#### OVC Tournament Semifinals

- #3 Southeast Missouri (20-12) moves on to face #2 Morehead State (19-12) in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament semifinals Friday. Tip-off is set for 9:30 p.m., CT at the Ford Center in Evansville, Indiana.
- Friday's game will be televised live on ESPNU with Robert Lee and Richie Schueler calling the action courtside.

#### Back in the Semifinals

- The Redhawks make their fourth Ohio Valley Conference Tournament semifinals appearance in five trips to the league's postseason event under Head Coach Brad Korn.
- Southeast Missouri made the semifinals in 2022, 2023, 2025 and 2026 with Korn as its coach. All of those tournaments were played at the Ford Center.
- This season is the Redhawks third trip to the OVC Tournament semifinals in four years.
- Overall, this is SEMO's seventh OVC Tournament semifinal appearance in program history.

#### Down to Four

- The top four seeds are in the semifinals of this year's Ohio Valley Conference Tournament.
- #1 Tennessee State will face #4 UT Martin in the first semifinal matchup Friday (7 p.m.).
- #2 Morehead State and #3 Southeast Missouri will meet in the nightcap (9:30 p.m.).
- Both contests will be televised live on ESPNU.

#### OVC Tournament Record

- Southeast Missouri is 18-17 all-time in Ohio Valley Conference Tournament games.
- SEMO is 7-3 in OVC Tournament games at the Ford Center.
- The Redhawks won two OVC Tournament titles in their program history. SEMO won the event in 1999-2000 under Gary Garner and 2022-23 under Brad Korn.
- In 2022-23, SEMO became the only #5 seed to win the OVC Tournament after winning four games in four days.
- Korn coached in every one of SEMO's OVC Tournament appearances in Evansville.

**Series Notes**

- Southeast Missouri and Morehead State meet for the 64th time Friday.
- MSU holds a 40-23 lead in the all-time series.
- SEMO and MSU split their two-game regular-season series with the Eagles winning, 71-69, in Morehead on Jan. 10 and the Redhawks winning, 82-70, on Feb. 5.
- Since losing to SEMO at the Show Me Center on Feb. 5, MSU has won seven-straight games.

**OVC Tournament Appearances**

- The 2026 campaign is Southeast Missouri's 20th Ohio Valley Conference Tournament appearance all-time.
- SEMO made the tournament in 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005, 2007, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2025 and 2026.
- The Redhawks are in the tournament for the fifth time since it moved to the Ford Center in Evansville, Indiana.
- This year marks the ninth-straight the OVC Tournament is in Evansville.

**As #3 Seed**

- Southeast Missouri is 1-0 as the #3 seed in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament.
- This year, SEMO is the #3 seed for the first time in its OVC Tournament history.
- The Redhawks were seeded in the other seven positions during their previous 19 trips to the OVC Tournament.

**Stacker Nails Game-Winner**

- Braxton Stacker buried a baseline jumper with 3.1 seconds left to give #3 Southeast Missouri a thrilling 68-66 come-from-behind win over #6 Lindenwood in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament quarterfinals Thursday.
- Stacker also made two free throws to give the game its 11th tie with 39 seconds remaining.
- He finished with 16 points four the 40th double-digit scoring game of his career.
- SEMO overcame a 13-point deficit to beat the Lions.

- With the win, the Redhawks remained undefeated against the #6 seed at the OVC Tournament with an all-time record of 3-0.

**Vs. the #2 Seed**

- The Redhawks are 1-5 against the #2 seed in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament.
- Southeast Missouri's only win at the OVC Tournament vs. a #2 seed came in the championship game of the 2023 tournament.
- SEMO, then seeded #5, knocked off #2 Tennessee Tech, 89-82, in overtime during the championship game on Mar. 4, 2023.

**Another Semifinal Matchup**

- Southeast Missouri and Morehead State square off in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament semifinals for the second time.
- SEMO upended then-#1 seeded MSU in the 2023 tournament at the Ford Center.
- The Redhawks beat the Eagles, 65-58, on Mar. 3 that year.
- SEMO became the only #5 seed to win the OVC Tournament when it won four games in four days during the 2022-23 campaign.

**Last Time vs. Morehead State**

- Southeast Missouri led for all but 11 seconds of the game en route to its 82-70 victory over Morehead State (Feb. 5).
- SEMO had four starters with double figures in the scoring column led by BJ Ward's game-high 21 points.
- For the game, the Redhawks shot 50.9 percent (29-of-57) from the field, 45 percent (9-of-20) from downtown and outrebounded MSU, 30-25.

## SOUTHEAST MISSOURI BASKETBALL NOTES

- SEMO split its two games against Morehead State this season after dropping a close 71-69 contest in Morehead on Jan. 10.
- The victory gave Brad Korn his first home win over MSU in his career. Prior to that victory, Korn was 0-5 against the Eagles at the Show Me Center.

### Korn vs. Morehead State

- Brad Korn is 5-9 against Morehead State as Southeast Missouri's head coach.
- Three of Korn's victories came in Morehead, one was in the semifinals of the 2023 Ohio Valley Conference Tournament and the other was in Cape Girardeau.
- MSU was the only OVC team Korn did not have a win against at the Show Me Center until this year.
- SEMO beat the Eagles, 82-70, on Feb. 5 to end Korn's five-game losing streak against MSU in Cape Girardeau.

### Almodovar, Terry and Ward Earn All-OVC Honors

- Guards Luke Almodovar and BJ Ward, and forward Brendan Terry earned All-Ohio Valley Conference honors for the 2025-26 season.
- Almodovar garnered first-team honors, while Terry and Ward were named second-team. Almodovar also made the league's All-Newcomer Team during his first year with the Redhawks.
- Almodovar leads Southeast Missouri in scoring with 14.2 points in 31 games and 21 starts this season. He tops the Redhawks with 64 three-pointers made and has scored double figures 22 times in 2025-26.
- Ward is tied for second on the team with 11.5 points per contest as one of just two players who started every game. He leads SEMO with 114 assists and is the team's top free throw shooter (51-of-63, 81 percent).
- Terry is close behind with 11.3 points per game and a team-high 5.5 rebounds. He has

scored double figures in 13 of his last 16 contests.

### All-OVC Guards Under Korn

- The addition of Luke Almodovar and BJ Ward makes seven All-Ohio Valley Conference guards Brad Korn has coached at Southeast Missouri in his career.
- No head coach in program history has coached more All-Conference guards than Korn.
- Teddy Washington, Jr. (2024-25), Rob Martin (2024-25), Phillip Russell (2022-23), Chris Harris (2022-23) and Eric Reed, Jr. (2021-22) are the others.

### Bypassing the First Day

- For the third time in its last four Ohio Valley Conference Tournament appearances, Southeast Missouri bypassed the first round.
- #3 SEMO started postseason play with a 68-66 victory over #6 Lindenwood in the quarterfinals on Mar. 5.
- Prior to this year, the Redhawks were in the quarterfinals of the 2022 tournament as the #4 seed and had a double bye to the semifinals of the 2025 tournament as the #1 seed.
- SEMO played in the first round of the 2023 tournament as a #5 seed when it won four games in four days to claim its last OVC Tournament title.

### 20 Wins

- Thursday's win over #6 Lindenwood gave Southeast Missouri its 20th victory of the season.
- It marked the fourth time SEMO won 20 or more games in a season during its NCAA Division I era (since 1991-92).
- It is also only the second time the Redhawks recorded 20 or more wins in back-to-back seasons since their move to the NCAA Division I ranks.
- SEMO's other 20-win seasons include 1998-99 (20-9), 1999-2000 (24-7) and 2024-25 (21-12).
- The Redhawks have won 19 or more games three times in six years with Brad Korn at the helm.

### 11 of 13

- The Redhawks posted wins in 11 of their last 13 games.
- Southeast Missouri was on a winning streak of three or more games four times this year.
- SEMO's longest winning streak was six games from Jan. 20-Feb. 7.

### Second-Straight Winning Season

- At 20-12 overall and 14-6 in the Ohio Valley Conference, the Redhawks put together their second-straight winning season.
- Southeast Missouri went 21-12 overall and 15-5 in league play en route to winning the OVC regular-season title outright and earning the #1 seed in the OVC Tournament in 2024-25.
- SEMO last had a winning season in back-to-back years during the 2012-13 (17-16) and 2013-14 (18-14) campaigns.
- Korn led the Redhawks to a winning season for the third time in four years.
- Overall, it is the 11th winning season in SEMO's NCAA Division I era (since 1991-92).

### Balancing Act

- Southeast Missouri put together another balanced effort offensively with five players scoring double figures vs. #6 Lindenwood (Mar. 5).
- Braxton Stacker led the way with 16 points, Marqueas Bell followed with 14, Brendan Terry and Luke Almodovar finished with 12

and Troy Cole, Jr. chipped in 11.

- It was the 25th time this season where SEMO had three or more players score double figures in a game.
- The Redhawks are 16-9 in those contests.

### Board Certified

- The Redhawks outrebounded their opponent in eight of their last 12 games.
- Southeast Missouri's +12 rebounding margin (38-26) vs. Southern Indiana (Feb. 7) is its largest of the season to date.
- SEMO leads the Ohio Valley Conference in rebounding defense with per game.

### Bringing the Defense

- Southeast Missouri has held opponents to 65 points or less in four of its last seven games.
- SEMO allowed just 61 points at Lindenwood (Feb. 14), 53 at UT Martin (Feb. 17) and 65 at Little Rock (Feb. 21) and vs. Southern Indiana (Feb. 12) in those matchups.

### Cole, Jr. Rises

- Troy Cole, Jr. scored double figures in three of Southeast Missouri's last four games.
- Cole, Jr. came off the bench to score 10 points and grab seven rebounds at Little Rock (Feb. 21).
- A week later, he finished with a season-high 14 points and eight rebounds vs. Tennessee Tech (Feb. 28).
- Cole, Jr. began this year's Ohio Valley Conference Tournament with 11 points and five rebounds off the bench vs. #6 Lindenwood (Mar. 5).
- Cole, Jr. now has nine double-digit scoring games in his career.

### Home Attendance Leader

- Southeast Missouri led the Ohio Valley Conference in home attendance this season.
- SEMO's total home attendance was 31, 982 in 15 games.

### Second Half of OVC Play

- The Redhawks went 8-2 during the second half of their Ohio Valley Conference season.
- Southeast Missouri began the second half of league play with a road sweep of Western Illinois (78-74, Jan. 29) and Eastern Illinois (77-59, Jan. 31) and a home sweep of Morehead State (82-70, Feb. 5) and Southern Indiana (90-65, Feb. 7).
- The Redhawks started the second portion of their conference schedule at 4-0 for the second year in a row.

- SEMO won its first nine games during the second half of OVC play in 2024-25.

### Ward Clears 100 Assists

- Point guard BJ Ward went over 100 assists this season at SIU Edwardsville (Feb. 12).
- Ward has 116 assists in 32 starts this season.
- He had a total of 15 assists to only two turnovers combined in games at Western Illinois (Jan. 29) and Eastern Illinois (Jan. 31).
- SEMO has had a player get 100 or more assists in a season three-straight years.
- Ward, Phillip Russell (174, 2022-23) and Rob Martin (108, 2023-24; 147, 2024-25) reached that mark in those seasons.

### Welcome to SportsCenter

- Luke Almodovar had one of the best dunks of the year when he threw down a thunderous one-handed slam on a fast break against Southern Indiana (Feb. 7).
- Almodovar, who is left-handed, dunked with his right hand to give Southeast Missouri a 67-49 lead with 8:59 left to play.
- The highlight quickly went viral and landed on ESPN SportsCenter. It was also the #3 play on the network's Top 10 plays that night.

### Season-High in Free Throws

- The Redhawks made a season-high 28-of-32 free throws vs. Southern Indiana (Feb. 7).
- Southeast Missouri outscored USI by a +12 margin (28-16) at the charity stripe.
- It was the most free throws SEMO made in a game since it finished with 34-of-42 in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament vs. Tennessee State on Mar. 2, 2023.
- A week later, SEMO shot 28-of-40 at the free throw line and outscored Lindenwood by a +14 (28-14) margin in free throws on Feb. 14.

### 14 OVC Wins

- Southeast Missouri ended Ohio Valley Conference play with an 89-73 home win over Tennessee Tech (Feb. 28).
- SEMO finished with a 14-5 record in OVC action.
- It was the third time in four seasons where the Redhawks won 10 or more league games and finished with a winning record in OVC action.
- SEMO also went 10-8 in 2022-23 and 15-5 in 2024-25 against league opponents.
- The 15 OVC wins last season were a SEMO program record.



**Happy New Year!**

- Southeast Missouri went 13-5 since the turn of the New Year.
- SEMO beat Eastern Illinois (Jan. 1), Western Illinois (Jan. 3), UT Martin (Jan. 20), Little Rock (Jan. 22) and Morehead State (Feb. 5), Southern Indiana (Feb. 7) and Tennessee Tech (Feb. 28) at home and Southern Indiana (Jan. 8), Western Illinois (Jan. 29), Eastern Illinois (Jan. 31), Lindenwood (Feb. 14), UT Martin (Feb. 17) and Little Rock (Feb. 21) on the road. The Redhawks also beat #6 Lindenwood (Mar. 5) in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament quarterfinals.
- Its losses came at Morehead State (Jan. 10), vs. Lindenwood (Jan. 15), vs. SIU Edwardsville (Jan. 17) at SIU Edwardsville (Feb. 12) and vs. Tennessee State (Feb. 26).
- The 3-0 start was SEMO's best in January under Head Coach Brad Korn.
- The Redhawks started the New Year with a win for the fifth time with Korn at the helm.
- SEMO improved to 4-2 in its first game of the New Year with Korn at the helm.

**Season-High Points in a Half**

- The Redhawks scored a season-high 58 points in the second half vs. Lindenwood (Jan. 15), there most points in any half of basketball this year.
- Southeast Missouri's 58 points are the most scored in a half since the Redhawks hit that same number in the second half vs. Little Rock on Feb. 2, 2023.

**18 of 24**

- The Redhawks went 18-6 in their last 24 games.
- SEMO posted its largest win of the season against an NCAA Division I foe when it defeated Western Illinois, 73-50, on Jan. 3.

**Terry Playing Well**

- Brendan Terry put together his best game of the season to date when he poured in a career-high 30 points off the bench to lead Southeast Missouri to its 84-76 win at Southern Indiana (Jan. 8).
- Terry, who scored 17 points in the first half, finished at 13-of-16 from the field. He also made two 3-pointers, grabbed a game-high eight rebounds, dished out two assists, had two blocks and two steals in 32 minutes.
- He followed that up with a team-high 13 points at Morehead State (Jan. 10), 10 points vs. Lindenwood (Jan. 15),

**Ward Clears 200 Career Assists**

- BJ Ward went over 200 assists in his career vs. Lindenwood (Jan. 15).
- Ward ranks fourth in the Ohio Valley Conference with 116 assists through 32 starts this season.
- Ward is averaging 3.8 per game and has dished out five or more assists in eight of his starts.
- He established a new career-high with eight assists at Eastern Illinois (Jan. 31).
- Ward went over 150 assists at Iowa (Nov. 18) and has 246 in his career.
- He also ranks sixth in the league in assists and assist/turnover ratio (1.7).

**Korn Second Among SEMO's Division I Head Coaches in Wins**

- With Southeast Missouri's 68-59 win over Eastern Illinois (Jan. 1), Brad Korn moved to second all-time among the school's head coaches in the program's Division I era.
- Korn has won 94 games and surpassed Dickey Nutt (80, 2009-15) on that list.
- Gary Garner (126, 1997-2006) has the most wins of any head coach in SEMO's Division I history.
- Korn led SEMO to 21 wins in 2024-25, its second-most in a season since the Redhawks moved to the Division I level.

**You Got Mossed!**

- Landren Blocker's posterizing dunk over Eastern Illinois' Kooper Jacobi was featured as the top play during NFL Sunday Countdown's You Got Mossed on Jan. 4.
- It was the first time SEMO basketball landed on the You Got Mossed segment.
- That play earned Blocker a pair of receiving gloves from legendary wide receiver Randy Moss.
- Blocker leads the team with 17 dunks this season.

**Korn Secures 60th OVC Win**

- Brad Korn earned his 60th career Ohio Valley Conference win when Southeast Missouri took down Tennessee Tech, 89-73, on Feb. 28
- Korn is 60-53 all-time in OVC play with one OVC regular-season title (2024-25) and one tournament championship (2022-23).
- Korn's 60 OVC wins rank second all-time behind Gary Garner (73) in SEMO's program history.

**Winning the Second Half**

- Southeast Missouri won the second half in 17 of its last 23 games.
- The Redhawks outscored their opponent by double figures in the second half a total of eight times in 2025-26.
- SEMO is outscoring opponents, 1,266-1,172 (+94) in the second half this year.

Media will be assigned seats courtside on the north side of the Show Me Center. Press Row is reserved for working media



only. Professional decorum is expected at all times. Cheering or outward expression is strictly prohibited.

### Postgame Interviews

The Southeast Missouri Strategic Communications staff will make requested student-athletes available to the media at the conclusion of each game. Korn and selected student-athletes will address the media after every game and the opposing head coach will be available upon request. Korn will address any media immediately after his postgame radio obligation with the Redhawks Radio Network.


