REDHAWKS RUNDOWN

REDHAWKS CLOSE REGULAR SEASON AT LEAGUE-LEADING SOUTHERN INDIANA

Southeast Missouri Women's Basketball (9-19, 6-11 OVC) will finish the 2023-24 regular season on Saturday, March 2, when they take on Ohio Valley Conference leader Southern Indiana (21-6, 16-1 OVC) in Evansville, Ind. Tip-off is slated for 5 p.m., CT. at Screaming Eagles Arena.

SERIES HISTORY

The Redhawks and Screaming Eagles will matchup for the 16th time on Saturday evening and the second time this season. SEMO dominates the all-time series, 12-3, but USI won earlier this season in Cape Girardeau by a final score of 75-37 on December 29.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS SCREAMING EAGLES

The Screaming Eagles head into their last match of the season coming off a dominating 75-38 win over Lindenwood. Southern Indiana is currently on a seven-match win streak with their last loss coming on February 3rd. Against Lindenwood, Southern Indiana's leading scorer Chloe Gannon came off the bench and scored 16 points. Gannon also recorded four rebounds, one assist, and one block. Junior Vanessa Shafford scored the second most points with 13. Shafford went 3-6 from behind the arch and added six rebounds, two assists, and a block and steal. Shafford is the Screaming Eagles leading scorer this season with 14.0 points per game which ranks eighth in the conference. She is also fifth in the OVC in rebounds (7.6 RPG), fourth in field goal percentage (45.5%), and fifth in 3-pointers made per game (2.2). Southern Indiana ranks second in the OVC averaging 72.4 PPG and they are holding their opponents to 63.0 PPG (3rd OVC). When it comes to shooting the rock, Southern Indiana is averaging 45.2% from the field (1st OVC), 36.0% from deep (1st OVC), and 72.9% from the stripe (6th OVC). The Screaming Eagles have won the OVC regular season title with their 16-1 conference record. They sit in first place with 11-6 UT Martin and 11-7 Eastern Illinois currently in second and third place.

OUTHEAST MISSOURI OMEN'S BASKETBALL

LAST TIME OUT

Southeast Missouri Women's Basketball (9-19, 6-11 OVC) cruised past Morehead State (14-14, 9-8 OVC) Thursday evening at the Johnson Arena by a final score of 70 - 63 to keep their tournament hopes alive. Junior Abigail Stevens led the Redhawks in scoring with a season high 16 points. Stevens came off the bench and played 29 minutes and shot six of ten from the field and 4-5 (80%) from the stripe. Stevens hauled in 11 rebounds (6 OR) to lead both teams. Alecia Doyle and Indiya Bowen also notched double digit points. Both scored 13 points and went 5-of-8 (62.5%) and 4-of-9 (44.4%) from the floor. Kiyley Flowers dished out half of the Redhawks assists with seven. The junior was also active on the defensive side of the ball posting two steals and two blocks. The Redhawks tied their season high in rebounds with 46 compared to MSU's 36. SEMO pulled down 16 offensive rebounds converting them into 15 second chance points.

LEAGUE TABLE

With just one final game to go in the regular season, the Redhawks are currently tied for eighth and are in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament. SEMO sits at 6-11 in the OVC, tied with Tennessee State, and owns the head-to-head matchup with the Tigers after a 48-47 win earlier this season. If SEMO wins on Saturday, they are in the tournament no matter what. However, with a TSU loss, the Redhawks are in regardless.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Junior forward Abbigail Stephens recorded a double-double in SEMO's 70-63 win over Morehead State on Thursday night. Stephens, a junior from Uniontown, Ohio, finished with SEMO's first double-double of the season chipping in 16 points and 11 rebounds. For Stephens, both numbers are SEMO career and season-highs.

STEALING FLOWERS

Junior guard Kiyley Flowers is coming off a six-steal performance last Saturday against UT Martin. The performance marks the 13th time this season that Flowers has recorded

three or more steals in a game. Flowers now leads the OVC in steals with 71 (2.7 SPG) and has two more steals than Makayla Wallace of Lindenwood (69).

FLOWERS DISHES THE ROCK

Guard Kiyley Flowers finished with an impressive seven assists in Thursday's game. The junior from Raymore, Mo. now has four games this season with seven or more assists and now has 99 assists on the season. She has a 1.3 assist-to-turnover ratio this season.

FROM EVANSVILLE

Freshman forward Amiyah Buchanan will return home for the first time in 2023-24 as the Redhawks will play their final game in Buchanan's hometown. Buchanan attended Evansville North High School before coming to SEMO. Buchanan is the leading rebounder on the team averaging 5.0 rebounds-pergame.

JALIYAH GREEN NAMED TO 2023-24 PRESEASON ALL-OVC TEAM

Junior guard Jaliyah Green was selected to the 2023-24 Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference team. Green is the lone Redhawk to land on the women's preseason allconference team. A season ago, Green led the Redhawks with 10.5 points-per-game while shooting .418 from the floor and .278 from three-point land. She was selected to the 2022-23 First Team All-Conference Team at the end of the season.

2023-24 CAPTAINS

Head coach Rekha Patterson announced on October 31, Sophie Bussard, Jaliyah Green, and Chandler Davis will serve as the captains in 2023-24. This year is the first for the trio in the leadership roles.

LOOKING AHEAD

The season finale will follow the matchup on Thursday evening as the Redhawks will travel to Evansville, Ind. to take on leagueleading Southern Indiana. Tip-off is set for 5 p.m., CT.

NEW COACHES

Head Coach Rekha Patterson, entering ninth season at the helm of SEMO women's basketball, will have an entirely new staff for the 2023-24 season. Mike Geary, Gabby Green, Danielle Sanderlin, and Jack Zilner will make up the coaching staff for this season.

Mike Geary

Mike Geary was on SEMO's staff during the 2020-21 season before leaving to go to Missouri Valley-member Bradley for two seasons. He has spent the last two seasons at Southern Illinois as an assistant. Geary has 19 years of head coaching experience with a 76- percent winning percentage under his belt. Before Rhode Island, Geary spent five years at Saint Louis, starting as an assistant coach in June 2013 after four seasons as an assistant at the University of Detroit Mercy. He was promoted to associate head coach at SLU in June 2014. He helped lead SLU's program to two WNIT appearances and one Atlantic-10 regular-season co-championship during his tenure. While with the Bilikens, Geary had five players named all-conference as well as two player of the year awards. SLU made the WNIT three times. Detroit Mercy posted a 21-13 record and won the Women's Basketball Invitational with Geary on staff in 2012-13. That followed a 2011-12 campaign that saw the Titans go 20-14 and earn a WNIT bid. During Geary's tenure, Detroit Mercy improved its NCAA Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) from 220 to 97. Detroit Mercy also appeared in the WNIT one time and had four athletes named to the all-conference team. Geary also spent two seasons as an assistant coach alongside Patterson at Ball State. They helped guide the 2006-07 Cardinals to a 24-7 ledger, the Mid-American Conference West Division title and a WNIT berth. While at Ball State, they had one student athlete named to allconference team. He had success as a head coach at the NCAA Division II level, winning 417 games. Geary led Lake Superior State to the 1988 NCAA Tournament round of 16 in his second season, and the Lakers were 47-10 in his two campaigns at the helm. As head coach, Geary led the Lakers to a pair of NCAA appearances and had five allconference players. Geary then embarked on

a stellar 17-year stint at Northern Michigan, where his teams compiled a 370-123 record and enjoyed 12 winning seasons, including eight in succession with 20 or more victories. As head coach, Geary had eleven NCAA Tournament appearances. He had 20 allconference players, and six athletes earn player of the year titles. Geary's Northern Michigan teams captured seven GLIAC Tournament crowns, including four-straight from 1995 to 1998. The Wildcats played in seven NCAA regional championship games and his players earned five All-America awards to go along with six GLIAC Most Valuable Player accolades.

Gabby Green

Coach Gabby Green comes to SEMO after previously serving as the video coordinator at University of Pacific and San José State. She began her playing career at California-Berkelev where she was selected to the PAC-12 All-Freshman Team in 2015. She finished up her junior and senior seasons at West Coast Conference-member Loyola Marymount University. In the 2018 season, Green was selected as the WCC Newcomer of the Year along with backto-back All-WCC First Team selection(s). Coach Green was also a member of the 2013 Team USA Women's Basketball U-19 World Championship team that went undefeated, winning the gold medal in Lithuania. In May of 2019, Green participated in the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks training camp. Following that, she spent a year playing overseas for Charnay in Macon, France from August 2020-April 2021.

Danielle Sanderlin

Danielle Sanderlin will join the Redhawks coaching staff following her time on the AAU circuit with the DC Queens Elite AAU program. A graduate of Massachusetts-Amherst, Sanderlin received her degree in communications and completed her master's degree in dispute resolution and conflict management from Southern Methodist University. As a player, Sanderlin competed at Canisius College, a member of the MAAC conference, from 2017-2020. She landed on the 2017-2018 MAAC All-Rookies team during her first season as a Griffin and was selected to the All-MAAC third team in 20192020.

Jack Zillner

Jack Zillner joins the Redhawks coaching staff as the Director of Basketball Operations and Player Development. Prior to joining the Redhawks, Zillner served as the women's basketball graduate assistant over the past two seasons ('21-'23) at the University of Kansas. A native of Lenexa, KS., Zillner comes to the Redhawks after developing under the 2021-2022 Big 12 Coach of the Year Brandon Schneider. Zillner coached Taiyanna Jackson who was a 2022-23 Unanimous All-Big 12 First Team player for the Jayhawks and was selected as the 2023 WNIT Most Valuable Player. Zakiyah Franklin was a 2022-23 All-Big 12 First Team selection for KU this past season and a 2023 WNIT All-Tournament team selection. When Coach Zillner is not coaching basketball, he enjoys spending his free time on the golf course.



ead Coach Rekha Patterson will enter her ninth season at the helm of Southeast Missouri women's basketball. Patterson led the Redhawks in 2022-23 to a 16-15 overall record. including a 10-8 finish in the Ohio Valley Conference, earning a four seed in the OVC tournament. SEMO ended the regular season on a six-game winning streak, beginning with a 90-86 overtime win at Tennessee State. SEMO rode the momentum into the conference tournament in Evansville, Ind. and defeated number 8-seed Morehead State, claiming the largest point differential win in program history, 77-38. SEMO would fall in the semifinals to Little Rock to conclude the 2022-23 campaign. Coach Patterson

has elevated the Southeast Missouri women's basketball program from a preseason last place selection in 2015 to the 2020 OVC Conference Tournament Champions. The Redhawks earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, a first in 13 years and were a team that was projected to win their First Round game before the season was cancelled due to COVID. The next season, 2021-22, the Redhawks finished ninth in the league and missed the OVC tournament for the first time since 2015. Coach Patterson did it again in 22-23, taking the program back to Evansville, Ind.

Prior to the 2021-22 season, Patterson guided the Redhawks to six-consecutive Ohio Valley Conference Tournament

appearances and led the Redhawks to just their second OVC Tournament title in program history and first since the 2006-07 season.

As Patterson enters her ninth season at the helm, she and her staff have been able to recruit, retain and develop a plethora of talented studentathletes. She has tutored an OVC Tournament MVP, the first-ever Freshman of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and All-OVC performers in each season.

Southeast Missouri qualified for its first Ohio Valley Conference Tournament as the #4 seed since the 2020 season. The Redhawks finished with a 16-15 overall record. SEMO posted a 10-8 record in OVC play for fourth in the league. Sophomore guard Jaliyah

Green was selected as an All-OVC First Team selection, the first in the last two seasons. During the season, SEMO recorded three series-sweeps in conference play including Lindenwood, Morehead State (x3), and Tennessee State. Wins over Eastern Illinois, at SIUE, and UT Martin highlighted big moments to get SEMO on track after starting the conference season off 0-4. Three wins in a row against Lindenwood, at Morehead State, and UT Martin got the Redhawks back on track, heading to Tennessee Tech. SEMO would lose in Cookeville but would bounce back with a big 77-59 win over TSU. SEMO hit a three-game losing skid following TSU, losing to EIU, LIttle Rock, and Tennessee Tech, respecitvely, before they would end their

season on a six-game winning streak to finish 10-8 in the conference. The 2022-23 season marked the best turnaround from a single season in Coach Patterson's tenure at SEMO. She now sits at 117-122 overall (.489) and has a 70-71 overall record in the OVC.

The 2019-20 season marked her second-straight winning season at SEMO after guiding the Redhawks to the 2020 OVC Tournament title.

SEMO recorded four series sweeps of OVC opponents (Tennessee Tech, Tennessee State, Austin Peay and SIUE) in 2020-21. The Redhawks led the league with a fieldgoal percentage defense of 37.1. SEMO also topped the conference for rebound margin (3.8), rebounds (1,036) and rebounds per game (39.85). SEMO ranked second in the OVC for blocked shots (147) and blocked shots per game (5.7). The Redhawks were also third for 3-point field goal defense with 27.7.

LaTrese Saine was awarded 2020-21 OVC Defensive Player of the Year and was named to the 2020-21 All-OVC First Team with Tesia Thompson. Saine is the second Redhawk in school history to earn OVC Defensive Player of the Year after Adrianna Murphy nabbed the laurel in 2017-18.

Saine led the OVC and ranked second in the NCAA in 2020-21 for blocked shots (103) and blocked shots per game (3.96). She also was second for rebounds (222) and third for rebounds per game (8.5). She rewrote the SEMO record books for blocking in 2020-21. She set the singleseason (103), single-game (10) and career block records (212) in her redshirt-senior season as a Redhawk and helped SEMO set the all-time single-game blocks record with 13 against Murray State on January 14, 2021.

Thompson (430 points) and Saine (270 points) were SEMO's top scorers averaging 18.7 and 10.4 points per game, respectively in 2020-21. Roshala Scott was third on the team with 10.2 points per game (265 points) and Taelour Pruitt averaged just under 10 points (9.9) per game (159 points). Sophie Bussard netted 8.8 points per contest (230 points).

Patterson mentored Thompson who finished her career with six All-OVC accolades including Freshman of the Year and Tournament MVP. She averaged 19.6 points and 7.8 rebounds per game in conference play, ranking third and ninth in the OVC in those categories, respectively in 2019-20. Thompson dished out 41 assists, five blocks and 25 steals, as well. For the year, she averaged 18.6 points per game as the Redhawks top scorer. Thompson concluded her SEMO career with 1,927 points, which ranks third in program history. She also is fourth all-time in school history for career rebounds (801) and fifth for steals (192).

Patterson was named the

in the record-setting game that ended Belmont's streak of four-straight OVC Tournament titles.

The Redhawks broke OVC Tournament single-game records in points scored and 3-point field goal percentage (82.4 percent). SEMO missed only three times from beyond the arc going a staggering 14of-17. Combined, SEMO and Belmont scored 213 points, also an OVC Tournament record for total points in a game.

A day after a staggering offensive showcase, #3 SEMO used a remarkable defensive

effort to beat #1 UT Martin and win the 2020 OVC Tournament Title. Defensively, SEMO held UTM to only 33.3 percent (18-of-54) from the field and did not give up a 3-pointer to a Skyhawk team, which entered the game as the second-most accurate 3-point shooting team in OVC play. The Skyhawks had a 3-pointer in every game that season except this one, finishing 0-of-11 from beyond the arc. The Redhawks 2019-20 All-OVC honorees included Tesia Thompson (First-Team, OVC All-Tournament Team MVP), Carrie Shephard (First-Team,

Thompson became just the 10th Redhawk in the Division I era to surpass 1,000 points. She reached the milestone at Ole Miss (Dec. 14) in the first quarter.

Patterson also mentored Shephard, who broke her own SEMO single-season record in 3-pointers made with 88 in 2019-20. In her junior and senior seasons, Shephard made a combined 161 three-pointers, which place her fourth all-time at SEMO in career 3-pointers made. She was second on the team in scoring with 16.6 points per game and led the team with 67 steals and rates second with 101 assists.

In 2018-19, four Redhawks logged over 200 points, with Tesia Thompson leading the team and the conference with 529 points. Carrie Shephard (288), Murphy (258) and Jocelyn Taylor (234) also scored over 200 points. Carrie Shephard set the single-season record for three-pointers attempted (217) and threepointers made (73).

In 2017-18, Patterson mentored Thompson, the first to gain All-OVC Newcomer, All-OVC Second Team and later named OVC Freshman of the Year honors in the same year. Murphy was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year, the first honor for a Redhawk. The Redhawks recorded the first ever pre-season WNIT victory over Saint Francis (82-50).

In 2016-17, Patterson mentored Bri Mitchell, the first, First Team All-OVC performer out of SEMO since Missy Whitney in 2007-08.

Mitchell and fellow 2016-17 senior Olivia Hackmann both topped the 1,000-point marks in their Redhawk careers. As a team, Southeast Missouri ranked second in the league in assists (479), fewest turnovers, scoring offense (73.9 points per game), and 3-point shooting percentage (34.9%). Individually, point guard Adrianna Murphy led

In her first season as head coach, Patterson guided the Redhawks to their first winning season in seven years, posting an even 15-15 overall record and an 8-8 Ohio Valley Conference record. The Redhawks, who were picked to finish last in the 12-team league, finished tied for fifth in Patterson's first season. In addition, Southeast punched its ticket to the OVC Tournament for the first time since 2009 under Patterson's tutelage. Junior guard, Bri Mitchell was named a Second Team All-OVC performer.

Statistically, the Redhawks ranked 13th nationally in rebounds per game, averaging 43.4 board per game. That figure ranked second in the OVC. SEMO's 28 defensive rebounds per game ranked 24th nationally, third in the OVC.

Of the eight head coaches in the history of Southeast Missouri women's basketball. Patterson became the fourth to record a winning season in their first year at the helm of the program.

Academically, the Redhawks have averaged a 3.30 GPA over the last six years. SEMO has had 36 student-athletes on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Sophie Bussard and Sophia Hancock each earned OVC Academic Medals of Honor in 2020-21 after earning perfect 4.0 GPAs during the academic year. Carrie Shephard earned the award in 2019-20. In 2015-16 and 2017-18 Ashton Luttrull received the OVC Medal

of Honor. The Redhawks recorded their highest semester team GPA (3.42) after the Spring 2020 semester.

Patterson was named the eighth head coach in Southeast Missouri women's basketball history during a press conference at the Show Me Center on April 15, 2015. She is the first female head coach in the NCAA Division I era for Southeast Missouri and fourth female head coach in the 39year history of the program.

Patterson is an active member of the community, serving on the Cape Girardeau Public Library Board of Directors since 2017, the Southeast Missouri FCA Board 2016-2019 and has been a member of the Chamber of Commerce since 2015. She has been a guest speaker for many local civic groups, sports organizations and Chamber of Commerce events and was the 2016 keynote speaker for the Women's Prayer Breakfast.

She currently serves as the OVC's WBCA Conference Captain.

Patterson previously was the associate head coach at Ball State from 2013-15. She also has worked on the staffs at Baylor (2002-04, 2010-12), Creighton (2007-08), Ball State (2006-07) and Eastern Illinois (2004-06).

During her coaching career, Patterson has worked with teams that have won a National Championship, reached two Final Fours, the Sweet 16 four times and has been a part of seven Big 12 championships.

All-Americans, an Ohio Valley Conference Freshman of the Year (Rachel Galligan) and numerous all-conference performers.

Patterson helped guide Ball State to the WNIT. In 2014-15, the Cardinals were 13-5 in Mid-American Conference (MAC) play. In her first season back at Ball State, the Cardinals advanced to the 2014 MAC Tournament championship game. Ball State became the first team to ever play five games in a single MAC Tournament. It was her second stint with the Cardinals after previously serving as an assistant coach in 2006-07.

In 2014, Patterson was a participant in the Achieving Coaching Excellence (ACE) program that was run by the NCAA.

While at Baylor from 2009-13, Patterson was part of the first women's basketball team to ever win 40 games as the Lady Bears posted an unbeaten mark on the way to the national championship. She spent the 2012-13 season as the associate coach and recruiting coordinator after working the previous three years as the coordinator of basketball operations.

Patterson was an assistant coach at Creighton in 2007-08 when the Bluejays won 21 games, fell one win short of sharing the Missouri Valley Conference regular season title, and completed the 15th-best turnaround in the nation that season.

While she was an assistant coach at Eastern Illinois from 2004-06, Patterson was the

post coach for Galligan as she earned the top freshman honor in the OVC.

From 2002-04, Patterson began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Baylor. Prior to that, she spent a year working at the NCAA national headquarters, where she was an education services intern.

A native of Red Springs, North Carolina, Patterson was a four-year letterwinner and two-time captain at North Carolina A&T, where she earned a bachelor's degree in public relations in 2001. She received a master's degree in education with an emphasis in sport management from Baylor in 2004.

Her mother, Eva Patterson-Heath, was the head coach of the Fayetteville State (N.C.) women's basketball program

and took her team to the NCAA Division II national tournament. She previously won over 500 games as the head coach at Red Springs (N.C.) High School.
