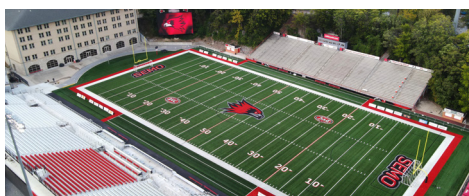

Redhawks vs. UT Martin

- Southeast Missouri opens Big South-OVC Conference Association play when it hosts UT Martin in its home-opener Saturday.
- SEMO plays its first home game of the season under the lights at 6 p.m., CT.
- Saturday's contest is the Redhawks only night game at Houck Field this year.
- SEMO is 10-8 all-time against UTM in Cape Girardeau.
- The Redhawks beat the Skyhawks each of the last two times they came to Houck Field -- 31-14 on Nov. 20, 2021 and 17-10 on Oct. 26, 2019.
- SEMO begins conference play on its home field for the third time in four seasons.
- The Redhawks started Big South-OVC play with a 45-7 victory over Lindenwood on Sept. 9, 2023 in Cape Girardeau.
- SEMO averaged 42 points per game in its last three conference home-openers. The Redhawks outscored those opponents, 126-41.

Early Big South-OVC Opener

- Southeast Missouri begins Big South-OVC action during week two for the second year in a row.
- Last year, SEMO beat Lindenwood, 45-7, to start league play on Sept. 9 at Houck Field.
- UT Martin is the Big South-OVC preseason favorite earning 61 points and five of the nine possible first-place votes by the league's head coaches.
- The Skyhawks shared the Big South-OVC title last season, but missed the FCS Playoffs. Gardner-Webb represented the Big South-OVC in the postseason.
- The Big South-OVC Association slate features nine league teams playing an eight-game conference schedule in 2024.

Home-Openers

- The Redhawks are 6-4 in home-openers under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz.
- Southeast Missouri goes for its third-straight home-opening win after beating Nicholls, 42-16, on Sept. 17, 2022 and Lindenwood, 45-7, on Sept. 9, 2023.
- SEMO is 20-13 all-time in home-openers during its NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision era.
- The Redhawks are 13-19 all-time in Big South-OVC home-openers.
- SEMO won eight of its first 10 conference home-openers with Matukewicz as its head coach.

Series Notes

- UT Martin and Southeast Missouri, schools located less than two hours apart, meet for the 40th time in 2024.
- UTM holds a slight 20-19 edge in the overall series which began in 1966.
- SEMO is 10-8 against UTM in Cape Girardeau and 9-12 against the Skyhawks in Martin.
- The Redhawks won four of the last six meetings between the teams.
- The home team won each of the last three matchups of the series.
- Tom Matukewicz is 5-5 against UTM as SEMO's head coach.

2010 Team to be Inducted into Hall of Fame this Weekend

- Southeast Missouri's 2010 football team will be inducted into the SEMO Athletics Hall of Fame during the Redhawks home-opening weekend.
- The 2010 team will be recognized as part of pregame ceremonies prior to kickoff Saturday.
- SEMO's 2010 team won the first Ohio Valley Conference title and clinched an NCAA Football Championship Playoff berth for the first time in program history.
- The Redhawks posted a 9-3 overall record and shared the OVC title with Jacksonville State after going a near-perfect 7-1 in league play.
- SEMO ranked among the Top-25 in either the FCS Media or Coaches polls for eight weeks during the season and rated as high as seventh in the country.
- Tony Samuel became the first coach in SEMO history to win the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and was also the American Football Coaches Association Region 3 and OVC Roy Kidd Coach of the Year.
- Tailback Henry Harris was OVC Offensive Player of the Year and landed a spot on five different All-America teams.
- Center Sean Middleton, also an All-American, won the Rimington Award which goes to the top center in the FCS.

- Offensive lineman Frank Knights and free safety Tyler Brock earned All-America honors, as well.
- SEMO had a total of 10 All-OVC selections, including eight first-team picks.
- Harris, quarterback Matt Scheible, Middleton, Knights, guard Bryan Curry, offensive tackle Evan Conrad, defensive tackle J.J. Sanchez and Brock were the first-team honorees.
- Additionally, Harris finished fifth in the overall voting for the Walter Payton Award.
- Statistically, the 2010 team finished among the top 10 teams in the nation in sacks allowed (1st, 0.50/game), least interceptions thrown (1st, 3), rushing offense (3rd, 265.1 ypg), fourth-down efficiency (3rd, 72.2 pct.), interceptions (4th, 20), third-down efficiency (5th, 47.3 pct.), turnover margin (5th, 1.08) and fewest yards penalized per game (9th, 37.7).



Redhawks Go Down to the Wire with New Mexico State

- The Redhawks led Football Bowl Subdivision and Conference USA member New Mexico State until the final minutes in their close 23-16 loss on Aug. 31.
- SEMO was ahead, 16-15, until a NMSU fourth down stop resulted in the game's winning touchdown with 1:57 left to play.
- The Redhawks had one final chance and got to the Aggies 16-yard line when Paxton DeLaurent's pass went off the hands of Cam Pedro and was intercepted with 37 seconds on the clock.
- SEMO dropped to 1-28 all-time against FBS opponents and has lost 23 in a row against such schools.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI FOOTBALL NOTES

About UT Martin

- UT Martin is this year's Big South-OVC Association preseason favorite after going 8-3 overall and 5-1 in conference play.
- The Skyhawks earned a share of the Big South-OVC title, but missed the FCS Playoffs.
- Jason Simpson is in his 19th season as UTM's head coach and needs just two wins to move into third place on the OVC career wins list. Simpson is 115-87 all-time.
- UTM brings back starting quarterback Kinkead Dent who started 11 games and completed 353 passes for 2,295 yards and 25 touchdowns.
- Defensively, Oshae Baker was named a Preseason All-American after earning All-Big South-OVC honors in 2023. Baker split time between cornerback and safety compiling 168 tackles and 15 tackles for loss.
- The Skyhawks have won three-consecutive conference titles. UTM won back-to-back OVC crowns in 2021 and 2022 before claiming the inaugural Big South-OVC title in 2023.
- UTM dropped its season-opener, 41-6, at Football Bowl Subdivision Kansas State (Aug. 31).

Pippin Shines

- Kicker DC Pippin scored 10 of Southeast Missouri's 16 points against New Mexico State (Aug. 31).
- Pippin made 3-of-4 field goals and one extra point to lead the Redhawks.
- He connected on field goals of 37, 53 and 48 yards, respectively.
- Pippin twice gave the Redhawks the lead and his 53-yard field goal in the third quarter was the second-longest of his career.
- He is SEMO's second-leading scorer with 15 points on 4-of-5 field goals and 3-of-3 extra points through two games this season.

Anderson Goes Over 100 Yards

- For the first time in his career, Dorian Anderson went over 100 receiving yards when he caught six passes for a game-high 115 yards and one touchdown at New Mexico State (Aug. 31).
- Anderson scored SEMO's only touchdown of the game on a 51-yard reception with 2:03 remaining in the first quarter.
- It was the second touchdown of Anderson's career.
- Anderson averaged over 19 yards per catch against the Aggies.
- He leads the Redhawks with 186 receiving yards and just under 17 yards per catch (16.9) this year.

Justus is Served

- Newcomer Justus Johnson intercepted a pass in each of his first two games as a Redhawk.
- The transfer from Murray State had both of his interceptions in the second half with his first pick coming in the fourth quarter against North Alabama (Aug. 24) and his second coming in the third quarter at New Mexico State (Aug. 31).
- SEMO leads the Football Championship Subdivision with three interceptions through its first two contests.

Take it Away

- Southeast Missouri's defense has five takeaways through two games this season.
- SEMO has three interceptions and two fumble recoveries.
- The Redhawks rank first in the Big South-OVC and third in the Football Championship Subdivision in turnovers gained.

DeLaurent Driven

- Quarterback Paxton DeLaurent, who left Southeast Missouri's season-opener against North Alabama (Aug. 24) in the second quarter with a shoulder injury, made his second

- SEMO accumulated 51 points and two first-place votes in the balloting by the Association's head coaches.

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start under center at New Mexico State (Aug. 31).

- DeLaurent completed 27-of-45 passes for 295 yards and one touchdown. He threw his second touchdown pass of the season for 51 yards to Dorian Anderson in the first quarter.
- The Camdenton, Missouri native leads the Big South-OVC and ranks third in the Football Championship Subdivision with 391 passing yards entering week two.
- Saturday marks DeLaurent's first start against UT Martin. The Redhawks did not play UTM in 2022 and DeLaurent missed the 2023 meeting between the teams with a shoulder injury.

Sack Free

- Southeast Missouri did not allow a sack in its latest matchup at New Mexico State (Aug. 31).
- It marked the first time the Redhawks offensive line did not give up a sack since Sept. 9, 2023 (vs. Lindenwood).
- SEMO had given up multiple sacks in 10-straight games before then.

Redhawks Win FCS Kickoff

- In its first ever appearance at the Week Zero FCS Kickoff, Southeast Missouri defeated North Alabama, 37-15, on Aug. 24.
- SEMO, which trailed 15-7 with 4:11 remaining in the second quarter, scored 30 unanswered points en route to its season-opening victory.
- The Redhawks grinded out the win without starting quarterback Paxton DeLaurent who left the game with a shoulder injury late in the second quarter.
- Freshman running back Payton Brown was named the game's Most Valuable Player after rushing for 97 yards and three touchdowns. Brown scored 18 of SEMO's final 30 points.
- Brown tied a FCS Kickoff single-game record in touchdowns and SEMO's defense tied a FCS Kickoff single-game record with four takeaways, including two fumble recoveries and two interceptions.
- SEMO played and won a football game on the ESPN mothership for the first time in program history.
- The Redhawks beat North Alabama for the first time in just the second meeting between the teams. SEMO and UNA last met 68 years ago during the 1956 season in Florence, Alabama.

- This year marked the seventh time Montgomery Alabama's Cramton Bowl played host to the FCS Kickoff.

Season-Opening Victory

- Southeast Missouri snapped a four-game losing streak in season-opening games with its win over North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- SEMO improved to 11-23 all-time in season-openers during its NCAA Division I era.
- Tom Matukewicz is now 3-8 in such games with six of those losses coming against FBS opponents.
- North Alabama marked just the third non-FBS opponent SEMO faced in a season-opening game with Matukewicz at the helm.
- The 37-15 (+22) win over UNA was SEMO's largest margin of victory in a season-opener since the Redhawks blanked Missouri Baptist, 77-0, in Matukewicz's first game as a head coach on Aug. 28, 2014.
- It was only the fifth time in the Redhawks NCAA Division I FCS era where they won a season-opener by more than 20 points.

Impressive Debuts

- Freshmen running back Payton Brown and redshirt-freshman quarterback Carter Hensley carried Southeast Missouri to victory in their first college game against North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- Brown, a true freshman from Festus, Missouri, ran for 97 yards and three touchdowns on 19 carries.
- He scored his first career touchdown on a 1-yard run in the second quarter before hitting paydirt on runs of 25 and 1 yards, respectively.
- Hensley, who entered the game late in the second quarter for the injured Paxton DeLaurent, completed 10-of-14 passes for 100 yards and ran for 26 yards and one touchdown on four carries.
- A native of Rogers, Arkansas, Hensley engineered the last five scoring drives of the contest.

Defense Delivers

- Southeast Missouri's defense put together an outstanding performance against North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- SEMO had four takeaways on two fumble recoveries and two interceptions.
- It was the most turnovers forced by the Redhawks in a season-opener in 16 years since Southwest Baptist turned the ball over five times on Aug. 28, 2008.
- Jared Pedraza and McCoy Casey each recovered a fumble and Adrian Patterson

and Justus Johnson added one interception apiece.

- The Redhawk defense also had a pair of big fourth-down stops.
- Additionally, SEMO finished with three sacks and five tackles for loss.

First SEMO Action

- Thirteen players saw their first action in a Southeast Missouri uniform against North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- Newcomers Adrian Patterson (DB), Justus Johnson (DB), McCoy Casey (OLB), Brandon Epton, Jr. (RB), Cam Pedro (WR), Carter Guillaume (OL), Tyler McMillan (OL) and Jalen Nettles (OL) made their first career starts.
- Carter Hensley, Jared Pedraza, Landon Sylvie, Payton Brown and Chris Daigre saw action, as well.
- Cam Pedro scored the first touchdown of the 2024 season on a 4-yard pass from Paxton DeLaurent with 9:29 left in the first quarter.

Preseason Recognition

- Center Zack Gieg and inside linebacker Bryce Norman were named to both the 2024 Stats Perform and Phil Steele Preseason All-America Teams.
- Zack Gieg and quarterback Paxton DeLaurent represent Southeast Missouri on the 2024 Stats Perform Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List. Gieg and DeLaurent are among 35 players on the preseason watch list. The Payton Award, which is in its 38th season, is presented annually to the National Offensive Player of the Year in Division I FCS football.
- Bryce Norman made the 2024 Stats Perform Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List. Thirty players are on the preseason watch list for the prestigious award given annually to National Defensive Player of the Year in Division I FCS football. This year is the 30th Anniversary for the Buck Buchanan Award.
- Sophomore Logan Leftrick is one of 13 players that made the 2024 FCS Punter of the Year Preseason Watch List. The FCS Punter of the Year Award is presented by The Augusta Sports Council.
- Bryce Norman was tabbed the 2024 Big South-OVC Association Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. Norman is SEMO's first Preseason Defensive Player of the Year since fellow linebacker Zach Hall earned the honor in 2019.
- Seven Redhawks, including quarterback Paxton DeLaurent, offensive lineman Zack Gieg, tight end Danny Joiner, kicker DC



Pippin, defensive lineman Steven Lewis, defensive back Joedrick Lewis and linebacker Bryce Norman are among the Big South-OVC Players to Watch.

Roster Notes

- Southeast Missouri's 2024 roster consists of 103 players.
- SEMO has 16 seniors, six graduates, 29 juniors, 22 sophomores and 30 freshmen.
- Ty Leonard, Darrell Smith, Jared Pedraza, Peyton Knight, Zack Gieg and Steven Lewis are the graduates.
- The Redhawks return 12 starters, including seven on offense and five on defense.
- Returning offensive starters are Paxton DeLaurent (QB), Zack Gieg (OL), Kobe Sixkiller (OL), Jamarcus Hill (OL), Tyson Miller (OL) and Jack Clinkenbeard.
- Returning defensive starters are Bryce Norman (ILB), Sam Cook (OLB), Steven Lewis (DL), Joedrick Lewis (DB) and Ty Leonard (DB).
- Bryce Norman (First-Team), Zack Gieg (First-Team) and kicker DC Pippin (Second-Team) are SEMO's returning All-Conference players from 2023.

Let's Talk Tuke

- Tom Matukewicz begins his 11th year as head coach at Southeast Missouri.
- Matukewicz has been at SEMO his entire career as a head coach.
- He is 55-60 overall and 41-30 in Big South-OVC play.
- Matukewicz guided the Redhawks to two conference regular-season titles (2019, 2022) and three FCS Playoff berths (2018, 2019, 2022), both program bests.
- He also has a program record eight wins over ranked FCS opponents.
- Matukewicz's 2018 (9-4), 2019 (9-4) and 2022 (9-3) teams each tied the school record in wins.
- He is the 13th head coach in SEMO football history and ranks third all-time in wins behind Kenneth Knox (88-59-4, 1952-67) and Abe Stuber (72-42-6, 1932-46).
- Matukewicz's 55 wins are the most of any head coach in the Redhawks Division I era.
- He was named the Roy Kidd Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2018 and 2022.

Notable Streaks

- Bryce Norman led Southeast Missouri in tackles for three-straight seasons. If Norman does that again in 2024, he will become the first player in program history to lead the

team in tackles four years in a row.

- Three-time First-Team All-Big South-OVC selection Zack Gieg has made 27-consecutive starts at center.
- Kobe Sixkiller, a four-year starter, made 16-straight starts on the offensive line.
- DC Pippin made 23-straight PATs. The last time Pippin missed an extra point was at Central Arkansas (Oct. 7, 2023).
- The Redhawks have not had a losing record in Big South-OVC play for six-straight seasons. The last time that happened was in 2017 (3-5).

Feature Back

- Brandon Epton, Jr. made his first career start as Southeast Missouri's tailback vs. North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- Epton, Jr. gained 48 yards on 16 carries and caught six passes for 22 yards. He also returned one kickoff 53 yards.
- Epton, Jr. took over for Geno Hess who was SEMO's tailback for the last six years.
- At Hutchinson Community College, Epton, Jr. ran for 535 yards and five touchdowns in 10 games at Hutchinson CC in 2023.
- Prior to that, he was at SMU, where he redshirted after playing in four games in 2022 and ran for 94 yards and three touchdowns in eight games in 2021.
- Geno Hess, who was SEMO's running back from 2018-23, broke seven career records and finished as the school's all-time leading rusher with 5,119 yards.
- Hess is presently a graduate assistant in the SEMO Athletics compliance office.

QB1

- A native of Camdenton, Missouri, Paxton DeLaurent is in his third year as Southeast Missouri's starting quarterback.
- DeLaurent started the first seven games of the 2023 campaign before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury early in the second quarter at Tennessee Tech (Oct. 21).
- This preseason, DeLaurent was ranked as the #8 returning quarterback in the FCS by HERO Sports.
- DeLaurent also made the 2024 Stats Perform Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List. A total of 35 players were selected to the initial list entering the season.
- In his career as SEMO's starting quarterback, DeLaurent has started 19 games and thrown for 4,867 yards and 32 touchdowns.
- DeLaurent was one of 20 quarterbacks across all divisions of college football invited to participate as a counselor at the Manning Passing Academy from June 27-30, 2024.

Receiving Votes

- Southeast Missouri received eight votes in the 2024 Stats Perform Poll this week.
- No Big South-OVC team is ranked in the Stats Perform Poll as of Sept. 2, 2024.
- Eastern Illinois and UT Martin also received votes in the polls.
- SEMO has been ranked a total of 32 weeks in either the AFCA or Stats Perform Top-25 polls under Head Coach Tom Matukewicz.

Mr. SEMO

- Nearby Jackson native Bryce Norman is back to lead Southeast Missouri's defense. Norman's hometown is just eight miles north of Cape Girardeau.
- The inside linebacker is the 2024 Big South-OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.
- He is the first SEMO player tabbed the league's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year since fellow linebacker Zach Hall earned the honor in 2019.
- Norman has become the household name of SEMO's defense and accumulated 288 tackles, 23.5 tackles for loss, 10 sacks, two interceptions, five forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries in his career.
- He ranks among SEMO's career leaders in tackles (13th, 288), sacks (9th, 10) and tackles for loss (15th, 23.5).
- Norman was rated as the #8 returning linebacker in the FCS by HERO Sports and the #10 top returning linebacker in the FCS by Sports Illustrated.
- He is also among 30 players selected to the 2024 Stats Perform Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List. This year marks the 30th Anniversary for the Buck Buchanan Award which is presented to the National Defensive Player of the Year in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision each season.
- Norman is looking to become the first player in SEMO football history to lead the team in tackles four-straight seasons.

Watch This

- Bryce Norman is 12 tackles away from reaching 300 in his career. Norman currently has 288 tackles. If he hits that mark, he will become the 10th player in program history to get 300 or more career tackles.

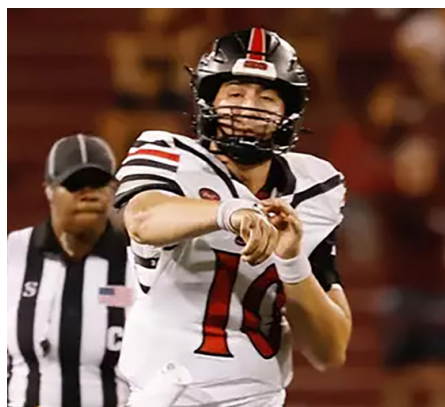

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- Paxton DeLaurent is 133 yards away from 5,000 passing yards in his career as SEMO's quarterback. His 4,867 passing yards rank fifth among the Redhawks all-time career leaders. DeLaurent is on pace to become the fourth SEMO quarterback to throw for 5,000 or more yards.
- Paxton DeLaurent has 32 career passing touchdowns. DeLaurent needs 15 to break SEMO's all-time career record of 46 set by Daniel Santacaterina (2018-19).

- Southeast Missouri has three new coaches on its football staff this season.
- Todd Drury is in his first year as safeties coach, Morris Lolar is in his first season coaching the cornerbacks and Madison Bunch is in his first year coaching the running backs.
- Drury joins the Redhawks after spending the 2023 season as defensive coordinator at Western Illinois. Before that, he was head coach at Missouri S&T from 2019-22.
- Lolar worked with the defensive backfield at Missouri Valley College in 2023. He, too, has previous head coaching experience working three years at the helm of NAIA member Bethel College (Kan.). Lolar played college football at Minnesota and Friends University before going on to

Paxton DeLaurent threw for 295 yards and one touchdown in his second start of the season at New Mexico State (Aug. 31). He threw a 51-yard touchdown pass to Dorian Anderson to give SEMO its early lead against the Aggies.

DC Pippin scored 10 of Southeast Missouri's 16 points in a 23-16 loss at New Mexico State (Aug. 31). Pippin made 3-of-4 field goals and one extra point. He connected from distances of 37, 53 and 48 yards, respectively. Pippin's 53-yard field goal in the third quarter marked the second-longest of his career. He twice gave the Redhawks the lead in that contest.

- Bunch was the offensive analyst and assistant running backs coach at Rutgers in 2023. He returns to SEMO's coaching staff where he once worked as the Redhawks recruiting coordinator and assistant wide receivers coach in 2022.

About the Program

- Southeast Missouri is in its 120th year of college football.
- The 2024 campaign marks SEMO's 34th year at the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level.
- The Redhawks joined the FCS in 1991 and are 144-230 all-time in their Division I era.
- SEMO won three conference titles (2010, 2019, 2022) and made four NCAA FCS Playoff appearances (2010, 2018, 2019, 2022) in program history.
- The Redhawks have a total of six winning seasons (7-5 in 1994, 8-4 in 2022, 9-3 in 2010, 9-4 in 2018, 9-4 in 2019, 9-3 in 2022) in their NCAA Division I tenure.

2024 Schedule Notes

- Southeast Missouri begins its 2024 season a week earlier with its first-ever appearance in the FCS Kickoff vs. North Alabama (Aug. 24).
- SEMO will play a 12-game schedule with five home games.
- The Redhawks travel over 1,200 miles west to play Football Bowl Subdivision and Conference USA member New Mexico State (Aug. 31).
- Longtime rival Southern Illinois (Sept. 21) and Northwestern State (Sept. 28) are SEMO's other non-conference foes.
- The Big South-OVC Association slate features nine league teams playing an eight-game conference schedule in 2024.
- SEMO opens conference play at home against reigning Big South-OVC Co-Champion UT Martin (Sept. 7).
- Tennessee Tech (Oct. 12), reigning Big South-OVC Co-Champion and 2023 FCS Playoff participant Gardner-Webb (Oct. 26) and first-year Association member Western Illinois (Nov. 16) complete the Redhawks home portion of the schedule.
- The remainder of the Big South-OVC schedule includes trips to Eastern Illinois (Oct. 5), Charleston Southern (Oct. 19), Lindenwood (Nov. 9) and Tennessee State (Nov. 23).

- SEMO faces Gardner-Webb and Charleston Southern for the first time in 2024.
- Big South-OVC Association games will primarily take place between weeks five and 13, with one game apiece during weeks two and four. Seven weeks will feature four Association matchups.
- SEMO has two bye weeks (Sept. 14 & Nov. 2) this season.

Big South-OVC Football Association Presidents and Chancellors Enter into New Enhanced Agreement

- On June 12, 2024, the Board of Presidents and Chancellors of the nine regionally-aligned member institutions solidified their commitment to each other with a new enhanced agreement that will provide an opportunity to extend the original partnership through 2030 and beyond.
- The agreement strengthens the structure between the FCS-committed institutions and is intended to provide all members access to the automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Playoffs, long-term stability and a competitive league schedule.
- All teams will play eight Association games in 2024, renewing established rivalries and sparking new ones.
- The original agreement, signed in February 2022, provided for Association play from 2023 through 2026. The new agreement, approved unanimously by all participating presidents and chancellors, now adds a "look-in" provision following the initial four-year term, which was to end after the 2026 season, for an additional four years, to provide institutions added membership certainty and stability.
- The framework also allows for the potential introduction of additional member institutions to the Association.
- The agreement confirms that the Ohio Valley Conference office will manage day-to-day football operations in consultation with Big South Conference leadership.
- The Big South-OVC Association currently includes nine schools: Charleston Southern, Eastern Illinois, Gardner-Webb, Lindenwood, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech, UT Martin and Western Illinois.

- One former Southeast Missouri football player is currently on an active NFL roster
- Wide receiver Ryan Flournoy is with the Dallas Cowboys. Flournoy was selected by the Cowboys in the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft.
- Fellow wide receiver Kristian Wilkerson was signed to the Las Vegas Raiders practice squad.
- Flournoy and Wilkerson played against each other in a NFL preseason game on Aug. 17, 2024. Flournoy caught his first touchdown pass in that contest.
- Former SEMO offensive lineman Dan Connolly played eight seasons with the New England Patriots and helped the Patriots win Super Bowl XLIX over the Seattle Seahawks in his final season. Connolly holds the longest kick return by an offensive lineman in an NFL game with a 71-yard return against the Green Bay Packers on Dec. 19, 2010. Connolly weighed 313 pounds at the time of his record return.
- Center Eugene Amano won the Rimington Award at Southeast Missouri and was a seventh round draft pick of the Tennessee Titans in 2004. Amano played nine seasons with the Titans and made 31 starts on the offensive line from 2004-12.
- Jon Gruden spent one season as SEMO's quarterbacks coach in 1988. Gruden was head coach of Tampa Bay when the Buccaneers won their Super Bowl title. He was also the head coach of the Las Vegas Raiders. Currently, Gruden is an advisor for the Milano Seamen of the European League of Football.

- Marty Mornhinweg was the Redhawks offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 1989-90. Mornhinweg was head coach of the Detroit Lions from 2001-02 and finished his career as a senior offensive consultant with the Philadelphia Eagles in 2020.

- Southeast Missouri Athletics has reached unprecedented success.
- Since 2019-20, SEMO has won 30 conference titles with every sport winning at least one along the way.
- Academically, SEMO broke a department record when it finished the 2023-24 academic year with a 3.44 spring grade point average.

The Redhawks never won the prestigious honor until 2020-21.

HOUCK FIELD

Phase One Complete

- Phase One of the Houck Project officially opened for the start of Southeast Missouri's 2023 football season.
- The Southeast Missouri State University Board of Governors took bold action to begin the first phase of construction for a new Houck Field on Sept. 24, 2021.
- Phase One included demolition of the original south grandstand structure and construction of a new south sideline, construction and replacement of the south sideline and grandstand of Houck Field as well as new seating, turf replacement, concession stands, restrooms, ADA access and associated HVAC, mechanical and other systems work.
- The original structure of Houck Field stood for 91 years before demolition following the 2021 season.
- Ground was broken for Phase One of the project on Sept. 6, 2022 with construction work done by Fager-McGee Commercial Construction.

Future Phases

- Future phases of the Houck Multiuse Complex will include construction of a new central ticketing office and press box with working and premium seating areas.
- The North sideline, where the walls of the limestone quarry will create a one-of-a-kind setting and fan experience that is uniquely Southeast Missouri, will be complete with its own concessions, restrooms and fan amenities.
- The full Houck Project will offer not only improved athletic facilities but also needed academic spaces, spaces for sports medicine and athletic training, football operations and premium seating areas for gameday.



More than a Stadium

- With its prominent location on Broadway Street, Houck Field welcomes everyone who visits SEMO and its historic riverfront district.
- Houck Field is the doorstep to downtown Cape Girardeau and the front porch of the Southeast Missouri campus.
- Once complete, a reimagined Houck Field will be a statement of a stronger, healthier university and be a shining jewel to anchor the downtown area.
- A new Houck Field will bring more visitors to the Southeast Missouri community and kindle new opportunities for local businesses.

Tom Matukewicz's Southeast Missouri football program is highly visible in the community and often engages in random acts of kindness.

Matukewicz simply uses goodwill to teach his players valuable life lessons.

- SEMO teamed up with the Cape Girardeau Police Department to raise money for the Minority Police Academy Scholarship Fund on Oct. 10, 2020. The event raised \$13,000, which helped fund two scholarships.
- In 2015, SEMO partnered with Saint Francis Medical Center to announce a new collaboration, taking the Redhawks' Pink Up efforts to a new level. As part of a Pink Up Jersey Auction, the football team raised over \$75,000 for breast cancer awareness over a four-year period. The Redhawks donned special pink jerseys, each personalized with a name in honor or memory of a survivor or loved one during this special initiative.
- Before its 2016 season- opener at Memphis, SEMO visited St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Redhawk players, coaches and support staff toured the amazing facility that leads the way the world understands, treats and defeats childhood cancer and other life-threatening diseases. SEMO donated teddy bears and other items along with a check for over \$500 to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.
- On July 21, 2016, Matukewicz organized a Cops and Hawks flag football game which brought a whole community together in light of shootings in the United States. Redhawk players and local law enforcement officials were teammates in the event which raised \$4,500 for BackStoppers, a non-profit organization that provides needed financial assistance and support to the spouses and dependent children of fallen and injured service members in the line of duty.
- During SEMO's 2014 season- opener against Missouri Baptist, the Redhawk captains took a No. 14 jersey to midfield for the coin toss to honor the memory of Kaden Robert. Robert was a Kelly High School football player who died in an accidental shooting on June, 2014.
- A week later, Michael Douglas, a 16-year old from Kansas, accompanied the Redhawks on the sideline for their game against the Jayhawks on Sept. 6, 2014. Douglas was diagnosed with an interstitial lung disease when he was a year old and has to use an oxygen tank. The teenager initially contacted wide receiver Mike Cyliak for an autograph the summer before the 2014 campaign. Once Matukewicz heard the story, he wrote Douglas a letter and invited him to the game.
- SEMO's football program generously donated to the Nolan Weber Believers 5K & Fun Run/ Walk in nearby Jackson. Weber was a soccer player at Jackson High School who fought brain cancer for almost three years (doubling the life expectancy of what his illness normally came with) before he passed away. The contribution went to the Believing Beyond Nolan Weber Foundation that provides financial and/or spiritual/ emotional support to children and their families battling cancer and other catastrophic illnesses.
- In 2022-23, Matukewicz organized two L.E.A.D Revival professional development workshops that focus on leadership within any type of organization or team. The event affords participants the opportunity to learn the art of leadership and building/maintaining a championship culture.
