


Many Southeast fans enjoy watching games from the hillsides along the first base side or beyond the left field wall.


Capaha Field has a natural

grass surface and is considered to be one of the best playing fields in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Recent renovations include a state-of-the-art press box which was completed prior to the start of the 2006 season. The press box, which is equipped with wireless broadband internet access, television, a kitchen/lounge area and restroom, gives media members a great view behind home plate.

Capaha Field also serves as home to the Plaza Tire Capahas, the oldest amateur baseball team in America.





"Tiger" Joe Uhls Locker Room

Located inside Houck Field House on the Southeast Missouri State campus is the "Tiger" Joe Uhls Baseball Locker Room.

The newly renovated locker room provides Redhawks base-ball players with the modern amenities commonly found in professional locker rooms. Most recently, hardwood floors were added in 2005.

The locker room features 35 professional-style lockers for players and coaches, restrooms, a

shower area and ample storage space for equipment and uniforms. A state-of-the-art entertainment system also provides players the opportunity to view scouting and coaching video as well as watch television for leisure.

In addition, a study area with broadband internet capabilities is available for Redhawks student-athletes. Surrounding the locker room is a mural honoring the all-time greatest players and moments in Southeast Missouri State baseball history.


Cape Girardeau

Redhawk Success Center

he new Redhawks Success Center offers Southeast Missouri State University athletes a place to study and develop as students and campus leaders.

The Redhawks Success Center is located in the Student Recreation Center South, located just south of Houck Stadium. The new facility offers a computer lab with 18 computers, study areas and adequate conference space for group meetings.

The Success Center staff consists of Director of Academic Services Sharon Burgard, NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Coordinator Sonya Bain and graduate assistants Lauren Scannell and Rachel Blunt.

This beautiful, new facility enhances the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by Southeast studentathletes.

Two-thirds of the studentathletes at Southeast currently maintain a 3.0 or higher cumulative grade point average. Southeast had a total of 207 scholar-athletes during the 2009 fall semester alone.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study and life skills topics, and enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.


Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes, who need additional support, are provided with programs that include meeting with a mentor bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The Success Center staff also works to get athletes involved in campus and community service projects. This is done to provide a support structure that allows greater opportunities of academic success for student-athletes.

The center is a proud member and participant of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Program (Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success), which was created to help student-athletes focus on the ownership of their academic, athletic, career, personal and community responsibilities. This program

allows student-athletes to establish partnerships with the NCAA, member institutions and surrounding communities to promote education and diversity. Student-athletes actively learn how to access campus resources, while building character, integrity and leadership skills through the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program.



Coaching Staff



ark Hogan is the winningest coach in Southeast Missouri State University baseball history.

Hogan became the program's fourth head coach in 1995, and has since compiled a 439-373-1 record in 15 seasons as the Redhawks skipper.

A native of Cape Girardeau, Hogan enters his 16th year with a total of 834 wins between the NCAA Division I, NCAA Division II and NJCAA Division I ranks.

Southeast has become one of the elite teams in the Ohio Valley Conference under Hogan's watch. Not only have the Redhawks made the OVC Tournament 15-straight years, but they racked up 209 conference victories, one regularseason title (2002) and two OVC Tournament championships (1998, 2002) along the way. Southeast also played in the OVC Tournament title game seven times and made two NCAA Regional appearances. Hogan's clubs have earned 15 or more league wins in eight of his 15 seasons.

Hogan has achieved many milestones throughout his illustrious coaching career. Most recently, he recorded his 800th victory with an 8-4 win at then-No. 16 Alabama on Feb. 22, 2009. In 2008, Hogan became the first head coach in Southeast baseball history to win 400 games. A year before that, he became the Redhawks all-time winningest coach, surpassing the legendary Joe Uhls. Hogan, who has 28 years of head coaching experience, also became the first in school history to win 30 games in a season, a feat he has accomplished on seven occasions.

In 2002, Hogan led Southeast to a school-record 37 wins and was named the OVC's Coach-of-the-Year.

The Redhawks have enjoyed unprecedented success both on and off the field with Hogan as their coach.

In fact, 16 of his players have earned either OVC Rookie, Player or Pitcher-of-the-Year honors. Hogan has also coached 11 All-Americans, with the most current being catcher Jim Klocke. Klocke will return for his senior season after becoming Southeast's first draft pick since 2003 when he was selected in the 46th round by the St. Louis Cardinals last June.

Academically, the Southeast baseball team recorded a 3.3 grade point average for the 2009 fall semester. In all, 24 players registered at least a 3.0 GPA and six earned a perfect 4.0 during that term. In addition, six Redhawks earned the OVC Medal of Honor, which goes to those student-athletes who achieve the highest GPA in a conference-sponsored sport.

Hogan has encouraged his players to get involved in the community, as well. After Hurricane Katrina hit in 2005, the baseball team organized a clothing drive to help benefit approximately 175 victims who relocated to Kennett, Mo.

Hogan transferred to Southeast Missouri State from Mineral Area College. He was a member of Southeast's 1976 baseball team which finished third at the NCAA Division II College World Series. The 1976 squad later became the first baseball team to be inducted into the Southeast Missouri State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006.


He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from Southeast in 1977 and went on to serve as a graduate assistant at Mississippi State in 1978-79.

Hogan then accepted his first head coaching position at Lurleen B. Wallace College in 1982. He went 230-147 in eight seasons at Lurleen and led his 1988 squad to a 38-16 record, AJCAA title and NJCAA Region XXII Championship. In addition, Hogan was named Alabama Junior College Athletics Association Coach-of-the-Year.

In 1990, Hogan moved to the NCAA Division II level. In five years at West Alabama, he registered a 155-110-2 record, won two Gulf South Conference Championships (1992, 1994), one NCAA Division II South Central Region Championship (1992) and finished fifth

at the 1992 NCAA Division II College World Series. His colleagues voted him Gulf South and South Central Region Coach-of-the-Year for his efforts.

Hogan resides in Cape Girardeau with his wife, Becky. They have three daughters: Julie, Christie and Betsy. Julie resides in Jackson, Miss., with her husband, Mitch Ogles, daughter, Caroline Mae and son, Chapman Lee Ogles. Chapman Lee is Mark and Becky's first grandchild. hris Cafalone is in his fourth year as the Redhawks hitting instructor and infield/catchers coach.

Cafalone was hired as an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State on Aug. 29, 2006 after spending 11 years in various coaching roles.

Southeast set school records in fielding percentage during Cafalone's first two years as infield coach. The Redhawks finished the 2007 season with a .965 mark, before topping that with a .968 percentage in 2008. Southeast also ranked second (2008) and third (2007) in the Ohio Valley Conference in fielding percentage those years.

Offensively, Cafalone led the Redhawks to a team batting average of .316 in 2009, marking the first time in five years where Southeast hit over .300 in a season. Since Cafalone took over as hitting coach, the Redhawks have improved their batting average by 43 points from .273 in 2007 to .316 a year ago. He has also seen at least one hitter rank among the top-10 conference leaders in batting average during two of the last three years.

Prior to joining the South-

east staff, Cafalone spent five years as a head coach at Onondaga Community College in Syracuse, N.Y., where he led the Lazers to the postseason three times. He coached the Central baseball team in the Empire State Games and mentored two draft picks in Pat Corbin (Supplemental pick of Philadelphia in 2009) and Philip Pohl (46th-round pick of Tampa Bay). Pohl was the 2008 New York High School Player-ofthe-Year. Cafalone also lettered as a catcher at Onondaga in

Before that, Cafalone worked in the same capacity for six years at Barry University, an NCAA Division II institution located in Miami Shores, Fla. He compiled an overall record of 179-144 en route to becoming the Buccaneers all-time winningest coach. Cafalone was named the Sunshine State Conference Coach-of-the-Year in 1998 and 2001, and led Barry to its first-ever NCAA Division II Tournament berth in 1998.

Cafalone was an assistant at Barry for two years before being promoted to head coach in 1995. As an assistant, he worked primarily with the catchers and infielders. Cafalone sculpted a defense which led the nation in double plays that year.


A native of Oswego, N.Y., Cafalone began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Hardin-Simmons in 1992. He also spent time coaching in the NCAA-sanctioned summer wood bat Northeast Collegiate Baseball League.

Cafalone earned a bachelor's degree in communications

from Hardin-Simmons in 1992 and an associate's degree from Onondaga CC in 1990.

He played college baseball at both Onondaga and Utica (N.Y.) College before transferring to Hardin-Simmons, where he played catcher and was a designated hitter. Cafalone was the recipient of the HSU Coaches Award in 1991.

Cafalone has one son, Anthony, who is 13.

Rick McCarty is set to begin his second season as the pitching coach at Southeast Missouri State.

McCarty coached for five years at perennial NCAA Division II power Delta State, where he oversaw the pitching staff. The Statesman averaged 47 wins per year and set a school record with 54 victories en route to winning the school's first national championship in 2004. Four years later, Delta State finished the regular-season ranked No. 1 in the country. The Statesmen won their conference regular-season and tournament titles, while setting a school record with 24-consecutive victories.

Several of McCarty's Delta State pitchers ranked nationally in ERA. He also saw two of his pitchers earn American Baseball Coaches Association/ Rawlings South Central Region Pitcher-of-the-Year honors, five garnered All-American status and 19 earned Gulf South Conference accolades.

Six Statesmen pitchers went on to sign professional contracts under McCarty's tutelage, including, Brent Leach, who is currently on the Los Angeles Dodgers 40-man roster. McCarty recruited several standout position players, including Jareck West (drafted by Oakland in 2007), Chris Clark (2007 Rawlings First-Team Gold Glove All-American) and Rickey Noland (2008 Gulf South Conference Player-of-the-Year and ABCA All-American).

Prior to Delta State, Mc-Carty coached for one season at his alma mater, Murray State. The Thoroughbreds won the OVC Tournament for the first time in 24 years and advanced to the NCAA Regional in Hattiesburg, Miss., during his only year on the staff.

McCarty, who hails from Campbellsville, Ky., graduated from Murray State in 2003. He played college baseball for four years, including two at John A. Logan College and two at Murray State. He was the Thoroughbreds closer, and tied a single-season record with eight saves in 2001. McCarty also had two wins against Southeast, one of which came in a 10-inning contest at the 2002 OVC Tournament.

McCarty and his wife, Rayna, reside in Cape Girardeau with their 2-year old daughter, Mya Grace. They are expecting their second child in April.

Season Outlook



Southeast enters the 2010 campaign with its largest team under veteran head coach Mark Hogan.

The Redhawks roster goes 35-deep with five position starters and seven pitchers returning from a team which went 26-25 overall and finished fourth in the Ohio Valley Conference at 12-11 last season. Southeast also welcomes 19 newcomers to this year's squad.

"We have a lot of depth and there is plenty of potential for this year's club to succeed," said Hogan, who is in his 16th year as the Redhawks skipper. "Obviously, we have some question marks, but overall, we have a nice blend of pitching, hitting and defense."

Twelve of Southeast's newcomers are junior college transfers. These individuals should create a lot of excitement.

"You normally don't have that much turnover," said Hogan. "Competition for starting positions will be intense and there will be many early opportunities given to several different players until we can establish the right lineup combinations."

Catching

Jim Klocke (St. Louis, Mo./ St. John Vianney H.S.), the most decorated player on the team, will resume his role as Southeast's starting catcher.

Klocke, a 46th-round draft pick of the St. Louis Cardinals, opted to return for his senior year. He has earned All-American honors and First-Team All-OVC accolades multiple times in his career. Klocke is also a great student, who carried a perfect 4.0 grade point average en route to garnering Second-Team ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-American laurels in 2009.

"Jim is a thrill to coach and one of those guys every coach dreams about getting the chance to work with," said Hogan. "He's a true scholarathlete in every respect."

Junior Ky Burgess (Broken Arrow, Okla./Seminole State JC) is expected to share time

with Klocke behind the plate.

Burgess, who played in the Junior College World Series at Seminole State, warrants everyday consideration because of his size and experience. Therefore, he could see action at catcher, first base or as a corner outfielder.

Junior *Tim Rupp (Floris-sant, Mo./Forest Park CC)* and sophomore *Jesse Tierney (St. Louis, Mo./St. John Vianney H.S.)* are the other catchers on this year's team.

Tim is the younger brother of Brian Rupp, who is currently a minor league baseball manager of the Wilmington Blue Rocks in the Kansas City Royals organization. Brian was also drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 43rd round of the 1992 amateur draft and played seven seasons of proball, reaching as high as AAA.

Tierney played mainly when Klocke went to the mound last season.

Infield

The Redhawks return two starters on the left side of the infield in junior *Trenton Moses* (Advance, Mo./Advance H.S.) and sophomore Kenton Parmley (Goreville, Ill./Goreville H.S.). Moses is back at third base, while Parmley returns at shortstop.

Moses hit .258 with 31 runs scored, 11 doubles, two home runs and 24 RBI in 47 starts at the hot corner a year ago.

Parmley started all but one game at shortstop, hitting .306 as a freshman.

Rupp and junior *Casey Jones (St. Louis, Mo./Forest Park CC)* will challenge at third.

Jones polished off a nice junior college career when he hit .358 with 15 doubles and 57 RBI at Forest Park CC in 2009.

The right side of the infield is up for grabs after the loss of starters Tony Spencer (2B) and Matt Wagner (1B).

Sophomore Kody Campbell (Oran, Mo./Oran H.S.) is the frontrunner at first base, while junior Taylor Heon (Pacifica, Calif./Skyline CC) and freshman Bobby Colucci (Schaumburg, Ill./Conant H.S.) are battling at second.

Campbell hit just under .300 (.298), primarily as the Redhawks designated hitter last season.

Burgess could also be a possibility at first.

Heon comes to Southeast from Skyline Community College, where he was the 2009 Rawlings Gold Glove winner of the Pacific Division.

Colucci, who played second, shortstop and third during his prep career, was a two-time All-Conference pick at Conant High School.

Freshman *Derek Gibson* (Bonne Terre, Mo./North County H.S.) is the latest addition to Southeast's infield.

Gibson, who redshirted at quarterback for the Redhawks football team last fall, was a two-sport athlete at North County High School.

Outfield

Despite losing two starters, Southeast's outfield appears to be a strong point.

Redshirt-junior Louie Haseltine (St. Louis, Mo./De Smet Jesuit H.S.) looks to fill the void left by Justin Wheeler in left field.

Haseltine had a breakout season in 2009, earning Second-Team All-OVC honors at designated hitter. He hit .325 and boasted a team-high .667 slugging percentage in 45 games and 34 starts.

"Louie brings a strong bat to our lineup," said Hogan. "He has the ability to be one of the best defenders at the corner outfield spots."

Senior *Nick Harris (Alabaster, Ala./Thompson H.S.)* enters his second year as Southeast's starting center fielder.

Harris, who has also seen significant playing time at shortstop, started 49 of 50 games last season. He hit .254 with 35 runs scored, 16 doubles, six home runs, a triple and 35 RBI. Harris finished second on the team with 17 stolen bases.

"Nick had a good fall and we definitely count on him being a big contributor for us," commented Hogan.

Junior Blake Slattery (Cape Girardeau, Mo./Cape Central H.S.) is expected to replace Tyrell Cummings in right.

Slattery was bothered by some injuries which limited him to 13 games last year, but is healthy entering the 2010 season.

Newcomers Burgess, junior Brennan Malham (Auburn, Ill./Lincoln Land CC) and freshman Cole Bieser (St. Louis, Mo./Valle Catholic H.S.) could also make an immediate impact along the wall.

Malham was a First-Team All-Region, All-Conference and All-Sectional pick at Lincoln Land Community College last season.

Meanwhile, Bieser was a two-time First-Team All-Conference and All-State honoree at Valle Catholic High School. His father, Steve, played baseball at Southeast and is a former Major Leaguer, who was known primarily for catching and playing all three outfield positions. He was drafted by Philadelphia in 1989 and made it to AAA within the Phillies

organization, before making his Major League debut with the New York Mets in 1997. He then concluded his professional career with the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Juniors Brett Russell (Mt. Morris, Ill./Kankakee CC), and Greg Dambach (St. Louis, Mo./Oakville H.S.), and freshmen Ryan Abernathy (St. Louis, Mo./Marquette H.S.), Stephen Massie (St. Louis, Mo./St. John Vianney H.S.) and Andrew Hendrian (Decatur, Ill./Meridian H.S.) round out the outfielders on this year's team.

Pitching

Although the Redhawks had their share of problems on the mound towards the end of last season, pitching figures to be a major strength in 2010.

Southeast has 14 pitchers on the roster, giving second-year pitching coach Rick McCarty a lot of options.

"We have a good group of guys who have been working extremely hard," said McCarty. "They have done everything we've asked of them at this point."

The Redhawks return seniors Kyle Gumieny (RHP, St. Louis, Mo./St. John Vianney H.S.), John Salazar (RHP, La Palma, Calif. (RHP, Golden West CC) and Kirk Boeller (RHP, Cape Girardeau, Mo./Notre Dame H.S.) and juniors Josh Syberg (LHP, St. Louis, Mo./St. John Vianney H.S.), Corey Harness (RHP, Spring, Texas/Klein Collins H.S.) and Brad LaBruyere (RHP, Cape Girardeau, Mo./Cape Central H.S.)

Gumieny is projected to be the No. 1 starter in this year's rotation. He spent most of last season in the same role, making 13 appearances and 12 starts. Gumieny went 3-2 and tied for second on the team in wins.

Juniors Jon Dicus (RHP, Rochelle, Ill./Kankakee CC), Logan Mahon (LHP, St. Elmo, Ill./Kaskaskia College), Jordan Underwood (Edmond, Okla./Seminole State JC) and Harness are other viable weekend starters.

Dicus, one of eight new pitchers on the team, was a First-Team All-Region IV selection at Kankakee Community College.

Mahon joins the Redhawks from Kaskaskia College, where he earned All-Conference, All-Region and Academic All-American honors a year ago.

Underwood was on the Preseason Players to Watch List at Seminole State Junior College in 2009.

Harness led the Redhawks with a 4.55 ERA in nine appearances and four starts last season.

Syberg, who also has experience as a starter, is currently out after undergoing shoulder surgery in the fall. His return is undetermined at this time.

Junior Nick Thomas (RHP, Plano, Texas/McLennan CC) and freshman Shae Simmons (RHP, Scott City, Mo./Scott

City H.S.) could see action as either a starter or reliever.

Thomas attended McLennan Community College, while Simmons was a two-time All-Scott Mississippi Conference pick at nearby Scott City High School.

Juniors Jacob Wente (Steeleville, Ill./Rend Lake College) and Trent Wise (Bentonville, Ark./Crowder CC), along with Klocke, Boeller and LaBruyere are formidable situational pitchers.

Junior Michael Adamson (Freeburg, Ill./John A. Logan College) could be the team's top set-up man, while Wise looks to take over as the Redhawks closer.

Adamson is a dual-threat, who can pitch and play outfield, while Wise set a school record in saves at Crowder Community College.

Klocke led the Redhawks with seven saves as the team's closer last season, but this year McCarty looks to use him less in that role.

"It's not ideal to have your starting catcher be your closer," he said.

However, Klocke will be available in certain situations if the need arises.

1976 NCAA Division II College World Series Third-Place **S**quad

The 1976 Southeast Missouri State baseball team was inducted into the Southeast Athletics Hall of Fame on Nov. 4, 2006, becoming the first baseball team inducted into the Hall of Fame since its inception in 2002. The team joined legendary Southeast head coach Joe Uhls, player Tom Upton (1944-49) and former player Steve Williams (1982-83) in the Hall.

The squad, coached and led by Uhls, won the MIAA conference title, the NCAA Division II Midwest Regional title and advanced to the NCAA Division II College World Series in Springfield, III. They finished third in the nation and ended the season with a 28-15 overall record.

Members of the team included All-Americans Mark Amick, Trae Hastings and Dan Wieser, as well as current Southeast head coach, Mark Hogan.

Intering its 62nd year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference. For only the second time in a decade, the Conference expanded by adding Southern Illinois University Edwardsville as the league's 11th member in 2008. The move expanded the OVC's geographical footprint to the St. Louis market and marked the first change in membership since expanding to the state of Alabama (Jacksonville State, Samford) in 2003.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth

DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28. She is currently one of just five females to be the head of a Division I conference, and one of just eight to lead a Division I conference all-time. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27–28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the

league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

The first Division I-AA football playoff (which is now known as the Football Championship Subdivision) was held in 1978 with only four teams, which is the only year through present day that the OVC did not field a playoff representative. In 1979, four of the nation's top teams were invited to the playoffs, and two of them - Eastern Kentucky and Murray State - were from the OVC. Eastern Kentucky would go on to win the national championship in each 1979 and 1982.

Football wasn't the only sport in which the OVC was quickly gaining respect. In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a narrow 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off

14th-ranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann - combined for 39 points in the win. MSU nearly went on to the Sweet 16 that year, losing to eventual national champion Kansas, 61-58. A bank shot by Mann that would've given the Racers a one-point lead rolled off the rim with three seconds left. In 1990 as a No. 16 seed, Murray State took No. 1 seed Michigan State into overtime before falling 75-71; that game still marks the closest a No. 16 seed has come to knocking off a No. 1 in men's tournament action. More recently, Murray State has dominated the OVC Tournament, reaching the championship game every year in the 1990's. The Racers' 13 OVC Tournament Championships are the most among all OVC schools.

After former member Middle Tennessee State won a first round game in 1989, the league had a drought as no other OVC team won a NCAA Tournament game for the next 19 years. But Morehead State, coming off a thrilling double overtime OVC Tournament victory over Austin Peay, topped Alabama State 58-43 in the Opening Round game at Flyer Arena in Dayton, Ohio. The game was played in front of an Opening Round record crowd of 11,346; that crowd included many MSU fans who made the three hour drive from Morehead for the game. The Eagles season would come to three days later when they lost to No. 1 overall seed Louisville, despite playing the Cardinals close for a majority of the game.

Through its 61 years, 12 teams have won or shared the league's regular season men's basketball title. Murray State heads the list with a Conference-record 20 outright or shared basketball crowns. Other past champions include former member Western Kentucky (19), Morehead State (9), Austin Peay (8), Eastern Kentucky (6), Tennessee Tech (5), former member Middle Tennessee (5), Tennessee State (2), former member East Tennessee State (2), Southeast Missouri State (1), UT Martin (who won its first in 2008-09) and former member Akron (1).

Among the coaching greats in men's basketball have been Western Kentucky's E.A. Diddle, who retired with 759 victories and 10 OVC titles; John Oldham, who was a member of the very first All-OVC squad and went on to win seven OVC crowns during his coaching tenure at Tennessee Tech and Western Kentucky; Paul McBrayer, who guided Eastern Kentucky to 219 wins and three OVC crowns; and Cal Luther, who is the only person in Conference history to win men's basketball Coach of the Year honors at two league schools - Murray State and UT Martin. Current Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos ended the 2008-09 season with 314 victories, the most all-time at Austin Peay and second most in OVC history (only four wins behind Luther).

There have been an equal number of great players including Western Kentucky's Clem Haskins, who is the only three-time OVC Player of the Year. Several players have won OVC Player of the Year honors twice: Western Kentucky's Jim McDaniels (1969-70 and 1970-71), Murray State's Les Taylor (1971-72, 1972-73), Jeff Martin (1987-88, 1988-89), Popeye Jones (1989-90, 1990-91) and Marcus Brown (1994-95, 1995-96), Austin Peay's Otis Howard (1976-77, 1977-78), Middle Tennessee's Jerry Beck (1980-81, 1981-82), Akron's Joe Jakubick (1982-83, 1983-84), Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers (1992-93, 1993-94) and UT Martin's Lester Hudson (2007-08, 2008-09).

In 2007-08, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson became the first men's Division I player to record a quadruple-double in a game, when he registered 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a victory over Central Baptist College. Hudson, who ranked fourth in scoring nationally as a junior, returned for his senior season in 2008-09 and was second nationally in scoring (behind Davidson's Stephen Curry) at 27.5 points a contest. Hudson earned numerous honors (including OVC Player of the Year and OVC Male Athlete of the Year in each 2008 and 2009 and All-American status from several outlets) before being drafted by the Boston Celtics

with the No. 58 pick of the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson became the first draft pick for the league since 2004 and only the third pick of the last decade for the OVC.

Over its 61 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track and golf. The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States Olympic Rifle Team. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peay) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present-day standouts like basketball player Trenton Hassell (Austin Peay), football player Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois), baseball players Jamie Walker (Austin Peay) and George Sherrill (Austin Peay) and professional golfer Jeff Sluman (Tennessee Tech). Hamilton is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and a NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles Lakers).

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of American (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 179 student-athletes honored with the award, including 25 over the last three years (2006-07 to the present).

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.


