

Capaha Field

The Southeast Missouri baseball team calls Capaha Field home. Located just two blocks west of the Southeast Missouri State campus, Capaha Field is owned and operated by the City of Cape Girardeau.

In addition to the ball field, Capaha Park features playgrounds, a pond, picnic areas, and a recently added frisbee golf course.

Redhawk fans enjoy watching the Southeast Missouri baseball team from the hillsides behind the first base dugout and beyond the left field wall. Southeast consistently leads the Ohio Valley Conference in attendance each season.

Capaha Field has a natural grass surface and is considered to be one of the best playing fields in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Capaha Field includes a state-of-the-art press box which was completed prior to the start of the 2006 season. The press box, which is fully equipped with wireless broadband internet access, televisions, a kitchen/lounge area and restroom, gives staff and media an excellent view behind home plate.

The dimensions of Capaha Field are 330 feet down the lines, 380 to the alleys, and 400 to straight-away center field. The fence running along the outfield is nine feet high.

Capaha Field also serves as the current home of the Plaza Tire Capahas, the oldest amateur baseball team in America.

"Tiger" Joe Uhls Locker Room


Located inside Houck Field House on the Southeast Missouri State campus is the "Tiger" Joe Uhls Baseball Locker Room.

The locker room provides Redhawks baseball players with the modern amenities commonly found in professional locker rooms. Most recently, hardwood floors were added in 2005.

The locker room features 35 professional-style lockers for players,

rest rooms, a shower area and ample storage space for equipment and uniforms. An entertainment system also provides players the opportunity to view scouting and coaching video as well as watch television for leisure.

In addition, a study area with broadband internet capabilities is available for Redhawks student-athletes. Surrounding the locker room is a mural honoring the all-time greatest players and moments in Southeast Missouri State baseball history.



ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

he Redhawk Success
Center offers Southeast
Missouri studentathletes a place to study
and develop as students and
campus leaders.

It is located in the Student Recreation Center, just south of Houck Stadium. The Redhawk Success Center offers a computer lab with 18 work terminals, study areas and rooms for group meetings.

The area is under the guidance of Director of Academic Services Sharon Burgard and graduate assistants Oge Oge and Luke Staudt.

The beautiful facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by

enjoyed by Southeast student-athletes.

Last year, the Redhawks combined for a 3.15 cumulative grade point average in the fall and spring semesters. Over 60 percent of all student-athletes recorded a 3.0 or higher GPA. Eleven of Southeast's 15 intercollegiate athletic teams recorded a team GPA over 3.0. Additionally, Southeast student-athletes logged a record 4,100 hours of community service over the 2014-15 academic year.

Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress is monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time studentathletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study skills and life skills topics, and thus, enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes can also receive individualized academic programs which include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic

progress.

The Success Center staff works to get athletes involved in campus and community projects, as well. This is done to provide a support structure and greater opportunity for academic success. Through the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, the Success Center gives student-athletes personal and professional skills in order to facilitate successful and productive futures.







2014-15 Notables

- Eleven of Southeast's 15 athletic programs achieved a 3.13 or higher GPA. Women's cross country boasted a department best 3.79 GPA, followed by women's soccer (3.69), women's gymnastics (3.628), women's tennis (3.622), volleyball (3.45), softball (3.35), women's indoor/outdoor track & field (3.31), baseball (3.29), women's basketball (3.28) and men's cross country (3.13).
- In all, 195 individuals accumulated a 3.0 or higher GPA, accounting for 61 percent of the student-athlete population.
 A total of 140 student-athletes made Southeast's Dean's List -students must have a 3.5 or higher GPA to earn that distinction.
- Seventy-one student-athletes received their degrees.
- Southeast's women's gymnastics team was among those who received public recognition awards for top academic performance from the NCAA.
- Seven Southeast programs, including women's cross country, women's tennis, volleyball, baseball, men's cross country and men's indoor/outdoor track & field ranked among the top three in the Ohio Valley Conference's single year APR.

outheast Missouri's Strength and Conditioning program is committed to developing the total studentathlete through their experiences within a competitive training environment.

Southeast's weight room renovation project is substantially complete at Student Recreation Center-South.

Indoor turf, weights, equipment and lifting platforms were added as part of the renovation, which cost \$500,000. The facility now has more space and equipment to handle Southeast's larger teams or multiple teams training at the same time. Other things such as branding and lighting are yet to be finished.

Redhawk student-athletes began training in their re-vamped facility in January.

Training Principles for Southeast Athletes

Reduce the risk of injuries

If a student-athlete is injured, he/she will not be able to compete at practice or games.

Ensure the student-athletes are optimally prepared to compete

It is our responsibility to best manage all stressors that are placed on the studentathletes body in order to achieve the best results on the playing field.

Maximize athletic ability

We challenge each athlete, both physically and mentally, in order to achieve optimal results.

Exercises for Southeast Athletes are based on the following Principles:

Ground Based Movements

Student-athletes compete with their feet on the ground, and therefore, should train that way. The ability to produce force against the ground determines how fast athletes can run and how high they can jump.


Three-Dimensional Movements

Student-athletes must be able to stabilize themselves in all planes of movement. A fancy way of saying we use free weights (barbells/dumbbells vs. machines).

Multi-Joint Movements

Very rarely in sport do athletes isolate one single joint at a time. Student-athletes can train more muscle mass at the same time.

revention. Treatment. Rehabilitation. Education. Those are the four primary phases of athletic training, and the Southeast Missouri athletic training staff strives to fulfill all of those areas when working with student-athletes on a daily basis.

Southeast student-athletes are offered the best care possible by the athletic training staff. The Sports Medicine department includes three full-time athletic trainers, six graduate assistants and several student assistants. The staff serves student-athletes around-the-clock at numerous facilities on campus.

The athletic trainers begin treatments and rehabilitation starting as early as 6 a.m., and are available until the last student-athlete is

There are currently four athletic training facilities on campus. The staff treats out of the Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary training room is located. There are three other satellite athletic training rooms, including one at Houck Field House, one at

Houck Stadium, and one at the Show Me Center.

The Southeast athletic training rooms are equipped with stationary bikes, hand weights, therapeutic modalities and the latest physical therapy equipment. Each component is strategically designed to not only give the student-athlete the best care, but also to aid in returning to competition as quickly as

Southeast Athletic Training has strong working relationships with local physicians and two hospitals in Cape Girardeau. It is from these hospitals that the Athletic Training department is assisted by four orthopedic physicians.

The Southeast Athletic Training program prides and commits itself to providing the best comprehensive, personalized and efficient healthcare to its student-athletes. Delivery of healthcare focuses on the prevention and management of athleticrelated injuries or illnesses, while adhering to the National Athletic Trainers' Board of Certification Standards of Professional

Practice. Our high quality of athletic healthcare is provided in combination with the education of athletic training students.

or the first time in the history of Southeast Missouri baseball. the 2015 team repeated as the Ohio Valley Conference regular-season champions. The season culminated with an appearance in the OVC Tournament Championship for the first time since 2008.

The Redhawks finished their secondstraight championship season with a 36-23 overall record, a win shy of tying the wins record of 37.

Offensively, the Redhawks had an explosive season. The 2015 squad broke the program record for runs scored with 473 on the season and also set a new program record .977 fielding percentage. Southeast ranked high in a number of national statistics categories including ranking third in scoring (8.0 runs/game) and walks (326), fifth in runs scored (473), sixth in slugging percentage (.477), seventh in home runs (66), 12th in batting average (.303) and hits (635). 13th in doubles (129), and 17th in fielding percentage (.977).

In his first season in a Redhawk uniform, left-handed pitcher Joey Lucchesi dominated the league en route to earning the title of OVC Pitcher of the Year. Lucchesi began the season in the bullpen before settling into a starting role at the beginning of OVC play. He finished 7-1 in 10 conference starts and recorded a 2.13 ERA in 71.2 innings of work. On the season Lucchesi struck out 93 hitters and held batters to a .192 batting average.

The Redhawks finished with six total players honors on the OVC postseason squads including Lucchesi earning first team honors. First baseman Ryan Rippee, shortstop Branden Boggetto, designated hitter Garrett Gandolfo, and utility player Andy Lennington all picked up Second Team All-OVC accoladed. Rookie

> standout Trevor Ezell was named to the All

Freshman Team.

Other postseason honors included Boggetto earning ABCA/Rawlings All-South Second Team honors, Ezell being named NCBWA Second Team Freshman All-American, and Jason Blum picking up Capital One Academic All-American Second Team honors.

On June 10, 2015, junior left-handed pitcher Alex Winkelman was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 21st round (619th overall pick) of the Major League Baseball Draft.

The pre-conference slate saw the Redhawks go 4-6 while also battling latewinter weather conditions, forcing the Redhawks' original early home games to move to neutral locations.

OVC play began with a series victory over Eastern Kentucky followed by a road series win over an offensively strong Morehead State team.

From Morehead, Kentucky, the Redhawks traveled to Southeastern Conference powerhouse Arkansas. The Razorbacks took game in on a walk off in the bottom of the ninth inning, 4-3. The Redhawks rebounded and won a 12-11 shootout in game two of the series.

After three more conference series victories, the Redhawks traveled to No. 20 Missouri State. Southeast dropped a tight 2-1 decision to the Bears who would go on to reach a Super Regional.

Three more OVC series victories including sweeps of Jacksonville State and Murray State led up to the home finale against Tennessee Tech. Southeast dropped its only league series to the Golden Eagles.

Southeast traveled to Columbia, Missouri to face in-state foe Missouri on May 5. The Redhawks earned an 8-5 victory over the Tigers, who were ranked No. 21 in the nation at that time. It was Southeast's first win over a nationally ranked opponent since Southeast

defeated No. 16 Arkansas on May 4, 2011. The Redhawks finished the season 2-1 against SEC opponents and had beaten Mizzou two of the last three meetings.

The regular season ended with a series win on the road at Belmont, finishing OVC play with a 22-8 record and nine conference series victories.

Southeast Missouri baseball was listed on the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Top 30 Poll as having received votes following the regular season on May 18.

The Redhawks took a No. 1 seed and their second-straight regular-season championship into their 21st-straight OVC Tournament in Jackson. Tennessee.

Southeast drew No. 6 Belmont in the second round of the tournament after receiving a first-round bye. Southeast was stunned by the Bruins, 7-2, to knock them down to the consolation bracket of the double-elimination tournament.

After falling in the late game on May 21, Southeast had a quick turnaround to play the early game on May 22. Southeast throttled No. 5 Jacksonville State to stav alive and face No. 4 Tennessee Tech. The offense stayed hot to eliminate the Golden Eagles with a 14-1 victory.

Southeast avenged its loss to Belmont with a 9-4 victory to eliminate the Bruins on day four and advance to the championship round for the first time since 2008.

Heading into their fifth game in three days, the Redhawks were running low on pitching. The Redhawks' championship run came to an end with a 16-3 loss to No. 2 Morehead State in the Championship round.

Southeast finished runner-up in the OVC Tournament and earned three or more wins in the tournament for the sixth time in program history.

The Southeast Missouri baseball program held the Third Annual First Pitch Dinner Friday evening at the Isle Casino Cape Girardeau event center. Former Major League Baseball manager and ESPN personality Bobby Valentine headlined the event as the keynote speaker.

Over 200 Redhawks baseball supporters attended the event. This year's dinner sold out for a record crowd.

The evening also featured a recruiting update from assistant coach and recruiting coordinator Lance Rhodes. Interim Director of Athletics Brady Barke spoke to the sell-out crowd to give updates on current and future facility improvements.

The event included silent and live auctions featuring signed baseball memorabilia, St. Louis Cardinals and Blues ticket packages, travel experiences with the Redhawks, and sports gear among other items.

The live auction drew \$4,300 while the silent auction earned over \$2,500.

PRESIDENT VARGAS

r. Carlos Vargas became the 18th president of Southeast Missouri State University on July 1, 2015, after having served as acting president at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania.

The appointment of Dr. Vargas by the Southeast Missouri State University Board of Regents culminated a comprehensive and wide-ranging search process that began in the fall of 2014.

When named as the University's 18th president, Dr. Vargas said, "Southeast Missouri State University is an outstanding university with a national reputation, and I am honored to have been selected as its next president." Vargas said that as he became more familiar with the university, he was impressed with various aspects of Southeast including its core mission,

> accreditation efforts, on line

programs, faculty and staff, and the quality and diversity of its students.

"When I visited the Southeast Missouri State University campus. I was impressed with the institution's long history of service to the region and its unique strengths," Vargas said. "I know Southeast is deeply committed to being accessible and affordable, and continuing to offer accredited academic programs where graduates can meet the needs of employers."

Dr. Vargas was named acting president of Kutztown University by the institution's Council of Trustees, July 1, 2014, following Kutztown University's succession plan for acting president. He served as the provost and vice president for academic and student affairs, and had been the school's chief academic officer since 2006.

Prior to his tenure at Kutztown, Dr. Vargas was at Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio,

where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs. He previously served in several roles at Kent State University (Ohio) for a total of 18 years, including founding director of the program on electron beam technology. He was also Kent's associate dean for research, interim assistant dean for research, and he served as interim assistant dean for the School of Technology. He started his tenure at Kent State in 1985 as a professor, and continued to teach until his departure from the university.

Dr. Vargas began his career in higher-education at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), from which he received a Bachelor of Science degree in physics. His initial appointment was as a senior associate researcher for the Institute of Geophysics, and he later held a similar position for the University's Institute of Physics.

He earned his Ph.D. in physics and aerospace science from the University of Michigan and he has Master of Science degrees from Michigan in physics and aerospace science. He is married to Pam Vargas, who currently serves as director of Research and Grant Development at Southeast, and they have a son, a daughter, and one granddaughter.



BRADY BARKE

rady Barke, senior associate to the president at Southeast Missouri State University, was appointed to serve as Interim Director of Athletics.

The appointment came shortly after Mark Alnutt resigned as Southeast's Director of Athletics effective July 31, 2015.

Barke was selected as the Senior Associate to the President and Secretary to the Southeast Missouri State University Board of Regents, and has worked in that role since June 1, 2013.

Barke was closely involved with the hiring of head men's basketball coach Rick Ray and head football coach Tom Matukewicz. Ray was named Southeast's 20th head men's basketball coach on April 13, 2015 and Matukewicz was introduced as the Redhawks 13th head football coach on Dec. 18, 2013.

No stranger to athletics, Barke began at Southeast in 2008 as

Assistant Director of Athletics for Compliance & Eligibility. He was then promoted to Associate Director of Athletics for Compliance and Student Support Services in 2011.

Barke was responsible for administering the comprehensive National Collegiate Athletics Association (NCAA) compliance program, directing the baseball, track and field, and cross country programs, and directly supervising the athletics academic services, strength and conditioning and athletic training units. Barke managed the \$3 million athletics scholarship budget for the University's 15 NCAA sports. He directed the men's basketball and football programs in 2011-12, including football scheduling responsibilities. Additionally, Barke was in charge of converting all compliance paperwork to electronic format and assisted with solidifying

the College Classic football game at Busch Stadium.

Prior to Southeast. Barke served as a governance intern with the NCAA national headquarters in Indianapolis and as a law clerk with the Southern Illinois University-Carbondale Department of Athletics Compliance Office.

Barke was previously a member of the National Association of Athletics Compliance (NAAC) and NAAC Board of Directors. He has facilitated the NCAA Regional Leadership Academy, and served on both the NCAA Sports Wagering Task Force and Olympic Sports Liaison Committee. In addition, he was chair of the NAAC Education Committee.

Barke has a juris doctorate degree from Southern Illinois University School of Law and a bachelor of science degree in biology from Webster University. While a student at Webster,


Barke was a member of both the basketball and golf teams. He earned all-conference honors and received the Student-Athlete of the Year Award as a senior.

Barke is a member of the Missouri Bar and earned his MBA from Southeast.

He and his wife, Halley, made a gift to establish The Brady and Halley Barke Endowed Scholarship in March 2014. he Southeast Missouri baseball program will look to do something that has only been done twice in the history of the Ohio Valley Conference: threepeat as OVC Regular Season Champions. Southeast won back-to-back championships in 2014 and 2015.; the first time since the 2003 and 2004 seasons when Austin Peay accomplished the feat.

While the Redhawks would love to win their third-straight championship, the ultimate goal is to take their season to the next level, an opportunity they narrowly missed in 2015. Fourth-year head coach **Steve Bieser** believes the 2016 team has the ability to win the OVC Tournament and make an NCAA Regional appearance.

"I believe our clubs are very similar from last year to this year," Bieser began. "I feel offensively we've been able to fill in missing pieces from a very solid group of offensive players last year. Our newcomers have really adjusted well and really bought into our system. They match what we need to be a very good offense."

While the Redhawks lost a lot of numbers following the 2015 season, the core of the lineup returns in 2016 including six starters. Of those six returning position players, four were honored as All-OVC players a season ago.

"I think we retain a lot from last year's squad. We have a few position changes with moving some guys around to create the best lineup as well as create the best defense possible.

On paper, we like the way we look offensively and defensively. We are really looking forward to playing someone other than ourselves. We've seen our pitchers over and over since the start of Fall baseball and we're ready to see somebody in a different colored uniform."



Starting Pitchers

The pitching staff will see a lot of new faces this season after losing a bulk of last year's staff.

Reigning OVC Pitcher of the Year **Joey Lucchesi (Newark, California)** will continue to get the ball on Friday nights this season. Lucchesi finished OVC play with a 7-1 record and a 2.13 ERA while striking out 93 hitters on the season.

"Joey will return as our Friday night starter as he is very familiar with that role. We are very excited to have Joey back for his senior year and we expect to see big things from him in 2016. Joey came on really strong last year and we expect to see that again this year. We know how it is when you're tabbed as the OVC Pitcher of the Year, everyone is gunning for you; but I am confident Joey is ready to rise to the occasion and have a solid year."

The Redhawks will have two new faces filling the Saturday and Sunday roles in Clay Chandler (La Center, Kentucky) and Robert Beltran (El Centro, California).

Chandler comes to Southeast after fulfilling a relief role at Wabash Valley College the previous two seasons. Beltran made 12 starts and finished with a 2.17 ERA a season ago at Arizona Western.

"Clay will get the ball for us on Saturdays. He has done nothing but impress us from a standpoint of being able to throw three pitches in any count and mix his pitches. He is a really solid control guy.

"Robert has come on really strong in the spring. He will look to solidify the rotation with a lefty on Friday and Sunday."

Bieser believes one of the most prepared starting options going into the season is **Jacob Lawrence (Nixa, Missouri)**. Lawrence made 16 appearances and five starts a season ago.

"I'd say the guy who has pitched the best from our crop of starters has been Jacob. He's been outstanding, especially since he came back from holiday break. He looks like our most ready guy and looks like he has put in the most work over break. He came back really strong and has been really dominating the last few weeks. We will look to use him as a swing man and use him in really tight situations but I feel he could slide into a weekend starting role or start midweek."

The Redhawks fifth starting option will be freshman left-hander *Daniel Bergtholdt* (Ste. *Genevieve, Missouri*). Bergtholdt comes from an outstanding high school career at Valle Catholic High School.

"We have to see Daniel continue to progress as he's a young guy. He is learning on the job but he has the stuff to be a dominate starter; he just has to get over the hump and settle in. When he does get the ball for the first time, it will come down to him being able to control his emotions."

The Bullpen

After having only one lefty in the bullpen last year, the Redhawks have really bulked up on their southpaw options this season. Jake Busiek (Wildwood, Missouri) and Adam Pennington (Jackson, Missouri) will both



look to fulfill a middle-inning role as lefty options along with righty Justin Murphy (Kingdom City, Missouri).

"I like the way our middle relief is set up. We have guys who have been very dominate starters in the past that will fill relief roles this season. Justin can do anything on our staff from start to close; he has really electric stuff. Jake has come back from injury and has looked really well in his early moments with us and we like the way he's been throwing the ball. Adam is also one of those guys who can play any role on our team."

Southeast returns key experience in the backend of their bullpen. Seniors Alex Siddle (Belleville, Illinois) and Brady Wright (Jonesboro, Illinois) along with sophomore Matthew Wade (Cordova, Tennessee) will be called upon to come in and shut down games in tight situations.

"On the backend of the middle, we've got some guys who have been here a while in Alex, Brady, and Matt who have the chance of getting the ball in the seventh, eighth, and ninth innings of games. We like that mix of



guys on the backend of a game who have a lot of experience in that role and we will rely heavily on them. We look for their experience to be able to come in and shut the game down in its most crucial point."

Bieser added, "We feel this is the deepest pitching staff we've had so far but that will remain to be seen."

Senior Scott Mitchell (Dublin. California) will return after starting 42 games behind the plate in 2015. Mitchell hit .378 in OVC play last

Joining Mitchell, the coaching staff has recruited a powerful duo to back him up in Akron transfer Brian Lees (Brunswick, Ohio) and junior college transfer Kylar Robertson (Sand Spring, Oklahoma).

Lees played 55 games as a sophomore at Akron and hit .292 and drove in 21 runs. Robertson hit .338 a season ago at Eastern Oklahoma, drove in 38 runs, and blasted a team-leading seven home runs.

"With Scotty returning behind the plate and Brian and Kylar there to back him up, we've got a formidable group of catchers this season. They are three solid options at the catching position for us."


First Base

Preseason All-OVC and Louisville Slugger Preseason All-American Ryan Rippee (Springfield, Missouri) will be the Redhawks' first baseman in 2016 after having an explosive offensive season in 2015. Rippee hit .299, drove in 56 runs with 12 home runs and 17 doubles.

"Rippee returns at first base and has solidified that position. He did an outstanding job at that position last season defensively and had one of his best offensive seasons in his career."

Bieser likes his catching and first base connection this season both defensively and offensively. Robertson also has the ability to move from behind the plate to playing first if needed.

Second Base

Last year's freshman phenom Trevor Ezell (Alexander, Arkansas) will step in as the Redhawks' new second baseman. Ezell started all 59 games in his rookie season at four different spots: third base (33), left field (17), second base (8), and designated hitter (1). Ezell made a splash after leading the team in runs (66), hits (77), triples (6), walks (41), stolen bases (11), and at bats (246).

Ezell earned Freshman All-American honors from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association following his rookie campaign.

"We've moved Ezell from third to second and he has really adjusted well and I think that's more of his natural position and we hope to keep him there long term. He was excellent in the leadoff position last season and he will continue to have that role on our team."





Shortstop

Preseason All-OVC shortstop **Branden Boggetto (Joliet, Illinois)** started all 59
games at short last season. Boggetto led the
team in RBI (61), doubles (23), home runs (13),
slugging (.583), and total bases (141). He was
named Second Team All-OVC and ABCA/
Rawlings South All-Region Second Team.

Senior **Andy Lack (Kennett, Missouri)** also returns as a viable backup in the middle infield. Lack saw limited time in 2015 due to a broken leg but has rehabbed back to full strength heading into his senior season.

"Boggetto was very solid last year at short and we intend to keep him there. Andy has been playing really well so he makes a third really solid piece in the middle of our infield. Ezell and Boggetto will be our starters in the middle with Lack as a formidable backup for either of them."

Third Base

The Redhawks ultimate utility man *Hunter Leeper (Mokane, Missouri)* will get the starting nod at the hot corner, a position he played some time at last season. Leeper started 12 games in left and 11 games behind the plate a season ago.

"Hunter will move from the outfield in to third base this season. Hunter has been really solid anywhere we put him whether its behind the plate or on the infield or in the outfield. He has looked good defensively at third and he has really built his confidence up swinging the bat."

Junior college transfer **Chris Caffrey** (**Cleveland, Tennessee**) will look to come in and challenge Leeper for playing time at third.

"Chris will be at third base with Leeper.

He has done very well offensively in the preseason. We will have to find a good mix of having Leeper, Caffrey, and Robertson in the lineup. We will look to have them all see a lot of playing time."

Outfield

The outfield is expected to look brand new this season. Centerfielder *Clayton Evans* (*Fenton, Missouri*) will miss the 2016 season due to injury but will return next season as a senior.

Second Team All-OVC designated hitter **Garrett Gandolfo (San Diego, California)** will transition to left field this season. Gandolfo started as the Redhawks' DH in 42 games last year but also saw time at first. He hit .303, hit 12 doubles, eight home runs, and drove in 52 runs.

"We have moved Garrett to left field and he has continued to work really hard at being an above average outfielder. He has made a good adjustment in that position. We moved him to keep his bat in the lineup and allow someone else to DH."

The Redhawks will call upon **Dan Holst** (St. Louis, Missouri) to play centerfield. Holst comes to Southeast from Southwestern Illinois College where he hit .365 last season with 16 doubles and 27 RBI.

"Since day one, Dan has really impressed the coaching staff with his style of play and his hitting. He plays hard and is an all-around gamer. He does a very good job in center. He was projected to play right for us but he will do a great job of filling in for Clayton in center."

Daniel Costello (Edmond, Oklahoma)

comes to Cape Girardeau from junior college powerhouse Navarro College where he played all three outfield positions, something Bieser believes every outfielder on the Redhawk roster has the ability to do.

"Daniel has been limited in the Fall due to injury but he is back at full strength and looks to be apart of the starting outfield on opening day.

"Pretty much all of our outfielders have the ability to slide all over the outfield and play all three positions. They are very versatile. **Chris Osborne (Edmonds, Washington)** is right there in being able to play all three spots as well. He has been doing a fine job for us in the preseason."

2016 Schedule

The schedule features 56 total games including 27 played at the friendly confines of Capaha Park.

The season kicks off with a four-game road swing at Lamar and continues with a game at Alcorn State.

"I like the way our schedule is set up. We have the chance to open at Lamar and they will be ready to play us. They've had some outstanding weather to prepare. Their head coach has been there a long time and is on his farewell tour and I'm sure his team will be excited to go out and play for him opening weekend.

"Being able to open the season with a four-game slate gives us the option to see how some of our pitchers will fall into certain spots."

The Redhawks will play the home opener in a three-game series against Central Arkansas Mar. 4-6 then will head back out on the road for a tough stretch that features





four Southeastern Conference games and the start of OVC play.

"We will finally be home in week three against a very good Central Arkansas team then roll into a very tough stretch in mid-March featuring two games against a Top-25 program in Ole Miss then open OVC play on the road at Eastern Kentucky and then come back to play two midweek games at Mizzou. I think that stretch will be really tough but it will define our team and where we will be at that point in the season. It's a tough stretch and it'll be a challenge but it will give us a good spot to tell us where we're at and what we need to improve on."

Winning back-to-back OVC titles and being picked to win the league puts a big target on the Redhawks but Bieser knows his team will be ready to put its best foot forward when it counts the most.

"We know our conference will be gunning for us and we will have to play our best games on the weekends because OVC teams will be looking to make a statement against us. I see our conference continuing to improve every

season and I think it will be a good challenge from top to bottom."

Southeast will play their toughest OVC competition on the road in Eastern Kentucky, Austin Peay, Jacksonville State, and Tennessee Tech; a feat they not only accomplished but excelled at in 2014.

"We have some tough OVC trips and they will be our biggest challenge this season. It's always tough to go to Jacksonville State and play on their field. I think Tennessee Tech will be very good again this year and being able to handle them on the road will be a challenge. Austin Peay is a very talented team and they have the situation where they have guys who have been starting since their freshman year who are juniors now."

From top to bottom, the league is expected to be a fight all season long with four or five teams expected to be close together vying for the top spot.

"I think four to five teams will be all competing for the title this season and what we've seen every year is a surprise team who comes ready to compete and makes the top half of the conference that much stronger."

2016 brings with it a new roles in the coaching staff. Last year's volunteer assistant Matt Borgschulte is back this season as the Redhawks' new hitting coach. Borgschulte left following the 2015 campaign but has returned after the departure of Dillon Lawson.

This season's new volunteer assistant is Joe Migliaccio. Migliaccio comes to Southeast from Siena College in New York. There, Migliaccio worked closely with the defense, both infielders and catchers.

Bieser concluded, "What's also exciting about this season is a partially new coaching staff. We've brought in a couple young coaches in Coach Boargschulte and Coach Migliaccio. They bring youth and a lot of energy to the staff. They have brought a lot to the table during the preseason and have been very knowledgeable. They have continued to want to learn more and more. I am very





n just three seasons at the helm of the Redhawks, head coach Steve Bieser has transformed the Southeast Missouri baseball program into a championship-caliber team in the Ohio Valley Conference as well as a program to make waves on the national level.

Entering his fourth season at the helm of the Redhawks, Bieser carries a career head coaching record of 99-76 and 58-33 in OVC play. The Redhawks won back-to-back Ohio Valley Conference Regular Season Championships in 2014 and 2015. It was the first time in program history Southeast had won backto-back titles. The Redhawks tallied 30-win seasons in each of their championship campaigns under Bieser's tutelage.

Southeast won its second-straight OVC crown in 2015 with a record of 22-8 in league play, 36-23 overall. The Redhawks earned a number of postseason honors. Most notably, Joey Lucchesi was named the OVC Pitcher of the Year. Lucchesi finished the season with a 3.17 ERA, a 7-2 record, and 93 strikeouts; all of which were top in the OVC. Southeast had four Second Team All-OVC members: first baseman Ryan Rippee, shortstop Branden Boggetto, designated hitter Garrett Gandolfo, and utility player Andy Lennington. Freshman Trevor Ezell picked up All-Freshman Team honors.

Southeast Missouri made its 21st-consecutive appearance in the OVC Tournament in 2015. The Redhawks advanced to the championship round of the tournament for the first time since 2008.

Other postseason honors included Capital One Academic

All-American Second Team Honors bestowed upon Jason Blum, Ezell being named NCBWA

Freshman All-American, and Boggetto picking up ABCA/ Rawlings All-South Second Team Honors.

Junior Alex Winkelman began the next level of his baseball career when he was drafted in the 21st round of the Major League Baseball Draft by the Houston Astros. Winkelman was the 619th overall pick in the draft and became the second draft pick under Bieser. In three years at Southeast, Winkelman compiled a 14-9 record and 4.51 ERA in 50 appearances and 35 starts. He was credited with two saves and recorded 204 strikeouts in 229.2 innings in his career.

The 2015 squad drew national attention with a pair of wins over Southeastern Conference opponents. Southeast defeated SEC powerhouse Arkansas on Mar. 18 in Fayetteville, 12-11. The Redhawks followed it up with an 8-5 victory over in-state foe Missouri on May 5.

In only his second season as head coach, Bieser's Redhawks won the 2014 OVC regular season championship, tied a program record for wins in a season going 37-20, posted the ninth-best team batting average in the country (.309), scored the ninthmost runs in the nation (408), finished eighth in scoring (7.2 runs per game), mentored Matt Tellor, 2014 OVC Player of the Year, and Travis Hayes, the 2014 OVC Co-Pitcher of the Year,

and saw three players go on to continue their professional careers on the baseball field.

The 2014 team made a name for itself by ranking nationally in a number of statistical categories as a team as well as individually. The team's .309 batting average ranked ninth in the nation. Southeast averaged 7.2 runs a game, ranking eighth, while their 408 total runs ranked ninth. The Redhawks finished second in the country in sacrifice flies with 47 on the season. Southeast boasted a .389 on-base percentage and a .422 slugging percentage on the season. Defensively, the Redhawks turned the ninth-most double plays and averaged 1.11 per game. On the bases, Southeast ranked 10th in the nation with 97 stolen bases; stealing 1.7 bases a game.

Individually, Derek Gibson and Tellor ran the gambit in a number of categories. Tellor ranked in the top-25 in 10 different statistical categories while Gibson appeared in five top-25 lists. Tellor was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the MLB First-Year Player Draft in the 10th round. Tellor was the 313th overall pick of the draft and is the highest draft pick out of Southeast Missouri since Galen McSpadden was drafted in the sixth round of the 1974 draft. Gibson signed a free agent contract with the St. Louis Cardinals on June 19, 2014. Bieser's son, Cole, went on to sign with the Gateway Grizzlies out of the Frontier League.

Academically, the Redhawks have been equally impressive with Bieser at the helm.

His clubs produced three Academic All-Americans, eight Academic All-District picks, one OVC Scholar-Athlete, six OVC Medal of Honor recipients and 48 OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll selections. Southeast recorded a team GPA above 3.0 each of the last three years, grabbing one OVC Team Academic Award along the way. Additionally, Bieser's teams are active in the community, averaging 550 team community service hours each of the last two years.





Bieser was named the fifth head coach of Southeast Missouri baseball on May 15, 2013.

Prior to taking over as head coach of the Redhawks, Bieser served as the pitching coach in 2011 and 2012.

Bieser coached starting pitcher Shae Simmons, who led the OVC in strikeouts in 2012 with 89 on his way to being named Second Team All-OVC. Simmons was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the 26th round of the 2012 MLB Draft. Simmons made his MLB debut May 31, 2014 against the Miami Marlins.

In 2011, the Redhawks pitching staff ranked third in the OVC in pitching recording a team ERA of 4.97, as the Redhawks recorded their first earned run average under five since 2007.

The Redhawks team ERA also improved from 2010 as the Southeast hurlers trimmed their team ERA by over one run. Bieser also mentored two pitchers to Second Team All-OVC honors in Logan Mahon and Jordan Underwood. Mahon was later drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the 22nd round of the MLB Draft.

Bieser, a native of Ste. Genevieve, Missouri came to Southeast after a very successful campaign as head coach at St. John Vianney High School in Kirkwood, Missouri. In seven seasons leading the Griffins, his team won two state championships in

2004 and 2006. He compiled a record of 137-51. Five of his players were selected in the First Year Major

League Player Draft (1st, 5th, 21st, 22nd, & 42nd rounds). Over 80 percent of his high school players went on to play collegiate baseball with 16 playing at the Divisi`on I level, four attaining freshman All-America status and one, former Redhawk Jim Klocke, being named a two-time All-American.

In 2009, he took over the Danville Dans of the Prospect League. Bieser coached the Dans to the Central League Championship.

in 1989 and was selected in the 32nd round of the 1989 June Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies.

On April 1, 1997, he made his Major League debut with the New York Mets as a catcher. Bieser was the ultimate utility player for the Mets playing all three outfield positions and the catching position. The following season, he signed with the Pittsburgh Pirates, serving as backup catcher, outfielder and top pinch hitter. Bieser finished his major league career with a .250 batting average and a perfect career major league fielding percentage over his two-year MLB career.

Bieser played 13 seasons professionally with nine of those seasons being at the Triple-A level or higher. Bieser played every position on the field in his professional career; twice doing it in the

same game. He finished second in the batting race of the International League playing for the Ottawa Expos with a .322 average in 1996. Four times in his career, he finished in the top 25 in offensive statistical rankings.

ance Rhodes is in his fourth season with the Redhawks coaching staff. Rhodes serves as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator for Southeast Missouri.

Since taking over the Redhawks pitching program prior to the 2013 season, Rhodes has trimmed the team ERA from 6.37 in 2012 to 4.60 in 2015; slicing over a run and a half off the average. The Redhawks' 4.60 earned run clip and .261 opponent batting average were the best in the Ohio Valley Conference in 2015.

With Rhodes guiding the pitching staff, the Redhawks have garnered two OVC Pitchers of the Year. Joey Lucchesi was named the OVC Pitcher of the Year in 2015. Lucchesi finished the season with a 3.17 ERA, a 7-2 record, and 93 strikeouts; all of which were top in the OVC. Lucchesi's 93 strikeouts ranked 58th nationally while his 6.14 hits allowed per nine innings ranked 23rd in the country.

Rhodes also mentored OVC Co-Pitcher of the Year Travis Hayes in 2014. Hayes appeared in 16 contests in his first season in a Redhawk uniform. He started nine games and compiled an 8-1 record and 3.22 ERA in 78.1 innings. He began the year in the bullpen before becoming a starter during the first OVC series of the season against Belmont. His eight victories were second in the OVC (56th nationally), his ERA ranked fourth, and he held opponents to a .237 batting average which was fifth in the league.

Alex Winkelman began the next level of his baseball career following the 2015 season when he was drafted in the 21st

round of the Major League Baseball Draft by the Houston Astros. Winkelman was the 619th overall pick in draft and became the first pitcher drafted under Rhodes' instruction. In three years at Southeast, Winkelman compiled a 14-9 record and 4.51 ERA in 50 appearances and 35 starts. He was credited with two saves and recorded 204 strikeouts in 229.2 innings in his career.

Rhodes, a former pitcher and volunteer assistant coach for the Redhawks returned to Southeast after serving as assistant coach for three seasons at Wabash Valley College in Illinois. He served as the pitching coach for the Warriors as they compiled 95 wins over a span of two seasons.

While at Wabash Valley College he helped lead the Warriors to back-to-back Great Rivers Athletic Conference regular-season titles. The Warriors also won their first conference tournament championship in 14 years in 2010.

In 2012, Wabash Valley recorded a record of 48-13 as they ranked as high as third in the NJCAA Division I polls, their highest national ranking in school history. His pitching staff recorded an impressive ERA of 2.78.

He was also the pitching coach for the Quincy Gems of the Prospect League in the summer of 2009. He led the Gems to a Western Division Championship that season.

During his time at Southeast, Rhodes assisted in fundraising events and assisted in scheduling. He also helped monitor student-athlete academic progress.

Rhodes graduated from Southeast Missouri in 2008 with a degree in general studies with an emphasis in physical education. He made 37 appearances for Southeast over two seasons with the Redhawks.

The Sikeston, Missouri native received his master's degree in physical education from Emporia State University.

Rhodes and his wife Brittney reside in Cape Girardeau with their two sons, Max (2) and Cooper, who was born in July 2015.

att Borgschulte returns to the Southeast Missouri coaching staff in 2016 as the Redhawks' hitting coach. His other duties will include assisting with recruiting, preforming administrative duties related to the baseball program, as well as coaching the outfielders.

Borgschulte was the volunteer assistant coach during Southeast's 2015 Ohio Valley Conference Championship season a year ago.

As the volunteer assistant, he assisted with an offense that ranked 12th nationally in batting average (.303), hit the 13th most doubles in the nation (129), recorded the 12th most hits (635), ranked seventh in home runs (66), sixth in on base percentage (.405), fifth in runs (473), third in scoring (8.0 runs per game), and third in base on balls (326).

As the outfield coach, Borgschulte's expertise showed as utility player Andy Lennington earned Second Team All-OVC honors and Trevor Ezell picked up OVC All-Freshman Team and NCBWA Freshman All-American accolades. Lennington and Ezell each saw significant playing time in the outfield in 2015.

Following the 2015 campaign, Borgschulte was hired as an assistant coach at Tusculum College in Greenville,

Tennessee. He made the decision to return to Cape Girardeau and was officially


announced as the Redhawks' hitting coach on Jan. 26, 2016.

Prior to his first stint with the Redhawks, Borgschulte spent a year as the volunteer at his alma mater Drury University in Springfield, Missouri. There, Borgschulte introduced the use of in-depth video analysis for hitting which helped increase the team's batting average, total bases per game, and runs per game. Borgschulte's video analysis program helped lead the Panthers to a Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship. He also implemented a new strength and conditioning program. He worked mainly with the outfielders.

Borgschulte joined the Drury staff after playing two years with the Panthers. As a senior in 2013, he became the first All-American selection in the program's history. oe Migliaccio joins the Southeast Missouri coaching staff in 2016 as the Redhawks' volunteer assistant coach. Migliaccio's main responsibilities include defensive development of the position players as well as assisting with the offense.

Migliaccio comes Southeast after a stint with Siena College in Loudonville, New York. He served as the volunteer assistant during the 2015 season and was promoted to the second assistant the following June. Migliaccio was responsible for all positions players' defensive work and also assisted with the offense. His work with the defense led to the third-highest fielding percentage in program history (.963) and finished the season leading the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in fielding percentage in league-only games (.976.)

He implemented new catching and defensive development programs while at Siena. In 2015, the infield completed conference games with a .981 fielding percentage, committing only eight errors, which was an improvement from .958 (21 errors) the previous season. During the complete season, the infield recorded a .967 fielding clip, committing 24 fewer errors than the previous season.

The catching defensive program he helped implement saw the catchers throw out 37% of all base stealers, an improvement of 18% from the year before.

Migliaccio spent the summer of 2014 serving as an assistant coach for the Liberal Bee Jays of the Jayhawk Collegiate League where he was in charge of working with hitters and infielders on a daily basis.

A successful collegiate career that started at Florida International University in 2009. He redshirted his freshman season then transferred to Parkland College (Illinois). He hit .324 in two seasons reaching safely on 106 hits, blasted six home runs, and collected 28 doubles in two seasons.

Migliaccio then transferred to Oral Roberts University where he graduated Cum Laude with a degree in Recreation Administration and a minor in Humanities in 2014. Migliaccio saw time at shortstop, second base, and third base at ORU and batted .455 in the 2013 Southland Conference Tournament.

Mark Hogan, the all-time winningest coach in Southeast Missouri State University baseball history, announced his retirement after 18 seasons on July 30, 2012. Hogan compiled a 526-456-1 (.536) record with one Ohio Valley Conference regular-season title (2002), two OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002) and the program's only two NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002). Hogan achieved many milestones throughout his illustrious 31-year career which culminated with an overall record of 911-713-3 between the NCAA Division I, NCAA Division II and NJCAA Division I ranks. Most recently, Hogan picked up his 900th career win when the Redhawks beat Arkansas State on Apr. 17, 2012. Prior to that, Hogan notched his 500th victory at Southeast when the Redhawks defeated Eastern Illinois on May 20, 2011. In 2007, Hogan surpassed the legendary Joe Uhls for the most wins in school history.





Class of 2002

Joe Uhls served as the baseball coach at Southeast from 1960-1984. He totaled a 373-257-5 record. He also served as an assistant basketball coach in the 1960's. The baseball locker room at Houck Field House is named in Uhls honor.

Class of 2004

Steve Williams played both football as a punter and baseball as a catcher. He led the football team in punting in 1981 and 1983. Williams was an All-America baseball catcher in 1982 and 1983 and played professionally in the Philadelphia Phillies organization. He still holds the All-Time career home run record wth 52 long balls.

Class of 2006

The 1976 baseball team won the MIAA conference title, the NCAA Midwest Regional title and advanced to the College World Series in Springfield, Ill., finishing third in the nation.

The College World Series team roster included Allan Alberter, Mark Amick, Lawrence Basta, Don Buechting, Bill Criscione, James Dambach, Mark Doerr, Clarence Eisenbach, James Hastings, Mark Hogan, Jeffry Hunt, David Jorn, Vincent Korando, Ralph Kuehn, Bruce Morgan, Bryan Parker, Thomas Smiley, Timothy Smith, Dan Wieser, Mike Wieser and Rick Wieser. The team was coached by the late Joe Uhls who was one of the inaugural inductees into the Southeast Athletic Hall of Fame.

Royal Tibi (1919-23) is believed to be the only athlete at Southeast to earn varsity letters in five sports. He lettered in football, basketball, baseball, track and tennis. An outstanding punter on the football team, he also served as captain of the track team and was described as an outstanding defensive player on the basketball team.

Class of 2008

Kerry Robinson set many school records while playing in the outfield from 1993-95. He holds the school record with 35 straight games with a hit. After being drafted in the 34th round of the Major League draft Robinson played five seasons in the minor leagues before making his major league debut with the Tampa Bay Rays on September 22, 1998. Robinson played seven seasons in the majors, with three of the seasons as a starter for the St. Louis Cardinals. He ended his career playing in 463 games and compiling 196 hits in 735 at-bats. Robinson committed just four errors in 379 chances in his big league career.

Class of 2010

Dale Meier established numerous pitching records over his four-year career. He registered a total of 16 wins and three saves and was involved in 51 percent of Southeast's wins during that time. In 1964, Meier had nine victories and one save, and pitched Southeast's first no-hitter of the modern era. A two-time Most Valuable Player (1963, 1964), Meier went on to play professionally for five years in the St. Louis Cardinals organization.

Clarence Bergman, who is deceased, lettered four years in four sports, including football, basketball, baseball and track. He scored the first touchdown in the dedication game at Houck Stadium on Oct. 3, 1930. Bergman was a captain of three teams.

Class of 2011

Jeremy Johnson was the 2000 Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year. A two-time First-Team All-OVC outfielder (1999, 2000) and OVC All-Tournament Team pick (1998, 2000), Johnson is currently Southeast's all-time career leader in hits (287), games played (216), runs scored (214) and total bases (521). He was named OVC Tournament MVP after leading Southeast to its first NCAA Regional appearance in 1998.



Class of 2012

Galen McSpadden began achieving success at a high level with Southeast as a left-handed pitcher and four-year letterman in the baseball program. He remains the only pitcher in school history to lead Southeast in ERA, innings pitched, strikeouts and wins in back-to-back seasons (1973, 1974). Today, McSpadden still ranks in nine of the school's single-season and career statistical categories. His 12.14 strikeouts per nine innings led the nation in 1973 and is presently a school record, while his 1.47 ERA in that season ranks fourth. As a senior, McSpadden boasted a 1.53 ERA, marking the fifth-best in school history. He posted 18 victories in his career, which is phenomenal considering that the baseball program played only 91 games during the years McSpadden was at Southeast. That being said, he tallied the win in 20 percent of Southeast's victories from 1971-74. McSpadden was a sixthround draft pick (121st overall) who played parts of five seasons in the San Diego Padres organization and made two stints with the Padres during big-league spring training. He is currently the head baseball coach and athletic director at Seward County Community College.

Class of 2014

Don Metz was a four-year letterwinner in baseball at Southeast. He was also the leading scorer as a freshman on the basketball team. Metz was named captain and Most Valuable Player of the 1970 baseball team and finished his career with a .330 batting average. He was named to the Topps NCAA Small College Baseball and District 5 All-Star Teams. He hit .415 as the Semi-Pro Baseball Player-of-the-Year in the Summer Victory League. Metz was inducted into the Southeast Missouri Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame in 2004 and officiated Final Four Missouri State Basketball Tournaments in 1982, 1988, 1993, 1998 and 2003. He was a member of the Athletic booster board in 2002.

Class of 2015

Trae Hastings was a dominating left-handed pitcher who still holds Southeast Missouri's all-time career records in shutouts (5), strikeouts (239) and complete games (24). He boasted a staggering 2.30 ERA in his career, currently the second-best mark in school history. Hastings earned All-MIAA honors in three-straight seasons (1975, 1976, 1977) and was part of Southeast's 1976 NCAA Division II College World Series team that finished third. He also ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in wins (t3rd, 22), starts (t7th, 33), innings pitched (7th, 234.1) and strikeouts per nine innings (7th, 9.18). Hastings started all but three of his career appearances as one of the most feared pitchers in Southeast baseball history.

Mark Hogan, the all-time winningest coach in Southeast Missouri baseball history, retired after 18 seasons at the helm. He compiled a 526-456-1 (.536) record with one Ohio Valley Conference regular-season title (2002), two OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002) and the program's only two NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002). Southeast became one of the elite teams in the OVC under Hogan's leadership. Not only did the Redhawks make the league's postseason tournament 18-straight years, but they racked up 248 conference victories along the way. Southeast also played in the OVC Tournament title game seven times and posted 15 or more league wins in eight seasons. A native of Cape Girardeau, Hogan achieved many milestones throughout his illustrious 31-year coaching career which culminated with an overall record of 911-713-3 between the NCAA Division I, NCAA Division II and NJCAA Division I ranks. Hogan picked up his 900th career win when the Redhawks beat Arkansas State on Apr. 17, 2012 and notched his 500th victory at Southeast when the Redhawks defeated Eastern Illinois on May 20, 2011. In 2007, Hogan surpassed the legendary Joe Uhls for the most wins in school history. He was also the first to win 30 games in a season that year, a feat he accomplished on nine occasions. Hogan led Southeast to a school record 37 wins and was named the OVC Coach of the Year, as the Redhawks won both the league's regular-season and tournament titles in 2002. Southeast later advanced to the NCAA Tuscaloosa Regional where it beat host Alabama, giving Hogan his first postseason win. Hogan coached a total of 80 All-OVC honorees (40 first-team selections; 30 second-team picks; 10 All-Freshman Team selections). Thirteen of his players earned either the OVC Rookie, Player or Pitcher of the Year award. He also coached 13 All-Americans, two Hall of Famers and 15 Major League Draft picks during his time at Southeast. Among that group was Trenton Moses, who became only the third player in league history to win the coveted OVC Player of the Year honor in multiple seasons (2011, 2012). In his final to seasons as head coach, Hogan had four student-athletes win the OVC Medal of Honor and 29 make the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the Redhawks earned a Team Academic Achievement Award in 2011 for having the most student-athletes with a 3.25 or better grade point average.







Now in its 68th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

In May 2011 the Conference expanded for the second time in four years, adding Belmont University which began competition in the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont gave the OVC 12 members, the most the league has had at one time in its illustrious history. The move added a second team in the city of Nashville and was the first addition to the league since Southern Illinois University Edwardsville joined in 2008. Subsequently, the league has shown its stability over the past decade, seeing only one member institution depart over the past 15 years.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles "Turkey" Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged February 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958 Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961 Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

After Title IX legislation passed in 1972, women's athletics began a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC began formulating plans for women's athletics in 1975 and established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982. The conference added women's golf and softball in 1994 and women's soccer in 1998.

Through the past 67 years, 15 teams have won or shared the league's football title. The list is led by Eastern Kentucky, winner of 21 outright or shared football crowns, which is tied for the most in Football Championship Subdivision history (with Massachusetts). Among OVC teams, former member Middle Tennessee is next with 11 titles, followed by Tennessee Tech with 10, and Murray State and former member Western Kentucky with eight apiece. Eastern Illinois has claimed seven football crowns and Jacksonville State has four, while Morehead State, Tennessee State and former members Evansville and East Tennessee State have captured two apiece. Austin Peay, Southeast Missouri, UT Martin and former member Youngstown State have one title apiece.

Murray State and Evansville tied for the initial football championship, and the Racers participated in the first-ever bowl game by an OVC team, tying Sul Ross State 21-21 in the 1948 Tangerine Bowl. From 1948 to 1975, OVC teams played in 15 bowl games, winning eight of them. Eastern Kentucky and Western Kentucky were also participants in the NCAA Division II playoffs in the early and mid-1970s prior to the NCAA's reclassification of football programs into Division I-AA. The term "I-AA" lasted until the end of the 2006 season when it was changed to Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

The first Division I-AA/FCS football playoff was held in 1978 with only four teams, which is the only year through present day that the OVC did not field a playoff representative. In 1979, four of the nation's top teams were invited to the playoffs, and two of them - Eastern

Kentucky and Murray State - were from the OVC. Murray dropped its semifinal game to Lehigh, but the Colonels nipped Nevada-Reno in double overtime and claimed the national championship a week later with a 30-7 victory over Lehigh. EKU was coached by former All-America quarterback Roy Kidd, who was in his 16th year at the helm of his alma mater and who skippered the Colonels to a second national title three years later. Following the 2002 season, Kidd retired after 39 years at EKU; upon retirement, he ranked sixth all-time among Division I coaches with 315 victories, earning him a spot in the College Football Hall of Fame. EKU's now 21 FCS playoff appearances are the second for the most all-time (behind only Montana's 23 berths).

In addition to Kidd, other coaching legends in the OVC include Charles "Bubber" Murphy, who coached at Middle Tennessee from 1947-1968, Western Kentucky's Jimmy Feix (1968-83), Wilburn Tucker (1954-67) and Don Wade (1968-82) of Tennessee Tech, Bill Ferguson (1967-77) of Murray State, Guy Penny (1959-67) of Morehead State and Boots Donnelly (1977-78 at Austin Peay; 1979-1998 at Middle Tennessee). Following the 2011 season Eastern Illinois head coach Bob Spoo retired after 25 years at the school (the last 16 as members of the OVC). In his time as an OVC coach he compiled 92 total victories (fifth-most in league history) and 68 OVC wins (fourth-most in league history) and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2012.

A sampling of former OVC football stars, some of whom were All-Americans during their collegiate careers before achieving stardom at the professional ranks, include Jim Youngblood and Larry Schreiber (Tennessee Tech), Phil Simms (Morehead State), Virgil Livers and Dale Lindsey (Western Kentucky), Myron Guyton and Chad Bratzke (Eastern Kentucky), Cortland Finnegan (Samford) and Tony Romo and Jimmy Garoppolo (Eastern Illinois). In 2008, former Tennessee State standout Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie became just the fourth NFL First Round draft pick in OVC history when he was selected 16th overall by the Arizona Cardinals. He would break into the starting lineup halfway through his rookie season and started at cornerback for the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII.

The 2007 season marked a return to scholarship football and the OVC for the Austin Peay Governors. Following the 1996 season

the Governors dropped scholarship football and competed as both an independent (1997-00, 2006) and as a member of the Pioneer Football League (2001-05).

The 2007 season also brought new vernacular to the Ohio Valley Conference and the division formerly known as I-AA. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game the term I-AA was changed to NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in a decision by the Division I Board of Directors. The new label was chosen to communicate in a positive and clear manner the unique differences between Division I football categories (chiefly, the post-season opportunity) while still defining them within the Division I experience. The FCS includes programs that compete in an effort to participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 89 NCAA national championships) as opposed to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) which competes in an effort to participate in the postseason bowl system (the 41 NCAA-licensed events which includes the Bowl Championship Series).

In 2010 Southeast Missouri State, picked to finish seventh in the preseason poll, compiled a 7-1 Conference record on the way to its first OVC Championship since joining the league in 1991. Overall the Redhawks were 9-2 during the regular season and earned a berth in the FCS Playoffs, its first playoff berth at any level in the program's 104-year history. Southeast would lose to eventual national champion Eastern Washington in the second round of the playoffs. Head coach Tony Samuel capped the year by winning the Sports Network's Eddie Robinson Award, given to the National Coach of the Year. Samuel was the second OVC coach to win the award (joining Murray State's Houston Nutt who won the award in 1995).

For only the second time in league history in 2011, three teams shared the OVC football championship, as Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech finished with 6-2 records. The only other time in league history more than two champions were crowned at the end of the year was 1962 (when four teams shared the crown).

In 2012 Eastern Illinois became just the fourth football team in OVC history to go from worst-to-first in winning the OVC Championship. The Panthers were led by head coach Dino Babers who became just the fourth

first-year head coach to win an OVC Championship (joining Boots Donnelly in 1977, Jason Simpson in 2006 and Dean Hood in 2008 – Jacksonville State head coach John Grass would become the fifth coach to achieve that feat in 2014). During the year Eastern Illinois junior wide receiver Erik Lora shattered the FCS single-season receptions record, hauling in 136 passes in 12 games; that mark was 13 more than the previous NCAA record and 44 more than the previous OVC mark.

In 2013 Eastern Illinois repeated as OVC Champions behind Walter Payton Award winner Jimmy Garoppolo. The quarterback became just the second OVC player to earn the National Player of the Year Award, joining former EIU signal caller Tony Romo (2002). Garoppolo passed for 5,050 yards (second most in NCAA single-season history) and 53 touchdowns (fourth in NCAA history) in leading the Panthers to a 12-2 record and berth to the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs. Garoppolo was drafted by the New England Patriots in the second round of the 2014 NFL Draft, becoming just the fifth OVC player selected in that round and just the fifth OVC quarterback ever selected (and first since 1998).

The 2013 season saw the OVC snap a 19-game playoff losing streak dating back to the 2000 season. Tennessee State shutout Butler (marking the first OVC road playoff victory since 1986) to snap the streak while later that day Jacksonville State smashed Samford in the first round. A week later Eastern Illinois beat Tennessee State while Jacksonville State won at McNeese State to each advance to the quarterfinals; that marked the first time the OVC put two teams in the quarterfinals in the same season since 1991. Overall the four total playoff wins in the same season established a new OVC record.

Football wasn't the only sport in which the OVC was quickly gaining respect. In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime in the national semifinals. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a narrow 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off 14thranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann combined for 39 points in the win. MSU nearly went on to the Sweet 16 that year, losing to eventual national champion Kansas, 61-58. A bank shot by Mann that would've given the Racers a one-point lead rolled off the rim with three seconds left. In 1990 as a No. 16 seed, Murray State took No. 1 seed Michigan State into overtime before falling 75-71; that game still marks the closest a No. 16 seed has come to knocking off a No. 1 in men's tournament action. More recently, Murray State has dominated the OVC Tournament, reaching the championship game every year in the 1990's. The Racers' 15 OVC Tournament Championships are the most among all OVC schools.

After former member Middle Tennessee State won a first round game in 1989, the league had a drought as no other OVC team won a NCAA Tournament game for the next 19 years. But Morehead State, coming off a thrilling double overtime OVC Tournament victory over Austin Peay, topped Alabama State 58-43 in the Opening Round game at University of Dayton Arena in Dayton, Ohio. The game was played in front of an Opening Round record crowd of 11,346 and included many MSU fans who made the three-hour drive from Morehead for the game.

In 2009-10, Murray State made OVC history by winning a record 31 games (31-5) on its way to the league's regular season and tournament championships. In the first round



of the NCAA Tournament, the No. 13 seed Racers topped Vanderbilt in thrilling fashion when senior Danero Thomas hit a jumper as time expired to lift MSU to a 66-65 victory. It marked the first OVC team to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament since 1989, and snapped a skid of 71-straight loses to Southeastern Conference foes (dating back to 2000-01). In the second round, the Racers pushed eventual national runner-up Butler to the brink before losing 54-52.

In 2010-11 Morehead State would make it three NCAA Tournament wins in as many years for the league and got a bit of revenge for the 2009 tournament loss to Louisville in the process. After finishing second in the regular season and winning the OVC Tournament Championship, the No. 13 seeded Eagles were shipped to Denver to play the in-state foe Cardinals. MSU jumped out to a 15-2 advantage but were down four points (61-57) with just over a minute to play in regulation. After two free throws from two-time OVC Player of the Year Kenneth Faried, the Eagles held for one final shot attempt and senior Demonte Harper pulled up off a cross-over dribble to nail a 3-pointer with 4.3 seconds left that gave Morehead State a 62-61 lead. UofL had one last attempt but Faried blocked the Cardinals last shot, giving MSU the win, its first over Louisville since the 1956-57 season.

In 2011-12 Murray State put together one of the greatest seasons in OVC history, beginning the year 23-0 (an all-time OVC best) and being ranked as high as No. 7 in the coaches poll on Feb. 6. The squad was the first OVC team to be nationally-ranked since Murray State was ranked in 1997-98; in addition the top 10 ranking was the first for an OVC team since the 1970-71 campaign (WKU). The Racers would top nationally-ranked Memphis and Saint Mary's during the season and win the league's regular season and tournament championships. MSU earned a No. 6 seed in NCAA Tournament, the highest-ever seed for an OVC team since the NCAA began seeding the field in 1979. The Racers would top Colorado State 58-41 in the second round before falling to Marquette in the third round. Murray State would win 31 games overall, tying the OVC all-time record the Racers set in 2009-

After the Murray State win in 2011-12, the league had won NCAA
Tournament games in

four-straight seasons, something that had never happened in league history (three-game winning streaks from 1960-62 and 1987-89 had been the previous best streaks). Over that time period (2009-12) the OVC was one of just nine conferences nationally to win a NCAA Tournament game in each season and one of only three non-BCS leagues (joining the Atlantic 10 and WCC) to do so.

In 2013-14 Murray State won five games to claim the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) and in the process became the first OVC men's basketball team to ever play games in the month of April.

The 2014-15 season saw five OVC men's basketball teams earn postseason bids, the most in league history. Those teams combined to win eight total games, the most ever by the OVC in one postseason. Entering 2015-16 OVC men's basketball teams have at least one national postseason tournament victory in seven-straight postseasons, an all-time league record.

In 2007-08, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson became the first men's Division I player to record a quadruple-double in a game, when he registered 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a victory over Central Baptist College. Hudson, who ranked fourth in scoring nationally as a junior, returned for his senior season in 2008-09 and was second nationally in scoring (behind Davidson's Stephen Curry) at 27.5 points a contest. Hudson earned numerous honors (including OVC Player of the Year and OVC Male Athlete of the Year in each 2008 and 2009 and All-American status from several outlets) before being drafted by the Boston Celtics with the No. 58 pick of the 2009 NBA Draft.

During the 2010-11 year Faried, the nation's leading rebounder during the season, became the NCAA's Modern Era (since 1973) career rebounding leader, totaling 1,673 rebounds which passed Tim Duncan for the record (he is 11th all-time in NCAA history). Faried also finished his career with 86 double-doubles, second all-time to only Duncan. He is one of only six players in NCAA history to finish with 2,000-plus career points (2,009) and 1,600-plus career rebounds. Faried was drafted 22nd overall by the Denver Nuggets in the 2011 NBA Draft, becoming the first OVC player selected in the first round since Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers 1994.

Murray State guard Isaiah Canaan, a first-

team All-American in 2011-12, capped his illustrious career in 2012-13 by becoming just the 17th player in OVC history to score 2,000 or more career points. Canaan, who was a key part of Murray State NCAA Tournament victories in both 2010 and 2012, earned a pair of OVC Player of the Year honors (2012 and 2013) during his career as well as being named OVC Freshman of the Year (2010), OVC Tournament MVP (2010) and OVC Male Athlete of the Year (2012). He was drafted by the Houston Rockets with the 34th overall pick (No. 2 pick of the second round) of the 2013 NBA Draft.

In 2014-15 Murray State became just the fifth OVC men's team to complete a perfect Conference season (16-0). The Racers were led by sophomore Cameron Payne who was named OVC Men's Basketball Player of the Year, OVC Male Athlete of the Year and earned third-team All-American honors from CBSSports.com. Following the season Payne declared for the NBA Draft, becoming the first sophomore in OVC history to do so and one of just four OVC players all-time to enter and stay in the draft with eligibility remaining. Payne was selected in the lottery by the Oklahoma City Thunder (pick No. 14 overall), making him just the ninth First Round NBA Draft pick in OVC history.

Through its 67 years, 13 teams have won or shared the league's regular season men's basketball title. Murray State heads the list with a Conference-record 24 outright or shared basketball crowns. Other past champions include former member Western Kentucky (19), Morehead State (9), Austin Peay (8), Eastern Kentucky (6), Tennessee Tech (5), former member Middle Tennessee (5), Tennessee State (2), former member East Tennessee State (2), Belmont (2 – including winning the titles in each of its first two years in the league), Southeast Missouri State (1), UT Martin (1) and former member Akron (1).

Among the coaching greats in men's basketball have been Western Kentucky's E.A. Diddle, who retired with 759 victories and 10 OVC titles; John Oldham, who was a member of the very first All-OVC squad and went on to win seven OVC crowns during his coaching tenure at Tennessee Tech and Western Kentucky; Paul McBrayer, who guided Eastern Kentucky to 219 wins and three OVC crowns; and Cal Luther, who is the only person in Conference history to win men's basketball Coach

of the Year honors at two league schools - Murray State and UT Martin. Current Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos became the winningest coach in OVC history in 2009-10, netting his 319th victory and passing Luther on the all-time list. Loos enters the 2015-16 season with 391 victories.

There have been an equal number of great players including Western Kentucky's Clem Haskins, who is the only three-time OVC Player of the Year. Several players have won OVC Player of the Year honors twice: Western Kentucky's Jim McDaniels (1969-70 and 1970-71), Murray State's Les Taylor (1971-72, 1972-73), Jeff Martin (1987-88, 1988-89), Popeye Jones (1989-90, 1990-91) and Marcus Brown (1994-95, 1995-96), Austin Peay's Otis Howard (1976-77, 1977-78), Middle Tennessee's Jerry Beck (1980-81, 1981-82), Akron's Joe Jakubick (1982-83, 1983-84), Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers (1992-93, 1993-94), UT Martin's Lester Hudson (2007-08, 2008-09), Morehead State's Kenneth Faried (2009-10, 2010-11) and Murray State's Isaiah Canaan (2011-12, 2012-13).

The OVC also has the honor of being the only conference to boast the nation's leaders in scoring, rebounding and assists all in one season. That feat was accomplished in 1991-92 by Morehead State's Brett Roberts (28.1 ppg), Murray State's Popeye Jones (14.4 rpg) and Tennessee Tech's Van Usher (8.8 apg).

Women's basketball in the OVC has been dominated by Tennessee Tech, which has won or shared 18 regular-season titles and owns nine OVC Tournament crowns. In fact, the Golden Eagles have reached the championship game of the OVC Tournament 22 times in the past 33 years. Although Tennessee Tech remains the standard-bearer, five other teams have won 15 of the last 22 OVC Tournaments. UT Martin became the latest program to add its name to the list, capturing its first OVC Tournament title in 2011 and also winning championships in 2012, 2013 and 2014. The Skyhawks became just the fourth team in OVC history (and first since Austin Peay from 2000-03) to win four-straight tournament titles.

Several coaches have made their mark in the history of OVC women's basketball. Former Tennessee Tech coach Marynell Meadors posted an amazing 363-139 (72.3%) record at Tech, becoming the first woman in NCAA or AIAW history to win 300 games at the same institution, while former Tennessee State skipper Teresa Phillips earned National Coach of the Year honors from USA Today in 1990 for turning around the Lady Tigers' program before going on to lead TSU to the NCAA Tournament in 1994 and 1995. Tennessee Tech coach Bill Worrell capped a stellar 20year career in 2005-06 and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2007; he compiled a 408-190 record while leading the Golden Eagles to an unprecedented 16 OVC regular-season titles and eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including five straight from 1989-93. Larry Joe Inman, who retired at the conclusion of the 2007-08 season and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2009. won more than 100 games at both Middle Tennessee and Eastern Kentucky, and earned OVC Coach of the Year honors a record eight times - five times at EKU and three at MTSU. In 2012-13 Inman came out of retirement to take the Tennessee State job; in 2014-15 he led the Lady Tigers to its first OVC Tournament Championship since 1995.

Many great players have graced the hardwood over the years, including former OVC Players of the Year Brooke Armistead and Gerlonda Hardin from Austin Peay, Pam Chambers, Jerilynn Harper, Cheryl Taylor, Angela Moorehead, Roschelle Vaughn, Diane Seng, Janet Holt and Emily Christian from Tennessee Tech; Morehead State's Donna Murphy, Priscilla Blackford and Chynna Bozeman; Eastern Kentucky's Kim Mays; Southeast Missouri's Gray C. Harris; Murray State's Ashley Hayes; and UT Martin's Heather Butler and Jasmine Newsome.

Morehead State center Brittany Pittman set new school, league and NCAA standards for blocked shots in 2008-09. Pittman swatted 164 shots during the season, setting a new NCAA single-season record (which has since been broken). During the campaign, only her second with the Eagles, she also set career block records for both Morehead State and the OVC (287).

In 2012-13 the UT Martin duo of Jasmine Newsome and Heather Butler finished fifth and sixth nationally among NCAA scoring leaders. Newsome, the 2012 and 2013 OVC Player of the Year, averaged 22.6 points per game on the way to All-American honors while Butler averaged 22.4 points per contest. Butler set a NCAA record during the season by connecting on a 3-pointer in her 80th-

straight game.

In 2013-14 Butler and Newsome capped their brilliant careers by ranking first and second in scoring in OVC history. Butler, the 2013-14 OVC Female Athlete of the Year, finished her career with 2,865 points, which ranked first in OVC and 16th in NCAA history. She also finished her career with 392 career 3-pointers (which was tied for the most in NCAA history following her career but now ranks second) and scored in double figures in all 129 career games which ranks fifth in NCAA history. Following the season Butler was signed by the WNBA's San Antonio Stars where she became the first OVC player to make an active WNBA roster. Newsome capped her career with 2,566 points, second only to Butler in OVC history.

The league also had another historical moment in November 2008 when the NCAA awarded Nashville the 2014 NCAA Women's Division I Final Four. The OVC served as the host of the prestigious event, which is one of the biggest sporting events the city of Nashville can host. The event was held April 6 & 8 at Bridgestone Arena in downtown Nashville and was played in front of sold-out crowds for both the semifinals and championship as UConn topped Notre Dame in a battle of undefeated teams to win its ninth national title.

Over its 67 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track and golf.

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States Olympic Rifle Team and Morehead State's Brian Shimer who competed in five Winter Olympics in bobsled (winning a bronze medal in 2002) and coached the 2010 United States bobsled team to its first gold medal since 1948. Former Morehead State football and Eastern Kentucky track and field athlete Dallas Robinson competed with the U.S. bobsled team during the 2014 Sochi Winter Olympics. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peay) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present-day standouts like basket-



ball player Kenneth Faried (Morehead State), football players Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois) and Jimmy Garoppolo (Eastern Illinois) and baseball players A.J. Ellis (Austin Peay) and Shawn Kelley (Austin Peay). Hamilton is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and a NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles Lakers).

The OVC's first volleyball tournament was held in 1981, the same year Eastern Kentucky began a string of six straight tournament crowns. Former EKU skipper Dr. Geri Polvino compiled a 627-439 record in 32 seasons as head coach of the Colonels, earning OVC Coach of the Year honors eight times. More recently, former Austin Peay coach Cheryl Holt and former Southeast Missouri skipper Cindy Gannon also earned their peers' recognition multiple times with four awards each.

Throughout the last 32 years, 11 different teams have won an OVC regular-season or tournament volleyball crown. Since joining the league in 1991, Southeast Missouri has dominated the scene, winning seven of its eight regular-season titles during the 1990's, including five straight from 1993-97. The Redhawks have also won five tournament crowns (1994, 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2000). Jacksonville State won back-to-back OVC Tournament Championships (2005, 2006) including going through the OVC undefeated (16-0) in 2006 and winning a NCAA Tournament match in 2010, the league's first NCAA victory since 2000.

Following the 2007 season, Jacksonville State's Abbey Breit was named the OVC Offensive Player of the Year for the third-straight season, becoming the first player in OVC history to accomplish that feat. Four other individuals - Eastern Kentucky's Angela Boykins (1985-86), Morehead State's Dayle Hammontree (1988-89), Southeast Missouri's Tuba Meto (1996-97) and Morehead State's Amy Almond (2001-02) – were back-to-back winners of the award.

Morehead State won its fourth-straight OVC regular season championship in 2013. Over that four-year period (2010-13) the Eagles compiled an impressive 67-3 league record.

In 2007, Eastern Kentucky's Jacob Korir won his fourth-straight Conference cross country title becoming just the third OVC studentathlete and 13th athlete nationally to accomplish that feat. Korir was a three-time All-American in cross country, earning two top-10 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country Championship. The Nairobi, Kenya, native was also named a track and field All-American twice during his career, was selected as the OVC Male Athlete of the Year in 2006-07 and received the NCAA post graduate scholarship in 2008.

In 2011 the Eastern Kentucky men's cross country earned a national ranking in the USTFCCCA poll, climbing to as high as No. 17; the ranking was the highest for an OVC team since the polls began in the early 1980s. The EKU men would qualify for the NCAA Championship, becoming the first OVC team to reach the national championship meet since 1980. Eastern Kentucky finished 26th overall at the event as junior Soufiane Bouchikhi was 47th in a field of 252 runners. On the women's side Eastern Kentucky senior Lydia Kosgei became the first EKU woman to ever qualify for the NCAA Championship and went on to finish 37th at the national meet, marking the second-highest finish for a female in OVC history, and also earning All-American honors.

A year later (2012) the EKU men's cross country team was ranked as high as No. 11 nationally and finished 24th at the NCAA Championship. Wade Meddles led the team with a 38th place finish at the event while Bouchikhi was 40th. In 2013 Eastern Kentucky placed 15th at the NCAA Championship, the highest national finish for an OVC team since 1980. Soufiane Bouchikhi capped his career by winning his fourth-straight OVC Championship and earning National Runner of the Week honors during the season. Bouchikhi finished 26th at the NCAA Championship in 2013, earning All-American honors for the second-straight season. In 2014 EKU qualified for its fourth-straight NCAA Championship and finished 23rd

In 2007 the Conference had two teams in the NCAA Women's Soccer Tournament for the first time in league history, as former OVC member Samford earned an at-large selection while Southeast Missouri was the Conference's automatic bid.

Former Austin Peay standout and 2012 OVC Soccer Player of the Year Tatiana Ariza represented her native country of Colombia in both the 2012 Summer Olympics in London (earning a start against the United States) as well as the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup. In the 2015 event she assisted on the first World Cup goal in her country's history and in the following match helped her team to a 2-0 victory over France, giving Colombia its first-ever win at the event.

For the first time under the current format, OVC men's golfers qualified for the NCAA National Championship in back-to-back years in 2013 and 2014. Austin Peay's Dustin Korte advanced from the regional to the national championship in 2013 (finishing 116th overall) while APSU's Marco Iten won the Auburn Regional in 2014 to qualify for the National Championship (finishing 55th). In 2015 OVC three individual men's golfers competed in the NCAA Regionals (one automatic berth and two at-large berths) in addition to the Eastern Kentucky team; the three individuals were the most from the OVC to qualify in one year under the current format. The OVC also boasts two current PGA Tour professionals in Scott Stallings (Tennessee Tech) and Josh Teater (Morehead State).

In 2009 it was OVC softball that accomplished several firsts as UT Martin (tournament champion) and Jacksonville State (at-large) were each selected for the NCAA Championship. Jacksonville State would take it a step farther by winning the Knoxville Regional (beating No. 13 national seed Tennessee along the way) to become the first OVC softball program to advance to a Super Regional. Jax State would fall to No. 4 Alabama in that Super Regional but finished the season 43-16 (19-2 OVC) and ranked 21st nationally in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and 24th nationally in the USA Today/NFCA poll.

The league's baseball presence has continued to evolve since its inception. The OVC baseball tournament moved to a neutral site for the first time in 2001 with Paducah, Kentucky and Brooks Stadium hosting the tournament in front of raucous crowds. The success of the tournament led to Jackson, Tennessee and The Ballpark at Jackson (the home of the Seattle Mariner's Class AA affiliate) – hosting the event for the first time in 2010.

The OVC also has made a statement in the NCAA Baseball Championship in recent

years, with its teams involved in several memorable contests in the last decade. Tennessee Tech surprised Wake Forest in the opening round of the 2001 tournament and Southeast Missouri stunned host Alabama in the opening round of the 2002 championship. Five years later, Austin Peay captured the collegiate baseball world's attention by taking Vanderbilt, the 2007 No. 1 overall seed, to extra innings. Eastern Illinois pushed host Nebraska to the limit in 2008 followed by Tennessee Tech's memorable contest against host Clemson in 2009.

After not making the OVC Tournament field in either 2009 or 2010, Austin Peay, who was picked to finish seventh in the 2011 preseason poll, won the regular season and tournament championships to garner its fourth NCAA Tournament appearance. In the first game of NCAA Regional play the Govs knocked off host and No. 1 seed Georgia Tech 2-1.

In 2012 Austin Peay completed a "repeat squared" (back-to-back regular season and tournament championships) for the first-time in OVC history. The Govs would go on to top Indiana State and Cal State Fullerton at the Eugene Regional, before falling to host Oregon in the regional final. It marked the first time since the 2000 season (Middle Tennessee) that an OVC team had won multiple NCAA Tournaments games in the same season.

Austin Peay completed a "3-Peayt" by winning its third-straight OVC Tournament crown in 2013. Along the way the Govs garnered the first nationally-ranking by an OVC team since 2009 (climbing to as high as 21st nationally) and tied the OVC single-season record with 47 victories. The Govs earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Bloomington Regional, becoming the first OVC team in the current regional format (since 1999) to earn anything other than a No. 4 seed. The squad topped Florida and Valparaiso to advance to the regional final for the second-straight season before losing to host Indiana. Govs senior closer Tyler Rogers was a big part of his team's success during the year, setting the NCAA single-season record for saves (23 - a mark that was later eclipsed during the College World Series).

In 2014, for the third-straight year, 12 OVC players were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Of those 12

selections five came in the first 10 rounds, setting a new record for most OVC players picked in the first 10 rounds (eclipsing the old mark of three set several times). The 12 selections were once again just one off the record of 13 selections in 2010; overall the OVC has had 65 players selected over the past six years (2010-15).

A first in the OVC occurred in 2008, when the league had a first round draft pick in both the NFL (Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie) and Major League Baseball (Eastern Kentucky's Christian Friedrich) Drafts in the same school year. A year later (2009) the league had a Major League Baseball First Round Compensation Round pick (Eastern Illinois' Tyler Kehrer who was No. 48 overall) and NBA Second Round pick (UT Martin's Lester Hudson) in the same season.

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conferencesponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 243 studentathletes honored with the award, including 51 over the last five years (2010-15).

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation, and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

Additionally, the OVC annually presents


the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Belmont University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.







(1) A former assistant women's basketball coach had multiple impermissible inperson, off-campus contacts and communications with two prospective women's basketball student-athletes, who were twin sisters, and their family.

(2) The former assistant coach also provided the recruits and their family with at least \$178 in school apparel and accessories at no cost.

(3) Further, the former assistant coach provided one of the recruits impermissible transportation and a meal.

A full list of penalties and corrective measures include:

- Public reprimand and censure for the university.
- One year of probation for the university from Feb. 12, 2016, through Feb. 11, 2017.
- A two-year show-cause order for the former assistant coach from Feb. 12, 2016, through Feb. 11, 2018. If he seeks employment at an NCAA member school, he must be restricted from all recruiting activity.
- A reduction in the number of days the women's basketball coaches were allowed to recruit from 112 days to 74 in 2014-15. (Self-imposed by the university.)
- A reduction in the number of days the women's basketball coaches can recruit from 112 days to 91 in 2015-16.
- A limit of eight official visits during 2015-16.
- A \$5,000 fine.
