### **HOUCK STADIUM**

serve as the home of Southeast Missouri State University football for the 79th- consecutive year.

Fans continue to flock to Houck Stadium to experience the exciting atmosphere on Redhawks football gamedays.

Houck Stadium was built in 1930 at a cost of \$150,000 and remains a beautiful and picturesque stadium today.

The dedication game pitted Southeast and Southern Illinois University from nearby Carbondale, Ill., on Oct. 3, 1930. That game attracted a crowd of over 6,000, with SIU claiming a 12-6 victory. The referee for the inaugural game was James T. Blair, who served as the governor of Missouri from 1957-61.

Houck Stadium was constructed on the site of an old rock quarry and was purchased in 1925 for \$11,000 at the recommendation of then-college President Joseph A. Serena.

Ten thousand bags of Portland Cement, 23,000 feet of Oregon Fir seat lumber and 150,000 feet of Yellow Pine Form lumber were used in the construction, according to an ad in the Houck Stadium dedication program. The original stadium included 5,240 seats on the south side of the field.

The field and stadium were named in honor of Louis Houck, who served 39 years as a Regent for the University and President of the Board for all but three of those years.

Seating on the north side of the stadium was added prior to the 1963 season. The press box was later constructed on the south side in 1979. Approximately 400 chairback seats were added to a center section on the south side of the stadium in 1992.

In 2000, a Field Turf playing surface was added and the exterior of the facility was resurfaced. Improvements were also made to the press box.

More upgrades took place in the the fall of 2005. Those included a paved parking area adjacent to the east end zone and new parking and landscaping areas surrounding the outside of the stadium.

Most recently, a state-ofthe-art dormitory was added to the west end of Houck Stadium. The ground floor of that building will house a locker room and athletic training room for the football program.

Six of the largest singlegame crowds at Houck Stadium have come in the last nine years.

In 2003, Southeast achieved a Houck Stadium record when 11,100 fans -- and a Fox Sports Midwest and Fox Sports South regional television audience -- witnessed the game against Southern Illinois University.

The Redhawks also drew over 10,000 fans for the Western Kentucky (10,222) and Murray State (10,028) games in 2000, the Murray State (10,100) game in 2001 and Southern Illinois (10,100) matchup in 2005.

Southeast reached a new single-season attendance record when it averaged 8,056 fans per game in 2000.






Marty Mornhinweg, another Southeast assistant, is currently the offensive coordinator for the Philadelphia Eagles.



### OFFENSIVE SEASON OUTLOOK

he Southeast Missouri State University football team is poised to begin its fourth season under head coach Tony Samuel.

The Redhawks return 17 seniors and 16 starters to this year's team.

Southeast finished the 2008 season at 4-8 and tied for seventh in the Ohio Valley Conference. In the overall scheme of things, you could say the Redhawks were three games away from a winning record. Simply because Southeast lost each of those contests by a touchdown or less.

After a successful offseason, Southeast enters its 2009 campaign with some questions to answer, but feels it has the tools to have a strong year.

"We finished the 2008 season with a little momentum and built on that in spring ball," said Samuel. "Now we're ready to get going. We have a lot of leaders that have the ability to set examples for others on this team. We know what we have to do and need to get out there and do it."

Offensively, Samuel will need to replace quarterback

Houston Lillard, who served as the team's starter the last two seasons. Lillard left Southeast ranked among the top-10 career leaders in several categories after completing 266-of-465 passes for 3,417 yards and 22 touchdowns since the start of the 2006 campaign.

Matt Scheible and Dustin Powell are the lead candidates for the quarterback position. Listed first on the depth chart, Scheible has a slight edge entering this year's training camp.

The Redhawks will have another big gap to fill following the departure of running back Timmy Holloman.

Holloman was the team's feature back for the last three seasons, making the Ohio Valley Conference All-Newcomer Team in 2005 and leading the OVC in rushing before being ruled ineligible midway through the 2007 season. Holloman ranks among Southeast's top-five career rushing leaders in yards (3rd, 2,424), attempts (3rd, 507) and touchdowns (3rd, 26).

Henry Harris is the frontrunner for that spot.

Receiving should once again be a major strength for the Redhawks. Preseason all-OVC pick Walter Peoples is the top receiver on the team after hauling in 65 receptions for a league-high 903 yards in 12 starts a year ago.

The offensive line also appears to be in good shape.

Guards Sean Middleton and Jaunell Pugh, along with center Bryan Curry, return to the interior part of the line.

Dominic Maldonado and Matt James are listed at the top of the depth chart at left and right tackle, respectively.

And, Bradley Brown is back at tight end.

Fullback Nick Grassi is the last of the returning starters on the offensive side of the ball.

Defensively, the Redhawks have six starters back, including three in the secondary.

Free safety Bryan Blanfort and cornerbacks Eddie Calvin and Salim Powell are the Redhawks top cover men.

Southeast had a total of 13 interceptions in 2008, with nine coming against league opponents. Calvin (4) and Blanfort (3) accounted for seven of those picks.

At linebacker, the Redhawks lost their leading tackler in Nick Stauffer. Stauffer set a single-season school record with 150 tackles en route to first-team all-OVC honors last year.

Philip Klaproth will be among those taking charge of the linebackers in 2009.

The defensive line returns two starters, including nose tackle Errick Aliifua and defensive end Damian Smith. Defensive end Quentin Brown will also be in the mix

Here is a positional breakdown for the Redhawks this year:

### QUARTERBACK

Sophomore **Matt Scheible** and senior **Dustin Powell** will hook up in this year's quarterback race.

Scheible, who saw action in 10 games and made two starts under center, showed excellent poise as a true freshman last season. He is

an exciting dual-threat quarter-back, who threw for 540 yards and five touchdowns and rushed for 254 yards and two TDs. His first career rushing touchdown was a dramatic, 5-yard game-winner in an overtime victory against Tennessee State.

Powell played mainly on special teams last year, but had a good showing at the team's annual spring game, where he completed 9-of-11 passes for 143 yards.

### **RUNNING BACK**

Junior **Henry Harris** looks to take over as Southeast's feature back this season.

A transfer from the University of Memphis, Harris was the Redhawks second-leading rusher with 318 yards and four touchdowns on 76 carries a year ago. Harris scored in each of his first three games and ran for over 100 yards one time.

Sophomore **Jacob McKinley** will challenge.

McKinley, who has excellent speed, ran the ball 21 times for 83 yards and one touchdown. He, too, could get plenty of touches on offense this year.

### **RECEIVERS**

The strength of Southeast's offense over the last two years has been its wide receivers. This season should be no different, as the Redhawks return five of their top seven targets from a year ago.

Preseason all-OVC senior Walter Peoples is the team's top pass-catcher, who is coming off a breakout year in 2008. Peoples, who has caught a pass in 14-straight games, had 65 catches for 905 yards and six touchdowns en route to second-team all-conference honors.

Junior Miles Edwards, sophomore Chantae Ahamefule and senior Brad Stewart are other prominent wideouts.

Edwards ranked second on the team with 31 catches for 432 yards and three touchdowns last season.

Ahamefule, who will challenge Edwards for a starting spot, came on strong during the second half of 2008. He finished with 251 of his 326 receiving yards and both of his TDs in his final five games of the season alone.

Meanwhile, Stewart hauled in 21 catches for 256 yards and a touchdown prior to suffering a season-ending knee injury.

Two receivers that redshirted in 2008 may also see viable playing time in multiple-receiver sets.

Freshman **Cedric Cox** had a nice spring and showed glimpses of his game-breaking speed when he caught two passes for 63 yards in the spring game.

Sophomore **Aaron King** transferred to Southeast from Lindenwood University and became a lot stronger and quicker after sitting out the 2008 season.

### **TIGHT END**

Junior **Bradley Brown** was Southeast's starting tight end last season and looks to resume that role again this year.

The sure-handed Brown caught nine passes for 116 yards and one touchdown.

Senior **Ashton Farmer**, who stands at 6-7, 250, is another big target. Farmer saw action in eight games last season. He played basketball for three years at Arkansas State before joining the Redhawks in 2008.

**Jason Brown** adds depth and experience as a fifth-year senior. Brown split time between tight end and the offensive line a year ago.

### **OFFENSIVE GUARD**

The Redhawks offensive line had some injury issues last season, and as a result, saw five different linemen start at least four games.

That being said, senior right guard Jaunell Pugh was the only lineman on the roster to start all 12 games. Pugh enters his final season at Southeast after making starts in 17-consecutive games.

Sophomore Armin Blagajcevic

is listed behind Pugh. Blagajcevic played in just two games as a freshman.

Juniors **Frank Knights** and **Sean Middleton** will go head-to-head for the starting job at left guard.

Knights is coming off an impressive spring, while Middleton started in five games a year ago.

### **OFFENSIVE TACKLE**

Fifth-year senior **Matt James** is expected to start at right tackle.

James saw limited action due to injuries, starting in just four games last season.

University of Arkansas transfer **Dominic Maldonado** took over as the starting left tackle this past spring.

Madonado was one of the top offensive line prospects in Missouri following a stellar prep career at Eureka High School.

Junior **Brandon Harris**, who can play either of the tackle positions, is listed as the backup at both sides.

Harris transferred from Glendale Community College, where he was an all-conference performer.

### CENTER

Sophomore **Matt Shannon**, who started in only two games last season, will handle the starting du-

ties after moving to center in the spring.

Junior **Bryan Curry** is also back from last season. He made eight starts a year ago.

### **FULLBACK**


The fullback position is sparked by the return of senior **Nick Grassi** and juniors **Mike Jones** and **Nathan Grass**.

Grassi started 10 games last season, proving to be a sure-handed target out of the backfield. Grassi averaged six yards per catch over each of his last three seasons.

Jones and Grass also bring a lot of experience to the table.


At 6-0, 240, Jones is the Redhawks biggest back. He was the starting running back for the first four games last season before making his transition to fullback. His size and versatility should give Samuel plenty of options.

Grass has excelled on special teams the last two years. He is a great blocker, who continues to get more playing time on offense.

### **DEFENSIVE SEASON OUTLOOK**



### **NOSE TACKLE**

The interior of the defensive line lost two starters, but returns some quality players who have seen plenty of action in the trenches.

Junior Errick Aliifua, who switched back to defense after starting nine games at offensive tackle last season, is the top candidate for the starting job at nose tackle.

At 6-3, 330, Aliifua is the biggest defensive lineman on the team. He excelled in short yardage situations, registering 16 tackles (2.5 for loss) before moving to offensive tackle a year ago.

Junior **J.J. Sanchez** will also look to get playing time at nose tackle.

Sanchez comes to Southeast from Glendale Community College, where he was a first-team all-Arizona Community College Athletic Conference pick.

### **DEFENSIVE TACKLE**

Junior **Maurice Lyles** and sophomore **Steve Hendry** will battle for the other tackle spot.

Lyles played in all 12 games and made one start last season. He recorded 20 tackles, including two for loss.

Hendry, who did not see action in 2008, is currently listed as Lyles' backup.

Junior **Josh Gipson** may see time at defensive tackle, as well.

Gipson played the last two seasons at Mendocino Community College and was the Defensive Lineman of the Year in 2008.

### **DEFENSIVE END**

Senior **Quentin Brown** and redshirt-freshman **Antonio Garritano** give the Redhawks some quality size at left defensive end.

Brown, a 6-6, 260, transfer from North Carolina State, holds the advantage for starting duties. He played in 10 games last season and accumulated 7.5 tackles for loss and three sacks in his first two years at Southeast.

Garritano, a former tight end, stands at 6-6, 240. He was one of the most improved players on the team throughout the course of the spring.

Junior **Damian Smith** is the lone returning starter on the defensive line. Smith will look to assume his starting role at right defensive end.

Smith registered 31 tackles, including six for loss, in seven starts last season.

Sophomore **Courtney Brame** is another viable option at right end. Brame primarily saw action on special teams a year ago.

Newcomers **Rowdy McCauley** and **Justin Love** could also provide depth to the position.

### LINEBACKERS

For the second-straight season, the Redhawks will have to replace their middle linebacker and leading tackler.

Nick Stauffer, who earned first-team all-OVC honors and set a Southeast single-season record with 150 tackles in 2008, leaves a big hole to fill.

Junior **Patrick Maloney** will step into that middle linebacker spot.

Maloney redshirted last season after suffering an injury in preseason camp, but recovered in time for spring drills. He finished the 2007 season with 16 tackles in six starts.

Maloney will be up against junior **Tyler Epstein**, who sat out last season after transferring from Northern Iowa.

Epstein played every game for UNI on special teams, helping lead the Panthers to a 12-1 record in 2007.

Sophomore Philip Klaproth and senior Josh Woods emerged

as playmakers at the outside linebacker spots.

Klaproth cracked the starting lineup in the second game of the season against nationally-ranked Missouri. He led all OVC freshmen and ranked third on the team with 76 tackles. Klaproth was later named to the OVC All-Newcomer Team for his efforts.

Woods initially started the 2008 season as a cornerback, but moved to outside linebacker. He had 10 tackles in his first start at linebacker against Tennessee State and went on to finish the year with a total of 48 tackles.

Junior **Joshua Jackson** and senior **Marvin Anderson** have also seen valuable playing time throughout their Southeast careers.

Jackson played in all 12 games and tallied 22 tackles last season.

Meanwhile, Anderson started four games before suffering a season-ending injury at Eastern Illinois. Anderson forced two fumbles and had 35 tackles prior to getting hurt.

### **SAFETIES**

Juniors **Bryan Blanfort**, **Aris Bowen** and **Taylor West** are the top safeties this year.

Blanfort will likely start at free safety, while Bowen will occupy the rover position.

Blanfort started the final eight games of the 2008 season and ranked sixth on the team with 54 tackles. He was also second on the team with three interceptions and posted five tackles for loss.

Bowen, a valid contributor on special teams, added nine tackles for the Redhawks last season.

West was a first-team all-conference selection at Cabrillo Community College, where he finished with 109 tackles a year ago.

### **CORNERBACKS**

The Redhawks return both of their starting cornerbacks in seniors **Eddie Calvin** and **Salim Powell**.

Calvin, a preseason All-American by Consensus Draft Services, led the team with four interceptions and 12 passes defended last season. He was Southeast's fourthleading tackler with 69 tackles in 11 starts. Calvin, who set a school record with three picks in the first half against Southwest Baptist, is projected to start at left cornerback.

Powell made eight starts at right corner a year ago. He finished with 24 tackles and one forced fumble in 12 games and eight starts. He should again be the starter at that position.

Senior **William Castro**, Bowen and juniors **Aaron Grimes** and **Abraham Woodard** increase the depth at cornerback.

Castro played in 10 games and posted 12 tackles last season.

Grimes intercepted four passes and recovered two fumbles at West Los Angeles Community College a year ago, while Woodard had 58 tackles as an all-conference pick at Northeast Oklahoma A&M.

### **SPECIALISTS**

Southeast special teams will be highlighted by the return of preseason All-American senior **Doug Spada**.

Spada, who handles the punting and kicking duties, finished third in the nation with a 44.7 yards per punt average last season. He kicked 15 punts over 50 yards and dropped 12 inside the 20-yard line. Spada also converted 15-of-24 field goals and 29-of-30 PATs.

Sophomore **Jacob McKinley** will be the Redhawks top return

McKinley broke Southeast's alltime single-season record in kick return yardage when he returned 35 kickoffs for 785 yards a year ago. He averaged 22.4 yards per return and nearly returned one kickoff for a touchdown when he broke free for 85 yards.

Freshman **Brandon Gabbard** will handle the long snapping this year. Gabbard snapped to current UCLA punter Jeff Locke as a prep at Mountain Ridge High School.





### **HEAD COACH TONY SAMUEL**



Tony Samuel is in his fourth season as the head football coach at Southeast Missouri State University. Samuel was named to the position Dec. 21, 2005, and the appointment became effective Jan. 1, 2006.

Samuel, a graduate of the University of Nebraska, came to Southeast from Purdue University where he served as defensive line coach since March, 2005. While at Purdue, he was the position coach of Rob Ninkovich, the team's Most Valuable Player and second team All-Big Ten defensive end in 2005.

Samuel served as head coach at New Mexico State University from 1997-2004 and currently stands as the third-winningest coach in school history with 57 victories. New Mexico State finished 6-5 in 1999, recording its first winning season since 1992 and only its third in 32 years. In 2002, his Aggie squad posted a mark of 7-5, which represented the most

wins by the program since 1967.

His teams won the Rio Grande Championship twice, and he led the Aggies to an undefeated home record in 2002. Samuel was instrumental in leading the 2003 New Mexico State squad to a 13th-place ranking in graduation rates among all NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) programs (76 percent).

Samuel coached the outside linebacker and rush end positions at his alma mater under legendary head coach Tom Osborne from 1986-96. In his 11 seasons with the Cornhuskers, Samuel mentored six first-team All-Americans and 12 future National Football League players. Nebraska won two National Championships (1994, 1995), captured seven Big Eight/Big 12 Conference titles and competed in 11 bowl games during that span, as well.

Prior to Nebraska, Samuel was the defensive line coach at Stanford (1984-85) and Western Michigan (1982-83).

As a player, Samuel was a

member of Coach Osborne's first recruiting class at the University of Nebraska. He was a two-year starter at defensive end and played in four bowl games, including the Sugar Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Astro Bluebonnet and Liberty Bowl. Samuel earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors as a senior in 1977. Samuel received his undergraduate degree in education from Nebraska in 1981. He was elected to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees in 2002.

Samuel is a native of Trinidad, West Indies, and moved to Jersey City, N.J., at the age of 10. He and his wife, Tamara, have five children, Travis, Serena, Phillip, Karisa and Terryn.



Vincent White is in his fourth season as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Southeast Missouri State University.

A native of Denver, Colo., White served as the running backs coach at Delaware State in 2005 and was the head coach at St. Mary's College (Calif.) before the school discontinued its football program in 2004. White also coached the running backs at Utah (2001-02), Arizona State (2000) and Pittsburgh (1997-99).





Brinkley also served as defensive coordinator, head track coach and head coach for


the junior varsity girls basketball program during his time at Beaumont.




Justin Kramer enters his fourth year as an assistant coach at Southeast.

Kramer, who also assists with the offensive line, originally joined the coaching staff as a graduate assistant in 2006.


A native of Liberty, Mo., Kramer played four years on the offensive line at Southern





Brady also coached the quarterbacks at Poway High School. He played quarterback for current Southeast head coach


He played quarterback for current Southeast head coach Tony Samuel at New Mexico State in 2002. He transferred to NMSU from San Diego Mesa College.

He broke the old record of 51 on Sept. 17, 1977 with a 27-yard kick against Delta State at Houck Stadium. His NCAA record total of 64 stood for several years and is still the record at Southeast. Wood, who currently resides in St. Louis, played professionally with both the St. Louis Cardinals and San Diego Chargers.







#### REDHAWKS SUCCESS CENTER/COMMUNITY SERVICE

The new Redhawks Success Center offers Southeast Missouri State University athletes a place to study and develop as students and campus leaders.

The Redhawks Success Center is located in the Student Recreation Center South, located just south of Houck Stadium. The new facility offers a computer lab with 18 computers, study areas and adequate conference space for group meetings.

The Success Center staff consists of Director of Academic Services Sharon Burgard, intern Sonya Bain and graduate assistants Lauren Scannell and Rachel Blunt.

Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance Brady Barke and graduate assistant Matt Carter also have offices in the Success Center.

This beautiful, new facility enhances the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by Southeast student-athletes.

Over 49 percent of studentathletes at Southeast currently maintain a 3.0 or higher cumulative grade point average. Southeast had a total of 141 scholar-athletes during the 2008-09 academic year alone.

The Redhawks football program is one such program that has reaped the benefits of the Success Center and its excellent staff. In fact, the team had over 19 athletes achieve GPAs of 3.0 or better.

A special course is required for all first time athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study and life skills topics, and enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes who are deemed "at risk" based on ACT scores and an assessment of their high school or junior college transcripts are provided with individualized academic programs that include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The Success Center staff also works to get athletes involved in campus and community service projects. This

is done to provide a support structure that allows greater opportunities of academic success for student-athletes.

The center is a proud member and participant of the NCAA CHAMPS/ Life Skills Program (Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success), which was created to help student-athletes focus on the ownership of their academic, athletic, career, personal and community responsibilities. This

program allows student-athletes to establish partnerships with the NCAA, member institutions and surrounding communities to promote education and diversity. Student-athletes actively learn how to access campus resources, while building character, integrity and leadership skills through the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, as well



### STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING/SPORTS MEDICINE

"Esse Quam Videri" - To be rather than to seem." We are very proud of the tradition of excellence we are building here at Southeast Missouri State University and demand a lot from our student-athletes.

Honesty, integrity, unrelenting effort and attention to detail are the pillars of our training program. Simply put, our goal is to outwork every opponent we go up against, and learn to rely on one another to achieve a common goal. We may not be the fastest, strongest or most talented, but we certainly have the attitude that, together, we can take on the world.

In the weight room, we take a comprehensive approach to training. Programs are ground-based, founded on the Olympic Lifts (Clean, Jerk, etc.) and traditional strength training (Front/Back Squat, Dead Lift, Pressing and Pulling). The concept is simple. Find something heavy and move it in a way that mimics the actions of your sport as fast as you can.

In the training arena, we strive to take the foundational strength and power we have developed and refine it into sport-specific movements and skills. We start by emphasizing correct motor skill and muscle recruitment patterns in order to maximize athletic potential and minimize the risk of injury. We drill tirelessly on proper movement patterns so that agility and change of direction are razor sharp.

We spend a great deal of time on both explosive movements and body control to develop first step quickness, acceleration/deceleration, balance and coordination. Lastly, we condition our minds and bodies in a way that mimics game simulation.

It is our hope that through the countless lessons learned in sport and competition, we are helping to develop the leaders of tomorrow.

#### SPORTS MEDICINE

Prevention. Treatment. Rehabilitation. Education. Those are the four primary phases of athletic training, and the Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Training staff aims to fulfill those areas when working with student-athletes on a daily basis.

Southeast student-athletes are offered the best care possible from the Redhawks Athletic Training staff which is under the direction of head trainer Alfred Castillo. Castillo and his staff work around the clock to serve student-athletes at a variety of facilities on campus.

Treatments and rehabilitation can begin as early as 6:30 a.m., and are

available until the last student-athlete is finished.

The primary athletic training room is currently located in the Rosengarten Athletic Complex. Other satellite athletic training rooms are located at Houck Field House, the Show Me Center and next to the Redhawks gameday locker room in the dormitory at the west end zone of the stadium.



#### SOUTHEAST MISSOURI STATE PRESIDENT DR. KENNETH W. DOBBINS



r. Kenneth W. Dobbins became the seventeenth president of Southeast Missouri State University on July 1, 1999, after serving in several positions in higher education administration both at Kent State University in Ohio and at Southeast.

During his tenure at Southeast, academic programs have been enhanced, including establishment of a School of Polytechnic Studies and the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts which opened in Fall 2007 on the new \$50 million River Campus. The Donald L. Harrison College of Business has been recognized for the last four years by a Princeton Review publication as one of the best business schools in the nation and the Department of Communication has achieved national accreditation of its programs in journalism, advertising, public relations, radio, and video production. The Department of Industrial and Engineering Technology also received its initial ABET accreditation under President Dobbins' leadership.

Enrollment has increased significantly, topped 10,000 for the first time in Fall 2005, and stood at over 10,800 in 2008. Record enrollments in higher education have occurred in the University's

25-county service region during his tenure due to the establishment of new regional campuses in Sikeston and Kennett and a higher education center at Perryville serving place-bound students in and near those rural communities.

An innovation center and business incubator to promote entrepreneurship and enhance the region's economy opened on the campus in 2005; a University Research Village is being planned on the 400-acre former University farm on Interstate-55 and the Department of Agriculture has relocated the farm to a new site; a comprehensive review of all academic and nonacademic programs has been accomplished to maintain quality and minimize student fee increases in the face of significant state appropriation reductions; and capital construction projects totaling over \$200 million have been completed to expand and modernize the University's physical plant.

Dr. Dobbins has served a two-year term as president of the Missouri Council on Public Higher Education (COPHE), the organization for presidents and chancellors of Missouri's public universities. He serves on and is a past chairperson of the Committee on Professional Development for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU). He also serves on the AASCU Board of Directors, and in November 2008 was elected as the secretary-treasurer. He is also one of five presidents selected to teach at the AASCU New Presidents' Academy. He is the immediate past president of the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC), a position he also held for a previous two-year term, and is

currently a member of the OVC Finance Committee. In addition, he is a vice president of the executive board of the Greater St. Louis Council, Boy Scouts of America.

He earned his B.S. degree in accounting from the University of Akron (Ohio) in 1971 and served as a commissioned officer and civilian executive in the U.S. Air Force for almost 10 years. He received the M.B.A. degree in 1979 from Old Dominion University (Virginia), and the Ph.D. in higher education administration in 1987 from Kent State. He is also a Certified Public Accountant in Ohio.

From 1981 until 1991, Dr. Dobbins held several positions at Kent State. He came to Southeast in 1991 as Vice President for Finance and Administration, and served as Executive Vice President from July 1993 until his appointment as President six years later.

Dr. Dobbins and his wife, Jeanine Larson Dobbins, founding coordinator for the Missouri Statewide Early Literacy Intervention Program based at Southeast, have a son, Paul, and a daughter-in-law, Stacey, who are both Southeast graduates.

#### DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS JOHN SHAFER



A ll it takes is five minutes to see how determined John Shafer is to build on the success of the Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Department.

Shafer was named the eighth Director of Athletics at Southeast on December 16, 2008 and officially began his duties on February 1, 2009.

Shafer says his first six months on the job have been better than he expected.

"The people within the university and city of Cape Girardeau have been tremendous," he said. "The staff has been very supportive during this transition."

Shafer made his first big hire when he announced Dickey Nutt as the Redhawks head men's basketball coach on March 12, 2009. Nutt coached 13 seasons at Arkansas State before taking over the Southeast helm.

"I knew coming in that hiring a new men's basketball coach would be my first charge," said Shafer. "Dickey met and exceeded all the criteria I was looking for. I believe his reputation, knowledege of the area and respect he gets from other coaches will help us be successful sooner than later."

Shafer, who turns 63 in August,

has worn many different hats throughout his career in college athletics.

He last served as a Director of Athletics at Eastern Kentucky University in 2003-04. In just one year, Shafer helped EKU establish a new academic record when 188 student-athletes were named Colonel Scholars, EKU also finished second for the Ohio Valley Conference Academic Award, as its men's programs nabbed the league's All-Sports Trophy and its women's teams garnered a share of that award. The Colonels, who won their first All-Sports Trophy since the mid-1990s, won conference titles in women's cross country and softball during that year, as well.

When asked what he missed most during the time he was away from college athletics, Shafer mentioned two things.

"I missed the student-athletes and the competition," he said. "I was always around young people as an athletic administrator. Quite honestly, I've been fortunate to endure success both on and off the field at every place I've been. This particular job is a great fit for me and I believe the administration from the President on down wants us to be successful in intercollegiate athletics."

Prior to his tenure at EKU, Shafer held a number of different positions in the Southeastern Conference. He was the Director of Athletics at Mississippi from 1998-02, Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Georgia from 1982-98, Assistant Athletic Director for Business at Vanderbilt from 1981-82 and Assistant Business Manager, Football Administrative Assistant and Assistant Baseball Coach at Auburn.


While Shafer was at Ole Miss, the Rebels became the only Division I school in the nation to go to a football bowl game, men's basketball "Sweet Sixteen" and NCAA Baseball Regional in 2001. In addition, Shafer began a capital campaign that raised more than \$6 million for expansion and renovations to the school's athletic facilities.

At Georgia, Shafer worked under Director of Athletics and legendary football coach Vince Dooley. He coordinated and oversaw all men's and women's conference and NCAA events which the Bulldogs hosted. Shafer also served as the liaison between the Atlanta Olympic Committee and the University of Georgia for the 1996 Summer Olympics. Responsibilities for that position included scheduling, supervising ticket operations, preparing a budget of more than \$23 million

and managing its entire insurance program.

A native of Alexandria, Va., Shafer earned both his bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation, and master's degree in physical education from Auburn. After earning all-SEC honors as a shortstop, Shafer went on to play professional baseball in the Kansas City Royals organization from 1969-70.

Shafer and his wife, Dianne, will celebrate their 40th Wedding Anniversary in December. They have a son, Michael, daughter-in-law, Erin, and two granddaughters, Sophie (5) and Sumner (3). Michael, a 1994 graduate and former basketball player at William and Mary, is currently the head women's basketball coach at the University of Richmond.


The Southeast Missouri State University Athletics Department recognizes the University's responsibility for the advancement and transmission of knowledge and the preparation of leaders in all segments of society.

The Athletics Department supports the educational objectives, academic progress and general welfare of student-athletes.


It offers assistance and encouragement for student-athletes to maintain ap-





