

Nicole Fransson has been a menace in the paint since her 2018-19 rookie season which saw her win Canada West Rookie of the Year. Fransson, who has vastly improved since her first season with TWU, will be looking to continue her strong

preseason averages of 17 PPG and 15 RPG. Beside Fransson stands *Jolene Vlieg*, who brings her incredibly versatile skillset to the table on both sides of the floor. Vlieg is known to be a nightmare for opposing offences, using her quickness and strength to keep the ball out of TWU's basket.
