

Postgame Procedure

The Southeast Missouri Sports Information staff will make requested student-athletes available to the media at the conclusion of each game. Coach Samuel's first postgame responsibility after meeting with the team is his live radio show. Samuel and selected student-athletes will address the media in the Houck Field House conference room. For interviews with opposing coaches and players, please make arrangements with the visiting sports information director before the end of the game.

Houck Stadium Press Box

Press facilities are located in the Houck Stadium Press Box located on the top of the south side of the stadium. The press box is a two-level

facility, so please use caution when walking up and down the stairs.

Redhawks Radio Network

Erik Sean returns for his 11th year as the "Voice of the Redhawks." Sean is the Director of Sports Operations for Mississippi River Radio's eight radio stations in Cape Girardeau. He is a 10-time winner of the Missouri Broadcasters Association's Play-by-Play Award and three-time winner of the MBA's Sports Award. Sean will be assisted again this season by former Southeast quarterback Rick Wieser (color analyst) and KZIM/KGIR sports anchor and reporter Todd Bonacki (sideline) at all home games.

Redhawks on Television

Southeast will be featured as part of the OVC's television package twice this season. The Redhawks will be on the OVC Football "Game of the Week" at Eastern Illinois on Sept. 2 and

at Austin Peay on Oct. 16. The OVC and Wazoo Sports have partnered to broadcast games from September to November. Wazoo Sports, Inc. is a regional sports network that delivers broadcasts of high school, NCAA, NAIA and youth sports LIVE & ON DEMAND via television and internet. Wazoo Sports launched online in December of 2007 and expanded to a 24/7 sports television on Sept. 25, 2009. Wazoo Sports has produced over 430 LIVE games and currently serves over 600,000 households in Kentucky. A complete list of the stations and affiliates outside the Wazoo Sports Network

coverage area that will broadcast the games will be released at a later date.



Weekly Television Show

Redhawk Football with Tony Samuel will be televised Monday nights at 11:05 p.m., CT, on the Heartland CW (WQWQ-TV, Charter Cable 33). The show is hosted by Todd Richards and will air 13 weeks this season.

KFVS12 will provide live webcasting for all of Southeast Missouri's home football games this season. Fans can watch all webcasts free of charge online at *kfvs12.com*.

Radio Show

"Redhawk Football with Tony Samuel" will air live every Tuesday from 12-1 p.m., CT, at Beef O'Brady's, beginning Aug. 31. The weekly radio show, hosted by Erik Sean, will be broadcast on ESPN 1220 and 1470 AM. Samuel and other Southeast coaches and athletic staff members will be featured on the show. ouck Stadium will serve as the home of Southeast Missouri State University football for the 80th-consecutive year.

Fans continue to flock to Houck Stadium to experience the exciting atmosphere on Redhawk football gamedays.

Houck Stadium was built in 1930 at a cost of \$150,000 and remains a beutiful and picturesque stadium today.

The dedication game pitted Southeast and Southern Illinois University from nearby Carbondale, Ill., on Oct. 3, 1930. That game attracted a crowed of over 6,000, with SIU claiming a 12-6 victory. The referee of the inaugural game was James T. Blair, who served as the Governor of Missouri from 1957-61.

Houck Stadium was constructed on the site of an old rock quarry and was purchased in 1925 for \$11,000 at the recommendation of then-college President Joseph A. Serena.

Ten thousand bags of Portland Cement,

23,000 feet of Oregon Fir seat lumber and 150,000 feet of Yellow Pine Form lumber were used in the construction, according to an ad in the Houck Stadium dedication program. The original stadium included 5,240 seats on the south side of the field.


The field and stadium were named in honor of Louis Houck, who served 39 years as a Regent for the University and President of the Board for all but three of those years.

Seating on the north side of the stadium was added prior to the 1963 season. The press box was later constructed on the south side in 1979. Approximately 400 chairback seats were added to a center section on the south side of the stadium in 1992.

In 2000, a Field Turf playing surface wa added and the exterior of the facility was resurfaced. Improvements were also made to the press box.

More upgrades took place in the fall of 2005. Those included a paved parking area adjacent





Most recently, a state-of-the-art dormitory was added to the west end of Houck Stadium. The ground floor of that building houses a locker room and athletic training room for the football program.

Six of the largest single-game crowds at Houck Stadium have come in the last 10 years.

In 2003, Southeast achieved a Houck Stadium record when 11,000 fans -- and a Fox Sports Midwest and Fox Sports South regional television audience -- witnessed the game against Southern Illinois University.

The Redhawks also drew over 10,000 fans for the Western Kentucky (10,222) and Murray State (10,028) in 2000, the Murray State (10,100) game in 2001 and Southern Illinois (10,100) matchup in 2005.

Southeast reached a new single-season attendance roord when it averaged 8,056 fans per game in 2000.

e are very proud of the tradition of excellence we are building here at Southeast Missouri State University and demand a lot from our studentathletes.

Honesty, integrity, unrelenting effort and attention to detail are the pillars of our training program. Simply put, our goal is to outwork every opponent we go up against, and learn to rely on one another to achieve a common goal. We may not be the fastest, strongest or most talented, but we certainly have the attitude that, together, we can take on the world.

In the weight room, we take a comprehensive approach to training. Programs are ground-based, founded on the Olympic Lifts (Clean, Jerk, etc.) and traditional strength training (Front/Back Squat, Dead Lift, Pressing and Pulling). The concept is simple. Find

something heavy and move it in a way that mimics the actions of your sport as fast as you can.

In the training arena, we strive to take the foundational strength and power we have developed and refine it into sport-specific movements and skills. We start by emphasizing correct motor skill and muscle recruitment patterns in order to maximize athletic potential and minimize the risk of injury. We drill tirelessly on proper movement patterns so that agility and change of direction are razor sharp.

We spend a great deal of time on both explosive movements and body control to develop first step quickness, acceleration/deceleration, balance and coordination. Lastly, we condition our minds and bodies in a way that mimics game simulation.

It is our hope that through the countless lessons learned in sport and competition, we are helping to develop the leaders of tomorrow.

revention. Treatment. Rehabilitation. Education. Those are the four primary phases of athletic training, and the Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Training staff strives to fulfill all of those areas when working with the student-athletes on a daily basis.

Southeast student-athletes are offered the best care possible by the Athletic Training staff. Head Athletic Trainer, Alfred Castillo, directs the Sports Medicine department which includes four full-time athletic trainers, six graduate assistants and several student assistants. The staff serves student-athletes around-the-clock at numerous facilities on campus.

The Athletic Trainers begin treatments and rehabilitation starting as early as 6:00 a.m., and are available until the last student-athlete is through. There are currently four athletic training facilities on campus. The staff treats out

of Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary athletic training room is located. There are two other satellite athletic training rooms, including one at Houck Field House and one at the Show Me Center.

The Southeast Athletic Training rooms are equipped with stationary bikes, hand weights, therapeutic modalities, and the latest physical therapy equipment. Each component is strategically designed to not only give the student-athlete the best care, but also to aid in returning to competition as quickly as possible.

Southeast Athletic Training has strong working relationships with local physicians and the two hospitals located within Cape Girardeau. It is from these hospitals that the Athletic Training department is assisted by four orthopedic physicians.

The Southeast Athletic Training program prides and commits itself to providing the





best comprehensive, personalized and efficient health care to its student-athletes. Delivery of healthcare focuses on the prevention and management of athletic-related injuries or illnesses, while adhering to the National Athletic Trainers' Board of Certification Standards of Professional Practice. Our high quality of athletic healthcare is provided in combination with the education of athletic training students.

he Redhawks Success Center offers Southeast Missouri State studentathletes a place to study and develop as students and campus leaders.

The Redhawks Success Center is located in Student Recreation Center, just south of Houck Stadium. The facility offers a computer lab with 18 computer work terminals, study areas and rooms for group meetings.

The area is under the guidance of Cindy Gannon, Associate Director of Athletics, with assistance from Director of Academic Services Sharon Burgard and two graduate assistants -Geoff Wester and Israel Kirk.

The beautiful facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by Southeast student-athletes. During the 2009 fall semester, the Southeast athletic programs combined for a 3.12 grade point average, its highest for a fall term. Eleven of the Redhawks

15 programs recorded a team GPA of 3.0 or better. In all, 207 student-athletes recorded at least a 3.0 GPA. Of that group, 50 finished the fall term with a perfect 4.0.

Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress are monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study skills and life skills topics and thus, enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes can also recieve individualized academic programs which includes meeting with a mentor at least bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.



The Success Center staff also works to get athletes involved in campus and community projects. This is done to provide a support structure and greater opportunity for academic success for student-athletes. Through the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills Program the Success Center gives student-athletes personal and professional skills in order to facilitate successful and productive futures.







REDHAWKS IN THE NEL

he Redhawks currently have three players active in the National Football League.

G/C Eugene Amano is with the Tennessee Titans, G/C Dan Connolly is with the New England Patriots and OLB/DE Edgar Jones is with the Baltimore Ravens.

Former Southeast assistant coach Jon Gruden rose to the top of professional football in 2003 when he guided the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title. Gruden was also head coach of the Oakland Raiders and is now a color commentator for Monday Night Football. Gruden coached at Southeast in 1988.

Marty Mornhinweg, another Southeast assistant, is currently the offensive coordinator for the Philadelphia Eagles.



) OFFENSIVE PREVIEW

he Southeast Missouri State University football team enters its 2010 season with some unfinished business.

Southeast, which went 2-9 overall and 1-7 in the Ohio Valley Conference, lost four games by 10 or fewer points last season.

The Redhawks were involved in many close contests throughout the year.

"Last season was full of momentum swings," said head coach Tony Samuel. "We were competitive, but missed some opportunities."

Southeast returns seven starters on both sides of the ball this season.

Offensively, preseason All-OVC quarterback Matt Scheible, tailback Henry Harris and wide receivers Chantae Ahamefule and Miles Edwards are back at the skill positions.

Southeast, which tied for second in the OVC in sacks allowed last season, has some holes to fill on the offensive line.

Center Sean Middleton, left guard Frank Knights and left tackle Evan Conrad all return, but the right side of the line is open.

Fullback Mike Jones and tight

end Bradley Brown are other key contributors on offense. Both served primarily in backup roles a year ago.

Defensively, a linebacker has led the Redhawks in tackles each of the last four seasons. Southeast will look to continue that trend this year.

Justin Woodlief and Philip Klaproth are back to take charge of the linebacker corps.

Woodlief led the Redhawks in tackles and was named to the OVC's All-Newcomer Team, while Klaproth finished as the team's third-leading tackler.

The defensive line was an area hampered by injury last season. However, it appears to be at full strength heading into 2010.

Preseason All-OVC selection J.J. Sanchez and Maurice Lyles return to the tackle spots.

Justin Love, who is coming off a strong freshman campaign, is back at defensive end.

Safeties Bryan Blanfort and Aris Bowen are the other two returning starters on defense.

Both were among the top-five on the team in tackles last season, with Blanfort ranking second and Bowen finishing fourth.

The Redhawks will have a new look at cornerback after losing their top two cover men in Salim Powell and Eddie Calvin.

Abraham Woodard and Aaron Grimes are listed first on the depth chart at those positions entering this year's camp.

On special teams, Southeast lost its top kicker and return man from last season.

Redshirt-freshman Joe Vucic is currently the frontrunner for the punting and kicking duties, while fellow newcomer Spencer Davis will handle returns.

Brandon Gabbard is expected to start at longsnapper again this season.

Here is a positional breakdown for the Redhawks this year:

Quarterback

Junior **Matt Scheible** will start under center for the Redhawks this season. Scheible took over as the starting quarterback in 2009.

The Washington, Mo., native is a dynamic dual-threat quarterback who completed 141-of-284 passes for 1,596 yards and 11 touchdowns in 11 starts last year. He achieved the ninth-best single-season passing average in school history with 145.1 yards per game.

Scheible was just as effective in the running game, where he gained 487 yards and scored four touchdowns on 129 carries. He ended the year ranked second on the team in rushing.

Redshirt-freshman **Zach Levy** will backup Scheible, while redshirt-freshman **Derek Gibson** and redshirt-sophomore **Nick Vechiarella** add depth to the position.

Running Back

Senior **Henry Harris** returns as the Redhawks feature back.

Harris ran for 720 yards and seven touchdowns on 151 carries as Southeast's leading rusher last season. He averaged 4.8 yards per carry and ranked sixth in the OVC in rushing with 65.5 yards a game.

The Redhawks finished the year

ranked 16th in the nation and second in the OVC in rushing offense, averaging 183.6 yards per contest.

Renard Celestin and Sheldon McCullough are also in the mix at tailback.

Celestin, who played in 10 games last season, ran the ball 10 times for 84 yards and one touchdown. He scored his first career TD on a 31-yard run late in the third quarter against Quincy on Sept. 3.

McCullough had a good spring. He was enrolled at Southeast, but did not play in any games during the 2009 season.

Receivers

Wide receiver figures to be another strong component of the Redhawk offense in 2010.

Junior **Chantae Ahamefule** and senior **Miles Edwards** are Southeast's biggest targets this year.

Ahamefule, who stands at 6-6, ranked second on the team with 28 catches for 365 yards and three touchdowns in 10 starts last season

Edwards (6-3) is currently tied for third all-time at Southeast with 14 career receiving touchdowns. He caught 26 passes for 368 yards and four touchdowns in 2009.


Junior **Cedric Cox** and sophomore **Ola Alli** are other prominent wideouts.

Cox caught seven passes for 122 yards and one touchdown. His TD came on a 56-yard pass at Tennessee State on Oct. 3.

Alli played in three games last season. He made his first career start at Jacksonville State on Nov. 7.

Running back Henry Harris can stretch the passing game with his ability to catch out of the backfield.

He was fifth on the team with 13 catches for 51 yards and had the most receptions of any running back last season.

Tight End

Senior **Bradley Brown** and freshman **Art Mueller** will battle for the starting job at tight end.

Brown played in seven games and made two starts for the Redhawks last season. He finished the year with three catches for 84 yards and averaged 28 yards per reception.

Mueller had a productive spring after redshirting in 2009.

Offensive Guard

The left side of the offensive line appears to be in good shape, but the right side is wide open.

Senior Frank Knights returns at left guard after starting all 11 games in his first year at Southeast last season.

Junior **Armin Blagajcevic** is listed at the top of the depth chart at right guard.

Blagajcevic saw action in five games a year ago.

Newcomers **Chris Duggins** and **Edgar Dimas** will challenge at the guard positions.

Duggins was a two-year starter at Fort Scott Community College, where he played in the National Championship game vs. Blinn (Texas) in 2009.

Dimas spent the last three seasons at Cerritos College.

Offensive Tackle

Southeast's offensive line allowed only 14 sacks last season, second-fewest in the OVC.

Sophomore **Evan Conrad** and senior **Brandon Harris** contributed to that success.

Both served in a starting capacity a year ago and will look to do so again in 2010.

Conrad started each of the last nine games of the season, including five at right tackle and four at left tackle.

Meanwhile, Harris made three starts at left tackle.

Senior **Kyle Hubert** and redshirt-freshman **Chris Watson** will also look to contribute.

Hubert, who can also play tight end, is listed as Conrad's backup at left tackle, while Watson is behind





Harris on the right side.

Center

Center is the most experienced part of the offensive line this season.

Seniors **Sean Middleton** and **Bryan Curry** return to anchor the position.

Middleton started 10 games last year, while Curry played in eight contests and made one start.

Fullback

Senior **Mike Jones** is the lead candidate at fullback after playing

10 games as a reserve in 2009.

Jones ranked third on the team with 463 yards and three touchdowns as Southeast's only running back to rush for over 100 yards in a game last season.

Jones, who is 6'4" and weighs 240 pounds, could also see significant playing time at tailback.

Senior **Nathan Grass** and sophomore **Matt Rehan** are other options.

Grass played in six games on special teams, while Rehan saw action in two contests last season.

Nose Tackle

Southeast had several injuries on the defensive line last season, but that part of the defense is healthy heading into 2010.

Senior **J.J. Sanchez** returns at nose tackle after registering 46 tackles in eight starts.

Sanchez, who ranked fourth on the team in sacks (1.5) and fifth in tackles for loss (4.5), took over as the Redhawks starting nose tackle at UT Martin on Sept. 26.

Senior **Josh Gipson** also saw significant playing time in 2009.

Gipson played in 10 games, had 21 tackles and ranked third on the team in both sacks (2.0) and tackles for loss (5.0). He recorded both of his sacks against Murray State on Nov. 14.

Freshman **Charles Tillman** could be another valid contributor at nose tackle.

Tillman notched 49 tackles and three sacks as a senior at Dunbar High School last season.

Defensive Tackle

Senior **Maurice Lyles** is back at defensive tackle.

Lyles started all 11 games for the Redhawks last season. He finished with 29 tackles, including one sack and 1.5 tackles for loss. Lyles also led the team and tied for second in the OVC with three fumble recoveries.

Josh Gipson and **Frankie Davis** will challenge Lyles for the starting job.

Davis recently transferred to Southeast from the University of Central Florida, where he redshirted and practiced on the scout team last season. He was an honorable mention All-State and First-Team All-Conference selection as a senior at East Ridge High School.

Defensive End

Sophomore **Justin Love** and junior **Steve Hendry** are projected to be the starters at defensive end.

Love is coming off a strong freshman campaign which saw him record 30 tackles and rank third on

the team with 5.5 tackles for loss. He also had one sack and forced a fumble.

Hendry saw limited action, posting five tackles in three games.

Junior **Courtney Brame** and true freshman **Trent Peterson** should also contribute.

Brame had five tackles in five games. He recorded a season-high three tackles in the season-opener vs. Quincy on Sept. 3.

Peterson joins the Redhawks from Milford Academy, where he had 25 tackles, a sack and two fumble recoveries in 2009.

Linebackers

Sophomore Blake Peiffer, seniors Justin Woodlief and Joshua Jackson, and junior Philip Klaproth return to lead the linebackers. Woodlief, Jackson and Klaproth ranked among the top-six on the team in tackles last season.

Peiffer has a slight edge over Woodlief at middle linebacker.

Peiffer finished with 32 tackles and one fumble recovery in 10 games as a true freshman.

Woodlief led Southeast and ranked fourth in the OVC with 93 tackles en route to landing a spot on the league's All-Newcomer Team. He also had two tackles for loss, one interception and forced a fumble.

Woodlief registered 10 or more tackles a team-high five times in nine starts. He posted a career-high 16 tackles at Eastern Kentucky on Oct. 31. In addition, Woodlief had 40 solo stops, second-most on the team.

While Woodlief is expected to maintain the starting job at middle linebacker, Jackson and Klaproth look to fill the outside spots.

Jackson ranked sixth on the team with 53 tackles in 11 games and two starts last season. He finished the year with a combined 22 tackles in his last two games alone.

Klaproth tied for third on the team with 66 tackles a year ago. Klaproth also blocked a field goal and had an interception.

Senior Andrew Adams and

sophomore **Darrick Borum** will battle at outside linebacker.

Adams added eight tackles in 10 games, playing mainly on special teams.

Borum, who was limited to only three games due to injury, had two tackles in 2009.

A linebacker has led the Redhawks in tackles every year since 2006.

Safeties

Southeast tied for fourth in the OVC with 11 interceptions last season, and senior **Aris Bowen** had two of those picks.

Bowen started eight games at the rover position and ranked fourth on the team with 65 tackles. Both of his interceptions came in consecutive games against Austin Peay (Oct. 10) and at Tennessee Tech (Oct. 24).

Junior **Kris Cottner** will backup Bowen at the rover spot. Cottner had three tackles and saw action in all 11 contests last season.

Sophomores **Tylor Brock** and **Branden Spann** will compete for the starting job at free safety.

Brock had 11 tackles in 10 games and scored a touchdown when he recovered a blocked punt in the end zone during his Southeast debut vs. Quincy on Sept. 3.

Spann registered eight tackles in five games.

Cornerbacks

The Redhawks lost both of their starting cornerbacks and will look for seniors **Aaron Grimes** and **Abraham Woodard** to help fill that void. Neither have started a game in their Southeast careers.

Grimes ended the 2009 season with eight tackles and one forced fumble in seven games, while Cottner had three tackles and saw action in all 11 contests.

Woodard registered 11 tackles in eight games, including five against Eastern Illinois on Sept. 19.

Junior transfers **Jaren Butler** and **Kweku Arkorful** increase the depth at cornerback.

Butler was a two-time Golden Gate All-Conference selection

HEAD COACH TONY SAMUEL



ony Samuel is in his fifth season as the head coach at Southeast Missouri State University.

Samuel, the ninth head coach in Southeast football history, was named to the position on Dec. 21, 2005.

In his first four years at Southeast, Samuel coached two First-Team All-Americans, five First-Team All-OVC selections and three OVC All-Newcomer picks.

Samuel also coached Edgar Jones, who is in his fourth year with the Baltimore Ravens. Jones is currently one of three former Southeast players in the National Football League.

Samuel has coached at the NCAA Division I level for 28

years, working 16 seasons as an assistant coach and 12 as a head coach.

He made stops at Western Michigan, Stanford, Nebraska, New Mexico State and Purdue before taking over at Southeast.

Samuel spent the bulk of his coaching career on the Great Plains of the Midwestern United States.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska, Samuel both played and coached football at his alma mater.

He coached the linebacker and rush end positions under legendary head coach Tom Osborne for 11 seasons (1986-96), Samuel mentored six First-Team All-Americans and 12 future NFL players. Nebraska won two National Championships (1994,





1995), captured seven Big Eight/ Big 12 Conference titles and played in 11 bowl games over that

As a player, Samuel was a member of Osborne's first recruiting class at Nebraska. He was a two-year starter at defensive end and played in four bowl games, including the Sugar, Fiesta, Astro Bluebonnet and Liberty Bowls. Samuel earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors as a senior in 1977.

Samuel and six other members of his coaching staff have ties to the University of Nebraska.

Samuel went on to be the head coach at New Mexico State from 1997-2004, where he presently stands as the third-winningest coach in school history with 57 victories.

New Mexico State went 6-5 in 1999, recording its first winning season since 1992 and only its third in 32 years. In 2002, Samuel's Aggie squad posted a 7-5 mark which represented the most wins in a season since 1967.

His teams won the Rio Grande Championship twice, and he led the Aggies to an undefeated home

record in 2002. Samuel was instrumental in leading the 2003 New Mexico State squad to a No. 13 ranking in graduation rates among all NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) programs (76 percent).

Samuel then spent one year as the defensive ends coach at Purdue University (2005) before accepting the head coaching job at Southeast.

While at Purdue, Samuel coached Rob Ninkovich, the team's Most Valuable Player and Second-Team All-Big Ten defensive end.

Samuel received his undergraduate degree in education from Nebraska in 1981. He was elected to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees in 2002.

Samuel is a native of Trinidad, West Indies, and moved to Jersey City, N.J. at the age of 10. He and his wife, Tamara, have five children, Travis, Serena, Phillip, Karisa and Terryn.

incent White is in his fifth season as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Southeast Missouri State University.

Brinkley also served as defensive coordinator, head track coach and head coach for the junior varsity girls basketball program during his time at Beaumont.


From 1990-94, Brinkley held various summer camp coaching positions at the University of Nebraska.

Brady held other coaching duties at Stanford (student-assistant) and worked various camps at Nebraska, USC and San Diego



outheast Missouri finished its fourth season under head coach Tony Samuel with an overall record of 2-9 and 1-7 in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Southeast ranked 16th in the nation and second in the OVC in rushing offense, averaging 183.6 yards per game.

The Redhawks started the year with a bang, setting a new modern day school record for points scored during a 72-3 rout of Quincy on Sept. 3.

Southeast scored 21 points in the first 4:25 of the game and never let up to earn Samuel his third season-opening victory.

The Redhawks, after scoring only 13 first-quarter points in 2008, erupted for 28 in the opening stanza. Southeast also scored a touchdown in all three phases of the game to take down a Quincy team that came to Cape Girardeau fresh off a win over NCAA Football Championship Subdivision member Indiana State.

"We had trouble scoring early in the past, but came out and executed in the first quarter," said QB Matt Scheible.

Southeast looked to maintain its momentum when it headed to Football Bowl Subdivision foe and

then-No. 23 Cincinnati on Sept. 12.

Doug Spada's 23-yard field goal with 5:55 left in the first quarter accounted for the Redhawks only scoring in the 70-3 loss.

Cincinnati went 12-1, won the BIG EAST and ranked eighth in the final Associated Press Top-25 Poll. The Bearcats only loss was to No. 3 Florida in the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

Southeast returned home to open its eight-game conference slate against eventual regular-season champion Eastern Illinois as a part of Family Weekend on Sept. 19.

EIU turned the ball over four times, but scored 16 unanswered points in the second half to escape with a 23-14 win in front of a crowd of 9,053 at Houck Stadium.

The Redhawks led, 14-7, at halftime, before coming up short against the Panthers.

That loss marked the first of four-straight by 10 or fewer points for Southeast in league play.

Southeast hit the road for the next two weeks, visiting UT Martin on Sept. 26 and Tennessee State on Oct. 3.

The Redhawks and Skyhawks hooked up in a hard-fought, physical battle.

"I thought both teams played



very hard and the effort was unbelievable," said Samuel. "It was a game of momentum swings."

Southeast nearly overcame a 14-point halftime deficit when it rallied for 13 points in the fourth quarter.

Scheible engineered a masterful 10-play, 81-yard drive and ran for a 1-yard touchdown to pull the Redhawks to within seven points with just under two minutes to play.

Southeast had one more chance, but threw an interception on its final possession of the 29-22 loss.

Mike Jones ran for 101 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries to lead the offense.

Defensively, LB Justin Woodlief recorded 10 tackles. Woodlief also delivered a crushing hit on QB Cade Thompson late in the game.

A week later, Southeast squared off against Tennessee State at LP Field, home of the National Football League's Tennessee Titans.

The Redhawks had the Tigers on the ropes, but couldn't deliver the knockout punch.

Southeast fell behind, 13-3, before Scheible threw a 44-yard touchdown pass to Miles Edwards to cut the lead to 13-10 just before the half.

The Tigers answered by scoring 10-straight points and Southeast didn't recover.

The Redhawks scored once more on an 18-yard pass from Scheible to Walter Peoples late in the fourth quarter.

After the touchdown, Southeast attempted an on-side kick and TSU recovered. The Tigers then ran out the clock to secure the 23-17 win.

Woodlief had another big game defensively, this time registering 14 tackles with 10 solo stops.

Southeast hosted Austin Peay during Homecoming Weekend on Oct. 10.

The Redhawks held a 14-3 lead after three quarters before APSU put up 21 points in the fourth to win, 24-14.

"It was a tough second half and our defense showed signs of fatigue," said Samuel.

The Governors scored three rushing touchdowns in the final quarter, none of which were more than six yards.

Harris scored the game's first touchdown on a 1-yard run with 9:13 remaining in the second quarter.

Bryan Blanfort intercepted a Jake Ryan pass and ran 69 yards for Southeast's other touchdown which came with 5:57 left in the third quarter. Blanfort's 69-yard run was the second-longest interception return for a touchdown in

school history.

There were also five interceptions in the game, including three by Southeast.

Next on the schedule were trips to Tennessee Tech (Oct. 24) and Eastern Kentucky (Oct. 31).

The Redhawks took an early 6-0 lead on a pair of Curtis Huge field goals in the first quarter.

However, the difference in the game was when TTU responded with 21 unanswered points by way of three-consecutive rushing touchdowns.

Southeast had 305 yards of total offense in the 28-16 loss.

Scheible completed 15-of-32 passes for 164 yards and one touchdown and surpassed 1,000 passing yards on the year.

The Redhawks wore all white uniforms for the first time since 2005. Interestingly enough, the last time Southeast dressed in all white was at TTU on Nov. 19 of that season.

"I thought our kids played hard," said Samuel. "This is a team game and all three phases of the game have to click."

Six-straight meetings between TTU and Southeast had been decided by no more than seven points prior to 2009.

The Redhawks went to OVC preseason favorite Eastern Ken-

tucky a week later.

Despite pulling to within seven points with 4:05 left in the game, EKU managed to hang on for a 20-6 win in a defensive battle.

"We had a lot of energy and fought through a lot of adversity," said Samuel. "We had some missed opportunities, but the effort was there."

Southeast trailed, 13-0, before Scheible threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to Peoples late in the fourth quarter.

Bruce Frieson's 28-yard touchdown run with four seconds left put the game on ice for EKU.

Woodlief established a careerhigh 16 tackles to lead the Redhawks. Philip Klaproth followed with 12.

Offensively, Peoples made his 100th career reception on an 11-yard catch early in the fourth quarter.

Southeast rounded out the season with three-straight home games, including two against ranked opponents.

The Redhawks hosted then-No. 15 Jacksonville State on Nov. 7.

JSU scored 24 unanswered points in the first half, including 21 in the opening quarter.

Huge scored Southeast's only points in the 24-3 loss on a 33yard field goal with 33 seconds left in the third quarter.

The Redhawks ran a season-high 78 plays en route to 312 yards of total offense.

Harris led Southeast with 74 yards on 17 carries, while Scheible followed with 71 yards on 19 attempts.

Southeast put an end to its eight-game losing streak against rival Murray State on Nov. 14.

The Redhawks scored five rushing touchdowns to key a dominating 49-13 win.

Southeast led 20-10 at halftime and outcored the Racers, 29-3, in the second half.

Jones and Harris each scored two touchdowns, helping the Redhawks to 302 rushing yards.

Jones enjoyed his second 100yard game of the season. He ran the ball 14 times for 113 yards.

Harris added 99 yards on 21 carries

Scheible completed 6-of-12 passes for 188 yards. He threw two touchdowns in a game for the first time in his career.

Both of Scheible's touchdown passes were to Chantae Ahamefule, who finished with 150 yards on three catches. One of those was a 75-yard reception in the third quarter.

The Redhawks played host to regional-rival and FCS power-

house Southern Illinois in the final game of the season. The Salukis came to town ranked No. 1 in the nation for the 75th meeting between the two schools.

Southeast, after trailing 21-0 at halftime, outscored SIU, 24-21, in the last 30 minutes.

Edwards caught touchdown passes of 54 and five yards to fuel a 17-point third quarter.

William Castro returned an interception 14 yards for a touchdown with 9:22 left in the game to cap the Redhawks scoring.

Scheible threw for 155 yards and two touchdowns on 10-of-18 passing.

"We hung in there and played really hard," said Scheible. "We came back and were able to put some points on the board against a great defense."

Southeast honored 17 seniors prior to the game, six of which were part of Samuel's first recruiting class in 2006.

Woodlief and punter Doug Spada garnered All-OVC honors for the Redhawks.

Woodlief was named to the league's All-Newcomer Team after leading Southeast with 93 tackles.

Spada, a second-team pick, earned all-conference accolades for the third time in his career. He ranked 15th in the nation in punting average (40.9 ypp).

GAME 1 RECAP

Southeast Missouri 72 Quincy 3

September 3, 2009 Houck Stadium Attendance: 6,105

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. -Southeast Missouri set a new modern day record for most points in a game with a 72-3 rout of Quincy in the 2009 season-opener.

Southeast scored 21 points in the first 4:25 of the game and never looked back en route to its third season-opening victory in four years under head coach Tony Samuel.

"Special teams can make you or break you in a hurry. Our guys made plays on special teams and set the tone early," said Samuel. "We played hard and never let up."

The Redhawks, who scored only 13 first-quarter points in 2008, erupted for 28 points in the opening stanza. Southeast put up touchdowns in all three phases of the game against a Quincy team that entered the night with plenty of momentum after toppling NCAA Football Championship Subdivision member Indiana State in overtime a week earlier.

"We had trouble scoring in the first quarter last year," said quarterback Matt Scheible. "We came out and executed in the first quarter tonight and saw the potential our offense has."

Jacob McKinley ran the opening kickoff back 80 yards to set up Southeast's first touchdown, a 2-yard run by Henry Harris on the third play of the game.

Tyler Epstein intercepted Sam Donatucci's first pass on the second play of Quincy's opening drive and ran 24 yards for a touchdown to push Southeast's lead to 14-0 at the 12:41 mark. Epstein's INT return for a touchdown was the Redhawks first in two years.

Southeast forced Quincy to punt on its next possession. Andrew Adams then came free up the middle to block Kyle Homeyer's kick. True freshman Tylor Brock recovered the ball in the end zone, giving the Redhawks a 21-0 lead.

Scheible's 32-yard touchdown pass to Chantae Ahamefule capped a 4-play, 78-yard march with 7:02 on the clock to make it 28-0.

The Redhawks continued to pour it on when they scored on all of their possessions in the second quarter.

Harris scored twice more on runs of three and 14 yards, respectively. Scheible hooked up with Walter Peoples for a 17-yard touchdown pass and scored on a 9-yard run. Doug Spada added a 20-yard field goal to give Southeast a 58-0 halftime lead.

Rushing touchdowns by Renard Celestin (31 yards, third quarter) and Trey Porter (12 yards, fourth quarter) polished off the Redhawks scoring.

Quincy managed to get on the board when Alex Beard made a 19-yard field goal with 6:14 remaining in the third quarter.

The Hawks best scoring opportunity came during their last possession of the game. Quincy had a 1st-and-Goal at the Southeast-2, but came up short. Linebacker Justin Woodlief was in on four tackles to key the Redhawks goal line stand.

Southeast registered 512 yards of total offense, while Quincy had 220.

Scheible completed 11-of-18 passes for 222 yards and two touchdowns in just the third start of his career. He also ran for one TD.

Peoples and Miles Edwards paved the way for the Redhawks receivers. Peoples caught five passes for 76 yards and a touchdown, while Edwards had two catches for a game-high 81 yards. Peoples (1,048) went over 1,000 receiving yards in his Southeast career.

Harris scored three rushing touchdowns in a game for the first time in his career to lead Southeast on the ground. He carried the ball three times for 88 yards, averaging eight yards per carry. The Redhawks scored six rushing touchdowns on the night, matching a single-game school record.

#23 Cincinnati 70 Southeast Missouri 3

September 12, 2009 Nippert Stadium Attendance: 30,421

CINCINNATI, Ohio. - Mardy Gilyard scored a career-high four touchdowns to lead No. 23 Cincinnati to a 70-3 win over Southeast Missouri at Nippert Stadium.

Gilyard scored on a 53-yard punt return, a 1-yard rush, and receptions of eight and 37 yards in the first half. According to STATS, LLC, the last player in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision competition to score via a punt return, reception and rush in the same game was Maurice Drew (now Jones-Drew) of UCLA on Oct. 8, 2005 (vs. California). Jones scored three rushing touchdowns and once each by way of a punt return and reception in that game.

"They do some good things," Southeast head coach Tony Samuel said of Cincinnati's high-powered offense. "Pike, in particular, really engineers their offense well. Gilyard is all over the place and they have other good receivers. They also have the ability to run."

After going three-and-out on the first possession of the game, Southeast preseason All-American Doug Spada punted for the first time this season. Gilyard fielded the kick and dashed 53 yards for a touchdown, giving Cincinnati a 7-0 lead at the 12:51 mark.

A 22-yard pass from Matt Scheible to Walter Peoples gave the Redhawks a 1st-and-Goal at the Cincinnati 3-yardline during Southeast's third drive of the game. Southeast, however, settled for a 23-yard field goal by Spada after losing three yards on two rushing attempts and throwing an incomplete pass.

The Bearcats would then quickly put the game out of reach, scoring 42 unanswered points to build a 49-3 halftime lead.

Tony Pike threw a 19-yard touchdown pass to Jacob Ramsey

(3:44) and ran for a 1-yard touchdown (2:15) in just 1:29, capping Cincinnati's first-quarter scoring.

Aaron Webster intercepted Scheible with a one-handed pick along the near sideline to help set up Pike's touchdown run. Pike later hooked up with Armon Binns for a 54-yard completion before that score.

Gilyard hit paydirt three times to key the Bearcats 28-point second quarter.

Gilyard's 1-yard run, which came two plays after Southeast was penalized for roughing the passer, finished off a 3-play, 40-yard drive that consumed just 40 seconds.

Gilyard also hauled in passes of eight and 37 yards from Pike. The 37-yard strike came three plays after linebacker Andre Revels picked off Scheible at the Southeast-43.

A 14-yard touchdown pass from Pike to Marcus Bennett accounted for the Bearcats other touchdown in the second quarter.

The Bearcat's kept roaring in the second half when Darrin Williams returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown, pushing Cincinnati's lead to 56-3 just 12 seconds into the third quarter.

A little over five-and-a-half minutes later, Zach Callaros threw a 43-yard touchdown pass to Charley Howard, capping a 3-play, 44-yard drive that lasted only 47 seconds.

Scott Johnson's 33-yard run was the Bearcats final touchdown in the 70-3 win.

Southeast suffered its ninthstraight loss to an FBS (formerly I-A) opponent. The Redhawks, who fell to 1-14 all-time against FBS teams, were outscored, 244-16, in their last four games against FBS schools.

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. -Eastern Illinois University turned the ball over four times, but scored 16 unanswered points in the second half to escape with a 23-14 win over Southeast Missouri.

EIU trailed, 14-7, at the half, but rallied to pull off the comefrom-behind win.

"We played extremely hard," said Southeast head coach Tony Samuel. "We also gave up a couple big plays and they came back to haunt us. Overall, the effort was great and the defense never backed

University of Florida transfer Mon Williams dashed 65 yards to tie the game at 14-14 with 10:33 left in the third quarter. Williams' touchdown run capped a 3-play, 93-yard drive for the Panthers.

Southeast then took over on downs at its own 10-yardline. On the first play of the drive, Henry Harris mishandled Matt Scheible's pitch. Scheible picked up the ball in the end zone and threw it out of bounds. The Redhawks were penalized for intentional grounding, which resulted in a safety, giving the Panthers a 16-14 edge.

EIU later sealed the win with a 3-yard touchdown pass from Jake Christensen to Erik Lora at the 13:28 mark of the fourth quarter.

Southeast managed to get into EIU territory just one time in the second half and Doug Spada missed a 35-yard field goal at the end of that drive. The Redhawks were also held to just 50 yards rushing in the game's last 30 min-

EIU struck first when Christensen hooked up with Lorence Ricks for a 42-yard touchdown pass on the Panthers fifth play from scrimmage.

Southeast answered by marching 77 yards on 13 plays to tie the game at 7-7 on a 1-yard run by

Scheible with 4:44 remaining in the first quarter.

Harris' 47-yard run helped set up the Redhawks next score. Southeast went 99 yards in seven plays to take a 14-7 lead when Harris hit paydirt on a 9-yard run at the 1:31 mark of the second quarter.

Defensively, Southeast forced turnovers on three-straight EIU possessions in the first half, all of which came inside the Redhawks 25-yardline.

J.J. Sanchez jarred the ball loose from Williams and Maurice Lyles recovered at the Southeast-22.

Shortly after Jimmy Potempa's 24-yard run gave EIU a 1stand-10 at the Southeast-20, Christensen fumbled the snap and Tyler Epstein recovered.

EIU then had a 1st-and-Goal at the Southeast-3 following a 52-vard pass play from Christensen to Ricks. Potempa, however coughed up the ball when he was hit by Justin Woodlief and Lyles recovered.

The Panthers other miscue came on a 2nd-and-Goal at the Southeast 1-yardline early in the third quarter. Josh Gipson knocked the ball out of Potempa's hands and Blake Peiffer secured it.

"We practice going after the football," said Samuel. "I thought our guys did a really good job of stripping the football and getting to it."

EIU registered 523 yards of total offense to Southeast's 381.

Christensen, a former starting quarterback at the University of Iowa, completed 19-of-26 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns.

Meanwhile, Scheible completed 17-of-35 passes for 171 yards. He also rushed for a game-high 75 yards on 15 attempts.

Walter Peoples and Bradley Brown led the Redhawks receiving corps. Peoples had four receptions for 57 yards and Brown hauled in two catches for 55 yards.

UT Martin 29 Southeast Missouri 22

MARTIN, Tenn. - Miguel Barnes ran for 105 yards and two touchdowns, and the University of Tennessee at Martin scored 21 points in the second quarter to key a 29-22 win over Southeast Missouri.

"I thought both teams played very hard and the effort was unbelievable," said Southeast head coach Tony Samuel. "It was a game of momentum swings."

Southeast started strong, marching 80 yards in seven plays on the game's opening drive.

Matt Scheible broke free for a 34-yard run and threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Miles Edwards, giving the Redhawks a 6-0 lead with 11:34 left to play in the first quarter.

Edwards, who made his first TD reception in nearly a year, moved into a three-way tie for ninth in career touchdown catches at Southeast. Edwards, T.J. Milcic (2002-05) and Lorenzo Gathers (1984-88) all share that spot with 11 apiece.

The Skyhawks had the ball for a period of 11:15 in the second quarter en route to scoring on three-consecutive possessions.

Barnes' 7-yard run capped a 12play, 70-yard drive to give the Skyhawks their first lead at 7-6 (12:34).

Following a 51-yard punt by Doug Spada, UT Martin took over on downs at its own 8-yardline.

OVC Preseason Offensive Player-of-the-Year Cade Thompson then went to work, completing three passes for 80 yards. Thompson's 52-yard touchdown pass to Dexter Anoka polished off the 5-play, 92-yard drive that consumed just 1:53.

UT Martin forced the Redhawks to punt again, and this time, started at its own 21. The Skyhawks used a perfect 5-of-5 thirddown conversions to manufacture their longest drive of the game.

One of those plays included an 18-yard pass from Thompson to Eunique Williams on a 3rdand-15, which gave UT Martin a first down at the Southeast-27. Seven plays later, Barnes hit paydirt on a 5-yard run to push the Skyhawks lead to 21-6 at the 1:10 mark. Barnes' second rushing TD capped a 16-play, 78-yard drive that chewed up 6:56.

Southeast rallied to score 16 points in the second half, including 13 in the fourth quarter.

Spada's career-long 53-yard field goal narrowed UT Martin's lead to 21-9 with 9:46 remaining in the third quarter.

Six minutes later, the Skyhawks had the ball at their own 20 following a Southeast punt. Four plays into the drive, Thompson completed a 24-yard pass to Jason McNair. Bryan Blanfort, however, blasted McNair over the middle. The ball came loose and Salim Powell scooped it up and ran 23 yards to the UT Martin-45.

From there, Mike Jones took matters into his own hands, gaining 52 yards on four carries to key a 9-play, 59-yard drive. Jones dashed 30 yards to the Skyhawk-20 and later scored on a 13-yard run to cut UT Martin's lead to 21-15 (13:55) early in the fourth quarter.

Southeast's defense came up big again when Eddie Calvin intercepted Thompson in the Redhawks end zone. Calvin registered his eighth career pick three plays after Justin Woodlief was penalized for illegal helmet contact when he sacked Thompson for a loss of 10 yards.

After the Redhawks were forced to punt on their next possession, UT Martin took over at its own 37.

Shortly after Thompson's 28yard pass to Kenny Jones gave the Skyhawks a first down at the Southeast-12, Brandyn Young picked up the final 12 yards on four-straight carries en route to the decisive score. Young's 1-yard plunge was followed by a two-point conversion, giving UT Martin a 29-15 advantage with 4:18 left.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Quarterback Calvin McNairl ran for a career-high 122 yards and two touchdowns and threw for 95 yards and one touchdown to lead Tennessee State to a 23-17 victory over Southeast Missouri.

TSU took an early lead with the help of a Southeast turnover. LB Tarver Sidney stripped the ball from QB Matt Scheible and Deonte Kilgore recovered at the Redhawks 35-yardline.

Nine plays and 35 yards later, McNairl scored on a 7-yard run to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead with 3:35 left in the first quarter.

Doug Spada, after making a 43-yard field goal to cut TSU's lead to 7-3 (11:50) in the second quarter, missed a 45-yard attempt.

TSU took over on downs at its own 27-yardline and marched 73 yards in 12 plays to extend its lead to 13-3. McNairl's 9-yard fourthdown completion to Joseph Hills kept the drive alive. Four plays later, McNairl and Hills hooked up again, this time on a 14-yard touchdown pass with 3:45 left.

Southeast answered right back when Scheible hit Miles Edwards in stride along the near sideline for a 44-yard touchdown, narrowing TSU's lead to 13-10 at the half. It marked the second time this season where Scheible and Edwards connected on a 44-yard pass play.

The Tigers added to their lead in the third quarter when Robert Vipond's first career field goal sailed through the uprights from 41 yards out, giving TSU a 16-10 advantage at the 4:54 mark.

TSU fumbled twice early in the fourth quarter, but maintained possession both times.

Eugene Clifford returned a punt 16 yards before Joshua Jackson jarred the ball loose. Marcus Snow, however, secured the ball for the Tigers at the TSU-45. On the fourth play of TSU's ensuing drive, McNairl fumbled, but Preston Brown was there to recover. McNairl's 13-yard touchdown run then gave the Tigers a 23-10 lead with 7:19 remaining.

Southeast made things interesting when Scheible threw an 18-yard touchdown pass to Walter Peoples with 1:09 left to play. That play came after Scheible completed a career-long 59-yard pass to Cedric Cox. Down, 23-17, Spada attempted an on-side kick, but TSU recovered. The Tigers then ran out the clock.

McNairl averaged 6.1 yards per carry on 20 rushing attempts. He also completed 10-of-15 passes for a career-high 95 yards.

TSU registered 354 yards of total offense and outgained Southeast, 259-88, on the ground. The Tigers (39:41) had the ball 19:22 more than the Redhawks (20:19), as well.

Additionally, TSU was 8-of-17 on third down and a perfect 2-of-2 on fourth down. The Tigers entered the game 0-for-5 in fourth down conversions.

Scheible completed 13-of-34 passes for 173 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran for a game-high 61 yards on 17 carries, was sacked three times and threw an interception.

Edwards, who moved to sixth in career touchdown receptions, led the Redhawks with four catches for 54 yards and one TD.

Defensively, Justin Woodlief led Southeast with a career-high 14 tackles. Woodlief had 10 solo stops, while assisting on four others. Bryan Blanfort followed with 10 tackles.

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. - Ryan White rushed for 228 yards and a touchdown and Terrence Holt ran for 100 yards and two touchdowns to lead Austin Peay (2-4, 1-2) to a 24-14 come-frombehind win over Southeast Missouri State (1-5, 0-4) Saturday at Houck Stadium.

The Governors trailed, 7-3, at halftime, but scored 21 points in the fourth quarter to spoil the Redhawks homecoming.

"It was a tough second half and our defense showed signs of fatigue," said Southeast head coach Tony Samuel. "We just have to continue to work hard and make something happen the rest of the way."

After Southeast free safety Bryan Blanfort returned an interception 69 yards for a touchdown to give the Redhawks a 14-3 lead with 5:57 left in the third quarter, APSU responded with three rushing touchdowns in the game's final 15 minutes.

Southeast was forced to punt on its first drive of the fourth quarter.

APSU later capped a 7-play, 56-yard march when Holt scored on a 6-yard run to cut the Redhawks lead to 14-10 with 10:29 remaining.

Jeremy Ross picked off Matt Scheible on the second play of the Redhawks next drive, and the Governors were in business at Southeast's 30-yardline.

White gained 15 yards and eight yards on back-to-back carries before hitting paydirt on a 2-yard plunge, giving APSU its first lead (17-14) at the 8:58 mark.

Southeast was then forced to punt again.

White broke free for a 20-yard run to help key a 13-play, 64-yard drive. Holt's 2-yard run capped the scoring, as APSU put the finishing touches on its 24-14 win.

White carried the ball 32 times, averaging over seven yards (7.1) per rush. Holt followed with 23 carries for a 4.3 average.

The Governors tallied 418 yards of total offense, while the Redhawks mustered just 154. Southeast was held to just 29 passing yards on the day with only five in the second half. APSU converted on 12-of-17 third downs, as well.

APSU also ran 79 offensive plays, 25 more than Southeast's 54. It marked the fourth time in five games where an opponent has run 75 or more plays against the Redhawks.

Henry Harris scored Southeast's other touchdown on a 1-yard run to give the Redhawks a 7-0 lead with 9:13 left in the second quarter.

In addition, there were seven turnovers between the two teams. Southeast had three interceptions and recovered a fumble, and APSU had two interceptions and one fumble recovery. Blanfort's 69-yard run was the second-longest interception return for a touchdown in school history.

Defensively, Philip Klaproth led Southeast with 14 tackles. Eddie Calvin and Blanfort followed with 10 apiece.

COOKEVILLE, Tenn. - Tennessee Tech scored 21-straight firsthalf points to key a 28-16 victory over Southeast Missouri.

The Golden Eagles trailed, 6-0, in the first quarter before rallying for 21 unanswered points on three-consecutive rushing touchdowns.

"I thought our kids played hard," said Southeast head coach Tony Samuel. "This is a team game and all three phases of the game have to click. Tennessee Tech had a short field to work with on a few of its scoring drives."

TTU started at Southeast's 45-yardline and quickly took its first lead of the game when Dontey Gay rushed for 45 yards on three carries. Gay hit paydirt on a 37-yard run to give the Golden Eagles a 7-6 edge with 16 seconds left to play in the first quarter.

On the Redhawks next possession, Richmond Tooley picked off Matt Scheible, giving TTU the ball at the Southeast-38.

The Golden Eagles ran the ball on seven-consecutive plays, with Tremaine Hudson taking the first four handoffs for 26 yards. Gay picked up the last 12 yards of the drive and scored his second TD on three carries. Gay's 2-yard plunge capped the 7-play, 38-yard march, as TTU took a 14-6 lead with 12:13 left in the second quarter.

After forcing Southeast to punt, TTU mounted a 5-play, 35-yard drive. The Golden Eagles faced a 3rd-and-long when Lee Sweeney completed a 17-yard pass to Colin Allen. Seven more yards were tacked on to the end of that play with the help of a personal foul by the Redhawks. Two plays later, Hudson scored on a 7-yard run to push TTU's lead to 21-6.

Curtis Huge scored 10 of the Redhawks points on three field goals and one PAT.

William Castro blocked a punt, helping set up Huge's first career field goal, a 32-yard attempt with 10:38 remaining in the first quar-

Henry Harris broke free for a 40-yard scamper, before Huge connected on a 31-yard field goal three plays later at the 4:55 mark.

His third field goal sailed through the uprights from 21 yards out right before the half.

Both teams went scoreless in the third quarter and had one touchdown each in the game's final 15 minutes.

Cedric Wilkerson's 1-yard run gave the Golden Eagles their biggest lead at 28-9 with 8:00 to play.

Two minutes later, Scheible threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Cedric Cox. Cox's first career TD reception capped an 8-play, 63-yard drive for the Redhawks.

Scheible completed 15-of-32 passes for 164 yards and one touchdown, while rushing for a game-high 69 yards on 26 carries. Scheible, who also threw three interceptions and was sacked a season-high four times, went over 1,000 passing yards on the year.

Defensively, Josh Woods paved the way with 10 tackles, including one sack and 2.5 for loss.

Gay led TTU with 125 yards and two touchdowns on 20 rushing attempts. Gay averaged 6.2 yards per carry, as well.

Southeast accumulated 305 yards of total offense to TTU's 262. The Redhawks (141) and Golden Eagles were nearly even on the ground.

TTU, which beat Southeast for the fourth time in a row, recorded its largest margin of victory (+12) against the Redhawks in seven games. Each of the last six meetings between these teams were decided by no more than seven

Southeast wore all white uniforms for the first time since 2005. Interestingly enough, the last time the Redhawks dressed in white jerseys and pants was at TTU on Nov. 19 of that year.

RICHMOND, Ky. - Eastern Kentucky came out on top of a defensive battle and hung on for a 20-6 victory over Southeast Missouri.

The Redhawks pulled to within seven points on a 17-yard touchdown catch by Walter Peoples with 4:05 remaining, but were unable to get any closer.

Meanwhile, the Colonels ran for 183 yards and three touchdowns, including two by C.J. Walker.

"We had a lot of energy and fought through a lot of adversity," head coach Tony Samuel said. "We had a couple of missed opportunities, but the effort was there."

EKU jumped out to an early lead on the game's opening possession with a 9-yard touchdown run byWalker. The Colonels marched 76 yards on 13 plays in 6:06. The drive included three third down conversions.

After the Redhawks fumbled on their first drive, EKU marched 62 yards downfield to the Southeast 5-yard line before Blake Peiffer and Bryan Blanfort stopped Bruce Frieson for no gain on 4th-and-1.

On the ensuing possession, EKU came up with their own fourth-down stop at the Southeast 23-yard line. Six plays later, Walker scored his second touchdown of the game on a 1-yard run to give the Colonels a 13-0 lead with 10:26 remaining.

After a Redhawks punt, the Colonels got to the Southeast 5-yard line before the Redhawk defense forced an incompletion on 3rd-and-goal. Logan O'Connor came on to attempt a 23-yard field goal that was blocked by Philip Klaproth. It was the first time the Redhawks had blocked a field goal since Oct. 7, 2006, when Adam Casper batted down a 29-yard attempt at Eastern Illinois.

Following a three-and-out on offense, the Southeast defense came up with another big play. William Castro intercepted T.J. Pryor's pass at the Redhawks 16-yard line and returned it 44 yards.

The teams traded possessions before halftime, with EKU holding a 13-0 advantage at the intermission.

On the opening drive of the second half, Southeast drove to the EKU 21-yard line before Matt Scheible was intercepted by Patrick McClellan in the end zone.

The defenses held on the next six possessions before the Redhawks were able to put together a scoring drive. Scheible connected with Peoples on a 17-yard touchdown pass with 4:05 remaining in the fourth quarter to cap a six-play, 50-yard march in less than two minutes.

"That was one of the best catches I've seen since I've been here," Samuel said. "Walter showed a lot of explosion to close on that ball."

The extra point attempt by Curtis Huge was blocked, leaving the score at 13-6.

EKU secured the win when Frieson broke loose for a 28-yard touchdown run with four seconds remaining.

Southeast was outgained 339-244 in total yards, but held the Colonels to 156 passing yards. EKU finished 10-of-19 on third down, while the Redhawks were just 5-of-16.

Southeast rushed for 149 yards. Henry Harris ran for a game-high 83 yards on 18 carries.

Scheible completed 11-of-29 passes for 95 yards and a touchdown. He added 28 yards on the ground.

Peoples led Southeast receivers with three receptions for 32 yards. He also made his 100th career reception on an 11-yard catch early in the fourth quarter.

Defensively, the Redhawks registered 10 tackles for loss, including four sacks.

Patrick Tatum's 22-yard field goal with 25 seconds left then gave JSU a 24-0 lead at the half.

Curtis Huge's 33-yard field goal with 33 ticks left in the third quarter accounted for Southeast's only points of the game, as the Redhawks suffered their eighthstraight loss.

Southeast ran a season-high 78 plays en route to 312 yards of total offense, including 235 on the ground. The Redhawks also possessed the ball more than their

Southeast Missouri 49 Murray State 13

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. -Southeast Missouri ran for 302 yards and five touchdowns in a 49-13 rout of Murray State.

Mike Jones and Henry Harris each scored two touchdowns, helping Southeast gain over 300 rushing yards in a game for the first time since 2006.

Southeast led 20-10 at halftime before outscoring the Racers 29-3 in the second half end an eightgame losing streak.

Murray took an early 3-0 lead on a 40-yard field goal by Kienan Cullen.

Southeast answered back with a 68-yard scoring drive that culminated in a 2-yard run by Henry Harris.

The Racers regained the lead with 1:17 remaining in the first quarter when Brockman connected with Rashad Daniels for a 33-yard touchdown on a wide receiver screen pass. Cullen added the extra point to give Murray a 10-6 advantage.

Five minutes into the second quarter, Matt Scheible hooked up with Chantae Ahamefule for a 44-yard touchdown. The Redhawks marched 78 yards in just 1:12.

The Redhawks increased their lead to 20-10 when Scheible broke free for a 16-yard touchdown with 16 seconds left.

Southeast rushed for 130 yards in the first half. The Redhawks also had 224 yards of total offense.

On the opening drive of the second half, Scheible hit Ahamefule on a 75-yard touchdown pass.

Huge converted the extra point to cap the 5-play, 85-yard drive in less than two minutes, giving Southeast a 27-10 lead with 10:09 left in the third quarter.

Cullen added a 48-yard field goal with 4:20 left in the third quarter to mark the end of the Racers scoring.

Southeast continued to dominate in the fourth quarter, rushing for three more touchdowns. Harris scored on a 2-yard run, while Jones hit paydirt from 38 and seven yards out, respectively.

Jones posted his second 100yard rushing performance of the season. He finished with 113 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries. Harris followed with 99 yards on 21 attempts.

Scheible completed 6-of-12 passes for 188 yards and two touchdowns.

Ahamefule caught three passes for 150 yards and two touchdowns, registering the first multiple touchdown game of his career.

Charlie Jordan ran for 89 yards on 18 carries to lead Murray.

Brockman threw for 205 yards and one touchdown.

Defensively, Joshua Jackson paved the way with 12 tackles. Aris Bowen had eight stops. Marvin Anderson followed with seven tackles and two sacks.

Tamar Butler notched 12 tackles to lead the Racers. Justin Clark also had double-digit tackles with

#1 Southern Illinois 42 Southeast Missouri 24

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. - No. 1 Southern Illinois used a high-powered offense to beat Southeast Missouri, 42-24, in the regular-season finale for both teams.

Southeast and SIU met for the 75th time in front of a crowd of 7,527. The Salukis finished with 475 yards of total offense, including 294 on the ground.

SIU quarterback Paul McIntosh threw for 181 yards and one touchdown and ran for 101 yards and three TDs to key the Saluki attack. Deji Karim added 155 rushing yards and two touchdowns for the nation's top-ranked Football Championship Subdivision team.

"McIntosh and Karim were the difference," said Southeast head coach Tony Samuel said. "They got them out of five or six situations. They got us on a few big plays."

After taking the opening kickoff, SIU drove 63 yards on nine plays in 2:51. McIntosh scored on a 15-yard run and Kyle Dougherty converted the extra point to give the Salukis a quick 7-0 lead.

Karim pushed SIU's lead to 14-0 on a 10-yard touchdown run with 3:10 left in the second quarter.

After a three-and-out, the Salukis got the ball back and scored again when McIntosh connected with Bryce Morris on a 10-yard passing play with 42 seconds remaining in the first half.

Southeast got on the board with a 38-yard field goal from Curtis Huge on the first drive of the second half.

Richard White returned the ensuing kickoff 59 yards to set up the second rushing touchdown of the day for McIntosh. He scrambled in from two yards out with 7:39 left in the third quarter. Dougherty's extra point extended the lead to 28-3.

On the next possession, the Redhawks found the end zone when Matt Scheible hit a wide open Miles Edwards for a 54-yard touchdown strike.

Immediately after the kickoff, Karim took the handoff and broke free for a 70-yard touchdown run, giving the Salukis a comfortable 35-10 advantage.

Edwards made a 5-yard touchdown reception to narrow the lead to 35-17 at the 4:21 mark of the third quarter.

Cornerback William Castro then intercepted a McIntosh swing pass and ran 14 yards for a touchdown with 9:22 left in the fourth quarter.

McIntosh, however, scored his third rushing touchdown of the day on a 3-yard quarterback sneak.

After a defensive stop, the Salukis managed to run out the clock to secure their 10th-straight victory.

Scheible completed 10-of-18 passes for 155 yards and two touchdowns to lead Southeast.

Walter Peoples concluded his standout Southeast career with three receptions for 32 yards. Edwards followed with 59 receiving yards and two scores.

Henry Harris ran for 93 yards on 21 carries.

Defensively, Joshua Jackson led the Redhawks with 10 tackles. Bryan Blanfort added nine solo stops.

Joe Allaria led the SIU receivers with a game-high five receptions for 59 yards. Matt Guinn and Morris both caught three passes.

Brandin Jordan registered a game-high 11 tackles and a sack.

Saturday marked the final game for Southeast's 17 seniors. Six of those seniors were members of Samuel's first recruiting class at Southeast in 2006.



Following his senior season, Dement was the first Southeast player ever drafted by a NFL team. He was drafted by the New York Giants, but opted to join the Marines.

58

Number 58 worn by Ken Iman, who played 14 seasons in the NFL, was retired on Oct. 4, 1974. Iman played at Southeast from 1956-59. He was signed as a free agent by the Green Bay Packers and spent four seasons with the Packers before being traded to the Los Angeles Rams. He was the Rams Most Valuable Player in 1972. Iman spent several years as an assistant coach in the NFL and currently serves as an assistant to the President of the Philadelphia Eagles.

67

Number 67 worn by Mike Wood was retired on April 23, 1978. Wood established a new NCAA record for career field goals during his senior season in 1977. He broke the old record of 51 on Sept. 17, 1977 with a 27-yard kick against Delta State at Houck Stadium. His NCAA record total of 64 stood for several years and is still the record at Southeast. Wood, who currently resides in St. Louis, played professionally with both the St. Louis Cardinals and San Diego Chargers.

Liberal Arts



A strength of the College of Health and Human Services is the fact that, although there are diverse academic offerings, all programs potentially lead to a career that significantly and positively impact the lives of individuals and families. The college is comprised of the following academic program areas:

Aerospace Studies is one of three such programs in Missouri. The Southeast Air Force ROTC has received the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award as one of the best ROTC units in the nation.

Communication Disorders provides students with a broad-based theoretical foundation in communication disorders. The graduate program in speech-language pathology is accredited by the Council of Academic Accreditation of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association.

Criminal Justice and Sociology has an internship program for criminal justice majors which provides students with an opportunity to observe professionals in their fields and with practical job experience. The Sociology Program offers both the bachelor of arts and bachelor of science degrees, as well as minors in sociology and criminology.

Health, Human Performance and Recreation offers a variety of programs that prepare professionals to make an impact on health throughout the lifespan.

Human Environmental Studies offers diverse programs to improve the quality of life of children, individuals and families.

Nursing offers students internships and clinical opportunities that give hands-on experience beginning their junior year. Our program is nationally accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education. Social Work prepares students for beginning generalist social work practice. The final semester is spent in field practicum actually working with clients. The Social Work program at Southeast Missouri State University is fully accredited by the Council of Social Work Education.

An education in the liberal arts gives you broadbased training for careers in business, the arts, media, education and the legal profession.

Southeast joined 112 other institutions worldwide in securing prestigious mass communication program accreditation by the Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communications (ACEJMC). Only one other institution in Missouri, the University of Missouri-Columbia, has this elite accreditation.

In addition, our public relations program is one of only 20 institutions—none in Missouri—that holds certification by the Public Relations Society of America (PRSA). Only nine other institutions in the world have recognition from both ACEJMC and PRSA for their mass communication program.

Our certified historic preservation program is one of a few U.S. programs that offer a four-year degree. Foreign Languages is recognized by the Association of Departments of Foreign Languages as one of the nation's 30 model programs for foreign language education.

Our pre-law program provides a comprehensive foundation to study law. During the last five years, Southeast's pre-law students have exceeded the national LSAT average score, and their placement rate in law school approaches 100 percent.

If you are a budding author or simply love English, you will be surrounded by a world of writing and publishing when you become part of a campus community of writer-publishers. Anthropology majors explore what it means to be a human in cultures past and present. Philosophy majors contemplate theories of past and present as they build a foundation for non-technical careers or for law school. The Otto and Della Seabaugh Polytechnic Building features more than 80,000 square feet of classroom and laboratory space, an auditorium with teleconferencing and interactive television capabilities, fully networked computer labs, and an industrial space that serves training and research needs. You will learn with the latest high-tech equipment in 14 laboratories and in classrooms with multimedia instructional technology. A Technology Resource Center promotes interaction with area industries.

Agriculture students have labs such as the beautiful 252-acre David M. Barton Agriculture Research Center, utilizing the latest in row crop research and beef production technology. The 11,000-square-foot climate-controlled Charles L. Hutson Horticulture Greenhouse, a 110-acre rice research station, a new irrigated turf plots facility, a sustainable garden and a modern soil fertility laboratory also help students with hands-on learning.

Southeast's River Campus is Missouri's only separate campus dedicated exclusively to art, dance, music and theatre. Overlooking the Mississippi River, a Cultural Arts Center and transformed Seminary Building are now home to the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts.

Five interconnected art studios, two computerized looms and projected digital photography, as well as two presses in the printmaking studio give artists all that's needed for their creativity.

Performing in the Donald C. Bedell Performance Hall matches the standards of great theatres in New York and Chicago. Adjacent scene and costume shops, as well as dressing rooms, allow theatre and dance students to experience the broad world of theatre.

Music students enjoy 11 soundproof music studios and the Robert F. and Gertrude L. Shuck Music Recital Hall, a striking room with world-class acoustics.

Living on Campus

Living on campus is an integral part of the college experience. Students who live in one of Southeast's 13 residence halls eat their meals in one of nine dining areas, study in the lounges or computer labs, and sleep—when there's time!

Southeast's residence halls come in many different styles including community-style, suitestyle, group living and apartments. Generally, students share a double room with a roommate. 

PRESIDENT DR. KENNETH W. DOBBINS



r. Kenneth W. Dobbins became the seventeenth president of Southeast Missouri State University on July 1, 1999, after serving in several positions in higher education administration both at Kent State University in Ohio and at Southeast.

During his tenure at Southeast, academic programs have been enhanced, including establishment of a School of Polytechnic Studies and the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts which opened in Fall 2007 on the new \$50 million River Campus. The Donald L. Harrison College of Business has been recognized for the last five years by a Princeton Review publication as one of the best business schools in the nation and GetEducated. com, a consumer watchdog group



that reviews and ranks online universities for cost, quality, and credibility has ranked Southeast Missouri State University #1 in the nation for affordability overall for its online MBA. The Department of Industrial and Engineering Technology recently received its initial ABET accreditation.

Enrollment has increased significantly since 1994 when some 7,900 students attended Southeast. In Fall 2005, enrollment topped 10,000 for the first time, and stood at more than 10,900 in 2009. Record enrollments in higher education have occurred in the University's 25-county service region during his tenure due to the establishment of new regional campuses in Sikeston and Kennett and a higher education center at Perryville serving place-bound students in and near those rural communities.

An innovation center and business incubator to promote entrepreneurship and enhance the region's economy opened on the campus in 2005; a University Technology Village is being planned on the 400-acre former University farm on Interstate-55 and the Department of Agriculture has relocated the farm to a new site; a comprehensive review of all academic and non-academic programs has been accomplished to maintain quality and minimize student fee increases in the face of significant state appropriation reductions; and capital construction projects totaling over \$200 million have been completed to expand and modernize the University's physical plant.

Dr. Dobbins has served a two-year term as president of the Missouri Council on Public Higher Education (COPHE), the organization for presidents and chancellors of Missouri's public colleges and universities. In 2007, he was selected to serve a three-year term on the American Association of State Colleges


and Universities (AASCU) Board of Directors. In 2008, he was elected Secretary-Treasurer of the organization, and currently serves as chair-elect of AASCU. For the past five years, he has served as one of five faculty members for the AASCU New Presidents' Academy. He previously served three years as president of the Ohio Valley Conference and is currently a member of the Conference finance subcommittee. In addition, he is a vice president of the executive board of the Greater St. Louis Council, Boy Scouts of America.

He earned his B.S. degree in accounting from the University of Akron (Ohio) in 1971 and served as a commissioned officer and civilian executive in the U.S. Air Force for almost 10 years. He received the M.B.A. degree in 1979 from Old Dominion University (Virginia), and the Ph.D. in

higher education administration in 1987 from Kent State. He is also a Certified Public Accountant in Ohio.

From 1981 until 1991, Dr. Dobbins held several positions at Kent State. He came to Southeast in 1991 as Vice President for Finance and Administration, and served as Executive Vice President from July 1993 until his appointment as President six years later.

Dr. Dobbins and his wife, Jeanine Larson Dobbins, Founder and Director Emeritus of the Missouri Statewide Early Literacy Intervention Program based at Southeast, have a son, Paul, and a daughter-in-law, Stacey, who are both Southeast graduates, and a new grandson, Lincoln Kenneth Dobbins.



DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS JOHN SHAFER





Il it takes is five minutes to see how determined John Shafer is to build on the success of the Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Department.

Shafer has been at Southeast a little over a year and a lot of exciting things have happened since he first took over as Director of Athletics on February 1, 2009.

Academics, administration, community service and competition are Shafer's main points of emphasis, and Redhawk athletic programs excel in those areas.

Academically, the Department's grade point average continues to improve. Currently, 55 percent of Southeast's student-athletes have a 3.0 or better grade point average. A total of 21 carry a perfect 4.0 GPA out of 331 student-athletes/spirit groups. Additionally, the Redhawk gymnastics team won its thirdconsecutive National Academic Team Championship in 2009.

Administratively, Shafer made his first big hire when he announced Dickey Nutt as the Redhawks head men's basketball coach on March 12, 2009. Nutt revitalized the program in his first year at the helm.

Shafer also moved his administrative staff to a new location. The Director of Athletics, ticket, business, compliance, sports information, development and event management offices are now centrally located. These departments were housed in two areas prior to

the move.

More importantly, Shafer continues to address the need to control costs, find new ways to generate revenue and re-organize/ modernize the Department of Athletics in order to be consistent with the best practices around the Ohio Valley Conference and across the country.

Compliance and facilities are also at the top of Shafer's list.

Shafer is providing more support in the compliance area which has enabled his staff to monitor and help coaches as it relates to following NCAA guidelines. In addition, he is constantly reviewing and monitoring facility upgrades. For instance, a new sound system was recently installed at Houck Stadium.

Shafer's tireless efforts have spread throughout the community, where his athletic teams are always visible.

The volleyball program raised over \$12,000 in this year's Dig For Life campaign which assists in the early detection and treatment of breast cancer. The Department of Athletics also helped raise money for the American Red Cross Haiti Relief and Development Fund. In addition, Shafer helped raise over \$10,000 for the Southeast Athletics Scholarship Fund at the 2010 Walk for Women's Athletics.

Shafer, 64, has worn many different hats throughout his career in college athletics.

He last served as a Director of Athletics at Eastern Kentucky University in 2003-04. In just one year, Shafer helped EKU establish a new academic record when 188 student-athletes were named Colonel Scholars. EKU also finished second for the Ohio Valley Conference Academic Award, as its men's programs nabbed the league's All-Sports Trophy and its women's teams garnered a share of that award. The Colonels, who won their first All-Sports Trophy since the mid-

women's cross country and softball during that year.

Prior to his tenure at EKU, Shafer held a number of different positions in the Southeastern Conference. He was the Director of Athletics at Mississippi from 1998-02, Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Georgia from 1982-98, Assistant Athletic Director for Business at Vanderbilt from 1981-82 and Assistant Business Manager, Football Administrative Assistant and Assistant Baseball Coach at Auburn.

While Shafer was at Ole Miss, the Rebels became the only Division I school in the nation to go to a football bowl game, men's basketball "Sweet Sixteen" and NCAA Baseball Regional in 2001. Shafer began a capital campaign that raised more than \$6 million for expansion and renovations to the school's athletic facilities.

At Georgia, Shafer worked under Director of Athletics and legendary football coach Vince Dooley. He coordinated and oversaw all men's and women's conference and NCAA events

also served as the liaison between the Atlanta Olympic Committee and the University of Georgia for the 1996 Summer Olympics. Responsibilities for that position included scheduling, supervising ticket operations, preparing a budget of more than \$23 million and managing its entire insurance program.

A native of Alexandria, Va., Shafer earned both his bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation, and master's degree in physical education from Auburn. After earning All-SEC honors as a shortstop, Shafer went on to play professional baseball in the Kansas City Royals organization from 1969-70.

Shafer and his wife, Dianne, celebrated their 40th Wedding Anniversary last December. They have a son, Michael, daughter-in-law, Erin, and two granddaughters, Sophie (6) and Sumner (4). Michael, a 1994 graduate and former basketball player at William and Mary, is currently the head women's basketball coach at the University of Richmond.

THIS IS THE OVC

ntering its 63rd year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference. For only the second time in a decade, the Conference expanded by adding Southern Illinois University Edwardsville as the league's 11th member in 2008. The move expanded the OVC's geographical footprint to the St. Louis market and marked the first change in membership since expanding to the state of Alabama (Jacksonville State, Samford) in 2003.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28. She is currently one of just five females to be the head of a Division I conference, and one of just eight to lead a Division I conference all-time. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first nontraditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

Through the past 62 years, 14 teams have won or shared the league's football title. The list is led by Eastern Kentucky, winner of 20 outright or shared football crowns, including both the 2007 and 2008 championships, as they compiled a 15-1 league record over that time period. Only one other Football Championship Subdivision school (UMass) has won more Conference titles than the Colonels. Among OVC teams, former member Middle Tennessee is next with 11 titles, followed by

Tennessee Tech with nine, and Murray State and former member Western Kentucky with eight apiece. Eastern Illinois has claimed five football crowns (including the 2009 title) while Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and former members Evansville and East Tennessee State have captured two apiece. Austin Peay, UT Martin (which captured its first crown in 2006) and former member Youngstown State have one title apiece.

Murray State and Evansville tied for the initial football championship, and the Racers participated in the first-ever bowl game by an OVC team, tying Sul Ross State 21-21 in the 1948 Tangerine Bowl. From 1948 to 1975, OVC teams played in 15 bowl games, winning eight of them. Eastern Kentucky and Western Kentucky were also participants in the NCAA Division II playoffs in the early and mid-1970s prior to the NCAA's reclassification of football programs into Division I-AA. The term "I-AA" lasted until the end of the 2006 season when it was changed to Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

The first Division I-AA/FCS football playoff was held in 1978 with only four teams, which is the only year through present day that the OVC did not field a playoff representative. In 1979, four of the nation's top teams were invited to the playoffs, and two of them - Eastern Kentucky and Murray State - were from the OVC. Murray dropped its semifinal game to Lehigh, but the Colonels nipped Nevada-Reno in double overtime and claimed the national championship a week later with a 30-7 victory over Lehigh. EKU was coached by former all-America quarterback Roy Kidd, who was in his 16th year at the helm of his alma mater and who skippered the Colonels to a second national title three years later. Following the 2002 season, Kidd retired after 39 years at EKU, a one-school tenure unmatched in all of Division I. Upon retirement, he ranked sixth all-time among Division I coaches with 315 victories, earning him a spot in the College Football Hall of Fame. EKU's 19 FCS playoff appearances are the second for the most all-time (behind only Montana).

In addition to Kidd, other coaching legends in the OVC include Charles (Bubber) Murphy, who coached at Middle Tennessee from 1947-1968, Western Kentucky's Jimmy Feix (1968-83), Wilburn Tucker (1954-67) and Don Wade (1968-82) of Tennessee Tech, Bill Ferguson (1967-77) of Murray State, Guy Penny (1959-67) of Morehead State and Boots Donnelly (1977-78 at Austin Peay; 1979-1998 at Middle Tennessee). Current Eastern Illinois head coach Bob Spoo has compiled 88 wins while his program has been a member of the

OVC; that currently ranks fifth all-time in league history.

A sampling of former OVC football stars, some of whom were All-Americans during their collegiate careers before achieving stardom at the professional ranks, include Jim Youngblood and Larry Schreiber (Tennessee Tech), Phil Simms (Morehead State), Virgil Livers and Dale Lindsey (Western Kentucky), Myron Guyton and Chad Bratzke (Eastern Kentucky), Cortland Finnegan (Samford) and Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois). In 2008, former Tennessee State standout Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie became just the fourth NFL First Round draft pick in OVC history when he was selected 16th overall by the Arizona Cardinals. He would break into the starting lineup halfway through his rookie season and started at cornerback for the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII. The OVC has had at least one former player named a NFL Pro Bowl selection in each of the past four seasons.

Football wasn't the only sport in which the OVC was quickly gaining respect. In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a narrow 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off 14th-ranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann - combined for 39 points in the win.

MSU nearly went on to the Sweet 16 that year, losing to eventual national champion Kansas, 61-58. A bank shot by Mann that would've given the Racers a one-point lead rolled off the rim with three seconds left. In 1990 as a No. 16 seed, Murray State took No. 1 seed Michigan State into overtime before falling 75-71; that game still marks the closest a No. 16 seed has come to knocking off a No. 1 in men's tournament action. More recently, Murray State has dominated the OVC Tournament, reaching the championship game every year in the 1990's. The Racers' 14 OVC Tournament Championships are the most among all OVC schools.

After former member Middle Tennessee State won a first round game in 1989, the league had a drought as no other OVC team won a NCAA Tournament game for the next 19 years. But Morehead State, coming off a thrilling double overtime OVC Tournament victory over Austin Peay, topped Alabama State 58-43 in the Opening Round game at Flyer Arena in Dayton, Ohio. The game was played in front of an Opening Round record crowd of 11,346; that crowd included many MSU fans who made the three hour drive from Morehead for the game. The Eagles season would come to three days later when they lost to No. 1 overall seed Louisville, despite playing the Cardinals close for a majority of the game.

In 2009-10, Murray State made OVC history by winning a record 31 games (31-5) on its way to the league's regular season and tournament championship. In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the No. 13 seed Racers topped Vanderbilt in thrilling fashion when senior Danero Thomas hit a jumper as time expired to lift MSU to a 66-65 victory. It marked the first OVC team to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament since 1989, and snapped a skid of 71-straight loses to Southeastern Conference foes (dating back to 2000-01). In the second round the Racers pushed eventual national runner-up Butler to the brink before losing 54-52.

Through its 62 years, 12 teams have won or shared the league's regular season men's basketball title. Murray State heads the list with a Conference-record 21 outright or shared basketball crowns. Other past champions include former member Western Kentucky (19), Morehead State (9), Austin Peay (8), Eastern Kentucky (6), Tennessee Tech (5), former member Middle Tennessee (5), Tennessee State (2), former member East Tennessee State (2), Southeast Missouri State (1), UT Martin (who won its first in 2008-09) and former member Akron (1).

Among the coaching greats in men's basketball have been Western Kentucky's E.A. Diddle, who retired with 759 victories and 10 OVC titles; John Oldham, who was a member of the very first All-OVC squad and went on to win seven OVC crowns during his coaching tenure at Tennessee Tech and Western Kentucky; Paul McBrayer, who guided Eastern Kentucky to 219 wins and three OVC crowns; and Cal Luther, who is the only person in Conference history to win men's basketball Coach of the Year honors at two league schools - Murray State and UT Martin. Current Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos became the winningest coach in OVC history in 2009-10, netting his 319th victory and passing Luther on the all-time list. Loos enters the 2010-11 season with 331 victories.

There have been an equal number of great players including Western Kentucky's Clem Haskins, who is the only three-time OVC Player of the Year. Several players have won OVC Player of the Year honors twice: Western Kentucky's Jim McDaniels (1969-70 and 1970-71), Murray State's Les Taylor (1971-72, 1972-73), Jeff Martin (1987-88, 1988-89), Popeye Jones (1989-90, 1990-91) and Marcus Brown (1994-95, 1995-96), Austin Peay's Otis Howard (1976-77, 1977-78), Middle Tennessee's Jerry Beck (1980-81, 1981-82), Akron's Joe Jakubick (1982-83, 1983-84), Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers (1992-93, 1993-94) and UT Martin's Lester Hudson (2007-08, 2008-09).

The OVC also has the honor of being the only conference to boast the nation's leaders in scoring, rebounding and assists all in one season. That feat was accomplished in 1991-92 by Morehead State's Brett Roberts (28.1 ppg), Murray State's Popeye Jones (14.4 rpg) and Tennessee Tech's Van Usher (8.8 apg).

In 2007-08, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson became the first men's Division I player to record a quadruple-double in a game, when he registered 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a victory over Central Baptist College. Hudson, who ranked fourth in scoring nationally as a junior, returned for his senior season in 2008-09 and was second nationally in scoring (behind Davidson's Stephen Curry) at 27.5 points a contest. Hudson earned numerous honors (including OVC Player of the Year and OVC Male Athlete of the Year in each 2008 and 2009 and All-American status from several outlets) before being drafted by the Boston Celtics with the No. 58 pick of the 2009 NBA Draft. Hudson became the first draft pick for the league since 2004 and only the third pick of the last decade for the OVC.

In the late 1970s, women's athletics began somewhat of a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to pro-

vide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982.

Women's basketball in the OVC has been dominated by Tennessee Tech, which has won or shared 16 regular-season titles and owns nine OVC Tournament crowns. In fact, the Golden Eagles have reached the championship game of the OVC Tournament 19 times in the past 29 years. Although Tennessee Tech remains the standard-bearer, four other teams have won 13 of the last 17 OVC Tournaments. Murray State became the latest program to add its name to the list, capturing its first OVC Tournament title in 2008. Austin Peay leads the quartet with seven crowns including four straight from 2000-03 and back-to-back titles in 2009 and 2010, while Tennessee State, Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri each have won titles during that span.

Several coaches have made their mark in the relatively short history of OVC women's basketball. Former Tennessee Tech coach Marynell Meadors posted an amazing 363-139 (72.3%) record at Tech, becoming the first woman in NCAA or AIAW history to win 300 games at the same institution, while former Tennessee State skipper Teresa Phillips earned National Coach of the Year honors from USA Today in 1990 for turning around the Lady Tigers' program before going on to lead TSU to the NCAA Tournament in 1994 and 1995. Tennessee Tech coach Bill Worrell capped a stellar 20-year career in 2005-06 and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2007; he compiled a 408-190 record while leading the Golden Eagles to an unprecedented 16 OVC regular-season titles and eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including five straight from 1989-93. Eastern Kentucky's Larry Joe Inman, who retired at the conclusion of the 2007-08 season and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2009, won more than 100 games at both Middle Tennessee and EKU, and earned OVC Coach of the Year honors a record eight times - five times at EKU and three at MTSU. He finished his career with 480 career victories

Many great players have graced the hardwood over the years, including former OVC Players of the Year Brooke Armistead and Gerlonda Hardin from Austin Peay, Pam Chambers, Jerilynn Harper, Cheryl Taylor, Angela

Moorehead, Roschelle Vaughn, Diane Seng, Janet Holt and Emily Christian from Tennessee Tech; Morehead State's Donna Murphy and Priscilla Blackford; Eastern Kentucky's Kim Mays; Southeast Missouri's Gray C. Harris; and most recently Murray State's Ashley Hayes who was the OVC Player of the Year in 2007-08 and 2008-09.

Morehead State center Brittany Pittman set new school, league and NCAA standards for blocked shots in 2008-09. Pittman swatted 164 shots during the season, setting a new NCAA single-season record (which has since been broken). During the campaign, only her second with the Eagles, she also set career block records for both Morehead State and the OVC (287).

The league also had another historical moment in November 2008 when the NCAA awarded Nashville the 2014 NCAA Women's Division I Final Four. The OVC will serve as the host of the prestigious event, which is one of the biggest sporting events the city of Nashville can host. The event will be held at Bridgestone Arena in downtown Nashville.

Over its 62 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track and golf.

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States Olympic Rifle Team and Morehead State's Brian Shimer who competed in five Winter Olympics in bobsled (winning a bronze medal in 2002) and coached the 2010 United States bobsled team to its first gold medal since 1948. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peay) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present-day standouts like basketball player Trenton Hassell (Austin Peay), football player Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois) and baseball players George Sherrill (Austin Peay) and Jon Rauch (Morehead State). Hamilton is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and a NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles Lakers).

The OVC's first volleyball tournament was held in 1981, the same year Eastern Kentucky began a string of six straight tournament crowns. Former EKU skipper Dr. Geri Polvino compiled a 627-439 record in 32 seasons as head coach of the Colonels, earning OVC Coach of the Year honors eight times. More

recently, former Austin Peay coach Cheryl Holt and former Southeast Missouri skipper Cindy Gannon also earned their peers' recognition multiple times with four awards each.

Throughout the last 27 years, 10 different teams have won an OVC regular-season or tournament volleyball crown. Since joining the league in 1991, Southeast Missouri has dominated the scene, winning seven of its eight regular-season titles during the 1990's, including five straight from 1993-97. The Redhawks have also won five tournament crowns (1994, 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2000). Jacksonville State was won back-to-back OVC Tournament Championships (2005, 2006) including going through the OVC undefeated (16-0) in 2006 and winning a NCAA Tournament match in 2010, the league's first NCAA victory since 2000

Following the 2007 season, Jacksonville State's Abbey Breit was named the OVC Offensive Player of the Year for the third straight season, becoming the first player in OVC history to accomplish that feat. Four other individuals - Eastern Kentucky's Angela Boykins (1985-86), Morehead State's Dayle Hammontree (1988-89), Southeast Missouri's Tuba Meto (1996-97) and Morehead State's Amy Almond (2001-02) - were back-to-back winners of the award.

In 2007, Eastern Kentucky's Jacob Korir won his fourth straight Conference cross country title becoming just the third OVC student-athlete and 13th athlete nationally to accomplish that feat. Korir was a three-time All-American in cross country, earning two top-10 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country Championship. The Nairobi, Kenya, native was also named a track and field All-American twice during his career and was selected as the OVC Male Athlete of the Year in 2006-07 and received the NCAA post graduate scholarship in 2008.

In 2007 the Conference had two teams in the NCAA Women's Soccer Tournament for the first time in league history, former OVC member Samford earned an at-large selection while Southeast Missouri was the Conference's automatic bid.

In 2009 it was OVC softball that accomplished several firsts as UT Martin (tournament champion) and Jacksonville State (at-large) were each selected for the NCAA Championship. Jacksonville State would take it a step farther by winning the Knoxville Regional (beating No. 13 national seed Tennessee along the way) to become the first OVC softball program to advance to a Super Regional. Jax State would fall to No. 4 Alabama in that Super Regional but finished the season

43-16 (19-2 OVC) and ranked 21st nationally in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and 24th nationally in the USA Today/NFCA poll.

The league's baseball presence has continued to evolve since its inception. The OVC baseball tournament moved to a neutral site for the first time in 2001 with Paducah, Ky. and Brooks Stadium hosting the tournament in front of raucous crowds. The success of the tournament led to Jackson, Tenn. and Pringles Park – the home of the Seattle Mariner's Class AA affiliate – which hosted the event for the first time in 2010 and is under contract to host the 2011 and 2012 championship as well.

The OVC also has made a statement in the NCAA Baseball Championship in recent years, with its teams involved in several memorable contests in the last decade. Tennessee Tech surprised Wake Forest in the opening round of the 2001 tournament and Southeast Missouri stunned host Alabama in the opening round of the 2002 championship. Five years later, Austin Peay captured the collegiate baseball world's attention by taking Vanderbilt, the 2007 No. 1 overall seed, to extra innings. Eastern Illinois pushed host Nebraska to the limit in 2008 followed by Tennessee Tech's memorable contest against host Clemson in 2009.

A first in the OVC occurred in 2008, when the league had a first round draft pick in both the NFL (Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie) and Major League Baseball (Eastern Kentucky's Christian Friedrich) Drafts in the same school year. A year later (2009) the league had a Major League Baseball First Round Compensation Round pick (Eastern Illinois' Tyler Kehrer who was No. 48 overall) and NBA Second Round pick (UT Martin's Lester Hudson) in the same season.

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 192 studentathletes honored with the award, including 25 over the last two years (2008-09, 2009-10).

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed.

Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation, and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

Additionally, the OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.


