TUESDAY TANGLE

Coming off a 64-50 victory over Dartmouth Saturday night, Stanford continues its seven-game homestand Tuesday with a visit from BIG EAST foe DePaul at 7 p.m. PT. Tuesday's contest can be seen on FOX Sports 1 with Aaron Goldsmith and Steve Lavin on the call. Stanford alums Scott Reiss and John Platz will have the call on KNBR 1050 AM courtside from Maples.

AGAINST DePAUL, THE BIG EAST CONFERENCE

Stanford and DePaul have split their four previous meetings. The Cardinal dropped an 87-72 decision to the Blue Demons in Rosemont, Ill., on Nov. 30, 2014. Stanford is 12-17 all-time against current members of the BIG EAST Conference. The Cardinal also played BIG EAST foe Villanova on Nov. 26 in Brooklyn, N.Y.

ROSCO ALLEN FROM DEEP

Rosco Allen is averaging 13.4 ppg this season. Half of his field goals (15-of-30) have come from three-point range. The senior ranks fourth in the Pac-12, shooting 48.4 percent (15-of-31) from beyond the arc. He has recorded multiple three-pointers in five of Stanford's seven games with at least three in a contest four times. He has totaled seven three-pointers in his last two games.

SOPHOMORE IMPACT

Stanford's sophomore class has played a major role in the Cardinal's success this season. Despite playing without injured point guard Robert Cartwright, the unit that includes Reid Travis (12.9 ppg), Michael Humphrey (8.6 ppg) and Dorian Pickens (10.0 ppg) has accounted for 44.4 percent of Stanford's points this season. Starting forwards Travis (7.1 rpg) and Humphrey (6.4 rpg) have accounted for 36.0 percent of the Cardinal's rebounds this season.

HOME SWEET HOME

Stanford is 3-1 in its first four home games of the 2015-16 season and has won six of its last seven at home overall. The Cardinal owns a 95-31 record at Maples Pavilion under head coach Johnny Dawkins. Stanford has won at least 10 home games for 22 straight seasons dating back to 1992-93.

PRODUCING IN INCREASED ROLES

With the graduation of starters Chasson Randle, Anthony Brown and Stefan Nastic following last season, several members of the Cardinal have stepped in to increased roles this year. Stanford's current starting lineup - Rosco Allen, Marcus Allen, Michael Humphrey, Reid Travis and Christian Sanders - combined to average 23.7 points in 91.4 (18.3 per player) minutes per game last season. That same group is averaging a combined 55.6 in 145.0 (29.0 per player) minutes this year.

NEW LOOK LINEUP

Rosco Allen was the lone Cardinal from Stanford's starting lineup in the 2015 postseason NIT Championship game against Miami who has started all seven games this season. Stanford's starting lineup in its last games (Rosco Allen, Marcus Allen, Reid Travis, Michael Humphrey and Christian Sanders) has started a combined 109 games individually. Rosco Allen leads the way with 37 career starts.

STRONG START FOR MARCUS ALLEN

Junior Marcus Allen scored 18 points in 24 minutes in his season debut against SMU after missing the first two games with a foot injury. Allen was inserted into the starting lineup the next game against Saint Mary's, where he finished with 14 points in 28 minutes. The shooting guard has scored in double figures in all five games he has played in this season, adding 12 points each against Villanova, Arkansas and Dartmouth. He leads the Cardinal in scoring, averaging 13.6 ppg.

HUMPHREY FILLING UP THE BOX SCORE

Sophomore Michael Humphrey is averaging 8.6 points, 6.4 rebounds and 2.3 blocks per game this season. He ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in blocks per game. Humphrey has started five of Stanford's seven games, including each of the last three contests. The forward has two double-doubles with 13 points and 11 rebounds against Green Bay and 13 points and 12 rebounds vs. Charleston Southern. He has four career double-doubles in 37 career games.

BROOKLYN COMEBACK

Stanford erased a 17-point deficit (48-65) with 6:11 to play, scoring 21 of the game's final 22 points to earn a 69-66 come-from-behind victory over Arkansas in the NIT Season Tip-Off Nov. 27 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. Senior Rosco Allen scored eight of his career-high 25 points in the final 4:27 of the game.

TRAVIS A FORCE IN THE PAINT

Sophomore forward Reid Travis leads the team in rebounds (7.1 rpg) and ranks third on the team in points (12.9 ppg). His team-leading 54.8 field goal percentage ranks 10th in the Pac-12. Travis is a regular starter in the paint for the Cardinal this year after making 12 starts and averaging 6.2 ppg in 23.1 mpg during his freshman season in 2014-15. The sophomore scored a career-best 18 points at Saint Mary's four games ago and collected a career-high 12 rebounds against Villanova three games ago.

QUARTERBACKS TURNED POST PLAYERS

Sophomore forwards Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey were each the quarterback of their high school football team. Travis was the signal caller for three years at DeLaSalle HS in Minnesota, before deciding to focus on basketball his senior year. Humphrey was the starting quarterback at Sunnyslope HS in Phoenix.

SANDERS TAKES OVER AS THE FLOOR GENERAL

After totaling 81 points in 61 games over his first three seasons at Stanford, senior point guard Christian Sanders has combined to record 50 points in seven contests this year. He scored a career-high 23 points in a career-long 31 minutes in the season-opening win over Green Bay, more than doubling his previous career-high of 11 against Belmont during the 2012-13 season. The senior is also averaging 3.0 assists per game with a career-best eight in the win over Charleston Southern on Nov. 15.

PICKENS NOTCHES DOUBLE-DOUBLE AGAINST VILLANOVA

Sophomore guard Dorian Pickens posted his first career double-double, recording 11 points and a career-best 10 rebounds against No. 8 Villanova on Nov. 26. After averaging 2.1 points in 9.8 minutes per game last season, he ranks fourth on the team in scoring this season with 11.0 points in 29.2 minutes per contest.

FRESHMAN MAKING IMMEDIATE CONTRIBUTIONS

The Cardinal's three-member freshman class of Josh Sharma, Marcus Sheffield and Cameron Walker have each seen action this season. Sheffield is the lone newcomer to see time in all seven contests, earning the start in the season opener against Green Bay. Walker, who missed the first four games of the year with a calf injury, has totaled 17 minutes in the last two games. Sharma has registered five blocks in 36 minutes over five games.

CONTROLLING THE GLASS

Stanford's 55 rebounds against Villanova in the NIT Season Tip-Off on Nov. 26 were the most by the Cardinal in the Johnny Dawkins era. Dawkins, in his eighth season as head coach of the Cardinal, has seen Stanford record 50 or more rebounds in a game six times.

CARTWRIGHT SIDELINED FOR SEASON

Sophomore guard Robert Cartwright sustained a compound fracture in his right arm and will miss the 2015-16 season. The injury occurred during Stanford's team practice at Maples Pavilion on Nov. 2. Cartwright underwent successful surgery and will begin his rehabilitation period in the coming weeks. Cartwright played in all but one game, earning one start, as a freshman during Stanford's 2015 Postseason NIT Championship run. The point guard averaged 1.9 points in 11.1 minutes per game. He shot 33.3 percent from three-point range.

STANFORD TO PLAY IN SHANGHAI IN 2016

Stanford will open the 2016-17 season against Harvard in the 2016 Pac-12 China game, scheduled to be played in Shanghai on Nov. 12, 2016, Pac-12 Commissioner Larry Scott announced on Nov. 13. The game, which will be televised live back in the United States on Nov. 11, will tip off the 2016-17 men's basketball season.

The 2016 Pac-12 China Game will be presented by Alibaba Group with Federation of University Sports of China (FUSC), which operates under China's Ministry of Education, serving as the co-host for the game.

Specific venue and U.S. and China broadcast information for the 2016 Pac-12 China Game will be finalized at a later date. The game is the latest event of Pac-12 Global, an unprecedented effort to promote goodwill for the Conference and its member institutions through sport, and to provide student-athletes with a transformative cultural exchange experience.

CARDINAL IN THE NBA

Five former Stanford standouts – Brook Lopez (Brooklyn Nets), Robin Lopez (New York Knicks), Dwight Powell (Dallas Mavericks), Josh Huestis (Oklahoma City Thunder) and Anthony Brown (Los Angeles Lakers) – opened the 2015-16 season on NBA rosters. Powell, Huestis and Brown all played under head coach Johnny Dawkins. Brook Lopez leads the Nets in scoring (20.2 ppg) and ranks second on Brooklyn's roster in rebounds (8.0 rpg). Dwight Powell, in his second year in the NBA, is averaging 9.0 ppg and 6.5 rpg for the Dallas Mavericks.

TOUR OF ITALY

Stanford enjoyed a 17-day tour of Italy from Aug. 19-Sept. 4, playing six exhibition games against some of the country's top professional teams. The program also had an opportunity to explore the country, visiting Rome, Florence, Venice, Bologna, Como and Pesaro during its exhibition tour.

TRI-CAPTAINS

Senior Rosco Allen, junior Marcus Allen and sophomore Reid Travis were voted captains for the 2015-16 season. Combined, the trio has played in 180 career games. All three averaged more than 20 minutes per game last season for the Cardinal.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

Sports Illustrated projected sophomore Reid Travis as one of the nation's breakout scorers, while junior Marcus Allen was recognized as one of the nation's projected under the radar breakout players by CBS Sports College Basketball Insider Jon Rothstein.

STANBACK JOINS CARDINAL

Trevor Stanback, regarded as one of the highest-rated prospects on the West Coast, has signed a National Letter of Intent with Stanford on Nov. 12.

Stanback, a 6-10, 220-pound power forward from Maranatha High School in Pasadena, Calif., is a consensus four-star prospect by the major recruiting services. He ranks as the 13th-best power forward in the nation by Scout.com and 68th-best prospect overall. A member of the Rivals100 for the Class of 2016, the group ranks him as the 88th-best prospect nationally. Scout.com ranks the power forward as the third-best prospect in the state of California, while ESPN's recruiting service has him as the ninth-best prospect in the Golden State. He is rated the 18th-best power forward in the nation by 247Sports.

Stanback, who carries a 4.0 cumulative grade point average, enrolled at Maranatha High School prior to his junior season after attending Chaminade College Prep his first two years. A center at Maranatha, Stanback was limited to eight games with an injury during the 2014-15 season, averaging 6.1 points and 3.0 blocks per game in his first year with the school. He returned for the playoffs, where he helped lead the Minutemen to the Division 4A title this past season. In Maranatha's CIF Southern Section Division 4A championship game against Campbell Hall, Stanback posted 13 rebounds and five blocks.

As a sophomore at Chaminade, Stanback guided the Eagles to the 2014 Division III state championship. He averaged 9.6 points, 8.4 rebounds and 3.8 blocks per game as a sophomore in 2014, and 9.1 points, 10.4 rebounds and 5.0 blocks as a freshman in 2013 for the Eagles.

Johnny Dawkins' contributions since arriving on The Farm have come in the form of both team and individual success, most notably guiding the Cardinal to the 2014 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 and the 2012 Postseason NIT championship.

Meanwhile, Dawkins has also been responsible for overseeing the development of Landry Fields, Josh Huestis and Dwight Powell, all of whom parlayed outstanding senior seasons into NBA Draft selections. Huestis (first round) and Powell (second round) were taken in the first round of the 2014 NBA Draft while Fields (second round) was chosen in 2010.

Dawkins has also made significant strides off the court, with the 2014 recruiting class representing the latest top-20 crop of freshmen to arrive on The Farm. Even more impressively, that same young talent is being developed quickly. In 2012, Chasson Randle became the fourth player to earn All-Freshman Team status among conference players during Dawkins' tenure following a six-year period in which only two Cardinal rookies were honored.

A very high standard in the classroom has also been established during Dawkins' tenure. In 2013-14, Stanford totaled the most Pac-12 All-Academic selections (6) of any conference school for the fifth consecutive season while Powell and Randle were tabbed back-to-back Pac-12 Scholar-Athletes of the Year.

The 2013-14 campaign was especially memorable, as Stanford (23-13, 10-8 Pac-12) advanced to the Sweet 16 for only the fifth time in school history after upsets of No. 7 seed New Mexico and No. 2 seed Kansas. Despite losing two starters and two key reserves to season-ending injuries, the Cardinal finished tied for third in the highly-competitive Pac-12.

Stanford finished 19-15 overall two seasons ago, advancing to the NIT second round. The Cardinal finished 9-9 in the Pac-12, swept the season series against California for the first time since 2008 and notched a 76-52 home upset of No. 10/12 Oregon.

Stanford produced a 26-11 record in 2011-12 en route to capturing the Postseason NIT title, the third championship in school history. The Cardinal chalked up its best win total since a 28-8 campaign in 2007-08. Stanford was the Pac-12's winningest program and tallied a league-best four top-50 RPI victories.

The Cardinal concluded the 2010-11 season at 15-16, fielding a team without a senior for the first time in school history. Stanford finished 14-18 during the 2009-10 campaign, Dawkins' second year at the helm.

In 2008-09, Dawkins directed Stanford to a 20-14 record and reached the CBI semifinals. In addition to surpassing Robert Burnett as the winningest first-year head coach in school history, Dawkins ranked third in victories among 21 first-year head coaches in Division I with no prior college head coaching experience.


