

Redhawk Tennis Complex



he Redhawk Tennis Complex serves as the home court for the Southeast Missouri State women's tennis team. The complex, which was built in 2000, features eight courts, all of which are lighted. The courts are a joint venture with the city of Cape Girardeau and are free to be used by the public when not in use by the Redhawks. The Redhawk Tennis Complex is located on the north side of campus at the intersection of Bertling and North Sprigg.







he Redhawk Success Center offers Southeast Missouri student-athletes a place to study and develop as students and campus leaders.

It is located in the Student Recreation Center, just south of Houck Stadium. The Redhawk Success Center offers a computer lab with 18 work terminals, study areas and rooms for group meetings.

The area is under the guidance of Director of Academic Services Sharon Burgard, Assistant Courtney Lawson and Graduate Assistants Emily Obergoenner and Caitlin Bamberger.

The beautiful facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by Southeast student-athletes. Last year, the Redhawks combined for a 3.12 cumulative grade point average in the fall and spring semesters. Over 60 percent of all student-athletes recorded a 3.0 or higher GPA. Thirteen of Southeast's 15 intercollegiate athletic teams recorded a team GPA over 3.0. The gym-

nastics team posted the best overall mark with a 3.85. In all, 16 student-athletes achieved a perfect 4.0 GPA.

Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress is monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study skills and life skills topics, and thus, enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes can also receive individualized academic programs which include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The Success Center staff works to get athletes involved in campus and community projects, as well. This is done to provide a support structure and greater opportunity for academic success. Through the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, the Success Center gives student-athletes personal and professional skills in order to facilitate successful and productive futures.

2012-13 Notables

- Southeast Missouri finished third in the OVC Commissioner's Cup for the 2012-13 school year. The third-place finish was the Redhawks highest in school history. Southeast accumulated a total of 104.25 points in the overall voting.
- Southeast student-athletes combined for a 3.12 cumulative grade point average in the fall and spring semesters. A total of 192 student-athletes recorded a 3.0 or higher GPA, accounting for 60 percent of all student-athletes. Sixteen Redhawks earned a perfect 4.0 GPA in 2012-13.
- In all, 63 student-athletes received their degrees, including 15 in the fall and 48 in the spring.

Success Center

- The Redhawks won four academic team awards and had five CoSIDA/Capital One Academic All-District selections in 2012-13. The gymnastics team was second in the nation with a 3.73 GPA in the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches/Women; the women's cross country team earned United States Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association All-Academic honors after ranking fifth in the nation with a 3.72 GPA; the men's cross country team ranked 11th in the nation with a 3.48 GPA to earn USTFCCCA All-Academic honors; and the women's soccer team won a National Soccer Coaches Association of America team academic award after ranking 13th in the nation with a 3.55 GPA.
- Southeast's football, women's soccer and women's tennis teams won the OVC Team Sportsmanship Award. Southeast's three sportsmanship awards tied for most in the conference in 2012-13.
- Southeast's women's gymnastics team earned an NCAA Public Recognition Award for academic performance. The gymnastics team posted a perfect 1,000 score and won the award for the third-straight year. Eight other Redhawk teams, including volleyball, men's cross country, women's cross country, women's outdoor track, women's indoor track, women's soccer and baseball also exceeded the national average in multi-year APR (974).
- Thirteen of Southeast's 15 teams achieved a cumulative grade point average over 3.0, including all 10 women's programs.

revention. Treatment. Rehabilitation. Education. Those are the four primary phases of athletic training, and the Southeast Missouri athletic training staff strives to fulfill all of those areas when working with studentathletes on a daily basis.

Southeast student-athletes are offered the best care possible by the athletic training staff. Head Athletic Trainer Alfred Castillo directs the Sports Medicine department which includes four full-time athletic trainers, six graduate assistants and several student assistants. The staff serves student-athletes around-the-clock at numerous facilities on campus.

The athletic trainers begin treatments and rehabilitation starting as early as 6 a.m., and are available until the last student-athlete is through. There are currently four athletic training facilities on campus. The staff treats out of the Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary training room is located. There are two other satellite athletic training rooms, including one at Houck Field

House and one at the Show Me Center.

The Southeast athletic training rooms are equipped with stationary bikes, hand weights, therapeutic modalities and the latest physical therapy equipment. Each component is strategically designed to not only give the student-athlete the best care, but also to aid in returning to competition as quickly as possible.

Southeast Athletic Training has strong working relationships with local physicians and two hospitals in Cape Girardeau. It is from these hospitals that the Athletic Training department is assisted by four orthopedic physicians.

The Southeast Athletic Training program prides and commits itself to providing the best comprehensive, personalized and efficient healthcare to its studentathletes. Delivery of healthcare focuses on the prevention and management of athletic-related injuries or illnesses, while adhering to the National Athletic Trainers' Board of Certification Standards of Professional Practice. Our high quality of athletic healthcare is provided in combination with the education of athletic training students.



Strength & Conditioning



outheast Missouri's Strength and Conditioning program is committed to developing the total student-athlete through their experiences within a competitive training environment.

This will be accomplished by focusing on reducing the risk of injury and maximizing athletic potential through individual evaluation and program design.

Training Principles for Southeast Athletes:

- 1. Reduce the risk of injuries
 - If a student-athlete is injured, he/she will not be able to compete at practice or games.
- 2. Ensure the athletes are optimally prepared to compete
 - It is our responsibility to best manage all stressors that are placed on the student-athletes body in order to achieve the best results on the playing field.
- 3. Maximize athletic ability
 - We challenge each athlete, both physically and mentally, in order to achieve optimal results.

Exercises for Southeast Athletes are based on the following Principles:

- 1. Ground Based Movements
 - Athletes compete with their feet on the ground, and therefore, should train that way. The ability to produce force against the ground determines how fast athletes can run and how high they can jump.
- 2. Three-Dimensional Movements
 - Athletes must be able to stabalize themselves in all planes of movement. A fancy way of saying we use free weights (barbells/ dumbbells vs. machines).
- 3. Multi-Joint Movements
 - Very rarely in sport do athletes isolate one single joint at a time. Athletes can train more muscle mass at the same time.

The Southeast Missouri Strength and Conditioning program is under the direction of Ryan Johnson.

Redhawk student-athletes use various training facilities located inside the Student Recreation Center South.







r. Kenneth W. Dobbins became the seventeenth president of Southeast Missouri State University on July 1, 1999 after serving as the University's Vice President of Finance and Administration from 1991 to 1993, and Executive Vice President from 1993 until his appointment as president. He previously held several positions in higher education administration at Kent State University in Ohio.

During his tenure at Southeast, academic programs have been enhanced including the establishment of the College of Science, Technology, and Agriculture and the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts which opened in Fall 2007 on the new River Campus. A comprehensive review of all academic and non-academic programs has been accomplished to maintain quality and minimize student fee increases in the face of significant state appropriation reductions. Southeast continues to be recognized nationally for many of its outstanding accredited academic programs. For the ninth year in a row, Princeton Review recognized the Master of Business Administration program on its list of "Best Business Schools." GetEducated.com listed Southeast #1 on the list of "Top 10 Ranked Best Values Online MBAs-AACSB-Accredited";

Southeast is recognized in the top tier of the Midwest best regional universities in U.S. News Best Colleges for 2013; and Southeast was again named among the "Best in the Midwest" by Princeton Review. Additionally, StateUniversity. com ranked Southeast the safest public college campus in Missouri, Military-friendlyschools.com lists Southeast among the top schools that embrace veterans as students, and recent freshmen survey data indicate that new students applied only to Southeast at a rate three times the national average.

Enrollment has increased significantly since a 20-year-low in 1994 when some 7,900 students attended Southeast. In Fall 2005, enrollment topped 10,000 for the first time, and stood at more than 11,700 in 2012. Additionally, record enrollments in higher education have occurred in the University's 25-county service region during his tenure due to the establishment of new regional campuses in Sikeston and Kennett and a higher education center at Perryville serving place-bound students in and near those rural communities.

During Dr. Dobbins' presidency, more than \$300 million in capital construction and building improvement projects have enhanced the University. The Seabaugh Polytechnic Building and the \$58 million River Campus were constructed. Additionally, The Douglas C. Greene Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship to promote entrepreneurship and enhance the region's economy opened on the campus in 2005; Southeast dedicated its new, state-of-the-art David M. Barton Agriculture Research Center in 2009; two new 300-bed residence halls were constructed in 2002 and 2009; and the University currently is in the midst of more than \$90 million in capital renovation for maintenance and repair projects including the renovation of the historic 107-year-old Academic Hall, the remodeling and upgrades to the Magill and Rhodes sciences complex, a new residence hall on the north end of campus, and a new classroom/residence hall building at the River Campus.

Dr. Dobbins has served a two-year term as president of the Missouri Council on Public Higher Education (COPHE), the organization for presidents and chancellors of Missouri's public colleges and universities, and is the senior member of the organization. In 2007, he was selected to serve a three-year term on the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Board of Directors, an organization which represents over 420 U.S. public college and university members and more than 3.7 million students or 56 percent of the enrollment at all public four-year institutions. He was elected Secretary-Treasurer of the organization in 2008, chaired the organization in 2010-2011, and currently serves on the executive committee as past chair of the AASCU Board. Also, for the past nine years, he has served as one of four faculty members for the week-long AASCU New Presidents' Academy, and currently chairs the Finance Committee of the American Academic Leadership Institute. He previously served three years as president of the Ohio Valley Conference and is currently a member of the Conference finance subcommittee. In addition, he is a vice president of the executive board of the Greater St. Louis Council, Boy Scouts of America, and was elected by local council associates to serve on the National Council, Boy Scouts of America. In 2010, he was awarded the Silver Beaver Award, the highest honor bestowed upon a Boy Scout volunteer by a

He earned his B.S. degree in accounting from the University of Akron (Ohio) in 1971 and served as a commissioned officer and civilian executive in the U.S. Air Force for almost 10 years. He received the M.B.A. degree in 1979 from Old

Dominion University (Virginia), and the Ph.D. in higher education administration in 1987 from Kent State, where in 2011, he was awarded the Alumni Leadership Award for the College of Education, Health and Human Services Annual Hall of Fame Awards He is also a Certified Public Accountant in Ohio.

Dr. Dobbins and his wife, Jeanine Larson Dobbins, Founder and Director Emeritus of the Missouri Statewide Early Literacy Intervention Program based at Southeast, have a son, Paul, and a daughter-in-law, Stacey, who are both Southeast graduates, and two grandsons, Lincoln Kenneth and Brady Larson Dobbins.

he Southeast Missouri State University Department of Athletics is on the rise under the leadership of Mark Alnutt.

Alnutt is in his second year at Southeast after officially taking over as Director of Athletics on April 19, 2012.

When Alnutt speaks, you will often hear him say, "academic excellence," "social development," "competitive success," and the "I-55 Corridor." The first three are the core values of Southeast's mission, and the latter is the stretch between St. Louis and Memphis which is so important from a branding, recruiting and fundraising standpoint. Alnutt successfully hit all of those areas among other things over the course of a productive 2012-13 campaign.

Academically, Southeast studentathletes combined for a 3.12 cumulative grade point average in the fall and spring semesters. A total of 192 individuals recorded a 3.0 or higher GPA, accounting for 60 percent of all student-athletes. Thirteen of the Redhawks 15 teams achieved a cumulative grade point average over 3.0, including all 10 women's programs.

In line with academics, Alnutt constantly encourages Southeast coaches and student-athletes to be visible in the community. Student-athletes logged over 1,000 hours of community service in such projects like Pink Up Cape, Feed My Starving Children, Project Homeless Connect and Cape Girardeau Adopt-A-

Street last year.

Competition wise, the Redhawks placed third in the Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner's Cup, earning their highest finish in the history of the award. The women's track & field team captured the OVC Indoor Championship and the volleyball team won the OVC West Division. Southeast's men's basketball team finished second in the OVC West Division and turned in its first winning season since 2004-05, as well.

Alnutt was the driving force behind securing the first-ever NCAA football game at the new Busch Stadium in St. Louis. Longstanding regional-rivals Southeast Missouri and Southern Illinois will meet in that matchup on Sept. 21, 2013.

Total giving to athletics also increased by more than 12 percent under Alnutt. As a result, the department raised over \$350,000 through various fundraising initiatives.

Alnutt launched the inaugural Redhawks Road Trip which served as a series of outreach events to give fans, alumni, supporters and community members the opportunity to meet coaches, student-athletes and administration from Southeast Athletics. Stops were made at a number of different locations along the "I-55 Corridor" from May to June.

Prior to accepting his first job as Director of Athletics, Alnutt served as the Senior Associate Athletics Director at the University of Missouri.

Alnutt was the administrative liaison for football; supervised track and field, cross country, gymnastics and golf; spearheaded the department's project management team; served as the primary point person for the Athletic Department, overseeing all aspects of facility project master planning, development, management and implementation; and was involved with external department operations, including

development, game operations, marketing, media relations, Mizzou Sports Properties and ticket operations.

Alnutt also managed postseason travel arrangements for each of the University of Missouri's 20 intercollegiate sport programs. He oversaw Missouri's Nike contract, the Big Wheels and Flying Tiger programs and the department's relationship with Old Hawthorne Golf Club. In 2009, he managed a \$5 million video board project through the University of Missouri Sports Complex with the centerpiece being a new board at Faurot Field. He also oversaw the design and construction of the new Golden Girls/Gymnastics practice facility in the fall of 2011. Alnutt was actively involved in the solicitation and stewardship efforts of capital gift giving, as well.

Alnutt spent six years at the University of Missouri as director of football operations, adding an assistant athletic director title prior to the 2005-2006 season. In that role, his duties included coordinating the team's travel plans, overseeing the football budget, handling compliance issues, scheduling of facilities, assisting with recruiting operations and managing the day-to-day operations of the football program.

He coordinated public relations and community service events for football, and oversaw all organizational aspects for the University of Missouri's trips to the 2003 and 2005 Independence Bowl games played in Shreveport, La. He also represented the football program as part of the design team that planned the \$16 million expansion and renovation project which turned the Tom Taylor Building into the Missouri Athletics Training Complex.

Alnutt was a three-year letterman for the University of Missouri as a linebacker and tight end from 1993-1995 and was voted the team's champion of the year as a senior. He earned a degree in sociology in 1995 and went to work for Major Brands



as a senior salesman in Kansas City from February 1996 to August 1997. He returned to the University of Missouri to pursue a master's degree in public administration with an emphasis on sports psychology. He joined the Missouri football staff in 1998 as an administrative/video graduate assistant. Alnutt completed his master's degree in May 2000 and took over as director of football operations that August.

A native of Kansas City, Alnutt served as president of the board of directors for Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Boone County and was selected to participate in the 2002-2003 NCAA Leadership Institute for Ethnic Minority Males. In June 2005, he was recognized by Columbia Business Times as one of the Columbia's 40-Under-40 business leaders for his work in the community.

He has participated in the Division I-A Athletic Director's Institute, attended the NACDA Mentoring Institute and chaired the NCAA Women's Gymnastics committee. In 2010, he was the recipient of an Outstanding Chancellor's Staff recognition and the Barbara S. Uehling Award for Administrative Excellence at the University of Missouri.

More recently, Alnutt was selected to serve a four-year term on the NCAA Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee, effective Sept. 1, 2013.

The NCAA Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee (MOIC) was formed by the Association in January 1990 to review issues related to the interests of ethnic minorities and women. These issues focus on the education and welfare of minority student-athletes, as well as the enhancement of opportunities for ethnic minorities and women in coaching, athletics, administration, officiating and the NCAA governance structure.

Alnutt and his wife, the former Kate Hankins, are the parents of four children, Jaren, Kinleigh, Mason and Aidan.

new era in Southeast Missouri women's tennis begins under the direction of Leah Hottois in 2013-14.

Hottois accepted her first head coaching position on Sept. 5, 2013. She took over the Southeast helm after working as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's tennis programs at the University of Dayton in 2012-13.

A young team of five newcomers and two returnees will look to flourish in its debut season with Hottois as its coach. Four freshmen, a sophomore walk-on and two upperclassmen, including senior Heather Robinson form this year's squad which had nice fall campaign.

"As a team, I feel like we had a good fall season," said Hottois. "We have learned that it takes everyone to fight until the last point and to keep their teammates upbeat and positive."

Freshmen Valeriia Kashina (Togliatti, Russia) and Valeriia Nagovitcina (Togliatti, Russia) will challenge at the top of the lineup this season.

Prior to Southeast. Kashina took first-

place in the Championship of Samara Region doubles competition and finished third in the Championship Russian Federation. She was a three-time winner of the Samara Region Championship. In addition, Kashina achieved a top-30 national ranking and was rated first position in her city and region before joining the Redhawks.

"Valeriia has a strong serve and forehand," said Hottois. "She is quick and eager to help lead our team and is very supportive of her teammates."

Nagovitcina registered one singles victory this past fall when she beat Southern Illinois' Polina Dozortseva on Oct. 26.

"Valeriia likes coming to the net and finishing points," commented Hottois. "She never gives up."

Freshman Ekaterina Donetskova (Samara, Russia) and senior Heather Robinson (Durham, England) will likely interchange in the middle of the Redhawks order.

Donetskova was a two-time winner of the singles title at the Samara Championship. She ranked as high as No. 29 in her country in 2009 and was crowned the National Russian Tournament Under-16 singles champion in 2008.

Meanwhile, Robinson is the Redhawks only senior. She compiled a team-best 6-2 singles record during the fall. Last season, Robinson ranked second on the team with nine singles victories, including seven at the No. 1 position.

"Ekaterina comes to the net and finishes off points with volleys and swinging volleys," said Hottois. "Heather is eager for the spring season to start and is looking to have a successful year."

Freshman Annisa Warasanti (Bandung, Indonesia) and junior Melissa Martin (Wolverhampton, England) round out the singles lineup.

Warasanti put together a team-best 6-2 singles record in the fall. She went a perfect 4-0 to win the Division 3 singles portion of Austin Peay's Fall Tournament and posted

two three-set victories on the final day of play.

Warasanti signed with the Redhawks in April after ranking as high as No. 4 in her country, where whe won national championships at both the Inter-Province and Inter-City levels.

"Annisa is a steady and consistent player. She has a variety of shots and plays with a lot of heart," said Hottois.

Martin fashioned a 3-6 singles record and paired up with Jessica Courtnell for a teambest 8-5 doubles mark a year ago. She earned two of her singles wins at the No. 5 position.

"Melissa is aggressive in doubles and will finish off points," quoted Hottois.

Sophomore walk-on **Katy Brady (Farmington, Mo.)** completes this year's roster. Brady earned All-Conference and All-District honors at Farmington High School.

"Katy is very positive and upbeat," concluded Hottois. "She tries to help the freshmen understand that they have great shots."

Overlooking the Mississippi River, a Cultural Arts Center and transformed Seminary Building are now home to the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts. With the coming of this magnificent facility, the number of new students planning to major in the visual and performing arts doubled in one year.

- Art students have five interconnected art studios for painting, drawing, printmaking, fibers and design plus two computerized looms, as well as two presses in the printmaking studio and a computer design lab with the latest hardware and software available.
- Students find internships and professional experience at the Berkshire Theatre Festival, the Lucille Lortel Theatre in New York, the McLeod Summer Theatre or the University of Connecticut Summer Theatre and more.

- In addition to performances throughout the season, featuring world famous guest artists, the Southeast Missouri Symphony Orchestra exchanged music as well as culture in China when they performed concerts in Shanghai and Beijing in 2009.
- The River Campus gives students the opportunity to show their work in a variety of first-class venues: the 950-seat Donald C. Bedell Performance Hall is a proscenium theatre with spacious stage and backstage areas. The 200-seat Wendy Kurka Rust Flexible Theatre can be configured in unlimited ways for "black box" productions. The 200-seat Robert F. and Gertrude L. Shuck Music Recital Hall features nearly perfect acoustics. a student/faculty art gallery features technology that allows for the display of 3-D animation, as well as painting, prints, ceramics and sculpture. The Rosemary Berkel and Harry L. Crisp II Museum has an interactive educational theatre, art gallery for changing exhibitions and a permanent display featuring southeast Missouri.

- Business programs are housed in Dempster Hall, a wireless Internet environment featuring an electronic presentation lab and more than 400 networked computers with the latest software.





During a summer field training course for the Professional Officer Corps, students experience survival training, aircraft and air crew orientation, physical training and the inner operations of an Air Force base.
- Our nationally accredited social work program requires students to complete 480 hours of field education under the supervision of experienced social workers.
- Southeast has a strong connection with the Law Enforcement Academy and has more than 30 years of partnerships in all branches of criminal justice at the federal, state and local levels. Our students intern with the U.S. Marshals Service; the ATF; the U.S. Secret Service; Federal Probation; Missouri Division of Probation and Parole; Missouri Youth Services and other law enforcement agencies.
- The dietetics program is accredited by the American Dietetic Association Commission. Our graduates have a success rate of nearly 100 percent on the national exam to become a registered dietitian.

An education in the liberal arts gives you broad-based training for careers in business, the arts, media, education and the legal profession.

- Southeast's mass communication program is accredited by the Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communications (ACEJMC). Only one other institution in Missouri has this elite accreditation. Our public relations program is one of only 28 institutions—none in Missouri—that holds certification by the Public Relations Society of America (PRSA). Only 12 other institutions in the world have recognition from both ACEJMC and PRSA for their mass communication program.
- Students can work at two campus radio stations (NPR affiliate KRCU 90.9 FM and KDMC 103.7), the Arrow student newspaper and "U2" cable television station.
- Our certified historic preservation program is one of a few U.S. programs that offer a four-year degree and is among a small number to have full membership in the National Council for Preservation of Education.
- During the last five years, Southeast's pre-law students have exceeded the national LSAT average score, and their placement rate in law school approaches 100 percent.
- Students majoring in philosophy have a 100 percent acceptance rate to graduate and law school.
- Our students make politics come alive by working on political campaigns and by serving as interns. Each year approximately 30 students from a variety of majors around the University travel to Washington, D.C. to conference with some of the nation's top scholars at the Center for Strategic and International Studies.


