OVC TELECONFERENCES

Teleconferences are once again bi-weekly for Ohio Valley Conference men and women's coaches this year and will be held on Tuesdays. All teleconferences begin at 10 a.m., CT, with Southeast head coach Dickey Nutt scheduled at 10:05 a.m. The schedule rotates a men's-only week, followed by a women's-only week, followed by a men's-only week, etc. Men's call dates are Dec. 2 (Wednesday), Jan. 26, Feb. 9, Feb. 23 and Mar. 1 (Monday). There will be a joint teleconference on the Monday before the OVC Tournament begins, involving all 16 coaches who make the field. The coaches will go according to pairings (#1 and #8 seed, #2 and #7, etc.) for 15 minutes at a time with the men's coaches scheduled from 10-11 a.m., CT, and the women's coaches going from 11 a.m.-Noon, CT. Show Me Center



The 7,000-seat Show Me Center (SMC) is the home of the Southeast Missouri State University men's and women's basketball teams. Additionally, the Show Me Center is the entertainment, and meeting hub for the 250,000 residents of the tri-state region.

Since opening its doors in the summer of 1987, the Show Me Center has served Southeast Missouri State University, the City of Cape Girardeau, and the citizens of Southeast Missouri, Southern Illinois, and Western Kentucky by providing quality concerts, sporting events, top-notch family entertainment, and a first-rate banquet, convention, and meeting facility.

The facility is a joint-venture of Southeast Missouri State and the City of Cape Girardeau. The combined SMC and Student Recreation Center, which received a complete renovation and expansion in 1999, were originally built at a cost of \$18 million.

The facility houses the Redhawks men's and women's locker rooms, which have been have been completely remodeled. New basketball offices on the north side of the SMC were completed during the fall of 2003. The portable parquet floor was purchased from the 1987 NCAA Division II Midwest Regional in Indianapolis.

The Student Recreation Center is adjoined to the Show Me Center, and it houses the Redhawks' practice facilities. The center has five full basketball courts (including two hard wood courts), a large weight room, six racquetball courts, an indoor track, two cardiovascular equipment areas, a climbing wall, two multipurpose rooms, and full locker rooms. The new Student Acquatic Center, which opened in December 2007, features a four-lane lap pool, a recreational pool with a rock wall and a zip line, a hot tub, and locker rooms.






AFFORDABILITY

Success Center/Community Service

he new Redhawks Success Center offers Southeast Missouri State University athletes a place to study and develop as students and campus leaders.

The Redhawks Success Center is located in the Student Recreation Center South, located just south of Houck Stadium. The new facility offers a computer lab with 18 computers, study areas and adequate conference space for group meetings.

The Success Center staff consists of Director of Academic Services Sharon Burgard, intern Sonya Bain and graduate assistants Lauren Scannell and Rachel Blunt.

Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance Brady Barke and graduate assistant Matt Carter also have offices in the Success Center.

This beautiful, new facility enhances the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by Southeast studentathletes.

Over 49 percent of studentathletes at Southeast currently maintain a 3.0 or higher cumulative grade point average. Southeast had a total of 141 scholar-athletes during the 2008-09 academic year alone.

A special course is required for all first time athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study and life skills topics, and enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes who are deemed "at risk" based on ACT scores and an assessment of their high school or junior college transcripts are provided with individualized academic programs that include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.


The Success Center staff also works to get athletes involved in campus and community service projects. This is done to provide a support structure that allows greater opportunities of academic success for student-athletes.

The center is a proud member and participant of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Program (Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success), which was created to help student-athletes focus on the ownership of their academic, athletic, career, personal and community responsibilities. This program allows student-athletes to establish partnerships with the NCAA, member institutions and surrounding communi-

ties to promote education and diversity. Student-athletes actively learn how to access campus resources, while building character, integrity and leadership skills through the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, as well.









Season Outlook

leven newcomers usher in Dickey Nutt for his first season at Southeast Missouri State University in 2009-10.

Nutt, named the program's 19th head coach on March 12, 2009, says his first recruiting class was the spark needed to get the Redhawks going in the right direction.

"I felt like our first recruiting class had to be talented, but more importantly, had to be good young men."

The first batch of Nutt's recruits included guards LaQuentin Miles, Marland Smith, Lucas Nutt and Anthony Allison, along with highly-touted forward Leon Powell.

Nutt deems those five players as the jumpstart to his rebuilding project.

"Those were the men we wanted to lay the founda-

tion with because they are good players," he said. "They are exceptional people and come from winning programs."

Guards Sam Pearson, Derek Thompson and KaJuan Watson, and forwards Rae-Vonn Banks, Cameron Butler and Eric McCrary make up the rest of Nutt's inaugural class.

These 11 newcomers, including 10 who have never played a Division I basketball game, will join forces with four returnees.

Returning starters Jajuan Maxwell (F), Johnny Hill (G) and LaMont Russell (F), and C/F Israel Kirk are all back from last season.

"The key to any program is recruiting and we have to recruit every day," said Nutt. "Our team is wide open right now."

BACKCOURT/PERIMETER

Eight of the 15 players on this year's roster are guards, giving the Redhawks plenty of depth in the backcourt and on the perimeter.

Junior *Anthony Allison* (*Marianna, Ark.*) is the front-runner at the point.

Allison, a transfer out of Missouri State-West Plains Community College, played in 30 games and made 10 starts for the Grizzlies last season. He ranked second on the team in scoring (12.7 ppg), assists (94), free throws made (92), field goals made (131) and steals (22). Allison also helped his team advance to the quarterfinals of the Region 16 Tournament.

"Anthony is a guy we had to have," commented Nutt. "He can get to the basket, score points and make things happen offensively."

the other guards.

Nutt will likely backup Allison at the point, while Pearson, Smith and Miles are all combo guards with the ability to play at the point or on the wing.

Nutt led Jonesboro High School with 17.7 points per game last season. His team advanced to the first round of the Class 6A State Tournament.

Pearson is the only Redhawks newcomer who has played at the Division I level. He played in 33 games and made four starts as a freshman at Ohio Valley Conference rival UT Martin (2007-08) before playing for current Southeast assistant coach Kyle Gerdeman at Moberly Area Community College a year ago. Pearson was a first-team all-region selection and averaged 17.5 points per game in his only season at Moberly.

Smith comes to Southeast from Hall High School, where he played in two state tournaments. He averaged 13.9 points, 3.7 rebounds and 2.8 assists in 26 games as a senior a year ago. Smith was also named the Most Valuable Player of his 2008 Class 6A State Championship team.

Miles, perhaps one of the best point guards on the team, was a two-time all-state performer and all-conference selection at Jacksonville High School.

Hill, Thompson and Watson give Southeast even more flexibility.

The veteran Hill averaged 5.9 points per contest in 27 games and a career-high 20 starts last season.

Thompson is a good shooter, who can be extremely dangerous when he gets in a rhythm. He spent the last two seasons at Progressive Christian Academy (Washington, D.C), which produced eight Division I players and five of the nation's Top-100 prep school players in 2008-09. Thompson led his team with 27.3 points per game as a senior.

Watson, a walk-on, averaged 18 points and five rebounds per game at Southern Shreveport

Community College last year.

"One of the strongest parts of our team is that our guys can handle the basketball," said Nutt. "They can dribble, pass and shoot it a little better. Offensively, we have to be fundamentally sound and take good shots. Defensively, we want to apply the most unbearable pressure on every possession without fouling."

FRONTCOURT

The Redhawks inside game took a rather big hit this preseason when it lost junior forward *Leon Powell (St. Louis, Mo.)* to a knee injury.

Powell, labeled as Nutt's top recruit, will miss the entire 2009-10 season and be granted a medical redshirt.

Powell was a two-time second-team all-Region XI pick at perennial national junior college power Indian Hills in Iowa. He averaged 11.5 points and 6.1 rebounds per game as a sophomore, leading his team to a 30-3 record and No. 2 national ranking that year.

Returning post players LaMont Russell (Sr., F, Wichita, Kan.), Jajuan Maxwell (Jr., F, Rayton, Mo.) and Israel Kirk (Sr., C/F, Nashville, Tenn.) are the most experienced underneath the basket.

Russell started 23 of 30 games and was the Redhawks second-leading rebounder with an average of 6.1 per game in 2008-09.

Maxwell saw action in 28 games, while making a career-high 15 starts a year ago. He averaged 7.2 points and six rebounds per game and registered two double-doubles. Maxwell has scored in all but three games during his Southeast career.

Kirk saw action in 28 games, mainly off the bench. Kirk, listed at 6-8, 230, is the biggest player on this year's team.

"We want our defense to ignite our offense, which will allow us to run well in the open court," said Nutt. "You have to be able to rebound and defend first, and have an inside presence. We have some good size inside which should allow us to do those things."

Sophomore forward Rae-Vonn Banks (Fayetteville, N.C.), and junior forwards Cameron Butler (Malvern, Ark.) and Eric McCrary (Belleville, Ill.) round out the frontcourt.

Banks, a walk-on, averaged 5.5 points and 4.1 rebounds in 31 games and five starts at Missouri State-West Plains Community College last season. He also shot 54.7 percent from the field and recorded a team-high 20 blocks.

Butler, who is fulfilling his dream of playing Division I basketball, saw action in 52 games and 29 starts during a two-year stint at NCAA Division II Southern Arkansas. He averaged 6.1 points and four rebounds per game in his career.

McCrary earned first-team all-Midwest Community
College Athletic Conference accolades at Mineral Area
Community College. He is the best long-range shooter among the Redhawks big men this season.

Southeast's non-conference slate is highlighted by four exciting regional matchups involving Saint Louis (Nov. 14), Arkansas State (Nov. 18), Southern Illinois (Dec. 9) and national powerhouse Memphis (Dec. 22). The Redhawks will also be one of four teams participating in the Basketball Travelers Classic (Nov. 27-29). Norfolk State, St. Bonaventure and host Illinois State round out the teams in that event.

Southeast starts and ends its 18-game Ohio Valley Conference slate against Austin Peay (Dec. 3, Feb. 27).

In addition, the Redhawks could possibly play in two nationally-televised games. Southeast's Jan. 9 game at Eastern Illinois (11 a.m., CT) will be aired live on ESPNU. The Redhawks are also part of this year's ESPN BracketBuster (Feb. 20). Eleven games (5 on ESPNU, 6 on ESPN2) will be televised as part of the BracketBusters package. Pairings will be announced Feb. 1. Southeast will be a visiting team in this year's event.

"You can generate lots of excitement by the way you schedule," said Nutt. "I feel like we have the best fans in the league and they deserve a good schedule. Now, we need to get our team to that level of scheduling with winning!"





ickey Nutt's expectations for his first year at Southeast Missouri State University are simple -- "Win games, recruit men with outstanding character, and graduate young people."

Nutt, who hails from Little Rock, Ark., was introduced as the 19th head coach in Southeast Missouri State basketball history on March 12, 2009.

He comes from a thick coaching bloodline and brings a level of enthusiasm and passion for basketball which is downright contagious. "First of all, I am very privileged to be the next coach at Southeast Missouri State University and I feel that sincerely every day," said Nutt. "I believe we will build this program the right way with good young men who take a lot of pride in being Redhawks and want to obtain a degree from this university.

Prior to taking over the Southeast helm, Nutt spent over two decades at Arkansas State University. He worked as an assistant coach from 1987-95 before serving as head coach from 1995-2008.

Nutt compiled an overall record of 189-187 and 102-101 in the Sun Belt Conference en route to becoming the

second-winningest coach in ASU history and posting the second-most career victories in the Sun Belt Conference. He guided the then-Indians to two Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles (1998, 2007) and one Sun Belt Tournament crown (1999). Nutt was named the Sun Belt's Coach-of-the-Year (1998) once and National Basketball Coaches Association District 9 Coach-of-the-Year (1998, 1999) twice, as well.

Utilizing his dynamic and congenial personality, strong family background and rich home-grown work ethic, Nutt accomplished what no other coach in ASU history has been able to do -- take the Indians to the NCAA Tournament.

Nutt did just that when he guided ASU to an 18-12 record and its only NCAA Tournament berth in 1999. The Indians lost, 80-50, to Utah in the first round of the Midwest Regional (New Orleans, La.) that year.

Nutt and his staff claimed three Sun Belt Conference titles. Nutt also saw 10 of his players earn all-conference honors and five garner all-tournament accolades in the Sun Belt. In addition, he had at least one player named Sun Belt Conference Player-of-the-Year, Defensive Player-of-the-Year and Newcomer-of-the-Year under his tutelage.

However, Nutt's life isn't all about college basketball. His

love for children and dedication to community service has prompted he and his wife, Cathy, to make several charitable donations over the years.

One of the more notable donations they made was in 2001 to the local Jonesboro Parker Community Center gymnasium, a place where area kids can go to play basketball instead of roaming the streets. He and Cathy offered up half the funds if the city would match their donation to help finish those basketball courts.

Nearly 500 kids - boys and girls - joined basketball teams at the community center when the project was complete.

Nutt, who is also well-known for his contributions to schools and churches, is an avid speaker at a number of functions, including camps and clinics, to this day.

Nutt began his collegiate coaching career at Oklahoma State under Leonard Hamilton (current head coach at Florida State) with then-assistants Tim Carter (current head coach at South Carolina State) and Bill Self (current head coach at Kansas). He also played four years for the Cowboys, who, at the time, were members of the Big 8 Conference.

Nutt landed his first head coaching job at Arkansas State in 1995. He was the 14th men's basketball coach in ASU's 80-year basketball history. Before that, he spent eight seasons as

the Indians top assistant coach.

Nutt bears one of the most recognizable names in college basketball and comes from one of the nation's most respected sports families.

He is the second of four sons to Houston and Emogene Nutt. Houston Sr., who passed away in the spring of 2005, was the longtime athletic director and basketball coach at the Arkansas School for the Deaf in Little Rock. Houston Sr., was often seen at athletic events supporting all four sons.

Dickey's oldest brother, Houston, is currently in his second season as head football coach at Ole Miss. Houston also served as head football coach at Murray State (1993-96), Boise State (1997) and Arkansas (1998-2007).

Meanwhile, Danny Nutt was the Razorbacks' running backs coach from 1998-2006 and is presently Ole Miss' Assistant Athletics Director for Player Development. Dennis was the head basketball coach at Texas State for six years and is now a scout for the NBA's Charlotte Bobcats.

The Nutt coaching foursome was featured in an article in Sports Illustrated back in 1999.

Dickey is married to the former Cathy Thompson of Oklahoma City and they have two sons, Logan and Lucas, and one daughter, Lexis.

Logan is a junior at Ole Miss, Lucas is a freshman at Southeast Missouri State and Lexis attends Cape Central High School.

Case spent the last six years as a player and graduate assistant at Kansas. In his most recent coaching role, Case handled the day-to-day operations, travel and scouting of the Kansas program. He also had on-court coaching duties.

Case earned first-team Academic All-Big 12 honors two years and was named to the Athletic Director's and Big 12 Commissioner's honor rolls a total of five times during his career with the Jayhawks.

As a player at Kansas, Case saw action in 94 games from 2004-08 under head coach Bill Self. Case had a hand in four Big 12 regular-season championships, three league postseason tournament titles and three NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearances. He was also part of the Jayhawks National Championship team in 2008.

Case graduated from Kansas with a bachelor's degree in Communication Studies in May, 2007. He posted a 4.0 grade point average his final semester. His father, Win Case, coached basketball at Oklahoma City University from 1993 until 2005 and is currently an assistant coach at Middle Tennessee State University. Win was a college teammate of Bill Self at Oklahoma State during the 1980s. Case's mother, Rita Newton, also played college basketball at Seminole State (Okla.) College.

Prior to enrolling at Kansas, Case averaged nearly 25 points per game as a senior at McAlester High School. He led Oklahoma's Class 5A as a junior when he poured in 25.4 points per game, while shooting 58 percent from the field and 45 percent from three-point range. Case went to the state playoffs twice as a prep and left McAlester as the school's all-time leading scorer with over 2,000 career points.

Honors & Awards

ALL-AMERICANS

Bill Giessing (1962, 1963)

Bill Giessing won third-team Little All-America honors in 1962 when he scored 660 points. In 1963, he was named second-team All-America by the Associated Press and third-team All-America by United Press International. Giessing was an inaugural inductee into the Southeast Athletics Hall of Fame.

Jack Klosterman (1943)

Jack Klosterman won NAIA All-America honors in 1943 after the Indians won the NAIA National Tournament. Klosterman, who served as the athletic director at Effingham High School (III.) for 27 years, died on October 17, 1991 at the age of 68.

Otto Porter (1981)

Otto Porter won second-team All-America honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches in 1981 following a stellar two-year career. Porter averaged 25.1 points and 8.9 rebounds per game during his senior season. He finished with a career averaged of 25.8 points per game, the best-ever in the MIAA. He was inducted into the Southeast Hall of Fame in 2004.

Ray Pugh (1988, 1989)

Ray Pugh was named third-team All-America by the United States Basketball Coaches Association and the Basketball News after the 1988-89 season. The Indians ranked second in the nation that year. Pugh averaged 17.8 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. As a junior, Pugh was named second-team All-America by Basketball News after leading the Indians to a 28-4 record in 1987-88. He was also selected as the MIAA's Most Valuable Player.

Carl Ritter (1961, 1963)

Carl Ritter, Southeast's all-time career scoring leader, earned both second-team National Association of Basketball Coaches (1963) and Associated Press (1961) All-America honors. He is a member of the Missouri Basketball Hall of Fame and was part of Southeast's inaugural Hall of Fame class. Ritter's jersey number of 32 is the only retired number in Southeast Missouri State men's basketball history.

Jack Russell (1943)

Jack Russell won NAIA All-America honors in 1943 along with teammate Jack Klosterman. The Indians won the NAIA National Title that year. Russell, who retired after a long teaching career at Cape Central, died on November 20, 2003.

Dwayne Rutherford (1990)

Dwayne Rutherford was a third-team All-America by the Basketball Gazette after leading the Indians to a 26-5 record and a spot in the Elite Eight. Rutherford is Southeast's all-time leader in assists.



Following an emotional ceremony, Ritter stepped behind the three-point line and made a perfect shot in front of a big Show Me Center crowd and regional television audience.



Rich Eichhorst and Bud Eley will be inducted into the Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Hall of Fame on Dec. 11, 2009. Eichhorst was a four-year letterman and three-year starter who earned all-MIAA honors as a junior and senior. He led the team in scoring and rebounding as a senior. Eichhorst played for the NBA St. Louis Hawks in 1961 and is the only Southeast player to advance to the NBA. Eichhorst spent 25 years as an NCAA Division I basketball official after retiring as a school administrator in St. Louis. Elev was the 1999 Ohio Vallev Conference Male Athlete of the Year and the 1999 OVC Player of the Year. He led the nation with 19 double-doubles and had the country's only triple-double in 1998-99. Elev was a three-time all-OVC selection. as well. The 1998-99 men's basketball team will also be inducted this year.

Under the direction of coach C.P. Harris, the 1943 Indians claimed the school's first-ever athletic national championship with a 34-32 victory over fellow MIAA Conference opponent Northwest Missouri State in the NAIB finals (Kansas City, Mo.).

Southeast had defeated Northwest in its previous two regularseason meetings that season to clinch the MIAA title. The third meeting between the two schools proved to be most exciting, as the Indians pulled away in the game's final seconds.

Southeast junior guard Jack Behrens drained a shot at the top of the key with seven seconds remaining, giving the Indians a narrow victory and national championship.

The come-from-behind win in the national championship game capped a comeback season for the Indians. Southeast lost its first four games of the 1942-43 campaign before winning 19 of its last 21 contests. The Indians also went 8-0 in MIAA conference play during that stretch.

On the way to their national crown, the Indians dropped some of the nation's top small colleges of the era with wins over Dakota Wesleyan, Westminster College, East Washington State and Murray State. Southeast also boasted a 10.6 margin of victory throughout the postseason.

All five of Southeast's starters were named either first or second-team all-conference. Behrens, Jack Russell and Carl "Ben" Bidewell garnered first-team honors, while Rolla Anderson and Jack Klosterman were named second-team for the 19-6 national champion Indians.

The team was inducted into the Southeast Athletics Hall of Fame.



A regular-season share of the Ohio Valley Conference title, the OVC postseason championship and the school's first-ever trip to the NCAA Division I Tournament were all achieved by the 1999-2000 Southeast Missouri State University basketball team.

The magical run that ended in a near-upset of then-No. 10 Lousiana State in the first round of the NCAA Regional (Salt Lake City, Utah) brought unprecedented national and international attention to Southeast.

Few thought the Indians had a chance against the tall and powerful Tigers of LSU, who had tied for the Southeastern Conference championship. However, Southeast head coach Gary Garner and his players had other things in mind.

The Indians struggled to get anything going offensively in the first half, but trailed only 24-19 at the intermission. Southeast then came out strong in the second half and nearly pulled off an upset. The Indians led, 61-58, with 2:39 left to play, but the Tigers rallied to knock down two-straight 3-pointers, including one in the last 18 seconds to go up, 64-61.

Roderick Johnson threw up a desperation 3-pointer the bounced off the back of the rim at the buzzer and LSU held on for the win. The tournament may have been over for Southeast, but the team, its fans and the University benefitted from a trip to the Big Dance.



ntering its 62nd year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference. For only the second time in a decade, the Conference expanded by adding Southern Illinois University Edwardsville as the league's 11th member in 2008. The move expanded the OVC's geographical footprint to the St. Louis market and marked the first change in membership since expanding to the state of Alabama (Jacksonville State, Samford) in 2003.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28. She is currently one of just five females to be the head of a Division I conference, and one of just eight to lead a Division I conference all-time. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athleti-

cally-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

The first Division I-AA football playoff (which is now known as the Football Championship Subdivision) was held in 1978 with only four teams, which is the only year through present day that the OVC did not field a playoff representative. In 1979, four of the nation's top teams were invited to the playoffs, and two of them - Eastern Kentucky and Murray State - were from the OVC. Eastern Kentucky would go on to win the national championship in each 1979 and 1982.

Football wasn't the only sport in which the OVC was quickly gaining respect. In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a nar-

row 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off 14th-ranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann - combined for 39 points in the win. MSU nearly went on to the Sweet 16 that year, losing to eventual national champion Kansas, 61-58. A bank shot by Mann that would've given the Racers a one-point lead rolled off the rim with three seconds left. In 1990 as a No. 16 seed, Murray State took No. 1 seed Michigan State into overtime before falling 75-71; that game still marks the closest a No. 16 seed has come to knocking off a No. 1 in men's tournament action. More recently, Murray State has dominated the OVC Tournament, reaching the championship game every year in the 1990's. The Racers' 13 OVC Tournament Championships are the most among all OVC schools.

After former member Middle Tennessee State won a first round game in 1989, the league had a drought as no other OVC team won a NCAA Tournament game for the next 19 years. But Morehead State, coming off a thrilling double overtime OVC Tournament victory over Austin Peav, topped Alabama State 58-43 in the Opening Round game at Flyer Arena in Dayton, Ohio. The game was played in front of an Opening Round record crowd of 11,346; that crowd included many MSU fans who made the three hour drive from Morehead for the game. The Eagles season would come to three days later when they lost to No. 1 overall seed Louisville, despite playing the Cardinals close for a majority of the game.

Through its 61 years, 12 teams have won or shared the league's regular season men's basketball title. Murray State heads the list with a Conference-record 20 outright or shared basketball crowns. Other past champions include former member Western Kentucky (19), Morehead State (9), Austin Peay (8), Eastern Kentucky

(6), Tennessee Tech (5), former member Middle Tennessee (5), Tennessee State (2), former member East Tennessee State (2), Southeast Missouri State (1), UT Martin (who won its first in 2008-09) and former member Akron (1).

Among the coaching greats in men's basketball have been Western Kentucky's E.A. Diddle, who retired with 759 victories and 10 OVC titles; John Oldham, who was a member of the very first All-OVC squad and went on to win seven OVC crowns during his coaching tenure at Tennessee Tech and Western Kentucky; Paul McBrayer, who guided Eastern Kentucky to 219 wins and three OVC crowns; and Cal Luther, who is the only person in Conference history to win men's basketball Coach of the Year honors at two league schools - Murray State and UT Martin. Current Austin Peav head coach Dave Loos ended the 2008-09 season with 314 victories, the most all-time at Austin Peay and second most in OVC history (only four wins behind Luther).

There have been an equal number of great players including Western Kentucky's Clem Haskins, who is the only three-time OVC Player of the Year. Several players have won OVC Player of the Year honors twice: Western Kentucky's Jim McDaniels (1969-70 and 1970-71), Murray State's Les Taylor (1971-72, 1972-73), Jeff Martin (1987-88, 1988-89), Popeye Jones (1989-90, 1990-91) and Marcus Brown (1994-95, 1995-96), Austin Peay's Otis Howard (1976-77, 1977-78), Middle Tennessee's Jerry Beck (1980-81, 1981-82), Akron's Joe Jakubick (1982-83, 1983-84), Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers (1992-93, 1993-94) and UT Martin's Lester Hudson (2007-08, 2008-09).

In 2007-08, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson became the first men's Division I player to record a quadruple-double in a game, when he registered 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a victory over Central Baptist College. Hudson, who ranked fourth in scoring nationally as a junior, returned for his senior season in 2008-09 and was second nationally

in scoring (behind Davidson's Stephen Curry) at 27.5 points a contest. Hudson earned numerous honors (including OVC Player of the Year and OVC Male Athlete of the Year in each 2008 and 2009 and All-American status from several outlets) before being drafted by the Boston Celtics with the No. 58 pick of the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson became the first draft pick for the league since 2004 and only the third pick of the last decade for the OVC.

Over its 61 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track and golf. The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States Olympic Rifle Team. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peay) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present-day standouts like basketball player Trenton Hassell (Austin Peay), football player Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois), baseball players Jamie Walker (Austin Peay) and George Sherrill (Austin Peav) and professional golfer Jeff Sluman (Tennessee Tech). Hamilton is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and a NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles Lakers).

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each

Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of American (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 179 student-athletes honored with the award, including 25 over the last three years (2006-07 to the present).

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

or the 16th time in 17 years, the Ohio Valley Conference invades downtown Nashville to crown its men's basketball champion.

The OVC Basketball Tournament is the league's showcase event, and the 2010 edition of "Music City Madness" will include a variety of exciting action both on and off the court.

The site of the tournament this year is the Sommet Center (formerly known as the Gaylord Entertainment Center) in

downtown Nashville, marking the 11th time the event has taken place in the building. The tournament was first held at the Sommet Center (pronounced soh-MAY) in 1997 (marking the first basketball event in the building) and has been there every year since with the exception of 2002, 2004 and 2008.

The state-of-the-art facility has received rave reviews from OVC players, coaches and fans. Among the building's amenities is a new Megatron scoreboard which was installed in 2007. The building, which is home to the NHL's Nashville Predators, seats up to 20,000 people for select basketball events.

Eight teams will make up the field for the 2010 OVC Tournament, with first-round games set for Tuesday, March 2 at the on-campus sites of the top four seeds. The winners of those games will come to Nashville for the semifinals on Friday, March 5. The OVC championship game is set for Saturday, March 6, with the winner earning the Conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Once again the semifinals will be televised on ESPNU while ESPN2 will televise the championship game.

Last season No. 4 seed Morehead State topped Austin Peay 67-65 in a thrilling double-overtime game to claim the school's first OVC Tournament Championship since 1984.







Dr. Kenneth W. Dobbins



r. Kenneth W. Dobbins became the seventeenth president of Southeast Missouri State University on July 1, 1999, after serving in several positions in higher education administration both at Kent State University in Ohio and at Southeast.

During his tenure at Southeast, academic programs have been enhanced, including establishment of a School of Polytechnic Studies and the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts which opened in Fall 2007 on the new \$50 million River Campus. The Donald L. Harrison College of Business has been recognized for the last four years by a Princeton Review publication as one of the best business schools in the nation and the Department of Communication has achieved national accreditation of its programs in journalism, advertising, public relations, radio, and video production. The Department of Industrial and Engineering Technology also received its initial ABET accreditation under President Dobbins' leadership.

Enrollment has increased significantly, topped 10,000 for the first time in Fall 2005, and stood at over 10,800 in 2008. Record enrollments in higher education have occurred in the University's

25-county service region during his tenure due to the establishment of new regional campuses in Sikeston and Kennett and a higher education center at Perryville serving place-bound students in and near those rural communities.

An innovation center and business incubator to promote entrepreneurship and enhance the region's economy opened on the campus in 2005; a University Research Village is being planned on the 400-acre former University farm on Interstate-55 and the Department of Agriculture has relocated the farm to a new site; a comprehensive review of all academic and nonacademic programs has been accomplished to maintain quality and minimize student fee increases in the face of significant state appropriation reductions; and capital construction projects totaling over \$200 million have been completed to expand and modernize the University's physical plant.

Dr. Dobbins has served a two-year term as president of the Missouri Council on Public Higher Education (COPHE), the organization for presidents and chancellors of Missouri's public universities. He serves on and is a past chairperson of the Committee on Professional Development for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU). He also serves on the AASCU Board of Directors, and in November 2008 was elected as the secretary-treasurer. He is also one of five presidents selected to teach at the AASCU New Presidents' Academy. He is the immediate past president of the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC), a position he also held for a previous two-year term, and is

currently a member of the OVC Finance Committee. In addition, he is a vice president of the executive board of the Greater St. Louis Council, Boy Scouts of America.

He earned his B.S. degree in accounting from the University of Akron (Ohio) in 1971 and served as a commissioned officer and civilian executive in the U.S. Air Force for almost 10 years. He received the M.B.A. degree in 1979 from Old Dominion University (Virginia), and the Ph.D. in higher education administration in 1987 from Kent State. He is also a Certified Public Accountant in Ohio.

From 1981 until 1991, Dr. Dobbins held several positions at Kent State. He came to Southeast in 1991 as Vice President for Finance and Administration, and served as Executive Vice President from July 1993 until his appointment as President six years later.

Dr. Dobbins and his wife, Jeanine Larson Dobbins, founding coordinator for the Missouri Statewide Early Literacy Intervention Program based at Southeast, have a son, Paul, and a daughter-in-law, Stacey, who are both Southeast graduates.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI STATE BASKETBALL

John Shafer



Il it takes is five minutes to see how determined John Shafer is to build on the success of the Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Department.

Shafer was named the eighth Director of Athletics at Southeast on December 16, 2008 and officially began his duties on February 1, 2009.

Shafer says his first nine months on the job have been better than he expected.

"The people within the university and city of Cape Girardeau have been tremendous," he said. "The staff has been very supportive during this transition."

Shafer made his first big hire when he announced Dickey Nutt as the Redhawks head men's basketball coach on March 12, 2009. Nutt coached 13 seasons at Arkansas State before taking over the Southeast helm.

"I knew coming in that hiring a new men's basketball coach would be my first charge," said Shafer. "Dickey met and exceeded all the criteria I was looking for. I believe his reputation, knowledege of the area and respect he gets from other coaches will help us be successful sooner than later."

Shafer, who turned 63 in August, has worn many different hats throughout his career in college athletics.

He last served as a Director of Athletics at Eastern Kentucky University in 2003-04. In just one year, Shafer helped EKU establish a new academic record when 188 student-athletes were named Colonel Scholars. EKU also finished second for the Ohio Valley Conference Academic Award, as its men's programs nabbed the league's All-Sports Trophy and its women's teams garnered a share of that award. The Colonels, who won their first All-Sports Trophy since the mid-1990s, won conference titles in women's cross country and softball during that year, as well.

When asked what he missed most during the time he was away from college athletics, Shafer mentioned two things.

"I missed the student-athletes and the competition," he said. "I was always around young people as an athletic administrator. Quite honestly, I've been fortunate to endure success both on and off the field at every place I've been. This particular job is a great fit for me and I believe the administration from the President on down wants us to be successful in intercollegiate athletics."


Prior to his tenure at EKU, Shafer held a number of different positions in the Southeastern Conference. He was the Director of Athletics at Mississippi from 1998-02, Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Georgia from 1982-98, Assistant Athletic Director for Business at Vanderbilt from 1981-82 and Assistant Business Manager, Football Administrative Assistant and Assistant Baseball Coach at Auburn.

While Shafer was at Ole Miss, the Rebels became the only Division I school in the nation to go to a football bowl game, men's basketball "Sweet Sixteen" and NCAA Baseball Regional in 2001. In addition, Shafer began a capital campaign that raised more than \$6 million for expansion and renovations to the school's athletic facilities.

At Georgia, Shafer worked under Director of Athletics and legendary football coach Vince Dooley. He coordinated and oversaw all men's and women's conference and NCAA events which the Bulldogs hosted. Shafer also served as the liaison between the Atlanta Olympic Committee and the University of Georgia for the 1996 Summer Olympics. Responsibilities for that position included scheduling, supervising ticket operations, preparing a budget of more than \$23 million and managing its entire insurance program.

A native of Alexandria, Va., Shafer earned both his bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation, and master's degree in physical education from Auburn. After earning all-SEC honors as a shortstop, Shafer went on to play professional baseball in the Kansas City Royals organization from 1969-70.

Shafer and his wife, Dianne, celebrated their 40th Wedding Anniversary in December. They have a son, Michael, daughter-in-law, Erin, and two granddaughters, Sophie (5) and Sumner (3). Michael, a 1994 graduate and former basketball player at William and Mary, is currently the head women's basketball coach at the University of Richmond.


