


Located just two blocks west of the Southeast campus, Capaha Field is owned by the City of Cape Girardeau. In addition to the ball field, Capaha Park features a swimming pool, lake and picnic areas.

Many Southeast fans enjoy watching games from the hillsides along the first base side or beyond the left field wall.

Capaha Field has a natural grass surface and is considered to be one of the best playing fields in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Recent renovations include a state-of-the-art press box which was completed prior to the start of the 2006 season. The press box,

which is equipped with wireless broadband internet access, television, a kitchen/lounge area and restroom, gives media members a great view behind home plate.

Capaha Field also serves as home to the Plaza Tire Capahas, the oldest amateur baseball team in America.

"TIGER" JOE UHLS LOCKER ROOM

Located inside Houck Field House on the Southeast Missouri State campus is the "Tiger" Joe Uhls Baseball Locker Room.

The newly renovated locker room provides Redhawks baseball players with the modern amenities commonly found in professional locker rooms. Most recently, hardwood floors were added in 2005.

The locker room features 35





professional-style lockers for players and coaches, restrooms, a shower area and ample storage space for equipment and uniforms. A state-of-the-art entertainment system also provides players the opportunity to view scouting and coaching video as well as watch television for leisure.

In addition, a study area with broadband internet capabilities is available for Redhawks student-athletes. Surrounding the locker room is a mural honoring the all-time greatest players and moments in Southeast Missouri State baseball history.





STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

outheast Missouri State University Strength and Conditioning is committed to developing the total student-athlete through their experiences within a competitive training environment.

This will be accomplished by focusing on reducing the risk of injury and maximizing athletic potential through individual evaluation and program design.

Training Principles:

- 1. Reduce the risk of injuries
- If a student-athlete is injured, he/she will not be able to compete at practice or games.
- 2. Maximize athletic ability
- We challenge each athlete, both physically and mentally, in order to achieve optimal results.

Exercises are based on the following Principles:

1. Ground Based Movements

• Athletes compete with their feet on the ground, and therefore, should train that way. The ability to produce forcagainst the ground determines how fast athletes can run and how high they an jump.

2. Three-Dimensional Movements

• Athletes must be able to stabalize themselves in all planes of movement. A fancy way of saying we use free weights(barbells/dumbbells vs. ma chines).

3. Multi-Joint Movements

• Very rarely in sport do athletes isolate onesingle joint, thus there is not much need to train one joint at a time. Athletes can train more muscle mass.

Success Center



SUCCESS CENTER



he Redhawk Success Center offers Southeast Missouri State studentathletes a place to study and develop as students and campus leaders.

The Redhawk Success Center is located in the Student Recreation Center, just south of Houck Stadium. The facility offers a computer lab with 18 computer work terminals, study areas and rooms for group meetings.

The area is under the guidance of Interim Associate Director of Athletics Brady Barke, with assistance from Director of Academic Services Sharon Burgard, Assistant Natalie Williams and Graduate Assistants Kelly Benacka and Israel Kirk.

The beautiful facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by Southeast student-athletes. During the 2010 fall semester, the Southeast athletic

programs combined for a 3.09 grade point average, its highest for a fall term. Eleven of the Redhawks 15 programs recorded a team GPA of 3.0 or better. In all, 186 student-athletes recorded at least a 3.0 GPA. Of that group, 23 finished the fall term with a perfect 4.0.

Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress are monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address study skills and life skills topics, and thus, enhance retention and academic success for student-athletes.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes can





also receive individualized academic programs which include meeting with a mentor at least bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The Success Center staff also works to get athletes involved in campus and community projects. This is done to provide a support structure and greater opportunity for academic success. Through the NCAA's CHAMPS/ Life Skills Program, the Success Center gives student-athletes personal and professional skills in order to facilitate successful and productive futures.

revention. Treatment. Rehabilitation. Education. Those are the four primary phases of athletic training, and the Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Training staff strives to fulfill all of those areas when working with the student-athletes on a daily basis.

Southeast student-athletes are offered the best care possible by the Athletic Training staff. Head Athletic Trainer, Alfred Castillo, directs the Sports Medicine department which includes four full-time athletic trainers, six graduate assistants and several student assistants. The staff serves student-athletes around-the-clock at numerous facilities on campus.

The athletic trainers begin treatments and rehabilitation starting as early as 6 a.m., and are available until the last student-athlete is through. There are currently four athletic training facilities on campus. The staff treats out

of Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary athletic training room is located. There are two other satellite athletic training rooms, including one at Houck Field House and one at the Show Me Center.

The Southeast Athletic Training rooms are equipped with stationary bikes, hand weights, therapeutic modalities, and the latest physical therapy equipment. Each component is strategically designed to not only give the student-athlete the best care, but also to aid in returning to competition as quickly as possible.

Southeast Athletic Training has strong working relationships with local physicians and the two hospitals located within Cape Girardeau. It is from these hospitals that the Athletic Training department is assisted by four orthopedic physicians.

The Southeast Athletic Training program prides and commits itself to providing the



best comprehensive, personalized and efficient healthcare to its student-athletes. Delivery of healthcare focuses on the prevention and management of athletic-related injuries or illnesses, while adhering to the National Athletic Trainers' Board of Certification Standards of Professional Practice. Our high quality of athletic healthcare is provided in combination with the education of athletic training students.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY REDHAWKS SEASON PREVIEW



2012 SEASON PREVIEW

The 2012 Southeast Missouri baseball team will have some familiar faces on the field, but the Redhawks will also add some new faces to the mix.

Southeast lost 18 seniors from last season's team that went 34-22 overall and 14-8 in the OVC, finishing second in the regular season standings.

The 2012 Redhawks feature 13 returnees with three of them being redshirts during the 2011 campaign.

Southeast returns a veteran infield that will be the stable of both the Redhawks offense and defense in 2012.

"We have an extremely good core returning that can provide a good base for the ball club," said head coach Mark Hogan.

The veteran infield is anchored by Preseason Ohio Valley Conference



Player of the Year Trenton Moses. He was also named Third Team Louisville Slugger Preseason All-American.

The 2011 Redhawks featured a veteran pitching staff. This season, Southeast return three pitchers from last season, with only two starts last season between the trio.

The 2012 roster features 34 players with six seniors, 10 juniors, four sophomores, three redshirt freshmen and 11 true freshmen.

Breaking down the 2012 roster, the Redhawks have 14 pitchers, 13 infielders and eight outfielders. During the offseason.

AROUND THE HORN

PITCHING


Southeast recorded an ERA of 4.97 in 2011, the lowest ERA by a Redhawk pitching staff since 2007 under first year pitching coach Steve Bieser.

The Redhawks staff will need to replace 54 starts from a season ago as the Southeast staff was led by a pair of Second-Team OVC All-Conference selections in Logan Mahon and Jordan Underwood.

Mahon was selected in the 22nd round of the Major League Baseball Draft by the Colorado Rockies.

"We have a lot of quality arms up and down," said Hogan. "Players just need some opportunities and we will see how they respond."

Christian Hull (O'Fallon, Mo./



Ft. Zumwalt West) will move from the bullpen to the rotation this season and will hold down the number one spot in the rotation. The sophomore left-hander made 22 appearances as a true freshman last season.

"Christian has great presence on the mound and is very competitive," said Hogan.

He was 1-0 and sported an ERA of 5.50 in 18 innings in 2011.


"Christian throws a lot of strikes, which makes him very effective," said Hogan.

Junior **Shae Simmons** (Scott City, Mo./Scott City) will move from the closer spot to the rotation this season as the number two starter.

Simmons made a team-high 23 appearances a season ago throwing 31 innings with 37 strikeouts.

"Shae is a power arm, but has

tremendous off speed pitches," said Hogan.

Zack Smith (Grand Rapids, Mich. /Lewis & Clark CC) is penciled in as the Redhawks number three starter.

"Zack is a big strong lefty with a very strong arm," said Hogan.

Last season at Lewis & Clark CC, Smith made 11 appearances logging 61.2 innings. Smith sported an ERA of 3.64 and struck out 1.02 batters per inning.

Ryan Prickett (Owasso, Okla. / Fort Scott CC) logged 27 innings a season ago and will be a fixture in the Redhawks bullpen this season.

"Ryan is very experienced and has a great idea of his role on the ball club," said Hogan.

Prickett sported an ERA of 5.67, going 1-1 with one save in 2011.

Ryan Kendall (Overland Park,

Kan. /Johnson County CC) will see time on the mound this season. Kendall made 24 appearances recording a 2.63 ERA last season with 23 strikeouts.

Trevor Kill (St. Mary's, Ohio / Butler CC) will see time out of the Redhawks' bullpen this season. Kill made 16 appearances with three saves a season ago. "Trevor is a power arm with solid off speed," said Hogan.

The Redhawks have plenty of arms ready to compete this season, as Michael Patman (Stillwater, Okla. /Butler CC), Dylan Lynn (Campbell, Mo. /Three Rivers CC), Bobby Hurst (Redwood City, Calif./Skyline CC), Hank Williams Jr. (St. Peters, Mo./ Meramec CC), Tony Zerrusen (Teutopolis, Ill./Lake Land CC) have junior college experience and all look to add to the depth of the staff.

Southeast also added a trio of freshmen pitchers that will also look to contribute.

Cody Spanberger (Granite City, Ill./Granite City CC), Grant
Davis (Boonville, Mo./Boonville),
Will Spitzfaden (St. Louis, Mo./
Lindbergh).

"Our staff did a great job of replacing some great arms with great talent," stated Hogan.

CATCHING

Jesse Tierney (St. Louis, Mo. / Vianney) and **Shane Blair** (Rock Falls, Ill. /South Mountain CC)

will see time behind the plate this season.

"They swing from different sides of the plate and they both can receive and throw well," said Hogan

Tierney started 33 games a season ago. The senior hit .277 last season in 130 at-bats.

Blair, started two season at South Mountain CC, where is led his team to a 39-19 record.

FIRST BASE

Kody Campbell (Oran, Mo. / Oran) played in 23 games last spring, hitting .256 in 43 at-bats. In 2010, Campbell hit .295 and drove in 19 runs with seven doubles.

"Cody had a great summer and fall, he is a patient hitter with a sweet swing," said Hogan.

Andy Lennington (Franklin, Tenn./Brentwood Academy) redshirted last season, but will look to play a key role for the Redhawks in 2012. Lennington will see time all over the field this season.

"Andy has progressed at first base and is a very versatile player that will add depth to our club," said Hogan


SECOND BASE

Taylor Heon (Pacifica, Calif./ Skyline CC) will a mainstay at second base this season for Southeast.

"Taylor is a great player for us and will see time in the front of the lineup this season," said Hogan.

Heon appeared in 35 games in

2011 hitting at a .306 clip. In 121 at-bats he had 37 hits with 23 runs scored and 19 runs batted in.

Andy Lennington (Franklin, Tenn. /Brentwood Academy) will look to add depth at second base.

THIRD BASE

Trenton Moses (Advance, Mo./Advance) was named OVC Player of the Year in 2011 and Third-Team All-American. Moses has added to his list of accolades this season already being named Preseason OVC Player of the Year and Preseason All-American by Louisville Slugger and CollegeBaseballInsider.com

"Trenton is an example of hard work and has added himself to a long list of great players here at Southeast," said Hogan. Moses hit .395 in 2011 with 11 home runs and 53 RBI. He added 70 hits, 44 runs, 14 doubles and slugged .672 with an on-base percentage of .502 in 54 games during last season's campaign. Moses ranked second in the OVC in average, on-base percentage (14th nationally) and slugging percentage.

Andy Lennington (Franklin, Tenn. /Brentwood Academy) and Nolan Fischer (Wentzville, Mo. / Wentzville Holt), a freshman will add depth at third base.

SHORTSTOP

Kenton Parmley (Goreville, Ill./Goreville) has been a staple at shortstop since day one at Southeast. In three seasons, Parmley has started in every game but three. Last season he hit .308, with 70 hits in 227 at-bats. He drove in 30 runs with 17 doubles. Parmley had a strong finish to the season being named to the OVC All-Tournament Team.

"Parmley is a game changer both offensively and defensively," said Hogan.

John Logan Zink (Louisville, Ill.) will be in the mix at shortstop in 124 at-bats in 2011 at Olney Central College he hit .298 with eight doubles and 20 RBI. He also scored 26 runs.

LEFT FIELD

Jason Blum (Ste. Genevieve, Mo./Valle Catholic) will patrol left field this season taking over for student assistant coach Michael Adamson.

"Blum had a great fall in left field for us, he has plus arm and great range, also has great offensive ability." Said Hogan.

CENTER FIELD

Cole Bieser (Ste. Genevieve, Mo./Valle Catholic) will roam center field this season. Bieser saw action in 34 games last season with four starts. The Ste. Genevieve native scored six runs and stole three bases in three attempts.

"Cole has great speed and brings great energy to the club, he is great in the field and covers a lot of ground," said Hogan.

Andy Lennington (Franklin,

Freshmen Cody Spanberger (Granite City, Ill./Granite City) and Steven Still (Oro Valley, Ariz./ Ironwood) will compete for an opportunity to see some time in the outfield

DESIGNATED HITTER

Ryan Barnes (St. Louis, Mo./ Vianney) will hold down the designated hitter spot for the Redhawks this season.

"Ryan is an outstanding hitter

and a great RBI guy that is a ball striker with gap potential," said Hogan.


Barnes was a Second Team All-State selection last season at St. John Vianney in St. Louis.

2011 SCHEDULE

The Redhawks will play 31 home games this season at Capaha Park. Also this season OVC games will be played as traditional three game series being played Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Southeast will open up the season in Dallas, Texas on Friday, February 17, as the Redhawks will play Dallas Baptist University. The Patriots shocked the college baseball world a season ago and advanced the NCAA Super Regional.


The Redhawks will host in-State foe Harris Stone on Tuesday, February 21 at Capaha Park in the 2012 home opener.


Southeast will also make a trip to New Mexico State on March 16-18. "New Mexico State is a very good program out of the WAC," stated Hogan.

Coaches



ark Hogan, a native of Cape Girardeau enters his 18th season with a total of 888 wins between the NCAA Division I, NCAA Division II and NJCAA Division I

Hogan became the program's fourth head coach in 1995, and has since compiled a 503-420-1 record in 17 seasons as the Redhawks skipper.

Southeast has become one of the elite teams in the Ohio Valley Conference under Hogan's watch. Not only have the Redhawks made the OVC Tournament 17-straight years, but they racked up 236 conference victories, one regular-season title (2002) and two OVC Tournament championships (1998, 2002) along the way. Southeast also played in the OVC Tournament title game seven times and made two NCAA Regional appearances. Hogan's clubs have earned 15 or more league wins in eight of his 16 seasons.

Hogan has achieved many milestones throughout his illustrious coaching career. He earned his 500th victory as head coach of the Redhawks on May 20, 2011 against Eastern Illinois. He earned his 850th career victory with a win against Central Arkansas, 13-11, on April 28, 2010. He recorded his 800th victory with an 8-4 win at then-No. 16 Alabama on Feb. 22, 2009. In 2008, Hogan became the first head coach in Southeast baseball history to win 400 games. A year before that, he became the Redhawks all-time winningest coach, surpassing the legendary Joe Uhls. Hogan, who has 30 years of head coaching experience, also became the first in school history to win 30 games in a season, a feat he has accomplished on nine occasions.

In 2011, Southeast posted a 34-22 and a 14-8 record in the OVC, the Redhawks' 34 wins rank as the third most in school history. The Redhawks were 20-14 outside the Ohio Valley Conference with a 6-5 win over #16 Arkansas to highlight non-conference play.

Southeast finished the 2011season eighth in the nation in batting average at .316. The Redhawks also finished the season eighth in the country in home runs per game at 1.02 as Southeast slugged 57 homers. The Redhawks offense scored 387 runs, leading the OVC and ranking fifth in school history.

In 2002, Hogan led Southeast to a school-record 37 wins and was named the OVC's Coach-of-the-Year.

The Redhawks have enjoyed unprecedented success both on and off the field with Hogan as their coach.

In fact, 13 of his players have earned either OVC Rookie, Player or Pitcher-of-the-Year honors. Hogan has had 41 players named to the All-OVC First-Team, 33 All-OVC Second-Team players and six players named to the All-Freshman Team under his tutelage. Hogan has also coached 14 All-Americans, with the most current being third baseman Trenton Moses, who was named Third-Team Louisville Slugger All-American. Moses earned the honor of OVC Player of the Year in 2011. Hogan has coached 11 MLB draft picks with the most recent being pitcher Logan Mahon who was a 22nd round selection of the Colorado Rockies in 2011.

Former Redhawk Justin Christian saw time with the San Francisco Giants in 2011. Christian was named an All-American and OVC Rookie of the Year under Hogan in 2003.

Academically, the Southeast baseball team recorded a 3.24 grade point average for the 2011 fall semester. In all, 27 players registered at least a 3.0 GPA and two earned a perfect 4.0 during that term. In addition, the Redhawks earned the Team Academic Achievement Award for the most student-athletes with a GPA of 3.25 or higher. Additionally, 15 players make the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll and two Redhawks earned the OVC Medal of Honor, which goes to those student-athletes who achieve the highest GPA in a conference-sponsored sport.


As a player, Hogan transferred to Southeast Missouri State from Mineral Area College. He was a member of Southeast's 1976 baseball team which finished third at the NCAA Division II College World Series. The 1976 squad later became the first baseball team to be inducted into the Southeast Missouri State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006.

He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from Southeast in 1977 and went on to serve as a graduate assistant at Mississippi State in 1978-79.

Hogan then accepted his first head coaching position at Lurleen B. Wallace College in 1982. He went 230-147 in eight seasons at Lurleen and led his 1988 squad to a 38-16 record, AJCAA title and NJCAA Region XXII Championship. In addition, Hogan was named Alabama Junior College Athletics Association Coach-of-the-Year.

In 1990, Hogan moved to the NCAA Division II level. In five years at West Alabama, he registered a 155-110-2 record, won two Gulf South Conference Championships (1992, 1994), one NCAA Division II South Central Region Championship (1992) and finished fifth at the 1992 NCAA Division II College World Series. His colleagues voted him Gulf South and South Central Region Coach-of-the-Year for his efforts.

Hogan resides in Cape Girardeau with his wife, Becky. They have three daughters: Julie, Christie and Betsy. Julie resides in Jackson, Miss., with her husband, Mitch Ogles, daughter, Caroline Mae and son, Chapman Lee Ogles. Chapman Lee is Mark and Becky's first grandchild. Christie and her husband, Billy Puckett, live in Aledo, Ill. Betsy is currently a graduate student at Southeast foucusing on speech pathology.



Coaches



hris Cafalone is in his sixth season as the Redhawks hitting instructor and infield/catchers coach.

Cafalone was hired as an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State on Aug. 29, 2006 after spending 11 years in various coaching roles.

The Redhawks offense was one of the most balanced in the nation in 2011 as Southeast ranked eighth in the country in home runs per game (1.02). The Redhawks also ranked eighth in the nation in slugging percentage at .474. Southeast's offense was 10th in the country in batting average at .316, as well.

In 2011, Southeast ranked second in the Ohio Valley Conference in fielding percentage at .966, a mark that ranks second all-time in the Redhawk's record books. The Redhawks were also effective behind the plate throwing out 65% of would-be base stealers.

Southeast set school records in fielding percentage during Cafalone's first two years as infield coach. The Redhawks finished the 2007 season with a .965 mark, before topping that with a .968 percentage in 2008. Southeast also ranked second (2008) and third (2007) in the OVC in fielding percentage those years.

In 2010, the Redhawks were one of the top offensive teams in the entire nation, holding the seventh-highest team batting average at .346. Southeast was 16th in Division I ranks in Slugging Percentage at .539. The Redhawks set new school records in team at-bats (1,973), runs (452), hits (683), doubles (134), RBI (429) and total bases (974). Since Cafalone took over as hitting coach, the Redhawks have improved their batting average by 43 points from .273 in 2007 to .316 in 2009, and even higher with a .346 clip last spring.

Prior to joining the Southeast staff, Cafalone spent five years as a head coach at Onondaga Community College in Syracuse, N.Y., where he led the Lazers to the postseason three times. He coached the Central baseball team in the Empire State Games and mentored two draft picks in Pat Corbin (Supplemental pick of Philadelphia in 2009) and Philip Pohl (46th-round pick of Tampa Bay). Pohl was the 2008 New York High School Player-of-the-Year. Cafalone also lettered

as a catcher at Onondaga in 1990.

Before that, Cafalone worked in the same capacity for six years at Barry University, an NCAA Division II institution located in Miami Shores, Fla. He compiled an overall record of 179-144 en route to becoming the Buccaneers all-time winningest coach. Cafalone was named the Sunshine State Conference Coach-of-the-Year in 1998 and 2001, and led Barry to its first-ever NCAA Division II Tournament berth in 1998.

Cafalone was an assistant at Barry for two years before being promoted to head coach in 1995. As an assistant, he worked primarily with the catchers and infielders. Cafalone sculpted a defense which led the nation in double plays that year.

A native of Oswego, N.Y., Cafalone began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Hardin-Simmons in 1992. He also spent time coaching in the NCAA-sanctioned summer wood bat Northeast Collegiate Baseball League.

Cafalone earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Hardin-Simmons in 1992 and an associate's degree from Onondaga CC in 1990.

He played college baseball at both Onondaga and Utica (N.Y.) College before transferring to Hardin-Simmons, where he played catcher and was a designated hitter. Cafalone was the recipient of the HSU Coaches Award in 1991.

Cafalone has one son, Anthony, who is 14. Cafalone is engaged to Angela Herrera of Chandler, Ariz.

teve Bieser is in his second season at Southeast Missouri serving as the Redhawks pitching coach. Bieser returns to the Redhawk program after donning a Redhawks jersey in the late 80s.

In 2011, the Redhawks pitching staff ranked third in the Ohio Valley Conference in pitching recording a team ERA of 4.97, as the Redhawks recorded their first earned run average under five since 2007.

The Redhawks team ERA also improved from 2010 as the Southeast hurlers trimmed their team ERA by over one run. Bieser also mentored two pitchers to Second- Team All-OVC honors in Logan Mahon and Jordan Underwood. Mahon was later drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the 22nd round of the MLB Draft.

Bieser, a native of Ste. Genevieve, Mo. came to Southeast after a very successful campaign as head coach at St. John Vianney High School in St. Louis. In Seven seasons at the helm of the Griffins, his team won two state championships in 2004 and 2006. He complied a record of 137-51.

In 2009, he took over the Danville Dans of the Prospect League and coached his son Cole, and Jesse Tierney during the summer seasons. Bieser coached the Dans to the Central League Championship before losing in extra innings in the league championship.

Five of his players were selected in the First Year Major League Player Draft (1st, 5th, 21st, 22nd, & 42nd rounds). Over 80 percent of his high school players have gone on to play collegiate baseball with 12 playing at the Division I level, four attaining freshman All-America status and one, former Redhawk Jim Klocke, being named a two-time All-American.

As a player, Bieser graduated from Southeast Missouri State in 1989 and was selected in the 32nd round of the 1989 June Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies.

On April 1, 1997, he made his Major League debut with the New York Mets. He appeared in 47 games as a utility player that year. The following season he signed with the Pittsburgh Pirates and served as a backup catcher and pinch hitter. In 2001, he ended his professional career as a player for the Memphis Redbirds.

Bieser and his wife, Diahann, have a son (Cole) and three daughters, Whitley (16), Briley (13) and Carley (5).

ichael Adamson is in his first season as a student assistant coach for the Redhawks. Adamson will work with the Redhawk outfielders and also assist with the team's hitting instruction.

Adamson, was a standout outfielder for the Redhawks earning First Team All-OVC honors in 2011 and Second Team honors in 2010. As a senior he hit .363 with seven home runs and 38 RBI. Adamson also stole 16 bases in 18 attempts.

Adamson is the Redhawks single-season record holder in at-bats in a season with 237 and hits in a season with 92, both records set in 2010. Adamson also belted 23 doubles in 2010, a number that ranks second in the single-season record books. He also can be found in the career records at Southeast ranking ninth all-time in career batting average at .373


He also excelled in the classroom being named Cosida First Team Academic All-District in 2011. Adamson was also named to the OVC Commissioner's Honor in 2011.

2011 SEASON REVIEW

The 2011 season was a breakthrough campaign for the Southeast Missouri baseball program. The Redhawks compiled 34 victories, their most since the 2002 campaign, and finished second in the Ohio Valley Conference with a 14-8 record. It was Southeast's second-straight 30-win season and marked the 17th straight year that the Redhawks qualified for the OVC Tournament. The 34 victories are Southeast's third-most in school history.

Offense was the Redhawks' calling card last spring. Despite a new bat infiltrating the college game, Southeast hit .316 as a team (10th-best in the nation), slugged .474 (eighth), clubbed 57 home runs (14th) and averaged 6.9 runs per game (21st), leading the OVC in each category. The Redhawks scored 387 runs altogether, the fifth-straight year they touched





home at least 359 times, and cracked 10 or more runs on opponents 13 times a year ago

No Redhawk stood out more than third baseman Trenton Moses, the 2011 OVC Player of the Year. Moses batted .395 with 11 home runs, 53 RBI, a .502 on-base percentage and a .676 slugging percentage. The third baseman was tabbed a third-team Louisville Slugger All-American. He was one of eight Southeast batters to hit over .300, giving the Redhawks a

balanced lineup that wore out opposing staffs. Moses was joined on the All-OVC first team by Michael Adamson, who stole 16 bases, hit .363, belted seven homers and scored a teamhigh 64 runs.

That elite offense combined with a pitching staff that ranked third in the league with a 4.97 ERA to produce staggering results. The Redhawks' ERA was their best mark since 2007. Southeast hurlers also struck out 335 batters, the most a Southeast staff has fanned since 2006. Closer Logan Mahon and starter Jordan Underwood anchored the staff, with Mahon nailing down eight saves and posting a teambest 2.54 ERA and whiffing 54 batters in 46 innings and Underwood posting a 5-1 record, including a perfect 4-0 mark against OVC foes.

On April 10, Southeast outslugged Tennessee Tech, 13-8, starting an eight-game winning streak that ran until April 22. The Redhawks won 11 of 12 games at that stretch, a span that lasted through April 30. Southeast averaged 9.9 runs per game during the eight-game win streak and 9.5 runs per game during that 12-game stretch. In total, the Redhawks outscored their opponents, 114-55, in that span.


Southeast stayed in the hunt for an outright conference title going with six games remaining in the year. However, a road series at Austin Peay kept the Redhawks from finishing on top. After splitting a pair of one run games, the Governors clinched the OVC crown with a 7-5 win in the rubber match, erasing a 3-1 Redhawk lead in the sixth inning.

The Redhawks entered the OVC Touranment on a high note, sweeping Eastern Illinois at home to wrap up the No. 2 seed in the postseason tournament. In that series, Southeast head coach Mark Hogan picked up the 500th win of his career.

Southeast's postseason got off to a rocky start as Jacksonville State dealt it an 8-2 defeat on the first day of the tournament. The Redhawks were resilient in their stay in the loser's bracket, however, posting victories over Eastern Illinois and Tennessee Tech to reach the semifinal round.

Jacksonville State once again proved a thorn in Southeast's side, outslugging the Redhawks 15-12 to end their season. Casey Jones, Brad LaBruyere and Kenton Parmley were each placed on the OVC All-Tournament team for their efforts.

The Redhawks 18 seniors complied the the third best record in school history. The 34 wins also marked the largest win total since 2002. Southeast also qualified for the OVC Tournament for the 17th straight season.

REDHAWKS IN THE MAJORS





JUSTIN CHRISTIAN

Christian signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles in 2008 and appeared in 24 games with the New York Yankees in 2007. In 24 games with the big club, he had six RBI's, three doubles and a .250 batting average. He played 18 games with the San Francisco Giants in 2011. In his 18 game stretch he reocrded a batting average of .255 with five doubles and four RBI's. The Giants purchased Christian contract in september as the former Redhawk saw time in the giant's outfield. He went 3 for 5 with three RBI's against the Dodgers on September 21.

SOUTHEAST HALL OF FAME MEMBERS

2002 INDUCTEE

Joe Uhls served as the baseball coach at Southeast from 1960-1984. He totaled a 373-257-5 record. He also served as an assistant basketball coach in the 1960's. The baseball locker room at Houck Field House is named in Uhls honor.

2004 INDUCTEE

Steve Williams played both football as a punter and baseball as a catcher. He led the football team in punting in 1981 and 1983. Williams was an All-America baseball catcher in 1982 and 1983 and played professionally in the Philadelphia Phillies organization. He still holds the All-Time career home run record wth 52 long balls.

2006 INDUCTEES

The 1976 baseball team won the MIAA conference title, the NCAA Midwest Regional title and advanced to the College World Series in Springfield, Ill., finishing third in the nation.

The College World Series team roster included Allan Alberter, Mark Amick, Lawrence Basta, Don Buechting, Bill Criscione, James Dambach, Mark Doerr, Clarence Eisenbach, James Hastings, Mark Hogan, Jeffry Hunt, David Jorn, Vincent Korando, Ralph Kuehn, Bruce Morgan, Bryan Parker, Thomas Smiley, Timothy Smith, Dan Wieser, Mike Wieser and Rick Wieser. The team was coached by the late Joe Uhls who was one of the inaugural inductees into the Southeast Athletic Hall of Fame.

Royal Tibi (1919-23) is believed to be the only athlete at Southeast to earn varsity letters in five sports. He lettered in football, basketball, baseball, track and tennis. An outstanding punter on the football team, he also served as captain of the track team and was described as an outstanding defensive player on the basketball team.

2008 INDUCTEE

Kerry Robinson set many school records while playing in the outfield from 1993-95. He holds the school record with 35 straight games with a hit. After being drafted in the 34th round of the Major League draft Robinson played five seasons in the minor leagues before making his major league debut with the Tampa Bay Rays on September 22, 1998. Robinson played seven seasons in the majors, with three of the seasons as a starter for the St. Louis Cardinals. He ended his career playing in 463 games and compiling 196 hits in 735 at-bats. Robinson committed just four errors in 379 chances in his big league career.

2010 INDUCTEES

Dale Meier established numerous pitching records over his four-year career. He registered a total of 16 wins and three saves and was involved in 51 percent of Southeast's wins during that time. In 1964, Meier had nine victories and one save, and pitched Southeast's first no-hitter of the modern era. A two-time Most Valuable Player (1963, 1964), Meier went on to play professionally for five years in the St. Louis Cardinals organization.

Clarence Bergman, who is deceased, lettered four years in four sports, including football, basketball, baseball and track. He scored the first touchdown in the dedication game at Houck Stadium on Oct. 3, 1930. Bergman was a captain of three teams.




2011 SOUTHEAST MISSOUR! HALL OF FAME



JEREMY JOHNSON (1996-2000)

Jeremy Johnson was the 2000 Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year. A two-time First-Team All-OVC outfielder (1999, 2000) and OVC All-Tournament Team pick (1998, 2000), Johnson is currently Southeast's all-time career leader in hits (287), games played (216), runs scored (214) and total bases (521). He was named OVC Tournament MVP after leading Southeast to its first NCAA Regional appearance in 1998.



ntering its 64th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

In May 2011 the Conference expanded for the second time in four years, adding Belmont University which will begin competition in the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont will give the OVC 12 members, the most the league has had at one time in its illustrious history. The move added a second team in the city of Nashville and was the first addition to the league since Southern Illinois University Edwardsville joined in 2008. SIUE will begin regular season competition this season (2011-12) and be eligible for postseason the same year Belmont joins the league.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. She is currently one of just five females to be the head of a Division I conference, and one of just eight to lead a Division I conference all-time. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first nontraditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

Through the past 63 years, 15 teams have won or shared the league's football title. The list is led by Eastern Kentucky, winner of 20 outright or shared football crowns, including both the 2007 and 2008 championships, as they

compiled a 15-1 league record over that time period. Only one other Football Championship Subdivision school (UMass) has won more Conference titles than the Colonels. Among OVC teams, former member Middle Tennessee is next with 11 titles, followed by Tennessee Tech with nine, and Murray State and former member Western Kentucky with eight apiece. Eastern Illinois has claimed five football crowns (including the 2009 title) while Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and former members Evansville and East Tennessee State have captured two apiece. Austin Peay, Southeast Missouri (which captured its first crown in 2010), UT Martin and former member Youngstown State have one title apiece.

Murray State and Evansville tied for the initial football championship, and the Racers participated in the first-ever bowl game by an OVC team, tying Sul Ross State 21-21 in the 1948 Tangerine Bowl. From 1948 to 1975, OVC teams played in 15 bowl games, winning eight of them. Eastern Kentucky and Western Kentucky were also participants in the NCAA Division II playoffs in the early and mid-1970s prior to the NCAA's reclassification of football programs into Division I-AA. The term "I-AA" lasted until the end of the 2006 season when it was changed to Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

The first Division I-AA/FCS football playoff was held in 1978 with only four teams, which is the only year through present day that the OVC did not field a playoff representative. In 1979, four of the nation's top teams were invited to the playoffs, and two of them - Eastern Kentucky and Murray State - were from the OVC. Murray dropped its semifinal game to Lehigh, but the Colonels nipped Nevada-Reno in double overtime and claimed the national championship a week later with a 30-7 victory over Lehigh. EKU was coached by former all-America quarterback Roy Kidd, who was in his 16th year at the helm of his alma mater and who skippered the Colonels to a second national title three years later. Following the 2002 season, Kidd retired after 39 years at EKU; upon retirement, he ranked sixth all-time among Division I coaches with 315 victories, earning him a spot in the College Football Hall of Fame. EKU's 19 FCS playoff appearances are the second for the most all-time (behind only Montana).

In addition to Kidd, other coaching legends in the OVC include Charles (Bubber) Murphy, who coached at Middle Tennessee from 1947-1968, Western Kentucky's Jimmy Feix (1968-83), Wilburn Tucker (1954-67) and Don Wade (1968-82) of Tennessee Tech,

Bill Ferguson (1967-77) of Murray State, Guy Penny (1959-67) of Morehead State and Boots Donnelly (1977-78 at Austin Peay; 1979-1998 at Middle Tennessee). Current Eastern Illinois head coach Bob Spoo has compiled 90 wins, while his program has been a member of the OVC which ranks him fifth all-time in league history while his 67 Conference victories are fourth all-time; Spoo will retire following the conclusion of the 2011 season, his 25th with the program.

A sampling of former OVC football stars, some of whom were All-Americans during their collegiate careers before achieving stardom at the professional ranks, include Jim Youngblood and Larry Schreiber (Tennessee Tech), Phil Simms (Morehead State), Virgil Livers and Dale Lindsey (Western Kentucky), Myron Guyton and Chad Bratzke (Eastern Kentucky), Cortland Finnegan (Samford) and Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois). In 2008, former Tennessee State standout Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie became just the fourth NFL First Round draft pick in OVC history when he was selected 16th overall by the Arizona Cardinals. He would break into the starting lineup halfway through his rookie season and started at cornerback for the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII. The OVC has had at least one former player named a NFL Pro Bowl selection in four of the past five seasons.

The 2007 season marked a return to scholar-ship football and the OVC for the Austin Peay Governors. Following the 1996 season the Governors dropped scholarship football and competed as both an independent (1997-00, 2006) and as a member of the Pioneer Football League (2001-05).

The 2007 season also brought new vernacular to the Ohio Valley Conference and the division formerly known as I-AA. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game the term I-AA was changed to NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in a decision by the Division I Board of Directors. The new label was chosen to communicate in a positive and clear manner the unique differences between Division I football categories (chiefly, the post-season opportunity) while still defining them within the Division I experience. The FCS includes programs that compete in an effort to participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 89 NCAA national championships) as opposed to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) which competes in an effort to participate in the postseason bowl system (the 35 NCAA-licensed events which includes the Bowl Championship Series).

In 2010 Southeast Missouri State, picked to

finish seventh in the preseason poll, compiled a 7-1 Conference record on the way to its first OVC Championship since joining the league in 1991. Overall the Redhawks were 9-2 during the regular season and earned a berth in the FCS Playoffs, its first playoff berth at any level in the program's 104-year history. Southeast would lose to eventual national champion Eastern Washington in the second round of the playoffs. Head coach Tony Samuel capped the year by winning the Sports Network's Eddie Robinson Award, given to the National Coach of the Year. Samuel was the second OVC coach to win the award (joining Murray State's Houston Nutt who won the award in 1995).

Football wasn't the only sport in which the OVC was quickly gaining respect. In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a narrow 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off 14th-ranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann - combined for 39 points in the win. MSU nearly went on to the Sweet 16 that year, losing to eventual national champion Kansas, 61-58. A bank shot by Mann that would've given the Racers a one-point lead rolled off the rim with three seconds left. In 1990 as a No. 16 seed, Murray State took No. 1 seed Michigan

State into overtime before falling 75-71; that game still marks the closest a No. 16 seed has come to knocking off a No. 1 in men's tournament action. More recently, Murray State has dominated the OVC Tournament, reaching the championship game every year in the 1990's. The Racers' 14 OVC Tournament Championships are the most among all OVC schools.

After former member Middle Tennessee State won a first round game in 1989, the league had a drought as no other OVC team won a NCAA Tournament game for the next 19 years. But Morehead State, coming off a thrilling double overtime OVC Tournament victory over Austin Peay, topped Alabama State 58-43 in the Opening Round game at Flyer Arena in Dayton, Ohio. The game was played in front of an Opening Round record crowd of 11,346; that crowd included many MSU fans who made the three-hour drive from Morehead for the game. The Eagles season would come to three days later when they lost to No. 1 overall seed Louisville, despite playing the Cardinals close for a majority of the game.

In 2009-10, Murray State made OVC history by winning a record 31 games (31-5) on its way to the league's regular season and tournament championship. In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the No. 13 seed Racers topped Vanderbilt in thrilling fashion when senior Danero Thomas hit a jumper as time expired to lift MSU to a 66-65 victory. It marked the first OVC team to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament since 1989, and snapped a skid of 71-straight loses to Southeastern Conference foes (dating back to 2000-01). In the second round the Racers pushed eventual national runner-up Butler to the brink before losing 54-52.

In 2010-11 Morehead State would make it three NCAA Tournament wins in as many years for the league and got a bit of revenge for the 2009 tournament loss to Louisville in the process. After finishing second in the regular season and winning the OVC Tournament Championship, the No. 13 seeded Eagles were shipped to Denver to play its in-state foe Cardinals. MSU jumped out to a 15-2 advantage but were down four points (61-57) with just over a minute to play in regulation. After two free throws from two-time OVC Player of the Year Kenneth Faried, the Eagles held for one final shot attempt and senior Demonte Harper pulled up off a cross-over dribble to nail a 3-pointer with 4.3 seconds left that gave Morehead State a 62-61 lead. UofL had one last attempt but Faried blocked the Cardinals last shot, giving MSU the win, its first over Louisville since the 1956-57 season.

The OVC has now won NCAA Tournament games in three-straight seasons, something that has happened in the league only twice previously (1960-62 and 1987-89). Over that time period (2009-11) the OVC is one of just 10 conferences nationally to win a NCAA Tournament game in each season and one of only four non-BCS leagues (joining the Atlantic 10, Horizon and WCC) to do so.

During the 2010-11 year Faried, the nation's leading rebounder during the season, became the NCAA's Modern Era (since 1973) career rebounding leader, totaling 1,673 rebounds which passed Tim Duncan for the record (he is 11th all-time in NCAA history). Faried also finished his career with 86 double-doubles, second all-time to only Duncan. He is one of only six players in NCAA history to finish with 2,000-plus career points (2,009) and 1,600-plus career rebounds. Faried was drafted 22nd overall by the Denver Nuggets in the 2011 NBA Draft, becoming the first OVC player selected in the first round since Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers 1994.

Through its 63 years, 12 teams have won or shared the league's regular season men's basketball title. Murray State heads the list with a Conference-record 22 outright or shared basketball crowns. Other past champions include former member Western Kentucky (19), Morehead State (9), Austin Peay (8), Eastern Kentucky (6), Tennessee Tech (5), former member Middle Tennessee (5), Tennessee State (2), former member East Tennessee State (2), Southeast Missouri State (1), UT Martin (who won its first in 2008-09) and former member Akron (1).

Among the coaching greats in men's basketball have been Western Kentucky's E.A. Diddle, who retired with 759 victories and 10 OVC titles; John Oldham, who was a member of the very first All-OVC squad and went on to win seven OVC crowns during his coaching tenure at Tennessee Tech and Western Kentucky; Paul McBrayer, who guided Eastern Kentucky to 219 wins and three OVC crowns; and Cal Luther, who is the only person in Conference history to win men's basketball Coach of the Year honors at two league schools - Murray State and UT Martin. Current Austin Peay head coach Dave Loos became the winningest coach in OVC history in 2009-10, netting his 319th victory and passing Luther on the all-time list. Loos enters the 2011-12 season with 351 victories.

There have been an equal number of great players including Western Kentucky's Clem Haskins, who is the only three-time OVC Player of the Year. Several players have won

OVC Player of the Year honors twice: Western Kentucky's Jim McDaniels (1969-70 and 1970-71), Murray State's Les Taylor (1971-72, 1972-73), Jeff Martin (1987-88, 1988-89), Popeye Jones (1989-90, 1990-91) and Marcus Brown (1994-95, 1995-96), Austin Peay's Otis Howard (1976-77, 1977-78), Middle Tennessee's Jerry Beck (1980-81, 1981-82), Akron's Joe Jakubick (1982-83, 1983-84), Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers (1992-93, 1993-94), UT Martin's Lester Hudson (2007-08, 2008-09) and Morehead State's Kenneth Faried (2009-10, 2010-11).

The OVC also has the honor of being the only conference to boast the nation's leaders in scoring, rebounding and assists all in one season. That feat was accomplished in 1991-92 by Morehead State's Brett Roberts (28.1 ppg), Murray State's Popeye Jones (14.4 rpg) and Tennessee Tech's Van Usher (8.8 apg).

In 2007-08, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson became the first men's Division I player to record a quadruple-double in a game, when he registered 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a victory over Central Baptist College. Hudson, who ranked fourth in scoring nationally as a junior, returned for his senior season in 2008-09 and was second nationally in scoring (behind Davidson's Stephen Curry) at 27.5 points a contest. Hudson earned numerous honors (including OVC Player of the Year and OVC Male Athlete of the Year in each 2008 and 2009 and All-American status from several outlets) before being drafted by the Boston Celtics with the No. 58 pick of the 2009 NBA Draft.

In the late 1970s, women's athletics began somewhat of a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982.

Women's basketball in the OVC has been dominated by Tennessee Tech, which has won or shared 17 regular-season titles and owns nine OVC Tournament crowns. In fact, the Golden Eagles have reached the champion-ship game of the OVC Tournament 20 times in the past 30 years. Although Tennessee Tech remains the standard-bearer, five other teams have won 13 of the last 18 OVC Tourna-

ments. UT Martin became the latest program to add its name to the list, capturing its first OVC Tournament title in 2011. Austin Peay leads the group with seven crowns including four-straight from 2000-03 and back-to-back titles in 2009 and 2010, while Tennessee State, Eastern Kentucky, Murray State and Southeast Missouri each have won titles during that span.

Several coaches have made their mark in the relatively short history of OVC women's basketball. Former Tennessee Tech coach Marynell Meadors posted an amazing 363-139 (72.3%) record at Tech, becoming the first woman in NCAA or AIAW history to win 300 games at the same institution, while former Tennessee State skipper Teresa Phillips earned National Coach of the Year honors from USA Today in 1990 for turning around the Lady Tigers' program before going on to lead TSU to the NCAA Tournament in 1994 and 1995. Tennessee Tech coach Bill Worrell capped a stellar 20-year career in 2005-06 and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2007; he compiled a 408-190 record while leading the Golden Eagles to an unprecedented 16 OVC regular-season titles and eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including five straight from 1989-93. Eastern Kentucky's Larry Joe Inman, who retired at the conclusion of the 2007-08 season and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2009, won more than 100 games at both Middle Tennessee and EKU, and earned OVC Coach of the Year honors a record eight times - five times at EKU and three at MTSU. He finished his career with 480 career victories.

Many great players have graced the hardwood over the years, including former OVC Players of the Year Brooke Armistead and Gerlonda Hardin from Austin Peay, Pam Chambers, Jerilynn Harper, Cheryl Taylor, Angela Moorehead, Roschelle Vaughn, Diane Seng, Janet Holt and Emily Christian from Tennessee Tech; Morehead State's Donna Murphy, Priscilla Blackford and Chynna Bozeman; Eastern Kentucky's Kim Mays; Southeast Missouri's Gray C. Harris; and Murray State's Ashley Hayes.

Bozeman finished her collegiate career in 2010-11 by winning her second consecutive OVC Player of the Year award. Her 2,170 points ranks her eighth all-time in OVC history, her 377 made career 3-pointers is first in OVC history and sixth in NCAA history and her 1,096 career 3-point attempts ranks first in OVC history and second in NCAA history.

Morehead State center Brittany Pittman set new school, league and NCAA standards for blocked shots in 2008-09. Pittman swatted 164 shots during the season, setting a new NCAA single-season record (which has since been broken). During the campaign, only her second with the Eagles, she also set career block records for both Morehead State and the OVC (287).

The league also had another historical moment in November 2008 when the NCAA awarded Nashville the 2014 NCAA Women's Division I Final Four. The OVC will serve as the host of the prestigious event, which is one of the biggest sporting events the city of Nashville can host. The event will be held at Bridgestone Arena in downtown Nashville.

Over its 63 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track

and golf.

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States Olympic Rifle Team and Morehead State's Brian Shimer who competed in five Winter Olympics in bobsled (winning a bronze medal in 2002) and coached the 2010 United States bobsled team to its first gold medal since 1948. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peay) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present-day standouts like basketball player Trenton Hassell (Austin Peay), football player Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois) and baseball players George Sherrill (Austin Peay) and Jon Rauch (Morehead State). Hamilton is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and a NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles Lakers).

The OVC's first volleyball tournament was held in 1981, the same year Eastern Kentucky began a string of six straight tournament crowns. Former EKU skipper Dr. Geri Polvino compiled a 627-439 record in 32 seasons as head coach of the Colonels, earning OVC Coach of the Year honors eight times. More recently, former Austin Peay coach Cheryl Holt and former Southeast Missouri skipper Cindy Gannon also earned their peers' recognition multiple times with four awards each.

Throughout the last 28 years, 10 different teams have won an OVC regular-season or tournament volleyball crown. Since joining the league in 1991, Southeast Missouri has dominated the scene, winning seven of its eight regular-season titles during the 1990's, including five straight from 1993-97. The Redhawks

have also won five tournament crowns (1994, 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2000). Jacksonville State won back-to-back OVC Tournament Championships (2005, 2006) including going through the OVC undefeated (16-0) in 2006 and winning a NCAA Tournament match in 2010, the league's first NCAA victory since 2000.

Following the 2007 season, Jacksonville State's Abbey Breit was named the OVC Offensive Player of the Year for the third straight season, becoming the first player in OVC history to accomplish that feat. Four other individuals - Eastern Kentucky's Angela Boykins (1985-86), Morehead State's Dayle Hammontree (1988-89), Southeast Missouri's Tuba Meto (1996-97) and Morehead State's Amy Almond (2001-02) – were back-to-back winners of the award.

In 2007, Eastern Kentucky's Jacob Korir won his fourth straight Conference cross country title becoming just the third OVC student-athlete and 13th athlete nationally to accomplish that feat. Korir was a three-time All-American in cross country, earning two top-10 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country Championship. The Nairobi, Kenya, native was also named a track and field All-American twice during his career, was selected as the OVC Male Athlete of the Year in 2006-07 and received the NCAA post graduate scholarship in 2008.

In 2007 the Conference had two teams in the NCAA Women's Soccer Tournament for the first time in league history, as former OVC member Samford earned an at-large selection while Southeast Missouri was the Conference's automatic bid.

In 2009 it was OVC softball that accomplished several firsts as UT Martin (tournament champion) and Jacksonville State (at-large) were each selected for the NCAA Championship. Jacksonville State would take it a step farther by winning the Knoxville Regional (beating No. 13 national seed Tennessee along the way) to become the first OVC softball program to advance to a Super Regional. Jax State would fall to No. 4 Alabama in that Super Regional but finished the season 43-16 (19-2 OVC) and ranked 21st nationally in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and 24th nationally in the USA Today/NFCA poll.

The league's baseball presence has continued to evolve since its inception. The OVC baseball tournament moved to a neutral site for the first time in 2001 with Paducah, Ky. and Brooks Stadium hosting the tournament in front of raucous crowds. The success of the tournament led to Jackson, Tenn. and Pringles Park – the home of the Seattle Mariner's Class AA af-

filiate – hosting the event for the first time in 2010; Pringles Park is under contract to host the 2012 championship as well.

The OVC also has made a statement in the NCAA Baseball Championship in recent years, with its teams involved in several memorable contests in the last decade. Tennessee Tech surprised Wake Forest in the opening round of the 2001 tournament and Southeast Missouri stunned host Alabama in the opening round of the 2002 championship. Five years later, Austin Peay captured the collegiate baseball world's attention by taking Vanderbilt, the 2007 No. 1 overall seed, to extra innings. Eastern Illinois pushed host Nebraska to the limit in 2008 followed by Tennessee Tech's memorable contest against host Clemson in 2009.

After not making the OVC Tournament field in either 2009 or 2010, Austin Peay, who was picked to finish seventh in the preseason poll, won the regular season and tournament championships to garner its fourth NCAA Tournament appearance. In the first game of NCAA Regional play the Govs knocked off host and No. 1 seed Georgia Tech 2-1.

A first in the OVC occurred in 2008, when the league had a first round draft pick in both the NFL (Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie) and Major League Baseball (Eastern Kentucky's Christian Friedrich) Drafts in the same school year. A year later (2009) the league had a Major League Baseball First Round Compensation Round pick (Eastern Illinois' Tyler Kehrer who was No. 48 overall) and NBA Second Round pick (UT Martin's Lester Hudson) in the same season.

In 2010 a record 13 OVC baseball players were selected in Major League Baseball's First-Year Player Draft.

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 202 studentathletes honored with the award, including 35 over the last three years (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11).

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to

the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation, and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.


Additionally, the OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State studentathlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin. Belmont University will become the league's 12th member on July 1, 2012.



Overlooking the Mississippi River, a Cultural Arts Center and transformed Seminary Building are now home to the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts. With the coming of this magnificent facility, the number of new students planning to major in the visual and performing arts doubled in one year.

- Art students have five interconnected art studios for painting, drawing, printmaking, fibers and design plus two computerized looms, as well as two presses in the printmaking studio and a computer design lab with the latest hardware and software available.
- Students find internships and professional experience at the Berkshire Theatre Festival, the Lucille Lortel Theatre in New York, the McLeod Summer Theatre or the University of Connecticut Summer Theatre and more.
- In 2008, the Golden Eagles Marching Band performed at the Edinburgh Military Tattoo in Scotland becoming only the second American university marching band to perform there twice
- In addition to performances throughout the season, featuring world famous guest artists, the Southeast Missouri Symphony Orchestra exchanged music as well as culture in China when they performed concerts in Shanghai and Beijing in 2009.
- The River Campus gives students the opportunity to show their work in a variety of first-class venues: the 950-seat Donald C. Bedell Performance Hall is a proscenium theatre with spacious stage and backstage areas. The 200-seat Wendy Kurka Rust Flexible Theatre can be configured in unlimited ways for "black box" productions. The 200-seat Robert F. and Gertrude L. Shuck Music Recital Hall features nearly perfect acoustics. a student/faculty art gallery features technology that allows for the display of 3-D animation, as well as painting, prints, ceramics and sculpture. The Rosemary Berkel and Harry L. Crisp II Museum has an interactive educational theatre, art gallery for changing exhibitions and a permanent display featuring southeast Missouri.



Living on Campus

Southeast offers students 11 residence halls from which to choose. Each room has Internet access and cable TV. Nine dining areas are available with a variety of options. And, with more than 150 diverse organizations, students find plenty of opportunities to get involved.





r. Kenneth W. Dobbins became the seventeenth president of Southeast Missouri State University on July 1, 1999 after serving as the University's Vice President of Finance and Administration from 1991 to 1993, and Executive Vice President from 1993 until his appointment as president. He previously held several positions in higher education administration at Kent State University in Ohio.

During his tenure at Southeast, academic programs have been enhanced, including establishment of a School of Polytechnic Studies and the Earl and Margie Holland School of Visual and Performing Arts which opened in Fall 2007 on the new River Campus. A comprehensive review of all academic and non-academic programs has been accomplished to maintain quality and minimize student fee increases in the face of significant state appropriation reductions. Southeast continues to be recognized nationally for many of its outstanding



accredited academic programs. For the seventh year in a row, Princeton Review recognized the Master of Business Administration program on its list of "Best Business Schools." GetEducated. com listed Southeast #1 on the list of "Top 10 Ranked Best Values Online MBAs-AACSB-Accredited"; Southeast is recognized in the top tier of the Midwest best regional universities in U.S. News Best Colleges for 2011; and Southeast was again named among the "Best in the Midwest" by Princeton Review. Additionally, StateUniversity. com ranked Southeast the safest college campus in Missouri.

Enrollment has increased significantly since a 20-year-low in 1994 when some 7,900 students attended Southeast. In Fall 2005, enrollment topped 10,000 for the first time, and stood at more than 11,200 in 2010. Additionally, record enrollments in higher education have occurred in the University's 25-county service region during his tenure due to the establishment of new regional campuses in Sikeston and Kennett and a higher education center at Perryville serving placebound students in and near those rural communities.

During Dr. Dobbins' presidency, more than \$250 million in capital construction and building improvement projects have enhanced the University. The Seabaugh Polytechnic Building and the \$50 million River Campus were constructed. An innovation center and business incubator to promote entrepreneurship and enhance the region's economy opened on the campus in 2005; Southeast dedicated its new, state-of-the-art David M. Barton Agriculture Research Center in 2009; two new 300-bed residence halls were constructed in 2002 and 2009; and the University currently is in the midst of \$58 million in capital renovation, maintenance and repair projects including the renovation of the historic 105-year-old Academic Hall.


Dr. Dobbins has served a two-year term as president of the Missouri Council on Public Higher Education (COPHE), the organization for presidents

and chancellors of Missouri's public colleges and universities. In 2007, he was selected to serve a three-year term on the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Board of Directors, an organization which represents over 420 public college and university members and more than 3.7 million students or 56 percent of the enrollment at all public four-year institutions. He was elected Secretary-Treasurer of the organization in 2008, and currently serves as chair of the AASCÚ Board. Also, for the past seven years, he has served as one of five faculty members for the AASCU New Presidents' Academy. He previously served three years as president of the Ohio Valley Conference and is currently a member of the Conference finance subcommittee. In addition, he is a vice president of the executive board of the Greater St. Louis Council, Boy

Scouts of America, and in 2010, he was awarded the Silver Beaver Award, the highest honor bestowed upon a Boy Scout volunteer by a council.

He earned his B.S. degree in accounting from the University of Akron (Ohio) in 1971 and served as a commissioned officer and civilian executive in the U.S. Air Force for almost 10 years. He received the M.B.A. degree in 1979 from Old Dominion University (Virginia), and the Ph.D. in higher education administration in 1987 from Kent State. He is also a Certified Public Accountant in Ohio.

Dr. Dobbins and his wife, Jeanine Larson Dobbins, Founder and Director Emeritus of the Missouri Statewide Early Literacy Intervention Program based at Southeast, have a son, Paul, and a daughter-in-law, Stacey, who are both Southeast graduates, and a grandson, Lincoln Kenneth Dobbins.





indy Gannon has been part of Southeast
Missouri State University
Athletics for more than 20 years.

In 2011-12, Gannon will serve as interim Director of Athletics in addition to continuing her role as Senior Woman Administrator. Gannon was named to the position for the second time in her career after John Shafer announced his retirement following three years of service.

Gannon officially began her duties as interim Director of Athletics on July 1 after completing her sixth year as Associate Director of Athletics and Senior Woman Administrator.

As Southeast's Associate Director of Athletics and Senior Woman Administrator, Gannon was in charge of event management, sports supervision, personnel recruitment and monitoring the department's compliance with gender equity, while serving as an institutional representative to the Ohio Valley Conference.

Gannon also led the efforts for the department's NCAA thirdcycle recertification. This certification process evaluates the Athletic Department's commitment to three operating principles outlined by the NCAA, including governance and commitment to rules; academic integrity; and gender/ diversity issues and student-athlete well-being. Southeast delivered a report on its progress to the NCAA in April.

Gannon has been the driving force behind other major events such as the Women's Walk and Dig for Life which continue to grow each year.

The Fourth Annual Women's Walk reached record numbers and raised \$30,000 for the Redhawk Athletics Scholarship Fund in 2011.

Meanwhile, Dig for Life, which is a month-long campaign during the Redhawks volleyball season, brought in a record \$22,000 a year ago. Gannon started this special foundation in 2000 after losing her mother to breast cancer. The campaign raises money to fund 200 local women for mammogram screening, who otherwise could not afford it.

In addition, Gannon recently finished her fourth year as a member of the National NCAA Division I Volleyball Committee.

A native of De Soto, Mo., Gannon started working at Southeast as a graduate assistant with the volleyball team. Three years later, she took over as head coach.

Gannon was at the helm of the volleyball program from 1989-2004, where she compiled a 366-211 record and led Southeast to eight OVC Championships and four NCAA Tournament Appearances. Gannon was also named OVC Coach of the Year four times.

Following her coaching career, Gannon remained at Southeast to work in athletic administration. She was last appointed interim Director of Athletics in October, 2008.

Recognized by not only her peers for her exceptional coaching, Gannon was a recipient of the Southeast Missouri State University College of Education Young Alumni Merit Award in 1998. She was recognized by her junior college alma mater when Mineral Area College selected her as an "Outstanding Alum." Gannon was also inducted into the De Soto High School Athletics Hall of Fame in 2009.

Gannon is a former member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) and National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators (NAC-WAA). In 2000, she chaired Southeast's Midwest Region and was a member of the AVCA Division I Top-25 Selection and All-America Committees.

Gannon received her undergraduate degree in physical education (1985) and master's in higher education (1987) from Southeast. She resides in Cape Girardeau.


