tyler Wilber 17th in RBI (55) and 23rd in RBI per game (1.3). Jevon Mason rates 14th in runs (54) and 12th in runs per game (1.3), while Kyle Miller is 14th in wins (7).

Stealing the Show

Andrew Keck is 9-of-13 on the basepaths this season. Keck has 43 stolen bases and is ninth on Southeast Missouri's all-time career stolen base list. Jevon Mason leads SEMO in stolen bases with 15 in 17 attempts.

Graber Goes Off

Outfielder Brett Graber hit a series best .455 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs and eight RBI in Southeast Missouri's threegame set vs. Bradley (Mar. 4-5). Graber went 5-for-11 at the plate. He also walked twice, boasted a 1.182 slugging percentage and finished with a .538 on-base percentage against the Braves.

Double-Digit Hits

Southeast Missouri registered double-digit hits in 22 games. SEMO is 19-3 in games when it gets 10 or more hits. It finished with a season-high 16 hits vs. Saint Louis (Mar. 1) and Valparaiso (Mar. 13).

RBI Guys

Tyler Wilber and Andrew Keck are first and second in the Ohio Valley Conference with 57 and 53 RBI, respectively. Wilber (17) and Keck (16) have combined for 33 multiple-RBI games this season.

Huge Week for Keck

Andrew Keck hit safely in three of Southeast Missouri's four wins last week. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, Keck opened the week by going 4-for-5 with a double, grand slam, career-high four runs and career-best seven RBI vs. Saint Louis (Mar. 1). The grand slam was Keck's second of the season that came in a three-day span. He also went 3-for-4 with two runs and one RBI vs. Bradley (Mar. 5) after finishing with two hits and two RBI the day before against the Braves. SEMO swept BU for its second series sweep of the season. For the week, Keck hit .563 (9-for-16) with nine runs, a double, grand slam, 11 RBI, three stolen bases and three walks. He boasted a .813 slugging percentage and .600 on-base percentage, as well.

Career Day for Keck

Catcher Andrew Keck went 4-for-5 with a grand slam, double, two singles, four runs scored, two stolen bases and seven RBI to lead Southeast Missouri to its win over Saint Louis

(Mar. 1). Keck hit safely in each of his first three at-bats. His four runs and seven RBI are new career-highs, while his four hits match a career-best. Keck leads the team with a .412 batting average.

Grand Slamming

Andrew Keck hit his second grand slam in three days against Saint Louis (Mar. 1). Keck launched his team-high third home run of the season over the left field wall in the bottom of the sixth inning. He smashed his first career grand slam to help send Southeast Missouri to a 10-2 win over Bellarmine (Feb. 27). That round-tripper came in the bottom of the first inning against the Knights.

Mason Plays Strong

Leadoff man Jevon Mason is Southeast Missouri's fourth-leading hitter with a .308 batting average. Mason ranks first on the team in runs (54), tied for third in doubles (11) and tied for second in home runs (10). He is also fourth on the team in slugging percentage (.588) and fourth in on-base percentage (.419) through 42 starts.

Over .300

Southeast Missouri has four players hitting over .300 through 43 games this season. Andrew Keck leads the team with a .371 clip, while Tyler Wilber (.354), Brett Graber (.323) and Jevon Mason (.308) follow. Those four players have accounted for 173 RBI, as well.

Six-Inning Starts

Left-hander Noah Niznik and right-hander Jason Rackers have combined for six. six-inning starts this season. Niznik went six innings to beat Bellarmine for his first win on Feb. 27 allowing just one run on five hits. He also struck out two and walked one in his longest start since pitching seven innings in a no-decision vs. Austin Peay (Mar. 20, 2021). Rackers picked up his second victory of the year after scattering four hits, giving up three runs and striking out four in six innings at Missouri State (Mar. 19). He then collected six strikeouts when he worked six innings in a no-decision vs. SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25). Niznik worked six innings with seven strikeouts in a no-decision at Austin Peay (Apr. 2). Most recently, Rackers had a season-high seven strikeouts in a win over Murray State (Apr. 8) and worked a season-long 7.1 innings

with five strikeouts in a no-decision at Belmont (Apr. 29).

What a Weekend!

The Redhawks used a pair of extra inning victories to win their season-opening series on the road at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 18-20). Southeast Missouri stunned the Patriots with 7-6 win in 12 innings on Feb. 18, a game that lasted four-and-a-half-hours. In less than 24 hours, the Redhawks turned around to come-from-behind and beat DBU, 6-5, in 10 innings during another one-run affair. SEMO claimed a series win against a ranked opponent for only the second time in program history. The Redhawks also took two of three at then-#16 Alabama to open the 2009 campaign.

Home-Openers

Southeast Missouri improved to 21-10 all-time in home-openers in its NCAA Division I era (since 1992). The Redhawks are now 4-2 in such games under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. Sawyers' home-opening wins came in 2022 (8-7, vs. Bellarmine), 2017 (22-2, vs. Western Illinois), 2019 (5-1, vs. Western Michigan) and 2021 (4-3, vs. Illinois State).

Miller Named OVC Pitcher of the Week

Southeast Missouri sophomore right-hander Kyle Miller won the first Ohio Valley Conference Pitcher of the Week award of the 2022 season on Feb. 21. Miller picked up his first win of the season at #22 Dallas Baptist on Feb. 18. He came out of the bullpen to toss six scoreless innings to help lead the Redhawks to a 12-inning one-run upset of the nationally-ranked Patriots. Miller struck out four, walked two and allowed only three hits in his first appearance of the year as SEMO posted a series win against a ranked opponent for only the second time in program history.

Ranked Teams Fall on Opening Day

#22 Dallas Baptist was one of six ranked teams to lose on opening day. Southeast Missouri edged the Patriots, 7-6, in 12 innings on Feb. 18. The win snapped an eight-game losing streak against ranked opponents for the Redhawks and marked their first victory over a ranked foe since Apr. 29, 2018 (10-6, vs. #20 Tennessee Tech). After getting two wins against the Patriots, Andy Sawyers now has a

total of three victories over ranked teams as SEMO's head coach.

Vote-Getters

Southeast Missouri was one of two Ohio Valley Conference teams receiving votes in this week's National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Poll on Feb. 21. Dallas Baptist, which was ranked #22 entering the 2022 season, dropped out of the poll after losing two of three in its season-opening series against the Redhawks.

Redhawk Debuts

Nine players, including Spencer Parker, Joel Vaske, Ryan Malzahn, Ben Palmer, Wyatt Grant, Jason Rackers, Tommy Windt, Ethan Osborne and Anthony Klein made their Southeast Missouri debuts during opening weekend at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 18-20). Palmer started three games at second base and Vaske saw action in all three contests and logged two starts. Rackers also struck out six in 5.2 innings during SEMO's game two win on Feb. 19.

Big Hits

Down, 3-1, with one out in the top of the ninth inning of game two at #22 Dallas Baptist (Feb. 19), pinch-hitter Joel Vaske hit a three-run home run to put the Redhawks ahead. SEMO scored four runs in the inning to grab a 5-3 advantage. After DBU hit a two-run home run to send the game to extra innings in the bottom of the ninth, Brett Graber hit a two-out single to score Andrew Keck for the game-winner. Keck doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored the winning run on Graber's hit. Vaske hit .333 with two extra base hits, two runs, four RBI, a .788 slugging percentage and .455 on-base percentage in his first three games as a Redhawk.

Season-Openers

Southeast Missouri improved to 13-18 all-time in season-openers during its NCAA Division I era (since 1992). SEMO is now 4-2 in such games under Head Coach Andy Sawyers. SEMO beat Western Michigan at home in 2019, UT Arlington in Nacogdoches, Texas in 2017, South Alabama in Mobile, Alabama in 2021 and #22 Dallas Baptist in Dallas, Texas for Sawyers' season-opening victories.

Season 64

The 2022 campaign marks Southeast Missouri's 64th year of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 31st season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,424-1,151 all-time and 889-763-1 at the NCAA Division I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 444-299-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won five OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2021), four OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016, 2021) and made four NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016, 2021) in program history.

OVC Preseason Favorite

Southeast Missouri was tabbed the preseason favorite in the 2022 Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Preseason Poll on Feb. 10. The reigning OVC regular-season and tournament champion, SEMO received eight of the possible 18 first-place nods in the overall voting by league Head Coaches and Communication Directors. SEMO accumulated a total of 114 points, while Murray State - which the Redhawks beat to win the OVC Tournament crown in 2021 - was picked second with four first-place votes and 104 points. Morehead State (93 pts.), Austin Peay (87 pts.) and Belmont (86 pts.) round out the top five, while SIU Edwardsville (55 pts.), Eastern Illinois (50 pts.), Tennessee Tech (43 pts.) and UT Martin (16 pts.) complete the nine-team predicted order of finish.

2022 Redhawks

The Redhawks 2022 roster consists of 38 players, including four seniors, 16 juniors, nine sophomores and nine freshmen. Southeast Missouri returns five position starters and two starting pitchers. SEMO also has each of its top five hitters back from last season.

Wilber Named OVC Preseason Player of the Year

Senior shortstop Tyler Wilber was voted the 2022 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Player of the Year. A native of Los Alamitos, California, Wilber started all 52 games last season. A Second-Team All-OVC pick, he was Southeast Missouri's leading hitter witha .378 batting average. Wilber also led the Redhawks in RBI (49), total bases (109), slugging percentage (.542), and hits (76). He finished the regular-season with a league-best .400

batting average. Additionally, Wilber was a semifinalist for the Brooks Wallace Award.

Batting Titles

Tyler Wilber won the Ohio Valley Conference regular-season batting title twice in his career to date. Wilber was hitting .400 at the end of regular-season play in 2021 and hit .383 during the 2019 campaign.

What a Career!

Tyler Wilber is in his fourth-year as Southeast Missouri's starting shortstop. Wilber has a career batting average of .376. His batting average is the second-highest in a career among players in SEMO's NCAA Division I era behind Todd Shylanski (.387, 1991-92). Wilber ranks fourth all-time among the Redhawks career leaders in batting average and sixth in on-base percentage (.467). He has 246 hits, 147 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, 26 home runs and 158 RBI in 167 starts.

Mason Secures Preseason All-OVC Honors

Left fielder Jevon Mason joined Tyler Wilber on this year's Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Mason, who hails from West Des Moines, Iowa, made the league's All-Tournament Team in his first year as a Redhawk in 2021. He ranked second on the team with a .350 batting average behind Wilber. Mason led Southeast Missouri with 14 doubles and boasted a team-best .447 on-base percentage.

167 and Counting

Tyler Wilber has never missed a start in his Southeast Missouri career. The shortstop has started 167 consecutive games as the most experienced player on the roster. Wilber committed only nine errors in 52 starts at short in 2021.

SEMO Spring Fact

Southeast Missouri's baseball (20-1), softball (11-0) and women's tennis (4-2) teams are a combined 35-3 at home this season. All three are reigning Ohio Valley Conference Champions. Additionally, the women's tennis team won this year's OVC Tournament crown and punched its ticket to the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever.

From Walk-On to Scholarship

What a rookie season right-hander Kyle Miller had for Southeast Missouri in 2021. Miller, who joined the team as a walk-on, compiled a 4-2 record in 20 appearances and five starts. He rated third on the team with 52 strikeouts in 51.1 innings. Miller picked up his first career save on six outs in the Redhawks season-opening win at South Alabama a year ago and then finished his freshman year by throwing a complete game two-hitter with 10 strikeouts in the Redhawks Ohio Valley Conference Tournament Championship win over Murray State. Miller begins his 2022 campaign as a scholarship player.

2022 Schedule

A 55-game schedule with 25 matchups at Capaha Field is in store for the Southeast Missouri baseball team this upcoming 2022 season. SEMO opens its season with a three-game series at reigning Missouri Valley Conference regular-season and tournament champion Dallas Baptist on Feb. 18-20. DBU is one of four NCAA Tournament teams from last season included on the Redhawks 2022 docket. Southeastern Conference member Ole Miss, which hosted the NCAA Regional SEMO played in during the 2021 campaign, will welcome the Redhawks for a midweek tilt on Apr. 19. Indiana State and Oklahoma State are the other 2021 NCAA Tournament participants. SEMO heads to ISU for a two-game set on Mar. 15-16 and travels to OSU (May 6-8) for its final non-conference series. OSU was runner-up in the Big 12 Conference Tournament last season. The Redhawks also face Kentucky (Feb. 22), Bellarmine, Saint Louis (Mar. 1, Mar. 29), Bradley (Mar. 4-6), Arkansas State (Mar. 8, Apr. 5), Valparaiso (Mar. 11-13), Missouri State (Mar. 18-20. May 10) and Southern Illinois (Apr. 12. Apr. 26) in non-conference action. SEMO hosts Bellarmine in its home-opening weekend on Feb. 25-27. The Redhawks 24-game Ohio Valley Conference schedule begins with a home series against SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 25-27). Murray State (Apr. 8-10), Morehead State (Apr. 22-24) and UT Martin (May 13-15) round out SEMO's home OVC foes. SEMO will make trips to Austin Peay (Apr. 1-3), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 14-16), Belmont (Apr. 29-May 1) and Eastern Illinois (May 19-21) for its four conference road series.

OVC Tournament Moves to Lexington

For the first time in 2022, the OVC Baseball Championship will be held at the Lexington Legends Ballpark in Lexington, Kentucky on May 25-28. Since 2001, the Championship has been held at four other neutral locations, including Paducah, Kentucky (2001-09), Jackson, Tennessee (2010-16, 2021), Oxford, Alabama (2017-18) and Marion, Illinois (2019).



ndy Sawyers is the reigning Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year after leading Southeast Missouri to the league's regularseason and tournament titles, and the program's fourth NCAA Tournament berth in 2021.

Sawyers looks to carry the momentume into the 2022 campaign, his sixth year as SEMO's head coach.

The Redhawks finished their championship season with an overall 30-22 record and 17-10 in the OVC. SEMO recorded 30 wins in a season for the first time with Sawyers at the helm and posted series wins in eight of its nine series against league foes in 2021.

Sawyers coached his first OVC Specialty Award-Winner when left-hander Dylan Dodd was tabbed the league's Pitcher of the Year.

Dodd later became the

highest draft pick in program history when he was selected in the third round by the Atlanta Braves in the 2021 Major League Draft. Additionally, Dodd wrapped up his final college season as a Second-Team Collegiate Baseball All-American.

Statistically, SEMO led the OVC with 14 saves and a .967 fielding percentage after committing just 49 errors in 52 contests. The Redhawks were also second in the conference in wins as their 30 victories marked the most in a season in five years.

In 2020, SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in OVC play when its season abruptly ended due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in

batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits (6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a league-high with 29 hits when play was suspended. Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Before they took the field in 2019, the Redhawks ushered in a state-of-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-tiem stats and performance metrics.

SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber

and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480).

Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers, including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and nine NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 40 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and nine top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman Josh Rolette who garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American honors in 2016. He also helped mentor Jake Scudder who was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. The Wildcats had three studentathletes on the All-Big 12 Teams that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to

stolen bases as the 149 steals were second-most in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399).

Before K-State, Sawyers spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American.

Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008, Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips to the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance at the 2005 College World Series. Sawyers, who lettered two years at Nebraska, worked with 12 Huskers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Alex

Collegiate Baseball.

After working as the volunteer assistant at Nebraska in 2000, Sawyers worked the 2001 and 2002 seasons as head coach at Hutchinson Community College, compiling an 87-30 record and two postseason berths. In 2001, the Dragons went 40-16 and won the Jayhawk West Sub-Regional, while the 2002 squad set a school record with 47 wins and was ranked as high as seventh by the NJCAA.

Sawyers' coaching career began at Northwestern (La.)

State in 1999 as a volunteer assistant coach, helping the Demons finish second in the Southland Conference.

He first played collegiately at Point Loma (Calif.) Nazarene College in 1994. Following a year off, he played at Mendocino (Calif.) Junior College in 1996 before finishing up his playing career at Nebraska.

A native of Willits, California, Sawyers received his bachelor (1998) and master's (2000) degrees from Nebraska. He is married to the former Dena Lindeblad and the couple have two sons, Andrew James (A.J.) and Alex.
