Redhawks Begin Playoff Action

- Southeast Missouri hosts #12 Illinois State in the first round of the NCAA Division I Football Championship Saturday. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m., CT at Houck Field
- SEMO is in the FCS Playoffs for the fifth time in program history. The Redhawks last made the 24-team bracket two years ago during the 2022 campaign.

FCS Playoff Appearances

- The 2024 season marks Southeast Missouri's fifth Football Championship Subdivision Playoff appearance.
- SEMO claimed its fourth playoff berth since 2018.
- For Head Coach Tom Matukewicz, this is the fourth time he has guided the Redhawks to the



NCAA Division I Football Championship.

- SEMO also made the playoffs in 2018, 2019 and 2022 with Matukewicz at the helm.
- Matukewicz has the most playoff appearances of any head coach in program history.
- SEMO's other playoff berth was in 2010 under then-Head Coach Tony Samuel.

FCS Playoff Record

- Southeast Missouri is 1-4 all-time in the FCS Playoffs.
- SEMO's only playoff win was a 28-14 victory over #15 Stony Brook on Nov. 24, 2018. That game was played at Houck Field in Cape Girardeau.
- The Redhawks won their first FCS Playoff game when they beat Stony Brook.
- SEMO also faced #1 Eastern Washington (L, 7-37, Dec. 4, 2010 in Cheney, Wash.), #3 Weber State (L, 23-48, Dec. 1, 2018 in Ogden, Utah), #13 Illinois State (L, 6-24, Nov. 30, 2019 in Cape Girardeau, Mo.) and #17 Montana (L, 24-34, Nov. 25, 2022 in Missoula, Mont.) in FCS Playoff action.
- This is the second time Illinois State comes to Cape Girardeau for a playoff game.

Co-Big South-OVC Champions

- The Redhawks finished the regular-season in a four-way share with Tennessee State, UT Martin and Tennessee Tech for the Big South-Ohio Valley Conference Association title.

- All four teams ended with a 6-2 Big South-OVC record.
- SEMO clinched the automatic berth by virtue of its 2-1 composite record which included wins over both UT Martin and Tennessee Tech.
- The Redhawks, Tennessee State and UT Martin are in this year's FCS Playoffs giving the league three teams in the playoffs for the first time since 2013.
- Tennessee State, Jacksonville State and Eastern Illinois all won playoff games during the 2013 playoffs.

Undefeated at Home

- Southeast Missouri went undefeated at home during the regular-season for the third time under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz.
- SEMO posted a 5-0 record at Houck Field this season after beating UT Martin, 45-42, in double overtime (Sept. 7), Northwestern State (Sept. 28), 19-0, Tennessee Tech (Oct. 12), 34-3, Gardner-Webb (Oct. 26), 30-24, and Western Illinois (Nov. 16), 54-45.
- The Redhawks also went unbeaten at home during the 2018 (5-0) and 2019 (6-0) regular-seasons.

Nine Wins

- The Redhawks picked up their ninth win when they defeated Western Illinois, 54-45, on Nov. 16.
- Southeast Missouri won nine games in a season for the fourth time under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz.
- The Redhawks' nine-win seasons with Matukewicz at the helm include 2018 (9-4), 2019 (9-4), 2022 (9-3) and 2024 (9-3). SEMO made the FCS Playoffs in 2018, 2019, 2022 and 2024.

One Win for the Record

- A win Saturday will break Southeast Missouri's program record in victories.
- SEMO has never had 10 wins in a season during its entire football history.
- Including 2024 (9-3) the Redhawks posted nine wins in a season a total of seven times

also going 9-0 in 1937, 9-0 in 1955, 9-3 in 2022, 9-3 in 2010, 9-4 in 2018 and 9-4 in 2019.

Big South-OVC Championships

- This year's Big South-OVC title is Southeast Missouri's fourth all-time in program history and third under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz.
- SEMO shared the Big South-OVC title in 2019, 2022 and 2024 with Matukewicz at the helm. The Redhawks came one win away from giving Matukewicz his first outright conference title this year.
- The Redhawks other championship came during the 2010 campaign, four years before Matukewicz took over as head coach.

Big South-OVC Playoff Matchups

- Of the three Big South-OVC teams in this year's FCS Playoffs, Southeast Missouri is the only one that has a home game.
- UT Martin will travel to #16 New Hampshire and Tennessee State will head to #14 Montana for the league's other first round playoff matchups.
- The Skyhawks and Tigers made the field among the 14 at-large selections.

Single-Season Records Fall

- Paxton DeLaurent has broken four Southeast Missouri single-season records in 2024.
- He needs one more passing touchdown to break his fifth single-season mark. DeLaurent has 29 touchdown passes through 12 games and is tied with Jack Tomco (2002) at the top of that list.
- DeLaurent also set new single-season marks in passing yards (3,520), completions (320), pass attempts (533) and total offense yardage (3,616) during the 2024 campaign.
- DC Pippin established a new SEMO single-season record in field goals made (26).



SOUTHEAST MISSOURI FOOTBALL NOTES

Series History

- Southeast Missouri and Missouri Valley Football Conference member Illinois State will square off for the 10th time in 2024.
- ISU holds a 6-3 advantage in the overall series.
- Two of SEMO's three wins against the Redbirds came in Cape Girardeau. The Redhawks beat ISU, 26-20, on Nov. 22, 1969 and, 28-25, on Sept. 16, 2000 in those contests.
- ISU won the only playoff game played between the two teams at Houck Field on Nov. 30, 2019 (24-6). SEMO had a 13-game home winning streak ended by the Redbirds that year.

Against the Missouri Valley Football Conference

- Illinois State is the second Missouri Valley Football Conference team Southeast Missouri faces in 2024.
- SEMO knocked off then-#7 Southern Illinois, 38-21, on Sept. 21 in Carbondale, Illinois.
- Saturday marks the 190th time SEMO plays a MVFC opponent.
- The Redhawks are 81-100-8 all-time against MVFC schools.
- SEMO is 3-8 vs. Illinois State, 4-5 vs. Indiana State, 28-46 vs. Missouri State, 1-1 vs. Northern Iowa, 44-40-8 vs. SIU and 1-0 vs. Western Illinois (now in the Big South-OVC).
- The Redhawks will travel to nine-time Football Championship Subdivision National Champion and MVFC member North Dakota State in 2025.

Redhawks Come Up Short at #25 Tennessee State

- The Redhawks came up on the short end of a 28-21 loss at #25 Tennessee State in their regular-season finale on Nov. 23.
- TSU scored 21 first quarter points and never turned back.

- SEMO made it a one-score game at halftime, but couldn't get by the Tigers.
- Paxton DeLaurent threw for 233 yards and two touchdowns, and Payton Brown scored twice for the Redhawks.
- SEMO ended the regular-season with losses in two (both on the road) of their last three games.

Senior Day Shootout

- Southeast Missouri honored its 13 seniors with a 54-45 shootout victory over Western Illinois (Nov. 16).
- Combined, there were 99 points, 1,152 total yards, 12 touchdowns and six field goals.
- SEMO's 54 points, 559 total yards, 192 rushing yards and six total touchdowns marked new season-highs.

Great Recovery

- Brandon Epton, Jr., who began the 2024 season as Southeast Missouri's starting running back, returned from an injury he sustained in a car accident during week three of the season.
- Epton, Jr. was back on the field for the first time after missing seven games against Western Illinois (Nov. 16).
- Epton, Jr. ran for 126 yards and scored two touchdowns (one receiving, one rushing) in the first 100-yard game of his career.
- He averaged 5.7 yards per carry and led SEMO to a season-high 192 rushing yards against the Leathernecks.

Pippin Wins First Stats Perform FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week Award

- DC Pippin was named Stats Perform FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week for the first time in his career on Nov. 18.
- It was the first national weekly award for any Redhawk in 2024.
- Pippin scored 18 points and did not miss a kick against Western Illinois (Nov. 16) going

Redhawks Third in 2024 Big South-OVC Preseason Poll

- Southeast Missouri was picked third in the 2024 Big South-OVC Association Preseason Poll released on July 17.
- SEMO accumulated 51 points and two first-place votes in the balloting by the Association's head coaches.
- UT Martin was tabbed this year's preseason favorite and Eastern Illinois was voted second.

4-of-4 in field goals and 6-of-6 in PATs.

- He is the first Southeast Missouri player to win a Stats Perform FCS National Player of the Week honor since Geno Hess (Offensive Player of the Week) did it on Nov. 20, 2022.

Homecoming Dub

- Southeast Missouri overcame an early 14-point deficit to take down Gardner-Webb, 30-24, on its Homecoming Oct. 26.
- SEMO played its 33rd Homecoming game since it moved to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision level in 1991.
- The Redhawks are now 18-15 all-time in those Homecoming matchups.
- SEMO improved to 7-3 in Homecoming games under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz. The Redhawks did not play a Homecoming game in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Four Yards to 8,000

- Paxton DeLaurent needs just four yards to reach 8,000 passing yards in his career.
- DeLaurent will be the first quarterback in Southeast Missouri history to throw for 8,000 career yards.
- He will also become the first player in the Ohio Valley Conference to throw for over 8,000 or more yards since Murray State's KD Humphries (10,458 yards, 2012-16).

Record Smasher

- Paxton DeLaurent broke his fifth Southeast Missouri career record this season.
- DeLaurent had 313 total yards against Gardner-Webb (Oct. 26) to break his program's career record in total offense. His 8,451 yards surpassed Matt Scheible's previous mark of 7,436 from 2008-11.
- DeLaurent also became the school's all-time career leader in passing yardage, passing touchdowns, pass attempts and completions this year.
- He has thrown for 7,996 yards and 59 touchdowns, and completed 689 passes in his career.
- DeLaurent moved by Jason Liley (6,179, 1989-92) for the passing yardage record, Daniel Santacaterina (46, 2018-19) for the passing touchdowns mark and Liley (530) for the pass completions record.

- He is the second quarterback in program history to throw for over 7,000 yards.
- DeLaurent has thrown a touchdown pass in 11 of his 12 starts this season.
- He threw multiple touchdown passes in seven games.

DeLaurent Clears 3,000 Passing Yards

- Paxton DeLaurent went over 3,000 passing yards this season when he threw for 375 against Western Illinois (Nov. 16).
- He leads the Big South-OVC and ranks fifth in the FCS with 3,520 passing yards.
- DeLaurent went over 3,000 yards in a season for the first time in his career and his 3,520 yards are a SEMO single-season record.
- He has thrown for over 300 yards in five of his last seven starts.

Ruble Rumbles

- Fourth string running back Cole Ruble ran for a career-high 122 yards and a touchdown, and caught two passes for 66 yards out of the backfield against Gardner-Webb (Oct. 26).
- Ruble carried the ball 16 times and averaged 7.6 yards per rush.
- He ripped off a 65-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 14-14 with 12:31 remaining in the second quarter.
- Ruble's 65-yard run is the longest by any Redhawk this season.
- Ruble is SEMO's third-leading rusher with 219 yards and two touchdowns on 46 attempts.
- As a team, SEMO hadn't rushed for more than 80 yards in three-straight games before Ruble's burst.

Riddick Second in Big South-OVC in Punt Returns

- Khalani Riddick is second in the Big South-OVC and ranks 13th in the FCS in punt returns.
- Riddick returned 19 punts for 204 yards averaging 10.7 yards per return through 11 games.
- His 204 punt return yards rate 10th among Southeast Missouri's all-time single-season leaders in that category.

Brown and Smith Return

- Running backs Payton Brown and Darrell Smith returned at Lindenwood (Nov. 9).
- Brown missed four games with an ankle injury and Smith was out two games with a hamstring injury.
- Brown carried the ball three times for six yards and Smith ran the ball nine times for 37 yards against the Lions.

Career Game for Norman

- Bryce Norman finished with a career-high 19 tackles at Lindenwood (Nov. 9).
- Norman had nine solo stops, assisted on 10 others and added two sacks and three tackles for loss.
- He went over 100 tackles in a season for the second time in his career.
- The 19 tackles are the most in a game by a Big South-OVC player this season and fifth-most by a FCS player.
- Norman's 10.5 tackles per game are first in the Big South-OVC and sixth nationally through 12 contests.

Flight Trip Win

- For the first time, Southeast Missouri won a game on a flight trip during its NCAA Division I era when it beat Charleston Southern, 26-13, on Oct. 19.
- SEMO flew for the second time this season when it made the trek to Charleston, South Carolina.
- The Redhawks previously were 0-7 in games they flew to since joining the NCAA Division I FCS ranks in 1991.
- SEMO has flown to seven games under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz making trips to Weber State (Loss, 2018), Montana State (Loss, 2019), Sam Houston State (Loss, 2021), Montana (Loss, 2022), Bryant (Loss, 2023), New Mexico State (Loss, 2024) and Charleston Southern (Win, 2024).

126 Tackles and Counting

- Bryce Norman leads Southeast Missouri with 126 tackles through 12 starts this season.
- Norman is over 100 tackles for the second season in his career. He also recorded a career-best 119 tackles in 2022.
- Norman led SEMO in tackles every year he has been in a Redhawk uniform.

What a Turnaround

- After finishing the 2023 season last in the Big South-OVC Association in sacks, Southeast Missouri is third in the conference in that category this year.
- SEMO has 33 sacks and is averaging 2.4 per contest.
- The Redhawks have more than doubled their sack total of 14 during the 2023 campaign.
- Nationally, the Redhawks are 33rd in the FCS in sacks.
- Ten different SEMO players have recorded a sack this season. Bryce Norman leads the way with 5.5 sacks for a loss of 53 yards.

Offensive Line Getting it Done

- Southeast Missouri's offensive line has had to battle through an abundance of injuries this season.
- Currently, SEMO is without three starters and has had seven offensive linemen affected by injury through 12 games.
- The Redhawks have powered through the adversity leading the Big South-OVC in sacks allowed. SEMO's offensive line allowed just 16 sacks for an average of 1.3 per game.
- SEMO also ranks 25th nationally in that category.
- This is a big improvement for SEMO's O-line which gave up 34 sacks in 2023.

Redhawks Now #16 in Both FCS Polls

- Southeast Missouri is #16 in the American Football Coaches Association and Stats Perform Media polls this week (Nov. 25).
- SEMO reached its highest ranking in program history at #6 this season and was in that spot in both polls for three-straight weeks.
- The Redhawks were also a Top-10 team for five weeks this year. It was the first time SEMO cracked the Top-10 in 14 years.
- It is the 11th-straight week where the Redhawks are ranked in both Top-25 polls.
- The Redhawks initially landed in the Top-25 in both polls on Sept. 16.
- The Redhawks have been ranked a total of 43 weeks in either the AFCA or Stats Perform Top-25 polls under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz.

- Each finalist will be profiled on TheAnalyst.com in November before the recipient will be announced on Dec. 10, then honored at the Stats Perform FCS National Awards Banquet on Jan. 4 in Frisco, Texas.

- Southeast Missouri recorded its first shutout of the season with a 19-0 win over Southland Conference member Northwestern State (Sept. 28).
- It was SEMO's first shutout at home over an NCAA Division I opponent in 30 years. The last was a 10-0 win over UT Martin on Sept. 24, 1994.
- The shutout marked the Redhawks second at Houck Field under Tom Matukewicz. His other was a 77-0 thrashing of Missouri Baptist in his first career game as a head coach on Aug. 28, 2014.
- It was SEMO's fifth during the Redhawks NCAA Division I era.

- Sophomore Cole Ruble scored his first career touchdown against Eastern Illinois (Oct. 5).
- Ruble scored on a 2-yard run to give SEMO a 24-0 lead with 9:35 left to play in the second quarter.
- Five players have scored a rushing touchdown this season, including Ruble (2), Payton Brown (4), Carter Hensley (1), Paxton DeLaurent (1) and Tristan Smith (1).

Pippin Propels Redhawks

- DC Pippin matched his career-high of four field goals once again when he went 4-of-4 vs. Western Illinois (Nov. 16).
- Pippin made four field goals in a game twice this year.
- His 18 points against the Leathernecks marked a new career-high.
- Pippin is SEMO's leading scorer this season with 114 points (26-of-34 field goals and 36-of-37 extra points).
- He leads the Big South-OVC and ranks fourth in the FCS in scoring with 9.5 points per game. Pippin is first in the FCS in field goals per game (2.4).
- Pippin made a field goal in 11 of 12 games and has scored double-digit points six times in 2024.
- He is second all-time on SEMO's career point after touchdown list. Pippin (123-of-125) is behind Derek Kutz (136-of-143, 2001-04) on that list.
- He is the third kicker in program history to make 100 PATs in his career joining Kutz and Ryan McCrum (100-of-104, 2013-16).
- Pippin was named Big South-OVC Specialist of the Week on Sept. 30, Oct. 7, Oct. 28 and Nov. 18, and Stats Perform National Special Teams Player of the Week on Nov. 18.

Non-Conference Wrap

- With its 19-0 win over Northwestern State (Sept. 28), Southeast Missouri finished with a 3-1 record in non-conference games.
- The 3-1 mark is the Redhawks best non-conference record under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz.
- It is the third time SEMO posted a winning non-conference record with Matukewicz at the helm.
- The Redhawks also compiled winning records

- The Redhawks picked up their non-conference wins against North Alabama (37-15, Aug. 24) in the FCS Kickoff, at then-#7 Southern Illinois (38-21, Sept. 21) and vs. Northwestern State (19-0, Sept. 28).

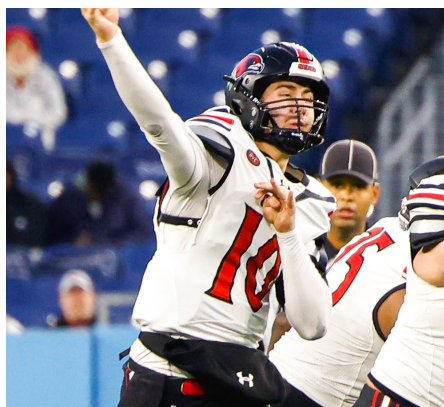
Defense Brings It

Record Performance

- Quarterback Paxton DeLaurent threw for a career-high 376 yards and Southeast Missouri record six touchdowns against UT Martin (Sept. 7).
- DeLaurent completed passes to seven different receivers.
- He completed 34-of-63 passes at a 53.9 percent clip. DeLaurent also established new career-highs in completions and attempts. DeLaurent's 63 passing attempts were also a school record.
- DeLaurent threw touchdown passes of 17, 18, 20, 5, 10 and 11 yards in the Redhawks come-from-behind double overtime thriller against the Skyhawks.
- He started under center against UT Martin for the first time in his career. He was injured when SEMO played UTM in 2023 and the schools did not face each other in 2022.

What a Game!

- The Big South-Ohio Valley Conference Association opener between Southeast Missouri and UT Martin was a monumental matchup at Houck Field on Sept. 7.
- In a game with a playoff like feel, SEMO overcame a two-touchdown deficit to take down the preseason Big South-OVC favorite Skyhawks, 45-42, in double overtime.
- UTM was ahead, 35-21, with 12:35 remaining in the fourth quarter when the Redhawks mounted their ferocious comeback.
- The game featured 87 combined points, 12 touchdowns, two overtimes, five lead changes, five ties, three 100-yard receivers, one 100-yard rusher, two 250-plus yard passers and one single-game record.

Big South-OVC Weekly Honors

- In five of the last eight weeks, Southeast Missouri earned multiple Big South-OVC Association weekly honors.
- Paxton DeLaurent won Offensive Player of the Week and DC Pippin earned Specialist of the Week honors on Nov. 18.
- DeLaurent was named Offensive Player of the Week and Bryce Norman was tabbed Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 14.
- DeLaurent was named Offensive Player of the

season with Matukewicz at the helm was 6-1 in 2022.

- The Redhawks surpassed their total number of wins from 2023 (4-7) by a +5 margin.
- SEMO last began a season at 8-1 in 2010. That year, the Redhawks won nine of their first 10 contests en route to the program's first-ever Ohio Valley Conference title and NCAA FCS Playoff appearance.
- The Redhawks have nine wins over FCS opponents this season.

Winning Season

- With its seventh win at Charleston Southern (26-13) on Oct. 19, Southeast Missouri clinched its fourth winning season with Tom Matukewicz as its head coach.
- SEMO also posted winning records under Matukewicz in 2018 (9-4), 2019 (9-4) and 2022 (9-3).
- This is the seventh time during the school's NCAA Division I FCS era where the Redhawks accumulated seven or more wins in a season.
- The 2024 campaign marks SEMO's seventh winning season in the program's NCAA Division I FCS tenure.

Redhawks Take Down #7 Southern Illinois

- #21 Southeast Missouri upended #7 Southern Illinois by a score of 31-18 in the annual War for the Wheel matchup on Sept. 21 in Carbondale, Illinois.
- It was the 92nd meeting between the teams separated just 48 miles apart.
- SEMO won the wheel trophy for the fourth time since the rivalry was deemed War for the Wheel in 2018.
- The Redhawks scored 14 fourth-quarter points to put the exclamation point on their third win of the season.
- SEMO beat SIU for the third time in its last four trips to Saluki Stadium.

Ninth Brickyard Win

- Southeast Missouri defeated a ranked FCS opponent for a program record ninth time under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz when the Redhawks beat #7 Southern Illinois (Sept. 21).
- SEMO improved to 11-33 all-time against ranked FCS foes since 2004.
- SIU, then #17 at the time, was the last ranked opponent the Redhawks beat prior to this season on Sept. 10, 2022 (34-31).
- For Matukewicz the victory was his fourth over a Top-10 ranked opponent as SEMO's head coach.

- Every time SEMO upsets a FBS or ranked FCS opponent, it displays the winning scores of those games permanently in the "Brickyard."
- The Brickyard resides in the Redhawks locker room located in the Rosengarten Athletic Complex.

Anderson Excels

- Dorian Anderson went over 100 receiving five times this season.
- Anderson recently notched 116 yards on five receptions against Western Illinois (Nov. 16).
- He also finished with 115 yards at New Mexico State (Aug. 31), a career-high 127 yards vs. UT Martin (Sept. 7), 111 yards at Southern Illinois (Sept. 21) and 109 yards at Eastern Illinois (Oct. 5).
- He is Southeast Missouri's top receiver with 63 receptions for 930 yards and 10 touchdowns through 12 starts.
- Anderson is first in the Big South-OVC in receiving touchdowns (10) and receptions per game (6.6), third in receiving yards (930) and fourth receiving yards per game (79.5).
- He is ninth in the FCS in receiving touchdowns, 23rd in receiving yards, 25th in receiving yards per game and seventh in receptions per game.
- Anderson caught a touchdown pass in eight of his last 11 games.
- He needs 70 yards to get 1,000 receiving yards this season. If that happens, Anderson will become the first Redhawk to get 1,000 receiving yards in a season since Kristian Wilkerson (1,350 in 2019).

Pedro Leads Big South-OVC in Receptions

- In his first year at Southeast Missouri, Cam Pedro leads the Big South-OVC with 73 receptions.
- Pedro has 748 receiving yards and four touchdowns through 12 games this season.

Offense Produces

- Southeast Missouri leads the Big South-OVC in total offensive plays (876), pass attempts (550), pass completions (330), passing touchdowns (29) and points scored kicking (349).
- Nationally, SEMO is seventh in the FCS in passing offense, 28th in scoring offense, 36th in total offense, ninth in red zone offense and second in fourth-down conversion percentage (81.3 pct.).
- Ten different Redhawks have scored a touchdown through 12 games this season, including Brandon Epton, Jr. (2), Payton Brown (6), Carter Hensley

- Pippin was also named the league's Specialist of the Week on Sept. 30.
- DeLaurent was tabbed Big South-OVC Offensive Player of the Week and Payton Brown was the league's Freshman of the Week on Sept. 23.
- Prior to that, DeLaurent won Big South-OVC Offensive and Bryce Norman earned Big South-OVC Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors on Sept. 9.
- Norman was named Big South-OVC Defensive Player of the Week on Nov. 11.
- SEMO has won a total of 13 Big South-OVC weekly awards this season.

One-Score Games

- Since the start of the 2023 season, Southeast Missouri has been involved in nine one-score games.
- Three of SEMO's games were one-score affairs in 2024.
- The Redhawks fell to New Mexico State, 23-16, on Aug. 31, beat UT Martin, 45-42, in double overtime on Sept. 7 and lost to Tennessee State, 28-21, on Nov. 23.
- The Redhawks are 3-6 in those games.

Air Raid

- In its 45-42 win over UT Martin (Sept. 7), Southeast Missouri threw for 376 yards.
- Through 12 games, SEMO ranks second in the Big South-OVC and ranks sixth in the FCS in passing offense with 301.7 yards per contest.
- The Redhawks have 29 passing touchdowns, all of which belong to Paxton DeLaurent.
- DeLaurent ranks fourth in the FCS in passing touchdowns, fifth in passing yards (3,520), stands fifth in passing yards per game (293.3) and is fourth in points responsible for (194).

Home-Opening Victory

- With its home-opening win over UT Martin (Sept. 7), Southeast Missouri improved to 7-4 in such games under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz.
- The Redhawks picked up their third-straight home-opening win after beating Nicholls, 42-16, on Sept. 17, 2022 and Lindenwood, 45-7, on Sept. 9, 2023.
- SEMO is now 21-13 all-time in home-openers during its NCAA Division I Football

Championship Subdivision era.

- The Redhawks moved to 14-19 all-time in Big South-OVC home-openers.
- SEMO won nine of 11 conference home-openers with Matukewicz as its head coach.

Double-Digit Tacklers

- Southeast Missouri had its first players reach double-digits in tackles against UT Martin (Sept. 7).
- Bryce Norman paved the way with 13 tackles, while Khalani Riddick and Mali Walton followed with 11 and 10, respectively.
- For Riddick and Walton, it marked the first time they finished with 10 or more tackles in a game.
- Norman and Walton turned in 12 and 10 tackles, respectively at #7 Southern Illinois (Sept. 21).
- Norman finished with 15 tackles vs. Tennessee Tech (Oct. 12) and 14 against Gardner-Webb (Oct. 26).
- Norman tallied 19 tackles and Walton added 14 at Lindenwood (Nov. 9).
- Walton added 10 tackles against Western Illinois (Nov. 16) and Norman and Riddick had 12 and 10 tackles, respectively, at Tennessee State (Nov. 23).
- Norman has 20 double-digit tackle games in his career.

Pulling Rank

- Southeast Missouri ranks among the top 10 teams in the FCS in two statistical categories.
- The Redhawks are second in fourth-down conversion percentage (81.3 pct.) and seventh in passing offense (301.7 ypg).

Take it Away

- The Redhawk defense has 18 takeaways through 12 games this season.
- SEMO has 11 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries.
- SEMO won the turnover margin in three games this season and forced a turnover in 11 of its last 16 contests dating back to 2023.

Notable Streaks

- Bryce Norman led Southeast Missouri in tackles for three-straight seasons. If Norman does that again in 2024, he will become the first player in program history to lead the team in tackles four years in a row.
- Kobe Sixkiller, a four-year starter, made 26-straight starts on the offensive line.
- The Redhawks have not had a losing record in Big South-OVC play for seven-straight

seasons. The last time that happened was in 2017 (3-5).

Good to Know

- Bryce Norman ranks third among Southeast Missouri's career leaders in tackles (397), fifth in tackles for loss (36.0) and sixth in sacks (14.5).
- Norman became the 10th player in program history to go over 300 career tackles.
- Paxton DeLaurent broke SEMO's all-time career records in passing yardage (7,996), passing touchdowns (59), completions (689) and attempts (1,124). DeLaurent is the only quarterback in program history to throw for over 7,000 yards.
- DeLaurent's 376 passing yards against UT Martin (Sept. 7) ranked seventh in program history for most passing yards in a game.
- His 63 passing attempts against the Skyhawks surpassed Mike Haley (61, at Kent State, Sept. 10, 2005) for a new single-game record.
- DeLaurent's six touchdown passes against UT Martin (Sept. 7) surpassed SEMO's previous single-game record of five thrown by Kyle Snyder (vs. Austin Peay, 2014) and Jack Tomco (vs. UT Martin, 2002).
- His 34 completions tied the school's single-game record.
- DeLaurent also broke his program's all-time record in total offense

- Quarterback Paxton DeLaurent has started all 12 games under center for the Redhawks this year.
- After leaving the FCS Kickoff game vs. North Alabama (Aug. 24) late in the second quarter with a shoulder injury, DeLaurent has since thrown for 295 yards and one touchdown at New Mexico State (Aug. 31), 376 yards and a school record six touchdowns vs. UT Martin (Sept. 7), 301 yards and four TDs at Southern Illinois (Sept. 21), 237 yards and one touchdown vs. Northwestern State (Sept. 28), 364 yards and three touchdowns at Eastern Illinois (Oct. 5), 422 yards and four TDs vs. Tennessee Tech (Oct. 12), 335 yards and one touchdown at Charleston Southern (Oct. 19), 312 yards and two touchdowns vs. Gardner-Webb (Oct. 26), 174 yards at Lindenwood (Nov. 9), 375 yards and four touchdowns vs. Western Illinois (Nov. 16) and 233 yards and two TDs at Tennessee State (Nov. 23).

- DeLaurent is 19-10 as SEMO's three-year starting quarterback.
- DeLaurent started the first seven games of the 2023 campaign before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury early in the second quarter at Tennessee Tech (Oct. 21).
- During the preseason, DeLaurent was ranked as the #8 returning quarterback in the FCS by HERO Sports.
- DeLaurent also made the 2024 Stats Perform Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List. A total of 35 players were selected to the initial list entering the season.
- Most recently, he was named one of 13 finalists for the FedEx Doris Robinson Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award.
- DeLaurent was one of 20 quarterbacks across all divisions of college football invited to participate as a counselor at the Manning Passing Academy from June 27-30, 2024.

Redhawks Go Down to the Wire with New Mexico State

- The Redhawks led Football Bowl Subdivision and Conference USA member New Mexico State until the final minutes in their close 23-16 loss on Aug. 31.
- SEMO was ahead, 16-15, until a NMSU fourth down stop resulted in the game's winning touchdown with 1:57 left to play.
- The Redhawks had one final chance and got to the Aggies 16-yard line when Paxton DeLaurent's pass went off the hands of Cam Pedro and was intercepted with 37 seconds on the clock.
- SEMO dropped to 1-28 all-time against FBS opponents and has lost 23 in a row against such schools.

Redhawks Win FCS Kickoff

- In its first ever appearance at the Week Zero FCS Kickoff, Southeast Missouri defeated North Alabama, 37-15, on Aug. 24.
- SEMO, which trailed 15-7 with 4:11 remaining in the second quarter, scored 30 unanswered points en route to its season-opening victory.
- The Redhawks grinded out the win without starting quarterback Paxton DeLaurent who left the game with a shoulder injury late in the second quarter.
- Freshman running back Payton Brown was named the game's Most Valuable Player after rushing for 97 yards and three touchdowns. Brown scored 18 of SEMO's final 30 points.
- Brown tied a FCS Kickoff single-game record in touchdowns and SEMO's defense tied a FCS Kickoff single-game record with four

takeaways, including two fumble recoveries and two interceptions.

- SEMO played and won a football game on the ESPN mothership for the first time in program history.
- The Redhawks beat North Alabama for the first time in just the second meeting between the teams. SEMO and UNA last met 68 years ago during the 1956 season in Florence, Alabama.
- This year marked the seventh time Montgomery Alabama's Cramton Bowl played host to the FCS Kickoff.

Season-Opening Win

- Southeast Missouri snapped a four-game losing streak in season-opening games with its win over North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- SEMO improved to 11-23 all-time in season-openers during its NCAA Division I era.
- Tom Matukewicz is now 3-8 in such games with six of those losses coming against FBS opponents.
- North Alabama marked just the third non-FBS opponent SEMO faced in a season-opening game with Matukewicz at the helm.
- The 37-15 (+22) win over UNA was SEMO's largest margin of victory in a season-opener since the Redhawks blanked Missouri Baptist, 77-0, in Matukewicz's first game as a head coach on Aug. 28, 2014.
- It was only the fifth time in the Redhawks NCAA Division I FCS era where they won a season-opener by more than 20 points.

Impressive Debuts

- Freshmen running back Payton Brown and redshirt-freshman quarterback Carter Hensley carried Southeast Missouri to victory in their first college game against North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- Brown, a true freshman from Festus, Missouri, ran for 97 yards and three touchdowns on 19 carries.
- He scored his first career touchdown on a 1-yard run in the second quarter before hitting paydirt on runs of 25 and 1 yards, respectively.
- Hensley, who entered the game late in the second quarter for the injured Paxton DeLaurent, completed 10-of-14 passes for 100 yards and ran for 26 yards and one touchdown on four carries.
- A native of Rogers, Arkansas, Hensley engineered the last five scoring drives of the contest.

Defense Delivers

- Southeast Missouri's defense put together an outstanding performance against North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- SEMO had four takeaways on two fumble recoveries and two interceptions.
- It was the most turnovers forced by the Redhawks in a season-opener in 16 years since Southwest Baptist turned the ball over five times on Aug. 28, 2008.
- Jared Pedraza and McCoy Casey each recovered a fumble and Adrian Patterson and Justus Johnson added one interception apiece.
- The Redhawk defense also had a pair of big fourth-down stops.
- Additionally, SEMO finished with three sacks and five tackles for loss.

First SEMO Action

- Thirteen players saw their first action in a Southeast Missouri uniform against North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- Newcomers Adrian Patterson (DB), Justus Johnson (DB), McCoy Casey (OLB), Brandon Epton, Jr. (RB), Cam Pedro (WR), Carter Guillaume (OL), Tyler McMillan (OL) and Jalen Nettles (OL) made their first career starts.
- Carter Hensley, Jared Pedraza, Landon Sylvie, Payton Brown and Chris Daigre saw action, as well.
- Cam Pedro scored the first touchdown of the 2024 season on a 4-yard pass from Paxton DeLaurent with 9:29 left in the first quarter.

Preseason Recognition

- Center Zack Gieg and inside linebacker Bryce Norman were named to both the 2024 Stats Perform and Phil Steele Preseason All-America Teams.
- Zack Gieg and quarterback Paxton DeLaurent represent Southeast Missouri on the 2024 Stats Perform Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List. Gieg and DeLaurent are among 35 players on the preseason watch list. The Payton Award, which is in its 38th season, is presented annually to the National Offensive Player of the Year in Division I FCS football.
- Bryce Norman made the 2024 Stats Perform Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List. Thirty players are on the preseason watch list for the prestigious award given annually to National Defensive Player of the Year in

- Bryce Norman was tabbed the 2024 Big South-OVC Association Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. Norman is SEMO's first Preseason Defensive Player of the Year since fellow linebacker Zach Hall earned the honor in 2019.
- Seven Redhawks, including quarterback Paxton DeLaurent, offensive lineman Zack Gieg, tight end Danny Joiner, kicker DC Pippin, defensive lineman Steven Lewis, defensive back Joedrick Lewis and linebacker Bryce Norman are among the Big South-OVC Players to Watch.

- Matukewicz guided the Redhawks to three conference titles (2019, 2022, 2024) and four FCS Playoff berths (2018, 2019, 2022, 2024), both program bests.

- He also has a program record nine wins over ranked FCS opponents.
- Matukewicz's 2018 (9-4), 2019 (9-4), 2022 (9-3) and 2024 (9-3) teams each tied the school record in wins.
- He is the 13th head coach in SEMO football history and ranks third all-time in wins behind Kenneth Knox (88-59-4, 1952-67) and Abe Stuber (72-42-6, 1932-46).
- Matukewicz's 63 wins are the most of any head coach in the Redhawks Division I era.
- He was named the Roy Kidd Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2018 and 2022.
- Matukewicz has 64 total wins as a head coach, including 63 at SEMO and one as Northern Illinois' interim head coach.

Mr. SEMO

- Nearby Jackson native Bryce Norman is back to lead Southeast Missouri's defense. Norman's hometown is just eight miles north of Cape Girardeau.
- The inside linebacker is the 2024 Big South-OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.
- He is the first SEMO player tabbed the league's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year since fellow linebacker Zach Hall earned the honor in 2019.
- Norman has become the household name of SEMO's defense and accumulated 397 tackles, 36 tackles for loss, 14.5 sacks, two interceptions, six forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries in his career.
- He ranks among SEMO's career leaders in tackles (3rd, 397), sacks (6th, 14.5) and tackles for loss (5th, 36.0).
- Norman was rated as the #8 returning linebacker in the FCS by HERO Sports and the #10 top returning linebacker in the FCS by Sports Illustrated.
- He is also among 30 players selected to the 2024 Stats Perform Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List. This year marks the 30th Anniversary for the Buck Buchanan Award which is presented to the National Defensive Player of the Year in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision each season.
- Norman is looking to become the first player in SEMO football history to lead the team in tackles four-straight seasons.

Welcome to Cape Girardeau

- Southeast Missouri has three new coaches on its football staff this season.
- Todd Drury is in his first year as safeties coach, Morris Lolar is in his first season

coaching the cornerbacks and Madison Bunch is in his first year coaching the running backs.

- Drury joins the Redhawks after spending the 2023 season as defensive coordinator at Western Illinois. Before that, he was head coach at Missouri S&T from 2019-22.
- Lolar worked with the defensive backfield at Missouri Valley College in 2023. He, too, has previous head coaching experience working three years at the helm of NAIA member Bethel College (Kan.). Lolar played college football at Minnesota and Friends University before going on to spend six years in the CFL between the Edmonton Eskimos and Winnipeg Bombers organizations.
- Bunch was the offensive analyst and assistant running backs coach at Rutgers in 2023. He returns to SEMO's coaching staff where he once worked as the Redhawks recruiting coordinator and assistant wide receivers coach in 2022.

About the Program

- Southeast Missouri is in its 120th year of college football.
- The 2024 campaign marks SEMO's 34th year at the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level.
- The Redhawks joined the FCS in 1991 and are 152-232 all-time in their Division I era.
- SEMO won four conference titles (2010, 2019, 2022, 2024) and made five NCAA FCS Playoff appearances (2010, 2018, 2019, 2022, 2024) in program history.
- The Redhawks have a total of seven winning seasons (7-5 in 1994, 8-4 in 2022, 9-3 in 2010, 9-4 in 2018, 9-4 in 2019, 9-3 in 2022, 9-3 in 2024) in their NCAA Division I tenure.

2024 Schedule Notes

- Southeast Missouri begins its 2024 season a week earlier with its first-ever appearance in the FCS Kickoff vs. North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- SEMO will play a 12-game schedule with five home games.
- The Redhawks travel over 1,200 miles west to play Football Bowl Subdivision and Conference USA member New Mexico State (Aug. 31).
- Longtime rival Southern Illinois (Sept. 21) and Northwestern State (Sept. 28) are SEMO's other non-conference foes.
- The Big South-OVC Association slate features nine league teams playing an eight-game conference schedule in 2024.

- SEMO opens conference play at home against reigning Big South-OVC Co-Champion UT Martin (Sept. 7).
- Tennessee Tech (Oct. 12), reigning Big South-OVC Co-Champion and 2023 FCS Playoff participant Gardner-Webb (Oct. 26) and first-year Association member Western Illinois (Nov. 16) complete the Redhawks home portion of the schedule.
- The remainder of the Big South-OVC schedule includes trips to Eastern Illinois (Oct. 5), Charleston Southern (Oct. 19), Lindenwood (Nov. 9) and Tennessee State (Nov. 23).
- SEMO faces Gardner-Webb and Charleston Southern for the first time in 2024.
- Big South-OVC Association games will primarily take place between weeks five and 13, with one game apiece during weeks two and four. Seven weeks will feature four Association matchups.
- SEMO has two bye weeks (Sept. 14 & Nov. 2) this season.

Big South-OVC Football Association Presidents and Chancellors Enter into New Enhanced Agreement

- On June 12, 2024, the Board of Presidents and Chancellors of the nine regionally-aligned member institutions solidified their commitment to each other with a new enhanced agreement that will provide an opportunity to extend the original partnership through 2030 and beyond.
- The agreement strengthens the structure between the FCS-committed institutions and is intended to provide all members access to the automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Playoffs, long-term stability and a competitive league schedule.
- All teams will play eight Association games in 2024, renewing established rivalries and sparking new ones.
- The original agreement, signed in February 2022, provided for Association play from 2023 through 2026. The new agreement, approved unanimously by all participating presidents and chancellors, now adds a "look-in" provision following the initial four-year term, which was to end after the 2026 season, for an additional four years, to provide institutions added membership certainty and stability.
- The framework also allows for the potential introduction of additional member institutions to the Association.
- The agreement confirms that the Ohio Valley Conference office will manage day-to-day

football operations in consultation with Big South Conference leadership.

- The Big South-OVC Association currently includes nine schools: Charleston Southern, Eastern Illinois, Gardner-Webb, Lindenwood, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech, UT Martin and Western Illinois.

Redhawks Team Up to Sack Hunger Again in 2024

- Southeast Missouri's Department of Athletics is once again teaming up to Sack Hunger this 2024 football season.
- SEMO is partnering with Southeast Missouri Food Bank, Coalter Insurance Group, First Midwest Bank, Coast to Coast Signs, Sikeston Jaycee Bootheel Rodeo and Midwest Sterilization to provide meals to families facing hunger in the southeast Missouri region.
- For every quarterback sack against opposing teams this year, Coalter Insurance Group, First Midwest Bank, Coast to Coast Signs, Sikeston Jaycee Bootheel Rodeo and Midwest Sterilization will each donate \$100 to Southeast Missouri Food Bank.
- Every \$1 donated to the Southeast Missouri Food Bank provides four meals, meaning each Redhawk sack will supply 2,000 meals to families facing hunger.
- River Radio, the official radio broadcast partner of SEMO Athletics, will also support the campaign by airing public service announcements during Redhawk football broadcasts throughout the 2024 season.
- Fans who wish to join the Redhawks in the fight against hunger can donate to Southeast Missouri Food Bank at SEMOfoodBank.org.

Redhawks in the NFL

- One former Southeast Missouri football player is currently on an active NFL roster
- Wide receiver Ryan Flournoy is with the Dallas Cowboys. Flournoy was selected by the Cowboys in the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft.
- Fellow wide receiver Kristian Wilkerson was signed to the Las Vegas Raiders practice squad.
- Flournoy and Wilkerson played against each other in a NFL preseason game on Aug. 17, 2024. Flournoy caught his first touchdown pass in that contest.
- Flournoy made his NFL debut against the Pittsburgh Steelers on Sunday Night Football Oct. 6.
- Defensive back Mike Ford, who initially joined the Cleveland Browns practice squad, was

recently moved to the team's active roster.

- Former SEMO offensive lineman Dan Connolly played eight seasons with the New England Patriots and helped the Patriots win Super Bowl XLIX over the Seattle Seahawks in his final season. Connolly holds the longest kick return by an offensive lineman in an NFL game with a 71-yard return against the Green Bay Packers on Dec. 19, 2010. Connolly weighed 313 pounds at the time of his record return.
- Center Eugene Amano won the Rimington Award at Southeast Missouri and was a seventh round draft pick of the Tennessee Titans in 2004. Amano played nine seasons with the Titans and made 31 starts on the offensive line from 2004-12.
- Jon Gruden spent one season as SEMO's quarterbacks coach in 1988. Gruden was head coach of Tampa Bay when the Buccaneers won their Super Bowl title. He was also the head coach of the Las Vegas Raiders. Currently, Gruden is an advisor for the Milano Seamen of the European League of Football.
- Marty Mornhinweg was the Redhawks offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 1989-90. Mornhinweg was head coach of the Detroit Lions from 2001-02 and finished his career as a senior offensive consultant with the Philadelphia Eagles in 2020.

Remarkable Success

- Southeast Missouri Athletics has reached unprecedented success.
- Since 2019-20, SEMO has won 32 conference titles with every sport winning at least one along the way.
- Academically, SEMO broke a department record when it finished the 2023-24 academic year with a 3.44 spring grade point average.
- The football team set its highest spring GPA ever with a 3.18 mark.
- SEMO most recently earned a school record 45 Ohio Valley Conference Medals of Honor for the 2023-24 academic year. The OVC Academic Medal of Honor is given annually to the student-athletes who achieve the highest grade point average in a Conference-sponsored sport. Every Redhawk that won the OVC Medal of Honor achieved a perfect 4.0 GPA.
- Redhawk teams won five NCAA Public Recognition Awards based on their perfect

- SEMO won the OVC Commissioner's Cup in two of the last four years. The Redhawks garnered the honor in 2020-21 and 2022-23. The OVC Commissioner's Cup is a symbol of overall athletic excellence in Conference-sponsored championships and is awarded annually to one member institution. The Redhawks never won the prestigious honor until 2020-21.

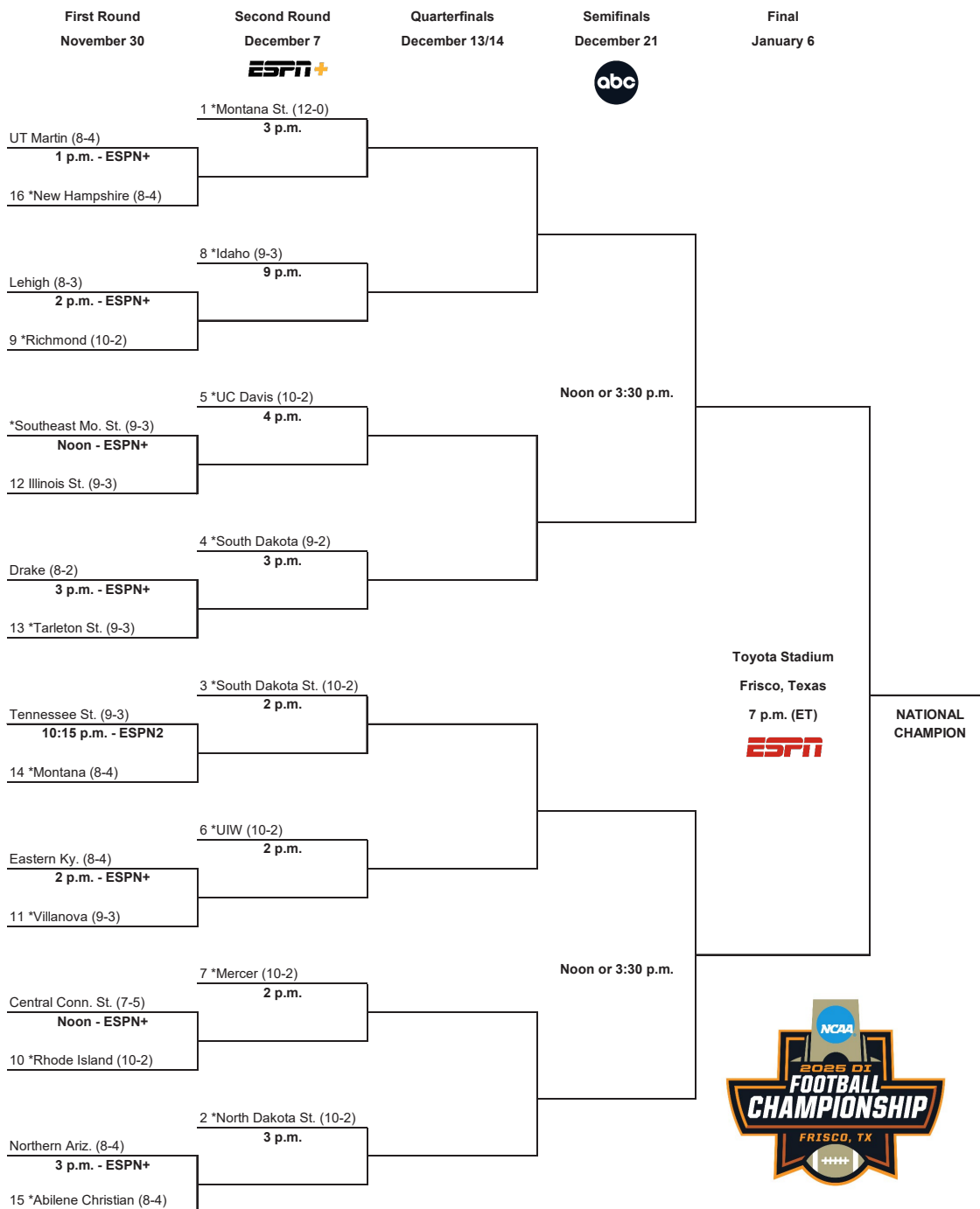

HOUCK FIELD

Phase One Complete

- Phase One of the Houck Project officially opened for the start of Southeast Missouri's 2023 football season.
- The Southeast Missouri State University Board of Governors took bold action to begin the first phase of construction for a new Houck Field on Sept. 24, 2021.
- Phase One included demolition of the original south grandstand structure and construction of a new south sideline, construction and replacement of the south sideline and grandstand of Houck Field as well as new seating, turf replacement, concession stands, restrooms, ADA access and associated HVAC, mechanical and other systems work.
- The original structure of Houck Field stood for 91 years before demolition following the 2021 season.
- Ground was broken for Phase One of the project on Sept. 6, 2022 with construction work done by Fager-McGee Commercial Construction.

Future Phases

- Future phases of the Houck Multiuse Complex will include construction of a new central ticketing office and press box with working and premium seating areas.
- The North sideline, where the walls of the limestone quarry will create a one-of-a-kind setting and fan experience that is uniquely Southeast Missouri, will be complete with its own concessions, restrooms and fan amenities.
- The full Houck Project will offer not only improved athletic facilities but also needed academic spaces, spaces for sports medicine and athletic training, football operations and premium seating areas for gameday.



More than a Stadium

- With its prominent location on Broadway Street, Houck Field welcomes everyone who visits SEMO and its historic riverfront district.
- Houck Field is the doorstep to downtown Cape Girardeau and the front porch of the Southeast Missouri campus.

- Once complete, a reimagined Houck Field will be a statement of a stronger, healthier university and be a shining jewel to anchor the downtown area.
- A new Houck Field will bring more visitors to the Southeast Missouri community and kindle new opportunities for local businesses.

Love, Effort, Attitude and Discipline (L.E.A.D.) are the pillars of Tom Matukewicz's process-driven Southeast Missouri football program which is earning its place in the national spotlight. Matukewicz is in his 11th year as the Redhawks head coach. His commitment to excellence and Brick-by-Brick mantra have the Redhawks soaring to new heights.

HEAD COACH TOM MATUKEWICZ**More than Just Football**

Tom Matukewicz's Southeast Missouri football program is highly visible in the community and often engages in random acts of kindness.

Matukewicz simply uses goodwill to teach his players valuable life lessons.

- SEMO teamed up with the Cape Girardeau Police Department to raise money for the Minority Police Academy Scholarship Fund on Oct. 10, 2020. The event raised \$13,000, which helped fund two scholarships.
- In 2015, SEMO partnered with Saint Francis Medical Center to announce a new collaboration, taking the Redhawks' Pink Up efforts to a new level. As part of a Pink Up Jersey Auction, the football team raised over \$75,000 for breast cancer awareness over a four-year period. The Redhawks donned special pink jerseys, each personalized with a name in honor or memory of a survivor or loved one during this special initiative.
- Before its 2016 season- opener at Memphis, SEMO visited St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Redhawk players, coaches and support staff toured the amazing facility that leads the way the world understands, treats and defeats childhood cancer and other life-threatening diseases. SEMO donated teddy bears and other items along with a check for over \$500 to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.
- On July 21, 2016, Matukewicz organized a Cops and Hawks flag football game which brought a whole community together in light of shootings in the United States. Redhawk players and local law enforcement officials were teammates in the event which raised \$4,500 for BackStoppers, a non-profit organization that provides needed financial assistance and support to the spouses and dependent children of fallen and injured service members in the line of duty.
- During SEMO's 2014 season- opener against Missouri Baptist, the Redhawk captains took a No. 14 jersey to midfield for the coin toss to honor the memory of Kaden Robert. Robert was a Kelly High School football player who died in an accidental shooting on June, 2014.
- A week later, Michael Douglas, a 16-year old from Kansas, accompanied the Redhawks on the sideline for their game against the Jayhawks on Sept. 6, 2014. Douglas was diagnosed with an interstitial lung disease when he was a year old and has to use an oxygen tank. The teenager initially contacted wide receiver Mike Cyliak for an autograph the summer before the 2014 campaign. Once Matukewicz heard the story, he wrote Douglas a letter and invited him to the game.
- SEMO's football program generously donated to the Nolan Weber Believers 5K & Fun Run/ Walk in nearby Jackson. Weber was a soccer player at Jackson High School who fought brain cancer for almost three years (doubling the life expectancy of what his illness normally came with) before he passed away. The contribution went to the Believing Beyond Nolan Weber Foundation that provides financial and/or spiritual/ emotional support to children and their families battling cancer and other catastrophic illnesses.
- In 2022-23, Matukewicz organized two L.E.A.D Revival professional development workshops that focus on leadership within any type of organization or team. The event affords participants the opportunity to learn the art of leadership and building/maintaining a championship culture.
