





### HEAD COACH LANA RICHMOND



Entering her 28th season as head softball coach at Southeast Missouri State, Lana Richmond has the longest consecutive tenure of any Southeast coach and current Ohio Valley Conference coach. Taking over the program in 1982, Richmond is only the third coach in the history of Southeast softball.

Richmond has built the program from the ground up, starting with only 2 scholarships and taking the 1991 team to the NCAA Division II Final Four. A program developed tirelessly, diligently and successfully with over 200 student-athletes who have worn the SEMO jersey for Richmond and her staff through the past three decades.

Over the past 27 seasons, Richmond has experienced unparalleled success as she has climbed the ranks to become the winningest coach in Ohio Valley Conference history and ranks among the top 20 winningest active coaches in NCAA history.

In her first ten seasons, Southeast was a Division II member, competing in the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA). In Division II, Richmond led the program to four NCAA Regional tournament berths, including the 1991 NCAA Final Four. In 1986 she coached one of Southeast's most successful squads, leading them to a school record 40 wins. Her coaching efforts won her NCAA honors as the 1987 and 1990 Division II Coach of the Year.

Since joining the OVC and the ranks of Division I competition in 1992, Richmond has guided her teams to high levels of success. Her numerous awards plus her team's accolades speak for themselves. Richmond is in charge of a program that has produced nine 30-plus win seasons over the 16-year span. During this stint, she has also led her squad to one NCAA Division I Tournament berth, four OVC tournament crowns and five OVC regular-season championships. While coaching 37 All-OVC first teamers, four OVC Player of the Year recipients and two OVC Pitcher of the Year award winners, while leading Southeast to a .750 winning record in the conference. Her achievements in coaching have not gone unnoticed by her peers, where Richmond has been honored five times as OVC Coach of the Year including last season when she was named Co-OVC Coach of the Year.

Her 28 years at the helm of the program have yielded many highlights. One such highlight was the memorable 2001 season as Richmond was joined to the history books as only the 27th coach in Division I history to reach the 700 career win plateau.

"It is about the student-athletes who have worn the Southeast uniform," Richmond said. "I have not scored a run for SEMO. They are the ones who have performed on the field. It is all about people and the relationships you build. I have only been their guide through this wonderful journey over the last 28 years."

The 1999 season marked her most successful season in Division I as Richmond led Southeast to their first NCAA Tournament berth. The squad won its first game vs. East Carolina 2-1 on May 21, 1999, making history as the first OVC team to record a victory in the NCAA Tournament.

"Each season our goal is to consistently be a contender for the conference championship. Our ticket to the NCAA's is through winning our conference tournament," noted Richmond. "Also, it is always a priority to graduate each player recruited to our program, and in 27 years, of all the players I have recruited, all but three have graduated."

This past October her team was honored for the tenth-straight year by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association as an All-Academic team. That team compiled a team grade point average of 3.35 which was the nation's 23rd best team GPA. From 1999-2005, her team compiled a streak of six-straight top-ten All-Academic honors. In 2002, her squad climbed to its highest ranking thus far, claiming the nation's second best GPA.

"This accomplishment is a tribute to the student-athletes and the standards they have set for themselves. This is reinforced by the priority placed on academics instilled in our program" said Richmond.

Richmond has been a member of the NFCA since 1987 and served on Division II NCAA All-American and Regional Ranking committees. She last served a two year stint on the NCAA Division One South Region Ranking Committee and the NFCA top 25.

Richmond graduated from Berea College in Berea, Ky. in 1980. Immediately after graduating, she began her coaching career at Georgetown College, before becoming the head softball and volleyball coach at Southeast. As a volleyball coach, Richmond led Southeast to a 203-91 overall record over seven seasons before choosing to concentrate solely on softball.

Richmond also served as the Senior Woman Administrator and an Assistant Athletic Director for over 20 years at Southeast before relinquishing her duties to devote more time with family and on the softball program.

"Coaching at Southeast Missouri State has been an honor and I believe it has been my calling," said Richmond. "I arrived on campus at Southeast as a young inexperienced 23-year old, barely older than some of my senior players. I am grateful Southeast has let me have this opportunity to coach and work here."

Richmond competes in half marathons throughout the year. She and husband Tim have a 17-year old daughter, Jordyn who is a member of the Cape Central

## THE ASSISTANT COACHES



Jeff Dabney is in his second season on the Redhawks coaching staff where he serves as the team's pitchers and catchers coach and works with the slap hitters. He also serves as the team's recruiting coordinator as well as directing the conditioning program.


Dabney comes to Southeast after serving as the head coach of North Florida Community College in Madison, Fla. His team featured nine all-conference players and one Athlete of the Week honoree. Dabney's duties at NFCC included administering over every aspect of the softball program including recruiting, fundraising, conditioning and scouting.

Prior to coaching at NFCC, Dabney was an assistant coach at the University of Florida in Gainesville, Fla. During his time at Florida, the team went 42-23, finishing third in the Southeastern Conference and a final ranking of 16th nationally. The team also featured four All-SEC Selections, four All-SEC Freshman Team players, one SEC Player of the Year, three CoSIDA Academic All-District selections and three players signed to professional contracts.

As head coach at Neosho County Community College in Chanute, Kan., from 1998 to 2005, Dabney notched over 200 wins, averaging 35 per season. His accolades include a 5th place finish at the 2004 Junior College World Series, 2004 Region 6 Champions, 2004 Coach of the Year, 2003 Conference Champions and back-to-back Academic National Championships in 2002 and 2003. Collectively his Junior College teams have included ten All-Americans, 36 all-region selections, and 32 all-conference selections. Along with 54 Academic All-Americans, the team also received one Student-Athlete of the Year and six Female Athlete of the Year awards.

"Coach Dabney continues to lead our pitchers and catchers," said Coach Richmond. "He prepares all scouting reports and calls a very strategic game for our pitchers. Coach Dabney has taken over the conditioning program and I can already see progress in the overall fitness level of the team."

Dabney graduated from Wichita State University with a degree in Sports Business and Administration.





Samantha Buckner begins her first year on the Redhawks coaching staff. Buckner's duties will include assisting the team with hitting, monitoring the weight program and overseeing academic progress. Additional duties include assisting in recruiting and administrative work.

Buckner started all four years at the at first base at the University of Arkansas and served as a team captain during her senior season. She played in 222 games, making 210 starts at first base. She hit 14 home runs and had 63 RBI during her Razorback career.

Additionally, Buckner worked as an assistant coach for the Clearwater Bullets, the America Softball Association (ASA) summer team based in Clearwater, Fla. Her responsibilities included organization of team, infield and hitting practices while assuming the head coaching position as needed.

The Mesquite, Texas native also worked numerous summer and winter clinics at Arkansas, leading group instruction which covered infield, catching, baserunning and multiple hitting situations.

"She will assist with the defense, hitting and recruiting," Richmond said. "Game days she is the dugout coach focusing on the hitters. With any young coach we want to give Sam a wide range of experience to help her transition to be a head coach someday. Her time at Southeast will afford her this opportunity. "

Buckner received her bachelor's degree in Communication from Arkansas in 2008, where she was a member of the SEC and Arkansas Razorback Honor Roll. She is currently finishing her master's degree in Communications at Arkansas.

### SPORTS MEDICINE

Prevention. Treatment. Rehabilitation. Education. Those are the four primary phases of athletic training and the Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Training staff strives to fulfill all four areas when working with student-athletes on a daily basis.

Southeast Missouri State student-athletes are offered the best care possible by the Athletic Training staff that includes four full-time athletic trainers, five graduate assistants and several student assistants. The staff serves the student-athletes nearly around-the-clock and at numerous facilities on campus.


The Athletic Trainers begin treatments and rehabilitation as early as 6:30 a.m. and are available until the last student-athlete is

through. There are currently three athletic training facilities on campus. The staff offices are located at the Rosengarten Athletic Complex, where the primary athletic training room is located, with two satellite athletic training rooms, located at Houck Field House and the Show Me Center.

The IPF and Starnes Center training rooms are stocked with equipment such as stationary bikes, hand weights, therapeutic modalities, and updated physical therapy equipment. Each component is strategically designed to not only give the student-athletes the best care, but also to aid in returning them to competition as quickly and safely as possible.

Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Training has strong working relationships with local physicians and the two hospitals located in Cape Girardeau. It is from these hospitals that the Athletic Training department is assisted by four orthopaedic physicians.

Southeast Missouri State University Athletic Training prides and commits itself to providing comprehensive, personalized and efficient health care to its student-athletes. Delivery of healthcare focuses on the prevention and management of athletic-related injuries or illnesses while adhering to the National Athletic Trainers' Board of Certification's Standards of Professional Practice. Our high quality of athletic healthcare is provided in combination with the education of athletic training students.


"Esse Quam Videri" -"To be rather than to seem". We are very proud of the tradition of excellence we are building here at Southeast, and therefore demand a great deal of our athletes. Honesty, Integrity, Unrelenting Effort, Diligence, Consistency, and Attention to Detail are the pillars of our training program. Simply put, our goal is to outwork every opponent we compete against, and learn to rely on each other to achieve a common goal. "We may not be the fastest, strongest, or most talented, but we will certainly have the attitude that together, we can take on the world.

In the weight room, we take a simple, yet comprehensive approach to training. Programs are ground-based, founded

on the Olympic Lifts (Snatch, Clean, Jerk) and traditional strength training (Front/Back Squat, Dead Lift, Pressing & Pulling). The concept is simple. Find something heavy, move it in a way that mimics the actions of your sport, as fast as you can. Repeat.

In the training arena, we attempt to take the foundational strength and power we have developed, and refine it into sport-specific movements and skills. We start by emphasizing correct motor skill and muscle recruitment patterns in order to maximize athletic potential, and minimize the risk of injury. We work tirelessly on proper movement patterns so that agility & change of direction are razor sharp.

Once refined, our movements become exceedingly aggressive and intense. It means very little if we can "lift a house", but can't apply that force at game speed." Accordingly, we spend a great deal of time on both explosive movements and body control to develop first step guickness, acceleration and deceleration, bal-



ance and coordination. Finally, we condition our minds and bodies in a way that mimics game circumstances so that by game time, its fun-not work.

It is our hope that through the countless lessons learned in sport

and competition, we are helping to develop the leaders of tomorrow.

Since most student athletes will spend more time with me than any other person they come across in their college experience, I take my role as a mentor very seriously. Its not about the destination, but the journey that takes you there.



# REDHAWKS SUCCESS CENTER



The Redhawks Success Center offers Southeast Missouri State student-athletes a place to study and develop as students and campus leaders.

The Redhawks Success Center is located in Student Recreation Center South, just south of Houck Stadium. The facility offers a computer lab with 18 computer work terminals, study areas and rooms for group meetings.

Entering student-athletes are evaluated for academic preparedness and assigned to appropriate categories. Student-athletes can also recieve individualized academic programs which includes meeting with a mentor at least bi-weekly to discuss academic progress.

The area is under the guidance of Cindy Gannon, Associate Director of Athletics, with assistance from Director of Academic Services Sharon Burgard, assistant Sonya Bain and two graduate assistants - Lauren Scannell and Geoff Wester.

The beautiful new facility has enhanced the outstanding work in the classroom already enjoyed by Southeast student-athletes. In the fall semester the Southeast athletic programs combined for a 3.12 grade point average, its highest for a fall term. Eleven of the Redhawks 15 programs recorded a team GPA of 3.0 or better. In all, 207 student-athletes recorded at least a 3.0 GPA. Of that group, 50 finished the fall term with a perfect 4.0.


Tutors are available for all student-athletes as needed. In addition, both attendance and academic progress are monitored through regular checks with faculty.

A special course is required for all first time student-athletes at Southeast. The course, which offers three credit hours, is part of a comprehensive program developed to address The Success Center staff also works to get athletes involved in campus and community projects. This is done to provide a support structure and greater opportunity for academic success for student-athletes.

The Southeast softball team has reaped the benefits of the Redhawks Success Center and its excellent staff. Last season, the team recorded a cumulative GPA of 3.35 and had 11 players register GPAs of over 3.0 for the school year and the spring semester. Ten players were named to the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll and 11 more were named Southeast Scholar Athletes.







#### OFF THE FIELD, IN THE COMMUNITY

Southeast Softball believes that giving back to the community is not only an obligation but a privilege. With that in mind, the team has taken the lead in community service among Southeast student-athletes by holding youth clinics, attending middle schools to discuss the importance of education and volunteering for numerous community service projects.















## 2010 REDHAWKS OUTLOOK

The Redhawks head into the season with great confidence and expectations after a strong 2009 campaign that saw them fall just short of the programs sixth OVC Tournament Championship and NCAA berth. Thanks to a 17-game winning streak, the Redhawks jumped from the cellar of the OVC to finishing second with a league record of 16-8.

Head Coach Lana Richmond was able to do this with a unique mixture of youth and returnees. This year's team returns all but one starter including four Second Team All-OVC selections. That fact alone led to the Redhawks being selected to finish third in the OVC Preseason Poll by the league's coaches. It is the highest selection for the team since the 2002 season.

The Redhawks add four talented newcomers to the 11 returning letterwinners. Coach Richmond believes that the make-up of this team has the ability to improve on last year's finish and bring the OVC title back to Cape Girardeau.

#### **CATCHERS**

Senior Alex Ramirez returns as the club's starting catcher. Ramirez has started 138 of the 141 games she has appeared in behind the plate including 102-straight. Last season, she garnered Second Team All-OVC honors after a stellar 2009 season.

Already considered one of the best defensive catchers in the OVC, Ramirez turned it on offensively and led the team in seven offensive categories including hits (46), RBI (27), home runs (6), walks (29) and slugging percentage (.486). Her .333 batting average set a new career-high, ranking second on the team and ninth in the OVC. Her 29 walks tied a school record and ranked third in the OVC.

Defensively she was stellar behind the plate as she committed just five errors in 309 chances for a .984 fielding percentage.

Freshman HaLeigh Willis will back-up Ramirez behind the plate. Willis was known for her versatility as a prep, where she was named All-Conference in three different positions.

#### **PITCHERS**

A major question mark heading into last season, the pitching staff became the linchpin in the Redhawks resurgence the second half of the season. Giana Zimmerman led the way in the circle as a freshman. The Second Team All-OVC and OVC All Newcomer Team selection led the Redhawks in every major pitching category. She finished in the top-ten in the OVC in seven categories including third in wins (19), strikeouts (184) and starts (27). Her 2.42 ERA ranked eighth in the OVC.

Those 184 strikeouts ranked second on the Southeast's single season charts. The 19 wins rank fifth all-time. She also recorded four games with double-digit strikeouts including a school record 13 on two occassions.

In OVC play she went 11-5 and struck out a league best 116 in just 103 innings.

Junior Whitney Dupuis steps in as the team's No. 2 pitcher. She made 20 appearances last season including 13 starts going 7-8 with 48 strikeouts in 80.1 innings. In OVC play she went 4-1 in eight appearances including four starts, two of which she completed.

Stefanie Barnes split duties as the No. 2 pitcher early in the season before an injury. She finished the season with 16 appearances including 10 starts, six of which she finished. She finished with a 3-4 record and tied for the team lead with two shutouts.

Dupuis and Barnes have the ability to help the Redhawks with their bats as well. Dupuis served as the team's designated player in 15 games. She finished with a .244 batting average and was one of just three players on the team that collected a double, a triple and a homerun for the year.

#### **INFIELDERS**

The Redhawks return three of their starters in the infield. Two of those returnees will see their playing time in a different positions than in 2009.

Junior Nicole Troncoso made quite the impact in her first season as a Redhawk, garnering Second Team All OVC and OVC

The outfield returns all three starters from last season. Second Team All-OVC selection Jennifer Vasquez leads the way. The senior returns as the team's starting leftfielder after a stellar 2009. Most of her damage was done in OVC play as she led the team with a .356 batting average in league play. Eighteen of her team-high 27 RBIs came in league action.

### THE SCHEDULE

Coach Richmond and her staff have compiled a challenging schedule for the upcoming season. On this year's schedule are four tournaments that will prepare the Redhawks for the tough OVC season.

For the third-straight season, the Redhawks start the year with a match-up against Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) school Jackson State for a single game in Jackson, Mississippi on February 11. Last season the Redhawks no-hit the Tigers and won 11-0.

Just like last season, the Redhawks will again continue their trip south to the Pelican State to participate in the ULM Mardi Gras Classic in Monroe, Louisiana from February 12-14. Last season, the Redhawks finished third in the tournament with a 2-2 record.

The Redhawks continue their tournament tour as they travel to Memphis, Tennessee to play in the fifth annual Blues City Classic for the third-straight season. Last season the tournament was cancelled due to inclement weather. This year's field includes host school Memphis, Indiana State, McNeese State, Appalachian State and Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne.

The Redhawks then return to their home state and travel to Columbia to participate in the annual All-Missouri Coaches Against Breast Cancer Tournament. This year's host, Mizzou, made it to the final eight of the NCAA Softball World Series and is ranked ninth in the ESPN.com/USA Softball pre-season poll. Saint Louis, Missouri-Kansas City and Missouri State round out the tournament field. Last season the Redhawks finished second in the tournament falling to Missouri in the championship game.

On March 10 the Redhawks will finally play their first home game of the season as they take on Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne for a doubleheader at the Southeast Softball Complex.

The Arkansas Invitational will be the final tournament of the season for Southeast. The Redhawks will face NCAA Regional participant Arkansas as well as SIU Edwardsville and Louisiana Tech.

During Spring Break, the Redhawks will host IUPUI for two games before traveling to Terre Haute to face Indiana State in a doubleheader.

The Redhawks open the OVC season that weekend at home against Morehead State on March 20-21. A trip to Eastern Kentucky (March 27-28) falls between a home doubleheader against Eastern Illinois on March 31.

The team kicks-off April at Austin Peay (April 2-3) before returning home to host non-conference rival SIU Carbondale on April 7 and Tennessee State (April 9-10).

The Redhawks play their next six games on the road including the first ever match-up against Murray State on April 17-18, who will be competing in their first season of softball.

The team then returns home for a tough stretch of home games as they host OVC pre-season favorites Jacksonville State and UT Martin in consecutive weekends. The Gamecocks won the regular season title last year and garnered an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Super Regionals. The Skyhawks defeated the Redhawks in the OVC Tournament title game, winning the league's automatic berth to the NCAA field.

The Redhawks conclude the regular season with a non-conference double-header at Saint Louis on May 5 before heading to Tennessee Tech for their final series before the start of the OVC Tournament on May 13 at the field of the league's regular season champion.

## 2009 REDHAWKS REVIEW



Alex Ramirez was named Second Team All-OVC The Redhawks 2009 softball season could be summed up with one word. Exciting! From start to finish, the team showcased their heart and belief in each other, coming within two outs of representing the Ohio Valley Conference at the NCAA Softball Tournament.

The team showed glimpses early of things to come as they started the year winning four of their first five games. The 4-1 record was the program's best start since the 1996 season. During that five game span the Redhawks recorded their fi-st no-hitter since 2004 as Whitney Dupuis and freshman Giana Zimmerman combined for the gem in the team's season opener at Jackson State. The team also placed third at the ULM Mardi Gras Classic in the first tournament of the year.

After playing 18th-ranked SIU Carbondale close in two losses at the Salukis' homefield, the Redhawks took down their first three opponents in the annual All-Missouri Breast Cancer Tournament held in Springfield, Missouri. The team defeated in-state rivals Missouri.

souri State, UMKC and Saint Louis by a combined score of 15-4 before succumbing to 12th-ranked Missouri in the championship game.

The Redhawks remained on the road and traveled to North Carolina for a stretch of games that would have had them play 11 games in eight days. That didn't happen as the UNC-Charlotte Tournament was cancelled due to inclement weather, the second tournament cancelled due to weather for the Redhawks after the Memphis Blues City Classic was called due to the forces of nature.

The team did manage to play four games against teams from the "Tarheel State" sweeping a doubleheader at North Carolina A&T before dropping two at Elon.

On the return trip back to Cape Girardeau the team stopped in Morehead, Kentucky for their OVC opener against the Eagles. The Redhawks took the opening two games before falling 2-1 in extra innings in the series finale. That gave the Redhawks an 11-8 record heading into the month of April.

The Redhawks played their first home series of the year against Tennessee Tech winning their home opener in comeback fashion before dropping the final two. Those two loses would be the beginning of an 11-game losing streak.

After dropping the first two games of their series against UT Martin the team regrouped and won the series finale, 4-3 thanks to a Elise Sperakos sixth-inning home run.

That win would spark a remarkable streak of 15-straight victories to close out the regular season. That streak included 13-straight wins against OVC opponents that propelled the Redhawks from eighth in the OVC standings to a second place finish with a 16-8 record. The 16 OVC wins were the most conference wins since the 2001 season. The second place finish also

was the highest finish since the 2001 season when that team was the OVC runner-up.  $\,$ 

Seven of those 15 wins were in one-run games including three in walk-off fashion

League coaches recognized the accomplishments of the team that was picked to finish seventh in the OVC pre-season poll prior to the start of the OVC Tournament as the squad received seven OVC awards. Head Coach Lana Richmond was named Co-OVC Coach of the Year, the fifth time she had been awarded the honor.

Juniors Alex Ramirez, Jennifer Vasquez, sophomore Nicole Troncoso and freshman Giana Zimmerman gave the Redhawks their most All-OVC selections since the 2001 season. All four were named to the All-OVC Second Team. Zimmerman and Troncoso were also named to the OVC's All-Newcomer Team.

After failing to make the OVC Tournament the past two seasons, the Redhawks secured the No. 2 seed and took on the No. 3 seed Eagles in the quarterfinals. In a match-up between the top two pitchers in the OVC it was the Redhawks who had the edge. Sophomore Carmen Fowler hit a two-out, RBI single in the bottom of the seventh for the dramatic walk-off 1-0 win.

That set up a semi-final match-up with No. 5 seed Tennessee Tech who started the Redhawks early season slide. The Redhawks got their revenge in a big way thanks to Jennifer Vasquez's three-run home run that sparked a 7-1 win and sent the team into the OVC Championship game for the first time since 1999

That victory gave the Redhawks 17-straight wins, the second longest winning streak in school history trailing the 1996 team which won 32-straight to start the season.

Needing just one win to secure the NCAA berth and OVC title the Redhawks appeared to be heading in that direction against UT Martin. With the team's deadlocked at 1-1 in the sixth inning, Vasquez delivered a solo home run to give the Redhawks a 2-1 lead heading into the final inning.

The Skyhawks answered with a solo shot of their own to knot the game at 2-2, sending the game into extra innings. With momentum on their side the Skyhawks won in eight innings on a Redhawks two-out error forcing a winner-take-all elimination game.

The Skyhawks jumped out to an early 2-1 lead and kept the Redhawks from capturing any of their signature late-inning magic and held on for the 4-1 win

Vasquez, Fowler and Zimmerman were named to the OVC All-Tournament Team.

The Redhawks finished with a record of 29-21, the most wins for the program since the 2000 season.

The milestone season by the team led to a number of Redhawk players moving into the program's record books. Senior Lauren Bradley finished with 16 career home runs, ranking fourth on the school's all-time charts. Ramirez cracked the top five in two career categories. Her 60 career walks rank fourth all-time and she ranks fifth all-time by reaching base 12 times in her career via hit by pitch. Her 29 walks during the season tied Karen Hudson for first on the school's single season charts. Vasquez recorded two triples in one game which tied the single-game record.

In the circle, Zimmerman made her mark as a freshman. Her 19 wins are tied for fifth on the single season charts while her 184 strikeouts rank second. She also set the single game record for strikeouts in a game with 13, a feat she accomplished twice in 2009.

Those personal achievements capped a memorable year and sets the bar high for future Redhawks teams. Coach Richmond has the program on the right track and feels that those goals cannot only be reached but surpassed in the coming years.

On December 11, 2009 the Southeast Missouri State Athletics Hall of Fame welcomed five individuals and one team into its prestigious company. Among those honored that day was Southeast graduate and former softball player Linda Wells. Wells became the third softball player inducted into the Hall of Fame joining Lisa Forster and Jayne Creek, who was a part of the Hall of Fame's inaugural class in 2002.



#### JAYNE CREEK (1978-1981) CLASS OF 2002

Creek was and All-American softball player who was the first Southeast athlete to be named a College of Sports Information Directors Association (CoSIDA) Academic All-American for her efforts in the classroom as well as on the field. She lettered in softball every year from 1978-81 and lettered one season in volleyball. Creek ranks among the school leaders in many career categories and holds the single season record for triples in a season with 10 set during the 1981 season. She helped lead her team to a 21 win season in 1980 and 22 wins in 1981.





#### LISA FOSTER (1987-1989) CLASS OF 2007

Foster was one of the greatest two-sport athletes in Southeast history. She lettered for both the softball and women's basketball teams from 1988-89. In 1989 she garnered All-American honors as she batted .362 and help lead the team to a 37-21 record. She was selected All-MIAA in 1988 and 1989. She ranks fifth on the school's all-time list with a career .344 batting average. As a member of the women's basketball team she was selected First Team All-MIAA in 1989 and garnered Second Team All-MIAA acolades in 1988 as she helped those teams to consecutive NCAA Division II Tournament appearances.





#### LINDA WELLS (LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT) CLASS OF 2009

Wells, a 1972 graduate of Southeast, ranks as one of the most prominent and successful softball coaches in NCAA history. She played five sports at Southeast including volleyball, basketball, tennis and field hockey and went on to a very successful career as a collegiate softball coach at Minnesota and Arizona State. A member of five Halls of Fame including the Minnesota Hall of Fame and the National Softball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, Wells coached the Greek Olympic softball team in 2004 and the Dutch Olympic team in 2008.

## THE SOUTHEAST SOFTBALL COMPLEX



The Southeast Missouri State softball team will begin its 12th season at the Southeast Softball Complex in 2010.

The complex contains three regulation softball fields, all of which are lighted. The facility also contains batting cages, an air-conditioned press box large enough to accommodate print and broadcast media and bleacher seating for over 600 people. Over the right field fence is a hill where on a nice sunny day fans can watch the game to get a unique view of the action.

Despite giving the Redhawks a homefield advantage, visiting teams often compliment the complex on its ability to accommodate them with its ample space for pre-game warm-ups, batting cages, off-the-field bullpen, closeness to hotels and restaurants.

Prior to playing at the complex, the Redhawks played its home games at Parker Field in the heart of the Southeast Missouri Campus.

The project was among many at Southeast Missouri in an effort to improve its sports facilities. Other projects included new tennis courts located across the road from the softball complex, a Field Turf artificial playing surface in Houck Stadium for the football and soccer teams, the resurfacing of the Abe Stuber track, a new locker room for the volleyball and baseball teams, new locker rooms for both the men's and women's basketball teams at the Show Me Center, a new locker room for the gymnastics team in Parker Hall and the most recent renovation included new locker rooms for both the soccer and softball teams in Houck Field House.

"With our ability for hosting tournaments and the amenities it offers for both games and practices, we believe we have one of the best facilities in the OVC," said Head Coach Lana Richmond.




